GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

THE SAMPLE SWATCH

It is imperative that you knit a sample swatch for every garment. Although you may be using the identical yarn and machine model as the pattern suggests, many variables such as dye lot difference, speed of knitting and just machine to machine differences can all cause a variance in the gauge achieved. Knit Magazine publishes the tension and gauge for each garment shown. We strongly urge you to knit a swatch representing three tensions - the recommended tension, and .1 or .2 higher and lower. These different tensions can be knitted in one piece with waste yarn separating the sections. This will eliminate unnecessary rethreading while allowing you to obtain the gauge published in the magazine.

To make a sample swatch on standard gauge machines cast on 60 stitches with waste yarn. Knit approximately 6 rows. *Mark the tension number for your swatch by making holes. For example 4 eyelet holes for Tension 4, 6 eyelet holes for Tension 6. Knit 6 more rows.

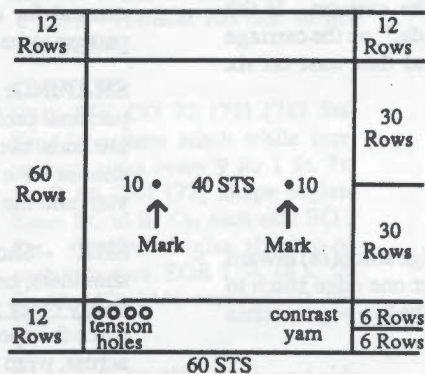
Change to garment yarn and reset row counter to 0. Knit 30 rows (in Pattern stitch). With contrast yarn, mark the 10th stitch FROM EACH SIDE by hand. Knit 30 Rows. Change to waste yarn and knit 6 rows. Change tension up or down for second section and repeat from *. Make third section with another tension. Remove on 12 Rows of waste yarn. Remove the sts. from the machine

by pushing the Carriage across without yarn.

Pull and stretch the swatch both lengthwise and diagonally from corner to corner. Gently block the swatch. Treat the swatch as you would the finished garment before measuring the gauge. For example, if you plan to wash this garment and dry it in the dryer, you should do so, measuring before and after to see the difference.

Measure between the stitches marked and the beginning and ending rows for the inches/cms. knitted. Divide the total number of stitches/rows by the inches measured to calculate sts. and rows per inch.

For Bulky knitters, make swatch with 30 Sts. and 30 Rows. If so desired, or for large pattern repeats, we suggest a wider and longer swatch to provide more accurate gauges.



BUTTONHOLES

The following methods of buttonholes are the general manner in which small and large buttonholes are created.

Small Buttonholes in Ribbing
Make small eyelet style buttonholes by following chart below.



Large Buttonholes in FNR
Vertical buttonholes are made by knitting each side separately (partial or short-row knitting). Knit the right side first, end with yarn on left. Without breaking yarn, knit left side. The strand of yarn inside the buttonhole can be picked up every other row when knitting the left side, but this is not necessary for a small buttonhole.

SHORT ROWS

Method One

With carriage on opposite side start placing appropriate number of ndls in HP. Knit across and wrap the inside needle. Again, place appropriate number of ndls in HP on opposite side from carriage, knit across and repeat wrapping. The wrapping will eliminate any holes in the knitting.

Method Two - Automatic Wrap

Example follows for shoulder short rows. This method can be used for other Short Rowing as well. For example if pattern says to Short Row at shoulder every other row 7 sts, 1 x and 6 sts. 1 x . . . With carriage on opposite side put 6 sts in HP, knit 1 row across and put one additional needle in HP. Opposite carriage place 6 ndls in HP. Knit 1 row across and bring one

HEMS

Two methods of knitting hems are described below. Variations on these instructions will allow you to knit plain hems, picot edge hems and more.

Method One

With waste yarn cast on the required number of stitches and knit about 10-12 rows ending with the carriage on the left. Knit 1 Row to the right with Ravel Cord. Change to garment yarn and knit 1 Row to the left at garment body tension. (i.e. Skirt at Tension 4, 1st row at T 4). Turn tension down approximately 2 full tension numbers lower (tighter) and knit to mid point. (i.e. Row 14 of a 28-row hem). Change tension to 1 full point lower than garment body and knit remainder of hem rows. Pick up the stitches from the first row of garment yarn - shown between the stitches of Ravel Cord. Hem is now completed. Proceed with pattern as per chart and instruc-

tions. Remove waste yarn and Ravel Cord when you have completed section.

Method Two

Bring required number of needles to "B" (working) position. Attach cast-on comb. Beginning with the 2nd needle on the LEFT, bring every other needle to "D" or "E" position. Push in both Part buttons. Knit 1 Row to the left. Release the part buttons and drop the cast-on comb. (DO NOT REMOVE cast on comb from work). Knit required number of rows for hem. Attach weights to the back of work close to the cast-on comb (about 1/4" above the comb). Beginning with the 1st needle on the LEFT, bring every other needle to "D" position. Carefully LIFT the cast-on comb and hang loops onto the needles in "D" position. Turn the comb back away from you and make sure the needles are through the loops. Pull the needles out to "E" position and remove the cast-on comb.

AT THE SAME TIME - Two functions are to be performed at the same time, such as shaping the neck and shoulder. Be sure to read both instructions before proceeding.

BO - Bind Off. To take off more than 1 St. at a time. When two or more stitches are to be bound off (or cast on) the carriage and yarn must be on the same side as the bind off. If the instruction is, "At R 100 BO 6 Sts on each side.", on the carriage side BO six stitches, knit one row and then bind off six stitches on the other side. See DECR and FF DECR.

BOLT - Slip Stitch Bind Off with a Latch Tool. Knit one row to the left at a tension at least five numbers higher (looser) than the garment tension. Bring all needles to holding position ("E") and then, pick up the first stitch on a latch tool allowing it to slip behind the latch, then pick up the next stitch and pull it through the stitch already on the latch hook, thus creating a slip stitch. If you cannot set the tension at least five full tension numbers higher, knit a row loosely manually.

CO - Cast on stitches for knitting. (CHECK INSTRUCTION MANUALS TO MAKE SURE DIFFERENT METHODS ARE SHOWN) In our instructions, CO is used either for a finished edge at the beginning of the garment, or to add edge stitch(es). If two or more stitches are to be cast on the carriage and yarn must be on the same side as the cast on. If the instruction is, "At R 100 CO 6 Sts on each side.", on the carriage side cast on six stitches, knit one row and then cast on six stitches on the other side.

COR - Carriage on Right

COL - Carriage on Left

DEC - Use the transfer tool to move the edge stitch(es) inward to the next needle. Usually used to transfer one edge stitch to the next needle, but may be used to transfer the two edge stitches to the next two needles.

EON - Every other needle

EOR - Every other row

EOS - Every other stitch

FF DECR - Used to make an even edge for seaming and decorative seams for raglans. If one stitch is to be decreased, use a two-prong transfer tool to move the two edge stitches inward one needle. If two stitches are to be decreased, use a three-prong transfer tool to move the three edge stitches in two needles. If three stitches are to be decreased, use two two-prong transfer tools and move the edge stitches in four needles. See DECR, BO and SHAPING.

FF INCR - To increase one stitch move the two edge stitches outward one needle, then fill the empty needle by picking up a bar from the row below and hanging it on the empty needle.

FNR - Full Needle Rib

G.C. - Garter Carriage

HP - Holding position or "E" position.

INCR - Increase. Usually used for "full-fashion" shaping, see FF Incr., or in conjunction with short row shaping. A simple incr can be made by pulling additional needle on side of carriage out to "E" position and knit across.

MB - Main Bed

MC - Main Color

Ndls - Needles

NWP - Non-working position or position "A"

R(s) - Row(s)

RB - Ribber Bed

RC - Row Counter.

RC 0 - Set RC to zero.

SET PATTERN - Follow the step-by-step instructions in your manual for setting the pattern and carriage controls for the pattern to be knit, e.g., Fairisle, tuck, single motif, etc.

SHAPING: The method used for shaping is a matter of personal preference. In our definitions we have described the methods commonly in use at Knitking. Which method is chosen for a particular pattern depends upon the garment, the yarn and the personal preference of the designer.

SHR - Short Row or Partial Knitting. Used for shaping shoulders, necklines, darts, gores, etc. Set carriage on H(old). **Every other row SHRs:** On the opposite side of the carriage, place the specified number of stitches in holding position, knit across, wrap the inner needle or use an "automatic wrap". After all specified stitches have been placed in HP change the carriage setting to N (knit) to return the needles to WP. **Every row SHRs:** On the side being shaped, place one stitch in HP every row. It is recommended you refer to your manual or an instruction book for detailed instructions about how to short row.

St(s) - Stitch(es)

St. St. - Stockinette stitch.

T - Tension.

WP - Working Position or "B" position.

WY - Waste yarn.

YM - Yarn marker. To place a yarn marker, use a short piece of contrasting yarn and loop it over the needle specified or the end needle of the row specified.

SEAMING GARMENTS

Any number of popular methods are suggested. We encourage you to experiment with any and all. If a garment in Knitking Magazine requires special seaming information it will be provided in the individual pattern instruction. Otherwise, methods include: linking on the knitting machine, Knitking's Lectrolink, the electric linker, crochet slip stitch, tapestry needles with back stitch sewing by hand. Bar to bar weaving for seamless appearance and seaming on a sewing machine.

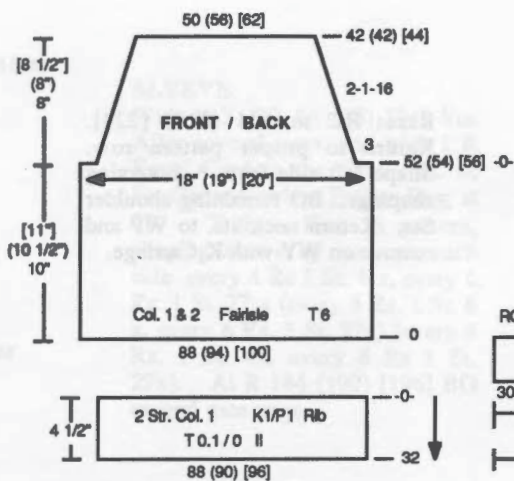

PATTERN STITCH: Pattern is knitted in fairisle. For pull-up stitch, *knit 4 Rs. Pull up Rubane yarn as shown on drawing and hang on proper needle. Hang paillette on same ndl. Carefully knit 2 rows making sure paillette is under sinker plate. Repeat from *.

BACK/FRONT: Knit 2 the same.

With WY CO for 88 (94) [100] Sts. After several rows change to Col. 1 and Col. 2. RC 0. T 6. Knit in pattern stitch (see above) to R 52 (54) [56]. Reset RC to 0. Shape raglan. On each side BO 3 Sts. Continue shaping decr. EOR 1 St. 16x for all sizes. At R 42 (42) [44] remove sts. on WY.



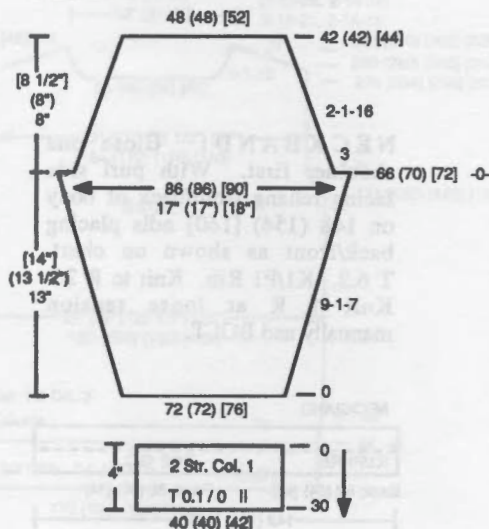
WAISTBANDS: Make 2.

With purl side facing rehang lower edge of back/front on 88 (90) [96] ndls. decr. evenly across. With Col. 1 (2 strands) knit 1 row across. Transfer EOS to RB for K1/P1 Rib. T 0.1/0 II. Knit to R 32, knitting last row at T 10/5. Transfer RB Sts. to MB and BOLT.

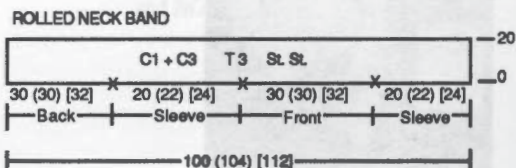
SLEEVE:

With WY CO 72 (72) [76] Sts. Knit in pattern stitch while incr. on both sides every 9 Rs 1 St. 7x. At R 66 (70) [72] shape raglan. Reset RC to 0. On each side BO 3 Sts. Continue raglan shaping on each side decr. EOR 1 St. 16 x. At R 42 (42) [44] remove sts. on WY.

SLEEVE CUFF: With purl side facing rehang lower edge on 40 (40) [42] ndls. decr. evenly across. With Col. 1 (2 strands), knit 1 row. Transfer EOS to RB for K1/P1 Rib. T 0.1/0 II. RC 0. Knit to R 30, knitting last row at T 10/5. Transfer RB Sts. to MB and BOLT.



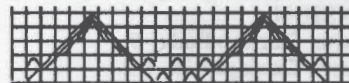
NECKBAND: Close 3 raglan seams. With knit side facing, rehang neckline on 100 (104) [112] ndls. as shown on chart. RC 0. St. St. T 3. With Col. 1 and Col. 3 knit 20 Rs. Lightly steam to allow knit-in elastic to set. Collar rolls to the purl side. Stitch to base of neckline.



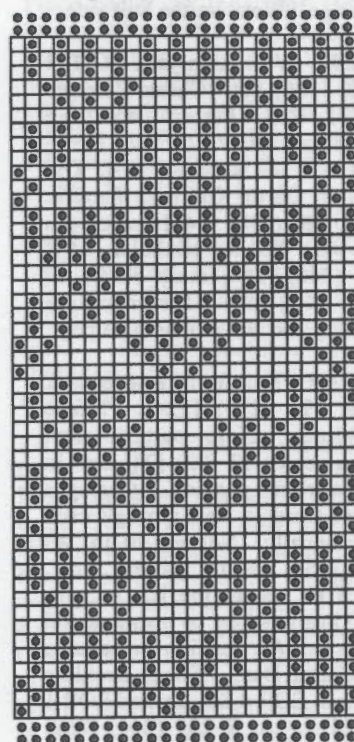

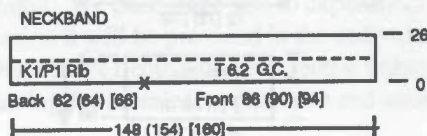
BACK: With main yarn CO 154 (160) [166] Sts. Garter Carriage K1/P1 Rib (Pattern #532 in Compuknit III/IV). T 5.2. RC 0. Knit to R 36. Reset RC to 0. T 9. Knit in Garter Carriage Pattern. At R 120 (130) [140] mark each side with YM for armhole. At R 230 (246) [260] mark center 60 (60) [62] Sts. for neckline opening and BO around gate pegs.

FRONT: Knit front same as back to R 194 (210) [224]. Shape neckline. Note pattern row. Place center 22 (22) [24] Sts. in non-working position by using a Ravel Cord to knit through each St. manually. Ndl will be in "A" position. Note pattern row. Place all sts. to the left in non-working position by using Ravel Cord to "A" position or remove on Garter Bar. *Shape neckline by decr. EOR 4 Sts. 2 x and EOR 1 St. 11 x. At R 230 (246) [260] BO remaining shoulder Sts. Return the Sts. to the left of center 22 (22) [24] Sts. to WP.

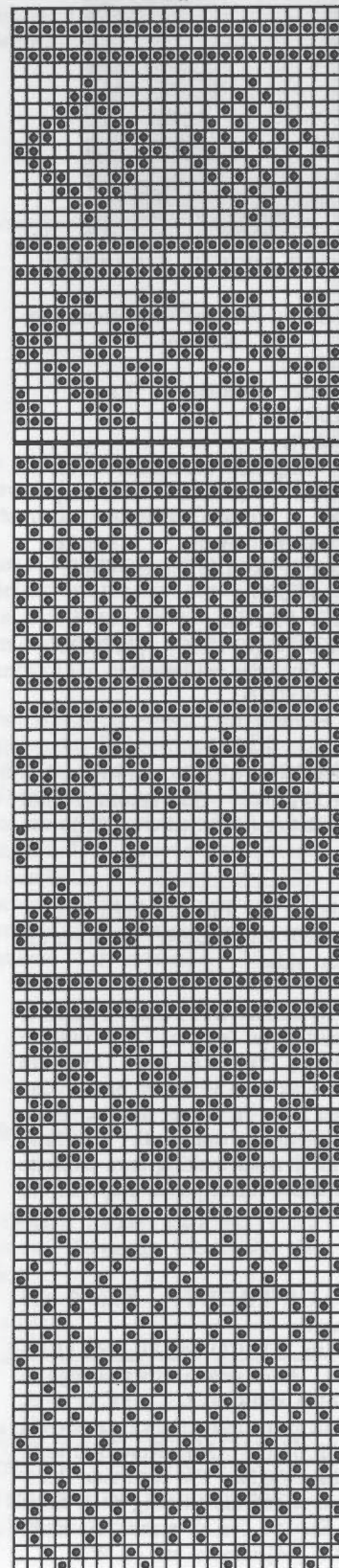
Reset RC to 194 (210) [224]. Return to proper pattern row. Shape left side from *, reversing shapings. BO remaining shoulder Sts. Return neck sts. to WP and remove on WY with K-Carriage.

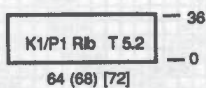
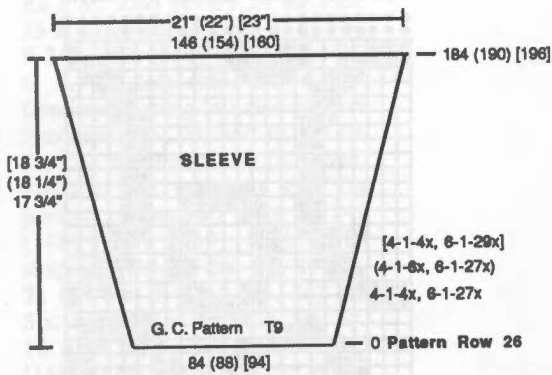


NECKBAND: Close one shoulder first. With purf side facing rehang front/back of body on 148 (154) [160] ndls placing back/front as shown on chart. T 6.2. K1/P1 Rib. Knit to R 26. Knit 1 R at loose tension manually and BOLT.



Mens Garter Carriage 24 Sts. x 114 Rs





SLEEVE:

With WY CO 84 (88) [94] Sts. After several rows, end with 1 R Ravel Cord to the right. RC 0. Set Garter Carriage Pattern Row at 26. T 9. Knit in pattern, shaping sleeve by incr. on each side every 4 Rs 1 St. 4 x, every 6 Rs 1 St. 27 x (every 4 Rs 1 St. 6 x, every 6 Rs 1 St. 27x) [every 4 Rs 1 St. 4x, every 6 Rs 1 St. 29x]. At R 184 (190) [196] BO around gate pegs.

CUFF: Garter Carriage K1/P1 Rib. T 5.2. RC 0. CO 64 (68) [72] Sts. Knit to R 36. With purl side facing, rehang lower edge of sleeve on these ndls, decreasing evenly across. Knit 1 R manually at loose tension from right to left and BOLT.

FINISHING: Close all seams. Fold collar inside and stitch in place.

Make on Standard 24-St. Punch Card or Electronic knitter with Ribber.

BACK: With Col. 1 CO for K1/P1 Rib 172 (180) [184] [188] Sts. After selvedge RC 0. T 0.1/0.1 I. Knit 44 Rs. Transfer RB Sts. to MB. Reset RC 0. T 5. Knit in fairisle pattern while incr. on both sides every 6 Rs 1 St. 4x.

At R 174 (180) [180] [186] shape armhole. Decr. EOR 1 St. 8 x for all sizes. At R 274 (284) [290] [308] begin neckline shaping. Place center 56 (64) [64] [64] Sts. in HP and all Sts. to the left. Note pattern row. *Shape neckline by decr. every row 1 St. 10x for all sizes. AT THE SAME TIME at R 280 (290) [296] [314] SHR shoulder EOR 15 Sts. 2x and 14 Sts. 1 x (15 Sts. 2x, 14 Sts. 1 x) [15 Sts. 2 x, 16 Sts. 1 x] [16 Sts. 3 x]. At R 286 (296) [302] [320] remove shoulder sts. to WY. Reset RC to 274 (284) [290] [308]. Return to proper pattern row. Shape neckline and shoulders from *, reversing shapings.

NECKBAND: Close one shoulder. With purl side facing rehang front/back on 160 (170) [170] [170] ndls. as shown on chart. With Col. 1 knit 10 R St. St. at T 5. Pick up first row to form doubled band. Knit 1 R across at T 10 and BOLT.



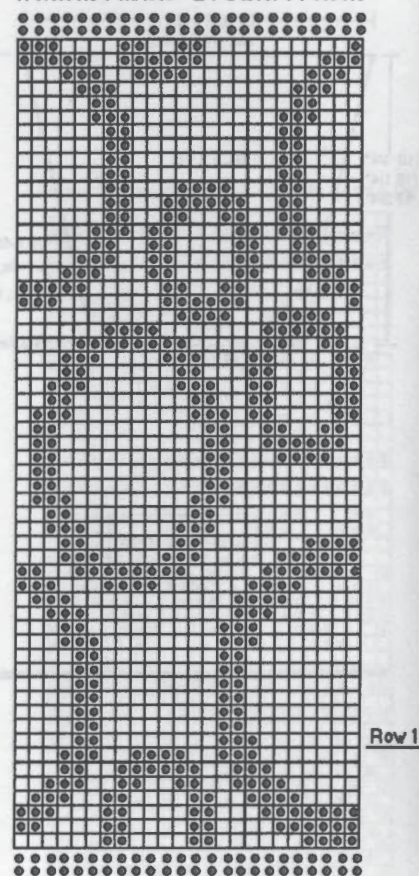
SLEEVE:

With Col. 1 CO 92 (100) [104] [108] Sts. for K1/P1 Rib. RC 0. T 0.1/0.1 I. Knit 44 Rs. Transfer RB Sts. to MB. Reset RC to 0. T 5. Knit is fairisle while incr. on each side every 5 Rs 1 St. 30 x. At R 150 (156) [156] [162] begin sleeve cap shaping. SHR cap on each side EOR 2 St. 15 x for all sizes. At R 180 (186) [186] [192] knit 1 R at T 10 over all Sts. and BOLT.



FINISHING: Close all seams.

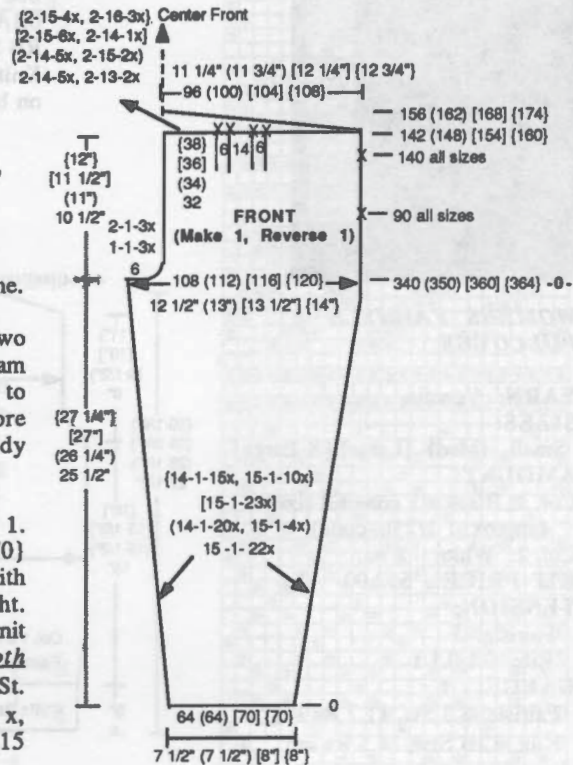

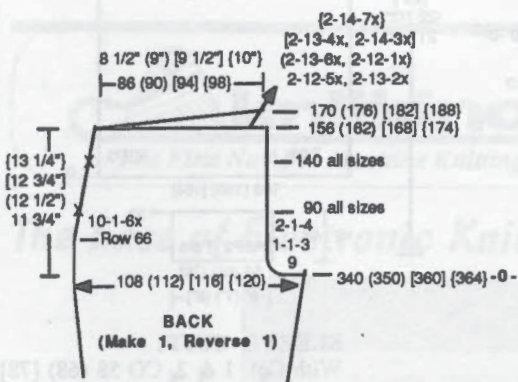

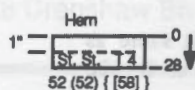
Rs 1 St. 23x [every 14 Rs 1 St. 15 x, every 15 Rs 1 St. 10 x]. At R 340 (350) [360] [364] reset RC to 0. On left side, BO 6 Sts. Continue shaping left side by decr every row 1 St. 3x, and EOR 1 St. 3x. At R 90 and 140 (all sizes) place a YM on right side for pocket placement. At R 142 (148) [154] [160] begin SHR shaping EOR 14 Sts. 5x, 13 Sts. 2x (14 Sts. 5 x, 15 Sts. 2x) [15 Sts. 6x, 14 Sts. 1x] [15 Sts. 4x, 16 Sts. 3x]. Knit to R 134 (140) [146], knitting last row manually at loose tension and BOLT.

CORD FOR TREE OUTLINE: With Col. 2 CO 4 Sts. T 7. RC 0. Depress one part button. Knit in St. St. to R 360. Remove on W.Y.

FINISHING: Close all seams. Stitch tree cord around short rows to form outline of Christmas tree. If desired, "trim" tree with mini ornaments. Make fringed top of tree with small strings of Col. 4, tied in the middle. Attach fringe trim to sweater.



Knitting News - Short Rows (Partial Knitting) - PART 1

In this issue there are several patterns that utilize the short row technique for either shoulder shaping or knitting patterns with colors changes. Several methods of short rowing (partial knitting) are described below. This partial knitting technique is described in the manuals that accompany the knitting machine when purchased. The following are two basic methods of Short Rows - Manual and Self Wrap. Both can be used for a variety of shapings from shoulder short rows, neckline, bust darts, pattern changes for color insets, skirt shaping . . . using any number of stitches . . . anyplace . . . on anything . . . for it barely shows in your knitting, and leaves no holes.

SHORT ROW - MANUAL WRAP: Work knitting as described in garment instructions. Note Short Row (SHR) instructions on chart or written text. (Example: SHR shoulders EOR 6 Sts. 3 x) Work SHORT ROWS for above instructions in this way: On OPPOSITE SIDE OF CARRIAGE (Cam Box or Slide), bring 6 ndls. to holding position., (be sure to set your machine for holding needles) knit across then bring the yarn under the INSIDE ndl. in holding position so that the yarn will go OVER the shank of the holding needle when you knit the next row. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of carriage, bring 6 ndls. to holding position, knit across then bring the yarn UNDER THE INSIDE NDL. as you did before. Continue to bring 6 ndls. OPPOSITE CARRIAGE to holding position, knit across, wrap yarn... until you have completed the appropriate number of times indicated in the instructions. Carriage should be on the right side. Now push ALL the ndls. OPPOSITE CARRIAGE (on the left) back to working position so they will knit the next row and knit across to the left side. Release the holding Cam, and knit to the right side (the holding ndls on the right will automatically knit if you release the holding cam lever). Short rows are completed at this time and all ndls holding doubled stitches from wrapping have been knitted to a single stitch.

SHORT ROW - SELF WRAP

At first this method may seem complicated but if you follow the directions and make a few samples, you will find it quicker and easier than the manual wrap method and will have almost the same results as though you had wrapped the needles.

If directions state - SHR EOR 6 sts. 3x, work as follows: Bring 5 sts. OPPOSITE CARRIAGE to holding position. Knit 1 row then bring 1 more ndl. to holding position (this is the 6th st.). Knit back. Bring 5 sts. opposite carriage to holding position, knit across then bring up 1 more ndl. to holding and knit back. Bring 5 ndls. opposite carriage to holding position, knit across then bring 1 more ndl. to holding and knit back. Repeat for the number of times indicated in pattern. This technique will automatically "wrap" the stitch unlike the method above where you manually wrap the needle.

Next issue we'll have more about different uses of short rows.

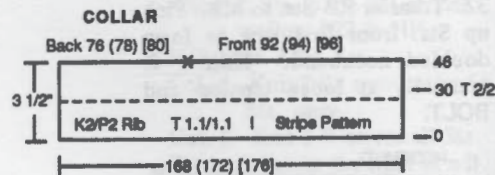

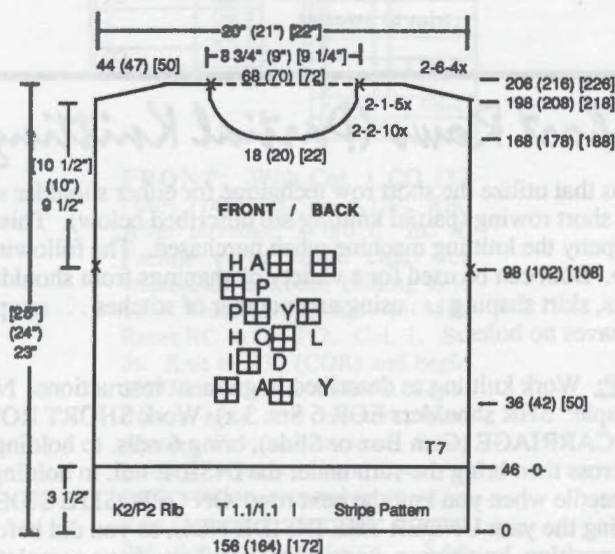

Continue in stripes to R 46. Transfer RB Sts. to MB. With purl side of garment facing rehang on neckline Sts. with front/back placement shown on chart. Knit 1 R manually at loose tension and BOLT.

SLEEVE: With Col. 1, CO 72 (78) [84] Sts. for K2/P2 Rib. After selvedge T 1.1/1.1 I. RC 0. Knit in rib following color stripe chart from bands and collar. At R 46 transfer RB Sts. to MB. Reset RC to 0. T 7. Col. 1. Incr. 2 Sts. on each side. Knit in St. St. while incr. shaping on both sides every 4 Rs. 1 St. 35 (21) [12] x and every 5 Rs 1 St. 2 (16) [25] x. With purl side facing, place neckband in proper position, starting at back center where neckband pieces are seamed, working around V and overlapping at the base of the V. Close all remaining seams.

knitting technical tips

With Compuknit IV's (KH 940) now as prevalent as its predecessor, the Compuknit III (KH 930), we would like to clear up some confusion that may exist regarding whether or not disks formatted in one will work in the other.

Disks can be formatted directly from the knitter in either the Compuknit III or Compuknit IV mode, depending on which machine you have. They can also, of course, be formatted from the KC III or KC III XT Pattern Design Computer. The KC III XT has on its Main Menu an option called "Change Mode" (it's the 7th item), which allows you to select which mode you wish to design in, either the Compuknit III or IV. Be aware, however, that when you change the mode, all previous memory is cleared, along with it any patterns you have stored.

As you probably know, the Compuknit IV is merely a Compuknit III with an increased memory (254,600 stitches compared to 13,600). And, like all computerized equipment, newer models (Compuknit IV) can run older "software," but older models (Compuknit III) cannot run newer versions. Hence, if you have designed a pattern on either the Compuknit III or on the KC III or KC III XT in the Compuknit III mode, it can be transferred into either the Compuknit III or Compuknit IV knitter for easy reproduction. Note, though, that when transferring it into either knitter, you will be prompted to enter the "track" that the particular pattern you want is on. This is where it may get a little bit confusing:

Because of the limited memory on the Compuknit III (13,600 stitches), in order to store a reasonable number of patterns, a disk formatted in this mode will offer 40 storage tracks, each capable of storing 13,600 stitches. A track is like a song on an LP record; with 40 tracks at 13,600 stitches per, each disk can store over 500,000 stitches. The Compuknit IV, on the other hand, can store 254,600 stitches in its memory. When formatted in the Compuknit IV mode, a disk, which we've already determined can hold a little more than 500,000 stitches, could store up to 2 tracks at 254,600 per. Still with us?

Now, let's get back to transferring patterns into the knitter. As indicated above, patterns designed in the Compuknit III mode can be transferred into a Compuknit III or a Compuknit IV (but not vice-versa). When you do that, you will be prompted to enter the track number you want (from 1 to 40). In this instance, both knitters will work the same. However, if you have designed a pattern in the Compuknit IV mode, it can only be transferred into the Compuknit IV for knitting (the Compuknit III will not accept it). Again, you will be prompted to enter a track number. Recall that only two tracks comprise a disk formatted in the Compuknit IV mode; so, you can only enter track #1 or #2. We have gotten many calls from knitters who have tried to save Compuknit IV-designed patterns onto a track other than 1 or 2, not realizing that there is no need to—there is plenty of memory available in these two, the only available tracks.

It all sounds confusing . . . but it's not once you start working with your knitting machine and disk drive (and Pattern Design Computer). ENJOY!
