

General Instructions

THE PRINTED INSTRUCTIONS

Follow the printed instructions or use them in combination with the Charts. When there is any question in the instructions, you have the Charts to show you how the section will look.

Be sure to READ AHEAD so that you KNOW what to do for the size you are knitting. In the shapings, where the number of stitches are the same but the number of times different, you might find shapings like this...3 sts. 1 (2) [3]x - so that for the first size you will bind off 3 sts. 1x, 2nd size 3 sts. 2x, 3rd size 3 sts. 3x. Sometimes the ROWS will be different for each size-so you must watch out for different row numbers.

Shoulder and neck shapings for the back section of a garment usually are shaped at the same time-so ALWAYS WATCH for the words, AT THE SAME TIME.

HOLDING STITCHES ON THE LEFT SIDE WHILE SHAPING THE RIGHT SIDE

There are different ways to hold stitches on one side while completing the other side. Usually, we tell you to bind off the center sts. for neck and put the left side into holding position while completing the right side. The easiest way, and really the best for beginners, is to take a piece of RAVEL CORD and hand knit the center neck stitches, pulling them back against the needle bed of machine to the "A" or out of work position. The stitches remain in the HOOKS of the needles so you are really only knitting them HALF WAY. With another color of Ravel Cord, knit the remaining sts. on the left side in the SAME WAY.

It is important to protect these held stitches in some way-so you can either hang a REVERSING BAR so that the EYES of the bar go BETWEEN the Gate Pegs on the machine and that the UPPER TIPS of bar only show above the needle bed, OR the simplest way is to use a piece of 1" masking tape and GENTLY place it beneath the knitting-right below the Gate Pegs. DO NOT press the tape, only enough pressure to hold it in place. This will prevent the Carriage (or Slide) from marking the held section.

It is VERY IMPORTANT that you mark the PATTERN ROW where you divide for the split for NECK (or SHOULDER) shaping. If you are using a PUNCH CARD, mark the card-if you are using an ELECTRONIC machine, mark the design window. Also take note of the Row number for the division. When you are ready to work the left section, bring the HELD stitches back to "B" (working) position by pulling each end of the Ravel Cord GENTLY and ripping it off. Be sure to align all needles straight in the "B" or knitting position.

Now you are ready to REFER TO YOUR OWN INSTRUCTION MANUAL for your machine to set the controls to begin knitting the left half. The neck stitches can be bound off after completing the right side, or you can leave them in hold until each side is finished. Bind off or remove them onto contrast waste yarn ready to be picked up for knitting a neckband or for other finishing.

FULL FASHION DECREASING OR INCREASING

For stockinette stitch, use the Full Fashion method for decreasing or increasing (except for regular cap shaping on sleeves where you decrease the edge stitch).

TO DECREASE: Hang the 3rd stitch onto the 2nd stitch, then move the end stitches in to fill the empty needle.

TO INCREASE: Move the 2nd end stitches 1 needle outward, then pick up the 3rd stitch from the row below and hang it onto empty needle.

PATTERN SYMBOLS

- () Symbol for 2nd size.
- [] Symbol for 3rd size.

There are up to 3 sizes given for Patterns in KNITTING MAGAZINE. For example, the Charts and printed instructions will show the cast on as - 124, first size, [132], second size, [140] third size.

- Needles in holding position.
- Needles back into working position
- Needle not used-in out of work position

Shaping symbols are given in the following order: Rows-Sts-Times. For example: 4-1-3x means: Every 4 rows decrease/increase 1 stitch 3 times. The shaping begins at the given row number.

THE SAMPLE SWATCH

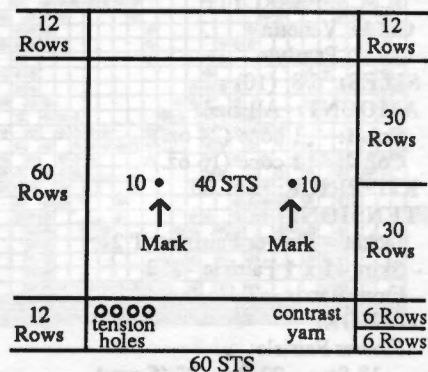
Before you knit any garment, you must knit a sample swatch using the yarn you have chosen for your garment. If you do not get the correct Stitch and Row Gauge as given for a Pattern in KNITTING MAGAZINE, try different tensions. If you are using the specified yarn, you should be able to get the correct gauge using a smaller or larger tension. If you are using a different yarn, you may have to make several swatches, but the gauge is very important.

To make a sample swatch, Cast on 60 stitches with waste yarn and knit 6 rows. Mark the tension number for your sample swatch by making holes (you can do this with a Lace Carriage or by hand), 4 transfers for Tension 4, 6 transfers for Tension 6, etc. Knit 6 more rows.

Change to garment yarn and set Counter at 0. Knit 30 rows (in Stockinette stitch or Pattern stitch, according to the garment). With Contrast waste yarn, knit the 10th stitch FROM EACH SIDE by hand. Knit 30 rows. Change to waste yarn and knit 12 rows. Remove the sts. from the machine by pushing the Carriage (or Slide) across without yarn.

Pull and stretch the sample swatch both lengthwise and diagonally from corner to corner, then lengthwise again. Gently block the swatch (KNITTING PRESSING CLOTHS are great for this), or you can allow the sample to rest several hours or even over night so that the stitches can return to their basic form.

THE KNITTING STITCH/ROW GAUGE and STITCH/ROW CALCULATOR can be used to find the NUMBER OF STITCHES or ROWS TO 1". After knitting a sample swatch place the STITCH/ROW GAUGE horizontally with the START LINE on the INSIDE of LEFT stitch mark on sample. Keep it straight then read the number on the Gauge directly below the inside RIGHT mark on Gauge. This will give you the STITCH GAUGE TO 1". For instance, if the number is 8, then you have 8 stitches to 1". To find the ROWS TO 1", measure from the first row of garment yarn, VERTICALLY to the last row. Read the NUMBER from the LOWER EDGE of



GAUGE, same as you did for stitches and if the number should be 14, you have 14 rows to 1".

THE STITCH/ROW CALCULATOR will now give you the number of sts. or rows needed for a specific measurement. Line the ARROW to the number 8 (8 sts. to 1"). Should you need 20 inches of stitches, find the number 20 below and right above the 20 the Calculator shows 160 sts. It works the same way for rows using the Row Gauge.

FINISHING

Gently block all sections-For PULLOVERS, JACKETS, and DRESSES: Join the front to back at shoulders and sides. Sew sleeves together and set in. Hem lower edge and sleeve edges if needed. For a double neckband or armhole band, sew 1 edge to inside and 1 to the outside of neck or armhole. For a single ribbed band, sew 1 edge to the outside of neck or armhole edge. For a cardigan or jacket with buttonholes, finish buttonholes and sew on buttons.

PANTS: Join front to back at sides. Sew inside leg seams, then join to center front and back. Make hem at waistline and inset elastic. Hem lower edge of pant legs.

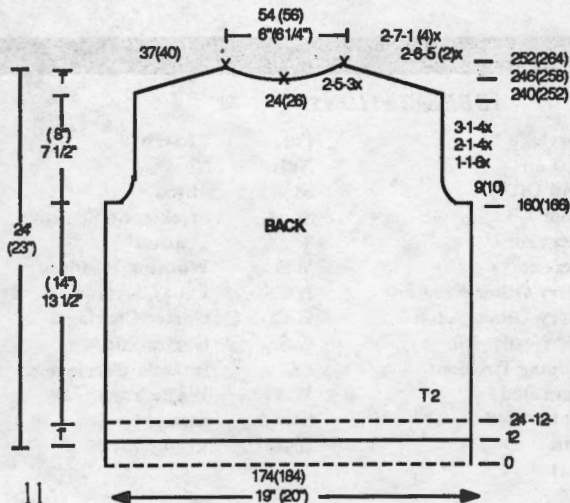

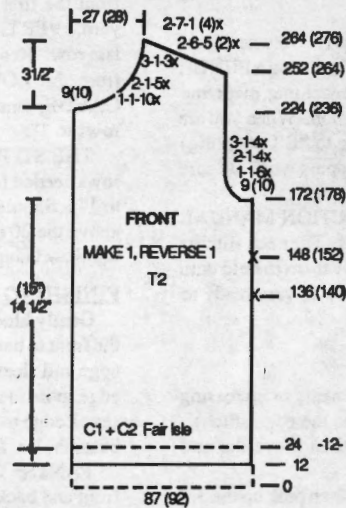

Note: For Fairisle patterns Venetia, Col. 1, is in the B feeder and Pearlyte, Col. 2, is in the A feeder.



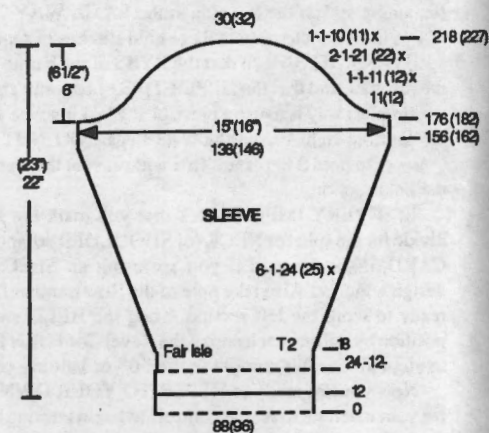
JACKET BACK: With WY cast on 174 (184) Sts, after several Rs end with 1 R Ravel Cord to the right. Col. 1. RC 0. T 4. St. st. Knit 1 R. Change to T 0.2. Knit 9 Rs. Set machine for 1 x 1 Fairisle pattern. T 1.1. Knit 14 Rs. Pick up Sts from first row and form hem. Change to Flower Fairisle pattern. Change RC to 12. T 4. Knit 1 R to the left to set pattern. Change to T 2. Knit in pattern. BO 9 (10) Sts for armhole at R 160 (166), and then Decr on each side every R 1 St 6x, EOR 1 St 4x and every 3 Rs 1 St 4x. **SHAPE NECK AND SHOULDERS AT THE SAME TIME.** Begin shoulder shaping at R 240 (252). On each side BO (or short row) EOR 6 Sts 5x (2x) and 7 Sts 1x (4x). Begin neck shaping at R 246 (258); place a yarn marker on the center St and then BO the center 24 (26) Sts. Place the Sts on the left in HP. Mark pattern row. Decrease for neckline EOR 5 Sts 3x. Return the Sts on the left side to WP, turn the Row Counter back to 246 (258) and pattern to row row marked. Reverse the shapings to complete the left side. RC 252 (264)



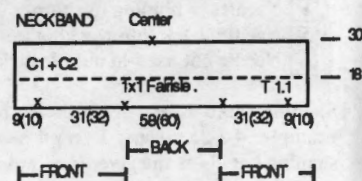
JACKET FRONT: Make 1, Reverse 1. (Fronts are 1" longer than back for bust ease.) Right side: With WY cast on 87 (92) Sts, after several Rs end with 1 R Ravel Cord to the right. Col. 1. RC 0. T 4. St. st. Knit 1 R. Change to T 0.2. Knit 9 Rs. Set machine for 1 x 1 Fairisle pattern. T 1.1. Knit 14 Rs. Pick up Sts from first row and form hem. Change to Flower Fairisle pattern. Change RC to 12. T 4. Knit 1 R to the left to set pattern. Change to T 2. Knit in pattern. Place a yarn marker on the right side at Rs 136 (140) to mark the area for bust ease. At R 172 (178), BO 9 (10)

Sts on right side for armhole and then Decr every R 1 St 6x; EOR 1 St 4x, and every 3 Rs 1 St 4x. **SHAPE NECK AND SHOULDERS AT THE SAME TIME.** Begin neckline shaping on the left at R 224 (236); BO 9 (10) Sts 1x and place a yarn marker on the 9th (10th) St, then BO every R 1 St 10x, EOR 1 St 5x, every 3 Rs 1 St 3x. Begin shoulder shaping at R 252 (276); BO (or short row) EOR 6 Sts 5x (2x) and 7 Sts 1x (4x). RC 264 (276).

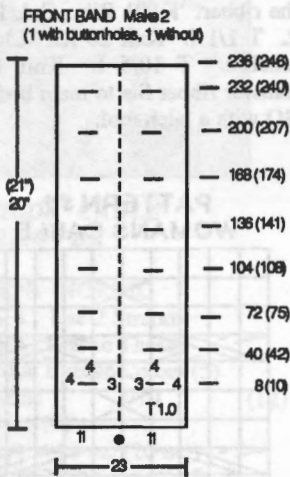
SLEEVES: WY cast on 88 (96) Sts. The cast on, hem and pattern instructions are the same as the Back and Front. Begin increases on each side at R 18; inc every 6 Rs 1 St 24x (25x). Begin BO for armhole at R 176 (182); BO 11 (12) Sts 1x, and then every R 1 St 11x (12x), EOR 1 St 21x (22x), every R 1 St 10x (11x), and then BO the remaining 30 (32) Sts.



NECK BAND: Close shoulder seams. Re-hang neck Sts, purl side facing, on 138 (144) Ndl. Hang the first 9 (10) Sts marked with a yarn marker on 9 (10) Ndl, hang the remaining front neck Sts on 31 (32) Ndl. Hang the back neck Sts on 58 (60) Ndl, placing the yarn marker in the center. Hang opposite front on remaining Ndl, placing yarn marker 9 (10) Ndl from the end. Set machine for 1 x 1 Fairisle pattern. RC 0. T 1.1. Colors 1 & 2. Knit 18 Rs. Change to St. st. T 2. Col 2. Knit to R30. Chg to T 10, knit 1 R to left and BO with latch tool.

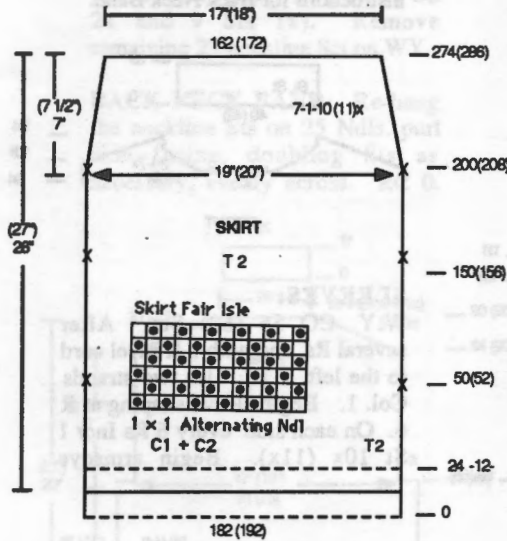


FRONT BANDS: Make two, one with buttonholes. With WY cast on 23 Sts., after several Rs Change to Colors 1 & 2. Set machine for 1 x 1 Fairisle pattern. RC 0. T 1.0. Continue knitting in pattern to R 236 (246). See **KNITTING NEWS** for buttonhole instructions. See chart for buttonhole placement.

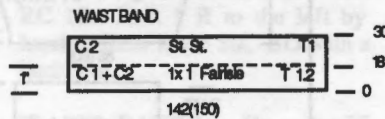


SKIRT FRONT/BACK: With WY cast on 182 (192) Sts, after several Rs end with 1 R Ravel Cord to the right. Col. 1. RC 0. T 4. St. st. Knit 1 R. Change to T 0.2. Knit 9 Rs. Set machine for 1 x 1 Fairisle pattern. T 1.1. Knit 14 Rs. Pick up Sts from first row and form hem. Change RC to 12. T 4. Knit 1 R to the left. Change to T 2. Continue in 1 x 1 Fairisle. Place yarn marker every 50 Rs. Decr on each side every 7 Rs 1 St

10x (11x) beginning at R 200 (208). Remove the remaining 162 (172) Sts on WY at R 274 (286).

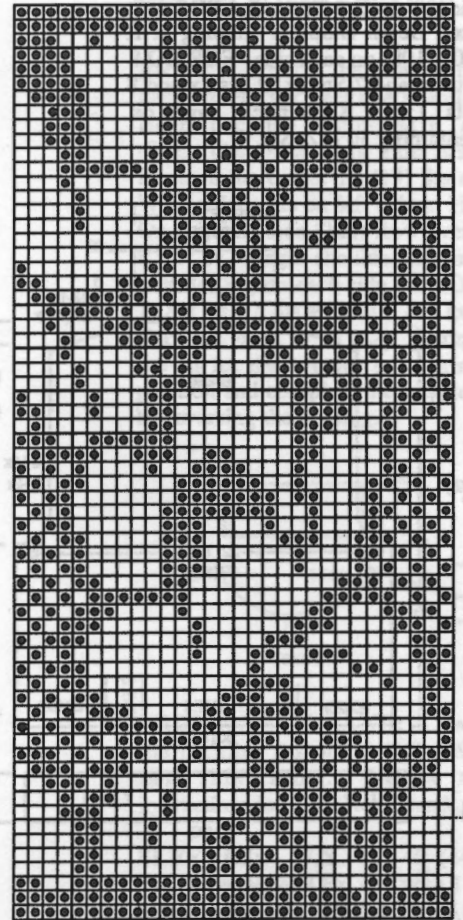


WAIST BANDS: Make two. Hang the 162 (172) Sts of the skirt on 142 (150) Ndl. Purl side facing. Double stitches, as necessary, evenly across the band. Set machine for 1 x 1 Fairisle pattern. RC 0. T 1.2. Colors 1 & 2. Knit 18 Rs. Change to St. st. T 1. Col 2. Knit to R30. Pick up Sts from first R to form hem.



FINISHING: Sew two front bands to jacket fronts, placing the band with buttonholes on right side. When seaming match yarn markers. See General Instructions.

CO 56 Sts (count Ndl in out of work position) with two strands of Nordic and knit 34 Rs in pattern, as shown in the pattern diagram for the Front/Back. There will be only 3 Sts on each side next

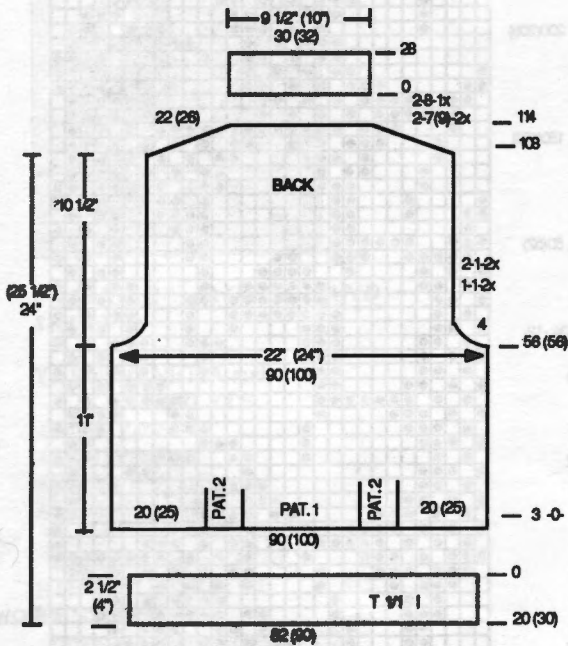
to the out of work Ndl. Measure the swatch from OW Ndl to the other. (Do not count the 3 Sts on each side - count 50 sts) and divide the measurement by 50 to obtain St. gauge for 1 inch. Measure from top edge to bottom and divide the measurement by 34 to obtain the R gauge for 1 inch.

See *Knitting News* this issue for "how to" bind off when a ndl is in non-working position.

BACK: W.Y. CO 90 (100) Sts. After several Rs, end with 1 R ravel cord to the left. T 10. Use two strands Col. 1. Knit 1 R left to right, transfer Sts for out of work Ndl to adjacent Ndl. Knit 2 Rs. RC 0. Begin cable pattern (see chart). Begin armhole shaping at R 56 (56); BO 4 Sts 1x, then on each

side every R 1 St 2x and EOR 1 St 2x. Begin shoulder shaping at R 108 (108) on each side. EOR BO 8 Sts 1x and 7 Sts 2x (9 Sts 2x and 8 Sts 1x). Knit neck band on remaining 30 (32) Sts.

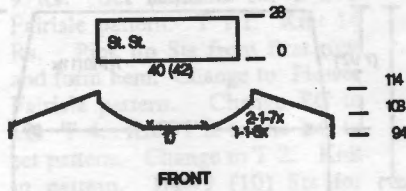


BACK NECK BAND: RC 0. Change to T 9, knit 4 Rs. Change to T 8.2, knit 3 Rs. Change to T 8.1, knit 3 Rs. Change to T 8, knit 4 Rs. Add C2. Change to T 7.2, knit 4 Rs. Change to T 7.1, knit 4 Rs. Change to T 7, knit 6 Rs. RC 28. Knit 1 R to the left by hand to form loose Sts. BO with a latch tool.

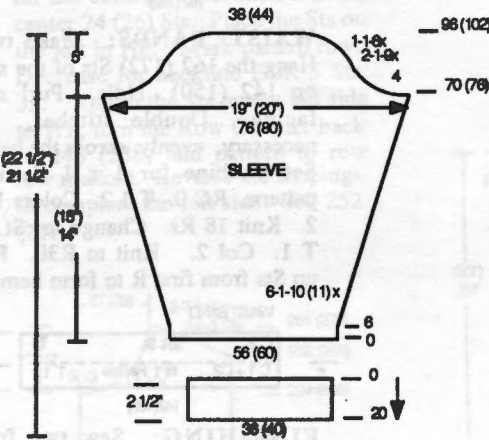
WAIST BANDS: Hang the 90 (100) waist Sts on 82 (90) Ndl, purl side facing, doubling Sts as necessary, evenly. Knit 1 R. Transfer EOS to the ribber. K1 P1 Rib. T 1/1 I. RC 0. Knit 20 (30) Rs. Change tension to 10/5 I. Knit 1 R, transfer ribber Sts to main bed. BO with a latch tool.

FRONT: Front is the same as the back except for neckline shaping. Begin neckline shaping at R 94 (94). Complete right side first. WY center 10 Sts and place Sts on left side in HP. On neckline side BO every R 1 St 5x and EOR 1 St 7x. Begin shoulder shaping at R 108 (108) on each side. EOR BO 8 Sts 1x and 7 Sts 2x (9 Sts 2x and 8 Sts 1x). Turn RC back to 94. Return the Sts for the left side to working position and complete the left side.

FRONT NECK BAND: Re-hang the neckline Sts on 40 (42) Ndl, purl side facing. Follow the instructions for Back Neck Band.



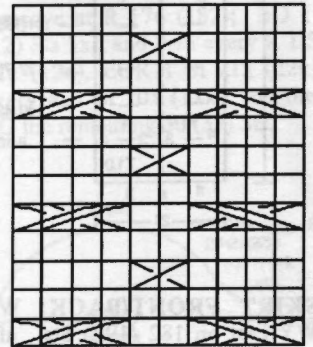
SLEEVES: W.Y. CO 56 (60) Sts. After several Rs, end with 1 R ravel cord to the left. T 10. Use two strands Col. 1. Begin sleeve shaping at R 6. On each side every 6 Rs Incr 1 St 10x (11x). Begin armscye



shaping at R 70 (76). BO 4 Sts 1x; then on each side Decr EOR 1 St 9x and every R 1 St 6x. At R 96 (102) knit 1 R to the left by hand and BO the remaining 38 (44) Sts with a latch tool.

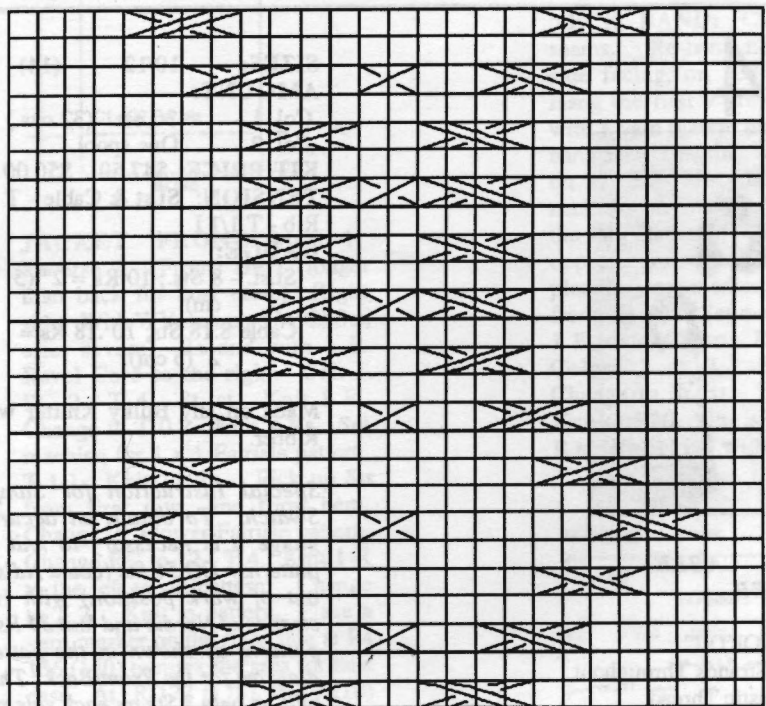
CUFFS: Hang the 56 (60) Sleeve Sts on 36 (40) Ndl, purl side facing, doubling Sts as necessary, evenly. Knit 1 R. Transfer EOS to the ribber. K1P1 Rib. Col. 1 and 2. T 1/1 I. Knit 20 Rs. Change tension. T 10/5 I. Knit 1 R, transfer ribber Sts to main bed and BO with a latch tool.

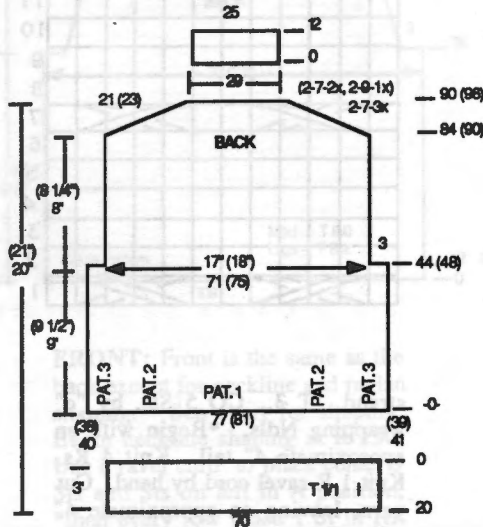
SPECIAL INSTRUCTION FOR SAMPLE SWATCH: To obtain an accurate gauge it is necessary to knit all patterns. CO 55 Sts (count Ndl in out of work position) with two strands of Nordic and knit 34 Rs in pattern, as shown in the pattern diagram for the Front/Back. There will be only 3 Sts on each side next to the out of work Ndl. Measure the swatch from one side OW St to the OW St on the other side, (do not include the 3 edge Sts): and divide the measurement by 49 to obtain the St. gauge for 1 inch. Measure from top edge to bottom and divide the measurement by 34 to obtain the R gauge for 1 inch.

See Knitting News this issue for "how to" bind off when a Ndl is in non-working position.

BACK: W.Y. CO 71 (81) Sts. After several Rs, end with 1 R ravel cord to the left. T 10. Use two strands Col. 1. Knit 1 R left to right, transfer Sts for out of work Ndl to adjacent Ndl. Knit 2 Rs. RC 0. Begin cable pattern (see

chart). At R 44 (48) BO 3 Sts on each side for armhole. Begin shoulder shaping at R 84 (90) on each side BO EOR 7 Sts 3x, (7 Sts 2x and 9 Sts 1x). Remove remaining 29 neckline Sts on WY.

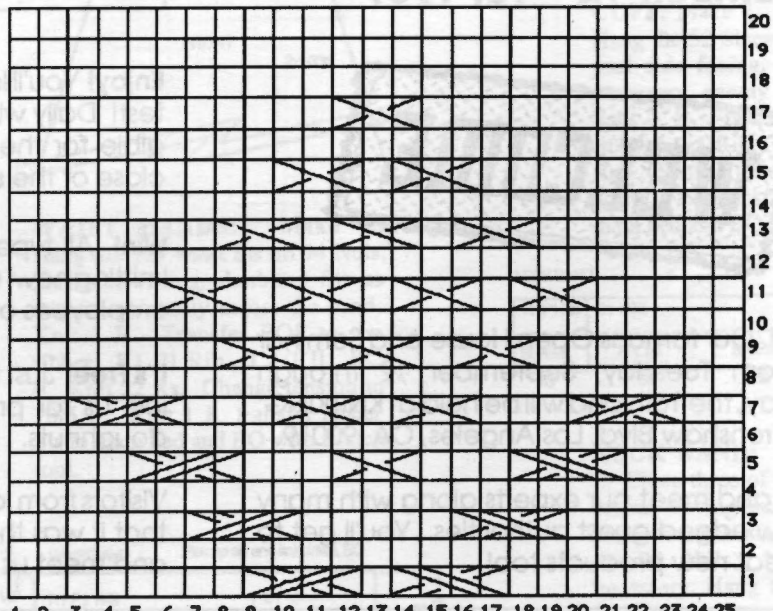
BACK NECK BAND: Re-hang the neckline Sts on 25 Ndl. purl side facing, doubling Sts as necessary, evenly across. RC 0.



Col. 1 & 2. Change to T 8, knit 6 Rs. Change to T 7, knit 6 Rs. RC 12. Knit 1 R to the left by hand to form loose Sts. BO with a latch tool.

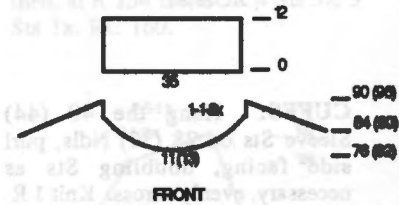

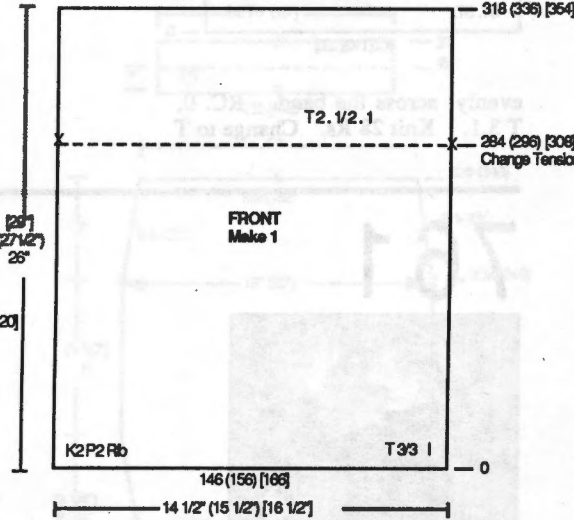
JACKET FRONTS: Make 1, Reverse 1. *Left side:* K2/P2 Rib. CO T 0/0 I. Cast on 62 (66) [70] Sts and complete selvedge. RC 0. T 3/3 I. Knit ribbing to R 66. Transfer ribber Sts to main bed. RC 0. T 3.1. St. st. Begin front shaping on right side at R 56 (60) [64]; decrease every 15 Rs 1 St 4x, every 16 Rs 1 St 10x (16 Rs 1 St 8x, 17 Rs 1 St 6x) [17 Rs 1 St 12x, 18 Rs 1 St 2x]. Place a yarn marker on left side for sleeve at R 140 (148) [156]. Begin shoulder shaping at R 276 (290) [304]; on the left side short row EOR 12 Sts 4x (13 Sts 4x) [14 Sts 4x]. At R 284 (298) [312]; all Ndls in WP; knit 1 R and remove on WY.



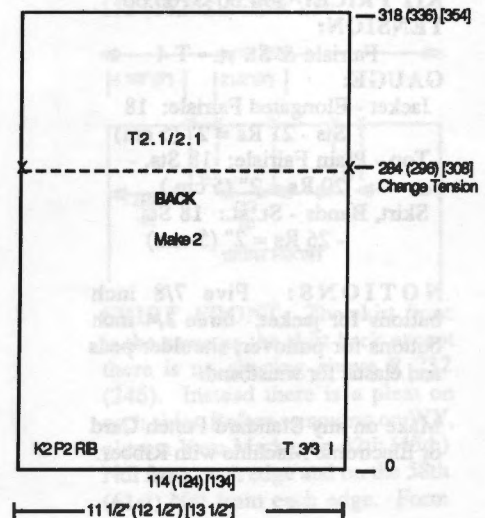

Set machine for Elongated



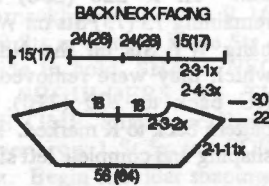

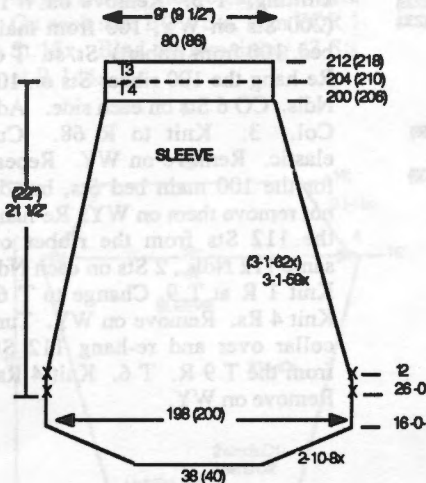

Buttonholes are 7 Sts from the fold line and 6 Sts wide. Make buttonholes on the 8th through 13th Ndl on each side of the fold line, one in the jacket and one in the facing. At R 190 (196), on right side, BO 23 (23) Sts for armhole. At R 280 (292), begin neck shaping. Place the Sts on the left of the fold line in HP. Mark pattern row. *Place 18 (19) Sts to the right of the fold line in HP, then Decr every R 1 St 9x, EOR 1 Sts 3x, and every 3 Rs 1 St 3x. Remove remaining 15 (17) Sts on WY at R 306 (318).

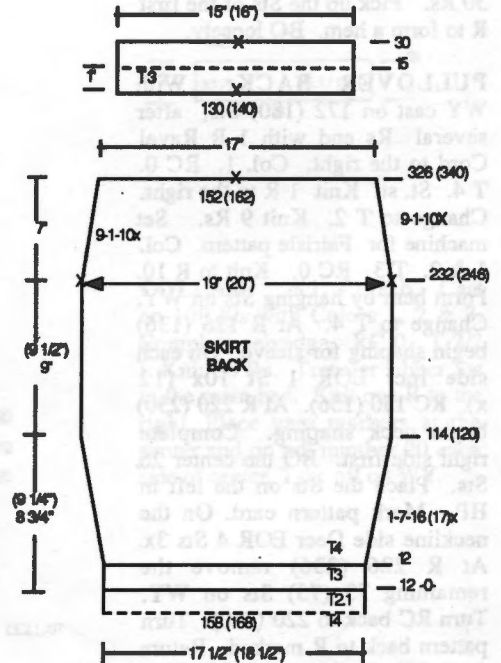

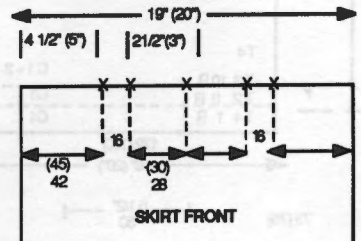

Decr on each side every 9 Rs 1 St 10x. At R 326 (340) remove the remaining 152 (162) Sts on WY.

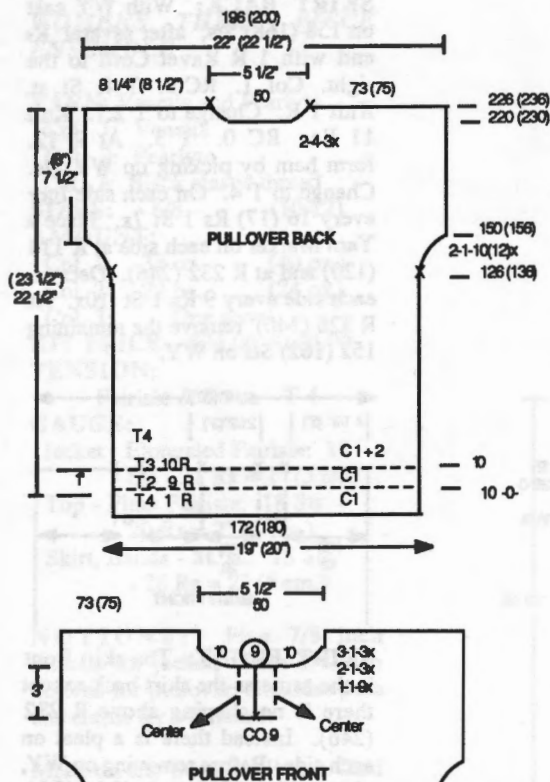

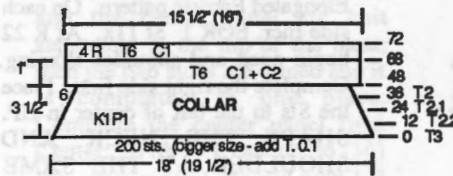

At R 226 (236) remove the remaining 73 (75) Sts on WY. Turn RC back to 220 (230). Turn pattern back to R marked. Return Sts in HP to work and complete left side.

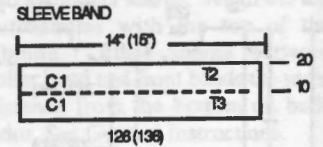

remove on WY. Take off shoulders and neck separately.



FRONT: Front is the same as the back except for neckline shaping. Begin neckline shaping at R 184 (194) [204]. Mark punch card. Take off on W.Y. 11 Sts in center. Place Sts on left side in hold. Shape neckline by decreasing EOR

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BINDING OFF WITH A NEEDLE IN NON-WORKING POSITION.

The three cable sweaters (Patterns 754, 755, 756) have needles in non-working position on each side of the cables. Before binding off, return the non-working needles to work. Pick up the stitch from the row below to fill them, then proceed with the bind off. If you do not do this you will have a hole at the top where the seam will be.

VERTICAL BUTTONHOLES IN RIBBING

Vertical buttonholes are accomplished by knitting each side separately (partial or short-row knitting). Pattern #760 has two parallel buttonholes, one on the left and one on the right, 5 or 6 rows long in a K1 P1 Rib. The buttonholes are 44 stitches apart and 8 stitches from the right edge. To form the two buttonholes, the 52 stitches to the right of the left buttonhole are placed in non-working position. Knit 5 rows. The stitches on the left are then placed in non-working position and the 44 stitches between the two buttonholes are returned to Working Position. Knit 5 rows. Place the 44 stitches in non-working position and return the 8 edge stitches to work. Knit 5 rows.

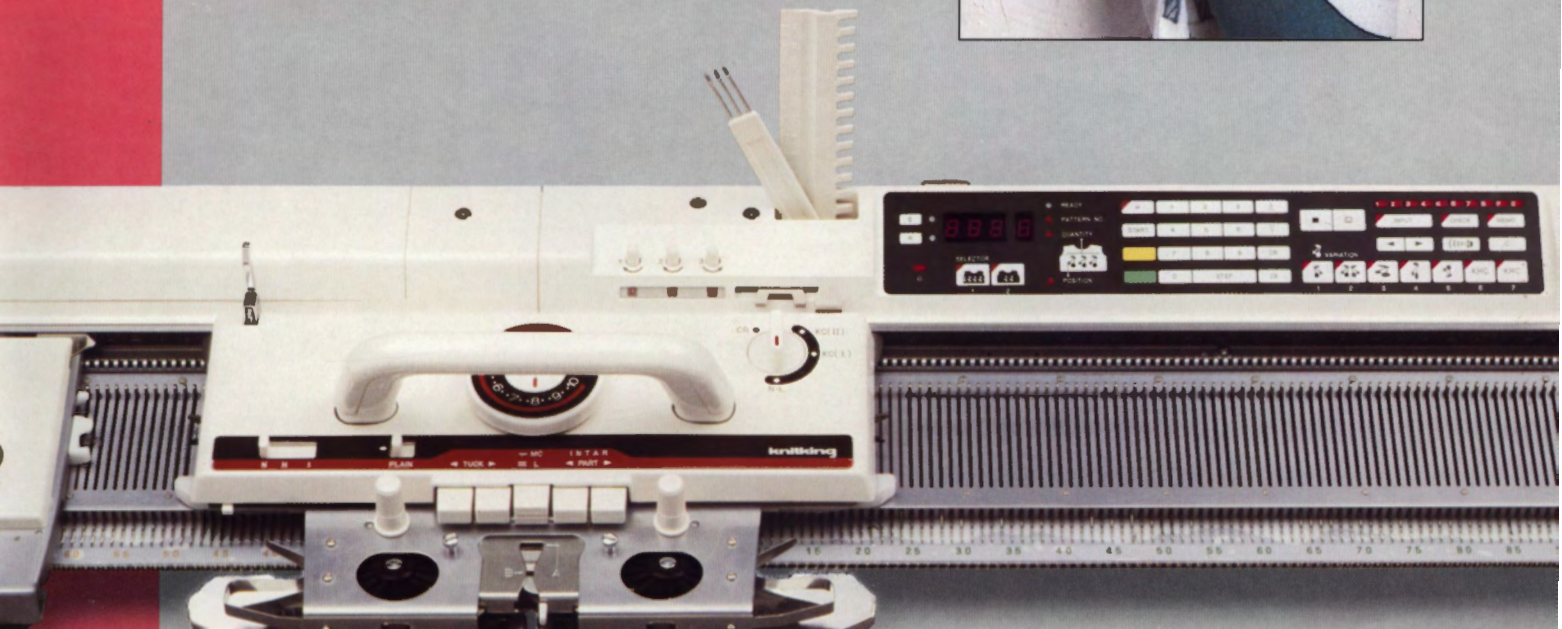
