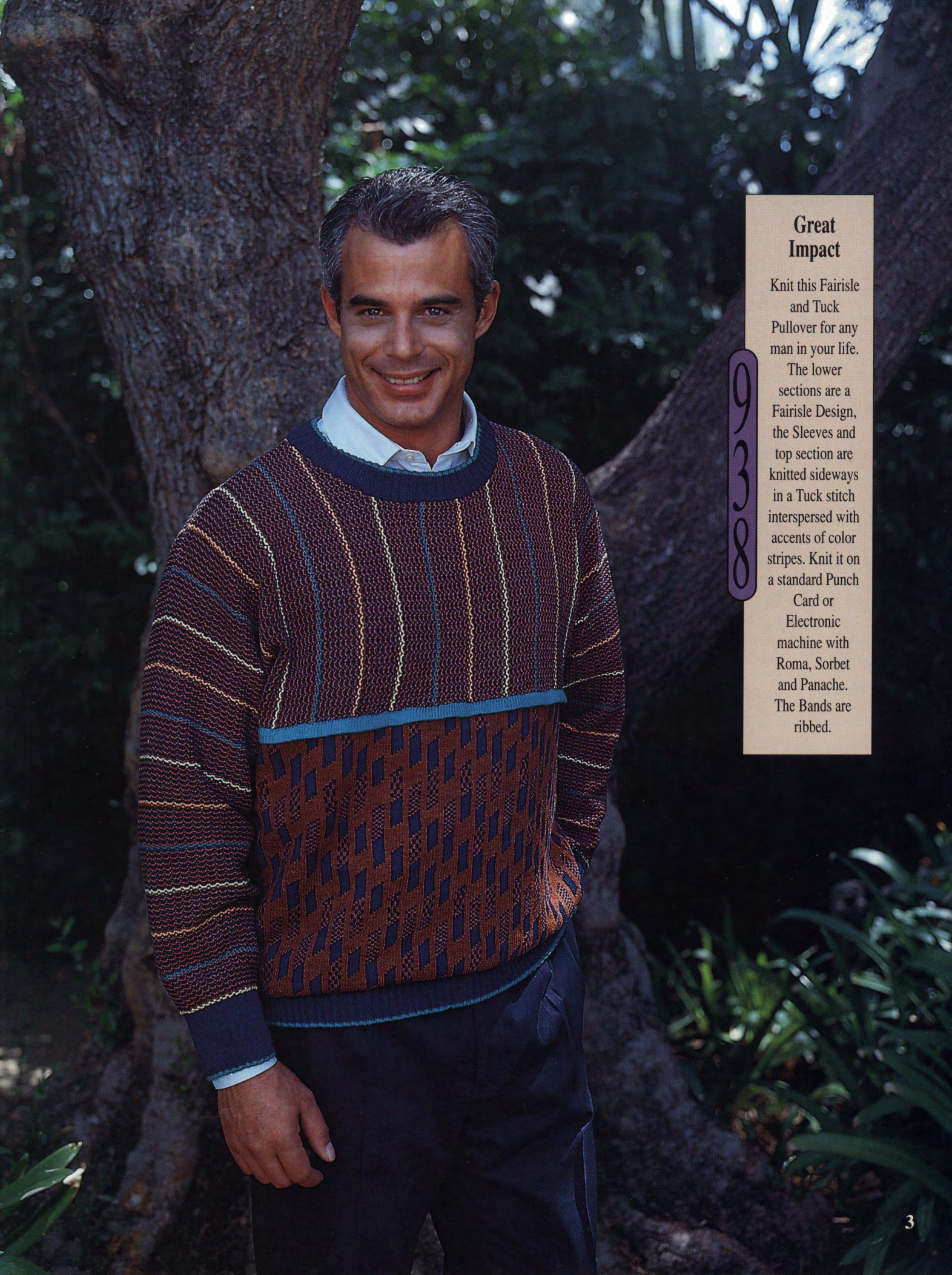

Double Treat

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A bright Fairisle Jacket is in a large design and ties at waist with a drawstring cord. We suggest a soft lining to hide the floats inside. Knit it with Alpine on the Punch Card or Compuknit/Bulky machine with Ribber. You can knit the long line Turtleneck Pullover in Stockinette stitch to wear under the Jacket on any Bulky Knitter with Ribbing Attachment. Alpine is the yarn.



Great Impact

Knit this Fairisle and Tuck Pullover for any man in your life.

The lower sections are a Fairisle Design, the Sleeves and top section are knitted sideways in a Tuck stitch interspersed with accents of color stripes. Knit it on a standard Punch

Card or Electronic machine with Roma, Sorbet and Panache. The Bands are ribbed.

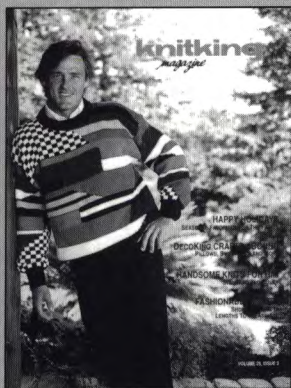

personifies the best of show in a Man's colorful Pullover. Men enjoy the new freedom of bright colors and this is a perfect example. Knit it on the Punch Card or Compuknit/Bulky with Ribbing attachment for the Bands. Yarn is Softon.

A Heavenly Mixture

Yarns are combined in a Weaving pattern for this gorgeous sideways knitted Jacket. The bands are woven horizontally, the back has a yoke with gathered pleat. Knit it with our Venetia, Caprinae, Pebble, Wings and Rubane on standard Punch Card or Electronic machine with weaving capabilities. Pretty buttons add the finishing touch.

A Sweater Dress

Warm and lovely for the coming cool weather. The long line and special needle set-ups for the ribbing, change as you knit and makes for a slim and trim look. Knit it with our Alpine yarn on the Bulky machine with Ribber.

Fashion Smart

Combine two Fairisle Designs with stripes for a very fashionable ensemble. The slim Skirt and inset on the Top is in a small design. The wide stripes for the top cross in the front and can be accented with a pin. The Jacket in a pretty Fairisle Pattern has full needle ribbing stripes for the sleeve cuffs. Knit this outfit with Venetia and Woolana on a standard Punch Card or Electronic machine.

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Holidays Are Fun

All children adore wearing a special Sweater during the holidays and you can knit these two in plenty of time. The little Girl is wearing a Mock Cardigan with Snowman Fairisle border design and an isolated Tree on the left front. Waist, neck and sleeve bands are ribbed... The Boy's Vest has a border design with isolated Santa on the left front. Take note of the new roll bands on the fronts and armholes of the Boy's Vest. Embroider the snowflakes on both garments when completed. Knit them on the Punch Card or Compuknit/Bulky machine with Mirage.



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Celebrate

Wear this mock Cardigan Pullover to all your party functions. It has a Fairisle border design plus an isolated Snowman. The Snowman holds a candy cane you knit separately then sew in place. Note the roll band on the front. Embroider the Snowflakes when garment is completed. Neck, cuffs and waistbands are ribbed. Knit on a Punch Card or Compuknit/Bulky machine with Ribber using Mirage.

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Dressy Creation

Very new and innovative is this Pullover you'll enjoy wearing. It is knitted in sections combining Stockinette stitch with a Fairisle Design. The center stockinette strips are twisted to form the look of large soft cables. A rolled trim down the front and two colors twisted together, accent the neckline. Waist and sleeve bands are ribbed. Knit it on a standard Punch Card or Electronic machine with ribber. The yarns are Sorbet, Angora/wool blend and Mini Pebble.

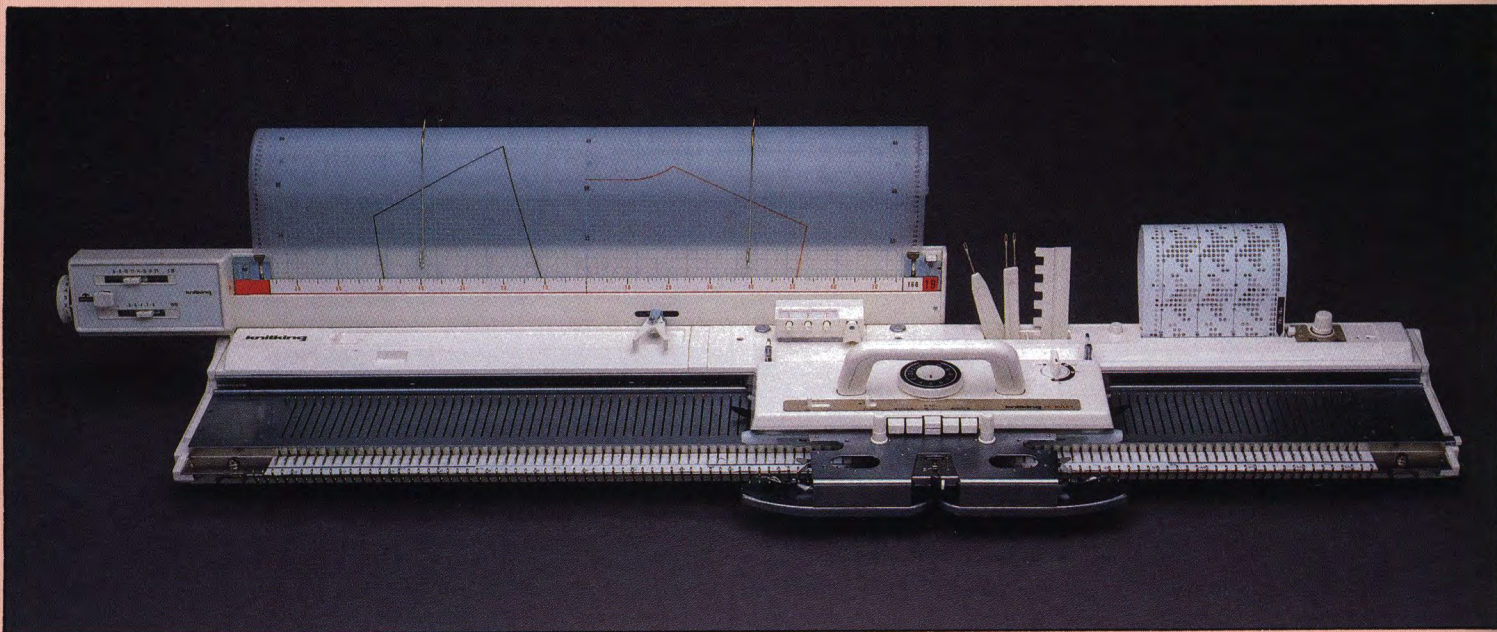

The **Knitking PC Bulky** is easily the most versatile of all Bulky knitting machines. It offers **Knitking's** exclusive **Automatic 24 Stitch Repeat Punch Card Pattern Selection** and **Single Motif Isolation** capabilities. It knits a range of yarns from sport weight to jumbo, including Angora, Mohair, Boucle, Ribbon, Cotton, Acrylic, etc.; with 114 stainless steel needles you can knit up to 38" wide, at 3 stitches per inch. The Tension Control Dial has 30 tension positions for knitting different weights of yarn.

The **PC Bulky** comes complete with **Twin Overhead Yarn Feeders**, **15 Pre-Punched Cards** (you can also make your own pattern stitch cards), **Row Counter**, complete **Tool Kit**, **Stitch Measure Scales for Knitleader**, **Carrying Case**, a detailed, well illustrated, easy-to-understand **Instruction Manual** and a one year warranty on parts and service.

The **Knitleader** is a charting accessory that fits on the back of the knitter. You draw, or trace a garment, full-size, on the furnished Mylar sheet. The chart rotates as you knit, and shows you, on a row-by-row basis, exactly where to increase and decrease stitches.

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GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

THE SAMPLE SWATCH

It is imperative that you knit a sample swatch for every garment. Although you may be using the identical yarn and machine model as the pattern suggests, many variables such as dye lot difference, speed of knitting and just machine to machine differences can all cause a variance in the gauge achieved. Knit Magazine publishes the tension and gauge for each garment shown. We strongly urge you to knit a swatch representing three tensions - the recommended tension, and .1 or .2 higher and lower. These different tensions can be knitted in one piece with waste yarn separating the sections. This will eliminate unnecessary rethreading while allowing you to obtain the gauge published in the magazine.

To make a sample swatch on standard gauge machines cast on 60 stitches with waste yarn. Knit approximately 6 rows. *Mark the tension number for your swatch by making holes. For example 4 eyelet holes for Tension 4, 6 eyelet holes for Tension 6. Knit 6 more rows.

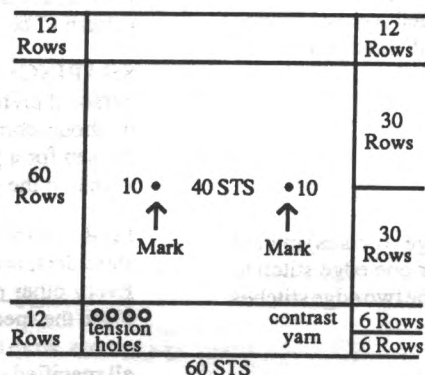
Change to garment yarn and reset row counter to 0. Knit 30 rows (in Pattern stitch). With contrast yarn, mark the 10th stitch FROM EACH SIDE by hand. Knit 30 Rows. Change to waste yarn and knit 6 rows. Change tension up or down for second section and repeat from *. Make third section with another tension. Remove on 12 Rows of waste yarn. Remove the sts. from the machine

by pushing the Carriage across without yarn.

Pull and stretch the swatch both lengthwise and diagonally from corner to corner. Gently block the swatch. Treat the swatch as you would the finished garment before measuring the gauge. For example, if you plan to wash this garment and dry it in the dryer, you should do so, measuring before and after to see the difference.

Measure between the stitches marked and the beginning and ending rows for the inches/cms. knitted. Divide the total number of stitches/rows by the inches measured to calculate sts. and rows per inch.

For Bulky knitters, make swatch with 30 Sts. and 30 Rows. If so desired, or for large pattern repeats, we suggest a wider and longer swatch to provide more accurate gauges.



HEMS

Two methods of knitting hems are described below. Variations on these instructions will allow you to knit plain hems, picot edge hems and more.

Method One

With waste yarn cast on the required number of stitches and knit about 10-12 rows ending with the carriage on the left. Knit 1 Row to the right with Ravel Cord. Change to garment yarn and knit 1 Row to the left at garment body tension. (i.e. Skirt at Tension 4, 1st row at T 4). Turn tension down approximately 2 full tension numbers lower (tighter) and knit to mid point. (i.e. Row 14 of a 28-row hem). Change tension to 1 full point lower than garment body and knit remainder of hem rows. Pick up the stitches from the first row of garment yarn - shown between the stitches of Ravel Cord. Hem is now completed. Proceed with pattern as per chart and instruc-

tions. Remove waste yarn and Ravel Cord when you have completed section.

Method Two

Bring required number of needles to "B" (working) position. Attach cast-on comb. Beginning with the 2nd needle on the LEFT, bring every other needle to "D" or "E" position. Push in both Part buttons. Knit 1 Row to the left. Release the part buttons and drop the cast-on comb. (DO NOT REMOVE cast on comb from work). Knit required number of rows for hem. Attach weights to the back of work close to the cast-on comb (about 1/4" above the comb). Beginning with the 1st needle on the LEFT, bring every other needle to "D" position. Carefully LIFT the cast-on comb and hang loops onto the needles in "D" position. Turn the comb back away from you and make sure the needles are through the loops. Pull the needles out to "E" position and remove the cast-on comb.

BUTTONHOLES

The following methods of buttonholes are the general manner in which small and large buttonholes are created.

Small Buttonholes in Ribbing
Make small eyelet style buttonholes by following chart below.

Buttonhole Transfer
Center St. of Each Bed to Next St. of Other Bed



Large Buttonholes in FNR

Vertical buttonholes are made by knitting each side separately (partial or short-row knitting). Knit the right side first, end with yarn on left. Without breaking yarn, knit left side. The strand of yarn inside the buttonhole can be picked up every other row when knitting the left side, but this is not necessary for a small buttonhole.

SHORT ROWS

Method One

With carriage on opposite side start placing appropriate number of ndls in HP. Knit across and wrap the inside needle. Again, place appropriate number of ndls in HP on opposite side from carriage, knit across and repeat wrapping. The wrapping will eliminate any holes in the knitting.

Method Two - Automatic Wrap

Example follows for shoulder short rows. This method can be used for other Short Rowing as well. For example if pattern says to Short Row at shoulder every other row 7 sts, 1 x and 6 sts. 1 x . . . With carriage on opposite side put 6 sts in HP, knit 1 row across and put one additional needle in HP. Opposite carriage place 6 ndls in HP. Knit 1 row across and bring one extra needle to HP. Repeat until shortrowing is completed.

AT THE SAME TIME - Two functions are to be performed at the same time, such as shaping the neck and shoulder. Be sure to read both instructions before proceeding.

BO - Bind Off. To take off more than 1 St. at a time. When two or more stitches are to be bound off (or cast on) the carriage and yarn must be on the same side as the bind off. If the instruction is, "At R 100 BO 6 Sts on each side.", on the carriage side BO six stitches, knit one row and then bind off six stitches on the other side. See DECR and FF DECR.

BOLT - Slip Stitch Bind Off with a Latch Tool. Knit one row to the left at a tension at least five numbers higher (looser) than the garment tension. Bring all needles to holding position ("E") and then, pick up the first stitch on a latch tool allowing it to slip behind the latch, then pick up the next stitch and pull it through the stitch already on the latch hook, thus creating a slip stitch. If you cannot set the tension at least five full tension numbers higher, knit a row loosely manually.

CO - Cast on stitches for knitting. (CHECK INSTRUCTION MANUALS TO MAKE SURE DIFFERENT METHODS ARE SHOWN) In our instructions, CO is used either for a finished edge at the beginning of the garment, or to add edge stitch(es). If two or more stitches are to be cast on the carriage and yarn must be on the same side as the cast on. If the instruction is, "At R 100 CO 6 Sts on each side.", on the carriage side cast on six stitches, knit one row and then cast on six stitches on the other side.

COR - Carriage on Right

COL - Carriage on Left

DECR - Use the transfer tool to move the edge stitch(es) inward to the next needle. Usually used to transfer one edge stitch to the next needle, but may be used to transfer the two edge stitches to the next two needles.

EON - Every other needle

EOR - Every other row

EOS - Every other stitch

FF DECR - Used to make an even edge for seaming and decorative seams for raglans. If one stitch is to be decreased, use a two-prong transfer tool to move the two edge stitches inward one needle. If two stitches are to be decreased, use a three-prong transfer tool to move the three edge stitches in two needles. If three stitches are to be decreased, use two two-prong transfer tools and move the edge stitches in four needles. See DECR, BO and SHAPING.

FF INCR - To increase one stitch move the two edge stitches outward one needle, then fill the empty needle by picking up a bar from the row below and hanging it on the empty needle.

FNR - Full Needle Rib

G.C. - Garter Carriage

HP - Holding position or "E" position.

INCR - Increase. Usually used for "full-fashion" shaping, see FF Incr., or in conjunction with short row shaping. A simple incr can be made by pulling additional needle on side of carriage out to "E" position and knit across.

MB - Main Bed

MC - Main Color

Ndls - Needles

NWP - Non-working position or position "A"

R(s) - Row(s)

RB - Ribber Bed

RC - Row Counter.

RC 0 - Set RC to zero.

SET PATTERN - Follow the step-by-step instructions in your manual for setting the pattern and carriage controls for the pattern to be knit, e.g., Fairisle, tuck, single motif, etc.

SHAPING: The method used for shaping is a matter of personal preference. In our definitions we have described the methods commonly in use at Knitking. Which method is chosen for a particular pattern depends upon the garment, the yarn and the personal preference of the designer.

SHR - Short Row or Partial Knitting. Used for shaping shoulders, necklines, darts, gores, etc. Set carriage on H(old). **Every other row SHRs:** On the opposite side of the carriage, place the specified number of stitches in holding position, knit across, wrap the inner needle or use an "automatic wrap". After all specified stitches have been placed in HP change the carriage setting to N (knit) to return the needles to WP. **Every row SHRs:** On the side being shaped, place one stitch in HP every row. It is recommended you refer to your manual or an instruction book for detailed instructions about how to short row.

St(s) - Stitch(es)

St. St. - Stockinette stitch.

T - Tension.

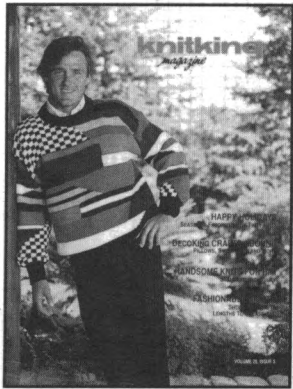
WP - Working Position or "B" position.

WY - Waste yarn.

YM - Yarn marker. To place a yarn marker, use a short piece of contrasting yarn and loop it over the needle specified or the end needle of the row specified.

SEAMING GARMENTS

Any number of popular methods are suggested. We encourage you to experiment with any and all. If a garment in Knitking Magazine requires special seaming information it will be provided in the individual pattern instruction. Otherwise, methods include: linking on the knitting machine, Knitking's Lectrolink, the electric linker, crochet slip stitch, tapestry needles with back stitch sewing by hand. Bar to bar weaving for seamless appearance and seaming on a sewing machine.

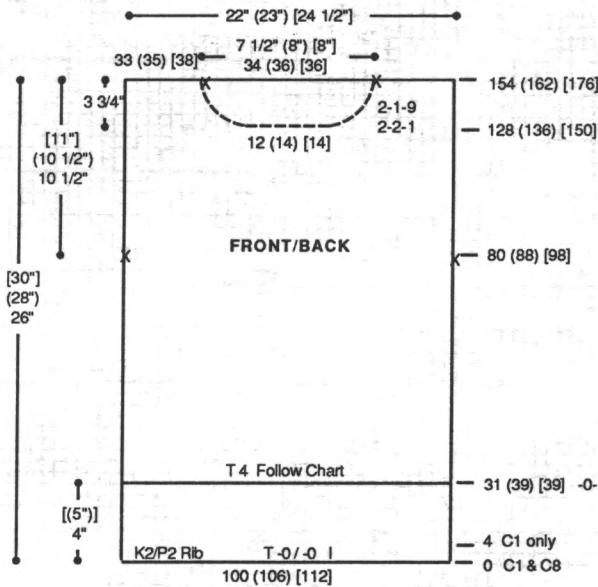

Note: Colors and SHR shapes are reversed for Back/Front, and Sleeves. Follow Color Charts for the order in which to knit SHR sections. See General Instructions for Automatic Wrap.

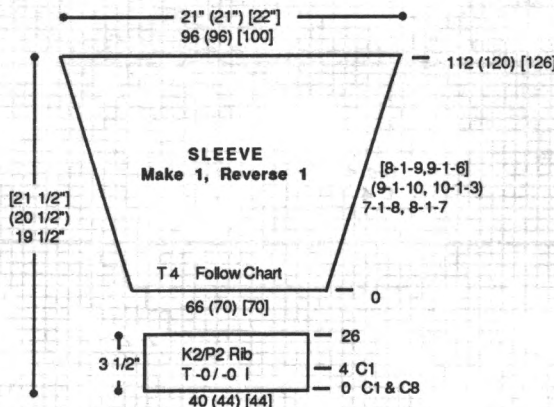
BACK:
With Col. 1 and Col. 8 CO 100 (106) [112] Sts. for K2/P2 Rib. After Selvedge T -0/-0 I. RC 0. Knit 4 Rs. and cut Col. 8. Knit to R 31 [(39)]. Transfer RB Sts. to MB. Reset RC to 0. T 4. Following Chart knit to R 80 (88) [98]. Place a YM on each side for armhole. Continue in pattern to R 154 (162) [176] and mark center 34 [(36)] Sts. for neck opening. Remove shoulder and neckline sts. on separate sections of WY.

FRONT:
Knit same as Back (Reversing SHR shapes and Colors) to R 128 (136) [150]. Shape neckline.

Place center 12 [(14)] Sts. in HP and all sts. to the left in HP. *On neckline edge SHR EOR 2 Sts. 1x and 1 St. 9x. At R 154 (162) [176] remove shoulder sts. on WY. Reset RC to R 128 (136) [150] and shape remaining neckline edge from *, reversing shapings. Remove shoulder sts. on WY.



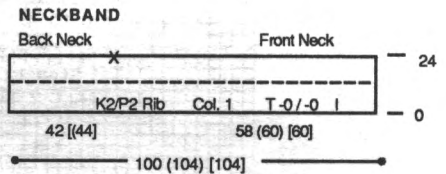
SLEEVE:
Make 1, Reverse 1. With WY CO 66 [(70)] Sts. After several rows, end with 1 row Ravel Cord to the right. RC 0. T 4. Following Chart knit in pattern while incr. on each side every 7 Rs. 1 St. 8x and every 8 Rs. 1 St. 7x (every 9 Rs. 1 St. 10x and every 10 Rs. 1 St. 3x) [every 8 Rs. 1 St. 9x and every 9 Rs. 1 St. 6x]. At R 112 (120) [126], knit 1 R at T 10 and BOLT.



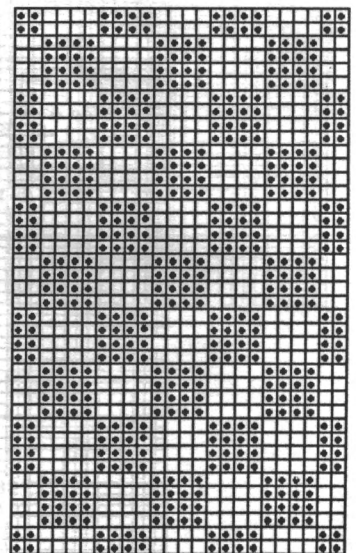
SLEEVE CUFF: Make 2. With Col. 1 and Col. 8 CO 40 [(44)] Sts. for K2/P2 Rib. After Selvedge T -0/-0 I. RC 0. Knit 4 Rs. and cut Col. 8. Knit to R 26. Transfer RB Sts. to MB. With purl side facing, rehang lower edge of sleeve decr. evenly across. Knit 1 R at T 10 and BOLT.

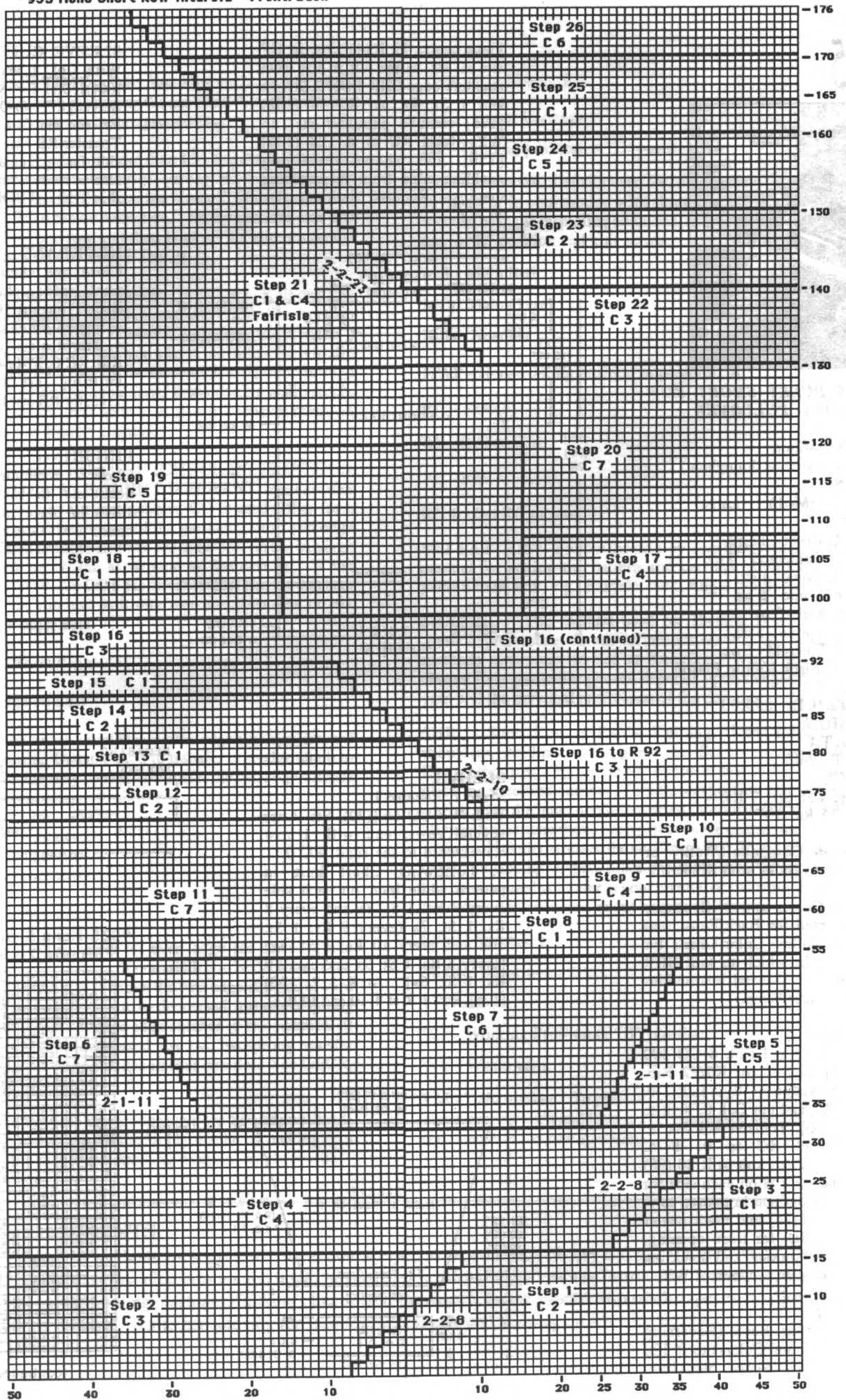
NECKBAND:
Close one shoulder first. With purl side facing, rehang Back/Front on 100 [(104)] ndls. as shown on chart. Knit 1 R at T 4. Transfer sts. to RB for K2/P2 Rib. RC 0. T -0/-0 I. Knit to R 24, knitting last row at T 8/4, Transfer RB sts. to MB and BOLT.

FINISHING:
Close all remaining seams. Fold neckband to inside and whip stitch in place to form doubled band.

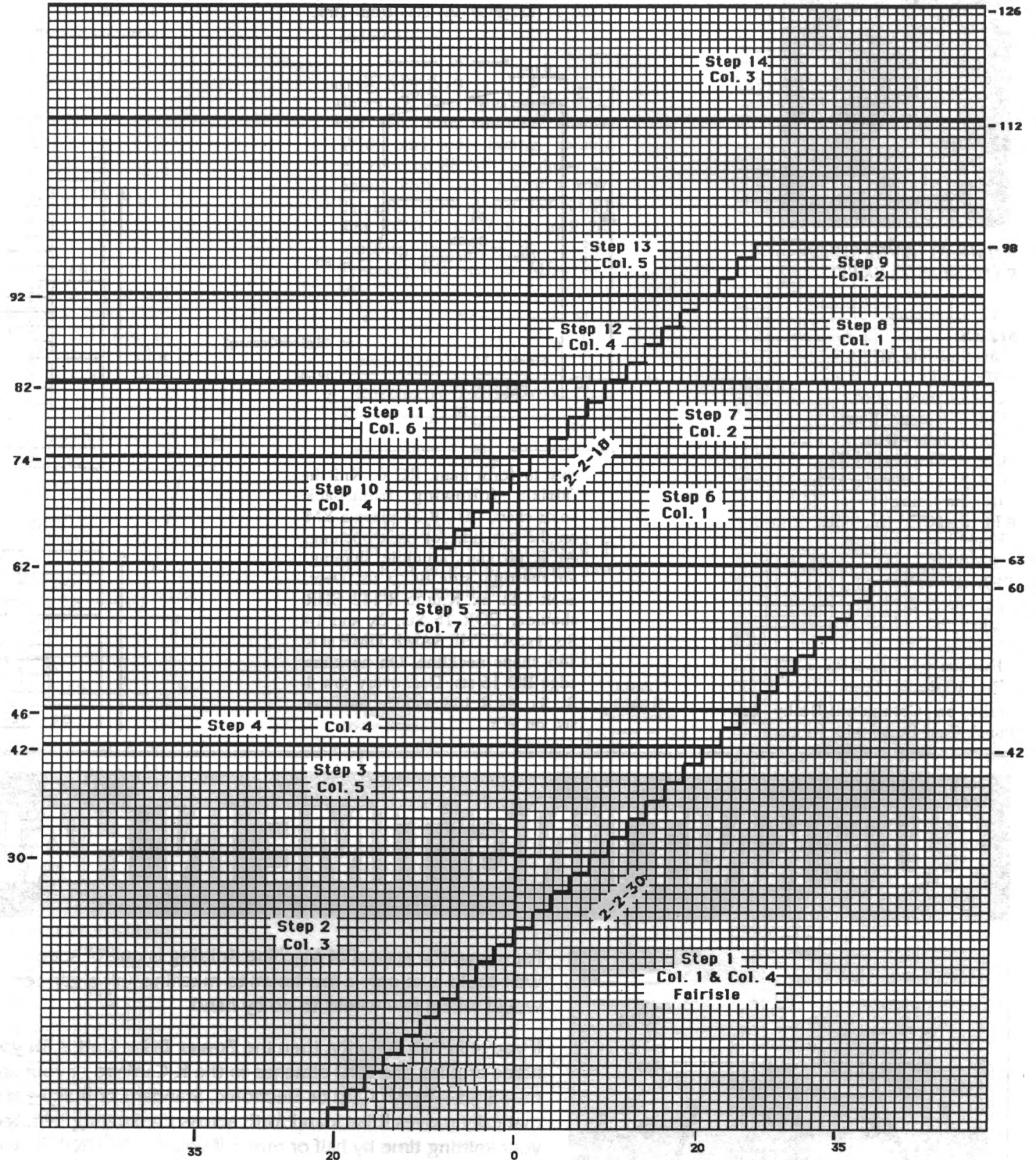

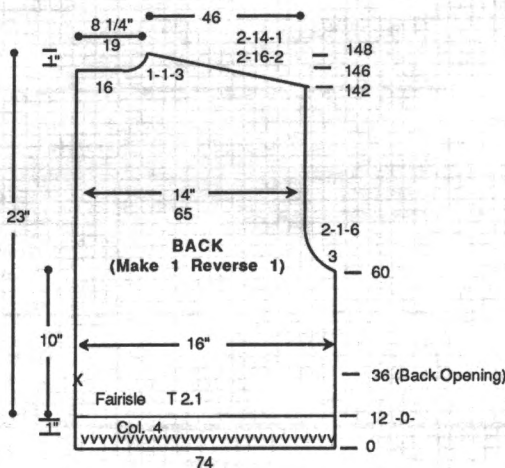

FRONT: Make 1, Reverse 1. Knit front same as back, omitting marker for back opening, to R 126. Shape neckline. On neckline edge BO 9 Sts. Decr. every row 1 St. 5x and EOR 1 St. 5x. At R 142 SHR shoulder EOR 16 Sts. 2x and 14 Sts. 1x. At R 148 remove shoulder sts. on WY.



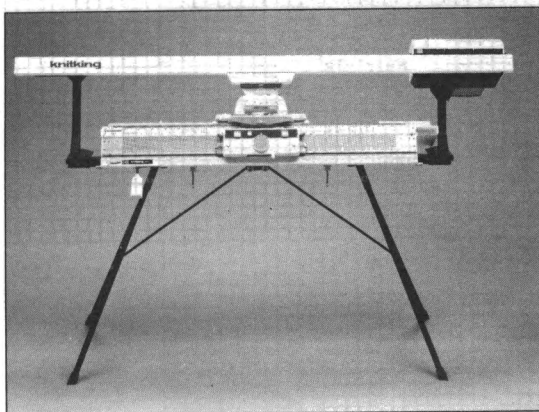
row to form hem. RC 0. Knit in fairisle following front/back color chart. At R 36 place a YM on the left side for back opening. At R 60 start armhole shaping. On the right side BO 3 sts. Decr. EOR 1 St. 6x. Knit to R 142. SHR shoulder EOR 16 Sts. 2x and 14 Sts. 1x. AT THE SAME TIME at R 146 shape neckline. On neckline edge BO 16 sts. Dec. every row 1 St. 3x. At R 148 remove shoulder sts. on WY.

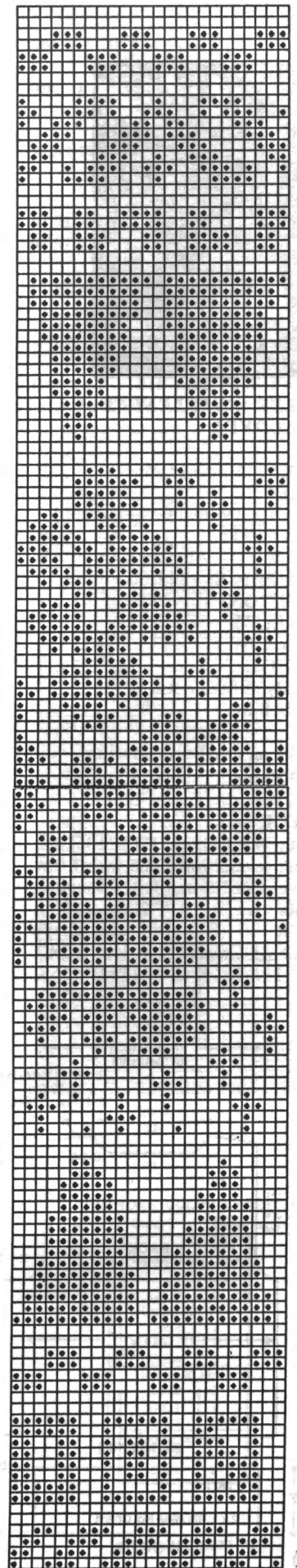

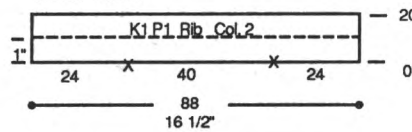
SLEEVE CUFF: Make 2.

With purl side facing, rehang lower edge of sleeve on 42 ndls. decr. evenly across. With Col. 2 knit 1 row at T 2.1. Transfer EOS to RB for K1/P1 Rib. RC 0. T 0/0 I. Knit to R 20, knitting last row at T 8/4. Transfer RB sts. to MB and BOLT.

NECKBAND:

Join back seam from marker up to the top. Join shoulder seams. With purl side facing, rehang neckline on 88 ndls. as shown on chart. With Col. 2 knit 1 row. Transfer EOS to RB for K1/P1 Rib. RC 0. T 0/0 I. Knit to R 20, knitting last row at T 8/4. Transfer RB sts. to MB and BOLT.

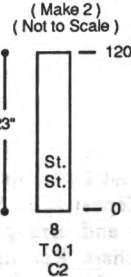

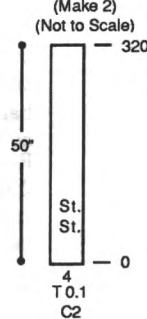
FRONT BAND: Make 2.

With Col. 2 "e" CO 8 sts. RC 0. T 0.1. Knit to R 120, knitting last row at T 10 and BOLT.

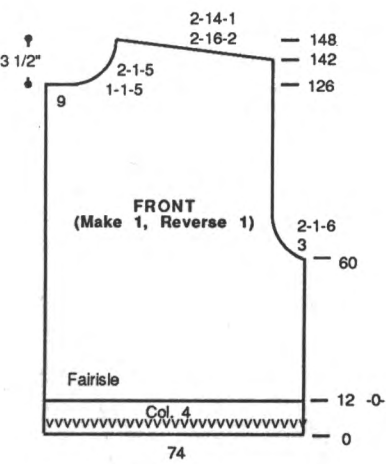


CORD: Make 2.

With Col. 2 "e" CO 4 sts. RC 0. T 0.1. Knit to R 320, knitting last row at T 10 and BOLT.

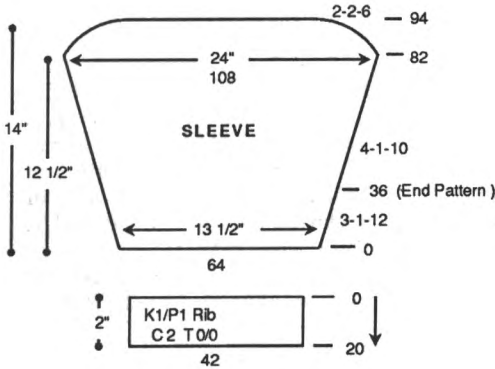
FINISHING:

Iron lining on back, front and sleeves. Fold neckband to inside and whip stitch in place. Attach front bands. Close all remaining seams. Pull cord through the bottom hem.



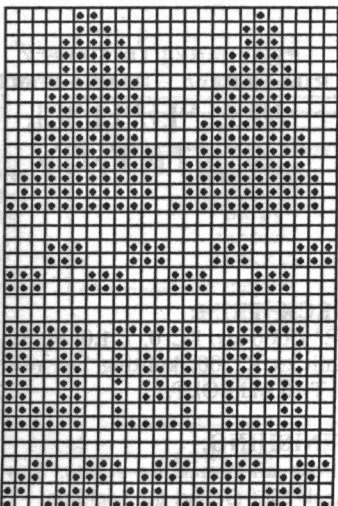
SLEEVE:

Make 2 the same. With WY CO 64 sts. After several rows, end with 1 row Ravel Cord to the left. RC 0. T 2.1. Knit in fairisle following sleeve color chart while incr. on each side

knitking technical tips

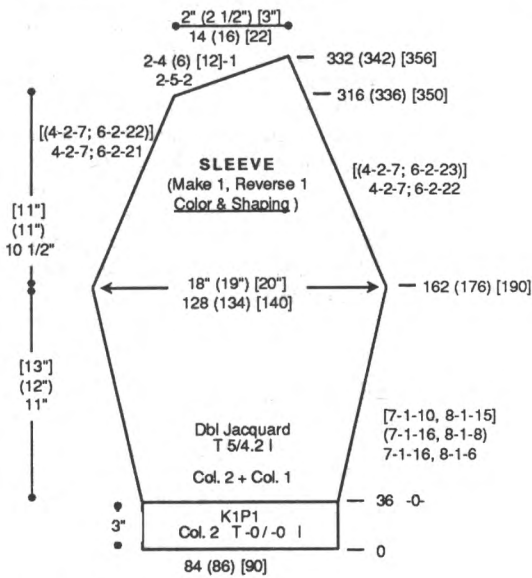
One of the niftiest accessories available for all standard-gauge Knitking machines is the automatic linking device known as the **Auto Li**. Loyal users will attest to its handiness for both linking two garment sections together and for putting a finished edge bind-off on your work.

Occasionally, though, we do get calls from new users of this device who complain that the bind-off is not "clean," with dropped stitches and other undesireables. These problems, though, can easily be overcome by following the hints listed below:

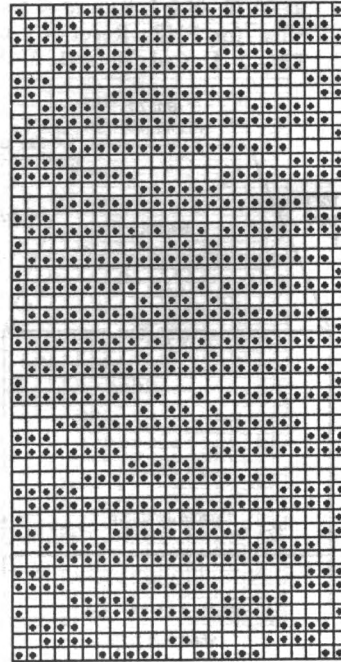


- ☞ Before starting the bind-off, make sure to knit the last row at a tension of 10.
- ☞ Remove the Cast On Comb, and put one Claw Weight at the right edge of the knitting, near the top (the **Auto Li** moves from right-to-left).
- ☞ As you begin using the **Auto Li**, use your left hand to pull slightly down and towards you on the knitted garment section. This will insure that the stitches remain properly positioned on the needles for optimum bind-off. **THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT!**
- ☞ As you continue binding-off, follow your work with the Claw Weight by continuing to hang it on the right edge, every so often. Doing this, especially on a very large knitted section, will enable you to maintain the proper weighting on the portion of the garment section that is ready to be bound off. That is, it will maintain a slight downward pressure close to the work at hand.

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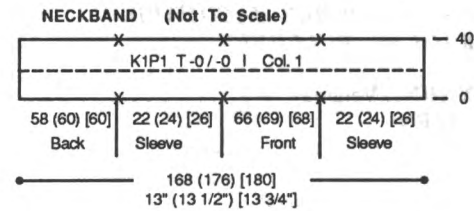

Back: With purl side facing, rehang lower edge of back on 78 (84) [92] ndls. decr. evenly across. With Col. 1 (2 strands) and Col. 2 (1 strand) twisted, and Col. 4, knit 1 R. Transfer EOS to RB for K1/P1 Rib. RC 0. T 1/1 I. Knit 22 Rs, knitting last row at T 8/4 and BOLT.

Front: With purl side facing, rehang lower edge of fronts on 78 (84) [92] ndls. overlapping the two front sides as shown on chart. Knit the same as Back.

SLEEVE CUFF:

With purl side facing, rehang lower edge of sleeve on 34 (34) [40] ndls. With Col. 3 and Col. 2 twisted, and Col. 4, knit 1 R. Transfer EOS to RB for K1/P1 Rib. RC 0. T 0.2/0.2 II. Knit 18 Rs, knitting last row at T 8/4 and BOLT.



FINISHING:

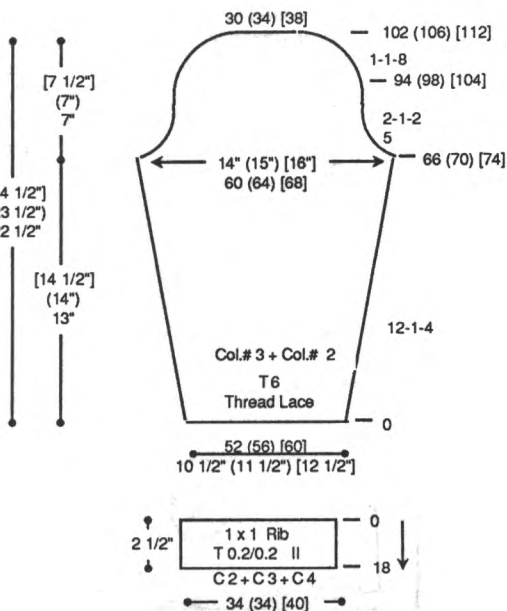
Cord: With Col. 3 "e" CO 2 Sts. T 8. St. St. Knit approx. 10 yds. Press flat.

Small Leaf (optional): Make 12. With Col. 3 "e" CO 2 Sts. T 6. St. St. Incr. 1 St. by bringing 1 ndl. on carr. side to WP until there are 6 Sts. K 2 Rs. Decr. 1 St. each side every R until there are 2 Sts. Cut yarn and pull end through 2 Sts. and lock.

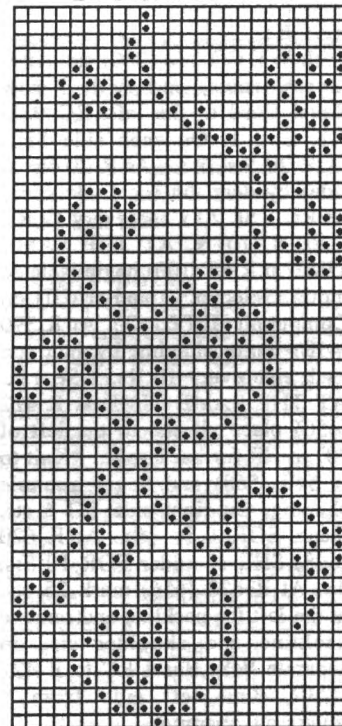
Pearls: Restring 1/2 pkg. of pearls leaving a long extra length of thread to work with.

DecoKing: Use 1/4" feed folder. Starting at the shoulder, make petals with ndl. in up position by pulling a small amount of cord through. Run the thread with pearls under the petal and twist before locking the petal. Bring up a pearl. Repeat for next petal making sure you are stitching over the thread. Bring up a pearl or two at random along the side of the cord alternating from one side to the other. To wrap pearls over the cord bring 4 or 5 pearls over and under the cord placing thread under cord and continue stitching. Attach the leaves and slip tail under the cord and lock. If you run out of pearls, restring. If you need more thread, cut thread and release the remaining pearls and knot.

Rehang front for Waistband. Close all seams. Gather sleeve cap to approx. 3" and sew in sleeve. Crochet trim around edges. With Col. 3 and Col. 2, Single Crochet 1 R backward into EOS using hook that comes with machine.

BLISTER STITCH VEST WITH DECOKING TRIM

This is a variation of Knit Magazine Pattern 893 (Volume 24, Issue 4). After knitting Blister Stitch Vest, embellish the vest with simple DecoKing stitchwork. Using 1 spool Night Music yarn, small DecoKing Feed Finger, stitch the pattern in the grooves of each blister stitch as shown below:



T-SHIRT WITH LACE, PEARLS AND FABRIC APPLIQUE

- SUPPLIES:**
DecoKing II Custom Embellishment Machine
1 Plain T-Shirt
Size 18 needle
1 Spool Rubane yarn
Fabric for Applique

1. Place fabric appliques randomly on a T-Shirt.
2. Use 1/2" lace trim with eyelet center as this eliminates extra bulk in the center of the trim, and will provide a groove where the pearls will be placed.
3. Take a string of decorative pearls and bring up into work approximately 10 pearls at a time and stitch over the string with monofilament thread in DecoKing needle. There are no other feed fingers/folders or other DecoKing attachments required on the machine for this trim.
4. With large Feed Finger, place Rubane trim and pearls around fabric appliques. (See Pattern 953 this issue for additional pearl placement instructions).

HOLIDAY WREATH SWEATSHIRT

- SUPPLIES:**
1 Spool 1/2" Solid Ribbon for Wreath (100 yards)
1 Plain Sweatshirt
Fabric Marker with Disappearing Ink
Small Decorative Beads for Trim

INSTRUCTIONS:
Wreath and Message:
Make a template for a 10-1/2" circle with an opening in center

of 5", round. Sketch onto sweatshirt. Sketch lettered message onto sweatshirt. Thread machine with 1/2" Ribbon and use a side-to-side motion filling in the space for the wreath. Place beads randomly as you go, or apply after ribbon has filled wreath space. With Small Feed Finger, Size 18 needle and Spool of Frizette yarn, stitch over lettered message.

For photo: Place photo in between lightweight clear plastic and a piece of sweatshirt material for backing. With Size 18 needle, trim edge around round "picture frame" with 1/2" gold lace trim. Begin with a loop at the top. Hand stitch a pin on the backing of the photo so photo can be removed before laundering sweatshirt.

SNOWFLAKE SWEATSHIRT

SUPPLIES:

1/2" Lace
Size 18 Needle
1 Plain Sweatshirt
Frizette for Lettering

INSTRUCTIONS:

Snowflake and Message:

With marker sketch a snowflake design (taken from any crochet type pattern or stitchwork guide). Remember to leave a 5" circle opening in center of snowflake. Place needle to one side of 1/2" Feed Folder. Thread with lace. See Wreath Sweatshirt for Letter Instructions.

For photo:

See Instructions for Wreath Sweatshirt, using silver lace trim around photo frame.

SWEATSHIRT WITH CUT-OUTS AND APPLIQUE TRIM:

SUPPLIES:

1 Plain Sweatshirt
Fabric appliques
Ribbon and yarn trims
Size 20 Needle

INSTRUCTIONS: Cut off lower 5" of sweatshirt for crop-top effect. Cut off lower 6" (or desired length) of sleeve for short-sleeve. Place several fabric, ultra leather, or vinyl

appliques in a random design on sweatshirt applying with TuffFuse. With 1/4", 1/2" ribbon or cords knitted on knitting machine, stitch around appliques and outlines of shapes. Trim out center next to stitching for cut-outs.

SWEATSHIRT WITH FREE FORM APPLIQUES AND DECOKING TRIM:

SUPPLIES:

1 Plain Sweatshirt
Fabric For Appliques
Ribbon Trims
Knitted Cord trims
Frizette yarn Trim

INSTRUCTIONS:

Make fabric appliques and apply to sweatshirt using TuffFuse. Trim around edge of each applique in either ribbon, yarn or frizette. Cut off cuff of sweatshirt cuffs and roll back twice to create cuff. Hand stitch cuff into place.

DECOKING PILLOW:

PATTERN DESIGN DRAWING AVAILABLE WITH KIT PURCHASE OF YARN. Kit includes yarn and pattern.

1 Pillow Form Batting
Duck Cloth Fabric

Transfer pattern with fabric marker to fabric. Using small feed finger, Size 18 needle, thread required color and stitch in small back and forth movements to fill spaces completely.

Tea Towel with Cross Stitch Opening
Decorative Threads (Frizette)
Small Feed Finger

INSTRUCTIONS:

Draw message of design with marking pen and outline or fill with decorative ribbons and trims. Great for holidays!

HELPFUL DECOKING HINTS

It is most helpful to use a backing when you DecoKing on knits or fine fabric. Freezer Paper makes an excellent backing, as the shiny (waxy) side can be ironed to the wrong side of the knit or fabric and will be lightly adhered to the surface, thus eliminating stretching and twisting when applying decorative stitches. You do not need backing on sweatshirts.

If you run into a problem with the bobbin thread . . . and the monofilament seems to be coming through on the wrong side (the back)—tighten your tension!

Use a Size 18 needle when you are applying a lightweight trim. A smaller needle means less abuse to the trim . . . bigger needle . . . bigger holes!

Ever find the feed finger skipping? Catching yarn only occasionally? First, make sure the needle is aligned. Move it slightly to one side or the other. Move the fabric through the machine more slowly. Many times you may be moving the fabric too quickly in a different direction and it will get off-track just a little.

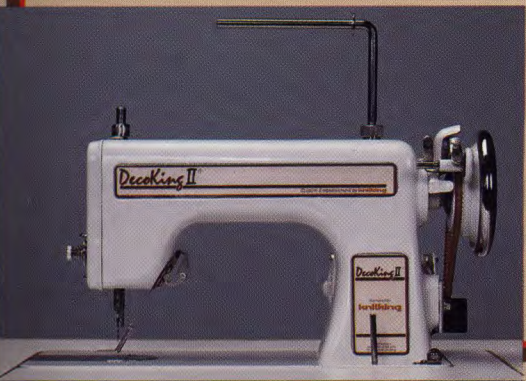

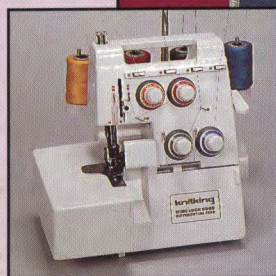
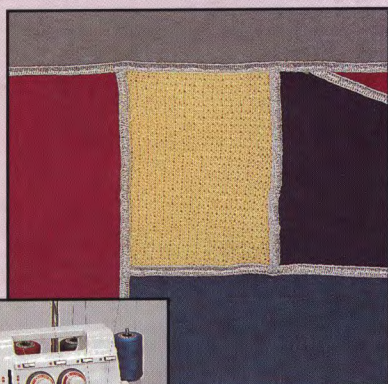
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
