SLEEVELESS VEST FASHIONS IN

3 PLY

&

5 PLY

These sleeveless vests have been designed for all Singer Knitting Machines. The designs are for children to adults and cover plain vests with scooped, singlet or V necklines and the buttoned vests can have either a high round or V neckline. The singlet vest has narrow ribbed shoulder straps.

These styles are for all seasons, wear them over shirts or jumpers in winter or on their own in summer.

This book has been designed for beginners however more advanced knitters may like to add their own variations as stripes, bands of fairisle or single motif fairisle.

NOTE: TUCK AND WEAVING STITCH DESIGNS ARE NOT SUITABLE.

To ensure the success of your knitting the first part of this book has been devoted to advice on tensions, length adjustments, hems and ribs, decreasing, button holes, and quantities of yarn required. Please read it carefully.

Tensions

These garments have been designed for Patons Azalea or 3 Ply Harmony in 100 gm balls and Patons Bluebell or 5 Ply Harmony in 100 gm balls.

In order to match the sizes shown in this book it is essential to produce the correct stitch and row numbers.

The correct stocking stitch numbers are:

3 Ply	5 Ply
32 stitches to 10 cm	29 stitches to 10 cm
48 rows to 10 cm	40 rows to 10 cm

For all Singer machines we suggest Stitch Dial 4.2 for 3 Ply and Stitch Dial 7 for 5 Ply. However you must knit a sample swatch as each machine varies, and various colours and flecks will affect the proportions.

To check: Knit a sample 60 stitches wide on a setting one point below the suggested number, knit 60 rows and mark work; then change to suggested setting, knit 60 rows and mark work, then work 60 rows on one point higher, e.g. 4.1 for 60 rows, 4.2 for 60 rows, 5 for 60 rows, or use the gauge scale supplied with later models. Remove the sample and leave for at least 12 hours before measuring – to allow the yarn to relax.

Rib Settings

The Stitch Dial settings for both K1, P1 rib and imitation rib are generally 2 numbers lower than that used for stocking stitch, e.g. Stocking Stitch 4.2, Rib 2.2.

Length Adjustments

We have used average measurements, however individual requirements may need the lengths to be altered. At the point for alteration the instructions have been marked 'Adjust here'.

3 Ply.

For shorter lengths deduct 12 rows for each 2.5 cm (1 inch) and for longer lengths add 12 rows for each 2.5 cm (1 inch).

5 Ply

For shorter lengths deduct 10 rows for each 2.5 cm (1 inch) and for longer lengths add 10 rows for each 2.5 cm (1 inch).

The ribbed basques are gauged at 14 rows per 2.5 cm in 3 Ply and 12 rows per 2.5 cm in 5 Ply. So if you wish to alter the depth of basque do so by this calculation.

Note: With imitation rib a hem is formed so alteration would be double these numbers.

But if you don't want to alter the overall length of the garment adjust the stocking stitch rows between the basque and armhole shaping, as given above.

If altering lengths, remember to alter all body pieces.

Decreasing

Decreasing in these styles should not be obvious, the neatest way is to place the 2nd last stitch onto end stitch then move both back to 2nd needle and push empty needle out of action.

Ribbing & Imitation Rib

Instructions are given for both K.1 P.1 rib using a ribber attachment or imitation rib where a hem is made.

Imitation Rib Hems

1. Select the given number of needles.
2. Push the alternate needles out of action.
3. Cast on using odd yarn and ravel cord, as given in Instruction Book for making a hem.
4. Set Stitch Dial to setting 2 below that for stocking stitch.
5. Join in the main yarn and knit the given number of rows.
6. Place the row of loops above the ravel cord onto the empty needles, all needles now in action.
7. Proceed with the instructions for the garment.

Imitation Rib Bands

Note: All imitation rib bands are folded in half when attached.

1. Select the given number of needles.
2. Push the alternate needles out of action.
3. Cast on loosely using the winding method.
4. Follow remainder of instructions given.

Buttonholes

The correct placement of buttonholes is given in all bands. These may be worked in either K.1 P.1 rib or imitation rib.

K.1 P.1 Rib: Transfer the centre ribber bed stitch onto the above main bed stitch, then transfer the next main bed stitch onto next ribber stitch. There will now be on each bed two stitches on the one needle and one empty needle. Leave the empty needles in action and continue knitting.

Imitation Rib: The bands in imitation rib are made double the width and folded back — therefore on the same row 2 buttonholes are to be made on stitches mentioned in the instructions. When folded the 2 holes are stitched together. To make the buttonholes knit 2 stitches together and leave the empty needles in action.

Note: If alterations made to lengths, also alter quantities.

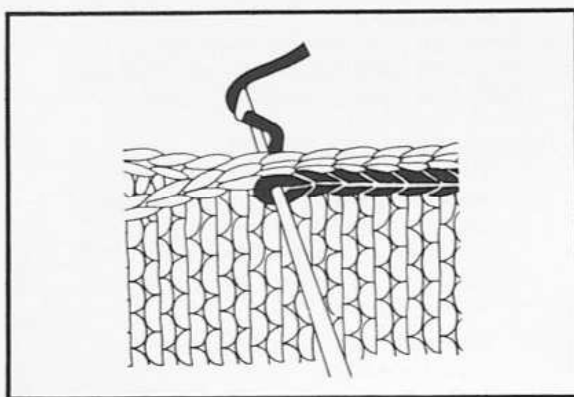
Methods of Sewing

1. **Side and Shoulder Seams:** Use either the mattress (blind) stitch which is worked on the right side, or crochet the edges together with a slip stitch.
2. **Arm and Neck Bands:** Use either a back stitch or crochet the edges together with a slip stitch.
3. **Vest front bands – buttoned:** (band knitted vertically). Use either the mattress (blind) stitch or crochet the edges together with a slip stitch.

Mattress (Blind) Stitch

Seams

All Styles – Except Singlet

1. Press all pieces lightly with a damp cloth.
2. Sew up shoulder and side seams.

Singlet

1. Press all pieces lightly with a damp cloth.
2. Sew up side seams.

Arm Bands - Rib

Note: For K1, P1 Rib attach cast off edge to garment.

All Styles – Except Singlet

1. Sew the seam in each band.
2. Pin centre of band to shoulder seam and band seam to side seam.
3. Fit band around armhole slightly stretching band around lower armhole curve.
4. Sew on band.

Singlet

1. Pin centre of band to side seam and match band end to point end on garment, each side. Evenly pin around remainder of armhole.
2. Sew on bands.

Arm Bands - Imitation Rib

1. Follow as for Armbands Rib.
2. Fold bands in half and slip stitch on wrong side.

Neck Bands - Rib

Note: For K1, P1 Rib attach cast off edge to garment.

V-Neck - Plain

1. Commencing with band ends at the V, evenly pin around neckline. With two pieces make a seam and match to shoulder seam.
2. Sew on band.
3. Mitre the band ends at the V and catch ends on wrong side.

Scoop Neck

1. Join band ends.
2. Match band seam to shoulder seam, with 2 pieces both band seams match shoulder seams.
3. Evenly pin band around neck, slightly stretching band around lower front curves.
4. Sew on band.

Singlet

1. Match coloured threads on bands, to outer edges of armhole bands, pin band, between marks, to neckline.
2. Sew on band.
3. Sew band end together to form shoulder seams.

V-Neck - Buttoned

1. Pin band evenly around neckline putting buttonholes on appropriate side. The last buttonhole should match the first neckline decrease.
2. Sew on band.
3. Sew on buttons to correspond with holes.

Round Neck - Buttoned

1. Pin ends of neck band to front edges, evenly pin band to neckline.
2. Sew on band.
3. Pin on front bands commencing at top of neck band, placing buttonhole band on appropriate side.
4. Sew on bands.
5. Sew on buttons to correspond with holes.

Neck Bands - Imitation Rib

V-Neck, Scoop Neck, Singlet

1. Attach as given for Neckbands - Rib.
2. Fold bands in half, slip stitch to wrong side. On V-Neck do this before mitreing ends at V.

V-Neck and Round Neck - Buttoned.

1. Attach as given for Neckbands Rib.
2. Fold bands in half and slip stitch to wrong side before sewing on buttons.
3. Catch each pair of button holes together.
