

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


















































Love your knitting machine

Now that summer is knocking at our doors we have included some cotton yarns which give knitting a new dimension. For so long we have had to admire from afar those excellent cottons available on the continent. My own thoughts are that cotton has had a bad hearing here and although not inexpensive, is warm in winter, cool in summer and extremely comfortable to wear — the practicalities are only surpassed by the beauty of natural fibres. My own cotton sweaters are tumble-dried which shrinks them slightly so I knit a size larger. You should wash, dry, and press your tension swatches in the same manner as you intend to care for your finished garment.

Pale grey, peach, lilac, soft pinks, blues and creams are this summer's fashion colours so we have taken steps to give you a number of garments you can easily team with accessories now in the shops. Grey is here to stay for a few seasons and may be worn with so many colours that it is a sound investment in any yarn. For something a little more "powerful" for the less than sunny days, try our pull-up mohair sweater in Argyll Finesse, or treat the man in your life to one of our super sweaters or jackets — he's been well catered for this time! 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WOVEN-TUCK SKIRT AND MINI PONCHO WITH LACE SWEATER

MACHINES: A, B or C. MATERIALS: KING COLE Superwash 4-ply wool. Skirt: Heather — 500 gm; Lilac — 50 gm; Linden - 50 gm; Silver — 500 gm; Wide Elastic. Mini Poncho: Heather (M) — 150 gm; Lilac - 25 gm; Linden - 25 gm. Sweater: Silver 420 (450, 480, 510, 540) gm. MEASUREMENTS: To fit bust 81 (86, 92, 97, 102) cm. Skirt: - one size, length approx. 68 cm below waistband. Poncho one size, 48 cm square (without fringe). **TENSION:** weaving — 24 sts and 43 rows = 10 cm (approx T6) Lace (card 2) - 26 stsand 44 rows = 10 cm (approx T5). RIB: 2 x2. T2/2. [Weaving — Tuck patterns.] Card 1. M = Heather. Weaving yarn — Linden and Lilac alt. To Knit - weave 10 rows Linden, 2 rows Lilac, 10 rows Linden. Set both Tuck buttons. With M tuck 3 rows. Release tuck buttons. Knit 1 row M. Weave 10 rows Lilac, 2 rows Linden, 10 rows Lilac. Tuck 3 rows with M. Release tuck buttons. Knit 1 row M. Rep these 52 rows.

SKIRT


Knitted sideways. Insert card 1. With WY cast on 123 sts and knit a few rows. COR. Set for weaving. 000. T6. With M in FA, work in patt to RC 338. Waste knit sts 20-53 at right of N bed, do not release from M/C. Cont in patt to RC 776. Waste knit sts 20-53 at right of N bed, do not release from M/C. Cont in patt to RC 1092. Waste knit. Graft seam together.


POCKETS


Pick up 34 sts from one side of pocket and place on Ns. Do not remove WY. 000. T5. With M knit 4 rows.* At waist edge dec 1 st and at opposite edge inc 1 st. Knit 2 rows*. Repfrom * to * to RC 50. Cast off. Pick up 34 sts from 2nd side of pocket and place on Ns. Remove WY. Knit as first side reversing shapings. Work 2nd pocket the same. Join pocket seams tog.

WAISTBAND (2 pieces)

Press skirt and pleats as diagram. Pockets must be placed on an inverted pleat. With right side facing pick up 118 sts evenly along one half of waist. T6. With M knit 1 row. Trans to 2 x 2 rib. 000. T2/2. Rib 90 rows. Trans to KH. T6. Knit 2 rows. Waste knit. Join waistband seams, fold in half to outside and back stitch through last row in M, encasing elastic at the same time.









FRILLS (6 pieces)

Insert card 2. With WY cast on 195 sts, and knit a few rows. COR. T5. With Silver Grey knit 8 rows. Make row of holes on alt Ns (leave Ns in WP). Knit 8 rows and turn up hem. 000. T5. Knit 2 rows. Work in lace to RC 74. Knit 2 rows st st. Waste knit.





MAKE UP

Press all frill sections. Join to form a circle. Divide hem of Skirt into 6 and mark with pieces of yarn. With right of frill facing replace sts of 1 frill onto M/C, 2 sts on each N. With wrong side of Skirt facing pick up sts between 2 markers and place onto same Ns. T10. With M knit 1 row. Latch off but do not break yarn. Work all the frills the same. Give final press.

WOVEN MINI PONCHO

Weaving/tuck patt as Skirt.


Insert card 1. With M COBH 117 sts. 000.

T6. Patt 60 rows. Cast off centre 17 sts.

Waste knit sts at left.

Shape Neck

Patt 1 row. At neck edge cast off 3 sts once, 2 sts twice, 1 st 5 times, 1 st every 4th row twice and every 6th row twice. 34 sts rem. Cont straight to RC 109. At neck edge inc 1




st on next and foll 6th row, every 4th row twice, every alt rows 5 times. Knit 1 row. Cast on 2 sts twice, and 3 sts once. 50 sts. Waste knit. Replace sts on WY onto Ns and work to match first side reversing shaping. Cast on 17sts at neck edge and replace sts from first side onto Ns. 117 sts. 000. Work in patt for 60 rows. Cast off.

MAKE UP AND NECKBAND

Press square. Make fringe in M and attach to outer edge. With M cast on 178 sts for 2 x 2 rib. 000. Rib 12 rows. Change to circular knitting (all Ns in WP). T6/6. 000. Knit to RC 8. Waste knit. Join neckband into a circle. Attach to neck and backstitch through last row of M, first on right side, then catch down sts on inside. Give final press.

LACE PANELLED SWEATER

NOTE: KH860, KH881, use card 2 and block out alt lace patt. KH910, programme 8 blank squares alongside lace patt. Other models, push back selected Ns of alt lace patt to B pos.



BACK

Cast on 122 (130, 138, 146, 154) sts. Rib 36 rows. Trans to KH. Insert card 2. 000. T5. Work in lace to RC 150. 000.

Shape Armholes

Cast off 8 (12, 8, 12, 8) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Cont to RC 84 (84, 88, 92, 92) rows. Waste knit.

FRONT


Knit as Back to RC 56 (56, 60, 64, 64) above armhole shaping.

Shape Neck

Waste knit centre 16 (16, 18, 18, 20) sts. Waste knit sts at left. Knit 1 row.Cast off at neck edge 4 sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts twice. Dec 1 st on alt rows 5 (5, 6, 6, 7) times. 37 (41, 43, 47, 49) sts rem. Knit to RC 88 (88, 92, 96, 96). Waste knit. Replace sts at left onto Ns and knit to match first side reversing shaping.

SLEEVES

With WY cast on 90 (90, 98, 106, 106) sts and knit a few rows. 000. T5. With M work in lace to RC 168. 000.



Shape Top

Dec 1 st at each end of next and every 4th row 17 times in all, then every row 14 times. 28 (28, 36, 44, 44) sts rem. Cast off.

CUFFS


With right side facing replace sts from base of sleeve onto 58 (58, 64, 74, 74) Ns dec sts evenly along the row. T5. Knit 1 row. Trans to rib. 000. T2/2. Knit 72 rows. Trans to KH. T5. Knit 2 rows. Waste knit.

NECKBAND AND MAKE UP

Join one shoulder. With right side facing, pick up 134 (134, 138, 138, 142) sts evenly round neck. T5. Knit 1 row. Trans to rib. 000. T2/2. Knit 120 rows. Trans to KH. T5. Knit 2 rows. Waste knit. Join 2nd shoulder.

Fold neckband in half to outside and backstitch through last row of M. Join side, sleeve and cuff seams. Sew in sleeves, gathering top to fit armhole. Fold cuffs in half to outside and backstitch through last row in M. Press.

LADY'S SKIRT AND TOP

MACHINES: A, B or C. MATERIALS: PATONS 4-ply Beehive: M (Lemon 4044) — 500 (500, 550, 550, 600) gm, 1st Con Col (Blue 4028), 2nd Con Col (Green 4106), 3rd Con Col (Lilac 4017) — 30 (35, 40, 45, 50) gm in each. 2.5 cm elastic to fit waist. MEASUREMENTS: To fit bust 81 (86, 91, 96, 101) cm, hip 86 (91, 96, 101, 106) cm. TENSION: 30 sts and 38 rows = 10 cm (approx T6.1). RIB: 1 x 1 T2/2. NOTES: The top is patt on the front however the back may also be patt. The patt is worked in intarsia but may be knitted in blocks - adding extra st each side of panel for seam - and stitched together.

SKIRT (2 panels)


Using M COBH 152 (161, 170, 179, 188) sts. T6 knit 10 rows. T10 knit 1 row. 000. T6.1 knit 190 rows. Trans to 1 x 1 rib. 000. T2/2 rib 70 rows. Cast off. Knit second panel to match.

MAKE UP

Sew side seams. Turn up hem at loose row and stitch down. Work herringbone stitch at waist and thread elastic through.

TOP BACK

Using M COBH 137 (143, 152, 158, 167) sts. T6 knit 8 rows. T10 knit 1 row. 000. T6.1 knit 65 rows. Starting at centre, trans



With M cast on 73 (73, 77, 77, 81) sts. Rib 46 rows. Trans to KH. Insert card. 000. T6. Knit to 6 rows. Begin weaving as Back, AT THE SAME TIME, inc 1 st at each end of next and every 8th row 6 times in all, then every foll 6th row 16 times. 117 (117, 121, 121, 125) sts. Knit to RC 158 or desired length. 000.


Shape Raglans


Cast off 5 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 (1, 3, 1, 3) rows then alt rows 12 (14, 14, 16, 16) times. 77 sts rem. Knit 1 row and waste knit.

FRONT YOKE

Push 97 (103, 109, 115, 121) Ns to WP. Replace sts from front neck onto Ns, dec 7 sts evenly along the row. Push to WP 37 Ns on left and 38 Ns on right. Replace half the







sts from each sleeve back onto Ns, dec 1 st at raglan edge on each sleeve and inc 1 st at each end of work. 174 (180, 186, 192, 198) sts. Insert tuck card. 000. T6. Foll colour sequence knit to RC 19. Knit 1 row, dec 28 (29, 30, 31, 32) sts evenly along the row. 146 (151, 156, 161, 166) sts. Work in patt to RC 37. Knit 1 row, dec 28 (29, 30, 31, 32) sts evenly along the row. work to RC 55. Knit 1 row, dec 22 (24, 26, 28, 30) sts evenly along the row. 96 (98, 100, 102, 104) sts. work to RC 73. Knit 1 row, dec 11 sts evenly along the row. 85 (87, 89, 91, 93) sts. Work to RC 86. Waste knit.


BACK YOKE

Work as Front Yoke but dec 23 sts instead of 11 on last dec. 73 (75, 77, 79, 81) sts. Waste knit.

NECKBAND AND MAKE UP

Back: push 73 (75, 77, 79, 81) Ns to WP. With purl side facing pick up sts from back yoke and place on Ns, inc 1 st each side. T1/1. With M rib 50 rows. T4/4. Rib 1 row. Waste knit.

Front: push 85 (87, 89, 91, 93) Ns to WP. Knit as Back. Sew shoulder and neckband seams. Fold neckband to outside and back st into last row in M. Join raglan seams, then side and sleeve seams.



COTTON DRESS — CROSS OVER BODICE

MACHINES: A, B or C. **MATERIALS:** Silverknit Adah: Rose (5760) — 470 (500, 530, 560, 590) gm. White (5701) — 90 (100, 110, 120, 130) gm. Medium crochet hook. **MEASUREMENTS:** To fit bust 81 (86, 91, 97, 102) cms. **TENSION:** St st — 32 sts and 47 rows = 10 cm over stripe, after steam press.


STRIPE

T6. Knit 1 row wih Rose and White (2 ends). T3. Knit 8 rows in Rose only. Rep these 9 rows

BODICE

BACK (Knitted sideways)

With Rose COBH 144 sts. 000. T3. Knit 4 rows in Rose. Foll stripe AT THE SAME TIME knit to 4 (10, 10, 14, 18) rows. Inc 1 st at beg of next and every foll 8th row 8 times in all. 152 sts. Knit to 65 (70, 71, 75, 79) rows. Mark right side for neck*. Knit to 149 (154, 163, 167, 171) rows. Mark right side with WY (end of neck). Dec 1 st at



right side on next row. Knit 10 rows. Dec 1 st a right side on next and every foll 8th row 7 times in all. 144 sts rem. Knit to 215 (224, 233, 242, 251) rows (ending with 4 rows in Rose.) Cast off.

LEFT FRONT


Knit as Back to *. Knit 1 (0, 1, 1, 1) row. COR.

Shape Front Edge

Cast off 4 sts at beginning of next and alt rows 20 (20, 14, 14, 14) times in all, and 3 sts on foll alt rows 23 (23, 31, 31, 31) times. Knit 1 row and cast off rem 3 sts.

RIGHT FRONT

Knit as Left Front, reversing shapings.



SKIRT

Knitted sideways. With WY cast on 196 sts. Knit several rows. COR. Change to Rose. 000*. T3. Knit 8 rows, T6, knit 1 row with Rose and White. Cont stripes and knit to 21 rows. (3 rows Rose.) Push 30 Ns opposite carr to HP and knit 2 rows. Push same 30 Ns to UWP and knit 3 rows. Knit 2 stripes. 3rd stripe, knit 2 rows. Push 40 Ns to HP and knit 2 rows. Push same 40 Ns to UWP and knit 4 rows. Keeping stripes correct and working HP on every 3rd stripe cont in this way (30 or 40 Ns to HP) to 648 (666, 684, 702, 720) rows. Knit 1 row in Rose only. Pick up sts from WY and place on Ns. Cast off loosely.

BELT

With White, COBH 8 sts. T3. Set for cord knitting and work until belt measures 3.5 m. Cast off.

MAKE UP AND EDGING

Join side seams of bodice, leaving 18 (18.5, 19, 19.5, 20) cm open at top, then sew shoulder seams, matching stripes. Cross

over fronts and tack tog at waist. Gather shorter edge of skirt to fit waist and sew tog. With crochet hook and White, work 2 rows of d.c. along base of skirt, armholes, along front edges and back neck. Press.



DRESS


MACHINES: D with KR. **MATERIALS:** EMU Coolspun. M. 450 (500, 550, 600, 650) gm. EMU Perle — 100 gm. **MEASUREMENTS:** To fit bust 81 (86, 91, 96, 101) cm. Hip 86 (91, 96, 101, 106) cm. **TENSION:** 16 sts and 27 rows = 10 cm (approx T3). **RIB:** 1 x 1 T1/1 using 2 ends (Perle). **NOTES:** Purl side is used as right side.

BACK

Using Perle cast on 71 (75, 79, 83, 87) sts. Rib 8 rows. Trans to st st. Break yarn. Join in M. 000. T3. Knit 212 rows.

Shape Raglan

000. Cast off 2 (2, 3, 3, 3) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Knit 2 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next and every 4th row 5 (5, 5, 4, 4) times then alt rows 7 (9, 10, 13, 15) times. Knit to RC 36 (40, 42, 44, 48). Waste knit.



FRONT

As back to 204 rows above rib.

Shape 'Vee'


Dec 1 st at centre. Push all Ns on opp side of carr to HP. At neck edge dec 1 st on every row 9 (5, 3, 0, 0) times then alt rows 10 (14, 16, 19, 19) times. AT THE SAME TIME when RC reads 212...

Shape Raglan

000. Cast off 2 (2, 3, 3, 3) sts at beg of next row. Knit 3 rows. Dec 1 st at beg of next and every 4th row 3 (3, 3, 2, 2) times then alt rows 9 (11, 12, 15, 17) times. Knit to RC 32 (36, 38, 40, 44). Fasten off. Rejoin yarn to other side of neck and work to correspond reversing shapings.

LEFT SLEEVE

COR. Using WY cast on 47 (49, 53, 55, 59) sts. Knit a few rows. Join in M. 000. T3. Knit 20 rows. Inc 1 st at each end of next and every 20th row 5 times. Knit to RC 108.



Shape Raglan

000. Cast off 2 (2, 3, 3, 3) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Knit 2 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next and every 4th row 1 (2, 2, 2, 2) times then alt rows 13 (13, 14, 15, 17) times. Knit to RC 32 (36, 38, 40, 44). On right side dec 1 st on next and alt rows, AT THE SAME TIME on side opp carr bring forward to HP 8 sts twice. RC 36 (40, 42, 44, 48). Waste knit.

RIGHT SLEEVE

As left sleeve reversing shapings and starting with COL.

CUFFS

Bring forward to WP 39 (43, 45, 45, 45) Ns. Pick up sts from base of sleeve and place onto Ns distributing sts evenly along row. Remove WY. T3. Using Perle knit 1 row. Trans to 1 x 1 rib. T1/1. Rib 18 rows. Cast off.

NECKBAND

Worked in 2 pieces. With purl side facing pick up 49 (51, 53, 55, 57) sts evenly along one side of 'Vee' and 1 sleeve.* Using Perle T3. knit 1 row. Trans to 1 x 1 rib. T1/1. Rib 8 rows. Cast off.* With purl side facing pick up 91 (93, 95, 97, 99) sts evenly along second side of 'Vee', second sleeve and back neck. Rep * to *.

MAKE UP

Join raglans and neckband. Mitre 'Vee'. Join side and sleeve seams.



LACE DRESS — CHEVRON STITCH


MACHINES: A or C with KR. **MATERIALS:** PATSY Crepe 4-ply. Orange 270 (300, 330, 360, 390) gms; Fawn — 295 (325, 355, 385, 415) gms; White — 195 (225, 255, 285, 315) gms; Brown — 70 (100, 130, 160, 190) gms; **MEASURE-MENTS:** To fit bust 81 (86, 91, 96, 102) cms. **TENSION:** Lace St — 37 sts and 39 rows = 10 cm, after light dry press. (approx T6).


SKIRT

Panel A — 147 sts. Panel B — 171 sts. Panel C — 195 sts. Bust 81 cm — panel B x 3. 86 cm — Panel A x 1, panel C x 2. 91 cm — panel A x 1, panel C x 2. 96 cm — panel B x 1, panel C x 2. 102 cm — panel C x 3.

Colour Sequence

Knit 14 rows in Orange, 16 rows Fawn, 16 rows White, 2 rows Orange, 2 rows Brown, 6 rows Fawn, 2 rows Brown, 58 rows = 1 repeat.






To Knit

Insert card, With WY cast on sts for 1 panel, placing the extra st to left of centre. Knit several rows. COL. Knit 1 row with nylon thread. With Orange COBH over same Ns. 000. T6. Knit 2 rows in st st. Begin lace and colour sequence, knit to 264 rows (Approx 67.5 cm) or length required. Cast off. Knit 2 more panels as given for sizes above.

BODICE BACK

With White, COBH 161 (171, 179, 189, 197) sts placing extra st to left of centre. 000. T6. Knit 2 rows in st st. Keeping colour sequence correct, knit to 96 rows. 000.



Shape Armholes

Cast off 8 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 145 (155, 163, 173, 181) sts rem*. Knit to 68 (70, 74, 76, 78) rows.

Shape Shoulder

Cast off 9 (10, 10, 11, 11) sts at beg of next 8 rows and 9 (9, 12, 12, 15) sts on next 2 rows. Cast off rem 55 (57, 59, 61, 63) sts.

FRONT

Knit as Back to *. Knit to 30 (32, 36, 38, 40) rows. Cast of centre 21 (23, 25, 27, 29) sts. Waste knit sts at left. Knit 1 row. Dec 1 st at neck on next 6 rows, every alt rows 8 times and every 4th row 3 times. 45 (49, 52, 56, 59) sts rem. Knit to 68 (70, 74, 76, 78) rows. Shape Shoulder as Back. Replace sts onto Ns and knit to match first side, reversing shapings.

BELT

T4. Knit a tube of 4 sts for approx. 1 m, 50 cm long. Cast off.

NECKBAND, ARMBANDS AND MAKE UP

Sew right shoulder seam. Slide Lever 11. With Brown cast on 149 (153, 157, 161, 165) sts over alt Ns. T1/1. Knit 1 circular row. Push all empty Ns to WP and half pitch lever to H. Change to Fawn. T2/2. Knit 1 circular row. Lever 1. T3/3. Knit 1 circular row. Cont in this way to T7/7. Knit 2 circular rows. Change to Brown, knit 2 circular rows. Trans sts to KH and knit 1 row*. With wrong side of work facing pick up sts evenly round neck and place on Ns. Knit 1 loose row and cast off.

Sew left shoulder seam. Foll neckband to *, cast on 113 (117, 121, 125, 129) sts. With wrong side facing pick up sts round armhole and place on Ns. Knit 1 loose row and cast off. Sew Skirt panels tog using mattress stitch. Sew side seams of Bodice. Sew Skirt to bodice, gathering skirt to fit. At base of skirt and using Orange work 1 row of d.c. Do not turn work. Work 1 row of crab st (working d.c. from left to right). Press seams. Thread belt through holes at waist.




LADY'S SUNSET SWEATER

MACHINES: KH910.

MATERIALS: Any D.K.; 250 (270, 290, 310) Deep Blue 100 gm Olive, 50 gm in each of White, Red, Pale Blue, Blue and Mid Blue. MEASUREMENTS: To fit bust 86 (91, 97, 102) cm. TENSION: 24 sts and 32 rows = 10 cm (approx T9). RIB: 2 x 2 T4/4.

BACK

With Olive cast on 124 (130, 136, 142) sts. Rib 16 rows. Trans to st st. 000. T9. Knit 23 rows. Pale Blue knit 16 rows, Blue knit 12 rows. Mid Blue knit 10 rows. Deep Blue knit to row 126.



Shape Armholes

Cast off 7 (8, 9. 10) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 110 (114, 118, 122) sts rem. Knit to row 202 (204, 206, 208).

Shape Shoulders

Cast off 11 sts at beg of next 4 rows and 12 (13, 14, 15) sts on next 2 rows. Waste knit on rem 42 (44, 46, 48) sts.

FRONT

Patt variation switches—No 2 upper pos. Patt selector switch—centre pos.





Insert sheet. Knit as Back to *. Mid Blue knit 8 rows. Set sheet for Fairisle (sun). FA Mid Blue, FB Red, knit 2 rows, FA Deep Blue, FB Red, Knit to 82 rows. Deep Blue st st. Knit to row 101. Set sheet for Fairisle (cloud). FA Deep Blue, FB White. Knit first cloud on one side and when finished knit second cloud on the other side. AT THE SAME TIME cast off 7 (8, 9, 10) sts on row 127 and 128. When clouds are finished knit in Deep Blue only to row 176.

Shape Neck

Cast off centre 12 (14, 16, 18) sts and push Ns at left to HP. Knit 1 row. Cast off at neck edge 4 sts once, and 3 sts once. Dec 1 st on next 2 rows, then alt rows 6 times. 34 (35, 36, 37) sts rem. Knit to row 202 (204, 206, 208). Shape Shoulder as Back. Rejoin yarn to rem sts and knit to match first side, reversing shapings.





Insert sheet. With Olive cast on 54 (56, 60, 62) sts. Rib 16 rows. Trans to st st. Waste knit. Replace sts onto 78 (80, 84, 86) Ns, inc 24 sts evenly along row. 000. T9. Working cols as Back, knit 4 rows. Inc 1 st at each end of next and every 7th row 18 times in all, AT THE SAME TIME knit to row 99. Set sheet for Fairisle (cloud). FA Deep Blue, FB White, Knit one cloud on *right sleeve only*. Knit to 128 rows. Mark each side with WY for armhole. Knit a further 8 (10, 12, 14) rows. Cast off.

NECKBAND AND MAKE UP

Press pieces with a damp cloth and warm iron. Sew right shoulder seam. Deep Blue cast on 110 (114, 118, 122) sts. Rib 10 rows.

Trans to st st. With wrong side of work facing, pick up sts round neck. Knit 1 loose row and cast off. Sew left shoulder seam. Sew in sleeves, then side and sleeve seams. Press seams.

Shape Top

Cast off 2 (2, 2, 3, 3, 3, 4) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next and alt rows 8 times in all, every 4th row 23 (23, 24, 25, 26, 26, 27) times and every alt rows 5 (7, 7, 7, 7, 9, 9) times. 21 (21, 23, 23, 25, 25, 25) sts rem. Knit 3 rows. Cast off.

NECKBAND AND MAKE UP

BACK

With wrong side of back facing pick up sts and place on Ns.* T7. With 2 ends knit 8 rows. T6, knit 6 rows. T8, knit 1 row. T6, knit 6 rows. T7, knit 8 rows. Cast off loosely.

FRONT

With wrong side facing pick up 56 (58, 60, 62, 64, 66, 68) sts from V to top of shoulder. Knit as Back from *, dec 1 st at V on 3rd and every foll alt row 6 times in all, and inc on alt rows 6 times. Knit other side to match. Sew shoulder seams, sew in sleeves, then sew side and sleeve seams. Sew mitred edges, fold to inside and sew in place. Press seams lightly.






With M in FA and Con Col in FB, knit to 58 rows. COR.



Shape Top

Cast off 2 (2, 2, 3, 3, 3, 4) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next and alt rows 8 times in all, every 4th row 23 (23, 24, 25, 26, 26, 27) times and every alt rows 5 (7, 7, 7, 7, 9, 9) times. 21 (21, 23, 23, 25, 25, 25) sts rem. Knit 3 rows. Cast off.

NECKBAND AND MAKE UP

BACK

With wrong side of back facing pick up sts and place on Ns.* T7. With 2 ends knit 8 rows. T6, knit 6 rows. T8, knit 1 row. T6, knit 6 rows. T7, knit 8 rows. Cast off loosely.

FRONT

With wrong side facing pick up 56 (58, 60, 62, 64, 66, 68) sts from V to top of shoulder. Knit as Back from *, dec 1 st at V on 3rd and every foll alt row 6 times in all, and inc on alt rows 6 times. Knit other side to match. Sew shoulder seams, sew in sleeves, then sew side and sleeve seams. Sew mitred edges, fold to inside and sew in place. Press seams lightly.






With M in FA and Con Col in FB, knit to 58 rows. COR.

Cast on 2 sts at beg of next and alt rows 42 times in all. 142 (145, 148, 151) sts. Knit 1 row. Cast on 16 sts at beg of next and alt rows 3 times. 190 (193, 196, 199) sts. 147 rows. Knit straight to 194 (194, 198, 198) rows. Mark N 48 (48, 52, 52) from left with WY for neck. Cast off loosely.

RIGHT BACK

times. 142 (145, 144, 147) sts rem. Knit 1 row and cast off.

LEFT FRONT

Knit as Right Back, reversing front neck shapings.

CUFFS, NECKBAND AND MAKE UP

Cuffs. Join shoulder seams at cuff for a few cms. With M cast on 63 (63, 67, 67) sts. Rib 24 rows. Trans to st st. With wrong side of work facing, pick up sts along cuff edge and place on Ns. Knit 1 loose row and cast off.

Back Neckband. Join centre back seam. With M cast on 82 (82, 90, 90) sts. T6. Knit 22 rows. Make a hem and knit the row. With wrong side of back facing pick up sts between markers and place on Ns. Knit 1 loose row and cast off.

Front Neckband. With M cast on 51 (51, 55, 55) sts. Knit as Back. Pick up sts along one neck edge and place on Ns. Knit 1 loose row and cast off. Knit other side to match. 





MEASUREMENTS: To fit bust — 81 (86, 91, 96, 101) cm. TENSION: 22 sts and 26 rows = 10 cm over weaving patt (approx T10). RIB: 2 x 2 Pitch lever to H Slide lever 11, T2/2. FNR Slide lever 11 T1/1. NOTES: Weaving patt is produced by using card on row 1. Knit 1 row st st and 1 row weaving. Yarn will be on opposite side to carr every other weaving row making it necessary to lay yarn toward carr (lay-in method of weaving must be used) please ensure that there is enough slack on the weaving yarn. Use card 1 pattern 1.





Trousers and Skirt: to fit waist 51 (53, 56, 61, 64) cm. TENSION: Sweater: 30 sts and 40 rows = 10 cm (approx T5.1). RIB: T1.1/1.1. Trousers: 32 sts and 42 rows = 10 cm st st (approx T5). RIB: 1 x 1 T1.2/1.2. Skirt: 30 sts and 40 rows = 10 cm st st (approx T6). RIB: 1 x 1 T1.2/1.2. NOTES: This garment was knitted on a KH910 with a 10 st patt repeat. For other models the patt repeat is 8 sts, therefore only 4 stripes are to be worked instead of 5.

STRIPE AND FAIRISLE PATTERN



Fold front neckband in half to outside and back stitch through last row in M. With wrong side facing pick up 29 (31, 33, 37, 39) sts from front shoulder and neckband and place on Ns. T5.1. With M knit 1 row. Trans to rib and knit 6 rows. Work 3 holes (over 2 Ns) across row. Knit 7 rows. Cast off. Work other shoulder to match.



With wrong side facing, pick up 92 (98, 104, 110, 116) sts along armhole edge, making sure to overlap rib bands at shoulders. Push 32 (32, 40, 40, 40) to HP opp to carr on next 2 rows. Push 8 Ns to UWP on next 8 (8, 10, 10, 10) rows. Knit 12 (12, 14, 14, 16) rows. 000. T5.1. Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll 5 (5, 6, 6, 6) th row to 62 (62, 68, 68, 74) sts. Knit to RC 80 (90, 106, 122, 132) AT THE SAME TIME after RC 44 (56, 70, 86, 96) work stripe patt omitting the Fairisle. Waste knit.

CUFFS



At left push to HP 8 (11, 15, 18, 21) Ns and knit 2 rows. Push 10 Ns at left to HP on next and alt rows until all Ns are in HP. Knit 1 row across all Ns. Waste knit.

RIGHT BACK

Knit as Left Back reversing shapings by starting with COR.

LEFT FRONT

With WY cast on 61 (64, 68, 71, 74) sts. Knit a few rows. COR. 000. T5. With M knit to RC 142 (172, 202, 234, 268). COR. 000.

Shape Crotch

At beg of next and alt rows cast off 4 sts, 3 sts, 2 sts once. Dec 1 st on alt rows 4 times. 48 (51, 55, 58, 61) sts rem. Knit to RC 36 (40, 44, 48, 52).

Shape Pocket

Keeping right edge straight dec 1 st (4 sts in) at left on next and alt rows 20 times. 28 (31, 35, 38, 41) sts. Knit 2 rows. RC 76 (80, 84, 88, 92). Waste knit.

RIGHT FRONT

Knit as Left Front reversing shapings by starting with COL. To make crease in front of trousers. Find centre st at waist (including 20 sts for pocket), 'ladder' stitch to first row, then with right side facing latch up st, 2 at a time.

POCKETS

With M COBH 60 sts. 000. T5. Knit 30 rows. Dec 1 st at beg of next and alt rows 20 times. Knit 2 rows. Waste knit. Knit 2nd pocket reversing shaping.

MAKE UP, WAISTBAND AND CUFFS

Join centre front seam. Fold pocket in half lengthwise and sew cast on edge tog, then sew 30 rows tog. Attach pocket to front of trousers by sewing the 2 shaped edges tog. Sew outside leg seams, starting at waist and sewing the pocket to trouser back as far as beg of shaping for pocket, then cont seam by joining the front and back seams together.

WAISTBAND

With right of garment facing pick up 171 (179, 183, 191, 199) sts evenly along waist edge, including sts at top of pocket and making a small pleat at centre of each front. T5. With M knit 1 row. Trans to rib and knit 28 rows. Trans to KH. T5. Knit 2 rows. Waste knit. Join centre back seam. Fold waist band in half to outside and back stitch through last row of M, encasing elastic at the same time.

CUFFS


With right side facing replace sts from base of trousers onto 81 (87, 93, 101, 107) Ns, dec sts evenly along the row. T5. With M knit 1 row. Trans to rib and knit 28 rows. Trans to KH. T5. Knit 2 rows. Wast knit. Join inside leg seam. Fold cuff in half to outside and sew as waistband. Give final press.

SKIRT

NOTE: As sweater and trousers.

BACK

With M COBH 142 (172, 172, 199, 199) sts. T5. Knit 12 rows. T10. Knit 1 row. 000. T6. Knit 10 rows. Work Fairisle patt for 15 or 12 rows. Set for double length patt and work stripe and Fairisle patt, changing col halfway for 30 or 24 rows. Cont in M to RC 144 (160, 176, 192, 208). Waste knit.



WAISTBAND


With right side facing, replace sts onto 121 (149, 149, 177, 177) Ns, dec sts evenly along the row. T6. Knit 1 row. Trans to rib and knit 26 rows. Trans to KH. T6. Knit 2 rows. Waste knit.

RIGHT FRONT

With M COBH 102 (112, 112, 122, 122) sts. Knit as Back to RC 104 (120, 128, 144, 160).

Shape Pocket

Dec 1 st at beg of next and every 3 (3, 4, 4, 4)th row 12 times. Knit to RC 144 (160, 176, 192, 208). Waste knit.



LEFT FRONT

Knit as Right Front, reversing shaping.

POCKETS

With M COBH 42 sts. 000. T6. Knit to RC 40 (40, 32, 32, 32). Dec 1 st at beg of next and every 3 (3, 4, 4, 4) th row 12 times. Knit to RC 80. Waste knit. Knit 2nd pocket, reversing shaping.

MAKE UP AND FRONT WAISTBAND

Join centre front seam. Fold pocket in half lengthwise and sew cast on edge tog, then sew seam to beg of shaping. Attach pocket to front skirt by sewing the shaped edges tog. With right side facing replace sts from top of skirt onto 76 (78, 82, 84, 90) Ns, forming a box pleat at centre (24 sts from each side to form pleat), including sts at top of pocket and placing several sts onto 1 N, to dec rem sts. T5. Knit 13 rows. T10, knit 1 row. T5. Knit 13 rows. T6, knit 2 rows. Waste knit. Join side seams (as side seams of trousers). Fold waistband in half to outside and sew as trouser waistband. Turn hem at base to inside and sew in place. Give final press.



CABLE AND BOBBLE SWEATER

MACHINES: D with KR. **MATERIALS:** ARGYLL Aran 700 (700,750,750,750) gm. **MEASUREMENTS:** To fit bust 81 (86, 92, 97, 102) cm. **TENSION:** 18 sts and 25 rows = 10 cm (approx T4). **RIB:** 2 x 2 T2/2.

TO KNIT BOBBLES

COR. Working from chart, set carr to HP. Bring all Ns to left of first bobble to be knitted (closest to carr) to HP. Knit 1 row. COL. Bring all Ns to right of first bobble to HP. Knit 5 rows. COR. Pick up sts from first row knitted of bobble and place onto Ns. Push back to UWP all Ns to left of first bobble up to and including the Ns of second bobble. Knit 1 row. Bring to HP all Ns to right of second bobble. Knit 5 rows. Cont as set until all bobbles have been worked. NOTE: carr will be on the left after bobbles have been knitted and only 1 row will have been knitted. (Bobble over 2 sts).

BACK


Cast on 86 (90, 94, 98, 102) sts. Rib 22 rows. Trans to KH and patt. 000. T4. Knit 90 rows. 000.





Join right shoulder. With right side of work facing pick up 94 sts evenly round neck. 000. T4. Knit 14 rows.* Work a row of bobbles (2 sts for bobbles and 2 sts between bobbles). Knit 3 rows. Work 2nd row of bobbles, placing bobbles between first bobbles. Knit 3 rows*. Rep from * to * once more. RC 30. Waste knit.

SLEEVES

Cast on 46 (46, 50, 50 54) sts. Rib 18 rows. Trans to KH and patt. 000. T4. Knit 6 rows. Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 6th row to 76 (76, 80, 80, 84) sts. Knit to 106 rows. Waste knit.

MAKE UP

Join left shoulder. With right side of sleeve facing replace sts back on M/C. With wrong side of garment facing pick up 76 (76, 80, 80, 84) sts along armhole and place on Ns. Knit 1 loose row. Cast off. Repeat for 2nd sleeve. Join side and sleeve seams. Fold neckband in half to outside and backstitch through last row of M.



EDGE — EDGE JACKET IN LACE



Cast off 3 (3, 4, 4, 4) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next and alt rows 3 (4, 4, 4, 5) times in all, then every 4th row twice. 83 (87, 91, 95, 99) sts rem. Knit to 104 (108, 110, 114, 118) rows.



Shape Shoulders

Cast off 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) sts at beg of next 10 rows and 6 (7, 8, 4, 5) sts on next 2 rows. Waste knit on rem 31 (33, 35, 37, 39) sts.

RIGHT FRONT


With WY cast on 49 (52, 55, 57, 60) sts. Knit as BACK from * to **.

Shape Armhole

Cast off 3 (3, 4, 4, 4) sts at beg of next row, then dec 1 st at same edge on foll 3 (4, 4, 4, 5) alt rows, then on every 4th row twice. 41 (43, 45, 47, 49) sts rem. Knit to 65 (69, 71, 75, 79) rows.

Shape Neck

Knit 2 rows. Dec 1 st at neck edge on next and alt rows 4 times in all, then every 4th row 6 times. 26 (27, 28, 29, 30) sts rem. Knit to 104 (108, 110, 114, 118) rows.



With WY cast on 55 (57, 61, 63, 67) sts. Knit as Back from * to *. Knit 10 rows. Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 16th row 13 times in all. 81 (83, 87, 89, 93) sts. Knit to 214 rows, or desired length. 000.

Shape Top

Cast of 3 (3, 4, 4, 4) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next and alt rows 5 times in all, every 4th row 4 (5, 6, 6, 6) times, alt rows 12 (10, 8, 10, 10) times, and at each end of next 4 (6, 8, 6, 8) rows. Cast off rem 25 (25, 25, 27, 27) sts.



NECKBAND, FRONT BANDS AND MAKE UP

Sew shoulder seams. With WY cast on 100 (104, 108, 112, 116) sts. Make hem as Back and knit row. With wrong side of work facing, pick up sts evenly round neck and place on Ns. Knit 1 loose row and cast off.

Front Bands

With WY cast on 157 (159, 161, 163, 165) sts. Knit as Neckband. With wrong side of front facing, pick up sts along front and neckband and place on Ns. Knit I loose row and cast off. Sew in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams. Press lightly.






MACHINES: A, B or C with KR. MATERIALS: EMU Perle 50 gm balls. Sweater — 10 (10, 11, 11, 12) balls. Skirt — 9 (9, 10, 10, 11) balls. Elastic for waist. Crochet Hook. MEASUREMENTS: To fit bust 81 (86, 92, 97, 102) cm and hips 86 (92, 97, 102, 112) cm. TENSION: Lace — 23 sts and 42 rows = 10 cm (approx T8) after pressing. RIB: 1 x 1 T6/6.

NOTE: Care is needed when knitting the lace owing to the firmness of the yarn.

SKIRT

Knitted sideways. Insert card. With WY cast on 141 sts and knit a few rows. Change to M. Knit 2 rows in st st. 000. T8.* Begin lace and knit to RC 24. Knit 3 (3, 5, 5, 7) rows in st st only. COL. Shape Panel:—Push into HP at right 15 Ns on next and alt rows 8 times in all. 21 Ns left in WP. Knit 1 row. COL. Push into UWP 15 Ns on next and alt rows 8 times in all. All Ns in WP.





COR. X RC 58 (58, 60, 60, 62) Knit in st st for 2 (4, 4, 6, 6) rows*. Rep from * to * 10 times more, or to desired fullness. 11 panels in all.

WAISTBAND AND MAKE UP Knit 2 pieces.

Press skirt to shape and graft seam. Fold skirt in half and mark waist with WY. With wrong side facing pick up 108 (116, 122, 130, 138) sts and place on M/C. T8. Knit 36 rows. Cast off loosely. Knit other piece to match. Join waistband seams. Fold to inside and sew in place, encasing elastic at the same time. Work crochet edging as given in sweater along lower edge.





Trans centre st onto adjacent N and put Ns at left onto WY. Knit 2 rows. Dec 1 st at neck edge on next and every 4th row 10 (13, 13, 16, 16) times in all, then every foll 6th row 10 (8, 8, 6, 6) times. 29 (31, 34, 36, 39) sts rem. Knit to RC 126. Cast off. Rejoin yarn to neck edge and knit to match first side, reversing shapings.





FRONT

Knit as Back (omitting V neck shaping) to RC 92 above marker.

Shape Neck

Cast off centre 21 (23, 23, 25, 25) sts and put Ns at left onto WY. Knit 2 rows. Dec 1 st at neck edge on next and alt rows 6 times in all, then every 4th row 4 times. 29 (31, 34, 36, 39) sts rem. Knit to RC 126. Cast off. Replace sts onto Ns and knit to match first side, reversing shapings.

SLEEVES

Cast on 65 (65, 69, 69, 69) sts. T6/6. Rib 50 rows. Trans to KH. 000. Knit 2 rows. Working in lace knit 2 rows. Inc 1 st at each end of next and every 4th row 21 (21, 23, 23, 23) times in all, then every alt row 16 (16, 12, 12, 12) times. Knit to RC 120. Cast off.

MAKE UP AND FINISHING

Press pieces firmly. Join shoulder seams. Sew sleeves to armholes between markers. Sew side and sleeve seam to last 5 cm of rib, reverse work and complete seam. Work 1 row of double crochet round neck edge and one row of fancy edging as desired.



LADIES TWO-PIECE

MACHINES: A and C. **MATERIALS:** PATSY 4-ply crepe: Top — 375 (400, 425, 450, 475) gms. Skirt — 370 (400, 430, 460, 490) gms. Elastic. **MEASUREMENTS:** To fit bust 81 (86, 91, 96, 102) cm. **TENSION:** fine lace — 32 sts and 42 rows = 10 cm. **RIB:** 2 x 2 T4/4.

TOP BACK

Insert card. With M. Cast on 73 (77, 81, 85, 89) sts at left and 71 (75, 79, 83, 87) sts at right 144 (152, 160, 168, 176) sts. Rib 28 rows. Trans to st st and inc 1 st at left. 000. T7. Work in fine lace to 100 rows. 000.

Shape Cap Sleeves

Inc 1 st at each end of next row. Knit 10 (12, 12, 14, 14) rows. Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 8th row 10 times in all. 167 (175, 183, 191, 199) sts. Knit to 92 (94, 98, 100, 102) rows.

Shape Shoulder and Back Neck


Cast off 7 (7, 8, 8, 9) sts at beg of next 4 rows. Cast off centre 31 (33, 35, 37, 39) sts. Waste knit sts at left. Cont shoulder shaping, AT THE SAME TIME, knit 1 row. Cast off 5 sts at neck edge on next and alt rows 4 times. Cast off rem 6 (9, 6, 9, 6) sts. Replace sts onto M/C and knit to match first side, reversing shapings.

FRONT

Knit as Back to 88 rows above rib.

Divide for Neck

Trans centre st to adjacent N. Waste knit sts at left. Knit 2 rows. Dec 1 st at neck edge on next and alt rows 5 times in all. COR. 000.



Foll sleeve incs as Back, AT THE SAME TIME, cont front neck decs 14 (15, 15, 16, 17) times more, then every foll 4th row 16 (16, 17, 17, 17) times. 48 (51, 54, 57, 60) sts rem. Knit to 92 (94, 98, 100, 102) rows. Shape Shoulder as Back. Replace sts onto M/C and knit to match first side, reversing shapings.

EDGINGS AND MAKE UP

Join shoulder seams. Cast on 26 sts. Rib until long enough to fit round neck. Cast



off in rib. Cast on 22 sts and rib 2 pieces to fit round armholes. Sew neckband to neck mitre centre front, and catch down pieces at back. Sew armbands in position. Sew side and armhole seams. Press seams lightly.

SKIRT


Knit 4 pieces. Cast on 51 (53, 55, 57, 59) sts at left and 49 (51, 53, 55, 57) sts at right. 100 (104, 108, 112, 116) sts. Rib 8 rows. Trans to st st and inc 1 st at left. 000. T7. Working in fine lace knit 14 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll 15th row 16 times in all. 69 (73, 77, 81, 85) sts rem. Knit to 254 rows. Waste knit.

WAISTBAND

Knit 2 pieces. With WY cast on 137 (145, 153, 161, 169) sts. Knit a few rows. COR. 000. T6. With M knit 13 rows. T10. Knit 1 row, T6. Knit 13 rows. Make a hem and knit row. With wrong side of skirt panels facing, replace sts of 2 panels onto Ns, placing last st of one panel and first st of 2nd panel onto centre N. Knit 1 loose row and cast off.

MAKE UP

With mattress st sew panels and waistband leaving inner hem open. Insert elastic, join ends and close seam. Press.





LADY'S DOLMAN SLEEVED SWEATER

MACHINES: A, B or C. MATERIALS: SILVERKNIT Ideal (M) — 340 gm. HAYFIELD Baroque Chenille — 150 (150. 150, 200, 200) gm. MEASUREMENTS: To fit bust 81 (86, 91, 96, 101) cm. TENSION: 22 sts and 26 rows = 10 cm over Weaving patt (approx T10). Lace T4. RIB: 2 x 2 Pitch Lever to H, Slide Lever II, T2/2. NOTES: Weaving patt is produced by using card on row 1. Knit 1 row st st and 1 row weaving. Yarn will be on opposite side to carr every other weaving row making it necessary to lay yarn toward carr (lay-in method of weaving must be used) please ensure that there is enough slack on the weaving yarn. For weaving use card 1 pattern 1. For lace use card from patt 14.

KNITTING TIP

Difficulty was experienced during the inc of stitches along "V" neck and casting on sts underarm seam. To solve this, knit 2 swatches, in WY, of no less than 65 sts and long enough to hang weights on, release from M/C. As the incs or cast on sts appear in patt, simply pick up sts from swatch and place on Ns. When garment is completely knitted backstitch through sts caught onto WY to prevent unravelling and remove WY.

BACK

Using WY cast on 33 sts and knit a few rows. COL change to M 000. T10 knit 2 rows. Working in weaving patt knit 2 rows. On right side inc 1 st on next and every foll 4th row 7 times, then every foll 3rd row 16 times and then every alt row 14 times, then every row 5 times. Knit to RC111. COR cast on 48 sts. 000. *Cont straight in weaving patt for 120 (126, 132, 140, 146) rows. Cast off 48 sts at beg of next row. Knit 1 row dec 1 st at right edge on next and every row 6 times, then alt rows 14 times, then every 3rd row 16 times, then every 4th row 6 times. Knit 4 rows. Waste knit.

FRONT


As back to *. Cont straight to RC 21 (23, 27, 31, 33).

Shape "V"

COL. At neck edge cast off 3 sts 15 times, then 4 sts 5 times. Knit 3 rows. At neck edge cast on 4 sts 5 times, then 3 sts 15 times. Work as back.

"V" INSERT

Using M COBH 65 sts T5 knit 8 rows. 000 T4. Work in lace for 7 rows. Dec 2 sts at each end of next and every foll 7th row 15 times. Knit to RC 108. Cast off.



MAKE UP, WAISTBAND AND CUFFS — WORKED IN M

Turn down hem on lace insert. Attach insert to front of garment. Sew top sleeve seams. Work 3 rows of d.c. along back neck.

Cuffs

Working over 65 Ns rib 62 rows. Trans sts to KH. With wrong side of garment facing pick up sts along sleeve base and place onto Ns. T6 knit 1 row and cast off.

WAISTBAND

Working over 119 (125, 131, 140, 146) Ns rib 80 rows. With wrong side of garment facing pick up sts along front base and place onto Ns. T6 Knit 1 row and cast off. Work back waistband to match.

Sew underarm seams. Fold ribs in half to inside and neatly catch down.




TUCK STITCH DRESS IN RAYON

MACHINES: A or C. **MATERIALS:** SILVERKNIT Ideal Rayon 2-ply. 400 (400, 520, 520, 580) gms in each of two cols. Shirring elastic. **MEASUREMENTS:** To fit bust 81 (86, 91, 97, 102) cms. **TENSION:** tuck st — 26 sts and 61 rows = 10 cm after steam pressing firmly (approx T4).

SKIRT

Knit 4 pieces. Knit 10 rows in each colour. With WY and placing extra N to right of centre, cast on 127 (133, 139, 145, 151) sts and knit a few rows. COL. Change to Col 1. COBH over same Ns. T4. Knit 1 row st st. 000. Work in tuck and cols to 290 rows. Waste knit.





BODICE

Back and Front alike. Push 127 (133, 139, 145, 151) Ns to WP. Replace sts of 2 skirt pieces, placing 2 sts on each N. T3. Col 1. Knit 2 rows st st. 000. T4. work in tuck and cols to 400 rows. Cast off.

MAKE UP AND FINISHING

Steam press pieces firmly to size. Join centre panels of skirt, then side seams of skirt and bodice, leaving 20 cm open at top for armholes. Sew shoulder seams for approx 13 (14, 15, 16, 17) cms. With crochet hook work 2 rows of double crochet round hem, armholes and neck. Thread 3 rows of shirring elastic through waistline.





SAME TIME inc 1 st on outside edge only every 5th row to 23 sts. Knit another 'strip' the same rev shapings.

Work second sleeve the same reversing cols.

MAKE UP — CUFFS AND WAISTBAND

Using mattress stitch, sew up 'strips' for back and front and sides. Sew 10 (10, 10, 15, 15) cm at shoulders. Sew up 'strips' for sleeves but do not sew up sleeve seams. CUFFS — With wrong side facing pick up 50 sts at base of sleeve. * T2. Using either col knit 1 row. Trans to 2 x 2 rib. 000. T0/0. Rib 20 rows. Cast off. * Work second cuff the same. Sew up sleeve seams and set in sleeves.

Back waistband — With wrong side facing, pick up 94 (98, 102, 106, 110) sts along base of sweater back, dist. sts evenly along row. Rep * to *.

Front waistband — As back waistband. Sew up waistband seams, work 2 rows of d.c. along neck edge.



LADY'S PATCHWORK COTTON SWEATER

D. **MATERIALS:** PINGOUIN Corrida No. 4 - 300 (300, 350, 350, 400) gm in each of 2 cols. MEASUREMENTS: To fit bust 81 (86, 91, 96, 101) cms. **TENSION**: st st — 21 sts and 28 rows = 10 cms (approx T2). RIB: 2×2 T0/0. NOTES: The sweater is knitted in 'strips' of 23 sts and working the 2 cols alternately every 28 rows. Work the lace and bobbles alternately on one col only leaving the second col in st st only (e.g. work 'patterns' on grey 'squares' for the back and pink 'squares' for the front). The 'strips' at each side are st st only, also the shaped section on the sleeves.

BACK

Begin each 'strip' with waste knitting and end by casting off. Work 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) 'strips' with 23 sts x 140 rows alternating the cols every 28 rows and working the lace and bobbles alternately on one col only.

FRONT

As back reversing the cols

SIDE STRIPS

Starting with waste knitting, work 2 'strips' of 12 (18, 23, 6, 12) sts x 84 rows in st st only changing cols every 28 rows. Cast off.

SLEEVES



Cast on 24 sts at left and 35 (39, 42, 45, 49) at right. 59 (63, 66, 69, 73) sts. Knit as Back to *. *Inc for Sleeves* as Back. 172 rows. 73 (77, 80, 83, 87) sts. 000.

Shape Front Neck

Dec 1st at front edge on next and every foll 4th row 4 (4, 4, 7, 10) times in all, then every 6th row 23 (24, 25, 23, 21) times. 46 (49, 51, 53, 56) sts rem. Knit to 160 (160, 166, 166, 166) rows. Shape Shoulder as Back.






BELT

Cast on 11 sts on each bed for circular knitting. T5/5. Knit for approx 1 m 50 cm long. Cast off.

NECKBANDS AND MAKE UP

BACK NECKBAND


Cast on 54 (56, 58, 60, 62) sts. Rib 16 rows. Trans to st st. With wrong side of back facing pick up sts and place on Ns. Knit 1 loose row and cast off.

Cast on 105 (111, 119, 125, 131) sts. Rib 26 rows. Trans to st st. 000. T5. Knit to 124 rows or desired length. Insert card 1. Work in lace for 32 rows. Change to st st. T4. Knit 7 rows. Make picot edge (holes on alt Ns). Knit 6 rows. Cast off.



STRAPS (4)


COBH 5 sts and knit a tube of 40 cm. Cast off.

MAKE UP

Sew side seam. Turn picot hem to inside and sew in place. Sew straps to top and tie at shoulders.

Knit 4 panels. Cast on 123 (127, 131, 135, 139) sts. Rib 10 rows. Trans to st st. 000. T5. Knit 22 rows. Dec 1 st at each side on next and every 22nd row 10 times in all. Knit to 226 rows. Trans to 1 x 1 rib. 000. T3/3. Cont decs as before AT THE SAME TIME change Tension 2 degrees every 14 rows until T1.1 is reached. Knit to 74 rows. T5/5. Rib 1 row. Trans to st st and chain cast off.



MAKE UP

Join the 4 panels. Cut elastic to fit waist and join into circle. Work a herringbone st round inside of waist, encasing the elastic.

MACHINES: D with KR. MATERIALS: SIRDAR Sherpa — M (Dapple Brown 144) - 700 (750, 800, 850, 900) gm. 1st Con Col (Oatmeal 145) 100 (100, 100, 150, 150) gm, 2nd Con Col (Romany Brown 143) 100 (100, 100, 150, 150) gm. 9 buttons. MEASUREMENTS: To fit chest 86 (91, 96, 101, 106) cm. **TENSION:** st st — 16 sts and 22 rows = 10 cm (approx T7). Cable patt — 17 sts and 22 rows = 10 cm (approx T7/4). Racking patt — 16 sts and 22 rows = 10 cm (approx T7/3). RIB: 1 x 1 T1.2/1.2. **NOTES:** Racking patt — Before commencing racking patt set the racking indicator to HO. Arrange Ns as diagram 1*.Knit 1 row, rack to H1. Knit 1 row, rack to H2. Knit 1 row, rack to H3. Knit 1 row, rack to H2. Knit 1 row, rack to H1. Knit 1 row, rack to HO.* Rep * to *.

Cable patt — Arrange Ns as diagram 2. For back, arrange Ns from centre outwards making sure the end Ns are on the KH. For fronts, arrange Ns from front edge outwards. Cables are worked every 10 rows by crossing 3 sts over 3 sts. When knitting the last row before making the cable, push Ns marked x to WP. Knit the row and then release the loop returning the Ns to NWP. The loop will enable you to make the cable with ease.





Using a new ball of M, cast on 28 sts at left side. Trans to cable patt. RC 6. Knit to RC 42. Cast off 10 sts at left. Break yarn. Pick up sts from left side of pocket and place onto Ns. Remove WY. Rejoin M from 1st ball of yarn. Cont straight to RC 82.



Shape raglan

000. Knit 1 row. COR. Cast off 3 (3, 3, 4, 4) sts at beg of next row. At armhole edge dec 1 st on next and alt rows 27 (28, 29, 30, 31) times. AT THE SAME TIME when RC reads 20 (22, 24, 26, 28)....

Shape front neck

Dec 1 st at neck edge on next and alt rows 16 times. Cont to RC 56 (58, 60, 62, 64). Fasten off.

LEFT FRONT

As right front reversing shapings and starting with COR.

RIGHT SLEEVE

COL. Using M. Cast on 45 (47, 49, 53, 55) sts. Rib 16 rows. Trans to st st. Inc 7 sts evenly along row 52 (54, 56, 60, 62) sts. T7. Knit 1 row. Break M. Join in 2nd Con Col. 000. Knit 6 rows. Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 6th row 13 times. AT THE SAME TIME after 46 rows change to M and racking patt to RC 92. Break M.

Shape raglan

000. Using 1st Con Col and st st. Cast off 3 (3, 3, 4, 4) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next and alt rows 27 (28, 29, 30, 31) times. Knit to RC 56 (58, 60, 62, 64). Dec 1 st at left side on next and foll alt row AT THE SAME TIME on side opp carr bring forward to HP 5 sts twice and 6 sts once. Waste knit.

LEFT SLEEVE

As right sleeve reversing shapings and starting with COR.

MAKE UP, COLLAR AND BANDS Join raglans.

Collar

With right side facing pick up 109 sts evenly along neck edge between the start of the front neck shaping. Using M. T8. Knit 1 row. Trans to 1 x 1 rib. T1.2/1.2**. On side opp carr bring forward to HP 36 Ns. Knit 1

row**. Rep ** to **. ***On side opp carn push back to WP 4 Ns. Knit 1 row***. Rep *** to ***, until all Ns are in WP. Knit 10 rows over all Ns. Cast off.

Button Band

With wrong side facing pick up 87 sts evenly along right front edge. Using M. T8. Knit 1 row. Trans to 1 x 1 rib. T1.2/1.2. Rib 10 rows. Cast off.

Buttonhole Band

As button band working 9 buttonholes evenly along row, after 5 rows.

Pocket Bands





Elastic to fit waist. MEASURE-MENTS: To fit bust 81 (86, 91, 96, 101) cm. **TENSION**: St st — 29 sts and 39 rows = 10 cm (using 2 ends approx T8). RIB: 1 x 1 T3/3 (using 2 ends) Jacquard T5/5 (2 ends M, 1 end Con Col) FNR various tensions as given using 1 end. NOTES: Electroknit Patterns — Variation number 51 page 90. Skirt is one size only and fits up to 106 cm hip, is knitted in FNR with one end except for Jacquard which is 2 ends of M and 1 end of Con Col. Waistcoat is knitted in st st and fairisle with 2 ends in each colour.





SKIRT


With M cast on 182 sts for FNR T5/5. 000. Rib 9 rows. With Con Col rib 2 rows. With M rib 4 rows. Work the 46 rows of Jacquard patt. With M rib 4 rows. With Con Col rib 2 rows. T5/4 rib 80 rows. T4/3 rib 42 rows. T3/2 rib 22 rows. T2/1 rib 20 rows. T1/1 rib 24 rows. T4/4 set KR to HP and knit 2 rows on KH only. With M knit 4 rows. T9 work in fairisle for 46 rows. T8 using M knit 4 rows. Using Con Col knit 2 rows. Cont in stripe patt of 54 rows M and 2 rows Con Col to RC 128.



Shape armholes

000. Keeping stripe patt as before, cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Cast off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Cast of 2 sts at beg of next 4 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next and alt rows 4 times. Knit to RC 108.

Shape shoulders and back neck

Cast off centre 32 sts. Set M/C to HP. Push to HP all Ns on opposite side of carr. At armhole edge cast off 7 sts 3 times then 3 (7, 10, 15, 18) sts once AT THE SAME TIME at neck edge cast off 4 sts twice then 3 sts once. Join in M to other side of neck and work to correspond reversing shapings.

RIGHT FRONT

Using WY cast on 64 (70, 74, 76, 78) sts. Knit a few rows. cont as back to armhole shaping.

Shape armhole and front neck

Shape armhole as back AT THE SAME TIME shape front neck by dec 1 st at neck edge every 4th row 25 (27, 28, 25, 24) times. Cont straight to RC 108.



RIB: 1 x 1 - may be worked with KR using every 3rd N in WP on both KH and KR approx T6/6, or by latch up method. Mock rib is not NOTES: PATT recommended. ALTERNATE NEEDLES ARE USED THROUGHOUT. 1st size — when punching card, omit Row 16 and work to Row 29 (28 patt rows) but foll colour sequence given for main card. 2nd size punch card as shown and work to Row 30 only (30 patt rows). 3rd size - punch card as shown and work to Row 32 only (32 patt rows). 4th size - punch card as shown and work to Row 34 (34 patt rows).

TENSION: St st — 18 sts and 24 rows = 10 cm (approx T9) knitted over alt Ns. RIB: See Jacket. PATT NOTES: As for jacket using M instead of C. All sizes punch 14 rows as jacket. Card B yoke, all sizes punch 30 patt rows, i.e. show to row 23 on card and use colour sequence as given.

BACK

Insert Card A. Using M cast on 59 (63, 67, 71) sts. Rib 11 rows. Trans to st st. 000. T10. Set to fairisle. Knit border patt. 000. T9. Set to st st and change to Card B. With M knit to 32 (36, 44, 52) rows then set to

fairisle. T10. Knit to 62 (66, 74, 82) rows AT THE SAME TIME mark each end of 34 (36, 44, 50) rows with WY. Set to st st at T9 and change to B. 3rd and 4th sizes only — knit to 76 (84) rows.

Shoulder shaping

All sizes: cast off 9 (10, 11, 12) sts at beg of next 2 rows and 9 (10, 10, 11) sts at beg next 2 rows. Waste knit rem 23 (23, 25, 25) sts.

FRONT

Work as back to 52 (56, 64, 72) rows.

Neck shaping

Waste knit centre 11 sts. Push Ns at left to HP. COR. Working in patt as Back, knit 1 row. Cast off 3 sts at beg of next row. Knit 1 row. Cast off 2 sts at beg of next row. Knit 1 row. Cast off 1 st at beg of next row. Knit 1 row. 3rd and 4th sizes only: Cast off 1 st at beg of next row, knit 1 row. All sizes: 18 (20, 21, 23) sts rem. Knit to 62 (66, 76, 84) rows.

Shoulder shaping

As Back. Rejoin yarn to neck edge and knit left side to match right, reversing shapings.

SLEEVES

Work as given for Jacket using M instead of C.

NECKBAND AND MAKE UP

As jacket:— join left shoulder and neckband seam.

HAT

MATERIALS: VIKING Samband Icelandic Pure Wool Lopi. A — 50 gm, B — 50 gm and M — 50 gm. MEASUREMENTS: To fit 45 (50) cm head (or adjust to fit). TENSION: See Jacket and Sweater. PATT NOTES: Use Card A and colour sequence.

INSTRUCTIONS

Insert Card A. Using M cast on 83 (91) sts or no required. Rib 5 rows. Trans to st st 000. T10. set to fairisle. Knit border patt — Card A. Set to st st T9 and using M knit to 48 rows. Waste knit. Bring forward to WP 42 (46) alt Ns and working from right to left, place edge st on 1st N then next 2 sts together on 2nd N. Repeat across Ns, placing 2 sts onto each N. Knit 1 row. 

Cast off 3 (3, 4, 4, 5) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next and alt rows 3 (4, 4, 5, 5) times in all, then every foll 4th row 4 times. 101 (105, 109, 113, 117) sts rem. Knit to 100 (102, 106, 108, 112) rows.





Shape Top



STRAPS



for hips. 000. Knit 6 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll 6th row 10 times in all, then every 4th row 3 times. 113 (119, 125, 131, 137) sts rem. Knit to 78 rows. T8. Knit 1 row. T4. Knit 32 rows. Make a hem and knit the row. Cast off loosely.

MAKE UP

Sew side seams, leaving 1 inner waist hem open. Thread elastic through hem, join ends and close seam.



LADIES FAIRISLE SWEATER

MACHINES: A or C. MATERIALS: M—LISTER LEE Motoravia 4-ply Powder Blue (1679) 300 (350, 350, 400) gm. Col A—LISTER LEE Tamarisk Hot Pink (582) 60 (60, 60, 80) gm. Stripe patt: Col 2-1 row, Col 6-13 rows, Col 8-1 row, Col 6-13 rows, Col 1-28 rows. Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows, 2 sts on next 2 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next and alt rows 22 times in all, then at each end of next 9 rows. Cast off.

FAIRISLE SQUARE

Insert card 3. With Col 4 COBH 48 sts. With Col 4 in A, work 60 rows in Fairisle, using Cols 1, 3, 4, 5 and 8 (12 rows each Col). Cast off.



MAKE UP AND BANDS

Join shoulders, side and sleeve seams. Set in sleeves, gathering top to fit armhole. With wrong side of front facing, pick up 150 sts along front edge. T6. With col 2 knit 16 rows. Waste knit. Knit other front band the same. Fold bands in half to outside, encasing a roll of padding and back stitch through last row knitted in M. Join ends. Pick up 142 (144, 146, 148, 150) sts round neck edge. T6. With Col 1 knit 16 rows. Waste knit. Fold neckband in half to outside and back stitch in place as front. Make a cord with Col 2 to thread through neckband. With Col 2 COBH 14 sts. T6. Knit 176 (180, 184, 188, 192) rows. Cast off. Stitch long seam and ends encasing roll of padding. Attach to inside of neckband. Stitch Fairisle Square to centre of Back to form a diamond. Sew velvet ribbon round outer edge of square.



MOHAIR SWEATER

MACHINES: D. MATERIALS: ARGYLL Finesse:— M (Medici 124) 225 (250, 250, 250, 250, 275) gm, 1st Con Col (Anuscha 117) 200 (225, 225, 225, 250) gm, 2nd Con Col (Florentine 116) 150 (150, 150, 175, 175) gm, 3rd Con Col (Rosanna 114) 150 (150, 150, 175, 175) gm. MEASUREMENTS: To fit bust 81 (86, 91, 96, 101) cm. TENSION: 14 sts and 34 rows = 10 cm (approx T6). RIB: 1 x 1 T1/1. NOTES: Stripe patt:—

4 rows Medici

8 rows Rosanna


4 rows Medici

8 rows Florentine

4 rows Medici

8 rows Anuscha

'Pull-up' patt:— After knitting 12 rows, pick up sts marked xxx from 1st row of Con Col and place onto Ns above. Knit 12 rows, pick up sts marked ooo from 1st row of next Con Col and place onto Ns above. Repeat.

BACK


Using Anuscha Cast on 65 (69, 73, 77, 79) sts and rib 20 rows. Trans sts to KH. 000. T6. Work in stripe and pull-up patt to RC 136 (136, 132, 132, 132). Mark each end with a piece of WY Cont straight to RC 218. Cast off.

FRONT


As back to RC 184 above rib.

Shape Front Neck

Cast off centre 9 sts. Set M/C to HP. Bring forward to HP all Ns on opp side of carr.



Keeping armhole edge straight dec 1 st at neck edge on every 3rd row 8 times. Cont straight to RC 218. Cast off. Rejoin yarn to other side of neck and complete to match first side reversing shapings.



SLEEVES

Join shoulders. With right side (purl side) facing, pick up 69 (69, 72, 72, 72) sts evenly along armhole edge (between markers). 000. T6. Work in patt for 148 rows. Waste knit.

Cuffs

Push 33 (33, 35, 35, 35) Ns to WP. With wrong side facing place sts from base of sleeve onto Ns distributing them evenly along the row. Remove WY. T7. Knit 1 row. Trans to rib and rib 20 rows. Cast off.

COLLAR

Using Medici COBH 82 sts. 000. T6. Work in patt for 76 rows. Cast off.

MAKE UP

Join side and sleeve seams. Join collar seam. Sew collar to neck edge. Fold collar in half and stitch down on inside of neck.

Show our creative knitting feature to your friends and relatives and I feel sure they will be surprised to learn that the main part of the garment is knitted! Even knitters of long standing to whom I displayed the garment gasped with delight and indeed it took a very close examination on my part to agree that it has been produced on a Brother! The idea lends itself to a multitude of variations — make an underskirt and two or even three top skirts in different colourways, a real boost to anyone's wardrobe, and Oh so chic!

MACHINES: A, B or C. MATERIALS: SILVERKNIT — Zebu — A (4313) 100 gm. Jupiter - B (2728) 130 gm. Spaniel - C (3630) 130 gm. M Invisible thread approx 150 gm available from: M. Klein, Kleintex House, 1-6 Noel Street, London W1V 4LL (Tel: 01-437 6162) or Kleintex House, 86-88 Lower Parliament Street, Nottingham (Tel: 0602 581045). 450 cm of lining fabric (approx 92 cm wide). Interfacing or starched muslin 250 cm. Elastic. 1 skirt hook. 1 button. Lace edging — 9 metres. Beads to decorate each corner of panels. MEASUREMENTS: Will fit all sizes up to and including 97 cm bust, larger sizes adjust to fit. TENSION: 23 sts and 57.5 rows = 10 cm (approx T2).

OVERSKIRT — Knit 4 pieces.

Insert card A. COBH with M and B together. Knit 1 row. Take B out of FA. 000. T2. Foll card and using laying in method of weaving, knit 6 row M only. *Weave 4 rows A, knit 6 rows M, weave 5 rows B, knit 2 rows M, weave 1 row B, knit 6 rows M, weave 5 rows C, knit 2 rows M, weave 1 row C, knit 16 rows M*. Rep from * to *, knit to RC 486, or required length. T3. Knit 4 rows with M and B together. Cast off with B.

MAKE UP


Sew in loose ends. Press firmly using damp cloth. Gather in top of each piece to 14 cm (adjust to fit). Cut length of lining for waistband, 8 cm deep, plus 5 cm for overlap. Press interfacing to wrong side of waistband. Sew knitted overskirt between waistband, leaving 2.5 cm free at each end. Sew on button to one end and make loop to fasten. Sew beads onto corners of skirt if desired.

BODICE — Knit 2 pieces

COBH and knit as overskirt to RC 198 or to desired length. Knit 2 rows with M and B together. Cast off with B.

MAKE UP


Cut 2 pieces of lining the same measurement as knitted bodice. Sew side seams of lining and knitted bodice. Make a hem at top of lining of 2.5 cm and tack in place, leaving



opening for elastic. Sew knitted bodice to fabric top, inserting lace as illustrated at the same time, then sew 2nd row along line of tacking. Thread in elastic and join ends. Close opening.

UNDERSKIRT — Knit 4 pieces


Insert card B. Push 200 Ns to WP. Using lace edging and working from left to right, hook lace onto Ns gathering slightly. 000. T2. Knit 6 rows M, weave 1 row A, knit 4 rows M, weave 2 rows A, knit 6 rows M, weave 1 row B, knit 4 rows M, weave 2 rows B, knit 6 rows M, weave 2 rows C, knit 4 rows M, weave 2 rows C, knit 6 rows M. Knit 2 rows with M and B together and cast off with B.



MAKE UP

Cut 2 pieces of interlining of 125 cm in length and 58 cm in depth and 2 pieces of 55 cm in width and 23 cm in depth (basque). Gather skirt to basque and sew in place. Join side seams, leaving one side of basque open. Sew the 4 knitted pieces into a circle, gather to fit hem of interlining and sew in place.


Gather top of basque to waist measurement. Cut 2 pieces of lining 160 cm wide and 92 cm in depth. Cut 4 pieces — see diagram — sew straight edge of pocket pieces to side seam at waist, press open seam. Stitch right side seam including outside pocket edge. Stitch left side seam and pocket to ▲ to form skirt opening. Gather in top of skirt to fit waist. Cut waistband to fit waist, plus 8 cm across top left back pocket. Iron on interfacing to



wrong side of waistband. Stitch waistband to skirt including left back pocket top, fold front left pocket to inside. Stitch underskirt to waistband. Turn waistband in half to inside and sew in place. Place hook fastener at inside front and press-stud at end of underlap.


SAMPLE A

SILVERKNIT Ideal. Large sequins. Punch holes larger so that machine needle will pass through. COBH and knit 4 rows.* Insert card. Set for tuck and knit 20 rows. Change to st st and knit 4 rows. Place a sequin behind latch of every 13th N and knit 8 rows*. Rep from * to *.



SAMPLE B

Sewing cotton and lace trimming. With cotton COBH and knit 6 rows. *Take lace trim and hook onto first N at right using single tool, hold lace in left hand and push tool through lace at top — just under the finished edge — in front of the 5th N from right edge and hook onto the 4th N from right. Count 4 Ns along, hold lace in front of that N, but hook onto previous N (3rd N along). Work along sts, hooking lace onto every 3rd N*. Knit 14 rows. ** Rep from * to ** then * to *. Knit 4 rows. Insert card B and




set for tuck. Knit 16 rows. Lock card and set for st st. Knit 16 rows. Set for tuck and knit 12 rows. Lock card and set for st st. Knit 16 rows*. Set for tuck and knit 6 rows. Lock

card and set for st st. Knit 16 rows*. Rep from * to * to end of work.


SAMPLE C

Fine bouclé yarn. Variation of sts are made by knitting a different number of rows between next lace row. e.g: Insert card C. Knit 2 rows between next lace row. Knit 4 rows between next lace row. Knit 6 rows between next lace row. To decorate the knitting, place a very small glass bead at centre of sequin and sew both together to work as required.



SAMPLE D

Sewing cotton and bouclé. Insert card D. With cotton COBH 39 sts. Knit 2 rows. 000. With bouclé weave 2 rows, knit 2 rows st st, tuck 4 rows, knit 2 rows st st. Rep these 10 rows.

BLACK AND WHITE DRESS

MACHINES: A, B or C. **MATERIALS:** PHILDAR Perle 5 — 50 g balls. Black — 8 (9, 9, 10, 10) balls. White: 2 (2, 2, 2, 2) balls. Crochet hook. Braid. **MEASURE-MENTS:** To fit Bust 81 (86, 92, 97, 102) cm. **TENSION:** st st — 31 sts and 43 rows = 10 cm (approx T6).

BODICE

BACK

With Black cast on 109 (117, 125, 133, 141) sts. 000. T6. Knit 8 rows. Inc 1 st at each end of next and every 8th row 11 times in all. 131 (139, 147, 155, 163) sts. Knit to RC 102. 000.

Shape Armholes

Cast off 3 (3, 4, 4, 5) sts at beg of next 2 rows*. Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 rows, then alt rows 3 (4, 4, 5, 5) times and every 4th row twice. 109 (115, 121, 127, 133) sts rem. Knit to RC 78 (80, 84, 86, 88).

Shape Shoulders and Back Neck


Cast off 4 (4, 5, 5, 5) sts at beg of next 6 rows. Cast off centre 41 (43, 45, 47, 49) sts and push Ns at left to HP. Cont shoulder shaping, AT THE SAME TIME, dec 1 st at neck edge on next 5 rows. Knit 1 row and cast off rem 5 (7, 3, 5, 7) sts. Rejoin yarn at armhole edge and knit to match first side, reversing shaping.

FRONT

Knit as Back to *.

Shape Neck

Trans centre st to adjacent N and push Ns at left to HP. Cont armhole shaping as Back, AT THE SAME TIME, knit 2 rows. Dec 1 st (with 2-st tool) at neck edge on next and alt rows 14 (14, 14, 15, 16) times in all,




then every 4th row 14 (15, 17, 17, 18) times. At RC 78 (80, 84, 86, 88). Shape Shoulder as Back. Rejoin yarn at armhole edge and knit to match first side, reversing shaping.

SLEEVES

With Black COBH 89 (93, 97, 101, 105) sts. 000. T6. Knit to 42 rows. 000.

Shape Top

Cast off 3 (3, 4, 4, 5) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next 5 rows, alt rows 17 (18, 19, 20, 21) times, then on next 10 rows. Cast off rem 19 (21, 21, 23, 23) sts.



SKIRT

Knitted sideways

With WY cast on 186 sts. Knit a few rows. COR. 000. T6. Change to Black. Knit 10 (10, 12, 12, 12) rows.*** At opposite end to carr push 20 Ns to HP. Knit 2 rows. * Push 20 Ns to HP, with White knit 2 rows. Push 20 Ns to HP, with Black knit 2 rows*. Rep from * to * twice more. Push 20 Ns to HP (26 Ns left in WP), with White knit 2 rows.** Push 20 Ns to UWP, with Black knit 2 rows. Push 20 Ns to UWP, with White knit 2 rows**. Rep from ** to ** twice more. Push 20 Ns to UWP, (20 Ns left in HP) with Black knit 2 rows. Push rem Ns to UWP, with Black knit 20 (22, 24, 24, 26) rows ***. Rep from *** to *** 14 times more, knitting only 10 (12, 12, 12, 14) rows straight. Waste knit.

MAKE UP

Graft skirt seam. Sew shoulder seams. Sew in sleeves, then sew side and sleeve seams. Sew skirt to bodice. Sew braid round armhole seams. With crochet hook and Black work 2 rows of double crochet round neck edge and base of sleeves. With sewing machine sew along lower edge of skirt in satin st (to make edge 'curl'). Alternatively work 2 rows of double crochet round edge with Black. Press seams.



SIDEWAYS CARDIGAN

MACHINES: D. MATERIALS: ROBIN Reflection. 100 (150) gm. A — Blueberry (3484) and 100 (150) gm. B — Scarlet (3485). ROBIN Illusion, 100 (150) gm. C — Evening Light (3584) and 100 (150) gm. D — Lantern Red (3585). 11 buttons. MEASUREMENTS: To fit up to 91 (101) cm bust. TENSION: 13 sts and 21 rows = 10 cm (approx T8). NOTES: The cardigan was knitted in one piece starting at front edge. Before commencing knit two pieces of waste knitting 52 sts wide x 20 rows.

FRONT

Using A COBH 93 sts and knit 2 rows. COR. **Step 1 — Push into HP 18 (12) Ns at left. Always taking yarn round inside N throughout, knit 2 rows. Push into HP 17 (12) Ns at left. Knit 2 rows. Push into HP 0 (11) Ns at left and knit 0 (2) rows. Using B knit 2 rows over all Ns. Step 2 — Push into HP 12 (12) Ns at left. Knit 2 rows. Push into HP 12 (12) Ns at left. Knit 2 rows. Push into HP 11 (11) Ns at left and knit 2 rows. Using C knit 2 rows over all Ns. Rep Step 2. Using D knit 2 rows over all Ns. Rep Step 1. Using A knit 2 rows over all Ns. Rep Step 2. Using B knit 2 rows over all Ns. Rep Step 1. Using C knit 2 rows over all Ns. Rep Step 1. Using D knit 2 rows over all Ns. Rep Step 2**. Waste knit 58 sts at right. (THIS IS THE SIDE SEAM).

SLEEVE

Push into WP 52 Ns adjacent to 35 sts now on M/C. Place sts from waste knit swatch onto empty Ns. Using A knit 2 rows over all Ns. Step 3 *Push into HP 7 (7) Ns at left and knit 2 rows*. Rep from * to * 4 times more. Using B knit 2 rows over all Ns. Step 4 *Push into HP 9 (9) Ns at left, knit 2 rows*. Rep from * to * twice more. Push into HP 8 (8) Ns at left and knit 2 rows. Using C knit 2 rows over all Ns. Repeat Step 4. Using D knit 2 rows over all Ns. Rep Step 3. Using A knit 2 rows over all Ns. Rep Step 4. Using B knit 2 rows over all Ns. Rep Step 3. Using C knit 2 rows over all Ns. Rep Step 3. Using D knit 2 rows over all Ns. Rep Step 4. Waste knit 52 sts at right. Push into WP 58 Ns adjacent to 35 sts now on M/C and unravelling WY place sts from side seam onto Ns.

BACK

Using A knit 2 rows. Rep from ** to **. (Now front sleeve and half back have been knitted.)

***Using D Step 5 Push 35 (35) Ns at left to HP and knit 2 rows. Return to UWP 11 (11) Ns at inside left, knit 2 rows. Return to UWP 12 (12) Ns at inside left, knit 2 rows. Return to UWP 12 (12) Ns at inside left, knit 2 rows. Using C Step 6 Push 35 (35) Ns at left to HP knit 2 rows. Return to UWP 0 (11) Ns at inside left, knit 0 (2) rows. Return

to UWP 17 (12) Ns at inside left, knit 2 rows. Return to UWP 18 (12) Ns at inside left, knit 2 rows. Using B Rep Step 6. Using A Rep Step 5. Using D Rep Step 6. Using C Rep Step 5. Using B Rep Step 5. Using A Rep Step 6.*** Waste knit 58 sts at right (THIS IS THE SIDE SEAM).

SLEEVE

Push into WP 52 Ns adjacent to 35 sts now on M/C. Place sts from waste knit swatch onto empty Ns. Using D Step 7 Push 35 (35) Ns at left to HP. Knit 2 rows. Return 8 Ns at left to UWP, knit 2 rows. * Return 9 Ns at left to UWP, knit 2 rows*. Rep from * to * twice more.

Using C Step 8 Push 35 (35) Ns at left to HP knit 2 rows. *Return to UWP 7 (7) Ns at inside left, knit 2 rows*. Rep from * to * 4 times more. Using B Rep Step 8. Using A Rep Step 7. Using D Rep Step 8. Using C Rep Step 7. Using B Rep Step 7. Using A Rep Step 8. Waste knit 52 sts at right. Push into WP 58 Ns adjacent to 35 sts now on M/C and unravelling WY place sts from side seam onto Ns.

FRONT

Rep from *** to ***. Cast off.

CUFFS AND MAKE UP

Graft sleeves together. Remove WY. Using either A or B, work 2 rows of d.c. in each of the 2 cols around hem, front opening and neck edge working 11 buttonholes along right front opening. Cuffs:— Using either A or B work 44 d.c. picking up 2 rows for each d.c. around base of sleeve. Work 4 rows in each of the 2 cols. Attach buttons.



MEN'S YOKED SWEATER

MACHINES: A, B or C with KR. MATERIALS: SIRDAR Country Style Double Crepe 400 (450, 500, 550, 600, 650) gm M, 100 gm 1st Con Col, 25 gm 2nd Con Col. MEASUREMENTS: To fit chest 86 (91, 96, 101, 106, 111) cm. TENSION: 27 sts and 34 rows = 10 cm (approx T10/8) over cable patt. **RIB:** 2 x 2 T4.2/4.2. NOTES: There are 5 cable panels on the front and back and 3 panels on the sleeves. The cables are worked on the KR. There are 24 (26, 28, 29, 31, 33) sts between each panel. To work cables either after rib or after WY on the sleeves:- trans all sts to KH. Set Pitch Lever to H. Working from centre arrange KR Ns as diagram counting along the bed to place the other cable panels. Trans the 2 sts each side of the centre 2 sts to KR making one st from the loop to make the 3rd st on KR.

K H K R *By using 2 x 3 st trans tools, make the cable every 6 rows 4 times on centre and outside panels, then work 4 cables every 6 rows 4 times on the other panels*. Repeat from * to *.

KNITTING TIP


When knitting the last row before making the cable, push 1 N on KH between cable Ns into WP. Knit the row and then release the loop returning the Ns to NWP. The loop will enable you to make the cable with ease.

SLEEVES (knit first)

Using WY cast on 82 (88, 92, 98, 104, 108) sts knit a few rows and join in M. 000 T10/8 work in cable patt, knit 9 rows. Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 9th row to 112 (118, 122, 128, 134, 138) sts. Knit to RC 150.

Shape Raglans

000 cast off 5 (5, 6, 6, 6, 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next and alt rows 8 (10, 12, 15, 17, 21) times. Knit 2 rows. Cont to shape raglan at left making two more decs, AT THE SAME TIME set M/C to HP. *On side opposite carr bring forward to HP 29 Ns. Always taking yarn round first inside N, knit 2 rows*. Rep from * to *. Waste knit. Work second sleeve to match reversing shapings.



Cuffs


Push 62 (66, 74, 78, 82, 86) Ns to WP. Unravel WY at base of sleeve and with wrong side facing place sts onto Ns distributing them evenly along the row. T10 knit 1 row. Trans to rib and knit 22 rows. Cast off.

BACK

Cast on 130 (138, 146, 150, 158, 166) sts and rib 28 rows. Trans to cable patt as given. 000 T10/8 knit 116 rows.

Raglan Shaping

000 cast off 5 (5, 6, 6, 6, 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next and alt rows until there are 104 (108, 110, 106, 110, 110) sts. Knit to RC 20 (24, 28, 34, 38, 46). LEAVE STS ON M/C.



BACK YOKE AND BACK NECKBAND

Dec 1 st at each end of work. Replace half the sts from each sleeve onto Ns (sleeve shaping to the outside) dec 1 st at raglan edge. Cast on 1 st at each end of work (centre sleeve). DO NOT REMOVE WY ON SLEEVES.

Using 1st Con Col trans sts for 2 x 2 rib. T6/6 rib 22 rows. Waste knit. Push 146 Ns into WP and place sts back onto Ns distributing them evenly along row. Trans sts for 6 x 6 rib. Using M T8/8 work 18 rows cabling (cables still worked on KR but without sts on KH between the 3 sts) every 6th row. Waste knit. Push 114 Ns into WP and place sts back onto Ns distributing them evenly along row. Trans sts to 2 x 2 rib. T5/5 using 2nd Con Col rib 22 rows. Waste knit.

Push 83 Ns into WP and place sts back onto Ns distributing them evenly along row. Trans to 6 x 3 rib. T8/8 using M rib 18 rows cabling every 6th row (cable still worked on KR but without sts on KH between the 3 sts). Waste knit.

Push 68 Ns into WP and place sts back onto Ns distributing them evenly along row. Trans to 2 x 2 rib. T4/4 using 1st Con Col rib 24 rows. Trans to KH T10 knit 2 rows. Waste knit.

FRONT

As back to raglan shaping.

Shape raglans and yoke base

Shape raglans as back to RC 16 (20, 24, 30, 34, 42) AT THE SAME TIME when RC reads 0 (0, 4, 10, 14, 22) set M/C to HP. Bring forward to HP 20 Ns in centre and all Ns on opposite side of carr. Always taking yarn round first inside N, knit 2 rows. On next and alt rows bring forward to HP 5 Ns. All Ns now in HP. Rejoin yarn and work second side to match reversing shapings. LEAVE STS ON M/C.

FRONT YOKE AND FRONT NECKBAND

Work as back yoke.

MAKE UP

Sew raglans side and sleeve seams. Sew yokes and neckband. Fold neckband in half to outside and backstitch through last row knitted in st st. Press lightly.
