All decreasing (or increasing) without row numbers as shown must be shaped on every 2nd row.

Increase 2 sts. With a transfer tool, move the sts. over the left (or right) leaving 2 empty needles at the point of increase. At the increase point,

move 1 st. to the left, (or right) so that there is an empty needles on each side of a stitch. On each side of the center stitch, pick up a stitch from the row below and hang it onto the empty needle.

3 stitches on 1 needle. The 1st and 3rd stitch in a group of 3 has been hung on the 2nd or center needle.

## General Instructions

#### HOW TO READ THE CHARTS AND INSTRUCTIONS

There are 3 sizes given for each Pattern in KNITKING MAGAZINE. Above each Chart for the different sizes, you will see that the first and smaller sizes might be shown as 8/10, the second size as (12/14) and the third as [16/18]. Check the measurements at the bustline and hips on the Charts to be certain that you will knit the correct size, remembering these are ACTUAL measurements of the completed section and that there must be a bigger allowance at the bustline and hipline for a Jacket or a Coat than there would be for a fitted dress or a fitted blouse or pullover. The question in your mind should be "How do I want this garment to fit...?"

When you have chosen the size you need, you can follow the Charts as shown. You will notice that where the shapings are the same FOR ALL SIZES, only I set of shapings will be shown on the first Chart and if you are knitting the 2nd or 3rd size, you simply follow the shapings as given for the first size. If the shapings are different, this will be shown on the Charts and you should follow them as given.

On the Charts, increases and decreases will be shown as follows

6 The number in the box means number of ROWS between the shapings, while the 5xl above the box means - l st. 5x... so you will increase or decrease l st. every 6th row 5x.

ARMHOLE SHAPINGS - NECK SHAPINGS - SHOULDER SHAPINGS - are made on every 2nd row UNLESS there is a number in a box along side or below the shapings. The rule is... where there is no box with a number, the shaping is made on every 2nd row.

#### THE PRINTED INSTRUCTIONS

above the needle bed.

You can follow the printed instructions or use them in combination with the Charts . Where there is any question in the printed instructions, you have the Charts to show you how the section will look.

The 3 sizes, with the different amounts of cast on stitches and the different shapings will look like this... Cast on 124 (136) [148] sts. You will

Cast on 124 sts. for the first size. Cast on 136 sts. for the 2nd size.

Cast on 148 sts. for the 3rd size.

The important thing to remember is that you MUST READ AHEAD so that you KNOW what to do for the size you are knitting. Sometimes where the number of stitches are the same but the number of times different, you will find shapings like this... 3 sts. lx (2x) [3x], 2 sts. lx (2x) [3x], 1 st. 3x (4x) [5x]. As you see, you MUST read ahead in order to follow the instructions as given for YOUR SIZE. The rows will be different for the different sizes in some cases... Shoulder and Neck shapings usually are worked at the SAME TIME for the back section – so watch for the words AT THE SAME TIME.

When knitting a section of garment in stockinette stitch, it is easy to hold the stitches on the left side while knitting the right half, but when knitting a Pattern Stitch such as a Norwegian Design, a Holding Position Design, Weaving, etc., you should use the following method. For the NECK SHAPING, we tell you to bind off the center sts., put the needles on the left into holding position and complete the right half first... so with a strand of contrast yarn, knit ALL of the left side stitches manually by hand, pulling each stitch back against the needle bed to the OUT OF WORK position. When the right side is completed, carefully pull the stitches held on contrast, forward into working position and as you do so, undo the contrast yarn, line up the needles (KNITKING AM 3 machine owners, put the stitches under the sinkers) and complete the left half.

If you own a Japanese machine, you may find that when knitting the right half with the left side held in this way, the sinker plate will mark the left side while you are knitting the right half. To prevent this marking, you can tape a piece of paper over the knitting, underneath the sinkers, or if you own a Reversing Bar, you can hang this onto the Sinkers while you are knitting the right half. When hanging the Reversing Bar, be sure the eyes of the bar go BETWEEN the Sinker Posts on the upper part of the bar so that the tips of the bar only - show

FULL FASHION DECREASING OR INCREASING

For Stockinette stitch, always use the Full Fashion method for increasing or decreasing.

TO DECREASE: Hang the 3rd stitch onto the 2nd stitch then move

the stitches in to fill the empty needle.

TO INCREASE: Move the 2 end stitches 1 needle outward, then pick up the 3rd stitch from the row below and

hang it onto the empty needle.

FINISHING: Block all sections. For PULLOVERS, JACKETS, and DRESSES: Join front to back at sides and shoulders. Sew sleeves together and set in. Hem lower edge and sleeve edges if needed. For a double neckband or armhole band, sew l edge to the inside and l to the outside of neck or armhole. For a single ribbed band, sew l edge to the outside of neck or armhole edge. For a cardigan or jacket with buttonholes, finish buttonholes and sew on buttons.

PANTS: Join front to back at sides. Sew inside leg seams, then join center front and back. Make hem at waistline and insert elastic. Hem lower edge of pants legs.

#### THE SAMPLE SWATCH

Before you begin to knit any garment, you will need to knit a sample piece using the yarn you have chosen for your garment, so that you can check the stitch and row gauge which must measure the correct number of stitches and rows in 5 cm (2 inches).

For each Pattern in KNITKING MAGAZINE, we give you 3 tension numbers to work from and if you use the specified yarn for the garment, you should be able to get the correct stitch and row gauge using one of these numbers. Here is a very easy way to make your sample swatch and count the stitches and rows without actually counting, by using our KNITKING Converta Tape.

Supposing the Tension Numbers for the Stitch and Row Gauge are given as 5 to 7. Set the Tension Dial to the first number which is 5. With contrast waste yarn, and using the quick cast on method, cast on 60 stitches and knit 10 rows. Change to garment yarn and turn the Row Counter to 0. Knit 30 rows. Counting from each end, knit the 10th stitch on each side by hand with a small piece of contrast yarn. Leave the needles in working position and knit 30 rows (Row 60), then knit 4 rows with contrast waste yarn. Turn the Row Counter to 0 and the Tension Dial to 6 and with garment yarn, knit 30 rows. Mark the 10th stitch on each side as you did before, knit 30 rows, then 4 rows with contrast waste yarn. Turn the Row Counter to 0 and with Tension 7, repeat the above once more, ending with 10 rows of contrast waste yarn. Remove the work from the machine by passing the Slide across the needles without yarn (sometimes called 'dropping').

Pull and stretch the sample piece both lengthwise and diagonally from corner to corner, then lengthwise again. Do not count the stitches and rows immediately, but allow the sample to rest for several hours or even over night. This will allow the stitches and rows to return to their basic form.

When your sample has rested and you are ready to count the stitches and rows, the KNITKING CONVERTA TAPE will do the counting for you without any counting on your part. Use the Tape as follows:

Measure the stitches with the TAPE, BETWEEN the 40 stitches marked with contrast waste yarn. Push the SLIDE so that the LEFT EDGE lines up to this exact measurement. Now look down along side the SLIDE and find the number 40 on the TAPE. The number directly opposite on the SLIDE will be your Stitch Gauge to 5 cm (2"). To find the number of rows in 5 cm (2"), place the TAPE to measure over the 60 rows, push the SLIDE to this number with the left edge lined up, the look for the number 60 on the TAPE and directly opposite this will be the number of rows to 5 cm (2")

If you do not own a KNITKING CONVERTA TAPE, you must mark a 5 cm (2 inch) square in the center of the knitting, then count the number of stitches and rows within the square.

After Row 82 (86) [90], divide in the center, put the needles on the left into holding position and complete the right side first.

\*ON ARM SIDE, bind off 3 sts. lx, 2 sts. 4x, l st. lx.

Knit to Row 140 (148) [152] then bind off the remaining sts.

Bring the needles on the left into working position, knit l row to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 140 (148) [152] and complete the left side. Follow the instructions from \*.



#### BACK: II

Cast on 92 (98) [102] sts. with color 2 and work 22 rows Ribbing. ON EACH SIDE, bind off 14 (15)[15] sts (or you can remove them onto a stitch holder). Continue in Stockinette stitch with color 1.
Knit to Row 162 (170) [174]. ON EACH SIDE, bind off 12 (14) [15] sts. for shoulder then bind off (or put on stitch holder) the 40 (40) [42] sts. for neck.


#### POCKET TAB:

Cast on 46 sts. with color 3 and work Stockinette stitch.
ON EACH SIDE, bind off 2 sts. llx.
After Row 22, bind off the remaining 2 sts.

#### FRONT: I

Work the front the same as the back to Row 144 (150) [154]. Put half the sts. on the left into holding position and complete the right side first. \*ON NECK SIDE, bind off 5 sts. 1x, 3 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 3x, st. 6x. (Same as first size). 5 sts. 1x, 3 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 4x, 1 st. 5x]. Bind off the remaining 12 (14) [15] sts. for shoulder. Bring the needles on the left into working position, knit 1 row to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 144 (150) [154] and complete the left half. Follow the instruction from \*.



#### FRONT: I

Cast on 80 (86) [90] sts. with color 2 and work 20 rows Ribbing. Continue in Stockinette stitch with color 1. Knit to Row 36. Begin the isolated Design following the Line Drawing. (See information above the Finishing Instructions). Center the lower line on the front of garment and add as many extra color 4 patterns across the lower front as is needed for your size (See Picture and use Line Drawing as guide). When Design is completed, continue in Stockinette stitch with color 1 and mark Row 100 (100) [110] for setting in the sleeves. After Row 136 (136) [150], bind off (or remove onto waste yarn) the center 12 (14) [16] sts. for neck, put the needles on the left into holding position and complete the right side first. \*ON NECK SIDE, bind off 4 sts. 3x for all sizes. After Row 144 (144) [158], bind off (or remove onto waste yarn) the remaining 22 (24) [25] sts. Bring the needles on the left into working position, turn the Row Counter back to 136 (136) [150] and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from \*.



#### **NECKBAND:**

Sew 1 shoulder seam then pick up the sts. around the neckline and work 10 rows Ribbing with color ), Bind off,

#### BACK: II

Cast on 80 (86) [90] sts. with color 2 and work 20 rows Ribbing. Continue in Stockinette stitch with color 1. Knit to Row 100 (100) [110]. Mark each side with a bit of contras waste yarn for setting in sleeves. Knit to Row 144 (144) [158]. Bind off 22 (24) [25] sts. ON EACH SIDE for shoulder then remove the 36 (34) [40] sts. for neck onto contrast waste yarn. OR you can remove each shoulder onto different color waste yarn and put the shoulders together on the machine later.

FRONT & BACK OF PANTS PLUS TOP FRONT: Make 1, reverse 1.

650 With contrast waste yarn, cast on -640 62 sts. Knit 8 to 10 row, change -614 to garment yarn (color 1) and continue in Stockinette stitch. Counter at 0. ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. -562 every 8th row 36x, every 6th row 6x, then cast on 2 sts. 1x. Be sure to REVERSE the 2nd section.



#### FOOT SECTIONS

Hang back half of bottom of garment (held on waste yarn) on the machine. Put counter at O and work Stockinette stitch with color 1. WORK SHORT ROWS: \*ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF SLIDE, put into holding position 1 st. 10x ON EACH SIDE, position 1 st. then ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF SLIDE, bring 1 st. back into working position 10x ON EACH SIDE.\*\* Knit to Row 114. WORK THE SHORT ROWS again from \* to \*\* then knit to Row 230. Remove the sts. onto waste yarn and weave these sts.to the open sts. of leg.

To finish the buttonhole, you need only to thread the ends of yarn on lower part into tapestry needle and bring the yarn through to the right side then go down through very edge of knitting to the wrong side and secure ends. This makes buttonhole look the same on each end.

## KNITKING NEWS

#### PRACTICAL KNITTING HINTS

#### THE PICOT HEM

Bring the required number of needles into working position. Hang the cast on comb. Bring the 2nd from the left, then every other needle into 'D' or 'E' position. Push in BOTH PART BUTTONS. Counter at O. Turn Tension down 1 number lower than garment tension (for example tension 4). Knit 1 row to the LEFT. Drop cast on comb, put on weights. Release Part Buttons. Knit 1 row to the right. Knit to Row 11 - Carriage is now on the LEFT. Turn Tension up 2 numbers larger than garment tension (tension 6). Knit 1 row left to right. Turn Tension to original tension (Tension 4). Bring every other needle to 'D' position - You can use every other needle Lace Card - Set needles from left to right, transfer sts. from right to

left. Knit 12 rows. Carriage is now on the RIGHT side. Beginning with first needle on the left, bring every other needle to 'D' position. Lift the cast on comb UP and hang sts. to make hem. Turn to Garment Tension (Tension 5) and continue with garment. Be sure to put the Row Counter at the correct row AFTER making the hem.

SHAPE NECKLINE with stitches in holding position on the LEFT (Fair Isle Technique).

Write down the Row number on the Card. This is

very important.... Carriage is on the right side. With a Ravel Cord, knit each stitch on the left half BY HAND, pulling EACH STITCH all the way back to the out of work position. You will only be knitting it partly... When you have pulled each stitch back against the needle bed - they are now OUT OF WORK. Take a piece of cellaphane tape and lightly place it UNDER the Gate Pegs on the knitting - across all the stitches held on the left. The prevents the Carriage from marking the yarn on the left as you knit the right half. This is not left as you knit the right half. so important when you are using the knit side as the right side as the Carriage marks the purl side, but it is a good thing to know anyway and nice to have the purl side unmarked. You can now continue to knit and shape the right side. When the right side is completed, you are ready to knit the left half. In order to prevent problems, so it this way .... Move the Carriage to the LEFT SIDE. Carefully remove the tape, then pull on the Ravel Cord, bringing the stitches back onto the needles and into working position. Turn the Card back to the number you wrote down. Set the Card on the DOT. Set the Knob to KC. Push in BOTH PART BUTTONS. the Carriage across WITHOUT yarn. The needles are Put the Knob on the Triangle. now set properly. Release the Part Buttons. Push in the MC Button. Turn the Row Counter back to correct number (where you starter the neck or neck/shoulder shaping). Continue to knit and complete the left half.

#### WOMAN'S VEST - DK 731, Volume 15, No.

The instructions for knitting the Pattern Stitch for Vest DK 731 was omitted in the Magazine. We print it here.

#### PATTERN:

Set machine for FISHERMAN'S RIB. Cast on over every other needle on the Knitter and every other needle on the Ribber. PH Lever on H. \*Rack from 5 to 7, push Carriage across.
Rack from 7 to 5, push Carriage across. REPEAT from \* 19x more (20x in all). Then - \*\* Rack from 5 to 7, Push Carriage across. Rack from 7 to 5, push Carriage across. REPEAT from \*\* 19x more (20x in all). PATTERN IS A REPEAT FROM \* to \*\*.
