MACHINE KNITTING

Instructions

CHIC

The full working instructions together with the line charts, colour and stitch pattern charts for each model in this book can be found under the respective model number on the following pages.

MODEL 1

TURQUOISE SWEATER

WITH FLOWERS

Sizes: 12/14(16/18). Instructions for the larger size are in brackets. One figure only applies to all sizes.

Machines: Suitable for Brother standard gauge machines with garter carriage.

Material: WELCOMME"Le Derby" (100% pure wool, 150m/50g) approx. 700(750)g turquoise. Small amount whiteAngora for the embroidery. Flowers, beads and sequins.

Ribs: 1 X 1 rib with garter

carriage.

Pattern: Stitch World Pattern 501. Copy of pattern for punchcard machines available from Reader Service.

Tension: 23 sts and 37 rows = 10cm at TD approx.10.

Back: Cast on 110(118) sts and knit 30 rows rib. Knit sev-

eral rows waste yarn and release from machine. Replace sts on NB, increasing 20 sts evenly across the row = 130(138) sts. Set RC 000 and knit in pattern. Increase 1 st at each side on every 16th row 5 times = 140(148) sts. Knit straight to RC 216 and shape back neck. Cast off centre 30 sts and knit each side separately. At neck edge cast off on alt. rows 4 sts once, 3 sts once and 1 st once. Cast off rem. 47(51) sts at RC 224.

Front: Cast on and knit as for back to RC 204. Shape neck by casting off centre 14 sts and knitting each side separately. At neck edge cast off on alt. rows 4 sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts twice and 1 st 5 times. Cast off shoulder sts at RC 224.


Sleeves: Cast on 60 sts and knit 30 rows rib. Transfer all sts to MB, increasing to 74 sts evenly across the row. Set RC 000 and knit in pattern. Increase 1 st at each side on every 4th row 30 times and on every 2nd row 3 times = 140 sts. At RC 128, cast off loosely.

Neckband: Cast on 120 sts for rib. Knit 3 rows rib on each of TD settings of 5, 6, 7 and 8. Knit 1 row st st at TD 10 and cast off.

Finishing: Swiss-darn flower shapes at random.

Sew on beads and sequins. Close shoulder seams and sew on neckband. Set in sleeves and close remaining seams.

MODEL 2

SWEATER WITH

PATTERN SQUARES

Size:12-16.

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge punchcard machines with ribber.

Material: SCHOELLER-ES-SLINGER "Geisha" (85% polyacryl, 15%mohair, 175m/50g) approx. 300g turquoise and 100g white. "Angora Princess" (80% angora, 20% lambswool, 95m/20g) approx. 40g each turquoise, lt.green and white.

Ribs: 1 X 1 rib at TD approx.5.

Fairisle patterns: Use punchcards or mylar sheets as supplied with machines.

Tension: 27 sts and 27 rows = 10cm at TD 10 over fairisle.

Abbreviations




To knit sweater: Knit strips, increasing and decreasing as shown on the charts. The arrows show the direction of knitting. Each square represents one stitch and 1 row. Arrange patterns to your lik-

ing in the squares, leaving the rem.triangles at beginning and end of each strip plain. Sew strips together neatly.

Sleeves: Cast on 60 sts and knit 30 rows rib. Transfer all sts to MB, increasing evenly to 76 sts. Set RC 000 and knit in st st. Increase 1 st at each side on every 3rd row 34 times = 144 sts. Cast off all sts at RC 106. Pick up approx. 120 sts along upper edge of back or front. Knit 1 row st st. Transfer sts for rib and knit 12 rows. Cast off with latchtool. Pick up sts

from lower edge of back or front as above. Knit 30 rows rib and cast off. Set in sleeves. Close side and sleeve seams.

FISHERMANS RIB

SWEATER WITH

CABLES

Size: 12/14 (16/18) Figures in brackets apply to larger sizes. One figure only applies to all sizes.

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with ribber.

STEINBACH Material: "Cordo Artikel 80" (100% cot-215m/50g) ton. approx. 350(400)g mint and 250(300)g white. "Cotton-Knoti Artikel 60" (65% cotton, 35% viscose, 138m/50g) 100g each in beige and mint. Ribs: Using Artikel 80 double, knit 1 X 1 rib at TD

Fishermans rib: Using Artikel 80 single, knit at TD approx. 4/5.

Cable strips: Using Artikel 60 double, cast on 8 sts on alternate needles. Knit 6 rows and cable centre 4 sts. Tension: 26 sts and 65 rows 10cm over Fishermans

Body: Cast on in white 67(71) sts and knit in Fishermans Rib as given to RC 210. Shape raglan by decreasing 2 sts at right edge on next and every following 8th and 10th row alternately (every 8th row), till 29 sts remain. At RC 382 cast off. Knit second piece to match. Knit two more pieces using mint and reversing all shapings.

Sleeves: Cast on with white 35(37) sts and knit in Fishermans Rib. Increase 1 stitch at right edge on every 6th row 32 times = 67(69) sts. At RC 210, shape raglan at right edge as on body, decreasing 2 sts 32(33) times on every 4th row. At RC 340(344), Cast off remaining 3 sts. Knit second piece to match. Knit two more pieces in mint, reversing all shapings.

Cable strips: Knit 4 strips each in mint and beige to fit the seams.

Finishing: Sew all pieces together as shown in picture. For the collar cast on 85 sts on alternate needles with Artikel 80 used double. Knit 40 rows st st and cast off. Close to a round and stitch to neckline. For cuffs, cast on 54 sts and knit 30 rows rib. Cast off and sew to sleeves. For welts, cast on 120 sts and knit 30 rows. Cast off and sew to back or front. Close side seams.

MODEL

LACE SWEATER

WITH BOBBLES

AND CABLES

Size: 12 - 16

Machines: Suitable Brother standard gauge machines with lace carriage and ribber.

Material: ESSLINGER "Cornelia" (100% polyacryl, 390m/100g) approx. 450g pink.

Ribs: 1 X 1 rib with ribber. TD approx 2/2. Lace pattern: Punchcard machines must use cams to create plain areas for bobbles and capositions Alternate bles. everv 36 rows. Electronic machines can be programmed over 48 sts.

Cables: Cable 2 sts over 2 every 6 rows, placing 4 cables in each square.

Bobbles: Use a separate piece of yarn and knit 3 sts by hand for 8 rows on rows 6, 12, 18, 24 and 30. Alternate positions on rows 12 and 24.

Tension: 25 sts and 36 rows = 10cm. TD approx. 9.

Back: Cast on 140 sts and knit 32 rows rib. Transfer all sts to MB, increasing evenly by 12 sts = 152 sts. Set RC 000. Knit in pattern as shown in diagram to RC 108. Mark side edges for armholes. Knit to RC 204 and shape back neck. Cast off centre 54 sts and knit each side separately in pattern. At neckedge cast off on alt. rows 2 sts 5 times. Cast off remaining 38 sts at RC 216.


Front: Cast on and knit as for back.





Sleeves: Cast on 66 sts and knit 32 rows rib. Transfer all sts to MB, increasing to 80 sts evenly across the row. Set RC 000. Knit in pattern, increasing 1 st at each side on every 4th row 35 times. At RC 144, cast off all sts.

Neckband: Close one shoulder seam. Pick up approx. 166 sts around neck-

line and hang on needles. Knit 1 row. Transfer sts for rib and knit 10 rows. Cast off loosely.


Finishing: Close second shoulder seam. Set in sleeves between markers. Close side and sleeve seams.

MODEL 5

PINK SWEATER

WITH PATTERN

SQUARES

Size: 12 - 16.

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with ribber.

Material: AUSTERMANN
"Mandy S" (75% wool, 25%
polyamid, 210m/50g) approx. 350g pink. "Royal Angora" (100% angora,
66m/20g) approx. 120g pink.
"Reine Seide" (100% silk,
155m/50g) approx. 50g pink.
Small amount of fine Lurex in

silver.

Ribs: 1 X 1 rib at TD approx.


4. Lace pattern: Using a transfer tool, transfer sts according to chart, knitting 2 rows st st between transfer rows.

Tuckstitch: Use chart given to punch card or use Card 1 from basic set at double length setting.

Tension: 22 sts and 28 rows = 10cm at TD 8 over st st in Angora.

Body: knitted in strips. Cast on 46 sts with Mandy and Lurex by hand and knit 66 rows st st. Turn work and re-hang with knit side facing. Insert card and knit 120 rows tuckstitch with Mandy. Turn work and knit 26 rows st st in Angora. Cast off. Knit 3 more strips the same. Centre strip: Cast on 46 sts with Mandy and knit 154 rows tuckstitch. Turn work. Change to silk and knit 36 rows lace pattern. Change to Mandy and Lurex and knit 26 rows st st. Knit one more strip to match.

Sleeves: Cast on with Angora 72 sts. Knit in st st, increasing 1 st at each side on every 4th row 32 times. AT THE SAME TIME, at RC 32 work a lace motif in silk over centre 24 sts for 20 rows. At RC 121, cast off all 132 sts. Finishing: Sew together. Close shoulder seams for 17cm from each outside edge. Set in sleeves. For neck trim, cast on by hand 116 sts with Angora. Knit 16 rows st st and cast off. Sew to neckline, so that the band rolls to the outside. For the cuffs, cast on 50 sts in rib and knit 34 rows. Attach to bottom of sleeves. For the welts, cast on 130 sts in rib and knit 30 rows. Attach to bottom of back and front. Close remaining seams.

MODEL 6 INTARSIA SWEATER

WITH GOLD BOBBLES

Sizes: 10/12(14/16) Instructions for the larger size are in brackets. One figure only applies to all sizes.

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with ribber and intarsia carriage.

Material: STEINBACH
"Nizza" (100% cotton,
140m/50g) approx.
250(300)g pink and

150(200)g each in blue and white. Crochet hook No.3.5. Small amount of gold lurex for the bobbles.

Ribs: 1 X 1 rib at TD approx.

Intarsia: Knitted from charts 1 and 2. Where the charts show a X, transfer the stitch to the left, leaving the empty needle in WP. The charts only show the rows worked from right to left. Rows worked from left to right are identical to the preceding row.

Tension: 25 sts and 31 rows = 10cm at TD 8 or 9.

Back: Cast on 110(120) sts with blue and knit in rib. Knit 4 rows blue, 8 rows pink, 4 rows white, 8 rows pink, 4 rows blue and 8 rows pink. Knit several rows waste yarn and release from machine. Re-hang sts on needles, increasing 20 sts evenly across the row = 130(140) sts. Now knit in intarsia from the chart to the end.

Front: Cast on and knit as for back, but transferring stitches for lace pattern to the right


Right sleeve: Cast on 60 sts with pink and knit 30 rows rib. Transfer all sts to MB, increasing 18 sts evenly across the row = 78 sts. Knit in intarsia from chart 2, reading all increases from the chart. Cast off.

Left sleeve: Cast on and knit rib as for right sleeve. Continue in pink stocking stitch only and working lace pattern as before. Increase at side edges as for right sleeve.


Finishing: For each bobble, use crochet hook to make 4 chains. Work 5 half-finished trebles in 1st chain. Pull yarn through all loops and fasten off. Sew bobbles to front as in picture. For the collar cast on by hand 130 sts and knit

at TD 10 for 30 rows. Cast off. Join shoulder seams. Sew collar to neck edge. Set in sleeves. Close side and sleeve seams.



MODEL BATWING SWEATER WITH BOBBLES

Size: 12 - 18.

Machines: Suitable standard gauge machines with ribber and intarsia car-

riage.

Material: **STEINBACH** "Lydia" (48% cotton, 30% 22% polyacryl, viscose, 140m/50g) approx. 550g blue and 150g mint. 50g supporting yarn in mint. 3.5mm crochet hook.

Ribs: 1 X 1 rib at TD ap-

prox.5/6.

Intarsia: Worked from chart 1. Use separate balls of yarn for each colour and cross yarns at back when changing colours to avoid holes. The chart shows only rows worked from right to left. Rows worked from left to right are identical to preceding rows.


Tension: 22 sts and 31-32 rows = 10cm at TD 10**.

Front with sleeves: Cast on 38 sts at right side of needle bed with blue. Now knit following chart and reading shapings from the chart. Increases of several sts should be E-wrapped. At end of second sleeve, take off work on waste varn.

Back with sleeves: Knitted in blue st st, reversing all

shapings.


Finishing: With crochet hook make 4 chains. Make 5 half-finished trebles in first chain, pull yarn through all loops and fasten off. Make sufficient bobbles to sew to front. Close shoulder and upper sleeve seams with mattress stitch. For the collar, cast on 130 sts in blue and knit 20 rows rib. Cast off. Sew to neckline. Fold in half to outside and stitch down. For the cuffs, pick up the sts from waste yarn at lower edge of sleeves and hang on machine, reducing them to 60 sts. Knit 1 row. Transfer for rib and knit 30 rows. Cast off. For the welts, pick up 110 sts from lower edge of back or front and knit as for the cuffs. Close side and sleeve seams.

MODEL 8

GARTER STITCH

SWEATER

Size: 12 - 16.

Machines: Suitable for Brother Electronic machines with garter carriage.

Material: GEDIFRA "Cocco" (100% mercerised cotton, 140m/50g) approx. 700g turquoise.

Ribs: 1 X 1 rib with garter carriage at TD approx.8.

Main pattern: Program Stitch World Pattern 31 with switches 3 and 4 UP.

Tension: 25 sts and 32 rows = 10cm over pattern at TD 10**.

The sweater is knitted sideways!


Back: Starting at needle green 55 and counting to the left, E-wrap cast on 39 sts. Set garter carriage outside turnmark and knit in pattern. Set RC 000. At left edge increase 1 stitch on every 3rd row 35 times = 74 sts. At left edge cast on by hand 60 sts = 134 sts. Knit straight to RC 286. At left edge cast off 60 sts. Decrease 1 stitch at left on next and every foll. 3rd row 35 times = 39 sts. RC shows 390. Cast off.

Front: Cast on and knit as for back to RC 160. Shape neck by casting off on right side 2 sts once and 1 stitch 6 times on alt. rows. Knit 42 rows straight. Increase 1 stitch at right edge 6 times on alt. rows and 2 sts once. RC

shows 230. Finish front and shaping as on back.

Finishing: Close upper shoulder and sleeve seams. For the neckband cat on 120 sts. Program machine for rib and knit 3 rows each on TD setting 5, 6, 7 and 8. Change to main carriage and knit 1 row st st at TD 10. Cast off. Sew band to neckline. For the cuffs cast on 64 sts and knit 40 rows rib. Attach to lower edge of sleeves. For the welts cast on 110 sts and knit 40 rows rib. Join to back or front. Close remaining seams.

MODEL 9 SMOCKED SWEATER

SMOCKED SWEATER

WITH SILVER STRIPES


Sizes: 16/18(20). Instructions for the larger sizes are in brackets. One figure only applies to all sizes.

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with ribber.

Material: SCHOELLER "Chicco" (50% viscose, 40|% polyacryl, 240m/100g) approx. 500(550)g turquoise. Angora 140g turquoise. Approx. 60g silver Lurex.

Ribs: 2 X 2 rib at TD approx.


Smocked pattern: Arrange stitches as shown in diagram. TD 9/8.



Tension: 26 st and 35 rows = 10cm at TD 8 over st st. Centre back panel: With Angora cast on 118 sts for smocked pattern. Knit 180 rows and cast off.

Centre front panel: Cast on and knit as for back to RC 156. Shape neck. Cast off centre 40 sts and knit each side separately. At neck edge cast off on alt. rows 5 sts once, 2 sts 4 times and 1 st 6 times. Cast off rem. 20 shoulder stitches at RC 180. Side panels with sleeves: Cast on with silver Lurex 158 sts and knit in stripes of 6(7) rows silver, 16 rows tur-quoise to RC 50(56). At right edge cast off 81 stitches. For the sleeve shaping, cast off at right edge 1 stitch on every 3rd row 34 times = 43 sts. At RC 154(161), knit several rows waste yarn and release from machine. Knit second piece to match. Knit two more pieces, reversing all shapings.

Finishing: Join two side/sleeve pieces along shoulder with mattress stitch. With knit side facing, pick up sts from waste yarn at lower edge and hang on needles. Arrange sts for smock pattern. Knit 30 rows



1/2 front and back with sleeve

with Angora. Transfer all sts to MB. Knit 13 rows st st. Make picot edge by transferring alt. sts to the right and leaving empty N in WP. Knit 12 rows and cast off. Smock the knit stitches of the centre panels every 6 rows. Join centre and side panels. For the welts, cast on 110(138) sts in Chicco and knit 28

rows rib. Attach to bottom of back and front. For the neckband cast on 128 sts with Angora. Knit 12 rows rib and cast off. Sew to neckline. Close remaining seams. Fold lower edge of sleeves on picot row and slipstitch in position.

Sleeves: Cast on with waste yarn 102 sts. Change to main yarn and set RC 000. Over centre stitches work lace pattern as rows 23, 25 and 27. AT THE SAME TIME, increase 1 stitch at each side on every 5th row 25 times = 152 stitches. At RC 94, widen the lace pattern as on back. At RC 134 cast off all sts.

Finishing: Close shoulder seams. Crochet 3 rows dc's around neckline. Pick up sts from lower edge of sleeves, placing two sts on each needle. Knit 1 row. Transfer sts for rib and knit 50 rows. Cast off. Set in sleeves. Close remaining seams.



WITH LACE

Sizes: 12/14(16/18). Instructions for the larger sizes are in brackets. One figure only applies to all sizes.

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with ribber.

Material: GEDIFRA "Cocco" (100% cotton, 140m/50g) approx. 600(650)g pink. 3.5mm crochet hook.

Ribs: 1 X 1 rib at TD approx.3.

Lace pattern: Transfer stitches by hand according to the chart. Knit 2 rows st st after each set of transfers. Starting at row 3, work to row 27. Repeat this row to RC 136. Continue from row 137.After last row on chart, continue in sequence.

Tension: 25 sts and 36 rows

= 10cm at TD 10.

Back: Cast on 120(130) sts and knit 40 rows rib. Knit several rows waste yarn and release from machine. Rehang on needles, increasing 24 sts evenly across the row = 144(154) sts. Set RC 000 and knit 2 rows. Start lace pattern by transferring centre 12 sts according to chart. Repeat transfers at 24(26) stitch intervals. Work lace as described to RC 180(188) and cast off.


Front: Cast on and knit as for back to RC 170(176). Shape neck. Cast off centre 36 sts and knit each side separately. At neck edge cast off on alt. rows 4 sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts once and 1 st once. cast off rem. shoulder sts at RC 180(188).



MODEL 11

SALMON SWEATER IN THREAD LACE

Size: 12 - 16

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with thread/punchlace facility.

Material: WSM "Angora Nova" (75% angora, 25% lambswool, 95m/20g) approx. 300g pink. 7 reels fine viscose varn.



Ribs: 2 X 2 rib at TD 3 using main yarn and 1 strand viscose. Main pattern: Punch card from chart given and knit with main yarn in feeder A and contrast in feeder B.


Tension: 25 sts and 34 rows = 10cm at TD approx. 9.


Back: Cast on 151 sts in 2 X 2 rib and knit 100 rows. Transfer all sts to MB and increase 1 st = 152 sts. Set RC 000 and knit in pattern to RC 70. Mark side edges for armholes. Knit to RC 166 and shape back neck. Set carriage for HP. Bring to HP 16 sts in centre and all sts at side opposite to carriage to HP. At neck edge cast off on alt. rows 8 sts once and 7 sts once. At RC 172, cast off re-

maining 53 shoulder sts. Front: Cast on and knit as for back to RC 86. Shape neck. Divide work in centre and knit each side separately. At neck edge cast off on alt. rows 5 sts once, 4 sts once, 3 sts twice, 2 sts 3 times and 1 st twice. At RC 172 cast off rem. sts. Repeat for other side. Sleeves: Cast on 66 sts in 2 X 2 rib and knit 40 rows. Transfer all sts to MB, increasing 16 sts evenly across the row. Set RC 000 and knit in pattern, increasing 1 st at each side on every 4th row 34 times = 150 sts. At RC 142 cast off all sts. Neckband: E-wrap cast on 30 sts with main yarn and 1 strand viscose. Set TD 6 and knit 410 rows st st. Cast off. Finishing: Close shoulder seams. Stitch neckband to neck edge with knit side together and closing the short ends. Using a double thread of Angora, oversew the band to create the cable effect. Set sleeves between markers. Close remaining seams.

MODEL 12

ANGORA SWEATER

WITH FAIRISLE

TRIANGLES

Size: 12 - 16.

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge electronic machines with ribber.

Material: WSM "Angora Nova" (75% angora, 25% lambswool, 95m/20g) approx. 360g light turquoise and 100g dark turquoise.

Ribs: 1 X 1 rib at TD approx. 3. Fairisle: Mark mylar sheet or program machine according

to diagram over 31 sts and 30 rows.



Tension: 27 sts and 34 rows = 10cm at TD approx. 10.


Back: Cast on 150 sts with light turquoise and knit 36 rows rib. Transfer all sts to MB, increasing 12 sts evenly across the row - 162 sts. Set RC 000 and *knit 12 rows st st. Knit 30 rows fairisle pattern. Repeat from * to RC 190. Knit 2 rows dark, 4 rows light, 2 rows dark and 12 rows light st st. RC shows 210. AT THE SAME TIME, at RC 108, mark side edges for armholes. At RC 210, cast off 49 sts at each side for shoulders. Over remaining 64 sts, knit with dark turquoise 2 rows at TD 5 and 12 rows at TD 10. Cast off.

Front: Cast on and knit as for back.

Sleeves: Close both shoulder seams. With purl side facing, pick up 162 sts between markers on sides and hang on needles. Set machine to knit pattern from top to bottom. "Ballerina" (68% cotton, 23%

Ribs: 1 X 1 rib at TD 0 using Fine Knit Bar.

Half Fishermans Rib: Set carriages as shown in instruction book.

Fairisle pattern: Use card 5 from basic Knitmaster set or

punch card. Use pink in feeder 1 and lilac in feeder 2. **Tension:** 19 sts and 20 rows = 10cm at TD 1 with Fine Knit Bar. Half Fishermans Rib 13 sts and 30 rows = 10cm at lowest TD setting.


Centre back panel: E-wrap cast on 70(84) sts with pink. Set RC 000 and knit in fairisle pattern to RC 120. Cast off. Centre front panel: Cast on and knit as for back to RC 104. Shape neck. Cast off centre 12 sts and knit each side separately. At neck edge cast off on alt. rows 4 sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts twice and 1 st twice. Knit to RC 120 and cast off rem. 16(23) sts.

Rib strips: Knit 2 in lilac. Cast on 13 sts and knit 360 rows in Half Fishermans Rib. Cast off. Sleeves: Cast on with lilac 48 sts and knit 20 rows rib. Knit several rows waste yarn and release from machine. Re-hang on MB, increasing by 10 sts = 58 sts. Set RC 000 and knit in pattern. Increase 1 st at each side on every 3rd row 22(26) times and on every 2nd row 4(0) times = 110 sts. At RC 76(80) cast off.

Finishing: Close shoulder seams. With lilac pick up 96 sts from neckedge and knit 3cm in rib. Cast off. Sew the rib strips to main body. Cast on with lilac 80(90) sts in rib. Knit 24 rows rib. Attach to bottom of back or front. Set in sleeves and close remaining seams.

Sizes: 12/14(16/18). Instructions for the larger sizes are in brackets. One figure only applies to all sizes.

Machines: Suitable for standard gauge machines with ribber.

Material: **SCHOELLER** "Menuett" (100% wool. 330m/100g) approx. 450(500)g lilac. ES-SLINGER "Angora" (80% angora, 20% wool. 475m/100g) approx. 200g white. 3mm circular knitting needle.

Ribs: 2 X 2 rib at TD approx. 8/7.

Smock pattern: Arrange needles as shown in diagram. After knitting, smock with lilac yarn every 12 rows as in picture.

Tension: 28 sts and 39 rows = 10cm at TD 7. 44 sts and

36 rows = 10cm over smock pattern.

Centre back panel: With Angora cast on 114 sts and knit 210 rows in smock pattern. Cast off.

Centre front panel: Cast on and knit as for back to RC 180. Cast off centre 56 sts and knit each side separately. At neck edge cast off on alt. rows 5 sts once, 4 sts twice, 2 sts 3 times and 1 st 3 times. Cast off rem.7 shoulder sts at RC 210.

Side panels: Knit 4: With lilac cast on by E-wrap 46(52) sts and 226 rows. Cast off.

Centre sleeve panel: Knit 2: With Angora cast on 134 sts. Arrange for smock pattern and knit 144 rows. Cast off. Sleeve side panels: Knit 2: With lilac cast on by E-wrap 18 sts at right side of needle bed. Set RC 000 and knit in st st, increasing 1 st at left edge on every 6th row 25 times = 43 sts. Cast off at RC 156. Knit 2 more panels reversing all shapings.

Finishing: Smock the white panels. Sew side and centre panels together. Close one shoulder seam. Pick up approx. 128 sts around neckline and knit 2.5cm in rib, either by hand or on the machine. Close other shoulder seam. Sew sleeve sections together. Pick up 54 sts from lower edge of sleeves and knit 30 rows rib. Cast off. For welts, cast on 150(162) sts and knit 30 rows rib. Join to body sections. Set in sleeves and close remaining seams.

Front: Cast on and knit as for back to RC 184. Shape neck. Push to HP centre 10 sts. At neck edge push to HP on alt. rows 4 sts once, 3 sts twice, 2 sts 6 times and 1 st once. Cast off shoulder sts at RC 224. Knit 1 row over held sts and cast off loosely.

Sleeves: Close shoulder seams. With purl side facing, pick up 176 sts between markers. Knit 2 rows black. Change to pattern and knit, decreasing 1 st at each side on every 4th row 38 times = 100 sts. At RC 156, reduce sts to 72. Knit 1 row and transfer for rib. Knit 30 rows rib and cast off.

Bias strip: E-wrap cast on at right end of needle bed 15 sts in white. Knitting in stripes of 10 rows white and 2 rows black, shape strip by increasing 1 stitch at left and decreasing 1 stitch at right on alternate rows. Knit to RC 204 and cast off.

Finishing: Close side and sleeve seams. Sew bias strip to neckline right sides together, fold to inside and stitch down.

Sleeves: Cast on 80 sts with waste yarn and knit several rows. Change to main yarn and set RC 000.Work in pattern, increasing 1 st at each side on every 4th row 30 times and on every 2nd row 4 times = 152 sts. Knit to RC 140 and cast off.


Tension: 32 sts and36 rows = 10cm at TD 10 over pattern.

Back: With blue cast on 160(172) sts and knit 40 rows rib. Transfer all sts to MB, increasing to 192(206) sts. Set RC 000 and knit in pattern to RC 234. Shape back neck. Cast off centre 38 sts and knit each side separately. At neck edge cast off on alt. rows 5 sts once, 4 sts once, 2 sts once and 1 st twice. Cast off rem. 64(71) sts at RC 244.



Shape sides by increasing 1 st at each side on every 3rd row 45 times and on every 2nd row 3 times = 192 sts. Cast off at RC 144. Neckband: Knit 2 pieces: Cast on in rib 110 sts and knit 16 rows rib. Finishing: Close shoulder Join neckband seams. pieces. Sew to neckline with join at centre back. At centre front mitre the pieces. Set in sleeves and close remaining seams.

Size: 16-20.

Machines: Suitable for chunky machines with intarsia carriage and ribber.

AUSTERMANN Material: "Rosetta" (50% mohair, 50% polyacryl, 115m/50g) prox. 250g linden and 150g turquoise. "Clarinetta" (82% viscose, 7% polyester, 11% polyacryl, 100m/50g) ap-100g linden/silver. prox. 4mm crochet hook. 4mm knitting needles if knitting ribs by hand.

Ribs: 1 X 1 rib with linden used double at TD 0 or by hand.

Intarsia: Knitted from charts 1 and 2. Cross yarns at back when changing colours to avoid holes. Use a separate ball of varn for each area. Use linden for area 1, turquoise for area 2 and linden/silver for area 3.

Tension: 16 sts and 24 rows = 10cm at TD 4.

Centre front section: Ewrap cast on with turquoise 44 sts. Work from chart 1. Knit rows 1-68 and repeat from row 1-64. Cast off.

Centre back section: Knit as for front section.

Right side panels, knit 2: Ewrap cast on 94 sts with linden/silver. Knit 4 rows. Knit to RC 20 with turquoise. Knit 4 rows linden/silver. Knit to RC 40 in turquoise. Knit 4 rows linden/silver. Cast off.

Left side panels: Knit as above, but using linden instead of turquoise.


Sleeve centre panels, knit 2: E-wrap cast on 44 sts with turquoise. Knit from chart 2 to RC 96 and cast off.

Side sections right sleeve: E-wrap cast on 68 sts with linden/silver. Knit in st st 4 rows linden/silver and 40 turquoise. AT THE rows SAME TIME, cast off at right edge 3 sts on alt. rows 20 times and 8 sts once. Knit second piece reversing all shapings.

Side sections left sleeve: Knit as above, but using linden instead of turquoise.


Finishing: Join all sections. Close shoulder seams and set in sleeves. For the cuffs pick up 36 sts from lower edge of sleeves. Knit 15 rows rib with double yarn and cast off. For the welts pick up 72 sts on back or front and knit 26 rows rib with double yarn. Cast off. Crochet 1 row dc's and 1 row crabstitch around neckline. Close remaining seams.





Winding up yarn

if you buy yarn as a skein (as is usually the case with natural yarns) or unravel a piece of kniiting to re-use the yarn (and this is certainly) still worthwhile today), then proceed as follows:



Place the skein round the backs of two chairs, draw the chairs apart until the skein is quite taut and cannot become tangled. The yarn can then be wound up without having to enlist the help of anybody else.

This method can also be used to smooth out unravelled yarn, only here the yarn has to be dampened first. When it has dried it will be nice and flat and ready for the next piece of work.

Or you can take the skein of yarn off the backs of the chairs and tie up the opposite ends. Hang one end up on a hook and a weight or something equally heavy on the other. Once the wool has dried, it will be as good a new!

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
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

To ensure that the yarn unrolls easily when knitting, wind it up as follows:

Now is the time to decide on whether you prefer the yarn to run off the outside or come out from the inside of the ball



This is the way the yarn runs off from the outside. Wind the thread a couple of times round two fingers, take this "ball centre" in one hand and hold between two fingers, wind the yarn round the remaining fingers, constantly changing direction. This way the ball remains loose and is easy to knit from.



Wind the yarn a couple of times round the thumb and index finger, remove from the fingers, place together, then wind up the yarn, changing direction frequently.






You must check the tension!


Before starting work on the garment, you must always check the tension. This will save you trouble in the long run. Also, you can use the test squares later on to make up an attractive patchwork blanket - so the effort really pays off. Work a test square in the pattern stated to be at least 15 cm x 15 cm (6"x6"). Then use stiff card to make a square with another square cut out (like a window frame) measuring 10 cm x 10 cm (4"x4"). By laying this frame over your tension square you'll find it easy to count stitches and rows. If the tension is too tight, use a size larger needle. If it's too lose, use a size smaller needle - using, of course, the yarn stated in the instructions.
