The instructions are the same for both sizes. PATTERN: Norwegian Design according to the Line Drawing. Use the adjustable needle selector. In the instructions, each row in the Norwegian Design is counted as 1 row, but several movements of the Cam Box are needed to complete 1 row. EDGES: Crochet. To increase, place the end st. from the row below onto the next empty needle.

FINISHING: Block all sections. Join back and front sections at sides and shoulders, Sew the sleeves together and set in. Crochet around front, neck and lower edge as follows:


ROW 1: With Color 1, single crochet around.
ROW 2: With Color 1, work 1 sc in first st., ch 1, *skip 1, 1 sc in next st., ch 1, REPEAT from * around.

ROW 3: With Color 2 sc into ch 1 space; *ch 1, sc in next ch 1 space; REPEAT from * around.


around. ROW 4: With Color 1, Repeat Row 3, but on the RIGHT SIDE, make 5 buttonholes beginning about 2%" from lower edge and space 2%" apart by chaining 5, skip 5, for each buttonhole.

ROWS 5 & 6: With Color 1, REPEAT ROW 3.
ROW 7: With Color 2, REPEAT Row 3.
ROW 8: With Color 1, work picot; *ch 2, sc into 2nd ch from hook; ch 1, skip 2, sc in next st. REPEAT from * around.

SLEEVE: Crochet 4 rows the same as above, working the 3rd row with Color 2, then work 1 row of picots as Row 8 using Color 1.




Work the second front section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to

OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX (NECK SIDE), decrease 1 st. after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 In (), ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 174; (174), 3 sts. after Rows 176, 178; (178), 2 sts. after Rows 180, 182, (182), 184; 1 st. after Rows 186, (186), 188, 190, (190), 192. The Armhole Shaping is now completed. Continue to decrease 1 st. ON NECK SIDE after Rows 194, 198, 202, 206, 210, 214, 218, 222, 226, 230, 234, 240, 246, 252, 258, then again after Rows in (). For SHOULDER bind off 4 sts. after Row 262; 5 sts. after Rows 264, (264),266, 268, 270, (270), 272, 274,

ROWS 0 to 174: Knit even.

Cast on 81 sts. with color 1 and work the Norwegian Design.




Bring the needles on the left side into working position, knit 1 row in PAT-TERN to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 262 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from*.

*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 262 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 3 sts. after Row 263 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAP-How 263 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAP-ING); 5 sts. after Row 264; 3 sts. after Row 265; 5 sts. after Row 266; 3 sts. after Row 267; 5 sts. after Row 268; 2 sts. after Row 269; 5 sts. after Row 270; 2 sts. after Row 271; 5 sts. after Row 272; 2 sts. after Row 273; 5 sts. after Row 274, 276.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 174, 175; 3 sts. after Rows 176, 177, 178, 179; 2 sts. after Rows 180, 181, 182, 183, 184, 185; 1 st. after Rows 186, 187, 188, 189, 190, 191, 192, 193, then knit to Row 262, bind off the center 21 sts. put the needles on off the center 21 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ROWS 0 to 174: Knit even.

Cast on 169 sts. with color 1 and work the Norwegian Design.



ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 198, 199, 200, 201, 202, 203; 2 sts. after Rows 204, 205, 206, 207, 208, 209, 210, 211, 212, 213; 1 st. after Rows 214, 215, 216, 217; 2 sts. after Rows 218, 219; 1 st. after Rows 220, 221, 222, 223; 2 sts. after Rows 224, 225; 1 st. after Rows 226, 227, 228, 229; 2 sts. after Rows 230, 231; 1 st. after Rows 236, 237; 1 st. after Rows 236, 237; 1 st. after Rows 238, 239, 240, 241; 2 sts. after Rows 242, 243; 1 st. after Rows 244, 245, 246, 247; 2 sts. after Rows 244, 245, 246, 247; 2 sts. after Rows 250, 251, 252, 253; 4 sts. after Rows 254, 255, 256, 257; 12 sts. after Rows 254, 255, 256, 257; 12 sts. after Rows 258. after Row 258.

ON EACH SIDE increase 1 st. ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 8, 16, 24, 32, 40, 48, 56, 64, 72, 80, 88, 96, 104, 112, 120, 128, 136, 144, 152, 160, 168, 174, 180, 186, 192, then knit to Row 198.

ROWS 0 to 8: Knit even.

Cast on 76 sts. with color 1 and work the Norwegian Design.

Decreases: SIDES: Hang the 3rd st. onto the 2nd st., then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle, FRONT EDGE: Hang the 14th st. ON FRONT EDGE onto the 13th sts., then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. Increases: Move the 2 end sts. 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle.

FINISHING: Block the sections, Join back and front sections at sides and shoulders, Weave the open sts. of the facing together, then sew the facing to neckline. Turn under 16 Rows on lower edge, 11 sts. on front edges and neckline and hem to wrong side. Join the short ends of the armhole facings, then sew the facings to the armholes, turn to wrong side and hem in place. Finish the buttonholes, sew on buttons.

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

EACH Eyelet Design Stripe is worked over 31 sts. as marked on the Diagrams. 1. ON EACH SIDE of the Stripe Center, hang the 7th st. onto the 8th st. and the 15th st. onto the 16th st. 2. ON EACH on the Stripe Center, move the SIDE on the Stripe Center, move the 1st-6th and 9th-14th sts. 1 needle to the right - left side - respectively. 3. Bring the empty needles into working position and knit 2 rows. 4. ON EACH SIDE of the Stripe Center, hang the 7th st. onto the 8th st. and the 15th st. onto the 16th st. 5. ON EACH SIDE of the Stripe Center, move the 2nd-6th and 10th-14th sts. 1 needle to the right-left side-respectively. 6. Bring the empty needles into working position and knit 2 rows, ETC.

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

The instructions are the same for all sizes. PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch. The Skirt is knitted sideways on the machine. EDGES: K1, P1, Ribbing.

FINISHING: Block all sections. TOP: Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. Join the short ends of the armhole bands, then sew the bands in place. Sew the side band to the right side seam and trim with buttons. (see picture). Work 2 rows of single crochet around the neckline. SKIRT: Weave the sts. together that are held on waste yarn, leaving 6" open at the waistline. Slip st. crochet the remaining open sts. then sew a zipper into the opening. Sew an elastic waist band to the wrong side at the waistline. Turn under about 2" for hem.



Cast on 105 sts. and work 14 rows K1, P1, Ribbing, then bind off all sts.

> Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 186 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from*

> *ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 187, 189, 191; 2 sts. after Rows 193, 195, 197; 1 st. after Rows 199, 201, 203. After Row 214 bind off the 14 Shoulder sts.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 6 sts. after Rows 124, 125; 4 sts. after Rows 126, 127, 128, 129; 3 sts. after Rows 130, 131, 132, 133; 2 sts. after Rows 134, 135, 136, 137; 1 st. after Rows 138, 139, 140, 141, 142, 143, then knit to Row 186, bind off the center 36 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first. (For the Front Section knit to half first. (For the Front Section knit to ROW 162).

ROWS 57 to 124: Knit even.

ROWS 0 to 56: Knit even, then change to stockinette st.

Cast on 154 sts. and work K1, P1, Ribbing.






Repeat ROWS 0 to 58 17 times more, but the LAST time, knit only to ROW 57. (The last row will be made up when weaving the open sts. together). Knit several rows with contrast waste yarn, then remove the knitting from the machine.


ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, put into holding position 94 needles after Row 10. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX bring back into working position 10 needles after Rows 12, 14, 16, 18, 20, 22, 24, 26, 28, (4 needles remain). ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX put into holding position 10 needles after Rows 30, 32, 34, 36, 38, 40, 42, 44, 46. Bring all needles back into working position after Row 48, then knit even to Row 58. One section of the skirt is now completed.


ROWS 0 to 10: Knit even.

Cast on 126 sts. with contrast waste yarn (open Cast-on), knit several rows, ending with the Cam Box on the right side. Change to the garment yarn and turn the Row Counter to 0. Work stockinette st. and Short Rows.



Cast on 196 sts. and work 14 rows K1, P1, Ribbing, then bind off all sts.





Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 162 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from .

*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 163; 3 sts. after Rows 165, 167; 2 sts. after Rows 169, 171, 173; 1 st. after Rows 175, 177, 179, 181, 183. After Row 214 bind off the 14 Shoulder

Work the front section the same as the back section to ROW 162, then bind off the center 30 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and com-plete the right half first. Work the second front section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to left. (Cam Box will be on the LEFT side at Row 0). Omit the buttonholes.

Decrease 1 st. ON NECK SIDE after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 202, (202), 204; (205), 2 sts. after Rows 206, 208; (208), 1 st. after Rows 210, (211), 212. The Armhole Shaping is now completed. Continue to decrease 1 st. ON NECK SIDE after Rows 214, 217, 220, 223, 226, 229, 232, 235, 238, 241, 244, 247, 250, 253, 257, 261, 265, then 1 more time after Row in (). For SHOULDER bind off 4 sts. after Row 266; 5 sts. after Rows 268, (269), 270, 272, 274, 276, 278. Work over the remaining 11 sts. (FACING) to Row 300, then put the sts. onto a stitch holder.


Continue to make buttonholes after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 122, (133), 142, 162, (163), 182, (193), then knit to Row 202.

Make buttonholes over the 3rd-7th and 16th-20th sts. counting from the left side after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 38, (43), 46, 54, 62, 70, (73), 78, 86, 94, 100, (103), 106, then knit to Row 122.


ROWS 17 to 38: Knit even

ROWS 0 to 16: Knit even, then cast on 22 sts. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX, (use a separate length of yarn) then begin the Eyelet Design over the 31 sts. marked on the Diagram.

Cast on 63 sts. and work stockinette st.



Cast on 118 sts. and work stockinette st. Decrease 1 st. ON EACH SIDE after Rows 2, 4, 6, 8, 10. After Row 12 bind off all sts.



Bring the needles on the left side into working position, knit 1 row in PATTERN to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 270 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from*.

*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Row 270 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 4 sts. after Row 271 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 5 sts. after Row 272; 4 sts. after Row 273; 5 sts. after Row 274; 3 sts. after Row 275; 5 sts. after Rows 276, 278.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 266, 267; 5 sts. after Rows 268, 269, then knit to Row 270, bind off the center 12 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 202, 203, 204, 205; 2 sts. after Rows 206, 207, 208, 209; 1 st. after Rows 210, 211, 212, 213, then knit to Row 266.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 122, 142, 162, 182, then knit to Row 202.

ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 38, 46, 54, 62, 70, 78, 86, 94, 100, 106, then knit to Row 122.

ROWS 17 to 38: Knit even.

ROWS 0 to 16: Knit even, then begin the Eyelet Design over the sts. marked on the Diagram.



FINISHING: Block all sections. Join back and front sections at sides and shoulders. Sew the sleeves together and set in. Sew 1 edge of the band to inside and 1 edge to the outside of front edges and neckline. (Buttonholes on the LEFT side). Finish the buttonholes, sew on buttons.



Cast on 24 sts. with color 2 and work stockinette st. Make buttonholes over the 2nd-7th and 18th-23rd sts. after Rows 10, 46, 82, 118, 154, then knit to Row 654 and bind off all sts.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 56, 80, 104, 128, 152, then knit to Row 180.

ROWS 0 to 56: Knit even, then change to stockinette st. and work the color stripes as marked in the Diagram.

Cast on 81 sts. with color 2 and work K1, P1, Ribbing.

Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 292 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from*.

*ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Rows 292 (EVEN ROWS = SHOULDER SHAPING); 293 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING), 294, 295, 296; 3 sts. after Row 297; 4 sts. after Row 298; 3 sts. after Row 299; 4 sts. after Row 300; 2 sts. after Row 301; 4 sts. after Row 302; 2 sts. after Row 303; 4 sts. after Rows 304, 306.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 286, 287; 4 sts. after Rows 288, 289, 290, 291, then knit to Row 292, bind off the center 21 sts., put the needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Rows 180, 181; 3 sts. after Rows 182, 183, 184, 185; 2 sts. after Rows 186, 187, 188, 189; 1 st. after Rows 190, 191, 192, 193, 194, 195, 196, 197, 198, 199, then knit to Row 286.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 56, 80, 104, 128, 152, then knit to Row 180.

ROWS 0 to 56: Knit even, then change to stockinette st. and work the color stripes as marked in the Diagram.

Cast on 173 sts. with color 2 and work K1, P1, Ribbing.

FINISHING: Block and hide all ends. Stretch Cover over padded seat matching centers and tack or staple under seat. Work from side to side and top to bottom stretching evenly and miter the corners.

With Color 1, cast on 136 sts. Knit 6 rows stockinette stitch, then put Counter at 0 and begin Pattern. Mark center stitch with bit of contrast yarn. ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 46, 70, 94, 118, 142, 166. Knit even in Pattern to Row 184. Change to stockinette stitch and with color 1, knit to Row 190. Mark center stitch with bit of contrast yarn and bind off.

NOTE: To make it easy for you . . . You will put the JAC CARD through your JAC 40 4 complete times plus 24 more rows (5th time). YARDSTICK HOLDER

MATERIAL: 2 50 gr. balls Color 1, small amounts of 3 contrasting colors KNITKING Dolly Dralon Crepe. Inexpensive plastic bracelet for hanger; yardstick. TENSION: 6 or 7. GAUGE: 13 sts. = 2½", 36 Rows = 2" measured over pressed pattern.

FINISHING: The PURL SIDE is the RIGHT SIDE. Hide all ends, then pin to board with knit side up and press with a warm DRY IRON. The piece should measure $2\%'' \times 80''$. Put one end through bracelet and fold down 6'' then pin in place. Fold other end up to within %'' of fold over top edge and pin carefully down the full length on both sides. Baste inside of picot then beginning 3%'' from top, on side with opening, sew on sewing machine just inside the picot edge to within %'' of bottom, stitch across and then down other side to 3%'' from top and across top to beginning of stitching. Pin the Hearts in place, spacing them evenly and alternating the colors. Thread end of yarn and sew around hearts with an invisible stitch.

Bring 17 needles into working position. Counting from the right side, put back to the out of work position, needles 3, 7, 11, 15 and leave them there. Cast on over the remaining 13 needles.

Knit 2 rows.

*Counting from the right, bring needles 2, 4, 7, 10, 12 into holding position, knit 4 rows.


Bring all needles back into working position, knit 2 rows. REPEAT from * to Row 1442. Bind off the crochet method.

HEARTS. Tension 6. Cast on 17 sts. Put the center needle into holding position, knit 6 rows. Return needle to working position. Knit 2 rows. HP 3696 — Let him make a big fashion splash . . . Checkerboard squares for a Man's sleeveless Pullover. Follow the Line Drawing for the Norwegian Design. The bands are a 1 x 1 Rib. Use KNITKING Allegro Dralon for Size 34; Dolly Dralon for Size 38.

MK 5421 — Double check this Teen size Pullover and knit it for your favorite gal. The Norwegian technique follows the Line Drawing. Knit Size 8 with KNITKING Allegro Dralon; Size 10 with Dolly Dralon.



DP 8180 -- Twice as nice . . . Twinsets are in . . . and you will look elegant in this lovely set. The Cardigan has a Norwegian Design Trim . . . the Pullover can be made with or without Mock Rib Bands (See Practical Knitting Hint in this issue). Size 16, KNITKING Regia; Size 20, Amore; Size 22, Alanda.


DK 8179 — A spectacular Pantsuit goes everywhere. Knit the Vest in a Holding Position Design following the Line Drawing or use your JAC 40 and Pattern No. 88. The Pants are made in stockinette stitch. Knit Size 10 with KNITKING Beatrice Crepe; Size 12 with Crocus Crepe; Size 16 with Dolly Dralon.












DP 8183 — Slim lines . . . soft texture . . . Flatter the full figure with an eye catching Jacket knitted in Stockinette stitch with an Eyelet and Cable Design on the front sections.



PRACTICAL KNITTING HINTS

MOCK RIBBING (To use for bands if you do not own a Ribbing Attachment). DP 8180 in this issue, has two sets of instructions for the Pullover bands. One is for knitting the bands with a Ribbing Attachment and the other for a Mock Rib - without a Ribber. If you have a Ribbing attachment, turn your Row Counter to 14 and cast on the number of sts. given first, then knit to Row 28 and change to stockinette stitch and continue knitting as instructed. A Mock Rib band is not quite as elastic as a regular Rib band, but is a good substitute. For the Mock Rib, cast on the number of sts. given in () using EVERY OTHER NEEDLE. Turn the tension setting 2 to 3 numbers lower than given tension and knit 28 rows. Now hang the cast-on sts. back onto the machine onto the same needles holding stitches, then bring the empty needles between those already in working position, into work. With your work hook, pick up each cross thread that spans from 1 st. to the other (release the sts. from under the sinkers first), twist the yarn, forming a loop, then place the loop onto the empty needle. After all the cross threads have been formed into loops and hung onto the empty needles, turn the tension to the proper setting for the rest of the garment section.

You can use this method for any garment with ribbed bands, but remember to turn the tension down and knit DOUBLE the number of rows given for a 1 x 1 rib band. After the band sections are completed, turn the Row Counter to the proper row and turn the tension to the correct number for your garment.

Another type of Mock Rib could be a 3 and 1 rib; This would be 3 needles in working position and 1 needle in the non-working position. Mock Rib bands should be blocked out in width then steamed in order to give them the ribbed look.

COLLAR and BAND KNITTED as ONE

There are several garments in this issue of KNITKING MAGAZINE that have the Collar and the Front Bands knitted as one... Patterns DP 8181, DP 8182 and MK 5417. We will use MK 5417 for our example and give you explicit instructions on how to accomplish this, then you can use the same method for the other two garments.

EXAMPLE: MK 5417

Make two sections for the Collar and Band ... exactly alike. Begin with an open cast-on using waste yarn. Cast on 48 sts. with contrast waste yarn and knit several rows, ending with the Cam Box on the right side. Change to the garment yarn and turn the Row Counter to 0. Knit even to Row 62. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, put 40 needles into holding position. With contrast waste yarn, knit several rows over the 8 sts. on the right side, then remove the 8 sts. from the machine (move the Cam Box across the needles without yarn). With the Cam Box on the LEFT SIDE, bring 8 needles on the left side into working position, and knit several rows with contrast waste yarn over these needles then remove the sts. from the machine as you did before. Move the Cam Box to the right side and turn the Row Counter back to 62. First, bring all 32 needles back into working position, then work Short Rows. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, put 2 needles into holding position before knitting each of the next 14 rows. After Row 76, bring all the needles back into working position, then bind off the 32 sts. using a separate length of yarn. With the Purl side facing you, hang the 2 sets of 8 sts. held on contrast waste yarn, back onto the machine right


next to one another. Turn the Row Counter back to 62, remove the waste yarn and continue working over the 16 sts. to Row 238, then bind off the 16 sts. Work the second Collar section the same way. After both sections are completed, block them and then weave the two sections together at the center back. Remove waste yarn.

NEW PATTERN SYMBOLS

Readers will notice that some new Symbols have been added to the garment Charts on the Instruction pages of this issue... These symbols also appear on Charts for use with the WHIZ KING Pattern Reader.

Many experienced knitters do not use the written instructions at the side of the charts in KNIT-KING MAGAZINE... they prefer to just follow the Charts... These new Symbols make it easier for them... If you read the written Instructions, you should ignore the Symbols...

A complete explanation of KNITKING Pattern Symbols is given below.



NOTES TO KNIT BY . . .

STITCH AND ROW GAUGE

KNIT A SAMPLE SWATCH . . . before you begin to knit any garment . . . for this is the MOST IMPORTANT STEP toward the correct size and the proper fit of any garment you wish to make. You MUST use the SAME YARN for your sample swatch that you will use to knit your garment and your sample swatch must be knitted large enough and using several different tension numbers on your machine. When you have done this, then you can determine the number of stitches and the number of rows in a two-inch measure. KNITKING MAGAZINE PATTERNS give you 3 tensions to try and one of them should give you the correct stitch and row gauge if you are using the yarn we recommend or a similar weight yarn. Here is the way to make your sample swatch.

Cast on over a sufficient number of needles to produce a swatch at least 4 inches wide. (If the pattern calls for 16 stitches to 2", then 16 x 2 = 32 stitches to cast on). Now knit 4 inches of rows at the first suggested tension number. (If the pattern calls for 22 rows to 2", 22 x 2 = 44 rows to knit). Knit 2 rows using a contrast color, change to the next higher tension and with garment yarn knit another 4", knit 2 rows with contrast color, change to the 3rd higher tension and knit another 4" and then bind off.

Roll the swatch into a cylinder over its length and pull on both ends, unroll it and stretch it diagonally by pulling on the four corners. Allow the swatch to rest and settle (preferably overnight) and then using a stitch gauge or a ruler, count the number of stitches over a 2" width, then the number of rows over a 2" length in EACH of the 3 tensions. Select the tension number that produces the stitches and rows called for in the pattern. If none of them are correct, you are most likely using the wrong weight of yarn.

READING OF CHARTS

You will notice the instructions start at the bottom of the Chart and work UP. Follow the charts exactly as written and providing your sample stitch and row gauge is correct, your garment will come out the right size. Please remember that the section of garment as it is knitted on the machine, faces the same way as the Charts are in this magazine. Where two front pieces are needed, (or any other part of a garment that needs two sections) only one section is normally shown and the second section is usually made with reverse shaping. Set in sleeves are usually identical, but raglan sleeves have to be knitted with reverse shaping for the second sleeve.

READING OF SYMBOLS

To simplify Pattern Knitting, we use Symbols in the Line Drawings and the Chart Diagrams. In the Line Drawings the symbols are shown and are to be read as you look at them while knitting a garment. For instance, if

open darts

a Purl stitch faces you, the Purl stitch Symbol is shown; if a knit stitch faces you (as when using the Ribber) then this Symbol is shown. The Symbol at the top of the Line Drawing is the center of the garment section and you use this as a guide for setting up the needles.

The following Symbols are used for Eyelet Designs in the Line Drawings and also for Full Fashion shaping on the Charts. The Line Drawings have row numbers on the right side. Missing Row numbers are always knitted straight or plain.

In Holding Position Designs selected needles are pushed into holding position for the stated number of rows. The numbers of rows appear at the right of the Line Drawings; Example: 1–4 means knit Rows 1 to 4; 5 to 7 means knit Rows 5 to 7, etc. This same Symbol is also shown on the Charts and is used for putting needles into holding position for Short Rows. The

Symbol on the Charts is used to put needles back into working position when knitting Short Rows.

A number in a box stands for the number of rows to be knitted between shapings. Make shaping first, then knit the necessary number of rows. If for instance it reads:

1 st. 8 x

6 1 st. 10 x

As you will be reading the instructions from the bottom up, here is the way you will follow them: . . . Decrease or increase (depending on the direction of the garment outline) 1 st. at the row where the shaping begins, then knit 8 rows, make the next decrease, then knit 8 rows, until you have decreased (or increased) 1 st. 10 x and you have knitted 8 rows after each decrease (or increase) (1 st. 10 x +8 rows 10 x). Now begin the first decrease (or increase) for the shaping (which has to be made 8 x) in every 6th row. Decrease (or increase) 1 st. first, then knit 6 rows until you have decreased 1 st. 6 x and after each decrease (or increase) have knitted 6 rows (1 st. 8 x + 6 rows 8 x).

Where shapings are given without a boxed number as on most armholes, necklines, etc., make the shapings on every second row (on each side of course).
