DK 8232 - Always smart . . . a Jumper can have many faces . . . Wear it with its own bright Pullover or with a Blouse. The Jumper is knitted in a Norwegian design using 4 colors . . . the Pullover is in Stockinette Stitch. Knit Size 10 with Subita Crepe, Sizes 12 and 14 with Beatrice.


MATERIAL: 50 gr. Balls Knitking Beatrice Crepe; 13 color 1, 1 color 2, 1 color 3, 1 color 4. TENSION: 8 to 10. GAUGE: 13 sts., 28 rows = 2". PATTERN: Holding Position Design according to the Line Drawing, using Wheel No. 6. The purl side is the right side. CAP TOP: K1, P1, Ribbing.

FINISHING: CAP: Join the section at center back, Pull up the cast-on sts, and the open sts. held on the 2 strands of yarn, tie and sew the ends in. Double the cap and fold the lower edge to the outside. SCARF: Block to the measurements given, then attach fringe to the short










Using the automatic cast-on for Ribbing, (see Practical Knitting Hints Book, Page 78) cast on 141 sts. with color 1 and work K1, P1, Ribbing. Knit to Row 14, then transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine and work the Holding Position Design. Change color after Rows 116, 124, 132, 140, 156, 164, 172, 180. After Row 282 transfer every other st. to the ribber and work 14 rows K1, P1, Ribbing. After Row 296 transfer the ribber sts. back to the main machine, then transfer the 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, etc. sts. onto a length of yarn, then the 2nd, 4th, 6th, etc. sts. onto a length of yarn. Using the automatic cast-on for Ribbing,



Cast on 120 sts. with color 1, work stockinette st. and Short Rows. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX put into holding position 40 needles after Rows 1. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX 0, 1. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX bring back into working position 10 needles after Rows 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9. ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 16, 22, 28, 34, 40, 46, 52. ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 60, 66, 72, 78, 84, 90, 96, then knit to Row 102 and bind off all 120 sts.



The instructions are the same for both sizes. PATTERN: Sleeves, Collar, Front Bands and Top of Cap: Stockinette Stitch worn on the knit side: Fronts, Back and Main Section of the Cap: Holding Position Design worn on the purl side. Use Wheel No. 6 and place the Gate Cam Release Lever to the needle heels, bring the 2nd, 4th, 6th, etc. needles into holding position, knit 1 row. Bring the needles back into working position, knit 1 row. Repeat the 2 rows for the Pattern Stitch. Push in the right Retractor Button to bring the needles back into working the Pattern Stroch. Push in the right Hetractor Button to bring the needles back into working position. Edges: Mock Ribbing, (3 needles in working position), 1 needle in the non-working position). DECREASES: Hang the 3rd st, onto the 2nd st, then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. INCREASES: Move the 2 end sts. 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st, from the row below onto the empty needle. To form the hem on the Mock Ribbing, see practical hint in the news letter.

FINISHING: Block all sections. SWEATER: Join back and front sections at sides and shoulders. Sew the sleeves together and set in. Turn under 18 rows on the sleeve edges and hem in place. Sew 1 edge of the buttonhole band to inside and 1 edge to outside of the right front edge. Sew the button band to the left front edge in the same manner. Fold the collar in half and sew the front edges together. Sew 1 edge of the collar to inside and 1 edge to outside of the neckline. Finish the buttonholes, sew on buttons. CAP: Join the section at center back. Pull up the sts. held on the length of yarn, tie and sew in the ends. Fold the ribbed edge to the outside.



Bring 47 needles into working position, hang 2 sts. onto each needle, remove the contrast waste yarn and turn the Row Counter back to 156. Work stockinette st. to Row 170, then transfer all 47 sts. onto a length of yarn.

Bring 94 needles into working position, Bring 94 needles into working position, with knit side facing you, hang 1 st. onto one needle and 2 sts. onto the following needle all the way across, remove the contrast waste yarn and turn the Row Counter back to 142. Work stockinette st. to Row 156, knit several rows with contrast waste yarn and remove the intrins from the mechine. knitting from the machine.


ROWS 37 to 142: Knit even, then replace the Gate Cam Release Lever, knit several rows with contrast waste yarn and remove the knitting from the machine.

ROWS 0 to 36: Knit even, then form the hem, place the Gate Cam Release Lever to the needle heels and work the Pattern Stitch over ALL 141 needles.


Bring 141 needles into working position, put every 4th needle into the non-working position and with color 2 cast on for the Mock Ribbing.



Cast on 144 sts. with color 1 and work stockinette st. Make buttonholes after Rows 7 and 21 over the 8th-12th, 33rd-38th, 58th-63rd, 83rd-88th, 108th-113th, 133rd-138th sts. counting from the left side. After Row 28 bind off all sts. Work the button band the same, but omit the buttonholes.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 210, 211, 212, 213; 2 sts. after Rows 214, 215, 216, 217, 218, 219, 220, 221. ON EACH SIDE, hang the 1st st. onto the 2nd st. after Rows the 1st st. onto the 2nd st. after Rows 222, 224, 226, 228, 230, 232, 234, 236, 238, 240, 242, 244, 246, 248, 250, 252, 254, 256, 258. ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Rows 260, 261; 4 sts. after Rows 262, 263; 6 sts. after Rows 264, 265; 12 sts. after Row 266.


ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 36, 46, 56, 66, 74, (change color after Row 78), 82, 90, 98, 106, 114, 122, 130, 138, (change color after Row 138), 146, 154, 162, 170, 178, 186, 194, (change color after Row 198), 202, then knit to Row 210.

ROWS 0 to 36: Knit even.

Cast on 60 sts. with color 2 and work stockinette st.

Work the second front section with R reverse shapings. Cast on the same way 408 as for the first front section, knit the 206 band, form the hem, knit 1 row in band, form the field, kill the Row PATTERN to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 56. (The Cam Box will be on the LEFT side at even numbered rows)

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Rows 351, 353; 1 st. after Rows 355, 357, 359, 361, 363, 365, 369, 373, 381, 385. For SHOULDER bind off 2 sts. after Rows 386, 388, 390, 392, 394, 396, 398, 400, 402; 3 sts. after Rows 404, 406, 408.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 260; 2 sts. after Rows 264, 268, 272; 1 st. after Rows 276, 280, 284, then knit to Row 351.

ROWS 57 to 260: Knit even.

ROWS 0 to 56: Knit even, then form the hem, place the Gate Cam Release Lever to the needle heels and work the Pattern Stitch over ALL 55 needles.

Bring 55 needles into working position, put every 4th needle into the non-working position and with color 1 cast on for the Mock Ribbing.



The instructions are the same for all sizes, PATTERN: Pullover: Stockinette Stitch. Stockinette Stitch with repeated color stripes as marked in the Diagrams. ALL Edges: K1, P1, Ribbing. INCREASES: Move the 2 end sts. 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle.

FINISHING: Block all sections, PULLOVER: Join the front and back section at sides and shoulders. Sew the sleeves together and set in. Join the short ends of the collar, then sew 1 edge of the collar to inside and 1 edge to the outside of the neckline. VEST: Join the back and front sections at sides. Sew the front bands in place. Join the neckband sections at center back and the armhole bands at short ends. Sew the back portion of the neckband to the back neckline. Beginning on the back shoulders, join about 4% of the armhole bands to 4% of the front portion of the neckband. (See picture). Sew the remainder of the bands in place.





Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 236 and com-plete the left half. Follow the instructions from\*

\*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 236 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING), 237 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING), 237, (ODB ROWS = NECK SHAPING), 238, 239, 240, 241; 4 sts. after Row 242; 2 sts. after Row 243; 4 sts. after Row 244; 2 sts. after Row 245; 4 sts. after Row 246; 2 sts. after Row 247; 4 sts. after Rows 248, 250,

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 162, 163, 164, 165; 2 sts. after Rows 166, 167, 168, 169, 170, 171; 1 st. after Rows 172, 173, 174, 175, 176, 177, 178, 179, then knit to Row 236, bind off the center 22 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first. (For the Front Section knit to first. (For ROW 210).

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 70, 88, 106, 124, 142, then knit to Row 162.

ROWS 27 to 70: Knit even.


ROWS 0 to 26: Knit even, then change to stockinette st.

Cast on 132 sts. with color 1 and work K1, P1, Ribbing.









Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 210 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from\*.

\*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 211, 213; 2 sts. after Rows 215, 217; 1 st. after Rows 219, 221, 223, 225, 227. For SHOULDER bind off 3 sts. after Rows 236, 238, 240; 5 sts. after Rows 242, 244, 246, 248, 250.

Work the front section the same as the back section to ROW 210, then bind off the center 22 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

\*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Row 394 (EVEN ROWS = 408 SHOULDER SHAPING); 3 sts. after Row 395 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAP-394 ING); 2 sts. after Row 396; 3 sts. after 386 Row 397; 2 sts. after Rows 398, 399, 400, 401, 402, 403; 3 sts. after Rows 404, 406, 408 404, 406, 408.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Rows 386, 387, 388, 389, 390, 391, 392, 393, then knit to Row 394, bind off the center 13 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 260, 261; 2 sts. after Rows 264, 265, 268, 269, 272, 273; 1 st. after Rows 276, 277, 280, 281, 284, 285, then knit to Row 386.

ROWS 57 to 260: Knit even.

ROWS 0 to 56: Knit even, then form the hem, place the Gate Cam Release Lever to the needle heels and work the Pattern Stitch over ALL 117 needles

Bring 117 needles into working position, put every 4th needle into the non-working position and with color 1 cast on for the Mock Ribbing.

Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 186 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from .


\*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 187, 189; 3 sts. after Rows 191, 193, 195; 2 sts. after Rows 197, 199, 201; 1 st. after Rows 203, 205, 207, 209, 211, 213. After Row 216 hang the remaining 3 sts. together, then bind




ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 32, 44, 56, 68, 80, 92, 104, 116, then knit to Row 124.


ROWS 0 to 32: Knit even, then change to stockinette st. and work the repeated color stripes as marked in the Diagram.

Cast on 128 sts. with color 1 and work K1, P1, Ribbing.










Cast on 97 sts. with color 1 and work K1, P1, Ribbing. Make buttonholes after Row 5 over the 9th-12th, 26th-29th, 43rd-46th, 60th-63rd, 77th-80th sts. counting from the left side. After Row 10 bind off all sts. Work the button band the same, but omit the buttonholes.



Cast on 147 sts, with color 1 and work 10 rows K1, P1, Ribbing, then bind off

Work the second front section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to left. (Cam Box will be on the LEFT side at Row 0)

We had a fantastic display of gorgeous garments, many of which have appeared in KNITKING MAGAZINE plus several that had never been seen before ... Our display was so impressive that may fair goers refused to believe that such lavish garments were made on KNITKING home knitting machines... Not one of the garments displayed cost more than \$25.00 to produce, and yet, we could have sold some of them a hundred times over at more than ten times their production cost... A pink pantsuit designed by Betty Atkin created great desire in the hearts of many women visitors and one husband visited our booth several times, offering up to \$300.00 for the suit ... His wife apparently had talked about it so much, he wanted to buy it for her... Unfortunately, it, like all our display garments, was not for sale.

Your Editor, Henry Atkin and his wife Betty take time out from their busy schedule each year to spend time (average 14 hours daily) meeting old and new friends... The fund of knowledge gained each time is invaluable in future plans to satisfy the likes and demands of our readers. We get to meet several hundred readers at the Fair and it is always a pleasure to talk with them.

We continue to be amazed at the number of people who buy knitting machines from catalogues at a wide range of prices... Sight unseen and without the slightest knowledge of what to do with them when they take delivery... Many never even get the first row cast on... they cannot understand the very poor translations into English, of some of the Instructions Manuals (and having studied many of these manuals, we can understand why)... It is unfortunate that as a result of one bad experience, many would be knitting machine owners are permanently turned off... This is one of the reasons why we always make exceptional trade-in offers to such people... knowing once they own a KNITKING product, we stand an excellent chance of keeping them as customers and of satisfying their continuing needs.

#### OUR READERS WRITE

We are no longer surprised at requests for subscriptions to KNITKING MAGAZINE received from HAND KNITTERS... They do not own a machine (don't know what they are missing) but they tell us they adore our Patterns and knit them by hand... But... we are surprised at requests from our Machine Knitters to change hand knit patterns into machine knits. If you are a hand knitter as well as a machine knitter, you will know that many hand knit patterns can be adapted to machine knitting. However... we wonder why you would want to do this. We think we give you a fantastic choice of patterns to knit by machine. Many times when you see a hand knit pattern, you can find a similar one in our magazine and with a small amount of adjustment you can produce a garment almost exactly like the hand knit one. If you are determined to change a hand knit into a machine knit...

you will note that there is always a stitch gauge given and you must get this stitch gauge regardless of what machine tension you use (keep trying different tensions) - but very rarely is a row gauge given because when you are hand knitting. you can use a ruler to measure off the length needed. So ... about the only thing you need to do in order to make a hand knit by machine is to get the stitch gauge and find the row gauge. When the pattern says to knit 10" up to the armhole, you will multiply the number of rows to 1" by 10. You will need to work this out for the length of the armhole, the depth for the neck and shoulder shaping and the length of sleeve and sleeve cap. Some hand knitters keep track of the rows anyway... they put a hand knit Row Counter on the end of their needles and keep track by turning the numbers after each two rows. This way they are sure the rows will match when they put the garment together. You can always substitute an easy to knit machine Pattern Stitch for a complicated hand knit pattern, but you still have to get the correct stitch gauge given, jand know the row gauge.

#### FINISHING INSTRUCTIONS

We occasionally receive letters from readers complaining that we do not give adequate finishing instructions. Actually, we think we give more than enough instructions ... We do not have the space in the magazine to cover every little detail such as the exact spot of where to sew a pocket on, the exact size of button or zipper to use. We tell you the size of zipper we use on a garment and if you block your garment and finish it as we say, this is the size you will need. But-tonholes can be finished in different ways and each person should use the button size that fits their finished buttonhole and that looks good to them. You must use your own judgement for some things. The placement of a pocket is a personal thing and you can always see the photograph of garment on the model in our magazine. Explicit instructions for knitting ... finishing ... sewing on collars and bands ... plus all kinds of hints and helps... is given in our "Practical Knitting Hints" book. The cost is \$2.95 plus 40¢ shipping. If you do not have one, it is worth every penny of its cost. You will want to read it through from cover to cover, then you can always find special information by checking the Index.

#### PRACTICAL KNITTING HINTS

#### MOCK RIBBING

When we need a band for the lower edge of a sweater or a jacket... for sleeve edges and necklines etc... most of the time a true ribbed band is called for. A true rib is always made by using the Ribber in combination with the main Machine. There are times however, when a pattern calls for a MOCK RIB and this is made using the main machine only. A Mock Rib is always knitted with certain needles out of work and a hem must be formed by hanging the cast-on stitches back onto the machine to form a double hem. Those of you who do not own a KNITKING machine with the Coordinated Ribber can in most cases, use the Mock Rib in place of the true rib bands on any garment. When making a garment in stockinette stitch, a Mock Rib should be made using one or two tension settings tighter than the tension used for the

main section of a garment. If a Pattern stitch is used for the main section as for the Sweater and Hat DP 8225 in this issue, you need not use a different tension for the Mock Ribbing. The most important part of a Mock Rib is in hanging the hem. If you do not do this properly, you will end up with holes that will spoil the look of your garment.

In Pattern No. DP 8225, the Sweater Instructions tell you to hang the hem after Row 56. To do this first hang each of the group of 3 cast-on stitches onto the machine, being sure to leave these stitches in front of the latches of the needles. (If you have a machine other than a KNITKING machine, you must place the stitches that are already on the machine behind the latches before hanging the cast-on stitches).

Now you must fill the empty needles by taking the loop formed by each 3rd stitch (even though it is already hung onto the 3rd stitch) and with the eye end of a tool, pick up the loop, give it a twist and hang the newly formed stitch onto the empty needle. It does not matter which way you twist the stitch just so that you twist all of them in the same direction. Leave the newly formed stitch IN FRONT of the latches. Now knit these stitches through the stitches which are behind the latches. KNITKING machine owners knit the stitches through in the following manner... Take the yarn out of the feed finger and hang it to the side, push back the right Cam Control Button (the

Cam Box is at the right) and knit two rows without yarn. Return the Cam Control Button, turn the Row Counter back to 56 and continue with your pattern.

When you have completed the garment section and removed it from the machine, take a ruler and push it through the formed hem, then pull downward - hard - so that the stitches form a rib look. When you block a Mock Rib such as this one where 3 needles are on the main machine then a needles out of work, etc. stretch the hem downward and push the rib together, pin, then with iron held high (DO NOT PRESS) allow the steam to penetrate. Leave the section on the board until it is thoroughly dry. Remember when working with synthetic yarns, be very careful to use steam only, as the iron will ruin the yarn. (An Iron-All sold by KNITKING will save you many headaches).

If you have any doubts, you can place a wet cloth over the ribbing, allow it to stand for several hours then remove the cloth and allow the section to dry. You would use this same method for any Mock Ribbing except a one and one Mock Rib. When you have one needle on the main machine and one out of work for a 1 x 1 rib, if you pulled down hard on the hem, the stitches could easily go together so that you lose the ribbed look... In this case, you must use 2 or 3 tensions tighter for your knitting, then block the hem by stretching the knitting in width instead of length so it looks like a rib.

### NOTES TO KNIT BY . . .

#### STITCH AND ROW GAUGE

KNIT A SAMPLE SWATCH . . . before you begin to knit any garment . . . for this is the MOST IMPORTANT STEP toward the correct size and the proper fit of any garment you wish to make. You MUST use the SAME YARN for your sample swatch that you will use to knit your garment and your sample swatch must be knitted large enough and using several different tension numbers on your machine. When you have done this, then you can determine the number of stitches and the number of rows in a two-inch measure. KNITKING MAGAZINE PATTERNS give you 3 tensions to try and one of them should give you the correct stitch and row gauge if you are using the yarn we recommend or a similar weight yarn. Here is the way to make your sample swatch.

Cast on over a sufficient number of needles to produce a swatch at least 4 inches wide. (If the pattern calls for 16 stitches to 2", then  $16 \times 2 = 32$  stitches to cast on). Now knit 4 inches of rows at the first suggested tension number. (If the pattern calls for 22 rows to 2",  $22 \times 2 = 44$  rows to knit). Knit 2 rows using a contrast color, change to the next higher tension and with garment yarn knit another 4", knit 2 rows with contrast color, change to the 3rd higher tension and knit another 4" and then bind off.

Roll the swatch into a cylinder over its length and pull on both ends, unroll it and stretch it diagonally by pulling on the four corners. Allow the swatch to rest and settle (preferably overnight) and then using a stitch gauge or a ruler, count the number of stitches over a 2" width, then the number of rows over a 2" length in EACH of the 3 tensions. Select the tension number that produces the stitches and rows called for in the pattern. If none of them are correct, you are most likely using the wrong weight of yarn.

#### READING OF CHARTS

You will notice the instructions start at the bottom of the Chart, and work UP. Follow the charts exactly as written and providing your sample stitch and row gauge is correct, your garment will come out the right size. Please remember that the section of garment as it is knitted on the machine, faces the same way as the Charts are in this magazine. Where two front pieces are needed, (or any other part of a garment that needs two sections) only one section is normally shown and the second section is usually made with reverse shaping. Set in sleeves are usually identical, but raglan sleeves have to be knitted with reverse shaping for the second sleeve.

#### READING OF SYMBOLS

To simplify Pattern Knitting, we use Symbols in the Line Drawings and the Chart Diagrams. In the Line Drawings the symbols are shown and are to be read as you look at them while knitting a garment. For instance, if a Purl stitch faces you, the Purl stitch Symbol is shown; if a knit stitch faces you (as when using the Ribber) then this Symbol is shown. The Symbol at the top of the Line Drawing is the center of the garment section and you use this as a guide for setting up the needles.

The following Symbols are used for Eyelet Designs in the Line Drawings and also for Full Fashion shaping on the Charts. The Line Drawings have row numbers on the right side. Missing Row numbers are always knitted straight or plain.

In Holding Position Designs

selected needles are pushed into holding position for the stated number of rows. The numbers of rows appear at the right of the Line Drawings; Example: 1–4 means knit Rows 1 to 4; 5 to 7 means knit Rows 5 to 7, etc. This same Symbol is also shown on the Charts and is used for putting needles into holding position for Short Rows. The

Symbol on the Charts is used to put needles back into working position when knitting Short Rows.

A number in a box stands for the number of rows to be knitted between shapings. Make shaping first, then knit the necessary number of rows. If for instance it reads:

1 st. 8 x

6 1 st. 10 x

As you will be reading the instructions from the bottom up, here is the way you will follow them: . . . Decrease or increase (depending on the direction of the garment outline) 1 st. at the row where the shaping begins, then knit 8 rows, make the next decrease, then knit 8 rows, until you have decreased (or increased) 1 st. 10 x and you have knitted 8 rows after each decrease (or increase) (1 st. 10 x +8 rows 10 x). Now begin the first decrease (or increase) for the shaping (which has to be made 8 x) in every 6th row. Decrease (or increase) 1 st. first, then knit 6 rows until you have decreased 1 st. 6 x and after each decrease (or increase) have knitted 6 rows (1 st. 8 x + 6 rows 8 x).

Where shapings are given without a boxed number as on most armholes, necklines, etc., make the shapings on every second row (on each side of course).
