Instructions

On the following pages you will find all the instructions for the models under their relevant numbers, together with charts, patterns and punchcards. A number of the models may also be knitted by hand.

Model 1

Butterfly Sweater in old gold

Sizes: To fit size 10/12-14/16 (18/20-

Instructions for the larger sizes are in brackets. One figure only, applies to all

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with ribber used for the welts. Material: WOLL SERVICE "Glamour" (55% cotton, 45% viscose, 145 m/50 g) approx. 600-650 g (700-750) g in Old Gold C. 353.

Various fabric remnants: large and small beads or sequins, small amounts of yarn for the embroidery.

Tension: 30 st and 36 R = 10 cm. TD approx. 9.

Ribs: Knitted at TD approx. 3.5-4. Arrows in pattern denote direction of

Back: Cast on 160 (172; 184; 190) sts and knit 60 R 1/1 rib. Transfer all sts to MB and set RC to 000. Continue in st st, incr. 1 st at each side on every 18th row 5 times = 170 (182; 194; 200) sts. Knit to RC 100 (104; 108; 112) and shape arm-

holes. On alt. rows, cast off at each side 7 sts once, 3 sts. once (twice; 3 times; 4 times), 2 sts 3 times and 1 st 17 times: 104 (110; 116; 116) sts remain. Knit straight to RC 184 (190; 198; 204) and shape neck. Push into HP the centre 28 (28; 32; 32) sts and all sts at side opposite to carriage. On rem. needles knit 1st side, pushing into HP at neckedge on alt. rows 6 sts twice and 5 sts once. Knit to RC 192 (198; 206; 212) and cast off rem. 21 (24; 25; 25) sts. Repeat for other side.


Return needles from HP into WP and arrange for 1/1 rib. Knit 12 rows and cast


Front: Knit as for back till RC shows 164 (170; 178; 184). Shape neck: Push centre 20 (20; 24; 24) needles and all needles at side opposite to carriage into HP. Knit 1st side by pushing into HP at neckedge on alt. rows 4 sts twice, 2 sts twice and 1 st 9 times. Knit on rem, sts till work measures the same as on back and cast off. Repeat for other side. Knit neckband as described on back.

Sleeves: Cast on with wast yarn 160 (160; 166; 166) sts and knit several rows. Set RC 000 and continue in st st. Increase 1 st at each side on every 6th row 10 times. 180 (180; 186; 186) sts. When RC shows 72, shape top of sleeve. Cast off at each side on alt. rows 8 sts once, 2 sts twice and 1 st 38 (38; 40; 40) times. 80 (80; 82; 82) sts remain. Knit to RC 155 (155; 159; 159) and cast off. Cuffs: Cast on 76 (78; 80; 82) sts for 1/1 rib and knit 40 rows. Transfer all sts to MB. Re-hang sts from bottom of sleeve (19 sts on 9 needles). Bring all needles to HP and knit 1 R. Cast off.

Making up: Close all seams and set in sleeves, pleating the top to fit. Fold cuffs in half to inside and slip-stitch into

The butterflies are cut from rectangles of fabric of approx. 6 x 15 cm. Round off the corners. Fold ½ cm edge to inside and sew with zig-zag stitch to neaten. Gather the centre with small running stitches. Sew on. Make the 2nd part of the butterfly slightly smaller. Body, head and antenna are embroidered in stemstitch. Sew on beads or sequins if wished.

Yellow Jacket with Cables

Size: 12-16

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with ribber. We used a Singer Double bed Machine.

Material: SCHACHENMAYR "Nomotta Catania" (100% cotton, mercerised, 105 m/50 g) approx. 800 g maize yellow

6 buttons, 2-2.5 cm diameter. Crochet hook No. 3.

Tension: 26 sts and 34 R — 10 cm. TD on MB approx 11, TD on RB approx. 9. Distance between beds on 5.

Ribs: 1/1 rib on TD approx. 4, distance set on 5.

Cable pattern: knitted on both beds together. All pieces are started on waste yarn. The needle arrangement is described for each piece. Welts are knitted separately.

Cable A: Take the left 3 sts of the cable panel on a transfer tool. Take the centre 3 sts of the panel on a transfer tool and move them to the left. Re-hang the left 3 sts in the centre. The 3 sts at right

remain. Tip! Pull the needles to HP after transfer and let the machine knit them back.

Cable B: Take the 3 sts at right of cable panel on a transfer tool. Move the 3 sts in the centre to the right and re-hang the right sts in the centre. The 3 sts at left

remain unchanged. Pattern sequence: * Knit 4 R. Knit cable A over each of the 9 sts on the MB.

Knit 4 R. Knit cable B over each of the 9 sts on the MB. Repeat from *. Arrows on pattern denote direction of knitting. Back: Cast on 167 sts with waste yarn and knit several rows. Change to main yarn and set RC to 000. Transfer sts as in diagram 1. Knit as shown in pattern sequence to RC 86. Mark both edges with waste yarn for armhole. When RC shows 88, change to diagram 4. Transfer 1 st at each side of cable in centre to MB and knit 1 R. Cable as shown at side of diagram and move the centre 3 sts to RB. Knit to RC 93 and cable as shown. From RC 97, transfer sts as shown and repeat the sequence of 4 rows from 107 to 110. When RC shows 180, shape neck. Cast off the centre 45 sts. At each side of neck, cast off on alt. rows 3 sts once and 2 sts once. Cast off rem. 56 sts at RC

Right front: Cast on with waste yarn 75 sts. Set RC to 000 and arrange needles as shown in diagram 2. Knit the pattern as described for the back. At RC 170, cast off 5 sts at left edge for the neck. Cast off at neckedge on alt. rows 3 sts 3 times, 2 sts once and 1 st 3 times. Cast off rem. 56 sts at RC 186.

Left front: Knit as right front, reversing the shapings etc.

Sleeves: Cast on 83 sts with waste yarn and knit several rows. Change to main yarn and set RC 000. Transfer sts as in diagram 3. Knit the pattern sequence and at the same time, shape the sides by incr. 1 st at each side on every 4th row 14

times and then on every 3rd row 25 times. Include the additional sts in the pattern when possible. At RC 136, cast off 161 sts loosely.

Back welt: Cast on 150 sts in 1/1 rib and knit 40 R. Transfer all sts to MB. Rehang sts from back on same needles, knit 1 R and cast off.

Front welts: Cast on 74 sts and knit as above.

Cuffs: Cast on 60 sts and knit 20 R 1/1 rib. Finish as on back.

Buttonband: Pick up the edge of the left front and hang on 180 needles. Knit 1 R at TD 7. Transfer for 1/1 rib and knit 17 rows. Knit 1 R at TD 12 and cast off with latchtool.

Buttonhole band: Pick up sts as given above. Knit 8 rows in 1/1 rib. Make 6 evenly spaced buttonholes according to the size of the buttons. Knit to RC 17. Knit 1 row at TD 12 and cast off.

Neckband: Cast on 166 sts in 1/1 rib, starting with TD 3. Increase TD setting every 2 rows, till you have knitted 15 rows. Knit I row very loosely and knit off with waste yarn.

Bobbles: With crochet hook make a chain. Pull the loop out to 1.5 cm. Make 4-5 half trebles in the loop, leaving the last loop of each on the hook. Pull the yarn through all the loops and fasten off. Sew on front and back as shown.

Making-up: Close shoulder seams. Sew on neckband and remove the waste yarn. Sew sleeves between markings on body. Close side and sleeve seams. Sew on buttons.







Diagram 3 (sleeves)

Intarsia Sweater

Size: 12/14

Can only be knitted larger on machines with more than 114 needles.

Machines: We used a Brother KH 230 with intarsia carriage and ribber for the

Material: AUSTERMANN "Aparto" (100% cotton, 75 m/50 g). Approx. 400 g olive, 150 g each in dk. red, rust and yellow. 50 g each in pink and blue. Crochet hook No. 4-4.5.

approx. 5*. **Ribs:** 2/2 rib at TD approx. 0. **Intarsia** is knitted following the diagrams. Reverse patterns for the left hand side. Cross all yarns on the back when changing colours.

Arrows on patterns denote direction of knitting.

All pieces are started with waste yarn and the welts knitted downwards at the

Back: Cast on 110 sts in waste yarn and knit several rows. Change to main yarn and knit, following chart 1. Read the decr for the neck from the chart, using the higher neckline.


Front: Knit as for the back, but shape the neck, following the lower neckline. Sleeves: Cast on 78 sts and knit, following chart 2. Read the increases at the sides from the chart. When RC shows 100, cast off.


Welts: Pick up sts from waste yarn of back or front and hang evenly on 82 needles. With olive, knit 1 R. Transfer sts for 2/2 rib and knit 34 rows. Cast off.


Cuffs: Pick up sts from waste yarn on

sleeves and hang evenly on 42 needles. Knit 1 R and transfer sts for 2/2 rib. Knit 24 rows and cast off.

Making-up: Close shoulder seams and sew sleeves to body. Close side and sleeve seams. Crochet 1 or 2 rows double crochet and 1 row crabstitch around the neckline in olive.







Yellow Garter Stitch Sweater

Size: 12-16.

Machines: We used a Brother KH 930

with garter carriage.

Material: WOLLSERVICE "Cablé 30" (100% cotton, 140 m/50 g) approx. 600 g maize yellow C. 265.

Garter stitch patterns: Fill in the mylar sheet or program the machine.

Cable pattern: 1 row and 12 sts. Sleeve pattern 8 rows and 7 sts. Main pattern 31

sts and 16 rows.

Tension: 27-28 sts and 31-32 R — 10 cm. TD approx. 9. The cable pattern is knitted at TD approx. 8. The 4 sts of the cable are twisted every 4 rows, taking care to cable always in the same direc-

Back: Cast on 165 sts by E-wrap. Set RC 000 and continue in main pattern, till RC shows 76. Mark both edges for the armhole. When RC shows 128, change to cable pattern and knit 32 rows cable at same TD setting. Cast off.

Front: Knit as for back.

Sleeves: Cast on 100 sts by E-wrap and continue in sleeve pattern. Increase 1 st at each side on every 6th row 22 times. At RC 136, cast off all 144 sts loosely. Welts: With wrong side out, re-hang stitches from back or front on 134 needles. Knit 1 row plain. Continue in cable pattern for 42 rows. Knit the last row on a looser tension and cast off with the garter carriage or latchtool.

Cuffs: Pick up loops from lower edge of sleeve, wrong side out, and place on 62 needles. Knit 1 row plain. Change to cable pattern and knit 30 rows. Cast off

as given above.

Making-up: Close shoulder seams, leaving 22 cm in centre for neck opening. Set in sleeves between markers. Close side and shoulder seams.

Model 5

White Sweater with **Flowers**

Size: 12-16

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with ribber and intarsia carriage. We used a Brother KH 930. Materials: Approx. 550 g white Cotton

cotton, 20% Polyacry (80% cotton, 20% Polyacry, 150 m/50 g) from the HAMBURGER WOLLFABRIK.

Small amounts of cotton or silk yarns in pale yellow, yellow, bright yellow, orange, red, It. green, green, cream, lilac, pink, dusky pink and dk. red. Gold Lurex for the embroidery. Multi-transfer

The yarn is available as a kit from STRICKSTUDIO Gerti Damerow, Barenfelder Str. 168, 2000 Hamburg 50, Tel.: (010 49) 40 3903171. Send Eurocheque for DM 120.- (140.-) to include postage. The sweater can also be purchased ready-made for DM 320.- (340.-) from the same address.

Tension: 27 sts and 33 R = 10 cm. TD approx. 9'

Ribs: 2/2 rib at TD approx. 3.

Arrows on pattern denote direction of

Front: Cast on 150 sts by E-wrap. Knit 24 R st st for the hem at TD 7. Pick up loops from cast-on row and hang on same needles. Set RC to 000 and continue at TD 9* following the chart for intarsia. When RC shows 146, shape armholes: Set multi-transfer tool with 6 prongs in work. At each side of work, move 6 sts in by 3, thereby decr. 3 sts at each side. Push empty needles in NWP. Knit 6 rows. Repeat the decreases 5 times - 18 sts decr. at each side.

At the same time, at RC 150 cast off the centre 2 sts and knit each side separately. Read the decr. from the intarsia chart. At RC 236, cast off the rem 37 sts for the shoulder.

Back: Knit as for front, omitting the intarsia. Shape the neck when RC shows 232. Set carriage for HP and put centre 34 sts in HP as well as all sts at side opposite to carriage. At neckedge, push 1 more needle into HP on following 3 R. Cast off shoulder sts as on back. Repeat for other side.

Neckband: Knit 1 R over the 40 sts in HP. Transfer sts for 2/2 rib and knit 10


rows. Cast off.

Left sleeve: Knitted from top to bottom. Cast on 104 sts by E-wrap. Set RC 000. Incr 1 st at each side on next and every foll. row till RC 22. Now incr 3 sts at each side at beg of next 2 rows = 152 sts. Set RC to 000. Shape sides by decr. 1 st at each side on every 4th row 31 times — 90 sts. When RC shows 126, decr. these sts to 70 by doubling up and knit 1 row. Transfer sts for 2/2 rib and knit 38 rows. Cast off.


Right sleeve: Knit as for left sleeve, but with intarsia flower. For this, choose a flower from the chart and knit it upsidedown in the centre of the sleeve.

Neckband Front: Pick up 94 sts from one shaped front edge with purl side out and knit 1 R. Transfer sts for 2/2 rib and insert comb and weights. Knit 10 R and cast off. Repeat for other side.


Making up: Close all seams and set in sleeves. Overlap the neckband at Vneck. Embroider with Lurex.






Instructions for the larger size are in brackets, one figure only applies to both



Machines: We used a Singer Double-bed machine. Suitable only for machines with 7.5 mm gauge, not standard or chunky machines.

Material: SCHACHENMAYR NOMOTTA "Cherie" (100% cotton, mercerised 115 m/50 g) approx. 700 (750) g pink C. 8719 and 50 g each in cyclamen C. 8720 and It. pink C. 8702. JAEGER "Angora" (70% Angora, 20% lambs-wool, 10% Polyamid, 90 m/20 g) 20 g

LL = length of ball in meters. Use similar length if substituting yarns.



each in pink C. 4700 and grey C. 4705. JAEGER "Marbella" (100% viscose, 110 m/50 g) approx. 50 g in fuchsia C. 4929.

Tension: 23 sts and 30 R = 10 cm. TD approx. 10.5 over intarsia.

Ribs: 1/1 rib at TD approx. 5. Distance between beds 4. The hearts are knitted in intarsia.

The hearts are knitted in intarsia. Smaller areas could also be swissdarned.

Arrows on patterns denote direction of knitting.

Start all pieces with waste yarn and knit several rows. Set RC to 000 and continue in main yarn, following the charts given



Front: Cast on 120 (130) sts and work as per chart. Decrease as shown and work the lower neckline. When RC shows 166, cast off rem. 26 sts for shoulder.


Back: Knit as for front, but with the higher neckline.

Sleeves: Cast on 76 sts and knit in st st. Knit hearts in intarsia as required. At the same time, increase 1 st at each side on every 4th row 27 times — 130 sts. When RC shows 114, cast off at each side on alt. rows, 8 sts 7 times (5 sts 11 times). Cast off rem. 18 (20) sts at RC 130 (137). Ribs: For back and front, cast on 100 (110) sts in 1/1 rib and knit 40 rows. Transfer all sts to MB. Hang sts from waste yarn of back or front on same needles, knit 1 R and cast off. For the sleeves, knit the ribs over 50 sts for 40 rows. Work as given above.

Neckband: Cast on 166 sts in 1/1 rib and knit 12 rows, changing the TD setting every 4 rows from 3 to 4 to 5. Transfer all sts to MB and knit 1 R at TD 10. Cast off. Making up: Close shoulder seams. Sew in the neckband with mattress stitch. Set in sleeves and close side and sleeve







Lilac Sweater in **Garter Stitch**

Size: 12-16.

Machines: Suitable for Brother KH 940

and KH 950i with Garter carriage.

Material: AUSTERMANN "Kentucky"
(50% wool, 50% viscose, 140 m/50 g)
approx. 550 g lilac C. 32. 42 small

Tension: 27 sts and 35 R = 10 cm over pattern with TD at approx. 10.

Ribs: Pattern No. 532 from Stitch World at TD 5.

Pattern for back and front: Program machine or mark out mylar sheet. Follow drawn lines on chart for neck shaping. Pattern for sleeves: Use pattern No. 509 from Stitch World.

Arrows on pattern denote direction of

Back: Cast on 144 sts with E-wrap and knit 40 R with pattern 532 as 1/1 rib. Increase sts to 156 and set RC to 000. Knit according to main pattern till RC shows 110. Mark both side edges with yarn for start of armhole. Continue to knit in pattern and follow the chart for the neckline shaping. At RC 206 cast off the rem. 48 sts at each side for the shoulders.

Front: Knit as for back, but with the lower neckline.

Sleeves: Close shoulder seams. Pick up sts between markers and hang evenly on 150 needles, purl side out. Knit 1 R st st. Set RC to 000 and knit pattern No. pattern 509








509 with the garter carriage. Decr. at each side on next and every foll, alt, row 1 st 3 times and then 1 st every 4th row 27 times, 90 sts. When RC shows 116, remove work from machine and re-hang on 54 sts, decr. evenly across the row. Change to pattern 532 and knit 40 R rib. Neckband: Cast on by E-wrap 136 sts and knit 15 R in rib. Knit several rows with waste yarn and remove from machine.

Making up: Sew neckband to neckline with backstitch through last row in main yarn. Close side and sleeve seams. Sew on beads on the cables on the front.

When RC shows 140, remove work from machine and re-hang on 74 needles. Knit 1 R with regular carriage. Change to garter carriage and knit 42 R Welts: Cast on by E-wrap 150 sts and knit 50 R in rib. Pick up sts from lower edge of back or front and hang on same needles. Bring needles out to HP and knit 1 R with regular carriage. Cast off. Making up: Close all seams. Turn neckband in half to the inside and slipstitch in position.





Model 8

Pink Garter Stitch Sweater

Size: 10-16.

Machines: Suitable for Brother Electronic Machines with garter carriage. The lace pattern is hand-transferred.

Material: WSM "Ella" (54% cotton,

46% viscose, 140 m/50 g) approx. 800 g

Garter stitch pattern: Program machine or mark the mylar sheet. The lace patterns are transferred by hand on every 2nd row following the charts, which only show the rows on which transfers are made. Place the lace patterns as you wish.

Tension: 31 sts and 40 R = 10 cm over pattern at TD approx. 6.5.

Ribs knitted at TD 3 with pattern

Arrows on pattern denote direction of knitting.

Back: Cast on 182 sts by E-wrap and knit in pattern to RC 114. Mark both side edges with yarn for the armhole. Knit to BC 208 and shape the neck. Knit back 44 sts in centre and all needles opposite carriage on the nylon cord and knit 1st side by putting out of work on alt. rows, 3 sts once, 2 sts once and 1 st 6 times. Cast off rem. 58 sts for shoulder when RC shows 224. Repeat for 2nd side. Neckband: Bring needles from nylon cord back into WP - 66 sts. Knit 24 R st st over these sts, decr. the tension on every 2nd row by one dot for the first 12 rows and increasing it again on the next

Front: Knit as for back. Sleeves: Close shoulder seams. Pick up 170 sts between markers and place on needles. Knit 1 R at TD 7 with regular

12 rows Cast off loosely.

How to keep your woolens looking good.

Knitted or crochetted garments should never be left soaking in water. It would be better to wash them twice.


To remove stubborn stains, make a strong solution of detergent in a small bowl. Examine the garment for stains and dirty edges and apply the solution to them. Leave for approx. 15 mins before washing


If you suspect that the colour in a garment may "run", wash by hand as usual and then lay the garment in a bowl of plain water for 12 hours. Usually a film of colour will form on the surface of the water. The colour should not run any more.

When washing Angora garments, add a teaspoon of glycerine to the last rinse to make the sweater Glycerine is obtainable from chemists.

Knitted Garments should never be hung on hangers, but should be folded flat.

Never put too many garments in a pile, as they will squash each other.









Size: 10/12 (14/16)

Instructions for the larger size are in brackets. One figure only applies to both

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with ribber.

Material: PHILDAR "Canelis 158" (67% polyacryl, 33% viscose, 117 m/50 g). Approx. 950 (1000) g in white for jacket and top or 750 (800) g for jacket only. For embroidery various small amounts of Angora and shiny yarn in pink, lilac and It. lilac. Several shades of green, Lurex thread in pink for flower. Crochet hook No. 3.

Cable welts: Knitted separately on the double bed with the foll. needle arrangement: centre 4 sts on MB, 2 sts at each side on RB, 4 sts each side on MB, etc. With comb and weights in position, set TD to 9/6 and slide lever to 1. * Knit 3 R. Move RB on half-pitch and

bring 2 needles opposite the 4 on the MB to WP. Knit the row. Return the additional needles to NWP and take up the extra yarn into the sts on the MB. Make cables over each of the 4 sts on MB and repeat from *.

Tension: 26 sts and 31 R = 10 cm over st st on TD 10.

Arrows on pattern denote direction of knitting.

Jacket

Back: Cast on 152 (162) sts with waste yarn and knit several rows. Change to main yarn and set RC to 000. Continue in st st to RC 84. Shape armholes: Cast off at each side on alt rows 5 sts once, 4 sts once, 3 sts once and 2 sts once (twice). Decrease 1 st at each side on every 4th row 5 times — 114 (120) sts. Knit straight to RC 166 and shape neck. Cast off the centre 44 sts and knit each side separately. At neckedge, cast off on alt rows 4 sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts once

and 1 st twice. Cast off the remaining 24 (27) sts for the shoulder at RC 178.

Right front: Cast on 74 (79) sts and knit as for back till RC 84. Shape armhole at right side as described for back. At the same time, when RC shows 80, shape neck by decr. 1 st fully-fashioned at left edge on next and every foll. 3rd row 30 times. Cast off rem. 24 (27) sts at RC 178.

Left front: Knit as for right front, reversing all shapings.

Sleeves: Cast on 84 (90) sts in waste yarn and knit several rows. Change to main yarn and continue in sts st. Incr. 1 st at each side on next and every foll. 3rd row 29 times = 142 (148) sts. When RC shows 94, shape top: Cast off at each side on alt. rows 5 sts once, 4 sts once, 2 sts once and 1 st 6 times. Then decr. 1 st at each side on every 6th row 4 times and on every 4th row 6 times. Decr. on alt rows at each side 1 st twice, 2 sts once, 4 sts once, 5 sts once and 10 sts



Ribs: Knitted by hand. 1st row (on right side) edge st, * purl 1, knit 2 by knitting 2nd st first and then 1st st, repeat from

across row. 2nd row: knit all sts as they appear, eg. knit 1, purl 2. Repeat these 2 rows.

Arrows on patterns denote direction of

knitting. Back: Cast on with waste yarn 130 (140) sts and knit several rows. Set RC to 000 and change to main yarn and st st. Knit to RC 76 and shape armholes. Cast off at each side on alt. rows 4 (6) sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts once and 1 st 4 times = 104 (110) sts. Knit straight to RC 140 and shape neckline. Cast off the centre 52 sts and knit each side separately. Cast off at neck edge on alt. rows 3 sts once, 2 sts once and 1 st once. Cast off rem. 20 (23) sts when RC shows 150.



Decr. on alt. rows at each side, 1 st 6 times, 2 sts 3 times and 4 sts once. Cast off rem. 50 sts at RC 162.





Neckline shaping as shown in graph.

Arrows on patterns denote direction of knitting.

Back: Cast on 170 (184) sts for 1/1 rib and knit 60 rows. Transfer all sts to MB and set RC 000. Continue in st st, incr. 1st at each side on every 24th row 5 times — 180 (194) sts. At RC 128, cast off for the armholes at each side on alt. rows 10 sts once, 5 (7) sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts 4 (5) times and 1 st 4 times. At RC 248, cast off the rem. 56 (59) sts.







3 m iron-on interfacing, 3 cm wide to stiffen the edging. 3 m ribbon in black/

gold. 40 yellow rhinestones pear shaped. 10 white round rhinestones. Small amount black fringed yarn. Remnants of fabric in black/gold for the flowers. Crochet hook No. 3.5.

Tension: 30-31 sts and 37 R = 10 cm over st st at TD approx. 9.

Ribs: 1/1 rib at TD. approx. 3.5-4. Arrows on pattern denote direction of

knitting.

Back: Cast on by E-wrap in Glamour 60 (72) sts and knit 1 R. Shape the back by casting on both sides on alt. rows 13 sts once, 12 sts once, 10 sts twice and 5 sts twice = 170 (182) sts. RC 12. Set RC to 000 and continue in st st. At RC 100, shape armholes. Cast off at each side on alt. rows 3 sts once, 2 sts 8 times and 1 st 12 times = 108 (120) sts. Knit straight to RC 176 and shape backneck. Cast off centre 20 (26) sts and knit each side separately. Cast off at neck edge a further 10 sts and knit to RC 180. Cast off rem. 34 (37) sts.







Steam the Angora strip carefully and sew over the interfacing. Sew on the ribbon in curves with black thread and if necessary use a sewingmachine. Attach the pearshaped stones in between. Cut the fabric into the petalshapes as shown and stitch on, using a zig-zag stitch. Crochet small circles from the fringed yarn and sew into the centre of the flowers. Set in sleeves, gathering the top to fit. If necessary, sew in shoulder pads.





Front: Cast on 140 sts in black and knit, following the chart for decreases at armhole and neck. The patterns are swiss-darned after knitting as shown in the key.

Back: Knit as for front, but with the higher neckline.



Back: Cast on 150 (162) sts with waste yarn. Change to main yarn and work, following chart. Mirror-image around "O" at left edge of chart.

Right front: Work over 71 (77) sts

following chart 1 as far as arrow at left. Left front: Work as right front, reversing all shapings and pattern.

Sleeves: Cast on 110 sts and work, following chart 2, mirror-imaging around

right edge.


Welts: Re-hang open sts from lower edge of back on 120 (126) needles, decr. evenly across the row. Knit 1 R Angora and Metallic. Push RB in position and transfer sts for 1/1 rib. Knit 40 R and cast off.

Re-hang sts from lower edge of front on 56 (60) needles and knit as for back. Cuffs are knitted over 64 (68) sts and 60

Front band: With purl side out, pick up 174 sts from left front edge. Knit 1 row st st. Push RB in position and transfer sts for 1/1 rib. Knit 10 R and cast off.

Right front band: Knit as for left band, but make 7 buttonholes on row 5, evenly spaced.


Making up: Close all seams and set in sleeves, gathering the top to fit. Sew fur fabric along dotted lines. For the collar cut a piece 50 cm long and sew on. Fold in half and neaten front edges from wrong side. Turn over and slip stitch to inside. Sew on buttons.



At RC 250 cast off rem. 27 sts for shoulder. Neckband: Return needles from HP to WP and pick up 20 extra sts on straight edge of neck at each side = 94 sts. Knit 1 R st st. Push RB in position and transfer sts for Rib B. Knit 10 rows and cast off.

Back: Knit as for front, but knit in st st to RC 120 before starting intarsia from chart 2, mirror-imaging the design around right edge of chart. Knit the neckline as shown with short-row method and knit neckband over rem. 54 sts.

Sleeves: Cast on with waste yarn 94 sts and knit several rows. Set RC to 000-and work the intarsia from chart 3, increasing and decreasing as shown on chart. Cast off all remaining sts after last row. Cuffs: Cast on 72 sts for Rib B and knit 40 R in yellow. Transfer all sts to MB pick up open sts from lower edge of sleeve and hang on same needles,

decreasing the extra sts evenly across the row. Knit 1 R and cast off.

Making up: Pin all pieces out according to the measurements, dampen slightlyand allow to dry. Close all seams and set in sleeves.

Size: 12/14.

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with ribber and intarsia carriage. We used a Brother KH 940. Material: 600 g yellow Cotton (80% cotton, 20% Polyacryl, 150 m/50 g) from the HAMBURGER WOLLFABRIK.

Small amounts of viscose, silk or shiny yarns in midbrown, dk. brown, beige, old gold, black, white and turquoise.



Rib A: Knitted with RB on H-position. Push into WP 150 needles on both beds. Knit zig-zag row and hang comb. Knit 2 circular rows. Transfer every 2nd st from RB to MB = 150 sts on MB and 75 sts on RB. Set TD to 5/3 and slide lever on Brother machines on 1.

Rib B: 2/2 rib as usual on TD 3/3. Intarsia: Knitted from charts 1-3 at TD 9**. Take care to cross the threads when changing colours. Smaller areas could be swiss-darned.

Front: Cast on as described for Rib A and knit 26 R in yellow. Transfer all sts from RB to MB = 150 sts. Set RC to 000 and continue in intarsia from chart 1, mirror-imaging the design from the left



Machines: Suitable for all standard gauge machines with ribber. We used a Brother KH 930.

Material: Approx. 550 g white cotton from the HAMBURGER WOLLFABRIK (80% cotton, 20% polyacryl, 150 m/ 50 g).

Arrows on pattern denote direction of

Hearts: E-wrap cast on 8 sts in white and knit 1 R. Set RC to 000. On rows 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16 and 18, increase 1 st at each side fully-fashioned — 26 sts. Knit straight to RC 26. Push half the needles to HP and knit 1st side by decreasing 1 sts at each side fully-fashioned on rows 28 and 30. Cast off rem. 9 sts on row 32. Knit 2nd side the same. Knit 5 hearts and sew 2 on the front, 1 on each sleeve and 1 on the back. If liked, knit 1 more heart twice the size, by increasing beyond row 18, and shaping the top in a similar fashion. Crochet around the edges of each heart with 2 rows double crochet before sewing on.

Back: Cast on 164 sts and knit 54 R in rib. Transfer all sts to MB and continue in st st to RC 92. Shape armholes. With multitransfer tool, move 6 sts in by 3 on each side of work. Push empty needles in NWP. Knit 6 rows and repeat decreases until 24 sts at each side have been decreased. Knit straight to RC 168. Shape neck. Push 48 sts in centre and all sts at side opposite to carriage to HP. Knit 2 R and on next and foll. alt. row, push 1 st to HP altogether twice. Cast off rem. 32 sts at RC 174. Repeat for other side. Knit neckband. Return needles from HP to WP. Reduce tension dial setting to approx. 5*. * Knit 5 R. Pick up loops from 1st row of st st and hang on needles. Knit 1 row at TD 9**. Repeat from * twice more = 3 tucks. Cast off. Front: Knit as for back till RC shows 142. Shape neck. Push into HP the centre 32 sts and all sts at side opposite to carriage into HP. Knit on rem. sts, pushing 1 needle into HP at neck edge on alt. rows 10 times. Cast off rem. 32 sts at RC 174. Repeat for other side. Knit neckband as on back, picking up extra 20 sts along each straight edge of neckline. Sleeves: Cast on 80 sts and knit 60 R in

rib. Transfer all sts to MB and continue in st st. Incr. 1 st at each side on next and every foll. 5th row 18 times - 116 sts. At RC 100, shape top. Decrease 3 sts at each side as described on back. Continue the decreases a further 10 times every 6th row and then twice on every 4th row and twice on every alt. row. Cast off-rem. 26 sts at RC 174.

Making up: Close all seams and set in sleeves, taking care to match the decreases. Knit the hearts and sew on.

Size: 12/14 (16/18)

Machines: Suitable for chunky machines with ribber and intarsia carriage. We used a Brother KH 230.
Material: PHILDAR "Coton d'egypte"

(100% mercerised cotton, 85 m/50 g) approx. 400 (500) g in lilac. "Angora 70" (70% Angora, 20% wool, 10% Polyamid, 80 m/20 g) approx. 80 g

"Spirales" (100% viscose, 105 m/50 g) approx. 100 g each in lilac and black-berry. Crochet hook No. 4.

Tension: 18 sts and 26 R = 10 cm measured over intersia at TD 5*. Ribs: 2/2 rib at TD approx. 0.

Intarsia: Knitted following the charts, at the same time transferring sts by hand to create the lace pattern. Please take care to open all latches after transferring and repeat the pattern across the area marked 1. Repeat rows 1-16 continuously.

Arrows on pattern denote direction of

knitting. Front: Cast on with waste yarn 104 (114) sts and knit several rows. Change to main yarn and work from the chart. Follow the line marked for the lower neckline. When RC shows 68, mark each side for the armholes.

Back: Knit as for front, reversing the pattern areas and knitting the higher

Sleeves: Cast on 72 sts as on back. Knit

according to chart 2. Cast off all sts after last row

Welts: Pick up sts from waste yarn on back or front reducing the number to 78 (82). Knit 1 row st st. Transfer sts for 2/2 rib and knit 30 rows. Cast off.

Cuffs: Pick up sts from lower edge of sleeves and reduce them to 42 sts. Knit 1 row st st and transfer to 2/2 rib. Knit 26 rows and cast off.







Chart 2 (sleeve)

Size: 12-16.

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge electronic machines with ribber and lace carriage.

Can be knitted without lace carriage or on punchcard machines by transferring sts by hand.

Material: HÜBNER "Carrera" (100% cotton, super soft, 125 m/50 g) approx. 550 g pink C. 25.

approx. 10**

Ribs: Knitted as 2/2 rib at TD approx. 6/6.

Lace pattern for back and sleeves: On rows 12, 36, 60, 84, 108, 132 and 156 transfer sts No. 70, 50, 30, 10, 30, 50 and 70 to the right and leave empty needles in WP. On rows 24, 48, 72, 96, 120 and 144 transfer sts No. 60, 40, 20, 0, 20, 40 and 60 to the right and leave empty needles in WP.

Lace flower pattern: For Brother electronic machines program the machine or mark the mylar sheet. The rows for knitting are not shown on diagram and should be included on the mylar sheet. The pattern consists of 4 rows lace carriage and 2 rows knitting carriage. This pattern is not suitable for Knitmaster electronic machines, as the yarn is too thick for the lace carriage. Owners of these machines should use the hand transfer method.

Hand transfer is done following the diagram and repeated 5 times across the row, placing one pattern centrally. **Cable pattern:** Knitted at TD 10**/8 on both beds. Arrange the needles from the centre by having the centre 6 sts on the MB. 25 sts at each side thereof are on the RB. 6 sts at each side are on the MB. 25 sts at each side on the RB. 6 sts on MB and rem. 16 sts on RB. On rows 5, 10, 20, 30, 35, 40, 50, 60, 65, 70 and 80, cable the 6 sts on MB with 2 x 3 prong transfer tools. When RC shows 85, reduce sts of cable by hanging one outside stitch onto its neighbour. Transfer sts from RB to MB, closing the gaps. 157 sts. Knit 1 row — RC 86.

Back: Cast on 158 sts and knit 44 rows in 2/2 rib. Transfer all sts to MB and continue in st st and lace pattern, When RC shows 64, mark each side with waste yarn for armholes. At RC 160, cast off all sts.

Front: Cast on 162 sts and knit 44 rows in 2/2 rib. Transfer sts and arrange for cable pattern. At RC 64, mark both edges with waste yarn for armholes. When RC shows 86, the cable pattern ends as described above and the lace flower pattern starts, placing one flower above each cable. At RC 124, flower lace pattern ends. Continue in st st to RC 130. Cast off the centre 19 sts and knit each side separately. At neckedge cast off on


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
alt, rows 4 sts once, 3 sts 3 times, 2 sts 3 times and 1 st 3 times. At RC 160, cast off the rem. 47 sts.

Sleeves: Close shoulder seams. Pick up 154 sts between markers on side edges and hang on needles. Set RC 000 and continue in lace pattern. Decrease 1 st at each side on next and every foll. 3rd row 35 times — 84 sts. When RC shows 114, re-hang sts on 58 needles. Knit 1 R. Push RB in position and transfer sts for 2/2 rib. Knit 38 rows and cast off.


Neckband: With RB in position, cast on 154 sts in 2/2 rib. Knit 14 rows. Push empty needles in WP. Set TD to 8/8 and set RB to Slip. Knit 4 R on MB only. Knit several rows waste yarn and release from machine. Set RB to Knit and knit 4 rows on RB only. Release from machine

with waste yarn. Making up: Close neckband to a circle. Sew with backstitch through last row in main yarn to neckline, first from outside and then from inside. Close side and sleeve seams.






Lace pattern for electronic machines

"Sunset" (65% acetate, 35% polyester, 150 m/60 express.

Tension: 26 sts and 32 R = 10 cm over intarsia at TD 10.

Ribs: 1/1 rib at TD approx. 6.

Intarsia: Knitted following the chart at TD 10. It is important to cross the threads when changing colours. The chart shows the pattern for ½ the front and back as well as the sleeves with increases and decreases. On the sleeve, continue the border up to the edge. This has only been omitted, to make the line

for the shaping better to follow.

The border is knitted between rows 103-141, Please take note of the "F" on the chart. This is where the background colour changes. The pattern should be programmed or transferred to the mylar sheet according to your own instruction book

Back: With RB in position, cast on 150 sts in rib and knit 40 rows. Transfer all sts to the MB and continue following the chart. Knit the higher neckline from RC 164, reading the shapings from the chart. At RC 170, cast off rem. 26 sts for the shoulder.

Front: Knit as for back, starting the neckline at RC 158.

Sleeves: Cast on with waste yarn 110 sts and knit several rows. Set RC to 15 and knit according to the chart. Read shapings from the chart and cast off rem. 64 sts at RC 171.

Cuffs: With RB in position, cast on 64 sts and knit 60 R in 1/1 rib. Transfer all sts to the MB. Re-hang sts from lower edge of sleeve (7 sts on 4 needles) and knit 1 R. Cast off.

Making up: Close all seams and set in sleeves, gathering the top to fit. Crochet around neckline 1 row double crochet and 1 row crabstitch.




Chart for all pieces







Arrows on patterns denote direction of knitting.

Back: Cast on with waste yarn 150 sts and knit several rows. Set RC to 000 and follow chart for the pattern. When RC shows 92, mark both edges for armholes. At RC 176, shape neck by pushing the indicated sts into HP. At RC 190, cast off the rem. 47 sts for the shoulder. **Neckband:** Bring needles from HP back to WP. Knit 1 row. Push RB into position and transfer sts for 1/1 rib. Knit 26 R and cast off loosely.

Back: Knitted as front, but entirely in lilac and with the higher neckline.

Neckband is knitted as for front.
Sleeves: Cast on 94 sts with waste yarn and knit several rows. Continue in lilac, incr. 1 st at each side on next and every foll. 4th row 28 times — 150 sts. At RC 116, cast off.

Back and front welts: With RB in position, cast on 116 sts and knit 44 rows rib. Transfer all sts to MB. Hang sts from waste yarn at lower edge of back or front (9 sts on 7 needles). Knit 1 row and cast off.

Cuffs: Knitted as described above over 52 sts and 26 rows. Hang 9 sts on 5 needles to decrease. Knit 1 row and cast off.

Making up: Close shoulder and neckband seam. Turn band in half to inside and slip-stitch imposition. Set sleeves between markers. Close side and sleeve seams. Sew on rhinestones.


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



Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with ribber and intarsia carriage. We used a Brother KH 940. Material: 600 g white cotton from HAM-BURGER WOLLFABRIK (80% cotton, 20% polyacryl, 150 m/50 g). Small amounts of cotton in turquoise, It. green and green, mid and dk. blue and lt.

Tension: 28-29 sts and 35 R = 10 cm over st st and intarsia at TD approx. 9. Ribs: 2/2 rib at TD approx. 3.

Back: With RB in position, cast on 154 sts and knit 36 rows 2/2 rib. Transfer all sts to MB. Continue in st st and knit to RC 122. Shape armholes by moving 6 sts in by 3 on each side. Empty needles in NWP. Knit 6 rows. Repeat the decreases till 21 sts at each side have been de-creased. Knit straight to RC 202 and shape neck. Push the centre 42 sts and all sts at side opposite to carriage into HP. Knit 1st side by pushing into HP at neckedge on alt, rows 1 st 5 times. Cast off rem 30 sts at RC 214. Repeat for other side. Neckband: Return needles from HP to WP and knit 1 row. Push RB in position and transfer sts for rib. Knit 14 R and cast off.

Front: Knit as for back till RC shows 10. Start intersia following the chart. At RC 176, set carriage for HP and shape neck. Push centre 42 sts to HP and work one side first. At neckedge, push 1 st to HP on alt. rows, 5 times. Knit to RC 214 and cast off. Repeat for other side. Neckband: Return 52 sts from HP to WP. Pick up an extra 20 sts at each straight side of neckline = 92 sts. Knit as for back.

Sleeves: Knitted from the top down. Ewrap cast on 88 sts and knit in st st. crease at each end on every row 1 st 4 times, 2 sts once. Repeat from * 4 times. Incr. 1 st at each side on next row. RC shows 27 = 150 sts. TIP: In order to increase 2 sts at both sides in the same row, use a separate piece of yarn on the side opposite the carriage.

Set RC 000. Continue in st st and decr. 1 stitch fully-fashioned at each side on every 4th row 35 times - 80 sts. When RC shows 142, remove work from machine and re-hang on 72 needles. Every 7th needle will have 2 sts. Knit 1 row. Push RB in position and transfer sts for rib. knit 36 rows and cast off.

Making up: Steam all pieces lightly from the wrong side, excluding the welts. Close all seams and set in sleeves.







postage. **Tension:** 27 sts and 34 R = 10 cm over st st in both yarns. TD approx. 8*.

Brother and Knitmaster machines may have to increase the TD to 9*. Smocked section: 88 sts = 20 cm. 37 R = 10 cm. Ribs: 1/1 rib in cotton at TD approx. 5.

Intarsia: knitted following the chart. Arrows on pattern denote direction of knitting.

Front and back are knitted in three sections and are therefore started on

waste yarn. Centre front section: Cast on 88 sts with waste yarn and knit several rows. Change to Angora and arrange needles as follows: Centre 2 sts on RB, next 8 sts on MB, 2 sts on RB, 8 sts on MB etc. You will have 8 times 8 sts on MB and 3 sts on MB at each side. On RB will be 9 times 2 sts. The side facing you will be the right side.

Set TD to 8/7 and RC to 000. Knit 6 rows. Thread a separate piece of cotton through 2 sets of sts on RB, starting from the left. Repeat with next three groups, leaving 2 sts at right edge. Knit 12 rows. Using a separate piece of cotton and starting from the right, again pull the yarn through 2 sets of 2 sts on RB and repeat across the row, leaving 1 set of 2 sts at left edge. Continue in this way till RC shows 168. Cast off the centre 58 sts. Knit each side separately. At neckedge cast off on alt. rows 1 st 12 times. Cast off rem. 3 sts at RC 194.

Back centre section: Cast on 54 sts in Angora and knit 176 rows. Cast off. The purl side will be used as the outside. Side sections: Knit 2 pieces in intarsia as shown in the graph and 2 pieces reversed. Cast off all sts at RC 176.

Sleeves: Cast on with waste yarn 98 sts and knit several rows. Continue in cotton, incr. 1 st at each side on every 4th row 25 times = 148 sts. At RC 102 shape top. Cast off on alt. rows at each side 4 sts twice, 2 sts twice and 1 st 3 times. Decr. 1 st at each side on every


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3rd row 14 times and on every 2nd row 1 st 4 times, 2 sts once and 6 sts once. Cast off rem. 66 sts at RC 170.

Back and front welts: Cast on in cotton 134 sts and knit 50 rows rib. Transfer all sts to MB. Re-hang sts from lower edge on needles, reducing the number evenly across the row. Knit 1 row and cast off. Cuffs: Cast on in cotton 58 sts and knit 40 rows in rib. Finish as for back.

Making up: Draw up the cotton threads marking the sts for smocking and fasten off. Sew on beads. Sew up the seams on the 3 sections. Close rem. seams and set in sleeves. Crochet around neckline 1 row double crochet. On 2nd row, * make 1 dc, 4 chains and 1 dc in the 3rd dc of previous row. Repeat from *.





Chart for side parts

Sweater with Lace Sleeves and Fish Motif

Sizes: 14/16 (18/20)

Instructions for the large size are in brackets. One figure only applies to all sizes.

Machines: Knitted on a Brother electronic machine with ribber and intarsia carriage and lace carriage. May also be knitted on Brother punchcard machines or on other standard gauge machines, by transferring the lace pattern by hand. Instructions for this are given.

Material: SCHACHENMAYR "Bagnola" (100% cotton, mercerised, 180 m/50 g) approx. 400 (450) g mint C. 1512, 50 g each in green, It. pink, It. lilac, dk. pink, dk. lilac, red, yellow, white, apricot, black.

Tension: 31 sts and 40 R = 10 cm over st st or intarsia at TD 7.

Lace/fine lace pattern: 32 sts and 44 R = 10 cm.

Intarsia: Knitted following the chart with separate balls of yarn for each colour. Take care to cross the threads, when changing colours. Smaller areas could also be swiss-darned.

Lace/fine lace pattern: Pattern No. 209 from Stitch World. Further instructions in your instruction book.


Lace pattern by hand-transfer: A very similar pattern can be achieved by following the chart shown. Empty needles must always be left in WP.



Neckband: Return needles from HP to WP and knit 1 R. Push RB in position and transfer sts for rib. Knit 14 rows in mint and cast off.

Back: Knit as for front, omitting the intarsia. Start neck shaping on RC 190 by







pushing into HP the centre 48 needles and all needles at side opposite to carriage. On alt. rows push into HP at neck edge 4 sts once, 3 sts once and 2 sts once. Knit neckband as given for front.

Sleeves: Cast on with waste yarn 128 sts and knit several rows. Change to mint and knit in lace/fine lace pattern. Increase 1 st at each side on every 5th row 21 times = 170 sts. When RC shows 110, shape top. Cast off on alt. rows at each side 6 sts once, 5 sts once, 4 sts once, 2 sts 5 times and 1 st 28 times. Now decr. 1 st at each side on every row till 44 sts remain. Cast off.

Cuffs: With RB in position, cast on 64 sts and knit 40 rows rib. Transfer all sts to MB. Pick up sts from lower edge of sleeve and hang 2 sts on each needle. Knit 1 row and cast off.

Making up: Carefully steam the intarsia from the wrong side. Close all seams. Set in sleeves, gathering the top to fit.





Size: 12-16.

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with ribber and intarsia carriage. We used a Brother KH 940.

Material: Approx. 450 g yarn (cotton/ viscose/linen mixture, 170 m/50 g) in beige. Small amounts in silk or shiny yarns inlt. and bright green, dk. and lt. olive, yellow, black, cream and red. Gold Lurex.





When the shoulder sts have been cast off, knit the **neckband** over the remaining needles. Knit 1 row st st, push RB in position and transfer sts for rib A. Knit 14

Sleeve bands: Cast on and knit as given for rib B in beige for 50 rows. Cast off. V-neckband: Pick up 110 sts from one shaped front edge and hang on needles. In beige, knit 1 row st st. Push RB in position and transfer sts for rib A. Knit 14 rows and cast off. Repeat for other side. Making up: Close shoulder seams and sew on sleevebands. Overlap the neckband at the V and sew down. Close remaining seams.

Size: 10-14. Sweater can only be knitted larger on machines with more than 114 needles.

Machines: Suitable for chunky single bed machines with intarsia carriage. Ribs are knitted by hand.

Material: SCHACHENMAYR "Nomotta" "Colerta" (80% cotton, 20% polyester, 90 m/50 g) approx. 300 g dk. blue, 300 g lt. blue, 100 g beige, 50 g each in green, yellow, red, apricot and brown. Small amount in black and white.

Tension: 21 sts and 27 R = 10 cm over st st and intarsia at TD approx. 1.

Ribs: Knitted by hand with knitting needles No. 3 in k1, p1 rib.

Intarsia: Knitted from the chart given. Take care to cross the yarns, when changing colours.

Lace pattern: With single transfer tool, transfer every 5th st to the right, leaving empty needles in WP. Knit 4 rows, repeat the transfers, but moving 3 sts to the left. On part of the sleeve, intarsia and lace will be worked at the same time. Take care, that the latches are always open!

Arrows on patterns denote direction of

knitting. Front: Cast on with waste yarn 114 sts and knit several rows. Change to main varn and intarsia and knit from the chart. Decreases for the armhole are drawn in the chart = 80 sts. After RC 110, continue in st st in lt. blue to RC 122. Shape neck. Push into HP the centre 10 sts and all sts at side opposite to carriage. On first side, push into HP at neckedge on alt. rows 4 sts once, 3 sts once and 2 sts 4 times. When RC shows 138, cast off rem. 20 sts for the shoulder. Neckband: Knit 1 row It. blue over needles in HP. Knit several rows with waste yarn and release from machine.

Back: Cast on and knit as for front, omitting the intersia but instead knitting 26 rows in beige and 55 rows in dk. blue. Continue in It. blue till RC 130. Push into HP the centre 22 sts and all sts at side opposite to carriage. On first side, push into HP on alt. rows at neckedge 4 sts once, 3 sts once and 2 sts once. Cast off rem. 20 sts at RC 138. Repeat for other side. Neckband: Knit as for front.

Sleeves: Cast on with waste yarn 74 sts and knit several rows. Set RC to 000 and continue in dk. blue. Increase 1 sts at each side on next and every foll. 4th row 17 times. At the same time, when RC shows 44, start intarsia. Knit the 2 centre sts in lt. blue, all others in dk. blue. On the following rows, increase the It. blue area by 2 sts at each side. At the same time, also introduce the lace pattern in the lt. blue area. When RC shows 72, shape top. Cast off at each side of next and every foll. alt. row 4 sts







Tension: 28 sts and 34 R = 10 cm over st st and intersia. TD approx. 9**.

Ribs: 2/2 rib at TD approx. 3. **Back:** With RB in position, cast on in white cotton 150 sts and knit 34 rows rib. Transfer all sts to MB. Continue in st st, shaping as shown in chart 1, but omitting the intarsia pattern. When RC shows shape armholes. With multitransfer tool, move 6 sts in by 3 on each side and put empty needles in NWP. Knit 6 rows and repeat the decreases, until 18 sts have been decreased at each side. Knit straight to RC 197 and shape neck. Push centre 42 sts into HP and all needles at side opposite to carriage. On first side, push to HP at neckedge on alt. rows 1 st 6 times. Cast off rem. 30 sts at RC 204. Repeat for other side. **Neck**band: Knit 1 row over needles in HP. Push RB in position and transfer sts for rib. Knit 12 rows and cast off.

Front: Cast on and knit as for back, but including the intersia pattern. Start neckline at RC 174. Push into HP the centre 36 sts and all needles at side opposite to carriage. On first side, push into HP at neckedge on next and every foll. alt. row 1 st 9 times. Continue as shown in chart. After shaping the other side, knit neckband: pick up an extra 20 sts from the straight edge of the neckline on each side — 94 sts. Knit 1 row st

st. Push RB in position and transfer sts for the rib. Knit 12 rows and cast off. Left sleeve: Knitted from top to bottom. Cast on by E-wrap 92 sts and knit 1 row. On the following 18 rows increase 1 st at each end on every row. * Using a spare piece of yarn at side opposite to carriage, incr. 2 sts at each end of next row. Incr. 1 st at each end of next row. Repeat from * once more. RC shows 23 = 140 sts. Set RC to 000. Shape sides by decr. 1 st fully-fashioned at each side of next and every foll. 5th row 28 times = 84 sts. Knit to RC 142. Remove work from machine and replace on 70 needles, decr. evenly across the row. Knit 1 row. Push RB in position and transfer sts for 2/2 rib. Knit 42 rows and cast off.

Right sleeve: Knit as for left sleeve, but include the pattern from chart 2. Knit this in when RC shows 82. Taking care to knit it upside down.

Making up: Steam all pieces lightly from the wrong side, omitting the welts. Embroider with Lurex in stemstitch. Close all seams and set in sleeves.

Rib A: With RB set on H-position, push needles 81-81 on each bed to WP. Knit cast-on row and 2 circular rows. Transfer every 2nd st from RB to MB. Set TD to 5/5 and continue to knit as usual. Rib B: 2/2 rib as normal.

Arrows on patterns denote direction of knitting.

Back: Čast on as described for rib A and knit 28 rows. Transfer all sts to MB = 162 sts. Continue in st st to RC 144. Shape armholes. Decrease 3 sts at each side by moving 6 sts in by 3, using the multi-transfer tool. Knit 6 rows. Repeat the decreases until 18 sts have been decreased at each side. Knit straight to RC 229 and shape back neck. Push into HP the centre 42 sts and all sts at side opposite to carriage. Knit first side by



Knit 10 rows and cast off.


Front: Cast on and work as for back, but include the intarsia pattern from RC 36. Shape neck when RC shows 204. Push centre 28 sts into HP and all sts at side opposite to carriage. Knit first side by pushing to HP at neckedge on every foll. row 1 st 11 times. Knit straight to RC 236 and cast off rem. 38 sts. Repeat for other side. Pick up an extra 19 sts at each straight side of neckline — 88 sts. Knit neckband with the Lurex tuck as on back. Knit rib and cast off.

Sleeves: With RB in position, cast on with It. olive 86 sts and knit 62 rows in rib B. Transfer all sts to MB and continue in st st. Incr. 1st at each side on next and every foll. 5th row 15 times — 116 sts. When RC shows 86, decr. 3 sts at each side by moving 6 sts in by 3 with the multi-transfer tool. Knit 6 rows. repeat a further 10 times. Decr. as before, but on every 4th row twice, and then on every 2nd row twice. Cast off rem. 26 sts at RC 160.


Buttonband: Hold the cuff lengthwise along the needle bed and pick up approx. 44 sts. With Lurex yarn at TD approx. 5, knit 5 rows and cast off. Sew the cast off edge down. Sew on the 5 buttons at equal distances.


Making up: Finish the embroidery and sew on the small buttons. Close all seams and set in the sleeves. Sew motifs to shoulders.

Dear readers,

we know from our reader service, that there are often queries regarding the different types of knitting machines. For the sake of simplicity, we will discuss only the machines used in the patterns in CHIC.

- 1. Standard gauge machines have a distance of 4.5 mm or 5 mm between the needles. Chunky machines have a distance of 9 mm. This applies to all machines with a steel needle bed. If you are not sure of the gauge of your machine, you can measure it with a ruler. The range of usable stitch sizes is normally from 1–10.
- 2. Now for the needle beds. Machines are sold as single or double beds. The single bed is fixed flat on a table. On simple machines you will only be able to knit stocking stitch and perhaps Intarsia. This is the technique using several different balls of yarn, by which you can create pictures. The yarn is laid into the open needles and the threads are crossed, when changing colour. Nowadays however, we use more and more punchcard and electronic machines. In this case, technology makes the work much simpler. Also available are carriages for knitting lace patterns, so avoiding the need of hand transferred patterning. Whenever possible, we will include charts for hand transferred patterns. Therefore if the patterns state "Suitable for all standard gauge machines", no special equipment is required.
- 3. You can extend the range of your knitting at any time, by purchasing a ribber. This is fixed in front of the main bed. In the instructions, we refer to the ribber as RB and the original machine as MB mainbed. With the aquisition of the second bed, you are able to knit patterns in knit and purl stitches in any arrangement.

We hope that this has helped to clear up some misunderstandings and make it easier to follow the patterns.




To make sure, your garments are a good fit, you must check that the number of stitches and rows in 10 cm agree with those given. Cast on at least 60 sts. in the appropiate pattern and knit 10 R.


Knit 1 R. contrast yarn. Knit 30 rows and mark stitch 21 on each side of centre Ø with contrast yarn. Knit a further 30 rows. Knit 1 row contrast yarn. Knit 10 rows pattern. Take off the machine, pull lengthwise and let the swatch rest. Using the Knitmaster "Green Ruler" lay it between the marked stitches and read off the number of stitches per 10 cm. Repeat for the number of rows. If the figures don't agree, either alter the tension dial setting or work out the number of stitches required, using the measurements given.




