editorial

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You most likely have read that the garment industry (other industries are planning similar moves) is planning to switch to the Metric System in its sizing of garments . . . This is a move that is long overdue, but one which will, nevertheless, create much confusion, both in industry and in the minds of home knitters and home sewers, for some time after its introduction.

We would love to switch to centimeter sizing immediately in our yarn charts . . . Centimeters are so much easier to work with than inches and fractions of inches and it is possible to obtain a greater degree of accuracy with the Metric System, but we know many of our readers would protest and some would claim they no longer understood charts even though all basic measurements are in stitches and rows.

Above all else, we want to make charts that are easily understood by all our readers, and as the switch to centimeters is inevitable, we suggest that you each obtain from your nearest source, a tape measure that has inches on one side and centimeters on the other (the Dritz Company puts out one) then gradually teach yourself to measure in centimeters using the inch side of your measure for comparisons. Our Converta Tape already works in centimeters and it instantly converts your measurements into stitches and rows.

The decision by the garment industry to switch to the Metric System is causing a delay in the production of the new KNITKING Charting Course, but we will continue as soon as the industry determines the measurements of basic size garments Our new course promises to be an expensive production and we would not like it to become obsolete shortly after its introduction.

YARN:	Regia	Alanda	Dolly Dralon
50 gr. BALLS:	16 Color 1 4 Color 2 6 Color 3	28 Color 1 7 Color 2 10 Color 3	21 Color 1 6 Color 2 8 Color 3
TENSION:	5 to 7	6 to 8	6 to 8
GAUGE:	2" 15 sts. 22 rows	14 sts. 21 rows	13 sts. 20 rows



Cast on 143 sts. with Color 2 and work 20 rows Stockinette stitch, then bind off all sts.

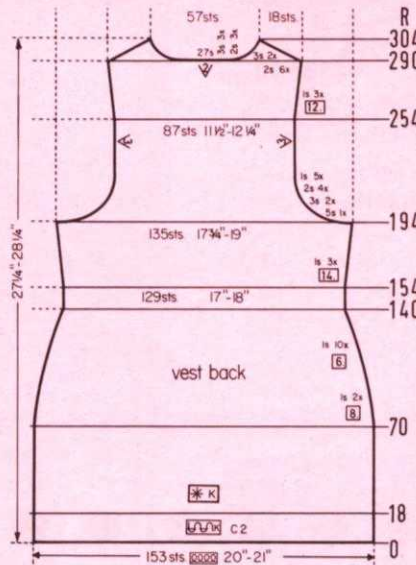
The instructions are the same for all sizes. PATTERN: Norwegian Design according to the Line Drawing, or use JAC 40 and Pattern No. 484. In the instructions, each row in the Norwegian Design is counted as 1 row, but several movements of the Cam Box are needed to complete 1 row. Pullover edges and neckband: K1, P1, Ribbing. Vest edges: Stockinette stitch. Increases: Move the 2 end sts. 1 needle outward then pick up the 3rd st. from the row below and hang it onto the empty needle. Decreases: Hang the 3rd st. onto the 2nd st., then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle.

FINISHING: Block all sections. Pants: Sew the inner leg seams together then join the sections at the center back and front. Turn under 18 Rows on leg edges and 1" on upper edge and hem in place on the wrong side. Insert elastic band into upper hem at waistline. Pullover: Join the back and front sections at sides and shoulders. Sew the sleeves together and set in. Sew the neckband to the neckline. Vest: Join the back and front sections at sides and shoulders. Turn under 9 Rows on lower edge and hem in place. Sew the short ends of the armhole bands together, then sew 1 edge to the inside and 1 edge to the outside of armhole. Sew the band to the front edges (with buttonhole band on the right side of front) and neckline in the same manner.

Bring the needles on the Left side into working position, knit 1 row in Pattern to the Left side, turn the Row Counter back to 290 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Row 290 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 3 sts. after Row 291 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 2 sts. after Row 292; 3 sts. after Row 293; 2 sts. after Row 294; 3 sts. after Row 295; 2 sts. after Row 296; 2 sts. after Rows 297, 298, 299, 300, 301; 3 sts. after Rows 302, 304.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 254, 266, 278, then work even to Row 290, bind off the center 27 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Rows 194, 195; 3 sts. after Rows 196, 197, 198, 199; 2 sts. after Rows 200, 201, 202, 203, 204, 205, 206, 207. Work even to Row 254.

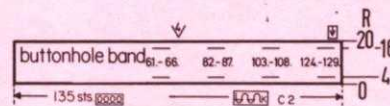
ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 154, 168, 182, then knit to Row 194.

ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 70, 78, 86, 92, 98, 104, 110, 116, 122, 128, 134, 140, then knit to Row 154.

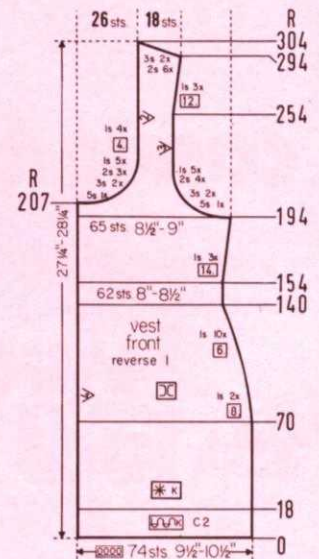
ROWS 19 to 70: Knit even.

ROWS 0 to 18: Knit even, then begin the Norwegian Design beginning with the SECOND SECTION of the Line Drawing for the correct Color selection.

Cast on 153 sts. with Color 2 and work Stockinette stitch.



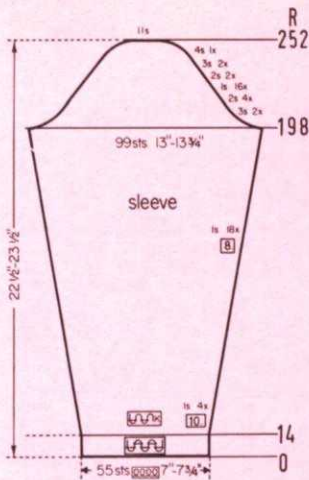
Cast on 135 sts. with Color 2. Work Stockinette stitch. Knit even to Row 4, then make buttonholes after Rows 4 and 16 over the 61st to 66th; 82nd to 87th; 103rd to 108th; 124th to 129th sts. counting from the left edge. Knit even to Row 20, then bind off all sts. Make the second band section the same but omit the buttonholes.

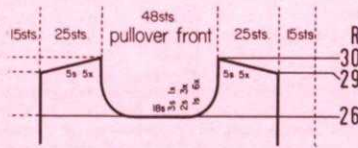


ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 198, 199, 200, 201; 2 sts. after Rows 202, 203, 204, 205, 206, 207, 208, 209. ON EACH SIDE, hang the 1st st. onto the 2nd st. after Rows 210, 212, 214, 216, 218, 220, 222, 224, 226, 228, 230, 232, 234, 236, 238, 240. ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Rows 242, 243, 244, 245; 3 sts. after Rows 246, 247, 248, 249; 4 sts. after Rows 250, 251; 11 sts. after Row 252.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 14, 24, 34, 44, 52, 60, 68, 76, 84, 92, 100, 108, 116, 124, 132, 140, 148, 156, 164, 172, 180, 188, then knit to Row 198.

ROWS 0 to 14: Knit even, then change to Stockinette stitch.

Cast on 55 sts. with Color 1 and work K1, P1, Ribbing.



Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 266 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from*.

*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 267; 2 sts. after Rows 269, 271, 273; 1 st. after Rows 275, 277, 279, 281, 283, 285. ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Rows 292, 294, 296, 298, 300.

Work the front section the same as the back section to Row 266, then bind off the center 18 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 292 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from*.

*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Row 292 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 4 sts. after Row 293 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 5 sts. after Row 294; 4 sts. after Row 295; 5 sts. after Row 296; 4 sts. after Row 297; 5 sts. after Rows 298, 300.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 212, 213, 214, 215; 2 sts. after Rows 216, 217, 218, 219, 220, 221; 1 st. after Rows 222, 223, 224, 225, 226, 227, then knit to Row 292, bind off the center 24 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

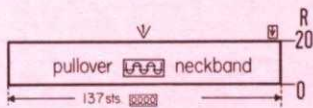
ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 138, 148, 158, 168, 178, 188, 198, then knit to Row 212.

ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 58, 64, 70, 76, 82, 88, 94, 100, 106, 112, 116, 120. Knit even to Row 138.

ROWS 14 to 58: Knit even.

ROWS 0 to 14: Knit even, then change to Stockinette stitch.

Cast on 138 sts. with Color 1 and work K1, P1, Ribbing.



Cast on 137 sts. with Color 1 and work 20 rows K1, P1, Ribbing then bind off all sts. the crochet method for Ribbing.

Work the second front section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to left. Cam Box will be on the Left side at Row 0.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Rows 290, 292, 294, 296, 298, 300; 3 sts. after Rows 302, 304.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 254, 266, 278, then work even to Row 290.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Row 194 (EVEN ROWS = ARM-HOLE SHAPING); 3 sts. after Rows 196, 198; 2 sts. after Rows 200, 202, 204, 206; 5 sts. after Row 207 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 1 st. after Row 208; 3 sts. after Row 209; 1 st. after Row 210; 3 sts. after Row 211; 1 st. after Row 212; 2 sts. after Row 213; 1 st. after Row 214; 2 sts. after Row 215; 1 st. after Row 216; 2 sts. after Row 217; 1 st. after Rows 219, 221, 223, 225, 227, 231, 235, 239, 243, then work even to Row 254.

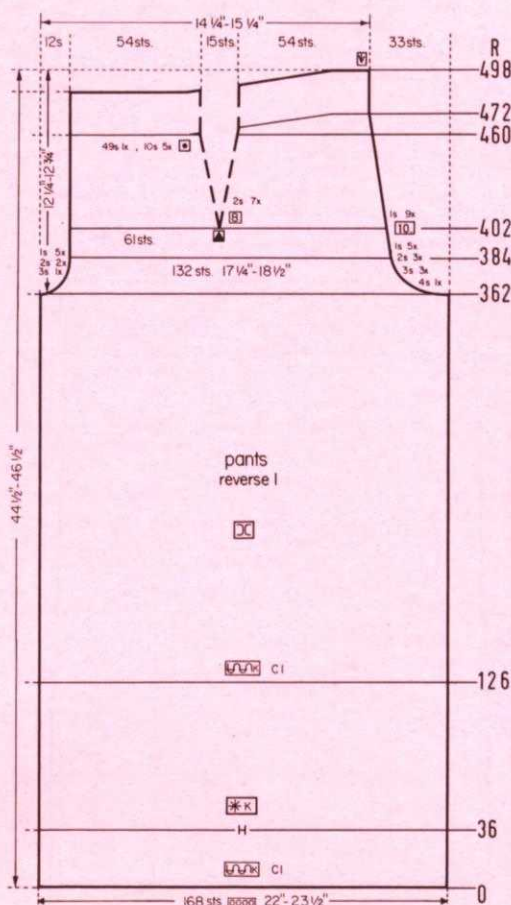
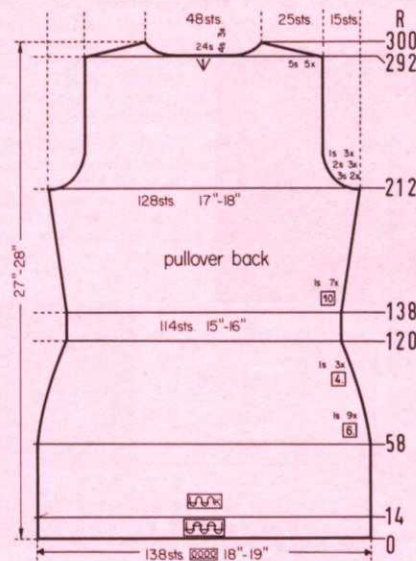
ON CAM BOX SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 154, 168, 182, then knit to Row 194.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 70, 78, 86, 92, 98, 104, 110, 116, 122, 128, 134, 140, then knit to Row 154.

ROWS 19 to 70: Knit even.

ROWS 0 to 18: Knit even, then begin the Norwegian Design beginning with the SECOND SECTION of the Line Drawing for the correct Color selection.

Cast on 74 sts. with Color 2 and work Stockinette stitch.



Work the second pants section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to left. Cam Box will be on the left side at Row 0.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, put into holding position 49 needles after Row 460; 10 needles after Rows 462, 464 (464), 466, 468, 470. After Row 472, bring all the needles back into working position, then knit to Row 498 and bind off the remaining 109 sts.

Decrease 2 sts. for DART after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 362 (EVEN ROWS = CENTER BACK); 3 sts. after Row 363 (ODD ROWS = CENTER FRONT); 3 sts. after Row 364; 2 sts. after Row 365; 3 sts. after Row 366; 2 sts. after Row 367; 3 sts. after Row 368; 1 st. after Row 369; 2 sts. after Row 370; 1 st. after Row 371; 2 sts. after Row 372; 1 st. after Row 373; 2 sts. after Row 374; 1 st. after Rows 375, 376, 377, 378, 380, 382, 384, 394, (402), 404, (410), 414, (418), 424, (426), 434 (434), (442), 444, (450), 454. Knit to Row 460, then work Short Rows and decrease 1 more st. on Cam Box side after Row in ().

ROWS 37 to 126: Knit in Pattern, then change to Color 1 and continue in Stockinette stitch. Work to Row 362.

ROWS 0 to 36: Knit even, then change to the Norwegian Design and begin with the FIRST SECTION of the Line Drawing for correct color selection.

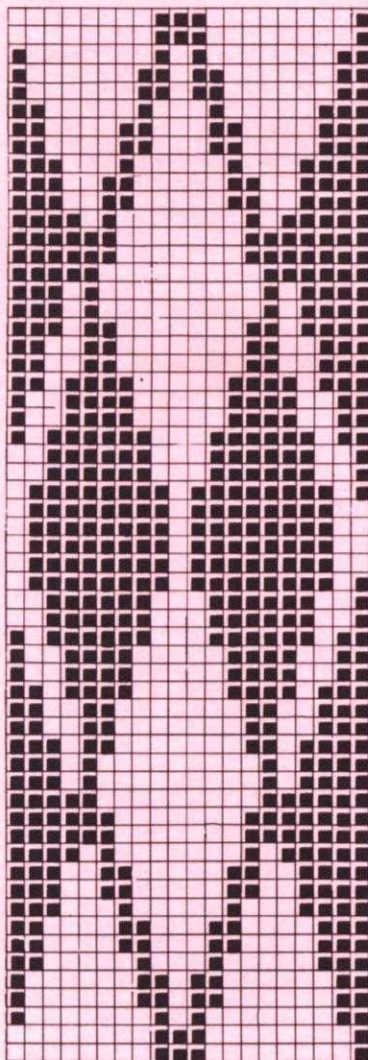
Cast on 168 sts. with Color 1 and work Stockinette stitch.

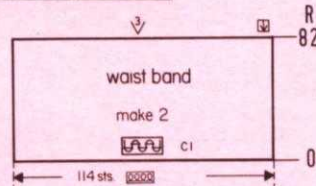

In the instructions, each row in the Norwegian Design is counted as 1 row, but several movements of the Cam Box are needed to complete 1 row. Pullover waist and cuff bands K1, P1, Ribbing. Pullover neckband Stockinette stitch. Pants: Stockinette stitch. Increases: Move the 2 end sts. 1 needle outward, then pick up the 3rd st. from the row below and hang it onto the empty needle. Decreases: Hang the 3rd st. onto the 2nd st., then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle.

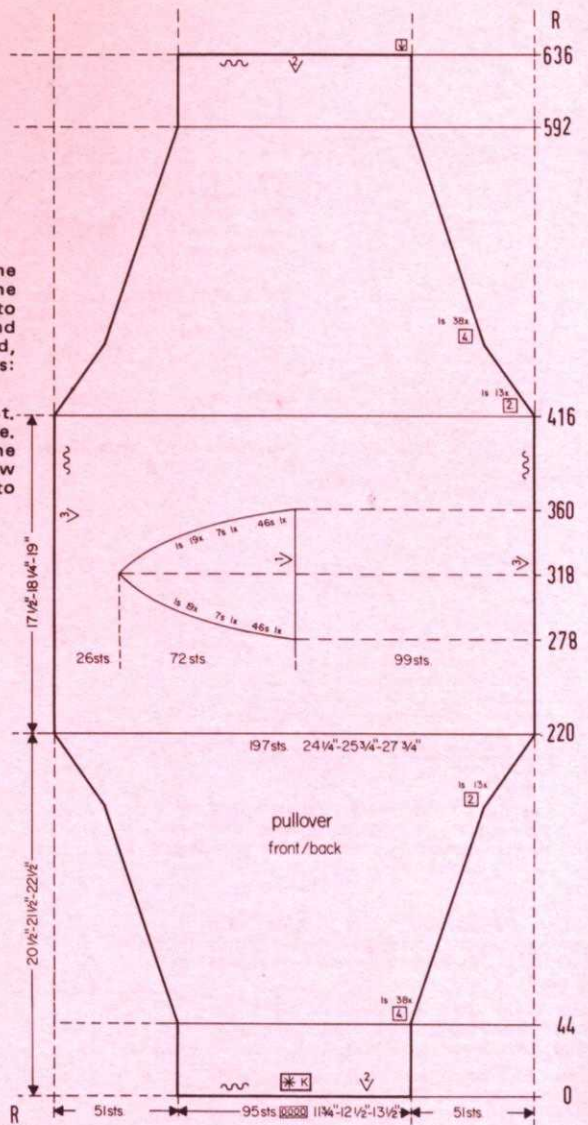
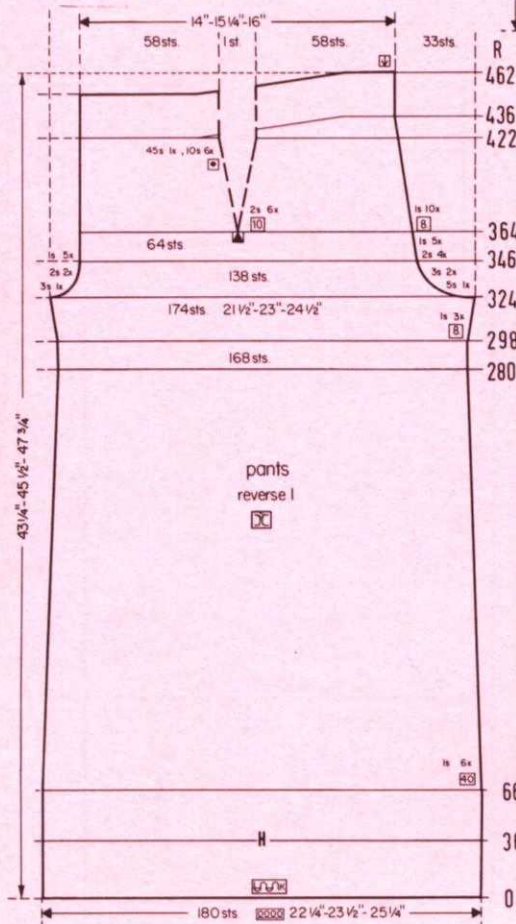
FINISHING: Block all sections. Pants: Sew the inner leg seams. Join center back and front. Turn under 18 rows on leg edges and 1" on upper edge and hem in place on the wrong side. Insert an elastic band into upper hem. Pullover: Ease in the lower edges to 15" and sew the waistband. Ease in the sleeve at cuff edge to 8 1/2" and sew cuff bands. Fold in half and sew underarm and side seams. Fold neckband in half and sew 1 edge to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline.

Make 2. Cast on 114 sts. with Color 1 and work 82 rows K1, P1, Ribbing, then bind off all sts. the crochet method for Ribbing.



Work the second pants section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to left. Cam Box will be on the left side at Row 0.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, put into holding position 45 needles after Row 422; 10 needles after Rows 424, 426 (426), 428, 430, 432, 434. After Row 436, bring all the needles back into working position then knit to Row 462 and bind off the remaining 117 sts.

Decrease 2 sts. for DART after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Row 324 (EVEN ROWS = CENTER BACK); 3 sts. after Row 325 (ODD ROWS = CENTER FRONT); 3 sts. after Row 326; 2 sts. after Row 327; 3 sts. after Row 328; 2 sts. after Row 329; 2 sts. after Row 330; 1 st. after Row 331; 2 sts. after Row 332; 1 st. after Row 333; 2 sts. after Row 334; 1 st. after Row 335; 2 sts. after Row 336; 1 st. after Rows 337, 338, 339, 340, 342, 344, 346, 354, 362, (364), 370, (374), 378, (384), 386, 394, (394), 402, (404), 410, (414), 418. Knit to Row 422, then work Short Rows and decrease 1 more st. ON CAM BOX SIDE after Row in ().

ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, put into holding position, 1 needle after Rows 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, 67, 68, 69, 70, 71. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, bring back into working position, 1 needle after Rows 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79, 80, 81, 82, 83. After Row 84, take the 21 sts. off onto contrast waste yarn.

*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 24, then knit even to Row 60. Remove 21 sts. on the right side (left for second half) onto a stitch holder, then move the Cam Box to the right of remaining sts., (left for second half) attach yarn, then work Short Rows over the remaining 21 sts.

After Row 24, bind off the center 8 sts., put all the needles on the left side into holding position and work the right half first.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, put 44 needles into holding position at Row 0 and after Row 1. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, bring back into working position, 4 needles after Rows 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23.

With purl side facing you, hang the 100 sts. of body that are held on contrast waste yarn, back onto the machine, then remove the waste yarn and turn Row Counter to 0, then work Short Rows.

SIZE: Alanda
50 gr. BALLS: 3 Color 1
1 Color 2

Dacron filler for stuffing.

TENSION: 9 to 10
GAUGE: 2" 13 sts., 18 rows

IMPORTANT: You MUST follow the written instructions when knitting the head because of the special shaping. PATTERN: Stockinette stitch. Decreases: Put the 3rd st. onto the 2nd needle, move the sts. over to fill the empty needle. Increases: Move the 2 end sts. 1 needle outward, then pick up the 3rd st. from the row below and hang it onto the empty needle.

FINISHING: Fold sides of body to the center and weave the seam together leaving an opening for stuffing. Fold up feet and weave the open sts. to the open sts. of the legs, then remove the waste yarn. Close leg seams. Stuff body and close opening. Weave the open sts. of the head together, then remove waste yarn. Close sides of head leaving an opening for stuffing. Stuff head and shape as you go, being sure to fill the jowls of face firmly. Close opening. Embroider eyes, nose and mouth with black, or you may cut the eyes from white and black felt, pin in place, then sew around edges with tiny invisible stitches. Fold ears in half with right sides together and sew up sides, turn to the right side, then close opening. Sew ears to sides of head slightly toward the front as shown in picture. Fold tail in half with right side together, sew seam then turn to the right side and place seam to the center. With seam to underside, sew tail to body. Place head between front paws and sew firmly in place (see picture).

Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 92 and work the left side. Follow the instructions from*.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, put into holding position 1 needle after Rows 128, 129, 130, 131, 132, 133, 134, 135, 136, 137, 138, 139. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, bring back into working position, 1 needle after Rows 140, 141, 142, 143, 144, 145, 146, 147, 148, 149, 150, 151. After Row 152, take the sts. off onto contrast waste yarn.

*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 92, then knit to Row 128. Take 21 sts. on the right side (left for second half) off onto a stitch holder. Move the Cam Box over and attach yarn, then work Short Rows over the remaining 21 sts.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, put 44 needles into holding position after Rows 68, 69. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, bring back into working position, 4 needles after Rows 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79, 80, 81, 82, 83, 84, 85, 86, 87, 88, 89. After Row 92, bind off the center 8 sts., put all the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ROWS 0 to 68: Knit even, then work Short Rows.

Cast on 100 sts. with contrast waste yarn and work in Stockinette stitch. Knit 8 rows, then change to Color 1 and put the Counter at 0.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, bring back into working position 2 needles after Rows 132, 133, 134, 135, 136, 137, 138, 139, 140, 141; 1 needle after Rows 142, 143, 144, 145, 146, 147, 148, 149, 150, 151, 152, 153, 154, 155, 156, 157. Knit to Row 168, then take the sts. off onto contrast waste yarn.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, put into holding position, 1 needle after Rows 106, 107, 108, 109, 110, 111, 112, 113, 114, 115, 116, 117, 118, 119, 120, 121; 2 needles after Rows 122, 123, 124, 125, 126, 127, 128, 129, 130, 131.

After Row 96, put needles 1, 26, 27, 28, 53 into holding position and knit 9 rows (be sure to wrap the yarn around the end needles in holding position each row). After Row 105, bring all the needles back into working position, knit 1 row to the right then work Short Rows.

After Row 88, put needles 26, 27, 28, into holding position and knit 7 rows, then bring these needles back into working position and knit to Row 96.

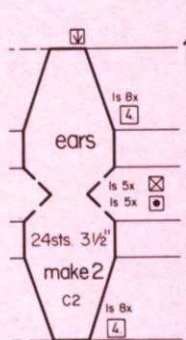
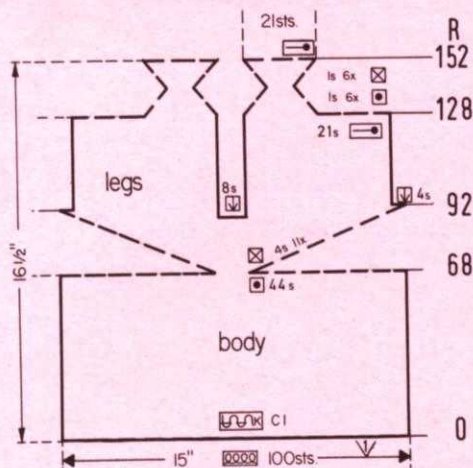
ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 80, 82, 84, then knit to Row 88.

ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 52, 54, 56. Knit to Row 60. After Row 60, put needles 1, 28, 47 into holding position and knit 8 rows (be sure to wrap the yarn around the end needle in holding position before knitting each row). After Row 68, bring needle 28 back into working position and knit 8 rows (always wrapping the end needles still in holding position). After Row 76, bring the end needles back into working position and knit to Row 80.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, put into holding position 2 needles after Rows 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, bring back into working position 2 needles after Rows 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47. Knit to Row 52.

ROWS 0 to 4: Knit even, then work Short Rows.

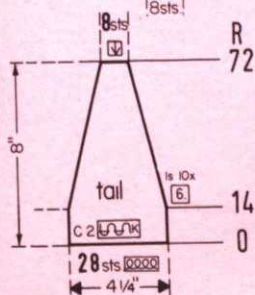
Cast on 53 sts. with contrast waste yarn and work Stockinette stitch. Knit 8 rows, then change to Color 1 and turn the Row Counter to 0.



ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 80, 84, 88, 92, 96, 100, 104, 108. Knit to Row 112, then bind off 8 sts. Make the second ear the same.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, put into holding position, 1 needle after Rows 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, 55. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, bring back into working position, 1 needle after Rows 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, then knit to Row 80.

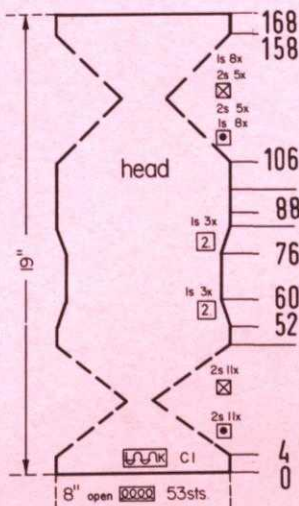
Cast on 8 sts. with Color 2 and work Stockinette stitch. ON EACH SIDE increase 1 st. after Rows 4, 8, 12, 16, 20, 24, 28, 32. Knit even to Row 46, then work Short Rows.



ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 14, 20, 26, 32, 38, 44, 50, 56, 62, 68. Knit even to Row 72 and bind off remaining 8 sts.

ROWS 0 to 14: Knit even.

Cast on 28 sts. with Color 2 and work Stockinette stitch.



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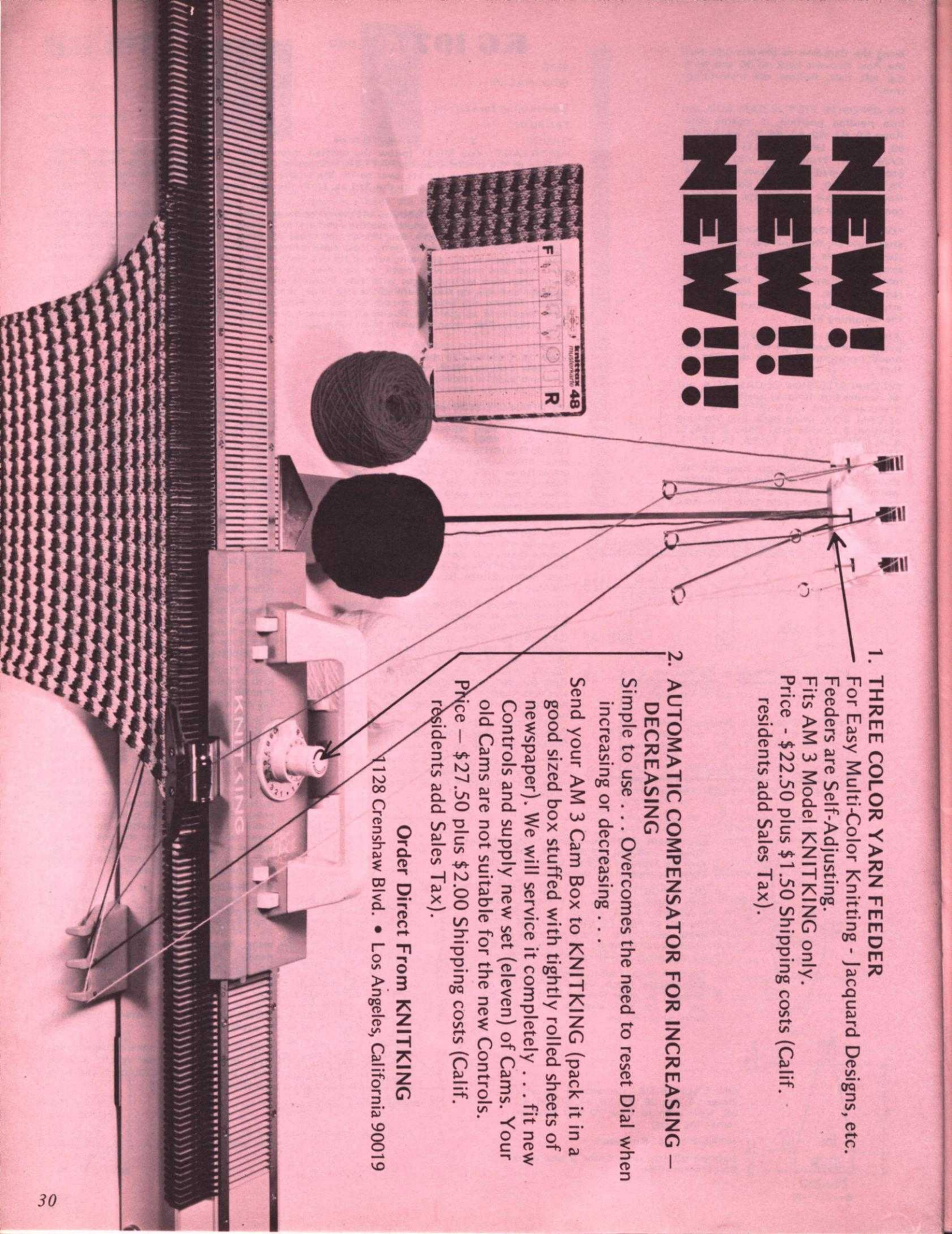
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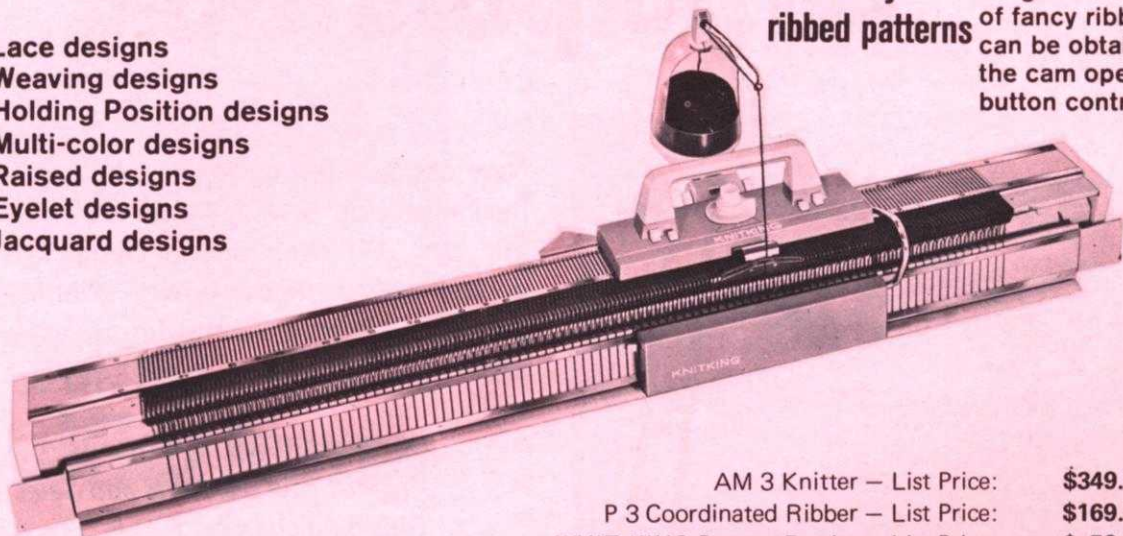
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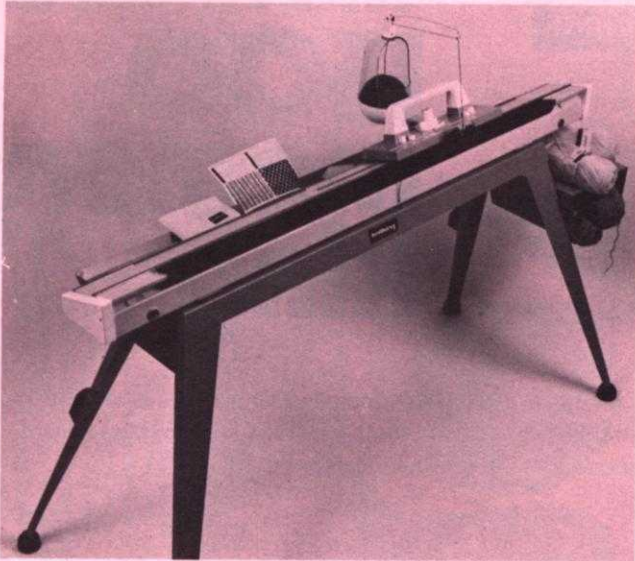

NOTES TO KNIT BY . . .

STITCH AND ROW GAUGE

KNIT A SAMPLE SWATCH . . . before you begin to knit any garment . . . for this is the MOST IMPORTANT STEP toward the correct size and the proper fit of any garment you wish to make. You MUST use the SAME YARN for your sample swatch that you will use to knit your garment and your sample swatch must be knitted large enough and using several different tension numbers on your machine. When you have done this, then you can determine the number of stitches and the number of rows in a two-inch measure. KNITTING MAGAZINE PATTERNS give you 3 tensions to try and one of them should give you the correct stitch and row gauge if you are using the yarn we recommend or a similar weight yarn. Here is the way to make your sample swatch.

Cast on over a sufficient number of needles to produce a swatch at least 4 inches wide. (If the pattern calls for 16 stitches to 2", then 16 x 2 = 32 stitches to cast on). Now knit 4 inches of rows at the first suggested tension number. (If the pattern calls for 22 rows to 2", 22 x 2 = 44 rows to knit). Knit 2 rows using a contrast color, change to the next higher tension and with garment yarn knit another 4", knit 2 rows with contrast color, change to the 3rd higher tension and knit another 4" and then bind off.




Roll the swatch into a cylinder over its length and pull on both ends, unroll it and stretch it diagonally by pulling on the four corners. Allow the swatch to rest and settle (preferably overnight) and then using a stitch gauge or a ruler, count the number of stitches over a 2" width, then the number of rows over a 2" length in EACH of the 3 tensions. Select the tension number that produces the stitches and rows called for in the pattern. If none of them are correct, you are most likely using the wrong weight of yarn.




READING OF CHARTS


You will notice the instructions start at the bottom of the Chart and work UP. Follow the charts exactly as written and providing your sample stitch and row gauge is correct, your garment will come out the right size. Please remember that the section of garment as it is knitted on the machine, faces the same way as the Charts are in this magazine. Where two front pieces are needed, (or any other part of a garment that needs two sections) only one section is normally shown and the second section is usually made with reverse shaping. Set in sleeves are usually identical, but raglan sleeves have to be knitted with reverse shaping for the second sleeve.


READING OF SYMBOLS

To simplify Pattern Knitting, we use Symbols in the Line Drawings and the Chart Diagrams. In the Line Drawings the symbols are shown and are to be read as you look at them while knitting a garment. For instance, if

a Purl stitch faces you, the Purl stitch Symbol  is shown; if a knit stitch faces you (as when using the Ribber) then this Symbol  is shown. The Symbol  at the top of the Line Drawing is the center of the garment section and you use this as a guide for setting up the needles.

The following Symbols    are used for Eyelet Designs in the Line Drawings and also for Full Fashion shaping on the Charts. The Line Drawings have row numbers on the right side. Missing Row numbers are always knitted straight or plain.

In Holding Position Designs  selected needles are pushed into holding position for the stated number of rows. The numbers of rows appear at the right of the Line Drawings; Example: 1-4 means knit Rows 1 to 4; 5 to 7 means knit Rows 5 to 7, etc. This same Symbol is also shown on the Charts and is used for putting needles into holding position for Short Rows. The

Symbol  on the Charts is used to put needles back into working position when knitting Short Rows.

A number in a box stands for the number of rows to be knitted between shapings. Make shaping first, then knit the necessary number of rows. If for instance it reads:

1 st. 8 x



1 st. 10 x



As you will be reading the instructions from the bottom up, here is the way you will follow them: . . . Decrease or increase (depending on the direction of the garment outline) 1 st. at the row where the shaping begins, then knit 8 rows, make the next decrease, then knit 8 rows, until you have decreased (or increased) 1 st. 10 x and you have knitted 8 rows after each decrease (or increase) (1 st. 10 x + 8 rows 10 x). Now begin the first decrease (or increase) for the shaping (which has to be made 8 x) in every 6th row. Decrease (or increase) 1 st. first, then knit 6 rows until you have decreased 1 st. 6 x and after each decrease (or increase) have knitted 6 rows (1 st. 8 x + 6 rows 8 x).

Where shapings are given without a boxed number as on most armholes, necklines, etc., make the shapings on every second row (on each side of course).

(See below for more Pattern Stitch Symbols.)

Knitking News

OUR READERS WRITE

Because we have had some letters requesting more information on JAC 40 PATTERN KNITTING, and because there are a number of Norwegian Designs using the JAC 40 in this issue, we will devote this column to Norwegian Pattern knitting. Some of the information will be a repeat of articles which have appeared in former Newsletters of KNITKING MAGAZINE.... and some of it will be new... so read it all... you can always learn some new tricks.

NORWEGIAN PATTERN KNITTING MADE EASY

To knit a Norwegian Pattern Design, you can hand feed the yarn or you can use your 3 color Yarn Feeder if you have an AM3 KNITKING machine. A Norwegian Pattern can have two or more colors and several movements of the Cam Box (or Slide) are needed to complete one row. Because of this, your Row Counter will not show the true number of rows knitted. Some knitters automatically re-set the Counter after each row is completed... some knitters use a small coin adder that sells for about \$1.00 in most dime stores, drug stores and Super Markets. It is about 4 inches long and two inches deep and has 3 control buttons. The windows are marked - dollars, dimes and cents and every time you complete one actual row of knitting (irrespective of the number of times you move your Cam Box to do it), you push in the cents button once. This is a very useful tool and can be used to keep track of increases and decreases when shaping as well as for JAC Designs.

Another way to keep track of rows when working a Norwegian Design is by figuring the number of JAC PATTERN ROWS to knit. For instance... If your JAC Punch Card is 40 rows, you must first find out how many times you need to insert your Punch Card to reach the armhole shaping. Supposing you have 178 rows to reach the Armhole... 26 rows are in Ribbing and you begin the Norwegian Design after Row 26. Subtract the 26 rows (ribbing) from 178 and you have 152 rows. Your Punch Card is 40 rows long so divide 40 into 152 which equals 3 plus 32 left over. You will insert your Punch Card and use it 3 full times, then insert it again and work through Row 32 of the JAC Card. You have now reached the armhole shaping and have completed Row 178 of your Pattern and have completed Row 32 of the JAC Pattern Card. You must now figure the number of JAC PATTERN ROWS you will need to reach the neck and shoulder shapings and the actual Row numbers plus the JAC PATTERN ROWS where you will bind off for your armhole, neck and shoulder shapings. Remember to figure your JAC Pattern Rows beginning with Row 33 of the Punch Card (you finished Row 32 when you reached the Armhole shaping).

This may sound a bit complicated, but if you will try it just one time, you will find that it is really a great way and quite easy as well. Just remember, it is the COMPLETED JAC PATTERN ROW you are counting, regardless of how many times you must push the Cam Box (or Slide) in order to complete one row.

NECK SHAPING WITH NORWEGIAN DESIGNS

When working the Neckline shaping on a Norwegian Design garment, we tell you to bind off the center stitches, then to put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first. If you do this, you cannot use the Cam Control Buttons on your KNITKING machine and will have to move the needles into position manually... but there is another way where you can knit the right half first with the stitches held on waste yarn and put into the out of work position. Knit several rows using waste yarn over the needles on the left side, then knit 1 row (still with waste yarn) by hand, 1 stitch at a time and pull the needle back to the OUT OF WORK position and leave each stitch in front of the needle latch. You will have to hold the previous stitch while knitting the next one so that each stitch will remain completely out of work. Now you can continue working the right side and you can use your Cam Control Buttons and Three Color Yarn Feeder as well. When you have completed the right side and are ready to knit the left half, carefully pull on the waste yarn to bring the needles into working position (leave the stitches in front of the latches), then unravel the rows of waste yarn carefully, then put the stitches behind the latches and knit the left half.

You can use this same method with a Japanese machine too, but we recommend that you place a strip of cellophane tape across the knitting in position where the presser plate on the Slide rubs across the knitting while you are working the right side. Because there are no sinkers on the Japanese machines, this rubbing can cause fuzz to appear on your knitting. When ready to knit the left side, remove the tape.

Another way to work the Neckline shaping on a Norwegian Design is to knit BOTH HALVES AT THE SAME TIME. Use separate balls of yarn for each side and hand feed the yarn. Each time you set up the needles for the right side, set up the needles for the left side too. Lay the yarn for the right side over the needles, then lay the yarn from the separate ball over the left side needles. (Fasten yarn on the right yarn fastener for the first two rows). Hold both ends of yarn in your hand and slide the Cam Box over the needle bed. Return the Cam Box for the second step. Set up the needles on both sides, lay the second color over the right side needles, then using a separate ball, lay the yarn over the left side needles. Again hold both ends of yarn in your hand and knit all the way across. When the row is completed and the Cam Box is on the left side, make the necessary bind-offs for the left shoulder and right half of the neckline. After the following row is completed and the Cam Box is on the right side, make the necessary bind-offs on the right shoulder and left half of the neckline. When working the neckline shaping in this manner, the knitting time is cut in half. The same method of working both sides at the same time can be used when knitting garments in a Holding Position Design using two colors. Use separate balls of yarn for each side.

HOW TO AVOID HOLES WHEN USING THE JAC 40

Sometimes when using the JAC 40, a color will finish in the middle of a row instead of at the end and unless that color is anchored in some way, a hole will show in your finished garment. This is the way you should anchor the yarn and avoid holes.

First set up your pattern for the next row, then take up the loose end of the contrast yarn, lay it over a needle in knitting position (behind the latch) that is closest to a needle in holding position. If your Cam Box is at the right, it should be a needle to the right. If the Cam Box is at the left, it should be a needle to the left.

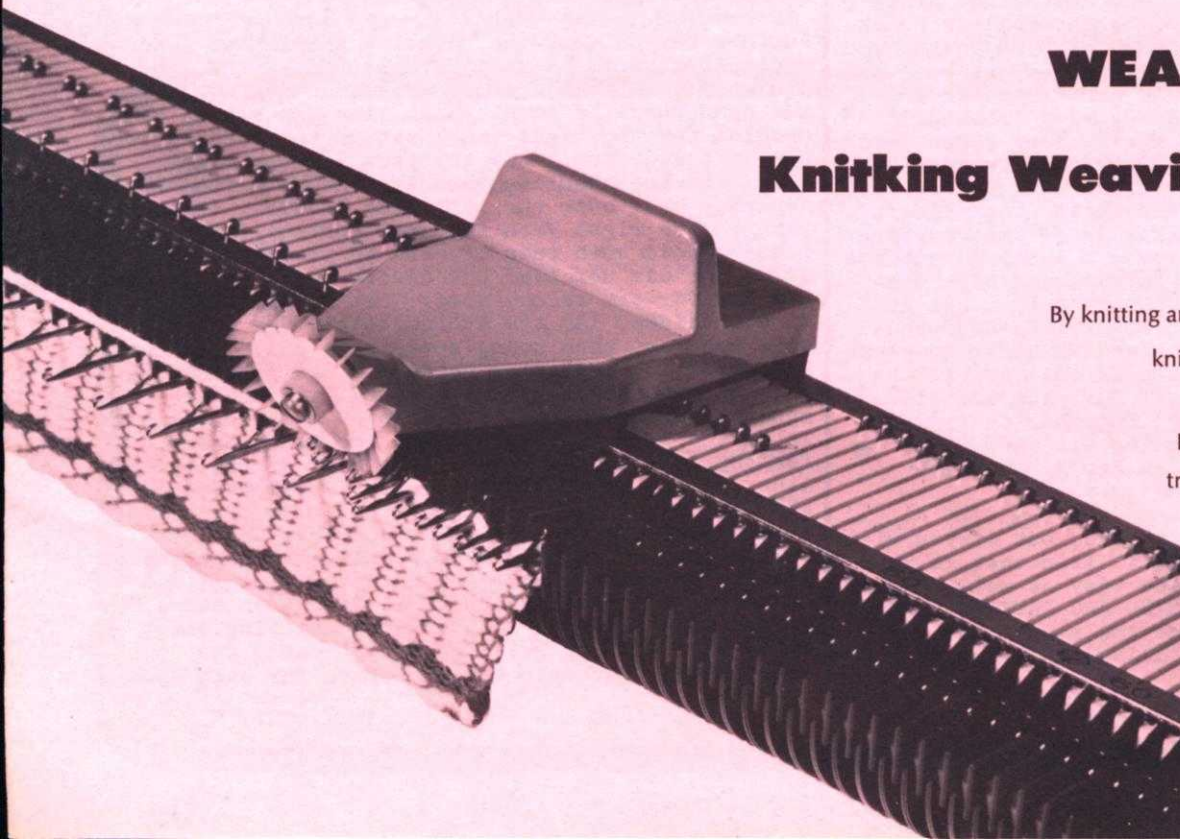
