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Broadly Speaking

We have concentrated on fashion garments in this issue including the blouson style and lacy look. For our Add to Set this month we have designed a polo necked jumper in the Hayfield Machine Knit to add to the dress, skirt and waistcoat and V-necked fairisle jumper.

We have two new features from Susan Nutbeam starting in Stitchin Time. In this issue 'Home Furnishing' begins with Susan telling you how she has knitted most of her furnishings and giving us patterns for a huge cushion and lace lampshade. This feature will continue throughout the year and in the next issue Susan will give you the pattern for a rug. Also starting in the next issue will be a 'Cut and sew' feature with different garments in each issue together with hints on how to knit in this way.

As you all can imagine it is not easy to photograph our garments during the winter months. Sandersons have very kindly let us use their interior design showrooms in the West End of London for our background in some of the photographs in this issue.

I hope some of you have managed to get along to either the Knitsew Exhibition or the Ideal Home Exhibition to see our knitting machine stand. FOCUS ON KNITTING



Pingouin have sent to us 26 new patterns using their iceberg, type shetland, nauge, cythere, sport, pasquinade, monsieur pingouin, poudreuse, caline and la houle yarns. We have illustrated 3 of the patterns here.

Patons have brought out 5 new patterns for all the family featuring their Trident and Pennant crepe yarns. If you have any difficulty in obtaining these patterns please let us know and we will be able to send them to you.

In the last issue we told you about Mailyarns. They have now introduced a new 2ply botany on cone called Fynwul. It is 100% pure new wool on 200g cones. It covers 12 feminine colours at a price of £2.70 per cone (1 - 3 cones) and £2.50 per cone (4 cones and over). Mailyarns believe that Fynwul will help to fill the void for a quality 2ply yarn. 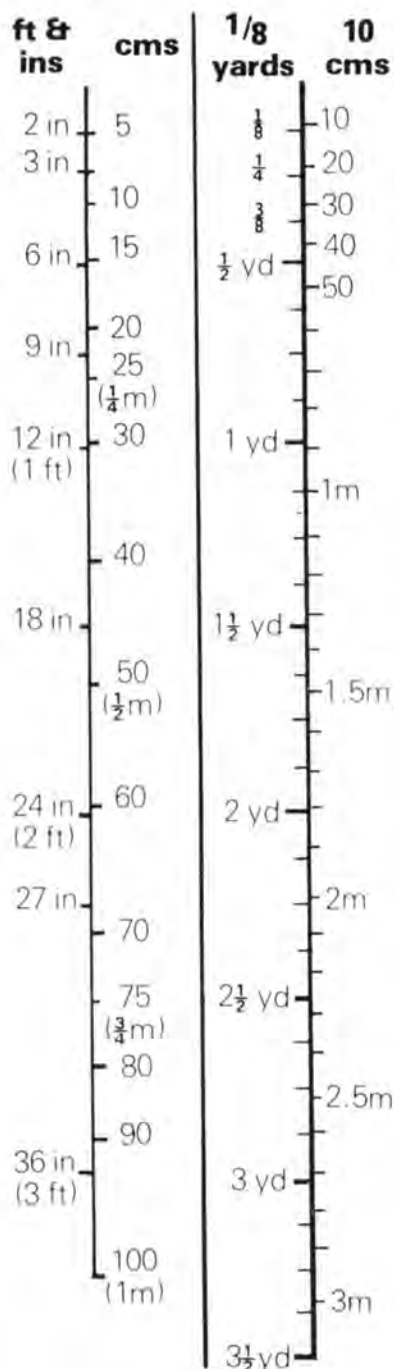

You will have noticed that some of the diagrams relating to shapes have been measured in centimetres. We have listed below metric comparisons for measurements in feet and inches for your guidance.



Approximately:
 1 inch = 2.54 centimetres
 1 yard = 91.4 centimetres
 1 metre = 39 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches

Most wool manufacturers already market yarns in metric packs and most pattern instructions quote weights of yarns in grams. Again for your guidance we have listed approximate conversions from grams to ounces.

MANS WOVEN BATTLEDRESS



Machines

Suitable for most machines

Sizes

To fit 36 (38, 40, 42, 44) in. chest.

Materials

17 (20, 22, 25, 28) 25 gms balls of Beaulon 4 ply Fingering (Hayfields) in Main col. 8 (9, 10, 12, 13, 14) 50 gms balls Hayfields Beaulon crepe chunky in contrast C.

Tension

23 sts. and 40 Rs. to 4 ins. over weaving pattern.

Pattern Notes

KH820/830 machines Stitch patt. 295 from Punchcard patt. Book 1.

KH800 machines: Patt. 298 from Stitchpattern book

KH588 machines: Patt. 282 from Stitchpattern book.

All edgings knitted in M only. Weaving pattern knitted with 4 ply as the knitting yarn and chunky as the weaving yarn.

BACK

Step 1. C.O.B.H. 116 (120, 126, 132, 138) sts. in M. K. 2 Rs. plain at M.T. Change to weaving patt. and continue in patt. throughout. R.C.000 T.D. at M.T., K. to R.C. 120 (130, 140, 150, 160).

Step 2. Cast off 5 (6, 6, 7, 7) sts. at the beg. of the next 2 Rs. Cast off 2 sts. at the beg. of the next 6 (6, 6, 6, 4) Rs. 44 in. only: Cast off 3 sts. at the beg. of the next 2 Rs. ALL sizes: Dec. 1 st. at both sides of next and every foll. alt. R. 5 (6, 6, 7, 7) times in all – 84 (86, 90, 92, 96) sts.

Step 3. K. to R.C. 206 (220, 236, 250, 266). Cast off 5 (5, 6, 6, 5) sts. at the beg. of the next 6 (6, 6, 6, 6) Rs. Cast off 5 (5, 4, 4, 4) sts. at the beg. of the next 4 (4, 4, 4, 6) Rs. Cast off remaining 34 (36, 38, 40, 42) sts.

FRONT (L.H.S.)

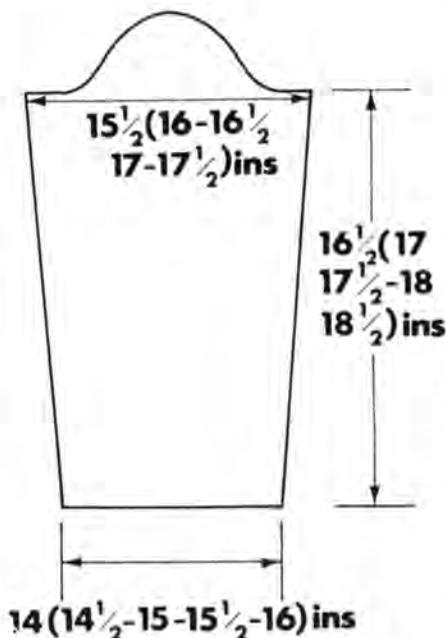
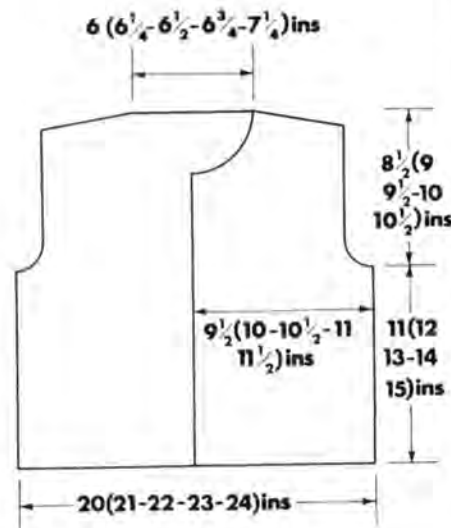
Step 1. C.O.B.H. in M., 55 (58, 60, 63, 66) sts. Knit 2 Rs. R.C.000 T.D. at M.T., start weaving patt. and continue in patt. throughout. K. to R.C. 20 – K. 1 extra R. for R.H.S.

Step 2. Cast off 6 sts. at the beg. of the next R. K. to R.C. 60 – K. 1 extra R. for R.H.S. Cast on 6 sts. at the beg. of the next R. K. to R.C. 120 (130, 140, 150, 160) – K. 1 extra R. for R.H.S.

Step 3. Cast off 5 (6, 6, 7, 7) sts. at the beg. of the next R. K. 1 R. Cast off 2 sts. at the beg. of the next and every foll. alt. R. 3 (3, 3, 3, 2) times in all, K. 1 R. 44 in. only: Cast off 3 sts. at the beg. of the next R. K. 1 R. ALL sizes: Dec. q st. at the beg. of the next and every foll. alt. R. 5 (6, 6, 7, 7) times in all – 39 (40, 42, 43, 42) sts. remain.

Step 4. K. to R.C. 185 (199, 215, 229, 245) – K. 1 extra R. for R.H.S. Cast off 4 (5, 6, 6, 5) sts. at the beg. of the next R. K. 1 R. Cast off 2 (2, 2, 3, 2) sts. at the beg. of the next R. K. 1 R. Cast off 2 sts. at the beg. of the next R. K. 1 R. Dec. 1 st. at neck edge on next and every foll. alt. Rs. 6 times in all.

Step 5. K. to R.C. 206 (220, 236, 250, 266) – K. 1 extra R. for R.H.S. Cast off 5 (5, 6, 6, 5) sts. at the beg. of the next and every foll. alt. R. 3 times in all, K. 1 R. Cast off 5 (5, 4, 4, 4) sts. at the beg. of the next and every foll. alt. R. 2 (2, 2, 2, 3) times in all. K. R.H.S. to match L.H.S., noting difference in Rs. worked.



SLEEVES

Cast on 80 (82, 86, 90, 92) sts. in M, with T.D. at M.T. K. 2 Rs. straight. R.C.000 T.D. at M.T., start weaving patt. and work in patt. throughout. K. to R.C. 10 and inc. 1 st. at both sides of next and every foll. 12th R. 5 (5, 4, 4, 4) times in all – 90 (92, 94, 98, 100) sts.

Step 2. K. to R.C. 164 (170, 174, 180, 184). Cast off 5 (6, 6, 7, 7) sts. at the beg. of the next 2 Rs. Dec. 1 st. at both sides of next and every foll. alt. R. 22 (26, 30, 31, 33) times in all. Dec. 1 st. at both sides of next and every foll. R. 12 (8, 4, 4, 1) times in all. Cast off remaining 12 (12, 14, 14, 16) sts.

POCKETS

Step 1. With wrong side of work facing and Carr. at L.H.S. of bed, pick up between cast off and cast on points on Front piece, 28 sts. T.D. at M.T., K. 1 R. Carr. at right. Transfer sts. for 2x1 rib, with T.D. at M.T. – 2, K. 26 Rs. and pick up every sts. to replace onto empty Ns. (to form pocket hem).

Step 2. T.D. at M.D., K. 70 Rs. and cast off.

FRONT EDGE BANDS

Buttonholes band: With right side of work facing, pick up from front edge 114 (126, 136, 146, 156) sts. T.D. at M.T., using M, K. 6 Rs. Counting from bottom edge of work make buttonholes over sts. as follows: 6, 7, 8 and 9: 29, 30, 31 and 32: 52, 53, 54 and 55: 75, 76, 77 and 78: 98, 99, 100, 101: (6, 7, 8 and 9: 33, 34, 35 and 36: 60, 61, 62 and 63: 87, 88, 89 and 90: 114, 115, 116 and 117: – 6, 7, 8 and 9: 35, 36, 37 and 38: 64, 65, 66 and 67: 93, 94, 95 and 96: 122, 123, 124 and 124: – 6, 7, 8 and 9: 38, 39, 40 and 41: 70, 71, 72 and 73: 102, 103, 104 and 105: 134, 135, 136 and 137: – 6, 7, 8 and 9: 40, 41, 42 and 43: 74, 75, 76 and 77: 108, 109, 110 and 111: 142, 143, 144 and 145). K. 12 Rs. then make buttonholes over same sts. as before, K. 8 Rs. and strip off with waste yarn. Before continuing with other edgings, finish off front edge by backstitching through last row knitted in the main colour.

Button Band: K. as for buttonhole band, omitting buttonholes – finish as above.

NECKBAND AND COLLAR

(Join shoulder seams)
With wrong side of work facing, pick up along front (inc. edgings), back, and along 2nd front, sts. as follows: 27

LONG NIGHTDRESS

(31, 35, 39, 43) sts. from 1st Front, 34 (36, 38, 40, 42) sts. from Back and 27 (31, 35, 39, 43) sts. from 2nd Front. T.D. at M.T., using M, K. 4 Rs. T.D. at M.T.-1, K. 4 Rs. T.D. and M.T., inc. 1 st. f.f. at both sides of next and every foll. 4th R, 12 times in all. K. to R.C. 56 and dec. 1 st. at both sides of next and every foll. 4th R, 12 times in all. T.D. at M.T.-1 K. 4 Rs. T.D. at M.T., K. 4 Rs. Pick up every 3rd sts. from 1st R. picked up and cast off all sts. together LOOSELY.

BOTTOM EDGING BANDS

BACK

Push into W.P. 79 (82, 86, 90, 94) sts. With wrong side of work facing, pick up sts. from bottom back and replace onto machine as folls: st. on 1st 2 (3, 3, 3, 3) Ns. * 2 sts. on next N, 1 st. on next N* repeat from * to * throughout to last 3 Ns. 1 st. on last 3 Ns. T.D. at M.T., K. 30 Rs. straight. Pick up sts. from 1st R. picked up (every 3rd sts.) and cast off all sts. together LOOSELY.

FRONTS

Buttonhole band: With wrong side of work facing, push 40 (42, 43, 45, 47) Ns. into W.P. Carr. at same side as front facing, replace sts. onto machine as folls:

1 sts. on to 1st 5 Ns, *2 sts. onto next N, 1 st. onto next N*, repeat from * to * to last 5 (5, 4, 4, 4) Ns, 1 sts. on last 5 (5, 4, 4, 4) Ns. Join yarn to work and cast on 14 sts. in front of front facing band. T.D. at M.T., using M, K. 8 Rs. straight. Counting sts. from overlap front edge, make buttonhole over sts. 7, 8, 9 and 10. K. 14 Rs. straight and make buttonhole over same sts. as before. K. 8 Rs. and pick up every 3rd sts. from 1st R. picked up and cast off all sts. together LOOSELY.

Button band: K. as for buttonhole band, omitting buttonhole.

SLEEVE EDGINGS

With wrong side of work facing, pick up and replace sts. onto 42 (43, 45, 47, 48) Ns. as folls: 1 sts. on 1sr 2 Ns, *2 sts. on next N*, repeat from * to * to last 2 Ns, 1 sts. on last 2 Ns. T.D. at M.T., using M, K. 30 Rs. and pick up every 3rd sts. from 1st row picked up, cast off all sts. together LOOSELY.

TO MAKE UP

Set in sleeves. Sew cast off side of pocket to matching position on back side seam. Join remainder of side seam. Join sleeve seams. Finish off all edging bands by sewing seams neatly. Give final light press.



Measurements

To fit bust: 81cm (32"), 86cm (34"), 91cm (36"), 97cm (38").

Materials

Mailyarns Ltd., 38 High Street, Syston, Leicester, LE7 8GP.
Bancot 4ply cotton. 2½ cones.

Tension

Always check tension before commencing.

T4 40 sts = 11cm and 60 rs = 13cm.
(Success depends on working to correct tension.)

Notes

Lace Card No. 21D from Basic pack. K m/c KH830.

BACK (left)

Insert card and lock on row 1. In W.WI. cast on 119 (123, 127, 131) sts. Knit a few rs. Change to M.WI. T3 knit 20 rs. Make hem and knit the row. Carr to right. RC 000. T4. (Release card and work in lace to row 80 then work in st.st.) Dec 1 st at right on next and ev foll 12th row until 79 (83, 87, 91) sts rem. Knit to 578 rs. Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row. Knit 1 row. RC 000. Knit to 46 rs and cont in lace. * Knit to 112 rs then start **shoulder shaping**. Cast off 7 (9, 11, 13) sts at beg of next row. Knit 1 row. Cast off 4 sts at beg of next and ev foll 2nd row until 32 (34, 36, 38) sts rem. Cast off.

BACK (right)

Knit to match reversing all shapings.

FRONT (left)

Knit as back to *. For **neck shaping** dec 1 st at left on next and ev foll 4th row. Work to 112 rs then start **shoulder shaping**. Cast off 7 (9, 11, 13) sts at beg of next row. Knit 1 row. Cast off 4 sts at beg of next and ev foll 2nd row until 7 (9, 11, 13) sts rem. Cast off.

FRONT (right)

Knit to match reversing all shapings. Join shoulder seams and mark centre back neck.

ARMHOLE EDGE

With W.WI. cast on 120 sts. Knit a few rs. Change to M.WI. T3. Knit 12 rs. Turn up hem. With wrong side of work facing pick up 120 sts along armhole edge and place on nds. Cast off.

NECK EDGE

With W.WI. cast on 140 sts. Knit a few rs. Change to M.WI. T3. Knit 2 rs. * Dec 1 st at each end of next row, knit 1 row * rep once more. Inc 1 st at beg of next 4 rs. Knit 2 rs. Turn up hem. Pick up 140 sts along neck edge from centre front to centre front, place on nds. Cast off.

Join all rem seams and press.



Blouse with woven Lace Sleeves and Bolero

Materials

Silverknit 1 cone Saturn, 1 cone Dakota, $\frac{1}{2}$ m x $\frac{1}{2}$ " ribbon, 20 buttons

Measurements

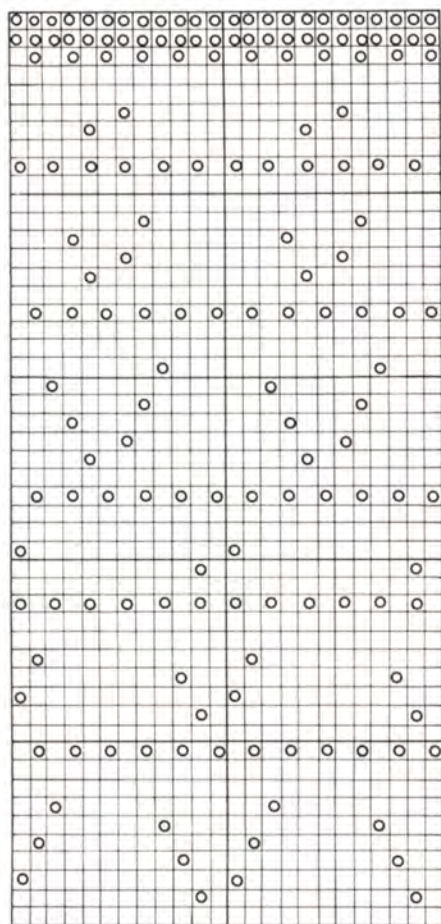
To fit 32 (34, 36) in bust.

Tension

Bodice 9 sts. x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ rs = 1 in in st. st.

T3

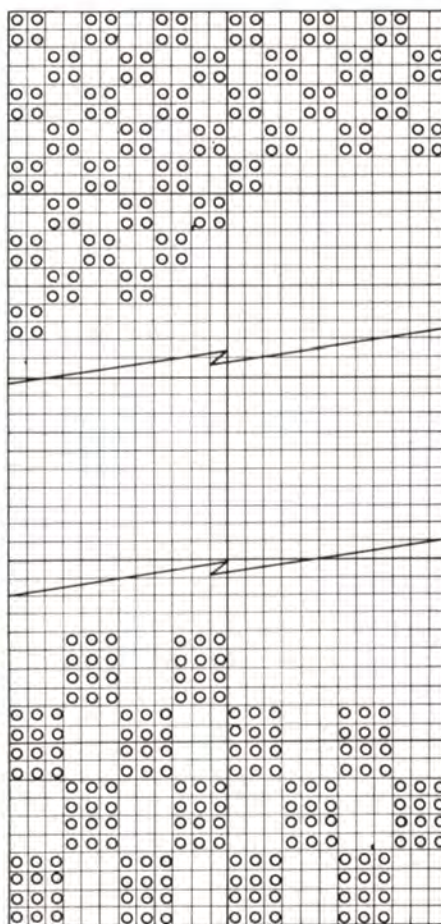
Sleeves 7 sts. x 12rs = 1 in T4



Notes

M/c set to KC for lace work. The empty rows on the card allow the lace carriage to pass to the left. Knit with lace carriage until every alternate N comes forward. At this point weave 2 rows with knit carriage (Ns will stay

forward to allow for this as both carriages are travelling in the same direction). Woven lace is not difficult, but slow to do I acknowledge the work of Kathryn Hobbs in sorting out this technique. Special card: as shown.



BLOUSE

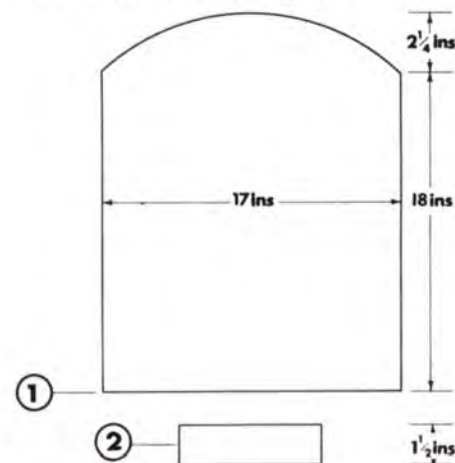
Back

Step 1. Cast on 130 (138, 140) sts K40 rows T2 MDE

Step 2. 000 T3 Inc 1st each and every 10th row to row 120 (125, 130)

Step 3. 000 Mark end N at this point with coloured yarn. Cast off 1st this

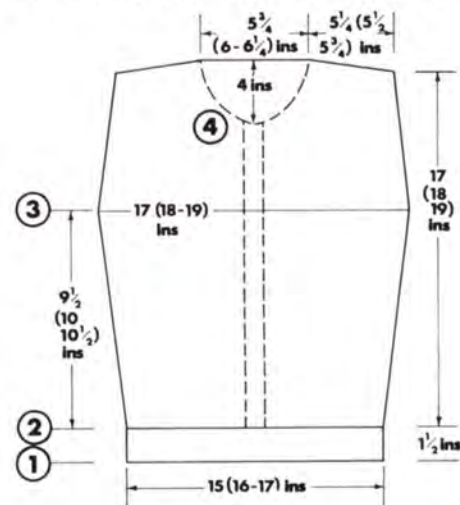
and every 10th row to row 090 (095 100). Cast off 3 sts beginning each row to row 116 (118, 120) C/O.



FRONT

Step 1. As back.

Step 2. Thread up 8 sts to left of centre O. Place all other Ns on left side in holding post. Wind on by hand 8 sts at centre front for buttonhole band, adjoining right front. 000 at 10th and every following 10th row transfer the 4th and 8th N from centre front for buttonhole, leaving empty N in working from position. Also at



every 10th row inc. 1st at right. Continue in this manner to row 120 (125, 130).

Step 3. Mark end st with coloured yarn. Continue to work buttonholes, dec 1st at right every 10th row to row 060 K10 rows c/o 23 (24, 25) sts at neck edge.

Step 4. Dec 1st at neck every 5th row and at the same time continue to dec. 1st at edge every 10th row, to 090 (095 100) Cast off 3 sts at right every alt. row, and at the same time dec. 1st at neck every 5th row until all sts are removed.

To work left front

Step 1. Pick up 4 sts adjoining left front from the 8 threaded up stitches. RC 000.

Step 2. Inc. 1st at left every 10 rows to row 120 (125, 130)

Step 3. 000 Mark end N as before. C/O 1st at left every 10rs to row 060 K10 rows c/o 19 (20, 21) at neck edge.

Step 4. Knit as step 4 for right front, reversing shapings.

SLEEVES

Step 1. Cast on 120sts in waste yarn K a few rows waste C.O.L. 000 K3 rows main yarn T4. C.O.R. Work lace carriage until every alternate N is brought forward. Weave two rows with boucle yarn. Continue to row 190 c/o 5 sts at beginning each

woven row until all sts are removed.

Step 2. Cuffs. Cast on 60Ns K40 rows T2 MDE. With right side facing m/c attach sleeve above waste yarn, placing 2 sts to each N. c/o.

TO MAKE UP

Graft the 8 sts wound on by hand on rt front to the 4 threaded-up, folding buttonhole band in to match the holes. Catch down buttonhole band facing. Sew on narrow ribbon to front edge of left front to carry buttons. Join all seams, coloured threads will indicate upper limit of side seams. Work 3 rows double crochet around neck, working one buttonhole on right front.

BOLERO

Worked in remaining boucle yarn.

TENSION

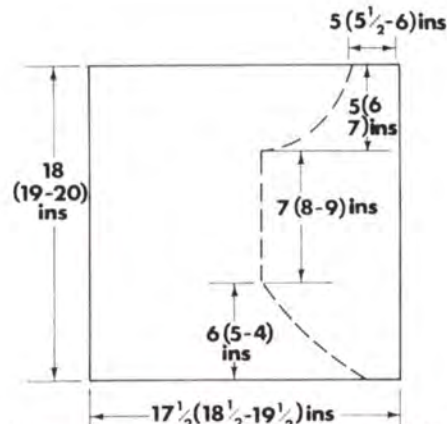
6 sts x 10rs = 1" TD approx. 5.

BACK

Step 1. C.O.B.H. 120 (126, 132) sts K209 (219, 229) rs K1 row T7; K1 row T10 c/o.

FRONT (2 reversing shapings)

Step 1. Bring forward 60, 63, 66 Ns Push back 30 Ns nearest centre of m/c to A position C.O.B.H. the remaining 30 (33, 36) Ns. Inc. 1st at left every alt. row until you have 60 (63, 66) sts in action.



Step 2. Continue straight to row 146 (156, 166) c/o 13 (15, 17) at left. c/o 1st at left every alt. row 10 times. Continue straight to row 209 (219, 229) c/o.

NECK TIE BAND

Cast on five sts over 9 Ns, ie



*K2 rows bring into holding position 2nd & 4th Ns K4 rows push back 2nd and 4th Ns and repeat from * until band measures 50" c/o.

To make up

Join seams
Sew neck tie around neck folding in half over raw edges.
Work 2 rows double crochet around all raw edges.

HONEYCOMB SWEATER



Measurements

To fit 34 (36, 38, 40) inch bust, fairly loosely

Materials

Hayfields Beaulon 4 - 4-ply fingering 400 (400, 425, 425) grms i.e. 12 (12, 13, 13) 25gr balls.

Tension

Measure on 'plain' side, allowing swatch to rest an hour first. TD8. 9 rs x 4 sts (over alt nds) = 1".

820 - 830 m/c card 2 x 2 check knitted on alt nds.



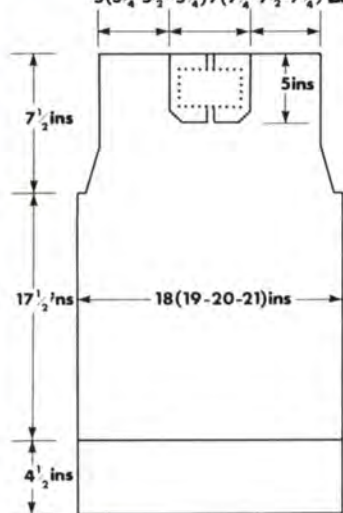
BACK

Step 1: Ribbers: Note, use the side weights as well as comb weights. Cast on 152 (160, 168, 176) sts in 1 x 1 rib. Knit 3 rs tub. TD2¹/₃ Knit 50 rs (knitting last row on T5/6). Transfer to main bed placing sts on nds already carrying a st. This will be easier if you rack the ribber bed one pos. Main bed now in 1 x 1 formation. S/bed m/c: TD5. Cast on 152 (160, 168, 176) sts in 1 x 1 mock rib. Knit 100 rs MDE. placing sts on nds already carrying a st.

Step 2: Insert card and set the m/c for patt. Depress both tuck buttons. RC 000, knit in tuck st to row 240, cast off 3 actual sts beg next 2 rs.

Step 3: RC 000. Dec 1 st each end of 10th, 20th, 30th row. Continue straight to row 100, knit one row st.st. Cast off.

BACK NECK



BACK+ FRONT

FRONT

Step 1 and Step 2: As back.

Step 3: RC 000. Dec 1 st each end of 10th, 20th, 30th row. Continue straight to row 40. With a length of

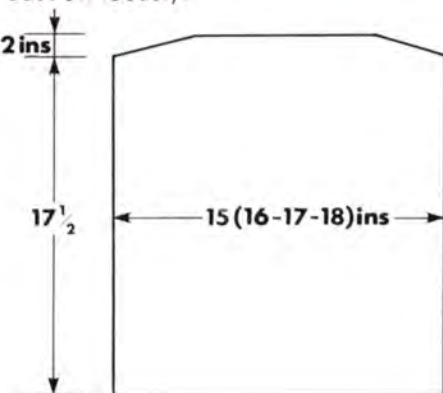

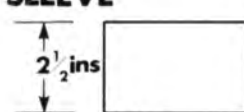

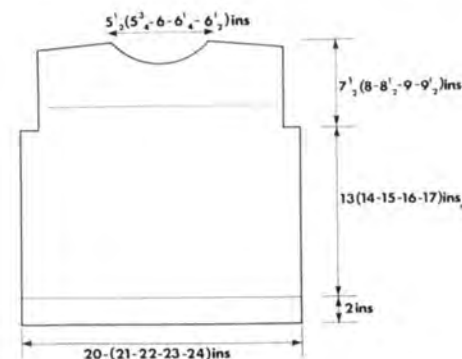

BACK

Step 1: Using ribber, cast on in 1 x 1 rib 119 (125, 131, 137, 143) sts. TD at MT-3/MT-3, knit 16 rows. Transfer sts to main bed and inc 1 st - 120 (126, 132, 138, 144) sts.

Step 2: RC 000 TD at MT, knit to RC 84 (92, 100, 108, 116). Cast off 6 sts at the beg of the next 2 rows. 108 (114, 120, 126, 132) sts remain.*

Step 3: Knit to RC 142 (154, 166, 178, 190). Cast off 10 (10, 11, 11, 12) sts at



the beg of the next 4 rows. Cast off 9 (10, 10, 11, 11) sts at the beg of the next 4 rows. Cast off remaining 32 (34, 36, 38, 40) sts.

FRONT

Step 1: Knit as Back to *.

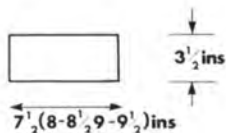
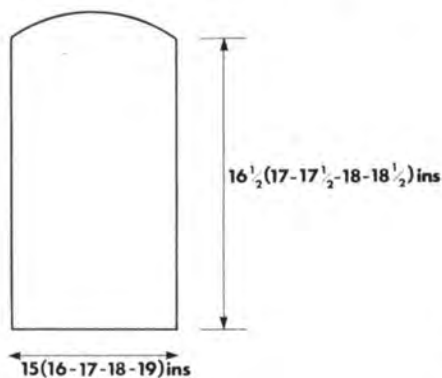
Step 2: Knit to RC 126 (138, 150, 162, 174). Cast off 8 (8, 10, 10, 12) sts at centre. Put LHS into HP and knit RHS as follows:

Step 3: Knit 1 row. Cast off 2 sts at the beg of the next and foll alt row, knit 1 row. Dec 1 st at neck edge on next and every foll row 8 (9, 9, 10, 10) times in all *and at the same time*, knit to RC 142 (154, 166, 178, 190).

Step 4: Cast off 10 (10, 11, 11, 12) sts at the beg of the next and foll alt row, knit 1 row. Cast off 9 (10, 10, 11, 11) sts at the beg of the next and foll alt row. Take carr to LHS of work, turn RC back to 126 (138, 150, 162, 174). Return sts to WP and knit LHS to match RHS.

SLEEVES

Step 1: COBH 90 (96, 102, 108, 114) sts. TD at MT, knit to RC 112 (116, 120, 124, 128). Push 10 Ns at opp side to carr into HP (always taking the yarn under the first needle and over the rest in HP to prevent hole), on the next 4 rows. Push all Ns at opp side to carr back to WP on next 2 rows. Knit 2 rows and cast off.



CUFFS

With carr at left of machine and wrong side of work facing, push 45 (48, 51, 54, 57) Ns into WP and replace cast on edge of sleeve onto Ns, by putting 2 sts onto each needle. TD at MT, knit 1



row. Transfer sts for 1 x 1 rib, add weights. TD at MT-3/MT-3, knit 34 rows. Transfer sts to main bed and cast off in rib configuration.

NECK FRILL

Using ribber, cast on in 1 x 1 rib, 168 (176, 184, 192, 200) sts. TD at MT/MT, knit 6 rows. TD at MT- , knit 6 rows, TD at MT- , knit 6 rows, TD at MT-1 knit 8 rows and transfer sts to main bed. TD at MT, knit 2 rows and strip off with waste yarn.

NECKBAND (Join 1 shoulder seam)

With right side of work facing, pick up and replace 52 (54, 56, 58, 60) sts from front and 32 (34, 36, 38, 40) sts from

back. Replace frill onto same sts with right side facing, 2 sts onto each needle. Put all (working) Ns into HP, leaving carr set so that these Ns will knit for 1 row. Knit with TD at MT-1, 16 rows and strip off machine with waste yarn.

TO MAKE UP

Join 2nd shoulder seam. Join frill seam. Turn neckband in half onto right side and backstitch through last loops knitted in the main colour and remove waste yarn. Set in sleeves. Join side and sleeve seams. Make cord long enough to thread through waistband and tie (as shown). Give final light press.

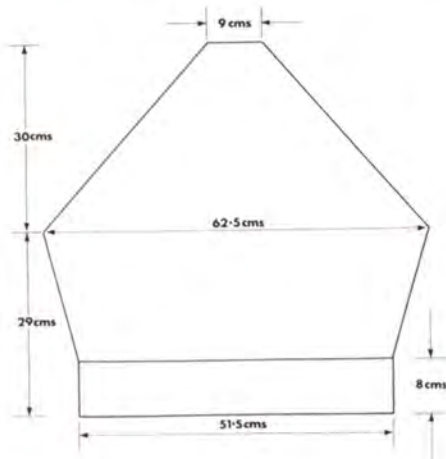

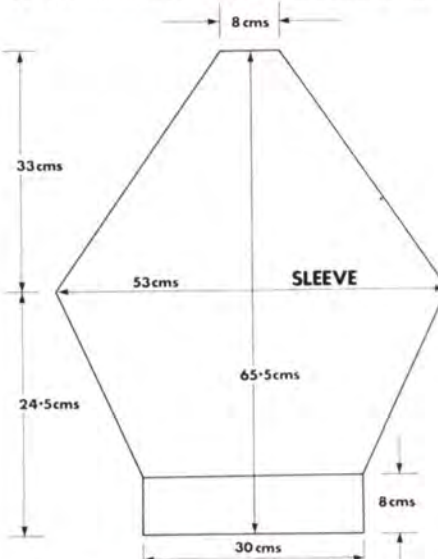

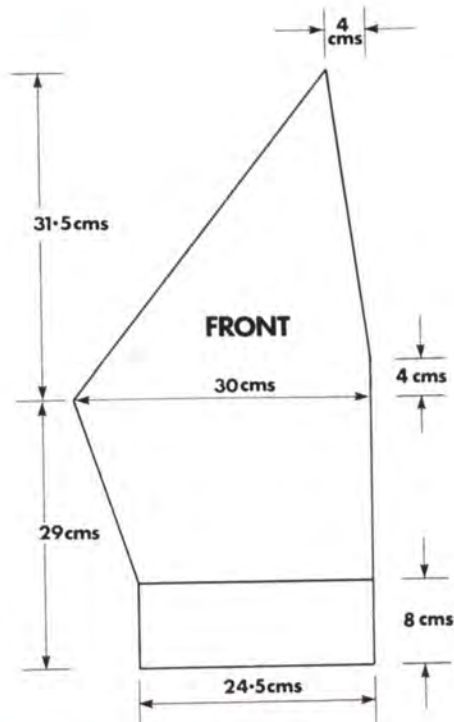

At left, inc 1 st ev 5th row until there are 76 sts. Knit to 90 rs. RC 000. Carr to left, dec 2 sts at left ev 4th row. Work shaping to row 18, then start neck shaping.

Work raglan shaping at same time as dec 1 st at neck edge on next and ev 9th row. Work these two shapings together until all sts are cast off.

Work other side reversing all shapings.

With W.Wl. cast on 190 sts. Knit a few rs. Change to M.Wl. T4. Knit 30 rs. Make hem. Pick up 190 sts along centre front from hem to centre back and place on nds (wrong side facing). Cast off.

Mark position on button band for 6 buttons, the last one at beg of neck shaping. Knit as button band, making button holes to match markers over 2 sts on rs 7 and 23. Knit to 30 rs.

Plain knitting: 32 sts and 38 rows to 4 ins (10 cms). TD approx 6.

Fine lace: 32 sts and 42 rows to 4 ins (10 cms). TD approx 6.

'Normal' lace: 32 sts and 42 rows to 4 ins (10 cms). TD approx 5.

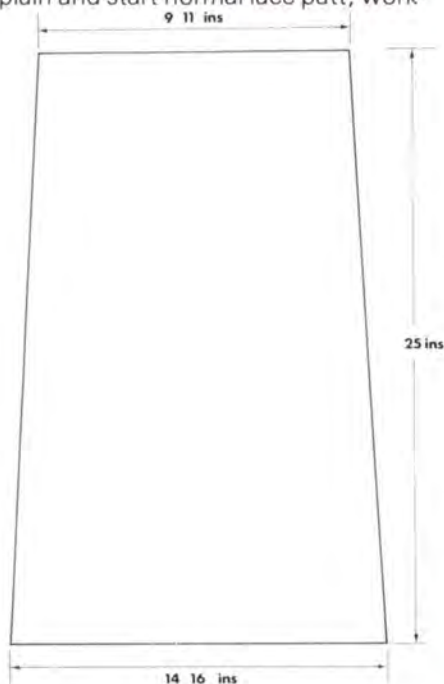

Yarn used 2 stranded throughout. Patt No. 40 from Vol 2 pattern book.

SKIRT FRILL (4 alike)

Step 1: COBH 168 (192) sts. TD at 4, knit 10 rows. Make picot, knit 1 row, TD at 9, knit 9 rows, TD at 4 and turn hem.

Step 2: RC 000, TD at 5, knit 2 rows plain and start normal lace patt, work-



ing pieces in normal lace throughout. Knit to RC 90 and strip off with waste yarn. Make 3 more frills alike.

SKIRT PANELS (4 alike)

Step 1: Push 112 (128) Ns into WP. With wrong side of frill facing, replace sts onto machine as folls: * 2 sts on 1st N, 1 st on next needle*. Repeat from *-* throughout — 112 (128) sts.

Step 2: TD at 6, knit 2 rows and start fine lace patt, working in lace throughout, knit to RC 8. Stop RC counting.

Knit 9 sts (at opp side to carr) back to 'rest' pos on next row, when carr has passed these sts, knit 10th st back to 'rest'. Repeat from *-*, 8 (10) times in all. Unravel cord (on sts at rest) at opp side to carr on next 2 rows — all Ns back into WP.

Step 3: Start RC counting again and dec 1 st at both sides of next and every foll 12th row 20 times in all — 72 (88) sts remain. Knit to RC 262 and strip off with waste yarn. Repeat the same with other 3 panels.

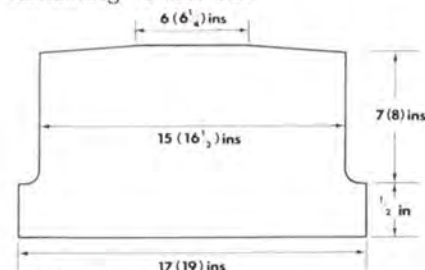
BACK BODICE

Step 1: Join 1 panel seam.

Step 2: Push 136 (152) Ns into WP and with wrong side of work facing replace sts onto machine as folls: 1 st on 1st 7 (7) Ns, *2 sts on next needle, 1 st on next 17th (6th) needle*. Repeat from *-* throughout. Work in plain knitting throughout.

Step 3: RC 000 TD at 6, knit to RC 004. Cast off 3 (4) sts at beg of next 4 rows. Dec 1 st at both sides of next and foll alt row — 120 (132) sts remain. Knit to RC 70 (80).

Step 4: Cast off 8 (9) sts at the beg of the next 2 rows. Cast off 7 (8) sts at the beg of the next 8 rows. Cast off remaining 48 (50) sts.



FRONT BODICE (RHS)

Step 1: With carr at right (left for LHS), push 64 (72) Ns into work.

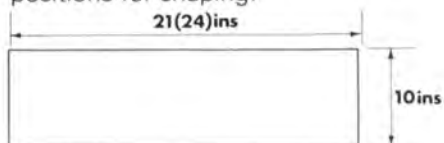

facing, starting at right edge for RHS (left for LHS) replace panel onto Ns by putting * 1 st on 1st 15 (11) Ns, 2 sts on next N*. Repeat from *-* throughout (there should be 4 sts from panel left at LHS (RHS for left front). Put extra sts onto stitch holder and strip off waste yarn. Plain knitting throughout.

Step 3: RC 000 TD at 6, knit 4 rows straight. Cast off 3 (4) sts at the beg of the next and foll alt row. Knit 1 row. Dec 1 st at the beg of the next and foll alt row — 56 (66) sts remain. Knit to RC 41 (51).

Step 4: Cast off 7 (8) sts at the beg of the next row, knit 1 row. Cast off 4 (6) sts at the beg of the next row, knit 1 row. Cast off 3 (5) sts at the beg of the next row, knit 1 row. Dec 1 st at the beg of the next and every foll alt row 6 times in all — 36 (41) sts remain.

Step 5: Knit to RC 70 (80). Cast off 8 (9) sts at the beg of the next row, knit 1 row. Cast off 7 (8) sts at the beg of the next and every foll alt row 4 times in all. LHS — Knit as for RHS, noting difference in starting side for carr and positions for shaping.



FRONT EDGING

Buttonhole Band

With wrong side of work facing, pick up from right-hand front edge 34 (42) sts. TD at 5, knit 2 rows*. Transfer 7th, 17th and 28th (9th, 21st and 33rd) sts to their adj needle leaving empty Ns in work*. Knit 4 rows and make picot edge, knit 1 row TD at 9, knit 3 rows TD at 5, then repeat from *-*. Knit 2 rows. Pick up every 3rd st from 1st row picked up for edging and cast off all sts together LOOSELY.

Button Band

With wrong side of work facing, pick up and replace from front edge 34 (42) sts. TD at 5, knit 12 rows. Pick up every 3rd st from 1st row picked up and cast off all sts together LOOSELY.

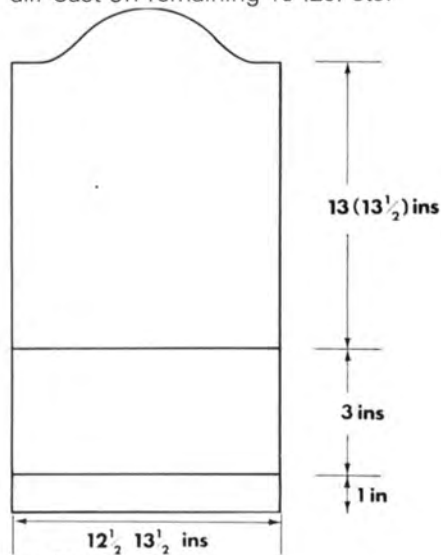

Step 1: COBH 100 (108) sts. TD at 4, knit 10 rows and make picot. TD at 9, knit 1 row, TD at 4, knit 9 rows and turn hem.

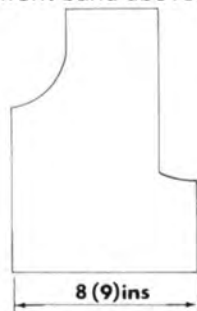

2nd part of front neck: pick up from shoulder to front of 2nd front neck piece 24 (30) sts and knit as for back plus one front band above.



TO MAKE UP

Press according to measurements given with a wet cloth and med hot iron (do not stretch work). Leave to cool and dry. Sew centre front seam up to front edging, grafting the 4 sts from stitch holder onto 2 front edge facings. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams. For Raglan shaping

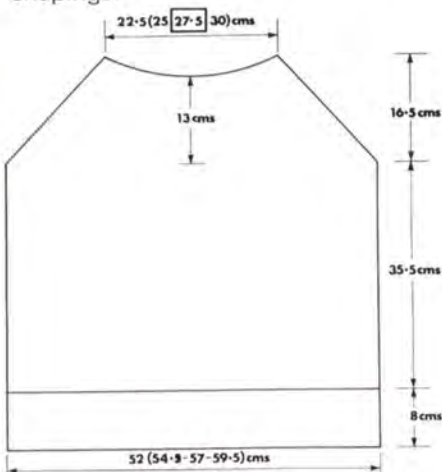

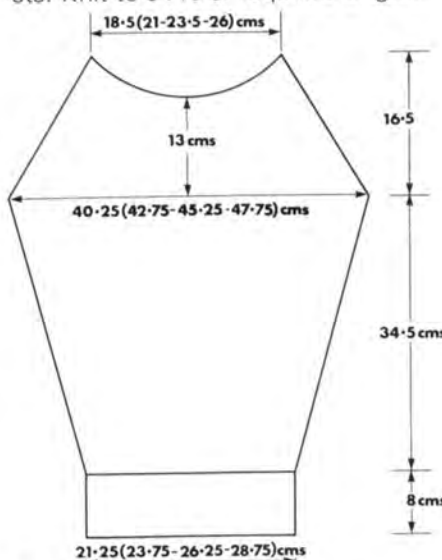

Cast off centre 16 (22, 28, 34) sts, put left side of work onto W.Wl. and release from machine. Cast off 4 sts at neck edge ev 2nd row until 6 sts rem. Cast off.

Frill

C.O.B.H. 12 sts. Knit 200 rs. T10. Cast off.

Neckband

With W.Wl. cast on 182 (188, 194, 200) sts. Knit a few rs. Change to M.Wl. T10, knit 10 rs. T8, knit 10 rs. T6, knit 20 rs. T8, knit 10 rs. T10, knit 10 rs. Turn up hem and cast off.

SKIRT Back and Front alike

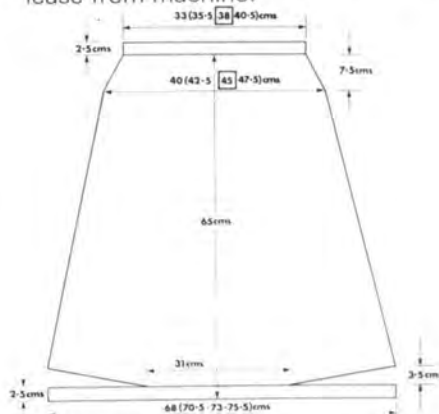
With W.Wl. cast on 179 (186, 193, 200) sts as 2 x 1 mock rib. Knit a few rs. Change to M.Wl. T7, knit 20 rs. Make hem and knit the row. Carr to right.

In W.Wl. cast on 87 (94, 101, 108) sts as 2 x 1 mock rib. Knit a few rs. Change to M.Wl. T7, knit 20 rs. Turn up hem and knit the row. Put last row of M.Wl. of skirt onto nds. Cast off.

Make other side to match.

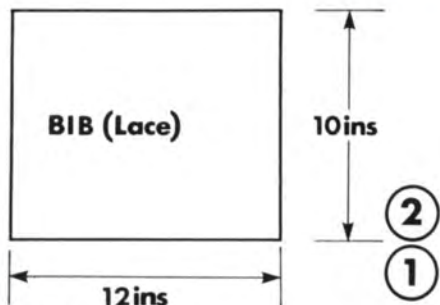

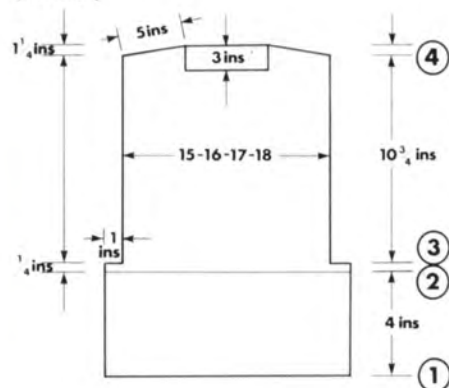

Step 1: With right side facing m/c, attach bib above waste yarn to the centre 40 nds on m/c. Remove waste yarn.

Step 2: With right side facing attach front neck over bib, matching centre sts. Carefully pull forward the nds until the sts of the bib fall behind the latches, then pull through the sts of the front neck.

Step 3: Pick up 20 sts on each side front neck for band. Pick up sts of back neck above waste yarn.

Step 4: Knit 2 rs T5. Transfer every 3rd nd for 2 x 1 mock rib. Knit 9 rs reducing tension by one every row. Knit 9 rs increasing tension by one every

row. Bring forward empty nds. Knit 2 rs T5. Knit a few rs in waste yarn. Remove from m/c.

SLEEVES

Step 1: Using waste yarn, cast on 175 sts. Knit a few rs. Knit 9 rs T6 MDE. Hang 2 weights on waste yarn.

Step 2: RC 000. In lace knit to row 192 (200, 208, 216). Cast off. Knit 2 cords over 3 nds, T.O., each about 20" long.

TO MAKE UP

Graft neckband and shoulders. Join all other seams. Insert cords into holes of lower lace row of sleeves. Iron lightly, pressing out scallops of hem.

SKIRT

Materials, Measurements, Tension, Card: As for top.

Panels

Knit 2, alter by 12 rs per inch if wished.

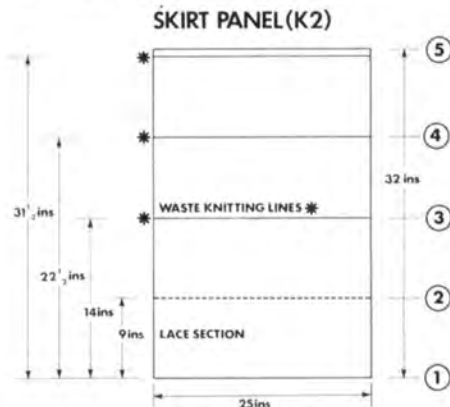
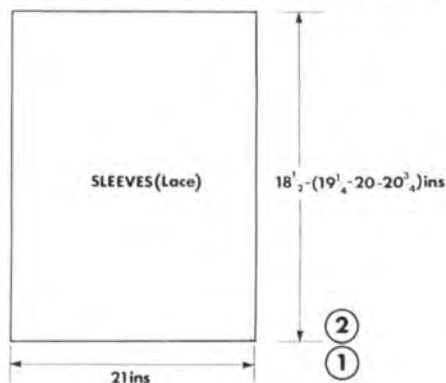

knit 4 rs. Using main yarn, knit 2 rs.
Using contrast, knit 4 rs. Using main
yarn, knit 4 rs. Cast off.

CUFFS

With wrong side of work facing push
up 60 nds, arrange in 2 x 1 rib, pick up
sts above cord. Placing 3 sts on each
needle, using main yarn, TD5, RC 000,
knit 1 row. TD4, knit 29 rs. TD8, knit 1
row. TD4, knit 30 rs. Cast off loosely.

NECKBAND

With right side of work facing, pick up
140 sts evenly round neck. TD8, knit 2
rs. Transfer st 2 x 1 rib. TD4, knit 10 rs.

TD3, knit 10 rs. TD2, knit 15 rs. TD8,
knit 1 row. TD2, knit 15 rs. TD3, knit 4
rs. Change to contrast. Knit 4 rs.
Change to main yarn. Knit 2 rs. TD4.
Change to contrast. Knit 4 rs. Change
to main yarn. Knit 7 rs. Push forward
nds in A pos. TD8, knit 4 rs. Change to
waste yarn. Knit few rs. Release from
machine.

TO MAKE UP

Join shoulders, side and sleeve
seams. Fold cuffs to inside of work
and slip st down. Fold neckband to
outside and backstitch into loops.
Press with warm iron.

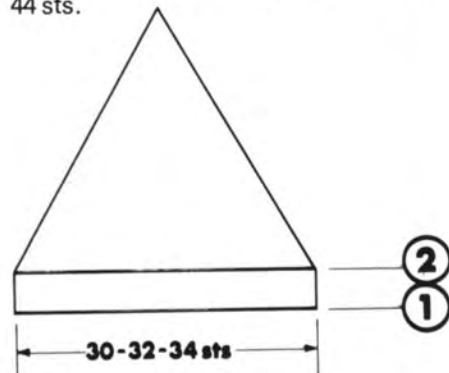

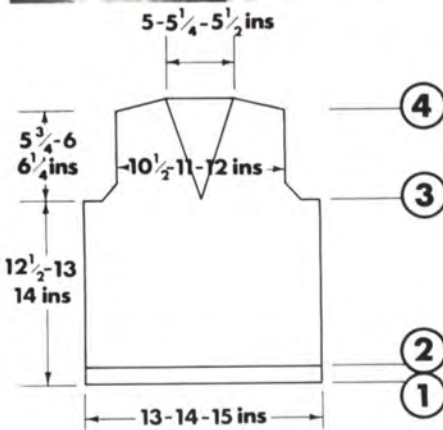

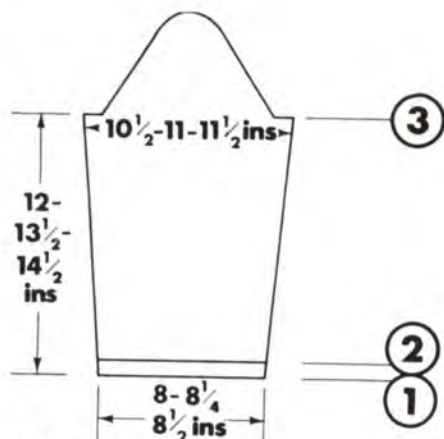

Collar

Step 1. In col. B. C.O.B.H. 80 84 86 sts. T4 Inc. 1st at beg. of next 10 rows. T6 K1 row. T4 Dec. 1st at beg. of next 10 rows, T4 Col. B. T6 K1 row 000. C.O.R.

Step 2. K8 rows, knit 2 stars, 8 nds. in from each end by hand selection. Cont. in col. A K to row 50. Cast off centre 40 42 44 sts. 000.

Step 3. Cont. on right side only K8 rows, Dec. 1st on inside edge every 4th row 6 7 6 times then every 3rd row 14 14 16 times until all sts. are dec. Knit right side to match rev. shapings.

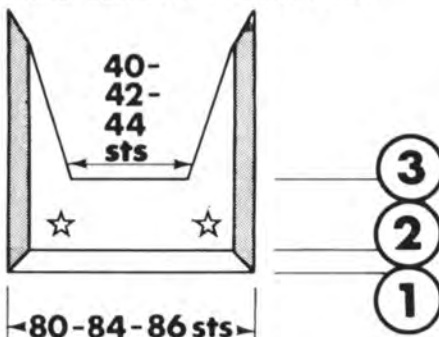

Insert

Step 1. C.O.B.H. in col. B. 30 32 34 T.4 K10 rows, T.6 K1 rows, T4 10 rows, T.H. T.6 K1 row.

Step 2. K2 rows ★ Col. A. K2 rows, Col. B K4 rows ★ rept. from ★ to ★ throughout at the same time dec. 1st at both ends every 3rd row 12 13 14 times. Cast off rem. 6 sts. Press.



TO MAKE UP

Join edges of collar to neck edge. Join band ends. Sew in insert, sew in sleeves. Join rem. seams.

Materials

10 cones of White Gold Silverknit from: Silverknit, The Old Mill, Eppers-ton By-Pass, Woodborough, Nottingham NG14 6DH.

Tension

Always check tension before commencing.

T10 over st.st. 40 sts = 13.5cm and 60 rs = 16cm.

BACK (left)

With W.Wl. cast on 102 (106, 110, 114) sts. Knit a few rs. Change to M.Wl. T9. Knit 20 rs. Turn up hem and knit the row. T10, knit 1 row. RC 000, knit 1 row. Carr on left, put 62 (65, 68, 71) nds on right into H.P. Knit 2 rs * push back 7 nds into W.P. Knit 2 rs. * Rep 6 times more. Set m/c to N. Knit 1 row. Carr to right. Dec 1 st on right on next and ev foll 5th row until 61 (65, 69, 73) sts rem. Knit to row 220. Dec 2 sts at beg of next row and dec 2 sts at right on ev foll 5th row 7 times. Knit to row 258. RC 000 *

Inc 1 st at right on next and ev foll 4th row until inc'd to 54 (58, 62, 66) sts. Knit to 38 rs. Carr to left. Cast off 30 (34, 38, 42) sts at beg of next row. Knit 1 row. Cast off 3 sts at beg of next row and ev foll 2nd row 9 times. Knit 1 row. Cast off rem sts.

BACK (right)

Knit to match left side reversing all shapings.

FRONT (left)

Knit as back to *. Inc 1 st on right on next and ev foll 4th row until inc'd to 60 (64, 68, 72) sts. Knit to row 38. RC 000. At right side dec 2 sts ev 2nd row and at left side dec 2 sts ev 3rd row. Work these 2 shapings tog until 3 sts rem. Cast off.

FRONT (right)

Knit to match left side reversing all shapings.

BELT

Make cord over 4 sts. Knit to required length.





HOME FURNISHING

Co-ordination seems to be very much a word of the moment as can be seen on every dress rail. However that's not where the story ends. The co-ordinated look has found a place in our homes too. It started with matching wallpaper and curtains and now even crockery is produced with the same print as the tablecloth and napkins.

There are two totally different looks around; one is the fine and fussy look – almost Victorian in flavour – the other follows on from the sleek Scandinavian look, where the natural characteristics of wool, cotton, leather, wood and pottery are the main feature.

I have recently restored a small cottage and after having finally hung up my overalls I found myself very short of cash and with a lot of odd – lovely but no way co-ordinating – furniture. Nothing matched at all so I decided to get out my trusty knitting machine and design some soft furnishings that are easy to make, easy on the purse and easy on the eye. I wanted each room to be comfortable, have a total look but be homely and interesting.

The fashion story has been lace, lace and more lace and now that too has moved into home furnishings; bedspreads, curtains, lampshades, cushion covers, everything. I hope your machine is set up listening to all this!

I'm very fond of lace so when I found myself with a lot of lampshades the wrong colour and size, I stripped them to the frame and recovered them. Now I have lampshades of different sizes and shapes but matching! One of my efforts you see before you. It doesn't take very long to knit and being made of 100% cotton can be taken off the frame and washed easily.

It would look especially well in the bedroom but don't exclude the dining room or even the bathroom.

If the fussiness of lace doesn't appeal, try something woven. The woven cloth produced on the knitting machine is more firm than the other fabrics and lends itself very well to furnishings. Weaving is a very interesting way of using up wool oddments too. I have designed a large woven cushion which seems to be loved by all. Every small child that comes into the house makes a B-line for it (see pattern).

In the dining room seat covers look very well woven and if your chairs are like mine and not all the same set, it will bring them together and give the appearance that they do belong together. Why not have placemats to match?

The possibilities are endless, a rug for the bedroom, wall hangings and throw-pillows for the lounge, curtains etc. All these things are fun to do and will add a touch of luxury and individuality to your home.

With so much mass-production around us most people prick up their ears at the mention of something home-made and I'm no exception. Generally there is a move towards individually made goods – why not jump on the bandwagon? Natural fibres are coming very much into their own again as their quality is appreciated more and more. The natural yarns can sometimes be a little more expensive but their quality lasts and lasts. A little time and effort now might well provide an heirloom for your family.

In future issues I shall be sharing some more ideas with you so don't rush out and buy anything unless it's yarn!

CUSHION Measurements

75cm x 75cm.

Materials

Mailyarns Ltd., 38 High Street, Syston, Leicester, LE7 8GP.
Shetlandia – a small amount from four different coloured cones.

Tension

Always check tension before commencing.

T4 40 sts = 15cm and 60 rs = 12cm.

Notes

Card from basic pack 6 D. Weaving thread is made up from 2 ends of Shetlandia.

Pattern

Made up from four colours: white, camel, brown, black. 10 rs camel woven on black, 10 rs brown woven on white, 10 rs white woven on camel.

CUSHION COVER

Top: Insert card and lock on row 1. C.O.B.H. 200 sts T4 in black. Knit 4 rs. Carr to left, set machine for weaving. Carr to right release card. (Weave camel onto black, foll patt.) Dec 1 st at each end of next and ev foll 2nd row until row 126. Change to white woven on white. Cont dec until 76 sts rem. RC 000. *

Change to white woven on white and knit 128 rs. RC 000. Inc 1 st at beg of next 2 rs and ev foll row to row 4, then cont in pattern reversing to match first side. Cont inc to 200 sts, change to st.st. Knit 6 rs, cast off.

Sides: Work in the same way as top until * then cast off. Rep.

Work underside in same way or cast on 200 sts and weave 376 rs in the combination of your choice.

Press all pieces, join seams.

LAMP SHADE

Measurements

To make 12 inch lampshade – see photo for shape.

Materials

Mailyarns Ltd., 38 High Street, Syston, Leicester, LE7 8GP.
Bancot 2-ply cotton. Small amount from 200g cone.

Tension

Always check tension before commencing.

T8 40 sts = 14cm and 60 rs = 16.5cm.

Notes

Card used from Jones Big and Bold pack, punch card set Vol. 5 Card No. 409.



With W.WI. cast on 60 sts. Knit a few rs. Change to M.WI. T8. Knit 2 rs. Insert card and lock on row 1.

* Release card and work in lace to 10 rs in st.st. Knit 3 rs. Put 30 sts on right into H.P. (Knit 2 rs. Starting from left

push 6 nds into W.P.) Rep until all nds are in W.P. Knit 3 rs. * Rep 11 times more except on last plain (st.st.) panel only knit 1 row after all nds are in W.P. Change to W.WI. and knit a few rs. Release from machine. Pin out and

press. Undo W.WI. and graft seam. Put onto frame and thread elastic through top and bottom, pull tight and join.

Make a row of tassels along base edge.

BOYS FAIRISLE SWEATER

Measurements

Age 5-6 years, 7-8 years, 9-10 years
To fit chest 61cm (24"), 66cm (26"),
71cm (28")

Materials

1 (1, 1) 250g cone Lister/Lee Target
Conifer machine knitting yarn. 60%
wool, 40% nylon. Col A.

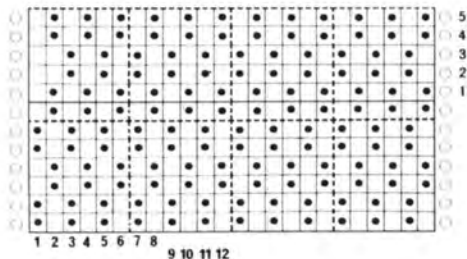
1 (1, 1) 250g cone Lister/Lee Target
Conifer machine knitting yarn. 60%
wool, 40% nylon. Col B.

Tension

30 sts and 42 rs = 10cm measured
over st.st. TD approx 6.

Pattern Sequence

Patt as diagram. Knit 2 rs col B, knit 4
rs col A, knit 2 rs col B, 4 rs col A, set-
ting m/c for fairisle. Release card, and
with col A in main feed knit 20 rs in
fairisle patt locking patt card on final
row in preparation for next row of fair-
isle. These 32 rs form patt. Patt can be
worked on 8, 12 and 24 st repeat
m/c's.



BACK

Step 1: Insert patt card and lock on
row 1. With waste yarn cast on 110
(116, 122) sts for 1 x 1 mock rib, work a
few rs waste C.O.L. Change to col A
and work 20 rs T4, 1 row T5, 20 rs T4.
Turn up hem and remove waste yarn.

Step 2: RC 000. TD6, C.O.R. Now
work in patt to row 112 (114, 116). Put
markers at each end of row 168 (172,
176).

Shoulder Shaping

Cast off 9 (9, 10) sts at beg of next 6 (4,
8) rs. Now cast off 10 (10, 0) sts at beg
of next 2 (4, 0) rs. Place rem 36 (40, 42)
sts on waste yarn.

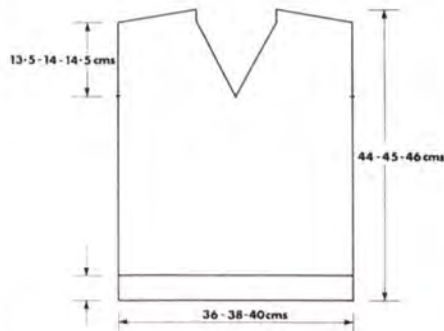
FRONT

Step 1: Cast on 110 (116, 122) sts and
work as for back.

Step 2: Work as for back to row 112
(114, 116). Put markers at each end of
row. Knit 2 rs straight C.O.R. (N.B.
pos of patt card.)

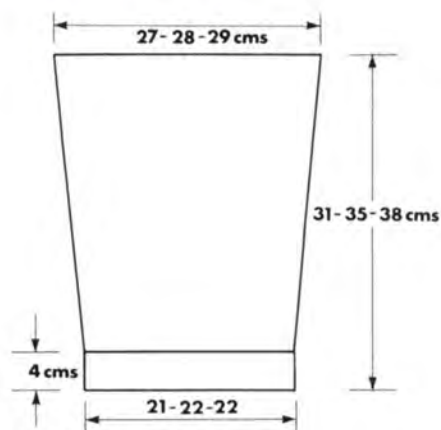

beg of next 1 (2, 0) alt rs. Work rem sts
as for right front.



SLEEVES

Step 1: With waste yarn cast on 52
(54, 56) sts for 1 x 1 mock rib and work
as for back.

Step 2: RC 000. Work as for back *at
the same time* inc 1 st at each end of
next and every foll 7 (8, 9)th row 15
times in all. 82 (84, 86) sts. Work
straight to row 108 (124, 136), work 6
rs col B. Cast off loosely.

MAKING UP AND NECKBAND

Block out each piece and press with a
warm iron and damp cloth. Join right
shoulder seam.

Push 79 (85, 89) nds into W.P. With
right side of work facing m/c replace
sts onto m/c as follows:

36 (40, 42) sts from back neck 43 (45,
47) sts from front V-neck. C.O.R.
TD4, knit 1 row, set for 1 x 1 mock rib,
TD4. Work 6 rs col A, 2 rs col B, TD5,
1 row col B, TD4, 2 rs col B, 6 rs col A.
Pick up sts to form hem. Cast off
loosely.

Push 43 (45, 47) nds into W.P. Now
work as for right neck band.

Join left shoulder. Sew in sleeve be-
tween markers. Join side and sleeve
seams. Join V-neck at centre. Give a
final light press.



GIRLS SHIRRED DRESS



Measurements

Age 3 - 4 years approx.
To fit 22 (24) inch chest.
16 (18) ins length from underarm to hem.

Materials

Phildar Contraste 049 5 (5) 50gr balls.
2 spools of shirring elastic.

Tension

6 sts x 11 rs = 1". TD8 over st.st.
M/cs: All m/cs capable of weaving.
Patt: 2 row patt.



820, 830 m/cs: Insert card 1 of basic set and leave card locked throughout.

Notes

To alter length, alter 2 by 11,rs for each inch. Dress may be used as a skirt by removing straps when outgrown.

Sufficient yarn remains to knit slippers.

FRONT AND BACK ALIKE

(Knit 2 pieces)

Step 1: Cast on 150 (156) sts with cast on row arranged over alt nds. TD6. After making cast on, bring forward the empty nds, (150, 156) sts TD8. Knit 8 rs. TD8, knit 1 row. T10, knit 10 rs, TD8. MDE placing loops on every alt nd.

Step 2: RC 000. Knit 120 (132) rs.

Step 3: Set m/c for patt. Engage weaving brushes. Set RC 000. Using the elastic double, lay this over the nds without stretching the thread. Knit the row slowly, then pull the thread until

LACE WAISTCOAT

you see it pull against all the nds. Knit another row with the elastic woven in. Knit 4 rs st.st.

Repeat step 3 until you have 6 (7) sets of shirring. RC 036 (042).

Step 4: Knit 2 rs st.st. Transfer every alt nd for picot edge. Knit 4 rs. Transfer every alt nd pushing empty nds to A pos. Knit 1 row T6. Knit a few rs waste yarn, remove from m/c.

STRAPS (knit 2) III • I • III

C.O.B.H. TD6. Formation * Knit 2 rs. Engage H.P. Bring forward 2nd, 5th, 8th nd to H.P. Knit 4 rs. Push back these nds slightly. Repeat from * to make 28 (30) 'shells'.

TO MAKE UP

Secure ends of elastic. Catch down loosely the top hem, join side seams. Attach straps.

SLIPPERS

Measurements

To fit over tights. Shoe size approx. 6-7 (8-9)

Materials

Phildar Contraste 049. 1 50gr ball. 1 spool shirring elastic (used double).

Tension

9 rs x 7 sts = 1" over st.st. TD8.

M/cs: As for dress.

Step 1: Cast on 46 (48) sts. Knit 3 rs TD8. Knit one row TD10. Knit 4 rs TD8 MDE. Knit one row to set patt. Engage wearing brushes.

Step 2: *Stretch elastic over nds. Knit 2 rs with elastic. Knit 2 rs st.st. Repeat from * twice.

Step 3: Knit 10 (12) rs st.st.

Step 4: Divide work. Remove half the stitches on a few rs waste yarn. Knit one row to return nds in H.P. to working pos.

Step 5: H.P. Bring to E pos 7 (8) sts opp carr. Knit one row. Bring to E pos 7 (8) sts opp carr. Push back the inside nd (nearest centre of heel) on each row which is opp carr. Continue until all nds are back in working pos.

Step 6: Knit 36 (38) rs.

Step 7: H.P. Bring to E pos 9 (10) sts and knit as for step 5 until all nds are back in working pos.

Step 8: Knit 30 (32). Knit a few rs waste yarn. Remove from m/c.

TO MAKE UP

Graft seam above waste yarn. Join side leg and foot seams, securing elastic. Insert a double length of shirring elastic in top hem.

Measurements

To fit bust: 81cm (32"), 86cm (34"), 91cm (36"), 97cm (38").

Materials

Jamieson & Smith (SWB) Ltd., 90 North Road, Lerwick, Shetland Isles, ZW1 OPQ.

Lace weight (2-ply) 4 hanks.

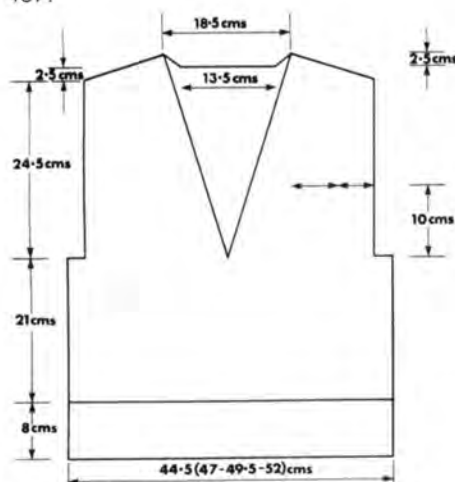
Tension

Always check tension before commencing.

T6 40 sts = 15cm and 60 rs = 14cm. (Success depends on working to correct tension.)

Notes

Card used from Jones Big and Bold pack, punch card set Vol. 5. Card No. 407.



BACK

Insert card and lock on row 1. With W.WI. cast on 116 (122, 128, 134) sts as 2 x 1 mock rib. Knit a few rs. Change to M.WI. T5. Knit 60 rs. Turn up hem and knit the row. Release card and work in lace. Knit 88 rs or required length. Cast off 6 sts at beg of next 2 rs. Knit to row 192. RC 000.

Shoulder Shaping

* Cast off 4 (4, 5, 5) sts at beg of next 2 rs. Knit 1 row *. Rep these 3 rs twice more. Cast off centre 34 sts. Put left

side of work onto W.WI. and release from machine (make note of card pos). Working on right side only, cont shoulder shaping at same time as cast off 3 sts ev 2nd row at neck edge. Work these two shapings together until 6 sts rem. Cast off. Work other side to match reversing all shapings.

FRONT

Insert card and lock on row 1. With W.WI. cast on 116 (122, 128, 134) sts as 2 x 1 mock rib. Knit a few rs. Change to M.WI. T5. Knit 60 rs. Turn up hem and knit the row. Release card and work in lace. Knit 88 rs or required length.

Cast off 6 sts at beg of next 2 rs. RC 000. Put left half of work onto W.WI., release from machine (make note of card pos), dec 1 st at neck edge ev 5th row. Work to row 102 then work shoulder shaping as back at same time as dec for front neck shaping.

Join shoulder seams. Mark centre back neck.

ARMHOLE EDGE

Cast on 130 sts in W.WI. Knit a few rs. Change to M.WI. T5. Knit 30 rs. Turn up hem. Pick up 130 sts along armhole edge and place onto nds. Cast off. Work other side to match.

NECKBAND

Cast on 200 sts in W.WI. Knit a few rs. end of next and ev foll 2nd row 6 times. Knit 2 rs. Turn up hem. Starting from right pick up sts along neck edge from centre front to centre back with wrong side of work facing. Cast off these sts leaving the last 5 sts. Pick up the sts along neck edge from centre back to centre front, place onto nds and cast off.

Change to M.WI. T5. Knit 2 rs. Dec 1 st at each end of next and ev foll 2nd row 6 times. Knit 2 rs. Inc 1 st at each

MAKE UP

Press and join rem seams.



Boys Chunky Jumper

Measurements

Age 5-6 years, 7-8 years, 9-10 years
To fit chest 61cm (24"), 66cm (26"),
71cm (28")

Materials

1 (2, 2) 250g cones of Lister/Lee Target Acrylic/Nylon Conifer machine knitting yarn.

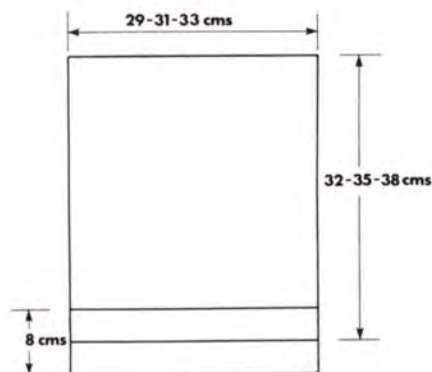
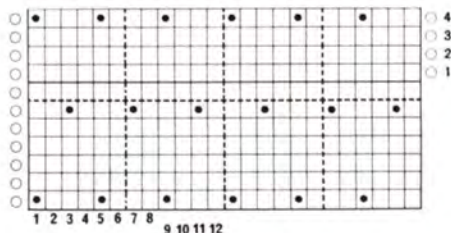
Tension

30 sts and 44 rs = 10cm measured over st.st. TD approx 6.

24 sts and 80 rs = 10cm measured over Tuck patt. TD approx 6.

Notes

Due to differences in Tension, width is added where the reverse st.st. yoke begins, by moving sts out. Extra weights may be needed for this extra 'springy' yarn. Tuck patt can be worked on 8, 12 and 24 sts. Repeat m/cs.



BACK

Step 1: Insert patt card and lock on row 1. With waste yarn cast on 86 (92,



96) sts, set for 1 x 1 mock rib and work a few rs. C.O.R. Change to main yarn and work 20 rs TD5, 1 row TD6, 20 rs TD5. Turn hem and remove waste yarn.

Step 2: TD6 knit 1 row setting m/c for tuck st. patt. RC 000. C.O.R. Depress both tuck buttons and work straight in patt to row 188 (196, 204). Put markers at each end of row. Cont straight in patt to row 199 (215, 231). Set m/c for plain knitting and work 1 row. C.O.R.

Step 3: Increase 10 sts on each side of knitting. This can be done by stripping off with waste yarn, and then replacing work onto 106 (112, 116) nds or moving sts out evenly with transfer tool. 106 (112, 116) sts.

Step 4: RC 000. Work straight in st.st. for 66 rs.

Shoulder Shaping

Cast off 8 (9, 9) sts at beg of next 6 (8, 6) rs. Now cast off 9 (0, 10) sts at beg of next 2 (0, 2) rs. Cast off rem 40 (40, 42) sts.

FRONT

Work steps 1-3 as for back.

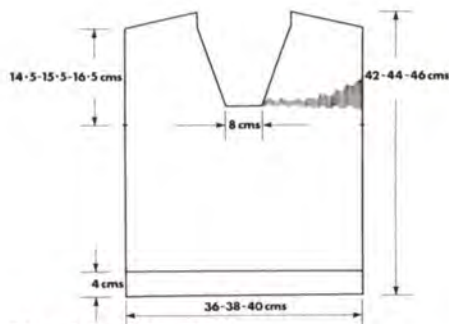
Step 4: RC 000. Work 2 rs straight in st.st.

Divide for neck

Put 65 (68, 70) nds to left in H.P. Now shape left neck by dec 1 st at neck edge on every foll 6th row 1 (1, 5) times. Now on every foll 8th row until 33 (36, 37) sts rem. Work 2 rs straight (66 rs).

Shoulder Shaping

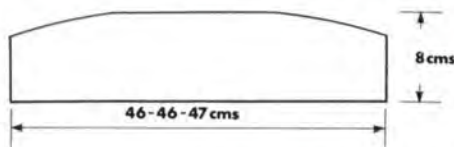

Step 2: TD6. Knit 1 row setting m/c for tuck st. patt. RC 000. C.O.R.



Depress both tuck buttons and work straight in tuck st for 223 (247, 271) rs. Set m/c for plain knitting, knit 1 row. Cast off very loosely.

MAKING UP AND COLLAR

Join shoulder seams.

COLLAR

With main yarn. TD4.

Step 1: Cast on 156 (156, 160) sts. Knit 2 rs. Set for 1 x 1 mock rib.

Step 2: Put 4 nds at opp end to carr into H.P. and knit 1 row catching yarn under last needle in H.P. to prevent a hole forming. Repeat step 2, 7 (7, 9) more times. Now put 3 nds at opp end to carr into H.P. and knit 1 row 4 (4, 2) times. Push nds to left into W.P. Knit 1 row, put rem sts into W.P. and knit 1 row.

Step 3: Work straight to row 86. Now repeat step 2.

Step 4: Pull alt nds in N.W.P. forward into W.P. Knit 1 row. TD6. Bring up cast on edge to form hem. Knit 1 row. Cast off loosely.

Sew in sleeves between markers. Sew in collar crossing at the front. Join side and sleeve seams. Give a very light press with warm iron and dry cloth.

Measurements

To fit 34, 36, 38 inch bust.
Total length: 24½, 25, 25½ ins.
Sleeve Seam: 17 ins.

Materials

1 Cone Hayfields 3-ply Machine Knit.

Tension

8 sts x 11½ rs = 1 inch over st.st.
TD approx 4.

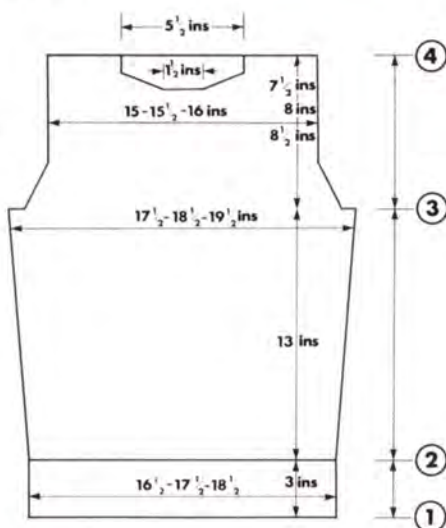
BACK

Step 1: Ribbers: Cast on for 1 x 1 rib 133 (141, 149) sts. T 4/4, knit 40 rs. 000. S/bed m/c: Cast on for 1 x 1 mock rib 133 (141, 149) sts. T2, knit 70 rs. Turn hem. 000.

Step 2: T4, inc 1 st at both ends every 35th row 4 times to 141 (149, 157) sts. Knit to row 150. Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rs. 000.

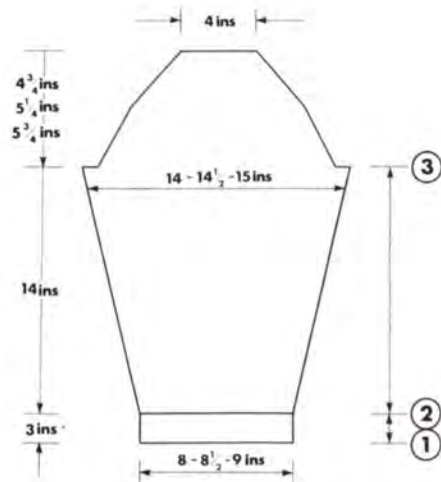
Step 3: Dec 1 st at both ends every 3rd row 6 (8, 10) times to 121 (125, 129) sts. Knit to row 86 (92, 98).

Step 4: Cast off 10 sts at beg of next 6 rs. Cast off 9 (11, 13) sts at beg of next 2 rs. Place rem 43 sts on to waste yarn, for back neck.



FRONT

Knit as for back to row 68 (74, 80) of step 3. Place centre 15 sts on waste yarn and continue on right side only leaving sts to left in H.P. Push 1 st into H.P. at neck edge every row 14 times.



Knit to row 86 (92, 98). Cast off 10 sts at beg of next 3 alt rs. Cast off rem 9 (11, 13) sts.

Work left side to match, placing sts from H.P. on waste yarn.

SLEEVES

Step 1: Cast on 65 (69, 73) sts. Work as for step 1 of back. 000.

Step 2: Inc 1 st at both ends every 6th row 23 times to 111 (115, 119) sts. Knit to row 170. Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rs. 000.

Step 3: Dec 1 st at both ends every 3rd row. 0 (0, 2) times, then every alt row 18 (22, 22) times, then every row 2 (0, 0) times (38, 44, 50) rs. Cast off 2 sts at beg of next 16 rs. Cast off rem 31 sts.

TO MAKE UP

Press all pieces excluding rib.

NECK

Ribbers: Cast on for 1 x 1 rib 121 sts. T 4/4, knit 60 rs. Trans to main bed.

S/bed m/c: Cast on for 1 x 1 mock rib 121 sts. T2, knit 110 rs. Turn hem. With right side of work facing m/c, place sts from back neck to 48 sts of collar spacing in extra sts evenly, place front neck to rem 73 sts easing in extra sts evenly, cast off loosely.

Join shoulder seams and collar seam. Sew in sleeves. Join sleeve and side seams.
