
INSTRUCTIONS ON USIFOR THE BULKY KNI

ACCESSORIES

Garter Bar - 3 pcs.] - I set



GARTER STITCHES


- 1. Hold the Garter Bar with the needle grooves upward and push the machine needles with stitches in their hooks forward to E position. (Fig.1) (The Garter Bar is horizontal.)
- Push the stitches behind the needle latches and transfer the stitches toward the Garter Bar (beyond the stitch stoppers of the Garter Needles).


(The Garter Bar is horizontal.)


- 3. Hold the Garter Bar vertically and push it until the tips of the Garter Bar needles open the latches of the machine needles. Then remove the Garter Bar from the knitting needles.
- Without removing the yarn from the Yarn Feeder, place the yarn across the needles and move the Carriage across the Needle Bed without knitting.


Turn over the Garter Bar (the fabric is on it).

- Push the latch needles to D position. Make sure that the latches of the knitting needles are completely open.
- 6. Push the tips of the Garter Bar needles downward about 0.5 cms. from the tips of the machine needle latches. Put the grooves from Garter Bar needles over the heads of the knitting needles. (Fig. 2)
- 7. Pull the Garter Bar forward gently and transfer the stitches to the hooks of the knitting needles (Figs. 3 & 4). When the Garter Bar is like that in Fig. 4, be sure that all the stitches are transferred back to the knitting needles.
- Pull the Garter Bar toward you and remove it from the knitting needles.
- 9. Align all needles in B position and knit one row.
- Repeat this procedure and you will have fine Garter Stitch work done.











PARTIAL GARTER STITCH (PARTIAL KNITTING)

You would want to knit Garter Stitch while doing Partial Knitting. The problem here is how to handle the yarn end which is in the middle of the row as in the case of Partial Knitting. Please follow the instructions below:

- Raise the yarn end above the machine needles before placing your Garter Bar on the needles and transfer all stitches to the Garter Bar.
- 2. Turn over the Garter Bar and bring the yarn end toward you. Transfer the stitches to the knitting needles.




To make use of this Partial Garter Stitch, you are able to knit Garter Stitch in one portion of the fabric and Stockinet Stitch in another portion.

The mark ····· indicates purl stitch, i.e. the knitting as knitted by the machine.

The mark —— indicates the knitting that is made when it is turned over by using the Garter Bar.

- Knit one row and make Partial Knitting up to the A point that starts the Garter Stitches in the second row.
- 2. Turn the fabric over using the Garter Bar and knit the rest of the second row.
- 3. Turn the fabric over again with the Garter Bar and operate the Carriage without knitting for one row. Then make Partial Knitting up to point A.
- 4. Repeat the above procedure.



E OF THE GARTER BAR TTER MODEL SK-120



Joint the Bars with using Bar Connector as shown belon.




LACE PATTERN (OPEN PATTERN)

1. Push those needles for making the Lace Pattern to E position. (Fig. 1)

Joint Button

- Push the rest of the needles forward but as far as the stitches will not go over the latches. (Fig. 2)
- 3. Push the needles in E position back and align all needles. (Be careful not to close the latches of the needles.)
- 4. Place the eyes of the Garter Bar needles onto the hooks of the machine needles and pull them all the way to E position. Gently pull the fabric forward. (The stitches in the pattern positions are transferred to the Garter Bar. Fig. 3)
- Remove the Garter Bar while opening the needle latches.
 Transfer the stitches to the neighbouring needles. (Fig. 4)
- Tilt the Garter Bar so that the stitches will slide down and stitches will pile up in a single movement. (Fig. 5)









 Move the Bar to the right over the space of four needles and push back the other two needles.






