



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

An absolutely unlimited number of fancy stitches and designs can be made on the AM 3 and you do not need punch cards, cast-on combs, weights or innumerable controls... Insert a Cam and then with one Central Control Knob (set it once, it automatically resets itself) you produce the Pattern Stitch needed ... With one Button Control, you never have to memorize what button you pushed last and KNITKING machines knit with any weight of yarn from fine crochet cotton to heavy thick and thin or loopy yarns ... Size 40 and 42 with KNITKING Allegro; Size 46 with Dolly Dralon.

DP 8106 — Uneven stripes on a Pullover are flattering . . . especially when the stripes are separated with a solid color Yoke to frame a pretty face. Tiny buttons go two-by-two at the neck opening. Size 8 is knitted with KNITKING Beatrice; Size 12 and 14 with Regia.






DK 8107 — Four-piece Bonanza . . . The newest trick from our top Designers is vertical stripes for a Jacket knitted sideways using Stockinette Stitch. Knit the swinging pleated Skirt in sections. The Pullover and jaunty Hat have ribbed Bands. For Size 12, use KNITKING Allegro; Size 14, Alanda.

The instructions are the same for both sizes. PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch with Color Stripes at lower edge and sleeve edges. DECREASES: Hang the 3rd st, onto the 2nd st, then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. To form the hems, hang the cast-on sts. back onto the machine behind the latches, then knit the following row with 1 to 2 tension settings higher.

FINISHING: Block all sections. Gather the flounce for the sleeves to the width of the lower sleeve edges, then sew the flounce in place. Gather and sew 1 flounce to the back section and I flounce to the front section. Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. Sew the sleeves together and set in. Work 1 row of single crochet around the neckline and back opening, then work 1 row of reverse single crochet around the neckline. Work 3 loops on 1 side and sew 3 buttons to other side of back opening.





ROWS 169 to 192: Knit even, then bind off the center 10 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

Work the front section the same as the back section to ROW 168.



ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 20, 21, 22, 23; 2 sts. after Rows 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29. ON EACH SIDE, hang the 1st st. onto the 2nd st. after Rows 30, 32, 34, 36, 38, 40, 42, 44, 46, 48, 50. ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Rows 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57; 8 sts. after Row 58.

ROWS 0 to 20: Knit even.

Cast on 66 sts. with color 1 and work stockinette st.

Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 168 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 206 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 5 sts. after Row 207 (ODD ROWS = NECK How 207 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 4 sts. after Row 208; 3 sts. after Row 209; 4 sts. after Row 210; 3 sts. after Row 211; 4 sts. after Row 212; 2 sts. after Row 213; 4 sts. after Row 214; 2 sts. after Row 215; 4 sts. after Row 216.


*ROWS 169 to 206: Knit even.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 148, 149, 150, 151; 2 sts. after Rows 152, 153, 154, 155; 1 st. after Rows 156, 157, 158, 159, then knit to Row 168, put 39 needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first. (For the FRONT Section knit to Row 168, but do not divide the sts.)

ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 24, 34, 44, 54, 64, 74, 84, 94, 104, 114, 124, 134, then knit to Row 148.

ROWS 0 to 24: Knit even.

Cast on 126 sts. with color 1 and work stockinette st.







The instructions are the same for all sizes, PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch, DECREASES: Hang the 4th st. onto the 3rd st., then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. Begin thr skirt DARTS by hanging the sts. together as marked on the Diagram, then move the sts. together to fill the empty needles. The following decreases for the Darts lie directly above, INCREASES: Move the 2 end sts. 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle.

FINISHING: Block all sections, Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. Sew the sleeves together and set in. Turn under 18 rows on lower edge and 13 rows on sleeve edges and hem to wrong side. Work 1 row of single crochet around the back opening. Gather the front part of the collar lightly, on the cast-on and bound-off edges, then sew 1 edge of the collar to inside and 1 edge to the outside of neckline. Fold the collar to outside, having the seam line in the center of the collar on the wrong side. Sew the zipper in place. Sew the silver trim to the sleeves and shoulders as shown in the picture. Make a tie belt with the remaining trim. You may line the skirt section with taffeta.







Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 352 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from*.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Row 596 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 8 sts. after Row 597 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 3 sts. after Row 598; 4 sts. after Rows 599, 600, 601, 602; 3 sts. after Row 603; 4 sts. after Row 604; 3 sts. after Row 605; 4 sts. after Row 606; 2 sts. after Row 607; 4 sts. after Row 608; 2 sts. after Row 609; 4 sts. after Row 608; 2 sts. after Row 609; 4 sts. after Row Row 610.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 512; 3 sts. after Rows 514, 516; 2 sts. after Rows 518, 520; 1 st. after Rows 522, 524, 526, 528, then knit to Row 596.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 432, 444, 456, 468, 480, 492, then knit to Row 512.





Cast on 196 sts. and work stockinette st.

Cast on 180 sts., work stockinette st. and Short Rows. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX put into holding position 63 sts. after Rows 0, 1. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX bring back into working position 8 needles after Rows 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13; 15 needles after Rows 14, 15, then knit to Row 66 and work Short Rows. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX put into holding position 15 needles after Rows 66, 67; 8 needles after Rows 68, 69, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX bring all needles back into working position after Rows 80, 81. After Row 82 bind off all 180 sts.





ROWS 0 to 32: Knit even, then change to stockinette st. and work the repeated Color Stripes as marked in the Diagram.

Cast on 73 sts. with color 1 and work K1, P1, Ribbing.

Work the front section the same as the back section to ROW 134, change to Color 3, bind off the center 23 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 135, 137, 139; 2 sts. after Rows 141, 143, 145; 1 st. after Rows 147, 149, 151, 153, 155, 157, then knit to Row 166, change to color 4. Knit even to Row 208, then bind off the 18 Shoulder sts.

Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 134 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from*.

BACK NECKBAND: Cast on 85 sts. with color 1 and work 12 rows K1, P1, Ribbing.

FRONT NECKBAND: Cast on 143 sts. with color 1 and work 12 rows K1, P1, Ribbing.

ARMHOLE BANDS: Cast on 171 sts. with color 1 and work 12 rows K1, P1, Ribbing.



KG 1956 SKI HAT

MATERIAL: KNITKING Flamingo Dralon, 50gr. balls in 3 colors. 2 Color 1, 1 Color 2, 1 Color 3. TENSION 7 to 9. GAUGE: 14 sts. 19 Rows = 2.

Cast on 117 sts. with Color 3. Knit 18 Rows EACH Colors 3, 2. 60 Rows, Color 1; 8 Rows, Color 2; 6 Rows EACH, Colors 3, 1, 2; 4 Rows EACH, Colors 3, 1, 2; 2 Rows EACH, Colors 3, 1, 2, 3 (Row 142)


Hang the hem by picking up the cast on sts. and hang them back onto the machine behind the latches. Turn Tension Dial 1 number higher, put COUNTER AT 0 and with Color 1, knit 1 row, turn the Tension back to original number. Bring the 2nd and 3rd needle into holding position. Transfer each of the sts. from the holding position needles to the needles in work, first to the right and then to the left so that there are 3 sts. on each of the working needles with 2 empty needles between with the exception of the two end needles. The end needle on the left will have 1 st. and you must move this one over (out) so that there are 2 empty needles. Put all the empty needles into the out of work position. With Color 1 knit 1 row over the 40 needles, then work the TAIL. (Row 2).

Knit 10 Rows EACH, Colors 1, 2, 3. 1 (Row 42); 8 Rows EACH, Colors 2, 3; 10 Rows Color 1 (Row 68); 8 Rows EACH, Colors 2, 3, 10 Rows Color 1; 6 Rows EACH, Colors 2, 3, 1 (Row 104); 8 Rows Color 1; 6 Rows EACH, Colors 2, 3, 1 (Row 150); 4 Rows EACH, Colors 2, 3; 6 Rows Color 1 (Row 164); 4 Rows EACH, Colors 2, 3; 6 Rows Color 1; 4 Rows EACH, Colors 2, 3; 1; 2 Rows EACH, Colors 2, 3; 4 Rows Color 1; 4 Rows EACH, Colors 2, 3; 4 Rows Color 1 (Row 184); 2 Rows EACH, Colors 2, 3; 4 Rows Color 1, 3; 4 Rows Color 1 (Row 192).

Take the sts. off onto the end of yarn. Do not pull up until you weave the

FINISHING: Weave the lining, then the hat and long tail. Pull up the top of tail and fasten securely. Make large Pom-pom and sew to top of tail.





DK 8137 — A basic Dress is easy to knit in Stockinette stitch and is the perfect foil for your favorite jewelry. Knit it in a jiffy too. Use KNITKING Subita Crepe 2 x 3 for a Size 12; Beatrice for Size 14; Regia for Size 16.

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





WHIZ KING PATTERN READER

Did you notice the Advertisement on the inside Front Cover of this issue... and did you read the Editoral on the first page...? We want to be sure that you know about the remarkable new accessory KNITKING is introducing and that you understand the complete Charting Service we are offering with it.

The WHIZ KING PATTERN READER is designed to enable you to knit the garment of your choice in the size you desire... All the preliminary work ... the designing of the garments and the drawing



of the Charts in various sizes is done by KNITKING ... all you have to do (once you own a WHIZ KING PATTERN READER) is to feed a Chart into the Reader and knit..!! You read the Chart as it automatically revolves by following the outline of your garment sections... You make your increases and decreases, darts and shapings, etc., on the correct rows with complete accuracy and without reference to written instructions and without even using your Row Counter.

Knitting with a WHIZ KING PATTERN READER is so incredibly simple that once you use it, you will never want to return to the old methods... Your WHIZ KING will speed the completion of garments tremendously because once you start, you will not have to repeatedly refer to written instructions. You will not need to take your eyes of your knitting machine until the completion of each garment section... and you can be confident that all garment sections will fit together when completed.

The designing of a simple uncomplicated, yet versatile Pattern Reading Device (like the designing of a KNITKING, fully versatile, easy to operate one button knitting machine) was a project that challenged the skill and ingenuity of our top notch development staff working in collaboration with our garment Designers and expert Knitters... Several prototype machines were made and rejected before tooling up to proceed with WHIZ KING and technical experts from the world wide distribution

center of KNITTAX-KNITKING machines were involved in its development... It was even necessary to design a completely new graph paper on which to draw original Charts... Traditional geometric squares are not satisfactory because a stitch is almost always greater in width than in height (for example, a yarn may produce 8 stitches and 11 rows to an inch) so, we designed a special graph paper with rectangles instead of squares with each rectangle representing a stitch... It took a Computer to decide the perfect shape and size of each rectangle... and the Pattern Reader had to be synchronized so that every time you push your Cam Box across your machine, your Pattern Chart revolves exactly one row, not a fraction more or a fraction less


We could get carried away and elaborate more on the skill and know how that has gone into the development of the WHIZ KING PATTERN READER, but we believe that most knitting machine owners will be interested mainly in its efficiency and simplicity of operation... As we said in our Editorial, we believe that the WHIZ KING PATTERN READER will mark the greatest advance in home knitting machine operation since the introduction of the first KNITKING over 25 years ago.

PRACTICAL KNITTING HINT

The Skirt for Pattern No. DK 8107 in this issue, is made in sections that are woven together, then a slip stitch crochet is worked over the center stitch of each panel so that pleats will fall into place. We have taken copy from our "Practical Knitting Hints Book" to show you exactly how this is accomplished.


Slip Stitch Crochet for Creases and Pleats Oftentimes instructions for patterns tell you to slip stitch crochet up or down on knit stitches to create a definite fold line. In order to do this, fold your knitting with the stitches that are to be crocheted off as your fold line. First form a loop on your crochet hook. Now insert the crochet hook through your knitting as shown in Illustration. 1. Catch the yarn and pull this loop through

your knitting and through the loop on the crochet hook. Continue inserting the hook through each row of the knitting, catching the yarn and pulling the loop through the knitting and through the loop on the hook. Crochet stitches formed in this manner will conform to the knitted stitches as shown in Illustration 2. We recommend using a crochet hook that is not too large,

and is of suitable size according to the yarn you are using. Pull the yarn firmly each time a stitch has been formed, otherwise the fold or crease line will expand and will be longer than the rest of your garment. Depending on how pronounced you want the fold line to be, a width of 1, 2 or 3 stitches can be crocheted off. The width most suitable can be determined when the stitch gauge is made.



Stitches that are to be crocheted off will obviously make a difference by that number of stitches in the width of the garment, especially if many fold lines are to be made as in a pleated skirt. These stitches have to be considered when figuring the pattern. Crocheted fold lines are also

very attractive on trouser creases and give a very nice

accent to skirts.

CORRECTION TO COPY in NOV/DEC KNITKING MAGAZINE

An error occurred in the setting of the Captions to the pictures on pages 6 and 7 of the November, December 1972 KNITKING MAGAZINE and the Pattern Numbers were over the wrong pictures. The Pattern Numbers and instructions on page 16 are correct however... Sorry if we confused you and thanks to the readers who pointed out the error..

OUR READERS WRITE

We still receive letters asking about SHORT ROWS and how to knit them on a machine... There are different methods for knitting Short Rows... and the method you use should depend on where the Short Rows are to be placed... and on WHAT....

METHOD No. 1: This is the first and BASIC type of Short Rows... the one you will use for Bust Darts; to shape the lower section of an "A"line Skirt; for shaping Armholes and Necklines... in fact, it can be used for ALL Short Rowing... using any number of stitches... anyplace...on anything... for it barely shows in your knitting... leaves no holes and is the best all around method. It takes a bit more time because you must wrap the INSIDE NEEDLE in holding position on every row. It is ALWAYS worked by placing a specified number of needles OPPOSITE CAM BOX into holding position for a specified number of rows and then bringing a specified number of needles OPPOSITE CAM BOX back into working position. If you are not familiar with Short Rows, and their variations... make some practice samples of each type and keep them for future reference. Use 3-ply sport weight yarn for all samples and Tension 5 or 6.

1. BUST DARTS: Cast on 50 sts. Knit 20 rows. Work Short Rows: ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, put 5 needles into holding position, knit across, then bring the yarn UNDER the inside needle in holding position so that the yarn will go over the shank of the needle when you knit the next row. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, put 5 needles into holding position, knit across, bring the yarn under the INSIDE NEEDLE as you did before and continue to bring 5 needles OPPOSITE CAM BOX into holding position, knit across, wrap yarn...until you have 20 needles ON EACH SIDE in holding po-

sition. Now bring ALL the needles back into working position before knitting the next 2 rows. Knit 20 rows, bind off. Pull your knitting into shape so that you can see the sample BUST DART. You will note that there are MORE ROWS in the CENTER part of the knitting - which is exactly what you need for the bust shaping of a garment. If your garment is to be worn on the PURL SIDE, when wrapping the inside needle in holding position, lift the stitch with a transfer tool from that inside needle and wrap the yarn around the shank of the needle, then put the stitch back onto needle - be sure to leave it in holding position. This places the wrapping in BACK on the knit side so it will not show on the Purl side.

In the November/December issue of KNITKING MAGA-ZINE, we told you about using Short Rows for the shaping of armholes and necklines.... so get out your copy and refresh your mind.

2. SHAPING A HEEL or TOE: Cast on 35 sts. Knit 20 rows. If you made the sample swatch above, you already know about wrapping the yarn around the inside needle, so we won't repeat the instructions for doing it here... just remember to wrap the yarn each time. ON OPPOSIDE SIDE OF CAM BOX, put 1 needle into holding position before knitting the next 24 rows (11 sts. left in work) wrap yarn each time. Now ON OPPOSIDE SIDE OF CAM BOX, bring back into working position, 1 needle before knitting the next 24 rows (remember to wrap the yarn)... All needles are now in work. Knit 20 rows, bind off. Pull the knitting into shape, and look at the heel (or toe) you have just knitted.

When you want HOLES as part of a Design, such as in an Afghan, or Pillow... this same method for knitting Short Rows is used but without wrapping yarn around the inside needle... just bring the specified number of needles OPPOSITE CAM BOX into holding position before knitting each row, then return them as specified...no wrapping of any kind.

 SHAPING THE BOTTOM OF AN "A" LINE SKIRT OR DRESS.

When knitting an "A" line Skirt, always knit the under side of HEM, then the specified ROWS for hem before shaping the sides. If you like, you can knit the UNDERSIDE of a hem at one tension lower than the garment tension. Cast on 50 sts. Knit 30 rows. Hang the hem by picking up each cast on stitch and place the sts. onto the needles behind the latches. Knit 1 row using 1 or 2 tensions higher than garment tension, turn the tension back to garment tension and knit 1 row. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, put 16 needles into holding position before knitting the next 2 rows (wrap yarn each time). ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, bring back into working position 4 needles before knitting the next 8 rows (wrap yarn). Knit 20 rows, bind off. Remember this is only a sample swatch... your Skirt or Dress will have far more stitches and the number of stitches and rows used for shaping the sides will be more. Pull sample into shape and you will see the "A" line is SHORTER on the sides than in the middle and the shaping goes from the center OUT and UP which is a different shaping than the Bust Dart. If you do not want a hung hem... cast on, then start the Short Rows immediately, and hem up later.

There are many variations of spacing of stitches. The number of needles you put into holding position and the number you will bring back into working position depend on what you are knitting, and the shaping you wish.

Watch for the next issue of KNITKING MAGAZINE Practical Knitting Hint... In it we will tell you two alternate methods.

NOTES TO KNIT BY . . .

STITCH AND ROW GAUGE

KNIT A SAMPLE SWATCH . . . before you begin to knit any garment . . . for this is the MOST IMPORTANT STEP toward the correct size and the proper fit of any garment you wish to make. You MUST use the SAME YARN for your sample swatch that you will use to knit your garment and your sample swatch must be knitted large enough and using several different tension numbers on your machine. When you have done this, then you can determine the number of stitches and the number of rows in a two-inch measure. KNITKING MAGAZINE PATTERNS give you 3 tensions to try and one of them should give you the correct stitch and row gauge if you are using the yarn we recommend or a similar weight yarn. Here is the way to make your sample swatch.

Cast on over a sufficient number of needles to produce a swatch at least 4 inches wide. (If the pattern calls for 16 stitches to 2", then $16 \times 2 = 32$ stitches to cast on). Now knit 4 inches of rows at the first suggested tension number. (If the pattern calls for 22 rows to 2", $22 \times 2 = 44$ rows to knit). Knit 2 rows using a contrast color, change to the next higher tension and with garment yarn knit another 4", knit 2 rows with contrast color, change to the 3rd higher tension and knit another 4" and then bind off.

Roll the swatch into a cylinder over its length and pull on both ends, unroll it and stretch it diagonally by pulling on the four corners. Allow the swatch to rest and settle (preferably overnight) and then using a stitch gauge or a ruler, count the number of stitches over a 2" width, then the number of rows over a 2" length in EACH of the 3 tensions. Select the tension number that produces the stitches and rows called for in the pattern. If none of them are correct, you are most likely using the wrong weight of yarn.

READING OF CHARTS

You will notice the instructions start at the bottom of the Chart and work UP. Follow the charts exactly as written and providing your sample stitch and row gauge is correct, your garment will come out the right size. Please remember that the section of garment as it is knitted on the machine, faces the same way as the Charts are in this magazine. Where two front pieces are needed, (or any other part of a garment that needs two sections) only one section is normally shown and the second section is usually made with reverse shaping. Set in sleeves are usually identical, but raglan sleeves have to be knitted with reverse shaping for the second sleeve.

READING OF SYMBOLS

To simplify Pattern Knitting, we use Symbols in the Line Drawings and the Chart Diagrams. In the Line Drawings the symbols are shown and are to be read as you look at them while knitting a garment. For instance, if a Purl stitch faces you, the Purl stitch Symbol is shown; if a knit stitch faces you (as when using the Ribber) then this Symbol is shown. The Symbol at the top of the Line Drawing is the center of the garment section and you use this as a guide for setting up the needles.

The following Symbols are used for Eyelet Designs in the Line Drawings and also for Full Fashion shaping on the Charts. The Line Drawings have row numbers on the right side. Missing Row numbers are always knitted straight or plain.

In Holding Position Designs

selected needles are pushed into holding position for the stated number of rows. The numbers of rows appear at the right of the Line Drawings; Example: 1—4 means knit Rows 1 to 4; 5 to 7 means knit Rows 5 to 7, etc. This same Symbol is also shown on the Charts and is used for putting needles into holding position for Short Rows. The

Symbol on the Charts is used to put needles back into working position when knitting Short Rows.

A number in a box stands for the number of rows to be knitted between shapings. Make shaping first, then knit the necessary number of rows. If for instance it reads:

1 st. 8 x

6 1 st. 10 x

As you will be reading the instructions from the bottom up, here is the way you will follow them: . . . Decrease or increase (depending on the direction of the garment outline) 1 st. at the row where the shaping begins, then knit 8 rows, make the next decrease, then knit 8 rows, until you have decreased (or increased) 1 st. 10 x and you have knitted 8 rows after each decrease (or increase) (1 st. 10 x +8 rows 10 x). Now begin the first decrease (or increase) for the shaping (which has to be made 8 x) in every 6th row. Decrease (or increase) 1 st. first, then knit 6 rows until you have decreased 1 st. 6 x and after each decrease (or increase) have knitted 6 rows (1 st. 8 x + 6 rows 8 x).

Where shapings are given without a boxed number as on most armholes, necklines, etc., make the shapings on every second row (on each side of course).
