



MODEL **SWEATER WITH LACY SQUARES**

Size: 12/14 (16/18). Instructions for the larger size are in brackets. One figure only applies to both sizes.

Machine: Suitable for standard gauge machines with ribber and intarsia carriage. We used a Brother KH 892.

Materials: SCHACHENMAYER "Ango ra" (70% Angora, 20% wool, 10% polyamid, 85m/25g) approx. **350(375)g turquoise**. "Bagnola" "Bagnola"

(100% cotton, mercerised, 180m/50g). 150g turquoise.
The yarn is available by mailorder from Christi Haegele, Burg-Windeck-Str. 4b, 7580 Bühl/Baden, Germany. Send Eurocheque for DM 317.50 (337.50) incl.

Tension: 27 sts and 35 rows = 10cm in Angora. TD. approx. 10.

Ribs: 1/1 rib at TD approx. 3.

Lacy squares: Knitted in intarsia techrique in cotton over 20 sts and 28 rows. Knit 2 rows. * Transfer every 2nd st to the left, leaving empty N in WP. Knit 4 rows. Transfer every 2nd to the right, leaving empty N in Wp. Repeat from *

Arrows on diagrams denote direction

Front: With cotton cast on 128(132) sts for 1/1 rib and knit 50 rows. Transfer all sts to MB, incr. to 142(152) sts. Set RC 000. Continue in **Angora** and state the set of the s work lacy squares in intarsia with cot-ton over centre sts on rows 7 - 34, 39 66 and 71 - 98. AT THE SAME TIME, when RC shows 88, shape armhole. Cast off at each side on alt. rows 4 sts once, 3 sts once(twice), 2 sts once and 1 st twice = 120(124) sts. At RC 114, make a tuck by picking up the loops of the sts from 10 rows below and putting them on the needles. Reset RC 104. At RC 109, work in intarsia and cotton, one lacy square in centre and one square at each side with 4 sts Angora in between. At RC 136, con-tinue in Angora st st to RC 168. Shape neck. Cast off centre 18 sts and knit each side separately. At neck edge cast

off on alt, rows 5 sts once, 4 sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts once and 1 st twice. Cast off rem. 35(37) sts for shoulder

at RC 186. Repeat for other side.

Back: Knits as for front to RC 178 and shape neck. Cast off centre 24 sts and knit each side separately. At neck edge cast off on alt. rows 6 sts once, 4 sts once and 3 sts once. Cast off shoulder sts as on front.


Sleeves: Cast on with waste yarn 70 sts and knit several rows. Change to Angora and st st. Increase 1 st at each side on every 4th row 21 times and on every 3rd row 20 times = 152 sts. AT THE SAME TIME, when RC shows 72, stop RC and knit 10 rows without increasing. Pick up loops from 1st of these rows and hang on same needles. Set RC and continue increases. Knit a

lacy square over centre sts between rows 77 and 104, as described above At RC 148, shape sleeve top. Cast off at each side on alt, rows 1 st 4 times and 2 sts twice (1 st 8 times) = 136 sts. Cast off at RC 160(164). Cuffs: Pick up 52(56) sts from lower edge of sleeves and hang on needles.


Knit 1 row in Angora. Transfer sts for 1/1 rib and hang comb and weights Change to cotton and knit 34 row in rib.

Neck trim: Knit 1 strip each in cotton and Angora over 8 sts and 190 rows. Gast off.

Finishing: Close shoulder seams. Twist the strips together and sew to neckline. Set in sleeves and close rem.

MODEL SIDEWAYS SWEATER WITH PLEATS

Size: 12 - 16.

Machines: Suitable for chunky machines with ribber and intarsia carriage. We used a Brother KH 230.

Material: PHILDAR "Coton d'Egypte" (100% cotton, 85m/50g) approx. 350g Ocean. 200g each in Glycine and Fidji. "Mogador" (82% viscose, 12% acryl, 6% polyester, 86m/50g) approx. 100g Agent. "Angora" (70% Angora, 30% lambswool, 33m/10g) approx. 70g Blanc. "Sunset" (65% acetate, 35% polyester, 160m/20g) approx. 60g Agent. Silver beads and sequin strip. Crocket hook 4mm.

Tension: 19 sts and 26 rows = 10cm at TD approx. 7 over intarsia.

Ribs: 2/2 rib at TD approx. 0.

Intarsia: Knitted foll, the chart, on rows 20, 40 and 70 knit a pleat as follows. Disengage RC and knit 10 rows in revelant yarn. Pick up loops from the first of these rows and hang on same needles. Pull all needles forward and knit 1 row, Engage RC and continue from chart. The 1st and 3rd pleat are knitted in Angora and the 2nd pleat in Sunset used triple.


Front with 1/2 sleeves: Cast on in waste yarn 35 sts and knit several rows. Set RC 000 and knit from chart, reading increases at right edge from chart. At RC 128, shape neck at left edge as shown with lower line. At RC 230, knit second sleeve, reading the chart from row 80 downwards. At RC 210, release rem 35, sts on waste 310, release rem, 35 sts on waste

Back and 1/2 sleeves: Knit as for front, except for using the higher neckline


shaping. Cuffs: Close upper sleeve and shoulder seams. Pick up sts from lower sleeve edge, reducing them to 48 sts. With Coton d'Egypte knit 1 row st st. Trans-fer for 2/2 rib and knit 30 rows. Cast

Welts: Pick up lower edge of back or front and hang on 90 needles. Knit 1 row st st. Transfer for 2/2 rib and knit

30 rows rib. Cast off.
Finishing: Sew on beads and sequin strip. Close rem. seams. Crochet around neckline with 1 row dc's and 1 row crabstitch.

MODEL **PURPLE GARTER** STITCH SWEATER

Size: 12 - 16.

Machines: Suitable for Brother Electronic machines with garter carriage.
On other standard gauge machines with ribber, the pattern may be knitted by transferring stitches.

Material: WOLL SERVICE "Cablé 30" (100% cotton, mercerised, 140m/50g)

approx. 650g purple.

10cm over garter stitch pattern at TD

Ribs: 2/2 rib at TD approx. 5. Stitch World pattern 534. Garter stitch: Stitch World pattern

Main pattern: Mark mylar sheet or program machine. Filled squares denote knit sts.

Lace pattern: After row 4 of the area, transfer centre stitch to the right. Leave empty N in WP. Transfer every 6th st either side across the row. Knit 8 rows. Repeat transfers, using needles in centre of previous transfer.

Arrow on diagrams denote direction of

knitting.

Front: Cast on 146 sts and knit 30 rows in 2/2 rib. Increase stitches to 166 and set RC 000. Knit in main pattern. In upper V-shaped area, make lace holes at 3 or 4 stitch intervals every 6th row. At RC 94, mark both edges for armholes. At RC 190, change to garter stitch and knit 10


rows. Cast off.

Back: Knit as for front, reversing the

pattern:

Sleeves: Close shoulder seams, leaving 22cm in centre open. Pick up 166 sts between markers on side seams and hang on needles, wrong side fac-ing. Set RC 000. Decrease 1 st at each side on every 4th row 33 times. AT THE SAME TIME, knit pattern as follows: 46 rows lace pattern as given above. Turn work and re-hang. Knit 46 rows. Turn work and re-hang. Knit 46 rows. RC 138. Reduce sts to 68 and knit 1 row st st. Set RC 000 and knit 30 rows 2/2 rib. Cast off.


Finishing: Close side and sleeve seams.



MODEL WHITE SWEATER WITH FLOWERS

Size: 12/14 (16/18). Instructions for the larger size in brackets. One figure only applies to both sizes. Machines: Suitable for standard gauge

machines with ribber and intarsia car-

machines with ribber and intarsia carriage. We used a Knitmaster 580.

Material: WOLL SERVICE "Glamour" (55% cotton, 45% viscose, 140m/150g) approx. 500(550) g white. AUSTERMANN "Angora Wolle" (70% Angora, 30% wool, 125m/25g) approx. 100(125)g white. You will also need 75-80 small white flowers. 160-200 long and 180-200

flowers, 160-200 long and 180-200

small white beads.

Tension: 30 sts and 36 rows = 10cm.

TD approx. 9. Ribs: 1/1 rib at TD approx. 3-4. Intarsia: Knitted from chart, reversing


pattern for left side. Arrows on diagrams denote direction

of knitting. Back: Cast on with Glamour 160(172) Back: Cast on with Glamour 160(1/2) sts and knit 60 rows rib. Transfer all sts to MB and set RC 000. Knit in Glamour and st st, increasing 1 st at each side on every 18th row 5 times = 170(182) sts. AT THE SAME TIME, start the interior at RC 60. After RC 120, continue in Angora st st. At RC 100, shape armholes by casting off at each side on alt. rows 4 sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts 4(5) times and 1 st 12(13) times. Decrease 1 st at each side on every 4th 4(3) times and 1 st 12(13) times. Decrease 1 st at each side on every 4th row 6 times = 104(110) sts. Knit straight to RC 182 and shape back neck with HP Push to HP the centre 22 sts and all sts at side opposite to carriage, Knit each side separately. At neck edge push to HP on alt. rows 7 sts 3 times. Cast off rem. 20(23) sts at RC 190. Knit other side. Knit 1 row st st over needles in HP. Transfer sts for rib and knit 25 rows for neckband. Cast

Front: Cast on and knit as for back to RC 164. Shape neck. Push to HP the centre 20 sts and all sts at side oppo-site to carriage. At neck edge push to HP on alt. rows 4 sts twice, 3 sts once, 2 sts 3 times and 1 st 5 times. Cast off shoulder sts as on back. Knit neckband


Sleeves: Cast on in Glamour 84 sts and knit 40 rows rib. Transfer all sts to MB and set RC 000. Continue in st st to RC 80, increasing as follows: * 1 st at each side on every 2nd row twice and on the foll. 4th row once. Repeat from * till there are 160 sts. At RC 80 start intarsia in the centre. At RC 110 shape top. Cast off at each side on alt.
rows 4 sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts once
and 1 st 10 times. Decrease 1 st at
each side on every 8th row 6 times =
110 sts at RC 184. Cast off at each side on alt. rows 2 sts 3 times, 3 sts 3 times, 4 sts twice and 5 sts once. Cast off rem. sts at RC 203.

Finishing: Sew on flowers at random with one bead in centre. SEw on two long beads together with one round bead in between. Close shoulder and neckband seams. Fold band in half to inside and slipstitch in position. Close side and sleeve seams. Set in sleeves, pleating the top to fit.

Size: 12 - 16.

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with ribber and intarsia carriage. We used a Knitmaster 580.

Material: WOOL SERVICE "GLamour"

cotton. viscose, 145m/50G) approx. 550g white. AUS-TERMANN " Angora Wolle" (70% An-gora; 30% wool, 125m/25g) approx. 100g white.

you will also need 5m bead strip white, 1 large white lace flower, 4 small white lace flowers, 10 small white velvet flowers, 100 medium white beads.

Tension: 30 sts and 36 rows = 10cm at TD approx. 9.


Ribs: 1/1 rib at TD approx. 3**-4.
Intarsia: Knitted from charts 1 and 2. Chart 2 is reversed around left edge. Arrows on diagrams denote direction

of knitting. Front: Cast on with Glamour 162 sts and knit 60 rows rib. Transfer all sts to MB and set RC 000. Continue in st st, increasing 1 st at each side on the 18th and every foll. 18th row 5 times = 172. AT THE SAME TIME, when RC shows 42, start the intarsia from chart 1. The chart only shows the centre 140 sts, use Glamour at either side on rem. sts. At RC 100, shape armholes. Cast off 2 sts at each side on every 2nd row 8 times = 140 sts. Knit straight to RC 166 and shape neck. Set carriage for HP and push to HP the centre 24 sts and all sts at side opposite to carriage.

On first side, push to HP at neck edge on alt. rows 4 sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts 4 times and 1 st 5 times. Castoff rem. 38 sts at RC 190. Repeat for other side. For the neckband, knit 1 row st st over needles in HP. Transfer sts for 1/1 rib and knit 24 rows. Cast off.

Back: Knit as for front, reversing the intarsia pattern. Knit neckline as shown on chart, using HP for the shaping. Knit

neckband as given for front. Left sleeve: E-wrap cast on 128 sts with Glamour. Set RC 000 and knit in st st. Cast on at each side on alternate

rows 1 st 6 times and 2 sts 3 times: 152 sts at RC 18. Set RC 000 and knit in st st, decreasing 1 st at each side on every 4 th row 35 times = 82 sts at RC 146. Reduce sts to 72 and knit 1 row. Transfer sts for rib and knit 40 rows 1/1 rib. Cast off.


Right sleeve: Knit as for left sleeve, but start with intarsia pattern from chart 2.


Continue in Glamour.

Finishing: Close shoulder and neckband seams. Fold neckband in half to inside and slipstitch in position. Set in sleeves. Sew the bead strip along the edge of the intarsia. Sew on flowers and beads at random. Close remaining seams.

and black. Cotton in black and white.

Tension: 27-28 sts and 34 rows = 10cm at TD 9**

Ribs: 2/2 rib at TD approx. 3.

Intarsia: Knitted from the chart, reversing the pattern from 0 to the left. Arrows on diagrams denote direction

of knitting.

Front: Cast on in mainyarn 160(172) sts and knit 52 rows 2/2 rib. Transfer all sts to MB and set RC 000. Continue all sts to MB and set HC 000. Commue
in st st to RC 10. Start intarsia and work
till RC shows 110. Shape armholes.
Set multi-transfer tool with 6 prongs
out. * At each side move 6 sts in by 3.
Knit 6 rows. Repeat from * 6(7) times
= 21(24) sts decreased at each side.
Knit straightte RC 166 and shape neck Knit straight to RC 166 and shape neck.

Set carriage for HP. Push to HP the centre 24 sts and all sts at side opposite to carriage. On first side push to HP on alt. rows 1 st 12 times. Cast off rem. 35(38) sts at RC 210. Repeat for other side. For the neckband, pick up 20 sts along the straight edges at side of neck = 88 sts. Knit 1 row st st. Transfer sts for rib and knit 12 rows. Cast off.

Back: Cast on and knit as for front, but knit only the striped triangle in intarsia. Knit armhole shaping as on front. Knit to RC 202 and shape neck. Push to HP the centre 42 sts and all sts at side oppositeto carriage. Knit each side separately, pushing to HP at neck edge on alt. rows 1 st 3 times. Knit neckband as for front without picking up addi-

tional sts.


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
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
Sleeves: Cast on 80(82) sts in mainy-arn and knit 60 rows 2/2 rib. Transfer all sts to MB and set RC 000. Continue an sts to MB and set RC 000. Committee in st st, increasing 1 st at each side on every 4th row 24(26) times = 128(134) sts. When RC shows 102(106) shape sleeve top as given for front with multi-transfer tool. Decrease 3 sts at each side on every 6th row 8 times; on every 4th row 6 times and on alt. rows 5(6) times. Cast off rem. 14 sts at RC 180(186).

Finishing: Close all seams and set in



Back: Cast on in Constant 144(154) sts and knit 50 rows rib. Transfer all sts to MB and continue in st st with Angora. At RC 76, shape armholes. Cast off at each side on alt. rows 5 sts once, 4 at each side of all two 3 sts once, 3 sts once, 3 sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts twice (3 times) and 1 st once = sts. Knit straight to RC 156 and shape neck. Cast off centre 34 and knit each side separately. At neck edge, cast off on alt. rows 4 sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts once and 1 st once. Cast off rem. 28(31) sts ar RC 166. Repeat for other


28(31) sts ar NC 106. Repeat for other side, reversing shaping.

Front: Cast on and knit as for back to RC 26. Start intarsia and lacy pattern as in chart, reversing the pattern for the left side. Knit to RC 136 and shape neck. Sleeves: Cast on in Constant 74(80) sts and knit 62 rows 2/2 rib. Change to Angora and set RC 000. Increase 1 st Angora and set RC 000. Increase 1 st at each side on every 8th row 4 times and on every 6th row 12 times = 106(112) sts. At RC 108, shape top. Cast off at each side on alt. rows 5 sts once, 2 sts 3 times, 1 st 11 times, 2 sts 4 times, 3 sts once and 4 sts twice. Cast off rem. 18(24) sts at RC 156. Neckband: Cast on in Constant 140 sts and knit 16 rows 2/2 rib. Release on waste varm or cast off loosely.

Finishing: Close shoulder seams. Sew in neckband either backstitching through open loops or sewing in cast-off edge. Close rem. seams and set in sleeves.







Tension: 28 sts and 36 rows = 10cm

Ribs: 2/2 rib at TD approx. 5-6.

Pattern: Mark mylar sheet or use Stitch
World pattern No.1. Adapt the pattern
for punchcard machines. Knit on a Fairisle setting, using the same yarn in both feeders. Knit 8 rows. Lift the 8 threads with the latchtool and place them on the centre needle of the next selected needles. Pull the needle to D-position and continue to knit.

Back: Cast on with waste yarn over needles left 77 to right 76 (left 84 to right 83) = 153(167) sts. Knit several rows. Change to mainyarn and set RC 000. Knit in pattern as given to RC 120. Shape armholes. With multi-transfer tool set with 6 prongs out, decrease 3 sts at each side by moving 6 sts in by 3. Knit 4 rows. Repeat the decreases 6(7) times = 21(24) sts decr. each side. Knit straight to **RC 192**. Shape neck. Cast off the centre 25(27) sts. and knit each side separately. At neck

and knit each side separately. At neck edge cast off on alt, rows 6 sts once, 4 sts once and 3 sts once. Cast off rem. 30(33) sts at RC 200.

Front: Cast on and knit as for back to RC 168. Shape neck. Cast off the centre 35(37) sts and knit each side



Continue in cattern incr. 1 st at each side on every pattern, incr. 1 st at each side on every 6th row 17 times = 115(121) sts. At RC 104, shape top. 



Chart for Model 29

Tension: 23 sts and 29 rows = 10cm at TD 0 with close-knit bar.

Ribs: Knitted by hand in cable pattern:
Row 1: Edge stitch, * pl, k2 crossed (knit 2nd st in front of 1st, then 1st stitch), pl. Row 2: Knit all sts ast they appear. Repeat these two rows.

Arrows on diagrams indicate direction of knitting.

Back: With waste yarn cast on 114 sts and knit several rows. Set RC 000 and knit in st st to RC 88. Shape armholes. Cast off at each side on alt. rows 4 sts


Embroidery: Have the diagram enlarged to correct size. Lay pattern on garment and with sewing cotton, tack through the outline of the larger flowers. Embroider these first and then fill the spaces with bullion switch.

Finishing: Close shoulder seams.

If your next ball of yarn is a different dye number, knit 10 rows using the two balls alternately. In this way, the two shades will blend and the difference is less noticable.

TIPS - TIPS - TIPS - TIPS - TIPS

Design your sleeves on squared paper!

Today we will explain how to work out shapings on sleeves using the given measurements and a tension swatch.


- Obtain some squared paper. If the markings are too small, have an enlargement made. This works better, if the original is printed in red.
- 2. Knit and measure a tension swatch. For our example, we will take 29 sts and 36 rows = $10\,\mathrm{cm}$.
- 3. To convert to rows and stitches from the above, divide as follows:


10cm = 29 sts. 1cm = 29 : 10 = 2.9 sts 14.4cm = 14.5 x 2.9 = 42.05 = 42 sts

42.05 = 42 sts

The same technique is used for the rows. Count 1 square for each stitch or row and draw the shape on the paper. Connect the lines and then draw the shapings. You will now be able to read off the shaping from the chart. You can also use the method to arrange patterns for intarsia. Squared paper may distort the pattern slightly, as the stitches are not square, however it is of little consequence.

4. It helps to mark the pattern along the outside edges on every 10th row to facilitate counting. It will also help you to co-ordinate the figures on the row counter with the pattern.


