
Back to this issue, readers will be pleased to learn about a technique which I have christened "Semi-Jacquard". It is worked exactly like jacquard except that some needles are left out of work on the Ribbing Attachment. The method was devised to solve the problem of long floats on the reverse side of the fabric. The number of needles in work on the Ribbing Attachment determins the firmness of the fabric and so when a heavier yarn is used fewer needles are wanted. Turn to page 12 and find out for yourself!

We have experimented with various different types of paint on knitwear. Fortunately the paints available now are more reliable than they were and so you can be confident that you are not going to destroy your wonderful creation even when washing! Try some out on the kid's sweaters - or even better, let them paint their own!

Knitwear is more close fitting than it has been for quite some time and so set insleeves are much more popular. If you cannot match up the tension when following a set-in sleeve pattern, use the Knitleader - it is very important that this shape sleeve fits you correctly. Unfortunately set-in sleeves are much more complicated to alter, so if you come across a shape which really suits you keep it safe! Happy Knitting,

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
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THE SOFT TOUCH

STITCHWORLD ..

STEP-BY-STEP

Students often attend courses feeling slightly awed by the extreme cleverness of their new Brother electronic knitting machine, and diffident of their own ability to tell it what to del in order to help them knit their first sweater we have devised an exercise to familiarize the Beginner with STITCHWORLD and understanding ways in which the machine can help with additional information during knitting.

If you feel that you come into the 'Beginner' category we believe you will find it useful to work your way, slowly and carefully through these instructions. We assume that you have had your wonderful Brother machine long enough to have mastered the basic techniques of casting on, knitting hems or ribs, increasing, decreasing and casting off. Also that you have experimented with the electronics of your machine to understand how the different stitches are knitted. You should now know how to control the flow of the yarn through the Tension Mast by knitting rhythmically, and feel ready to try out a real garment.


Bands of lace and fairisle are always popular so, let's get ambitious and tackle a sweater incorporating both of these stitches. Look through STITCHWORLD and choose sections of Stitch patterns which have a number of rows in stocking stitch between the fairisle or lace stitch designs - we can easily see where to begin and end them.

The multi-colour fairisle patterns are on pages 16-25, select some you like. Most of them will do, but when you start designing your own sweaters you will choose according to your own taste - cars, elephants, fish or coffee pots! You will soon learn how to select part of the pattern and place it where you want it. We wanted a traditional fairisle look for our sweater and so chose the middle part of Stitch Pattern 82, the whole of Stitch Pattern 81, and the middle part of Stitch Pattern 75.

Now look up the Stitch Pattern Charts in the back of STITCHWORLD to see exactly how long these patterns are in order to plan the colours and rows. Let's go through this planning sequence for Stitch Pattern 75 to show you how to manipulate the machine's built-in patterns—you will enjoy working out the others for yourself.

Turn to page 142 of STITCHWORLD and look at the graph Stitch Pattern 75. We chose not to use the little triangles, but need to know on which row to start the snowflake pattern. Count up the rows of rectangles (one rectangle = 1 stitch):-4 rows make up the triangles + 2 rows plain = 6. Row 7 is the start row for the snowflake pattern.

Let's do a dummy run on the machine with no stitches on it! The electronics and turned on, 30 needles each side of 0 are in B (Working) Position, and the Knitting Carriage is outside the Turn-mark at the left, Change Knob is set to KCI. USING THE KH950i - activate the Pattern Selector for all over patterning which places the stitch pattern across the centre of the needlebed. Push the "M" MEMORY Key on the dashboard and the small Pattern No. red light is lit asking us what number want. We enter 75, and then press "M" again, the READY lamp is lit. Row 1 shown in the display - we want row 7. Press 7 and then CF. The display show 7. USING THE KH930 AND KH940 - activate SELECTOR 1 for all over patterning which places the stitch pattern across the centre of the needlebed. Press STEP CE Key to clear previous number and enter 75. Press STEP. Display position of the left end needle of the complete pattern repeat. Press STE READY lamp is fit and display shows row 1. Press the UP Key until the display shows row 7. ALL MACHINES: When you knit to the right the needles selected will be those of row 7. Take the Knitting Carriage across the emoty needles. Some are selected. How do we know they are the right ones? Check with the Stitch Pattern Chart! The centre of the snowflake will be at the centre of the needlebed, check the needles reading them from the centre to the right, 4 in B (Working) Position, 1 in D (Upper Working) Position, 6 in B (Working) Position, 9 in D (Upper Working) osition, - the same as the chart. By understanding how to use the machine and the



The wonderful Brother PPD allows you to arrange the stitch design - motifs and all-over patterns - exactly as you wish before you start knitting. This is of particular interest to Garter Carriage owners because it is possible to knit the garment piece, interrupted only for shaping.

USING THE PPD TO KEEP MOTIFS WHOLE ACROSS THE ROW

STEP-BY-STEP



STEP 1. Enter each of the 4 stitch designs as separate Patterns. Create a Grid which represents your size for the back or front of the sweater - 1 rectangle = 1 st. Subtract the total number of rows of the 4 Patts - (Sea Snail - 35, Starfish -40, Shell - 31 and Waves 60 = 166) from the length of the sweater: 225 - 166 = 59. (There are several blank rows at the beginning and end of each patt so we do not have to worry about the patts being too close together). Using the number of rows remaining decide the order and number of motifs for the width and length. Taking our sweater as an example, size 86cm bust, we first chose to use the Sea Snail - this stitch design is 32 sts wide. Placing this stitch design at the centre of the grid will give an indication as to how many COMPLETE motifs are possible across the row. HELP: Select 2 - [TRANSFER CURSOR] - STEP. To determine the first needle position of the central motif, subtract the motif stitches from the sweater stitches and then halve: 159 - 32 = 127, then halve - round up or down to whole number = 64. Input Stitch No 64 - STEP - Row No 1 - STEP - Grid appears back on Screen with Cursor 'flashing' at st 64, row 1. HELP: Select 8 [VARIATIONS] - STEP - Spread (Horizontal) ON. HELP: Select 7 -[LOAD STORED PATTERN], STEP: Select 1 - [FROM BUILT IN PAT-TERN]. STEP: Input Patt No of Sea Snail. STEP: Select 1: All. STEP: (Pattern spreads across bottom of Screen). Select 3: [REDUCE]. Grid appears showing a row of whole Motifs which we feel is acceptable. HELP: Select 1: YES.








STEP 2.We have chosen to use the Waves as our second stitch pattern. As this particular stitch design is continuous we need only consider the first row position - we chose the next row, row 36. Transfer Cursor to St 1, row 36. HELP: Select 7 - [LOAD STORED PATTERN]. STEP - Select 1 - [FROM BUILT-IN PATTERN]. STEP - Input your Patt No for Waves. STEP - Select 1: ALL, STEP. Select 1: YES.

STEP 3.We then chose to use the Starfish as our third stitch pattern beginning on row 96. To determine the first needle position of the central motif subtract the motif stitches from the sweater stitches, then halve: 159 - 39 = 120, then halve = 60. Trans cursor to row 96, Stitch 60. HELP: Select 7 - [LOAD STORED PATTERN]. Select 1 - [FROM BUILT-IN PATTERN]. Input your Patt No for Starfish. STEP. Select 1: ALL. STEP - Select 3: [REDUCE].

STEP 4 Now adjust so that the Starfish design is unbroken. HELP: Select 2: NO. We need to place the Pattern to the left of centre. Transfer the Cursor to St 40, Row 96. STEP - Select 3: [REDUCE]. Position has changed so that motifs are unbroken. STEP -Select 1: YES. Continue in the same manner for the rest of the sweater front and back, remember when working SLEEVES to place motifs upside down.

Full instructions for the Garter Carriage sweater at the left and the Lace sweater at the right are to be found in the Centre Section Nos 15 and No 14 respectively.



Stitch Library


Ripple stitch is our name for a fabric which is flat on one side and undulating on the other it is produced by using the Main Bed (KH) and Ribbing Attachment (KR) together. The "Ripples" are formed by knitting several rows on the KH only - the number of rows is determined by the type of yarn used and the design of the stitch.






SEMI-JACQUARD STEP-BY-STEP


The right side of a Jacquard fabric may look like fairisle, however an examination of the wrong side of the fabric will reveal that it has no floats. Jacquard is knitted using the Main Bed (KH) and the ribber (KR) together, the floats are eliminated because they are knitted by the ribber in the same way as the main bed. Usually jacquard is worked with all the needles on the KH, and the KR in working position (WP) this may result in a rather firm fabric unsuitable for your design, and so when using the standard gauge machine only fine yarns are suitable. Large fairisle designs worked on electronic knitting machines tend to have long floats on the reverse side of the fabric and the jacquard technique may produce too stiff a fabric. Compromise, use semi-jacquard! This technique is worked in the same way as Jacquard except that it uses fewer needles on the ribber allowing thicker and possibly textured yarns to be used.



In order to work Jacquard using a Brother knitting machine, you must first set for full needle rib. Your Colour Changer and Knitting Carriages are located at the left. Set for the first row of your stitch pattern. Set Change Knob to KCII and using the Main Yarn, knit I row. Depress both PART BUTTONS on the KH and knit 1 row. Follow colour changes in the normal way. You will notice that every time you take the knitting carriages across the needlebed all the selected needles - on the KH, and every needle on the KR is knitted. Hence, for every 2 rows knitted on the KH right side of fabric, 4 rows are knitted on the KR - reverse side of fabic, when using 2 colours. The reverse side of the fabric (above) shows stripes in two colours.



Some ribbing attachments have more than one setting. They make it possible for every other KR needle to be selected across the row. This means that the fabric is lighter and because fewer stitches are being knitted less yarn is used. The reverse side of the fabric above shows what happens when every other needle is knitted on the KR - known as "birds eye" in the knitting trade!





When designing your fabric remember that you can change the needle arrangement on the KR to suit the yarn and tension.

Full instructions for both the sweaters are given in the Centre Section No. 27 (left) and 16 (right).

The sweaters on these pages were knitted using the Semi-Jacquard method. The sweater on the left has a 1x 2 needle arrangement on the KR and the sweater on the right has a 1 x 1 needle arrangement on the KR. The swatch below shows the reverse side of the sweater on the right.





OUT OF AFRICA

Using the Garter Carriage for some areas of a garment and the Knitting Carriage for other areas of the same garment can offer you new areas of design. We have incorporated both stitches in these fabulous garments. The lady's sweater also has the additional feature of using cables on the ribs - the special effect is created by crossing the stitches right over left, then left over right.



Full instructions for both garments are given in the Centre Section No 12 for the Lady's and No 26 for the Man's.






A SPLASH OF GREEN

The cardigan at the left is worked in simple stripes and intarsia. The one below features single motifs, some of which are mirror imaged to give a less regimentated effect. The sweater opposite is worked in fairisle. Full instructions for all three garments are given in the Centre Section Nos 7, 10, and 8 respectively.










MACHINES: C or D with KR. MATERIALS: KING COLE Angora Look 4-Ply; M - 795 (810, 825, 840, 855) (59 Peach) (80% acrylic 20% nylon 525m/100g). 6 metres satin ribbon. MEASURE-MENTS: To fit bust 86 (91, 96, 101, 106)cm. TENSION: Tuck St Patt - 40 sts = 16.3cm and 60 rows = 11.3cm (approx T8). RIB: 2 x 1 (see ABBREVIATIONS) T3/3. NOTES: See Stitch Pattern Sheet No 5 (A). M/C's with Built-in Patterns use Patt No 263.



BACK

Using M COBH over 200 KH Ns. *Set for first row of Tuck St Patt T8 knit 1 row to select Ns, COL, 000. Working in Tuck St throughout*, knit to RC13 (14, 15, 16, 18). Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll 13th (14th, 15th, 16th, 18th) row x 39 (36, 33, 30, 27) [122 (128, 134,

140, 146) sts]. Knit to RC552.

Armhole shaping

Cast off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll alt row x 4, then every foll 4th row x 4. Knit to RC680. Waste knit 34,(37, 40, 43, 46) sts at each end of work for shoulders. Cast off rem 34 sts.

LEFT FRONT

Using M COBH over 54 KH Ns. Repeat from * to *, knit to RC6. At left, inc 1 st on next and every foll 6th row x 10, every 8th row x 12, every 10th row x 14 then every 14th row x 10, and AT THE SAME TIME at RC13 (14, 15, 16, 18), dec 1 st at right on next and every foll 13th (14th, 15th, 16th, 18th) row x 39. Knit to RC508.

Neck shaping

At left, dec 1 st on next and every foll 10th row x 17 and, AT THE SAME TIME at RC553 work ...

Armhole shaping

COR, cast off 2 sts at beg of next row. Knit 1 row. At right dec 1 st on next and every foll alt row x 4 then every 4th row x 4. Knit to RC690 and waste knit rem 34 (37, 40, 43, 46) sts.

RIGHT FRONT

As LEFT FRONT reversing shapings.

SLEEVES


Using WY cast on over 113 KH Ns and knit a few rows. Using M T8 setfor first row of Tuck St Patt and knit 1 row to select Ns, 000. Working in Tuck St throughout, knit to RC202.

Sleeve head shaping

Cast off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll alt row x 6, every 4th row x 8, every 6th row x 9, then cast off 4 sts at beg of next 8 rows. Cast off rem 31 sts. CUFFS: Push 62 KH Ns into WP. With wrong side facing, place sts from Cuff edge onto Ns distributing them evenly along therow. Trans to RIB, 000. Knit to RC49. T10/8 knit 1 row. Trans all sts to KH and latch cast off each st individually.

FRILLS (7 pieces)

Using M cast on over 200 KH Ns as



RIB, 000. T5/5 knit to RC30, T3/3 knit to RC56, T1/1 knit to RC62. Trans all sts to KH. T6 knit 1 row. With wrong side facing and working from centre back neck pick up same number of sts evenly along back neck towards centre front opening, T6 knit 4 rows and waste knit.

MAKE-UP

Join shoulders by placing both sets of shoulder sts back onto Ns with right sides together. Using M T10 knit 1 row and cast off. Join side seams. Join SLEEVE and CUFF seams. Fold CUFFS in half to inside and slip stitch into position. Set. in SLEEVES. Join FRILL seams and lightly press outside edge. Attach ribbon to outside edge of FRILL. Backstitch FRILL to FRONT opening, hem and back neck edge of garment.




MACHINES: A, C or D with KR. MATERIALS: KING COLE Angora Look 4 -Ply; M - 285 (295, 305, 315, 325)g (59 Peach) (80% acrylic 20% nylon 525m/100g). 5 buttons. MEASUREMENTS: To fit bust 86 (91, 96, 101, 106)cm. TENSION: Lace St Patt - 40 sts = 14.4cm and 60 rows = 15cm (approx T7). RIB: 1 x

1 T2/2. NOTES: See Stitch Pattern Sheet No 6 (A). A M/c's - punch marked area and use 24 st L-Point Cams to block off alt patt repeats or push back selected Ns to WP over alt patt repeats.

BACK

Using M cast on over 145 (153, 159, 167, 173) KH Ns as RIB, * 000. Knit to RC42. Trans all sts to KH, 000. T7 knit 8 rows. Working in Lace St Patt throughout *, knit to RC80. Place a WY marker at each end of work. Knit to RC184. Waste knit centre 43 sts. Waste knit rem 51 (55, 58, 62, 65) sts at each end of work for shoulders.



RIGHT FRONT

Using M cast on over 67 (71, 75, 79, 81) KH Ns as RIB. Repeat from * to *, knit to RC40.

Front slope shaping

At left, dec 1 st on next and every foll 8th row x 16 (16, 17, 17, 16 and, AT THE SAME TIME, at RC80, place a WY marker at right end of work. Knit to RC192 and waste knit rem 51 (55, 58, 62, 65) sts.


LEFT FRONT

As RIGHT FRONT reversing shapings.

SLEEVES

Join both shoulders by placing both sets of shoulder sts back onto Ns with right sides together, using M T10 knit 1 row andcast off. Using WY cast on over 94 KH Ns and knit a few rows ending with COR, 000. Using M T7 knit to RC6. Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 6th row x 27 and, AT THE SAME TIME at RC8 work in Lace St Patt through-





out. Knit to RC172 and waste knit rem 148 sts. With right side facing, place sts back onto Ns. With wrong side facing, pick up same number of sts evenly along armhole edge between WY markers and place onto Ns. Using M T10 knit 1 row and cast off. CUFFS: Push 61 KH Ns into WP. With wrong side facing, place sts from cuff edge back onto Ns distributing them evenly along the row. Using M T7 knit 1 row. Trans to RIB, 000. Knit to RC25. T10/8 knit 1 row. Trans all sts to KH and latch cast off.

BUTTONHOLE BAND

AND RIGHT COLLAR Push 197 KH Ns into WP. With wrong side of RIGHT front facing, pick up same number of sts evenly along front opening edge and half back neck, and place onto Ns, COR, 000. Using M T7 knit 1 row. Trans to RIB and knit 1 row. At left, push 162 Ns into HP, Always taking yarn around inside N, knit 2 rows. At left on next and every foll alt row take back to UWP 6 Ns x 17, 60 Ns x 1, 000. Knit to RC9. Working from left to right, from the 3rd st, work 5 x 2 sts buttonholes with 11 sts in between. Knit to RC17. T10/8 knit 1 row. Trans all sts to KH and latch cast off.

BUTTON BAND AND LEFT COLLAR

As BUTTONHOLE BAND AND RIGHT COLLAR omitting buttonholes and reversing shapings by reading right for left and vice versa.

MAKE-UP

Join back COLLAR seam. Join side and SLEEVE seams. Attach buttons.



MACHINES: C or D with KR. MATERIALS: KING COLE Angora Look 4 -Ply; M - 265 (280, 295, 310, 325)g (59 Peach), A - 25 (30, 35, 40, 45)g (White) (80% acrylic 20% nylon. 525m/100g). 2.5cm wide elastic to fit waist + 2.5cm. MEASUREMENTS: To fit height 110 (116, 122, 128, 134)cm, approx chest 59 (61, 63, 66, 69)cm. TENSION: St st - 40 sts = 14.4cm and 60 rows = 15cm (approx T7). RIB: 1 x 1 T2/2. NOTES: See Stitch Pattern Sheet No 5(B) for Patt A and No 5(D) for Patt B.

PANTS RIGHT LEG

Using WY cast on over 95 (99, 103, 109, 111) KH Ns and knit a few rows ending with COR, 000. Using M T7 knit to RC152 (168, 180, 196, 208). ADJUST LENGTH HERE

Leg shaping


Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 4th row x 8. Knit to RC184 (200, 212, 228, 240)

Crotch shaping

Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll alt row x 8. Knit toRC256 (276, 292, 312, 328).

Waist shaping

COR at left on next and every foll alt row, (always taking yarn round inside N to prevent a hole forming) push into HP 48 (50, 52, 55, 56) KH Ns x 1, 10 KH Ns x 4. Knit 1 row over all Ns. WAISTBAND: Trans to RIB, 000. Knit to RC26. T10/8 knit I row. Trans all sts to KH and latch cast off. CUFFS: Push 51 (51, 55, 55, 57) KH Ns into WP. With wrong side facing, place sts from ankle edge back onto Ns distributing them evenly along the row. Using A T7 knit 1 row. Trans to RIB, 000. Knit to RC33. T10/8 knit 1 row. Trans all sts to KH and latch cast off.



LEFT LEG As RIGHT LEG reversing shapings. MAKE-UP


Join crotch seams and WAISTBAND seams. Join inside LEG and CUFF seams. Fold CUFFS in half to inside and stitch down loosely. Fold WAISTBAND in half to inside and stitch down loosely encasing elastic.

TOP BACK

Using A cast on over 95 (97, 101, 105, 111) KH Ns as RIB, 000. T4/4 knit to RC8. Trans all sts to KH, 000. Using M T7 knit to RC64 (72, 84, 100, 108). Place a WY marker at each end of work. Knit to RC128 (140, 156, 176, 188). Waste knit centre 55 (55, 59, 59, 61) sts. Waste knit rem 20 (21, 21, 23, 25) sts at each end of work for shoulders.

FRONT

As BACK to RC13 (19, 27, 39, 47). Set for first row of Patt A and knit 1



row to select Ns. With M in FA and A in FB work 1 motif at centre and, AT THE SAME TIME, at RC64 (72, 84, 100, 108), place a WY marker at each end. Cont in St st to complete, knit to RC80 (92, 104, 124, 132).

Neck shaping


Dec 1 st at centre. Waste knit sts at left. Knit 2 rows. At left, dec 1 st on next and every foll alt row x 27 (27, 29, 29, 30). Knit to RC136 (148, 164, 184, 196) and waste knit rem 20 (21, 21, 23, 25) sts. Return sts at left to Ns and knit to match right side reversing shapings.

COLLAR

Join both shoulders by placing both sets of shoulder sts back onto Ns with right sides together. Using M T10 knit 1 row and cast off. Using A cast on over 139 (139, 149, 149, 157) KH Ns as RIB, 000. Knit to RC50. Trans all sts to KH T7 knit 1 row. With wrong side facing, working from beg of neck shaping, pick up 42 (42, 45, 45, 48) sts evenly along neck edge and place onto Ns. Push Ns forward until loops slip behind latches, place yarn into hooks of Ns and manually take Ns back to WP knitting the sts. Latch cast off these sts. Repeat as above for 55 (55, 59, 59,61) sts for the BACK neck and rem sts for the second side of neck.

SLEEVES

Push 100 (106, 112, 116, 122) KH Ns into WP. With wrong side facing, pick up same number of sts evenly along armhole edge between WY markers and place onto Ns, 000. Using M T7 knit 3 rows. Set for first row of Patt B (VARIATION No5 -UPSIDE DOWN) - set for 2 motifs at centre with 6 sts inbetween - and knit I row to select Ns. With M in FA and A in FB knit to RC10 (12, 8, 16, 12). Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll 6th row x 17 (18, 20, 20, 22) (single motifs finish at RC17, cont in st st in M only) knit to RC112 (120, 128, 136, 144) and waste knit rem 66 (70, 72, 76, 78) sts. CUFFS: Push 45 (45, 49, 49, 49)

Working in Fairisle St Patt throughout, knit to RC161 (177, 191, 207, 219). Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 3rd row x 9. Knit to RC188 (204, 218, 234, 246).

Crotch shaping

Dec 1 st at each end of next and



every foll alt row x 6. Knit to RC263 (283, 301, 321, 337).

Back Waist shaping

At left, push 57 (57, 61, 61, 67) Ns into HP. (Always taking yarn round inside N), knit 2 rows. At left on next and every foll alt row push 13 (14, 14, 15, 15) Ns into HP x 4. Using M knit 1 row over all Ns. WAISTBAND: Trans to RIB, 000. Knit to RC29. T10/8 knit 1 row. Trans all sts to KH and latch cast off. ANKLE CUFFS: Push 53 (55, 57, 59, 61) KH Ns into WP. Set to knit Fairisle St Patt ROW 72, UPSIDE DOWN and knit 1 row to select Ns. Working in Fairisle St Patt throughout, knit to RC5 (6, 3, 4, 4). Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll 7th row x 15 (16, 18, 19, 20). Knit to RC110 (118, 126, 134, 142) and waste knit rem 72 (76, 78, 82, 86) sts. CUFFS: Push 45 (45, 47, 47, 47) KH Ns into WP. With wrong side facing, place sts from cuff edge back onto Ns distributing them evenly along the row. Using B T600 knit 1 row. Trans to RIB, 000. Knit to RC39. T10/8 knit 1 row. Trans all sts to KH and latch cast off.

BUTTONHOLE BAND (including back neck)

Using B COBH over 150 (159, 171, 183, 195) KH Ns. T5 knit 7 rows. T10 knit 1 row. T5 knit 6 rows and waste knit, turn work and place sts back onto Ns. Buttonholes: push into HP, 5 x 3 Ns evenly spaced over the 60 (66, 75, 84, 93) Ns at right end of work. With wrong side facing, pick up same number of sts evenly along LEFT FRONT opening edge and BACK neck edge (omitting Ns inHP) and place onto Ns. T10 knit 1 row over all Ns and cast off.

BUTTON BAND

As BUTTONHOLE BAND using 117 (126, 138, 150, 162) KH Ns and omitting buttonholes.

MAKE-UP

Join NECKBAND seam, fold in half to inside and slip stitch into position. Join side and SLEEVE seams. Attach buttons.






WY marker at each end of work. Knit to RC128 (138, 152, 168, 184). Waste knit centre 43 sts. Waste knit rem 30 (31, 33, 36, 39) sts at each end of work for shoulders.

FRONT

As BACK to RC106 (118, 132, 148, 164).

Neck shaping

(Note patt position). Waste knit centre 13 sts. Waste knit sts at left, COR. Knit 1 row. At beg of next and every foll alt row cast off 3 sts x 1, 2 sts x 3, then dec 1 st x 6. Knit to RC134 (146, 160, 176, 192) and waste knit rem 30 (31, 33, 36, 39) sts. Return sts at left to Ns and knit to match right side reversing shaping.

NECKBAND

one shoulder by placing one set of shoulder sts back onto Ns with right sides together. Using M T10 knit 1 row and cast off. Push 113 KH Ns into WP. With right side facing, pick up same number of sts evenly along neck edge and place onto Ns. Using D T6° knit 1 row. Trans to RIB, 000. Knit to RC30. Trans all sts to KH T6° knit 2 rows and waste knit. Join second shoulder as first. Join NECKBAND seam, fold in half to outside and backstitch to garment through last row knitted in D.

SLEEVES

Push 102 (108, 114, 120, 126) KH Ns into WP. With wrong side facing, pick up same number of sts evenly along armhole edge between WY markers and place onto Ns, 000. T6° using A knit 1 row. Set to knit Fairisle St Patt ROW 72 - UPSIDE DOWN and knit 1 row to select Ns. Working in Fairisle/colour sequence, knit to RC5 (6, 3, 4, 4). Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll 7th row x 15 (16, 18, 19, 20) and, AT THE SAME TIME at RC18, using M knit to RC85 (93, 101, 109, 117). Set to knit Fairisle St Patt and knit 1 row to select Ns, working in Fairisle St Patt, knit to RC110 (118, 126, 134, 142) and waste knit rem 72 (76, 78, 82, 86) sts. CUFFS: Push 45 (45, 47, 47, 47) KH Ns into WP. With wrong side facing, place sts from cuff edge back onto Ns distributing them evenly along the row. Using D T6° knit 1 row. Trans to RIB, 000. Knit to RC39. T10/8 knit 1 row. Trans all sts to KH and latch cast off.

MAKE-UP

Join side and SLEEVE seams.

Using WY cast on over 98 KH Ns and knit a few rows, 000. Using M T6°° knit 1 row. Set for first row of Fairisle St Patt and knit 1 row to select Ns. Working in Fairisle/stripe sequencet, knit to RC76. Using M, T6° knit to RC393. Using A knit 1 row. Set to knit Fairisle St Patt ROW 72, - UPSIDE DOWN and knit 1 row to select Ns. Working in Fairisle St Patt, knit to RC469 and waste knit.

MAKE-UP





RIGHT FRONT

Using M COBH over 53 (54, 56, 59, 62) KH Ns. Repeat from * to *. Place a WY marker at right end of work. Knit to RC133 (143, 159, 175, 191).

Neck shaping

At beg of next and every foll alt row cast off 5 sts x 1, 3 sts x1, 2 sts x 2, then dec 1 st x 6. Knit to RC158 (168, 184, 200, 216) and waste knit rem 35 (36, 38, 41, 44) sts.



FRONT BANDS

Using WY cast on over 114 (123, 135, 147, 159) KH Ns and knit a few rows ending with COL. Using E T5 knit 6 rows. Turn up hem. T6 knit 1 row. With wrong side facing, pick up same number of sts evenly along FRONT opening edge and NECK-BAND and place onto Ns. T6 knit 1 row. T10 knit 1 row and cast off.

MAKE-UP

Join side and SLEEVE seams. Turn up hem. Set in zipper as illustrated.



cast off 6 sts x 1, 4 sts x 1, 3 sts x 1, 2 sts x 2, then dec 1 st x 4. Knit to RC266 and waste knit rem 58 (62, 66, 70, 74) sts.



CUFFS: Push 77 KH Ns into WP. With wrong side facing, place sts from cuff edge back onto Ns distributing them evenly along the row. Using B T6 knit 1 row. Trans to RIB, 000. Knit to RC49. T10/8 knit 1 row. Trans all sts to KH and latch cast off. Knit second CUFF using C.



BUTTONHOLE BAND

Using D cast on over 19 KH Ns as RIB, 000. T0/0 knit to RC3. Work 1 x 2 st buttonhole at centre of next and every foll 26th row x 12. Knit to RC292. Trans all sis to KH and latch cast off.

As BUTTONHOLE BAND omitting buttonholes.


















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



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
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
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
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JOAN MIRO'

MASTER OF ALL TRADES

The great Spanish artist Joan Miro' is known as the "Universal Catalan". Nothing in the art world, it seems, was beyond his imagination or his talents. He turned his hand to so many different art forms - from sketching, etching and painting to sculpture, tapestry, ceramics and even poetry. And he had no limitation on what materials he used: from canvas paper, wood and towelling to keys, shells and even blackberry jam!

The creations of Joan Miro' that we have chosen for one of our themes in this edition are those of the 1940s - really the mid-term of his artistic career. At this time, Miro' was trying to produce something that was, essentially, himself, working out his own lan-guage. The paintings on which our designs are based are all colourful abstracts from a series called "Constellations". They are painted on muted, subtle backgrounds which allow the shapes and forms to stand out, linked together by black lines. His themes are repetitive, even within a single painting: heavenly bodies - the sun, moon and stars; ladders of escape, the symbols of womanhood, birds and eyes.

But to understand how Miro' reached this point in his development, it is interesting to trace his career to see what influenced his thinking.

Joan Miro' was born on April 20th 1893 in Barcelona to a father who was a jeweller and watchmaker and a mother who was the daughter of a cabinetmaker. Miro's grandparents were the first, in effect, to influence the youngster - his paternal grandparents living in the province of Tarragona and his maternal ones in Majorca - both places that, in the future, would be brought alive on canvas by the artist.

Miro's first drawings were made when he was eight years of age -



realistic drawings with a vivid use of colour, the subject matter taken from visits to Cornudella in Tarragona and Palma in Majorca.

Miro' was sent to a commercial school at the age of 14, his parents deciding that he needed such accomplishments that would bring him a steady, secure job. But at the same time, Miro' enrolled in drawing classes at the famous art school known as the "Llotja" because it was held in Barcelona's Stock Exchange - the very place where, twelve years previously, Picasso had studied.

After finishing his studies at the commercial school,

Miro' began work as an apprentice accountant, his father much opposed to his son's artistic leaning. But the life clearly did not suit him and in a short time, Miro' fell seriously ill. He was sent to convalesce in Mont-roig, a Tarragon village some hundred kilometres south of Barcelona. Here, Miro' came to love the association with nature: the wild scenery, the peasants, the working of the land - and it was here that he decided to devote his life to art.

On returning to Barcelona, Miro' enrolled at the School of Art run by Francesc Gali, a private school of a more open spirit than the Llotja. Here, he first came into contact with the Catalan poets of the time. His early work was often of the Mont-roig countryside, influenced greatly by "Les Fauves" - the Wild Ones" - with unusual colour combinations and thick brushwork. Van Gogh, Cezanne and the Cubist movement were also early influences on Miro''s work.

The First World War had led to many foreign artists finding a haven in Barcelona, with the result that the city's intellectual

and artistic life was, for aspiring artists such as Miro', a fascinatingly lively centre.

Miro's first visit to Paris came in 1919, when that city was being dominated by the Dada movement: avant-garde art. It was at this time that Miro' met Picasso and visited the Louvre: experiences that he needed time to reflect on, for he left Paris without producing a single creation and spent the summer back in Mont-roig, among more familiar scenes.

The following year, though, Miro returned to Paris, settled down and found a studio, helped considerably by his family. His poverty was so severe that he could afford only one proper lunch a week.

In 1921, Miro' held his first one-man show at the Galerie La Licorne in the Rue de la Boetie in Paris - and it was a complete failure: not a single canvas was sold.

Once again, Miro' retreated to Mont-roig, studying in detail all aspects of the land but when he returned to Paris, Miro's style had changed: no longer did he paint things as he saw them but now his was an emotional perspective. A group of artists and writers had formed the rue Blomet group, inventing new systems of expression.

Miro' said he allowed himself to be affected by the

amotion of what he saw and then painting only what he could remember - what had the greatest impact - when he returned to his studio.

Miro's next move was towards Surrealism and the possibilities offered by the world of dreams. Others of this movement used drugs and hypnosis to create the world of the subconscious but Miro'- never. His life always had been a methodical and orderly one and while the Surrealists produced painted dreams, Miro' made paintings of dreams.

The writer, Andre Breton, creator of the Surrealist movement, said "Miro' is the most Surrealist of us all!" and in 1925, all of fashionable Paris flocked to his exhibition - a memorable and most successful event.'

But Miro' was never one to stay still: he had to keep moving, to experiment, to change. A visit to Holland and his first sight of the works of the great 17th century Dutch masters was another major influence.

In the late 1920s, Miro' suffered something of a crisis in his artistic career. He married and had a daughter and his art changed from paintings to three-dimensional creations that were neither sculpture nor objects. He would use many different "bodies", such as keys, shells, sandpaper: "The most ordinary objects may be turned into objects of art," he said.

Variety was Miro's watchword at this time: he did a series of paintings on wood, then on larger canvases, then a series of collages, more paintings on canvas as the basis of tapestries, yet another group of paintings on cardboard, more on panels of celotex, on plywood and on towelling.

During the war, Miro' returned to Barcelona and this

was yet another period of experimentation: he produced an abundant output, all on paper, but in such variety of material - pencil, India ink, watercolour, pastel, guache, paint mixed with Benzine, coloured pencils and blackberry jam!

He took a delight in exploring every possibility of the unexpected in the materials he used. This was the time when his most common themes were of woman, birds and stars - the searching for his own language of expression. And it was in the early 1940s that Joan Miro´ achieved international recognition.

The museum of Modern Art in New York put on a retrospective exhibition in 1941 and in 1947, he spent eight months in the United States, working for part of the time on a monumental work of a restaurant mural.


Successes followed in New York and Paris and that stimulated Miro' throughout the fifties. He ventured into ceramics, engraving and lithography and in the sixties, experimented with poetry and paintings related to poetry. In 1968 and 69, he had exhibitions in Barcelona and by the beginning of the 1970s, Miro's work was recognised and esteemed the world over. At the start of the decade, for example, the great International Exhibition of Osaka was held and Miro' was invited to participate with a large painting and a ceramic mural.

Exhibitions followed in Madrid, Mexico, Caracas and Milan but the international acclaim did not affect Miro's great love for his homeland and he gave to his birthplace city of Barcelona, the joan Miro' Foundation, opened after his death, in 1975. There are 188 of his painting, 145 sculptures, nine textile works and nearly five thousand drawings.


But the Foundation is not solely of Joan Miro': other artists such as Adami, Alfaro, Braque, Calder and Tapies are also shown there in accordance with Miro''s philosophy of always searching for new ideas, new methods and new influences.




Pom-pons STEP-BY-STEP



STEP 1 Using stiff card, cut out 2 discs of required diameter. Cut out a hole in the centre of each disc. To make it easier for winding the yarn, cut out a wedge from each disc. Place the discs together and using several ends of yarn together, wind yarn around them until the centre hole is filled.



STEP 2. Insert scissors between discs and cut yarn.




STEP 3. Pull discs slightly apart and using 2 ends of yarn tie yarns tightly together. Remove discs and trim pom-pon.


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


