We at KNITKING, wish all our readers Happiness . . . Peace and Prosperity in 1971.



Slacks and a V-necked Pullover make up a Pantsuit for todays Gal on the go... The Slacks are beautifully fitted with flared legs and the Pullover has an embroidered trim at Neckline, on Collar and Sleeves. Subita Crepe 2 x 3. Size 12/14. See page 12.



DK 7936

An elegant design for a Pantsuit should please anyone. It is very easy to knit in stockinette stitch using KNITKING Subita Crepe 2 x 3. The popular side slashed Pullover has a purchased embroidered trim outlined with gold Rickrack. Size 10/12. See page 14.

DP 7945

Stripe an attractive Pullover in 2 colors of KNITKING Crocus Crepe, then belt it with a twisted cord (see Practical Knitting Hints Book, page 58). Keep the winds from your hair with a matching fringed Head Scarf. Size 12/14. See page 18.





For the bold and dashing Man . . . knit a snappy Pull-over in the very latest belted fashion. Button the high Collar and sew buttons as shown for a trim. KNIT-KING Double Knitting. Size 38/40. See page 26.



HP 3637

A wide spaced rib (worn on the Purl side) with turtle-neck Collar makes a warm and comfortable Pullover for your Man . . . Knit it with KNITKING Amore. Size 36/38. See page 25.



MK 5291

Styled for the Junior Miss, a Skirt and Pullover is the perfect addition to her wardrobe. The high buttoned Ribbed Collar on the Pullover and the side Pleat on the Skirt are fashions "Now" look. Use KNITKING Amore. Size Junior 7 to 9 (Bust 31" to 32"). See page 27.



KK 5288

Knit a Raglan Sleeved Pullover for a young Man with KNITKING Sonika Dralon. A 1 x 1 Rib is used for all edges. When completed, add the Kite design to the front and embroider as illustrated. Size 6 to 7. See page 30.



MK 5281

Knit a delightful Bavarian type dress for a young girl. Easy stockinette stitch using KNITKING Subita Crepe 2 x 4. The trim is purchased, or you can design and knit the trim yourself. Size 7 to 8 (Chest 25" to 26"). See page 29.



KK 5287

Dropped Sleeves and Letterman stripes make a copy of his favorite sportsman's Pullover. He'll wear it continuously . . . KNITKING Crocus Crepe. Size 8 to 10. See page 31.



KK 5286

A Jumpsuit for a small child, with a Pullover to be worn underneath, is quickly knitted with KNITKING's wash 'n wear 3-ply Dralon. Zip the front of Jumpsuit for easy dressing . . . Make up your own applique for the knees of Jumpsuit. Size 4 to 5. See page 32.

KG 1920

MITTENS in 6 sizes. Average width around hand above thumb; 6" (6½", 7", 7½", 8", 8½").
MATERIAL: 1½ oz. (1 ball) for small sizes; 5½ oz. (3 balls) will make 2 pair of larger sizes, **KNITTING** Sonika Dralon. **TENSION** 6 to 8. **GAUGE:** 14 sts., 21 rows 2".

FINISHING: Weave the sts. held on waste yarn, then remove waste yarn. Weave the side seams and thumb seams 1 st. in. on each edge, matching marked rows. These Mittens may be made with stripes, a Norwegian Design, Cables or embroidered tops. You may also knit a cord for the children's sizes, making it the length of both long sleeves on a Coat or Jacket, plus the width across back, plus approximately 9". Attach a Mitten to each end of cord, then pull each Mitten through the sleeves of coat or jacket to prevent their loss.

RIGHT MITTEN: Using Ribber, cast on 42 (46, 48, 54, 56, 60) sts. having 2 sts. at one end on the main machine. Rib 16, (18, 20, 22, 26, 30) rows. Transfer Ribber sts. to main machine and continue in stockinette st. Knit 16 (18, 20, 22, 24, 26) rows. Counting from the left edge (right edge for second Mitten) work the thumb opening by knitting needles 1 to 7 (8, 9, 10, 11, 12) by hand (loosely) using a contrast waste yarn (same as making a buttonhole). Mark the other edge with a contrast yarn, then continue with main yarn over ALL needles. Knit 18, (22, 24, 28, 32, 36) rows even.

SHAPE TOP: Divide work in the center, take off 21 (23, 24, 27, 28, 30) sts. on the left side (right side for second Mitten) onto a stitch holder, then knit short rows over remaining sts. Put 1 needle opposite Cam Box into holding position beginning next 10, (10, 12, 12, 14, 16) rows. Bring back into working position 1 needle opposite Cam Box beginning each row till all are in work, ending with Cam Box on the right side. Remove the stitches on contrast waste yarn. **THUMB:** Put 7, (8, 9, 10, 11, 12) sts. from BOTH edges of thumb opening held on contrast yarn onto 2 stitch holders and remove waste yarn. Bring 15, (17, 19, 21, 23, 25) needles into working position. With Purl side facing you, hang 7, (8, 9, 10, 11, 12) sts. from each stitch holder onto these needles leaving 1 needle empty in the center, then pick up a stitch from row below and hang it onto this empty needle. Mark each side with a piece of contrast yarn. Knit 14, (16, 18, 20, 22, 24) rows even. Remove on contrast waste yarn and hang back onto machine, decreasing by hanging 1 st. on first needle and 2 sts. on each following needle. 8, (9, 10, 11, 12, 13) sts. Remove the waste yarn and knit 2 rows. First 3 sizes: Break yarn leaving long end and thread into tapestry needle, then take the sts. off onto yarn and pull up for tip. Last 3 sizes: Decrease to 9 sts., knit 2 rows, break yarn leaving an end and thread into tapestry needle. Take the sts. off onto the yarn and pull up for tip. Make second Mitten, reversing the sides for thumb and top shaping.


KG 1921

SLIPPER BOOTS

MATERIAL: 3½ oz. (2 balls) main color; 1½ oz. (1 ball) contrast color **KNITTING** Frigate. **TENSION:** 8 and 10 over every other needle. **GAUGE:** 9 sts., 12 rows 2".

FINISHING: Run a strand of yarn through one short end for toe and tie securely. Make two rows of single crochet around top of sox. Lace cord through eyelets and tie. You may if you like, attach a pom-pom to ends of ties.

Cast on 61 sts. over every other needle, using contrast color.



KG 1921 SLIPPER BOOTS

Ski enthusiasts really go for these Slipper Boots... but even if you don't ski, they are pretty nice to warm your toes. No size to these... they fit almost everyone... try them.

ROWS 1-2: Tension 8, knit even.

ROWS 3-8: Transfer the 3rd, then every 5th st. to neighboring needle, bring the empty needles into working position then knit even.

ROWS 9-54: Change to Tension 10 and main color and knit even.

ROWS 55-60: Change to Tension 8 and contrast color then knit even.

ROWS 61-62: Transfer the 3rd then every 5th st. to neighboring needle, leave the empty needles in working position and knit even. Bind off after Row 62.

CORD for Ties: Make a cord using main color over 2 sts. and Tension 1. Knit 400 rows then bind off.



KG 1920 MITTENS (in 6 sizes)

Now you can knit Mittens for every member of your family... from baby to he-man size. This is a basic simple pattern and you can knit a Norwegian design of your choice in the hand section, stripe it in many colors, or embroider the back of hand. Make a plain one first and see how easy it is. **KNITTING** Sonika Dralon.





SIZE: 10/12. **MATERIAL:** 28 oz. (16 balls) yellow/white KNITTING Amoretta and 1 3/4 oz. (1 ball) yellow KNITTING Sonika Dralon for the crochet trim. (If you wish, you may use ready made braid trim. You need about 5 yards). **TENSION:** KNITTING 7 to 9. **GAUGE:** 15 sts. 2", 21 rows 2". **PATTERN:** Stockinette st. **EDGES:** Crochet trim or ready made braid. **SKIRT and NECKLINE DECREASES:** After rows indicated, hang the 3rd st. on the appropriate sides onto the 2nd st., then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. **SLEEVE INCREASES:** After Rows indicated, move the 2 end sts. on each side 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle. The finished length of the skirt is about 22".

FINISHING: Block all sections to measurements given. **SKIRT:** Weave the sections together at sides, 1 st. in from each edge. Turn under 13 rows on upper edge and hem to wrong side. Insert an elastic band into hem. Work 1 row of single crochet around lower edge, then sew on the trim. **JACKET:** Join front and back sections at sides and shoulders. Sew sleeves together and set in. Work 1 row of single crochet around all edges, then sew on the trim. Finish buttonholes, sew on the buttons.

CROCHET TRIM

With Sonika Dralon, make a chain of appropriate length (1 length for skirt, 1 length of trim to fit around front edges, neckline and lower edge of jacket, 1 length of trim for each sleeve). Row 1: Beginning with the 2nd chain, work 1 single crochet into each chain st. Row 2: *Yarn over, insert hook into 2nd single crochet, pull up loop, REPEAT from * 2 times more, then yarn over and pull through all loops on hook, chain 3, single crochet into 1st chain st. etc., etc.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Rows 168, 169; 3 sts. after Rows 170, 171; 2 sts. after Rows 172, 173, 174, 175. **ON EACH SIDE, hang the 1st st. onto the 2nd st. after Rows 176, 178, 180, 182, 184, 186, 188, 190, 192, 194, 196, 198, 200.** **ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Rows 202, 203, 204, 205, 206, 207, 208, 209, 210, 211, 212, 213; 3 sts. after Rows 214, 215, 216, 217, 218, 219; 15 sts. after Row 220.** **ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 10, 18, 26, 34, 42, 50, 58, 66, 74, 82, 90, 98, 106, 114, 122, 130, 138, 146, 154, 162, then knit to Row 168.** **ROWS 0 to 10:** Knit even. **Cast on 67 sts. and work stockinette st.**



Work the second front section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to left. (Cam Box will be on the LEFT side at Row 0). Omit the buttonholes.

Continue to decrease 1 st. ON NECK SIDE after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 6 sts. after Row 136; 4 sts. after Row 138; (138), 2 sts. after Row 140; 1 st. after Rows 142, (142), 144, 146, (146). The Armhole Shaping is now completed. Continue to decrease 1 st. ON NECK SIDE after Rows 150, 154, 158, 162, 166, 170, 174, 178, 182, 186, 190, 194, 198, 202, 206, 210, 214, 218, 222, then 1 more time after Row in (). For SHOULDER, bind off 5 sts. after Rows 224, 226, (226), 228, 230, 232, 234; 6 sts. after Row 236.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX (NECK SIDE) decrease 1 st. after Rows 110, 114, 118, 122, 126, 130, 134, then knit to Row 136.

ROWS 0 to 110: Knit even and make buttonholes after Rows 20, 46, 72 and 98 over the 5th-8th needles counting from the left side.

Cast on 81 sts. and work stockinette st.

Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 228 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Row 228 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 6 sts. after Row 229 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 5 sts. after Row 230; 4 sts. after Row 231; 5 sts. after Row 232; 3 sts. after Row 233; 5 sts. after Row 234; 6 sts. after Row 236.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Rows 224, 226, 228, 227. Now knit to Row 228, bind off the center 22 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 136, 137; 3 sts. after Rows 138, 139; 2 sts. after Rows 140, 141; 1 st. after Rows 142, 143, 144, 145, 146, 147, then knit to Row 224.


ROWS 0 to 136: Knit even.

Cast on 144 sts. and work stockinette st.



SIZE: 12/14. **MATERIAL:** Pullover: 12¼ oz. (7 balls); Slacks: 17½ oz. (10 balls) white KNITTING Subita Crepe 2 x 3 and 2 yards embroidered border trim. **TENSION:** KNITTING 3 to 5. **GAUGE:** 18 sts, 2", 25 rows 2". **PATTERN:** Stockinette Stitch. Except on the Armholes, make all shapings of 1 st. **Full-fashion. DECREASES:** After rows indicated, hang the 3rd st. on the appropriate sides onto the 2nd st., then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needles. **INCREASES:** After rows indicated, move the 2 end sts. on the appropriate sides 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle. Begin the Slacks Darts by hanging the sts. together as marked on the diagram, then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needles. The following decreases for the darts lie directly above.


FINISHING: Block all sections to measurements given. **PULLOVER:** Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. Sew sleeves together and set in. Turn under 13 rows on sleeve edges and 15 rows on lower edge and hem to wrong side. Work 1 row of single crochet around neckline. Fold collar in half lengthwise and sew short ends. Sew 1 edge of collar to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline. Sew trim to neckline, collar and sleeve edges. (See picture for placement of collar and trim). **SLACKS:** Join front and back sections at sides. Close inner seams. Join sections at front and back center. Turn under 20 rows on leg edges and upper edge and hem to wrong side. Insert an elastic band into upper



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Work the second skirt section the same. ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 68, 80, 92, 104, 116, 128, 140, 152, 158, 164, 170, 176, 180, 184, 188, 192, 196, 200, 204, 208, 212, 214, 216, 218, 220, then knit to Row 246 and bind off the remaining 107 sts. ROWS 0 to 68: Knit even. Cast on 157 sts. and work stockinette st.



Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 228 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

* ON NECK SIDE decrease 1 st. after Rows in (). Continue to decrease 1 st. for Armhole after Rows 228, (228), 230, 232, 234, (234), 236. The Armhole Shaping is now completed. Continue to decrease 1 st. ON NECK SIDE after Rows 240, 246, 252, 258, 262, 266, 270, 274, 278, 282, 286, 290, 294, 298, 302, 306, then again after Rows in (). For SHOULDER bind off 3 sts. after Rows 310, (310), 312; 4 sts. after Rows 314, (314), 316, 318, (318), 320, 322, (322), 324, 326, (326), 328, 330.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Rows 214, 215; 3 sts. after Rows 216, 217, 218, 219; 2 sts. after Rows 220, 221, 222, 223, 224, 225; 1 st. after Rows 226, 227, then knit to Row 228, put 70 needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.


Work Short Rows for the Darts. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX put into holding position 6 needles after Rows 186, 187, 188, 189, 190, 191, 192, 193, 194, 195, 196, 197, 198, 199. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX bring all needles back into working position after Rows 200, 201, then knit to Row 214.

ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 50, 60, 70, 80, 90, 100, then knit to Row 186. ROWS 0 to 50: Knit even. Cast on 188 sts. and work stockinette st.

DK 7936

SIZE: 10/12. **MATERIAL:** TOP 14 oz. (8 balls); SLACKS 15½ oz. (9 balls) white KNITTING Subita Crepe 2 x 3, 2½ yards embroidered border trim and 5 yards gold Rick-Rack. **TENSION:** KNITTING 3 to 5. **GAUGE:** 18 sts, 2", 25 rows 2". **PATTERN:** Stockinette Stitch. Except on the Armholes, make all shapings of 1 st. Full-Fashion. **DECREASES:** After rows indicated, hang the 3rd st. on the appropriate sides onto the 2nd st., then move the end st. inward to fill the empty needles. **INCREASES:** After rows indicated, move the 2 end sts. on the appropriate sides 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle. Begin the Slacks Darts by hanging the sts. together as marked on the diagram, then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needles. The following decreases for the darts lie directly above.

FINISHING: Block all sections to measurements given. **TOP:** Join front and back section at shoulders and sides, leaving about 10" on each side open for the slits. Sew sleeves together and set in. Turn under 15 rows on lower edge and sleeve edges and hem to wrong side. Sew 1 edge of neckband to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline. Work 1 row of single crochet around front opening and at side openings. Sew the border trim to lower edge, then sew Rick-Rack to upper and lower edge of border. (See picture). Sew a button to each side of front opening and close buttons with a twisted cord worked into a loop. For the belt twist 14 strands of yarn into a cord. (See Practical Knitting Hints Book, page 58). **SLACKS:** Join front and back sections at sides. Close inner leg seams. Join sections at center of front and back. Turn under 20 rows on leg edges and upper edge and hem to wrong side. Insert an elastic band into upper hem.






ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Rows 220, 221; 3 sts. after Rows 222, 223, 224, 225; 2 sts. after Rows 226, 227, 228, 229, 230, 231. **ON EACH SIDE,** hang the 1 st. onto the 2nd st. after Rows 232, 234, 236, 238, 240, 242, 244, 246, 248, 250, 252, 254, 256, 258, 260, 262, 264, 266, 268, 270, 272, 274. **ON CAM BOX SIDE,** bind off 2 sts. after Rows 276, 277, 278, 279; 3 sts. after Rows 280, 281; 4 sts. after Rows 282, 283, 284, 285; 14 sts. after Row 286.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 30, 40, 50, 60, 68, 76, 84, 92, 100, 108, 116, 124, 132, 140, 148, 156, 164, 172, 180, 188, 196, 204, 212, then knit to Row 220.

ROWS 0 to 30: Knit even.

Cast on 76 sts. and work stockinette st.



Cast on 133 sts. and work 26 rows stockinette st., then bind off all sts. the crochet method.

Work the second back section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to left. (Cam Box will be on the LEFT side at Row 0).

Work Short Rows for the shaping. **ON OPPOSITE SIDE** of CAM BOX put into holding position 6 needles after Rows 506, 508, 510, 512, 514, 516, 518, 520. After Row 522 bring all needles back into working position, then knit to Row 562 and bind off the remaining 71 sts.

Decrease 1 st. **ON EACH SIDE** and 2 sts. for EACH DART after Row 464, then decrease 1 st. **ON CAM BOX SIDE** after Rows in () and 2 sts. for EACH dart when indicated. **ON OPPOSITE SIDE** of CAM BOX decrease 1 st. after Rows 470, (472), 476, (480), 482, (2 sts. for EACH dart after Row 484), 488, (488), 494, (496), 500, (504) and 2 sts. for EACH dart after Row 504, then knit to Row 506.



ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 386, 388, 390; 3 sts. after Rows 392, 394; 2 sts. after Rows 396, 398, 400, 402; 1 st. after Rows 404, 406, 408, 410, 412, 416, 420, 424, 432, 440, 448, 456, then knit to Row 464.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 216, 224, 232, 240, 248, 256, 264, 272, 280, 288, 296 then increase 1 st. **ON OPPOSITE SIDE** of CAM BOX (SIDE SEAM) after Rows in (). **ON CAM BOX SIDE (INNER SEAM)** increase 1 st. after Rows 302, (304), 308, (312), 314, 320, (320), 326, (328), 332, (336), 338, 344, (344), 350, (352), 356, (360), 362, 368, (368), 374, (376), 380, (384), then knit to Row 386.

ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 40, 68, 96, 124, 152, then knit to Row 216.

ROWS 0 to 40: Knit even.

Cast on 97 sts. and work stockinette st.



Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 344 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 344 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 5 sts. after Row 345 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 4 sts. after Row 346; 3 sts. after Row 347; 4 sts. after Row 348; 3 sts. after Row 349; 4 sts. after Row 350; 2 sts. after Row 351; 4 sts. after Row 352; 2 sts. after Row 353; 5 sts. after Row 354; 2 sts. after Row 355; 5 sts. after Rows 356, 358, 360.

Having the short ends of the collar at the shoulder opening, sew 1 edge of collar to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline. Sew a zipper to the opening.




ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 24, 34, 44, 54, 64, 74, 84, 94, 102, 110, 118, 126, 134, then knit to Row 142, change to white and increase 1 more st. **ON EACH SIDE.** Knit 4 rows white and 4 rows red. After Row 150 bind off all 86 sts. the crochet method. **ROWS 0 to 24:** Knit even, then change to stockinette st.

Cast on 58 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing.



Cast on 125 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing. After Row 48 bind off all sts. the crochet method for ribbing.



Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 168 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

* **ON CAM BOX SIDE,** increase 1 st. after Row 168, then 1 more time after Row in (). **ON CAM BOX SIDE,** bind off 3 sts. after Rows 169, 171 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 2 sts. after Rows 173, (174), 175, 177; 1 st. after Row 179; 4 sts. after Row 180 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 1 st. after Row 181 (last time for Neck); 4 sts. after Rows 182, 184; 5 sts. after Rows 186, 188, 190; 8 sts. after Rows 192, 194, 196.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 126, 132, 138, 144, 150, 156, 162, then knit to Row 168, bind off the center 10 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ROWS 25 to 126: Knit even and change to white after Row 118, then change to red after Row 122. After Row 126 continue with blue.

ROWS 0 to 24: Knit even, then change to stockinette st.

Cast on 122 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing.

Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 188 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

* **ON CAM BOX SIDE,** bind off 5 sts. after Row 188 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 4 sts. after Row 189 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 5 sts. after Row 190; 4 sts. after Row 191; 8 sts. after Row 192; 3 sts. after Row 193; 8 sts. after Rows 194, 196.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 180, 181, 182, 183, 184, 185; 5 sts. after Rows 186, 187, then knit to Row 188, bind off the center 16 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 126, 132, 138, 144, 150, 156, 162, 168, 174, then knit to Row 180.

ROWS 25 to 126: Knit even and change to white after Row 118, then change to red after Row 122. After Row 126 continue with blue.


ROWS 0 to 24: Knit even, then change to stockinette st.

Cast on 122 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing.

SIZE: 4-5 (Chest 23"-23½"). MATERIAL: COVERALLS 7 oz. (4 balls) blue and 1¼ oz. (1 ball) red; PULLOVER 5¼ oz. (3 balls) white KNOTTING Subita Dralon 3 ply and leather for the heart shaped trim on the Coveralls. TENSION: KNITTING 5 to 7. GAUGE: Stockinette Stitch 12 sts, 2"; Pattern-Stitch 12 sts, 2"; 28 rows 2". PATTERN: COVERALLS: Stockinette Stitch; PULLOVER: Holding Position Design according to Line Drawing, worn on the puri side. KNITTING Machines use Wheel No. 3. EDGES: K1, P1, Ribbing. INCREASES: After rows indicated, move the 2 end sts. ON EACH SIDE 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle. DECREASES: After rows indicated, hang the 3rd st. on the appropriate side onto the 2nd st., then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle.

FINISHING: Block all sections to measurements given. COVERALLS: Close leg seams. Join sections at center back and for 4" at center front, leaving the remainder of the front free for the opening. Turn under 16 rows on leg edges and hem to wrong side. Work 1 row of single crochet with blue and 1 row of double crochet with red around all edges. Sew trimmed leather hearts to knees. (See picture). Sew a zipper to front opening. PULLOVER: Join front and back section at sides and shoulders, leaving 2" of the right shoulder free for the opening. Sew sleeves together and set in. Turn under a small amount around the opening and hem to wrong side. With short ends on the right shoulder, sew 1 edge of neckband to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline. Work 3 loops on 1 side and sew 3 buttons to other side of opening.

Cast on 108 sts. and work 22 rows K1, P1. Ribbing, then bind off all sts. the crochet method for ribbing.



Bring the needles on the left side back into working position, knit 1 row in PATTERN to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 186 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.



* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Row 186 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 3 sts. after Row 187 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 2 sts. after Rows 188, 189, 190, 191, 192; 3 sts. after Rows 194, 196, 198.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 120, 121; 2 sts. after Rows 124, 125; 1 st. after Rows 128, 129, 132, 133, 136, 137, then knit to Row 186, bind off the center 11 sts, put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first. (For the FRONT SECTION knit to Row 164).

ROWS 15 to 120: Knit even.

ROWS 0 to 14: Knit even, then transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine and work the Holding Position Design.

Cast on 75 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing.




ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 132, 133, 136, 137; 2 sts. after Rows 140, 141, 144, 145; 1 st. after Rows 148, 149, 152, 153, 156, 157, 160, 161; 2 sts. after Rows 164, 165, 168, 169; 3 sts. after Rows 172, 173; 11 sts. after Row 176.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 14, 15, 32, 33, 50, 51, 68, 69, 84, 85, 100, 101, 116, 117, then knit to Row 132.

ROWS 0 to 14: Knit even, then transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine and work the Holding Position Design.


Cast on 39 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing.



Bring the needles on the left side back into working position, knit 1 row in PATTERN to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 164 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Row 165 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 2 sts. after Row 167; 1 st. after Rows 169, 171, 173. For SHOULDER bind off 2 sts. after Rows 186, 188, 190, 192; 3 sts. after Rows 194, 196, 198.

Work the Front Section the same as the Back Section to Row 164, then bind off the center 9 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.



Work the second section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to left. (Cam Box will be on the LEFT side at Row 0).

ON CAM BOX SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Row 272 (EVEN ROWS = FRONT NECK SHAPING); 3 sts. after Row 273 (ODD ROWS = ARMHOLE SHAPING); 1 st. after Row 274; 3 sts. after Row 276; 2 sts. after Row 277; 1 st. after Row 278; 2 sts. after Row 279; 1 st. after Rows 280, 281, 282, 283, 284, 285 (last time for Armhole), 286, 288, 292, 296, 300, 304, 308, 312, 316, 320, 324, 328, 332, 336. After Row 340 bind off the remaining 12 sts. for SHOULDER.

Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 272 and complete the left half.


ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 314, 316 (EVEN ROWS = BACK NECK SHAPING); 3 sts. after Rows 318, 320; 2 sts. after Rows 322, 324; 1 st. after Rows 326, 328, 330. After Row 340 bind off the remaining 12 sts. for SHOULDER.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Row 273, 275 (ODD ROWS = ARMHOLE SHAPING); 2 sts. after Rows 277, 279; 1 st. after Rows 281, 283, 285, then knit to Row 314.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Rows 150, 151, 152, 153. ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 154, 156, 158, 160, 164, 168, then knit to Row 272, bind off the center 8 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 58, 66, 74, 82, 90, 96, 102, 108, 114, 120, 126, 132, 138, 144, then knit to Row 150.

ROWS 0 to 58: Knit even. Cast on 92 sts. and work stockinette st.

OUR READERS WRITE

We get many letters asking about Short Rows.... This suggests to us that many people do not have one of our marvelous little books "Practical Knitting Hints." The following is a complete excerpt from Practical Knitting Hints... If you are using your knitting machine, this book is indispensable... It is full of similar hints and will help you in every phase of machine knitting.

Using Short Rows

Knitting short rows is a standard procedure and is used for socks (heels and toes) diagonally worked bell shaped skirts and the seat of trousers. Beyond that, the possibilities to simplify and improve your knitting with short rows are many. We will present some of these possibilities here. The techniques employed in working short rows are well known as they are presented and explained in the KNITTING Instruction Manual and Home Study Course.

Shoulder Shaping Using Short Rows

1. Shoulder shaping is obtained by several consecutive decreases which always occur on every other row. Instead of binding off for these decreases, the needles with the stitches to be bound off are simply put into holding position. For example, if you are knitting the front of a pullover and have started the neck shaping and the needles on the left side are in holding position. The instructions state: After row 230, and on every other row bind off 7 sts. 6 x. After row 231, (the cam box is on the left side) you will put 7 stitches on the right side into holding position, then knit 2 rows. Again you will put 7 needles on the right side into holding position and knit 2 rows. Continue following this procedure until all stitches for the shoulder shaping are in holding position. As always when working short rows, the yarn must, each time, be passed around the nearest needle in holding position. Now bring all the needles into working position and bind off, or if you desire, you may knit 1 more row before binding off. This way, the doubled stitches (those made when you wrap the yarn around the needle) are knitted and the slanted shaping runs evenly without the "steps" which otherwise occur between the decreases. This final row, when you knit across over all the needles, is not included in the row count of the pattern. When knitting short rows with the automatic yarn feeder and you are passing the yarn around the nearest needle in holding position, be sure that the yarn does not catch on any of the needles in holding position.

Bustline Darts Using Short Rows

2. Bustline darts for pullovers, dresses or jackets will also turn out very well when they are knitted with short rows. If in our directions we state that the darts are to be sewn in on the completed garment or that you are to ease in the fullness at the bust line of the front section, we do not wish to imply that we do not approve of darts that are worked into the garment. On the contrary, as you know a good fitting bust dart is very important and the figures of women who wear the same size dress will vary. A dart sewn in on a completed garment can be adjusted to fit any figure, whereas a dart that is worked into a garment must be made in the right position. Therefore, we prefer to let every woman decide for herself which type she favors. By following our diagram, you can work the darts into the garment as the garment is being made instead of sewing it in the completed garment. In general, begin the darts according to figure and size about 1 1/2" to 2 1/2" below the armhole shaping and shape the darts in the direction of the tip of the bust. The width of the darts is given in our diagram in inches and the height is also shown on the chart. The exact number of inches and rows to be used for the darts can be determined by subtracting the length of the back section from the bottom to the armhole shaping from the length of the front section, from the bottom to the armhole shaping. For the average sizes, this difference will be between 3/4"

to 2". For example, if we were to make darts in a pullover, we would take a width of 36 stitches (4 3/4") and a height of 12 rows (1 1/4") for each side. Therefore, working with short rows on every other row, we must divide the 36 stitches for 6 decreases (12 rows). In other words, on each side of every other row, put 6 needles into holding position 6 x. As always, these needles are on the side opposite the Cam Box — and here also, the yarn is passed around the nearest needle in holding position. You will then have 12 rows with 36 needles on each side in holding position. Now put the 36 needles on the opposite side of the Cam Box back into working position and work 1 row. Then put the 36 needles on the other side back into working position and work 1 row. The dart is now completed. It is important to note that the needles on each side are put into holding position successively, but they are brought back into working position simultaneously. In this way, the darts slant upward with a gradual shaping and a very good fit is guaranteed.

3. Neck shapings, where the decreases do occur on every other row, can also be made by knitting short rows. If, for example, for the first decrease on the neck shaping, you are to bind off 12 center stitches, instead of binding them off, put the 12 center needles into holding position and to mark them for later reference, close the latches of these 12 needles and put the remaining needles on the left side into holding position. Your Cam Box is on the right side, knit 2 rows, then put the needles for the next number of stitches to be bound off, into holding position. As stated before, remember to pass the yarn around the nearest needle in holding position. Continue to put the needles into holding position on every other row until the bind-offs are made on every 4th row. You must then decrease the conventional way by transferring the stitches to the neighboring needle. After the right half is completed, move the Cam Box to the left side, bring all the needles on the left side (with the exception of the needles marked with closed latches,) back into working position and knit the left half to correspond with the right half. After the left half is completed, bring all needles into working position and knit 1 row with a tension 5 settings higher, then bind off the crochet method. If a tension higher than 5 was used for the garment, knit this row manually (one stitch at a time) to form large stitches.

4. Frequently, sleeves are knitted from the top down. This is often done in childrens clothing so that you can easily unravel sleeves that have become too short or have worn out and re-knit them. Here also, it will simplify the work if you knit short rows. To knit a sleeve from the top down, you must cast on all the stitches necessary for the entire upper arm width. On the side opposite the Cam Box, put the number of needles, which will be needed later for increases, into holding position. Knit 1 row. Now put the same number of needles on the opposite side into holding position. (In the center, there will be from 2" to 2 3/4" of stitches in working position before you knit the second row.) Knit 1 row. Now, alternately, on each side, bring the needles as required for the rounded cap and under arm shaping into working position. When all needles are in working position, the sleeve cap is completed and the remaining section of the sleeve can be worked. This method of knitting the sleeve cap and underarm shaping gives a very uniform and neat edge and additionally, it can be worked quickly as you do not have to cast on extra stitches for the increases, but simply have to bring the appropriate needles back into working position. Here also, the yarn must be passed around the nearest needle in holding position. For you readers who will be trying this method for the first time, here are 2 suggestions:


1. Study the pattern stitch! If the direction of a pattern stitch is distinct, you must always begin the sleeve at the bottom edge. Otherwise, there will be a noticeable and disagreeable difference in the appearance of the front and back sections worked in one direction and the sleeves which have been worked in the opposite direction.

2. If you are using a KNITKING MAGAZINE pattern you can arrange to work the sleeve from the top instead of the bottom with the exception that you will follow the rows in reverse fashion. The stitches which are the last to be bound off at the top of the sleeve worked from the bottom will become the stitches which are in working position at the beginning of the sleeve worked from the top. You should, however, avoid shapings which have decreases on every 4th row because there is a possibility that the cast on edge will not be elastic enough. Round armhole and neck shapings may also be knitted with



short rows as long as the decreases occur consecutively on every other row.

You can obtain a good fit on a ribbed collar if you knit it with short rows. This means that you will knit more rows for the center back section than for the front collar sections. Before you put the needles consecutively into holding position for the short rows, you must first always transfer the appropriate Ribber stitches to the main machine. When knitting short rows for a ribbed collar, you will also lay the yarn around the nearest needle in holding position as you do with all short rows.

You can quickly and easily knit the collar pictured here, in one section, if you use the short row method commonly used for knitting sock toes and heels. Cast on enough stitches to give you the double width of the collar. If the finished collar width is 2 1/2" to 2 3/4", cast on 5" to 5 1/2". Immediately after casting on, you will start knitting the mitered shapings. When doing so, the Cam Box must be on the RIGHT side of the machine. Now, on the RIGHT side put 1 needle in holding position and knit 1 row, then on the left side, put 1 needle in holding position and knit 1 row. Repeat these two rows until only 2 or 3 needles in the center are left in working position and the Cam Box is again on the right side. Now individually and consecutively, bring the needles back into working position on the side opposite the Cam Box. The yarn is not laid around the nearest needle in holding position as is usually done when knitting short rows.


When all needles are back in working position and the Cam Box is again on the right side, the first collar corner is completed. Now knit as many rows as are necessary for the width of the collar, taking into consideration the two collar corners. Then knit the second collar corner with the mitered shapings, exactly the same as the first. When the last needle on the left side is back into working position, knit one row over all the needles, then bind off all the stitches. The collar will be folded in half and may be steamed in a slightly curved position. If you want a less pointed collar than the one pictured, leave 4 or 5 center needles in working position instead of 2 or 3.

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NOTES TO KNIT BY . . .

STITCH AND ROW GAUGE

KNIT A SAMPLE SWATCH . . . before you begin to knit any garment . . . for this is the **MOST IMPORTANT STEP** toward the correct size and the proper fit of any garment you wish to make. You **MUST** use the **SAME YARN** for your sample swatch that you will use to knit your garment and your sample swatch must be knitted large enough and using several different tension numbers on your machine. When you have done this, then you can determine the number of stitches and the number of rows in a two-inch measure. **KNITTING MAGAZINE PATTERNS** give you 3 tensions to try and one of them should give you the correct stitch and row gauge if you are using the yarn we recommend or a similar weight yarn. Here is the way to make your sample swatch.

Cast on over a sufficient number of needles to produce a swatch at least 4 inches wide. (If the pattern calls for 16 stitches to 2", then $16 \times 2 = 32$ stitches to cast on). Now knit 4 inches of rows at the first suggested tension number. (If the pattern calls for 22 rows to 2", $22 \times 2 = 44$ rows to knit). Knit 2 rows using a contrast color, change to the next higher tension and with garment yarn knit another 4", knit 2 rows with contrast color, change to the 3rd higher tension and knit another 4" and then bind off.

Roll the swatch into a cylinder over its length and pull on both ends, unroll it and stretch it diagonally by pulling on the four corners. Allow the swatch to rest and settle (preferably overnight) and then using a stitch gauge or a ruler, count the number of stitches over a 2" width, then the number of rows over a 2" length in EACH of the 3 tensions. Select the tension number that produces the stitches and rows called for in the pattern. If none of them are correct, you are most likely using the wrong weight of yarn.

READING OF CHARTS

You will notice the instructions start at the bottom of the Chart and work UP. Follow the charts exactly as written and providing your sample stitch and row gauge is correct, your garment will come out the right size. Please remember that the section of garment as it is knitted on the machine, faces the same way as the Charts are in this magazine. Where two front pieces are needed, (or any other part of a garment that needs two sections) only one section is normally shown and the second section is usually made with reverse shaping. Set in sleeves are usually identical, but raglan sleeves have to be knitted with reverse shaping for the second sleeve.

READING OF SYMBOLS

To simplify Pattern Knitting, we use Symbols in the Line Drawings and the Chart Diagrams. In the Line Drawings the symbols are shown and are to be read as you look at them while knitting a garment. For instance, if

a Purl stitch faces you, the Purl stitch Symbol  is shown; if a knit stitch faces you (as when using the Ribber) then this Symbol  is shown. The Symbol  at the top of the Line Drawing is the center of the garment section and you use this as a guide for setting up the needles.

The following Symbols    are used for Eyelet Designs in the Line Drawings and also for Full Fashion shaping on the Charts. The Line Drawings have row numbers on the right side. Missing Row numbers are always knitted straight or plain.

In Holding Position Designs  selected needles are pushed into holding position for the stated number of rows. The numbers of rows appear at the right of the Line Drawings; Example: 1-4 means knit Rows 1 to 4; 5 to 7 means knit Rows 5 to 7, etc. This same Symbol is also shown on the Charts and is used for putting needles into holding position for Short Rows. The

Symbol  on the Charts is used to put needles back into working position when knitting Short Rows.

A number in a box stands for the number of rows to be knitted between shapings. Make shaping first, then knit the necessary number of rows. If for instance it reads:

1 st. 8 x



1 st. 10 x



As you will be reading the instructions from the bottom up, here is the way you will follow them: . . . Decrease or increase (depending on the direction of the garment outline) 1 st. at the row where the shaping begins, then knit 8 rows, make the next decrease, then knit 8 rows, until you have decreased (or increased) 1 st. 10 x and you have knitted 8 rows after each decrease (or increase) (1 st. 10 x + 8 rows 10 x). Now begin the first decrease (or increase) for the shaping (which has to be made 8 x) in every 6th row. Decrease (or increase) 1 st. first, then knit 6 rows until you have decreased 1 st. 6 x and after each decrease (or increase) have knitted 6 rows (1 st. 8 x + 6 rows 8 x).

Where shapings are given without a boxed number as on most armholes, necklines, etc., make the shapings on every second row (on each side of course).

(See below for more Pattern Stitch Symbols.)

PATTERN STITCH SYMBOLS

 = knit stitch

 = purl stitch

 = empty needle (leave in working position)

 = needle not used (in the out of work position)

 = needle in the holding position

 = Needles back into working position.

 = 2 stitches on 1 needle - either transferred from the right side or the left side, then put the needle into holding position

 = needle holding 2 stitches. Stitch has been transferred from the LEFT

 = needle holding 2 stitches. Stitch has been transferred from the RIGHT

 = 3 stitches on 1 needle. The 1st and 3rd stitch in a group of 3 needles has been hung on the 2nd or center needle.

 = Center of Garment Section.

 = Number of rows to be knitted between shapings.

The diagrams (Line Drawings) for pattern work are followed just as they are shown and are to be read as you look at them while knitting the garment.


