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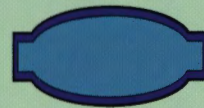
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Editorial

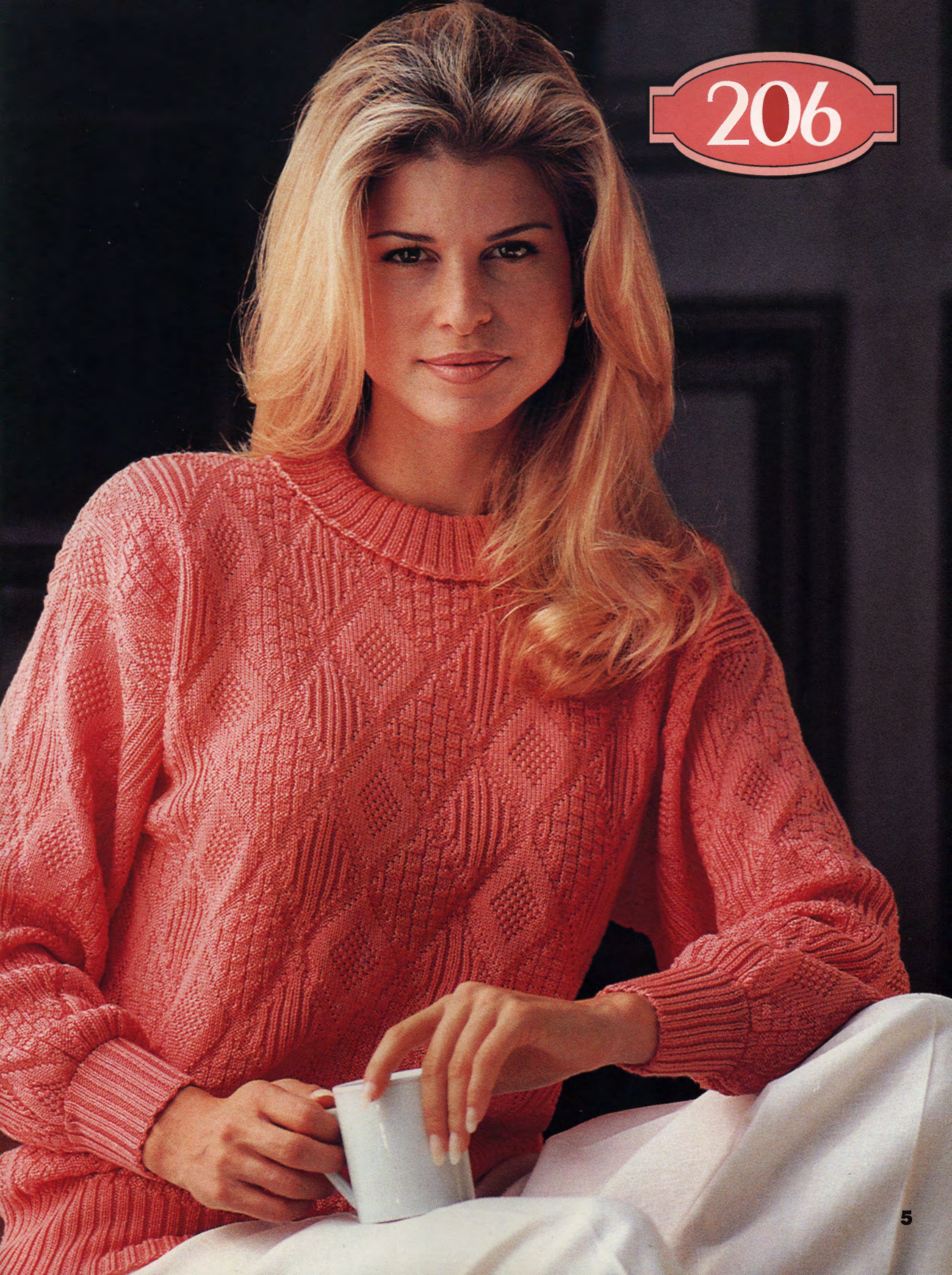

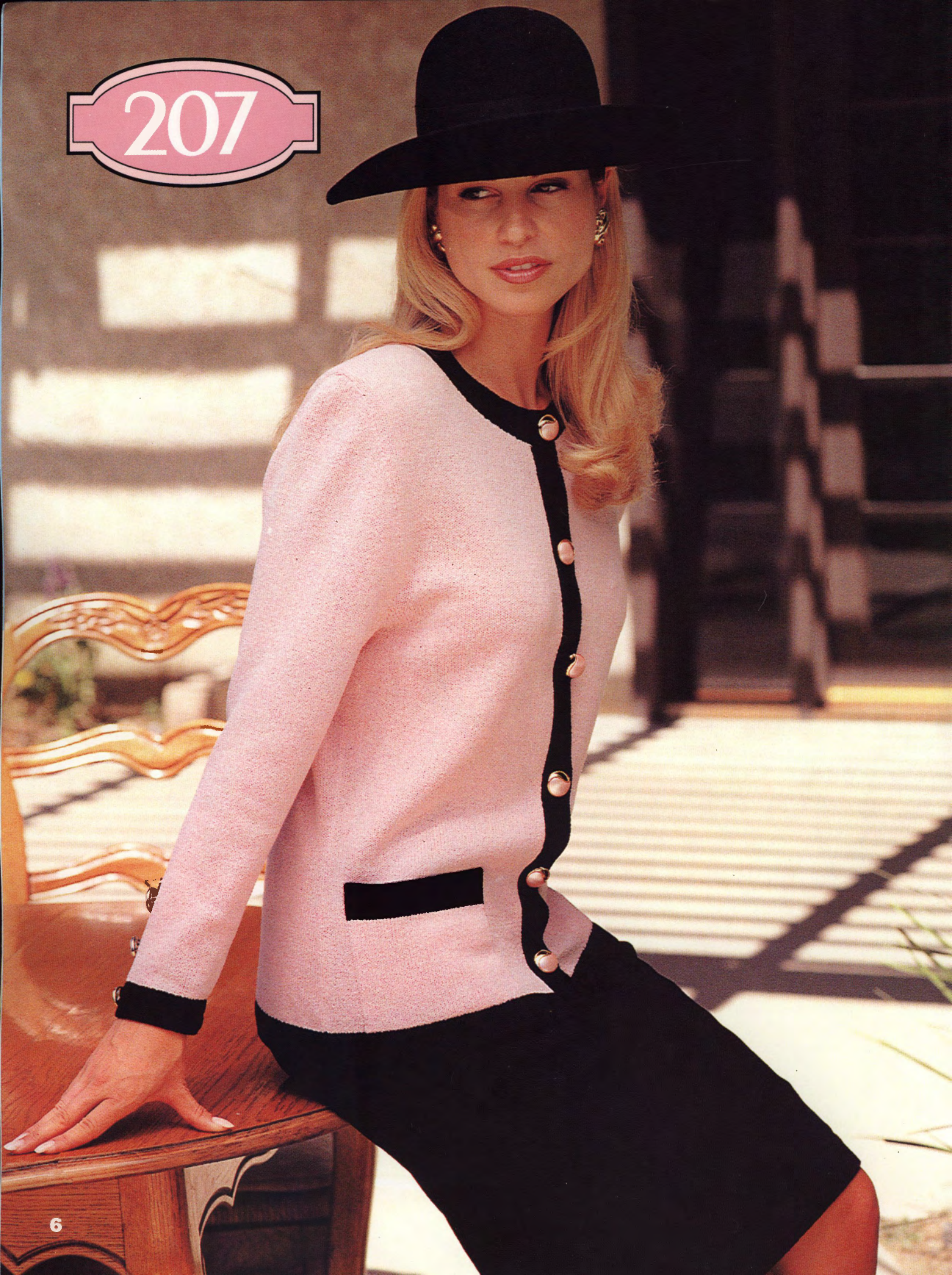
The results allow you to look your best in ways that reflect your personal taste.

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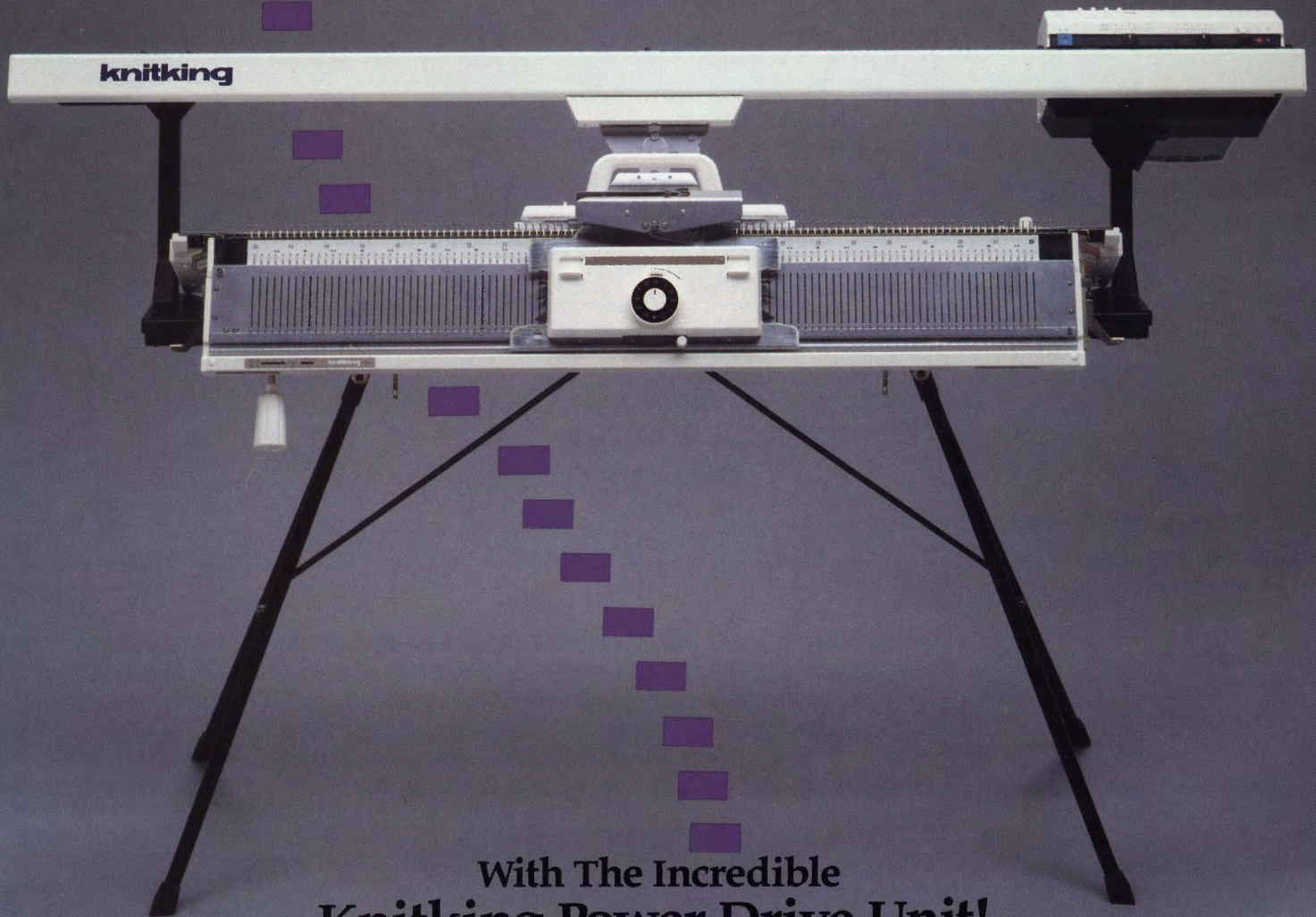

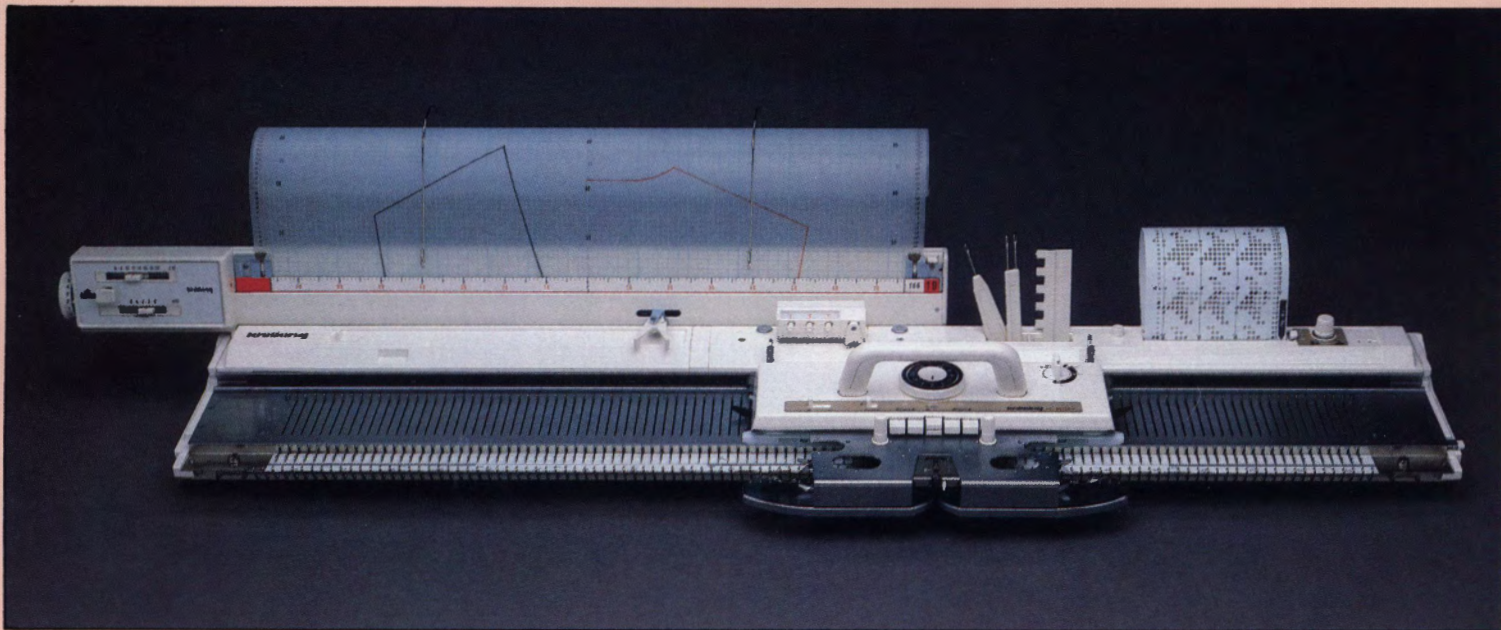

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Punch Card Programmed Bulky



The **Knitking PC Bulky** is easily the most versatile of all Bulky knitting machines. It offers **Knitking's** exclusive **Automatic 24 Stitch Repeat Punch Card Pattern Selection** and **Single Motif Isolation** capabilities. It knits a range of yarns from sport weight to jumbo, including Angora, Mohair, Boucle, Ribbon, Cotton, Acrylic, etc.; with 114 stainless steel needles you can knit up to 38" wide, at 3 stitches per inch. The Tension Control Dial has 30 tension positions for knitting different weights of yarn.

The **PC Bulky** comes complete with **Twin Overhead Yarn Feeders**, **15 Pre-Punched Cards** (you can also make your own pattern stitch cards), **Row Counter**, complete **Tool Kit**, **Stitch Measure Scales for Knitleader**, **Carrying Case**, a detailed, well illustrated, easy-to-understand **Instruction Manual** and a one year warranty on parts and service.

The **Knitleader** is a charting accessory that fits on the back of the knitter. You draw, or trace a garment, full-size, on the furnished Mylar sheet. The chart rotates as you knit, and shows you, on a row-by-row basis, exactly where to increase and decrease stitches.

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GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

THE SAMPLE SWATCH

It is imperative that you knit a sample swatch for every garment. Although you may be using the identical yarn and machine model as the pattern suggests, many variables such as dye lot difference, speed of knitting and just machine to machine differences can all cause a variance in the gauge achieved. Knitmagazine publishes the tension and gauge for each garment shown. We strongly urge you to knit a swatch representing three tensions - the recommended tension, and .1 or .2 higher and lower. These different tensions can be knitted in one piece with waste yarn separating the sections. This will eliminate unnecessary rethreading while allowing you to obtain the gauge published in the magazine.

To make a sample swatch on standard gauge machines cast on 60 stitches with waste yarn. Knit approximately 6 rows. *Mark the tension number for your swatch by making holes. For example 4 eyelet holes for Tension 4, 6 eyelet holes for Tension 6. Knit 6 more rows.

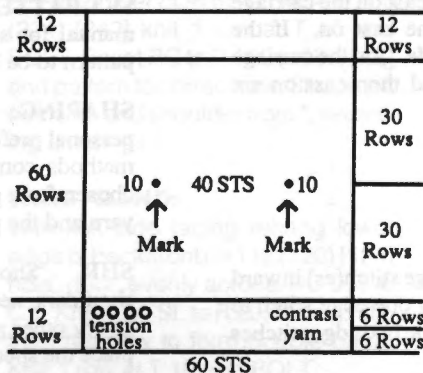
Change to garment yarn and reset row counter to 0. Knit 30 rows (in Pattern stitch). With contrast yarn, mark the 10th stitch FROM EACH SIDE by hand. Knit 30 Rows. Change to waste yarn and knit 6 rows. Change tension up or down for second section and repeat from *. Make third section with another tension. Remove on 12 Rows of waste yarn. Remove the sts. from the machine

by pushing the Carriage across without yarn.

Pull and stretch the swatch both lengthwise and diagonally from corner to corner. Gently block the swatch. Treat the swatch as you would the finished garment before measuring the gauge. For example, if you plan to wash this garment and dry it in the dryer, you should do so, measuring before and after to see the difference.

Measure between the stitches marked and the beginning and ending rows for the inches/cms. knitted. Divide the total number of stitches/rows by the inches measured to calculate sts. and rows per inch.

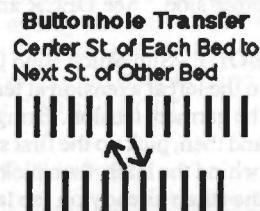
For Bulky knitters, make swatch with 30 Sts. and 30 Rows. If so desired, or for large pattern repeats, we suggest a wider and longer swatch to provide more accurate gauges.



BUTTONHOLES

The following methods of buttonholes are the general manner in which small and large buttonholes are created.

Small Buttonholes in Ribbing
Make small eyelet style buttonholes by following chart below.



Large Buttonholes in FNR
Vertical buttonholes are made by knitting each side separately (partial or short-row knitting). Knit the right side first, end with yarn on left. Without breaking yarn, knit left side. The strand of yarn inside the buttonhole can be picked up every other row when knitting the left side, but this is not necessary for a small buttonhole.

SHORT ROWS

Method One

With carriage on opposite side start placing appropriate number of ndls in HP. Knit across and wrap the inside needle. Again, place appropriate number of ndls in HP on opposite side from carriage, knit across and repeat wrapping. The wrapping will eliminate any holes in the knitting.

Method Two - Automatic Wrap

Example follows for shoulder short rows. This method can be used for other Short Rowing as well. For example if pattern says to Short Row at shoulder every other row 7 sts, 1 x and 6 sts. 1 x . . . With carriage on opposite side put 6 sts in HP, knit 1 row across and put one additional needle in HP. Opposite carriage place 6 ndls in HP. Knit 1 row across and bring one extra needle to HP. Repeat until shortrowing is completed.

HEMS

Two methods of knitting hems are described below. Variations on these instructions will allow you to knit plain hems, picot edge hems and more.

Method One

With waste yarn cast on the required number of stitches and knit about 10-12 rows ending with the carriage on the left. Knit 1 Row to the right with Ravel Cord. Change to garment yarn and knit 1 Row to the left at garment body tension. (i.e. Skirt at Tension 4, 1st row at T 4). Turn tension down approximately 2 full tension numbers lower (tighter) and knit to mid point. (i.e. Row 14 of a 28-row hem). Change tension to 1 full point lower than garment body and knit remainder of hem rows. Pick up the stitches from the first row of garment yarn - shown between the stitches of Ravel Cord. Hem is now completed. Proceed with pattern as per chart and instruc-

tions. Remove waste yarn and Ravel Cord when you have completed section.

Method Two

Bring required number of needles to "B" (working) position. Attach cast-on comb. Beginning with the 2nd needle on the LEFT, bring every other needle to "D" or "E" position. Push in both Part buttons. Knit 1 Row to the left. Release the part buttons and drop the cast-on comb. (DO NOT REMOVE cast on comb from work). Knit required number of rows for hem. Attach weights to the back of work close to the cast-on comb (about 1/4" above the comb). Beginning with the 1st needle on the LEFT, bring every other needle to "D" position. Carefully LIFT the cast-on comb and hang loops onto the needles in "D" position. Turn the comb back away from you and make sure the needles are through the loops. Pull the needles out to "E" position and remove the cast-on comb.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

AT THE SAME TIME - Two functions are to be performed at the same time, such as shaping the neck and shoulder. Be sure to read both instructions before proceeding.

BO - Bind Off. To take off more than 1 St. at a time. When two or more stitches are to be bound off (or cast on) the carriage and yarn must be on the same side as the bind off. If the instruction is, "At R 100 BO 6 Sts on each side.", on the carriage side BO six stitches, knit one row and then bind off six stitches on the other side. See DECR and FF DECR.

BOLT - Slip Stitch Bind Off with a Latch Tool. Knit one row to the left at a tension at least five numbers higher (looser) than the garment tension. Bring all needles to holding position ("E") and then, pick up the first stitch on a latch tool allowing it to slip behind the latch, then pick up the next stitch and pull it through the stitch already on the latch hook, thus creating a slip stitch. If you cannot set the tension at least five full tension numbers higher, knit a row loosely manually.

CO - Cast on stitches for knitting. (CHECK INSTRUCTION MANUALS TO MAKE SURE DIFFERENT METHODS ARE SHOWN) In our instructions, CO is used either for a finished edge at the beginning of the garment, or to add edge stitch(es). If two or more stitches are to be cast on the carriage and yarn must be on the same side as the cast on. If the instruction is, "At R 100 CO 6 Sts on each side.", on the carriage side cast on six stitches, knit one row and then cast on six stitches on the other side.

COR - Carriage on Right

COL - Carriage on Left

DECR - Use the transfer tool to move the edge stitch(es) inward to the next needle. Usually used to transfer one edge stitch to the next needle, but may be used to transfer the two edge stitches to the next two needles.

EON - Every other needle

EOR - Every other row

EOS - Every other stitch

FF DECR - Used to make an even edge for seaming and decorative seams for raglans. If one stitch is to be decreased, use a two-prong transfer tool to move the two edge stitches inward one needle. If two stitches are to be decreased, use a three-prong transfer tool to move the three edge stitches in two needles. If three stitches are to be decreased, use two two-prong transfer tools and move the edge stitches in four needles. See DECR, BO and SHAPING.

FF INCR - To increase one stitch move the two edge stitches outward one needle, then fill the empty needle by picking up a bar from the row below and hanging it on the empty needle.

FNR - Full Needle Rib

G.C. - Garter Carriage

HP - Holding position or "E" position.

INCR - Increase. Usually used for "full-fashion" shaping, see FF Incr., or in conjunction with short row shaping. A simple incr can be made by pulling additional needle on side of carriage out to "E" position and knit across.

MB - Main Bed

MC - Main Color

Ndls - Needles

NWP - Non-working position or position "A"

R(s) - Row(s)

RB - Ribber Bed

RC - Row Counter.

RC 0 - Set RC to zero.

SET PATTERN - Follow the step-by-step instructions in your manual for setting the pattern and carriage controls for the pattern to be knit, e.g., Fairisle, tuck, single motif, etc.

SHAPING: The method used for shaping is a matter of personal preference. In our definitions we have described the methods commonly in use at Knitking. Which method is chosen for a particular pattern depends upon the garment, the yarn and the personal preference of the designer.

SHR - Short Row or Partial Knitting. Used for shaping shoulders, necklines, darts, gores, etc. Set carriage on H(old). **Every other row SHRs**: On the opposite side of the carriage, place the specified number of stitches in holding position, knit across, wrap the inner needle or use an "automatic wrap". After all specified stitches have been placed in HP change the carriage setting to N (knit) to return the needles to WP. **Every row SHRs**: On the side being shaped, place one stitch in HP every row. It is recommended you refer to your manual or an instruction book for detailed instructions about how to short row.

St(s) - Stitch(es)

St. St. - Stockinette stitch.

T - Tension.

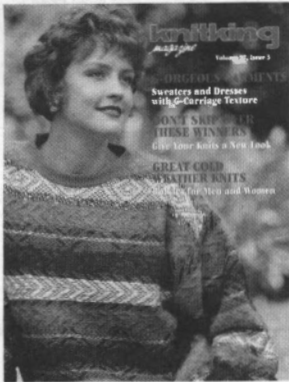
WP - Working Position or "B" position.

WY - Waste yarn.

YM - Yarn marker. To place a yarn marker, use a short piece of contrasting yarn and loop it over the needle specified or the end needle of the row specified.

SEAMING GARMENTS

Any number of popular methods are suggested. We encourage you to experiment with any and all. If a garment in Knitking Magazine requires special seaming information it will be provided in the individual pattern instruction. Otherwise, methods include: linking on the knitting machine, Knitking's Lectrolink, the electric linker, crochet slip stitch, tapestry needles with back stitch sewing by hand. Bar to bar weaving for seamless appearance and seaming on a sewing machine.

Body: T 10

GAUGE:

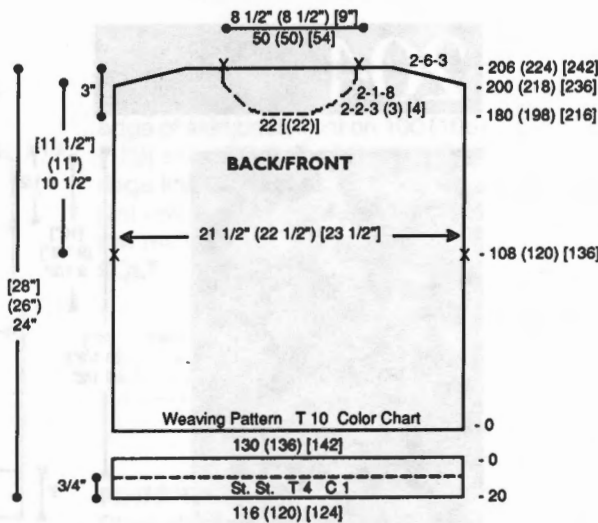
Body: 6 Sts., 8.8 Rs. = 1"

TECHNIQUE: Weaving and St. St.

Make on Standard 24-Stitch Punch Card or Standard Electronic Machine with Ribber.

BACK:

With WY CO 130 (136) [142] sts. After several rows end with 1 row Ravel Cord to the left. Knit 1 row at T 7 to select ndls. RC 0. T 10. Knit in weaving pattern following Color Chart. At R 108 (120) [136] place a YM on each side for armhole. At R 200 (218) [236] SHR shoulders EOR 6 Sts. 3x. At R 206 (224) [242] mark center 50 (50) [54] sts. for neckline. Knit 1 row at T 10 and BOLT.

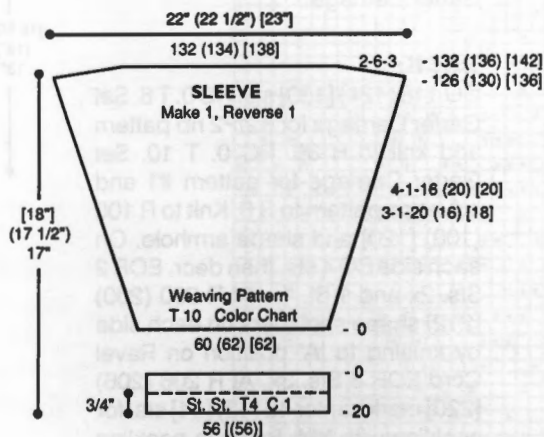


FRONT:

Knit front same as back to R 180 (198) [216]. Shape neckline. BO center 22 [(22)] sts. Place all sts. to the left in HP. Note pattern row. *On neckline edge decr. EOR 2 Sts. 3 (3) [4] x and 1 St. 8 x. At R 200 (218) [236] SHR shoulder EOR 6 Sts. 3x. At R 206 (224) [242] knit 1 row at T 10 and BOLT. Reset RC to R 180 (198) [216] and pattern to correct row. Shape left neckline and shoulder from *, reversing shapings.

WAISTBAND:

With knit side facing rehang lower edge of back/front on 116 (120) [124] ndls. decr. evenly across. RC 0. T 4. C 1. Knit in St. St. to R 20. Pick up sts. from first row to form double band. Knit 1 row at T 10 and BOLT.



SLEEVE:

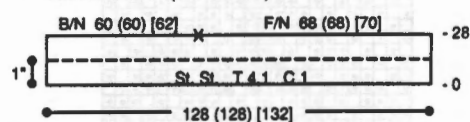
With WY CO 60 (62) [62] sts. After several rows end with 1 row Ravel Cord to the left. Knit 1 row at T 7 to

select ndls. RC 0. T 10. Knit in weaving pattern following Color Chart while incr. on each side every 3 Rs. 1 St. 20 (16) [18] x and every 4 Rs. 1 St. 16 (20) [20] x. At R 126 (130) [136] shape sleeve cap. On each side SHR EOR 6 Sts. 3x. AT R 132 (136) [142] knit 1 row at T 10 and BOLT.

CUFF:

With knit side facing rehang lower edge of sleeve on 56 [(56)] ndls. decr. evenly across. RC 0. T 4. C 1. Knit in St. St. to R 20. Pick up sts. from first row to form double band. Knit 1 row at T 10 and BOLT.

NECKBAND (Not to Scale)



NECKBAND:

Close one shoulder. With knit side facing rehang neckline on 128 (128) [132] ndls. following chart. RC 0. T 4.1. C 1. Knit in St. St. to R 28. Pick up sts. from first row to form double band. Knit 1 row at T 10 and BOLT.

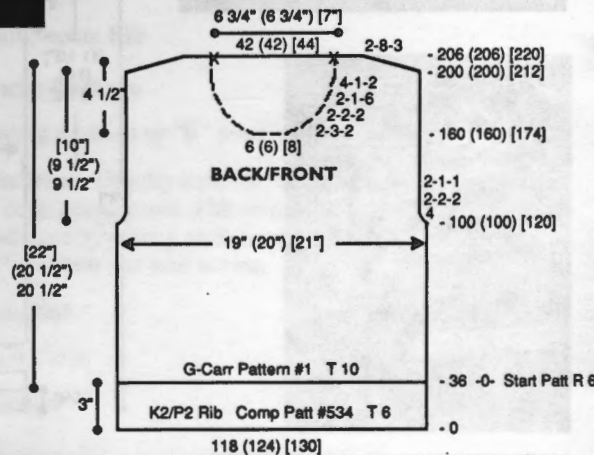
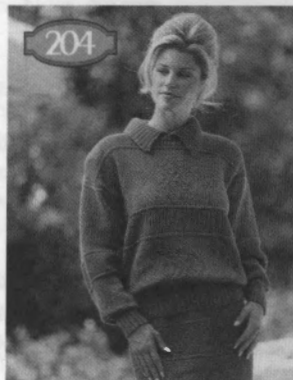
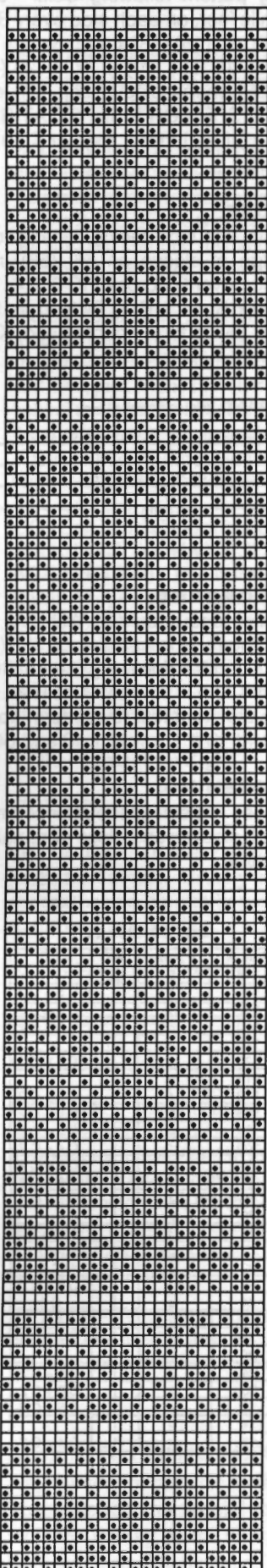
FINISHING:

Close remaining shoulder seam. Attach sleeves and close all remaining seams.

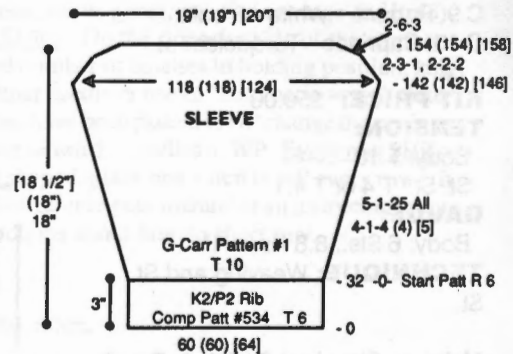

BACK:

CO 118 (124) [130] sts. RC 0. T 6. Set Garter Carriage for K2/P2 rib pattern and knit to R 36. RC 0. T 10. Set Garter Carriage for pattern #1 and advance pattern to R 6. Knit to R 100 (100) [120] and shape armhole. On each side BO 4 sts. then decr. EOR 2 Sts. 2x and 1 St. 1x. At R 200 (200) [212] shape shoulders on each side by knitting to 'A' position on Ravel Cord EOR 8 Sts. 3x. At R 206 (206) [220] mark center 42 (42) [44] sts. for neckline with YM. Remove neckline and shoulder sts. on separate WY.

FRONT:

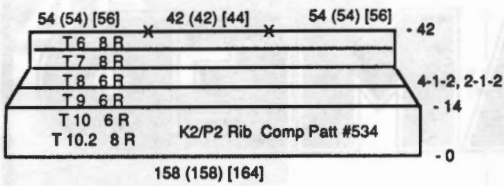
Knit front same as back to R 160 (160) [174]. Shape neckline. Knit center 6 (6) [8] sts. to 'A' position on Ravel Cord and all sts. to the left. Note pattern row. *On neckline edge decr. EOR 3 Sts. 2x, 2 Sts. 2x, 1 St. 6x and every 4 Rs. 1 St. 2x. At R 200 (200) [212] shape shoulder by knitting to 'A' position on Ravel Cord EOR 8 Sts. 3x. At R 206 (206) [220] remove shoulder sts. on WY. Reset RC to R 160 (160) [174]. Reset pattern to correct row and shape left side from *, reversing shapings.



SLEEVE:

CO 60 (60) [64] sts. RC 0. T 6. Set Garter Carriage for K2/P2 rib pattern and knit to R 32. RC 0. T 10. Set Garter Carriage for pattern #1 and advance pattern to R 6. Knit while incr. on each side every 4 Rs. 1 St. 4 (4) [5] x and every 5 Rs. 1 St. 25 x for all sizes. At R 142 (142) [146] shape sleeve cap. On each side decr. EOR 3 Sts. 1x and 2 Sts. 2x, then knit to 'A' position on Ravel Cord EOR 6 Sts. 3x. At R 154 (154) [158] remove sts. on WY.

NECKBAND (Not to Scale)



SKIRT WASITBAND:

With purl side facing rehang upper edge of skirt back/front on 100 (106) [120] ndls. RC 0. T 10. With K-Carriage knit to R 20. Pick up sts. from first row to form double band. Knit 1 row manually at a loose tension and BOLT.

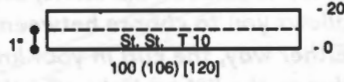

NECKBAND:

CO 158 (158) [164] sts. RC 0. T 10.2. Set Garter Carriage for K2/P2 rib pattern. Knit 8 Rs. and change to T 10. Knit 6 Rs. and change to T 9. Start decr. on each side every 4 Rs. 1 St. 2x and EOR 1 Sts. 2x. while changing tension as follows. Knit 6 Rs. and change to T 8. Knit 6 Rs. and change to T 7. Knit 8 Rs. and change to T 6. Knit 8 Rs. and remove sts. on WY. With knit side facing rehang neckline on 150 (150) [156] ndls. following chart. With purl side facing rehang neckband beginning from front center on these same ndls. Knit 1 row manually at a loose tension and BOLT.

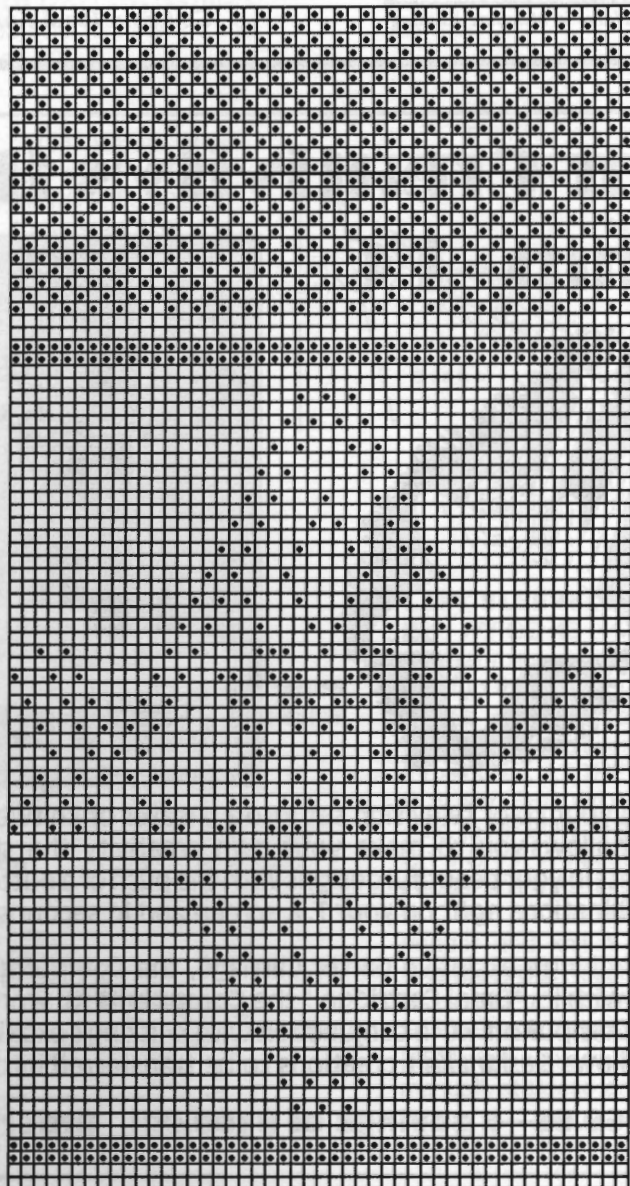

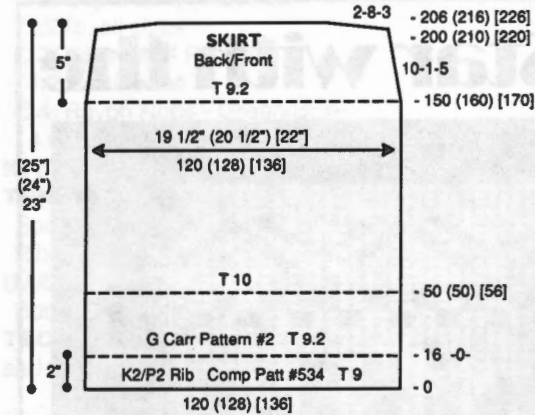
FINISHING:

Close shoulder seams. Close center seam of collar from bottom up 3/4". Attach sleeves and close all remaining seams.

SKIRT BACK/FRONT:

CO 120 (128) [136] sts. RC 0. T 9. Set Garter Carriage for K2/P2 rib pattern and knit to R 16. RC 0. T 9.2. Set Garter Carriage for pattern #2. Knit to R 50 (50) [56] and change to T 10. Continue to R 150 (160) [170] and change to T 9.2. Decr. on each side every 10 Rs. 1 St. 5x. At R 200 (210) [220] on each side knit to 'A' position on Ravel Cord EOR 8 Sts. 3x. At R 206 (216) [226] remove sts. on WY.

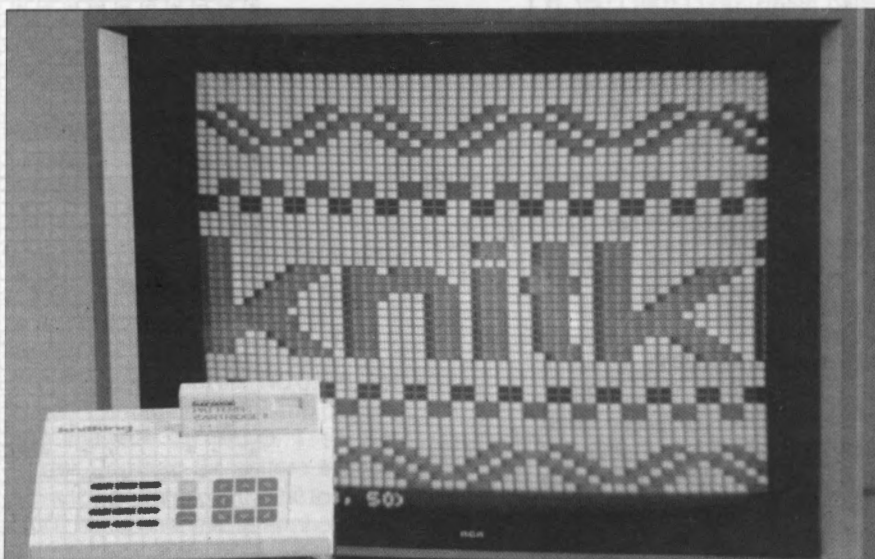

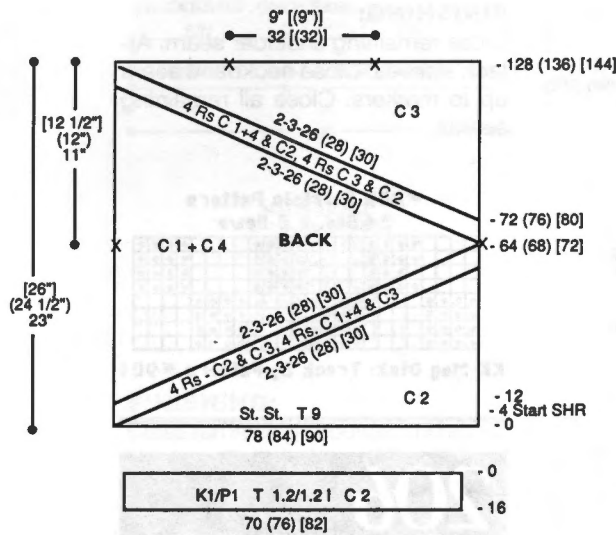

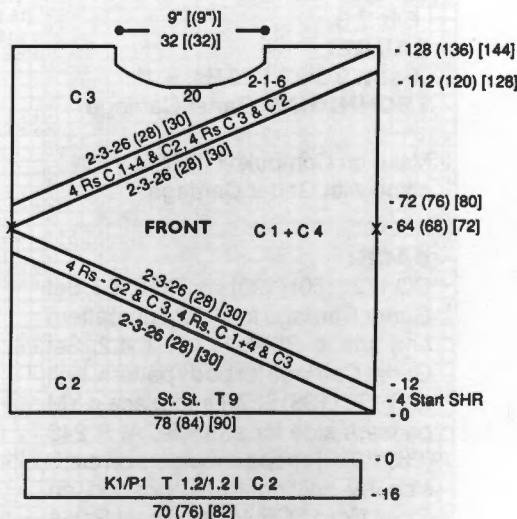

With C 2 in 'A' Feeder and C 3 in 'B' Feeder knit 4 Rs. in fairisle. Change to C 1 + C 4 in 'A' Feeder and C 3 in 'B' Feeder and knit 4 Rs. in fairisle. Place a YM on right side for armhole. Change to C 1 + C 4. Reset RC to 12. Place all sts. in HP. On left side push to WP EOR 3 Sts. 26 (28) [30] x. Place a YM on left side for armhole. On right side bring to HP EOR 3 Sts. 26 (28) [30] x. With C 1 + C 4 in 'A' Feeder and C 2 in 'B' Feeder knit 4 Rs. in fairisle. Change to C 3 in 'A' Feeder



and C 2 in 'B' Feeder and knit 4 Rs. in fairisle. Change to C 3. Reset RC to 72 (76) [80]. Place all sts. in HP. On right side push to WP EOR 3 Sts. 26 (28) [30] x. At R 128 (136) [144] mark center 32 [(32)] sts. for neckline and remove sts. on WY.

FRONT:

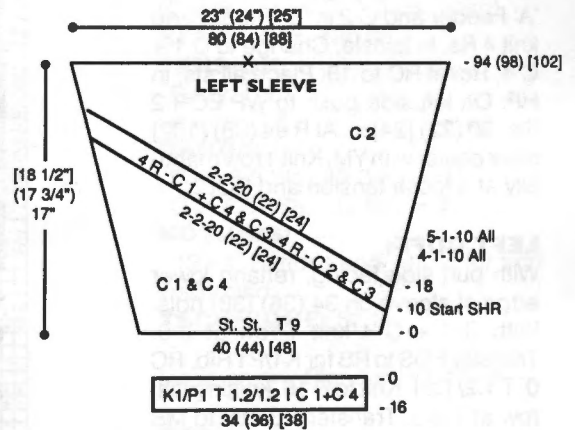
With WY CO 78 (84) [90] sts. After several rows, end with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. RC 0. T 9. C 2. St. St. Knit to R 4 and start SHR. On right side bring 3 ndls. to HP EOR 26 (28) [30] x. With C 2 in 'A' Feeder and C 3 in 'B' Feeder knit 4 Rs. in fairisle. Change to C 1 + C 4 in 'A' Feeder and C 3 in 'B' Feeder and knit 4 Rs. in fairisle. Place a YM on left side for armhole. Change to C 1 + C 4. Reset RC to 12. Place all sts. in HP. On right side push to WP EOR 3 Sts. 26 (28) [30] x. Place a YM on right side for armhole. On left side bring to HP EOR 3 Sts. 26



(28) [30] x. With C 1 + C 4 in 'A' Feeder and C 2 in 'B' Feeder knit 4 Rs. in fairisle. Change to C 3 in 'A' Feeder and C 2 in 'B' Feeder and knit 4 Rs. in fairisle. Change to C 3. Reset RC to 72 (76) [80]. Place all sts. in HP. On left side push to WP EOR 3 Sts. 26 (28) [30] x. AT THE SAME TIME at R 112 (120) [128] shape neckline. Place center 20 sts. in HP and all sts. to the left. *On neckline edge decr. EOR 1 St. 6x. At R 128 (136) [144] remove shoulder sts. on WY. Reset RC to 112 (120) [128] and shape left side from *, reversing shaping. Remove shoulder and neckline sts. on separate WY.

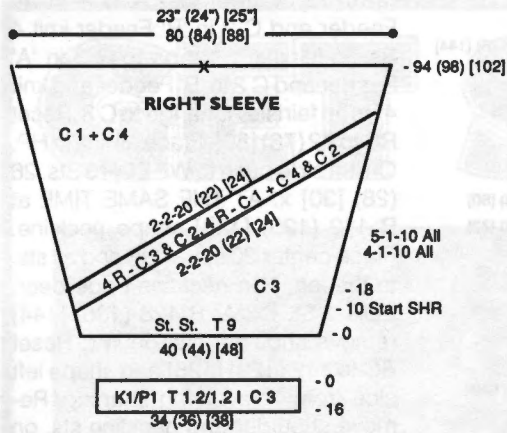
WAISTBAND:

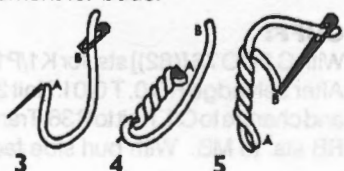


Bring the needle through to the right side of knit at **A**, form a loop with the yarn and hold it in place with the thumb while the needle is inserted into the fabric exactly where it came up (**A**). The loop is formed and then secured by bringing the needle up inside the end of the loop at **B**, then down outside the loop at **C** forming a tie-down stitch.

BULLION STITCH

Bullion stitches are created by wrapping thread around the needle and securing it on the fabric. They can be arranged for bed effects or to make little leaves or petals. Note photo for placement for buds.

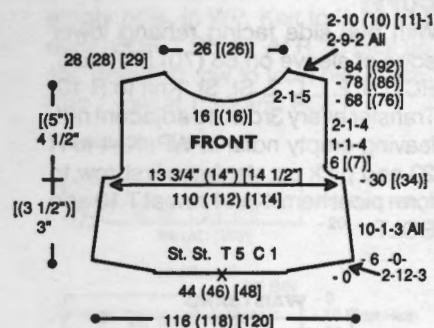


Bring the needle up at **A** and down at **B**. Do not pull the yarn through. Bring the needle half-way up again at **A**, but do not pull the needle through the fabric. **Diagram 3.**

Holding the needle from below, wind the thread around the needle (5 times for our petals). The number of twists will be determined by the length of the stitch and the thickness of the thread. As a rule, five or six twists are used.

With your left finger and thumb holding the twist just made, ease the needle up through the twist with your right hand. Do not release your hold until the needle goes through. Slowly pull the remainder of the thread up through the twist. Reinsert your needle at **B** and gently secure the twist against the fabric. **Diagram 5.**

With WY CO 176 (192) [200] sts. After several rows end with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. RC 0. T 8. Knit in fairisle following Body Color Chart. At R 212 (208) [202] place a YM on each side for armhole. At R 304 [(304)] mark center 60 [(68)] sts. for neckline with a YM. Remove neckline and shoulder sts. on separate WY.

FRONT:

Knit front same as back to R 280 [(280)]. Shape neckline. Place center 32 [(40)] sts. in HP and all sts. to

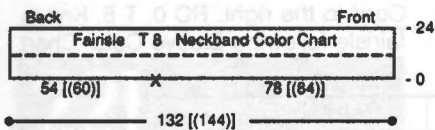
