





Instructions

On the following pages you will find all knitting instructions, diagrams and punchcards under the relevant model numbers. ATTENTION! A number of the designs in this book can be knitted by hand. If you have any questions, we will gladly help.

MODEL 1 JACKET IN TUCKSTITCH

Size: 10 (14) Instructions for second size are in brackets, one figure only applies to both sizes:

Machines: Suitable for chunky machines. Instructions are for Knitmaster and Brother, We used Brother KH

Material: Various qualities of AUSTER-MANN: "Mango" (100% cotton, mercerised, 100 m/50 g) 450 (500) g dusky pink C 24 and 200 (250) g pink C 13. Tapeyarn "Tropical" (100% viscose, 100 m/50 g) 50 g dk. brown C 19. You will also need fabric remnants, beads and bugle beads, flowers, sequins or similar, 6 buttons, knitting needle No. 3,5 and crotchet hook No. 3.5.

The yarn is available in kitform from WOLLSTUDIO Jutta Hinrichs, Wormser Str. 5, 6550 Bad Kreuznach, Tel.: (06 71) 4 26 25.

CUFFS: Knitted in pink by hand as foll.: 2 purl, 4 knit across the row, cabling the 4 knit st on rows 5, 11, 17, 23, 29 and 35. Cast off after R 40. Tuckstitch: Hand selected. Set machine for H.P. and push every 10th needle to H.P. Knit 4 R. Re-set machine for stocking stitch and knit 1 R. These 5 R are repeated.

Pattern sequence: * 5 R tuck stitch, 3 R plain, 5 R tuck stitch (pattern is staggered) 3 R plain *. Repeat from * to

Intarsia: Knitted foll, the chart. Wind a separate ball of yarn for every colour and cross the threads when changing. When knitting Intarsia and Tuck stitch at the same time, select needles as given above and knit. The needles must be returned by hand to intarsia position for R 5. Read all incr. and decr. from the chart. Use e-wrap when incr. several stitches.

Tension: 21 st and 35 R = 10 x 10 cm. T.D. approx 0.

Right front: Knit foll. the chart. For size 40, knit 6 R and return R.C. to 000, so that the rows on chart can be followed for both sizes.

Attention: Watch for the needle arrangement at bottom of chart, as it simplifies the selection of needles for

the pattern. Tuckstitch starts on R 10 with needles 0, 10, 20, 30 etc. Next tuckstitch rows will tuck or needles 5, 15, 25, 35 etc.

Left front: Knit as for right front, reversing the shapings.

Back: Knit as for fronts, but in one piece. Put the right edge of chart on centre 0, it will help in selecting the needles for the pattern. Start neck shaping on R 168 by casting off 10 st in centre. Decr. on alt. R 4 st twice and 3 st once. Cast off rem. 19 (22) st.

Sleeves: Cast on in waste yarn 76 st and knit several rows. R.C. 000. In dusky pink and tuckstitch (no intarsia) knit to R.C. 110, incr. 1 st at each end on next and every foll. 6th row 17 times — 110 st. Shape top by casting off 3 st at beg, of next 2 R. Then decr. at each end on alt, rows 2 st twice and 1 st 3 times. Decr. 1 st at each end on next and foll. 4th row twice — 86 st. Knit straight to R.C. 164 and decr. on alt. rows at each end 3 st. 3 times. Cast off rem 68 st.

Making-up: Knit cuffs by hand as given. Close shoulder and side seams. Crotchet around the outer edge 2 rows dk. brown single crotchet, incr. on corners and decr. where necessary. Crotchet a further 3 rows in pink/dusky pink as appropriate (2 rows only at neck edge). At the same time, make 6 buttonholes in right front over 2-3 sts. Finish front edges with 1 R crabstitch. On the rem. edges, crotchet bobbles: 5 chains, *miss 1 st, 1 treble in next, make 10 loops around the treble, keeping loops on the hook and pulling the yarn through all at the same time. Miss 1 st and make 1 treble in next. repeat from *. Set sleeve top in to armhole, leaving seam still onen.

Fabric flowers: Cut out leaves approx. 12 x 6 cm and sew into position. Chainstitch in dk. brown around the leaves. Embroider the lazy daisy stitch in dusky pink on pink areas, sew on beads etc. and close rem. seams.







MODEL 2 BLUE SILK SWEATER

Size: 18/20

Machines: Suitable for all standard gauge machines with ribber. We used a Brother KH 940.

Material: ZWERGER Silk "Dschubba" (100% fine pure silk, 125 m/20 g) 700 g blue C 25.

Available in kit form from Christl Haegele, Leiwertweg 10, 7939 Öpfingen, Tel.: (07391) 3030. The sweater is also available ready-made.

Tension: 27 st and 29 R to 10 cm after washing. T.D. approx. 10/8 over cable pattern. 1 x 1 rib knitted on T.D. 4/4.

Cable pattern: Knitted over 24 st foll. the chart. Both M.B. and R.B. are shown. After R 50, repeat from R 1. The swatch must be washed and hung up to dry before measuring.


Back: Cast on 160 st and knit 40 R in rib.

Transfer all st to M.B.R.C. 000, T.D. 10, knit straight to R.C. 86. Shape armholes by casting off 10 st at beg. of next 2 R.—


140 st. At R.C. 150 cast off the centre 60 st and continue over each rem. 40 st separately to R.C. 174. Cast off.

Front: Cast on and knit rib as for back. Transfer st to M.B. and incr. to 180 st. R.C. 000. Continue on both beds by arranging needles as foll: Centre 24 st for cable pattern. At each side 10 st on R.B., 3 st on M.B., 10 st on R.B., 24 st for cable pattern, 10 st on R.B., 3 st on M.B., 10 st on R.B. as t on M.B., 10 st on R.B. as t on M.B. and 5 st on R.B. Decr. are worked as for back, but casting off 12 st for the armhole and 66 st for the neck. Cast off rem. 45 st at R.C. 174.

Sleeves: Cast on 66 st. and knit 24 R
1 x 1 rib. Transfer all st to M.B., incr. to
100 st. (or cast on with waste yarn and
knit ribs afterwards). Set R.C. 000 and
arrange needles as foll.: Centre 24 st for
cable pattern, at each side 10 st to R.B.,
3 st on M.B., rem. st on R.B. Knit with
this arrangement, adding increases to
needles on R.B. Incr. 1 st at each end of
next and foll. 4th row 28 times — 156 st.
Knit straight to R.C. 124 and cast off.
Making-up: From each section of neckine, pick up 102 to 108 st and knit 10 R
1 x 1 rib before casting off. Close
shoulderseams and set in sleeves.
Close side and sleeve seams.

MODEL 3 BLUE SWEATER WITH -SEQUIN FLOWERS

Size: 12-16

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with intarsia facility and ribber. We used a Brother KH 910.

Materials: AUSTERMANN Qualities as follows: "Sangria" (100% viscose, 120 m/50 g) 350 g royal C 25 and 100 g lt. blue C 28. "Royal Anjou Angora" (100% Angora 66 m/20 g) 80 g each in royal C 412 and lt. blue C 411. "Sucette" (100% Polyester, 135 m/20 g) 20 g silver C 1.

You will also need 2 sequin appliques. Assorted rhinestones in blue and silver, a crotchet hook No. 3.5.

Available as a kit from WOLLSTUDIO Jutta Hinrichs, Wormser Str. 5, 6550 Bad Kreuznach, Tel.: (0671) 42625.

Tension: 26 st and 30 R = 10 cm. T.D. approx. 10. 1 x 1 rib, T.D. 4/4.

Intarsia: Knitted on M.B. only using charts 1 and 2. Use a separate ball of yarn for each area and cross yarns when changing colours.

Front: With Angora royal cast on 132 st and knit 36 R in 1 x 1 rib. Transfer all st to M.B. and set R.C. to 000. Work in intarsia foll. chart 1 and reading all incr. and decr. from the chart. After 162 R cast off 25 st for each shoulder. Knit the neckband over the rem. 54 st before casting off.

Back: Knit as for front, but substitute Sangria royal in the areas with *.

Right sleeve: With Angora royal cast on 66 st and knit 40 R in 1 x 1 rib. Transfer all st to M.B., incr. evenly to 70 st. Set R.C. 000 and knit in intarsia foll. chart 2, reversing the work around the centre stitch. Read all incr. and decr. from chart. Cast off after last row.

Left sleeve: Knit as for right sleeve, substituting Sangria royal in the areas marked with *.

Making-up: Close shoulder seams. Turn neckband to inside and slipstitch into place. Sew on sequin motifs. Crotchet bobbles in Angora royal and attach like grapes. For 1 bobble make 4 chains and into the 1st chain make 4 half trebles, pulling the last thread through all loops. Make 1 chain and break yarn. Tie to sweater and knot on back of work. In various places embroider in Angora royal or It. blue with satin stitch. Sew on rhinestones. Close all seams. Set in sleeves, gathering the top to fit.





MODEL 4 **BLACK/WHITE SWEATER**

Size: 12/14 (16/18). The figures for the larger size are in brackets, one figure only applies to both sizes.

Machines: Suitable for Knitmaster 550 or 580 with ribber. Can also be knitted on electronic machines with more than 60 st memory.

Sweater could also be knitted with intarsia, embroidering the fine lines afterwards.

Materials: WOLL SERVICE "Glamour" (55% cotton, 45% viscose, 145 m/50 g) 500 (550) g black C 316 and 15 g white C 301. You will also need 2 rhinestones for the eyes and some red Lurex yarn for the mouth. Fabric paint in black for the hair and red for the mouth.

Available as a complete kit from ATELIER Gilla Wilmes, Düsselthaler Str. 1, 4000 Düsseldorf 1, Tel.: (0211) 365885. The sweater is also available ready-made in your size and choice of colour. Price on request.

Tension: 29 st and 35 R = 10 cm. T.D. approx. 8 1 x 1 rib T.D. 3/3.

Fairisle pattern: Transfer pattern to mylar sheet and read into machine. For Knitmaster 580 the Design-Controller will store the pattern for future reference. Attention! If you are knitting over more than 172 st, continue the pattern on either side. Long loops in the centre should be cut and knotted on the inside.

Back: Cast on in black 150 (162) st. and knit 60 R rib. Transfer all st. to M.B. and continue in black. Set R.C. 000, Increase 1 st at each end of next and foll. 8th row 10 times - 170 (182) st. At R.C. 86 mark both edges with a contrast yarn for the start of the sleeve. At R.C. 172 shape neckline: Push centre 18 st and all st opposite to carriage to H.P. * Knit 2 R and push 7 (8) st, to H.P. * Repeat twice more. Knit straight to R.C. 180 and cast off rem. st. Knit other side to match. Return 60 (66) needles in centre to AS. and arrange for 1 x 1 rib. Knit 10 R and

Front: Cast on as for back. Increases


and marker threads are worked as for back, but at the same time, machine is set for single motif fairisle. Neckline shaping starts on R.C. 160. Push centre 18 (20) st to H.P. and all st opposite carriage. * Knit 2 R. Push 4 (5) st to H.P. on alt. rows twice, 3 st once 2 st 3 times and 1 st 4 times. Cast off the rem. 55 (58) st at R.C. 180. Repeat for other side, reversing shapings. Knit neckband as on back, but incr. 3 st on each side — 66 (72) st.

Sleeves: Knitted from top to bottom. Close shoulder seams. Pick up 180 st between marker threads on sweater and place on needles. Set R.C. 000 and knit in black. At the same time, * decr. 1 st at each end of 4th and foll. 4th row and 1st at each end of foll. 2nd row *. repeat from * to * till 96 st remain. When R.C. reads 146 re-hang st on to 72 needles (every 3rd needle has 2 st). Arrange needles for 1 x 1 rib and knit 40 R. Cast

Making-up: Close seams. Embroider

the outline of the mouth in Lurex and colour the inside with fabric paint. Colour the hair. Sew on rhinestones for the eves.





MODEL 5 RED SWEATER WITH WHITE DIAMONDS

Size: 12-16

Machines: Suitable for all standard gauge machines with ribber and intarsia facility. We used a Knitmaster 700.

Material: BOUTON D'OR "Angora" (70% Angora, 30% Wool, 96 m/20 g) 240 g red C 507 and 20 g grey C 16. STAHL SCHE WOLLE "New York" (50% botany wool, 50% viscose, 125 m/50 g) 50 g red C 455.

The yarn is available as a kit from Maschenstudio Claudia Grube, Steintorstr. 8, 3000 Hannover 1, Tel.: (0511). 320835. The sweater is also available ready-made. Price on application.

ready-made. Price on application.

Tension: 25 st and 30 R = 10 cm. T.D. approx. 10. Cable ribs T.D. approx. 5.

Cabled ribs: Knitted on both beds. After casting on, arrange needles as foll. centre 5 st on M.B. 4 st at each side on R.B. 5 st on M.B. etc. Set R.C. 000. Cable the 5 M.B. stitches on R. 4, 12, 20, 28 and 36 with a double and a treble

transfer tool. **At the same time,** on R. 8, 16, 24 and 32 transfer the centre of the 5 M.B. st to the right and leave the empty needle in W.P. The hole will be formed on the next row.

Charts 1 and 2: Transfer all st to M.B. and continue to knit in Intarsia. At the same time, at the appropriate place, cable the 6 st. within the areas in "New York" red. Within the diamonds, transfer the st. on alt. R as shown. Knit chart 1 as mirror image. Chart 2 shows only a section of the sleeve.

Back: Cast on 139 st in New York and knit 40 R in cabled rib. Transfer all st to M.B., incr. evenly to 144 st. Follow chart to R.C. 84 and decr. at each end of alt. rows 8 st. once and 1 st. 8 times. Follow chart for the higher neckline. Cast off

the rem. shoulder stitches.

Front: Knit as for back, but use the deeper armhole shaping as well as the lower neckline.




Sleeves: Cast on 96 st. on M.B. with waste yarn and knit several rows. R.C. 000, continue with Angora red. Incr. 1 st. at each end of next and foll. 4th row 18 times and every 3rd row 8 times — 148 st. At the same time, start the pattern as in chart 2 on R.C. 40. At R.C. 100, cast off at right edge 10 st. and at left edge 8 st. Then decr. 1 st. at each end on alt. rows to R.C. 150. Cast off rem. stitches. Knit the 2nd sleeve to match, but reading left for right on 1 st. decr. Deeper edge will be sewn to the front armhole.


Cuffs: Cast on 62 st. in New York and knit 40 R in cabled rib. Take off with waste yarn and re-hang on M.B. Hang the st. from waste yarn on sleeve, decr. evenly across the row. Knit 1 R. and cast off


Neckband: Cast on 128 st. in New York and knit in cabled rib, but cabling as foll.: Knit 4 R, cable, knit 4 R., transfer st., knit 4 R., cable, knit 4 R. — 16 R. Transfer all st. to M.B., knit 1 R. each at T.D. 8 and 9 and take off with waste

yarn.
Making-up: Steam all pieces from wrong side. Close shoulder, side and sleeve seams. Set in sleeves, making two pleats at the top. Sew on neckband through open stitches with seam at









MODEL 6 **GREEN GARTER SWEATER**

Size: 10-14

Machines: Suitable for Brother Electronic machines with garter carriage. Could be knitted on other standard gauge machines by manually changing stitches.

Materials: Various qualities by Materials: Various qualities by AUSTERMANN: "Kentucky" (50% wool, 50% viscose, 140 m/50 g) 650 g green C 48. "Angora" (70% angora, 30% wool, 100 m/20 g) 20 g green C 440.
Available as a kit from Wollstudio Jutta Hinrichs, Wormser Str. 5, 6550 Bad Kreuznach, Tel.: (0671) 42625. The sweater is also available readymade.

Tension: 27 st and 35 R = 10 cm

T.D. 10. 2 x 2 ribs with garter carriage at


Diamond pattern: Program pattern No. 507 and work with garter carriage. After R 16, cable the 6 centre stitches of alt, diamonds, and with a separate piece of yarn knit these 6 st. by hand, so that they are not too tight. After R. 20, drop the stitch either side of the cable for 8 R. and latch up. Finish the diamond after R C 32 and remove garter carriage, Set carriage outside of turnmark, K.C.1, both Part buttons in. Move pattern to 2nd row and push carriage across without yarn to select needles. Release Part buttons and set for fairisle with Kentucky in feeder 1 and Angora in feeder 2. With T.D. 10***, knit 4 R. Please select the 2nd pattern row only for these 4 rows. After R.C. 36, repeat from beg., cabling over alt. diamonds. Cables can also be knitted by unravelling the 6 st. cabling them and re-knitting them with the yarn. If you wish to knit this sweater on M.B. and R.B. it will be necessary to arrange needles and move them across the beds for the pattern.


Back: Cast on 162 st. with Kentucky and knit 40 R. rib. Set R.C. 000 and change to diamond pattern. At R.C. 176 cast off the centre 58 st. and knit both sides separately. At neckedge cast off on alt. rows, 4 st. once, 3 st. once, 2 st. once and 1 st. once. Cast off rem. 42 st. at R.C.

Front: Knit as for back but with V-neck. For this, separate work at R.C. 140 and knit each side separately. (Knit the unwanted st. back to A-pos. with the nyloncord) At neckedge, decr. 1 st. on every row fully-fashioned until 42 st. remain. Cast off at R.C. 186. Knit 2nd side to match.

Sleeves: Knitted from the top downwards. Cast on 156 st. and knit in pattern, starting with R 17 of pattern. Don't cable in this 1/2 diamond! Decr. 1 st. at each end of every 4th row 30 times = 96 st. At R.C. 124, re-hang the stitches on to 54 needles, decr. as required. Set R.C. 000 and knit 32 R rib. Neckband: Cast on 198 st. with Kentucky and knit 32 R rib. Knit 1 R. plain with Kentucky and 4 R with Angora. Release from machine with waste yarn. Making-up: Close shoulder seams. Sew in neckband, overlapping at the front. Set in sleeves and close rem. seams.

MODEL 7 SWEATER WITH INTARSIA BIRD

Size: 12-16

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with intarsia carriage and ribber. We used a Brother KH 930.

Materials: Cotton/viscose yarn 550 g beige and 100 g lt. olive (150 m/50 g) Remnants in cotton or mixed fibres in yellow, rust, grey, dk. grey, red, green, mid and dk. green and black. Sily yarn in turquoise and petrol. Angora in white. Available in kitform from STRICK-STUDIO Gerti Damerow, Barenfelder Str. 168, 2000 Hamburg 50, Tel.: (040) 3903171. You can also obtain the sweater ready-made.

Tension: 28 st and 39 R = 10 cm. T.D. approx. 9. 2 x 2 rib T.D. approx. 3.

Intarsia: Worked over the centre 140 st. foll the chart, using beige as back-ground and main colour. Use a separate ball of yarn for each colour and cross yarns when changing colours.

Back: Cast on 150 st. in beige and knit 26 R. rib. Transfer all st. to M.B. Continue in beige to R.C. 122. Decr. 1 st. fullyfashioned at both ends of next and every foll. 5th row 21 times = 108 st. At R.C. 214 shape neck: push 40 st. in centre and all st. at side opposite to carriage to H.P. On rem. st. knit 2 R. Push 3 needles to H.P. on alt. rows twice

= 28 st. Knit to R.C. 222 and cast off. Knit other side to match.

Front: Knit as for back, but start intarsia immediately after the rib. The neck-shaping starts at R.C. 190 by pushing the centre 32 st. into H.P. Push into H.P. on alt. rows at neck 4 st. once, 3 st. once, 2 st. once and 1 st. once. The rem. 28 st. are cast off after R.C. 222. Repeat for 2nd side.

Neckband: Replace stitches from backneck on machine and arrange for 2 x 2 rib. Knit 20 R. and cast off. For frontneck, replace stitches as above, picking up 21 extra stitches from neckedges on each side — 94 st. Knit 20 R. and cast Sleeves: Cast on with waste yarn 84 st. and knit several rows. Change to beige and continue in stocking stitch. Incr. 1 st. at each side on next and every foll. 5th row 33 times - 150 st. At R.C. 168 shape top by casting off 4 st. at beg. of next 26 R. Cast off rem. 46 st.

Cuffs: Cast on 70 st. in beige and knit 40 R. rib. Transfer all st. to M.B. Pick up stitches from waste yarn on sleeves and put on to the same needles, decr. evenly across the row. Knit 1 R. and cast off. Making-up: Close shoulder and neck-band seam. Sew on sleeves. Close side and sleeve seams.





TIP! Entering patterns in Brother KH 930 and 940:

Small amounts in olive and khaki for leaves and stems, natural, yellow and copper for flowers and black/gold Lurex for special effects. 11 small buttons (1 in reserve). 85 (90) cm. fine elastic. Available as a kit (excl. embroidery yarn) with buttons and elastic from ATELIER Gilla Wilmes, Düsselthaler Str. 1, 4000 Düsseldorf 1, Tel.: (0211) 365885. You can also buy the jacket ready-made in your choice of colour. Price on request.

Tension: 30 st and 37 R = 10 cm. T.D. approx. 10. 1 x 1 rib, T.D. 3. 2 x 2 rib, T.D. 3. Plain knitting, T.D. approx. 8**. Tuckstich: Transfer pattern to mylarsheet. Marks in R.H. column denote repeats.

Machine settings for back and sleeves: Set pattern cams at both sides to 60. Patternwidth 60. NI cam in centre. Button 1 — right light on. Button 2 — left light on. Button 5 — mirror image (for 580 — right light on, for 550 — light on). Machine setting for right front: Pattern cam at right edge — 4 needles in. At left edge on 60, counting from right cam. Patternwidth — 60. NI cam directly under right Pattern cam. Button 1 — right light on. Button 2 — right light on (pattern runs in opposite direction) Machine setting for left front: Pattern cam at left edge, 4 needles in. At right edge on 60, counting from left cam. Patternwidth — 60. NI cam directly under left cam. Button 1 — right light on. Button 2 — left light on (pattern knits as seen on mylarsheet).

Reading the pattern: Insert mylarsheet. Set as described above. Carriage on right, set for stocking stitch. Knit 2 R. Set for tuck and release card. Back: The peplum is knitted in 3 parts. Cast on over the centre 40 (46) needles with e-wrap or latchtool. Knit 42 R (includes 6 R for hem). Pull stitches to A-position with nyloncord. Cast on 65 (68) st. to the left and knit, decr. 1 st. at left edge on R, 12, 18, 24, 30, 36 and 42. 59 (62) st. remain. Knit needles back to A-position with nyloncord. Cast on and knit at right side as for left, reversing shapings. Return all needles to W.P. 158 (170) st in W.P. Set R.C. 000. Knit straight, incr. 1 st. at each end of R. 6, 12, 18, 24, 30 and 36. Continue straight to 60 and read in the tuckstitch pattern, knitting in tuckstitch from R.C. 63. Increase T.D. to 10*. At R.C. 94 decr. at each side 7 (8) st. Decrease on alt. rows at each side 4 st. once, 3 st. once, 3 (4) st. twice and 1 st. 10 times. Decr. 1 st. every 4th row 5 times = 100 (106) st. Knit straight to R.C. 174 and shape neck, Cast off 20 st. in centre. Decr. on alt. rows at neckedge 5 st. once, 4 st. once, 3 st. once and 1 st. twice - 26 (29) st. remain. Cast off these st. after R.C. 184. Knit other side to match.

Right front: Peplum worked in 1 part

Right front: Peplum worked in 1 part only over needles 40 (46) on left and 45 on right of centre 0. Knit as shown on back, working decr. at left edge. Set R.C. 000 and work incr. and armhole shapings on left side as given for back. Start pattern as on back. For the neck, decr. at right edge on R.C. 156, 5 st. once, then on alt. rows 3 st. once, 2 st. 4 times and 1 st. 8 times. Cast off rem. 26 (29) st. after R.C. 184.

Left front: Knit as **for right front**, reversing all shapings.

Sleeves: With ribber in position, cast on 80 st. in 1 x 1 rib and knit 40 rows. Transfer all st. to M.B. Knit plain to R.C. 80 and read in the pattern. At the same time, incr. at both sides * on alt. rows 1 st. twice and every 4th row once *. Repeat from * to * 160 st. Knit straight to R.C. 110. Shape top. 



Size: 10/12.

Machines: Suitable for all chunky machines with ribber. We used a Brother KH 260.

Material: 650 g natural wool mix yarn C 00 "Parisienne" (47% pure wool, 40% Polyacryl, 13% Alpaca, 115 m/50 g) from Hamburger Wollfabrik. Knitting needle No. 3 to 3.5. Available as a kit from Christi Haegele. Leiwertweg 10, 7939 Öpfingen, Tel.: (07391) 3030. Sweater is also available ready-made. Tension: 21 st and 24 R = 10 cm, taking

an average from all patterns. T.D. 2/2. Ribs: Knitted by hand in 1 x 1 rib or with garter carriage, T.D. 9. Aranpattern: Knitted on both needle

beds. Cast on with waste yarn in 1 x 1 rib and knit several rows. Set R.C. 000 and arrange needles as in first row of pattern chart. Knit chart A over 20 st. and chart B over 22 st. The charts show

arrangement for M.B. and R.B. Transfer stitches when the carriage is on the right and knit 2 rows. Please watch that you never have 2 needles exactly opposite each other. After R. 24 of pattern A, repeat the 3rd to the 24th row.

Pattern B repeats from R. 3 to 14. Cables: 4 st. on M.B. are cabled every 8 rows, always in the same direction.

Front: Cast on 112 st. with waste yarn on both beds and knit several rows. Arrange needles as follows: centre 22 st. for pattern B on M.B. On each side, put 1 st. on M.B., 4 st. on R.B., 4 st. for cable on M.B., 4 st. on R.B., 1 st. on M.B., 20 st. for pattern A on M.B., 1 st. on M.B., 4 st. on R.B., 4 st. for cable on M.B., remaining 2 st. on R.B. Knit with this arrangement to R.C. 124 and cast off the centre 20 st. for the neck. Knit each side separately by casting off at neckedge on alt, rows 2 st. 4 times. Cast off rem. 38 st. for the shoulder at R.C. 136. Back: Knit as given for front, omitting the neck shaping. At R.C. 136, cast off all stitches loosely.

Sleeves: Cast on with waste yarn 66 st. in 1 x 1 rib and knit several rows. Change to mainyarn and arrange needles as follows: centre 50 st. as described for front, and rem. 8 st. at each side in pattern B. Continue in the arrangement and when incr. put needles in correct position for pattern. Incr. 1 st. at each side every 4th row 21 times — 108 st. Knit to R.C. 88 and cast off.

Making-up: Knit all ribs by hand: back and front 100 st. and 30 rows. Sleeves 50 st. and 24 rows. Close shoulder seams. Knit neckband over 88 st. and 10 rows. Sew on sleeves and close side and sleeve seams.





Brother machines with Machines: Garter carriage. We used a Brother KH 940. Cables and diamonds are knitted by hand.

Material: WOLL SERVICE "Torino 4fach" (50% wool, 50% Polyacryl, 144 m/50 g) 850 (900) g red C 965. Knitting needle No. 4, 7 buttons. Available as a kit from WOLLSTUDIO Jutta Hinrichs, Wormser Str. 5, 6550 Bad Kreuznach, Tel.: (0671) 42625. The sweater is also available ready-made.

Tension: 27 st and 31 R = 10 cm over double mosstitch. T.D. 10.

33 st and 31 R = 10 cm over diamond/ cable. Knitted by hand.

2 x 2 rib with garter carriage, T.D. 8. Diamond/cable pattern: Cast on 50 st. and knit by hand following charts A, B and C. Only alt. rows are shown, knit return rows as they appear. Pattern A and C, repeat rows 1 to 8. Pattern B, re-

peat from row 3 to 32.

Back: For the centre panel, cast on 46 st. by e-wrap. Program Pattern 420 and switch 4 UP (double length). Knit 176 R and cast off. For the panels either side, cast on 50 st. and knit 57 cm — 176 R in diamond/cable pattern. For the two outer panels, cast on 16 (22) st. and knit 176 R in double moss stitch. Cast off and join panels with mattress stitch.

Right front: For the right panel, cast on 30 st. and knit 134 R double moss stitch. Shape neck by casting off at right edge 15 st. once, then on alt. rows 4 st. once, 3 st. 3 times and 2 st. once. That finishes the panel. For the diamond/ cable panel, cast on 50 st. and knit in pattern for 47 cm — 146 R. Shape continuation of neck, by casting off at right edge 3 st. once, 2 st. twice on alt. rows and 1 st. 3 times. On the rem. 40 st. continue in pattern to 176 rows and cast off. The left panel is knitted as for the back. Join all panels with mattress stitch.

Left front: Knit as above, reversing all shapings.



Knit neckband over st in H.P., adding 22 st at each side of neck 88 st.

Sleeves: Cast on with waste yarn 82 st and knit several rows. R.C. 000. Change to main yarn and knit to R.C. 154, incr. 1 st at each side on next and foll. 4th row 38 times. At R.C. 158 shape top by casting off 5 st at beg. of next 24 R. Cast off rem. 38 st.

Cuffs: Cast on in beige 70 st and knit 40 R 2 x 2 rib. Transfer all st to M.B. and pick up st from waste yarn on sleeve, hanging 2 st on every 6th needle. Knit 1 row and cast off.

You will also need fabric paint in black, copper coloured beads and a small amount of copper coloured silk or viscose varn for embroidery. The yarn is available as a kit ATELIER Wilmes, from Gilla Düsselthaler Str. 1, 4000 Düsseldorf 1, Tel.: (0211) 365885. You can also purchase the sweater, in your size and choice of colour. Tension: 30 st and 34 R = 10 cm. T.D.





Tension: 21 st and 27 R — 10 cm. T.D. approx. 5. Ribs knitted by hand as 1 x 1

Intarsia: Knitted following charts 1 and 2. Please use separate balls of yarn for each colour and cross the threads when







Machines: Suitable for chunky machines with ribber. We used a Brother chunky KH 260. Instruction written for Brother and Knitmaster.

Material: AUSTERMANN "Piano" (100% cotton, mercerised, 85 m/50 g) 600 g lilac C 56. "Curacao" (59% acetate, 23% viscose, 15% Polyacryl, 3% Lurex, 75 m/ 50 g) 150 g rust C 12. "Madeira" (62% cotton, 38% Polyamid, 90 m/50 g) 50 g lilac C 2. "Royal Anjou Angora" (100% angora, 66 m/20 g) 20 g in each of yellow C 236, rust C 237 and lilac C 242. You will also need 30 cm each of black/ yellow/lilac patterned and plain lilac material, 5 m thick and 2 m thin cord in yellow. Materials available as a kit from WOLLSTUDIO Jutta Hinrichs, Wormser Str. 5, 6550 Bad Kreuznach, Tel.: (0671)

42629. **Tension:** 20-21 st and 29 R = 10 cm.

T.D. 3. 2 x 2 rib at T.D. 0. **Tuckstitch pattern:** Hand selected.

Counting from shoulder edge pull every 5th needle to H.P. and set carriage to hold needles. Knit 4 R. Release Holdlever and knit 1 R. This equals 5 rows tuckstitch.

Pattern sequence: 10 rows Piano, * 2 rows Madeira, 9 rows Piano, 5 rows tuckstitch in Piano, 3 rows Piano, 5 rows tuckstitch in Piano (pattern moved to right by 1 st.) 3 rows Piano, 5 rows tuckstitch in Piano (pattern moved by 1 st to right), 8 rows Piano *. Repeat from * to *.

Intarsia: Knitted following the chart. Use a separate ball of yarn for every colour and cross the threads when changing colours. When knitting intarsia and tuckstitch in same row, pull needles out as usual, but return them to W.P. with transfer tool. Read all incr. and decr. from the chart. Where several stitches are increased, this must be done by E-wrap at side of carriage. Finish the 2nd sleeve in reverse. Start

Welts: For back and front welts, cast on 78 st with waste yarn and knit 20 R rib with Piano and 3 R with Curacao. For cuffs, cast on 38 st and knit as above.

Graft ribs on to garment pieces.

Angora pieces: Plain knitting at T.D. 1.
Knit 2 inlilac. Cast on 25 st. Shape by casting on 1 st at right and casting off 1 st at left on alt. rows. After R.C. 25, reverse the shaping. At R.C. 40, cast off. Knit one piece in yellow, casting on 30 st and incr. and decr. as above to R.C. 30 and reverse shaping to R.C. 50. Knit one piece in yellow as the lilac. Knit one piece in rust over 18 st incr. and decr. as before to R.C. 20 and reverse shaping to R.C. 30. Knit two pieces in rust over 22 st incr. and decr. as before to R.C. 25 and reverse shaping to R.C.


Fabric strips: Gather strips on sewing machine and stitch on in curves, forming leaf shapes.

Cords: Sew on in spirals. Curacao thread: Sew on free-hand. Making-up: Close upper shoulder seams. Graft welts in position. Sew on fabric and angora pieces. Close side and sleeve seams

Tips for embroidering on knitted pieces

The outlines of embroidery are transferred with the help of basting threads.

Copy the design from the magazine on to tracing paper. Pin on to the knitting, using the pins at right angles. Cut the design carefully so it will lay flat. With double thread follow the lines carefully stitches. with small Remove the paper and embroider first the large motifs, then the details. Where two pieces are embroidered with same design, put them both with right sides together and baste through both layers.

Needle on R.B. has knitted. 3rd row: Push 1 needle either side of ribber needle to W.P. and knit 2 rows, 5th row: Transfer the outer stitch on ribber to the next outside needle, leaving empty needle in W.P. and knit 2 rows. 7th row: Transfer 2 outer st on R.B. to next needles, leaving empty needle in W.P. and knit 2 rows. 9th row: as 7th, but transferring 3 outer st. Knit 2 rows. To decr. for leaf shape, transfer 1 st at each end from ribber to M.B. and knit 2 rows. Repeat until all st have been transferred on to M.B.

Cable pattern: Knitted on both beds. After casting on, arrange needles as follows: centre 2 st on R.B. 6 st on either side on M.B., 2 st either side on R.B. Rem. needles as 1 x 1 rib. Knit 5 R and cable the 6 st left and right of centre: on the right cross left over right and on the left cross right over left. Knit 10 R and

repeat. Back: Cast on 148 (158) st and knit 35 R in rib, Transfer all st to M.B. and continue in stocking stitch to R.C. 86. Shape armholes by casting off at each end of next and foll. alt row 8 (10) st once, 4 st once, 3 st once, 2 st twice and 1 st 6 times = 98 (104) st. Knit straight to R.C. 152 and shape neck: Cast off centre 20 st and knit each side separately. Decr. at neckedge on alt. rows, 6 st once, 3 st once, 2 st once and in every row 1 st 6 times. Cast off rem. 22 (25) st at R.C. 166.

Front: Cast on 148 (158) st and after cast-on rows, arrange needles as given for cable pattern. After R.C. 35, transfer all but the centre 14 stitches to R.B. Continue the cable, knitting the other stitches plain. Knit the armhole, the neck and the shoulders as on the back, at the same time, at R.C. 70 take the work off with waste yarn and re-hang with knit side facing you. Take off the centre 14 st on a stitch holder and E-wrap the empty 14 needles. Set R.C. back to 70 and continue to knit. The cables are knitted later. At R.C. 86, knit the first leaf in the centre, At R.C. 105, knit 2 leaves, starting on stitch 15 each side of centre O. At R.C. 123 knit 2 leaves over stitches 30 each side of centre O. At R.C. 141, knit 2 leaves, starting each on stitch 43. When the front is finished, pick up 7 stitches from stitch holder. Incr. 1 st at edge and put 1 at each edge on R.B. Continue in cable pattern for 96-100 R. Knit 2nd cable to match. Sew the cable bands on with mattress stitch. Sleeves: Cast on 66 st and knit 32 R rib. Transfer all stitches to M.B., incr. to 84 st. R.C. DOO. Incr. 1 st at each end of next and every foll. 3rd row 33 times. At the same time and starting at R.C. 10, transfer 1 st to R.B. at each end on every row until only 2 st remain on M.B. Now transfer 1 st each side of centre back to M.B. on Alternate row. At R.C. 95 and 133 knit 1 leaf, starting at centre. At R.C. 100, shape top: cast off at each side on alt, rows 8 st once, 4 st once, 3 st once, 2 st once and 1 st 10 times. At R.C. 176 cast off rem. 62 st.

Making-up: Embroider gold flowers on the front, see picture. Sew the small beads in the flower centre and the large beads under the leaves. Close all seams and set in the sleeves, pleating the top to fit. Crotchet 1 row double crotchet and 1 row crabstitch around the neck.

Knit 2nd side reversed. Chart 2 - Front of top, mirror imaged. Chart 1 and 3 = Sleeves. Please see instructions for sweater, model 26. Cut long threads on wrong side of work and knot securely

Instructions for Jacket:

Back: Cast on 170 (182) st in red and knit 60 R rib. Transfer all st to M.B. and continue plain knitting to R.C. 90. For armhole, cast off at each side on alt. rows, 4 (5) st once, 3 st once, 2 st 4 (5) times and 1 st 12 times. Decr. 1 st at each end of next and foll. 4th row 8 times - 100 (106) st. Knit straight to R.C. 180 and shape neck: Set machine to hold st and push into H.P. centre 22 st and all at side opposite carriage. On alt. rows, push to H.P. at neckedge 6 st once, 4 st once, 3 st once and 1 st once. Cast off rem. 25 (28) st at R.C. 190. Knit other side of neck to match. Instructions for sweater:

Tension: 29 st and 46 R = 10 cm over garterstitch. T.D. approx. 7. 38 st and 33 R = 10 cm over cables.


Increasing stitches after knitting welts


What to do, when the pattern states to "increase evenly after knitting the welt?"

There are several possibilities:

- 1. Knit the welt, knitting the last row slightly looser to make the transfer easier. Now decide at what distances to increase. For example, if you have 80 st and have to increase 10 st, you will need 1 empty needle every 8 stitches. This transfer is simpler if you use a multitransfer tool. First transfer all stitches to the M.B. and drop the R.B. Now move the stitches on the right of centre 0 outwards till you have 5 empty needles. Repeat on the left. Now sort out from the centre: 8 needles with stitches, 1 empty needle etc. Fill the empty needles by picking up a thread from the stitch below.
- 2. Knit the welt and transfer all stitches to the M.B. Knit several rows with waste yarn and remove the work from the machine. Push up the required number of needles (in this case 90). Starting from the right, replace the stitches from the waste yarn: 4 st on 4 needles, leave 1 needle empty, 8 st on next 8 needles, leave 1 empty, etc. Fill the empty needles as above. Remove waste yarn.

If you need to increase more than 10 stitches, it is better to start with waste yarn and add the welt afterwards. More of this in our next issue.





Care of knitted or crotchet garments:

Washing:

Turn the garment on to the wrong side and wash in cold or lukewarm water with a special wool shampoo. Never leave to soak or use too much detergent. Avoid rubbing or wringing to eliminate felting.

The exeption are cotton garments, which may be washed in the washing-machine on wool cycle. Only use the washing-machine when the manufacturers instructions say so.

Rinsing:

Immediately after washing, rinse until the water remains clear. Adding softener improves woollen garments. Take care! Some yarns will stretch when softeners are used. Try your tension swatch first.

Drying:

Roll the garments in towels to remove excess moisture. Lay flat on towels to dry. Never hang knitteds on coathangers to dry.

Storing:

Garments should be folded and stored away from light and heat. Never expose wool to direct sunlight, as it will turn patchy.

If you have to start a new ball of yarn in the middle of a row, untwist the yarn slightly and twist the new end into the old, before knitting the two together.

Tips for the hand-embroidery on knitted garments:


Draw the design on to thin paper and position it on the garment. If you wish the same design on two pieces on knitting, lay them together with right sides inside and put the pattern on top. Use a thread of cotton in a contrast colour and sew through the drawn lines, leaving small loops. Remove pins and pull the two sections apart. Cut the threads, leaving the "trailers" in position.

Use these outlines to embroider the mainpart and fill in the details last.

Do not forget the tension swatch

To make sure, your garments are a good fit, you must check that the number of stitches and rows in 10 cm agreeswith those given. Cast on at least 60 sts. in the appropriate pattern and knit 10 R. Knit 1 R. contrast yarn. Knit 30 rows and mark stitch 21 on each side of centre Ø with contrast yarn. Knit a further 30 rows. Knit 1 row contrast yarn. Knit 10 rows pattern. Take off the machine, pull lengthwise and let the swatch rest. Using the Knitmaster "Green Ruler" lay it between the marked stitches and read off the number of stitches per 10 cm. Repeat for the number of rows. If the figures don't agree, either alter the tension dial setting or work out the number of stitches required, using the measurements given.






