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Only when it is your business that suffers from a fire, do you realize how devastating and far reaching its affect can be. The fire at KNITKING on Sunday, June 22nd ruined the Shipping and Receiving Department and our major warehouse plus the KNITKING MAGAZINE Design and Production Department. Many garments planned for future editions were destroyed and have to be re-made. Much of the written material suffered water damage and is no longer legible.

We are rapidly rebuilding the burned out structure and by the time you receive this magazine, we will have resumed our normal hectic pace. In the meantime...we apologize for the delay in getting this Edition to you. Incidentally, we hope you will agree that it is truly outstanding.

Our last issue, Volume 20 #3, should have been delivered to us by the printer on June 20th...this was one occasion when we did not complain about its late arrival. Had it been on our premises on the 22nd, it would definitely have been burned to a crisp in our Shipping Department. It arrived two days after the fire and was on its way to you a day later.

Our first shipment of these remarkable machines arrived a month after the fire...We unloaded them on to our parking lot where previously prepared labels were attached and where U.P.S. trucks arrived at pre-arranged intervals to haul them off to ecstatic customers, many of whom have since communicated their excitement and enthusiasm directly to us.

It functions on all KNITKING machines with Ribbers from the KH 830 through the COMPUKNIT III including, of course, the KH 260 with KR 260 Ribber.

Don't pass this one up... A completely coordinated three piece outfit to wear and wear. Make it on any standard machine in Stockinette stitch with Ribber. The pants are straight legged. Knit in your own initials on the front of pullover. Be sure to use our Venetia yarn.



Knit this stunning two piece Dress in Stockinette stitch. It is beautifully designed and has the softness women love. Pleats at shoulder and perky bows for a designer touch. Venetia is the yarn.



Turn on your Garter Carriage for this one and you can take off for the day. You will be delighted with a soft and flattering Dress that is very easy to knit. The yarn is called ICE CREAM and it is soft and smooth.



A two piece Dress to brighten your wardrobe has single Motif Flowers on the pretty Top. Knit it on your Electronic machine. The ribbed Skirt is made using the Garter Carriage. Venetia and Angora with a small amount of Isabella for the leaves.

Wherever you go, eyes will turn when you are wearing this Smart Dress. The surplice front bodice, the shoulder pleats lifted softly with pads make for gracious dressing. It is knitted in Stockinette stitch with Venetia.



Brilliant stain glass colors are selected for knitting a glorious Butterfly Motif for this special Pullover. You can make it on any Electronic Machine with Venetia and Isabella.

#### THE PRINTED INSTRUCTIONS

Follow the printed instructions or use them in combination with the Charts. Where there is any question in the instructions, you have the Charts to show you how the section will look

Be sure to READ AHEAD so that you KNOW what to do for the size you are knitting. In the shapings, where the number of stitches are the same but the number of times different, you might find shapings like this ... 3 sts. 1 x (2x) [3x]-so that for the first size you will bind off 3 sts. 1x, 2nd size 3 sts. 2x, 3rd size 3 sts. 3x. Sometimes the ROWS will be different for each size-so you must watch out for different row numbers.

Shoulder and neck shapings for the back section of a garment usually are shaped at the same time-so ALWAYS WATCH for the words AT THE SAME TIME.

#### HOLDING STITCHES ON THE LEFT SIDE WHILE SHAPING THE RIGHT SIDE

There are different ways to hold stitches on one side while completing the other side. Usually, we tell you to bind off the center sts. for neck and put the left side into holding position while completing the right side. The easiest way and really the best way for beginners is to take a piece of RAVEL CORD and hand knit the center neck stitches, pulling them back against the needle bed of machine to the "A" or out of work position. The stitches remain in the HOOKS of the needles so you are really only knitting them HALF WAY. With another color of Ravel Cord, knit the remaining sts. on the left side in the SAME WAY.

It is important to protect these held stitches in some way-so you can either hang a REVERSING BAR so that the EYES of the Bar go BETWEEN the Gate Pegs on the machine and that the UPPER TIPS of Bar only-show above the needle bed...OR the simplest way is to use a piece of 1 inch masking tape and GENTLY place it beneath the knitting-right below the gate pegs. Do NOT press the tapeonly enough pressure to hold it in place. This will prevent the Carriage (or Slide) from marking the held section.

It is VERY IMPORTANT that you mark the PATTERN ROW where you divide for the split for NECK (or SHOULDER) shaping .... If you are using a PUNCH CARD-MARK THE CARD-if you are using an ELECTRONIC machine, MARK THE DESIGN WINDOW. Also take note of the Row number for the division. When you are ready to work the left section, bring the HELD stitches back to B (working) position by pulling each end of the Ravel Cord GENTLY and rip it off-be sure to align all needles straight in the B or knitting position.

Now you are ready to REFER TO YOUR OWN INSTRUCTION MANUAL for your machine-to set the controls to begin knitting the left half. The neck stitches can be bound off after completing the right side or you can leave them in hold until each side is finished, then bind them off or remove them onto contrast waste yarn ready to be picked up for knitting a neckband or for other finishing.

#### FULL FASHION DECREASING OR INCREASING

For Stockinette stitch, use the Full Fashion method for decreasing or increasing (except for regular cap shaping on sleeves where you decrease the edge stitch).

TO DECREASE: Hang the 3rd stitch onto the 2nd stitch then move the end stitches in to fill the empty needle.

TO-INGREASE: Move the 2nd end stitches 1 needle outward, then pick up the 3rd stitch from the row below and hang it onto empty needle.

#### THE SAMPLE SWATCH

Before you knit any garment, you must knit a sample swatch using the yarn you have chosen for your garment. If you do not get the correct Stitch and Row Gauge as given for a Pattern in KNITKING MAGAZINE-try different tensions. If you are using the specified yarn, you should be able to get the correct gauge using a smaller or larger tension. If you are using a different yarn, you may have to make several swatches-but the gauge is very important.

To make a sample swatch-Cast on 60 stitches with waste yarn and knit 6 rows. Mark the tension number for your sample swatch by making holes (you can do this with a Lace Carriage or by hand), 4 transfers for Tension 4, 6 transfers for Tension 6, etc. Knit 6 more rows.

Change to garment yarn and set Counter at 0. Knit 30 rows (in Stockinette stitch or Pattern stitch-according to the garment). With Contrast waste yarn knit the 10th stitch FROM EACH SIDE-by hand. Knit 30 rows. Change to waste varn and knit 12 rows. Remove the sts. from the machine by pushing the Carriage (or Slide) across without varn.

Pull and stretch the sample swatch both lengthwise and diagonally from corner to corner, then lengthwise again. Gently block the swatch (KNITKING PRESSING CLOTHS are great for this)-or you can allow the sample to rest

several hours or even over night so that the stitches can return to their basic form. THE KNITKING STITCH/ROW GAUGE and STITCH/ROW CALCULATOR can be used to find the NUMBER OF STITCHES or ROWS TO 1 INCH.

The KNITKING STITCH/ ROW GAUGE will give you the NUMBER OF STITCHES or ROWS to 1 inch. After knitting a sample swatch by following our instructions, place the STITCH/ROW GAUGE horizontally with the START LINE on the INSIDE of LEFT stitch mark on sample.

Keep it straight then read the number on the Gauge directly below the inside RIGHT mark on Gauge. This will give you the STITCH GAUGE TO 1 INCH. For instance, if the number is 8, then you have 8 stitches to 1 INCH. To find the ROWS TO 1 INCH, measure from the first row of garment yarn, VERTICALLY to the last row. Read the NUMBER from the LOWER EDGE of GAUGE same as you did for stitches and if the number should be 14, you have 14 rows to 1 inch.

The STITCH/ROW CALCULATOR will now give you the number of sts. or rows needed for a specific measurement. Line the ARROW to the number 8 (8 sts. to 1 inch) and should you need 20 inches of stitches, find the number 20 below and right above the 20 the Calculator shows 160 sts. It works the same way for rows using the Row Gauge.

#### FINISHING

Gently block all sections-For PULLOVERS, JACKETS and DRESSES: Join the front to back at shoulders and sides. Sew sleeves together and set in. Hem lower edge and sleeve edges if needed. For a double neckband or armhole, band sew 1 edge to inside and 1 to the outside of neck or armhole. For a single ribbed band, sew 1 edge to the outside of neck or armhole edge. For a cardigan or jacket with buttonholes, finish buttonholes and sew on buttons.

PANTS: Join front to back at sides. Sew inside leg seams, then join to center front and back. Make hem at waistline and insert elastic. Hem lower edge of pants' legs.

The number in the box is the number of Rows between shapings. The 3 x 1 4 above the box gives you the sts. and number of times to make the decreases (or increases) - FOR EXAMPLE: 3 x 1 over the box with 4 means-At the given Row number, #decrease 1 st. knit 4 rows# and REPEAT from \* to \* 2 times more for a total of 3 times in all. All decreasing (or increasing) WITHOUT ROW NUMBER IN BOX must be made on EVERY 2nd ROW.

Make on any Electronic Machine. The borders are Fair Isle Design. The Butterfly is a Single Motif and is made in two sections. Follow Charts for pattern placement and setting. BACK:

With W.Y. cast on 140 (148) sts. Knit several rows ending 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. With Col. 1 knit 4 (6) rows, setting Pattern on last row. With Col. 1 and Col. 2, begin Pat. 1. After R 74 (76), with Col. 1, knit & (8) R. After R 80 (84) bring all Ndls. to HP. Begin Short Row increases. ON THE RIGHT, push back into working position, 4 sts. 35 (37)x. ALWAYS wrap inside needle to prevent holes. AT THE SAME TIME, after Row 130 (134), mark for neck opening. After R 210 (218) begin Short Row Decreases. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of Carr. bring to HP 4 sts. EOR 35 (37)x. AT THE SAME TIME, after R 230 (242), mark for Neck Opening. After R 285 (299) set for Pat. 1. (Note that Reflection Switch has different setting. TRUE REFLECTION: On 910 Machine Switch is in UPPER position. After READY LIGHT appears, PRESS ORANGE CE BUTTON then enter the last row number of Pat. on the Mylar Sheet (In this Case 70). PRESS CF BUTTON. After Row 356 (370), change to Col. 1 only and knit 4 (6) rows. Remove onto W.Y.

FRONT PANEL: Right Side.

With W.Y. cast on 140 (148) sts. Work the waste knitting with 1 Row Ravel Cord to the right same as you did for the back. Knit in Pat. 1 with color 1 & 2 same as you did for the BACK. to R 80 (84). BIND OFF LOOSELY.

FRONT PANEL: Left Side

With W.Y. cast on 140 (148) sts. Work the waste knitting same as Back ending 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. Bring all Ndls. to HP. Using 'e' method, cast on over these Ndles. with color 1. Knit 4 (6) rows setting Pat. on last row. Using TRUE REFLECTION SETTING same as BACK. With col. 1 & 2, knit to Row 80 (84). REMOVE ON WASTE YARN.

BUTTERFLY: Front Right Side.

USE NDLS. 1 to 28 (30) to the RIGHT OF 0. With W.Y. cast on 28 (30)sts. Work the waste knitting same as before ending with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. With Col. 1, knit to Row 36 (42) setting Pat. 2 on last row. With Col.1& 3, knit in Pattern. AT THE SAME TIME, on the RIGHT SIDE, increase 1 st. every 6th row 36 (38)x. After R 124 (130), begin Neck decreases. Dec. 1 st. every 3rd Row 34 (36)x. After Row 226 (238), bind off the remaining sts.







BUTTERFLY: Front Left Side.

Using Ndls. 28 (30) to the LEFT of 0, make same as right side, being sure to follow Chart and REVERSE ALL SHAPINGS.

WAISTBAND: Make 2, REVERSE 2.

With W.Y. cast on 80 (90) sts. Work the waste knitting same as before ending with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. With Col. 1, knit 4 Rows, setting Fair Isle Pattern 1 on last row AND BE SURE TO NOTE THE SET LINE FOR THIS SECTION IS ON Row 30. SEE CHART. After Row 48, remove onto W.Y. Make 1 more band the same as above, then make 2 reversing the Pattern (SEE CHART).



#### FINISHING:

Join Waistbands A & B together following diagram. Join the 2 sections of Butterfly down the center. Join Front Side Panels to sides of Butterfly.

Bring to WP 160 (180) Ndls. With right side facing, pick up open sts. of Waistband. With wrong side facing, hang lower edge of Front/ Back onto these Ndls. Bind off. Close side seams. With 1 strand Col. 1, work 1 row slip stitch Crochet around neck edge then work 1 row with 1 strand Col. 3. With Col. 1, work 2 rows slip st. Crochet around lower edge. Make a small chain for Butterfly Antenna with color 3 and sew in place (see Picture).

made on any Standard Machine. Skirt is TUCK PAT. Make it on any Punch Card machine. The Skirt is knitted sideways on machine using Color Changer. The Purl side of Skirt is the right side. Punch Card. 9 Covered Buttons. Elastic for Skirt waist.

SKIRT: Knitted Sideways.

With W.Y. cast on 188 (194 ) [200] sts. Knit several rows ending with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. Counter 0, change to Col. 1. Knit St. st. After R 100, Set TUCK PAT and knit to R 496 (538) [582] being sure to NOT COLOR CHANGES AS SHOWN ON LEFT SIDE OF PUNCH CARD AND AT THE SAME TIME, on the LEFT EDGE, mark for waist after Rows 297 (319) [341]. Change to Col. 1 and continue in St. st. After R 596 (638) [682] Set Punch Card on 1 and continue in TUCK PAT. After R 992 (1076) [1164], pick up first row of St. held on W.Y. Knit 1 row tihe color 1 across all Ndls. Bind off.

#### SKIRT WAISTBAND (Knit side) Make 2.

Bring to WP 148 (160) [172] Ndls. Using markers on Chart as guide, and with knit side facing you, hang the TUCK STITCH PROTIONS of 1/2 Skirt waist onto these Ndls. (DO NOT HANG the Stockinette section (this is for pleat). When the Tuck sections are on machine, make INVERTED PLEAT on stockinette section (to the right side) and hang the sts. onto the Ndls. Bring all Ndls. to HP. With Col. 1, 'e' cast on behind the latches. Carefully knit 1 row over all Ndls. Continue in St. st. BUT AT THE SAME TIME, ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. every 8th row 8x. After R 63 (Carr on left), knit 1 Row T 10 to the right. Continue in St. St. (T 3) to Row 100. Pick up the sts. from loose row (T 10) to form hem. Bind off LOOSELY. REPEAT FOR SECOND HALF OF SKIRT.







#### BLOUSE FRONT:

With W.Y. cast on 98 (100) [102] sts. After several rows end with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. Change to Col. 1. Counter 0. Continue St. st. BUT AT THE SAME TIME, ON THE LEFT, inc. 1 st. EOR 49 (50) [51]x. After R 99 (101) [103], ON THE LEFT, cast on 39 (43) [47] sts. (See Chart). After R 196 (200) [208] ON NECK SIDE, dec. 1 st. EOR 19 (20) [21]x. After R 262 (270) [280], mark both ends for center of garment. After R 292 (300) [312], ON NECK SIDE, inc. 1 st. EOR 19 (20) [21]x. After R 425 (441) [457], ON LEFT SIDE, bind off 39 (43) [47] sts. then on EOR dec. 1 st. 49 (50) [51]x. After R 524 (542) [560], bind off.

#### BLOUSE BACK: Make 1, reverse 1

Cast on same as front and knit to R 196 (200) [208]. SHAPE NECK: Dec. 1 st. EVERY ROW 62 (66) [70]x. After R 260 (268) [280], bind off remaining sts.

#### SLEEVE BANDS: Make 2.

CLOSE BOTH SHOULDERS FIRST K1, P1 Rib: With Col. 1, cast on 97 (99) [101] sts. Knit 36 rows. Transfer Rib sts. to MB. Pick up sts. of first row to form hem. With WRONG SIDE FACING, hang open sts. of sleeve, doubling sts. across. Bind off LOOSELY. REPEAT for other sleeve.



#### BLOUSE WAIST BAND: Make 2.

K1, P1 Rib: Cast on 151 (159) [167] sts. Knit 100 rows. Transfer Rib sts. to MB. Pick up first row to form hem (same as sleeve band). Close side seams of Blouse. With wrong side facing, hang 1/2 of waist edge onto these Ndls. (Waistbands join at center front). REPEAT for second band.

#### BACK BANDS: Make 2, one without Buttonholes.

W.Y. Cast on 147 (150) [153] sts. After several rows, end with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. Change to Col. 1. Counter 0. Knit St. st. to R 10. Make BUTTON-HOLES (See Chart for Needle selection and distance between buttonholes). Knit to R 30. REPEAT BUTTONHOLES over same Ndls as before. After R 40, hang hem. With Wrong side Facing hang lower section of back opening onto these Ndls.Plus the edge of the Waist Band. (On chart this is section Marked 124 (127)[130] ). Bind off loosely. Repeat for other side of back opening.

#### COLLAR: Make 1

W.Y. cast on 174 (182) [190] sts. After several rows end with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. Counter 0, change to Col. 1. Knit St. st. AND ON EACH SIDE, inc. 1 st. every 8th row 5x. After R 40, ON EACH SIDE, dec. 1 st. every 8th row 5x. After R 80, pick up first row to form hem. Mark the center 52 (56) [60] sts. with W.Y. (See Chart). With wrong side facing, hang neck edge of Blouse onto these Ndls. Be sure the marked sts. meet at the shoulder seam. Bind off.

#### FINISHING:

See General Instructions. Insert Elastic thru casing at skirt waist. Make hem at lower edge of Skirt. On the right side, close inverted pleats to approximately 9 inches from lower edge. Sew on Buttons and finish buttonholes.



#### SLEEVES:

K1, P1 Rib: Cast on 71 (77) sts. After R 44, transfer Rib sts. to MB. Add 1 st. on right. ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. every 4th row 37 (38)x. After R 196 (200) mark center with W.Y. and bind off.

#### FINISHING:

Join bands marked (1) on Charts together. Join bands marked (2) on Charts together (SEE PICTURE). Fold 10 sts. from 24 st. strip to the inside to form hem. After joining pieces, attach longer section to the right side of V Neckline. Attach the SHORTER section to the LEFT side of V Neckline. Join shoulders. Fold Neck Facing to the inside and secure. Join sleeves. Close side seams. Insert thread through neck opening for a firm edge and to prevent sag.

After R 510 (526), transfer rib sts. to MB. Bind off.





#### SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR LACE JACKET

One complete Pattern ends on R 60 of the Card - so STOP the Card. Then completes 20 (22) rows of St. st. Before starting next Lace Pattern, manually advace Card to Line 1. REPEAT THROUGHOUT.

LACE JACKET - Make 1, reverse 1.

Knitted sideways on the machine. With W.Y. cast on 179 (185) sts. After several rows end with 1 row Ravel Cord to the RIGHT. Counter 0, change to Col. 2. Knit 10 (12) rows St. st. then continue in Lace Pattern. After R 20 (22), SHAPE NECK ON THE RIGHT. Inc. 1 st. EOR 15 (16)×. Continue in Lace Pattern. After R 118 (126), ON THE RIGHT LOOSELY BIND OFF 95 (100) sts. then from LEFT to RIGHT 'e' cast on over the same empty Ndls.the 95 (100) sts. Bring these Ndls. to E position and CAREFULLY knit the next row. Hang a cast on Comb or some type of weight on these new sts and continue in Lace Pat. After R 186 (198), ON THE RIGHT, DECREASE 2 STS. EVERY ROW 50 (54)x. After R 236 (252), bind off LOOSELY. Make 2nd section with REVERSE SHAPING.

#### SLEEVES:

With W.Y. cast on 190 (200) sts. After several rows end with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. Counter 0, change to Col. 2 Knit 2 rows then begin Lace Pat. Knit to R 184 (190). MARK CENTER OF SLEEVE, then remove onto W.Y.

#### SLEEVE TRIM: MAKE 2 COL. 4

With W.Y. cast on 190 (200) sts. same as you did for sleeves. After Ravel Cord row, change to Col 4. Counter 0. Continue in St. st. to R 40. Pick up the first row to form hem. Carefully remove W.Y. Knit 1 row over doubled sts. Bind off LOOSELY BEHIND THE GATE PEGS.(MARK CENTER)

#### SLEEVE TRIM: MAKE 2 Col. 3

With W.Y. cast on 170 (180) sts. same as you did for Col. 4 trim. Change to Col. 3 and knit 80 rows St. st. Pick up first row to form hem and complete same as for Col. 4 Trim.



With W.Y. cast on 150 (160) sts. same as other trims. With Col 1, Knit to R 120. Pick up first row to form Hem and complete same as other trims.





LOWER BANDS FOR JACKET: Make 2. FNR: Cast on 140 (150) sts. with Col. 2. Knit 40 rows. Transfer Rib sts. to MB. With wrong side facing, hang lower edge of 1 section of Jacket onto these Ndls. (Jacket is joined at center back). Bind off. REPEAT for 2nd section).

FNR: With Col. 2, cast on 186 (200) sts. After selvedge, knit to R 20. Transfer Rib sts. to MB. Remove on W.Y.

#### FINISHING:

Weave the 2 sections of Jacket down the center back. Close both shoulders. With RIGHT SIDE FACING, start at

shoulder seam and hang 1/2 of sleeve opening onto 95 (100) Ndls. then hang 1/2 of Col 4 Sleeve Trim onto these same Ndls. Take Col 3 Sleeve Trim, locate center and again starting at Shoulder, hang the sts. onto Ndls in the same way. Take Col. 1 Sleeve trim and locate the center and hang onto Ndls same as before. You now have several layers of knitting ALL on the same Ndls. The Carriage WILL NOT BE ABLE to knit across, SO CAREFULLY knit 1 row manually. (Bring Ndls. to E position,hook yarn over needle hook and push back to B position - Knit each st. in this way After knitting the row manually. With WRONG SIDE FACING, hang 1/2 of TOP EDGE of Sleeve onto the same Ndls. Bind off LOOSELY. Bring 95 (100) Ndls. to WP and REPEAT ENTIRE PROCEDURE to attach second half of sleeve trim and sleeve. Follow General Instructions for the remainder of the finishing.

Ribber. Entire Dress is knitted in FULL NEEDLE RIBBING.

BACK:

FNR: Cast on 142 (150) [158] sts. After completing selvedge with T 4/4 II knit 10 rows. Change to T 3/3 I. ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. every 50 rows 3x. After R 240 (246) [252], ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. every 6th row 5x. After R 276 (282) [288], ON EACH SIDE, INCREASE 1 st. every 6th row 5x. After R 364 (370) [376], mark each side with W.Y. for setting in sleeves.. After R 458 (470) [482] transfer the Ribber sts. to MB. Mark each side for Neck then bind off. Work the front same as back to R 430 (440) [450]. Bind off the center 38 (42) [46] sts. (Transfer to MB first, then bind off). Put Ndls. on left into HP and complete the right side first. \*Knit to R458 (470) [482]. Transfer the Ribber sts. to MB and bind off. Bring Ndls. on left to WP Turn Row Counter back to 430 (440) [450] and complete left half. Follow Instructions from \*.

FRONT:











#### SLEEVES: Gauge 14 STs 22 R=2"

With W.Y. cast on 100 (108) sts. the same as for front/back. After Ravel Cord row, change to garment yarn. Counter U. Knit 2 rows, then begin Pattern 2. ON EACH SIDE, inc. 1 st. every 20 rows 7x. After R 150 (154) SHAPE CAP: SEE CHART FOR DECREASES IN YOUR SIZE. NOTE: also that right side differs from left. After R 220 (228), bind off remaining sts.

#### CUFF: Make 2.

With W.Y. cast on 56 (62) sts. the same as for front/back. After Ravel Cord row, change to garment yarn. Counter 0. Knit 2 rows, then begin Pattern 1. After R 20, with wrong side facing, hang the open sts. of sleeve onto these Ndls. decreasing evenly across. Knit 1 row then bind off.

SKIRT: Knitted Sideways.

With W.Y. cast on 185 (192) sts. Knit several rows ending with 1 Row Ravel Cord to the right. Change to garment yarn. Counter 0. Knit 6 rows. Carriage on right. \*WORK SHORT ROWS: ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARR. Bring to HP 10 (17) sts. Knit 2 rows (remember to always wrap inside Ndl. to prevent a hole when working Short Rows). ON EVERY 2nd ROW, bring to HP, 20 sts. 5x, 30 sts. 2x. 15 sts. 1x. Bring all Ndls. to working position and knit 14 rows. REPEAT FROM \* 25 (26) × MORE AND END WITH 7 rows Stockinette st. over all Ndls. Remove onto W.Y. Steam the edges of waste knitting carefully, then weave the open sts. together.

#### WAIST BAND: Make 2. T3

Cast on 120 (128) sts. (Use Cast on Comb if you have one) or W.Y. With garment yarn, knit 32 rows St. st. Hang hem. With wrong side facing, hang HALF OF SKIRT WAIST onto these needle decreasing evenly across. Bind off LOOSELY. Repeat for 2nd half of skirt.

#### FINISHING:

See General Instructions. Crochet around Neck opening and bottom edge of Top. Crochet around Skirt bottom edge and lower edge of Top.

Made on the KH 910 with Garter Carriage KG 88. You can use your REGULAR CARRIAGE for ALL STOCKINETTE STITCH. Waistband K1, P1 Ribbing. Lower edge, neck and sleeve bands are all Seed Stitch using KG 88.

IMPORTANT: There are two sets of numbers shown on the Charts. The INSIDE NUMBERS are for setting the GARTER CARRIAGE and the OUTSIDE NUMBERS for the number of rows SHOWN ON THE MACHINE ROW COUNTER.

#### SKIRT BACK:

'e' cast on 168 (178) [184] sts. Knit 2 rows Stockinette stitch with Tension 3. With KG 88 Garter Carriage and Ten. 1.1, work 16 rows SEED ST. With REGULAR CARRIAGE, continue in Stockinette st - Ten. 4.2. After Row 270 (280) [290] remove onto W.Y.

#### SKIRT FRONT:

Work the FRONT the same as the back, completing the 16 rows SEED ST. (Row 18). Begin PATTERN. WORK 42 ROWS PATTERN 1. Ten. 6 108 ROWS PATTERN 2. 96 ROWS PATTERN 3. After R 264 - continue in St. st. to Row 270 (280) [290]. Remove the sts. onto W.Y.

#### BELT:

'e' cast on 5 sts. Set machine for knitting a cord - Ten. 5. Knit a cord approximately 60" long then bind off. Make TASSEL by winding yarn around 6" cardboard then cut 1 end and tie at other end. (See Picture). Make a 2nd cord and tie tassel at each end of cord.



FRONT BODICE:

Bring 140 (148) [156] Ndls. into B (working) position. Hang the FRONT SKIRT onto these Ndls. DOUBLING every 5th & 6th st. on one Ndl. Knit 1 row LEFT TO RIGHT in Stockinette st. THEN SET G CARRIAGE COUNTER for 30 rows K1, P1 Ribbing Tension 1.1. Change to Ten. 6 and work 6 (10) [14] rows Stockinette st. AT THE SAME TIME, WORK THE INCREASES ON EACH SIDE AS SHOWN ON THE CHART. After Row 36 (40 [44], BEGIN PATTERN 4 4 for 96 rows.



#### BACK NECKBAND:

Bring 72 (76) [80] Ndls to WP. Pick up the open sts. held on waste yarn across the neck with wrong side facing you. Remove the waste yarn. Work SEED STITCH changing the tensions every 2 rows as follows and AT THE SAME TIME, ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. every 2nd row 5x.

Work 2 rows each - Ten. 3.1, 3, 2.2, 2.1, then 4 rows Ten. 2. After Row 12, use the GARTER CARRIAGE with Tension 10 and bind off.

When Pattern is completed, change to Regular Carriage and Ten. 4.2 and continue in Stockinette st. After R 152 (162) [172], SHAPE NECK: USE SHORT ROWS FOR SHAPING NECK AND SHOULDERS. Put the center 32 (36) [40] sts. and all sts. on the left of these into holding position and complete the right side first. \*ON NECK SIDE, SHORT ROW 3 sts. 3x, 2 sts. 2x, 1 st. 7x AND AT THE SAME TIME after R 161 (173) [185] SHORT ROW SHOULDER by holding the sts. for YOUR SIZE as shown on the Chart. After R 180 (192) [204], knit 1 row OVER THE SHOULDER STS. ONLY then remove them onto W.Y. LEAVE THE CENTER NECK PLUS ALL STS. ON THE RIGHT IN HP. Attach yarn on the right of remaining sts. Knit 1 row to the left then turn the Row Counter back to 152 (172) [182] and complete the left half following the instructions from \*



#### BACK BODICE:

Work the back the same as the front OMITTING THE DESIGN. After R 162 (174) [186], SHAPE SHOULDER ON EACH SIDE using SHORT ROWS same as you did for the front BUT AT THE SAME TIME, after R 168 (180) [192], work the NECK SHAPING USING SHORT ROWS as you did for the front by following the Chart shaping for your size.

Begin with Ndl. 5 on the RIGHT of 0 and with W.Y. cast on 78 (83) sts. same as you did for back. End with Ravel Cord to the LEFT. Work the SHORT ROWS ON THE RIGHT SIDE ONLY same as front and work the increases on the RIGHT. After R 93, Put these sts. into HP (or remove them onto W.Y. if you prefer). Leave 4 empty Ndls. to the LEFT of 0 and with W.Y. cast on 78 (83) sts. to the left of the empty Ndls. After waste knitting end with 1 row Ravel Cord to the RIGHT. Work the SHORT ROWS ON THE LEFT SIDE ONLY same as front and work the increases on the LEFT.

After R 93, 'e' cast on over the center 8 empty needles. Bring all needles to WP (or if you removed the right section on W.Y. hang the sts. back onto the machine. You can use an 8 st. cast on rag for the 8 center sts. or if you cast them on, be sure to bring them to E position for several rows so they will knit off. Hang a small weight in the center of knitting. Counter 93, Carriage on left. Work over all sts. and complete same as the front. After R 300 (312), remove onto W.Y. (MARK CENTER).

#### SKIRT FRONT: Omit Slit.

With W.Y. cast on 164 (174) sts. Knit several rows ending with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. Change to Garment yarn. Counter 0. Work St. st. and Short Rows. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARR. bring to HP 48 sts. before knitting next 2 rows (be sure to always wrap inside Ndl. to prevent hole when knitting short rows). ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARR. push back to WP 16 sts. then 32 sts. ON EACH SIDE. Continue over all Ndls. in St.st. ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. every 10th row 10x. After R 260 (272), ON EACH SIDE, dec. 1 st. every 8th row 5x. After R 300. (312), remove on W.Y.



FINISHING: See General Instructions. Make Bows and attach (See Photo for placement). The front section of Jacket is pleated at shoulders (make 2 pleats on each side, evenly spaced). Pattern is repeated throughout entire dress. START G.C. and knit 48 rows. At Row 52, change Tension. Set G.C. to 52 and continue to FOLLOW CHART for balance of front. but AT THE SAME TIME, after R 230 (240) (regular Counter), mark EACH SIDE with W.Y. for waist. After R 308 (322), ON EACH SIDE bind off 26 sts for armhole. After R 338 (358) bind off the center 42 (48) sts. With a RAVEL CORD, knit the sts. on LEFT back to 'A' position, then complete the right side first. After R 380 (400), bind off. Carefully bring Ndls. on left back to WP and remove Ravel Cord. Turn Row Counter back to 338 (358) and complete left half.

BACK:

Work the same as Front to R 372 (392). Bind off the center 42 (48) sts. With Ravel Cord, knit the sts. on the left back to 'A' position and complete same as Front. After R 380 (400), bind off. Continue same as front.



SLEEVES:

'e' cast on 104 (112) sts. Follow the Chart for Tension changes and after R 148 (162) remove on W.Y. Bring 88 (94) Ndls. to WP. Hang open sts. of sleeve onto these Ndls. decreasing evenly across. Knit 1 row over all Ndls. (with Regular Carriage if desired.) With T 5 and G.C. knit 10 rows Garter Stitch. Bind off.



NECK BANDS: Make 2 Garter Stitch. T 5. With wrong side facing, pick up 42 (48) sts. along front neck. (Be sure to pick up the WHOLE bind off st). Knit 12 rows Garter Stitch. Bind off. REPEAT FOR BACK NECK EDGE.

> SIDE NECK BANDS: Make 2 Garter Stitch. T 5 Bring 42 Ndls. to WP. Pick up sts. along side neck edge. Knit 12 rows Garter St. Bind off

> > BELT: Make 2.Garter St. T 5.

Bring 94 Ndls. to holding position and with garment yarn, CROCHET CAST ON BEHIND THE LATCHES. Push the Ndls carefully into working position. Knit 12 rows Garter St. Bind off. Sew 2 short ends together. Fold other ends over to form point and slip stitch in place.



FINISHING:

See General Instructions. To finish Neckbands, Mitre each corner on the wrong side and sew with matching thread. Open the seam and press flat.





MENS SWEATER (42/44)SIZES: 38/40 VARN . Roma AMOUNT : Col. 1 10 oz. 11 oz. Col. 2 10 oz. 11 oz.

BACK: Make 2 Side Panels

With W.Y. cast on 65 (70) sts. After several rows end with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. Counter 0, change to Col. Knit St. st. to Row 40 (42) Change to Col. 3. Knit 2 rows. Change to Col.1 and continue in St. st. to Row 82 (86) setting Fair Isle Pattern before knitting last row. Knit to R 122 (128). Stop Fair

Isle Pat. With Col 1, knit 2 rows St. st, setting Pat on 2nd row. Continue in Pattern changing colors as shown on Chart.

AT THE SAME TIME, after R 138 (142) mark each side for setting in sleeves.

After R 164 (172), cancel Pattern and with Col. 1, knit to R 202 (214). Change to Col. 3, knit 2 rows. Continue to follow Chart to Row 246 (258).Bind off or remove on W.Y.

#### BACK: Center Panel- Make 1

With W.Y. cast on 66 (70) sts. same as for side Panels. After Ravel Cord row, change to Col. 1. Counter 0. Knit 2 rows, setting Pattern on second row same as before. Continue to follow Chart changing colors as shown. After R 246 (258), bind off or remove on W.Y.

FRONT: Make 2 Side Panels .

Knit the same as the 2 back Panels.



FRONT: Center Panel - Make 1

Cast on same as center Panel for back. Follow the Chart in the same way and after R 164 (172) divide in the center for 'V' neck. Place sts. on left into HP (or knit them back to A position (NWP) with Ravel Cord. Complete the right side first. \*ON NECK SIDE, decrease 1 st. every 3rd row 24 (26)x. Continuing in Fair Isle Pat. following Chart.. After R 246 (258) bind off remaining 9 sts. Bring the Ndls. on left to WP Turn Row Counter back to 164 (172) and complete the left half. Follow instructions from \*.



WAISTBAND: Make 2

Join Panels of front and panels of back first. K1, P1 Rib.: With Col. 1, cast on 179 (189) sts. Knit 54 rows. Transfer Rib sts. to MB. Hang the open sts. of front onto these Ndls. Bind off. Repeat for Back.





K1, P1 Rib: With Col. 1, cast on 75 (79) sts. Knit 54 rows. Transfer Rib sts. to MB. With wrong side facing, hang open sts. from lower edge of Sleeve onto these Ndls. decreasing evenly across. Bind off.

#### NECKBAND: Long Band

K1, P1 Rib: Cast on 129 (135) sts. with Col. 1. ON THE RIGHT, decrease 1 st. EOR 8x, then Increase 1 st. EOR 8x. After Row 32, transfer Rib sts.to MB. Hang hem. With wrong side facing, pick up 79 (83) sts. along V and the remaining across back neck (SEW SHOULDER FIRST). Bind off.



#### NECKBAND: Short Band

K1, P1 Rib. With Col. 1, cast on 79 (83) sts. Work same as longer band but make the decreases and increases ON THE LEFT. After R 32, transfer Rib sts. to MB. With wrong side facing, pick up 79 (83) sts. along V then bind off.

#### SLEEVES:

With W.Y. cast on 114 (122) sts. After several rows end with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. Change to Col. 2 and continue St. st. ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. every 9th row 16 (17)x AND AT THE SAME TIME, FOLLOW THE CHART for the changes in Color and Pattern changes. After R 154 (160) ON EACH SIDE, inc. 1 st. every 2 rows 22x. After R 202 (208) bind off or remove on W.Y.

EOR 2 (3)x, 2 sts. every 3rd row 2 , 2 sts. every 4th row 14x and 2 sts. EOR 1 (2)x. After R 188 (194) bind off or remove on W.Y.

#### FRONT:

Knit the same as Back to R 118 (120). SHAPE RAGLAN: Full Fashion Method. 2 sts. 1x, 2 sts. EOR 3 (4)x, 2 sts. every 3rd row 10x, 2 sts. every 6th row 4x., 2 sts. 2x (1 st. 1x) BUT AT THE SAME TIME, after R 134 (140), divide in the Center. Place sts. on left into HP (or knit them back to NWP (A) position with Ravel Cord and complete the right side first. \*ON NECK SIDE, dec. 1 st. every 3rd row 7 (8)x, 1 st. every 4th row 6x. Be sure to continue raglan shaping. All decreasing is completed at R 184 (190). Bring the Ndls. on left to WP Turn Row Counter back to 134 (140) and complete left half. Follow instructions from \*.

#### MENS STRIPED SWEATER

SIZES: 40/42 (44/46)YARN . BULKY Venetia AMOUNT: Col. 1 White = 14 oz. all sizes. Col. 2 Red = 10 oz. Col. 3 Yellow = 2 oz. Col. 4 Blue = 1 oz. TENSION: St. st. 2 FNR 2/1 II GAUGE: 10 sts. 13 rows = 2" (5 cm)

Make on any BULKY Machine with Ribber. St. st. with Color Stripes. Bands are Full Needle Ribbing (FNR).

#### SLEEVES:

With W.Y. cast on 64 (70) sts. After several rows end with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. Change to Col. 1. Counter O. Knit to R 22 (24) then begin following Color stripes 30 rows Red, 16 rows White, etc. BUT AT THE SAME TIME, ON EACH SIDE, inc. 1 st. every 6th row 17x After R 104 (106), FOLLOW CHART FOR RAGLAN DECREASES (full fashion) and PLEASE NOTE THAT EACH SIDE HAS DIFFERENT SHAPINGS. After R170 (176) ON RIGHT SIDE, bind off or use Short Rows, 6 sts. 2x, 5 sts. 1x.

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FNR: With Col. 1, cast on 54 (60) sts. After Row 28, transfer Rib sts. to MB. With wrong side facing, hang the open sts. of sleeve edge onto these Ndls. decreasing evenly across. Knit 1 row. Bind off.



NECKBAND: Close Raglan Seams first. FNR: T 1.2/1 II. With Col. 1 cast on 134 (140) sts. ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. EOR 5x. After R 12, transfer Rib sts. to MB. Knit 1 row over the doubled sts. then remove on W.Y. Sew or weave the 2 ends of band together, then weave to Neckline with V at front.

FINISHING: See General Instructions.



#### PRACTICAL KNITTING HINTS

#### DOUBLE BUTTONHOLES IN A STOCKINETTE STITCH BAND

When you are making a double band in Stockinette stitch and you need to make Buttonholes spaced across the band, there is a way to completely finish the buttonholes as you are knitting the band.

For our SAMPLE, cast on 60 sts. We will make 3 buttonholes and the band is 20 rows completed. Cast on with waste yarn (ordinarily you would pick up sts. along the edge where you want a band). After knitting about 1" with waste yarn, change to main or garment yarn and 'e' cast on over all sts. behind the latches. Counting from the left edge, skip 5 sts. Mark the next 5 needles on the needlebed with a pencil. \*Skip 15 sts. and mark the next 5 needles. REPEAT FROM \* 1x more. You have marked the needlebed for 3 buttonholes in our sample. With garment yarn, knit 5 rows. With a long strand of waste yarn (same weight), knit the MARKED STS. BY HAND LOOSELY then bring them to holding position (so they will knit on the next row). With garment yarn, knit 10 rows. Bring the marked needles to selecting position. Pick up the TOP ROW of the buttonhole sts. held on waste yarn and hang them onto marked needles. With garment yarn, knit these sts. by hand (use separate strand for each buttonhole) loosely. Bring the needles to HP again and with latch tool bind off the 5 sts. pulling 2nd st. through first, 3rd through 2nd, etc. Hang the last loop on adjacent needle. Pick up the sts. from LOWER ROW held on waste yarn and hang them onto empty needles. Bring these Ndls. to HP so they will knit. Knit 5 rows. PICK UP THE 'e' CAST ON ROW to form hem. Bind off.

#### CASING FOR PEPLUM - PATTERN 554

This is just a reminder for CARRIAGE SETTINGS on MAIN BED and RIBBER.

When knitting on BOTH BEDS, PR BUTTONS on RIBBER are DOWN. When knitting on MAIN BED ONLY, PR BUTTONS on RIBBER must be UP.

When knitting on RIBBER ONLY, BOTH PART BUTTONS on MAIN BED must be PUSHED IN.

#### YARN KITS FOR GARMENTS IN THIS ISSUE

American Yarn Spinners are truly expert in the production of Cone Yarns generally used for the manufacture of mass produced knitted garments. Quality hand knitting yarns in balls and skeins have traditionally been imported mainly from Europe and Australia. A demand on the part of Manufacturers of high priced garments such as St. John, Adolfo, Miss Jo Ann, Jessica Knits and many more resulted in the production of higher priced, quality dress yarns such as Wool/Rayon mixtures sold under various name brand names (ours is Venetia). Roma is another cone yarn that has gained tremendously in popularity and we recently introduced another modern yarn under the GLACE name.

The big reduction in the value of the American dollar against other currencies over the past year, has caused a substantial increase in the price of imported yarns. In many cases prices have doubled. This fact coupled with lengthy delivery problems and the increasing need for cone yarns to satisfy the demand of the rapidly growing numbers of home knitting machine owners, has encouraged several U.S. spinning companies to develop fancy yarns and supply them on cones at very competitive prices.

KNITKING intends to phase out the imported yarns as shown in our current Catalog, so if you need any Kits from this or earlier issues, please place your orders right away and avoid disappointment. We will introduce new cone yarns on a continuing basis and produce single sample cards of each yarn and available colors at the time of introduction. Cards for Venetia, Roma and Glace are available for \$1.00 each, postpaid.
