Editorial

It has taken a long time in the U.S.A. where only in the past three years has interest and enthusiasm for machine knitting really taken off. In the early 1950's we only knew the original KNITKING machines made in W. Germany and the Speed-O-Knit made in Switzerland. During the middle and late fifties, several other brands found their way onto the American market. Brother Industries and Silver Seiko of Japan started the long climb to their eminent position as the top two knitting machine manufacturers in the world today. Several other Japanese manufacturers got into the business with inferior quality machines and poor service. They, almost without exception, subsequently failed. Some European manufacturers began producing heavy and somewhat cumbersome double bed machines that failed to make a lasting impression. One American and one Germany company tried to cash in on the success of Knittax, the company which, for many years, produced KNITKING machines for the U.S. market. They actually copied the design and function patented by Knittax which inevitably got them into trouble and they too disappeared from the market.

In the 'old days' knitting machine manufacturers usually produced one, at the most two different models, their degree of advertising was minimal and our merchandising was tough. We took time on Radio and TV and we advertised in national knitting magazines. We hired and trained salesmen on a regular weekly basis and sent them into people's homes to follow up leads obtained from such advertising, but the percentage of sales per demonstration was poor and the lead cost per sale was very high. There were very few people in the U.S. with any real knowledge of machine knitting and an even lesser number who were able to teach their skills to new machine owners. At KNITKING, we have always been fortunate in regard to the skills of our teachers and machine knitting experts. As pioneers in this business, we are thrilled that our persistence and that of a few other pioneer organizations is, at last, paying off. Consumer interest and sales are increasing steadily.

Machine design today is a far cry from the hand-fed manual pattern selection machines of 30 years ago (and yet many of these old machines are still in use). Nowadays, you really have a choice: Push Button Pattern Selection, Punch Card Pattern Selection, Electronic Computer Pattern Selection, machines for fine needle knitting, standard needle knitting and for bulky knitting plus built-in charting accessories, automatic ribber to knitter transfer carriages, automatic bind off carriages, etc.

We are pleased to note and we appreciate the increasing number of knitters who are using their knowledge and their brains to develop the new skills needed to write text books, pattern books and know-how articles. Some new publications are offered in this issue. We endorse every one of them.

It was almost inevitable in this computer age that computerized programming of pattern designs would become a part of both hand and machine knitting. Already several companies are offering such services. For a fee, they will feed your measurements and other relevant information, such as stitch and row gauge, into a computer and it will produce all the information you need to knit a garment guaranteed to fit you.

The equipment available to perform this service can cost several thousand dollars...obviously more money than the average knitter can and would spend to do her own computing. We are happy to tell you that KNITKING is collaborating with a Japanese manufacturing company that has designed and is producing a computer specifically for charting machine and hand knit patterns. We expect to have it ready for the U.S. market at about the middle of this year and we expect it to retail for less than \$500.00 Watch for more information regarding this clever new machine knitting tool and some other new products and services to be offered by KNITKING.





General Instructions

THE PRINTED INSTRUCTIONS

Follow the printed instructions or use them in combination with the Charts. Where there is any question in the instructions, you have the Charts to show you how the section will look.

Be sure to READ AHEAD so that you KNOW what to do for the size you are knitting. In the shapings, where the number of stitches are the same but the number of times different, you might find shapings like this...3 sts. 1 x (2x) [3x]—so that for the first size you will bind off 3 sts. 1x, 2nd size 3 sts. 2x, 3rd size 3 sts. 3x. Sometimes the ROWS will be different for each size—so you must watch out for different row numbers.

Shoulder and neck shapings for the back section of a garment usually are shaped at the same time—so ALWAYS WATCH for the words AT THE SAME TIME.

HOLDING STITCHES ON THE LEFT SIDE WHILE SHAPING THE RIGHT SIDE

There are different ways to hold stitches on one side while completing the other side. Usually, we tell you to bind off the center sts. for neck and put the left side into holding position while completing the right side. The easiest way and really the best way for beginners is to take a piece of RAVEL CORD and hand knit the center neck stitches, pulling them back against the needle bed of machine to the "A" or out of work position. The stitches remain in the HOOKS of the needles so you are really only knitting them HALF WAY. With another color of Ravel Cord, knit the remaining sts. on the left side in the SAME WAY.

It is important to protect these held stitches in some way—so you can either hang a REVERSING BAR so that the EYES of the Bar go BETWEEN the Gate Pegs on the machine and that the UPPER TIPS of Bar only—show above the needle bed...OR the simplest way is to use a piece of 1 inch masking tape and GENTLY place it beneath the knitting—right below the gate pegs. Do NOT press the tape—only enough pressure to hold it in place. This will prevent the Carriage (or Slide) from marking the held section.

It is VERY IMPORTANT that you mark the PATTERN ROW where you divide for the split for NECK (or SHOULDER) shaping....If you are using a PUNCH CARD—MARK THE CARD—if you are using an ELECTRONIC machine, MARK THE DESIGN WINDOW. Also take note of the Row number for the division. When you are ready to work the left section, bring the HELD stitches back to B (working) position by pulling each end of the Ravel Cord GENTLY and rip it off—be sure to align all needles straight in the B or knitting position.

Now you are ready to REFER TO YOUR OWN INSTRUCTION MANUAL for your machine—to set the controls to begin knitting the left half. The neck stitches can be bound off after completing the right side or you can leave them in hold until each side is finished, then bind them off or remove them onto contrast waste yarn ready to be picked up for knitting a neckband or for other finishing.

FULL FASHION DECREASING OR INCREASING

For Stockinette stitch, use the Full Fashion method for decreasing or increasing (except for regular cap shaping on sleeves where you decrease the edge stitch).

TO DECREASE: Hang the 3rd stitch onto the 2nd stitch then move the end stitches in to fill the empty needle.

TO INCREASE: Move the 2nd end stitches 1 needle outward, then pick up the 3rd stitch from the row below and hang it onto empty needle.

THE SAMPLE SWATCH

Before you knit any garment, you must knit a sample swatch using the yarn you have chosen for your garment. If you do not get the correct Stitch and Row Gauge as given for a Pattern in KNITKING MAGAZINE—try different tensions. If you are using the specified yarn, you should be able to get the correct gauge using one of the tensions shown. If you are using other yarns, you may have to make several swatches—but the gauge is very important.


To make a sample swatch—Cast on 60 stitches with waste yarn and knit 6 rows. Mark the tension number for your sample swatch by making holes (you can do this with a Lace Carriage or by hand), 4 transfers for Tension 4, 6 transfers for Tension 6, etc. Knit 6 more rows.

Change to garment yarn and set Counter at 0. Knit 30 rows (in Stockinette stitch or Pattern stitch—according to the garment). With contrast waste yarn knit the 10th stitch FROM EACH SIDE—by hand. Knit 30 rows. Change to waste yarn and knit 12 rows. Remove the sts. from the machine by pushing the Carriage (or Slide) across without yarn.

Pull and stretch the sample swatch both lengthwise and diagonally from corner to corner, then lengthwise again. Gently block the swatch (KNITKING PRESSING CLOTHS are great for this)—or you can allow the sample to rest several

hours or even over night so that the stitches can return to their basic form. USE KNIT-KING CONVERTA TAPE for MEASURING YOUR SAMPLE (or the KNITKING INSTANT STITCH AND ROW GAUGE MEASURE).

If you use the Converta
Tape, pull out the Tape to
measure BETWEEN the 40
marked stitches in the center
of your swatch. Move the red
marker on the Tape so that it
points to 40 stitches on the
TAPE. Your stitch gauge to 2"
(5 cm) will show in the RED
WINDOW. To find the number
of rows in 2" (5 cm), place the



60 STS.

Tape to measure over the 60 rows, push the red marker to 60 on the Tape and your row gauge for 2" (5 cm) will show in the red window.

If you do not own a KNITKING CONVERTA TAPE or a Stitch and Row Measure, you must count the number of stitches and rows to 2" (5 cm) after marking a 2-inch square in the center of your knitting.

FINISHING

Gently block all sections—For PULLOVERS, JACKETS and DRESSES: Join the front to back at shoulders and sides. Sew sleeves together and set in. Hem lower edge and sleeve edges if needed. For a double neckband or armhole, band sew 1 edge to inside and 1 to the outside of neck or armhole. For a single ribbed band, sew 1 edge to the outside of neck or armhole edge. For a cardigan or jacket with buttonholes, finish buttonholes and sew on buttons.

PANTS: Join front to back at sides. Sew inside leg seams, then join to center front and back. Make hem at waistline and insert elastic. Hem lower edge of pants' legs.

All decreasing (or increasing) WITHOUT ROW NUMBER IN BOX must be made on EVERY 2nd ROW.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS: Jacket is done with Mock Rib 4xl. Bands are stockinette;
Make 2 pocket linings FIRST. Jacket Front, Back and Sleeves cast on waste yarn and ravel cord. Set up 4xl Rib with 2 sts. on each side of 0 in work. Pullover in stockinette. Neck edge single crochet 1 Row, Picot 1 Row. Skirt in stockinette.

POCKET LINING: Open Cast on with waste yarn in 4xl pattern over 44 needles (counting the out of work needles) 1 Row ravel cord. Knit 42 rows. Take off on waste yarn.
MAKE 2.



BACK:


Open cast on with waste yarn (same as pocket) over 179 (180) [199] sts. Knit I row ravel cord. With garment yarn knit in pattern to row 168 (174) [180].

SHAPE ARMHOLES: (Count out of work needles as 1 st.) bind off 6 sts. lx. 4 sts. lx, 3 sts. lx l st. every other row 2x and l st. every 4th row 5x. Knit in pattern to row 270 (280) [290].

SHAPE SHOULDERS: Before putting the needles into holding for short rows, fill in the empty needle as in simple increase, picking up the row below on the adjacent needle and hanging it on the empty needle. SEE CHART. Put into hold on each side 9 sts. 3x, 8 sts. 2x (10 sts. lx, 9 sts. 4x) 10 sts. 4x, 9 sts. 1. Take off remaining 53 (57) [61] sts. on waste yarn.


FRONTS: Make 1, Reverse 1

Cast on with open cast on 94 (99) [104] sts. 1 row ravel cord. Knit I row with garment yarn. HANG POCKET on 6 (6 1/2) [7] Rib in from Front edge. Knit side faces you. (Match out of work needles to pocket pattern). Knit to row 42. Take off on waste yarn the 44 sts. on the garment front that match the pocket. Now hang the 44 pocket sts. on the empty needles. Knit to row 168 (174) [180]. Shape armhole and start neck shaping on the same row. SHAPE ARMHOLE: (Count out of work needles as 1 st.) Bind off 6 sts. 1x, 4 sts. 1x, 3 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 1x and 1 st. 7x.
AT THE SAME TIME: NECKEDGE: 1 sts. every 3 rows 30x (1 st. 32x) [1 st. 34x.] SHOULDER: As in back, fill in empty sts. before short rowing. empty sts. before short rowing. Short row 9 sts. 3x, 8 sts. 2x (10 sts. 1x, 9 sts. 4x) [10 sts. 4x, 9 sts. 1x]. Finish at row 280 (290) [300].




SHELL:

BACK: Cast on 136 (146) [156] sts. K1 P1 Tension 0/0. Knit in rib for 36 row. Transfer ribber stitches to main bed. Change to Tension 4 - 5. Knit to row 152 (156) [160]. Increase on each side 1 st. every other row 12x. At row 176 (180) [184]. Knit straight to row 254 (262) [270]. Bind off center 42 (44) [46] sts. Put left side into hold and finish right side first. Decrease at neck edge 3 sts. 1x, and 2 sts. 1x. AT THE SAME TIME: shape shoulder in short rows. 15 sts. 1x, 13 sts. 3x (15 sts. 2x, 14 sts. 2x) [16 sts. 2x, 15 sts. 2x]. Turn counter back to row 254 (262) [270] and finish the left side with reverse shaping.



FRONT: Knit same as back to row 228 (236) [244]. Take off center sts. 20 (22) [24] on waste yarn. Put remaining sts. on left side into hold and finish the right side first. Decrease at neck edge 4 sts. lx, 3 sts. lx, 2 sts. 3x and l sts. 3x. Starting at row 254 (262) [270] shape shoulder as in Back. Return counter to 228 (236) [244] and finish the left side with reverse shaping.

FRONT HEM BANDS: Pick up (as in Neck Band) 76 (79) [84] sts. Knit 30 rows and hang hem. Bind off.

FRONT EDGE BANDS: Pick up 178 (184) [190] sts. along front edge. Knit 30 rows and hang hem. Bind off.

SLEEVE BANDS: Pick up 60 (64) [68] sts. along cuff edge. Knit 30 rows and hang hem. Bind off. SLEEVES: Make 2

Cast on with open cast on, 1 row ravel cord on 76 (80) [84] sts.
Increase 1 st. every 5th row 25x to row 168 (174) [180].

SLEEVE CAP: Bind off 6 sts. on each side, then decrease 3 sts. every other row 2x, 1 st. every other row 5x, then 1 st. every 3 rows 22x (23x) [24x] and 1 st. every row 9x (10x), [11x]. Bind off remaining sts.

POCKET BANDS: Pick up 36 sts. from waste yarn. Using Part Button Hem method knit 30 rows and hang hem. Bind off loosely. Sew in place to front.

SKIRT WITH 4 PLEATS:

General Instructions: Since there are different needles used for SHORT ROWS - MARK THE NEEDLE BED - FOR A - Use X for the holding and O for returning needles - in BLACK.

Do the same for B - only this time use RED MARKINGS. This will speed up the knitting time. Every other needle used for tuck stitch when needed. Begin and end skirt using contrast waste yarn.



ON THE LEFT, put into holding position, 10 needles, then 30 needles then 40 needles 3x. (40 sts. remain in work).


REVERSE THE SHORT ROWS - Push back into working position, 20 sts. then 40 sts. 2 x, then 35 sts. (25 sts remain). ALL NEEDLES IN WORKING POSITION, Knit 14 rows.

REPEAT FROM * 4x more.

(SEE SIZE CHART FOR CHANGES IN SIZES.)

TUCK: ON THE LEFT, put 40 sts. into holding position, knit 1 row to the left (select every other needle). Push in BOTH TUCK BUTTONS and knit 1 row to the right side. RELEASE TUCK BUTTONS. Push back 2 needles on the left into working position, knit to the left and bring I back into holding position. Knit to the SHORT ROWS FOR PLEATS: Put into holding position, 5 sts. then 15 sts. 10x (6 sts. remain). REVERSE THE SHORT ROWS: Push back into working position 3 sts. then 15 sts. 10x, 2 sts. 1 x 40 sts. remain in holding position.

TUCK: First put 2 sts. back into work - knit 1 row to the left. Bring one needle back into holding position. Select every other needle. PUSH IN BOTH TUCK BUTTONS, knit 1 row to the right. RELEASE TUCK BUTTONS. Knit 14 rows over all needles. REPEAT FROM A plus B as SHOWN ON THE CHART FOR YOUR SIZE. YOU MUST END WITH 6 ROWS OVER ALL NEEDLES, THEN REMOVE ONTO CONTRAST YARN.

Transfer stitches from ribber to main bed. Set Tension to 6, counter to 0 and begin knitting as charted.



BACK:


Cast on 168 sts. Bgin as in general instructions. Start decreasing full fashion (move 3rd stitch to 4th stitch and move sts. over). Decrease on each side l st. every 6th row 63x. Knit to row 384. Take off remaining 42 sts. on waste yarn.

LEFT AND RIGHT SIDE: Make 1 and reverse 1

Begin as in general instructions, casting on 180 sts. on both beds. Full fashion decrease as in Back, 1 st. every 6th row 63x on each side. At the same time on right side at row 154, Bind off 3 sts. And at row 240 cast on 3 sts, For the arm slit bands. At row 336 split garment in two. Take off one side on waste yarn and finish the other side. Decrease 1 st. every 3rd row 6x, then 1 st. every other row 16x. (Remember to continue edge decreases). Take 5 sts. off on waste yarn. Reset counter to 336 and finish remaining side. Take neck stitches off on waste yarn.

FRONT: Make 1 and reverse 1

Begin as before, casting on 84 sts. on both beds. Decreasing on left side 1 st. every 6th row 61x. At the same time at row 342 start neck edge shaping: Bind off 7 sts. 1x, 4 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 1x, 1 st. 4x, and 1 st. every 4th row 5x. End at row 374. Make sure you mark row 154 and row 240 for slit bands.



SEW ALL SHOULDER SEAMS TOGETHER

NECK BAND:

Cast on 126 sts. Tension 6. Knit 8 rows. Prepare Buttonhole: 4 needles in on the left side. Knit 6 rows, 1 row eyelet, Knit 6 rows, repeat buttonhole on left side. Knit 8 rows and hang hem. Hang entire neck edge, including front bands, onto needles. Knit 1 row loosely and latch off.

Cast on Kl Pl 49 sts. Knit 6 rows at Tension 3/2. Transfer ribber sts. to main machine and hang Front section with purl side facing you onto main needles (between marked rows). Latch tool bind off.



FRONT BANDS:

Buttonhole side as follows: Cast on 200 sts. at Tension 6. (Right side is the neck edge). Knit 8 rows. Prepare buttonholes (see Instruction manual or use alternate method). Buttonhole needles are 15th and 16th from the right, skip 18 needles. Alternate 2 buttonhole needles and 18 garment needles 6x (7 buttonholes). Knit 6 rows with garment yarn. I row eyelet. Knit 6 rows and repeat buttonhole row. Knit 8 rows and hang hem. Then hang Right Front of garment on to needles as armhole slit bands. Knit 1 row loosely and latch off.

Left band is 200 sts. at Tension 6. Knit 14 rows, 1 row eyelet, Knit 14 rows. Hang hem. Hang left front onto the needles as above. Knit 1 row loosely and latch off.

Row 80, change to Color 3. over 92 sts. On the LEFT decrease (1 st. every other row 1x and 1 st. every row 5x) 2x. Then 1 st. every row 4x, and 1 st. every other row 1x. On the RIGHT, short row 1 st. every other row 13x. Row 100, on the LEFT, BIND OFF 4 sts. 1x, and 5 sts. 2x. Row 106, knit 2 rows in white. 48 sts. on needles. Row 108, change to Color 1. On the LEFT, BIND OFF 3 sts., 6x, and 2 sts. 8x. On the RIGHT, short row 1 st., every other row 14x.

Sew 4 pieces together, then make waistband.

Knitking News

PRACTICAL KNITTING HINTS

We have many requests from owners of electronic computer machines asking for help in converting our Punch Card Patterns to Mylar Pattern Sheets. The method is simple. All you need is a Mylar pattern sheet and the special pen or pencil needed to mark it with. You will keep within the lines easier if you use the plastic stencil supplied in the tool kit of your machine.

All KNITKING Punch Cards have a repeat pattern on a base of 24 stitches wide.

 If the design is less than 24 sts. wide, draw a line down the middle of the card you wish to convert to the 910.

12 sts. 12 sts.

- Look for the repeat pattern. It may be all 24 sts. or 12, 8, 6, 4, 3 or 2 sts. wide. Any width and any length.
- It is wise to use the repeat pattern from the center portion of the card if it is 8 sts. or smaller.
- Draw a box around the repeat, width and length. NOW transfer the holes in your box as black squares onto your Mylar 910 sheet.
- Enter the appropriate numbers into your computer according to the Instruction Manual.
- This works for FAIRISLE and LACE patterns and can be used for Tuck and Skip stitch. If there are many holes in a Tuck card use the following method.
- 7. If it is a pattern for Tuck with many more holes than blanks, follow the same procedure to #4. After you draw your box, copy the blank spaces to the Mylar sheet as black squares and put your #6 button UP. This can save you a lot of work.

These are general rules, as in all such there are exceptions. One exception is when the pattern is a combination of Lace and Tuck, where the lacer moving from right to left sets up the Tuck row. It is then necessary to copy that Tuck Row to the Mylar sheet twice, because the electronic mechanism is set by KC and the Lacer.

SHORT ROWS WITH KA 8200 INTARSIA CARRIAGE

Refer to Page 3 of KA 8200 Intarsia Instruction Manual, Figure 4, Position $\rm E.$

Short Rows (Partial Knitting) can be done easily with Intarsia Carriage. Just bring into holding position on side opposite Carriage, the number of needles (stitches) -1 that you wish to decrease. *Lay your yarn across the needles according to pattern. Move Intarsia Carriage in same direction as yarn. Bring into holding position the inside needle (stitch) to complete the number of stitches to be decreased (automatic wrap). Now, bring into holding position opposite side from Intarsia Carriage, the number of needles -1 and REPEAT from * until Short Row shaping is complete. To put onto Waste Yarn, bring all needles into holding except the needles to be knitted on waste yarn. These are put into 'D' position with latches open. Lay waste yarn across the 'D' position needles before moving Intarsia Carriage for 10 to 12 rows. Take off.

FINISHING

General Finishing Instructions are always in each issue of KNITKING MAGAZINE. Refer to GENERAL INSTRUCTION PAGE. Here are a few more hints to help you put your garments together.

It is advisable to block all parts to size before seaming. Let dry thoroughly, then seam. Seaming can be done in many ways... sewing on the sewing machine, crocheting with a slipstitch method, hanging back on the machine with right sides together and latch tool bind off and hand weaving with right sides facing you being among the most popular. There is also a Baby Linker (See our Ads) that does a very nice job very quickly. After the garment is together, steam the seams lightly and again check your measurements.
