

Number of Rows between Shapings. Make increase (or decrease) FIRST, then knit 4 rows. For example: 3 x 1 means decrease (or increase) 1 st., knit 4 rows; decrease 1 st., knit 4 rows, decrease 1 st., knit 4 rows; decrease 1 st., knit 4 rows. All decreasing (or increasing) without row numbers as shown must be shaped on every 2nd row.

Increase

Increase 2 sts. With a transfer tool, move the sts. over the left (or right) leaving 2 empty needles at the point of increase. At the increase point, move 1 st. to the left, (or right) so that there is an empty needles on each side of a stitch. On each side of the center stitch, pick up a stitch from the row below and hang it onto the empty needle.

3 stitches on 1 needle. The 1st and 3rd stitch in a group of 3 has been hung on the 2nd or center needle.

Short Row increase or decrease; for instance on a flared skirt knitted sideways.

# General Instructions

### HOW TO READ THE CHARTS AND INSTRUCTIONS

There are 3 sizes given for each Pattern in KNITKING MAGAZINE. Above each Chart for the different sizes, you will see that the first and smaller sizes might be shown as 8/10, the second size as (12/14) and the third as [16/18]. Check the measurements at the bustline and hips on the Charts to be certain that you will knit the correct size, remembering these are ACTUAL measurements of the completed section and that there must be a bigger allowance at the bustline and hipline for a Jacket or a Coat than there would be for a fitted dress or a fitted blouse or pullover. The question in your mind should be "How do I want this garment to fit...?"

When you have chosen the size you need, you can follow the Charts as shown. You will notice that where the shapings are the same FOR ALL SIZES, only 1 set of shapings will be shown on the first Chart and if you are knitting the 2nd or 3rd size, you simply follow the shapings as given for the first size. If the shapings are different, this will be shown on the Charts and you should follow them as given.

On the Charts, increases and decreases will be shown as follows

5x1 The number in the box means number of ROWS between 6 the shapings, while the 5x1 above the box means - 1 st. 5x... so you will increase or decrease 1 st. every 6th row 5x.

ARMHOLE SHAPINGS - NECK SHAPINGS - SHOULDER SHAPINGS - are made on every 2nd row UNLESS there is a number in a box along side or below the shapings. The rule is... where there is no box with a number, the shaping is made on every 2nd row.

### THE PRINTED INSTRUCTIONS

You can follow the printed instructions or use them in combination with the Charts . Where there is any question in the printed instructions, you have the Charts to show you how the section will look.

The 3 sizes, with the different amounts of cast on stitches and the different shapings will look like this...

Cast on 124 (136) [148] sts. You will

Cast on 124 sts. for the first size.

Cast on 136 sts. for the 2nd size. Cast on 148 sts. for the 3rd size.

The important thing to remember is that you MUST READ AHEAD so that you KNOW what to do for the size you are knitting. Sometimes where the number of stitches are the same but the number of times different, you will find shapings like this... 3 sts. 1x (2x) [3x], 2 sts. 1x (2x) [3x], 1 st. 3x (4x) [5x]. As you see, you MUST read ahead in order to follow the instructions as given for YOUR SIZE. The rows will be different for the different sizes in some cases... Shoulder and Neck shapings usually are worked at the SAME TIME for the back section - so watch for the words AT THE SAME TIME.

HOLDING STITCHES ON THE LEFT SIDE WHILE SHAPING THE RIGHT SIDE When knitting a section of garment in stockinette stitch, it is easy to hold the stitches on the left side while knitting the right half, but when knitting a Pattern Stitch such as a Norwegian Design, a Holding Position Design, Weaving, etc., you should use the following method. For the NECK SHAPING, we tell you to bind off the center sts., put the needles on the left into holding position and complete the right half first.... so with a strand of contrast yarn, knit ALL of the left side stitches manually by hand, pulling each stitch back against the needle bed to the OUT OF WORK position. When the right side is completed, carefully pull the stitches held on contrast, forward into working position and as you do so, undo the contrast yarn, line up the needles (KNITKING AM 3 machine owners, put the stitches under the sinkers) and complete the left half.

If you own a Japanese machine, you may find that when knitting the right half with the left side held in this way, the sinker plate will mark the left side while you are knitting the right half. To prevent this marking, you can tape a piece of paper over the knitting, underneath the sinkers, or if you own a Reversing Bar, you can hang this onto the Sinkers while you are knitting the right half. When hanging the Reversing Bar, be sure the eyes of the bar go BETWEEN the Sinker Posts on the upper part of the bar so that the tips of the bar only - show above the needle bed.

FULL FASHION DECREASING OR INCREASING

For Stockinette stitch, always use the Full Fashion method for increasing or decreasing.

TO DECREASE: Hang the 3rd stitch onto the 2nd stitch then move

the stitches in to fill the empty needle.

TO INCREASE: Move the 2 end stitches 1 needle outward, then pick up the 3rd stitch from the row below and

hang it onto the empty needle.

FINISHING: Block all sections. For PULLOVERS, JACKETS, and DRESSES: Join front to back at sides and shoulders. Sew sleeves together and set in. Hem lower edge and sleeve edges if needed. For a double neckband or armhole band, sew I edge to the inside and 1 to the outside of neck or armhole. For a single ribbed band, sew I edge to the outside of neck or armhole edge. For a cardigan or jacket with buttonholes, finish buttonholes and sew on buttons.

Join front to back at sides. Sew inside leg seams, then join center front and back. Make hem at waistline and insert elastic. Hem lower edge of pants legs.

### THE SAMPLE SWATCH

Before you begin to knit any garment, you will need to knit a sample piece using the yarn you have chosen for your garment, so that you can check the stitch and row gauge which must measure the correct number of stitches and rows in 5 cm (2 inches).

For each Pattern in KNITKING MAGAZINE, we give you 3 tension numbers to work from and if you use the specified yarn for the garment, you should be able to get the correct stitch and row gauge using one of these numbers. Here is a very easy way to make your sample swatch and count the stitches and rows without actually counting, by using our KNITKING Converta Tape.


Supposing the Tension Numbers for the Stitch and Row Gauge are given as 5 to 7. Set the Tension Dial to the first number which is 5. With contrast waste yarn, and using the quick cast on method, cast on 60 stitches and knit 10 rows. Change to garment yarn and turn the Row Counter to O. Knit 30 rows. Counting from each end, knit the 10th stitch on each side by hand with a small piece of contrast yarn. Leave the needles in working position and knit 30 rows (Row 60), then knit 4 rows with contrast waste yarn. Turn the Row Counter to 0 and the Tension Dial to 6 and with garment yarn, knit 30 rows. Mark the 10th stitch on each side as you did before, knit 30 rows, then 4 rows with contrast waste yarn. Turn the Row Counter to O and with Tension 7, repeat the above once more, ending with 10 rows of contrast waste yarn. Remove the work from the machine by passing the Slide across the needles without yarn (sometimes called 'dropping').

Pull and stretch the sample piece both lengthwise and diagonally from corner to corner, then lengthwise again. Do not count the stitches and rows immediately, but allow the sample to rest for several hours or even over night. This will allow the stitches and rows to return to their basic form.

When your sample has rested and you are ready to count the stitches and rows, the KNITKING CONVERTA TAPE will do the counting for you without any counting on your part. Use the Tape as follows:

Measure the stitches with the TAPE, BETWEEN the 40 stitches marked with contrast waste yarn. Push the red marker on the Tape so that it points to 40 stitches on the Tape. Your stitch gauge to 5 cm (2 inches) will show in the red window on the Tape. To find the number of rows in 5 cm (2 inches), place the tape to measure over 60 rows, push the red marker to 60 on the Tape and your row gauge for 5 cm (2 inches) will show in the red window. If you do not get the correct stitch and row gauge in the first part of your sample, then try the other two.

If you do not own a KNITKING CONVERTA TAPE, you must mark a 5 cm (2 inch) square in the center of the knitting, then count the number of stitches and rows withing the square.

cast on 56 sts. with color 1. Work 36 rows K1, P1 Ribbing then continue in Stockinette stitch with changes in color as SHOWN ON THE ON THE RIGHT side, increase 1 st. every 2nd row 18x, then 2 sts. 5x. After Row 82, cast on 84 sts. After Row 146, SHAPE NECK ON THE LEFT SIDE. Bind off 4 sts. 12x, 3 sts. 12x (use a separate yarn for binding off). Watch the color changes as shown. After Row 194, ON NECK SIDE, cast on 3 sts. 12x, 4 sts. 12x. After Row 306, bind off 84 sts. then on every 2nd row, bind off 2 sts. 5x, 1 st. 18x. After Row 352, change to K1, P1 Ribbing to Row 388 then bind off.

To the extreme left of machine,

WAISTBAND: Make 2.

Cast on 120 sts. and work 12 rows K1, P1 Ribbing. Bind off. Sew to lower edge of front and back.

### NECKBAND:

Cast on 212 sts. (106 sts. on each bed) and work K1, P1 Ribbing. ON EACH SIDE, on every 2nd row, increase 2 sts. 6x. Bind off.

### BACK: II

The back is worked the same as the front with the exception of the neck shaping and the color stripes begin after Row 252 (so they will line up with front). The color changes are the same. For NECK SHAPING, after Row 146, \*232 ON NECK SIDE, bind off 1 st. 5x, then after Row 232, cast on 1 st. 5x.

### JACKET SLEEVES:

Cast on 92 (98) [102] sts. and work 22 rows K1, P1 Ribbing. Continue in Eyelet Pattern. ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. every 4th row 7x (8x) [8x]. After Row 54 (56) [56], SHAPE CAP: ON EACH SIDE, bind off 4 sts. 1x, 3 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 2x, 1 st. 20x, 2 sts. 6x. (4 sts. 1x, 3 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 2x, 1 st. 18x, 2 sts. 9x). 4 sts. 1x, 3 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 2x, 1 st. 18x, 2 sts. 10x]. After Row 112 (118) [120], bind off the remaining sts.



272 RIGHT FRONT BAND: Cast on 21 sts. and work Stockinette stitch. Knit 10 rows, Make BUTTONHOLES over needles 4 to 7 and 14 to 17 counting from the left edge. Knit 32 rows, and make BUTTONHOLES over same needles as before. REPEAT the BUTTONHOLES every 32 rows to Row 96. Remove these sts. onto waste yarn.

> FOR FRONT - Cast on 70 (75) [80] sts. and work 22 rows K1, P1 Ribbing. Continue in Eyelet Pattern to Row 84. Continue in Stockinette stitch. Put 15 sts. on the left (right for left front) into holding position and over the next 36 sts. work



JACKET FRONT: Make 1, reverse 1.

Cast on 162 (162) [166] sts. and work Stockinette stitch. (Color 1). After Row 47, for neck shaping, cast on 1 st. 3x, 2 sts. 5x, 3 sts. 1x, 4 sts. 1x, BUT AT THE SAME TIME, after Row 60, CONTINUE IN PATTERN.

After Row 154 (162) [166], bind off 98 sts. (or remove them onto waste yarn). SHAPE UNDERARM: ON EVERY 2nd ROW, bind off 1 st. 16x, 2 sts. 9x. Knit to Row 272 (280) [284], then continue in K1, P1 Ribbing to Row 298 (306) [310]. Bind off. Work the 2nd section in reverse. Neck shapings will be on the right side and underarm on the left.



JACKET BACK: Color 1.

Begin at center Back. With contrast waste yarn, cast on 178 (178) [182] sts. Knit 8 to 10 rows, change to garment yarn and put Counter at 0. Begin with 6 rows Stockinette stitch (instead of 12) then continue with Pattern. AT THE SAME TIME, on every 2nd row, cast on 1 st. 4x on the left side (right for 2nd half) for the neck shaping. Knit to Row 126 (132) [136].

Bind off 98 sts. (or you can remove them onto waste yarn and weave sides later). SHAPE UNDERARM:
ON EVERY 2nd ROW, bind off 1 st. 16x, 2 sts. 9x.
Knit to Row 198 (206) [210].
Continue with K1, P1 Ribbing to Row 224 (232) [236]. Bind off.

Hang the open sts. of center back onto machine and work the 2nd half begining with 6 rows Stockinette stitch. All shapings will now be on the RIGHT.

JACKET NECK & FRONT BANDS: Make 2.

Cast on 200 sts. with waste yarn as you did for back. After knitting 8 to 10 rows, change to color 1 and put counter at 0.

Knit 48 rows Stockinette stitch.

Remove 70 sts. at one side onto waste yarn, then hang the hem over the remaining needles and bind off. Sew the open strips together at center back, then pin 1 edge of band to neckline and sew in place. Fold band in half and sew other edge to the inside. Remove the waste yarn. (See picture).



FINISHING: See General Instructions.



### NECKBAND:

Cast on 176 sts. on BOTH beds (Knitter and Ribber ) and work K1, P1 Ribbing. ON EACH SIDE, increase 2 sts. every 2nd row. After Row 14, bind off.





FRONT BANDS: Make 2.


Cast on 204 (208) [212] sts. with color 2 (half the sts. on Ribber and half on knitter) Work Ribbing same as before to Row 16, then bind off.

On the 2nd band, make 5 BUTTONHOLES over 4 needles with 24 sts. in between.

SKIRT BACK: Make 2.

Cast on 108 (116) [124] sts. with color 1 and work Stockinette stitc Knit to Row 30 (42) [42].


ON EACH SIDE decrease 1 st. every 10th row 27x. After Row 300 (312) [312], bind off.



Cast on 122 (132) [140] sts. with color 1 and work Stockinette stitch. After Row 30 (42) [42] ON SIDE EDGE, DECREASE 1 st. EVERY 8TH ROW 32x BUT AT THE SAME TIME, after Row 232 (246) [246], divide for slit. Put 12 (12) [14] sts. on the right (left) into holding position. ON THE RIGHT (left)\*decrease 2 sts. every 2nd row 1x, then 1 st. 1x and REPEAT from \* 8x more. After Row 268 (282) [282], put these sts. into holding position. Bring the 12 (12) [14] sts. into working position, turn the Row Counter back to 232 (246) [246] and cast on 27 sts. on INNER EDGE.

Knit to Row 268 (282) [282]. Bring all the needles into working position and continue the side decreases.

After Row 300 (312) [312], bind off.



VEST FRONT: I Make 1, reverse 1.

Cast on 68 (74) [79] sts. with color 1 and work 18 rows Ribbing (same as front & back).


Continue in Pattern with color 2.


Knit to Row 174 (184) [188].

SHAPE ARMHOLE: Bind off 3 sts. 2x, 2 sts. 4x, 1 st. 5x. (3 sts. 2, 2 sts. 4x, 1 st. 7x) [3 sts. 2x, 2 sts. 5x, 1 st. 6x].

After Row 201 (211) [215], SHAPE NECK: Bind off 3 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 3x, 1 st. 6x then 1 st. every 4th row 6x). [Same as first size). [3 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 3x, 1 st. 8x then 1 st. every 4th row 6x].

After Row 308 (320) [324], SHAPE SHOULDER same as the back.






Cast on 188 (192) [192] sts. color 2. Work Ribbing same as before to Row 16 then bind off.

Cast on 160 (172) [178] sts. with color 1 and work 18 rows K2, P2 (or K1, P1) Ribbing.
Continue in Pattern with color 2. Knit to Row 174 (174) [178].
SHAPE ARMHOLE: ON EACH SIDE, bind off 3 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 3x, 1 st. 5x then 1 st. every 4th row 8x. (3 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 3x, 1 st. 6x, then 1 st. every 4th row 9x).
[3 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 4x, 1 st. 8x, then 1 st. every 4th row 4x].
After Row 308 (310) [318], bind off the center 32 (32) [36] sts. put

the needles on the left into holding position and complete the right side first.

\*SHAPE SHOULDER AND NECK AT THE SAME TIME. FOR SHOULDER, bind off 4 sts. 7x, (4 sts. 8x), [4 sts. 7x, 6 sts. 1x], FOR NECK, bind off 4 sts. 2x, 3 sts. 2x, for all sizes. Set up for Cables as shown on the Chart for size you need. 12 sts. form the pattern -3 purl sts, 6 knit sts., 3 purl sts. After every 10th row, cross the center 6 knit sts. to form cable. After Row 154 (160) [168], SHAPE SHOULDER: ON EACH SIDE, bind off 10 sts. 3x. (8 sts. 3x, 9 sts. 1x). [7 sts. 5x]. After Row 160 (168) [176],

bind off the remaining sts.



Work the Pocket lining first. Cast on 26 sts. and work 30 rows Stockinette stitch. Remove these sts. onto stitch holder. Make another pocket lining the same. FRONT: Cast on 44 (47) [50] sts. and work 20 rows Ribbing. Continue in Stockinette stitch and Cable Design as shown on the Chart for size you need. Work the Cables the same as the back and after Row 46, put 18 (20) [20] sts. on the right and 14 (15) [15] sts. on the left into holding position (reverse for 2nd section). Over the 26 remaining sts. work 8 rows Ribbing, then bind off these sts. Hang the pocket lining sts. onto the empty needles and continue in Stockinette stitch with Cable Design. After Row 125 (133) [137], SHAPE NECK: Bind off 4 sts. 1x, 3 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 2x, st. 3x. (4 sts. 1x, 3 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 2x, st. 3x). [4 sts. 1x, 3 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 3x, After Row 154 (160) [168], SHAPE SHOULDER same as the back.

# KNITKING NEWS

#### PRACTICAL KNITTING HINTS

If you want a permanent cast-on edge (for instance for a pleated skirt), here is an easy way.

Bring the required number of needles into working position. Hang the cast on comb. Bring every other needle into "E" position (all the way forward). Push in LEFT PART BUTTON. With contrast waste yarn, knit I row to the left. Drop the cast on comb and release part button. Knit at least 1" of waste knitting. With garment yarn, cast on using the "e" method (permanent edge) right over the waste yarn, behind the latches of the needles (bring the needles into "E" position to make it easier to cast on). The cast on should be from left to right. Turn the tension to 1 number lower than the one you will use for knitting your garment. Knit 2 rows. If you are working a Pattern stitch, set the card after knitting the first row. Turn Tension to garment tension, put Counter at O and continue with your garment.


Block the section and use the waste knitting to push pins into and hold the pleats in place. After blocking is completed, cut the first row of the waste yarn and pull this row out. Now it is easy to unravel the waste yarn down to the permanent cast on edge.

#### TRANSPORT YOUR MACHINE WITH KNITTING ON IT ..

Dani Carver of Duarte, Calif. teaches machine knitting at Adult Education Classes in Altadena. She gave us this handy hint. When it is impossible to complete a section of a garment at class, instead of removing the knitting onto waste yarn Dani has her students purchase plastic spines sold at the 5 & 10 cent stores or stationery stores. At this date, we have found that they are not sold separately anymore and you must purchase a package of plastic paper holders which come with the color spines. There are 4 or 6 in a package and they cost approximately \$1.00. Use the spines to slip over the front posts (gate pegs) of your machine - leave the knitting on the machine ready for the next row. You will have to use enough of the spines to cover all the stitches (they are 11" long). You can now pick up the machine without worrying about your knitting. If you remember to carry some tissue paper with you, you can roll your knitting up in the tissue and place it on top of the needle bed.


#### NARROW BANDS OF RIBBING

When you must have a narrow band of Ribbing - say 6 or 8 rows, it is much easier to remove the sts. of the band when completed, onto waste yarn. When you have knitted the band, transfer the Ribber sts. to the main machine then remove the sts. onto contrast waste yarn. Pick up the number of required sts. around a neckline, armhole or wherever you need the band (WRONG SIDE FACING YOU) then hang the open sts. of the band onto these same needles. Bind off the double sts. together.



#### RIBBING BUTTONHOLE

The open necked Pullover, HP 763 has a Rib band with buttonholes. The illustration on the left shows a simple way to make a small buttonhole. With a crochet hook, spread and pull the knitting apart for as many rows needed for an opening. Tack the opening at each end then work a buttonhole stitch all around the opening. Use matching buttonhole twist or fine matching yarn.

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





