DP 8119 — Knit this raglan Pullover in an evening ... and finish it the next day. Take note of the deep ribbing used for the bands . . . the new look for the season. For Size 8, use KNITKING Beatrice; Size 10, Crocus Crepe; Size 14, Mohana.



HP 3684 — Stripe a Pullover Shirt for your Man. It's quickly knitted in stockinette stitch with a 1 x 1 Rib for the bands. Size 36 is made with KNIT-KING Subita Crepe 2 x 3; Size 38 and Size 42 with Regia.


DK 8120 — A Norwegian Design with stripes to accent the waistline is used on the lower section of this lovely Dress . . . the bodice is stockinette stitch. Top it with a Ribbed Jacket . . . and wear it through all seasons. Size 10 is knitted with KNITKING Beatrice; Sizes 12 and 16 with Regia.

DK8123 - Midi-mad . . . a Skirt and a Blouse in the still popular midi length. The skirt is in stockinette stitch, the blouse in a lovely Holding Position Design. For a Size 10, use KNITKING Beatrice; Size 12 and Size 16, Amore.

DK 8118 — Another lovely two-piece Midi length dress has a charming Eyelet Design border on the Skirt and on the Top. Knit Size 10 and Size 12 with KNITKING Amore.





KK 5392- Boys or Girls can wear a striped Pullover and a warm Jacket . . . (be sure to change the buttonhole side if knitting the Jacket for a Girl). Simple Stockinette stitch for both . . . with ribbed bands. The Jacket is worn on the purl side. Size 10 and Size 12 . . . use KNITKING Flamingo Dralon.



The instructionas are the same for all sizes, PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch with a contrast color center panel. CENTER BAND, BELT and Sleeve EDGES: K1, P1, Ribbing. DECREASES: Hang the 3rd st. onto the 2nd st. then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. Begin the DARTS on the back section by hanging the sts. together as marked in the Diagram, then move the sts. together to fill the empty needles. The following decreases, then increases for the Darts lie directly above. INCREASES: Move the 2 end sts. 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle. To form the hem, hang the cast-on sts. back onto the machine behind the latches, then knit the following row with 1 to 2 tension settings higher. (If you prefer to sew the hem, omit forming the hem on the machine).

FINISHING: Block all sections. Sew the front band sections together, then sew the band to FINISHING: Block all sections. Sew the front band sections together, then sew the band to the center panel, leaving the left edge at upper front opening free. Weave the center panel to the side panels, 1 st. in from each edge. Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. Sew the sleeves together and set in. If you did not form the hem on the machine, turn under 18 rows on lower edge and hem to wrong side. Fold the lower edge of the sleeves 1½" to the outside and hold in place with a button. (See picture). Fold the collar in half and sew the open side edges together. Sew 1 edge of collar to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline. Work 1 row of single crochet around the front opening, then close the opening with a snap. Sew buttons to the center band and a buckle to the belt.







ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 478, 479, 480, 481, then knit to Row 482, bind off the center 12 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 386, 387, 388, 389, 390, 391; 2 sts. after Rows 392, 393, 394, 395, 396, 397, 398, 399; 1 st. after Rows 400, 401, 402, 403, 404, 405, 406, 407, then knit to Row 478.

Increase 2 sts. for EACH DART after Rows in (). ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 312, (312), 322, (330), 332, 342, (348), 352, 362, (366), then knit to Row 386

Decrease 2 sts. for EACH DART after Rows in (). ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 64, 80, 96, 112, 128, 144, 160, 174, 188, 202. 216, 224, 232, 240, (240), 248, 256, (258), 264, 270, 276, (276), 282, 288, 294, (294) then knit to Row 312.



Cast on 61 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing.



Cast on 147 sts. and work 44 rows K1, P1, Ribbing, then bind off all sts.



Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 216 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from*.

*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 216 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 5 sts. after Row 217 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 4 sts. after Row 218; 5 sts. after Row 219; 4 sts. after Row 220; 3 sts. after Row 221; 4 sts. after Row 222; 3 sts. after Row 223; 4 sts. after Rows 224, 226, 228.


ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 140, 141; 3 sts. after Rows 142, 143, 144, 145; 2 sts. after Rows 146, 147, 148, 149, 150, 151; 1 st. after Rows 152, 153, 154, 155, 156, 157, then knit to Row 216, bind off the center 19 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 48, 70, 92, 114, then knit to Row 140.


ROWS 19 to 48: Knit even.

ROWS 0 to 18: Knit even, then change to stockinette st.


Cast on 137 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing.







Begin the Cable Design by crossing 4 sts. on each side of the center st. as shown. Use 2 double transfer tools, Place the 4 sts. from the right side of the center st. onto the 2 tools. Now place the 2 sts. from the left tool onto the needles that were occupied by the sts. on the right tool, then place the 2 sts. from the right tool onto the 2 empty needles. On the left side of the center st. place the 4 sts. onto the 2 tools, then place the 2 sts. from the right tool onto the needles that were occupied by the sts. on the left tool and the sts. from the left tool onto the 2 empty needles. Repeat after every 6 rows. After 24 rows, begin a new Cable Stripe on EACH SIDE, then knit 24 rows and again begin a new Cable Stripe ON EACH SIDE.



Bring the needles on the left side into working position, knit 1 row in PAT-TERN to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 426 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from*.

*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Row 426 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 3 sts. after Row 427 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAP-ING); 2 sts. after Row 428; 3 sts. after Row 429; 2 sts. after Rows 430, 431, 432, 433, 434, 435, 436, 437, 438, 439, 440, 442, 444; 3 sts. after Row 446.


ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 306, 307; 2 sts. after Rows 308, 309, 310, 311, 312, 313; 1 st. after Rows 314, 315, 316, 317, 318, 319, 320, 321, then knit to Row 426, bind off the center 13 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first. (For the Front Section knit to ROW 380).



ROWS 0 to 16: Knit even, then begin the Holding Position Design. Set up the pattern manually, knit 1 row, then use the needle shifter to change the position of the needles after every row knitted.

Cast on 117 sts. with color 1 and work stockinette st.

The instructions are the same for all sizes. PATTERN: Front and Back Section: Holding Position Design according to Line Drawing No. 1, worn on the knit side. Set up the pattern manually, then change the position of the needles with the needle shifter. Sleeve: Stockinette manually, then change the position of the needles with the needle shifter. Siever, Street and a Norwegian Design according to Line Drawing No. 2, or use JAC 40 and Pattern No. 459. Each row in the Norwegian Design is counted as 1 row in the Gauge and Instructions, but several movement of the Cam Box are needed to complete 1 row. Sleeve EDGES and COLLAR: K1, P1, Ribbing. CAP: Stockinette Stitch, Holding Position Design and Norwegian Design. INCREASES: Place the end st. from the row below onto the next

FINISHING: Block all sections. PULLOVER: Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. Sew the sleeves together and set in. Turn under 16 rows on lower edge and hem to wrong side. Join short ends of collar, then sew the collar to neckline and fold over to outside. CAP: Weave the section together at center back, 1 st. in from each edge. Turn under 26 rows on lower edge and hem to wrong side. Pull the sts. held on yarn together, then sew the ends in


Bring the needles on the left side into working position, knit 1 row in PAT-TERN to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 380 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from*


*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Row 381; 2 sts. after Rows 383, 385, 387; 1 st. after Rows 389, 391, 393, 395, 399, 403, 407, 411. For SHOULDER bind off 2 sts. after Rows 426, 428, 430, 432, 434, 436, 438, 440, 442, 444; 3 sts. after Row 446.


Work the front section the same as the back section to ROW 380, then bind off the center 11 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.



Cast on 151 sts. with color 2 and work stockinette st. to Row 32, then, beginning with ROW 7 of the Line Drawing or JAC 40 card work 13 rows of the Norwegian Design. After Row 45 change to color 2 and work 6 rows stockinette st. After Row 51 change to color 1 and work the Holding Position Design. After Row 110 change to stockinette st. and knit 1 row. Now knit several rows with waste yarn, then remove the knitting from the machine. Decrease 50 sts. by hanging the CAP sts. back onto the machine as follows: First needle 1 st., second needle 2 sts., third needle 1 st., fourth needle 2 sts., etc. Remove the waste yarn and knit to Row 118, then knit several rows with contrast waste yarn, remove the knitting from the machine and decrease 50 sts. by hanging machine and decrease 50 sts, by hanging 2 sts, onto each needle. Remove the waste yarn and knit to Row 126. Remove the sts. from the machine by transfering first the 1st, 3rd, 5th etc. sts. onto a length of yarn, then the 2nd, 4th, 6th sts. onto a second length of yarn. (Use the ribber transfer needle to thread







Cast on 157 sts. with color 1 and work 78 rows K1, P1, Ribbing, then bind off all sts

The instructions are the same for all sizes. PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch and a Holding Position Design with Cables on the front section according to the Line Drawing. EDGES: K1, P1, Ribbing, INCREASES: Move the 2 end sts. 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle. NECKLINE DECREASES: Hang the 20th st. on NECK SIDE onto the 19th st., then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle.

FINISHING: Block all sections. Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. Sew the sleeves together and set in. Weave the open sts. of the facing together, then sew the facing to back neckline. Turn under 9 sts. at front edges and around neckline and hem to wrong side. Finish the buttonholes, sew on buttons.



ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Rows 184 185; 3 sts. after Rows 186, 187, 188, 189; 2 sts. after Rows 190, 191, 192, 193, 194, 195, 196, 197. ON EACH SIDE, hang the 1st st. onto the 2nd st. after Rows 198, 200, 202, 204, 206, 208, 210, 212, 214, 216, 218, 220, 222, 224, 226, 228, 230, 232, 234. ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Rows 236, 237, 238, 239; 3 sts. after Rows 240, 241, 242, 243; 4 sts. after Rows 244, 245; 13 sts. after Row 246.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 22, 30, 38, 46, 54, 62, 70, 78, 86, 94, 100, 106, 112, 118, 124, 130, 136, 142, 148, 154, 160, 166, 172, 178, then knit to Row 184.

ROWS 0 to 22: Knit even, then change to stockinette st.

Cast on 69 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing.

Hang the 76 sts. from the stitch holder back onto the machine. On the RIGHT side of these sts. cast on 18 sts. using a separate length of yarn. With the Cam Box on the LEFT side and Row Counter at 98 complete the left half. Follow the instructions from*. Omit the button-

ON NECK SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 204, 208, 212, 216, 220, 224, 228, 232, 236, 240, 244, 248, 252, 256, 260, 264, 268, then again after Rows in (). For SHOULDER bind off 4 sts. after Rows 270, 272, (272), 274, 276, (276), 278, 280, (280), 282; 5 sts. after Row 284. Over the remaining 18 sts. (FACING) knit to Row 284, then put these sts. onto a stitch holder.

Make buttonholes after Row in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 6 sts. after Row 182; 3 sts. after Rows 184, 186; 2 sts. after Rows 188, 190, (190), 192, 194; 1 st. after Rows 196, then knit to ROW 198 and begin working the Holding Position Design according to PATTERN 1. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX decrease 1 st. after Row in (). Continue to decrease 1 st. ON CAM BOX SIDE after Rows 198, 200, (200), 202.

Make buttonholes over the 2nd-5th and 14th-17th sts. counting from the left side after Row 112, then again after Rows in (). Continue to increase 1 st. ON CAM BOX SIDE after Rows 120, (138), 142, then knit to Row 145 and knit Short Rows for the DART. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX put into holding position 4 needles after Rows 145, 147, 149, 151, 153, 155, 157, 159, 161. After Row 163 bring all needles back into working position, make buttonholes after Row 164 AND begin the Cable Design according to PATTERN 2 after Row 164. Knit to Row 182.



ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 54, 76, 98, but do not knit after the last increases. On the left side, put 76 sts. onto a stitch holder. On the left side of the 85 sts. left on the machine cast on 9 sts. (Use a separate length of yarn) and complete the right half first.



Using 2 single transfer tools, place the 1st st. onto one tool and the 2nd st. onto the other tool. Now hang the 1st st. onto the 2nd needle and the 2nd st. onto the 1st needle. Cross the 4th with the 5th st. the 12th with the 13th and the 15th with the 16th sts. in the same manner. Knit 2 rows. Now cross the 2nd and 3rd, the 5th and 6th, the 11th and 12th and the 14th and 15th sts., then knit 2 rows. Follow the Line Drawing for the following crossing of the sts. After Row 198 repeat PATTERN 1. (Remember to push in the right retractor button and to put the empty needles into the non-working position after having the appropriate sts. transfered to the neighboring needles.)



Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 252 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from*.

*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 252 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 3 sts. after Row 253 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING): 4 sts. after Row 254; 3 sts. after Row 255; 4 sts. after Row 256; 3 sts. after Row 257; 4 sts. after Row 258; 2 sts. after Row 259; 4 sts. after Row 260; 2 sts. after Row 261; 4 sts. after Row 262; 2 sts. after Row 263; 4 sts. after Row 264; 5 sts. after Row 266.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 6 sts. after Rows 164, 165; 3 sts. after Rows 166, 167, 168, 169; 2 sts. after Rows 170, 171, 172, 173, 174, 175, 176, 177; 1 st. after Rows 178, 179, 180, 181, 182, 183, 184, 185, then knit to Row 252, bind off the center 21 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 54, 76, 98, 120, 142, then knit to Row 164.

ROWS 17 to 54: Knit even,

ROWS 0 to 14: Knit even, then change to stockinette st.

Cast on 155 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing.



BODY and FACE: With Red, cast on 90 sts. Knit 1 row to the left side. Put 45 needles on the right side into holding position and work short rows over the 45 needles on the left. ON SAME SIDE as CAM BOX, put 2 needles into holding position beginning next 17 rows (do not wrap yarn). (11 needles remain in work). Wrap the yarn around the inside needle this one time, bring all the needles on the right into working position and knit 1 row. Knit even to Row 50, then begin the color stripes. *2 rows Blue, 2 rows Yellow, 2 rows Red and REPEAT from * ending with 2 rows Blue. (Row 76). Change to Pink yarn and knit to Row 94. Put 45 needles on the LEFT side into holding position and work short rows over the 45 needles on the right side. ON SAME SIDE AS CAM BOX, put *1 needle into holding position beginning next 2 rows and REPEAT from * till 13 remain in work (Row 116). Wrap the yarn this one time and bring back into working position *1 needle OPPOSITE CAM BOX beginning next 2 rows, 2 needles beginning next 2 rows and REPEAT from * till all are in work (Row 138). Knit 1 row to the left side over all the needles then remove work onto contrast waste yarn.

LEGS: With Red, cast on 22 sts. Knit even to Row 66. Change to Blue and knit 10 rows even then put 11 needles on the left side into holding position and work short rows over the 11 needles on the right side as you did before. *Put 1 needle same side as Cam Box into holding position beginning next 8 rows (4 x on each side). Wrap the yarn this one time and bring back into working position, 1 needle OPPOSITE CAM BOX beginning each row till all are in work*. Knit 4 rows even, then REPEAT the short rows from * to *. After Row 112, bring all the needles into working position and remove onto contrast waste yarn.





Knit the second leg section with reverse shaping, casting on from right to left and working the foot section on the left side. (Cam Box will be on the left at Row 0).

ARMS: With Blue, cast on 22 sts. and work color stripes *2 rows Blue, 2 rows Yellow, 2 rows Red and REPEAT from * ending with 2 rows Blue (Row 56). Change to Pink and knit even to Row 64. Put 11 needles on the LEFT side into holding position and work short rows over the 11 needles on the right as you did before. HAT: With Blue, cast on 73 sts. Knit 10 rows, then hang hem. Work color stripes -2 rows Red, 2 rows Yellow, 2 rows Blue to Row 30. Change to Red and knit 2 rows. ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. every other row to Row 44, then ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. EVERY ROW to Row 74. Bind off 3 sts.

MATERIAL: 3 - 50 gr. balls KNITKING Subita Crepe 2 x 3. TENSION: 4 to 6. GAUGE: 17 sts., 23 rows 2".

BACK: Cast on 131 sts.



ROWS 1-16: Work even, then hang the cast on sts. back onto the machine behind the latches to form the hem. (Knit the next row 2 tension settings higher).

ROWS 17-162: Work even.

ROWS 163-174: SHOULDER SHAP-ING: Work short rows. Put 5 needles opposite Cam Box into holding position beginning next 12 rows. After Row 174, knit about 10 rows with contrast waste yarn over the center 71 sts., then remove these sts. from the machine. Move the Cam Box to the right side, bring the right side shoulder needles back into working position and knit 1 row with tension 10 over these needles, then crochet these sts. off. Crochet the left shoulder sts. off in the same manner.

FRONT: The front is worked the same as the back to Row 140.

ROWS 141-174: NECK and SHOULDER SHAPING: Work short rows. Put all the needles to the left of the 0 needle into holding position (close these needle latches for identification) and complete the right half first. After Row 140, then on every other row on neck side, put 7 needles 1 x, 4 needles 1 x, 3 needles 1 x 2 needles 8 x and 1 needle 6 x into holding position, and AT THE SAME TIME, after Row 163, then on every other row, SHAPE SHOULDER by putting 5 heedles 5 x into holding position. After Row 173, put the last 5 shoulder needles into holding position, move the Cam Box to the right side, bring the shoulder needles into working position and knit 1 row with tension 10 over these needles, then crochet these sts. off. Move the Cam Box to the left side, bring all the sts. to the left of the 0 needle back into working position, turn the Row Counter back to 140 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from Rows 141 to 174 but the first time put only 6 needles into holding position. After the left side shoulder sts. are bound off, knit several rows with a contrast waste yarn over the center 71 sts., then remove the sts. from the machine.







ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, bring back into working position, 2 needles after Rows 2, 3, 4, 5; 1 needle after Rows 6, 7.*



Beginning with the 0 needle. cast on 18 sts. to the right. Put the Counter at 0. REPEAT the instructions from * to * and from ** to **. Do not break yarn. Put these needles into holding position and move the Cam Box to the left side. Bring the center 10 needles into working position and with long end of yarn, cast on over these needles then put them into holding position. Bring the 23 needles on the right side into working position and with end of yarn, knit 1 row to the right side. Return the main ball of yarn to the Yarn Container and Feed Finger. Bring all the needles into working position, turn the Row Counter back to 46 (56



ON EACH SIDE, DECREASE 1 st. after Row 58 and again every other row 10 x more. (40 sts.). Knit even to Row 84.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, INCREASE 1 st. at the beginning of next 32 rows (16 x on each side). (72 sts.). Knit to Row

ON EACH SIDE, hang the 19th sts. onto the 18th needle, put the center 34 needles and the 18 needles on the left side into holding position. *Knit even to Row 124. ON CAM BOX SIDE, DECREASE 1 st. after Rows 124, 130. Knit to Row 136, then knit short rows. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, put 1 needle into holding position after Row 1 needle into holding position after Row 136, 2 needles after Row 137, 1 needle after Row 138, 2 needles after Row 139, ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, position after Rows 140, 141. Bind off the crochet method.*

Move the Cam Box to the left side, bring the 18 needles on the left into working position, turn the Row Counter back to 118 and REPEAT the instructions from * to *.

Bring the remaining 34 needles into working position, turn the Row Counter back to 118. ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 120, 124, 128, 132. Knit to Row 136, then knit short rows.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, put 1 needle into holding position after Row 136 and after EVERY ROW to Row 152 (8x on each side). ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, bring all the needles into working position after Rows 152, 153, then bind off LOOSELY the crochet method.

UPPER BODY - Make 2 (1 with reverse shaping)





FINISHING: Block the sections - lower edges 15", side edges 13", shoulders 3 1/2". Sew the right shoulders together, then hang the neckline sts. back onto the machine. Transfer every other sts. to the Ribber, having 2 sts. on one end on the main machine (one extra stitch may have to be picked up). Knit 70 rows with ribber tension 5, then bind off all sts. the crochet method for ribbing. Join the left side shoulders. If the Collar is to be worn turned to the inside, weave the Collar seam together from the right side, 1 st. in from each edge. If the Collar is to be worn turned to the outside, weave a little less than half from the right side and the remainder from the wrong side. Turn under 5 sts. around side edges. Give final pressing.





RIGHT SECTION

Cast on 19 sts. Follow the Under Body Instructions from * to * and from ** to ** (24 sts.) This completes one leg section - do not break yarn. Cast on 6 sts.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, INCREASE 1 st. after Rows 48, 49, 53, 54, 55. ON CAM BOX SIDE, INCREASE 1 st. after Rows in () and ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, DECREASE 1 st. after Rows 58, 60 (60), 62, 64, 66 (66), 68, 70, 72 (72), 74, 76, 78 (78), (84). (29 sts.).

ON CAM BOX SIDE, INCREASE 1 st. after Rows 85, 87, 89, 91, 93, 95, 97, 99, 100, 101, 103, 105, 107.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, INCREASE 1 st. after Rows in () and DECREASE 1 st. after Rows 108 (109), (111), (113), 114 (115). Knit to Row 119. (45 sts.).

Counting from the LEFT SIDE, (right for 2nd section), hang the 21st st. onto the 20th needle. Put all the needles on the right (left for 2nd section) into holding position and work the left side (right for second section). Knit even to Row 125. Turn the Row Counter to 124. ON CAM BOX SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 124, 130, knit to Row 136 then knit short rows. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, put 1 needle into holding position after Row 136, 2 needles after Row 137, 1 needle after Row 138, 2 needles after Row 139. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, bring all the needles back into working position after Rows 140, 141. Bind off the remaining 18 sts. the crochet method (loosely).

Bring the remaining 24 needles into working position. Attach yern at the LEFT (right for second section) side and knit 1 row to the right (left for second section). Turn the Row Counter to 120.

OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, DECREASE 1 st. after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, DECREASE 1 st. after Rows 120 (120) (124), 126, (128), 132 (132)

ON CAM BOX SIDE, continue to decrease after Rows in () and ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX work short rows. Put 1 needle into holding position after Rows 136, 138 (138), 140, 142, 144 (144), 146, 148, 150. After Row 151, bring all the needles into working position, knit 1 row then bind off the crochet method (loosely).

Make the second upper section with reverse shaping, casting on from LEFT to RIGHT. Cam box will be on the LEFT side at Row 0.

FINISHING: You may sew the pieces together on the sewing machine, or use a back stitch if you do not have a maback stitch if you do not have a machine. With right sides together, sew the center seam of upper body sections. With right sides together, sew upper body to under body leaving the space between lower legs open for stuffing. Turn to the right side. Insert Frog eyes (see picture). Fill body with white beans (not too full) then close opening. With red yarn single crochet across the seam red yarn, single crochet across the seam at mouth for approximately 3½".









MATERIAL: 2 balls red, 1 ball white, 1 ball green KNITKING Flamingo Dralon. (If you order 2 more balls for a basic color, you will have enough of the contrasting colors to knit another sock). TENSION: 7 to 9. GAUGE: 14 sts. 19 rows = 2". PATTERN: Stockinette St. and JAC 40 and Pattern No. 5. Put the Pattern Card into the JAC 40 UPSIDE DOWN and use and JAC 40 and Fattern No. 5. Fut the Fattern Card into the JAC 40 PSIDE DOWN and use only the 18 rows of the tree section . . . or you can use any design you wish for the Cuff providing it does not exceed 42 rows. If you want to put a design on the leg section, center it on each side such as in the Snowflake Design which is Jac Pattern No. 27A with all holes covered except the Snowflake (use scotch tape). Mark needle 20 on each side of 0 and use this to place the red center guide of the Jac 40. Begin the design 6 to 10 rows down after hanging the hem for cuff.

FINISHING: Weave the leg seam 1 st. in from each edge, being sure to catch the open stitch on each side at the heel end. Weave the open sts. of the heel to the leg section. Make a cord over 3 needles with tension 3 and knit 100 rows. (KNITKING machine owners, make cord by pushing the right Cam Control Button back). Fold cord in half and sew to the inside at top of stocking.

Knit 2 rows red, 4 rows white, 2 rows red, 4 rows white. After Row 84 hang the hem by picking up each cast on st. and place them onto the needles behind the latches. Knit the next row with Tension 10, then turn the tension back to 8 and knit to Row 152.

ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 152, 160, 168, 176, 182, 188, 194, 200, 206. Knit to Row 228 then ON EACH SIDE remove 16 sts. onto a stitch holder. Knit even to Row 238 then decrease 1 st. ON EACH SIDE. (30 sts.). Knit even to Row 286 then work Short Rows.

Change to white yarn. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, put 1 needle into holding position 11 x on each side (8 remain in work). ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, bring back into working position 1 needle 11 x on each side. (Row 330). Change to red yarn and knit even to Row 388. REPEAT the instructions from * to *. After Row 432, remove the sts. onto a stitch holder.

KG 1954 BABY FROG

MATERIAL: 1 50 gr. ball Yellow, 1 Green KNITKING Allegro Dralon (will make 2). Small amount of Red for mouth. Small white beans for stuffing — or plastic pellets. Small Frog eyes. PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch. TENSION: 3 to 5. GAUGE: 16 sts. 23 Rows = 2". Make increases and decreases on the edges.

UNDER BODY

With Yellow, cast on 12 sts. *ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, put 4 needles into holding position at Row 0 and after Row 1. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, bring back into working position, 2 needles after Rows 2, 3, 4, 5. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, DECREASE 1 st. after Rows in () and ON CAM BOX SIDE, INCREASE 1 st. after Rows 7 (7), 9, 11 (11), 13, 15 (15), 17, 19 (19), 21. Knit to Row 24*. Put these needles into holding position. To the left of these needles, leave 4 empty needles and cast on 12 sts. from right to left. Cam Box will be on the left side at Row 0. Follow the instructions from * to *. Knit 1 row to the right and cast on 8 sts. Put all the needles on the left into holding position and bring the 16 needles on the right into working position and knit 1 row to the right. Turn the Row Counter to 24. (40 sts.).

ON CAM BOX SIDE, INCREASE 1 st. after Rows 28, 29, 32, 33. ON EACH SIDE DECREASE 1 st. after Rows 36, 38, 40, 42, 44, 46, 48. Knit to Row 50.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, INCREASE 1 st. after Rows 52 and 53 and again on EVERY ROW 20 x more on each side). (52 sts.) After Row 74, ON EACH SIDE, hang the 13th st. onto the 12th needle. Leave the 12 sts. on the right in working position and put all the needles on the left into holding position. *Knit even to Row 80. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, put 1 needle into holding position after Rows 80, 81, 82, 83, 84, 85. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, bring all the needles back into working position after Rows 86, 87. After Row 88, bind off all sts. *Move the Cam Box to the left side, bring the first 12 needles into working position, turn the Row Counter to 74 and REPEAT the Instructions from * to *.

Bring the remaining 26 needles into working position, turn the Row Counter to 74. ON EACH SIDE, DECREASE 1 st. after Rows 76, 78, 80, 82, 83, 84, 85. Knit to Row 88, then work short rows. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, put 2 needles into holding position after

Rows 88, 89, 90, 91. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, bring all the needles back into working position after Rows 92, 93. After Row 94, bind off all sts.

UPPER BODY — Make 2 (1 with reverse shaping). With Green, cast on 14 sts. and REPEAT the Instructions for Under Body leg from * to Row 32. Cast on 5 sts. ON CAM BOX SIDE, INCREASE 1 st. after Rows 25, 28, 29, 32. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, DECREASE 1 st. after Rows in (), and ON CAM BOX SIDE, INCREASE 1 st. after Rows 33, 37 (37), (39), 41 (41), (43), 45 (45), (47), 49 (49). ON CAM BOX SIDE, INCREASE 1 st. after Rows 52, 53, 54, 56, 58. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, DECREASE 1 st. after Rows in () and INCREASE 1 st. after Rows 60 (60), 62, 64 (64), 66, 68 (68), 70, 72 (72). After Row 74, hang the 15th st. onto the 14th needle (counting from the right - left for second section), put the 17 needles on the left (right) into holding position and work the leg. Knit even to Row 80. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, put 1 needle into holding



position after Rows 80, 81, 82, 83, 84, 85. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, bring all the needles back into working position after Rows 86, 87. After Row 88, bind off all sts.

Bring the remaining 17 sts. into working position. Turn the Row Counter back to 74. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, DECREASE 1 st. after Rows 76, 77, 79, 80, 81, 83, 84, 85, 86. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, put 1 needle into holding position after Rows 87, 89, 91. After Row 93, bring all the needles back into working position and knit 1 row, then bind off the remaining 7 sts.

Work the second section with reverse shaping, casting on from right to left. Cam Box will be on the left side at Row 0.

FINISHING: Finish in the same manner as larger Frog.

KG 1952

HOLIDAY SLIPPERS

SIZE: Small, with medium and large in (). MATERIAL: 150 gr. ball for small; 350 gr. balls for two pair of medium or large, KNITKING Dunja and 150 gr. ball Flamingo Dralon in a contrast color for lining each pair. 4 small bells. PATTERN: Stockinette st. TENSION 5 to 7 for Dunja; 4 to 6 for Flamingo Dralon. GAUGE: 11 sts., 14 rows = 2" using Dunja. USE EVERY OTHER NEEDLE for both yarns. When transferring the specified sts., KNITKING machine owners, bring the needles into holding position and release all sts. from under the sinkers, then transfer the sts.

With Dunja, cast on 27 (29-31) sts. OVER EVERY OTHER NEEDLE. Work short rows. Put 10 needles OPPOSITE CAM BOX into holding position at Row 0 and after Row 1. Be sure to wrap the yarn around the inside needle in holding position. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, bring back into working position, 2 needles at a time till all are in work (wrap the yarn each time). Counting from the RIGHT, hang the sts. from needles 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12 (also 14 for medium and large sizes) onto the adjacent needle to the LEFT. Counting from the LEFT, hang the sts. from needles 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12 (also 14 for medium and large sizes) onto the adjacent needle to the RIGHT. There should be 6 holes on each side of the center needle for small size; 7 holes on each side of center for medium and large sizes (the medium size will have 3 sts. on the center needle). Leave empty needles in work and knit 2 rows.

Work self wrap short rows: ON SAME SIDE AS CAM BOX, put 1 needle into holding position beginning each row until 7 remain in work. Wrap the yarn around the inside needle in holding position this one time only.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, bring 2 needles back into working position, knit across, then return 1 needle to HOLDING POSITION (the needle right next to those in holding). REPEAT from ** - always bringing 2 needles opposite Cam Box back into work, knit across, then put 1 needle back into holding position each time until all needles are in working position.*

Knit 16 to 18 rows for small (20 to 22 rows for medium - 24 to 26 rows for large).

REPEAT the SHORT ROWS from * to * and from ** to ***. Knit 2 rows. Change to Flamingo yarn and turn the tension down 1 number lower. Knit 2 rows.

REPEAT the SHORT ROWS from * to * and from ** to ***. Knit 16 to 18 rows for small (20 to 22 rows for medium - 24 to 26 rows for large).




REPEAT the SHORT ROWS from * to * and from ** to ***. Knit 2 rows. Eyelet across the same way as you did before, leave empty needles in work and put 2 needles OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX into holding position before knitting the next 10 rows and be sure to wrap the yarn around the inside needle in holding position each time. There will be 10 needles on each side in holding position.


ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, bring all the needles back into working position before knitting the next 2 rows. Hang the cast on sts. onto the machine behind the latches. There will be 2 sts. on each needle. Turn your tension to 8 and knit 1 row with Dunja yarn, then holding this yarn, use it to crochet the sts. off one at a time - loosely.

CORD FOR TIES. (Every needle). Pick up 2 sts. close to the hole on side of slipper. Set your machine for knitting a cord (KNITKING Machine owners, push back the Right Cam Control Button) and with tension 3, knit 102 rows. Bind off. Make cord on other side and on second slipper.

FINISHING: Pull and stretch into shape, tucking the lining inside. With right side facing you and beginning at the LEFT of toe (as it faces you), use a No. 1 crochet hook and Dunja Yarn, slip stitch crochet around slipper catching loops of lining with outside edge to close the sides of slipper. DO NOT PULL SIDES TIGHTLY. When you reach the heel, slip stitch into the whole OUTSIDE stitch only (not the lining) and pull up rather tight along the heel. Continue around to the beginning of toe, end off, Run the cord through the eyelets to meet at center and pull up tightly then tie in bow. Sew small bells to ends of ties.

MK 5391 — For school or play . . . a three piece outfit that is very easy to knit . . . and easy to care for when knitted with KNITKING Regia for a Size 6 and Allegro Dralon for Sizes 8 and 10. Follow the Chart for the Norwegian Design on the Skirt . . . or use your Jac 40 and Pattern No. 463.



"I am never satisfied with how stockinette stitch bands look when I sew them onto the neckline of my garments... How can I make them look professional?"....

Our KNITKING experts tell us this is the way they do it....

In order to neatly sew a stockinette stitch band to a neckline or armhole, it is essential that the neckline (or armhole) of your garment has been shaped with short rows. To shape the armholes (or neckline), put the needles holding the stitches to be bound off, into holding position after the Rows indicated...(when binding off - the stitches are bound off ON CAM BOX SIDE, but when working short rows, needles ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX are put into holding position). After all the armhole stitches (or neckline stitches) are in holding position, take a separate strand of your garment yarn, lay it over the open latches of the needles in holding position, push them gently back into working position, then with the strand of yarn, knit them BY HAND loosely. Now you can bind them off using the crochet method and BE SURE to maintain the same tension on the crochet bind-off as on the garment section. You must use a separate strand of yarn for EACH ARM-HOLE but when you are shaping the neckline, wait until both sides have been knitted and ALL of the neck stitches are in holding position, then use the separate strand of yarn to bind them all off at one time.

When you are knitting the stockinette stitch neckband (or armband for a sleeveless garment) cast on the specified number of stitches and BE SURE TO MARK THE CENTER STITCH with a bit of yarn.

Now as you knit, you should turn the Tension Dial DOWN as you work toward the center, then turn it UP again for the second half. For instance, if the band is 16 rows, each half will be 8 rows. If you are knitting with Tension 5, after casting on, knit 2 rows tension 5; 2 rows tension 4; 8 rows tension 3; 2 rows tension 4; 2 rows tension 5. You can use this tension change trick for knitting ANY neck or armhole band that will be doubled over - including any ribbed band. Bind off the crochet method neatly, being sure to maintain the same tension on the crochet bind-off as on the knitted piece. Of course if your pattern for the armhole band says to increase, then decrease on each end, be sure to do it.

Pull up the cast-on edge (see Practical Knitting Hints Book, page 40). Weave the short ends of the band together. With the right side of the band to the wrong side of the garment, pin the cast on edge of the band evenly to the neckline, being certain to match the center front and place the seam at the center back (for the armholes, place the seam at the underarm and center marking at the shoulders). Using a loose overcast stitch, sew the band to the neckline by inserting the needle into the cast-on stitches of the band, then into the bound-off stitches of the garment neckline (or armhole). Do not pull the yarn too firmly as the stitches should be elastic. When

you have completed this, fold the band over to the outside and pin it in place (you will note that it falls right into the proper place) covering the over-cast edge. The yarn you use may have to be split to obtain a thin strand to sew with. Use a sharp needle and back stitch the band in place by going into the center of each bound-off stitch of the band.

KNITTING CABLES or EYELET DESIGNS

Any time you knit a pattern where stitches have to be crossed, or eyelets made over the same set of needles continuously (such as DP 8128, MK 5389, DP 8114 in this issue), mark the Needle Rail of your machine where the Cables or Eyelets will go. You can use a bright crayon or a china marking pencil and it is only necessary to mark the CENTER STITCH of each group in your pattern. Each time you make the Cable or Eyelet, RELEASE the STITCHES (over which you make the design) from under the Sinkers. This will make it easy for you to cross or move the appropriate stitches.

HINT...HINT...

Do you turn down the idea of knitting a garment that looks difficult for you to make..? Try knitting a SMALL SECTION FIRST - such as the sleeve... or the front section of a jacket...etc. You will gain the needed confidence and work up tremendous enthusiasm to go on to complete what you THOUGHT was difficult.

NOTES TO KNIT BY . . .

STITCH AND ROW GAUGE

KNIT A SAMPLE SWATCH . . . before you begin to knit any garment . . . for this is the MOST IMPORTANT STEP toward the correct size and the proper fit of any garment you wish to make. You MUST use the SAME YARN for your sample swatch that you will use to knit your garment and your sample swatch must be knitted large enough and using several different tension numbers on your machine. When you have done this, then you can determine the number of stitches and the number of rows in a two-inch measure. KNITKING MAGAZINE PATTERNS give you 3 tensions to try and one of them should give you the correct stitch and row gauge if you are using the yarn we recommend or a similar weight yarn. Here is the way to make your sample swatch.

Cast on over a sufficient number of needles to produce a swatch at least 4 inches wide. (If the pattern calls for 16 stitches to 2", then $16 \times 2 = 32$ stitches to cast on). Now knit 4 inches of rows at the first suggested tension number. (If the pattern calls for 22 rows to 2", $22 \times 2 = 44$ rows to knit). Knit 2 rows using a contrast color, change to the next higher tension and with garment yarn knit another 4", knit 2 rows with contrast color, change to the 3rd higher tension and knit another 4" and then bind off.

Roll the swatch into a cylinder over its length and pull on both ends, unroll it and stretch it diagonally by pulling on the four corners. Allow the swatch to rest and settle (preferably overnight) and then using a stitch gauge or a ruler, count the number of stitches over a 2" width, then the number of rows over a 2" length in EACH of the 3 tensions. Select the tension number that produces the stitches and rows called for in the pattern. If none of them are correct, you are most likely using the wrong weight of yarn.

READING OF CHARTS

You will notice the instructions start at the bottom of the Chart and work UP. Follow the charts exactly as written and providing your sample stitch and row gauge is correct, your garment will come out the right size. Please remember that the section of garment as it is knitted on the machine, faces the same way as the Charts are in this magazine. Where two front pieces are needed, (or any other part of a garment that needs two sections) only one section is normally shown and the second section is usually made with reverse shaping. Set in sleeves are usually identical, but raglan sleeves have to be knitted with reverse shaping for the second sleeve.

READING OF SYMBOLS

To simplify Pattern Knitting, we use Symbols in the Line Drawings and the Chart Diagrams. In the Line Drawings the symbols are shown and are to be read as you look at them while knitting a garment. For instance, if a Purl stitch faces you, the Purl stitch Symbol is shown; if a knit stitch faces you (as when using the Ribber) then this Symbol is shown. The Symbol at the top of the Line Drawing is the center of the garment section and you use this as a guide for setting up the needles.

The following Symbols are used for Eyelet Designs in the Line Drawings and also for Full Fashion shaping on the Charts. The Line Drawings have row numbers on the right side. Missing Row numbers are always knitted straight or plain.

In Holding Position Designs selected needles are pushed into holding position for the stated number of rows. The numbers of rows appear at the right of the Line Drawings; Example: 1–4 means knit Rows 1 to 4; 5 to 7 means knit Rows 5 to 7, etc. This same Symbol is also shown on the Charts and is used for putting needles into holding position for Short Rows. The

Symbol on the Charts is used to put needles back into working position when knitting Short Rows.

A number in a box stands for the number of rows to be knitted between shapings. Make shaping first, then knit the necessary number of rows. If for instance it reads:

1 st. 8 x

6 1 st. 10 x

As you will be reading the instructions from the bottom up, here is the way you will follow them: . . . Decrease or increase (depending on the direction of the garment outline) 1 st. at the row where the shaping begins, then knit 8 rows, make the next decrease, then knit 8 rows, until you have decreased (or increased) 1 st. 10 x and you have knitted 8 rows after each decrease (or increase) (1 st. 10 x +8 rows 10 x). Now begin the first decrease (or increase) for the shaping (which has to be made 8 x) in every 6th row. Decrease (or increase) 1 st. first, then knit 6 rows until you have decreased 1 st. 6 x and after each decrease (or increase) have knitted 6 rows (1 st. 8 x + 6 rows 8 x).

Where shapings are given without a boxed number as on most armholes, necklines, etc., make the shapings on every second row (on each side of course).

(See below for more Pattern Stitch Symbols.)

PATTERN STITCH SYMBOLS

= knit stitch

= purl stitch

= empty needle (leave in working position)

= needle not used (in the out of work position)

= needle in the holding posi-

Needles back into working position.

= 2 stitches on 1 needle either transferred from the right side or the left side, then put the needle into holding position

= needle holding 2 stitches. Stitch has been transferred from the LEFT = needle holding 2 stitches. Stitch has been transferred from the RIGHT

= 3 stitches on 1 needle. The 1st and 3rd stitch in a group of 3 needles has been hung on the 2nd or center needle.

= Center of Garment Section.

8 = Number of rows to be knitted between shapings.

The diagrams (Line Drawings) for pattern work are followed just as they are shown and are to be read as you look at them while knitting the garment.
