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The PASSAP BABY BOOK

A baby book for the PASSAP DUOMATIC has been planned for some time, and now we are proud to say : here it is !

We have had a good many requests to reprint some very popular patterns from earlier PASSAP books which are now out of print, so we have added these to the wide range of new baby knits, all of them complete with up-to-date knitting instructions, ranging from new-born babies up to four-year-olds.

In this book you will find jackets, pants, dresses, sweaters and rompers of various types with - we hope - something to suit all tastes. Two models will prove particularly useful : leggings Number 2063 and socks Number 2074, both of which are given in four sizes.

We have not included our usual wool chart, because baby wools are the same in most countries. But for your guidance we have included some notes about the number of metres per 100 gr (or yards per ounce) and on page 23 you will find a small chart on this subject.

We do hope you will enjoy using the PASSAP BABY BOOK.

Before starting your work please study carefully the explanations given on pages 1 and 2

Patterns: The drawings refer to half width, the indications of stitch numbers refer to whole width of each part.

Figure I	= back	Figure IX	= pants
Figure II	= front	Figure X	= gusset
Figure III	= sleeve	Figure XI	= scarf
Figure IV	= collar	Figure XII	= cap, bonnet
Figure V	= border, cuff	Figure XIII	= mittens
Figure VI	= pocket	Figure XIV	= socks, stockings
Figure VII	= skirt, front	Figure XV	= straps
Figure VIII	= skirt, back	Figure XVI	= bra, halter, bodice, top

If the centre line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is worked simultaneously with reversed shapings, i. e. decreasing or increasing is made on the left as well as on the right side.

If the centre line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is worked separately with reversed shapings, i. e. first knit one part according to diagram (increasing or decreasing at right), then the second part the opposite way (decreasing or increasing at left).

Abbreviations:

Col.	= colour of wool	○	= tubular (or) = half tubular
st, sts	= stitch, stitches	●	= every (in every row)
St.S	= stitch size	×	= times
Nd, nds	= needle, needles	+	= increase
R	= row	—	= decrease, cast off
T	= 2 rows	▲	= graduations (short rows)
		■	= for open work row hang st to the next nd, leave empty nd in W. P.

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter "st"). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working Position on back and front bed.

Exception: For tubular or half tubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed. The same number of needles must therefore be put into Working Position on the other bed. In these cases the sign for tubular \bigcirc respectively (or) for half tubular is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increase or decrease always occurs in the first row of a section.

- $+ 3 \times 2 \cdot 8 \cdot R$ means: increase 2 stitches 3 times in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- $- 19 \times 3 \cdot 7 \cdot R$ means: decrease 3 stitches 19 times in every 7th row (back 2 stitches, front 1 stitch or vice versa).
- $- 17 \times 1 \cdot 2./3 \cdot R$ means: decrease 1 stitch 17 times, alternately once after 2 rows and once after 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle - 4 \times 8 \cdot 2 \cdot R$ means: work graduations, i. e. short rows (on DUO with pushers and lock BX). Step by step put 8 nds (and their respective pushers) into Rest Position 4 times after every 2nd row (for double bed 4 nds each back and front). Once all graduations are finished, continue knitting normally, i. e. all nds in Working Position (pushers in Neutral Position).

Graduations can be knitted two ways, either from outer edge towards centre (gradual decreasing with the minus-sign "-" after the black triangle) or from the centre towards outer edge (gradual increasing with the plus-sign "+" after the black triangle.)

Number of stitches and centimetres :

- $136 = 20 \text{ cm}$ means: a total of 136 sts (for K/K 68 stitches each on back and front) make a width of 20 cm.
- $\bigcirc 146 = 43 \text{ cm}$ means: cast on 146 sts each on back and front bed for tubular which makes a width of 43 cm.

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be tested by you, by making your own test square for your own wool.

Test square: We strongly recommend that you make always a test square with your own material before starting to work, in order to calculate for your material the necessary numbers of stitches and rows along the PASSAP - chart. The chapter "The test square and its calculation" in your instruction book informs you how to proceed for these calculations. This is very important, especially when adjusting a model to another size.

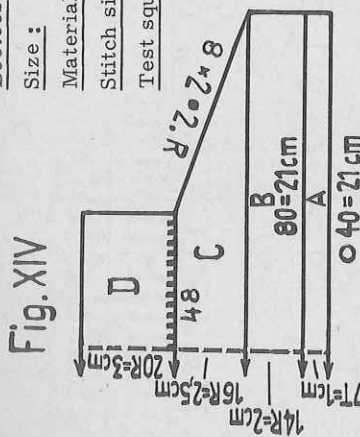

To make up:

Sew up. Make twisted or knitted cord and thread through holes at ankles.

TIPS

How to make an open work row when knitting 1:1 rib, using transfer lock U 70:

For last row before open work row set St. S on back bed about 1 1/2 sizes larger than normal. Knit 1 row, rack 1 1/4 nds to left, transfer sts to front bed, rack 1 1/4 nds to right, leaving empty nds in W. P. Continue with normal St. S.

Tubular knitted cord:

With 3 (2 front, 1 back) 4 or 5 nds and lock set on CX/CX knit cord of desired length.

Uneven number of sts (3, 5, 7) = round cord.

Even number of sts (2, 4, 6) = flat cord.

Neck band: For tubular cast on 42 sts on each bed and knit 12 rows tubular, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly. Sew up jacket. Sew loose sts on thread to side edges of collar. Sew on collar starting and ending at centre of pattern 2 stripes. Neaten buttonholes, sew on buttons. Bonnet: Sew loose sts on thread to edges of section D. Sew on neck band. Secure ribbon at front.

Fig. IXb, front: A = 6 rows tubular, then knit 6 rows on back bed and 6 rows on front bed. Transfer all sts to front bed. B = stocking st. C = leg shaping: graduations starting from the outside. D = divide work, at right shape leg. E = for leg band knit stocking st over all nds. For other leg repeat sections D and E reversing shapings.

Gusset: Cast on 3 sts and knit 48 rows, increasing 1 st at both ends every

alternate row, 11 times. Then decrease 1 st every alternate row, 11 times.

Cast off.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press. Sew up.

Sweater: Sew on neck band first to outside, st by st with back st, then to inside st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Work a row of single crochet along shoulder openings, making 4 button loops at front. At back, sew on buttons to match.

Pants: Set in gusset. Fold leg band in half to inside. At waist insert elastic.

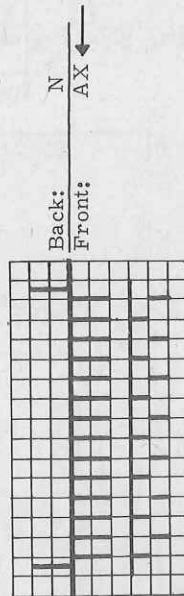

Fig. XII, bonnet: A = knit tubular. B and C = knit in pattern. Cast off.

Front borders: Make two.

With 60 sts cast on for tubular and knit 12 rows stocking st tubular followed by 4 rows tubular and 2 rows K/K with contrast yarn, release.

Band for bonnet: With 50 sts knit as for front border.

To make up:

Block and press all parts lightly. Sew up. Sew on front borders, first to outside, then to inside, st by st with back st, unravelling contrast yarn. Sew side

edgings to collar. Sew collar to neck, starting and ending at centre of front borders, unravelling contrast yarn. Neaten buttonholes, sew on buttons.

On bonnet sew the 29 cast-off sts of section B to shaped edges of section C. Sew on band same way as front bands. Lastly, sew on ribbons.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly. Sew up. Sew waist band between the 4 rows stocking st at waist, starting at centre back, easing in fullness of main part to about 66 cm. Sew straps to back, sew on buttons at front, neaten buttonholes. Sew ribbon to points of waist band, take ribbon through buttonholes. Cross and tie ribbon.

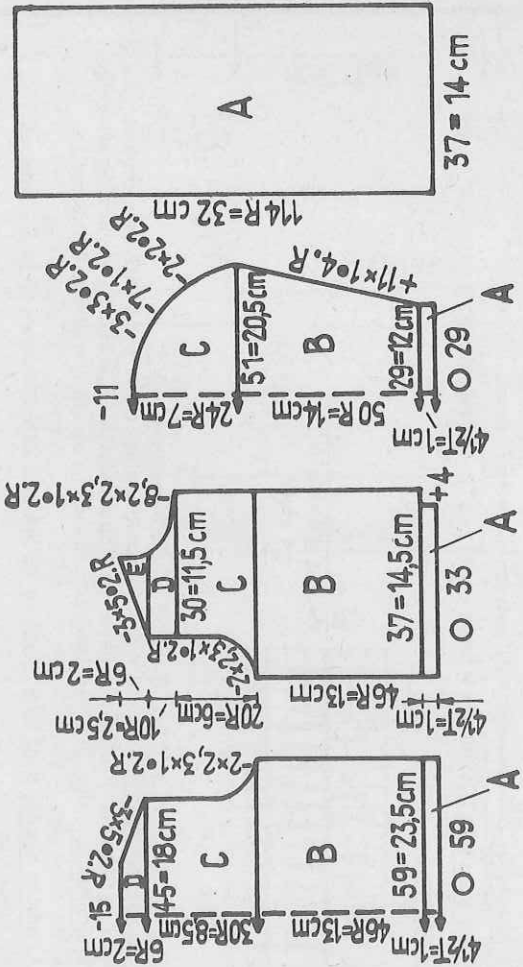
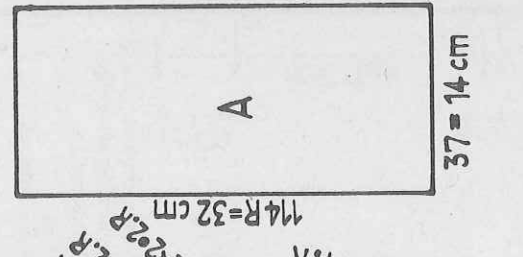

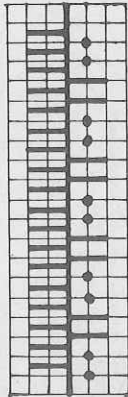

To make up: Block and press all parts lightly. Sew up. Fold centre front edges in half to inside and catch down. Fold front edge of hood in half to inside and catch down. Work one row of double crochet round lower edge of hood and neck of jacket. Place double crochet row of hood over double crochet row of jacket and pull a twisted cord through holes of both rows together. At right front make two button loops and sew on 2 buttons.

Outfit consisting of jacket, bonnet and rompers

Size: 8 to 12 months

Material: 12 ozs medium wool, 14 small buttons, 1 yard ribbon

Stitch size: Pattern 4, stocking st $5\frac{1}{2}$, 1:1 rib = $2\frac{3}{4}$

Test square: 100 sts = 31 cm ($12\frac{1}{4}$ "), 100 rows = 16 cm ($6\frac{1}{4}$ ")

Pattern: Entire outfit in honeycomb pattern according to diagram, borders in stocking st, stocking st tubular and 1:1 rib.

Jacket

Fig. I: A = knit straight in pattern. B = continue in pattern, decreasing at both ends. C = transfer sts to back bed for stocking st and knit in stocking st, then a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. II: One front. A = as for Fig. I. B = at right knit straight, at left decrease.

C = at right cast off 4 sts, transfer sts to back bed, knit a few rows stocking st with contrast yarn, release.

Knit other front in the same way, reversing shapings.

Fig. III: A = 1:1 rib. B = knit straight in pattern. C = continue in pattern, decreasing at both ends. D = transfer sts to back bed, knit a few rows stocking st with contrast yarn, release.

To make up jacket:

Block and press all parts. Sew up. Fold neck band in half to inside and sew down st by st into the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. At front sew on 4 small buttons. Button through pattern of other front edge. Press seams.

Bonnet

Fig. XII: A = border: knit in pattern, but with lock set at back on AX →, at front on N. B = continue in pattern according to diagram. C = 1:1 rib, put sts on a strong thread.

To make up bonnet:

Draw up and fasten off. Join edges along section C to arrow. Fold pattern border to outside and sew down at each end. Sew on ribbon.

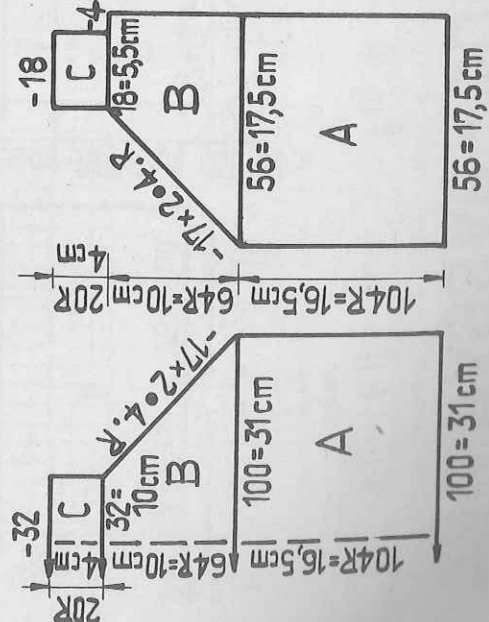

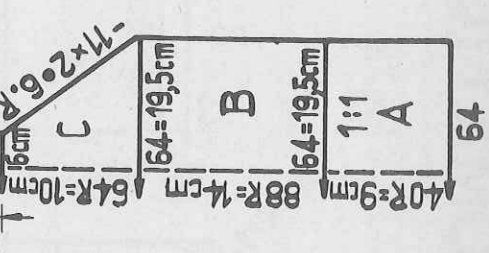
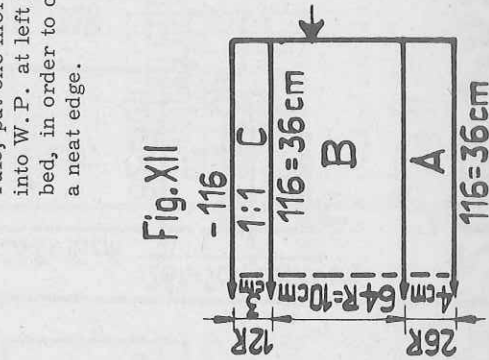

Fig. IX: Begin at waist back: A = waist hem: with St. S 1 make zig-zag in 1:1 over 130 nds. Set lock at back on GX, at front on N. With 65 nds on front bed knit 18 rows. Last row (RC 20) with lock set on N/N, St. S 4. B = knit straight in pattern. C = decrease at both ends. D = knit straight. E = increase at both ends. F = bib. Knit straight in pattern. G = transfer sts to back bed, knit stocking st at back, then a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Straps (make two): With 6 sts on each bed knit 160 rows in stocking st (RC 160)

Then make buttonhole thus: At front and back place centre st onto next st, leaving empty nds in W.P. Knit 2 rows tubular. Pick up thread, twist and place on empty nds. Shape point, decreasing 1 st every alternate row, front and back.

Leg band (make two): Make zig-zag over 80 nds and knit 18 rows tubular, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

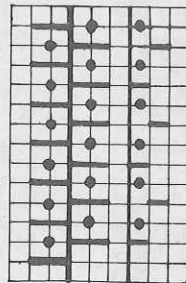
To make up:

Press all parts lightly. Fold top of bib in half to inside (section G) and sew down, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Sew one small button to each top corner of bib. Sew straps to centre back of waist hem (section A) (straps will be buttoned to bib). Sew on leg bands along sections C, D and E, first outside, then inside, backstitching into the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. At both sides, along sections A and B sew on 4 small buttons. Fold up bib, placing section B on top of section F. Take buttons of sections A and B through pattern of section F.

Material: 350 metres length per 100 gr approx. 110 yards per 1 oz 10 cm = approx. 4"

F = neck band: knit straight, a few rows with contrast yarn, release. Now, return 39 sts of left shoulder onto nds of machine. At right cast on 6 sts. Complete left shoulder with reversed shapings.

Fig. II: A, B and C = as for Fig. I. D = divide work with BX and pushers. Knit first shoulder according to diagram; at right knit straight, at left shape neck with graduations. E = at right shoulder shaping with graduations, at left knit straight. A few rows with contrast yarn, release these 25 sts (shoulder). Knit second shoulder with reversed shapings. F = at right and left of remaining 28 sts replace 5 sts of inner edges of sections E. With 38 sts continue straight, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. III: A = 1:1 rib. B = transfer sts for stocking st, increase at both ends. C = knit straight, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Material: 585 metres length per 100 gr approx. 183 yards per 1 oz

To make up:

Block and press all parts. Join shoulder seams, grafting sts together and unravelling contrast yarn. Join neck band with mattress stitch. Sew sleeves to inside of sections C and D, unravelling contrast yarn, matching edges of section C of sleeve with cast-off sts of armhole (match arrows \blacktriangledown and dots \bullet .) Join side and sleeve seams. Fasten neck band with button loop and button.

A, C and D = half tubular, open at right. Before casting on, rack back bed to the right. Begin with contrast yarn. Place sts exactly in the centre (see needle scale).

A = waist hem, half tubular, open at right, knit straight. B = at right make graduations on front bed with BX and pushers (release arrow keys) start with 1 pusher. C = knit half tubular, straight. D = thigh shapings on front bed.

Note: Mark nds on which sts have always to be transferred thus: put a drop of coloured varnish on pushers 1 and 4 at left of centre (see needle scale). M = toe, at both ends decrease with double decker, back and front, take last few sts on a thread, draw up and fasten off.

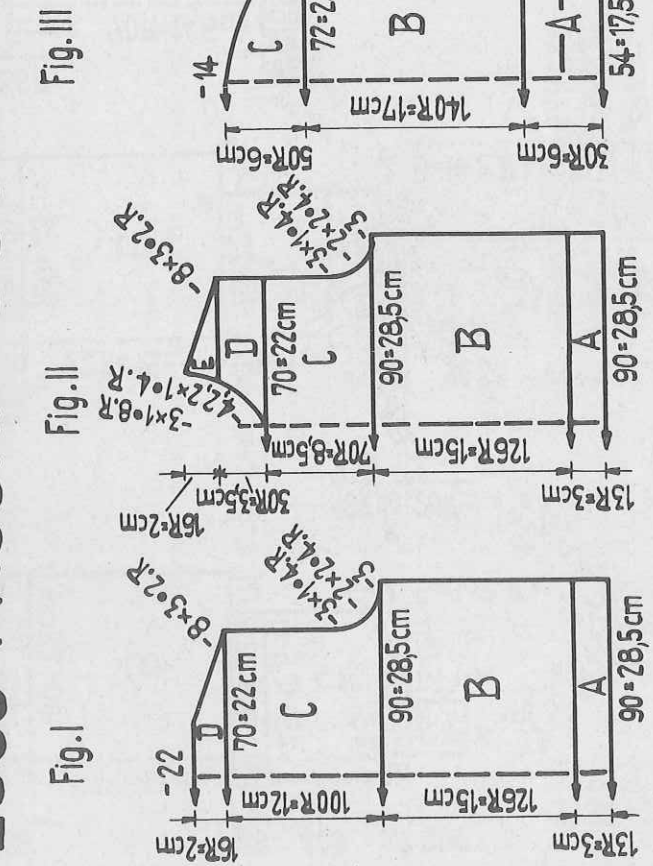
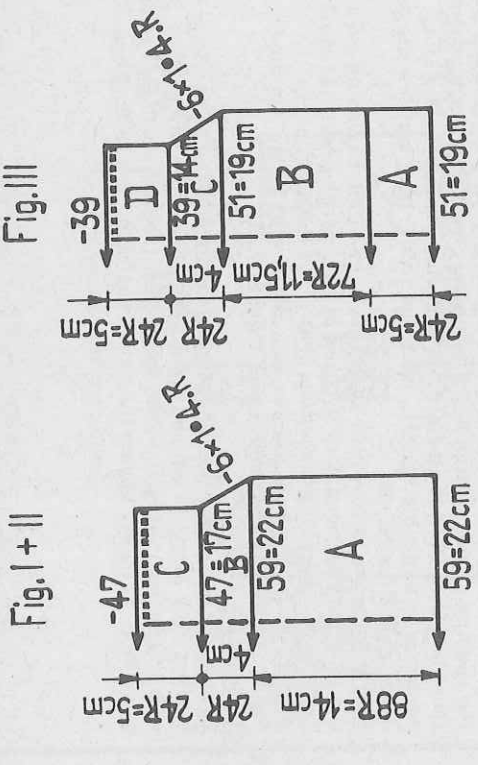

B = half tubular, open at left: divide work with BX and pushers; at right back put 48 pushers into W. P., at right front put 48 pushers in R. P. Press left arrow keys, knit straight. C = knit right leg according to diagram: knit tubular with BX and pushers, pressing both arrow keys. At right knit straight, at left decrease with double decker tool. D = tubular. E = heel: knit on front bed (returning back bed pushers within blocking rail). Decrease and increase with BX and pushers. F = heel: knit tubular as for section D. G = at both ends decrease, back and front. Put last sts on a thread, draw up and fasten off. Return pushers within blocking rail. Knit left leg with reversed shapings: At back put 48 pushers in R. P., at front into W. P., press right arrow keys. B = half tubular, open at right. C = tubular with CX/CX, decrease at right with double decker tool, at left knit straight. D to G according to diagram.

To make up:

Crochet chain stitches along zig-zag cast-on of Fig. I/section C, picking up every alternate thread. Join side seams. At both points of straps make a buttonhole lengthwise, sew through double thickness of knitting, securing each stitch. Cut open. At front sew on buttons to match buttonholes. Pull cord or elastic through holes at waist.

Pompon :

From cardboard cut two discs 2,5 cm in diameter and make a hole in the centre, leaving a rim of approx. 1,7 cm. Place the two discs one on top of the other. Wind plenty of wool around the double rim. Then cut wool outside between the discs and tie tightly in the centre leaving surplus yarn ends. Remove discs. Trim pompon to shape and hold over steam to get fluffy effect.

Then set lock at back on N, at front on GX, and with 163 sts knit 24 rows stocking st on back bed. Over 62 nds at right front knit a few rows with contrast yarn. In the centre miss 41 sts, over remaining 62 sts at left knit a few rows with contrast yarn. On back bed leave 40 sts in the centre, at right knit 63 sts, at left 62 sts with contrast yarn, release. D = with 81 sts knit in fairisle stitch until row counter reads 16, then knit motif 2. Finish off with RC 16 in fairisle stitch. E = transfer all sts to front bed, knit 12 rows in stocking st blue, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Braces : Fairisle pattern according to pattern. Make two.

With 9 nds on front bed and 8 nds on back bed knit straight until RC reads 300. Make buttonhole thus : at left return 5 pushers on front bed and 4 pushers on back bed within blocking rail, knit RC 8, break off. Return pushers at left to W.P. and return pushers at right within blocking rail, knit RC 8, break off. Put all pushers into W.P. Shape point thus : every 4th row decrease 1 st at both ends, back and front, 4 times. Darn ends into edges of work.

Transfer remaining 59 sts from back to front bed. Continue in stocking st, increasing at both ends. C = knit straight. D = divide work with BX and pushers. Cast off 5 centre sts. Knit first half according to diagram : at right knit straight, at left shape neck. E = knit straight, cast off. Complete other half to match.

To make up :

Press bib and contrast yarn. Sew picot edging to side edges of bib, first outside then inside, backstitching into the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn (stretch picot edging). Work 1 or 2 rows of single crochet along neck and shoulder edge. Sew on knitted cord, press again.

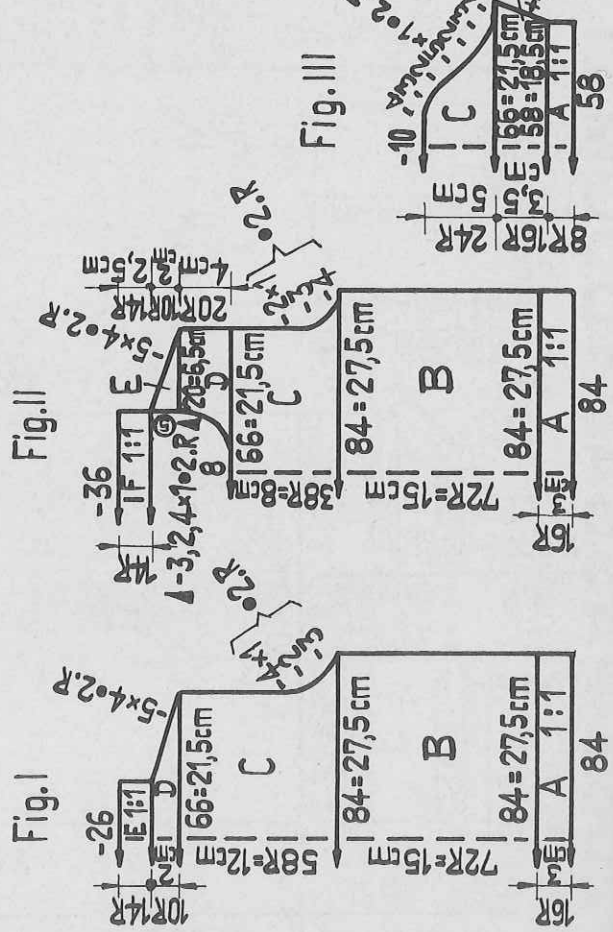

Fig. II: A, B and C = as for Fig. I. D and E = shape neck with BX and pushers. First knit left shoulder according to diagram. D = at right knit straight, at left shape neck with graduations. E = at right shoulder shaping, at left knit straight. For right shoulder repeat sections D and E with reversed shapings. F = at both ends of remaining sts, for neck band place 5 sts of unshaped edges of sections F onto nds. Knit 1 row with white. Transfer sts for 1:1 rib and knit 13 rows with white, cast off.

Fig. III: A = 1:1 rib with green. B = transfer sts for stocking st, increase at both ends. C = shape sleeve head, cast off.

To make up: Block and press all parts. Join side and one shoulder seam including neck band. Join other shoulder opening for about 1 cm. Along front shoulder work 4 rows of single crochet, making 4 buttonholes in the second row. Along back shoulder work 2 rows of single crochet for underlap. Sew on buttons. Join sleeve seams, set in sleeves.

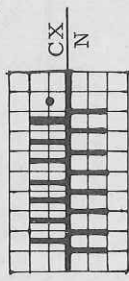

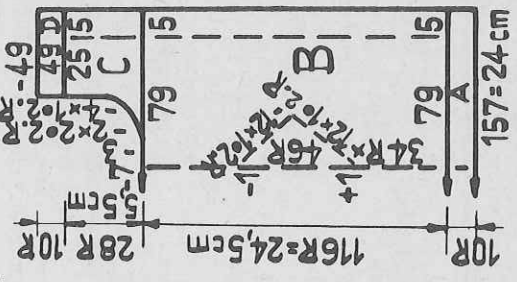

A = with 78 sts on back bed and 79 sts on front bed make zig-zag, St. S 1. Change to St. S 2 1/2 and knit 2 rows CX/CX, then 10 rows "long stitch" pattern according to diagram. B = at both ends leave 5 sts on back bed, transferring centre 68 sts to front bed. Knit 34 rows. Knit motif thus: on back bed put centre nd into W. P. and knit 2 rows. At both sides of centre nd put 1 more nd into W. P. (3 nds altogether) and knit further 2 rows, etc. etc. until there are 25 nds in W. P. Then, at both ends and every alternate row move edge sts of motif 1 nd inwards. Transfer last st to front bed. C = divide work, casting off centre 7 sts. Knit first half according to diagram: at right knit straight, at left shape neck, then continue straight. D = on back bed put all nds into W. P. and knit 10 rows in "long stitch" pattern. Transfer sts to front bed and cast off tightly. Knit second half with reversed shapings.

Cord: Knit tubular and half tubular. With 4 sts on each bed and lock set on CX knit 220 rows tubular, then 220 rows half tubular (with BX and pushers, pressing right arrow keys). Lastly, knit 220 rows tubular, cast off.

Fig. II: A and B = as for Fig. I. C = at left put 49 sts on dekercombs. Knit first shoulder according to diagram; at right shape armhole, at left cast on 5 sts, then straight, D = at right knit straight, at left shape neck. E = at right shape shoulder, at left knit straight. Place sts on dekercombs on to nds of machine. At right cast on 5 more sts and knit second shoulder with reversed shapings.

Fig. III: A = scallop edging according to diagram; with blue and St. S 3 (lock set on N/N) make zig-zag from left to right. Break off. With white knit 7 rows according to diagram, 1 row N/N, transfer all sts to front bed. B = first make an open work row, then continue in stocking st. C = shape sleeve head, cast off.

Fig. IV, collar: A = with 208 nds work scallop edging as for Fig. III. Before knitting 8th row, transfer all sts to front bed, knit 1 row with lock set on N/CX. At both ends put 16 sts on a thread. B = hang sts of scallop edging onto nds as follows; at right hang 3 sts of edging onto first nd of collar, knit 1 row. (Lock is at left.) At left hang 3 sts of scallop edging onto first nd of collar, knit 1 row. (Lock is at right.) From now on, consecutively hang first on the right, then on the left and always on the same side as lock, 1 st of scallop edging onto first nd of collar and knit 1 row until all sts of the edging are hanging on nds. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

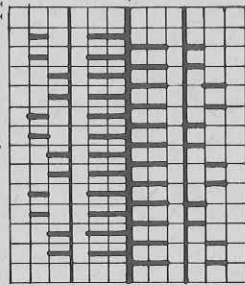

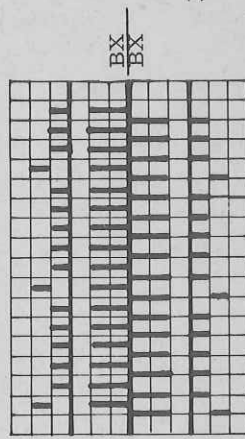

At right edge of front opening work 2 rows of single crochet, making 4 button loops in the second row, at left work 1 row of single crochet and sew on buttons to match button loops. Join sleeve and side seams, set in sleeves. Pull cord through open work row on sleeves.

 Material: 13 ozs crêpe cotton yarn, 4 small buttons, waist elastic
 Stitch size: 4 3/4
 Test square: 100 sts = 31 cm (12 1/4"), 100 rows = 21,5 cm (8 1/2")
 Pattern: stocking st. Jacket with knitted-in pockets, shorts with permanent crease.

Jacket

Fig. I: Start and finish with contrast yarn. A and B = knit straight. C = shape armholes, then continue straight. D = shape shoulders, release.
Fig. II: Knit left front according to diagram. Start with contrast yarn. A = stocking st. B = at left cast on 19 sts, knit straight. In the 32nd, 70th and 108th row make a pair of buttonholes thus: at left miss 2 sts, knit 4 sts with contrast yarn by hand, miss 9 sts, knit 4 sts with contrast yarn by hand. In the 40th row make pocket as follows: at right miss 15 sts, for the following 16 nds put pushers into W.P. Set lock at front on BX, at back on GX, knit 20 rows for pocket band. Now hang the loops of the purl sts of the last row knitted prior to the band onto the 20 front bed needles. Knit 60 rows for pocket. Break yarn and push lock entirely to the right. Return pushers within blocking rail, lock set at front on N. Continue knitting in stocking st with all nds (see also "ABC of Perfect Knitting", page 55). C = at right shape armhole, at left knit straight. D = at right knit straight, at left cast off 10 sts. Release 11th stitch. Shape neck with graduations (BX and pushers) according to diagram, then continue straight. E = at right shape shoulder, at left knit straight. Lastly put remaining sts for neck band on deckercombs. Knit right front with reversed shapings, omitting buttonholes. F for neck band place sts on deckercombs back onto nds of machine as follows: in the centre place

the 36 sts of back, at both sides leave 7 nds out, then at right place sts of right front, at left sts of left front onto nds of machine. Hang unshaped edges of neck (sections D and E) onto the 7 empty nds. With 102 nds and St.S 4 3/4 knit 4 rows. At left knit outside buttonhole thus: at left miss 4 sts, knit 4 sts with contrast yarn. Knit 3 rows. Knit 8th row with St.S 8, pulling knitting down. Knit 3 rows with St.S 4 3/4. At left knit inside buttonhole as before. Lastly, knit 4 rows, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. III (make two): Begin with contrast yarn.

A = hem, straight. B = increase at both ends. C = shape sleeve head, cast off.

To make up jacket:

Block and press all parts. Drop 11th st (released stitch) to beginning of section A. Crochet ladder made by dropped stitch, taking 2 threads at a time. Turn front facings along fold line to inside and sew down. Remove contrast yarn from buttonholes and graft loose sts from back and front together. Fix side edges of pocket and side edges of pocket bands. Join shoulder and side seams. On neck band crochet a chain with long sts of 8th row (knitted with St.S 8), taking one thread at a time. Neaten button-hole of neck band. Sew down neck band and lower hem of jacket, unravelling contrast yarn. Join sleeve seam. Sew hem on sleeves to inside, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Set in sleeves. Sew on buttons.

Shorts

Fig. IX: Knit left part according to diagram. Begin and end with contrast yarn.

A = hem, knit straight. B = graduations from the right with BX and pushers.

Increase at right. C = make graduations from the left with BX and pushers. Increase at left. D = continue with all nds, increasing at both ends. E = shape crutch. At

right continue decreasing, at left knit straight for centre front seam. F = waist

hem, knit straight. Release.

Knit right part with reversed shapings.

To make up:

Block and press both parts. On both parts drop 22nd stitch from centre front to beginning of section A. With green tool, crochet ladder made by dropped stitch, taking 2 threads at a time (creases). Join leg seams. Join both parts along crutch seam. Fold sections A and F to inside and sew down, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Insert waist elastic.

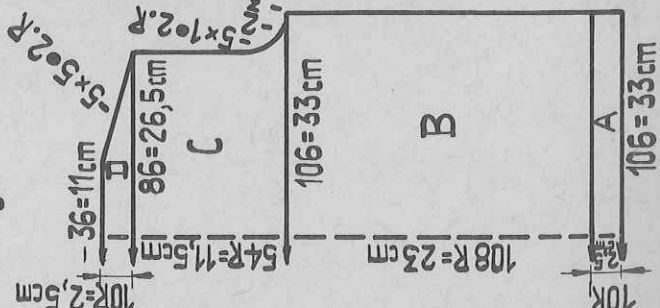

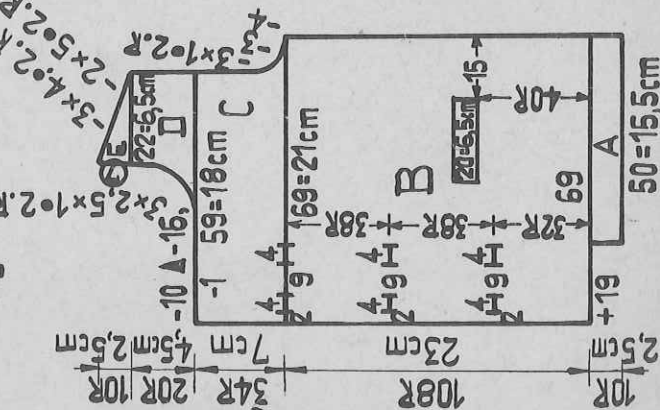

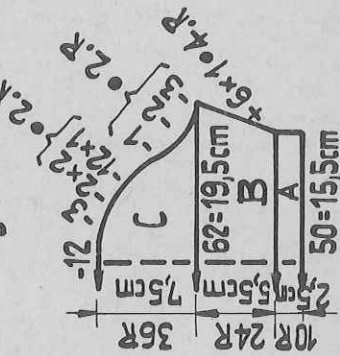
