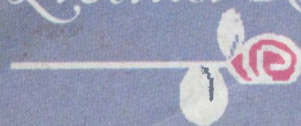

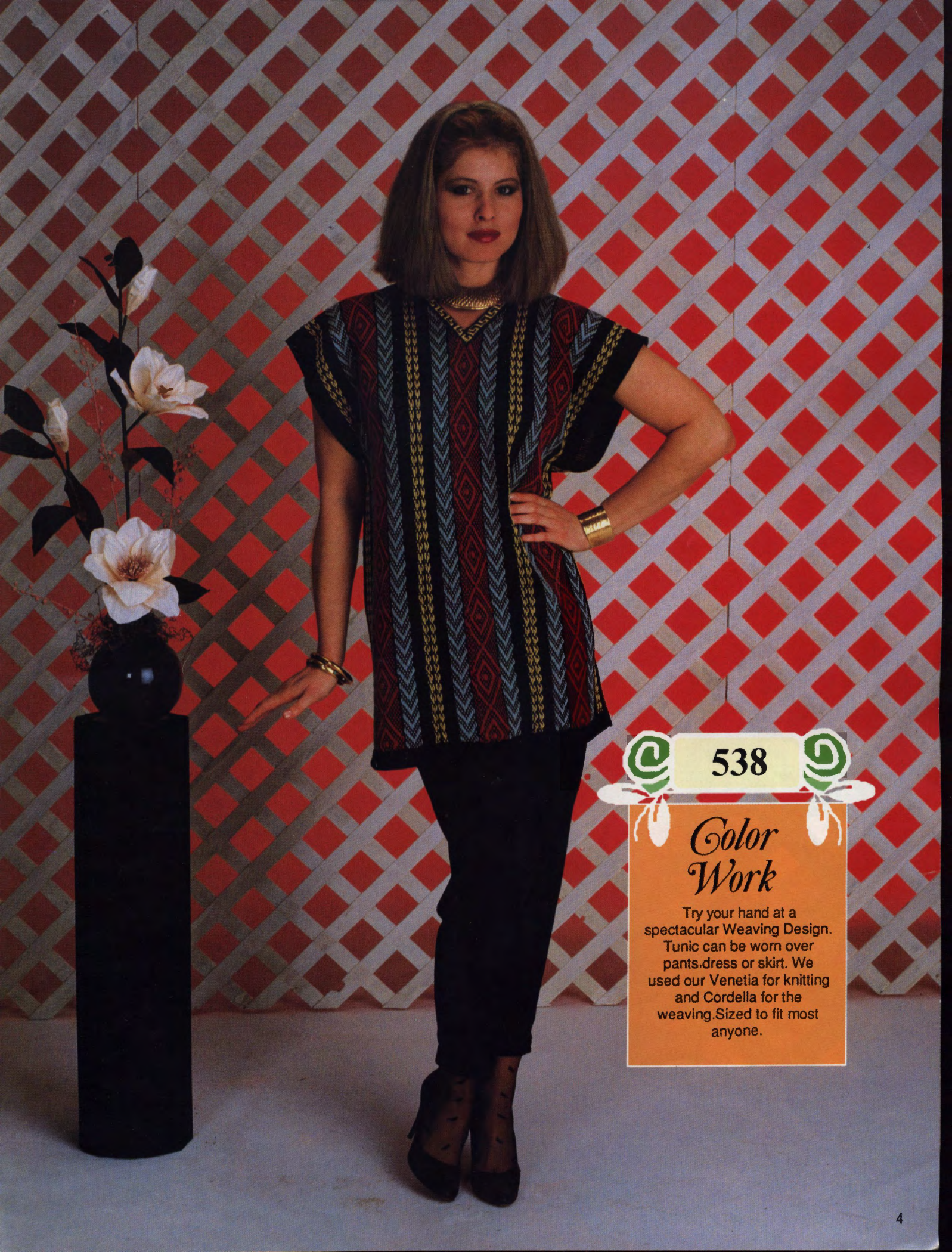
Editorial

Over a period of several weeks, prior to going to press with this issue, we questioned many customers of greater than average skills and with many years of experience in the operation of both punch card and computer knitting machines regarding their own personal collection of punch cards and computer mylar sheets and just how many different pattern stitches they have in their own collection. Most of them said between 50 and 60... some said as many as 100... the largest amount quoted was 150 and that from a customer with over 25 years of knitting experience. We do not doubt that many of our readers, if they take the time to count, can come up with a figure of 200 or more, but it takes a lot of experience and a lot of knitting to use that number of individual pattern stitches.

If you have not already turned the pages of this issue, take a look at our center page spread and the information regarding the new and incredible COMPUKNIT III (KH 930)... You will see that it has 555!!! Yes, five hundred and fifty-five complete pattern stitch designs already programmed into its computer... more than even the most prolific knitter could use knitting a garment a week for 10 years... every one with a different pattern stitch programmed exactly as illustrated in a special manual supplied with each machine. General Instructions

THE PRINTED INSTRUCTIONS

Follow the printed instructions or use them in combination with the Charts. Where there is any question in the instructions, you have the Charts to show you how the section will look.

Be sure to READ AHEAD so that you KNOW what to do for the size you are knitting. In the shapings, where the number of stitches are the same but the number of times different, you might find shapings like this...3 sts. 1 x (2x) [3x]—so that for the first size you will bind off 3 sts. 1x, 2nd size 3 sts. 2x, 3rd size 3 sts. 3x. Sometimes the ROWS will be different for each size—so you must watch out for different row numbers.

Shoulder and neck shapings for the back section of a garment usually are shaped at the same time—so ALWAYS WATCH for the words AT THE SAME TIME.

HOLDING STITCHES ON THE LEFT SIDE WHILE SHAPING THE RIGHT SIDE

There are different ways to hold stitches on one side while completing the other side. Usually, we tell you to bind off the center sts. for neck and put the left side into holding position while completing the right side. The easiest way and really the best way for beginners is to take a piece of RAVEL CORD and hand knit the center neck stitches, pulling them back against the needle bed of machine to the "A" or out of work position. The stitches remain in the HOOKS of the needles so you are really only knitting them HALF WAY. With another color of Ravel Cord, knit the remaining sts. on the left side in the SAME WAY.

It is important to protect these held stitches in some way—so you can either hang a REVERSING BAR so that the EYES of the Bar go BETWEEN the Gate Pegs on the machine and that the UPPER TIPS of Bar only—show above the needle bed...OR the simplest way is to use a piece of 1 inch masking tape and GENTLY place it beneath the knitting—right below the gate pegs. Do NOT press the tape—only enough pressure to hold it in place. This will prevent the Carriage (or Slide) from marking the held section.

It is VERY IMPORTANT that you mark the PATTERN ROW where you divide for the split for NECK (or SHOULDER) shaping....If you are using a PUNCH CARD—MARK THE CARD—if you are using an ELECTRONIC machine, MARK THE DESIGN WINDOW. Also take note of the Row number for the division. When you are ready to work the left section, bring the HELD stitches back to B (working) position by pulling each end of the Ravel Cord GENTLY and rip it off—be sure to align all needles straight in the B or knitting position.

Now you are ready to REFER TO YOUR OWN INSTRUCTION MANUAL for your machine—to set the controls to begin knitting the left half. The neck stitches can be bound off after completing the right side or you can leave them in hold until each side is finished, then bind them off or remove them onto contrast waste yarn ready to be picked up for knitting a neckband or for other finishing.

FULL FASHION DECREASING OR INCREASING

For Stockinette stitch, use the Full Fashion method for decreasing or increasing (except for regular cap shaping on sleeves where you decrease the edge stitch).

TO DECREASE: Hang the 3rd stitch onto the 2nd stitch then move the end stitches in to fill the empty needle.

TO INCREASE: Move the 2nd end stitches 1 needle outward, then pick up the 3rd stitch from the row below and hang it onto empty needle.

THE SAMPLE SWATCH

Before you knit any garment, you must knit a sample swatch using the yarn you have chosen for your garment. If you do not get the correct Stitch and Row Gauge as given for a Pattern in KNITTING MAGAZINE—try different tensions. If you are using the specified yarn, you should be able to get the correct gauge using a smaller or larger tension. If you are using a different yarn, you may have to make several swatches—but the gauge is very important.

To make a sample swatch—Cast on 60 stitches with waste yarn and knit 6 rows. Mark the tension number for your sample swatch by making holes (you can do this with a Lace Carriage or by hand), 4 transfers for Tension 4, 6 transfers for Tension 6, etc. Knit 6 more rows.

Change to garment yarn and set Counter at 0. Knit 30 rows (in Stockinette stitch or Pattern stitch—according to the garment). With Contrast waste yarn knit the 10th stitch FROM EACH SIDE—by hand. Knit 30 rows. Change to waste yarn and knit 12 rows. Remove the sts. from the machine by pushing the Carriage (or Slide) across without yarn.

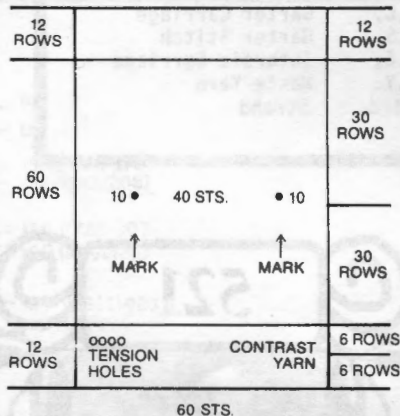
Pull and stretch the sample swatch both lengthwise and diagonally from corner to corner, then lengthwise again. Gently block the swatch (KNITTING PRESSING CLOTHS are great for this)—or you can allow the sample to rest several hours or even over night so that the stitches can return to their basic form.

THE KNITTING STITCH/ROW GAUGE and STITCH/ROW CALCULATOR can be used to find the NUMBER OF STITCHES or ROWS TO 1 INCH.

The KNITTING STITCH/ROW GAUGE will give you the NUMBER OF STITCHES or ROWS to 1 inch. After knitting a sample swatch by following our instructions, place the STITCH/ROW GAUGE horizontally with the START LINE on the INSIDE of LEFT stitch mark on sample.

Keep it straight then read the number on the Gauge directly below the inside RIGHT mark on Gauge. This will give you the STITCH GAUGE TO 1 INCH. For instance, if the number is 8, then you have 8 stitches to 1 INCH. To find the ROWS TO 1 INCH, measure from the first row of garment yarn, VERTICALLY to the last row. Read the NUMBER from the LOWER EDGE of GAUGE same as you did for stitches and if the number should be 14, you have 14 rows to 1 inch.

The STITCH/ROW CALCULATOR will now give you the number of sts. or rows needed for a specific measurement. Line the ARROW to the number 8 (8 sts. to 1 inch) and should you need 20 inches of stitches, find the number 20 below and right above the 20 the Calculator shows 160 sts. It works the same way for rows using the Row Gauge.



FINISHING

Gently block all sections—For PULLOVERS, JACKETS and DRESSES: Join the front to back at shoulders and sides. Sew sleeves together and set in. Hem lower edge and sleeve edges if needed. For a double neckband or armhole, band sew 1 edge to inside and 1 to the outside of neck or armhole. For a single ribbed band, sew 1 edge to the outside of neck or armhole edge. For a cardigan or jacket with buttonholes, finish buttonholes and sew on buttons.

PANTS: Join front to back at sides. Sew inside leg seams, then join to center front and back. Make hem at waistline and insert elastic. Hem lower edge of pants' legs.

Needle not used—in out of work position.

3x1

The number in the box is the number of Rows between shapings. The 3 x 1 above the box gives you the sts. and number of times to make the decreases (or increases)—FOR EXAMPLE: 3 x 1 over the box with 4 means—At the given Row number, *decrease 1 st. knit 4 rows* and REPEAT from * to * 2 times more for a total of 3 times in all. All decreasing (or increasing) WITHOUT ROW NUMBER IN BOX must be made on EVERY 2nd ROW.

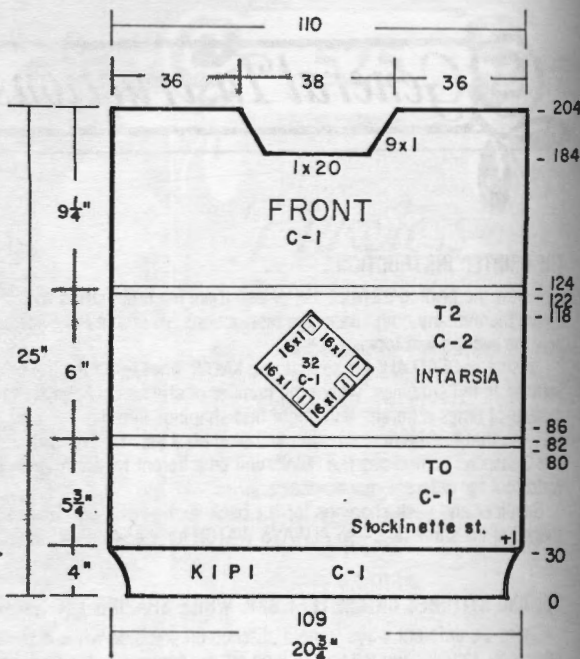

BACK:

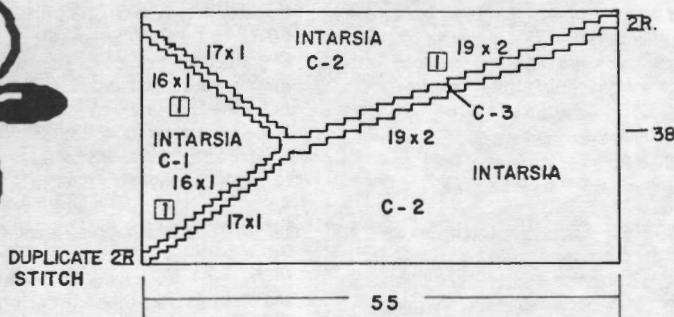
K1 P. Rib. Col. 1. Cast on 109 sts. Knit 30 Rows. Transfer Rib sts. to MB. Continue St. st. with Col. 1. Knit to Row 80. With 2 strds. Col. 3, knit 2 rows. With 1 strd. Col. 2 Angora, T-2, knit to Row 86. BEGIN INTARSIA DESIGN. Follow the Chart to Row 122. With 2 strds. Col. 3, knit 2 rows. Row 124, change to Col. 1. Knit to Row 204. Remove center 38 sts. onto W.Y. Remove right and left 36 shoulder sts. onto W.Y.

FRONT:

Same as back to Row 184. Bind off center 20 sts. put sts. on left into HP and complete right side first. *ON NECK SIDE, on every 2nd row, decrease 1 st. 9x. Remove onto W.Y. Bring Ndls. on left to WP, Row Counter back to 184 and complete left half. Follow Instructions from *.

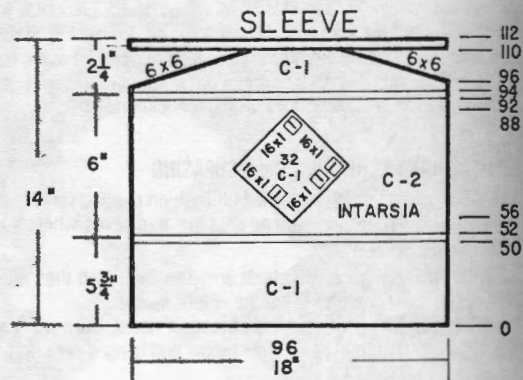


BODICE CHART HALF SIDE SHOWN

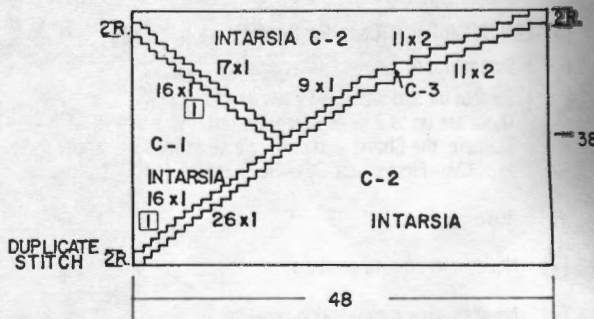


SLEEVES: Watch for Tension changes.

With W.Y. cast on 96 sts. After knitting several rows, end with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right side. Counter 0. Single strd Col. 1, knit to R 50. With 2 strds. Col. 3, knit 2 rows. With Col. 2 Angora, knit St. st. to R 56. Begin INTARSIA DESIGN and work as shown on the Chart to Row 88. Continue St. st. to R 92. With 2 strds. Col. 3, knit 2 rows. SHAPE CAP: Work Short Rows. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARRIAGE, bring into HP 6 sts. 6x ON EACH SIDE. Bring all Ndls. OPPOSITE CARRIAGE back into working position before knitting next 2 rows. After R 112, remove onto waste yarn.

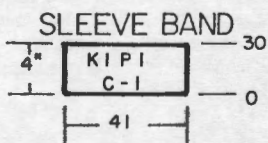


SLEEVE CHART HALF SIDE SHOWN



SLEEVE BANDS:

K1, P1 Rib. Col. 1. Cast on 41 sts. Knit 30 Rows. Transfer Rib sts. to MB. With wrong side facing, hang open sleeve sts. onto these Ndles, decreasing evenly across. Knit 1 Row over all sts. Bind off.

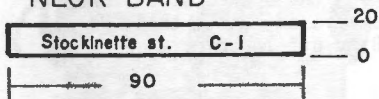

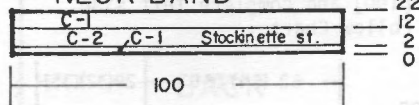

NECK BAND No. 2. Make 1.

With Color 1, 'e' cast on 100 sts. Work St. st. Knit 2 rows, change to Col. 2 and knit 10 rows. Change to Col. 1, knit 10 rows. Bind off.

NECK BAND

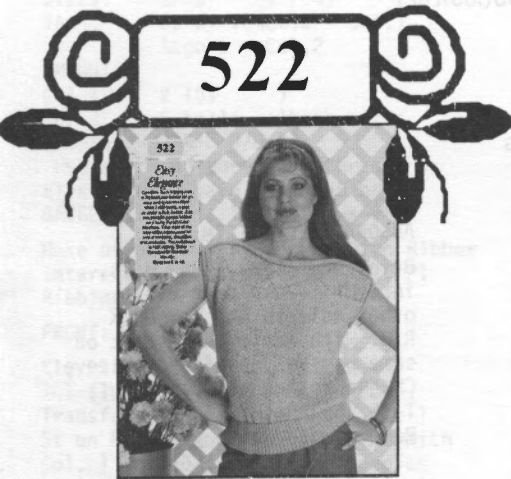


FINISHING:

Close both shoulders. Take Col. 1 Neckband and weave narrow ends together forming a circle. Attach to neck edge (Purl side showing) and allow it to roll naturally to front. (Roll should be thick and approximately 1" wide). Stitch into place.

Attach Col 2 Neckband in same manner taking care to see that only the Angora shows (Col. 1 is inside roll). Stitch into place. (See Photo).

With Col. 4, work DUPLICATE STITCH. Follow the Chart and outline Diamond Design on Front, Back and Sleeves and the angled lines. (See Photo). Close side and sleeve seams.



WOMENS SLEEVELESS PULLOVER

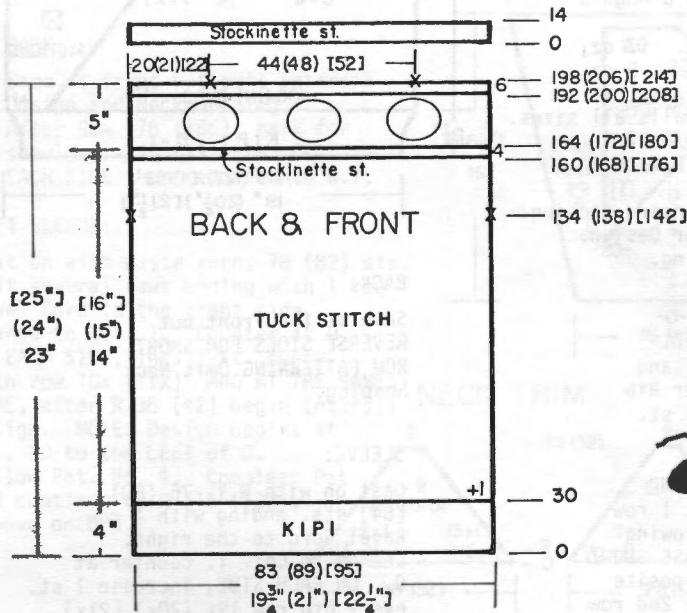
SIZES: 6/8 (10/12) [14/16]

YARN: Bulky Venetia = Col. 1
Rainbow Metallic = Col. 2

AMOUNT:
Col. 1 1 1/2 lbs. for all sizes.
Col. 2 2 spools for all sizes.

TENSION: Tuck St. 3, Rib. 0/0 II
GAUGE: 8 1/2 sts. 19 Rows = 2" (5 cm)

Make on any Punch Card Bulky machine. Main section is Tuck St. Use Card No. 2 from original set for KNITTING KH 260. Upper Bodice is Thread Lace. Punch Card. Bands are K1, P1 Ribbing. Knit side is the right side



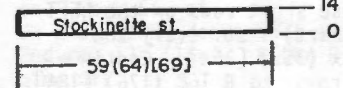
FRONT/BACK: The same.

K1, P1 Rib. With color 1, cast on 83 (89) [95] sts. Knit 30 rows. Transfer Rib sts. to MB and continue in TUCK PAT. to R 134 (138) [142]. Mark each side for arm opening. Continue in Pat. to R 160 (168) [176]. Cancel Tuck Pat. Knit 3 rows St. st. SET THREAD LACE PAT. LEFT TO RIGHT and with DOUBLE STRANDS Col. 2 in B Feeder, knit in Pat. to R 192 (200) [208]. Cancel Thread Lace and continue in St. st. T 2 to Row 198 (206) [214]. Mark each side for Neck opening (see Chart) then remove onto W.Y.

NECK AND SHOULDER TRIM:

With KNIT SIDE facing, hang the open sts. of Front back onto machine. With color 1 and T 2. Knit 14 rows. Bind off. REPEAT FOR BACK.

SLEEVE BAND MAKE 2



SLEEVE BANDS: Close shoulders first.

Bring 59 (64) [69] Ndl. into WP. With knit side facing, pick up sts. along arm opening from marker to marker and hang onto these Ndl. With Col. 1, T 2, knit 14 rows. Bind off LOOSELY. REPEAT for other arm opening.

FINISHING:

Close side seams. Join Sleeve Curl to Shoulder Curl. DO NOT PRESS WITH IRON OR STEAM. USE WET BLOCKING METHOD. See Practical Knitting Hints, this issue.



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Bind off the center 42 (44) [46] sts. Leave the left side in HP and complete right side first. ON NECK SIDE, dec. 1 st. EOR 10x. After Row 192 (202) [212], remove onto waste yarn. Turn Counter back to 170 (180) [190] and complete left side. Follow Chart .

SLEEVE CUFF:

K1, P1 Rib. Col. 2. Cast on 51 (57) [63] sts. Knit to Row 26. Transfer Rib sts. to MB. Hang the open sts. of lower sleeve edge onto these Ndl's. Bind off loosely.

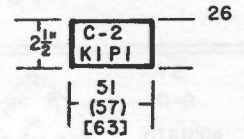
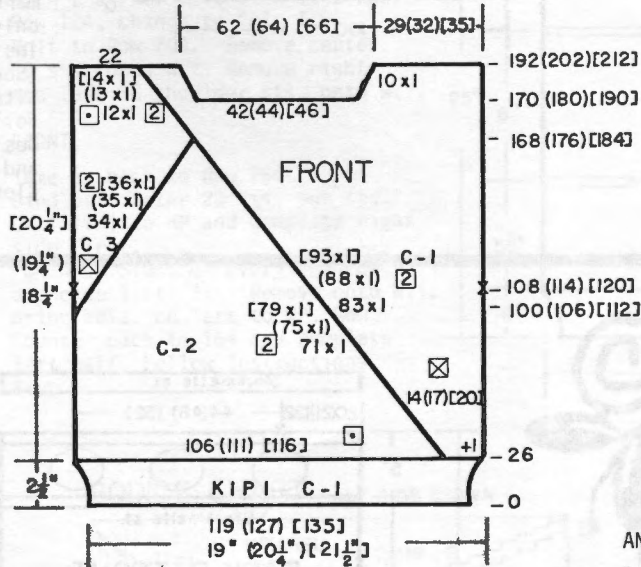
WOMENS PULLOVER

SIZES: 6/8 (10/12) [14]
 YARN: BULKY Venetia & Angora
 AMOUNT:
 Col. 1 15 oz. 16 oz. 17 oz.
 Col. 2 7 oz. 8 oz. 9 oz.
 Col. 3 2 oz. all sizes.
 Col. 4 Angora - 3 balls all sizes.
 TENSION: 10 Rib. 6/6 II
 GAUGE: 12 1/2 sts. 18 Rows = 2"

Can be made on any standard machine. Short Rows are used for Design. Bands are K1, P1 Ribbing.

FRONT:

With Col. 1, K1, P1 Rib. Cast on 119 (127) sts. and knit 26 rows. Transfer Rib sts. to MB. Increase 1 st. on the right. ON THE RIGHT SIDE, put 14 (17) [20] sts. into HP Attach Col. 2 and knit 1 row to the left side. Following the Chart, work DECREASE SHORT ROWS. Put 1 needle opposite Carriage into HP every 2nd row and BE SURE TO WRAP inside needle in HP (or you can use automatic wrap if you know how). After R 100 (106) [112] begin decrease short rows on the LEFT (see Chart) 1 st. every 2nd row 34x (35x) [36x]. Continue short rows to R 168 (176) [184]. All Ndl's. in HP. Turn Counter back to 100 (106) [112]. Carriage on the LEFT. With Col. 3 Work INCREASE SHORT ROWS. Push back into WP 1 st. every 2nd row 34x (35x) [36x]. After Row 169 (177) [185] work decrease short rows, 1 st. to HP 12x (13x) [14x]. After Row 192 (202) [212], Put these sts. into holding position. Turn Counter back to 26, and Carriage on the Right side. Bring the 14 (17) [20] sts. on right into WP. With Col. 1, work INCREASE SHORT ROWS, Bring back into working position 1 st. every 2nd row 83x (88x) [93x]. After Row 170 (180) [190], SHAPE NECK:



BACK:

Same as the Front but REVERSE SIDES FOR SHORT ROW PATTERNING. Omit Neck Shaping.

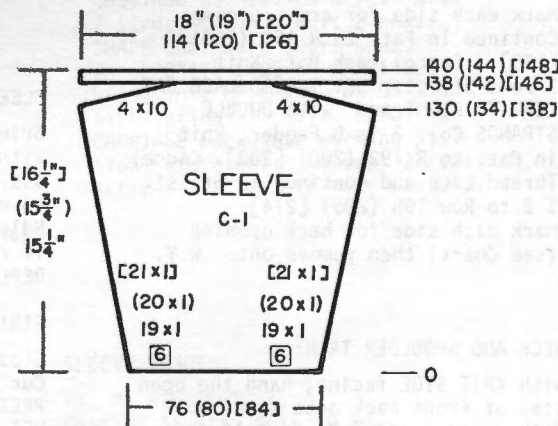
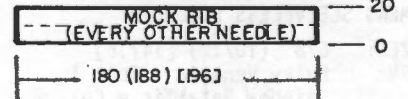
SLEEVE:

Cast on with W.Y. 76 (80) [84] sts. ending with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. Change to Col. 1. Counter at 0. ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. every 6th row 19x (20x) [21x]. Knit to R 130 (134) [138]. SHAPE CAP: ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARRIAGE, bring into HP 10 sts. 4x ON EACH SIDE. After R 138 (142) [146], knit 2 rows over all sts. Remove on W.Y.

ANGORA SLEEVE TRIM:

Bring 180 (188) [196] Ndl's. into WP. Push back every other Ndle to NWP for MOCK RIB. With waste yarn, cast on same way as you did for sleeve. Change to Angora (Col 4) T-10 and knit 20 Rows. Remove onto waste yarn.

ANGORA SLEEVE TRIM



FINISHING:

Close both shoulders. Bring into WP 114 (120) [126] Ndl's. With right side (knit) facing, using markers as guides, hang front/back sleeve opening onto these Ndl's. Pick up open sts. of Angora Trim from last row knitted and hang onto same Ndl's. Fold Angora Trim in half (as in making a hem) and hang first row of open sts. onto same Ndl's. With wrong side facing, hang open sts. of sleeve top on same Ndl's, knit 1 row over ALL STS. WITH LOOSE TENSION then bind off LOOSELY. NECK OPENING: With color 1 work 1 row slip st. crochet around neck then 1 row single crochet with Angora. Close sleeve and side seams.

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WOMENS INTARSIA PULLOVER

SIZES: 8/10 (12/14)
YARN: Bulky Venetia = Col.1
 Angora = Col.2

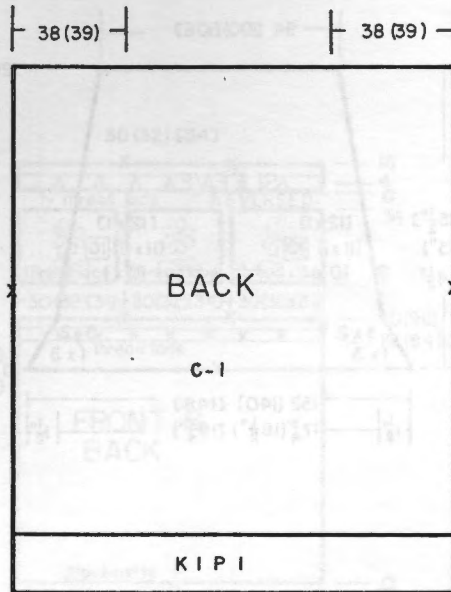
AMOUNT:
 Col.1 2 lbs }
 Col.2 6 balls } both sizes
TENSION: 3 Rib 0/0 II

Use matching thread or thread elastic with yarn for Ribbing.
GAUGE: 10 Sts. 14 1/2 Rows=2"

Make on any Bulky Machine with Ribber Intarsia Method. Bands are K1, P1 Ribbing.

FRONT:

K1, P1 Rib. Col. 1. Cast on 101 (107) sts. and knit 24 rows. Transfer Rib sts to MB and inc. 1 St on Right. Continue in St St with Col. 1 to R50 (58). Bring needles to Intarsia Position then begin the Intarsia Pattern No.1. On Right Side at Nd1. No. 30, Knit 2 rows with Col. 2 over 1 Nd1. then ON EACH SIDE, inc. 1 St in Pat. 19x, but AT THE SAME TIME, AFTER Row 76 (84), begin Pat. No. 2. Note that Pat. ends 4(7) sts. from left side. Follow the decreases as shown on Chart. After Row 108 (112) mark each side for setting in sleeves. At Row 114 (122) begin Pat. 3. and AT THE SAME TIME, after Row 142 (146) divide for neck. Knit the left half with a Ravel Cord back to "A" (Non Working Position) and continue the right side. ON NECK SIDE decrease 1 st every 2nd row 18x (20x). After Row 178 (186) Remove the remaining sts onto W.Y. Bring the sts. on left into WP and carefully remove the Ravel Cord. Turn Counter back to 154 (162). ON NECK SIDE, decrease 1 St. every 4th row 8x (10x). After Row 178 (186), remove onto W.Y.



BACK:

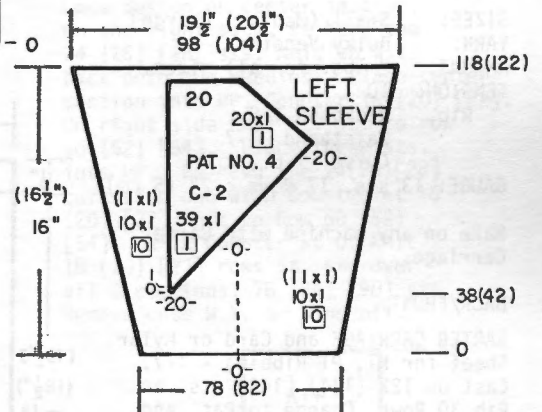
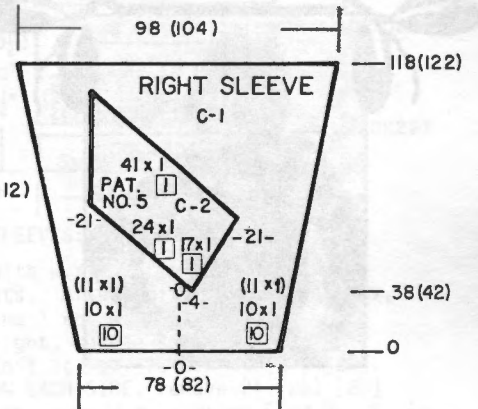
Same as front but omit Intarsia Design and Neck opening. After Row 178 (186), mark for shoulder - 38 (39) sts. ON EACH SIDE then remove onto W.Y.

LEFT SLEEVE:

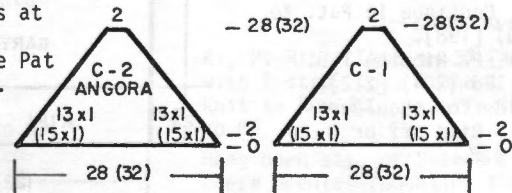
Cast on with waste yarn, 78 (82) sts. Knit several rows ending with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right side. Change to Col. 1. Counter at 0. ON EACH SIDE, inc. 1 st. every 10th row 10x (11x) AND AT THE SAME TIME, after R 38 (42) begin Intarsia Design. NOTE: Design begins at Nd1. 20 to the LEFT of 0. Follow Pat. No. 4. Complete Pat and continue to R 118 (122). Remove onto W.Y.

RIGHT SLEEVE:

FNR. Cast on 160 (164) sts. Knit 6 rows. Transfer Rib sts. to MB. Pick up sts. along LEFT PANEL FRONT EDGE (match No. 1 in circles). Knit 1 loose row then bind off.

RIGHT PANEL:

FNR. Cast on 133 (139) sts. Knit 10 rows. Transfer Rib sts. to MB. Knit 2 rows St. st. then work Short Rows. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARR. bring into HP 9 sts. Knit 1 row to left. (wrap inside Ndl.) ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARR. bring into HP 40 Ndl's. Knit 1 row to right (wrap inside Ndl.) ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARR. bring back to WP, 3 sts. 3x on LEFT and 10 sts. 4x on RIGHT. ON THE RIGHT, decrease 1 st. every 30 Rows 12x, AND AT THE SAME TIME, after Row 294 (300) ON THE LEFT, dec. 1 st. every 2nd row 46x (48x) then 1 st. every 3rd row 29x (30x) AND AT THE SAME TIME, after Row 383 (390) SHAPE ARMHOLE same as the back. After R 478 (490), remove the remaining sts. on W.Y.



RIGHT PANEL NECKBAND:

FNR. Cast on 130 (134) sts. Knit 6 rows. Transfer Rib sts. to MB. Pick up sts. from NECK EDGE OF RIGHT PANEL (match No. 4 in circles). Knit 1 loose row then bind off.

RIGHT PANEL FRONT BAND:

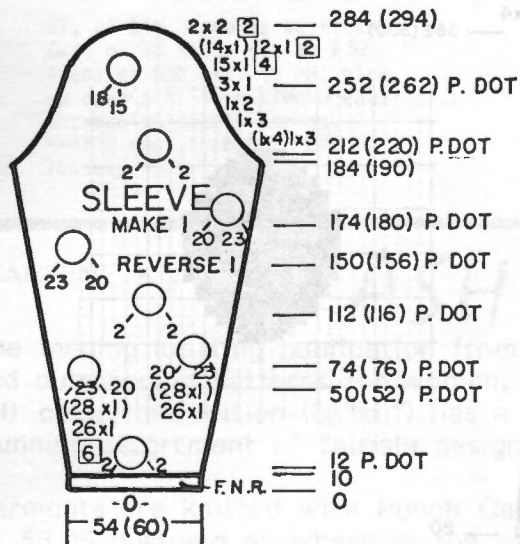
FNR. Cast on 150 (154) sts. Knit 6 rows. Transfer Rib sts. to MB. Pick up sts. along RIGHT PANEL FRONT EDGE (match No. 3 in circles). Knit 1 loose row then bind off.

NOTE: Please not on Chart that approximately 20 rows are allowed for placement of Belt. Be sure Right Panel front band is attached below this point.

BELT:

FNR. Cast on 20 sts. Knit 50 rows. Bind off and attach to RIGHT PANEL FRONT EDGE (See Chart and Picture).

FINISHING: See General Instructions Trim each sleeve with 3 buttons. Attach 2 1/4" Belt Buckle to Belt. Sew a small snap fastener to inside of right side Panel. (See Photo).

FNR. Cast on 54 (60) sts. Knit 10 rows. Transfer Rib sts. to MB. Knit 2 rows St. st. Begin Intarsia method for first Polka Dot. Follow Chart for placement of remaining Polka Dots. Also NOTE THE NUMBERS shown designate NEEDLE NUMBERS, either to the right or left of 0. AT THE SAME TIME, after Row 16, ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. every 6th row 26x (28x). After R 184 (190), SHAPE CAP: Please follow the Chart for shaping of sleeve Cap. After Row 284 (294) bind off the remaining sts.

PRACTICAL KNITTING HINTS

IMPORTANT: WE NEED TO SAVE SPACE.

Beginning with this issue of KNITKING MAGAZINE, we are changing over to the use of SYMBOLS to abbreviate some of the standard words or expressions used frequently in the instructions. This should save space and you will note there are a few other changes, all to your advantage. Please refer to CODE FOR SYMBOLS which will always be on Page 13 in every issue. We believe you will like it all.

GARTER CARRIAGE - ROWS ON CHARTS used in combination with GARTER CARRIAGE ROWS

When you are using the KG 88 or KG 89 Garter Carriage, the Charts show rows for the knitting of garment, so you begin with your Counter at 0 and it advances to the Row Number at completion of a section. The GARTER CARRIAGE, is ALWAYS SET for the number of rows needed to a specific point and the Row Counter works backwards to 0 and then stops. Do not ignore the machine Row Counter, use BOTH COUNTERS.

SHORT ROWS ON EVERY ROW - Set Controls to Hold Needles placed in Holding Pos.

Pattern 534 in this issue of KNITKING MAGAZINE, has SHORT ROWS MADE ON EVERY ROW. Our KNITTING TECHNIQUE Book, pages 45 and 47 show drawings for both INCREASE and DECREASE Short Rows ON EVERY ROW. We recommend this excellent book. Its price is normally \$23.95, its Sale Price \$19.95 with Shipping costs \$1.25. Do practice the following technique before you attempt this different garment.

DECREASE SHORT ROWS ON EVERY ROW

ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARR. bring required number of Ndl. to HP. Knit across, wrap inside Ndl. in HP. *ON SAME SIDE AS CARR. bring required Ndl. to HP. Pass the yarn OVER and UNDER the Ndl. in HP. and bring the required Ndl. OPPOSITE CARR to HP. and knit across. REPEAT FROM * ON EVERY ROW.

INCREASE SHORT ROWS ON EVERY ROW

*ON SAME SIDE AS CARR. push the required number of Ndl. in HP to WP. Pass the yarn OVER and UNDER THESE Ndl. AT THE SAME TIME, ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARR. push back the required number of Ndl. from HP to WP. Knit across. REPEAT FROM *.
