DK 7874

An elegant Suit has an "A" Line Skirt. Cables are on the front and back sections of the deep ribbed Jacket. The saddle shoulders and high ribbed, buttoned Collar are especially attractive. Use KNIT-KING Troyer Tweed. Size 12/14. See page 22.



HP 3618

For Fall and Winter wear, your Man will be comfortable in this Pullover with its high ribbed neckline. Make the Cables down the front section only. The yarn . . . KNITKING Lovely. Size 38/40. See page 24.

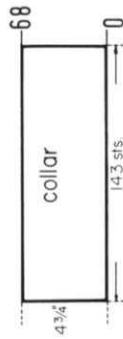
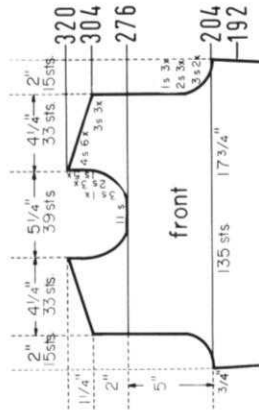
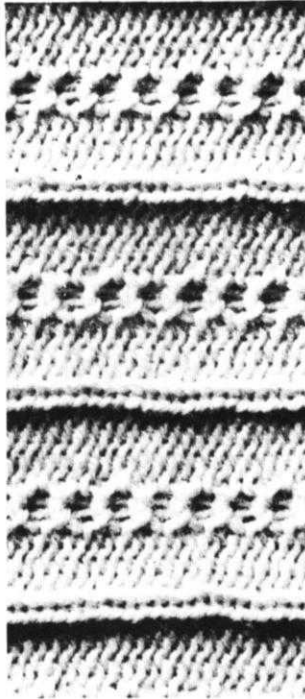

DP 7873

SIZE: 10/12 MATERIAL: 12½ oz. (7 balls) pale blue KNITTING CRYLOR Conchita. TENSION: KNITTING 4 to 6. GAUGE: Pattern stitch 15 sts, 2" 28 rows 2". PATTERN: Holding Position Design according to Line Drawing, worn on the puri side. EDGES: K1, P1, Ribbing. INCREASES: After rows indicated, move the 1st st. ON EACH SIDE 1 needle outward, then place the 2nd st. from the row below onto the empty needle.

FINISHING: Block all sections to measurements given. Join front and back section at sides and shoulders, easing in the fullness at bustline of front section. Sew sleeves together and set in. Join short ends of collar, then sew 1 edge of collar to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline.



Cast on 143 sts. and work 68 rows K1, P1, Ribbing, then bind off all sts. the crochet method for ribbing.

Bring the needles on the left side into working position, knit 1 row in PATTERN to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 292 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

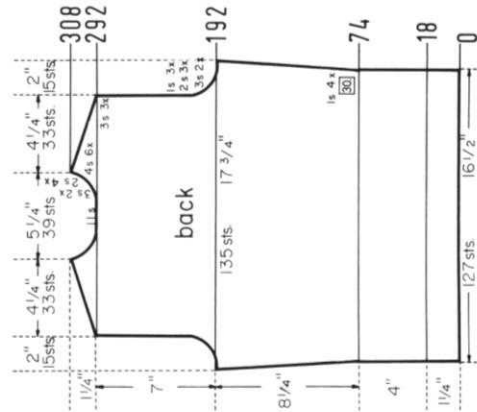
* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Row 292 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING), 294, 295, 296; 2 sts. after Row 297; 4 sts. after Row 298; 2 sts. after Row 299; 4 sts. after Row 300; 2 sts. after Row 301; 4 sts. after Row 302; 2 sts. after Row 303; 4 sts. after Rows 304, 306, 308.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 192, 193, 194, 195; 2 sts. after Rows 196, 197, 198, 199, 200, 201; 1 st. after Rows 202, 203, 204, 205, 206, 207, then knit to Row 292, bind off the center 11 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position (transfer the ribber sts.) and complete the right half first.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 74, 104, 134, 164, then knit to Row 192.

ROWS 0 to 18: Knit even, then transfer the appropriate ribber sts. to the main machine and work the Holding Position Design.

Cast on 127 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing.



Bring the needles on the left side into working position, knit 1 row in PATTERN to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 276 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Row 277 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 2 sts. after Rows 279, 281, 283; 1 st. after Rows 285, 287, 289, 291, 293. For SHOULDER bind off 3 sts. after Rows 304, 306, 308; 4 sts. after Rows 310, 312, 314, 316, 318, 320.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 204, 205, 206, 207; 2 sts. after Rows 208, 209, 210, 211, 212, 213; 1 st. after Rows 214, 215, 216, 217, 218, 219, then knit to Row 276, bind off the center 11 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position (transfer the ribber sts.) and complete the right half first.

ROWS 193 to 204: Knit even.

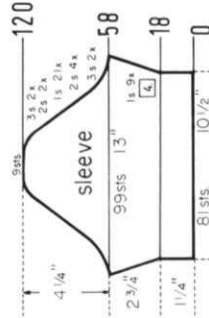
Work the front section the same as the back section to ROW 192.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 58, 59, 60, 61; 2 sts. after Rows 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, 67, 68, 69. ON EACH SIDE, hang the 1st st. onto the 2nd st. after Rows 70, 72, 74, 76, 78, 80, 82, 84, 86, 88, 90, 92, 94, 96, 98, 100, 102, 104, 106, 108, 110. ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Rows 112, 113, 114, 115; 3 sts. after Rows 116, 117, 118, 119; 9 sts. after Row 120.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 18, 22, 26, 30, 34, 38, 42, 46, 50, then knit to Row 58.

ROWS 0 to 18: Knit even then transfer the appropriate ribber sts. to the main machine and work the Holding Position Design.

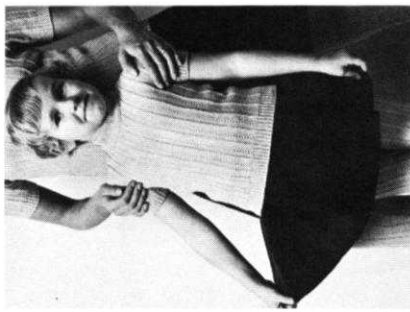
Cast on 81 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing.



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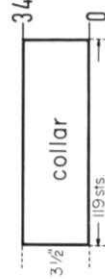
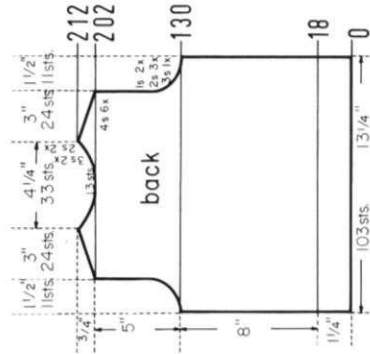
SIZE: 6-7 (Chest 24"-25"). MATERIAL: 14 oz. (8 balls) dark blue KNITTING Crylor Conchita. TENSION: KNITTING 5 to 7. GAUGE: Stockinette Stitch 15 sts, 2", 24 rows 2". Holding Position Design 15 sts, 2", 40 rows 2". PATTERN: Jacket: Stockinette Stitch; Skirt: Stockinette Stitch and Holding Position Design Stripes according to Line Drawing. The purl side on all sections is the right side. INCREASES: After rows indicated, move the 2 end sts. on the appropriate sides 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle. The Skirt is knitted sideways and the bell-shape is obtained by knitting Short Rows. The finished length of the skirt is 11 1/2".

FINISHING: Block all sections to measurements given. SKIRT: Weave the sts. held on contrast yarn together, leaving about 3" on the upper part free for the opening. Bind these sts. off. Sew 1 edge of waist band to inside and 1 edge to outside of upper edge easing in the fullness of the skirt. Insert an elastic band and sew to short ends of waist band. Sew in a zipper. Turn under 2" on lower edge and hem to wrong side. JACKET: Join front and back sections at sides and shoulders. Sew sleeves together and set in. Turn under 1" on sleeve edges and hem to wrong side. Work 2 rows of single crochet around front edges and neckline. Turn under 17 rows on lower edge and hem to wrong side. Insert an elastic band and sew to front edges. Finish buttonholes, sew on buttons.



SIZE: 6-7 (Chest 24"-25"). MATERIAL: 7 oz. (4 balls) pale blue KNITTING Crylor Conchita. TENSION: KNITTING 4 to 6. GAUGE: Pattern Stitch 15 sts, 2", 28 rows 2". PATTERN: Holding Position according to Line Drawing, worn on the purl side. EDGES: K1, P1, Ribbing.

FINISHING: Block all sections to measurements given. Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. Sew sleeves together and set in. Join short ends of collar, then sew 1 edge of collar to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline.



Cast on 119 sts. and work 34 rows K1, P1, Ribbing, then bind off all sts. the crochet method for ribbing.

Bring the needles on the left side into working position, knit 1 row in PATTERN to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 202 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 202 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 3 sts. after Row 203 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 4 sts. after Row 204; 3 sts. after Row 205; 4 sts. after Row 206; 2 sts. after Row 207; 4 sts. after Row 208; 2 sts. after Row 209; 4 sts. after Rows 210, 212.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 130, 131; 2 sts. after Rows 132, 133, 134, 135, 136, 137; 1 st. after Rows 138, 139, 140, 141, then knit to Row 202. (For Front Section knit to Row 174). After Row 202 bind off the center 13 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ROWS 19 to 130: Knit even.

ROWS 0 to 18: Knit even, then transfer the appropriate ribber sts. to the main machine and work the Holding Position Design.

Cast on 103 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing.

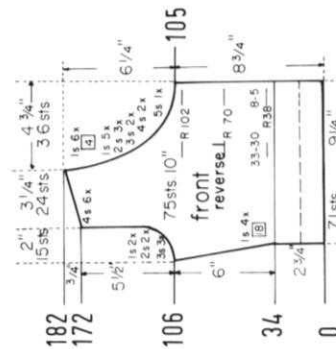
Work the left front section with reverse shapings, casting on from left to right. (Cam Box will be on the RIGHT side at Row 0). Omit the buttonholes.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Row 105 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 3 sts. after Row 106 (EVEN ROWS = ARMHOLE SHAPING); 4 sts. after Row 107; 3 sts. after Row 108; 4 sts. after Row 109; 3 sts. after Rows 110, 111; 2 sts. after Row 112; 3 sts. after Row 113; 2 sts. after Rows 114, 115; 1 st. after Row 116; 2 sts. after Row 117; 1 st. after Row 118 (last time for Armhole); 2 sts. after Row 119; 1 st. after Rows 121, 123, 125, 127, 129, 131, 135, 139, 143, 147, 151. For SHOULDER, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 172, 174, 176, 178, 180, 182.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX make buttonholes after Rows () over the 5th-8th and 30th-33rd sts. counting from the right side. ON CAM BOX SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 34, (38), 52, 70, (70), 88, (102), then knit to Row 105.

ROWS 0 to 34: Knit even.

From right to left cast on 71 sts. and work stockinette st. (Cam Box will be on the LEFT side at Row 0).



Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 172 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

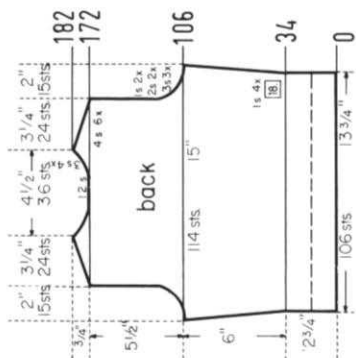
* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 172 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 3 sts. after Row 173 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 4 sts. after Row 174; 3 sts. after Row 175; 4 sts. after Row 176; 3 sts. after Row 177; 4 sts. after Row 178; 3 sts. after Row 179; 4 sts. after Row 180, 182.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 106, 107, 108, 109, 110, 111; 2 sts. after Rows 112, 113, 114, 115; 1 st. after Row 116, 117, 118, 119, then knit to Row 172, bind off the center 12 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 34, 52, 70, 88, then knit to Row 106.

ROWS 0 to 34: Knit even.

Cast on 106 sts. and work stockinette st.



Repeat Rows 0 to 74 10 x, but on the last repeat knit only 73 rows. After Row 813 knit several rows with contrast waste yarn, then remove knitting from machine.

ROWS 59 to 74: Work the Holding Position Design (work Line Drawing Rows 2 x).

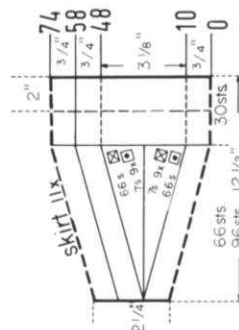
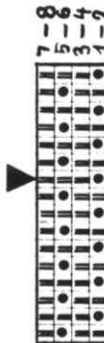
ROWS 49 to 58: Work stockinette st. over all 96 sts.

ROWS 11 to 48: Work Short Rows. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX put into holding position 66 needles, then knit 2 rows. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX bring back into working position 7 needles after Rows 12, 14, 16, 18, 20, 22, 24, 26, 28. (3 needles remain). ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX put into holding position 7 needles after Rows 30, 32, 34, 36, 38, 40, 42, 44, 46. After Row 48 bring all needles back into working position.

ROWS 0 to 10: Work stockinette st. and knit even.

With contrast waste yarn cast on 96 sts. and knit several rows, ending with the Cam Box on the right side. Change to garment yarn and turn Row Counter to 0.

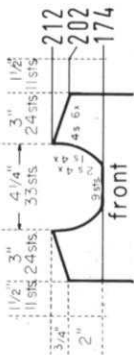
Cast on 180 sts. and work 24 rows stockinette st., then bind off all sts.



Bring the needles on the left side into working position, knit 1 row in PATTERN to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 174 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Rows 175, 177, 179, 181 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 1 st. after Rows 183, 185, 187, 189. For SHOULDER bind off 4 sts. after Rows 202, 204, 206, 208, 210, 212.

Work the front section the same as the back section to Row 174, then bind off the center 9 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

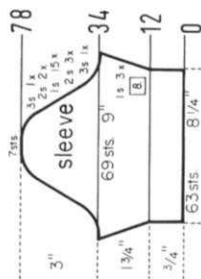


ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 34, 35; 2 sts. after Rows 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41. ON EACH SIDE, hang the 1st st. onto the 2nd st. after Rows 42, 44, 46, 48, 50, 52, 54, 56, 58, 60, 62, 64, 66, 68, 70. ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Rows 72, 73, 74, 75; 3 sts. after Rows 76, 77; 7 sts. after Row 78.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 12, 13, 20, 21, 28, 29, then knit to Row 34.

ROWS 0 to 12: Knit even then transfer the appropriate ribber sts. to the main machine and work the Holding Position Design.

Cast on 63 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing.

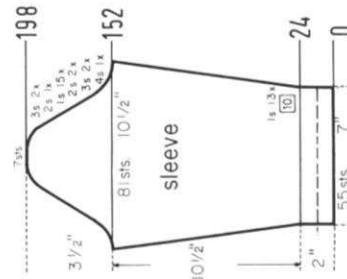


ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 152, 153; 3 sts. after Rows 154, 155, 156, 157; 2 sts. after Rows 158, 159, 160, 161. ON EACH SIDE, hang the 1st st. onto the 2nd st. after Rows 162, 164, 166, 168, 170, 172, 174, 176, 178, 180, 182, 184, 186, 188, 190. ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 2 sts. after Rows 192, 193; 3 sts. after Rows 194, 195, 196, 197; 7 sts. after Row 198.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 24, 34, 44, 54, 64, 74, 84, 94, 104, 114, 124, 134, 144, then knit to Row 152.

ROWS 0 to 24: Knit even.

Cast on 55 sts. and work stockinette st.

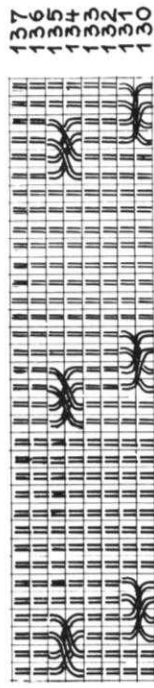


SIZE: 12/14. **MATERIAL:** 19½ oz. (11 balls) green KNITTING Crocus and a 20" zipper. **TENSION:** KNITTING 6 to 8. **GAUGE:** 14 sts, 2", 21 rows 2". **PATTERN:** Stockinette Stitch and a Cable Design on the front sections. (See Line Drawing for instructions). **EDGES:** K1, P1, Ribbing. **DECREASES:** After rows indicated, hang the 4th st. on the appropriate side onto the 3rd st., then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. **INCREASES:** After rows indicated, move the 2 end sts. on the appropriate side 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle. Bind off the ribbed bands on the crocheted method for ribbing. The finished length of the jumper is 36".

FINISHING: Block the sections to measurements given. Weave back sections together, 1 st. in from each edge. Beginning at the lower edge, weave front sections together for 12". Turn under 1 st. on remaining front edges and hem to wrong side. Sew pockets to jumper. Join front and back section at sides and shoulders, easing in the fullness at bustline of front sections. Turn under 18 rows on lower edge and hem to wrong side. Join short ends of armhole bands, then sew 1 edge of armhole band to inside and 1 edge to outside of armholes. Join neckbands at center back, then sew 1 edge of neckband to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline. Sew in zipper.



The Cable Design reaches over the 34 sts marked on the diagram of the front section. After Row 130, hang the 1st and 2nd of these sts. onto the 3rd and 4th needle, then the 3rd and 4th sts. onto the 1st and 2nd needles. Cross the 15th and 16th sts. with the 17th and 18th sts., then the 29th and 30th sts. with the 31st and 32nd sts. in the same manner. Knit 4 rows. Now cross the 3rd and 4th sts. with the 5th and 6th sts., the 17th and 18th sts. with the 19th and 20th sts. then the 31st and 32nd sts. with the 33rd and 34th sts. Knit 4 rows. Repeat these 8 rows for Pattern.



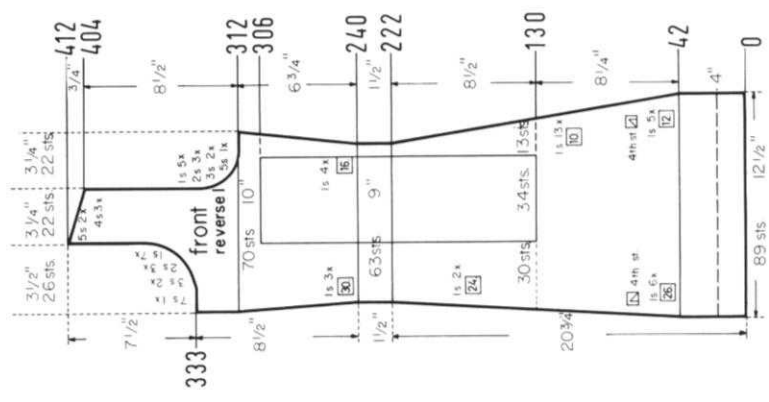
Cast on 111 sts. and work 22 rows K1, P1, Ribbing, then bind off all sts.



Cast on 173 sts. and work 22 rows K1, P1, Ribbing, then bind off all sts.



Cast on 48 sts., work stockinette st. and over the center 34 sts. work the Cable Design. Cross the sts. the first time after Row 4 and the last time after Row 52. After Row 58 transfer every other st. to the ribber and work 10 rows K1, P1, Ribbing. After Row 68 bind off all sts.



Work the second front section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to left. (Cam Box will be on the LEFT side at Row 0).

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Row 312 (EVEN ROWS = ARM-HOLE SHAPING); 3 sts. after Rows 314, 316; 2 sts. after Rows 318, 320, 322; 1 st. after Rows 324, 326, 328, 330, 332; 7 sts. after Row 333 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 3 sts. after Rows 335, 337; 2 sts. after Rows 339, 341, 343; 1 st. after Rows 345, 347, 349, 351, 353, 355, 357. For SHOULDER, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 404, 406, 408; 5 sts. after Row 410, 412.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX increase 1 st. after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 240, (240), 256, (270), 272, 288, (300). Cross the sts. the last time after Row 306, then knit to Row 312.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX decrease 1 st. after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 42, (42), 54, 66, (68), 78, 90, (94), 102, 112, (120), 122, (cross the sts. the first time after Row 130) 132, 142, (146), 152, 162, 172, (172), 182, 192, (198), 202, 212, 222, (222), then knit to Row 240.

ROWS 0 to 42: Knit even. Cast on 89 sts. and work stockinette st.

Work the second back section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to left. (Cam Box will be on the LEFT side at Row 0).

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 8 sts. after Row 383 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 3 sts. after Rows 385, 387, 389; 2 sts. after Rows 391, 393, 395; 4 sts. after Row 396 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 1 st. after Row 397; 4 sts. after Row 398; 1 st. after Row 399; 4 sts. after Row 400; 1 st. after Row 401; 5 sts. after Rows 402, 404.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Row 304 (EVEN ROWS = ARM-HOLE SHAPING); 3 sts. after Rows 306, 308; 2 sts. after Rows 310, 312, 314; 1 st. after Rows 316, 318, 320, 322, 324, then knit to Row 383.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX increase 1 st. after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 240, (240), 256, (270), 272, 288, (300), then knit to Row 304.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX decrease 1 st. after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 42, (42), 54, 66, (68), 78, 90, (94), 102, 112, (120), 122, 132, 142, (146), 152, 162, 172, (172), 182, 192, (198), 202, 212, 222, (222), then knit to Row 240.

ROWS 0 to 42: Knit even. Cast on 89 sts. and work stockinette st.

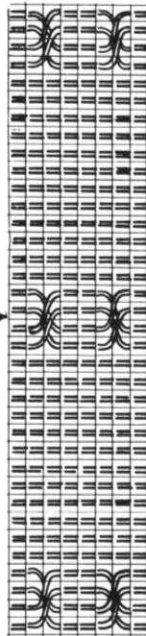
MK 5241

SIZE: 8-9 (Chest 26"-27"). MATERIAL: 14 oz. (8 balls) red KNITTING Crocus and a 10" Zipper. TENSION: KNITTING 6 to 8. GAUGE: 14 sts. 2", 21 rows 2". PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch and a Cable Design on the front sections. (See Line Drawing for instructions). EDGES: K1, P1, Ribbing. Bind off the ribbed sections the crochet method for ribbing. DECREASES: After rows indicated, hang the 3rd st. ON EACH SIDE onto the 2nd st, then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. The finished length of the jumper is 22 1/2".

FINISHING: Block the sections to measurements given. Weave the back sections together, 1 st. in from each edge. Beginning at the lower edges, weave the front sections together for 10", turn under 1 st. on the remainder of the front edges and hem to wrong side. Sew pockets to jumper, (see picture). Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. Turn under 2" on lower edge and hem to wrong side. ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 316, 317, 318, 319, 320, 321, 322, 323. After Row 324 bind off the center 21 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 210, 211; 3 sts. after Rows 212, 213, 214, 215, 216, 217; 2 sts. after Rows 218, 219, 220, 221; 1 st. after Rows 222, 223, 224, 225, 226, 227, 228, 229, then knit to Row 316. ROWS 45 to 210: Knit even. ROWS 0 to 44: Knit even, then change to stockinette st. Cast on 185 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing.

SIZE: 14/16. **MATERIAL:** Jacket 15 1/2 oz. (9 balls) yellow; Shell 5 1/2 oz. (3 balls) yellow = Color A, 3 1/2 oz. (2 balls) olive = Color B and 3 1/2 oz. (2 balls) rust = Color C **KNITTING** Subita Dralon 3 ply. **TENSION:** KNITTING 5 to 7. **GAUGE:** Stockinette Stitch 15 sts. 2", 22 rows 2", **PATTERN:** **JACKET:** Stockinette Stitch; **SHELL:** Stockinette Stitch with repeated color stripes as marked in the diagram of the back section. **EDGES:** K1, P1, Ribbing. Bind off all ribbed bands the crochet method for ribbing. **SLEEVE INCREASES:** After rows indicated, move the 2 end sts. ON EACH SIDE 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle.

FINISHING: Block all sections to measurements given. **JACKET:** Join front and back sections at sides and shoulders. Sew sleeves together and set in. Turn under 12 sts. on the front edges and hem to wrong side. Sew neckband to neckline, leaving a small opening on the right side for a buttonhole. ROWS 81 to 94: Knit even over 18 needles, then knit several rows with contrast waste yarn and remove these sts. from the machine. Turn the Row Counter back to 34.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX bring back into working position 1 needle after Rows 64, 65, 66, 67, 68, 69, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79, then knit to Row 80.

ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX put into holding position 1 needle after Rows 48, 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, then knit to Row 64. (2 needles remain in working position) change to red and lower tension 1 number.

ROWS 35 to 48: Knit even, then work short rows.

EACH SIDE with a contrast yarn, then mark needles ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX in holding position and complete the upper part of the mitten first. (18 sts.)

ROWS 0 to 16: Knit even, then change to stockinette st.

Cast on 35 sts. with blue (use every 4th needle on the main machine and every 2nd needle on the ribber) and work K1, P1, Ribbing.

OUR READERS WRITE

One of the most frequently asked questions we still receive from readers is "How can I weave stitches together that are held on contrast waste yarn?" We did have an article on this some time ago, but because very obviously a large number of subscribers did not see it, we are repeating it herewith.....

WEAVING OPEN STITCHES TOGETHER

There are many occasions when you will want to weave open stitches together such as on the heels and toes of socks, skirts, facings, etc... To obtain the needed open stitches for weaving, you must begin and end your knitting with contrast waste yarn.

Some people steam the open ends and then struggle to weave the stitches from the right side. We at KNITKING have what we think is a better way and we want you to try it...

Please follow the directions exactly from start to finish and this will be your practice piece. In order for you to see the stitches easily, make your sample piece using KNITKING Frigate or a similar weight yarn (4-ply worsted is O.K.) knitted over every other needle.

Cast on a total of 30 stitches with contrast waste yarn of same weight as main yarn. Use the Automatic Cast-on method (See Practical Knitting Hints Book - page 12). Knit 3 to 5 rows ending with Cam Box (or Slide) on the left side. Now knit 1 row with a Ravel Cord. A piece of rayon crochet cotton (not too fine) makes an excellent Ravel Cord. Change to main yarn and knit 49 rows (any odd number) ending with Cam Box on the LEFT side. Leave a length of yarn about 3 times as wide as the knitting on machine, then cut. Knit 8 rows with contrast yarn and remove work from machine.

Now you are ready to weave the stitches together. Thread a Tapestry needle or Ribber Transfer Needle with the long end of main yarn. NEVER use a pointed needle for weaving stitches together.

Take your sample of knitting and fold it in half with the KNIT side INSIDE and the PURL side OUTSIDE. The threaded needle should be on the RIGHT BACK HALF and the Ravel Cord on the FRONT HALF. Allow the edges knitted with the contrast yarn on both ends to roll toward the INSIDE (knit side) so that you are holding it in such a way as to see and match up the FIRST row of main knitting at each end.

Begin to weave... Pick up the threaded needle in your right hand and holding the knitting together in your left, go into the first stitch on the back section from the BACK. (Be careful here, as it is important that you go into the stitch made with the yarn end...pull the strand gently so you SEE it). Continuing with the needle coming toward you, go into the edge of front section.... this is not a stitch, but a loop with the Ravel Cord through it. Now go into the first stitch on

the front section from the FRONT to back (away from you) across to the back section (away from you) into the original first stitch on the back section. Bring the needle into the second stitch on the back section from the BACK (toward you) across and into the first stitch (that you worked before) on the front section. Go into the second stitch on the front section from the FRONT to back (away from you) into the second stitch (that you worked before) on the back section... into the next stitch on the back section from BACK to front (toward you) and into stitch (that you worked before) on the front section... etc., etc... Take note that you ALWAYS go into a stitch twice to complete it. ALWAYS pull up each stitch every time, just enough to match the main knitting... not too tight, nor too loose. If you will take a good look at your knitting, you will soon see that you are following the course of the Ravel Cord on one side and the contrast yarn on the other. When you come to the end, complete the weaving, being certain that you have gone into loop below where end of Ravel Cord is, then back to last stitch on the back section.

You are now ready to remove the contrast waste yarn. Turn your sample to the knit side out. When you knitted your sample piece, you ended with 8 rows of contrast waste yarn and this will rip out very easily - so just pull it out. The cast-on end holds the Ravel Cord- Release each end of the Ravel Cord by pulling it out of first stitch, then pull out the Ravel Cord and the waste yarn falls away. If it pulls hard, or if you have used a fine soft yarn when knitting a garment, you should really remove the Ravel Cord a few stitches at a time. If you have used rayon crochet cotton for a Ravel Cord (not a commercial cord) you can cut it every inch or so, then pull the pieces out and throw them away.

Now take a good look at your weaving.... pretty good eh?

Another very frequently asked question from KNITKING owners is in regard to Ribbing with a heavy (4-ply) worsted weight yarn. Here is the answer:

EASY CAST-ON for RIBBING with HEAVY YARN

Before Ribbing (knitting too) with heavy weight yarn that must be knitted over every other needle, wax your yarn with paraffin in the following manner:

While winding your yarn, hold the paraffin wax in your left hand and allow the yarn to run over it, controlling the yarn with very slight pressure from your thumb and, if the ball winds too tight, wind it a second time without using the wax.

Bring every other needle on the main machine into HOLDING position, making sure one of those needles is the "0" (center) needle followed by an uneven number of needles on each side of the "0". Cast on from left to right over these needles in back of the latches, then put all needles into working position (you may use your Needle Shifter to bring the needles into work). Set your tension at 8, 9 or 10, depending on the weight of

yarn and the tension you will use for knitting the body of garment. Knit 1 row to the left side (Row Counter will be at 1). Now fix your Ribber on to the Machine with the Ribber Cam Box on the LEFT SIDE. Transfer the center stitch - then every other stitch on each side - to the Ribber using alternate Ribber needles. Make sure the latches on the Ribber are open and that the stitches slide behind the latches. See that the white Strippers are in place, connect the Cam Boxes and begin Ribbing.

ALTERNATE CAST-ON WITH HEAVY YARN

If your yarn is rather stiff and the above Ribbing edge does not seem to have much elasticity, here is an alternate method to use which will give you a very elastic edge.

Fix your Ribber onto machine with BOTH Cam Boxes on the LEFT side. Bring the Ribber needle directly opposite the "0" needle on Main Machine into working position (all the way up) then bring every alternate needle of Ribber on each side into working position. Bring the 3rd then every 4th needle on either side of the Main Machine into working position. Remember that the first and last needle must always be a Main Machine needle. Cast on in the normal way for Ribbing... counter clockwise on the Main Machine needles and clockwise on the Ribber needles. The stitches should be in FRONT of the latches on the Main Machine and BEHIND the latches on the Ribber. Run the Cam Box of the Main Machine to the right side (this will put the Main Machine stitches behind the latches). Now hold the yarn under the hooks of the Ribber needles (right to left) and knit each Ribber stitch by hand, bringing the Ribber needles back into knitting position and making sure the latches are OPEN. Run the Main Machine Cam Box across to the LEFT side. See that the white Strippers are in place, connect the Cam Boxes, place yarn in Holder and Feed Finger, then proceed with Ribbing.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR KNITTING THE PINCUSHION that appears on page 13 of this issue.

MATERIAL: Small amounts of 2 colors KNITKING Sonika Dralon. 2 1/2" circle of Polyfoam at

least 1" thick (you may cut the circle from a kitchen sponge). TENSION: 6 to 8. GAUGE: 14 sts. 19 rows 2".

OPEN CAST-ON 24 sts. using contrast waste yarn. After knitting several rows, knit 1 row to the right side with a ravel cord, change to main color yarn and put counter at 0.

ROWS 1-8: Put 3 needles opposite Cam Box into holding position beginning next 2 rows and 2 needles beginning next 6 rows. (Short Rows)

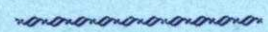
ROWS 9-16: Put back into working position 2 needles opposite Cam Box beginning next 6 rows and 3 needles beginning next 2 rows.

ROWS 17-96: REPEAT ROWS 1-16 5 times more (6 sections) knit several rows with contrast waste yarn and remove work from machine.

PETAL EDGING: With second color, cast on 61 sts. OVER EVERY OTHER NEEDLE. Work with tension 10. Put the 1st, then every 6th needle into holding position and knit 10 rows (be sure to wrap the yarn around the end needle in holding position beginning every row).

ROW 11: Return all needles to working position and knit this one row slowly. Break yarn leaving a long end, then tie this end to the cast on end tightly against the stitches. Thread tapestry needle with long end of yarn, release stitches from under the sinkers and take each stitch off on strand of yarn.

FINISHING: Weave half the stitches together that are held on waste yarn, then stuff the foam circle into this half and weave the rest of the stitches held on waste yarn. Remove waste yarn. Pull up the Petals and pin to fit around cushion a little more than half way down from the top of cushion. With long strand of yarn, sew Petals to cushion, making sure to only go through the knitting (not the foam) and working from the underside, catch each open stitch of Petals. Make 3 French knots in center of top.

NOTES TO KNIT BY . . .

STITCH AND ROW GAUGE

KNIT A SAMPLE SWATCH . . . before you begin to knit any garment . . . for this is the MOST IMPORTANT STEP toward the correct size and the proper fit of any garment you wish to make. You MUST use the SAME YARN for your sample swatch that you will use to knit your garment and your sample swatch must be knitted large enough and using several different tension numbers on your machine. When you have done this, then you can determine the number of stitches and the number of rows in a two-inch measure. KNITTING MAGAZINE PATTERNS give you 3 tensions to try and one of them should give you the correct stitch and row gauge if you are using the yarn we recommend or a similar weight yarn. Here is the way to make your sample swatch.

Cast on over a sufficient number of needles to produce a swatch at least 4 inches wide. (If the pattern calls for 16 stitches to 2", then $16 \times 2 = 32$ stitches to cast on). Now knit 4 inches of rows at the first suggested tension number. (If the pattern calls for 22 rows to 2", $22 \times 2 = 44$ rows to knit). Knit 2 rows using a contrast color, change to the next higher tension and with garment yarn knit another 4", knit 2 rows with contrast color, change to the 3rd higher tension and knit another 4" and then bind off.




Roll the swatch into a cylinder over its length and pull on both ends, unroll it and stretch it diagonally by pulling on the four corners. Allow the swatch to rest and settle (preferably overnight) and then using a stitch gauge or a ruler, count the number of stitches over a 2" width, then the number of rows over a 2" length in EACH of the 3 tensions. Select the tension number that produces the stitches and rows called for in the pattern. If none of them are correct, you are most likely using the wrong weight of yarn.




READING OF CHARTS


You will notice the instructions start at the bottom of the Chart and work UP. Follow the charts exactly as written and providing your sample stitch and row gauge is correct, your garment will come out the right size. Please remember that the section of garment as it is knitted on the machine, faces the same way as the Charts are in this magazine. Where two front pieces are needed, (or any other part of a garment that needs two sections) only one section is normally shown and the second section is usually made with reverse shaping. Set in sleeves are usually identical, but raglan sleeves have to be knitted with reverse shaping for the second sleeve.


READING OF SYMBOLS

To simplify Pattern Knitting, we use Symbols in the Line Drawings and the Chart Diagrams. In the Line Drawings the symbols are shown and are to be read as you look at them while knitting a garment. For instance, if

a Purl stitch faces you, the Purl stitch Symbol  is shown; if a knit stitch faces you (as when using the Ribber) then this Symbol  is shown. The Symbol  at the top of the Line Drawing is the center of the garment section and you use this as a guide for setting up the needles.

The following Symbols    are used for Eyelet Designs in the Line Drawings and also for Full Fashion shaping on the Charts. The Line Drawings have row numbers on the right side. Missing Row numbers are always knitted straight or plain.

In Holding Position Designs  selected needles are pushed into holding position for the stated number of rows. The numbers of rows appear at the right of the Line Drawings; Example: 1-4 means knit Rows 1 to 4; 5 to 7 means knit Rows 5 to 7, etc. This same Symbol is also shown on the Charts and is used for putting needles into holding position for Short Rows. The

Symbol  on the Charts is used to put needles back into working position when knitting Short Rows.

A number in a box stands for the number of rows to be knitted between shapings. Make shaping first, then knit the necessary number of rows. If for instance it reads:

1 st. 8 x



1 st. 10 x





As you will be reading the instructions from the bottom up, here is the way you will follow them: . . . Decrease or increase (depending on the direction of the garment outline) 1 st. at the row where the shaping begins, then knit 8 rows, make the next decrease, then knit 8 rows, until you have decreased (or increased) 1 st. 10 x and you have knitted 8 rows after each decrease (or increase) (1 st. 10 x +8 rows 10 x). Now begin the first decrease (or increase) for the shaping (which has to be made 8 x) in every 6th row. Decrease (or increase) 1 st. first, then knit 6 rows until you have decreased 1 st. 6 x and after each decrease (or increase) have knitted 6 rows (1 st. 8 x + 6 rows 8 x).


Where shapings are given without a boxed number as on most armholes, necklines, etc., make the shapings on every second row (on each side of course).

PATTERN STITCH SYMBOLS


 = knit stitch


 = purl stitch


 = empty needle (leave in working position)


 = needle not used (in the out of work position)


 = needle in the holding position

 = Needles back into working position.


 = 2 stitches on 1 needle - either transferred from the right side or the left side, then put the needle into holding position

 = needle holding 2 stitches. Stitch has been transferred from the LEFT

 = needle holding 2 stitches. Stitch has been transferred from the RIGHT

 = 3 stitches on 1 needle. The 1st and 3rd stitch in a group of 3 needles has been hung on the 2nd or center needle.

 = Center of Garment Section.

 = Number of rows to be knitted between shapings.

The diagrams (Line Drawings) for pattern work are followed just as they are shown and are to be read as you look at them while knitting the garment.
