# Instructions

MACHINE KNITTING
CHIC

The full working instructions together with the line charts, colour and stitch pattern charts for each model in this book can be found under the respective model number on the following pages.

Model

Turquoise sweater

with flowers

**Size:** to fit bust 86/91 (97/102) cm - 34/36 (38/40) in.

Figures in brackets refer to size 97/102 cm. If there is only one set of figures it applies to all sizes.

**Machines:** These instructions are written for Brother KH 930 with electronic carriage KG 93 (single bed machine).

Materials: WELCOMME "Le Derby" (100% pure merino wool, mt = 150 m/50 g) about 700 (750) g turquoise (col 08), furthermore WSM "Angora nova" (75% angora, 25% wool, mt = 90 m/20 g) about 20 g white. For the decoration flowers, pearls and fancy drops.

**Ribbing:** Place KG-carriage at right, TD 8. Insert program 532 and work foll machine instructions.

**Basic patt:** work patt 501 with KG-carriage and largest TD.


Tension (basic patt, largest setting): 23 sts and 37 rows to 10 cm square.


**Back:** cast on 110 (118) sts for ribbing and work 30 rows rib patt. Using WY, K a few rows and remove from machine.

Transfer sts again to machine. inc 1 st after every 5th st 20 times (1 st after 4th st, then 1 st every 6th st 18 times and 1 st after 4th foll st) = 130 (138) sts. Sew RC to 000 and cont in basic patt. For side shapings inc 1 st at each end of every 16th row 5 times = 140 (148) sts. Cont straight. After 216 rows cast off the 30 centre sts for neck and finish each side separately. At neck edge cast off on every alt row 4 sts once. 3 sts once and 1 st once. After 224 rows cast off rem 47 (51) shoulder sts.

**Front:** proceed as for back, but with lower neck. After 204 rows cast off the 14 centre sts and finish each side separately. At neck edge cast off on every alt row 4 sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts twice and 1 st 5 times. After 224 rows cast off rem 47 (51) shoulder sts.

Sleeve: cast on 60 sts for ribbing and work 30 rows in rib patt. Cont as for back and inc 1 st after every 4th st 14 times = 74 sts. Set RC to 000 and cont in basic patt. Inc 1 st at each end of every 4th row 30 times, then 1 st on every alt row 3 times, making inc foll machine instructions. After 128 rows cast off all 140 sts.

Model 2

Sweater with

patterned squares

**Size:** to fit bust 86 to 97 cm - 34 to 38 in.

**Machines:** These instructions are written for Empisal Electronic 550k (single bed machine); also suitable for all other standard gauge machines with punchcard automatic, TD 4.5 to 5 mm.

Materials: SCHOELLER-ESS-LINGER "Geisha" (85% acrylic, 15% mohair, mt = 175 m/50 g) about 300 g turquoise col 93 and 100 g white col 01; "Angora Princess" (80% angora, 20%

lambswool, mt = 95 m/20 g) about 40 g turquoise col 33, light green col 34 and white col 01. One long  $2^{3}/4$  mm circular needle.

**Ribbing:** machines without ribber: using 2<sup>3</sup>/4 mm needles work K1, P1 rib by hand. Machines with ribber: set machine for rib patt.

Fair Isle patt: Use the foils supplied with the machine, pressing buttons 1 to 5 at random to vary patt. Set patt limits over 1st and last st in order considered subsequent inc. Work foll machine instructions. Use largest TD.

**Tension:** (largest TD, Fair Isle patt): 27 sts and 27 rows to 10 cm square, (largest TD, st st = sleeve): 24 sts and 31 rows to 10 cm square.


**Method:** work sweater foll chart in separate patt stripes, the arrows indicate the knitting direction. 1 square = 1 st or row. Start in loop method, with 1 additional edge st on either


side (these sts are not included in the chart). Inc and dec as given in chart. The small edge triangles can be worked in st st, all complete squares in Fair Isle patt.

**Sleeve:** cast on 60 sts with Geisha (turquoise) for cuff and work about 6 cm in rib patt. Transfer piece to machine, inc 1 st 16 times alt after 3 sts and

4 sts = 76 sts. Set RC to 000. With largest setting cont in st st. After 3 rows inc for sleeve shaping 1 st at each end of every 3rd row 34 times = 144 sts. After 106 rows cast off all sts.

To make up: join patt stripes. Band: over upper edge of each piece pick up about 120 sts with Geisha (turquoise), work 1 row as foll: K tbl of every st, then work 2 cm rib patt. Cast off all sts. Work waistband alike, but over 6 cm. Join shoulder seams, sew sleeves in position, then join side and sleeve seams.





### Model

#### Fisherman's rib sweater with cables

Size: to fit bust 86/91 (102/107) cm - 34/36 (38/40) in.

Figures in brackets refer to size 102/107 cm. If there is only one set of figures it applies to all

**Machines:** These instructions are written for Empisal 700 (formerly 360) with special facility; also suitable for other standard gauge machines with double bed (without pattern automatic).

Materials: STEINBACH "Cordo Artikel 80" (100% cotton, mt = 4300 m/kg) about 350 (400) g mint col 39 and 250 (300) g white col 01; "Cotton-Knoti Artikel 60" (65% cotton, 35% viscose, mt = 2760 m/kg) about 100 g mottled beige col 1 and mint col 39

Ribbing: (Artikel 80) with the double yarn, work alt K1, P1 on every 2nd N, TD 8/9.

Fisherman's rib: (Artikel 80) work with 1 strand, on every 2nd N, TD 4/5.

Cable patt: (Artikel 60) work with the double yarn in st st over 8 sts on every 2nd N (loose setting). Every 6 rows cross the 4 centre sts.

Collar: (Artikel 80) work with the double yarn in st st on every mock rib).

Tension: (measured over fisherman's rib): 26 sts and 65 rows to 10 cm square.

1/2 front and back (work 2 pieces): cast on 67 (71) sts in white (Artikel 80) and work fisherman's rib. After 210 rows shape raglan: at right edge dec 2 sts. Rep dec alt on every 8th and 10th row (on every 8th row) until 29 sts rem. After 382 rows cast off all sts.

1/2 front and back (work 2 pieces): proceed as for 1st piece, but using mint (Artikel



#### Sweater in lace

#### pattern with cables

Size: to fit bust 86 to 97 cm -34 to 38 in.

Machines: These instructions are written for Brother KG 930 (KH 910) and KR 850 (KG 93), KH 860/881/882

Materials: ESSLINGER "Cornelia" (100% acrylic, mt = 390 m/100 g) about 500 g pink col 05. **Basic patt:** K1-P1 on double bed, lace patt on single bed. Work alt lace patt, bobbles and cable squares (1 square = 24 sts wide and 36 rows high). Arrangement of squares see page 20. Cables: cross each time 2 sts twice on rows 6, 12, 18, 24 and 30 of each cable square. Arrange the 24 sts from the left as foll: K1, 1 cable, K2, 1 cable, K2, 1 cable, K2, 1 cable, K1,

Bobbles: work bobbles by hand with a separate strand of the same varn over 3 sts and 8 rows each (4 Rs and Ws rows). Work the bobbles, like the cables, on rows 6, 12, 18, 24 and 30. Disposition for rows 6, 18 and 30: 2 sts, 1 bobble, 3 sts, 1 bobble, 3 sts, 1 bobble, 3 sts, 1 bobble, 1 st, Disposition for rows 12 and 24: 5 sts, 1 bobble, 3 sts, 1 bobble, 3 sts, 1 bobble, 4 sts.

These cable and bobble squares can only be worked if there are 24 sts in st st between the lace patt squares (24 sts).



Height of ribbing: back, front and sleeves 8 cm. Arrow in diagram = direction of knitting.


Back: cast on 140 sts on double bed, work 32 rows in K1-P1 ribbing, transfer sts, inc 1 st after every 11th st 12 times = 152 sts. Set RC at 000. Cont in patt, after 108 rows mark edge st at each end. After 204 rows cast off the 56 centre sts for back neck. Cont in patt over the 48 sts at left, at neck edge dec 2 sts on


every alt row 5 times. After 216 rows cast off rem 38 shoulder sts. Complete left side in reverse.

Front: proceed as for back.


Sleeve: cast on 66 sts on double bed, work 32 rows in K1-P1 ribbing, transfer sts, inc evenly across to 80 sts. Work 144 rows (4 squares in height) in basic patt, inc 1 st at each end of every 4th row 35 times. After 144 (150 sts) rows cast off all sts. Work 2nd sleeve alike).

Neck band: join one shoulder seam. Round neck pick up 166 sts and transfer to machine, K 10 rows in K1-P1 rib, starting with TD 4. On every alt row reduce TD. Cast off all sts loosely. To make up: join 2nd shoulder. seam and band seam. Sew sleeves in position between markers. Join side and sleeve









Model

Pink sweater

#### with fancy motifs

Size: to fit bust 86 to 97 cm -34 to 38 in.

Machines: These instructions are written for standard gauge machines with single bed, with and without punchcard automatic.

AUSTERMANN Materials: "Mandy S" (75% wool, 25% polyamide, mt = 210 m/50 g) about 350 g pink col 116; "Royal Angora" (100% angora, mt = 66 m/20 g) about 120 g pink col 205; "Reine Seide" (100% Tus-sah silk, mt = 155 m/50 g) about 50 g pink col 12 and bobbin supporting yarn "Sucette" (100% polyester, mt = 135 m/20 g) silver col 1.

Ribbing: machines without ribber: using 23/4 mm needles work K1, P1 rib by hand. Machines with ribber: set machine for rib patt using fine gauge.

St st: BB, loose setting.

Lace patt: BB, st st, loose setting. Every 2 rows transfer sts foll chart. Rep patt g in width, start with sts before patt g and end with sts after patt g.

Fancy patt. punch a card foll

diagram.

Tension: (measured over st st with Angora): 22 sts and 28 rows to 10 cm square. Work the sweater with separate


patt panels.

Right and left panel (work 4 pieces): cast on 46 sts with Mandy and Sucette and work 66 rows st st. Turn, transfer sts again to machine. Using Mandy work 120 rows in fancy patt. Turn work, transfer sts again to machine. Work 26 rows st st with Angora. Cast off all sts.


Centre panel (work 2 pieces): cast on 46 sts with Mandy. Work 154 rows in fancy patt. Turn work and transfer sts again to machine. Using Seide work 36 rows in lace patt, then another 26 rows st st with Mandy and Sucette. Cast off all sts.

Sleeve: cast on 72 sts with Angora and work st st. Inc for sleeve shaping 1 st at each end of every 4th row 30 times. Machines with intarsia facility: after 32 rows work lace patt with Seide over the 24 centre sts for 20 rows. Machines without intarsia facility: work this panel straight in 3 pieces and join subsequently. After 121 rows cast off all 132 sts. Work 2nd sleeve alike.

To make up: Sew all patt panels tog. Join shoulder seams over 17 cm each. Sew sleeves in position. Roll band: cast on about 116 sts with Angora and work 16 rows st st, cast off all sts. Sew band in position, Ws rolls over Rs. Work all ribbings separately with Mandy and sew in position. Cuffs: 50 sts/34 rows, waistband: 130 sts/30 rows. Join side and sleeve seams.

### Model Sweater with golden

Size: to fit bust 81/86 (91/97) cm - 32/34 /36/38) in.

Figures in brackets refer to size 91/97 cm. If there is only one set of figures it applies to all sizes. Machines: These instructions are written for Empisal Model 700 (formerly 360) with special facility; also suitable for other standard gauge machines with intarsia technique.

Materials: Steinbach "Nizza" (100% cotton, mt = 2800 m/kg) about 250 (300) g pink col 44 and 150 (200) g each blue col 51 and white col 1. One

3<sup>3</sup>/4 mm crochet hook, oddments in glossy yarn for the bobbles.

Ribbing: machines without ribber: using 23/4 mm Ns work K1, P1 rib by hand. Machines with ribber: set machine for rib patt. Using TD 5/6.

Stripes: 4 rows blue, 8 rows pink, 4 rows white, 8 rows pink, 4 rows blue and 8 rows pink = 36 rows.

Intarsia: work foll charts I and II with TD 10. Work sts on BB in rev st st. Remove sts from machine. Insert lock at left, set to intarsia and push 1 row to the right (without yarn). Cont in intarsia technique foll machine instructions. When changing cols twist yarn at back of work. At the same time, work a lace motif. Note: only those rows are given in chart which are worked from right to left. Work rows from left to right as preceding row. 1 =blue, 2 =white, 3 = pink.

Tension (st st): 25 sts and 31 rows to 10 cm square.

Back: cast on 110 (120) sts in blue and work 36 rows in rib patt with stripes. Using WY, work a few rows in rev st st, remove from machine, transfer sts again to BB, inc 1 st after every 5th (6th) st 20 times = 130 (140) sts. Cont foll chart in intarsia patt, then cast off all sts.


Front: proceed as for back, but in reverse.

Right sleeve: cast on 60 sts in pink and work 30 rows in rib patt. Then inc 1 st after every 3rd st 18 times = 78 sts. Cont foll chart II. Inc for sleeve shaping as given in chart. Then cast off all sts.


Left sleeve: start as for right sleeve. After ribbing, cont in pink only and in lace patt. Work inc as for right sleeve.


To make up: bobble: chain 4, crochet 5 trebles in 1st chain, leaving last loop of every treble on hook. Draw yo through all loops on hook. Sew bobbles to front as shown. Collar: cast on 130 sts in pink on BB and work 30 rows st st with largest setting, then cast off all sts. Join side seam. Join shoulder seams, sew sleeves in position, then join side seams. Sew collar in position.

# Model Batwing sweater with bobbles

**Size:** to fit bust 86 to 102 cm - 34 to 40 in.

**Machines:** These instructions are written for Empisal Model 700 (formerly 360) with special facility; also suitable for other standard gauge machines with intarsia technique, without pattern automatic.

**Materials:** Steinbach "Lydia" (48 % cotton, 30% viscose, 22 % acrylic, mt = 2800 m/kg) about 550 g blue col 6949 and 150 g mint col 6939, supporting yarn "Lyon" (35% cotton, 35% modal, 30% viscose, mt = 2780 m/kg) about 50 g mint col 5048. One 3³/5 mm crochet hook.

**Ribbing:** machines without ribber: using 2<sup>3</sup>/4 mm Ns work K1, P1 rib by hand. Machines with ribber: set machine for rib patt. Using TD 5/6.

Intarsia: work foll chart with TD 101/2, in direction of arrow. Work rev st st on BB. Remove sts from machine, place lock at left, set to intarsia patt and push 1 row to the right without yarn. Cont in intarsia technique. When changing cols twist yarn at back of work.

One square in chart = 1 st and 2 rows. Work area 1 with blue, area 2 with mint and supporting yarn. Crochet the bobbles at the end of work.


**Tension (st st, TD 10<sup>1</sup>/2):** 22 sts and 31–32 rows to 10 cm square.


Work sweater crosswise, starting at lower edge off one sleeve.

Front with sleeves: cast on 38 sts with carriage at right. Work in intarsia technique foll chart. Inc and dec at side edge as given. Cast on several sts in loop technique. After the last row slip rem 38 sts on a length of yarn.

**Back with sleeves:** proceed as for front, but in reverse and in blue only. This piece can also be worked in rev st st.

To make up: bobble (mint and supporting yarn): chain 4, crochet 5 trebles in 1st chain, leaving last loop of every treble on hook. Draw yo through all loops on hook. Sew bobbles to front as shown. Join shoulder and upper sleeve seams. For the blue collar, cast on 130 sts and





Model 8

#### Sweater in relief

#### pattern

**Size:** to fit bust 86 to 97 cm - 34 to 38 in.

**Machines:** These instructions are written for Brother KH 930 with electronic carriage KG 93 (single bed machine).


Materials: GEDIFRA "Cocco" (100% mercerised cotton, mt = 140 m/50 g) about 700 g turquoise col 7018.

**Ribbing:** Place KG-carriage at right, TD 8. Insert program 532 and work foll machine instruc-

Relief patt: work patt 31 with KG-carriage and TD 10 ' insert variation keys 3 and 4. Tension (relief patt): 25 sts and 32 rows to 10 cm square. Work sweater crosswise, starting at lower edge of one sleeve. Back: N over 55 in the green area of bed = N for 1st st. Push 39 Ns in B-position from here to the left. Cont in relief patt. At the same time, inc 1 st at left edge every 3 rows 35 times = 74 sts. Then cast off at left 60 sts once in loop technique = 134 sts. Cont straight until work measures 286 rows. Now cast off at left 1 st every 3 rows 35 times. After 390 rows cast off rem

39 sts. **Front piece:** proceed as for 1st piece, but with neck shaping. After 165 rows cast off 2 sts at right edge once, then cast off 1 st on every alt row 6 times. Work 42 rows straight, now make inc instead of dec. After 230 rows cont straight at right edge.

To make up: join upper shoulder and sleeve seams. For neck band cast on 120 sts with TD 5, work ribbing as foll: 3 rows each with TD 5, 6, 7 and 8. Now work 1 row (= P sts) with normal lock (largest setting), cast off all sts loosely. Sew band into position with cast-on edge above. For each sleeve cuff cast on 64 sts and work 40 rows rib patt, cast off all sts. Work waistband alike, but casting on 110 sts each. Sew bands in position, join rem seams



Model 9

#### Smock sweater

#### with silvery stripes

**Size:** to fit bust 97/102 (107) cm - 38/40 (42) in.

Figures in brackets refer to size 107 cm. If there is only one set of figures it applies to all sizes.

Machines: These instructions are written for Singer 2320; also suitable for Passap (Pfaff) Duomatic 80, Duomatic S, Electronic 6000.

Materials: SCHOELLER "Chicco" (50% viscose, 40% acrylic, 10% polyamide, mt = 240 m/100 g) about 500 (550) g turquoise col 19; ESSLINGER "Angora" (80% angora, 20% wool, mt = 475 m/100 g) about 140 g turquoise col 33 and "Gold + Silber" (80% viscose, 20% other fibres, mt = 380 m/100 g) about 60 g silver col 01. One short 3 mm circular needle.

**Ribbing:** set machine for rib patt K2, P2 as foll:



Back row of Ns, TD 9.
Front row of Ns, TD 8.

Smock pattern: work alt

**Smock pattern:** work alt P4, K2 – as foll:



Back row of Ns, TD 9. Front row of Ns, TD 8. **St st:** BB, TD 8.

**Stripes:** work alt 6 (7) rows in silver and 16 rows with Chicco. **Tensions:** (measures over st st, stripes): 26 sts and 35 rows to 10 cm square; (measured over smock patt): 39 sts and 30 rows to 10 cm square.


**Back centre:** cast on 118 sts with Angora. Cont in smock patt. Work 180 rows straight, then cast off all sts.

Front centre: work as back centre, but with neck shaping. Cast off the centre 40 sts and finish each side separately. At neck edge cast off on every alt row 5 sts once, 2 sts 4 times and 1 st 6 times. After 180 rows cast off rem 20 shoulder sts.

Side piece with sleeve (work 2 pieces): cast on 158 sts in silver and work st st with stripes. After 50 (56) rows cast off 81 sts at right edge, then cast off for sleeve shaping at right edge 1 st every 3 rows 34 times = 43 sts. After 154 (161) rows slip all sts on a length of yarn.

**Side piece with sleeve** (work 2 pieces): proceed as for 1st piece, but working dec at left edge.

1/2 front and back with sleeve

**To make up:** join 2 side and sleeve pieces each along shoulder line. Push sts into machine (knit side at front), set Ns for smock patt and work 30 rows with Angora. Using Wy, K a few rows and remove from machine, turn and push sts on BB. Using Angora, work 25 rows st st, on 13th row push 2 sts each on 1 N = fold line. Then cast off all sts. For waist-

band (work 2 pieces) cast on 110 (138) sts with Chicco and work 28 rows in rib patt. Cast off all sts loosely. Now smock pieces (spacing about 6 rows). Join all seams. Fold lower sleeve edges over along fold line and sew in position. Round neck pick up with the circular needle and Angora about 128 sts and work 2.5 cm in rib patt, then cast off all sts.

Model 10

#### Pink sweater

#### in lace pattern

**Size:** to fit bust 86/91 (97/102) cm - 34/36 (38/40) in.

Figures in brackets refer to size 97/102 cm. If there is only one set of figures it applies to all sizes.

Machines: These instructions are written for Brother KH 930; also suitable for other standard gauge machines without pattern automatic.

Materials: GEDIFRA "Cocco" (100% mercerised cotton, mt = 140 m/50 g) about 600 (650) g pink col 7057. One 33/4 mm crochet hook.

Ribbing: work alt K1, P1 on every 2nd N, TD 3.

St st with lace patt: BB, TD 10 (= largest setting). Transfer sts by hand foll chart, then work 2 rows in st st. Only those rows are given in chart, in which sts are transferred. After the 27th row, cont last transfer to 136th row. Cont with 137th row, at the end of chart cont lace patt in the same manner.

Tension (st st with lace patt): 25 sts and 36 rows to 10 cm square.

Back: cast on 120 (130) sts. for ribbing and work 40 rows rib patt. Then transfer all sts on BB. Using WY, work a few rows and remove from machine. Transfer sts again to BB, increasing 1 st after every 5th st 24 times = 144 (154) sts. Cont in st st, after 2 rows transfer the 12 centre sts foll chart. Then transfer 12 sts again at a spacing of 24 (26) sts = lace motif 3 times. Cont foll chart. After 180 (188) rows from ribbing cast off all sts.

Front: proceed as for back, but with round neck. After 170 (176) rows from ribbing cast off the 36 centre sts and finish each side separately. At neck edge cast off on every alt row 4 sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts once and 1 st once. After 180 (188) rows from ribbing cast off rem 44 (49) shoulder sts.







**St st band** = 1 strand Angora and 1 strand Starlight (insert separately, then tog into feeder A).

**Lace fancy patt** = Angora in feeder A, Starlight (double yarn) in feeder B.

KH 892: punch a blank card foll diagram.

**KH 930:** insert patt. Work patt over the complete width with selector key 1.

Stitch size setting: double bed K2 - P2 TD 3/3 I; st st - band TD 6; lace fancy patt TD 9.

Tension: 5 cm = 12.5 sts and 17 rows. KL 116: (shaping machine): width 16 cm, height 17.5 cm.

**Height of ribbing:** back and front 20 cm, sleeves 8 cm, arrow in diagram = knitting direction.







**Height of ribbing:** Back, front and sleeves 8 cm. Arrow in diagram = direction of knitting.



At the right and the left of cables drop 2 sts each, crochet st by st as K st with the latch N. KH 910: transfer patt to a blank foil, inserting outlined area. Method: patt g = below. All variation keys below.



KH 930: insert patt. Method: selector key 1.

Patt over the complete width of knitting.

Stitch size setting: double bed TD 2/2 I, single bed TD 6. **Tension:** 5 cm = 14 sts and 21 rows; KL 116 (= shaping machine): width 14.2 cm, height 14.2 cm.


Ribbing: back, front and sleeves 8 cm each. The arrow in the diagram = knitting direc-


Back: cast on 149 sts (50 ribs on KH - 49 ribs in KR) on double bed (2 edge sts each on single bed KH), work 40 rows in K2-P2 rib, transfer sts to machine, increasing evenly across to 168 sts. Set RC at 000. Work in lace patt with cables. After 126 rows from rib-


bing mark edge st at each end. After 244 rows from ribbing push Ns of left half to NWP for neck. From centre (0) to the right dec on every alt row 7 sts once and 6 sts 4 times (short rows). After 252 rows cast off rem 53 shoulder sts. Work left half in reverse. Over the centre 62 sts work a few rows with WY and remove from machine.

Front: proceed as for back to 218 rows from ribbing. For neck push Ns of left half to NWP. From centre (0) to the right dec on every alt row 5 sts once, 4 sts once, 3 sts twice, 2 sts 7 times and 1 st twice (short rows). After 252 rows from ribbing cast off the rem 53 shoulder sts. Work left half in reverse. Cont as for back. Over front neck edge transfer 8 sts on either side to machine and join sts of neck (total 140 sts), work 30 rows in K2-P2 rib, cast off all sts loosely.

Sleeve: using WY work a few rows over the 96 sts on single bed. Cont in lace patt with cables and inc 1 st at each end







of every 5th row 30 times, then 1 st on every 3rd row 6 times. After 172 rows (168 sts) cast off all sts. Work 2nd sleeve alike. **Cuff:** cast on 62 sts on double bed and work 30 rows in K2-P2 rib, transfer sts to machine. Join the sts of 1st row of one sleeve

and cast off all sts. Work 2nd cuff alike.

To make up: join shoulder and neck band seams. Fold neck band to Ws and sew in position. Sew sleeves in position between markers, then join side and sleeve seams.

To make up: join upper sleeve and shoulder seams. For neck band pick up with the circular needle about 120 sts and work 2 cm in rib patt, cast off all sts. For sleeve cuffs transfer sts tomachine and work 30 rows in

rib patt in beige, cast off all sts. Along each lower edge pick up about 120 sts with beige, transfer sts to machine and work 30 rows in rib patt, cast off all sts. Join lower sleeve and side seams.

**Size:** to fit bust 86 to 97 cm - 34 to 38 in.

**Machines:** These instructions are written for Brother chunky gauge machine KH 260; also suitable for Empesal chunky gauge machine model 155.

Materials: Austermann "Salve" (50% cotton, 25% polyamide, 15% acrylic, 10% viscose, mt = 105 m/50 g) about 450 g beige col 2 and "Royal Angora" (100% angora, mt = 66 m/20 g) about 80 g cream col 200 and 60 g turquoise col 209, one 33/4 mm circular needle.

**Ribbing:** work alt K1, P1 on every N, TD 0.

Patt A, B and C: punch cards foll diagrams, cont using patt in height. Dark symbol = punched, works basic col, unpunched = contrast col.

St st and Fair Isle technique:

TD 4, work foll machine instructions. Patt B: punched = basic col, empty square = contrast col. Rs and Ws rows are given. Rep marked sts in width and in height.

Patt sequence:





60 rows beige (rows 286–345) **Tension** (patt sequence, TD 4): 18 sts and 23 rows to 10 cm square.

Work sweater crosswise, starting at lower edge of one sleeve. Method: cast on 29 sts in beige (carriage at right) and work patt sequence. At the same time, inc at left edge for sleeve shaping 1 st every 8th row 5 times, then 2 sts every alt row 36 times. Cont straight (= 106 sts). After 154 rows cast off for neck 4 sts at right edge, then cast off every alt row 3 sts once and 2 sts once. Cont straight. After 185 rows inc sts at neck edge in reverse to 191 rows = neck band. Now cont straight at right

At the same time, after 230 rows, cast off at left edge 2 sts 36 times and 1 st 5 times (in reverse to inc of 1st side) = 29 sts. After 345 rows slip sts on a length of yarn. Work 2nd piece, casting on with carriage at left, work patt sequence as on 1st piece, and inc or dec in reverse. Note: work patt B in such a manner that motifs cont after joining pieces.





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# Model 21

#### Sweater

#### with blue stripes

**Size:** to fit bust 86/91 (97/102) cm - 34/36 (38/40) in.

Figures in brackets refer to size 97/102 cm. If there is only one set of figures it applies to all sizes.

**Machines:** These instructions are written for Empesal model 700 (earlier 360) single bed machine; also suitable for other standard gauge machine with single bed, without punchcard automatic.

Materials: STEINBACH "Cotton-Visco" (81% cotton, 19% viscose, mt = 2800 m/kg) about 400 (450) g khaki col 5442 and 100 g cream col 5459, "Nizza" (100% cotton, mt = 2800 m/kg) about 100 g turquoise col 336 and 50 g black col 300. One 3 mm circular needle, one 33/4 mm crochet hook.

**Ribbing:** using 3 mm needles work K1, P1 rib by hand.

St st: TD 10.

Cable: cast on 10 sts in turquoise and work st st with TD 10. Every 5 rows cross the 6 centre sts.

Lace patt: This patt can be worked with the lace lock; or transfer sts by hand foll chart. Centre motif (arrow) and continue to the sides. Work 22 rows in height. Only those rows are given in chart in which the sts are transferred. After transferring sts, work 2 rows without patt.

Stripes (st st): 6 rows khaki,
\* 8 rows turquoise, 2 rows
black, 22 rows lace patt in
cream, 8 rows turquoise,
2 rows black, 22 rows khaki,
rep twice from \* = 198 rows.


**Tension** (st st, TD 10): 25 sts and 35 rows to 10 cm square.

**Back centre:** cast on 69 sts with khaki and continue in striped patt. Inc 1 st at each end of every 10th row 19 times = 107 sts. After 198 rows cast off all sts.

Front centre: proceed as for back centre.

**Cable band** (work 2 pieces): work about 400 rows over 10 sts, then cast off all sts.

1/2 side piece with sleeve (work 2 pieces): with carriage at the left cast on 36 sts in khaki (open method), cont in st st. For sleeve shaping inc at right edge 1 st on every alt row 54 times = 90 sts, work another 2 rows, then cast on at the right 54 sts once (loop method) = 144 sts. Cont straight. After 150 (158) rows cast off all sts loosely.

1/2 side piece with sleeve (work 2 pieces): proceed as for 1st piece, but in reverse, cast on 1st group of sts at the right and work inc at the left.

To make up: join the side pieces with sleeves. Work cuffs in khaki, dec sts evenly across 1st row until there are 62 sts. Work 8 cm in rib patt, cast off all sts. Join rem pieces and sew cables over the seams. Round neck crochet crab sts (= double crochet from left to right) in khaki. Waistband: pick up 100 (110) sts over each lower edge





Machines: These instructions are written for Empesal Knitbed master 250, single machine with tension dial 4.5 mm; also suitable for Passap (Pfaff) Duomatic 80, Duomatic S, Electronic 6000.

Materials: ESSLINGER "Fortissima moda" (75% wool, 25% polyamide, mt = 420 m/100 g) about 450 g beige col 40 and "Angora" (80% angora, 20% wool, mt = 475 m/100 g) about 20 g each green col 34, blue col 37, lind col 33 and pink col 25. One long 23/4 mm circular needle, one 3 mm crochet hook.

Ribbing: using the circular needle work K2, P2 rib by hand. St st: work in beige with TD 8. Tucks: work tucks in st st with Angora at the same time. Leave 26 Ns each in WP. Push rem Ns in NWP to front (position D). Disconnect RC. Over these 26 sts work 18 rows in st st with TD 7 using indicated contrast col. Now join sts of 1st row (= contrast col) to the 26 sts. Tuck at back. Change again to TD 8, connect RC and cont in beige over all Ns.

Tension: (measures over st st in beige, TD 8): 25 sts and 40 rows to 10 cm square.

Front: cast on 126 sts in beige with the circular needle. Work 7 cm in rib patt. Transfer sts to machine, inc 1 st after every 7th st 18 times = 144 sts. Cont in st st using beige. Work tucks as

1st tuck (lind) after 50 rows over sts 32 to 57 from right edge. 2nd tuck (pink) after 64 rows over sts 32 to 57 from left edge. 3rd tuck (blue) after 78 rows over sts 32 to 57 from right edge.

4th tuck (green) after 92 rows over sts 32 to 57 from left edge. 5th tuck (green) after 106 rows over sts 32 to 57 from right edge.


6th tuck (lind) after 120 rows over sts 32 to 57 from left edge. 7th tuck (pink) after 134 rows over sts 32 to 57 from right edge.

After 184 rows cast off all sts. Back: proceed as for front.

Sleeve with yoke: cast on 50 sts. with the circular needle in beige and work 8 cm in rib patt. Transfer sts to machine, inc evenly across until there are 96 sts. Cont in st st using beige. For sleeve shaping inc 1 st at each end of every 8th row 15 times = 126 sts. After 134 rows cast off 25 sts at each end. Cont straight. After 360 rows cast on these sts again (loop method). At the same time, work these tucks as over the 26 centre sts as foll: work alt 1 tuck in green, blue, lind and pink; after row 4, 31, 58, 85, 112, 139, 166, 193, (220), (247), (274), 301, 328, 355, 382, 409, 436, 463, 490. Figures in brackets indicated that there are two tucks next to each other over sts 3 to 18, from right or left edge.

At the same time, after 198 rows from waistband, divide work in half for neck and cont over each half separately. Cont right half (front) first. At neck edge cast off on every alt row 4 sts once, 3 sts 3 times, 2 sts twice and 1 st 3 times. Work 62 rows straight, then inc in reverse. Now cont over left half, for neck back cast off at right edge on every alt row 2 sts once and 1 st 3 times. Work 82 rows straight, then inc in reverse. Now cont over both halves and end piece in reverse, making dec instead of inc.

To make up: join all pieces. Round neck crochet 1 round double crochet and 1 round crab sts (= double crochet from left to right) using green.



### Model

#### Pink sweater

#### with large tucks

Size: to fit bust 86/91 (97/102) cm 34/36 (38/40) in.

Figures in brackets refer to size 97/102 cm. If there is only one set of figures it applies to all sizes.

Machines: These instructions are written for Empesal Knittmaster 250, single bed machine with tension dial 5 mm; also suitable for Passap (Pfaff) Duomatic 80, Duomatic S, Elec-

tronic 6000.

Materials: ESSLINGER "Fortissima moda" (75% wool, 25% polyamide, mt = 420 m/100 g) about 450 (500) g pink col 41, "Angora" (80% angora, 20% wool, mt = 475 m/100 g) about 40 g each turquoise col 33 and blue col 14 and 20 g white col 01. One long 23/4 mm circular needle.

Ribbing: using the circular needle work K2, P2 rib by hand. Stripes: 6 rows pink, 2 rows white, 10 rows pink, 2 rows blue, 10 rows pink, 2 rows turquoise, 10 rows pink = 42 rows.

St st: work in pink with TD 8. Tucks: work tucks with Angora in st st at the same time. Leave the indicated number of sts in WP. Push rem Ns in NWP to front (position D). Disconnect RC. Over these 26 sts work 18 rows in st st with TD 7 using indicated contrast col. Now join sts of 1st row (= contrast col) to the 26 sts. Tuck at back. Change again to TD 8, connect RC and cont over all sts using pink.

Tension: (measured over st st in pink, TD 8): 25 sts and 40 rows to 10 cm square.

Back centre: cast on 69 (79) sts in pink and work 204 (214) rows in st st. Now cast off 6 (11) sts each for shoulders = 57 sts. Leave sts on a circular needle.

Attention! Using a different brand of wool, please choose one with a similar mt (meterage).

Front centre: work as back centre, but with tucks and with round neck. After 120 rows 1 white tuck over the 21 centre sts, after 140 rows 1 blue tuck over the 31 centre sts, and after 160 rows 1 turquoise tuck over the 41 centre sts. After 170 (180) rows work short rows for neck shaping: leave the 17 centre sts in NWP (see also instructions for machine), then leave at neck edge on every alt row 4 sts once, 3 sts twice, 2 sts 3 times and 1 st 4 times in NWP. Cont straight. After 204 (214) rows cast off rem 6 (11) shoulder sts. Now join the sts of back centre (decreasing 10 sts evenly across). Work band over all sts in st st. After 20 rows cast off all sts. Join the short shoulder seams and band seams.


**Side piece with sleeve** (work 2 pieces): cast on 129 (133) sts in pink and work in st st. After 54 rows cast off at right edge 43 (47) sts once, then cast off 1 st on every 6th row 30 times.

At the same time, after 12 rows, work 1 blue tuck over sts 1 to 158 (always counted from left edge), after 40 rows 1 turquoise tuck over sts 1 to 138, after 68 rows 1 white tuck

over sts 1 to 118, after 96 rows 1 blue tuck over sts 1 to 98, after 124 rows 1 turquoise tuck over sts 1 to 78, after 152 rows 1 white tuck over sts 1 to 58 and after 180 rows 1 blue tuck over sts 1 to 38. After 236 rows leave rem 56 sts in NWP.

**Side piece with sleeve** (work 2 pieces): work as 1st piece, but making dec at left edge and tucks at the right.

To make up: join 2 side pieces with sleeve each. Cuffs: cont over the 112 sts in pink, dec evenly across to 56 sts and work 5 cm in rib patt. Cast off all sts. Waistband: cast on 130 (140) sts in pink and work rib patt with stripes, then cast off all sts. Join all pieces.



# Model **24**

Sweater with circles

**Size:** to fit bust 81/86 (102/107) cm - 32/34 (40/42) in.

**Machines:** These instructions are written for Empesal chunky machine Mod 155 with special facility; also suitable for brother chunky machine.

Materials: SCHOELLER "Ballerina" (68% cotton, 23% polyamide, 9 % acrylic, mt = 100 m/50 g) about 400 (450) g lilac col 14, PINGOUIN "Fil d'Ecosse No 5" (100% cotton, mt = 160 m/50 g) about 200 g pink col 60.

**Ribbing:** work alt K1, P1 on every needle, spacing 3, TD R with fine gauge.

**Half fisherman's rib:** work on every 2nd N, handle on P 3. All other settings: see machine instructions.

Basic patt: work in Fair Isle patt technique on BB. Insert pink cotton in feeder 1, fringed yarn in feeder 2. Punches in patt card K the fringed yarn. Use punchcard 5 (included with the accessories of machine), TD 1, set extension lever to S. All

other settings: see machine instructions.

**Tensions:** (measured over basic patt, TD 1): 19 sts and 20 rows to 10 cm square, (measures over half fisherman's rib, TD R): 13 sts and 30 rows to 10 cm square.

Back centre: cast on 70 (84) sts in pink on BB. Set RC to 000. Cont in basic patt. After 120 rows cast off all sts.

Front centre: proceed as for back centre, but with neck shaping. After 104 rows cast off the 12 centre sts and finish each side separately. At neck edge cast off on every alt row 4 sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts twice and 1 st twice. After 120 rows cast off rem 26 (23) shoulder sts.


Half fisherman's rib band (work 2 pieces): cast on 13 sts with fringed yarn and work 360 rows. Cast off all sts.



sts. Sew the fisherman's rib bands to side edges. Waistband: Cast on about 80 (90) sts with fringed yarn and work 24 rows in rib patt, using WY, K a few rows and remove from machine. Sew waistband in position, catching open sts. Sew sleeves in position, then join side seams.

Machines: These instructions are written for Singer 2320; also suitable for Passap (Pfaff) Duomatic 80, Duomatic S, Electronic 6000.


Materials: SCHOELLER "Menuett" (100% wool, mt = 330 m/100 g) about 450 (500) g violet col 54, ESSLINGER "Angora" (80% angora, 20% wool, mt = 475 m/100 g) about 200 g white col 01. One short 3 mm circular needle.

Ribbing: work alt K2, P2 as foll:

**Back centre:** cast on 114 sts with Angora, then cont in smock patt. Work straight. After 210 rows cast off all sts.

Front centre: proceed as for back centre, but with neck

shaping. After 180 rows cast off the 56 centre sts and finish each side separately. At neck edge cast off on every alt row 5 sts once, 4 sts twice, 2 sts 3 times and 1 st 3 times. After 210 rows cast off rem 7 shoul-


**Side piece** (work 4 pieces): cast on 46 (52) sts with Menuett and work in rev st st. After 226 rows cast off all sts.

Work 2.5 cm in rib patt, cast off all sts. Cuffs: cast on 54 sts each using Menuett and work 30 rows in rib patt, cast off all sts. Waistband: cast on about 150 (162) sts each and work 30 rows in rib patt, cast off all sts. Sew pieces in position, then join side and sleeve seams.



### Model **26**

#### Sweater with

#### Fair Isle borders

**Size:** to fit bust 91 to 102 cm - 36 to 40 in.

Machines: These instructions are written for Empesal electronic Model 550; also suitable for Brother.

Materials: ESSLINGER "Angora" (80% angora, 20% wool, mt = 475 m/100 g) about 400 g white col 01, "Gold und Silber" (80% viscose, 20% other fibres, mt = 380 m/100 g) about 100 g silver col 03.

**Ribbing:** work alt K1, P1 on every 2nd N. TD 6.

Fair Isle patt: transfer border to the foil, starting at left lower edge. Cont foll machine instuctions. After last row cont again to st st. TD 10.

Patt sequence 1: \*2 rows white st st, 14 rows Fair Isle patt, rep from \*.

Patt sequence II: 2 rows silver and 2 rows white in st st, \* 14 rows Fair Isle patt, 8 rows white, 2 rows silver and 8 rows white in st st, rep from \*.

**Tension:** (measured over Fair Isle patt): 29 sts and 35–36 rows to 10 cm square.


Front centre: cast on 74 sts in white and work foll patt sequence I. After 210 rows leave all sts in NWP.


**Back centre:** proceed as for front centre.

Using white work 30 rows in rib patt, then cast off all sts. Join pieces. Waistband: using white pick up about 140 sts over each lower edge and work 30 rows in rib patt, then cast off all sts. Join rem seams.





### Model **27**

#### Sweater

#### with rose motif

**Size:** to fit bust 86 to 97 cm - 34 to 38 in.

**Machines:** These instructions are written for Brother KH 930 and KR 850 (KG 93).

Materials: WSM "Dittamo" (60% viscose, 40% acrylic, mt

= 1750 m/500 g = 1 cone) 1 cone white col 9701 (basic col) and "Lhasa" (50% lambswool, 30% angora, 10% cashmere, 10% polyamide, mt = 90 m/20 g) 220 g black col 9600 (contrast col).

Patt: K1-P1 on double bed (or with KG).

Fair Isle patt on single bed. The patt programme can be ordered (see list of machine manufacturers and machine instructions).

**Stitch size setting:** double bed TD 2/2 II, single bed TD 7. **Tension:** 5 cm = 14.5 sts and 20 rows; KL 116 (= shaping machine): width = 13.8 cm, height = 14.9 cm.

**Height of ribbing:** back and front 10 cm, sleeves 6 cm. The arrow in diagram = knitting direction.

**Back:** cast on 160 sts in white on double bed, work 50 rows K1-P1 rib and transfer sts to machine, inc evenly across to 172 sts. Insert program and work in patt. After 104 rows from ribbing mark edge st on either side. After 216 rows from ribbing slip sts of left half to NWP position. From centre (0) to the right dec 7 sts on every alt row 4 times (short rows). After 224 rows cast off rem 58 shoulder sts. Work left half in reverse. Cast off the 56 centre sts loosely.

**Front:** proceed as for back to 184 rows from ribbing. For neck slip sts of left half in NWP. From centre (0) to the right dec on

every alt row 5 sts once, 4 sts once, 3 sts twice, 2 sts 6 times and 1 st once (short rows). After 224 rows cast off rem 58 shoulder sts. Work left half in reverse. Cast off the 56 centre sts loosely.

**Sleeve:** join both shoulder seams. Pick up 176 sts at side edge between markers and transfer to machine, work 2 rows in black in st st and 156 rows in patt, dec1 st at each end of every 4th row 38 times. After 156 rows (100 sts), dec evenly across to 72 sts. Work 30 rows in K1-P1 rib, cast off all sts. Work 2nd sleeve alike.

Bias band: cast on 15 sts in white and work (TD 5) 17 times: \* 10 rows white and 2 rows black \* in st st. On every alt row dec 1 st at left edge and inc 1 st at right edge. After 204 rows cast off all sts. Start with carriage at left.

To make up: join side and sleeve seams. Sew bias band to neck edge (Rs on Rs), using back sts, fold band over Ws and sew in position.

152 sts. Set RC at 000. Work in fancy lace patt. After 102 sts mark edge st on either side. After 196 rows from ribbing shape neck: push sts of left half in NWP. From centre (0) to the right dec on every alt. row 8 sts twice and 7 sts once (short rows). After 204 rows cast off rem 53 shoulder sts. Work left half in reverse. Using WY, work a few rows over 46 centre sts, then remove from machine.

Front: proceed as for back to 154 rows from ribbing. Shape neck: push sts of left half in NWP (KH 892: note number of rows in punch card - KH 930: press M-key). From centre (0) to the right dec on every alt rows 5 sts once, 4 sts once, 3 sts twice, 2 sts 3 times and 1 st twice. After 204 rows from ribbing cast off rem 53 shoulder sts. Work left half in reverse: KH 892: set punchcard to noted number of rows - KH 930: disconnect N-key. Over the 46 centre sts work as for back. Sleeve: using WY cast on 80 sts on single bed and work a few rows. Cont in fancy lace patt and inc 1 st at each end of every 4th row 30 times, then 1 st on every alt row 4 times. After 140 rows (152 sts) cast off all sts. Work 2nd sleeve alike.

**Sleeve cuff:** cast on 64 sts on double bed. Work 40 rows in K2-P2 rib, transfer sts to machine. Join sts of 1st row of one sleeve and cast off. Work 2nd cuff alike.

**Neck band:** join one shoulder seam. Round neck pick up 148 sts and transfer to machine. Work 8 rows in K2-P2 rib, starting with TD 5. On every row set TD to one full size tighter. Cast off loosely.

To make up: join 2nd shoulder and neck band seam. Sew sleeves in position between markers, join side and sleeve seams.




Machines: These instructions are written for Brother KH 892 (KH 930) and KR 850 (KG 93). Materials: WSM "Angora Nova (75% angora, 25% lambswool, mt = 95 m/20 g) 280 g col 9 (basic col) and "Starlight" (tancy yarn) 7 bobbins col 17 (work with the double yarn, contrast col).

Patt: K2-P2 rib (2nd method) on double bed (KR 850 see instruction book page 26).

K2-P2 rib = 1 strand Angora and 1 strand Starlight (insert separately, then insert into feeder of connection frame.

rancy lace patt: Angora in feeder A, Starlight (double yarn) in feeder B.





**Height of ribbing:** back, front and sleeves 8 cm. Arrow in diagram = direction of knitting.

**Back:** cast on 146 sts on double bed and work 40 rows K2-P2 rib, transfer sts to machine, inc evenly across to







Figures in brackets refer to size 102/107 cm. If there is only one set of figures it applies to all sizes.

**Machines:** These instructions are written for Brother KH 930 with special facility; also suitable for Empesal or Brother-electronic.

**Materials:** WSM "Angora Nova" (75% angora, 25% lambswool, mt = 95 m/20 g) about 300 g blue col 34 and 260 g turquoise col 11.

Ribbing: work alt K1, P1, fine gauge.

Jacquard patt: insert programme card of patt 11 and cont foll machine instructions in Fair Isle patt. Turquoise = basic col, blue = contrast col, TD 10. For Brother and Empisal-Electronic transfer patt to foil

**Tension** (Jacquard patt TD 10): 32 sts and 36 rows to 10 cm square.


Back: cast on 160 (172) sts in blue and work 40 rows rib patt. Transfer all sts to BB. Using WY work a few rows st st, remove from machine. Transfer sts again to BB, inc 1 st after every 5th st 32 (34) times = 192 (206) sts. Set RC at 000 and cont in jacquard patt. After 234 rows cast off the 38 centre sts for neck back and cont each side separately. At neck edge cast off on every alt row 5 sts once, 4 sts once, 2 sts once and 1 st twice. Cast off rem 64 (71) shoulder sts after 244 rows.


Front: proceed as for back, but with V-neck. After 162 rows

from ribbing divide work at centre and cont over each half separately. At neck edge cast off 1 st: \* after 2 rows, 2 rows, 2 rows and 4 rows, rep from \* until 64 (71) sts remain. Cast off these shoulder sts after 244 rows.

**Sleeve:** cast on 72 sts in blue and work 40 rows rib patt. Cont as for back, inc 1 st after every 3rd st 24 times = 96 sts. Cont in jacquard patt. At the same time, inc 1 st at each end of every 3rd row 45 times, then 1 st on every alt row 3 times = 192 sts. After 144 rows cast off all sts.

To make up: for neck band cast on 110 sts twice in blue and work 16 rows rib patt, cast off all sts. Join shoulder seams and band pieces (= centre of neck back), sew band in position. At front point mitre overlapping angles. Sew sleeves in position, join side and sleeve seams.

**Size:** to fit bust 97 to 107 cm - 38 to 42 in.

**Machines:** These instructions are written for Brother chunky machine KH 260; also suitable for Passap (Pfaff) Duomatic 80, Duomatic S, Electronic 6000.

Materials: AUSTERMANN
"Rosetta" (50% mohair, 50%
acrylic, mt = 115 m/50 g) about
250 g lind col 7 and about 150 g
turquoise col 34, "Clarinetta"
(82% viscose, 7% polyester,
11% acrylic, mt = 100 m/50 g)
about 100 g lind-silver col 26.
One 4 mm crochet hook.

**Ribbing:** (in basic col with the double yarn): work alt K1, P1 on every 2nd N, TD 0 - or at the end of work by hand using 4 mm Ns. St st (BB): TD 4.

Intarsia patt (BB): work foll charts 1 and 2 with TD 4. Remove yarn, set lock at left, set to intarsia patt and work 1 row without yarn to the right. All Ns are in WP. Cont in intarsia technique. When changing cols twist yarn. One square = 1 st and 1 row. Work area 1 in lind, area 2 in turquoise and area 3 in lind-silver.

**Tension** (st st, TD 4): 16 sts and 23 rows to 10 cm square.

Work 12 pieces, arrows in diagram = direction of knitting.

Centre front piece: cast on 44 sts in loop technique with turquoise, work foll chart 1. After 68 rows work again rows 1 to 64. then cast off all sts.

Centre back piece: proceed as for centre front piece.

Side pieces, right (work 2 pieces): cast on 94 sts in

loop technique with lind-silver and work st st: rows 1 to 4 lind-silver, rows 5 to 20 turquoise, rows 21 to 24 lind-silver, rows 25 to 40 turquoise, rows 41 to 44 lind-silver. Then cast off all sts.

Side pieces, left (work 2 pieces): work as for right side pieces, but using lind instead of turquoise.

Centre sleeve pieces (work 2 pieces): cast on 44 sts in loop technique with turquoise, work rows 1 to 96 foll chart 2, then cast off all sts.

Side piece of right sleeve: cast on 68 sts in loop technique with lind-silver, work st st: rows 1 to 4 lind-silver, rows 5 to 44 turquoise.


At the same time, cast off at right edge on every alt row 3 sts 20 times and 8 sts once.

Side piece of right sleeve (2nd piece): proceed as for 1st piece, but dec at left edge.


**Side pieces of left sleeve:** proceed as for side pieces of right sleeve, but using lind instead of turquoise.

To make up: join all side pieces to corresponding centre pieces, then join shoulder seam. Sew sleeves in position. For each cuff cast on 36 sts with lind (double yarn), work 15 rows rib patt, cast off all sts. Work waistband alike, but picking up 72 sts each, work 26 rows in rib patt, cast off all sts. Round neck crochet with lind-silver 1 round double crochet and 1 round crab sts (= double crochet from left to right).

Have you decided on yarn and the model of your dreams? Then there are still a few things worth thinking about:

Beginners should keep to fairly easy models first. Otherwise, if what they are knitting should not meet their expectations – and that would certainly be the case with models for the advanced knitter – then they could quite possibly become disheartened and give up all hope of ever being sucessful with needles and yarn.

Whether you are a beginner or an advanced knitter, never forget the tension sample. This should not be made too small and you should be able to measures 10x10 cm quite easily in the middle of the sample. Selvedge stitches frequently lead to false results.

Don't be tempted to work your tension sample only a couple of centimeters in height. Frequently your tension won't change until you have actually worked several pattern repeats.


Even if you have used the same yarn for another model, always work another tension sample as each pattern requires a completely different number of stitches.

Taking your measurements: to measure your bust place a tape measure loosely round the largest part of your bust. The waist measurement is taken at the narrowest point.



#### Winding up yarn

If you buy yarn as a skein (as is usually the case with natural yarns) or unravel a piece of knitting to re-use the yarn (and this is certainly still worthwhile today), then proceed as follows:




Place the skein round the backs of two chairs, draw the chairs apart until the skein is quite taut and cannot become tangled. The yarn can then be wound up without having to enlist the help of anybody else.

This method can also be used to smooth out unravelled yarn, only here the yarn has to be dampened first. When it has dried it will be nice and flat and ready for the next piece of work.


Or you can take the skein of yarn off the backs of the chairs and tie up the opposite ends. Hang one end up on a hook and a weight or something equally heavy on the other. Once the wool has dried, it will be as good as new!

To ensure that the yarn unrolls easily when knitting, wind it up as follows:

Now is the time to decide on whether you prefer the yarn to run off the outside or come out from the inside of the ball.



This is the way the yarn runs off from the outside. Wind the thread a couple of times round two fingers, take this "ball centre" in one hand and hold between two fingers, wind the yarn round the remaining fingers, constantly changing direction. This way the ball remains loose and is easy to knit from.



Wind the yarn a couple of times round the thumb and index finger, remove from the fingers, place together, then wind up the yarn, changing direction frequently.


# You must check the tension!

Before starting work on the garment, you must always check the tension. This will save you trouble in the long run. Also, you can use the test squares later on to make up an attractive patchwork blanket – so the effort really pays off. Work a test square in the pattern stated to be at least 15 cm x 15 cm (6"x 6"). Then use stiff card to make a square with another square cut out (like a window frame) measuring 10 cm x 10 cm (4"x 4"). By laying this frame over your tension square you'll find it easy to count stitches and rows. If the tension is too tight, use a size larger needle. If it's too lose, use a size smaller needle – using, of course, the yarn stated in the instructions.


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
