
### Letter from the Publisher

#### KNITTING INSTRUCTIONS

#### BEACH DRESS AND BAG, DK 7686



SIZE: 8. MATERIAL: 121/4 oz. (7 balls) red, 5½, oz. (3 balls) white and 3½ oz. (2 balls) blue KNITKING Subita Dralon 3 ply, Color #436, #401 and #416. TENSION: KNITKING 4 to 6. STITCH and ROW GAUGE: 16 sts. 2", 23 rows 2". PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch.

BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 179 sts. with blue.

ROWS 1-36: Work even, then hang the cast-on sts. back on the machine behind the latches to form the hem. ROWS 37-54: Work even with white.

ROWS 55-72: Working with blue, decrease 1 st. on each side after ROWS 54 and 66 by always hanging the 3rd st. on each side onto the 2nd needle, then moving the 2 end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. After ROW 72 continue

ROWS 73-284: Decrease 1 st. on each side after ROW 78, then again every following 12th row 14 x and every follow-

ing 10th row 2 x as you did before. (141 sts.)

ROWS 285-298: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 3 sts. beginning next 4 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 4 rows and 1 st. beginning next 6 rows. (115 sts.)

ROWS 299-354: Work even.
ROWS 355-368: SHOULDER SHAPING: Bind off 4 sts. beginning next 4 rows and 5 sts. beginning next 2 rows. After ROW 360 bind off the 15 center sts. for NECK. (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover). Bind off 5 sts. on Shoulder Side and continue to shape shoulder on every other row by binding off 5 sts. 4 x. AT THE SAME TIME, Shape Neck on every other row by binding off 5 sts. 1 x, 4 sts. 1 x and 3 sts. 1 x.

FRONT: (Figure I). Cast on 83 sts. with blue.

ROWS 1-18: Work even, then cast on 26 sts. on the left

side, using a separate length of yarn.

ROWS 19-36: Work even, then hang the first 83 cast-on sts. back on the machine behind the latches to form the hem.

ROWS 37-54: Work even with white.
ROWS 55-72: Working with blue, decrease 1 st. on the right side after ROWS 54 and 66 as you did on the back.

After ROW 72 continue with red.


ROWS 73-284: Decrease 1 st. on the right side after ROW 78, then again every following 12th row 14 x and every following 10th row 2 x as you did before. AT THE SAME TIME, work buttonholes after ROWS 92, 152, 212 and 272 over the 2nd-8th and 19th-25th needles counting from the left side. (90 sts.)

ROWS 285-298: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 3 sts. on the right side, then on every other row bind off 3 sts. 1 x, 2 sts.

2 x and 1 st. 3 x. (77 sts.)

ROWS 299-341: Work even and make buttonholes after **ROW 332** 

ROWS 342-368: NECK SHAPING: Bind off 26 sts. on the left side, then on every other row bind off 3 sts. 1 x, 2 sts. 3 x, 1 st. 2 x and 1 st. on the next 4th and following 4th row. AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 354, then on every other row SHAPE SHOULDER by binding off 4 sts. 2 x and



5 sts. 6 x. Work the second front section with reverse shapings and omit the buttonholes.

NECK FACING: Cast on 92 sts. with red and work 3 rows with tension 4 and 3 rows with tension 5. After 6 rows bind off all sts.

BAG: (Figure III). Cast on 96 sts. with red.

ROWS 1-144: Work the first 36 rows with red, then always alternate 18 rows blue, 18 rows white and 18 rows red. ROWS 145-162: Working with blue, knit short rows. (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover). On opposite side after rows 144 and 145, 148 and 149 put 1 needle into holding position, then alternately on each side of every other row put 1 needle 2 x, 2 needles 2 x and 3 needles 2 x into holding position.

ROWS 163-180: Reverse the sequence and bring the needles

back into working position.

ROWS 181-324: Work even, always knitting 18 rows red, 18 rows white and 18 rows blue and the last 36 rows red. After ROW 324 bind off all sts.

FINISHING: DRESS: Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. Turn under 13 sts. on front edges, matching buttonholes. With right sides together sew facing to neckline, then turn to wrong side and hem. Turn under 3 sts. around armhole and hein to wrong side. Finish buttonholes, sew on buttons.

BAG: Attach press-on type interfacing on wrong side of bag section, then fold section in half and join sides. Turn under 18 rows on upper edge and hem to wrong side. Line the bag with water proof material. Knot a cord using 2 x 20 strands of yarn. (See Practical Knitting Hints Book—Page 60). Join cord to bag at sides. (See picture).

#### BEACH COAT, DP 7682



SIZE: 12/14. MATERIAL: 14 oz. (8 balls) green and 51/4 oz. (3 balls) red. KNITKING Subita Dralon 3 ply, Color #432 and #436. TENSION: KNITKING 4 to 6. STITCH and ROW GAUGE: 16 sts. 2", 21 rows 2". PATTERN: Stockinette stitch.

BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 186 sts. with green.

ROWS 1-34: Work even, then hang the cast-on sts. back on the machine behind the latches to form the hem

ROWS 35-226: Decrease 1 st. on each side after ROW 46, then again every following 10th row 14 x and every following 8th row 4 x by always hanging the 3rd st.on each side onto the 2nd needle, then moving the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. (148 sts.)

ROWS 227-310: RAGLAN SHAPING: Decrease 1 st. on each side after ROW 226, then again every other row 37 x by always hanging the 3rd st. on each side onto the 2nd needle, then moving the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. After ROW 302 bind off the center 24 sts. for NECK. (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover). Decrease 1 st. on the right side and continue to Shape Raglan on every other row by decreasing 1 st. 3 x as you did before. AT THE SAME TIME, Shape Neck on every other row by binding off 7 sts. 1 x, 5 sts. 1 x and 4 sts. 2 x. FRONT: (Figure I). Cast on 104 sts. with green.

ROWS 1-17: Work even. After ROW 17 cast on 26 sts. on the left side.

ROWS 18-34: Work even, then hang the first 104 cast-on sts. back on the machine to form the hem.


ROWS 35-226: Decrease 1 st. on the right side after ROW 46, then again every following 10th row 14 x and every following 8th row 4 x as you did on the back. AT THE SAME TIME, for the FRONT SHAPING, decrease 1 st. on the left side after ROW 46, then again every following 10th row 17 x by always hanging the 28th st. on the left side onto the 27th needle, then moving the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. (93 sts.)

ROWS 227-302: RAGLAN SHAPING: Decrease 1 st. on the right side after ROW 226, then again every other row 36 x as you did on the back AT THE SAME TIME, continue to Shape Front by decreasing 1 st. on the left side after ROW 226, then again every following 10th row 5 x as you did before. After ROW 285, then on every other row SHAPE NECK by binding off 26 sts. 1 x, 5 sts. 1 x, 4 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 2 x, 2 sts. 2 x, 1 st. 2 x and after ROW 302 hang the remaining 3 sts. together, (2 outside sts. onto center st.) then bind off. Work the second front section with reverse shapings.

SLEEVE: (Figure III). Cast on 140 sts. with red.

ROWS 1-42: Work even, then hang the cast-on sts. back on the machine behind the latches to form the hem. Now always work 20 rows green and 18 rows red.

ROWS 43-150: Decrease 1 st. on each side after ROW 42, then again every following 10th row 10 x. (118 sts.)
ROWS 151-226: RAGLAN SHAPING: Decrease 1 st. on each side, then again every other row 37 x as you did on the back.
ROWS 227-234: Work short rows. (See Notes to Knit By).
On the left side put 13 needles 1 x, 8 needles 1 x, 7 needles 1 x and 6 needles 1 x into holding position. AT THE SAME TIME continue to Shape Raglan on the right side on every other row by decreasing 1 st. 4 x more. After ROW 234 bring all needles into working position and bind off all 38 sts. Work the second sleeve with reverse shaping.



NECKBAND: The Neckband is worked in 2 sections. For the first section cast on 112 sts. with green and work 52 rows stockinette st., 9 rows with tension 6, 9 rows with tension 5, 16 rows with tension 4, 9 rows with tension 5 and 9 rows with tension 6. AT THE SAME TIME, make DARTS as follows: For each Dart decrease 2 sts. after ROW 6, then again every following 6th row 3 x. For the first decrease hang the 28th and 30th sts. counting from the right side onto the 29th needle and the 66th and 68th sts., also counting from the right side onto the 67th needle, then move the sts. together to fill the empty needles. The next decreases lie directly above. After ROW 30 increase 2 sts. for each Dart, then again every following 6th row 3 x. The increases lie directly above the decreases. After ROW 52 bind off all sts. the crochet method. For the second section cast on the same amount of sts. and use the same tensions. Make the DARTS as for the first section, but reverse the sides. (Count from the left side). AT THE SAME TIME, for the POINTED SHAPING, increase 1 st. after ROW 2, then again every other row 5 x. Decrease 1 st. after ROW 16, then again every other row 5 x. Increase 1 st. after ROW 28, then again every other row 5 x. Decrease 1 st. after ROW 40, then again every other row 5 x. AT THE SAME TIME, work buttonholes after ROWS 13 and 37 over the 13th-21st needles. After row 52 bind off all sts. the crochet method. FINISHING: Join front and back sections at sides. Sew sleeves together, then weave to front and back sections, 1 st. in on each edge. Turn under 13 sts. on each front edge and hem to wrong side. Join neckband sections at center back, then sew 1 edge of neckband to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline, leaving about 11/2" on each side of neckband free. Sew pointed edge and straight edge of neckband. Finish buttonhole, sew on button.

#### BEACH DRESS, DK 7684



SIZE: 8/10. MATERIAL: 14 oz. (8 balls) white and  $1\frac{3}{4}$  oz. (1 ball) red KNITKING Subita Dralon 3 ply, Color #401 and #427. TENSION: KNITKING 4 to 6. STITCH and ROW GAUGE: 16 sts. 2", 21 rows 2". PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch.

BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 153 sts. ROWS 1-12: Work even, then cast on 20 sts. on each side. (Use a separate length of yarn for the left side).

ROWS 13-92: Work even, then bind off 9 sts. on each side. (Use a

separate length of yarn for the left side). **ROWS 93-276:** Decrease 1 st. **on each side** after ROW 106, then again every following 12th row 13 x by always hanging the 3rd st. **on each side** onto the 2nd needle, then moving the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. (147 sts.) **POWS 277-292:** APMHOLE SHAPING: Rind off 4 sts. be-

ROWS 277-292: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 6 rows and 1 st. on each side of the following 4th row. (121 sts.)

ROWS 293-344: Work even.

ROWS 345-360: SHOULDER SHAPING: Bind off 4 sts. beginning next 8 rows. After ROW 352 bind off the center 17 sts. for NECK. (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover). Bind off 4 sts. on Shoulder Side and continue to shape shoulder on every other row by binding off 4 sts. 2 x and 5 sts. 2 x. AT THE SAME TIME, Shape Neck on every other row by binding off 5 sts. 2 x and 4 sts 1 x. FRONT: (Figure I). Work the front the same as the back to ROW 92, then bind off 9 sts. on each side as you did on the back.

ROWS 93-112: Decrease 1 st. on each side after ROW 106 as you did on the back. After ROW 112 bind off the center 11 sts., put the sts. on the left side onto a stitch holder


and complete the right side first.

ROWS 113-284: Decrease 1 st. on the right side after ROW 118, then again every following 12th row 12 x as you did before.

ROWS 285-300: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 4 sts. on the right side, then on every other row bind off 3 sts. 1 x, 2 sts. 1 x, 1 st. 3 x and 1 st. on the following 4th row 1 x. ROWS 301-321: Work even.

ROWS 322-368: NECK SHAPING: Decrease 1 st. on the left side, then again every other row 13 x and every following 4th row 3 x. AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 352, then on every other row SHAPE SHOULDER by binding off 4 sts. 7 x and 5 sts. 2 x. Now hang the sts. from the stitch holder back on the machine, turn the Row Counter back to 112 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from ROWS 113-386 reversing the sides, starting the ARMHOLE SHAPING after ROW 285, the NECK SHAPING after ROW 322 and the SHOULDER SHAPING after ROW 353.

COLLAR: (Figure III). Cast on 121 sts. with white. ROWS 1-16: Work short rows. (See Notes to Knit By). On the left side put 118 needles into holding position, knit 2 rows. Now in succession, bring 3 needles 1 x, 4 needles 2 x, 5 needles 2 x and 7 needles 2 x back into working position.



After ROW 16 put all needles into holding position, move the Cam Box to the left side and turn the Row Counter to 0. ROWS 1-16: On the left side in succession, bring 3 needles 2 x, 4 needles 2 x, 5 needles 2 x and 7 needles 2 x back into working position. Put all needles into holding position. move the Cam Box to the right side, bring all needles back into working position and continue working over all needles. ROWS 17-56: Increase 1 st. on each side after ROW 16, then again on the following 6th row 1 x, every following 4th row 5 x and every other row 6 x. AT THE SAME TIME, continue working with red after ROW 48.

ROWS 57-61: Decrease 1 st. on each side after ROWS 56, 58 and 60. After ROW 61 bind off all sts. the crochet

POCKET: Make two. Cast on 45 sts. with white. Work 50 rows white and 14 rows red, then bind off all sts.

FRONT BAND: Make two. Cast on 11 sts. with red and work with tension 3.

ROWS 1-256: Work even.

ROWS 257-262: For the pointed shaping bind off 2 sts. beginning next 2 rows and 1 st. beginning 4 rows. After ROW 262 hang the remaining 3 sts. together, (2 outside sts. onto center st.), then bind off.

FINISHING: Weave front and back section together at sides. 1 st. in on each edge. Turn under 12 rows on lower edge and 10 rows on slit edges and hem to wrong side. Join shoulders. Turn under 3 sts. around armholes and hem to wrong side. Sew collar to neckline. Join pointed ends of front bands to collar corners. Sew bands to collar and front opening, then turn under half, and hem to wrong side. Sew in zipper. (See Picture) Turn under half of pocket edging and hem to wrong side. Sew pockets in place.

#### WOMAN'S DRESS, DK 7679



SIZE: 10/12. MATERIAL: 7 oz. (4 balls) white,  $5\frac{1}{4}$  oz. (3 balls) blue and  $5\frac{1}{4}$  oz. (3 balls) red KNIT-KING Subita Dralon 3 ply. Color #401, #416 and #427. TENSION: Color KNITKING 4 to 6. STITCH and ROW GAUGE: 16 sts. 2", 23 rows 2". PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch with repeated Stripes of 6 rows blue, 14 rows red, 6 rows blue and 20 rows white.

BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 147 sts. with red.

ROWS 1-20: Working even, knit 14 rows red and 6 rows blue. After ROW 20 cast on 19 sts. on each side, using a separate length of yarn for the

ROWS 21-40: Working even, knit 6 rows blue and 14 rows red. After ROW 40 hang the first 147 cast-on sts. back on the machine behind the latches to form the hem.

ROWS 41-76: Working even, knit 6 rows blue and 20 rows white, then work the repeated Color Stripes as explained. After ROW 76 bind off 9 sts. on each side, using a separate length of yarn for the left side.


ROWS 77-274: Decrease 1 st. on each side after ROW 112, then again every following 18th row 3 x, every following 10th row 6 x and every following 8th row 6 x by always hanging the 3rd st. on each side onto the 2nd needle, then moving the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. (135 sts.)

ROWS 275-288: Work even.

ROWS 289-380: Increase 1 st. on each side after ROW 288,

then again every following 10th row 7 x. (151 sts.)
ROWS 381-390: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 5 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows and 2 sts. beginning next 4 rows. (119 sts.)

ROWS 391-426: Decrease 1 st. on each side after ROW 390, then again every following 4th row 8 x by always hanging the 7th st. on each side onto the 6th needle, then moving the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. After ROW 426 divide the sts. in the center for the opening, put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.



ROWS 427-453: Continue to Shape Armhole after ROW 426, then on every following 4th row by decreasing 1 st. 7 x as before

ROWS 454-466: NECK SHAPING: Bind off 7 sts. (or 8 sts.) on the left side, then on every other row bind off 5 sts.  $1 \times 3$  sts.  $2 \times 3$  and  $2 \times 3 \times 4$  THE SAME TIME, decrease 1 st. on the right side after ROW 454. After ROW 458, then on every other row SHAPE SHOULDER by binding off 4 sts. 5 x. Now turn the Row Counter back to 426, bring all needles back into working position and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from ROWS 427-466 but reverse the sides and start the NECK SHAPING after ROW 454 and the SHOULDER SHAPING after ROW 459.

FRONT: (Figure I). Work the front the same as the back, but omit the opening and after ROW 430 bind off the center 13 sts. for NECK (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover) then on every other row on Neck Side bind off 3 sts. 2 x, 2 sts. 2 x, 1 st. 3 x and 1 st. on every following 4th row 3 x. NECKBAND: Cast on 129 sts. with blue and work stockinette st., 6 rows blue, 6 rows red, 12 rows blue, 6 rows red and 6 rows blue. After 36 rows bind off all sts. FINISHING: Weave front and back section together at

sides, 1 st. in from each edge. Turn under 10 sts. on slit edges and hem to wrong side. Join shoulder seams. Turn under 3 sts. around armholes and hem to wrong side. Sew 1 edge of neckband to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline. Work 1 row of single crochet around back opening. Work 2 loops on 1 side and sew 2 button to other side of opening.


SIZE: 12/14. MATERIAL 83/4 oz. (5 balls) white and small amounts of blue and red KNITKING Subita Crepe 2 x 3. Color #104, #137 and #115. TENSION: KNITKING 3 to 5. STITCH and ROW GAUGE: 18 sts. 2", 25 rows 2" PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch. EDGES: K1, P1, Ribbing.

BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 165 sts. ROWS 1-16: K1, P1, Ribbing. After ROW 16 transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine and continue with stockinette st.

ROWS 17-192: Increase 1 st. on each side after ROW 66, then again every following 20th

row 5 x. (177 sts.) ROWS 193-216: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 3 sts. beginning next 4 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 4 rows, 1 st. beginning next 8 rows and 1 st. on each side of the next 4th and following 4th row. (145 sts.)

ROWS 217-272: Work even. ROWS 273-292: SHOULDER SHAPING: Bind off 8 sts. beginning next 2 rows and 4 sts. beginning next 8 rows. After ROW 282 bind off the center 15 sts. for NECK. (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover) Bind off 4 sts. on Shoulder Side and continue to shape shoulder on every other row by binding off 4 sts. 2 x and 5 sts. 3 x. AT THE SAME TIME, Shape Neck on every other row by binding off 5 sts. 1 x, 4 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 1 x and 2 sts. 1 x.



FRONT: (Figure I). Work the front the same as the back to **ROW 192** 

ROWS 193-202: Work even.

ROWS 203-226: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 3 sts. beginning next 4 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 4 rows, 1 st. beginning next 8 rows and 1 st. on each side of the next 4th and following 4th row. (145 sts.)

ROWS 227-240: Work even. After ROW 240 divide the sts. in the center for the opening, put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first. ROWS 241-271: Work even.

ROWS 272-302: NECK SHAPING: Bind off 5 sts. (6 sts.) on the left side, then on every other row bind off 4 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 1 x, 2 sts. 2 x, 1 st. 2 x and 1 st. on every following 4th row 3 x. AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 282, then on every other row SHAPE SHOULDER by binding off 8 sts. 1 x. 4 sts. 7 x and 5 sts. 3 x. Now move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 240, bring the needles back into working position and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from ROWS 241-302, reversing the sides.

FRONT BAND: Cast on 42 sts. with blue and work 96 rows stockinette st. changing the color every 12 rows in the following order: beginning with blue, then white, red, white, blue, white, red and white. AT THE SAME TIME, make vertical buttonholes after ROWS 24 and 72 by dividing the work in the center and knitting for 11 rows in 2 sections.

After 96 rows bind off all sts.

SHOULDER FLAPS: Make two. Cast on 36 sts. with blue and work 60 rows stockinette st., changing the color every 10 rows as follows: beginning with blue, then white, red, white, blue and white. AT THE SAME TIME, make a vertical buttonhole after ROW 40 by dividing the work in the center and knitting for 9 rows in 2 sections. After 60 rows bind off all sts. (For buttonholes, see Practical Knitting Hints

Book, page 35).

NECK FACING: Cast on 115 sts. with white and work 10 rows stockinette st., 5 rows with tension 4 and 5 rows with tension 5. After 10 rows bind off all sts.

FINISHING: Join front and back section at sides and shoulders, easing in the fullness at bustline of front section. With right sides together sew facing to neckline, then turn to wrong side and hem. Work 1 row of single crochet around front opening, making a small loop on upper right edge and sewing a button to upper left edge. Turn under 4 sts. around armhole and hem to wrong side. Join long edges of front band, leaving 2 openings for buttonholes. (Seam will be in center back of band). Finish shoulder flaps in the same manner. Finish buttonholes. Sew buttons to front and shoulders of shell. Button front band and shoulder flaps in place. Attach shoulder flaps at armhole edge.

SIZE: 10/12. MATERIAL: 13 oz. light blue, 3 oz. white and 1 oz. yellow Pauline Denham Nomotta Splen-Pauline Denham Nomotta dour. TENSION: KNITKING 4 to 6. STITCH and ROW GAUGE: 16 sts. 2". 24 rows 2". PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch, worn on the purl side. BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 173 sts. with blue.

ROWS 1-284: Decrease 1 st. on each side after ROW 68, then again every following 16th row 7 x, every following 12th row 4 x and every following


8th row 7 x. (135 sts.)

ROWS 285-298: Work even.

ROWS 299-358: Increase 1 st. on each side after ROW 298, then again every following 8th row 7 x. (151 sts.)

ROWS 359-394: Work even and AT THE SAME TIME after Row 358 work 6 rows yellow, 10 rows blue, 10 rows white and 6 rows yellow. After ROW 390 continue working with

ROWS 395-412: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 6 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 4 rows and 1 st. beginning next 8 rows. (109 sts).



ROWS 413-436: Work even.

ROWS 437-494: NECK SHAPING: Bind off the center 23 sts., (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover) then on every other row on Neck Side bind off 6 sts. 1 x, 5 sts. 1 x, 4 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 1 x, 2 sts. 1 x, 1 st. 2 x and 1 st. on the next 4th and following 4th row. Now work even to ROW 494, then bind off the remaining 19 st.

FRONT: (Figure I). Work the front the same as the back

to ROW 356.

ROWS 357-366: BUST DARTS: Work short rows. (See Notes to Knit By) Alternately on each side put 7 needles 5 x into holding position.

ROWS 367-368: On the left side bring all needles into working position, knit 1 row. On the right side bring all needles

into working position, knit 1 row.

ROWS 369-404: Work even and AT THE SAME TIME after ROW 368 work 6 rows yellow, 10 rows blue, 10 rows white and 6 rows yellow. After ROW 400 continue working with

ROWS 405-422: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 6 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 2 sts., beginning next 4 rows and 1

st. beginning next 8 rows. (109 sts.)

ROWS 423-466: NECK SHAPING: Bind off the center 31 sts. as you did on the back, then on every other row on Neck Side bind off 5 sts. 1 x, 4 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 1 x, 2 sts. 2 x, 1 st. 2 x and 1 st. on the next 4th and following 4th row. Now work even to row 466, then bind off the remaining

NECK FACING: Cast on 112 sts. with white and work 3 rows with tension 4 and 3 rows with tension 5. After 6 rows bind off all sts. Work the second section the same, but

cast on only 86 sts.

FINISHING: Join front and back section at sides. Turn under 20 rows on lower edge and hem to wrong side. Turn under 3 sts. around armholes and hem to wrong side. Fold under back shoulder edges forming points and hem in place. With right sides together sew facings to front and back neckline then turn to wrong side and hem. Join back and front shoulder by sewing a button to each shoulder, sewing through both edges.



BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 159 sts. with yellow.

ROWS 1-48: Work 16 rows yellow, 16 rows green and 16 rows Yellow. Now hang the cast-on sts. back on the machine behind the latches to form the hem and continue with the

repeated Color Stripes. ROWS 49-226: Increase 1 st. on each side after ROW 96, then again every following 26th row 4 x. (169 sts.) ROWS 227-252: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 5 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 6 rows, 1 st. beginning next 6 rows and 1 st. on each side of the next 4th and following 4th row. (123 sts.) ROWS 253-302: Work even.



ROWS 303-346: NECK SHAPING: Bind off the center 15 sts., (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover) then on every other row on Neck Side bind off 6 sts. 2 x, 4 sts. 2 x, 3 sts. 2 x, 2 sts. 2 x, 1 st. 2 x and then work even to ROW 346.

ROWS 347-360: SHOULDER SHAPING: Bind off 2 sts. on Shoulder Side, then on every other row bind off 2 sts. 1 x and 3 sts. 6 x.

FRONT: (Figure I). Work the front the same as the back to ROW 276.

ROWS 277-314: NECK SHAPING: Bind off the center 21 sts. as you did on the back, then on every other row on Neck Side bind off 5 sts. 2 x, 4 sts. 2 x, 2 sts. 2 x, 1 st. 4 x and 1 st. on every following 4th row 3 x. AT THE SAME TIME, work vertical buttonholes after ROW 300 by dividing the work between the 11th and 12th needles and working for 9 rows in 2 sections. (See Practical Knitting Hints Book, page 35.)

ROWS 315-328: Work short rows for the pointed shaping. (See Notes to Knit By) Alternately on each side put 1 needle 5 x and 2 needles 2 x into holding position. After ROW 328 bring the needles back into working position and using a separate length of yarn, bind off all sts. the crochet method.

FINISHING: Join front and back section at sides. With green, work 2 rows of single crochet around all edges. Finish buttonholes, sew buttons to back shoulders.

BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 195 sts.

and work stockinette st.

ROWS 1-282: Decrease 1 st. on each side after ROW 48, then again every following 18th row 8 x, every follow-

ing 8th row 6 x and every following 6th row 7 x by always hanging the 3rd st. on each side onto the 2nd needle, then moving the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. (151 sts.) ROWS 283-296: Work even.

ROWS 297-360: Increase 1 st. on each side after ROW 296, then again every following 6th row 4 x and every following 8th row 4 x. (169 sts.)


ROWS 361-470: RAGLAN SHAPING: Bind off 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows. AT THE SAME TIME, decrease 2 sts. after ROWS 462 and 466 for Raglan Shaping as you did before

FRONT: (Figure I). Work the front the same as the back to ROW 360.

ROWS 369-374: RAGLAN SHAPING: Bind off 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows, then decrease 2 sts. on each side after ROW 371 by hanging the 3rd and 4th sts. on each side onto the 5th and 6th needles, then moving the 2 end sts. 2 needles inward to fill the empty needles. After ROW 374 hang the center st. onto the neighboring needle, put all needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first

ROWS 375-470: RAGLAN and FRONT SHAPING: Continue to Shape Raglan by decreasing 2 sts. on the right side as you did before, then again every following 3rd row 8 x and every following 4th row 17 x. AT THE SAME TIME, Shape Front by decreasing 1 st. on the left side after ROW 376, then again every other row 9 x, every following 4th row 5 x and every following 6th row 9 x. For these decreases always hang the 3rd st. on the left side onto the 2nd needle, then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. After ROW 470 hang the remaining 3 sts. together (the 2 outside sts. onto the center st.) then bind off. Now turn the Row Counter back to 374, bring the needles back into working position and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from ROWS 375-470 but reverse the sides. SLEEVE: (Figure III). Cast on 108 sts.

ROWS 1-10: K1, P1, Ribbing. After ROW 10 transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine and continue with stockinette st.



ROWS 11-54: Increase 1 st. on each side after ROW 10, then again every following 4th row 8 x and every other row 4 x. (134 sts.)

ROWS 55-156: RAGLAN SHAPING: Bind off 2 sts. beginning next 2 rows. After ROW 57 decrease 2 sts. on each side then again every following 3rd row 9 x and every following

4th row 17 x as you did on the back.

ROWS 157-164: Work short rows. (See Notes to Knit By. inside back cover). On the left side put 6 needles 1 x, needles 1 x and 3 needles 2 x into holding position. AT THE SAME TIME, decrease 2 sts. on the right side after ROWS 156 and 160. After ROW 164 bring all needles back into working position, then bind off all remaining 18 sts. Make the second sleeve with reverse shaping .

NECKBAND: Cast on 137 sts. with blue and work K1, P1 Ribbing, 6 rows blue, 12 rows white and 6 rows red and AT THE SAME TIME, for the Pointed Shaping, bind off 2 sts. on the right side, after ROW 2, then again every other row 10 x. After 24 rows bind off all sts. the crochet method for ribbing. Work the second section with reverse shaping,

casting on from right to left.

BELT: Make two. Cast on 115 sts. with blue and work K1, P1, Ribbing, 8 rows blue, 8 rows white and 8 rows red. After 24 rows bind off all sts. the crochet method for ribbing.

FINISHING: Weave front and back section together at sides. 1 st. in from each edge, easing in the fullness at bustline of front section. Sew sleeves together and weave to front and back section, 1 st. in from each edge. Turn under 20 rows on lower edge and hem to wrong side. Join neckband at front and back, then sew to neckline. Join belt at center back and line with grosgrain ribbon. Sew a buckle to one end.

SIZE: 10/12. MATERIAL: 101/2 oz. (6 balls) pale yellow KNITKING Satin Cotton 2 x 8 ply. Color #709. TEN-SION: KNITKING 5 to 7. STITCH and ROW GAUGE: 15 sts. 2", 20 rows . PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch with Evelet Design according to chart.

BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 131 sts. ROWS 1-12: Work even, then hang the cast-on sts. back on the machine behind the latches to form the hem. ROWS 13-60: Work even and AT THE SAME TIME, begin the Eyelet Design after ROW 14 by hanging

first the center st. and the 2nd st. on each side onto the

left neighboring needle.

ROWS 157-176: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 6 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 2 sts. begining next 2 rows, 1 st. beginning next 4 rows and 1 st. on each side of the next 4th and following 4th row. AT THE SAME TIME, begin the 4th Diamond Design after ROW 158 by hanging the 33rd st. on each side onto the left neighboring needle. (103 sts.)

ROWS 177-220: Work even.



ning next 4 rows and 1 st. on each side of the next 4th and following 4th row. (103 sts.)

ROWS 185-208: Work even.

ROWS 209-240: NECK SHAPING: Bind off the center 17 sts. as you did on the back, then on every other row on Neck Side bind off 7 sts. 1 x, 5 sts. 1 x, 4 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 1 x, 2 sts. 2 x, 1 st. 3 x and 1 st. on the next 4th and following 4th row. AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 232, then on every other row SHAPE SHOULDER by binding off 3 sts. 5 x.

NECKBAND: Cast on 141 sts. and work stockinette st., 4 rows with tension 6, 6 rows with tension 5 and 4 rows with tension 6. After 14 rows bind off all sts. the crochet

method.

ARMHOLE BAND: Make two. Cast on 103 sts. and work stockinette st., using the same tensions as for the neck-band. After 14 rows bind off all sts. the crochet method. FINISHING: Embroider a flower in the center of each Diamond, using a lazy daisy stitch. Join front and back section at sides and shoulders, easing in the fullness at bustline of front section. Join neckband, then armhole bands at short ends. Sew 1 edge of neckband to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline. Sew armhole bands to armholes in the same manner.





other row on Neck Side bind off 4 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 1 x, 2 sts. 2 x, 1st. 2 x and 1 st. on every following 4th row 4 x. AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 296, then on every other row SHAPE SHOULDER by binding off 4 sts. 5 x and 5 sts. 6 x. NECKBAND: Cast on 126 sts. and work stockinette st., 4 rows with tension 3, 8 rows with tension 2 and 4 rows with tension 3. After 16 rows bind off all sts. the crochet method. FINISHING: Join front and back section at sides and shoulders, easing in the fullness at bustline of front section. Turn under 4 sts. around armhole and hem to wrong side. SIZE: 42/44. MATERIAL: 153/4 oz. (9 balls) KNITKING Linen-Cotton. TENSION: KNITKING 3 to 5. STITCH and ROW GAUGE: 17 sts. 2", 25 rows 2". PATTERN: Stockinette rows 2" Stitch. EDGES: K1, P1, Ribbing. BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 195 sts. ROWS 1-16: K1, P1, Ribbing. After ROW 16 transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine, increase 1 st. on each side and continue with stockinette st.

ROWS 17-210: Work even. ROWS 211-234: ARMHOLE SHAP-

ING: Bind off 5 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 6 rows, 1 st. beginning next 4 rows and 1 st. on each side of the next 4th and following 4th row (153 sts.)

ROWS 235-324: Work even.

ROWS 325-344: NECK and SHOULDER SHAPING: Both shapings are started at the same row. Bind off the center 23 sts. for NECK, (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover) then on every other row on Neck Side bind off 6 sts. 1 x, 5 sts. 1 x, 4 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 1 x, 2 sts. 3 x and 1 st. 2 x. AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 324, then on every other row SHAPE SHOULDER by binding off 3 sts. 5 x and 4

FRONT: (Figure I). Work the front the same as the back, but start the NECK SHAPING after ROW 290 by binding off the center 17 sts. as you did on the back, then on every other row on Neck Side bind off 4 sts. 2x, 3 sts. 2 x, 2 sts. 3 x, 1 st. 5 x and on every following 4th row 1 st. 4 x

SLEEVE: (Figure III). Make two. Cast on 119 sts.


ROWS 1-16: KI, P1, Ribbing. After ROW 16 transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine and continue with stock-

ROWS 17-66: Increase 1 st. on each side after ROW 16,

ROWS 67-142: CAP SHAPING: Bind off 5 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 ning next 4 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 10 rows, 1 st. beginning next 48 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 4 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 4 rows, 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows and after ROW 142 bind off the remaining 17 sts.

POCKET: Cast on 41 sts. and work 50 rows stockinette st.

Now transfer every other st. to the ribber and work 10 rows K1, P1, Ribbing, then bind off all sts. the crochet method for ribbing.



**NECKBAND:** The neckband is worked in 2 sections. For the front section cast on 135 sts. and for the back section cast on 101 sts. Work 32 rows K1,P1, Ribbing, then bind off the crochet method for ribbing.

FINISHING: Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. Sew sleeves together and set in. Join neckband at short ends, then sew 1 long edge to inside and 1 long edge to outside of neckline. Sew pocket to pullover as illustrated.

STITCH and ROW GAUGE: 16 sts. 2", 21 rows 2". PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch. EDGES: K1, P1, Ribbing. BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 177 sts. ROWS 1-16: K1, P1, Ribbing. After ROW 16 transfer the ribber sts. to

the main machine and continue with

ROWS 17-180: Work even.
ROWS 181-202: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 5 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 4 rows, 1 st. beginning next 4 rows and 1 st. on each side of the next

stockinette st.

4th and following 4th row. (137 sts.) ROWS 203-272: Work even.

ROWS 273-288: SHOULDER SHAPING: Bind off 5 sts. beginning next 8 rows. After ROW 280 bind off the center 21 sts. for NECK. (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover). Bind off 5 sts. on Shoulder Side and continue to Shape Shoulder on every other row by binding off 5 sts. 3 x and 6 sts. 1 x. AT THE SAME TIME, Shape Neck on every other row by binding off 5 st. 1 x, 4 sts. 1 x and 3 sts. 1 x. FRONT: (Figure I). Cast on 79 sts.

ROWS 1-16: K1, P1, Ribbing. After ROW 16 transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine and continue with stockinette st

ROWS 17-180: Work even.


**ROWS 181-202:** ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 5 sts. on the right side, then on every other row bind off 4 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 1 x, 2 sts. 2 x, 1 st. 2 x and 1 st. on the next 4th and following 4th row. (59 sts.)

ROWS 203-255: Work even.
ROWS 256:288: NECK SHAPING: Bind off 3 sts. on the left side, then on every other row bind off 2 sts. 2 x, 1 st. 3 x and on every following 4th row 1 st. 3 x. AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 272, then on every other row SHAPE SHOULDER by binding off 5 sts. 8 x and 6 sts. 1 x. Work the second front section with reverse shapings.
SLEEVE: (Figure III). Make two. Cast on 109 sts.

ROWS 1-16: K1, P1, Ribbing. After ROW 16 transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine and continue with stockinette st.

ROWS 17-58: Increase 1 st. on each side after ROW 16, then again every following 4th row 9 x. (129 sts.)

ROWS 59-72: CAP SHAPING: Bind off 5 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 4 rows and 2 sts. beginning next 6 rows.



ROWS 73-120: Bind off 1 st. beginning next 6 rows and 2 sts. beginning next 2 rows. Repeat these bind-offs 4 x, then bind off 2 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 4 sts. beginning next 4 rows and after ROW 120 bind off the remaining 11 sts.

COLLAR: (Figure IV). Cast on 122 sts. and work stock-

inette st.

ROWS 1-22: Work short rows. (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover). On the left side put 40 needles into holding position, knit 1 row. On the right side put 40 needles into holding position, knit 1 row. Now alternately on each side bring 7 needles 4 x and 2 needles 6 x back into working position.

ROWS 23-72: Work even.

ROWS 73-86: Alternately on each side put 3 needles 4 x and

9 needles 3 x into holding position.

ROWS 87-88: On the left side bring all needles back into working position, knit 1 row. On the right side bring all needles back into working position, knit 1 row. After ROW 88 bind off all sts.

POCKET: Cast on 37 sts. and work 56 rows stockinette st.,

then bind off all sts.

FRONT BAND: Make two. Cast on 8 sts. with red and with tension 3 work 254 rows stockinette st., then bind off all sts. FINISHING: Join front and back sections at sides and shoulders. Sew sleeves together and set in. Weave front bands to front edges, 1 st. in on each edge, then turn under half to wrong side and hem. On wrong side, sew outer zipper band edges close to the fold line of front edges leaving the blue of the zipper band visible on the right side. (Outside) Fold collar in half lengthwise and sew short ends. Sew cast- on edge of collar to inside and bound-off edge to outside of neckline. Turn under 8 rows on upper pocket edge and hem to wrong side, then sew to shirt as illustrated.

SIZE: 14/16. MATERIAL: 21 oz. (12 balls) white KNITKING Subita Crepe 2 x 4, Color #4. TENSION: KNITKING 5 to 7. STITCH and ROW GAUGE: Pattern Stitch 19 sts. 2", 19 rows 2".

PATTERN: Pattern Ribbing accord-

ing to chart.

BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 197 sts., having the 7th, 9th, 11th, 17th, 19th, 21st, etc. sts. on the ribber and work in Pattern Ribbing.

ROWS 1-168. Work even. ROWS 169-270: RAGLAN SHAPING:

Decrease 2 sts. on each side after ROW 168, then again every other row 12 x and every following 3rd row 25 x by always hanging the 3rd and 4th sts. on each side onto the 2nd needle, then moving the end sts. inward to fill the empty needles. After ROW 270 bind off the remaining 45 sts. FRONT: (Figure I). Work the front the same as the back to ROW 168.


ROWS 169-262: RAGLAN SHAPING: Decrease 2 sts. on each side after ROW 168, then again every other row 12 x and every following 3rd row 15 x as you did on the back. After ROW 240 bind off the center 13 sts. for NECK. (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover and transfer all ribber sts. to the main machine before putting them in holding position.) Decrease 2 sts. on Raglan Side and continue to Shape Raglan on every following 3rd row by decreasing 2 sts. 6 x as you did before. AT THE SAME TIME, Shape Neck on every other row by binding off 4 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 2 x, 2 sts. 3 x, 1 st. 2 x and 1 st. on the following 4th row 1 x. SLEEVE: (Figure III). Cast on 83 sts., having the 2nd, 4th, 10th, 12th, 14th, etc. sts. on the ribber and work in

Pattern Ribbing.

ROWS 1-168: Increase 1 st. on each side after ROW 30, then again every following 4th row 31 x and every other row 5 x. (157 sts.) (Stay in Pattern when increasing).

ROWS 169-262: RAGLAN SHAPING: Decrease 2 sts. on each side after ROW 168, then again every other row 6 x and every following 3rd row 26 x as you did on the back, then decrease 2 sts. on the right side after ROW 261.

ROWS 263-270: Work short rows. (See Notes to Knit By). On the **left side** put 5 needles 2 x and 3 needles 2 x into holding position. Work the second sleeve with reverse shaping, casting on from right to left.

POCKET: Make two. Cast on 46 sts., having the 3rd, 5th, 7th, 13th, 15th, 17th, 23rd, 25th and 27th sts. on the ribber and all remaining sts. on the main machine. Work 54 rows even and AT THE SAME TIME work buttonholes after ROW 26 over the 9th-14th and 28th-35th needles counting from the right side. After ROW 54 bind off all sts.

COLLAR: Cast on 183 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing with tension 7

ROWS 1-6: K1, P1, Ribbing. After ROW 6 continue in Pattern Ribbing. Set up Pattern by transfering first the 3rd and 4th ribber sts. to the main machine.

ROWS 7-48: Work even and knit ROWS 17-32 with tension

6 and ROWS 33-48 with tension 5. After ROW 48 bind off all sts. the crochet method.

FINISHING: Join front and back section at sides. Sew sleeves together, then weave to front and back section, 1 st. in from each edge. Turn under 15 rows on lower edge and sleeve edges and hem to wrong side. Join short ends of collar and sew to neckline, then fold collar to outside. Fold pockets in half having the ribbed pattern on the outside, sew side edges, then sew to pullover as shown on picture. Finish buttonholes. Sew on buttons. Pull a belt through pockets.



ROWS 221-294: Work even. ROWS 295-312: SHOULDER SHAPING: Bind off 4 sts. beginning next 4 rows. After ROW 298 bind off the center 17 sts. for NECK. (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover). Bind off 4 sts. on Shoulder Side and continue to Shape Shoulder on every other row by binding off 4 sts. 5 x and 5 sts. 2 x. AT THE SAME TIME, Shape Neck on every other row by binding off 5 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 2 x and 2 sts. 3 x.



FRONT: (Figure I). Work the front the same as the back to ROW 180, then hang the center st. onto the neighboring needle, put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ROWS 181-312: Decrease 1 st. on the left side after ROW 182, then again every other row 3 x, every following 4th row 8 x and every following 6th row 13 x by always hanging the 3rd st. on the left side onto the 2nd needle, then moving the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. ROWS 219-268: Bind off 1 st. beginning next 4 rows and 2 sts. beginning next 2 rows. Repeat these bind-offs 6 x, then bind off 2 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 5 sts. beginning next 2 rows and after ROW 268 bind off the remaining 12 sts

NECKBAND: Cast on 159 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing. ROWS 1-17: Bind off 2 sts. on the right side after ROW 2 then again every other row 7 x. After ROW 17 bind off all sts. the crochet method for ribbing. Work the second neckband section with reverse shaping, casting on from right to left.



ROWS 243-276: NECK SHAPING: Bind off the center 20 sts. as you did on the back, then on every other row on Neck Side bind off 3 sts. 2 x, 2 sts. 2 x, 1 st. 4 x and 1 st. on the next 4th and following 4th row. AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 260, then on every other row SHAPE SHOULDER by binding off 3 sts. 3 x and 4 sts. 6 x.



Bind off 4 sts. on Shoulder Side and continue to Shape Shoulder on every other row by binding off 4 sts. 5 x. AT THE SAME TIME, Shape Neck on every other row by binding off 4 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 1 x and 2 sts. 2 x.

FRONT: (Figure I). Cast on 130 sts.

ROWS 1-20: K1, P1, Ribbing. After ROW 20 transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine and continue with stock-

ROWS 21-92: Work even, then bind off the center 10 sts., put the 60 stitches on the left side onto a stitch holder and complete the right half first.

ROWS 93-172: Cast on 5 sts. on the left side after ROW 93 and increase 1 st. on the left side after ROW 171.


ROWS 173-190: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 5 sts. on the right side, then on every other row bind off 3 sts. 1 x, 2 sts. 1 x, 1 st. 2 x and 1 st. on the next 4th and following 4th row. AT THE SAME TIME, increase 1 st. on the left side after ROW 175, then again every following 4th row 3 x. ROWS 191-236: Increase 1 st. on the left side after ROW

191, then again every following 4th row 11 x. ROWS 237-264: NECK SHAPING: Bind off the 43rd-51st sts. counting from the right side, put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right side first. After ROW 237, then on every other row on Neck Side bind off 3 sts. 1 x, 2 sts. 2 x, 1 st. 3 x and 1 st. on the next 4th and following 4th row. AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 250, SHAPE SHOULDER by binding off 3 sts. 2 x and 4 sts. 6 x. Now bring the needles on the left side into

working position, turn the Row Counter back to 236 and

complete the left part of the Neck Shaping.

ROWS 237-263: Bind off 3 sts. on the right side for Neck after ROW 238, then on every other row on Neck Side bind off 2 sts. 2 x, 1 st. 3 x and 1 st. on the next 4th and following 4th row. AT THE SAME TIME, increase 1 st. on



the left side after ROW 239, then again every following 4th row 3 x and after ROW 259, then on every other row bind off 3 sts. 3 x. Now move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to ROW 92, hang the sts. from the stitch holder back on the machine and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from ROWS 93-264 and ROWS 237-263, reversing the sides.

SLEEVES: (Figure III). Make two. Cast on 75 sts. with white

and work stockinette st.

ROWS 1-56: Increase 1 st. on each side after ROW 6, then again every following 6th row 3 x and decrease 1 st. on each side after ROW 34, then again every following 6th row 3 x and AT THE SAME TIME, work ROWS 23-36 with blue. ROWS 57-106: Increase 1 st. on each side after ROW 58, then again every following 6th row 5 x and every following 4th row 3 x. (93 sts.)

ROWS 107-160: CAP SHAPING: Bind off 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 6 rows, 1 st. beginning next 36 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 4 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows and after ROW 160 bind off the remaining 9 sts.

COLLAR: (Figure IV) Cast on 99 sts. and work stockinette st. ROWS 1-24: Work short rows. (See Notes to Knit By) On the left side put 28 needles into holding position, knit 1 row. On the right side put 28 needles into holding position, knit 1 row. Alternately on each side, bring 3 needles 6 x and 2 needles 5 x back into working position.

ROWS 25-70: Decrease 1 st. on each side after ROW 28, then again every following 4th row 4 x and increase 1 st. on each side after ROW 50, then again every following 4th row 4 x

ROWS 71-86: Alternately on each side put 3 needles 4 x and 4 needles 4 x into holding position.

ROWS 87-88: On the left side bring all needles into working position, knit 1 row. On the right side bring all needles into working position, knit 1 row. After ROW 88 bind off all sts. FRONT BAND: Make two. Cast on 11 sts. with blue and work 116 rows stockinette st. with tension 3, then bind off

FINISHING: Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. Sew sleeves together and set in. Turn under 28 rows on sleeve edges, hem to wrong side and fold over to outside. Fold under facing at front opening. Fold collar in half length wise and sew side edges. Sew cast-on edge of collar to inside and bound-off edge to outside of neckline. Weave front bands to foldline of front opening, and to side edges of collar, 1 st. in on the band. Fold bands in half and hem against seamline on wrong side. Knit a round cord over 3 needles with tension 2, 600 rows long (the empty rows are counted). Pull cord through front, then tie, as shown on picture.

#### GIRL'S DRESS, MK 5027



SIZE: 12-13, (Chest 30"-31"). MATERIAL:  $10\frac{1}{2}$  oz. (6 balls) pink KNITKING Subita Dralon 3 ply, Color #405. TENSION: KNITKING 4 to 6. STITCH and ROW GAUGE: 16 sts. 2", 21 rows 2". PATTERN: Stockin-ette Stitch and Cable Stripes with Eyelets at the yoke. 1. Transfer the 5th, 14th, 23rd, 32nd etc. sts. to the left neighboring needles, leave empty needles in working position.

2. Knit 3 rows. 3. Drop the 3rd, 7th, 12th, 16th, 21st, 25th, etc. sts. from the needles, leave the empty needles

in working position. With 2 single transfer tools cross sts. as follows: Going behind the 5th needle, transfer the 4th st. to the 6th needle and the 6th st. to the 4th needle. (It is best to lift the 5th st. of the needle while crossing the sts. Cross the 13th and 15th, the 22nd and 24th, and etc. sts. in the same manner. 4. Knit 2 rows. Repeats steps 1 to 4 throughout. After each 20-30 rows drop the 3rd, 7th, 12th, 16th, 21st, 25th, etc. sts. from the needles and latch up into knit stitches.



BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 179 sts.

ROWS 1-36: Work even, then hang the cast-on sts. back on the machine behind the latches to form the hem. ROWS 37-210: Decrease 1 st. on each side after ROW 38, then again every following 8th row 21 x by always hanging the 3rd st. on each side onto the 2nd needle, then moving the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. (135 sts.) After

ROW 210 start working the Cable Pattern.

ROWS 211-222: Work even. ROWS 223-242: ARMHOL'E SHAPING: Bind off 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 4 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 1 st. beginning next 4 rows and 1 st. on each side of the next 4th and following 4th row. (103 sts.)

ROWS 243-286: Work even.

ROWS 287-298: NECK SHAPING: Bind off the center 21 sts. (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover) then on every other row on Neck Side bind off 6 sts. 1 x, 5 sts. 1 x, 4 sts. 2 x and 3 sts. 1 x. AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 290, then on every other row SHAPE SHOULDER by binding off 3 sts. 1 x and 4 sts. 4x.

FRONT: (Figure 1). Work the front the same as the back, but start the NECK SHAPING after ROW 268 by binding off the center 19 sts. as you did on the back, then on every other row on Neck Side bind off 5 sts. 2 x, 4 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 1 x, 2 sts. 1 x, 1 st. 2 x and 1 st. on the next 4th and following 4th row.

NECKBAND: Cast on 145 sts. and work 12 rows stockinette st., 3 rows with tension 5, 6 rows with tension 4 and 3 rows with tension 5. After 12 rows bind off all sts.

ARMHOLE BAND: Make two. Cast on 101 sts. and work 12 rows, using the same tensions as you did on the neckband, then bind off all sts.

FINISHING: Weave front and back sections together at sides 1 st. in from each edge. Join shoulders. Join short ends of neckband and short ends of armbands. Sew 1 long edge of neckband to inside and 1 long edge to outside of neckline. Sew armbands to armholes in the same manner.

#### BOY'S PULLOVER, KK 5026



SIZE: 13-14, (Chest 32"-33"). MA-TERIAL:  $5\frac{1}{4}$  oz. (3 balls) blue and  $1\frac{3}{4}$  oz. (1 ball) white KNITKING Subita Dralon 2 ply, Color #410 and #401. TENSION: KNITKING 1 to 3. STITCH and ROW GAUGE: 19 sts. 2", 30 rows 2". PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch. EDGES: K1, P1, Ribbing. Make all shapings for front neckline and collar full-fashioned. When decreasing hang the 3rd st. onto the 2nd needle, then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. When increasing, move the 2 end


sts. 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle.

BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 171 sts.

ROWS 1-18: K1, P1, Ribbing. After ROW 18 transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine and continue with stockinette st.

ROWS 19-240: Work even.

ROWS 241-262: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 4 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 1 st. beginning next 6 rows and



1 st. on each side of the next 4th and following 4th row. (137 sts.)

ROWS 263-342: Work even.

ROWS 343-360: SHOULDER SHAPING: Bind off 4 sts. beginning next 6 rows. After ROW 348 bind off the center 23 sts. for NECK. (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover). Bind off 4 sts. on Shoulder Side and continue to Shape Shoulder on every other row by binding off 4 sts. 4 x and 5 sts. 2 x. AT THE SAME TIME, Shape Neck on every other row by binding off 5 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 2 x and 2 sts. 2 x. FRONT: (Figure I). Work the front the same as the back to

ROW 228, then bind off the center 31 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the

right half first.

ROWS 229-240: Decrease 1 st. on the left side after ROW 338 for FRONT SHAPING.

ROWS 241-262: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 4 sts. on the right side, then on every other row bind off 3 sts. 2 x, 2 sts. 1 x, 1 st. 3 x and 1 st. on the next 4th and following 4th row. AT THE SAME TIME, decrease 1 st. on the left side after ROWS 248 and 258.

ROWS 263-360: Decrease 1 st. on the left side after ROW 268, then again every following 10th row 7 x. AT THE SAME after ROW 342, then on every other row SHAPE SHOULDER by binding off 4 sts. 8 x and 5 sts. 2 x. Now bring the needles on the left side into working position, turn the Row Counter back to 228 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from ROWS 229-360, reversing the sides. Start the Armhole after ROW 241 and the Shoulder after ROW 343.

SLEEVE: (Figure III). Make two. Cast on 99 sts.

ROWS: 1-18: K1, P1, Ribbing. After ROW 18 transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine and continue with stockinette st.

ROWS 19-72: Increase 1 st. on each side after ROW 22.

then again every following 4th row 10 x. (121 sts.)

ROWS 73-144: CAP SHAPING: Bind off 4 sts. beginning
next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 4 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 8 rows, 1 st. beginning next 48 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 4 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 6 rows and after ROW 144 bind off the remaining 11 sts.

COLLAR: (Figure IV) Leaving the center 75 needles free, cast on 19 sts. on each side, then put the 19 needles on the left side into holding position and work the right half first. ROWS 1-132: Increase 1 st. on the left side after ROW 10, then again every following 10th row 10 x. Now put these needles into holding position, bring the 19 needles on the left side with the cast-on sts. into working position, turn the Row Counter to 0 and work the left half. Follow the instructions from ROWS 1-132, reversing the sides. After ROW 132 move the Cam Box to the right side, cast on 53 sts. over the center needles, bring the needles on the right side into working position and continue working over 113 needles. ROWS 133-228: Work even, then bind off the center 53 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ROWS 229-360: Decrease 1 st. on the left side after ROW 250, then again every following 10th row 10 x. After ROW 360 bind off the remaining 19 sts. Now bring the needles on the left side into working position, turn the Row Counter back to 228 and complete the left half. Follow the instruction from ROWS 229-360, reversing the sides.

FINISHING: Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. Sew sleeves together and set in. Weave shaped edges of collar to shaped edges of pullover and sew straight inner edge of collar to back neckline. Fold collar in half and sew to wrong side of pullover. Sew zipper between outer collar edges.

#### MAN'S CARDIGAN, HP 3551



SIZE: 40/42. MATERIAL: 22<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> oz. (13 balls) white KNITKING Subita Crepe 2 x 4, Color #4. TENSION: KNITKING 6 to 8. STITCH and ROW GAUGE: 16 sts. 2", 22 rows 2". PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch with Cable Stripes on front and back sections. 1. Knit 10 rows. 2. Using 2 double transfer tools, cross the sts. by hanging on each side, first the 6th and 7th sts. onto the 8th and 9th needles, then the 8th and 9th sts. onto the 6th and 7th needles. Cross the 19th-22nd, the 32nd-35th,

the 45th-48th, the 58th-61st, the 71st-74th, and the 84th-87th sts. on each side in the same manner. Repeat Steps 1 and 1 throughout. SLEEVES: Stockinette Stitch. EDGES: K1, P1, Ribbing.

BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 183 sts. ROWS 1-20: K1, P1, Ribbing. After ROW 20 transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine and continue with stockinette st. and the Cable Pattern, crossing the sts. the first time after ROW 26.


ROWS 21-196: Work even.

ROWS 197-218: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 6 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 4 rows, 1 st. beginning next 4 rows and 1 st. on each side of the next 4th and following 4th row. (141 sts.)

ROWS 219-298: Work even.

ROWS 299-316: SHOULDER SHAPING: Bind off 4 sts. beginning next 8 rows. After ROW 306 bind off the center 11 sts. for NECK. (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover). Bind off the 4 sts. on Shoulder Side and continue to Shape Shoulder on every other row by binding off 5 sts. 5 x. AT THE SAME TIME, Shape Neck on every other row by binding off 8 sts. 1 x, 6 sts. 1 x , 4 sts. 1 x and 2 sts. 1 x.

FRONT: (Figure I). Cast on 108 sts.
ROWS 1-20: K1, P1, Ribbing. After ROW 20 transfer the



ribber sts. to the main machine and continue with stockinette st, and the Cable Pattern, working the Pattern from right to left (7 cables) and crossing the sts. the first time after ROW 26.

ROWS 21-174: Work even.

ROWS 175-316: FRONT SHAPING: Decrease 1 st. on the left side after ROW 174, then again every following 4th row 8 x and every following 6th row 17 x by always hanging the 18th st. on the left side onto the 17th needle, then moving the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 196, SHAPE ARMHOLE by binding off 6 sts. on the right side, then on every other row bind off 4 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 1 x, 2 sts. 2 x and 1 st. on the next 4th and following 4th row. After ROW 298, then on every other row SHAPE SHOULDER by binding off 4 sts. 5 x and 5 sts. 5 x. After ROW 316 cast on 1 st. on the right side then work the back Neckband over the remaining 17 sts.

ROWS 317-352: Work even, then put all sts. on a stitch holder. Work the second front section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to left and working the Cable Pattern counting from left to right. (7 Cables). Make vertical buttonholes after ROWS 22, 68, 114 and 160 by dividing the work between the 16th and 17th needles counting from the right side and working for 9 rows in 2 sections. (See Practical Knitting Hints Book, Page 35)

FINISHING: Join front and back sections at sides and shoulders. Sew sleeves together and set in. Weave neckband together at center back. Sew neckband to neckline. Turn under 1" at front edges and neckband and hem to wrong side, leaving buttonholes free. Finish buttonholes. Sew on buttons

SIZE: 13-14, (Chest 31"-32"). MA-TERIAL: 51/4 oz. (3 balls) red and 51/4 oz. (3 balls) white KNITKING Subita Dralon 3 ply, Color =427 and =401. TENSION: KNITKING 4 to 6. STITCH and ROW GAUGE: 16 sts. 2", 21 rows 2". PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch with repeated color stripes of 12 rows white and 4 rows red.

BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 138 sts. with red ROWS 1-34: Work even, then hang

the cast-on sts. back on the machine behind the latches to form the hem. Continue working the repeated color stripes.


ROWS 35-180: Work even.

ROWS 181-198: ARMHOLE SHAPING: Bind off 5 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 4 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 2 sts. beginning next 2 rows, 1 st. beginning next 6 rows and 1 st. on each side of the following 4th row. (102 sts.)

ROWS 199-206: Work even, then continue working with red. ROWS 207-208: Bind off 3 sts. on the right side, then cast on 13 sts. Knit to the left side, bind off 3 sts. and cast on 13 sts.

ROWS 209-223: Work even, then put 95 needles on the right side into holding position.

ROWS 224-294: For the SHOULDER STRAP work even and AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 278, make vertical buttonholes by dividing the work on each side between the 7th and 8th needles and working for 7 rows in 3 sections. (See practical Knitting Hints Book, page 35). After ROW 294 bind off all sts. the crochet method. Now bring 68 needles on the left side into working position and for the facing work 17 rows even, then bind off these sts. Move the Cam Box to the right side, turn the Row Counter back to 223, bring the remaining needles back into working position and work the second SHOULDER STRAP. Follow the instructions from ROWS 224-294.



FRONT: (Figure I). Work the front the same as the back to ROW 206. then continue working with red.

ROWS 207-208: Bind off 3 sts. beginning next 2 rows. ROWS 209-240: Work even, then bind off all sts, the crochet method

FINISHING: Join front and back section at sides. Join long edges of each shoulder strap and sew open edges together. Turn under 17 rows around neck edge for facing. Join back neck facing side edges to shoulder straps. Turn under 3 sts. around armhole and hem to wrong side. Finish buttonholes, sew on buttons. (See Picture)

#### GIRL'S PULLOVER, MK 5030



SIZE: 12-13, (Chest 30"-31"). MA-TERIAL: 7 oz. (4 balls) blue and 51/4 oz. (3 balls) white KNITKING Subita Dralon 3 ply, Color #416 and #401. TENSION: KNITKING 4 to 6. STITCH and ROW GAUGE: 15 sts. 2", 23 rows 2". PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch. The Pullover is knitted sideways and begins at the Sleeve

BACK: Cast on 30 sts. with blue, beginning with the 40th needle counting from the right side.

ROWS 1-50: Work 32 rows blue, 4 rows white and 14 rows blue and AT THE SAME TIME, increase 1 st. on the left side after ROWS 37 and 47.

ROWS 51-212: Alternately work 6 rows white and 6 rows blue and AT THE SAME TIME, increase 1 st. on the left side after ROW 57, then on every following 10th row 6 x, every following 8th row 6 x and every following 4th row 5 x and after ROW 187, then on every other row increase 1 st. 7 x, 2 sts. 5 x and 3 sts. 1 x.

ROWS 213-227: Work 14 rows blue and 1 row white and

AT THE SAME TIME, cast on 3 sts. on the left side after ROW 213, then on every other row cast on 4 sts. 2 x, 5 sts. 2 x, 10 sts. 1 x, 16 sts. 1 x and after ROW 227 cast on 60 sts. (177 sts.)

ROWS 228-276: Work even, first 3 rows white and 14 rows blue then continue working alternately 6 rows white and 6 rows blue.


ROWS 277-326: NECK SHAPING: Bind off 2 sts. on the right side, then on every other row bind off 1 st. 2 x, on every following 4th row 1 st. 2 x, on every following 6th row 1 st. 2 x and on the following 8th row 1 st. 1 x. AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 310, work 14 rows blue and 2 rows white. After ROW 326 the first half of the back section is completed and the second half is continued in reverse.

ROWS 327-376: NECK SHAPING: Work 2 rows white and 14 rows blue, then continue working alternately 6 rows white and 6 rows blue and AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 344. increase 1 st. on the right side, then again on the following 8th row 1 x, every following 6th row 2 x, every following 4th row 2 x, on the following 2nd row 1 x and after ROW 376 increase 2 sts.

ROWS 377-425: Work even and AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 408 work 14 rows blue and 3 rows white.

ROW 426: Bind off 60 sts. on the left side and work 1 row with white

ROWS 427-440: Work 14 rows blue and AT THE SAME TIME. bind off 16 sts. on the left side after ROW 427, then on every other row bind off 10 sts. 1 x, 5 sts. 2 x, 4 sts. 2 x and 3 sts. 1 x. After ROW 440 continue working 6 rows white and 6 rows blue.



ROWS 441-652: Bind off 3 sts. on the left side after ROW 441, then on every other row bind off 2 sts. 5 x, 1 st. 8 x, then on every following 4th row bind off 1 st. 5 x, on every following 8th row 1 st. 6 x and 1 st. on every following 10th row 8 x, then work even. AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 602 work 14 rows blue, 4 rows white and 32 rows blue. After ROW 652 bind off the remaining 30 sts.

THE FRONT SECTION is started on the left side of the machine and is worked like the back, but for the NECK SHAPING, after ROW 276 bind off 5 sts., then on every other row bind off 4 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 2 x, 2 sts. 1 x, 1 st. 2 x, on every following 4th row bind off 1 st. 3 x and on every following 6th row 1 st. 2 x. Increase 1 st. for the Neck Shaping after ROW 340, then again every following 6th row 1 st. 2 x, and every following 4th row 1 st. 3 x. Now on every other row increase 1 st. 1 x, 2 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 2 x, 4 sts. 1 x and 5 sts. 1 x.

**NECKBAND:** Cast on 138 sts. with white and work 28 rows stockinette st., 4 rows white, 6 rows blue, 8 rows white, 6 rows blue and 4 rows white, working 4 rows with tension 6, 4 rows with tension 5, 12 rows with tension 4, 4 rows with tension 5 and 4 rows with tension 6. After 28 rows bind off all sts.

**FINISHING:** Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. (Sleeves) Turn under  $1\sqrt[3]{4}$ " at lower edge and sleeve edges and hem to wrong side. Join short ends of neckband, then sew 1 long edge of neckband to inside and 1 long edge to outside of neckline.



BACK: (Figure II). Cast on 112 sts. with blue.

ROWS 1-20: Work even, then hang the cast-on sts. back on the machine behind the latches to form the hem, then change to white.

ROWS 21-114: Alternately work 4 rows white and 2 rows blue.



ROWS 115-142: Work 12 rows blue, 4 rows white and 12 rows blue and AT THE SAME TIME, increase 1 st. on each side after ROWS 120, 124, 128, 132, 136, 138 and 2 sts. on each side after ROW 140. After ROW 142 continue working alternately 4 rows with white and 2 rows with blue. ROWS 143-144: Cast on 8 sts. beginning next 2 rows. (144 sts.)

ROWS 145-194: Increase 1 st. on each side after ROW 150, then again every following 6th row 4 x and every following

4th row 4 x. (162 sts.)

ROWS 195-216: SHOULDER SHAPING: Bind off 3 sts. beginning next 4 rows, 4 sts. beginning next 4 rows and 5 sts. beginning next 4 rows. After ROW 206 bind off the center 12 sts. for NECK. (See Notes to Knit By, inside back cover). Bind off 5 sts. on Shoulder Side and continue to Shape Shoulder on every other row by binding off 6 sts. 3 x and 8 sts. 2 x. AT THE SAME TIME, Shape Neck on every other row by binding off 4 sts. 1 x, 3 sts. 2 x and 2 sts. 1 x.

FRONT: Work the front the same as the back to ROW 188. ROWS 189-216: NECK and SHOULDER SHAPING: Bind off the center 10 sts. as you did on the back, then on every other row on Neck side bind off 3 sts. 2 x, 2 sts. 1 x, 1 st. 2 x and on every following 4th row 1 st. 3 x. AT THE SAME TIME, after ROW 194, then on every other row SHAPE SHOULDER by binding off 3 sts. 2 x, 4 sts. 2 x, 5 sts. 3 x, 6 sts. 3 x and 8 sts. 2 x.

NECKBAND: Cast on 87 sts. with blue and work stockinette st., 2 rows with tension 6, 2 rows with tension 5, 6 rows with tension 4, 2 rows with tension 5 and 2 rows with tension 6. After 14 rows bind off all sts. the crochet method. ARM BAND: Make two. Cast on 57 sts. with blue and work 14 rows stockinette st., using the same tensions as you did for the neckband, then bind off all sts.

FINISHING: Join front and back section at sides and shoulders, leaving 4" of the left shoulder seam free for the opening. Make a narrow hem around this opening. Join short ends of arm bands. Sew 1 long edge of neckband to inside and 1 long edge to outside of neckline. Sew arm bands to armholes in the same manner. Sew zipper to opening.

#### PRACTICAL KNITTING HINTS


RETRACTOR BUTTONS on Knitking Machines (AM3, AM 2) The Retractor Buttons are used in combination with your Pattern Wheels and they do exactly what their name implies ... retract (or push back) the needles that are in holding position to the working position. If you are knitting a pattern stitch where one row is in pattern and the next in stockinette stitch, push in the RIGHT Retractor button and leave it there throughout your pattern knitting. If you are knitting two rows in pattern and changing the dial number every two rows or knitting plain rows between, push in the LEFT Retractor Button and leave it in. If you are changing the number on the dial every 4th row, then BEFORE knitting the 4th row push in the LEFT Retractor Button, knit the 4th row and IMMEDIATELY RELEASE the Retractor Button, then change the number on the dial and knit 3 rows, push in the LEFT Retractor Button and knit the 4th row then RE-LEASE the Button, etc., etc. Remember that when you are knitting any "Pattern Set" using the Retractor Buttons, and you want the needles to go back into working position as you knit the next row and your Cam Box is on the Right Side, push in the Right Retractor Button. If the Cam Box is on the left side, push in the left button. In other wordsyou will push in the button on the side that is farthest away from the direction the Cam Box will move on the next row...

#### 4D 7688 — How to Line the Beach Bag.

You will need one piece of press-on type interfacing, plus one piece of plastic material or waterproof canvas approximately  $11\frac{1}{2}$ " x 25". Block the bag first, and when dry cut the interfacing slightly smaller than bag section and press on to the wrong side. Using the bag as a pattern, cut lining material allowing  $\frac{1}{4}$ " for seams at sides and cut 1" smaller at top edges. Fold bag in half and weave or sew sides together. Fold in half and sew sides of lining  $\frac{3}{8}$ " from edges beginning at top, down to  $\frac{1}{2}$ " above fold. Bring the center of fold up to seam to form a "T" and then stitch on both sides. Be sure to use a large stitch on sewing machine if you are working with plastic or it will tear. Insert lining into bag. Fold over 18 rows at top and slip stitch to lining.

#### OUR READERS WRITE

HELP!.... "I do very well when using the Pattern Wheels on my KNITKING machine except when I begin any shaping... then the pattern gets mixed up and I do not know just what to do...."

When you are dialing a Pattern Design using a Cam Wheel, you invariably CHANGE THE NUMBER when you increase or decrease or bind off...and here is the way to do it.

Let us take for example Wheel No. 2 which will push out every 6th needle into holding position. With this Wheel you can dial ANY NUMBER from 1 to 6, which simply means that if you dial the number 1, the FIRST needle will move into holding position and then every following 6th needle will move into holding position as you push the Cam Box across the needles while holding down the Pattern Knob. If you dial the number 2, then the second needle and every following 6th will move into the holding position.... If you dial 3, the 3rd and every following 6th move into holding....etc...etc...

Suppose you are knitting a garment in two colors using Wheel 2 and the Pattern is 4 rows white and 4 rows blue. Each time you change color you must change the dial number ... With white you dial the number 3, with blue you dial the number 6. If there has been no increasing up to the underarm shaping, you are fine and your pattern moves along perfectly. Now you are at the Armhole Shaping and your pattern says to bind off 7 sts. beginning next You are supposed to dial the number 3 and use white. Before you can knit this next row, you must set up some needles by hand on the right side - so you will put the 3rd needle and the following 6th into holding position. Now bind off the 7 stitches. You will see that the needle left in holding position is the 2nd needle - push it back into work and dial the number 2. If you are decreasing 1 stitch on every other row, you should keep a slip of paper handy and write down the change in dial number BEFORE knitting the 4th row of the pattern set, then you won't forget or become confused. As you become more and more familiar with your pattern you will find that by looking carefully at the knitting on machine (the last rows you have knitted) you will be able to see what you have completed and know exactly what number to dial for knitting the next 4 rows should you forget to write it down. Remember, you can use this method for ANY PATTERN STITCH using a Wheel no matter whether it is knitted in one or several colors.



#### NOTES TO KNIT BY . . .

#### STITCH AND ROW GAUGE

Every KNITKING pattern calls for a specific number of stitches and rows for 2 inches and in order to obtain the correct size finished garment, you must be sure to knit at the correct tension. This means that before starting a garment, you must knit a sample swatch with the yarn you intend using for the garment.

Cast on over a sufficient number of needles to produce a swatch 4 inches wide. (If the pattern calls for 16 stitches to  $2^{\prime\prime}$ ,  $16 \times 2 = 32$  stitches) then knit 4 inches of rows at the first suggested tension (if the pattern calls for 22 rows to  $2^{\prime\prime}$ ,  $22 \times 2 = 44$  rows) knit 2 rows with a contrast color, change to the next higher tension, knit another  $4^{\prime\prime}$ , knit 2 rows with contrast color, change to a third higher tension and knit another  $4^{\prime\prime}$ , then bind off.

Roll the swatch into a cylinder over its length and pull on both ends. Unroll it and stretch it diagonally by pulling on the four corners. Allow the swatch to rest and settle (preferably overnight) then using a stitch gauge or ruler, count the number of stitches and rows over a 2" length in each of your 3 tensions. Select the tension that produces the stitches and rows called for in the pattern. If none of them are correct, you are most likely using the wrong weight of yarn.

#### HOLDING POSITION

The needles are as far forward on the needle bed as they will go.

#### NON-WORKING POSITION

The needles are as far back on the needle bed as they will go.

#### BINDING OFF

See Instruction Manual for your own machine.

#### CROCHET BIND OFF

Use this method for binding off neck and armbands, edgings, facings or collars. Knit a bind off row using 5 tensions higher than tension used for section and then with latch needle tool, and working from the opposite side of the yarn end, pull the second stitch through the first stitch, the 3rd through 2nd, the 4th through 3rd, etc. . . . . When you reach the end of row, pull the loose end of yarn through the last stitch. If you are unable to turn the tension up 5 numbers because you already are working with a large tension, lay the yarn over the needles by hand and knit this one row by pulling each needle back and forward again completing a stitch. Leave approximately  $\frac{1}{4}$  loop for each stitch (depending on type of yarn used) then bind off crochet method.

#### SHORT ROWS

Used for shaping of all kinds. Push the specified number of needles opposite the Cam Box into holding position and knit across to them. Now you must place the yarn OVER and UNDER the first inside needle that is in the holding position. Place the specified needles opposite Cam Box into holding position (other side) and knit across to these needles, and again place the yarn OVER and UNDER the first inside needle in the holding position. Repeat as many times as your pattern states. When you return these needles to the working position, the same procedure is used — bring the needles into work opposite the Cam Box, knit across to them, place the yarn OVER and UNDER the first inside needle in holding position and repeat for other side. Continue in this manner until all the needles are back in the working position.

#### INCREASING, DECREASING

See the Instruction Manual for your own machine.

#### INCREASING AND DECREASING WHEN USING RIBBER

When increasing, increase on the main knitter first, knit one row and then transfer the necessary stitches from the knitter to the ribber and continue

When decreasing or binding off, you must transfer the ribber stitches to the main machine before decreasing or binding off.

CONTROL KNOBS (Under the slide handle — one on each side on KNITKING and certain other machines.)

1. When BOTH Control Knobs are UP, (or IN on the latest KNITKING) knit one row going from right to left. The needles knit and move back just beyond the front of the needle bed and the yarn hangs on the front of the needles. The slide will now move freely in either direction

with the needles remaining in a "SAFE POSITION". When you wish to resume knitting, press down (Out on the latest KNITKING) BOTH Control Knobs. The first movement of the slide is made without yarn and will bring the needles into working position, you then continue knitting.

- 2. RIGHT CONTROL KNOB UP (IN on latest KNITKING). Knit from right to left. The row knits, moves the needles back and the yarn is held in front of the latches. Knit from left to right, the yarn goes under the needles without knitting as the needles move into the working position. This is the operation used for making round cords (with 3 or 4 needles only) and also for knitting single rows of one color.
- 3. LEFT CONTROL KNOB UP (IN for latest KNITKING). The same as above but moving from left to right.

#### **NECK SHAPING**

When the directions state to bind off the center stitches for NECK, one correct way is as follows: With a new ball of yarn, bind off the given number of stitches working from right to left. Leave this ball of yarn hanging to one side (to be picked up later) and put all the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right side first as directed. When you have completed the right side, pick up the yarn that you used for the neck bind off, put it in the wool feeder, bring all the needles into working position and knit 1 row to the left side. Turn row counter back to the number on which you started your neck shaping and complete the left half with reverse shaping, making the same number of decreases and on the same row numbers as on the right half.

You may also use the SHORT ROW method for shaping your neck and shoulders provided the decreasing is made on every other row. When the shaping is completed, knit 1 row over all the neck stitches (or shoulder stitches) with tension set at least 5 numbers higher, and then bind off all stitches using the crochet method.

If you are hand feeding a Norwegian design, bind off the center neck stitches with a new ball of yarn, then work both sides of neck shaping at the same time, using two balls of yarn for each color.

#### MISSING ROW NUMBERS

When there are row numbers missing in the instructions as for instance when you have completed the designated increases or decreases on a section of garment, continue knitting until you reach the next given row number.

#### READING OF SYMBOLS

Certain holding position and eyelet designs are sketched in the knitting patterns. The Chart with symbols is read as the work comes toward you from the machine. Where purl stitches are facing you, the purl symbol will be shown and where knit stitches are facing you, the knit symbol will be shown. On the sides of the chart are the row numbers, i.e. 1-8 indicates the first and last row number. In eyelet design patterns, specified stitches are transferred to another needle and the empty needles are returned to the knitting position each time. In holding position designs, selected needles are pushed into the holding position for the stated number of rows.

#### PATTERN STITCH SYMBOLS knit stitch III = purl stitch empty needle (leave in working position) = needle not used (in the out of work position) = needle in holding position = 2 stitches on 1 needle - either transferred from the right side or the left side, then put the needle into holding position = needle holding 2 sts. Stitch has been transferred from the LEFT □ needle holding 2 sts. Stitch has been transferred from the RIGHT 3 stitches on 1 needle. The 1st and 3rd stitch in a group of 3 needles has been hung on the 2nd or center needle. The diagrams for pattern work are followed just as they are shown, and on your knitting as it comes towards you on the machine. open dart closed dart
