General Instructions

THE PRINTED INSTRUCTIONS

Follow the printed instructions or use them in combination with the Charts. Where there is any question in the instructions, you have the Charts to show you how the section will look.

Be sure to READ AHEAD so that you KNOW what to do for the size you are knitting. In the shapings, where the number of stitches are the same but the number of times different, you might find shapings like this...3 sts. 1 x (2x) [3x]—so that for the first size you will bind off 3 sts. 1x, 2nd size 3 sts. 2x, 3rd size 3 sts. 3x. Sometimes the ROWS will be different for each size-so you must watch out for different row numbers.

Shoulder and neck shapings for the back section of a garment usually are shaped at the same time - so ALWAYS WATCH for the words AT THE SAME TIME.

HOLDING STITCHES ON THE LEFT SIDE WHILE SHAPING THE RIGHT SIDE

There are different ways to hold stitches on one side while completing the other side. Usually, we tell you to bind off the center sts, for neck and put the left side into holding position while completing the right side. The easiest way and really the best way for beginners is to take a piece of RAVEL CORD and hand knit the center neck stitches, pulling them back against the needle bed of machine to the "A" or out of work position. The stitches remain in the HOOKS of the needles so you are really only knitting them HALF WAY. With another color of Ravel Cord, knit the remaining sts. on the left side in the SAME WAY.

It is important to protect these held stitches in some way - so you can either hang a REVERSING BAR so that the EYES of the Bar go BETWEEN the Gate Pegs on the machine and that the UPPER TIPS of Bar only-show above the needle bed...OR the simplest way is to use a piece of 1 inch masking tape and GENTLY place it beneath the knitting-right below the gate pegs. Do NOT press the tapeonly enough pressure to hold it in place. This will prevent the Carriage (or Slide)

from marking the held section.

It is VERY IMPORTANT that you mark the PATTERN ROW where you divide for the split for NECK (or SHOULDER) shaping....If you are using a PUNCH CARD-MARK THE CARD-if you are using an ELECTRONIC machine, MARK THE DESIGN WINDOW. Also take note of the Row number for the division. When you are ready to work the left section, bring the HELD stitches back to B (working) position by pulling each end of the Ravel Cord GENTLY and rip it off-be sure to align all needles straight in the B or knitting position.

Now you are ready to REFER TO YOUR OWN INSTRUCTION MANUAL for your machine - to set the controls to begin knitting the left half. The neck stitches can be bound off after completing the right side or you can leave them in hold until each side is finished, then bind them off or remove them onto contrast waste yarn ready to be picked up for knitting a neckband or for other finishing.

FULL FASHION DECREASING OR INCREASING

For Stockinette stitch, use the Full Fashion method for decreasing or increasing (except for regular cap shaping on sleeves where you decrease the edge stitch).

TO DECREASE: Hang the 3rd stitch onto the 2nd stitch then move the end stitches in to fill the empty needle.

TO INCREASE: Move the 2nd end stitches 1 needle outward, then pick up the 3rd stitch from the row below and hang it onto empty needle.

THE SAMPLE SWATCH

Before you knit any garment, you must knit a sample swatch using the yarn you have chosen for your garment. If you do not get the correct Stitch and Row Gauge as given for a Pattern in KNITKING MAGAZINE-try different tensions. If you are using the specified yarn, you should be able to get the correct gauge using one of the tensions shown. If you are using other yarns, you may have to make several swatches-but the gauge is very important.

To make a sample swatch-Cast on 60 stitches with waste yarn and knit 6 rows. Mark the tension number for your sample swatch by making holes (you can do this with a Lace Carriage or by hand), 4 transfers for Tension 4, 6 transfers for


Tension 6, etc. Knit 6 more rows.

Change to garment varn and set Counter at 0. Knit 30 rows (in Stockinette stitch or Pattern stitch-according to the garment). With contrast waste yarn knit the 10th stitch FROM EACH SIDE-by hand. Knit 30 rows. Change to waste yarn and knit 12 rows. Remove the sts. from the machine by pushing the Carriage (or Slide) across without yarn.

Pull and stretch the sample swatch both lengthwise and diagonally from corner to corner, then lengthwise again. Gently block the swatch (KNITKING PRESS-ING CLOTHS are great for this) - or you can allow the sample to rest several

hours or even over night so that the stitches can return to their basic form. USE KNIT-KING CONVERTA TAPE for MEASURING YOUR SAMPLE (or the KNITKING INSTANT STITCH AND ROW GAUGE MEASURE).

If you use the Converta Tape, pull out the Tape to measure BETWEEN the 40 marked stitches in the center of your swatch. Move the red marker on the Tape so that it points to 40 stitches on the TAPE. Your stitch gauge to 2' (5 cm) will show in the RED WINDOW. To find the number of rows in 2" (5 cm), place the



Tape to measure over the 60 rows, push the red marker to 60 on the Tape and your row gauge for 2" (5 cm) will show in the red window.

If you do not own a KNITKING CONVERTA TAPE or a Stitch and Row Measure, you must count the number of stitches and rows to 2" (5 cm) after marking a 2-inch square in the center of your knitting.

FINISHING

Gently block all sections-For PULLOVERS, JACKETS and DRESSES: Join the front to back at shoulders and sides. Sew sleeves together and set in. Hem lower edge and sleeve edges if needed. For a double neckband or armhole, band sew 1 edge to inside and 1 to the outside of neck or armhole. For a single ribbed band, sew 1 edge to the outside of neck or armhole edge. For a cardigan or jacket with buttonholes, finish buttonholes and sew on buttons.

PANTS: Join front to back at sides. Sew inside leg seams, then join to center front and back. Make hem at waistline and insert elastic. Hem lower edge of pants' legs.



All decreasing (or increasing) WITHOUT ROW NUMBER IN BOX must be made on EVERY 2nd ROW.





SLEEVES:

Cast on 80 (90) sts. and work 18 rows K1, P1 Ribbing. Transfer the ribber sts. to main machine and continue in PATTERN with Tension 8.
ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. every 10th row 7x.
After Row 74 (78) ON EACH SIDE leave 6 sts. in Stockinette stitch and continue in Pattern as you did for back and front.
After Row 90 (98), STOP PATTERN. Work Stockinette stitch to Row 100 (108) then bind off LOOSELY.

YARN: Amore



A Zig-Zag Eyelet Design. Punch Card. Bands are Kl, Pl Ribbing.

BACK & FRONT - the same.

Cast on 123 (135) sts. and work 18 rows Kl, Pl Ribbing. Transfer the ribber sts. to main machine and continue in Eyelet Design with Tension 8. Knit to Row 160 (170). Continue in Eyelet Design BUT AT THE SAME TIME, ON EACH SIDE, keep the 21 (23) sts. in Stockinette stitch. After Row 168 (178), bind off 15 (17) sts. Keeping 6 sts. ON EACH SIDE in Stockinette stitch, continue in Pattern to Row 232 (248]. STOP PATTERN. Change Tension to 6 and work 10 rows Stockinette stitch. After Row 242 (258), ON EACH SIDE, bind off k4 (16) sts. Change Tension to 5 and ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. EVERY ROW 9x to Row 252 (268). Knit 1 row Tension 8 then remove the sts. onto contrast waste yarn.

Make second section the same.




ALWAYS knit 2 rows Stockinette stitch before beginning Lace Pattern.

PATTERN:

*LACE CARRIAGE 2 times.
Knit 2 rows.
REPEAT FROM * 4 times more.
** LACE CARRIAGE 4 times.
Knit 2 rows.
REPEAT FROM ** 4 times more.
REPEAT FROM BEGINNING throughout.

FINISHING: See General Instructions. Fold neckband to the inside and sew down in place through the open sts. Remove waste yarn.





BACK & FRONT - the same.

Cast on 123 (135] sts. and work 18 rows KI, Pl Ribbing. Transfer the Ribber sts. to main machine and continue in Eyelet Design with Tension 8. Knit to Row 136 (144) Continue in the Eyelet Design but AT THE SAME TIME, ON EACH SIDE, keep the 21 (23] sts. in Stockinette stitch. After Row 144 (152), ON EACH SIDE, bind off 15 (17] sts. Keeping 6 sts. ON EACH SIDE in Stockinette stitch, continue in Pattern to Row 204 (218). STOP PATTERN. Change tension to 6 and work 10 rows Stockinette stitch. After Row 214 (228) ON EACH SIDE, bind off 14 (16) sts. Change Tension to 5 and ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. EVERY ROW 9x to Row 224 (238). Knit 1 row Tension 8 then remove the sts. onto contrast waste yarn.

Make second section the same.



SLEEVES:

Cast on 80 (90) sts. and work 18 rows Kl, Pl Ribbing. Transfer the ribber sts. to main machine and continue in Pattern with Tension 8. ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. every 18th row 4x. After Row 74 (78) ON EACH SIDE, leave 6 stitches in Stockinette stitch and continue in Pattern as you did for the back and front. After Row 90 (98), STOP PATTERN. Work Stockinette stitch to Row 100 (108). Bind off LOOSELY.

FINISHING:


See General Instructions. Fold neckband to the inside . and sew down in place through the open sts. then remove waste yarn.







Begin to SHAPE ARMHOLE ON EACH SIDE same as the back BUT AT THE SAME TIME, after Row 222 (230) [238], bind off the center 8 sts., put the needles on the left into holding position and complete the right side first. *ON NECK SIDE bind off 2 sts. 2x, 1 st. 3x CONTINUING THE ARMHOLE SHAPING on the right (left for other side). After Row 293 (305) [317], SHAPE NECK: Bind off 5 sts. lx, 2 sts. lx, l st. lx (2x)[3x].After Row 330 (346) [362], SHAPE SHOULDER same as the back. Bring the needles on the left into working position, knit 1 row to the left side (WATCH PATTERN) and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.






OPEN CAST ON with contrast waste yarn - 102 (106) [110] sts.
Knit 9 to 11 rows then 1 row with Ravel Cord to the RIGHT then change to garment yarn and Counter at 0. Knit in Pattern to Row 278 (286) [294]. SHAPE CAP: ON EACH SIDE bind off 5 sts. 1x, 3 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 1x, 1 st. 7x then 1 st. every 4th row 6x (8x) [10x] then 1 st. every 6th row 4x, 1 st. every 4th row 4x, 1 st. 1x, 2 sts. 1x, 3 sts. 1x, 4 sts. 1x.
After Row 370 (386) [402], bind off the remaining sts.




SEW UP SHOULDER SEAMS BEFORE MAKING THE FOLLOWING BANDS. ARMHOLE BAND:

Cast on 126 (134) [142] sts. and work 22 rows Stockinette stitch with Tension 3. Hang the hem, then with knit (wrong) side facing you, hang the edge of armhole onto these needles and bind off LOOSELY. Repeat for other armhole.




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REPEAT THE PUNCH CARD THROUGH ROW 41 then punch 2 rows of holes for connecting card.

SLEEVE BANDS:

Cast on 77 (79) [83] sts. and work 36 rows K1, P1 Ribbing. Transfer the ribber sts. to main machine then hang the open sts. of sleeve onto these needles, doubling every 3rd stitch. Knit 1 loose row then bind off the crochet method.



LEFT SIDE NECKBAND:

Cast on 30 (32) [34] sts. and work 22 rows Stockinette stitch with Tension 3. Hang hem then with knit (wrong side facing you, hang the neck edge from shoulder to front neck onto these needles then bind off LOOSELY.

RIGHT SIDE & BACK NECK BAND:

Cast on 68 (72) [76] sts. and work same as for left side neckband. Hang hem then hang the back neck and right neck edge onto these needles. Bind off LOOSELY.

FRONT OPENING BAND:

Cast on 76 (78) [80] sts. and work same as other bands.

SHOULDER PADS:

Cast on 30 sts. and work Stockinette stitch with SHORT ROWS.
ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARRIAGE,
put into holding position 12 sts.
before knitting the next 2 rows.
ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARRIAGE,
bring back into working position
1 st. 12x ON EACH SIDE.
After Row 26, ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF
CARRIAGE, put into holding position
1 st. 12x ON EACH SIDE.
After Row 52, ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF
CARRIAGE, bring all the needles
back into working position on
the next 2 rows then bind off all
sts.

FINISHING:

Close side and sleeve seams. Set in Sleeves, gathering a bit at top. (See Picture). Make 2 twisted cords using 8 strands of yarn then attach at each front as shown. Close all hem openings. Fold shoulder pads in half and sew to inside shoulders.








3/4" Elastic - about 40" long.

An Argyle Pattern on the front, back and sleeves. Bands are Kl, Pl Ribbing. Use SHORT ROWS for the Pattern (or you can use the Intarsia mthod if you prefer).

BACK:

Cast on 153 (165) [177] sts. with color 1 and work 40 rows K1, P1

Transfer the ribber sts. to main machine and increase 1 st. on the right side.

Continue in Stockinette stitch with

color 1.

After Row 152 (162) [168] MARK YOUR NEEDLE BED AS FOLLOWS: ON THE RIGHT, MARK NEEDLES 55 and 56, *SKIP 20 needles and mark the NEXT 2 NEEDLES. REPEAT FROM * 4x more. Beginning on the RIGHT SIDE, leave 21 (27) [33] needles in working position. Bring the remaining needles into

HOLDING (E) position.

Set machine for holding needles. WORK SHORT ROWS on the left. Bring into holding position 1 st.

9x and be sure to wrap the inside needle in holding position to

prevent a hole.

Break yarn. Leave these needles plus the all needles on the right and the 2 marked needles in holding position.

Mark needles 44 and 45 on the right side,*skip 20 needles and mark the next 2 needles and REPEAT from * across needle bed. Work the Argyle Pattern the same way as you did on front and back, but color 3 will have only half a pattern. See Chart. After Row 142 (148) [154] SHAPE CAP: ON EACH SIDE, bind off 5 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 1x, 1 st. 2x, 1 st. every 11th row 5x, 1 st. every 8th row 2x. After Row 232 (244) [256], bind off or work Short Rows ON EACH SIDE - 4 sts. 1x, 5 sts. 1x, 10 sts. 3x. After Row 242 (254) [266] bind off the remaining sts.









After Row 366 (372) [378], SHAPE CROTCH following the different shapings on each side as shown on the Chart.



After Row 503 (513) [523], work SHORT ROWS: ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARRIAGE, put into holding position 20 sts. 4x (5x) [22 sts. 5x] then 14 sts. 1x, 10 sts. 2x (1x) [1x] then 5 sts. 3x. Bring all the needles into work, knit 1 row then remove the sts. onto contrast waste yarn. Make another section with REVERSE SHAPING.



PANTS WAISTBAND: Make 2.

Cast on 120 (130) [140] sts.
and work 24 rows Stockinette stitch.
Hang the hem, then with wrong side

Make 2 small buttonholes at l edge of belt using sewing machine or you can cut 1 thread, pull out 1 or 2 rows and buttonhole stitch around OR you can crochet loops at edges to fit buttons. Sew buttons to other side.

SIZES: 2 (4) [6] (8)
YARN: Amore
AMOUNT: 4 4 5 5 balls
TENSION: 5
GAUGE: 14 sts. 24 rows = 2" (5 cm)







ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARRIAGE, bring into holding (E) position 5 sts. 8x (6 sts. 8x) [7 sts. 8x] (8 sts. 8x) Then for all sizes 2 sts. 7x. Bring back into working position 2 sts. 7x for all sizes 5 sts. 8x (6 sts. 8x) [7 sts. 8x] (8 sts. 8x) Knit 10 róws.


BACK & FRONT BODICE

Bring 66 (72) [78] (84) needles into working (B) position. With wrong side facing you, hang 1/2 Skirt waist onto these needles. Knit 2 rows.
Transfer every 3rd st. to neighboring needle and leave empty needles in work.

Continue in Lace Pattern to Row 42 (46) [50] (54).
ON EACH SIDE, cast on 25 (27) [29] (31) sts.

NECKBAND

Bring 116 (126) [136] <146) needles into working (B) position. With wrong side facing you, hang the sts. from front and back sections onto these needles, doubling every stich. Knit 10 rows. Make Picot across over every 2nd needle. Knit 10 rows. Hang the hem and bind off loosely.


FINISHING:

Weave the open sts. of skirt together and remove waste yarn. Sew up shoulders and neckband. Single crochet around lower edge of skirt, or you can sew lace onto edge. Single crochet through open sts. for armhole and remove waste knitting.








Remove the center stitch onto strand of yarn (tie to hold) and push empty needle back to A (out of work) position. AT THE SAME TIME, ON EACH SIDE, bind off 5 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 2x, 1 st. 3x. After Row 100, 110, ON EACH SIDE, leave 3 sts. then REMOVE the 4th st. onto strand of yarn as you did before and put empty needles out of work. After Row 113, bind off the center 10 sts., put the needles on the left into holding position and complete the right side first. *ON NECK SIDE, bind off 4 sts. 1x, 2 sts. 2x, 1 st. 4x and after Row 128, SHAPE SHOULDER, bind off 4 sts. 3x. Bring the needles on the left into working position, knit 1 row to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 118 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

Work the BACK the same as the FRONT but OMIT the out of work needles.

SLEEVES:

Cast on 38 sts. and work 20 rows Kl, Pl Ribbing.
Transfer the ribber sts. to main machine and continue in Stockinette stitch.
ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. every 7th row 11x.





After Row 106, remove the center stitch onto strand of yarn and tie to hold. Push empty needle to out of work position (A) SHAPE CAP: ON EACH SIDE, bind off 3 sts. lx, 2 sts. lx l st. 2x, l st. every 6th row 2x BUT AT THE SAME TIME, after Row 116, remove the 4th st. ON EACH SIDE OF CENTER st. onto strand of yarn as you did before and push the empty needles out of work and CONTINUE THE CAP SHAPING ON EACH SIDE.

Decrease 1 st. every 4th row 5x, then 1 st. every 2nd row 1x, 2 sts. 1x, 4 sts. 1x. After Row 152, bind off the remaining stitches.

COLLAR:

Sew up 1 shoulder first.
With wrong side facing you,
hang the neck onto 80 needles
from OPEN shoulder to shoulder.
Knit 22 rows Stockinette stitch.
Bind off LOOSELY. Allow the collar
to curl to the right side.

TASSELS: Make 3.

Cut 10 strands of Angora 8" in length for each tassel. Fold in half and with garment yarn, tie in center of 10 strands then wind yarn about 8x below the fold, approximately I" down. Knot ends and hide under the winding. With Angora and working from the RIGHT SIDE, pick up the stitch held on varn and with crochet hook or latch tool, crochet over each strand of the open stitches (see picture). Attach I tassel to center. REPEAT the Angora crochet for each ladder and attach tassel to each outside trim (see picture).








Cast on 69 (77) [85] sts. with color 1 and work 36 rows K1, P1 Ribbing. Transfer the ribber sts. to main machine and increase 1 st. on the right side. ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. every 5th row 34x (35x) [36x] BUT AT THE SAME TIME, after Row 94 (98) [102], put the CENTER 2 sts. PLUS the remaining sts. on the LEFT into holding position and complete the right side first. Continue the increasing on the right only and work SHORT ROWS ON THE LEFT. ON EVERY 4th row, put into holding position 1 st. 30x (32) [34x]. After Row 214 (226) [238], put the remaining sts. into holding position. Put Row Counter back to 94 (98) [102]. Leave the 2 center sts. plus all needles on the right in holding position and complete the left side. Work the SHORT ROWS same as before and continue the increases on the left. After Row 214 (226) [238], put all but the 2 center sts. into holding position. Work the PUSH BACK SHORT ROWS same way as for front. After Row 214 (226) [238], remove all the sts. onto contrast waste yarn or you can bind them off loosely.

FINISHING: See General Instructions. Close shoulders then set in sleeves to marked edges. Turn under facing and sew in place. SKIRT: Color 1.

With contrast waste yarn, cast on 184 (192) [200] sts. Knit 9 to 11 rows then change to garment yarn and Counter at O. Work Stockinette stitch with Short Rows and be sure to always wrap the inside needle in holding position to prevent a hole. Knit 10 (12) [14] rows Stockinette st. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARRIAGE, put into holding position 10 sts. 1x (all sizes) then 19 (20) [21] sts. 8x. 22 sts. remain in work. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARRIAGE, push back into working position 10 sts. 1x for all sizes, then 19 (20) [21] sts. 8x. Knit 6 rows for all sizes. *ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARRIAGE, put into holding position 102 (110) [118] sts. 1x, then 20 sts. 3x. Push back into working position 10 sts. then 20 sts. 3x, Knit 6 rows over all sts. REPEAT FROM * 3x MORE. Work the A SECTION SHORT ROWS Knit 20 (24) [28] rows over all stitches.

** Work the B SECTION SHORT ROWS.

With WRONG side facing you hang the other end of Motif onto the same needles in FRONT of the latches. (Be sure not to twist the Motif). Pull the front sts. through the back sts. With strand of yarn hanging from Motif, Knit 1 very LOOSE ROW (tension 7 or 8) from right to left then crochet bind off - or you can use the LINKER 8310 to bind off the stitches. Cut waste knitting close to bindoff on all 4 edges then pull out the waste knitting and throw it away. REPEAT for all Motifs. Steam press circle gently. Place 3 motifs together, one point from each Motif touching. With small crochet hook, slip stitch each touching point - going into each point separately using attached yarn. End with slip stitch into first Motif point again. Pull into shape and press again. Add next row of Motifs. If you place all the Motifs on a table you will see how to attach them (See Picture).



FINISHING: Work 1 row single crochet around each section except Hangers. Sew in place as shown. Sew the hangers across Top as shown, folding each in half first.



PRACTICAL KNITTING HINTS

SPECIAL CAST ON EDGE

A beautiful finished cast on edge can be made by casting on with your latch hook tool. It is especially nice if you are using a Lace Design. The method for using this cast-on is in your Instruction Manual. For this particular edge, bring the required needles into 'E' position (holding) and latch tool cast on from LEFT TO RIGHT. Again latch tool cast on over all needles from RIGHT to LEFT and once more from LEFT TO RIGHT. Knit 1 row SLOWLY from right to left. Knit 3 more rows. Carriage is on the RIGHT. Begin any Lace Pattern.

INCREASING OR DECREASING WHEN USING THE RIBBER

l x l INCREASING. - To increase, take the double eyed Ribber Transfer Needle and reach down BELOW the end stitch on the Main Machine, pick up cross thread, skip l needle and place onto next empty Ribber needle. For next increase, pick up cross thread below end ribber needle, skip l needle and place onto next empty Main Machine needle. Continue in this way, working back and forth from Main Machine to Ribber, then Ribber to Main Machine.

1 x 1 DECREASING. - To decrease, With double eyed Ribber Transfer Needle, remove end st. from Main Machine and transfer it to end Ribber needle. For the next decrease, remove end Ribber stitch and transfer it to end needle on Main Machine.

FULL NEEDLE INCREASING. - Using the Ribber Transfor Tool, work in the same way as above but DO NOT skip an empty needle and you must increase on BOTH BEDS. Pick up a stitch from row below on Main Machine and put it onto next empty needle and pick up a stitch from row below on the Ribber and place onto next empty Ribber needle.

TO DECREASE, always transfer end stitch ON EACH BED and place onto inner needle then put empty needles to 'A' (out of work) position.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS WHEN USING THE ELECTRIC CARRIAGES - KG 88 or KG 89

STOCKINETTE STITCH: - Normally, when knitting on the machine the PURL SIDE ALWAYS FACES YOU. However, when using the Electric Carriages - for the KH 910 or the KH 891 WITHOUT a Mylar Sheet or a Punch Card, the KNIT SIDE will ALWAYS FACE YOU.

When you want the PURL SIDE TO FACE YOU (for 910 machine only) read the BLANK SPACES (only 1 spot) on the Mylar sheet. See Pattern No. 426 in this issue. You can also have the PURL SIDE facing you without using the Mylar sheet. The 910 machine must be turned ON then PUSH UP THE NO. 6 BUTTON.

FOR THE KH 891, Set the Punch Card on any BLANK LINE (NO HOLES PUNCHED) then set the CARD ON STOP and leave it there.

K1, P1 RIBBING on the KH 910: - When you want K1, P1 Ribbing, MAKE ONLY 1 DOT on the Mylar Sheet (any place) then READ THE DOT PLUS A BLANK SPACE.
