Dear Readers, This is a difficult time of year to think about knitwear. everyone off on holidy - not that I don't know that some people take their machines with them - and picnics and barbi's being top of the social agenda. We thought the only way to drag you back to your machine is to offer something really interesting, and to those who want it, a bit of a challenge! It seems rare to see Plating used but our Smock Top is a great example of what this wonderful stitch can do with two simple yarns. If you have not used Plating before be sure to read our intoduction to this

fascinating stitch, and be very careful when choosing your yarns. The edging used in this design looks difficult but in fact is very simple, and gives the garment a very professional finish.

For those of you who like a challenge, try our wonderful evening outfit, also Plated, but the real glory of this sweater is the mixing of a number of different lace stitches. Follow the Step-by-Step instructions for the PPD and you will see how you can build up you own version using your favourite lace stitches. For those who like our version, and have a FB100 disk drive, the whole of

BEGINNERS INTRODUCTION TO PLATING

The Plating Unit produces a range of fabrics which add a whole different dimension to knitting and knitwear design. The Plating Unit is put into the Knitting Carriage in place of the Feeder A and Feeder B Unit. It also has two Feeders, one in the back, which knits the yarn on the front side of the fabric and one in the front which knits the yarn on the underside of the fabric (as it sits on the knitting machine).

If you are using the Plating Feeder for the first time, start off with a simple stocking stitch. The two yarns may be of the same weight and texture or they may be completely different. Our Smock Top makes use of two colours of yarns of a similar weight and texture. depending on the mix. The end results are very difficult to predict so you really must experiment as much as time will allow.

In the case of our Smock Top the outside yarn is darker than the inside yarn. The part of the fabric which is plain stocking stitch shows the colour underneath only slightly. Where the tuck stitch appears, and at the edges of the garment, the under yarn shows through giving a wonderful three-dimensional effect to the fabric.

Another use of the Plating Unit is to incorporate it with the Ribbing Attachment. One yarn shows for the purl stitch and the other for the plain stitch giving a spectacular stripe to the ribs. We have used this technique to make a feature of the skirt, collar and cuffs of our Plated Lace Sweater. (Page 9). Machine Manual give full details of how to install the Plating Unit.)

PLATING, LACE AND TUCK STITCH SMOCK TOP

MACHINES: A, C or D with Plating facility. MATERIALS: YEOMAN YARNS Janeiro; A -245 (255, 265, 275, 285)g (Tobacco) and B - 230 (240, 250, 260, 270)g (Maize) (50% viscose, 25% linen, 25% acrylic, 750m/100g). MEASURE-MENTS: To fit bust 86 (91, 96, 101, 106)cm. TENSION: Plated St st - 40 sts = 18.6cm and 60 rows = 15cm (approx T7). **NOTES:** Plating - A in Back Feeder and B in Front Feeder. Border Trim - Working from left to right, COBH over 6 KH Ns, COR. T7 knit 6 rows. COBH over next 6 KH Ns and knit 6 rows. * Push into HP the 6 KH Ns at the left and COBH over the next 6 KH Ns at the right. Knit 6 rows.* Repeat from * to * along the row until the required number of sts have been cast on. Knit 6 rows over the last sts to be cast on.

The total weight of the two yarns must be equivalent to a weight which is suitable for your knitting machine - roughly a 4-ply when using the 9mm gauge machine. Try two yarns of 2-ply together, or one yarn of 1-ply and one yarn of 3-ply. Another alternative would be a 4-ply with the second yarn no more than a sewing thread.

Using Plating can change the look of the colour of the yarns. If you want to tone down a colour for example, use a darker, duller yarn behind it and, hey presto! the fabric looks less exuberant. To brighten up a fabric try the opposite. The colour tones of the fabric are also changed Some people cannot wear hairy or metalic yarns next to their skin. Plating allows them to have one yarn on the outside and one yarn on the inside of a garment. We have used this technique in the case of the above mentioned sweater where the lurex is on the outside of the sweater - inside is a cool comfortable rayon mix.

Stitches which may be incorporated with Plating are stocking stitch based - plain stocking stitch, tuck, lace, and fine lace. (Your Knitting

BACK

Section A (2 pieces) - Work Border Trim (see NOTES) over 130 (133, 136, 139, 142) KH Ns. ** Knit 1 row, COL. Set for first row of Stitch Pattern 1 and knit 1 row to select Ns, 000. Knit 12 rows TUCK. Work in Lace to RC18 **. Cont in St st to RC34 and waste knit. Section B (2 pieces) - Push into WP 98 (101, 104, 107, 110) KH Ns. With right side facing, return sts from Section A to Ns distributing them evenly along the row.*** T7



With right side facing, return As BACK to sts to Ns distributing them RC40 (44, 48, evenly along the row. Repeat from *** to ***. Section D - Push into WP 108 (114, 120, 126, 132) KH Ns. With right side facing, return sts to Ns distributing them evenly along the row. Repeat from ** to **. Cont in St st to end, knit to RC30.

FRONT

Armhole shaping

At beg of next and every foll row cast off 3 sts x 2, 2 sts x 6, then dec 1 st at each end of alt rows x 4 then every 4th row x 4. Knit to RC68 (72, 76, 80, 84). **Back Neck shaping**

Waste knit centre 24 sts. Waste knit sts at left, COR. Knit 1 row. At beg of next and every foll alt row cast off 2 sts x 5. Knit to RC80 (84, 88, 92, 96) and waste knit rem 15 (18, 21,



row cast off 3 sts x 1, 2 sts x 3, then dec 1 st x 6. Knit to RC80 (84, 88, 92, 96) and waste knit rem 15 (18, 21, 24, 27) sts. Return sts at left to Ns and knit to match right side reversing shaping.

NECK TRIM

Join one shoulder by placing one set of shoulder sts back



onto Ns with right sides together. Using one end of each yarn, T10 knit 1 row and cast off. Work Border Trim over 122 KH Ns. Knit 1 row. With wrong side facing, pick up same number of sts evenly along neck edge and place onto Ns. T10 knit 1 row and cast off. Join second shoulder as first. Join Neck Trim seam.





SLEEVES

Work Border Trim (see NOTES) over 52 (54, 56, 58, 60) KH Ns. Repeat from ** to ** and AT THE SAME TIME at RC8. Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 8th row x 19 and AT THE SAME TIME cont in St st to RC28 then work 1 Motif of St Patt 2 in centre. Cont in St st to end. Knit to RC164.

STEP-BY-STEP PPD. PLATED LACE AND CABLE SWEATER

The front of our sweater features 9 different lace stitch designs - separated by cable columns - and is knitted in one piece! It is possible to put together any combination of lace stitches but it does get very complicated if the lace carriage movements and the knit rows, across the row, don't coincide. For this reason we have avoided that situation altogether in our example. Another point one must remember when working out your own sweater is how wide, or how many stitches will make up each stitch design across the row. For example, if one pattern repeat of the stitch design is wider than the space you have allocated, only one part of the stitch will be formed and this is not very attractive. Again we have avoided any complications by making our lace panels 24 sts wide and choosing Stitch Pattern designs of 24 stitches or stitch pattern designs where one pattern repeat is a multiple of 24. The Cable columns are made up of 12 stitches between each block of Lace. As you work through you will see why we have restricted ourselves in the choice of lace designs but this does not detract from the garment designs.

STEP 1. Input all of the 9 Lace stitch designs (or the amount you require).



Sleeve head shaping

At beg of next and every row cast off 3 sts x 2, 2 sts x 6, then dec 1 st at each end of alt rows x 18 (21, 24, 27, 30) then cast off 2 sts at beg of next and every row x 12 (10, 8, 6, 4). Cast off rem 12 sts.

MAKE-UP

Block and press all pieces. Set in SLEEVES. Join side and SLEEVE seams. Press seams. STEP 2. Create a Grid 168 sts x 600 rows - the number of rows are determined by the number of L-Carr movements, in this case there are 4 L-Carr movements for every 2 rows of stocking stitch. Therefore for each of the panels there are 60 rows of stocking stitch which will be 120 movements of the Lace Carr x 5 = 600.



STEP 3. We must now enter the first of our Lace stitch designs over 24 sts x 120 rows. Cursor will be at St 1, Row 1. HELP. Select 7 - LOAD STORED PATTERN. Select 1 -FROM BUILT-IN PATTERN. Select 1 - CREATED PAT-TERN. Enter your pattern number of chosen Lace stitch design and select 1: ALL. STEP. Select 1:YES.Keep repeating this until you have 24 sts x 120 rows completed. Do not worry if your design goes beyond 120 rows as you can utilise ERASE PART OF PATTERN facility at the end of each completed panel.

STEP 4. Now transfer the cursor to St 37, Row 1 (24 sts for first Lace stitch design + 12 sts for Cable panel, so the first needle position for the second Lace stitch design is 37). Now repeat as above with your second Lace stitch design.

STEP 5. Repeat as above for the third Lace stitch design transferring the cursor to St 73, row 1.

STEP 6. Transfer Cursor to St 109, Row 1. We have used 3 different Lace stitch designs across the row. We have repeated 2 of them by utilising LOAD STORED PATTERN facility. HELP. Select 7 - LOAD STORED PATTERN. Select 1 - FROM **BUILT-IN PATTERN. Select** 1 - CREATED PATTERN Enter your pattern number for the whole design. Select 1: ALL. STEP. Select 1: YES. We have now completed the first sections of Lace stitch designs.

Select 6 - ERASE PART OF PATTERN. Set corner to (1,121). STEP. Frame 168 sts x number of rows to be erased. STEP. Select 1:YES. For each section we have staggered the Lace stitch designs, so for the second panel we must transfer the cursor to St 19, row 121.

SWEATER - A -285 (300, 315, 330, 345)g and B - 190 (200, 210, 220, 230)g. SKIRT - A - 255 (270, 285, 290, 305)g and B - 170 (180, 190, 200, 210)g. Elastic to fit waist + 2.5cm. MEASURE-MENTS: To fit bust 86 (91, 96, 101, 106)cm. Approx length of Skirt = 90cm. **TENSION:** Plated Lace St Patt - 40 sts = 17.2cm and 60 rows = 11.4cm (approx T6). RIB: Plated 2 (see X ABBREVIATIONS) T3/3. NOTES: 9 Stitch Patterns. Measurements are approximate as it is difficult to be precise when using several different lace sts in one row. PPD instructions see STEP-BY-STEP on page 6. Plated Lace and Cable St Patt - Each panel of Lace is 24 sts wide x 60 rows and there are 12 sts in between each Lace Pattern. Of these 12 sts the centre 6 are cabled, 3 over 3, every 10 rows and the Ns each side of the centre 6 sts are left in NWP. To make the cabling easier, on the 9th row, bring the empty Ns to WP and knit the 10th row. Drop the loop formed and take the empty Ns back to NWP. Before you cable the sts, operate the L-Carr. After 60

rows of Lace/Cable, knit 16 rows in St st. L-Carr -Disconnect end N selection and remember to push back any end Ns that are selected.

A machines - You can select one Lace design for each 60 row panel and block out the 12 sts for the Cable. C machines -Select a Lace St Patt over 24 sts and add on 12 sts for the Cable panel.

Trans all sts to KH. With wrong side facing, pick up same number of sts evenly along neck edge and place onto Ns. T7 knit 1 row. T10 knit 1 row and cast off. Join second shoulder as first. Join NECKBAND seam.

OTT MILL MAN DIE VAN

Using A and B cast on over 125 (131, 137, 143, 149) KH Ns as RIB, 000. Knit to RC24. Trans all sts to KH. Inc 1 st, 000. Working in Plated Lace and Cable St Patt throughout (see NOTES), knit to RC238. Place a WY marker at each end of work. Knit to RC368.

Back neck shaping

Waste knit centre 22 sts. Waste knit sts at left, COR. Knit 1 row. At beg of next and every foll alt row cast off 2 sts x 5. Knit to RC380 and waste knit rem 42 (45, 48, 51, 54) sts. Return sts at left to Ns and knit to match right side reversing shaping. FRONT As BACK to RC228. Neck shaping (Note Patt position). Waste knit



SLEEVES

Using A and B cast on over 62 KH Ns as RIB, 000. Knit to RC50. Trans all sts to KH, 000. Working in Plated Lace and Cable St Patt throughout (see NOTES), knit to RC6. Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 6th row x 32. Knit to RC228 and cast off loosely.

MAKE-UP

Block and press all pieces on the wrong side. Stitch top of SLEEVES to armhole edges between WY markers. Join side and SLEEVE seams.













SKIRT BACK/FRONT

Using A and B cast on over 137 (143, 152, 158, 167) KH Ns as RIB, 000. Knit to RC150. Place a WY marker at each end of work. Knit to RC450 (adjust length here). WAISTBAND: Trans to 1 x 1 RIB, 000. T1/1 Knit to RC29. T10/8 knit 1 row. Trans all sts to KH and latch cast off.

MAKE-UP

Join side seams from WAIST-BAND to WY marker. Fold WAISTBAND in half to inside and stitch down loosely encasing elastic.

LADY'S COTTON GARTER STITCH PATTERN JACKET.

MACHINES: A, C or D with G-Carriage and optional PPD (see NOTES). MATERIALS: STANDARD 4-PLY COTTON, we used YEOMAN YARNS Cannelle; A - 820g (Thyme) (100% cotton 350m/100g). **MEASUREMENTS:** One size to fit bust up to 106cm. **TENSION:** Garter St Patt - 40 sts = 13.5 cm and 60 rows = 17.2cm (approx T8), after washing, blocking and pressing. NOTES: Garter St Patt 1 is the Stitchworld builtin No 488. Garter St Patt 2 is 8 sts x 12 rows of 1 row knit, 1 row purl. The garment instructions have been written



for machines without the aid of a PPD. The PPD instructions are given below but follow similar lines to those given in the Step-by-Step instructions in Brother Fashion Issue 3.

PPD PROCEDURE

BACK - Input a Grid 189 sts x 108 rows and fill with Garter St remembering Patt 1 to centralise the St Patt. Now using the SUBSTITUTION and SPREAD VERTICAL facilities. Place Garter St Patt 2 at each side*. When this section has been knitted, programme Garter St Patt 1 and knit to end. LEFT FRONT - Input a Grid 111 sts x 108 rows. Work as BACK to *. When this section has been knitted, input a Grid 111 sts x 54 rows. Work as BACK to

> EXCEPT only place the Garter St Border at right side. This section is knitted 3 times. When knitted, input a Grid 119 sts x 130 rows and fill with Garter St Patt 1 as before. ** Using the SUB-STITUTION facility only, place the 12 rows of Garter St Patt 2 at the right side from St 50 **. Repeat from ** to ** x 8 placing the St Patt 1 St more to the right each time and on the last repeat continue the 12 rows to the top of the grid. When you

programme this section remember to position the left end N position to the Left end N on the Needle Bed.

Using A COBH over 173 KH Ns, 000. *** Working in Garter St Patt 2 knit to RC12. Working in Garter St Patt 1 to end, knit to RC120 ***. Cast on 8 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Knit to RC290. Place a WY marker at each end of work. Knit to RC380.

Shoulder and

Back Neck shaping

COL, Backstitch cast off centre 17 sts. Using ravel cord, take back to NWP all sts at right. At beg of next and every foll alt row cast off 15 sts x 4, 18 sts x 1 and, AT THE SAME TIME, at right, on alt rows, cast off 2 sts x 4. Return sts at right to Ns and knit to match left side reversing shapings.

LEFT FRONT Using A COBH, over 95 KH

Ns, 000. Repeat from *** to ***. Cast on 8 sts at beg of next row. Knit to RC282. Front shaping

Inc 1 st at right on next and every foll 12th row x 8, and, AT THE SAME TIME at RC290. Place a WY marker at left end of work. Knit to RC380.

Shoulder shaping

At beg of next and every foll alt row cast off 15 sts x 4, 18 sts x 1. On rem sts knit 20 rows and waste knit.

RIGHT FRONT

As LEFT FRONT reversing shapings.

GARTER STITCH BANDS FOR SLITS (4)

Using A COBH over 8 KH Ns, 000. Working in Garter St Patt 2 throughout, knit to RC120 and cast off. Attach to BACK and FRONTS. cast off. Join COLLAR extension and stitch to BACK neck. Push 153 KH Ns into WP. With wrong side facing, pick up same number of sts evenly along armhole edge between WY markers and place onto Ns. Using K-Carr T8 knit 1 row, 000. Working in Garter St Patt 1 throughout - UPSIDE DOWN, knit to RC4. Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll 4th row x 34. Knit to RC138. CUFFS: Working in Garter St Patt 2 to end, T5. Knit 12 rows. T10 knit 1 row and cast off.

MAKE-UP

Wash, block and press. Join side and SLEEVE seams.

BABY RANGE

MACHINES: A, C or D with KR. MATERIALS: STAN-DARD 4-PLY WOOL, we used height 68 (74, 80, 86)cm, approx chest 47 (49, 51, 53)cm. TENSION: Fairisle St Patt and St st - 40 sts - 14.3cm and 60 rows = 14.6cm (approx T6 for Fairisle and T6° for St st). **RIB:** 1 x 1 T1/1. **NOTES:** Fairisle St Patt 1 (Plaid) - A in FA throughout, knit 8 rows B, 4 rows C in FB. Fairisle St Patt 2 (Ducks) - A in FA throughout, knit 4 rows C, then 20 rows B in FB.

BLANKET - 'Ducks' section Using WY cast on over 196 KH Ns and knit a few rows ending with COR, 000. T6 * Using A knit 5 rows. Set for first row of Fairisle St Patt 2 and knit 1 row to select Ns. Working in Fairisle (see NOTES) knit 24 rows. Using A knit 5 rows. Set for first row of Fairisle St Patt 2 - REVERSE and knit 1 row to select Ns. Working in Fairisle, knit 24 rows. * Repeat from * to * throughout. Knit to RC336 and waste knit.

FRONT BAND

Using A COBH over 8 KH Ns, 000. Working in Garter St Patt 2 throughout, knit to RC820 and cast off. Attach to FRONT opening edges and BACK neck.

SLEEVES

Join both shoulders by placing both sets of shoulder sts back onto Ns with right sides together. T10 knit 1 row and

With right side facing, return sts from 'Duck's section to Ns. Using A T6 knit 1 row. **Using C knit 19 rows. T10 knit 1 row and latch cast off**. Repeat from ** to ** for opposite end. For sides repeat from ** to ** using 115 sts and working from corner to centre.

MAKE-UP

Join seams of trims. Block and press.



HAT

over 61 KH Ns as RIB, 000. Knit to RC12. Trans all sts to KH. With wrong side facing, pick up same number of sts evenly along neck edge and place onto Ns. T7 knit 1 row. T10 knit 1 row and cast off.

BUTTONHOLE BAND

Push 105 KH Ns into WP. With wrong side facing, pick up same number of sts evenly along RIGHT FRONT opening edge and place onto Ns. Using A T7 knit 1 row. Trans to RIB,



000. Knit to RC6. Work 7 x 2 st buttonholes evenly spaced along the row. Knit to RC11. T10/8 knit 1 row. Trans all sts to KH and latch cast off.

BUTTON BAND As BUTTONHOLE BAND omitting buttonholes

SLEEVES

Push 84 KH Ns to WP. With wrong side facing, pick up same number of sts evenly along armhole edge between WY markers and place onto Ns, COL. Set for first row of Fairisle St Patt - UPSIDE DOWN - T7 using A knit 1 row to select Ns, 000. Working in Fairisle throughout - in **REVERSE** order - knit to RC8. Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll 4th row x 19. Knit to RC84 and waste knit rem 46 sts. CUFFS: Push 37 KH Ns to WP. With wrong side facing, place sts from cuff edge onto Ns distributing them evenly along the row. Using A T7 knit 1 row. Trans to RIB, 000. Knit to RC19. T10/8 knit 1 row. Trans all sts to KH and latch cast off.
