If the central line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is done simultaneously with reversed shapings.

If the central line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is done separately with reversed shapings.

Stitch size: These numbers are recommended by us, but mus be controlled by means of a test square, knitted on your machine with your wool.

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i.e. to all needles which are in Working Position on front and back bed.

Exception: For tubular, the necessary stitches are only given for one bed, on the other bed, the same number of needles has to be put into Working position. In these cases, the sign for tubular ○ respective-ly halftubular C or ∩ is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

+3×2•8.R

means: 3 times incr. 2 stitches in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).

-19×3•7.R

means: 19 times decr. 3 stitches in every 7th row (2 stitches at back, 1 stitch at front and vice versa).

-17×1•2./3.R

means: 17 times decr. 1 stitch, alternately after 2 rows and 3 rows.

▲-4×8•2.R

means: work with pushers and knit graduations (Lock BX). Gradually after every 2nd row return 8 pushers into Rest Position (for double bed work 4 pushers each on back and front bed). When all graduations are finished, put pushers into Neutral Position and knit normally with all needles and without pushers.

Number of stitches and inches:

136 = 8"

means: a total of 136 stitches (for K/K 68 stitches each on front and back) make a width of 8".

○ 146 = 17"

means: cast on 146 stitches each on front and back for tubular which makes a width of 17 ins.

Test square and PASSAP chart

If you always knit 100 stitches and 100 rows for your test square, you save the trouble of counting rows and stitches and can read any desired measurement in our PASSAP chart (at the end of this book).

Horizontally: Across the top you will find the measurements in inches of your test square of 100 stitches and 100 rows; range from 4" to 20", split up in two charts.

Vertically: Required measurements in inches for your garment. From top to bottom, on the left and right, you will find the number of inches measured for your garment. These numbers range from 1/2" to 40" on each chart.

Example: 100 stitches of your test square measure, say, 10". For your garment, however, you need a width of, say, 8". Look in the horizontal column under 10" and in the vertical column under 8". Where both columns meet you find the number 80, i.e. you have to cast on 80 stitches (40 on each bed).

In the same way you find the desired number of rows on the chart. Numbers for measurements, which you do not find on the chart, you may obtain by a simple addition.

How to divide the work. Knit stitches, which should temporarily rest, like a buttonhole, with contrast yarn. Put the needles into Neutral Position. Thus you obtain long loops, which hold the stitches. Later on you just have to unravel the contrast yarn and the stitches will slip back to their needle heads.

PASSAP 12. Each model can also be done on PASSAP 12, if you choose a PASSAP 12 pattern. - Fairisle patterns can be done on PASSAP 12 with heel deckers, which are available at any PASSAP dealer.

Baby-Coat with hood

Size: for 6 to 8 months. Material: appr. 4 ozs 3-ply baby wool, 2 buttons.

Stitch size: 5 1/4

Test square: 100 sts = 15 3/4 ins. 100 rows = 11 ins.

Pattern: black strippers

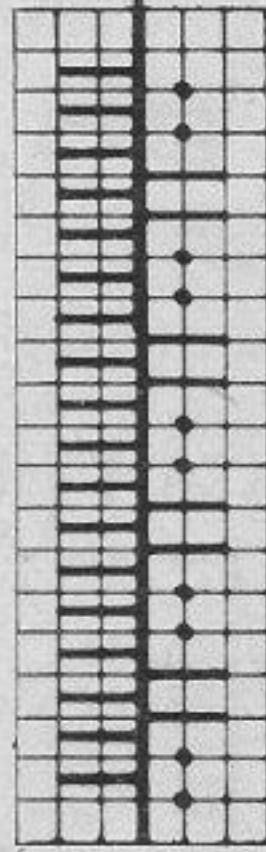


Fig. I: A = tubular. B, C, D = pattern.

Fig. XII hood: A = pattern, knitting 8 sts stocking st at one end for front edge.

Note: Exceptionally the indications refer to the sts for the back bed only. Decr. or incr. the racking st on front bed as required. To make up: Pin out parts to size, press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. At front stitch half of edging inside, also the front edge of hood. Join back seam of hood. Around neckline and lower edge of hood work one row of double crochet. Make a cord and join hood to coat. On the front right make 2 loops and at the left attach 2 buttons.

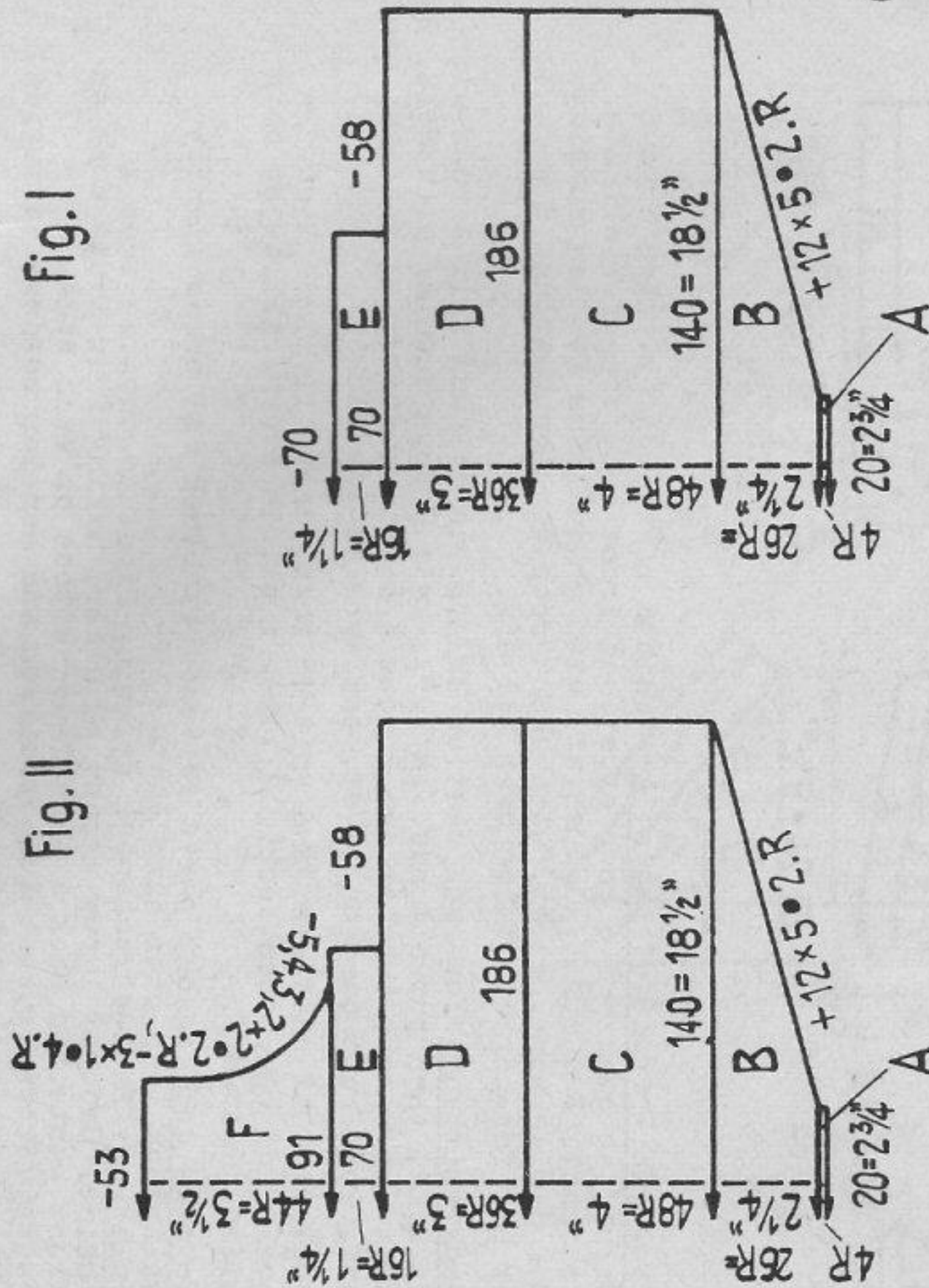
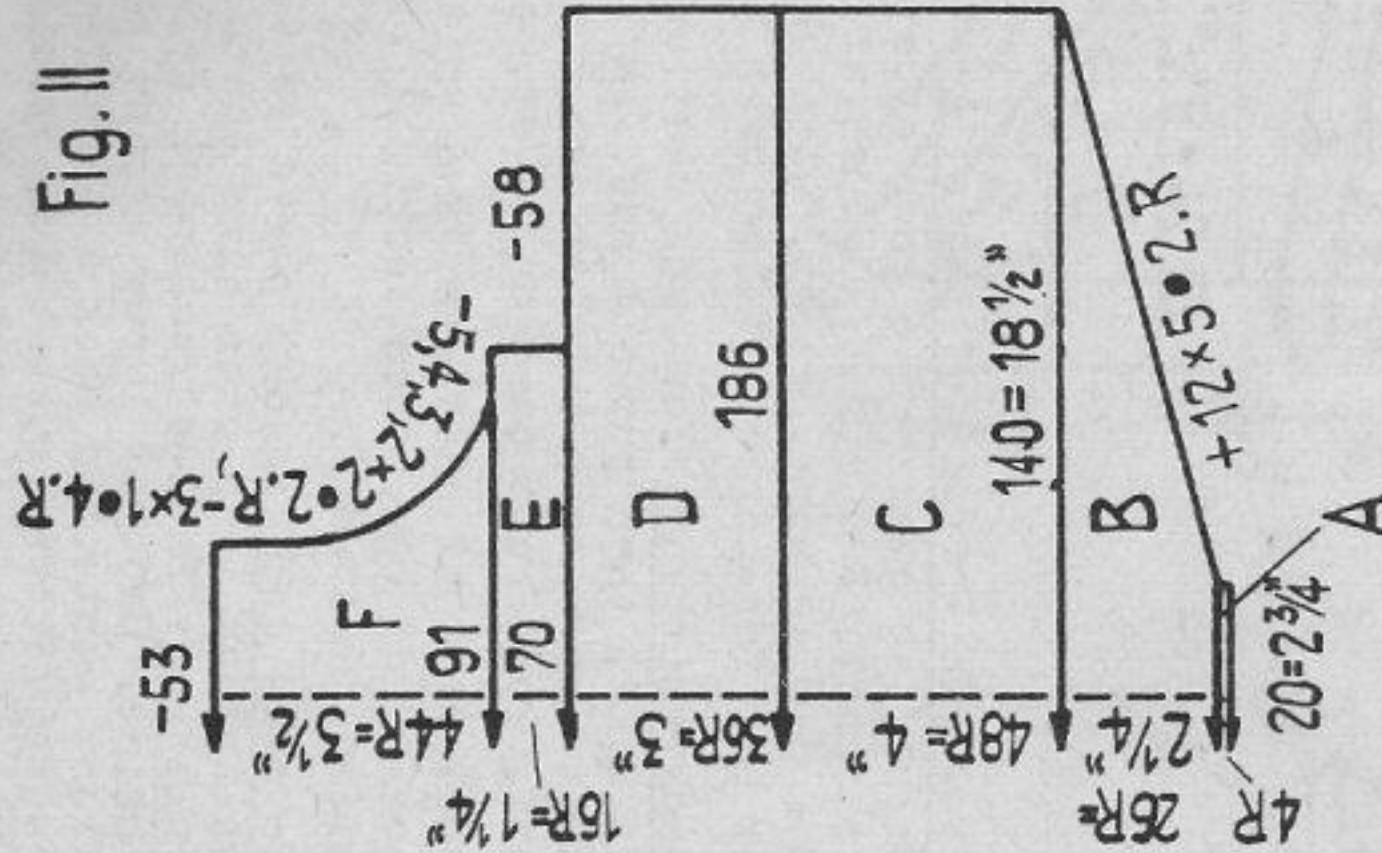

Baby's rompers.

Size: appr. 10 to 14 months. Materials: medium cotton yarn, 5 ozs. white, 1 oz. red, 2 buttons.

Stitch size: stocking st. and pattern 4, border 1 3/4

Test square: 100 sts = 13 1/2 ins. 100 rows = 8 1/4 ins.

Pattern:

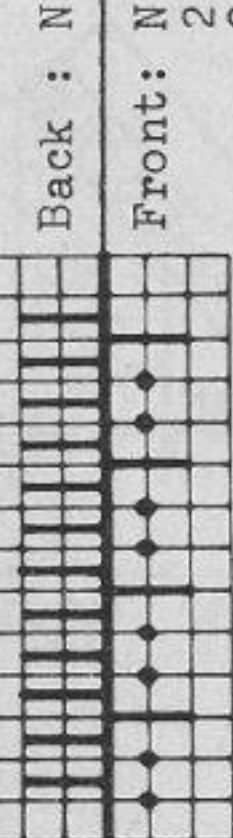


Fig. I: A = stocking st. at front bed. B and C = stocking st.

D = transfer all sts to back, then pattern. E = put all sts onto stitchholder, then, over 70 nds, hang the sts. back to the machine in 1:1 division. Knit 8 rows in 1:1, then work an open work row and knit again 8 rows. F = transfer all sts to back, pattern.

Fig. II: A, B, C, D and E: work as for Fig. I. Cast off.

Legbands: knit twice. Cast an 80 sts and knit stocking st 4 rows white, 6 rows red, 4 rows white. Cast off.

Bib-band: Cast on 120 sts, knit stocking st. 4 rows white, 6 rows red, 4 rows white. Cast off.

Straps: knit twice. Cast on 20 sts for tubular and knit 240 rows. Now, for point, knit 10 rows, at the same time dec, at both ends front and back 1 st in every 2nd row.

To make up: Pin out parts to size, press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch legbands and bib-band into position, st by st, at first on the outside, then slip stitch inside. Attach straps and sew 1 button to each point. At the back make two loops for the buttons. Make a cord, 47 ins long and pull through open work row.

Pullover and Pants

for babies 10-12 months. Material: approx. 5 ozs. 5-ply baby wool, light blue, 8 small buttons, elastic.

Stitch size: stocking stitch, pattern 4 1/2, welts 2.

Test square: 100 sts. = 13 ins. 100 rows = 8 3/4 ins.

Pattern:

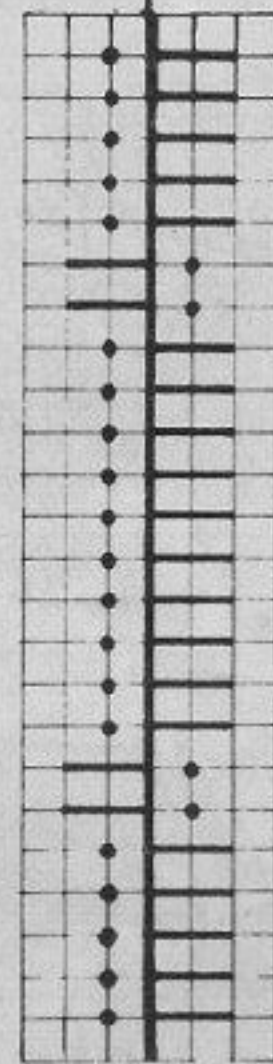


Fig. I: A = 1:1. B, C and D = pattern.

Fig. IXa - back of pants: A = knit 6 rows tubular, then 6 rows st.st. at back and 6 rows st.st. at front bed, transfer all sts. to front. B = st.st. with graduations. C = st.st. D = st.st. with graduations for leg shaping. E = divide work, st.st. with short rows for leg shaping. F = st.st. over all sts. for border of leg.

Fig. IXb - front of pants: A = knit 6 rows tubular, then 6 rows st.st. at back and 6 rows st.st. at front bed, transfer all sts. to front. B = st.st. C = st.st. with graduations for leg shaping. D = divide work, st.st. with short rows for leg shaping. E = st.st. for border of leg over all sts.

Neck trimming: For back cast on 22 sts. in 1:1 and knit 4 rows with St.S. 2, then put all nds. in W.P., knit 8 rows tubular with St.S. 4 1/2. Knit a few rows tubular and 2 rows K/K with contrasting wool and cast off. For front cast on 44 st. and work as for back.

Gusset: Cast on 3 sts. and knit 48 rows, incr. 11 times 1 st. in every 2nd row, then decr. 11 times 1 st. in every 2nd row on both sides. Cast off.

To make up: Pin out parts to measure, block and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth.

Fullover: Back-stitch neck trimming first to outside then to inside. Crochet 1 row around shoulder, making four loops each on front parts. On back attach four buttons on each side.

Pants: Stitch gusset into position and hem leg borders to inside. Pull elastic through waist.

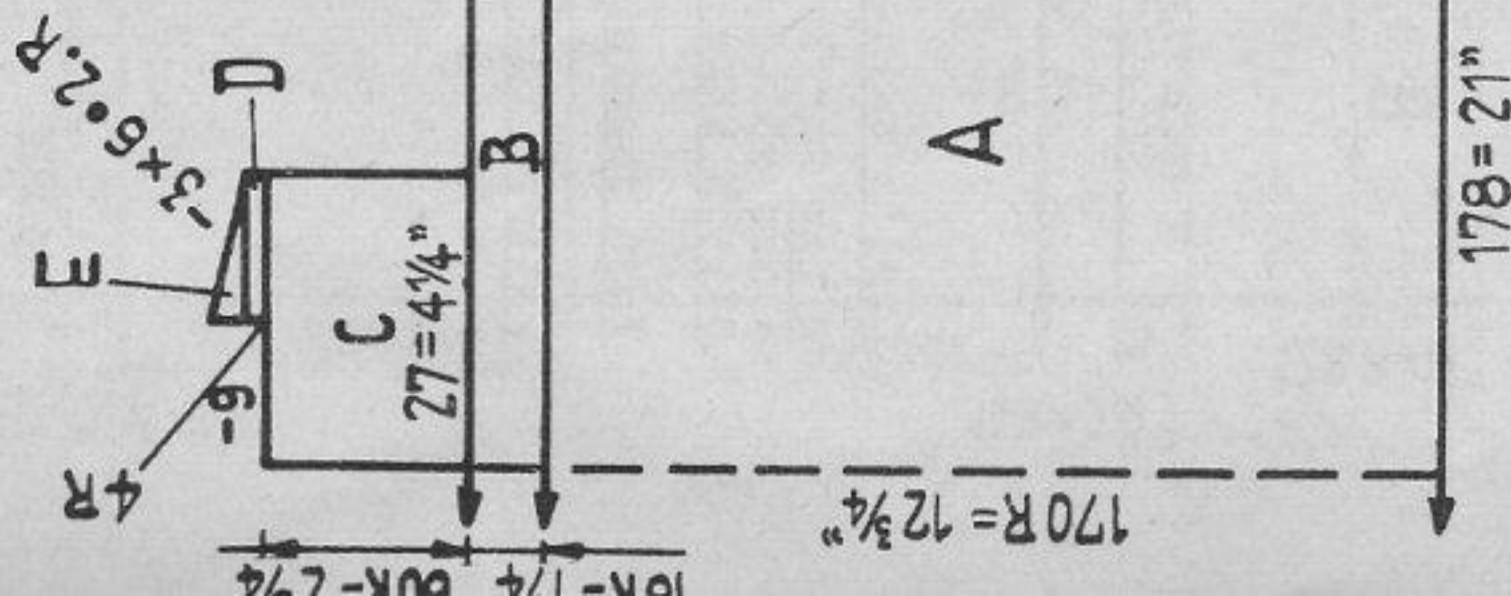
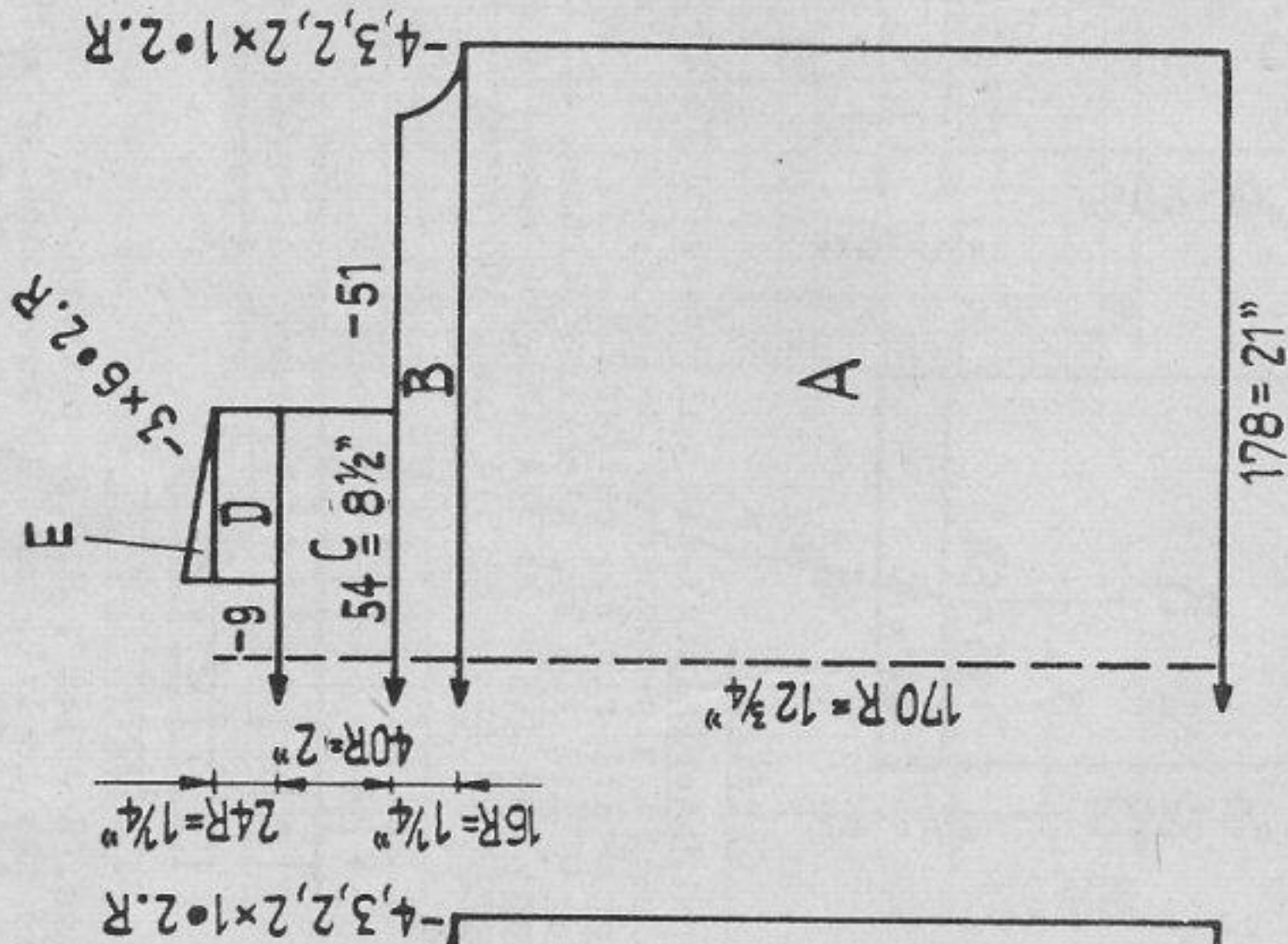


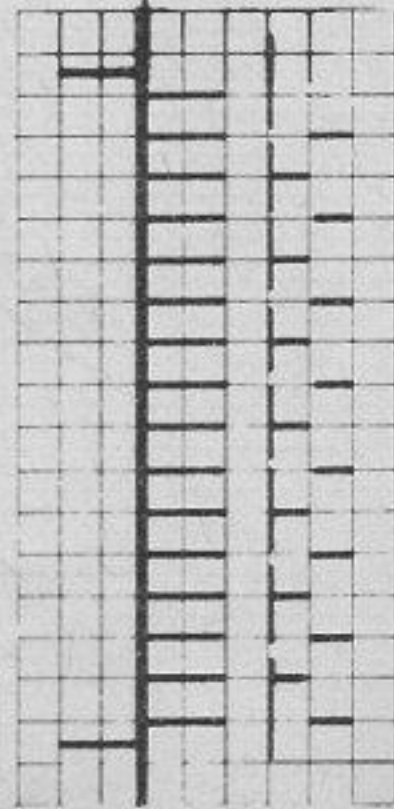

Child's dress with matching knickers

Size: approx. 1 1/2 - 2 years. **Material:** approx. 7 ozs. fine pale blue baby wool, 1 oz. white, 4 buttons.
Stitch size: st. st. 3 1/2, pattern 3 1/2.
Test square: st. st.: 100 sts. = 11 3/4 ins. 100 rows = 7 1/2 ins.
 pattern: 100 sts. = 15 ins. 100 rows = 4 3/4 ins.

Back: N 2 rows N 0 pale blue
Front: 2 rows AX 2 rows white

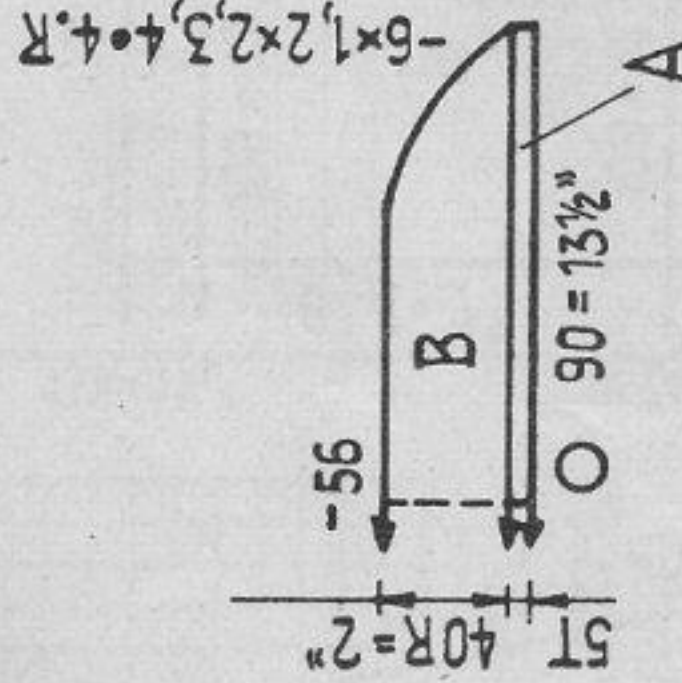

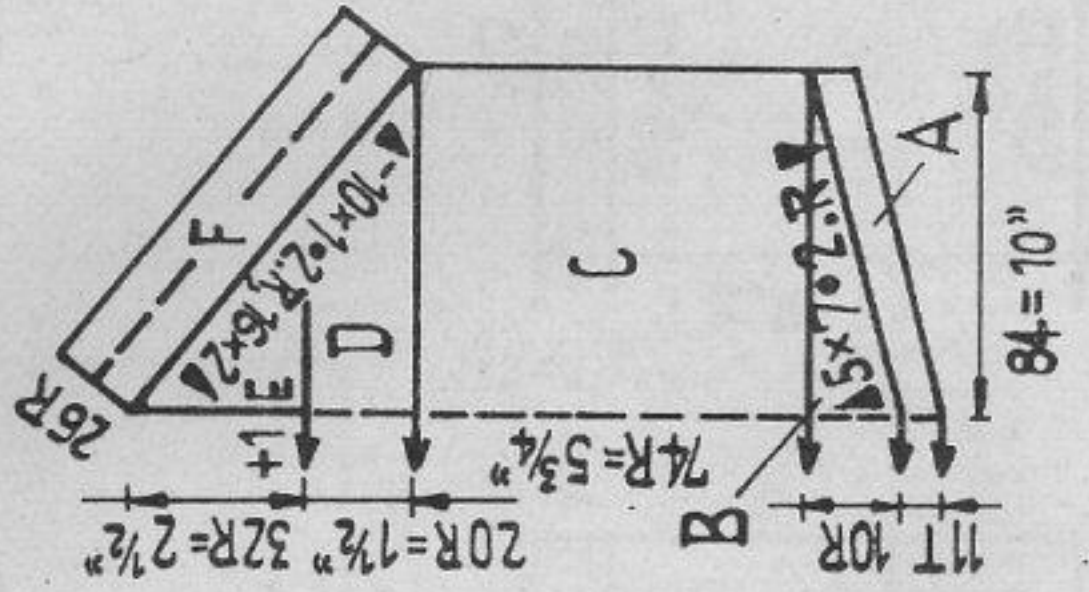

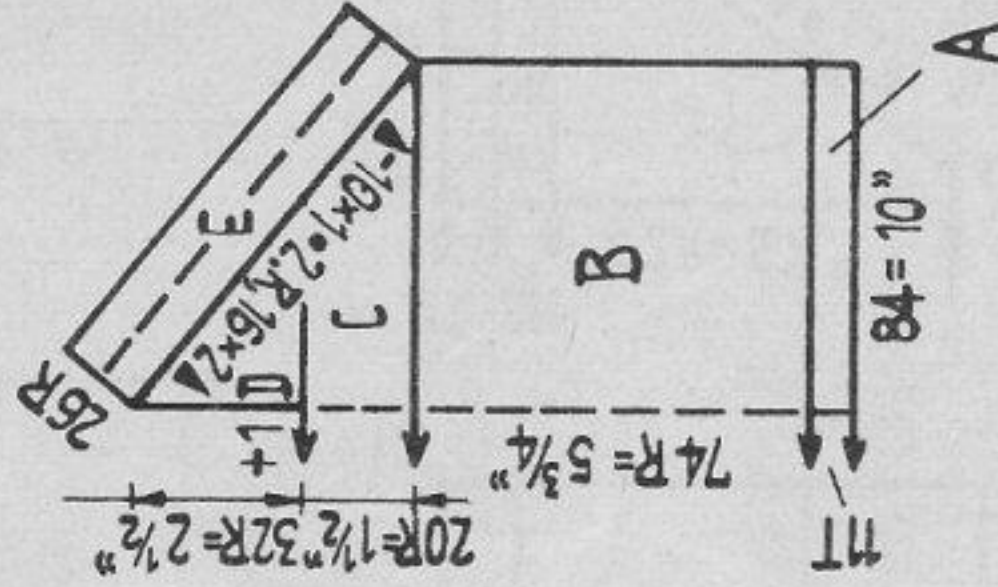

Cast on 5 sts., knit 64 rows, whilst at each end incr. 1 st. 15 times in every 2nd row, then decr. at each end 1 st. in every 2nd row. **Neck trimming:** Cast on 86, knit 10 rs. st. st. cast-off.

To make up: Pin out parts to size, press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Gather and stitch cap sleeve into position leaving at both side 1 1/4" open from armhole-edge. Stitch neck trimming into position first outside then slip-stitch inside. Crochet round back opening making 4 loops. Attach buttons. Sew seam inside. **Knickers:** Join seams, stitch gusset into position. Sew leg-seams to inside. Pull elastic through waist.

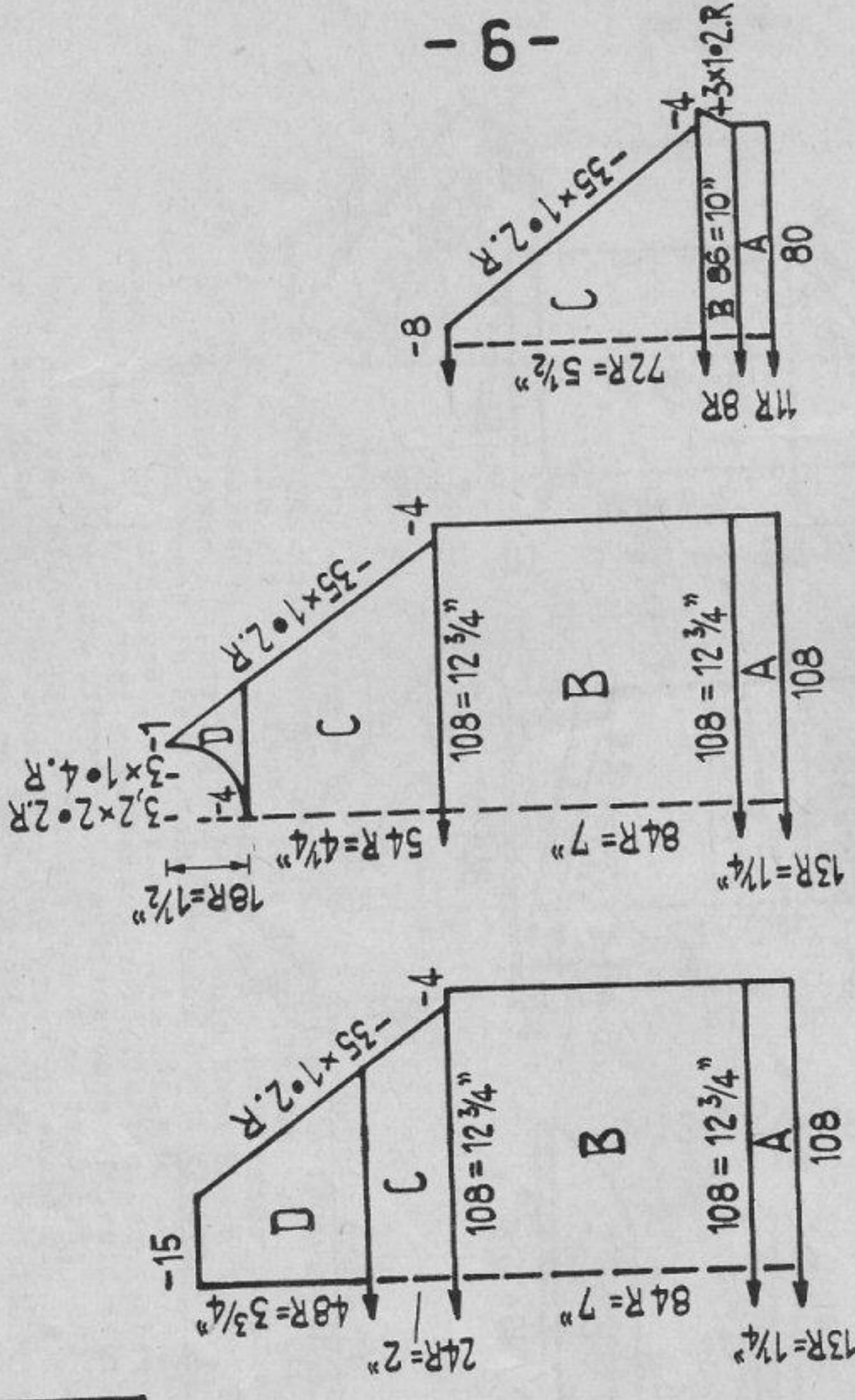
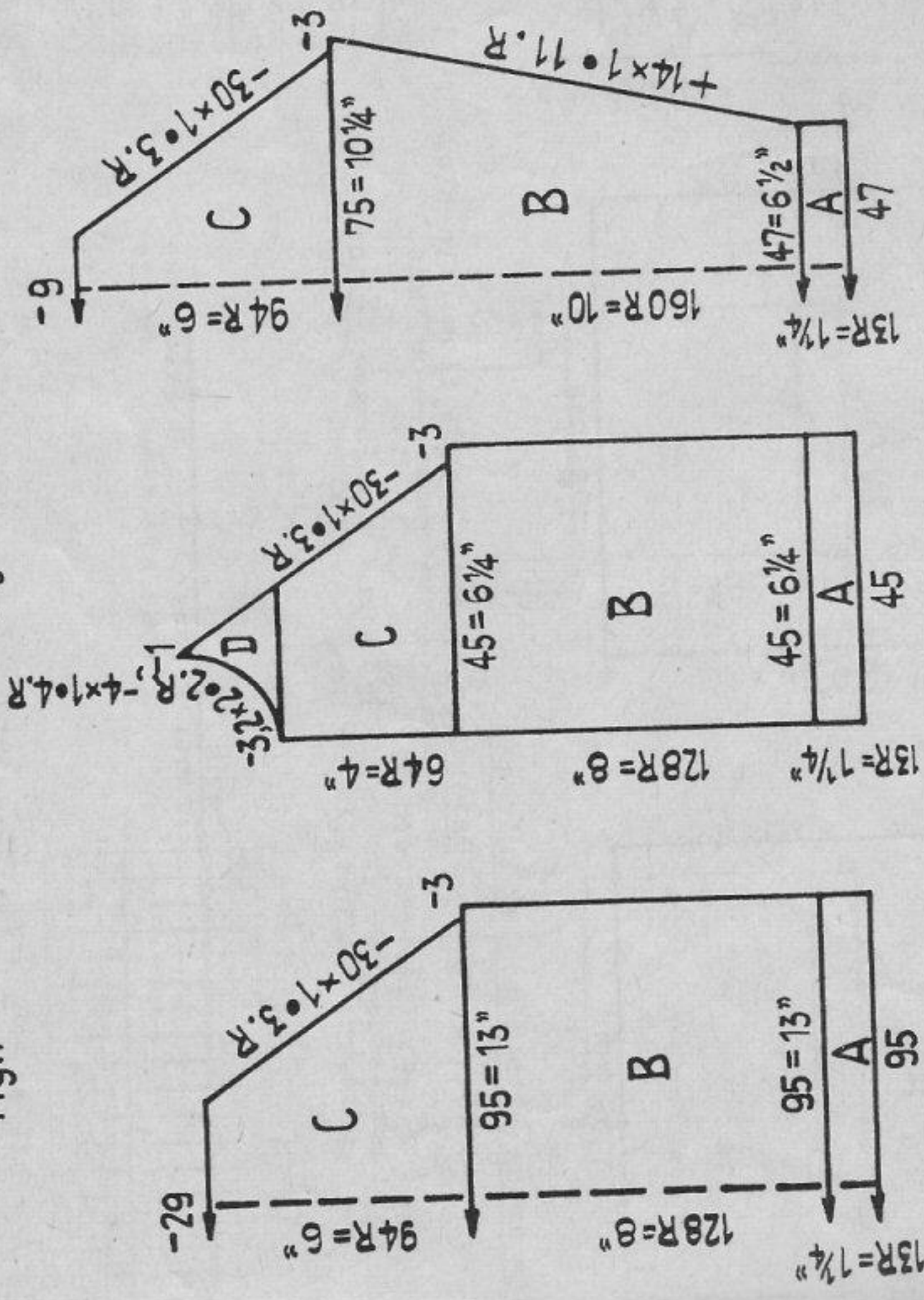

Girl's twin-set -- Cardigan
 Size: for 3 to 4 years. Materials: 3-ply pulloverwool, appr. 4 ozs white, 8 ozs blue, 1 zip-opener 5 ins long, 6 buttons.

Stitch size: Cardigan: 1:1 rib 2 1/4, pattern 4
 Pullover: 1:1 rib 2 1/4, stocking stitsch 4 1/2.
 Test square: Cardigan: 100 sts = 13 3/4 ins, 100 rows = 6 1/4 ins.
 Pullover: 100 sts = 11 3/4 ins, 100 rows = 8 ins.

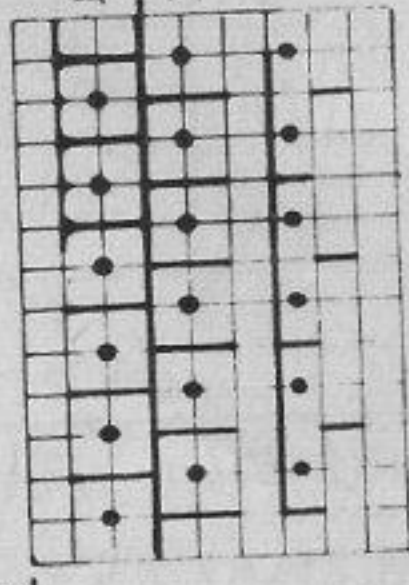

 Neckband: Cast on 63 sts in 1:1, knit 10 rows tubular with St.S. 1 1/2, 16 rows 1:1, incr. ST.S. by 1/4 number after every 2nd row, until ST.S. 3 1/4. Work 1 buttonhole in 9th row over 6th to 9th sts. Then knit 8 rows tubular over all nds with St.S. 4 1/2. 2 rows N/N with contrast yarn and cast off.
 Buttonhole band: Cast on 91 sts over all nds, knit 10 rows tubular with St.S. 2, working 1 buttonhole each in the 5th row over the following nds: 5th to 9th, 24th to 28th, 43rd to 47th, 62nd to 66th and 81st to 85th. Then knit 8 rows N/N with contrast wool and release work. Knit a second band with buttons.

Girl's twin-set -- Pullover
 FIG. I, II, III: A = 1:1, cast on with racking. Knit 1 Row blue, 12 rows white (for sleeves only 8 rows white), 2 rows blue.
 B, C, D = stocking st. white.
 Neckband: Cast on 94 sts in 1:1 in blue, knit 1 row blue with St.S. 2 1/2, 6 rows white with St.S. 3 1/2, over all nds 4 rows white tubular and 4 rows blue tubular with St.S. 5 1/2, 2 rows N/N with contrast yarn and release work.
 To make up: Pin out only the pullover parts and press lightly, using a hot iron over damp cloth. Stitch neckband and buttonhole bands into position, first to outside, then to inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Finish buttonholes. Fix zip-opener and attach buttons.

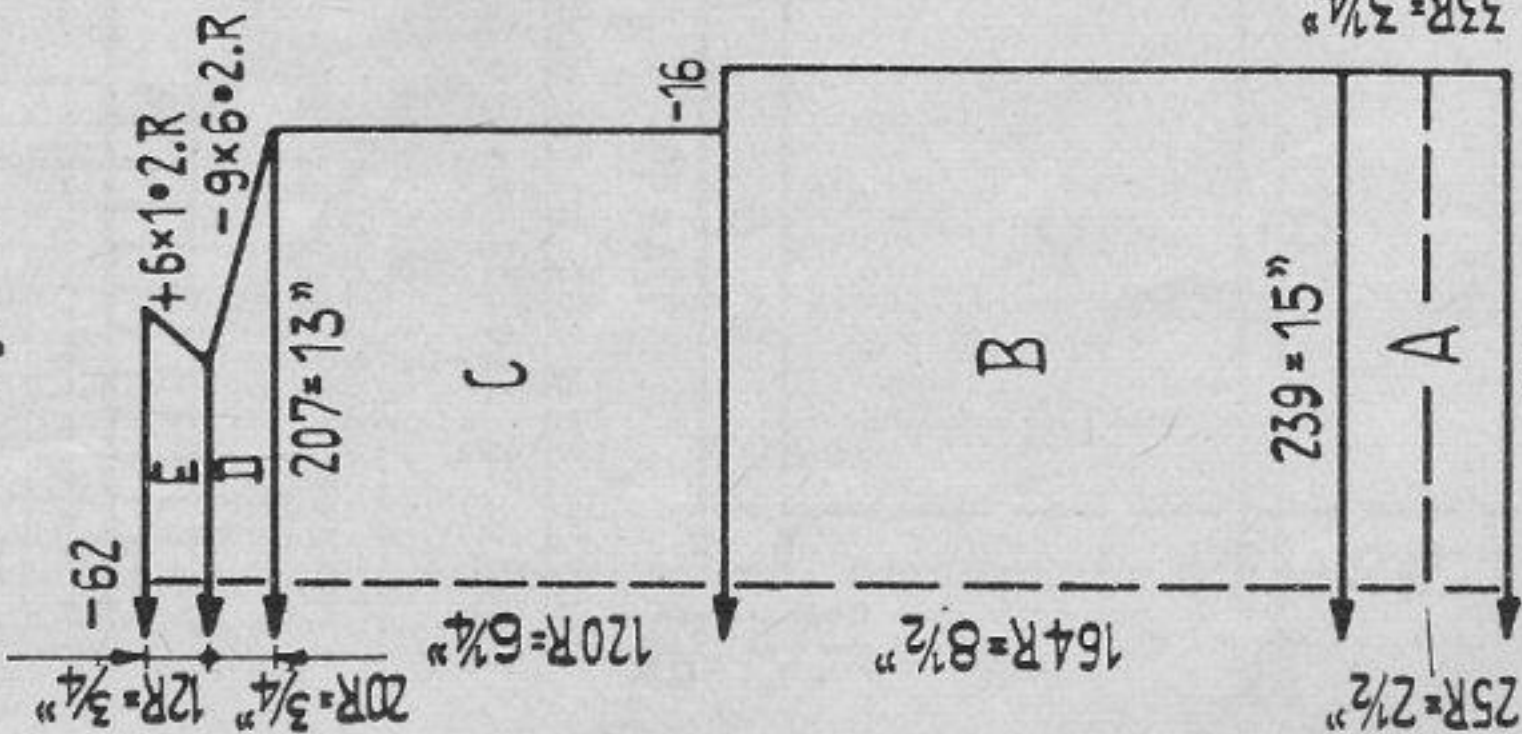
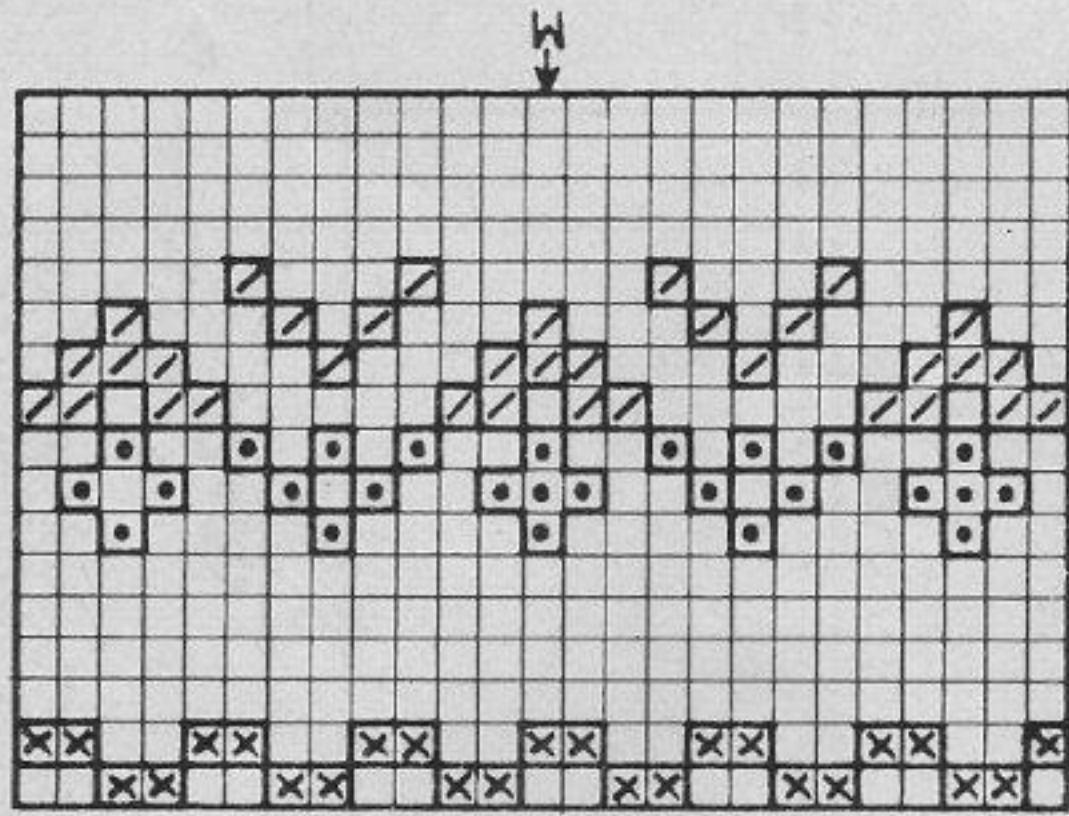

Material: approx. 7 ozs. dark blue, 2 ozs. white, 2 ozs. red, 2 ozs. black medium sweater wool.

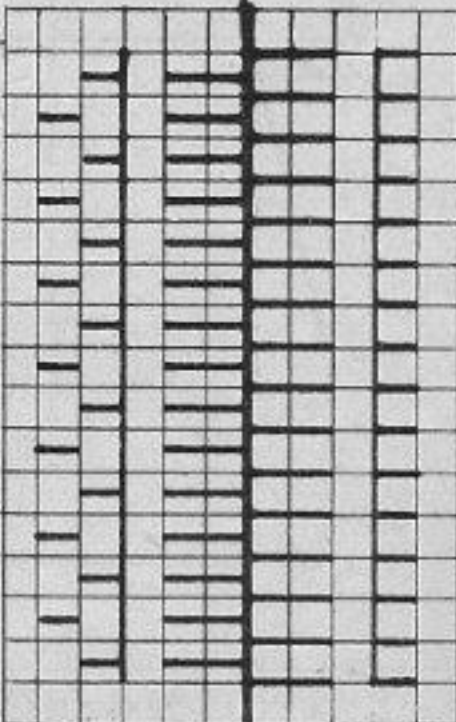
Stitch size: 1:1 rib 3, st. st. 5 1/2, pattern 4 1/2.

Test square: 100 sts. = 6 1/4 ins. 100 rows = 5 1/4 ins.

Pattern: Fairisle according to diagram. / = white, • = red,

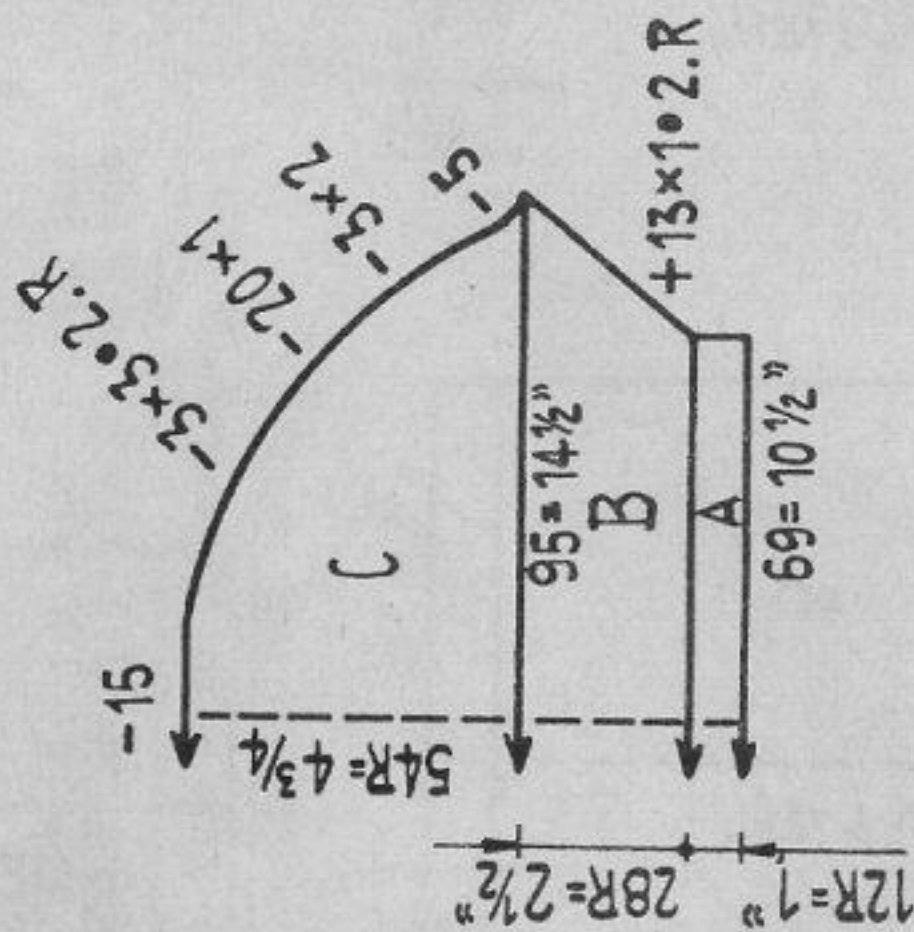

To make up: Pin out parts to measure, block and press lightly and join seams. Press st. part and contrast. wool of neck trimming then unravel K/K and stitch trimming into position first to outside then to inside, unravelling contrasting wool.

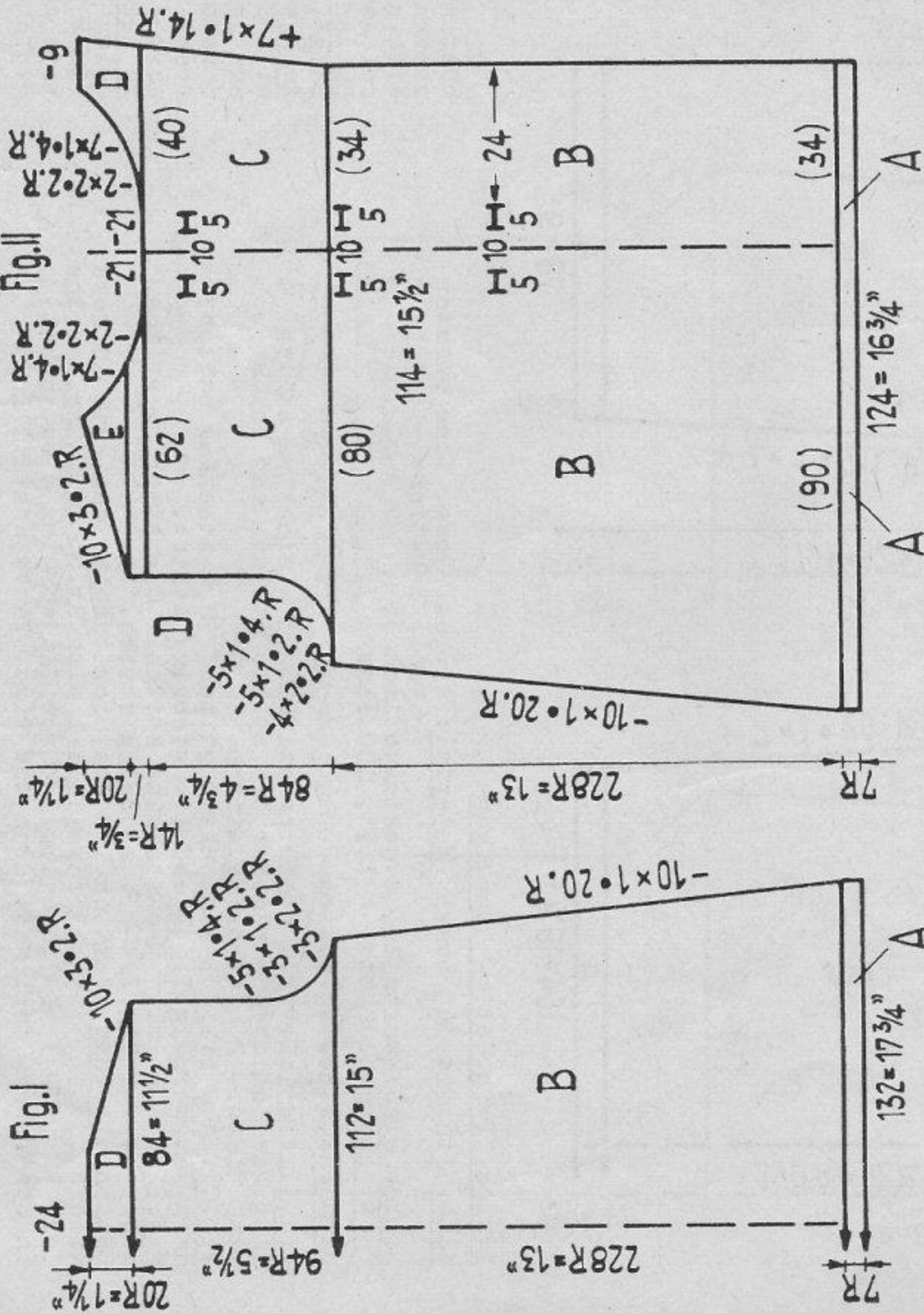

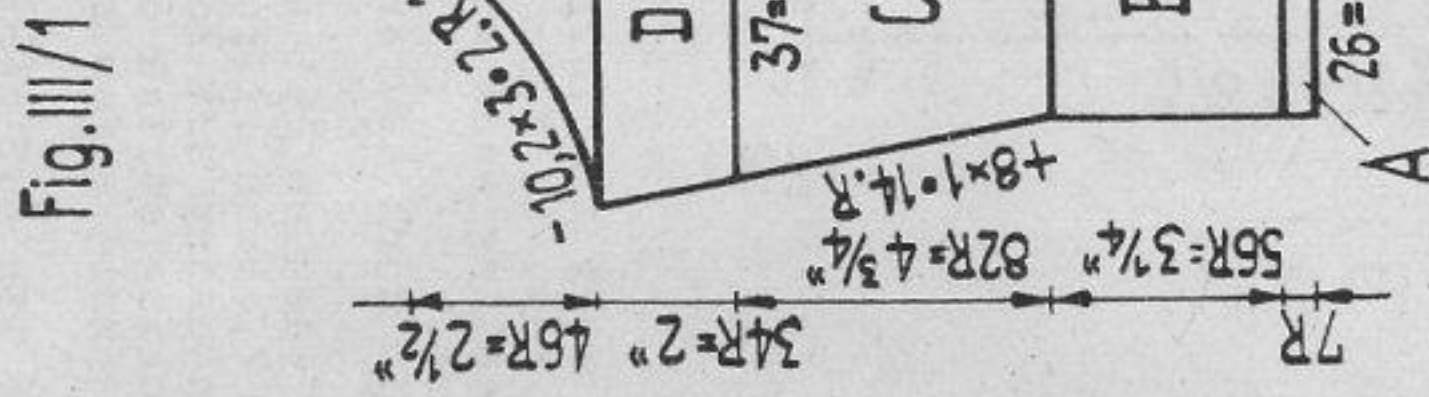

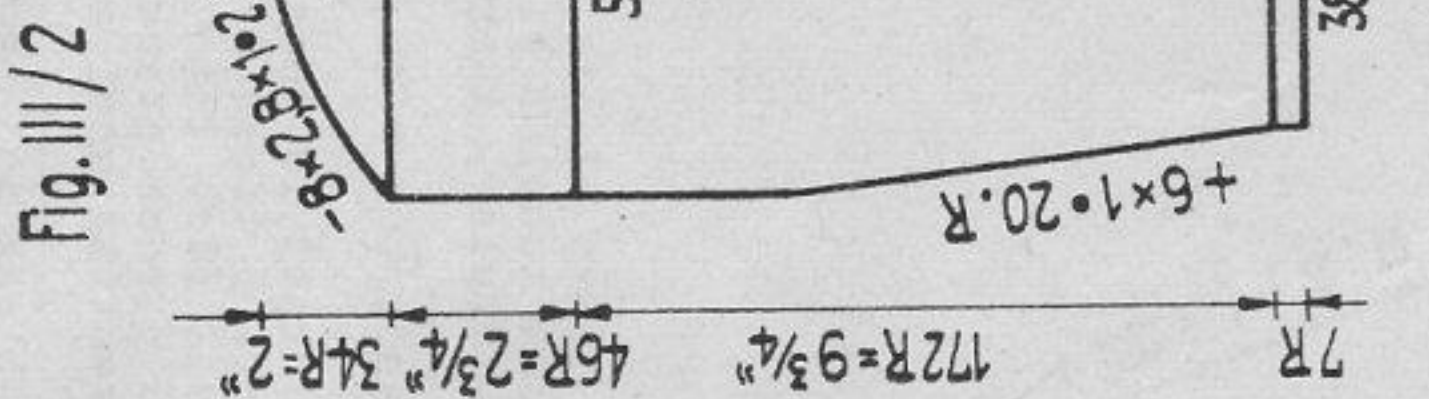

Coat and beret for little girl
 Size: for 3 to 4 years. Material: approx. 14 ozs. medium wool, 8 buttons, lining, stiffening for collar and belt, 1 button to be covered.
 Stitch size: 5
 Test square: 100 sts. = 13 1/2 ins. 100 rows = 5 1/4 ins.
 Pattern:

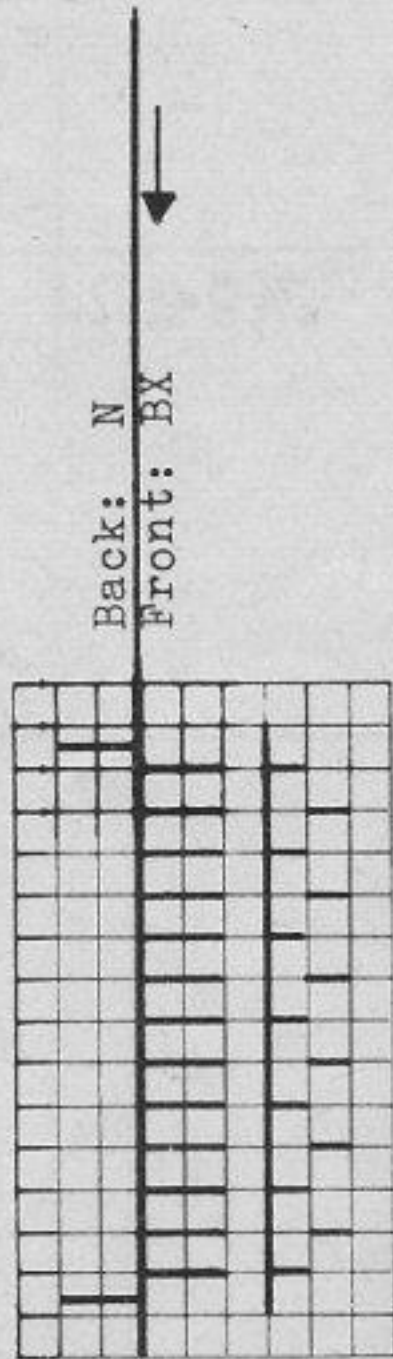


Fig. I: A = stocking stitch. B, C and D = pattern.

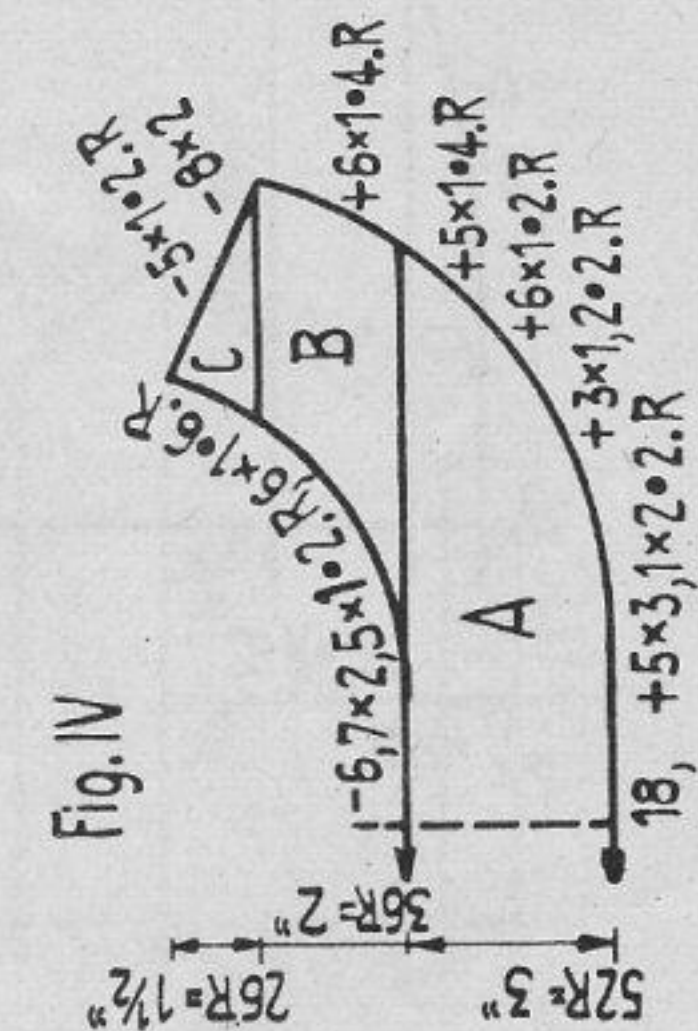

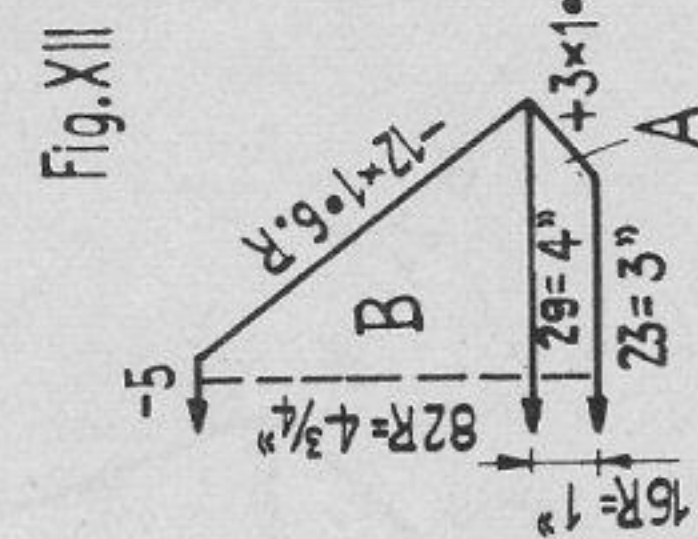

Belt: Cast on 42 sts. and knit 42 rows pattern, increasing 10 times 1 st. on both sides in every 2nd row and decreasing 10 times 1 st. in every 2nd row. Cast off.
 To make up: Pin out parts to size, block and press lightly using hot iron on damp cloth. Join seams and stitch sleeves into position. Line collar and belt with stiffening. Fix collar to neck shaping, leaving 2 1/4 ins. on both sides. Turn and fix trimming to inside. Finish button-holes and attach buttons. Turn and fix hem to inside. Line coat, fix belt to back with 2 buttons.
 Beret: Join parts and stitch band round beret. Line and fix one covered button in the centre of beret.

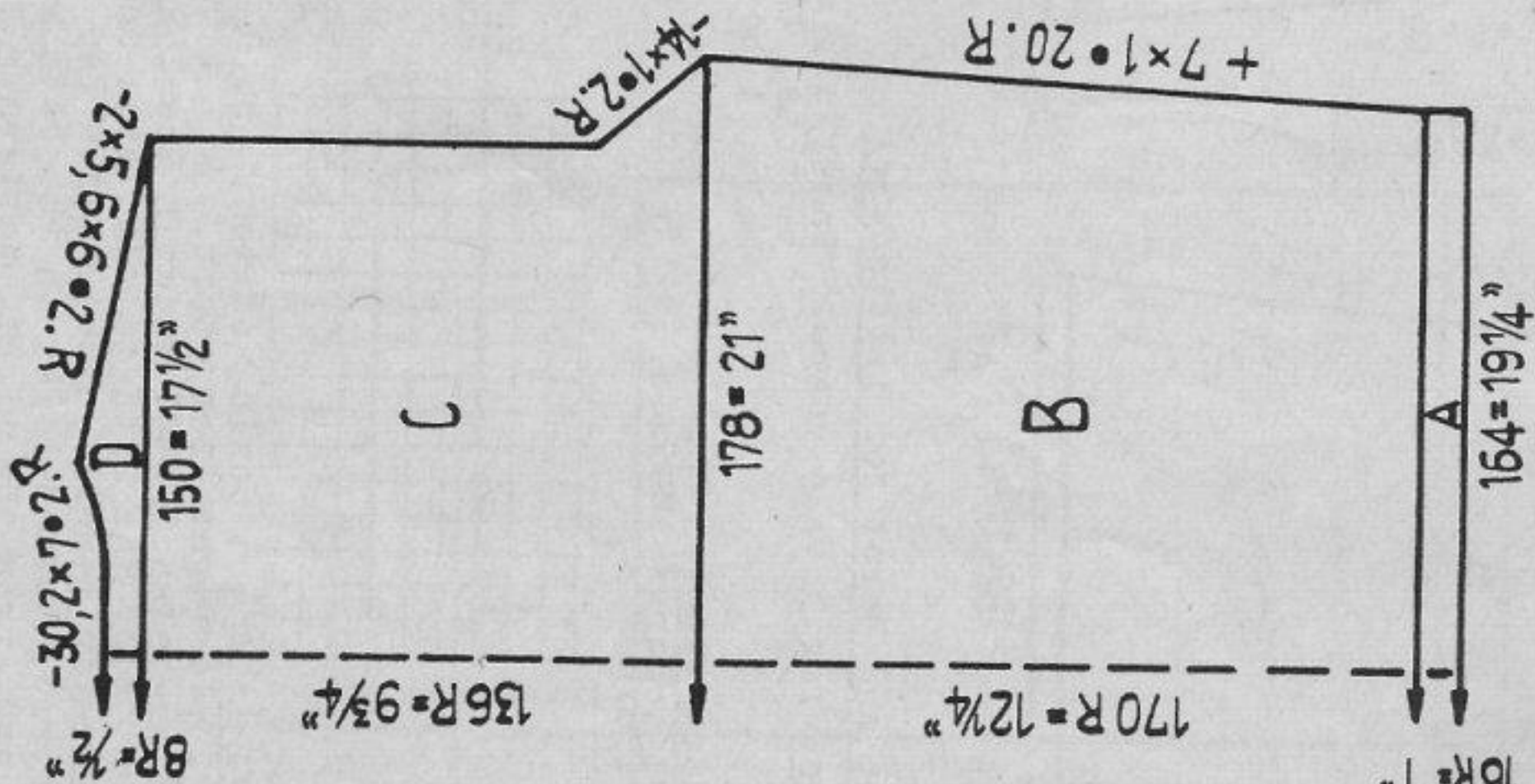

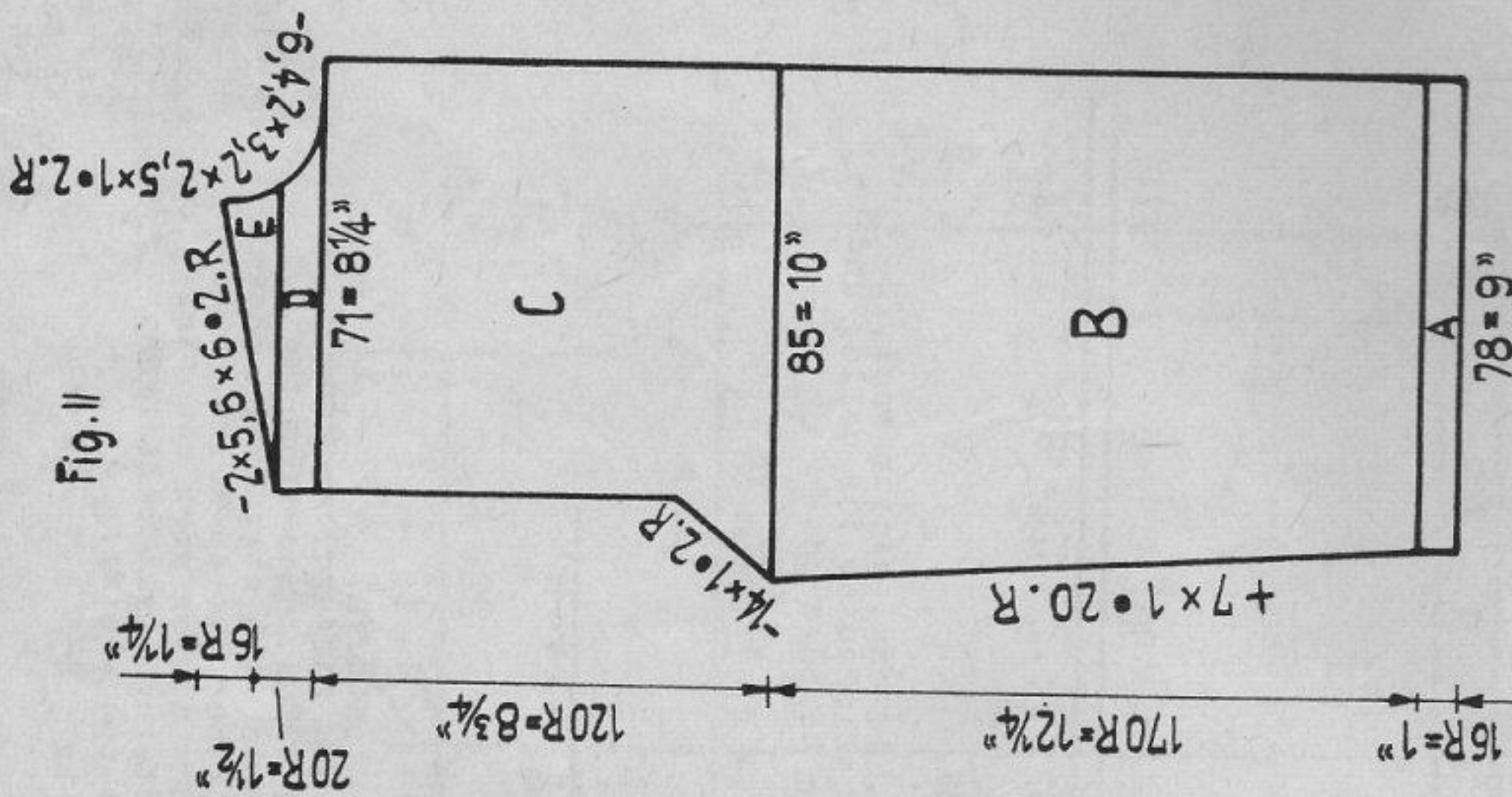
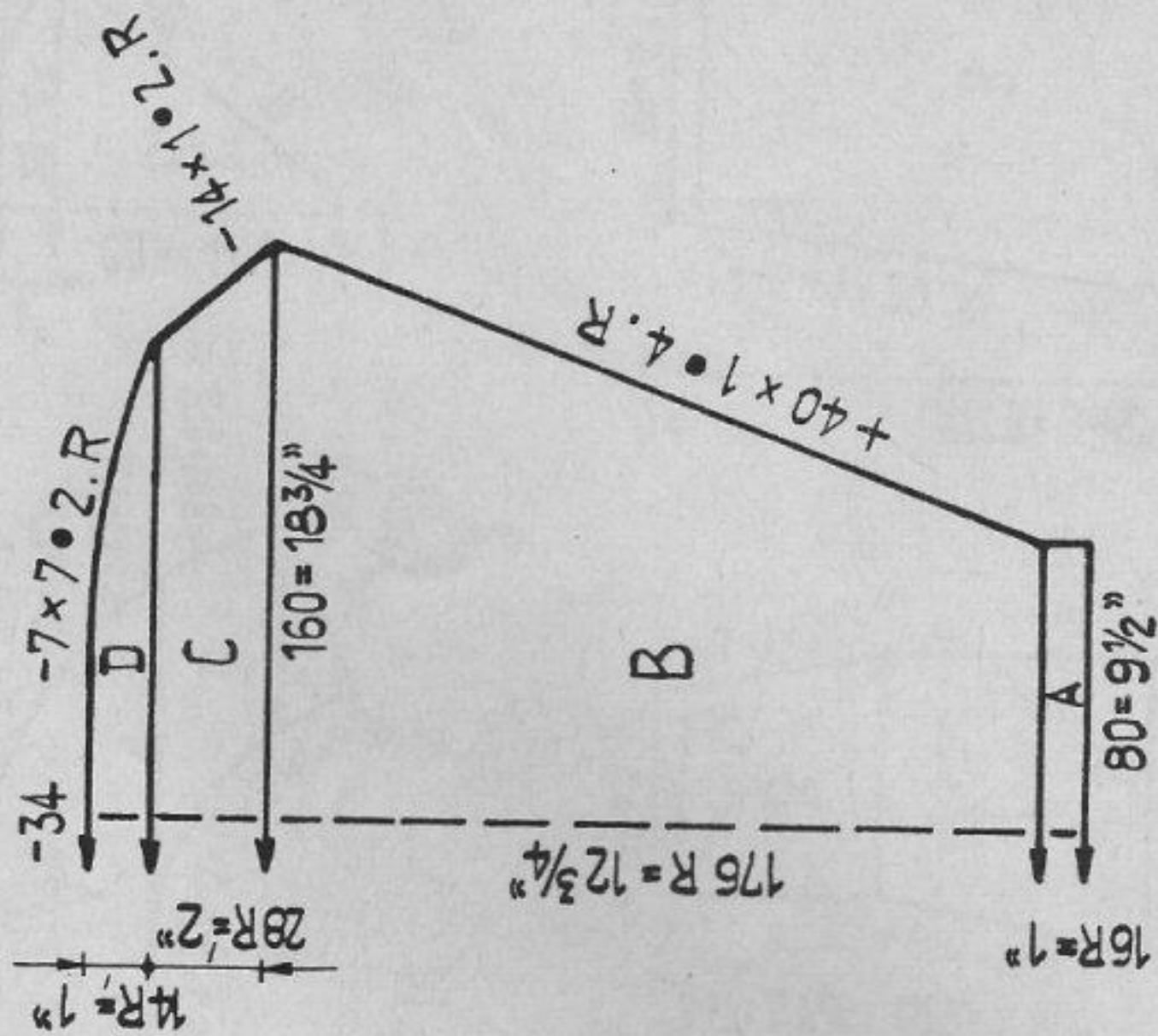

Ladies' Twin Set - Cardigan

Size: to fit 36" bust Material: approx. 9ozs. fine sweater wool, 8 buttons

Stitch size: welts 1 1/4, stocking stitch 3 3/4
 Test square: 100 sts. = 11 1/2", 100 rows = 7 1/4"

Pattern: Stocking stitch

Fig. I: A = 1:1. B = stocking stitch. C = stocking stitch, decr. as follows: transfer 3rd st. to 4th nd. and follow up with 2 sts. D = stocking stitch.
 Fig. II: A = 1:1. B = stocking stitch. C = stocking stitch, decr. as for Fig. I. D and E = stocking stitch.
 Fig. III: A = 1:1. B = stocking stitch. C = stocking stitch, decr. as for Fig. I. D = stocking stitch.
 Buttonhole band: Cast on 170 sts. for tubular and knit 10 rows with St.S. 3 3/4, then 11 rows in 1:1 with St.S. 1 1/4, decr. on the left 5 times 1 st. in every 2nd row and working 8 buttonholes in 6th row as follows: from the right leave 4 sts., knit

buttonhole over the following 5 sts., leave 17 sts. etc. Then return all nds. to W.P. and knit 10 rows tubular with St.S. 3 3/4. With contrasting wool knit a few rows tubular, then 2 rows K/K, release work.
 Button band: Work as for buttonhole band, but without buttonholes.
 Neck welt: Cast on 151 sts. in 1:1 and knit 10 rows tubular with St.S. 2, then 11 rows in 1:1, decr. 5 times 1 st. on right and left in every 2nd row. Then put all nds. into W.P. and knit 5 rows stocking stitch on back bed and 5 rows stocking stitch on front bed. Knit a few rows with contrasting wool and release work.
 To make up: Pin out parts to measure, block and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Back stitch front welts at first to outside, then to inside. Stitch neck welt into position and join with front welts. Finish buttonholes and attach buttons.

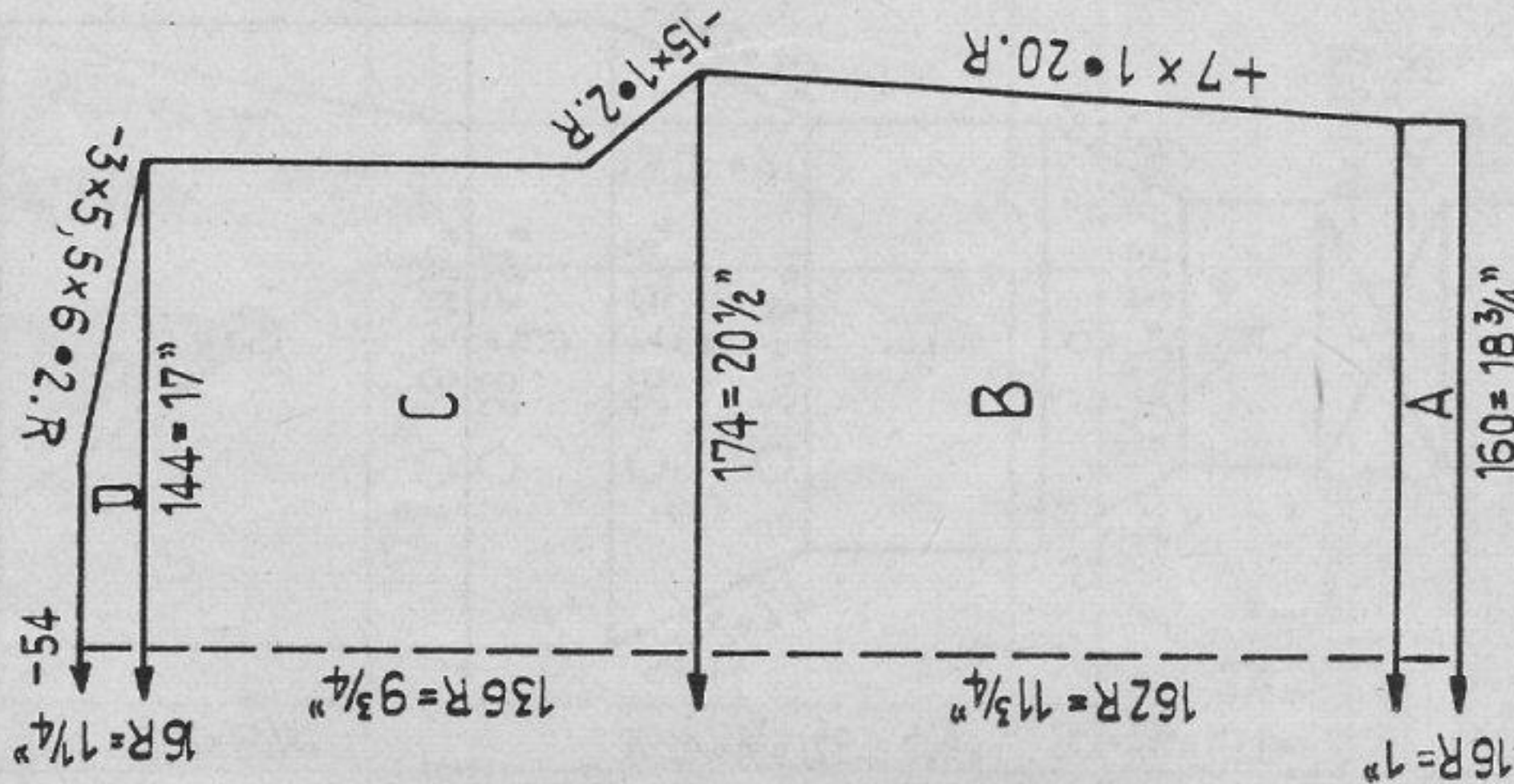

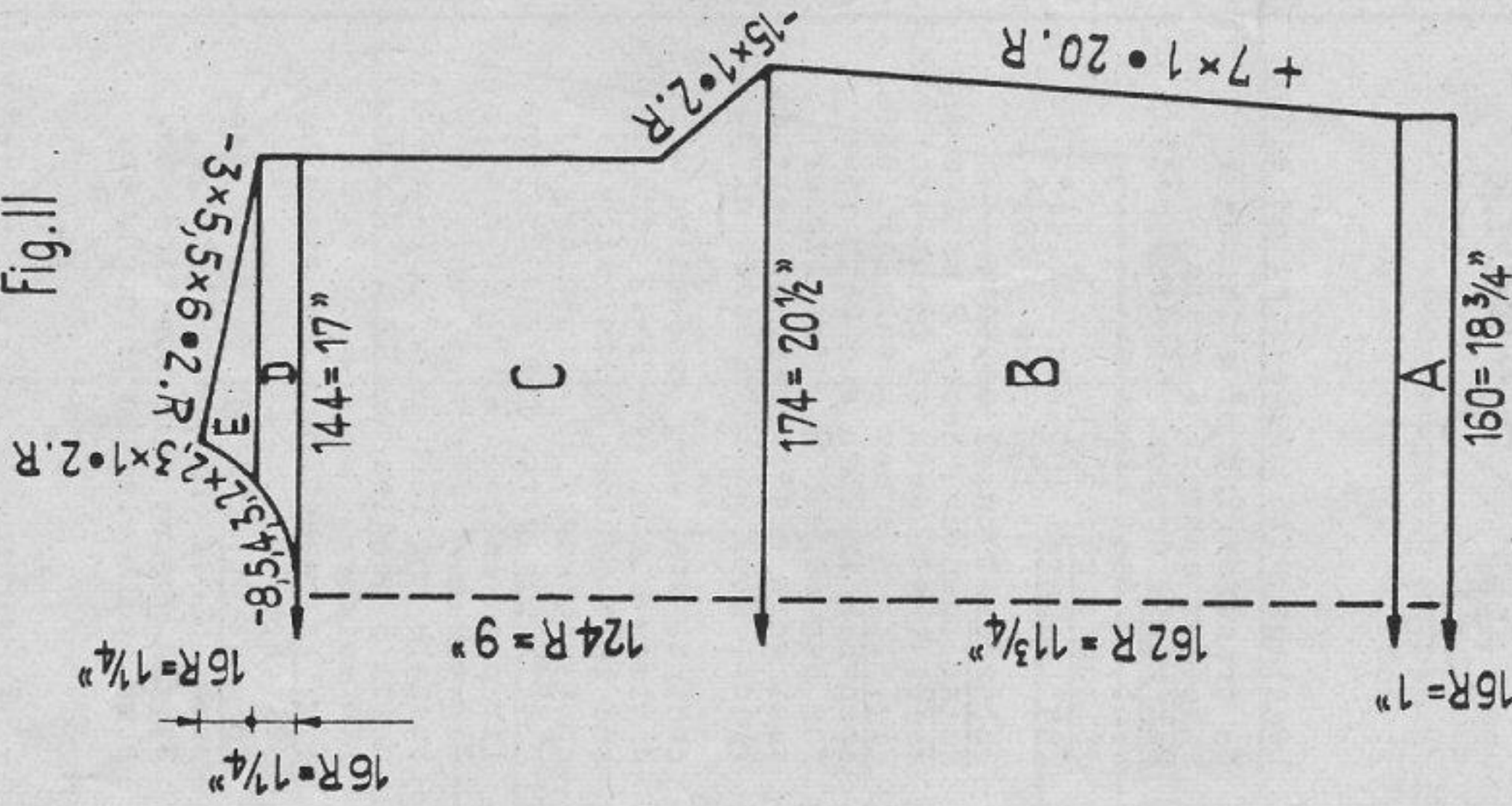
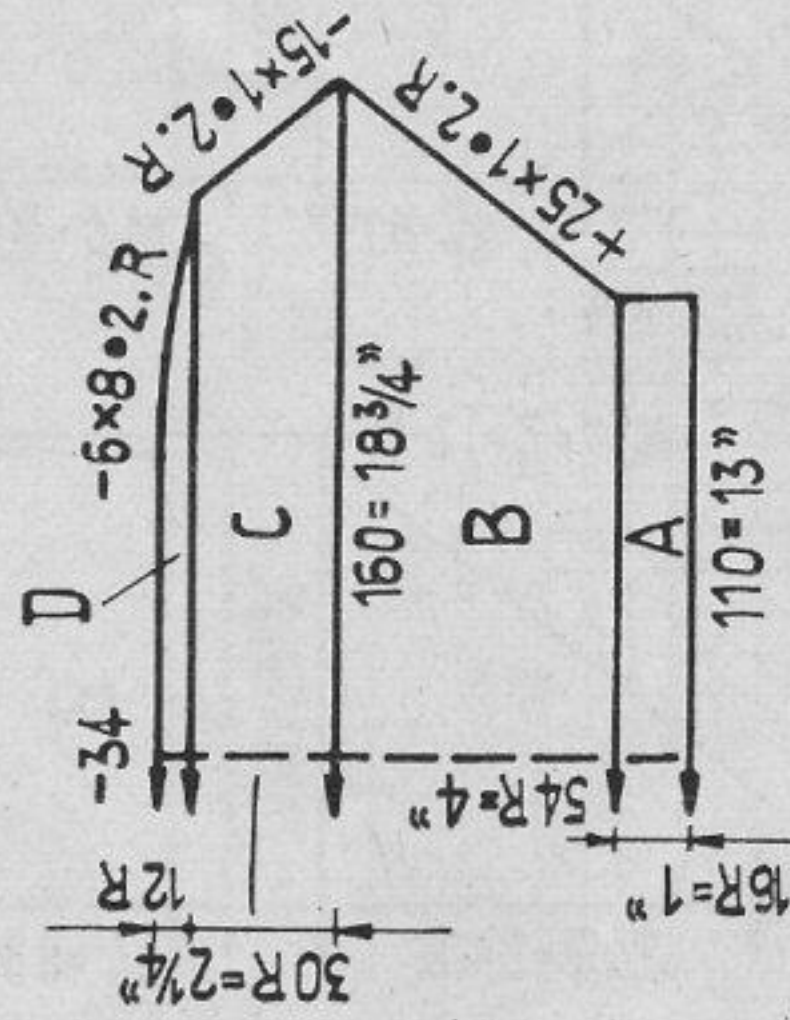

Test square: 100 sts. = 11 1/4 ins. 100 rows = 7 1/4 ins.

Pattern: stocking stitch

Fig. I: A = 1:1. B = stocking stitch. C = stocking stitch. decrease as follows: hang 3rd st. to 4th nd. and follow up with 2 sts. D = stocking stitch.

Fig. II: A = 1:1. B = stocking stitch. C = stocking stitch, decrease as for Fig. I. D and E = stocking stitch.
 Fig. III: A = 1:1. B = stocking stitch. C = stocking stitch, decrease as for Fig. I. D = stocking stitch.
 Neck welt: Cast on 120 sts. in 1:1 and knit 8 rows tubular with St.S. 2 1/4, then knit 11 rows, then all nds. into W.P. and knit first 5 rows on back, then 5 rows on front bed. With contrasting wool knit a few rows tubular, then 2 rows K/X and release work. To make up: Pin out parts to measure, block and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Back stitch neck welt first to outside, then to inside.

Test square: 100 sts = 14 L/4 ins. 100 rows = 7 ins.

Pattern: stocking stitch, wrong side outwards.

Fig. VII front and VIII back: A = cast on with contrast yarn and knit a few rows, then change to bouclé wool, stocking st. B and C = stocking stitch.

To make up: Pin out parts to size, press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. At front waist sew two darts, 1 inch large and $3\frac{1}{2}$ ins deep. At back sew two darts $1\frac{1}{2}$ ins large and 7 ins deep. Stitch waist band and zip-opener into position. At lower edge unravel contrast yarn and crochet 1 row of firm sts into the open loops.
