We take great pleasure in wishing all our readers a joyous Christmas and peace and contentment for 1971.



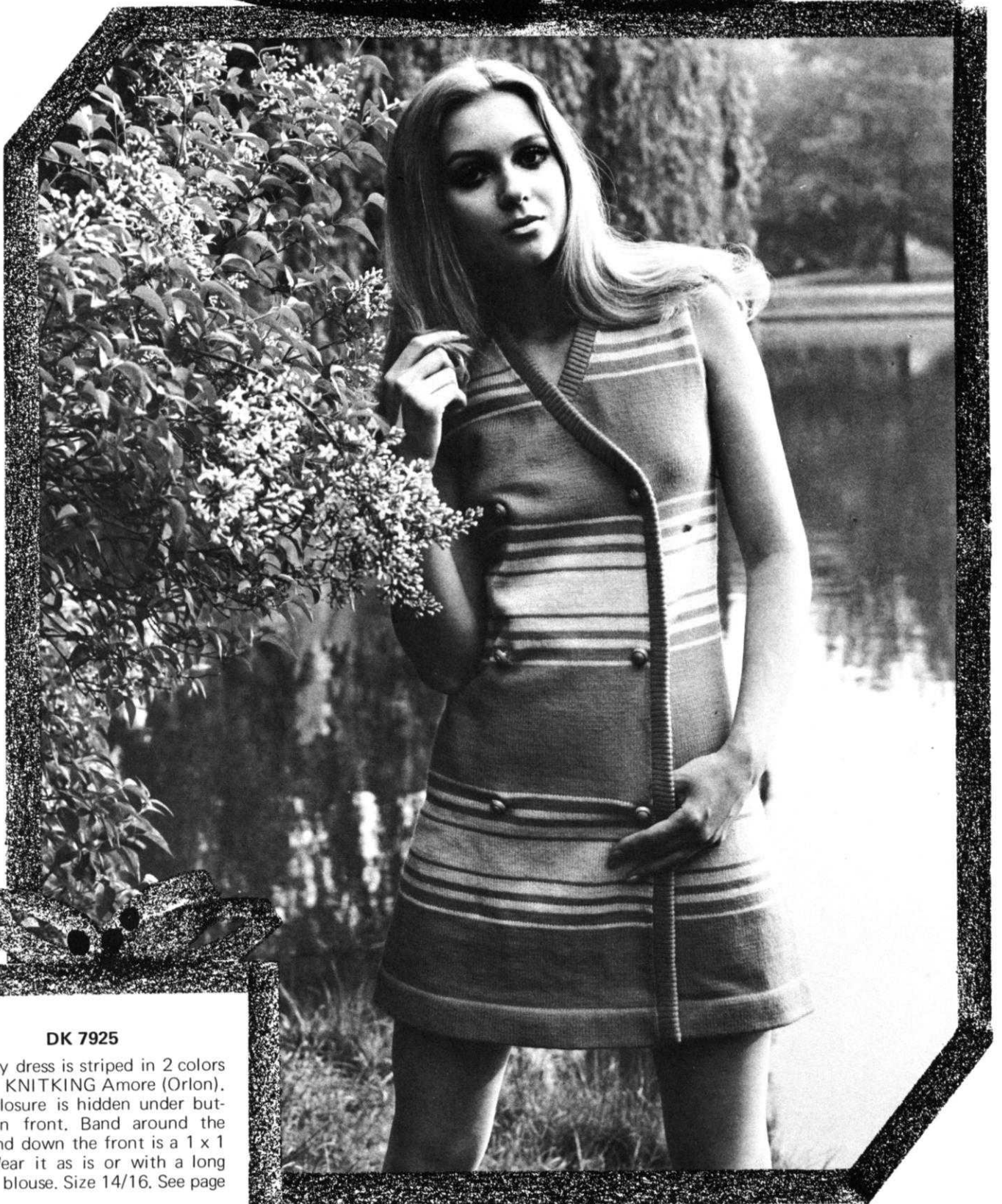

Purr-fect for day or evening wear is our beautifully styled 3 piece Pant-suit. Knit it in KNITKINGS' Subita Crepe 2 x 3. The Tunic top has a zippered front closure and both Pullover and Tunic have a Norwegian Border Design at lower edge. Follow the line drawing or use JAC 40 and Pattern No. 420. Size 8/10. See page 13





DK 7925

A lovely dress is striped in 2 colors of lush KNITKING Amore (Orlon). Snap closure is hidden under buttons on front. Band around the neck and down the front is a 1 x 1 Rib. Wear it as is or with a long sleeved blouse. Size 14/16. See page 17.



DK 7926

A smartly tailored Pantsuit is knitted in stockinette stitch with KNITKING Excelsior. You have a choice of short sleeves as shown in Photograph or long sleeves included with Pattern. The Collar, sleeve edges and top of large pockets are ribbed. A zipper is used for closing the front. Size 16/18. See page 18.



DK 7929

Look smart and fashionable in a Skirt with a matching Vest. The Skirt is knitted in 6 sections then woven together. The Vest has an Eyelet Design on the front section. Use a 1 x 1 rib for the Bands. KNITKING Crocus Crepe. Size 18/20. See page 16.

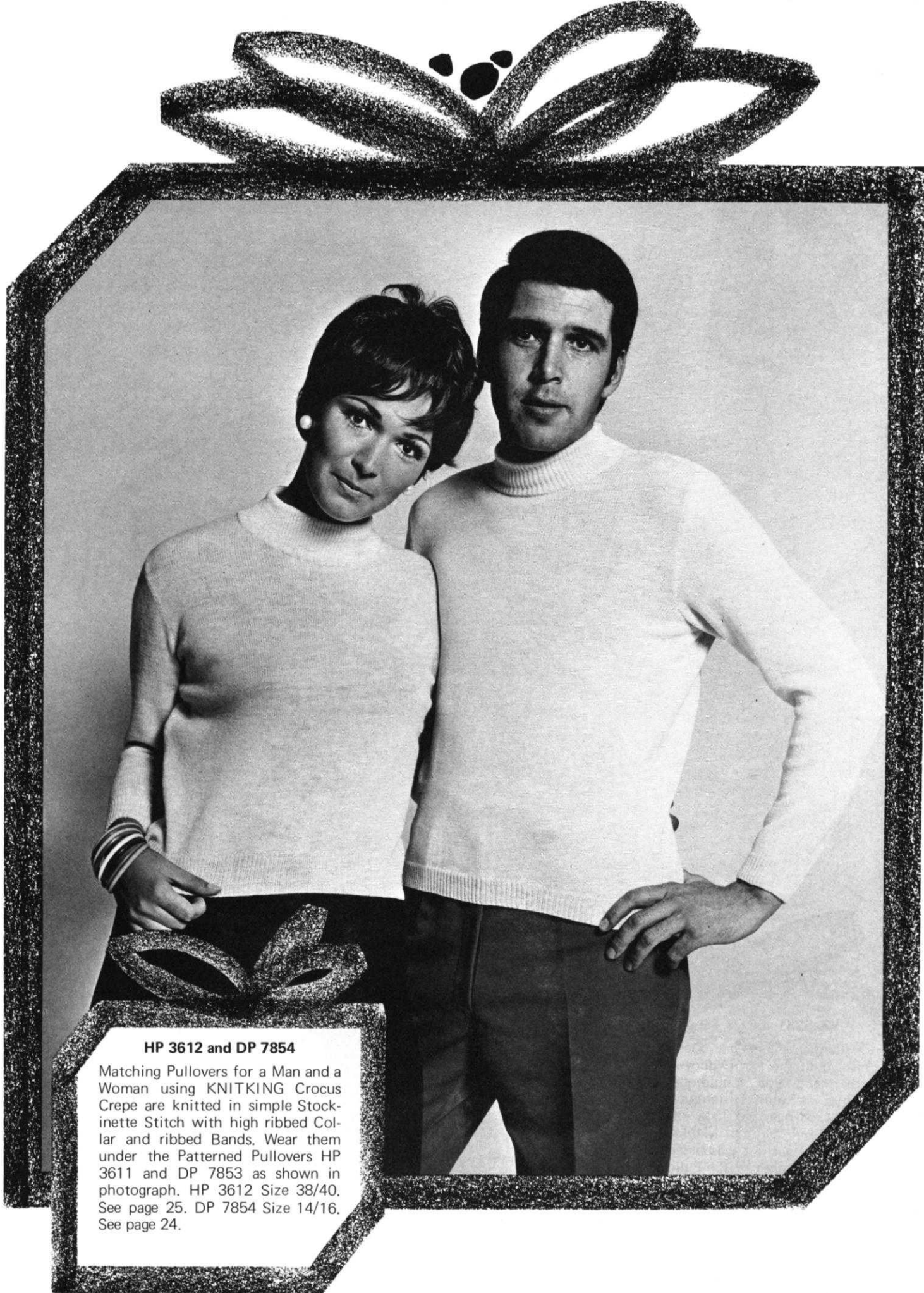


HP 3611

A patterned V Necked Pullover for a Man is knitted in a Holding Position Design that follows the line drawing. KNITKING machines may use Wheel 6 and the Needle Shifter. The yarn... Blue and White KNITKING Fortissima... a long hard wearing sport weight yarn. Size 38/40. See page 22.

DP 7853

Red and White KNITKING machine washable Crocus Crepe makes a beautiful Norwegian Design Pullover. Follow the Line Drawing or use your JAC 40 and Pattern No. 417. Size 14/16. See page 23.



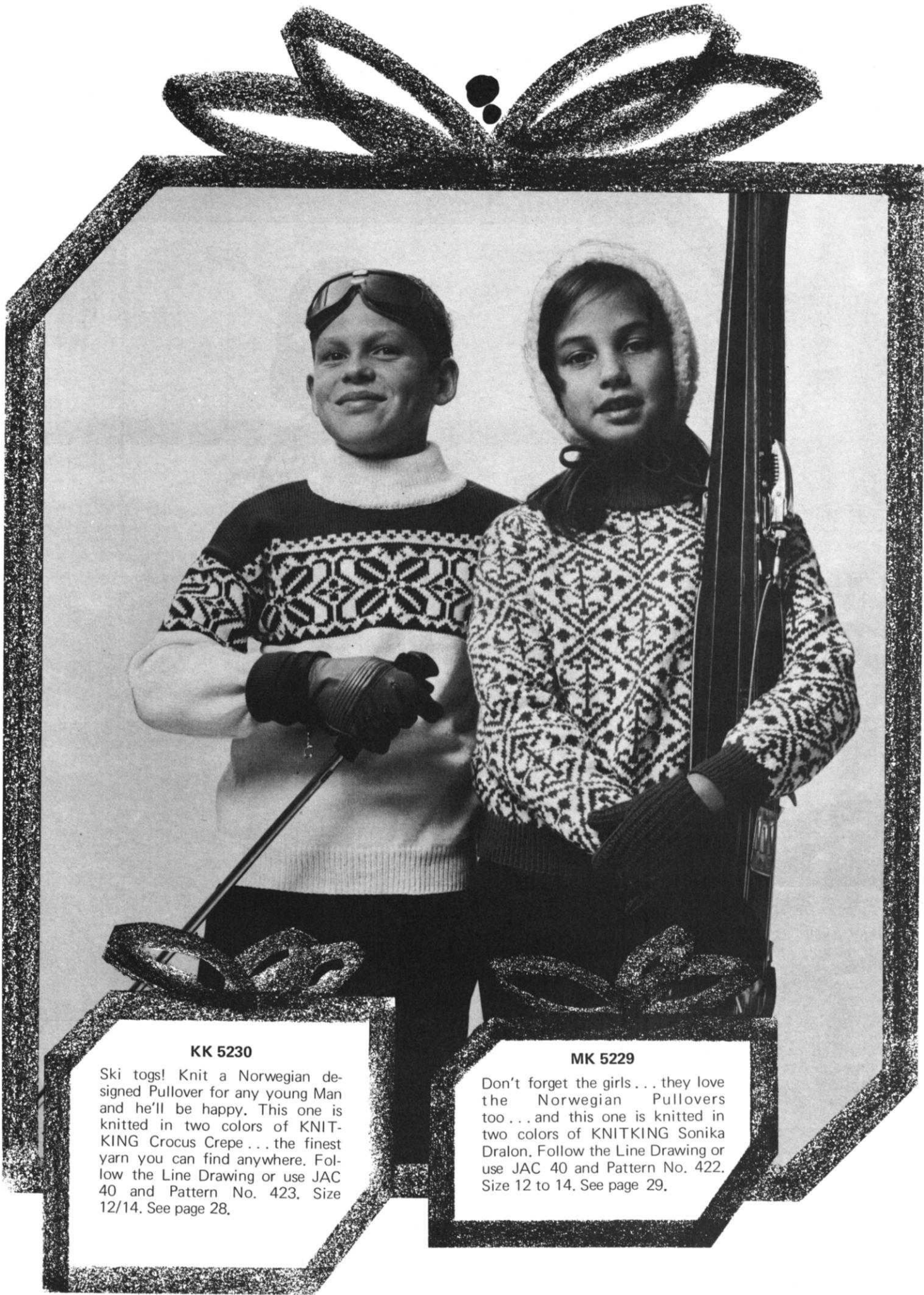
HP 3612 and DP 7854

Matching Pullovers for a Man and a Woman using KNITTING Crocus Crepe are knitted in simple Stockinette Stitch with high ribbed Collar and ribbed Bands. Wear them under the Patterned Pullovers HP 3611 and DP 7853 as shown in photograph. HP 3612 Size 38/40. See page 25. DP 7854 Size 14/16. See page 24.



KK 5231 and DP 7857

The identical Norwegian Design is used to knit the warm Pullovers for Mother and Son (could be for daughter as well). Different color schemes change the look of the design. Use 4 colors of KNITKING 100% wool machine washable Crocus Crepe for each of the Pullovers and follow the Line Drawing or use your JAC 40 and Pattern No. 430. KK 5231 Size 6 to 8. See page 27. Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 378 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 379, 381, 383; 2 sts. after Rows 385, 387; 1 st. after Rows 389, 391, 393, 397, 401. For SHOULDER bind off 4 sts. after Rows 404, 406, 408, 410, 412, 414, 416, 418.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 320, 321; 3 sts. after Rows 322, 323, 324, 325; 2 sts. after Rows 326, 327, 328, 329; 1 st. after Rows 330, 331, 332, 333, then knit to Row 378, bind off the center 15 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ROWS 313 to 320: Work stockinette st. and knit even. After Row 320 continue working the Norwegian Design. Work the front section the same as the back section to ROW 312.

Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to Row 396 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

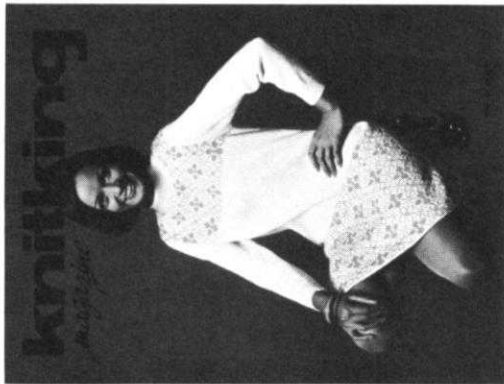
* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 396 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING), 397 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING), 398, 399, 400, 401, 402; 3 sts. after Row 403; 4 sts. after Row 404; 3 sts. after Row 405; 4 sts. after Rows 406, 408, 410.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 312, 313; 3 sts. after Rows 314, 315, 316, 317; 2 sts. after Rows 318, 319, 320, 321; 1 st. after Rows 322, 323, 324, 325, then knit to Row 396, bind off the center 15 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 242, 256, 270, 284, 298, then knit to Row 312 and continue working the Norwegian Design.

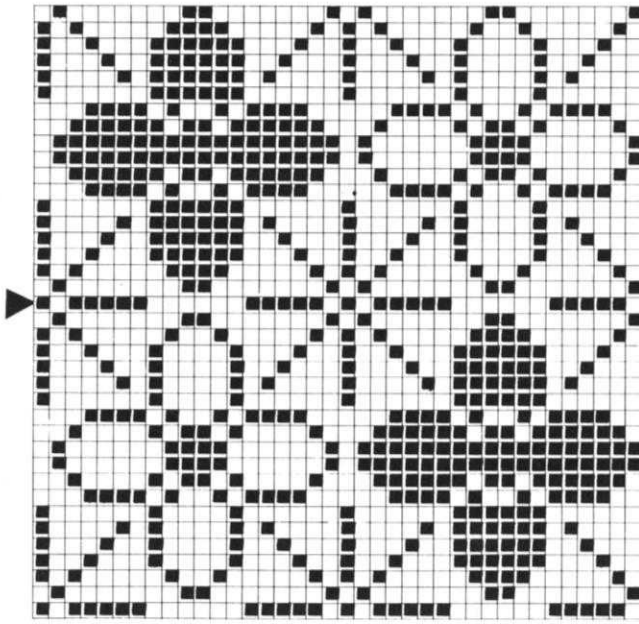
ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 66, 74, 82, 90, 98, 106, 114, 122, 130, 138, 146, then knit to ROW 150, change to white and work stockinette st. CONTINUE to decrease 1 st. ON EACH SIDE after Rows 152, 158, 164, 170, 176, 182, 188, 194, 200, 206, 212, 218, 224, then knit even to Row 242.

ROWS 19 to 66: Knit even. ROWS 0 to 18: Knit even, then begin the Norwegian Design. Cast on 185 sts. with white and work stockinette st.

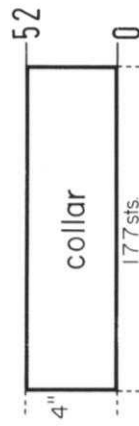


SIZE: 10/12. MATERIAL: 23% oz. (13 balls) white and 7 oz. (4 balls) turquoise. KNITTING Excelsior. TENSION: KNITTING 4 to 6. GAUGE: 16 sts., 2", 22 rows 2". PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch and Norwegian Design on Skirt and Yoke section according to Line Drawing or use JAC 40 and Pattern No. 418. In the instructions each row in the Norwegian Design is counted as 1 row, but several movements of the Cam Box are needed to complete 1 row. SLEEVE EDGES and COLLAR: K1, P1, Ribbing. DECREASES: While working the Norwegian Design, hang the 1st st. ON EACH SIDE onto the 2nd st., then continue with Full-fashion decreases as follows: ON EACH SIDE, hang the 3rd st. onto the 2nd st., then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. INCREASES: ON EACH SIDE, move the 2 end sts. 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle. The finished length of the dress is 35".

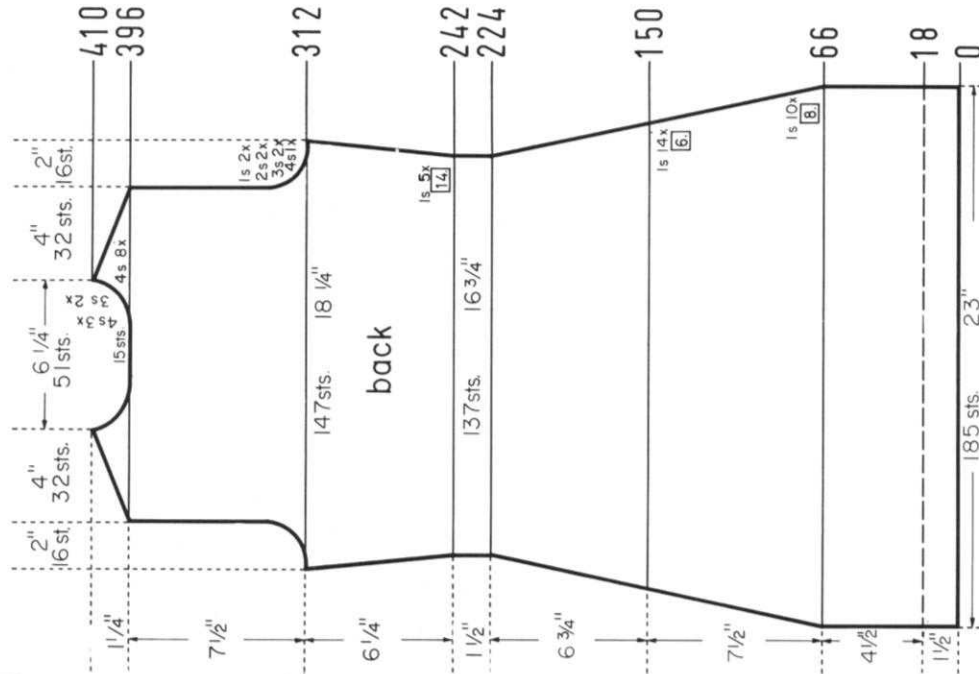
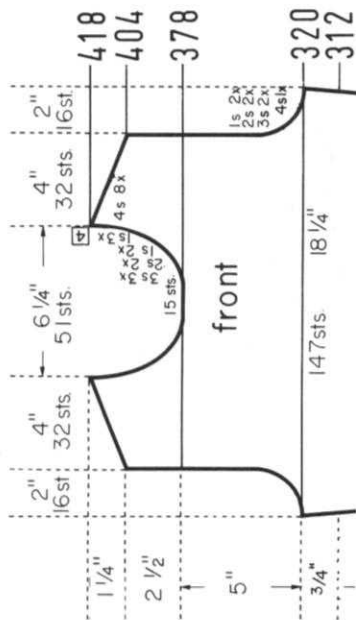
FINISHING: Block all sections to measurements given. Join front and back section at sides and shoulders, easing in the fullness at bustline of front section. Sew sleeves together and set in. Turn under 18 rows on lower edge and hem to wrong side. Join short ends of collar, then sew 1 edge of collar to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline.

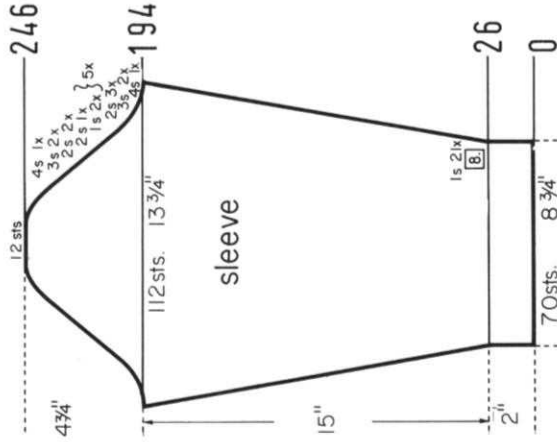
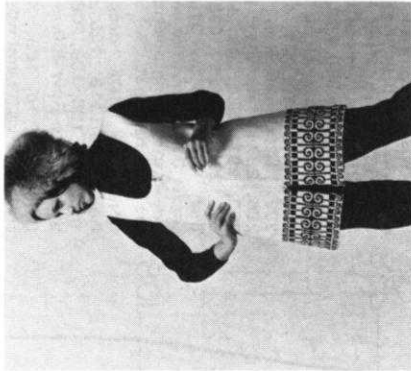


Cast on 177 sts. with white and work 52 rows K1, P1, Ribbing, then bind off all sts. the crochet method for ribbing.



DK 7852

SIZE: 8/10. **MATERIAL:** Pullover 14 oz. (8 balls) black and 3 1/2 oz. (2 balls) white; Vest 1 1/2 oz. (1 1/2 balls) white and 3 1/2 oz. (2 balls) black; Slacks 1 1/2 oz. (1 1/2 balls) black KNITTING Subita Crepe 2 x 3 and a 16" Jacket Type Zipper. **TENSION:** KNIT-KING 3 to 5, GAUGE: Stockinette Stitch 18 sts and 2", 25 rows 2". **PATTERN:** Stockinette Stitch and a Norwegian Design on lower edge of Pullover and Vest according to Line Drawing or use JAC.40 and Pattern No. 420. **BANDS and Sleeve EDGES:** K1, P1, Ribbing. In the instructions each row in the Norwegian Design is counted as 1 row, but several movements of the Cam Box are needed to complete 1 row. Except the Pullover Armholes, make all shapings of 1 st. Full-fashion. **DECREASES:** After rows indicated, hang the 3rd st. on the appropriate sides onto the 2nd st., then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. **INCREASES:** After rows indicated, move the 2 end sts. on the appropriate sides 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle. Begin the SLACK DARTS by hanging the sts. together as marked on the diagram, then move the end sts. inward. The following decreases for the darts lie directly above. **FINISHING:** Block all sections to measurements given. **PULLOVER:** Join front and back section at sides and shoulders, easing in the fullness at bustline of front section. Sew sleeves together and set in. Turn under 16 rows on lower edge and hem to wrong side. Join short ends of collar, then sew 1 edge of collar to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline. **VEST:** Join front and back sections at sides and shoulders, easing in the fullness at bustline of front sections. Turn under 7 sts. on front edges and 22 rows on lower edge and hem to wrong side. Join front bands to neckband, then sew band to fronts and neckline. Join short ends of armhole bands, then sew bands to armholes. Sew zipper in place. **SLACKS:** Weave front and back sections together at sides, 1 st. in from each edge. Close inner leg seams. Join the sections at center back and center front. Turn under 20 rows on upper edge and leg edges and hem to wrong side. Insert an elastic band into upper hem.

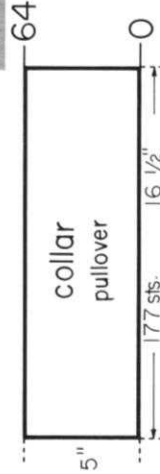


ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 194, 195; 3 sts. after Rows 196, 197, 198, 199; 2 sts. after Rows 200, 201, 202, 203, 204, 205; 1 st. after Rows 206, 207, 208, 209; 2 sts. after Rows 210, 211; 1 st. after Rows 212, 213, 214, 215; 2 sts. after Rows 216, 217; 1 st. after Rows 218, 219, 220, 221; 2 sts. after Rows 222, 223; 1 st. after Rows 224, 225, 226, 227; 2 sts. after Rows 228, 229; 1 st. after Rows 230, 231, 232, 233; 2 sts. after Rows 234, 235, 236, 237, 238, 239; 3 sts. after Rows 240, 241, 242, 243; 4 sts. after Rows 244, 245; 12 sts. after Row 246.

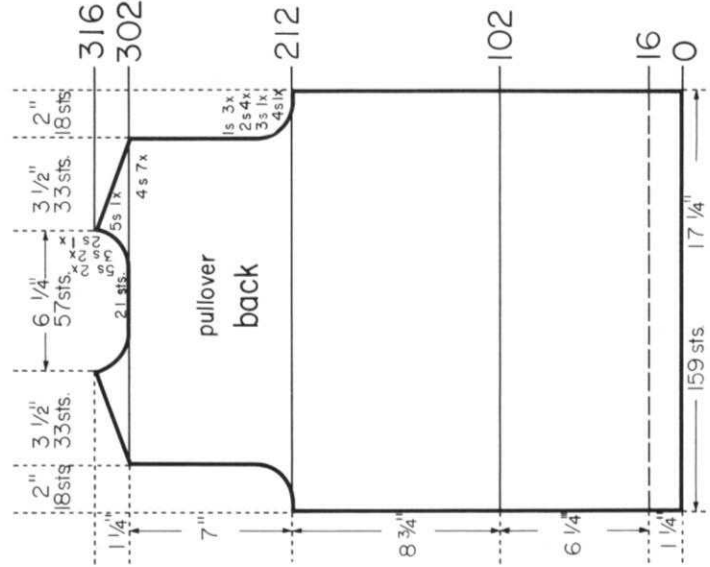
ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 26, 34, 42, 50, 58, 66, 74, 82, 90, 98, 106, 114, 122, 130, 138, 146, 154, 162, 170, 178, 186, then knit to Row 194.

ROWS 0 to 26: Knit even, then change to stockinette st.

Cast on 70 sts. with white and work K1, P1, Ribbing.



Cast on 177 sts. and work 64 rows K1, P1, Ribbing, then bind off all sts.



Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 302 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 302 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 5 sts. after Row 303 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 4 sts. after Row 304; 5 sts. after Row 305; 4 sts. after Row 306; 3 sts. after Row 307; 4 sts. after Row 308; 3 sts. after Row 309; 4 sts. after Row 310; 2 sts. after Row 311; 4 sts. after Row 312, 314; 5 sts. after Row 316.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 212, 213; 3 sts. after Rows 214, 215; 2 sts. after Rows 216, 217, 218, 219, 220, 221, 222, 223; 1 st. after Rows 224, 225, 226, 227, 228, 229, then knit to Row 302, bind off the center 21 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ROWS 103 to 212: Knit even.

ROWS 17 to 102: Knit even, then change to black and work stockinette st.

ROWS 0 to 16: Knit even, then begin the Norwegian Design.

Cast on 159 sts. with black and work stockinette st.

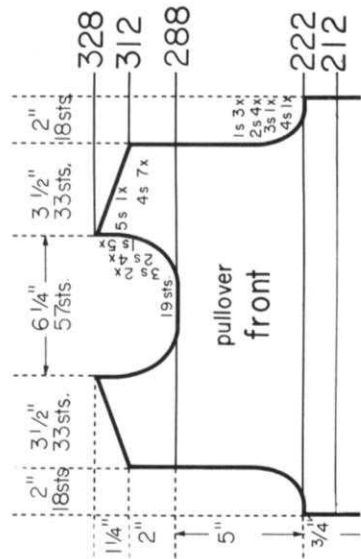

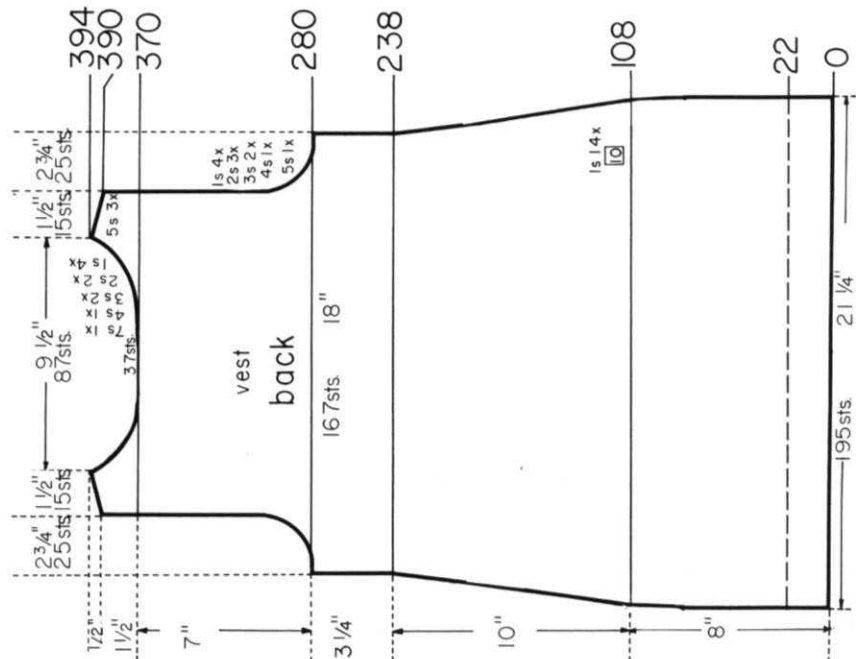
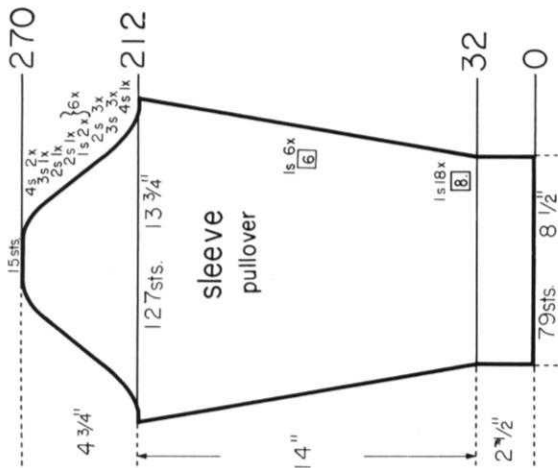

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 222, 223; 3 sts. after Rows 224, 225; 2 sts. after Rows 226, 227, 228, 229, 230, 231, 232, 233; 1 st. after Rows 234, 235, 236, 237, 238, 239, then knit to Row 288, bind off the center 19 sts. and complete the right half first.

ROWS 213 to 222: Knit even.

Work the front section the same as the back section to ROW 212.





ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 212, 213; 3 sts. after Rows 214, 215, 216, 217, 218, 219; 2 sts. after Rows 220, 221, 222, 223, 224, 225; 1 st. after Rows 226, 227, 228, 229; 2 sts. after Rows 230, 231; 1 st. after Rows 232, 233, 234, 235; 2 sts. after Rows 236, 237; 1 st. after Rows 238, 239, 240, 241; 2 sts. after Rows 242, 243; 1 st. after Rows 244, 245, 246, 247; 2 sts. after Rows 248, 249; 1 st. after Rows 250, 251, 252, 253; 2 sts. after Rows 254, 255; 1 st. after Rows 256, 257, 258, 259; 2 sts. after Rows 260, 261, 262, 263; 3 sts. after Rows 264, 265; 4 sts. after Rows 266, 267, 268, 269; 15 sts. after Row 270.

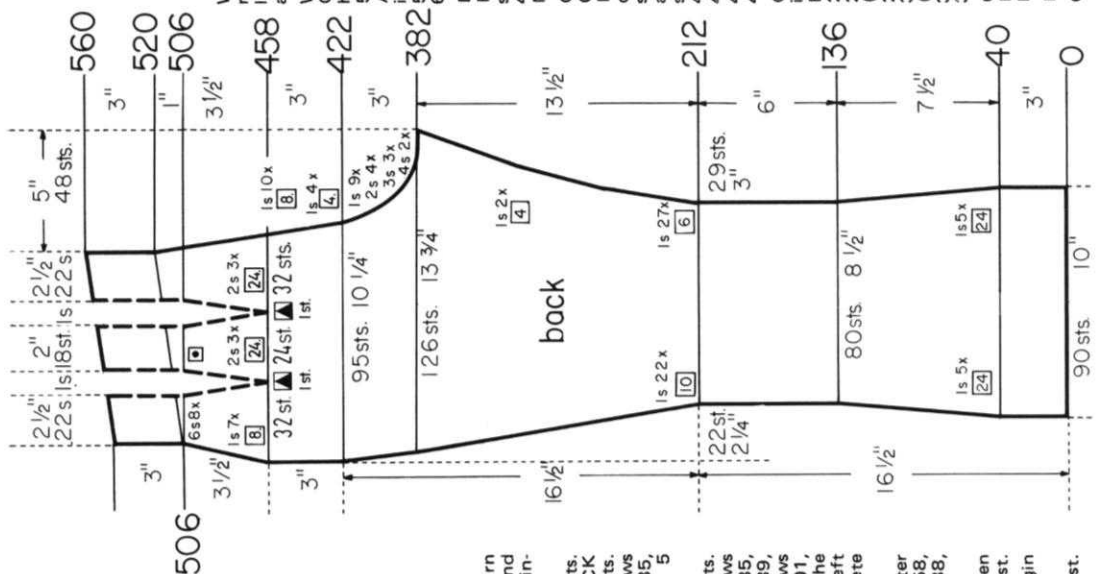
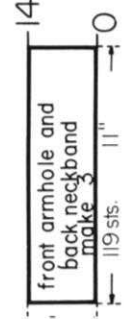
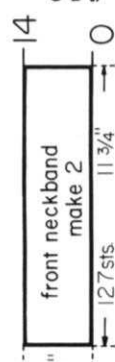
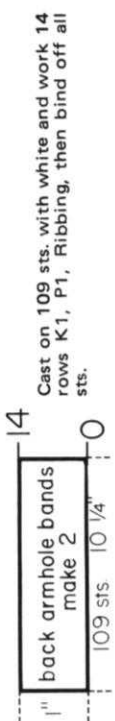
ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 32, 40, 48, 56, 64, 72, 80, 88, 96, 104, 112, 120, 128, 136, 144, 152, 160, 168, 176, 182, 188, 194, 200, 206, then knit to Row 212.
ROWS 0 to 32: Knit even, then change to stockinette st.
Cast on 79 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing.

Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 370 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 7 sts. after Row 371 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 4 sts. after Row 373; 3 sts. after Rows 375, 377; 2 sts. after Rows 379, 381; 1 st. after Rows 383, 385, 387, 389. For SHOULDER bind off 5 sts. after Rows 390, 392, 394.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Rows 280, 281; 4 sts. after Rows 282, 283; 3 sts. after Rows 284, 285, 286, 287; 2 sts. after Rows 288, 289, 290, 291, 292, 293; 1 st. after Rows 294, 295, 296, 297, 298, 299, 300, 301, then knit to Row 370, bind off the center 37 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 108, 118, 128, 138, 148, 158, 168, 178, 188, 198, 208, 218, 228, 238, then knit to Row 280.
ROWS 23 to 108: Knit even, then change to white and work stockinette st.
ROWS 0 to 22: Knit even, then begin the Norwegian Design.
Cast on 195 sts. and work stockinette st.



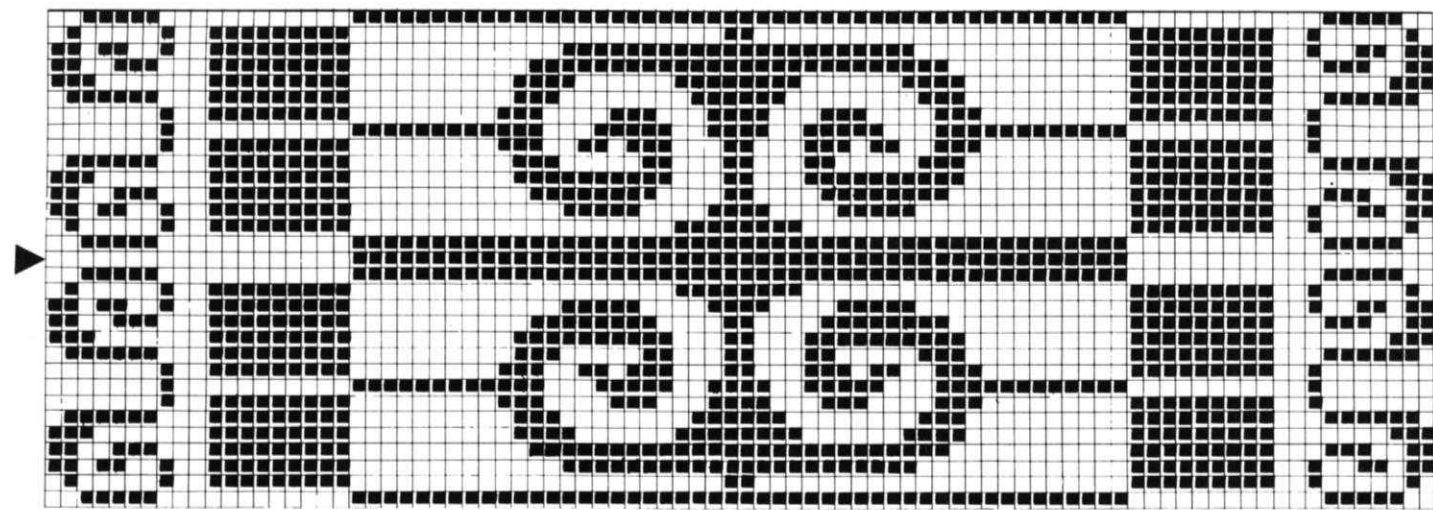
Work the second back section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to left. (Cam Box will be on the LEFT side at Row 0).
Work Short Rows for the shaping. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX put into holding position 7 needles after Rows 506, 508, 510, 512, 514, 516, 518. After Row 520 bring all needles back into working position, then knit to Row 560 and bind off loosely the remaining 64 sts.

Decrease 2 sts. for EACH DART after Rows in (). ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 458, (458), 466, 474, 482, (482), 490, 498, 506, (506), but do NOT KNIT THE NEXT ROW NOW.

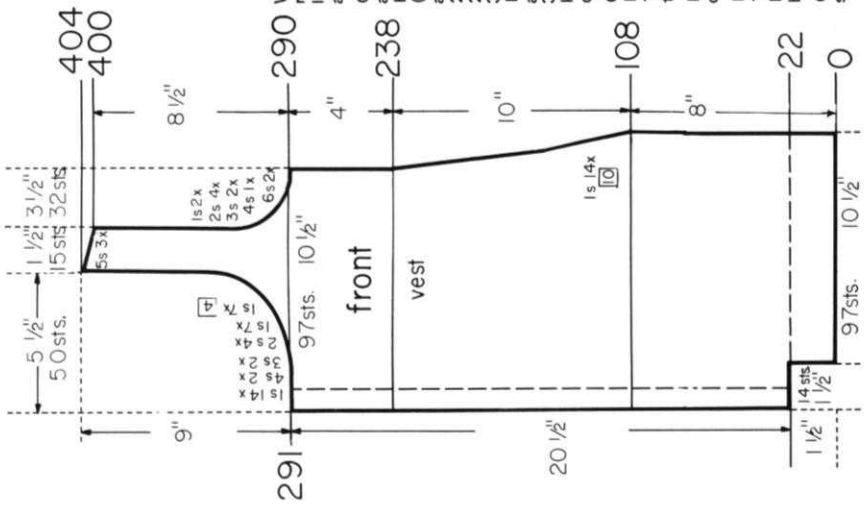
ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX CONTINUE TO INCREASE 1 st. after Rows in (), ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 382, (382), 384; 3 sts. after Rows 386, 388, 390; 2 sts. after Rows 392, (392), 394, 396, 398; 1 st. after Rows 400, 402, (402), 404, 406, 408, 410, 412, (412), 414, 416, 418, 422, (422 last INCREASE), 426, 430, 434, 442, 450, then knit to Row 458.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX increase 1 st. after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 212, (212), 218, (222), 224, 230, (232), 236, 242, (242), 248, (252), 254, 260, (262), 266, 272, (272), 278, (282), 284, 290, (292), 296, 302, (302), 308, (312), 314, 320, (322), 326, 332, (332), 338, (342), 344, 350, (352), 356, 362, (362), 368, (372), 374, 378, then knit to Row 382.

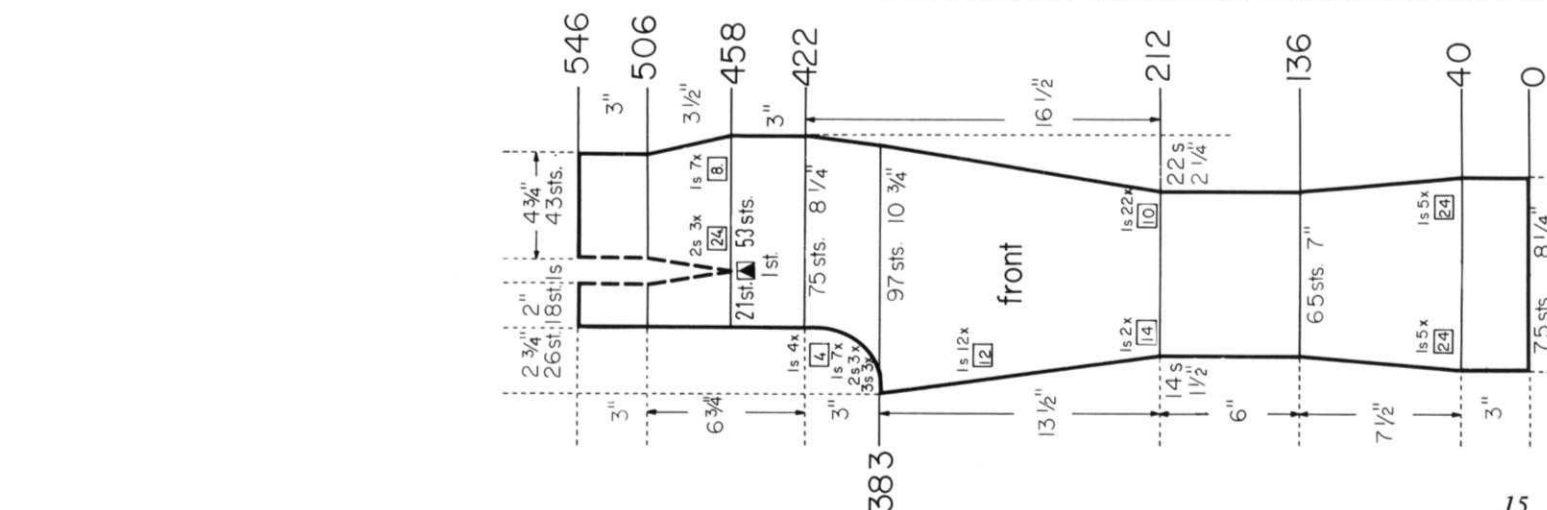
ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 40, 64, 88, 112, 136, then knit to Row 212.
ROWS 0 to 40: Knit even.
Cast on 90 sts. and work stockinette st.

Work the second front section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to left. (Cam Box will be on the LEFT side at Row 0).
 ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 6 sts. after Row 290 (EVEN ROWS = ARM-HOLE SHAPING); 14 sts. after Row 291 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 6 sts. after Row 292; 4 sts. after Rows 293, 294, 295; 3 sts. after Rows 296, 297, 298, 299; 2 sts. after Rows 300, 301, 302, 303, 304, 305, 306, 307; 1 st. after Rows 308, 309, 310 (last time for armhole), 311, 313, 315, 317, 319, 321, 323, 327, 331, 335, 339, 343, 347, then knit to Row 400. For SHOULDER bind off 5 sts. after Rows 400, 402, 404.
 ON CAM BOX SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 108, 118, 128, 138, 148, 158, 168, 178, 188, 198, 208, 218, 228, 238, then knit to Row 290.
 ROWS 23 to 108: Knit even, then change to white and work stockinette st.
 ROWS 0 to 22: Knit even, then cast on 14 sts. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX (use a separate length of yarn) and begin the Norwegian Design.
 Cast on 97 sts. with white and work stockinette st.



Work the second front section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to left. (Cam Box will be on the LEFT side at Row 0).
 Decrease 2 sts. for the DART after Rows in (), ON CAM BOX SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 458, (458), 466, 474, 482, (482), 490, 498, 506, (506), then knit to Row 546 and bind off loosely the remaining 62 sts.
 ON CAM BOX SIDE (SIDE SEAM), continue to INCREASE 1 st. after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE (INNER LEG SEAM), bind off 3 sts. after Rows 383, 385, 387; 2 sts. after Rows 389, 391, (392), 393; 1 st. after Rows 395, 397, 399, 401, (402), 403, 405, 407, 409, (412), 413, 417, 421, (422 last INCREASE), then knit to Row 458.
 ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX increase 1 st. after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 212, (212), 222, (226), 232, (240), 242, 252, (252), 262, (264), 272, (276), 282, (288), 292, (300), 302, 312, (312), 322, (324), 332, (336), 342, (348), 352, (360), 362, 372, (372), 382, then knit to Row 383.
 ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 40, 64, 88, 112, 136, then knit to Row 212.
 ROWS 0 to 40: Knit even.
 Cast on 75 sts. and work stockinette st.

DK 7929

SIZE: 18/20. **MATERIAL:** 29% oz. (17 balls) green KNITTING Crocus Crepe. **TENSION:** KNIT-KING 5 to 7. **GAUGE:** 16 sts. 2", 23 rows 2". **PATTERN:** Stockinette. Stitch and an Eyelet Design on the front sections of the vest. Follow the Line Drawing for the Eyelet Design. **BANDS:** K1, P1, Ribbing. Bind off the bands the crochet method for ribbing. **SKIRT DECREASES:** After rows indicated, hang the 4th st. ON EACH SIDE onto the 3rd st. then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. **FRONT SHAPING:** After rows indicated, hang the 3rd st. (3 balls) blue **KNITTING** Crocus Crepe. **TENSION:** KNITTING 6 to 8. **GUAGE:** 16 sts. 2", 21 rows 2". **PATTERN:** Stockinette Stitch and a Norwegian Design according to Line Drawing or use JAC 40 and Pattern No. 423. In the instructions each row in the Norwegian Design is counted as 1 row, but several movements of the Cam Box are needed to complete 1 row. **EDGES and COLLAR:** K1, P1, Ribbing. **SLEEVE INCREASES:** After rows indicated, move the 2 end sts. **ON EACH SIDE** 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle.

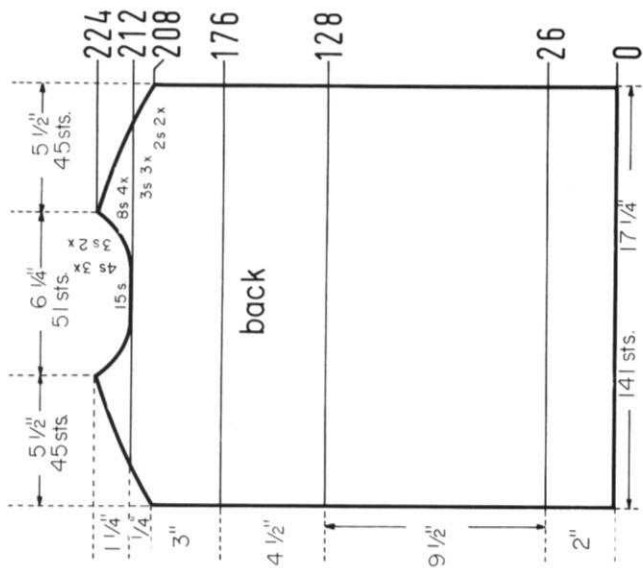
FINISHING: Block each section to measurements given. Join front and back section at shoulders, then, at sides, leaving the upper portion 7 1/2" open for the armholes. Sew sleeves together and set in. Join short ends of collar, then sew 1 edge of collar to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline.



Cast on 169 sts. with white and work 50 rows K1, P1, Ribbing, then bind off all sts. the crochet method for ribbing.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Row 208, 209, 210, 211, then knit to Row 212, bind off the center 15 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

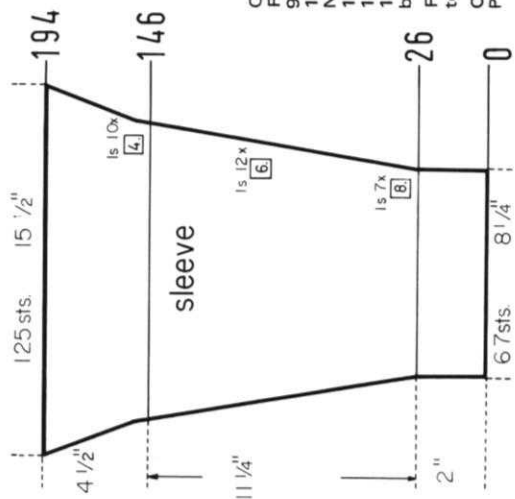

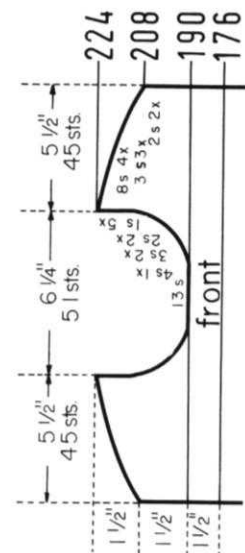

ROWS 0 to 26: Knit even, then change to stockinette st.

Cast on 67 sts. with white and work K1, P1, Ribbing.



Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 190 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 191 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 3 sts. after Rows 193, 195; 2 sts. after Rows 197, 199; 1 st. after Rows 201, 203, 205, 207; 2 sts. after Row 208 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 1 st. after Row 209 (last time for Neck); 2 sts. after Row 210; 3 sts. after Rows 212, 214, 216; 8 sts. after Rows 218, 220, 222, 224.

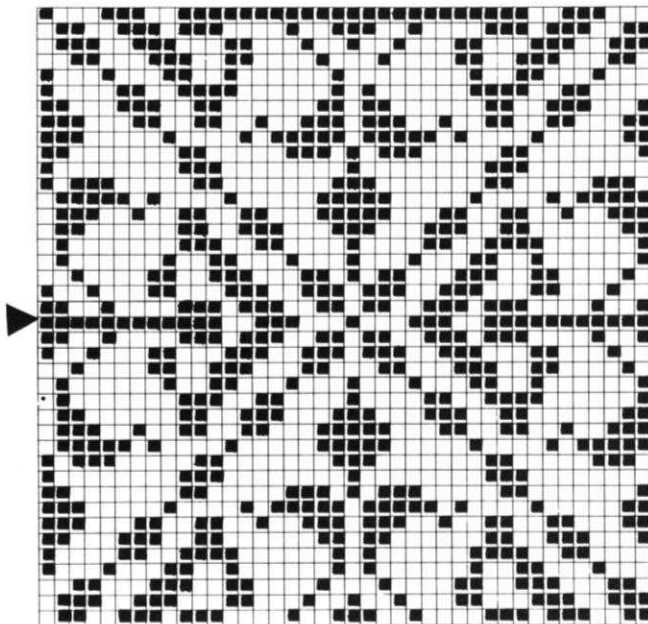
ROWS 177 to 190: Knit even, then bind off the center 13 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

In the instructions, each row in the Norwegian Design is counted as 1 row, but several movements of the Cam Box are needed to complete 1 row. **EDGES and COLLAR:** K1, P1, Ribbing. **SLEEVE INCREASES:** After rows indicated, move the 1st st. ON EACH SIDE 1 needle outward, then place the 2nd st. from the row below onto the empty needle.

FINISHING: Block each section to measurements given. Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. Sew sleeves together and set in. Join short ends of collar, then sew 1 edge of collar to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline.

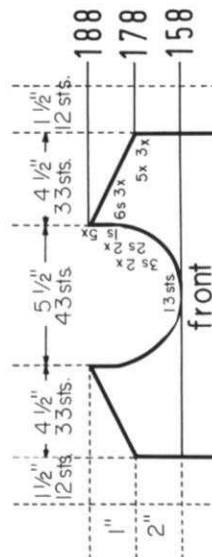

ROWS 0 to 26: Knit even, then transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine and work the Norwegian Design.

Cast on 193 sts. with beige and work K1, P1, Ribbing.

SLIPPERS — Tweed stitch using every 3rd needle. MATERIAL: 3 balls KNITTING Frigate or Leacril will make two pair. TENSION: 9 or 10 over every 3rd needle. GAUGE: 8 sts. 22 rows 2" measured over pattern.

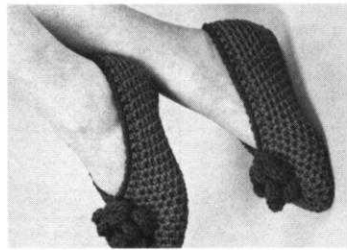
FINISHING: Sew up the front to end of decreases. Pull up the cast on edge firmly then sew up back seam pulling up the bottom of heel to round it off. Make 1 row of single crochet using a contrast color around top edge going into every other stitch on edge, then 1 row of reverse single crochet. Trim front with Pom-poms, flowers (See KNITTING MAGAZINE March/April 1970, page 32 for flower trim), or any kind of trim you wish.

PATTERN: Tweed stitch. Purl side is the right side. *Put 2nd, then every other needle into holding position, knit 2 rows. Return all needles to working position. Put the 1st, then every other needle into holding position, knit 2 rows. Return all needles to working position. REPEAT from * for pattern. IMPORTANT! When end needle is a holding position needle, be sure to wrap the yarn around it in order to prevent a hole. KNITTING machines use NEEDLE SHIFTER.

SIZE: Small, Medium and Large in (). Make two.

Cast on 25 (27 — 27) sts. Knit in tweed stitch till counter reads 70 (78 — 88).

Decrease 1 stitch on each side, then decrease 1 st. each side every other row till 11 sts. remain (13 — 13). Knit 1 row over all needles and take off the stitches on a double strand of yarn. Pull up and tie tightly.



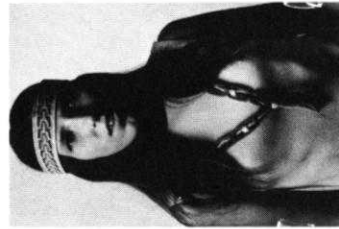

INDIAN HEADBAND — fits head size 20" to 22". If you want larger size, cast on more stitches.

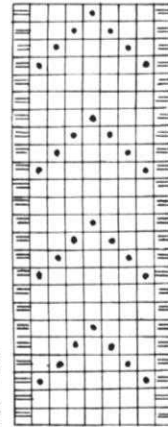
MATERIAL: 1½ oz. (1 ball) each of 3 colors KNITTING Subita Crepe 2 x 4 (will make 5 or more headbands). 3/4 yd 1½" grosgrain ribbon in Color A. TENSION: 4 or 5. GAUGE: 16 sts. 22 rows 2". **PATTERN:** Follow Line Drawing. KNITTING machines use Wheel No. 2. When knitting the pattern, push in the LEFT Retractor Button when Cam Box is on the left side and release it when Cam Box is on the right side.

FINISHING: With the right side of band facing you, slip stitch crochet the open stitches held on waste yarn. This will give you the same edge as the bind off row. Cut waste yarn at each end and pull out. Line the back of Headband with Grosgrain Ribbon, finishing the ends neatly. Make a loop buttonhole for one side (crochet it, or make a cord to fit button) and sew button on other end, or if you prefer make cords for tying, or sew snaps on for closure. To make cords for tying, set machine for knitting a cord. Cast on 3 stitches and knit 150 rows for each cord. Make 8 cords and attach 2 at each corner BEFORE closing each end of lining. Sew a bright bead at the end of each cord. You may use this as a headband or a belt.

Using the open cast-on method, cast on 164 sts. (more for larger size) with waste yarn. After knitting several rows, change to Color A and follow the Line Drawing for 22 rows. Bind off the Crochet method.



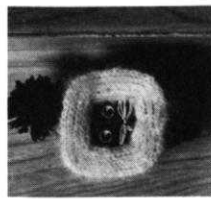
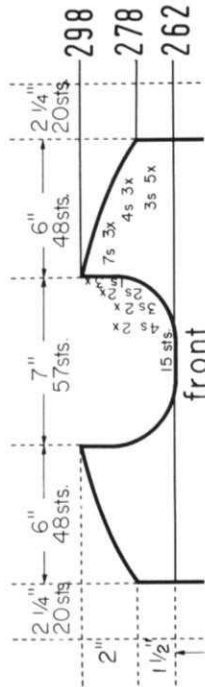

SANTA CLAUS Doorknob Cover

MATERIAL: 1½ oz. (1 ball) Red KNITTING Leacril and 1½ oz. (1 ball) White Rhapsodie (will make 4 or more). TENSION 8 or 9 over every other needle. GAUGE: 10 sts., 13 rows 2".

FINISHING: Weave ends together and remove waste yarn from beard. Single crochet around opening of face section pulling up to fit over door-knob. Brush the Beard then sew in place to frame face with 1½" of red showing at top and bottom. Embroider eyes or use purchased eyes and sew on. Make large french knot for nose with black. Use 6 strands of scrap white yarn (fine) and make mustache. Make red pom-pom for top of hat.

With Red cast on 17 sts. over every other needle. Knit Short Rows.

* Put into holding position 1 needle opposite Cam Box beginning each row until 1 needle remains in work.

Put back into working position 1 needle opposite Cam Box until all are in work.

Knit 2 rows. REPEAT from * to * 1 time. Bind off the crochet method. **BEARD:** Using Open cast-on method, cast on 6 sts. over every other needle. After knitting several rows with waste yarn, change to white Rhapsodie and knit short rows. Cam Box is on the Right.

Put 2 needles opposite Cam Box (left) into holding position and knit 2 rows. Put 1 needle on left into holding position and knit 2 rows. Knit 8 rows. REPEAT from * to * 3 times more, but knit 4 rows at the end instead of 8. Take off on contrast waste yarn.

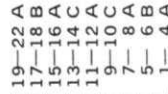

INDIAN NECKLACE

MATERIAL: 1½ oz. each of 3 colors, Red, Orange, Turquoise KNITTING Subita Crepe 2 x 4. 1 dozen wooden beads 1/2" diameter (make sure the beads have fairly large holes). TENSION 1.

FINISHING: Lay the 4 cords flat along side each other, even at the top and with the two red cords on the outside, and other two colors on the inside. Begin approximately 7" down from the top and make a square knot on each side, the outer cord over first inner cord, the right outer cord over right inner cord to the left, the left outer cord over left inner cord to the right. (If you have a book that shows Macrame, this will help). String a bead on the center two cords together, then 2" down from first knots, make another set of knots, string a bead again and continue in this way until you have approximately 7" of cord left. Thread a small tapestry needle with 1 end at a time and pull through one bead, pulling the cord down so that there is a 2" space from last knot as shown in Photograph. The last cords will be hard to pull through but if you are careful you can do it. Cut the ends evenly and tie off ends.

Set your machine for knitting a cord. KNITTING machines, push in (pull up) right Cam Control Button. Leave a 5" end, then cast on 3 stitches and knit the cords as follows: Make 2 cords in the same color 1250 rows. Make 1 cord in each of the two other colors 900 rows (the empty rows do count). Be sure to leave ends on cords for pulling through a bead.

CHANGING SIZES

We get letters from readers asking how to adjust certain patterns to their own sizes... We explained in a recent issue how it was possible to make a garment larger or smaller by knitting at a different tension.... It is also possible to make garments larger or smaller by using a yarn different to the one called for in the pattern. We give you two examples to show you how simple this procedure is:

DRESS - DK 7925

The instructions are given for a Size 14/16 using KNITTING Amore. The Tension we recommend is 6 to 8 and it, of course depends on your machine. Our Stitch and Row Gauge is: 15 sts. 2" and 23 rows 2". The finished dress will measure 40" at the bustline when closed. If you use KNITTING Crocus Crepe and Tension 5 to 7, the Stitch and Row Gauge should be 16 sts. 2", 23 rows 2" and the measurement at the bustline of the finished dress will be 38" when closed. If you use KNITTING Subita Crepe 2 x 3 and Tension 4 to 6, the Stitch and Row Gauge should be 17 sts. 2" and 23 rows 2" and the measurement at the bustline of the finished dress when closed will be 36". All the other width measurements will be smaller in proportion. All the length measurements will remain the same because the Row Gauge for all 3 yarns is the same. As sizes between 10 and 16 differ mainly in the width (unless you are a petite size) you can, by using different weights of yarn and changing the tensions, easily change from one size to another.

If the armhole measurement seems a little too long when you change to a smaller size, start the armhole shaping a few rows later.... Also if the measurement from the waistline to the armhole seems too long for you, shorten it by knitting less rows before the armhole shaping begins. You must remember to be sure and set your Row Counter ahead if you deduct rows so that you do not become confused when you begin the armhole shaping.

PANTSUIT - DK 7934

KNITTING Lovely is the yarn used for the easy to knit Pantsuit DK 7934. If you are a petite size 6 or 7, you can knit this in KNITTING Conchita Crylor. Your Stitch and Row Gauge should be 16 sts., 24 rows 2" using Tension 4 or 5.

If you are long legged and the pants need to be made longer, add the extra rows where there is no shaping (between Rows 100 and 156) then put your Counter to Row 156 when you begin the shaping. If the pants need to be made shorter, this is where you will shorten them as well... simply deduct the necessary number of rows, but put your Row Counter to Row 156 before you start the shaping.

OPERATION OF JAC 40

Owners of a JAC 40 will know that most of the punch cards available produces designs 40 stitches wide. There are a few punch cards however that produce patterns of a lesser number. Before using any punch card you should check the number beside the word "Breite" at the top right hand corner of the card. In most cases, it will say 40 and your needles will have to be set in multiples of 40. If it says 38, your needles will have to be set in multiples of 38. It is important that patterns knitted with JAC designs have a balanced look especially when viewed directly from the front or back, but because it is not possible to produce all sizes of garments in exact multiples of 40 stitches, it will not be possible to always match your side seams.

If you read the instructions that came with the JAC 40, you will see that we suggest that needles should be set so that the 0 needle in the middle of your machine is the center of your knitting and that you push your needles forward into the holding position with the JAC by locating the red plastic foot in the center needle groove and then in the 40 needle groove on each side, then in the 80 needle groove on each side. There are however times when the center of your knitting will not be the 0 needle and when this is the case, we tell you and show you at the top of the line drawing by marking it with a black triangle. You will then mark the back rail of your machine with a bright color crayon. You should mark it BEFORE you start knitting the Jac Pattern and BEFORE you insert the pattern card into the JAC, and then mark each 40th needle (or 38th or 36th) on each side of the center needle across the needle bed. You will then place the red plastic foot in the needle grooves of the marked needles.

HOW TO AVOID HOLES WHEN USING THE JAC 40

Sometimes when using the JAC 40, a color will finish in the middle of a row instead of at the end and unless that color is anchored in some way, a hole will show in your finished garment. This is the way you should anchor the yarn and avoid holes.

First set up your pattern for the next row, then take up the loose end of the contrast yarn, lay it over a needle in knitting position (behind the latch) that is closest to a needle in holding position. If your Cam Box is at the right, it should be a needle to the right. If the Cam Box is at the left, it should be a needle to the left.

NORWEGIAN PATTERN KNITTING MADE EASY Using Example DK 7850 (Cover Garment)

To knit a Norwegian Pattern Design, the yarn must be hand fed and several movements of the Cam Box are needed to complete one row. Because of this, your Row Counter will not show the true number of rows knitted. Some knitters automatically re-set the Counter after each row is completed... some knitters use a small coin adder that sells for about \$1.00 in most dime stores, drug stores and Super Markets. It is about 4 inches long and two inches deep and has 3 control buttons. The windows are marked - dollars, dimes and cents and every time you complete one actual row of knitting (irrespective of the number of times you move your Cam Box to do it) you push in the cents button once. This is a very useful tool and can be used to keep track of increases and decreases when shaping as well as for Jac designs.

Here is another way to keep track of Rows when using your JAC 40. We will use DK 7850 (Cover garment) for our example. JAC Pattern No. 418 is a 38 stitch pattern. The center of the Jac Pattern is the 0 needle and so you must mark (on the back rail of your needle bed) needle 38 and 76 on each side. The Design is a repeat of 38 rows. The pattern begins after Row 18 of the dress. Up to Row 66, no shaping takes place. By then you have inserted the Jac Punch card twice, and are on the beginning of Row 11 of your Punch Card. The shapings are made after every 8 rows. On a slip of paper, mark the Jac Card row and right next to it the first decreasing row. Now add 8 to the Jac Card row and 8 to the decreasing row. Continue to do this up to the last decrease row within the Norwegian Design which is at Row 146.

You now have 3 more rows of the Norwegian design before you begin the stockinette section and so when you have completed Row 18 of your JAC Card, turn your Row Counter to Row 150 and continue knitting with white yarn in stockinette stitch.

Follow the same procedure when you work the Norwegian Design after Row 312 on the Back section and Row 320 on the front section.

As you can see, we ignored the Row Counter by figuring how many Jac Pattern rows to knit and you can use this method for any Norwegian Design using two or more colors. Always remember however, that it is the COMPLETED Jac Pattern row that we count regardless of how many times you must move the Cam Box to complete one row.

KNITKING CONVERTA TAPE

If you look at the accessory numbered 7 on the inside front cover of this magazine you will see the KNITKING Converta Tape.... an indispensable tool and yet our most neglected accessory... The Converta Tape is more than twice the size of the illustration and its 5 foot long tape rolls onto a drum.

With a KNITKING Converta Tape you can easily and speedily chart your garments to any body measurements... The Converta Tape has its own stitch gauge measure and after making a sample swatch, you set the gauge on the drum (if you study the illustration you will see that it is set at 14") pull out the tape to the measurement you need and the point on the gauge tells you exactly how many stitches you need...!! You use the same procedure to find out exactly how many rows you need for a garment section.

The KNITKING Converta Tape also tells you exactly how many stitches and rows you need if you are using a different weight yarn or stitch gauge to that called for in a pattern.

NOTES TO KNIT BY . . .

STITCH AND ROW GAUGE

KNIT A SAMPLE SWATCH . . . before you begin to knit any garment . . . for this is the MOST IMPORTANT STEP toward the correct size and the proper fit of any garment you wish to make. You MUST use the SAME YARN for your sample swatch that you will use to knit your garment and your sample swatch must be knitted large enough and using several different tension numbers on your machine. When you have done this, then you can determine the number of stitches and the number of rows in a two-inch measure. KNITTING MAGAZINE PATTERNS give you 3 tensions to try and one of them should give you the correct stitch and row gauge if you are using the yarn we recommend or a similar weight yarn. Here is the way to make your sample swatch.

Cast on over a sufficient number of needles to produce a swatch at least 4 inches wide. (If the pattern calls for 16 stitches to 2", then $16 \times 2 = 32$ stitches to cast on). Now knit 4 inches of rows at the first suggested tension number. (If the pattern calls for 22 rows to 2", $22 \times 2 = 44$ rows to knit). Knit 2 rows using a contrast color, change to the next higher tension and with garment yarn knit another 4", knit 2 rows with contrast color, change to the 3rd higher tension and knit another 4" and then bind off.




Roll the swatch into a cylinder over its length and pull on both ends, unroll it and stretch it diagonally by pulling on the four corners. Allow the swatch to rest and settle (preferably overnight) and then using a stitch gauge or a ruler, count the number of stitches over a 2" width, then the number of rows over a 2" length in EACH of the 3 tensions. Select the tension number that produces the stitches and rows called for in the pattern. If none of them are correct, you are most likely using the wrong weight of yarn.




READING OF CHARTS


You will notice the instructions start at the bottom of the Chart and work UP. Follow the charts exactly as written and providing your sample stitch and row gauge is correct, your garment will come out the right size. Please remember that the section of garment as it is knitted on the machine, faces the same way as the Charts are in this magazine. Where two front pieces are needed, (or any other part of a garment that needs two sections) only one section is normally shown and the second section is usually made with reverse shapings. Set in sleeves are usually identical, but raglan sleeves have to be knitted with reverse shapings for the second sleeve.


READING OF SYMBOLS

To simplify Pattern Knitting, we use Symbols in the Line Drawings and the Chart Diagrams. In the Line Drawings the symbols are shown and are to be read as you look at them while knitting a garment. For instance, if

a Purl stitch faces you, the Purl stitch Symbol  is shown; if a knit stitch faces you (as when using the Ribber) then this Symbol  is shown. The Symbol  at the top of the Line Drawing is the center of the garment section and you use this as a guide for setting up the needles.

The following Symbols    are used for Eyelet Designs in the Line Drawings and also for Full Fashion shaping on the Charts. The Line Drawings have row numbers on the right side. Missing Row numbers are always knitted straight or plain.

In Holding Position Designs  selected needles are pushed into holding position for the stated number of rows. The numbers of rows appear at the right of the Line Drawings; Example: 1-4 means knit Rows 1 to 4; 5 to 7 means knit Rows 5 to 7, etc. This same Symbol is also shown on the Charts and is used for putting needles into holding position for Short Rows. The

Symbol  on the Charts is used to put needles back into working position when knitting Short Rows.

A number in a box stands for the number of rows to be knitted between shapings. Make shapings first, then knit the necessary number of rows. If for instance it reads:

1 st. 8 x



1 st. 10 x



As you will be reading the instructions from the bottom up, here is the way you will follow them: . . . Decrease or increase (depending on the direction of the garment outline) 1 st. at the row where the shapings begin, then knit 8 rows, make the next decrease, then knit 8 rows, until you have decreased (or increased) 1 st. 10 x and you have knitted 8 rows after each decrease (or increase) (1 st. 10 x + 8 rows 10 x). Now begin the first decrease (or increase) for the shapings (which has to be made 8 x) in every 6th row. Decrease (or increase) 1 st. first, then knit 6 rows until you have decreased 1 st. 6 x and after each decrease (or increase) have knitted 6 rows (1 st. 8 x + 6 rows 8 x).

Where shapings are given without a boxed number as on most armholes, necklines, etc., make the shapings on every second row (on each side of course).

(See below for more Pattern Stitch Symbols.)

PATTERN STITCH SYMBOLS



= knit stitch



= purl stitch



= empty needle (leave in working position)



= needle not used (in the out of work position)



= needle in the holding position



= Needles back into working position.



= 2 stitches on 1 needle — either transferred from the right side or the left side, then put the needle into holding position



= needle holding 2 stitches. Stitch has been transferred from the LEFT



= needle holding 2 stitches. Stitch has been transferred from the RIGHT



= 3 stitches on 1 needle. The 1st and 3rd stitch in a group of 3 needles has been hung on the 2nd or center needle.



= Center of Garment Section.



= Number of rows to be knitted between shapings.

The diagrams (Line Drawings) for pattern work are followed just as they are shown and are to be read as you look at them while knitting the garment.
