Patterns: Drawing refers to half width, indication of stitch number to whole width of each part.

Figure I	= back part	Figure IX	= pants
Figure II	= front part	Figure X	= gusset
Figure III	= sleeve	Figure XI	= scarf
Figure IV	= collar	Figure XII	= cap, bonnet
Figure V	= band, cuff	Figure XIII	= mittens
Figure VI	= pocket	Figure XIV	= socks
Figure VII	= skirt, front	Figure XV	= straps
Figure VIII	= skirt, back		








If the central line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is done simultaneously with reversed shapings.

If the central line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is done separately with reversed shapings.

Stitch size: These numbers are recommended by us, but must be controlled by means of a test square, knitted on your machine with your wool.

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter).

The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i.e. to all needles which are in Working Position on front and back bed.

Exception: For tubular, the necessary stitches are only given for one bed, on the other bed, the same number of needles has to be put into Working position. In these cases, the sign for tubular **O** respectively halftubular **C** or **)** is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

- + 3 × 2 • 8 . R** means: 3 times incr. 2 stitches in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- 19 × 3 • 7 . R** means: 19 times decr. 3 stitches in every 7th row (2 stitches at back, 1 stitch at front and vice versa).
- 17 × 1 • 2./3 . R** means: 17 times decr. 1 stitch, alternately after 2 rows and 3 rows.
- ▲ - 4 × 8 • 2 . R** means: work with pushers and knit graduations (Lock BX). Gradually after every 2nd row return 8 pushers into Rest Position (for double bed work 4 pushers each on back and front bed). When all graduations are finished, put pushers into Neutral Position and knit normally with all needles and without pushers.

Number of stitches and inches:

- 136 = 8"** means: a total of 136 stitches (for K/K 68 stitches each on front and back) make a width of 8".
- O 146 = 17"** means: cast on 146 stitches each on front and back for tubular which makes a width of 17 ins.

Test square and PASSAP chart

If you always knit 100 stitches and 100 rows for your test square, you save the trouble of counting rows and stitches and can read any desired measurement in our PASSAP chart (at the end of this book).

Horizontally: Across the top you will find the measurements in inches of your test square of 100 stitches and 100 rows; range from 4" to 20", split up in two charts.

Vertically: Required measurements in inches for your garment. From top to bottom, on the left and right, you will find the number of inches measured for your garment. These numbers range from 1/2" to 40" on each chart.

Example: 100 stitches of your test square measure, say, 10". For your garment, however, you need a width of, say, 8". Look in the horizontal column under 10" and in the vertical column under 8". Where both columns meet you find the number 80, i.e. you have to cast on 80 stitches (40 on each bed).

In the same way you find the desired number of rows on the chart. Numbers for measurements, which you do not find on the chart, you may obtain by a simple addition.

How to divide the work: Knit stitches, which should temporarily rest, like a buttonhole, with contrast yarn. Put the needles into Neutral Position. Thus you obtain long loops, which hold the stitches. Later on you just have to unravel the contrast yarn and the stitches will slip back to their needle heads.

PASSAP 12: Each model can also be done on PASSAP 12, if you choose a PASSAP 12 pattern. - Fairisle patterns can be done on PASSAP 12 with heel deckers, which are available at any PASSAP dealer.

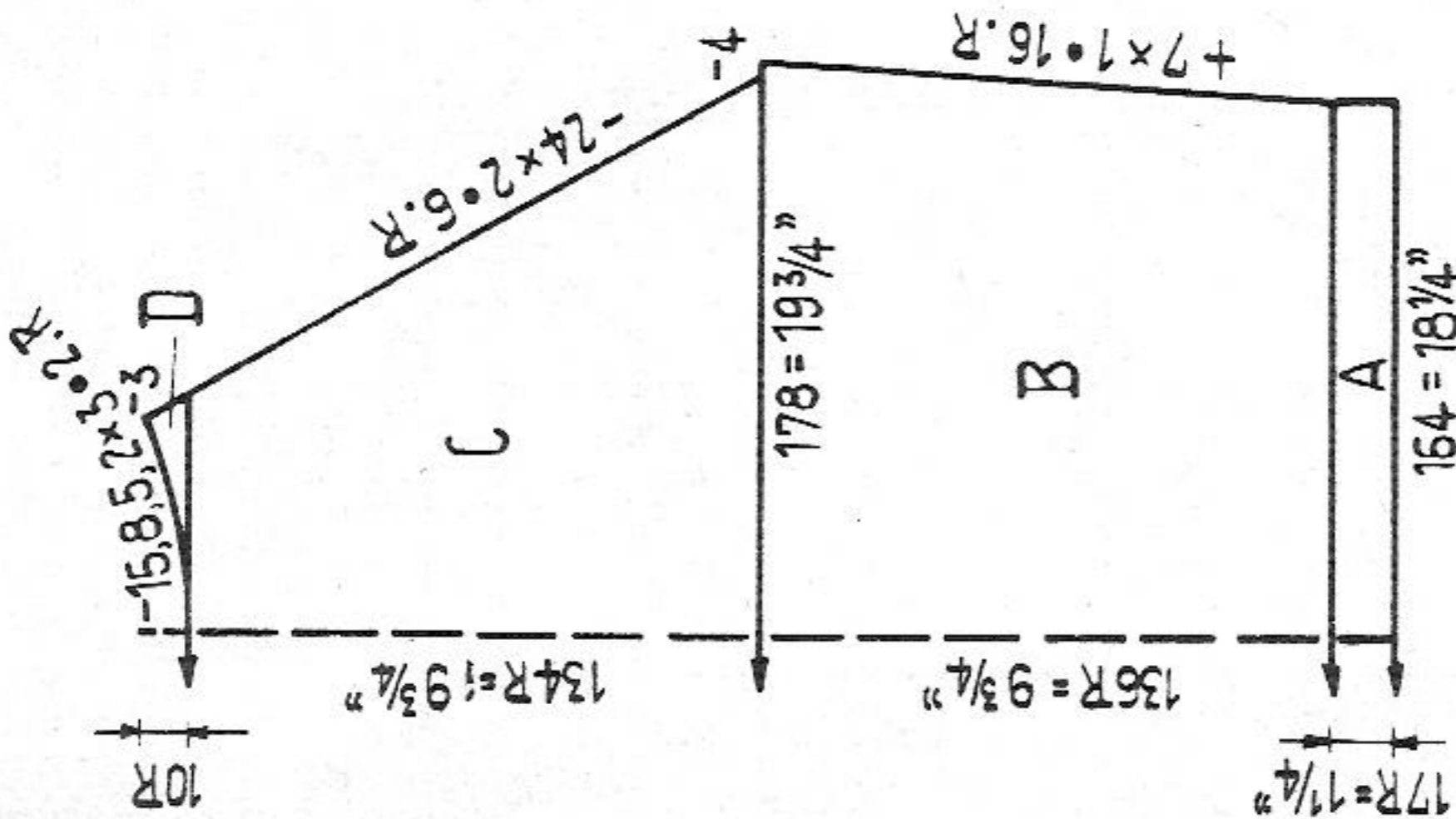

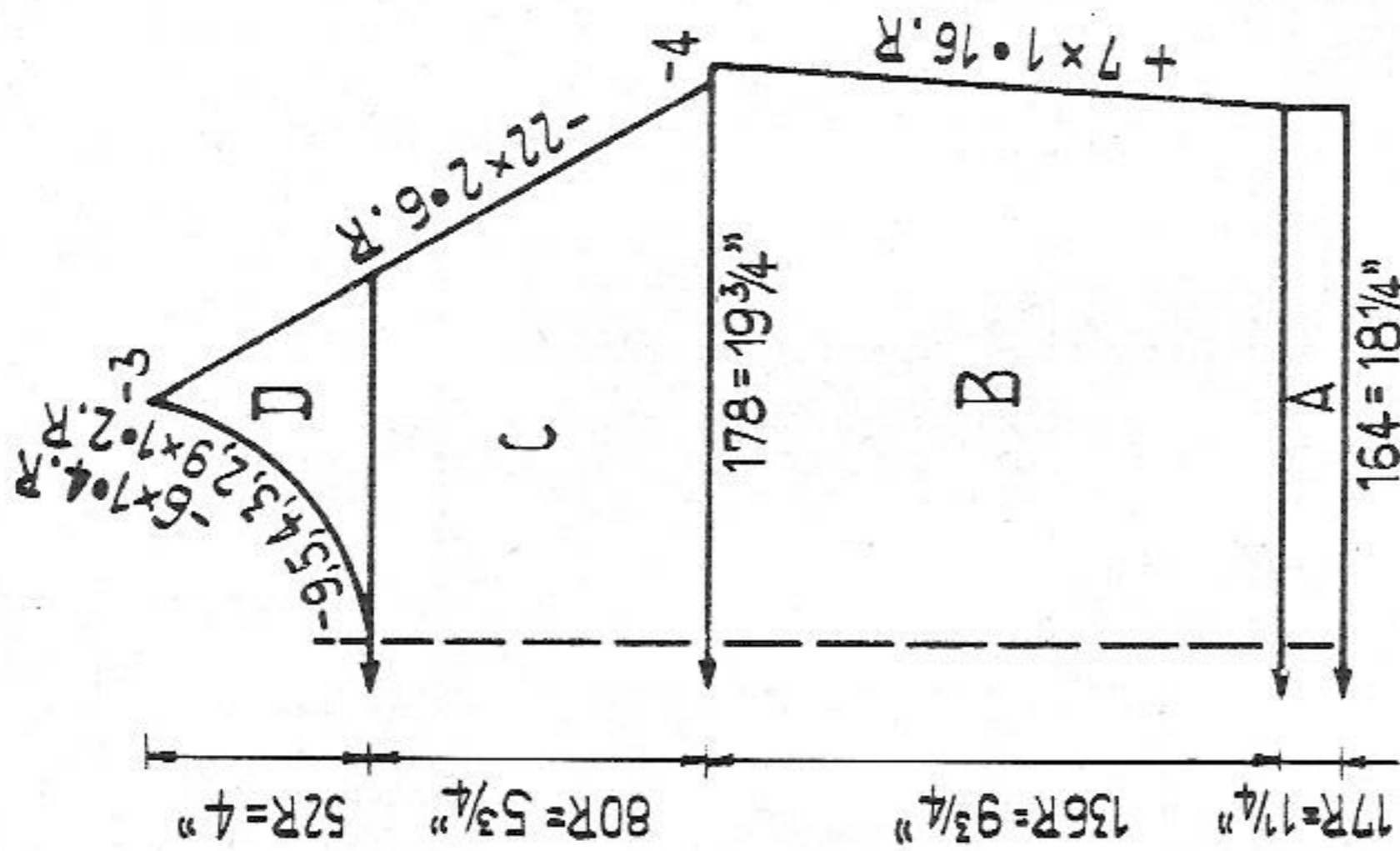
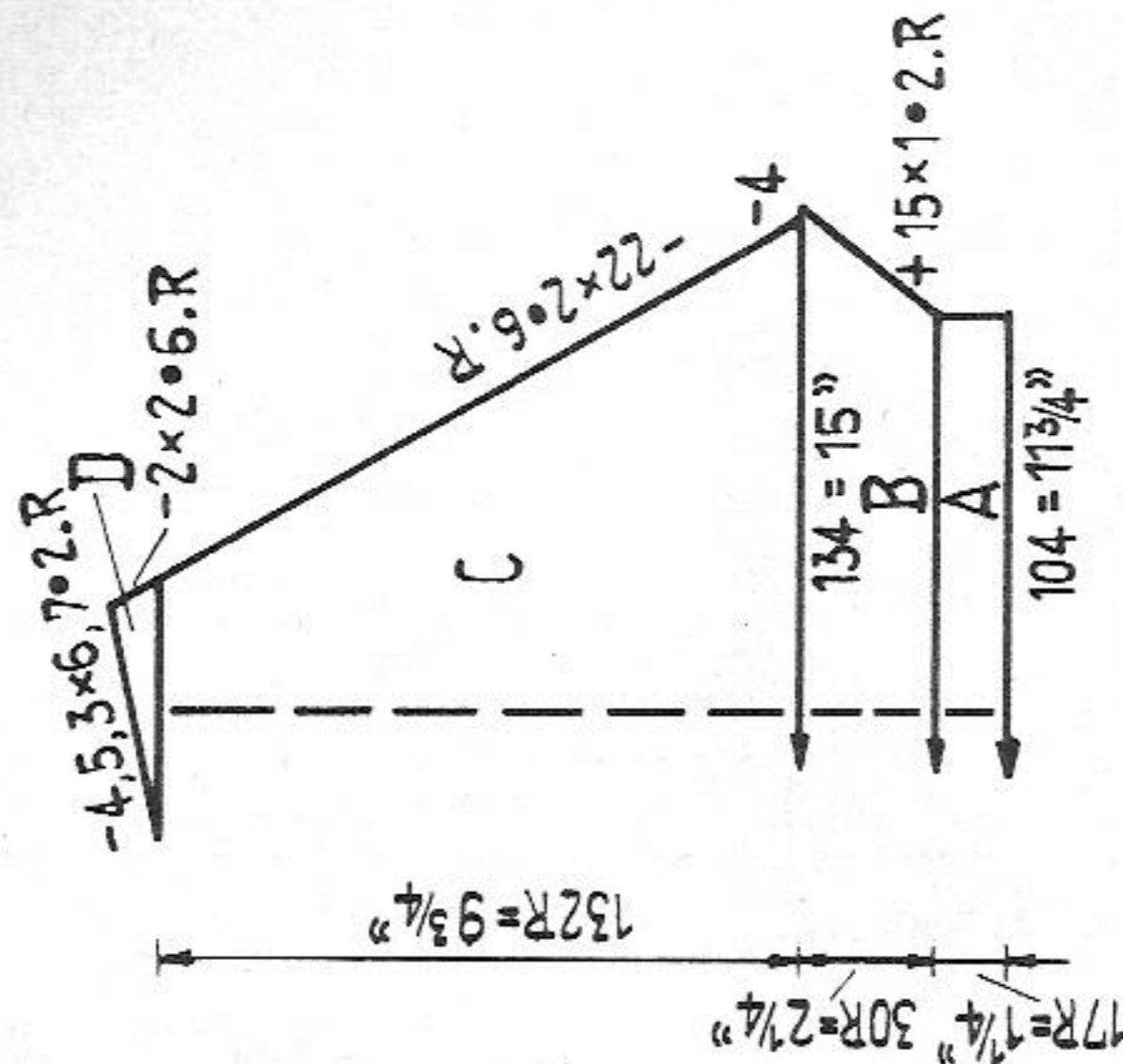

Lady's twin-set, sweater

Size: to fit 34 to 36 inch bust.

Materials: approx. 7 ozs fine wool light green

Stitch size: 1:1 border 2, stocking st. 3 3/4

Test square: 100 sts = 11". 100 rows = 7 1/4"

Pattern: stocking stitch

Figure I and II: A = 1:1. B = st. st. C = st. st., for raglan shaping hang the 4th and 5th sts onto the 6th and 7th nds and follow up with the remaining 3 sts. D = divide work, st. st.

Figure III: A = 1:1. B = st. st. C and D = st. st., for raglan shaping work as for Fig. I.

Neckborder: front. Cast on 160 sts in 1:1 and knit 9 rows. Bring all nds into W. P. and knit 2 rows tubular and then on each bed 4 rows st. st. With contrast wool knit 2 rows tubular and 2 rows K/K, then release. Back. Cast on 60 sts in 1:1 and work as for front.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch neckborders into position, first outside st. by st. with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Join back- and front borders.

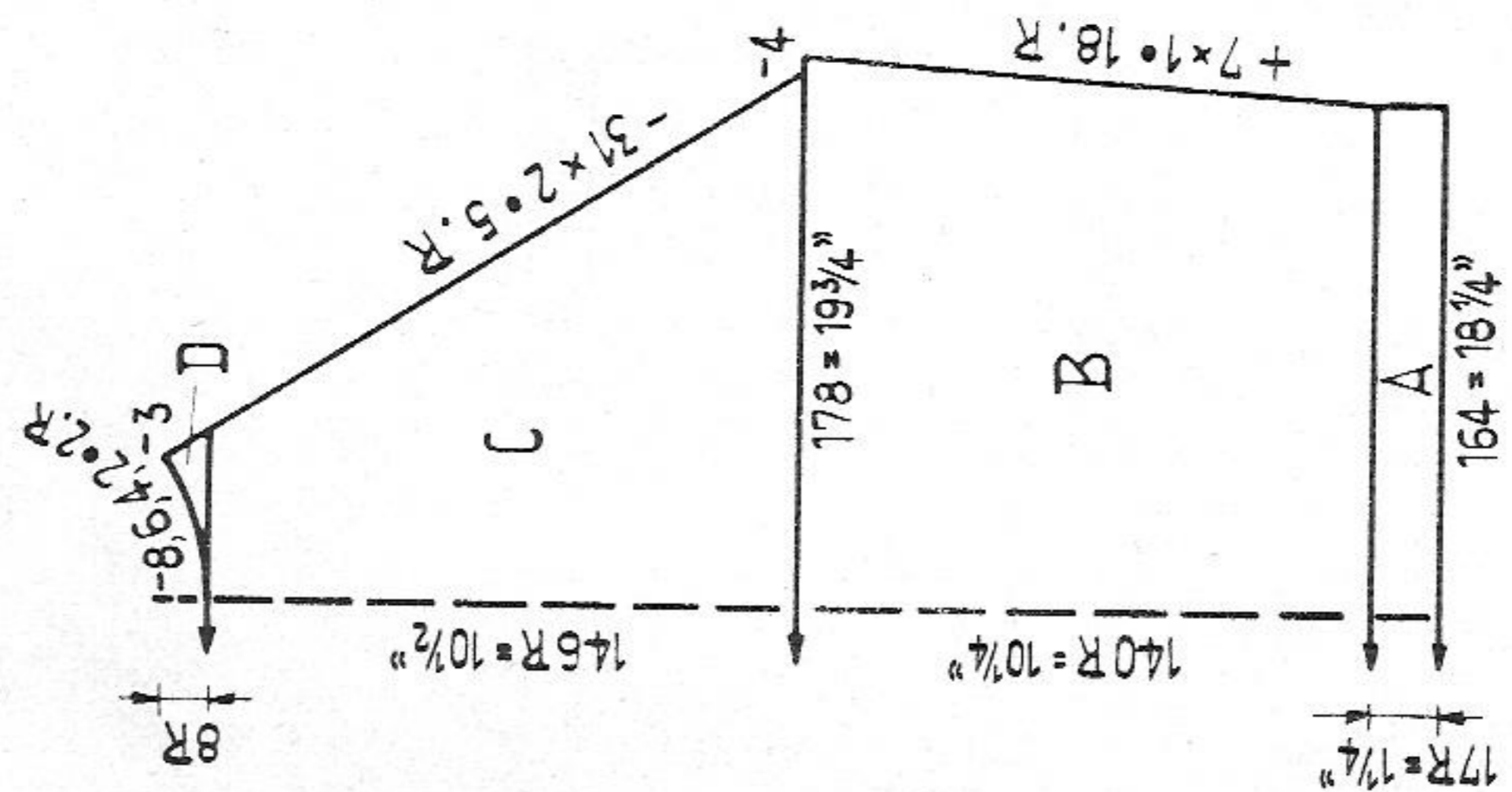

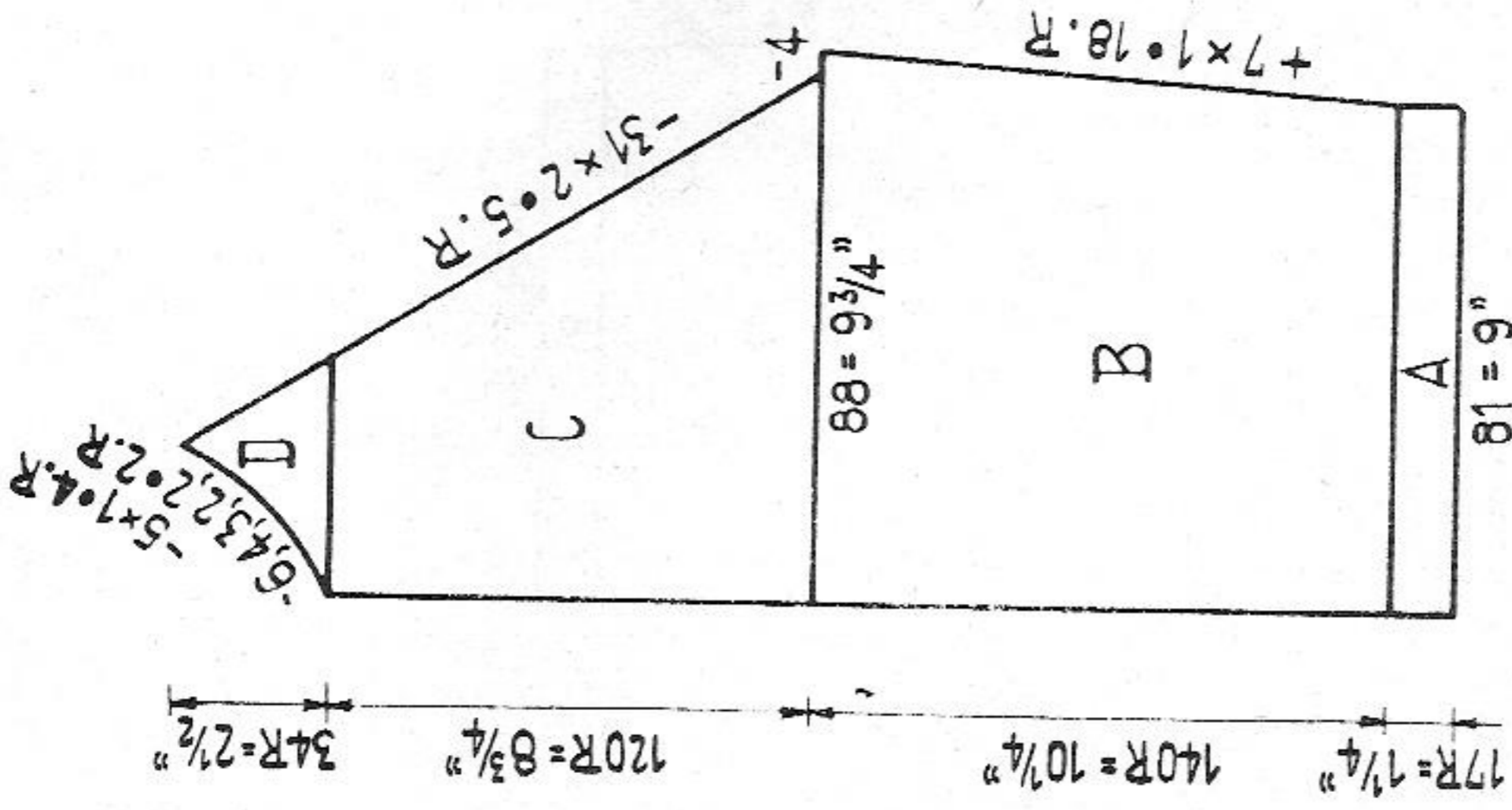
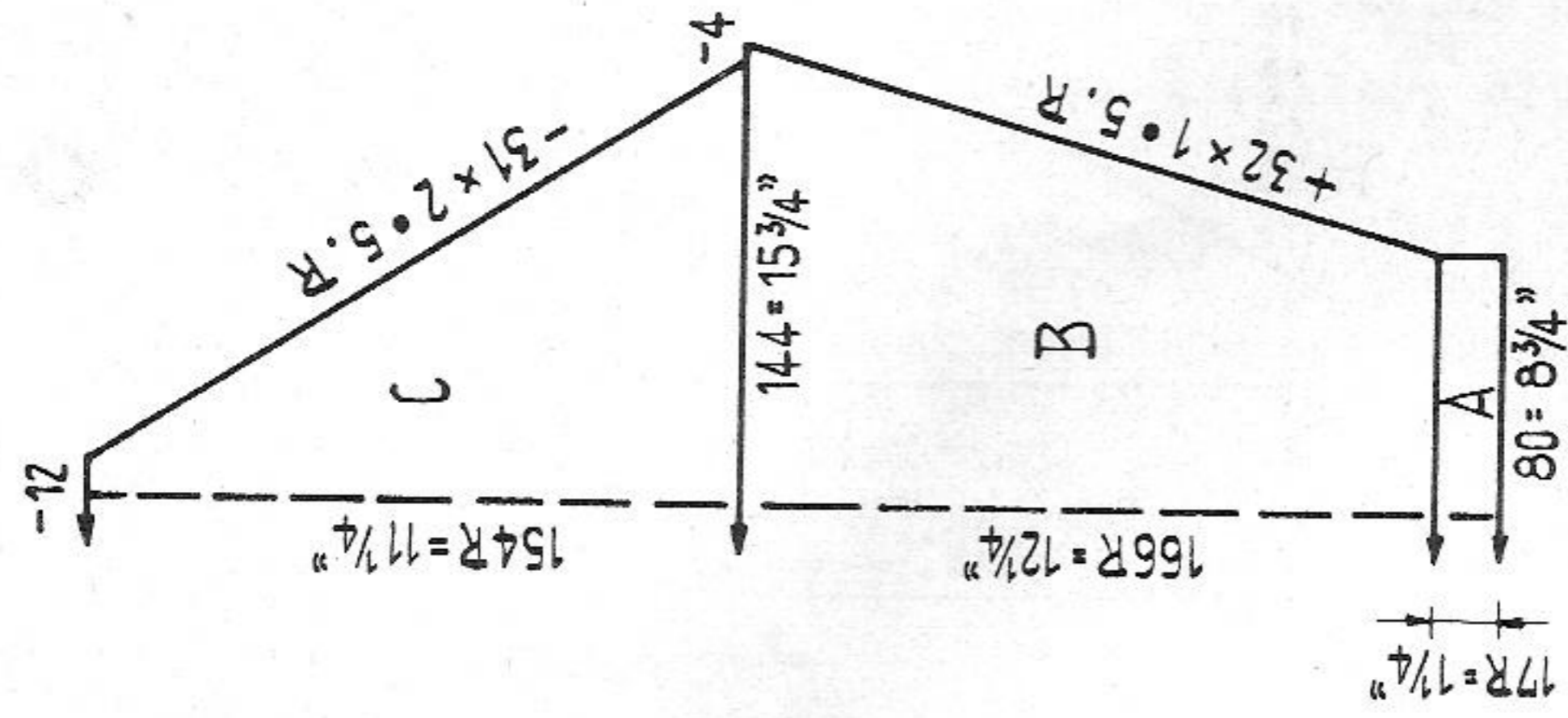

Lady's twin-set, cardigan

Size: to fit 34 to 36 inch bust

Materials: approx. 8 ozs fine wool light green, 8 buttons.

Stitch size: 1:1 border 2, stocking st. 3 3/4, tubular 3

Test square: 100 sts = 11". 100 rows = 7 1/4"

Pattern: stocking stitch

Figure I: A = 1:1. B = st. st. C = st. st., for raglan shaping hang the 4th and 5th sts onto the 6th and 7th nds and follow up with the remaining 3 sts. D = divide work, st. st.

Figure II: A = 1:1. B = st. st. C and D = st. st., for raglan shaping work as for Fig. I.

Figure III: A = 1:1. B = st. st. C = st. st., for raglan shaping work as for Fig. I.

Neckborder: cast on 120 sts in 1:1 and knit 10 rows tubular with St. S. 2. Then knit 11 rows in N/N, at the same time dec. at both edges 1 st 5 times in every 2nd row. Bring all nds into W. P. and knit 2 rows tubular, then on each bed 4 rows st. st. With contrast wool knit 2 rows tubular and 2 rows K/K, then release.

Frontborder with buttonholes: on front and back bring 164 nds into W. P. and cast on. Knit 10 rows tubular. Then transfer sts for 1:1 and knit 11 rows, at the same time at left dec. 1 st 5 times in every 2nd row. After 6 rows make buttonholes as follows: start at right and make 1st buttonhole over the 6th to 10th nds and all others over 5 nds with 16 sts distance between each. Then bring all nds into W. P. and knit 2 rows tubular and on each bed 4 rows st. st. With contrast wool knit 2 rows tubular and 2 rows K/K, then release. Knit 2nd border without buttonholes.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch borders into position, first outside st by st with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool, the slip stitch inside. Join neckborder with frontborder. Finish buttonholes and attach buttons.

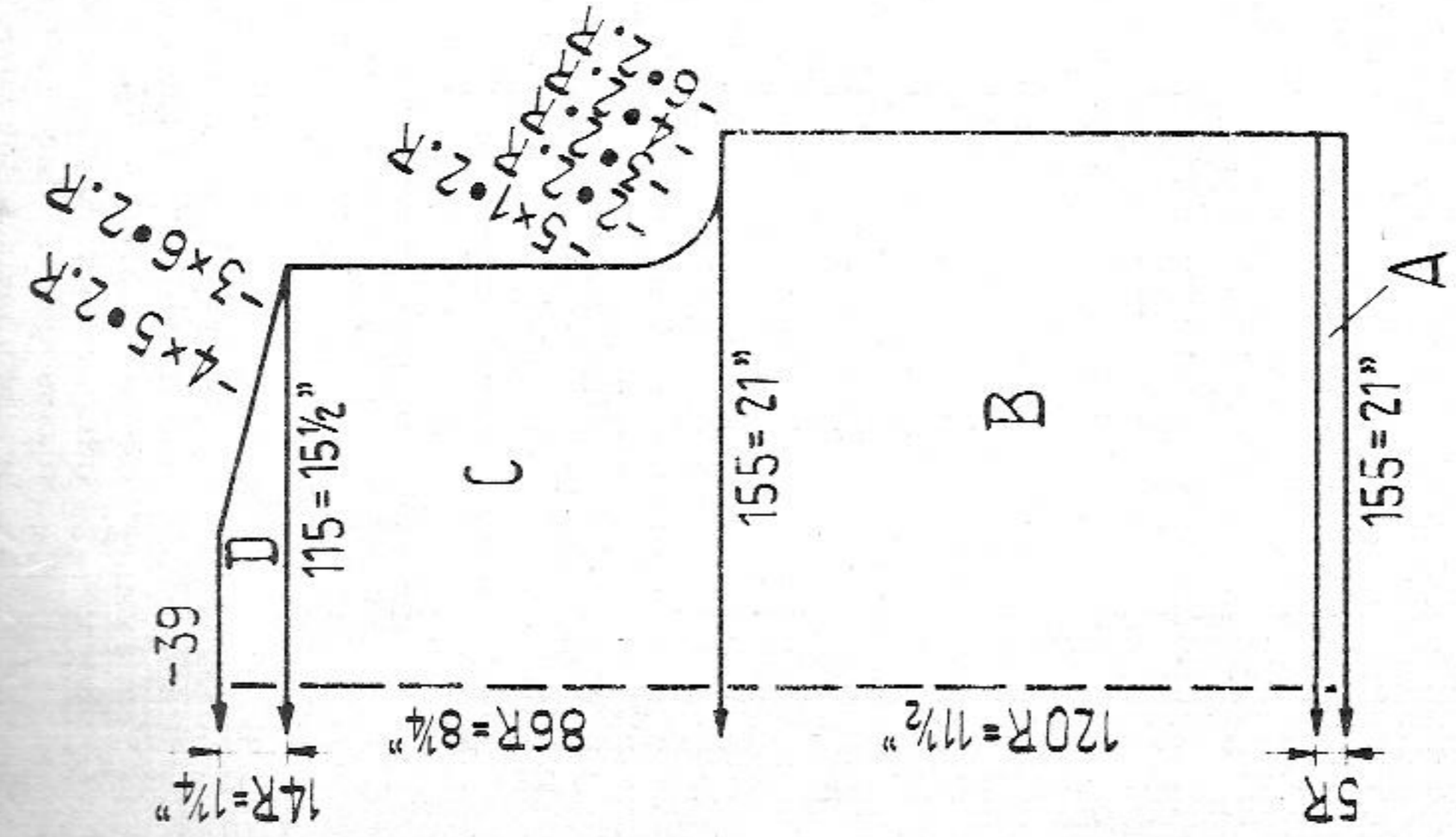

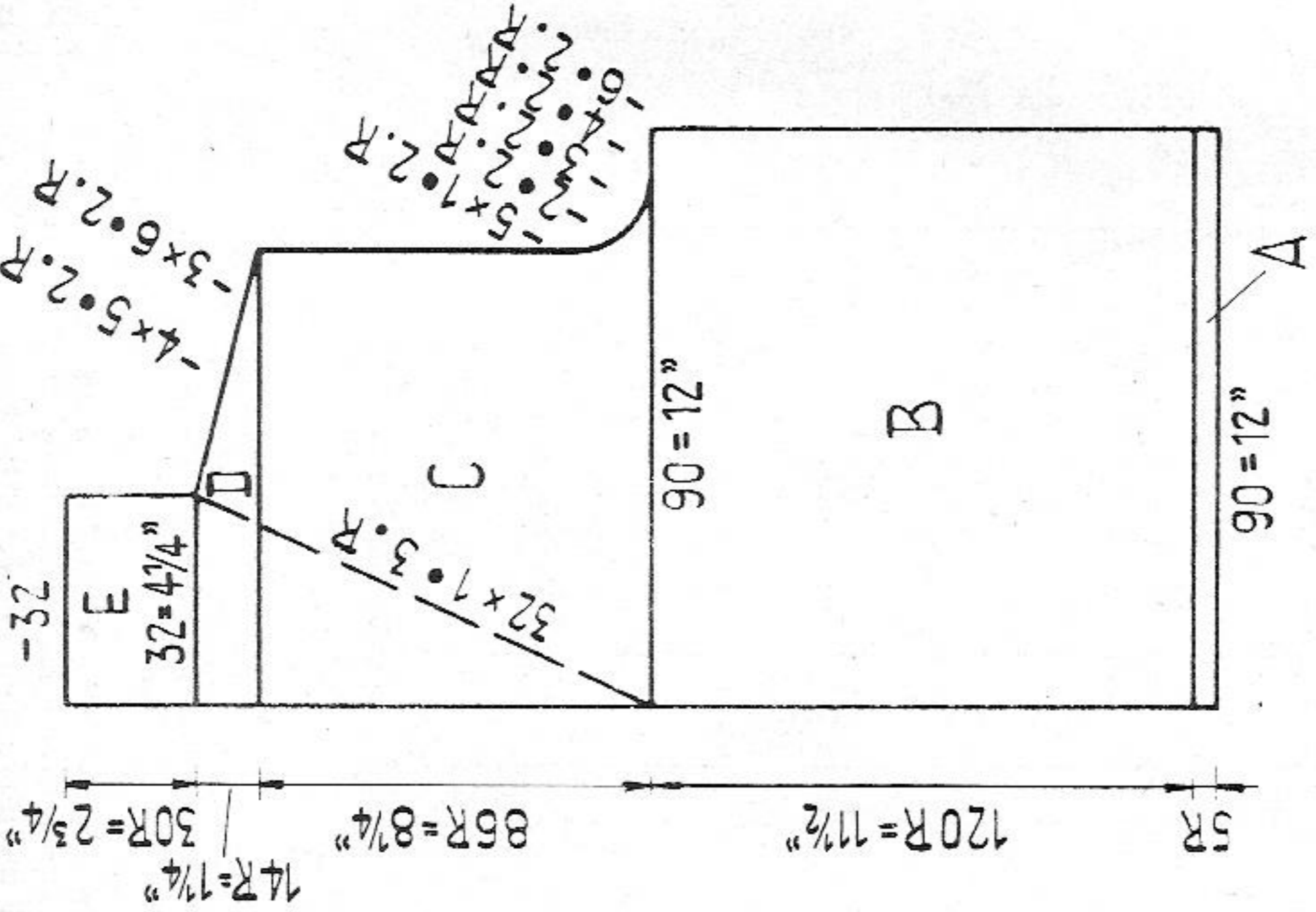
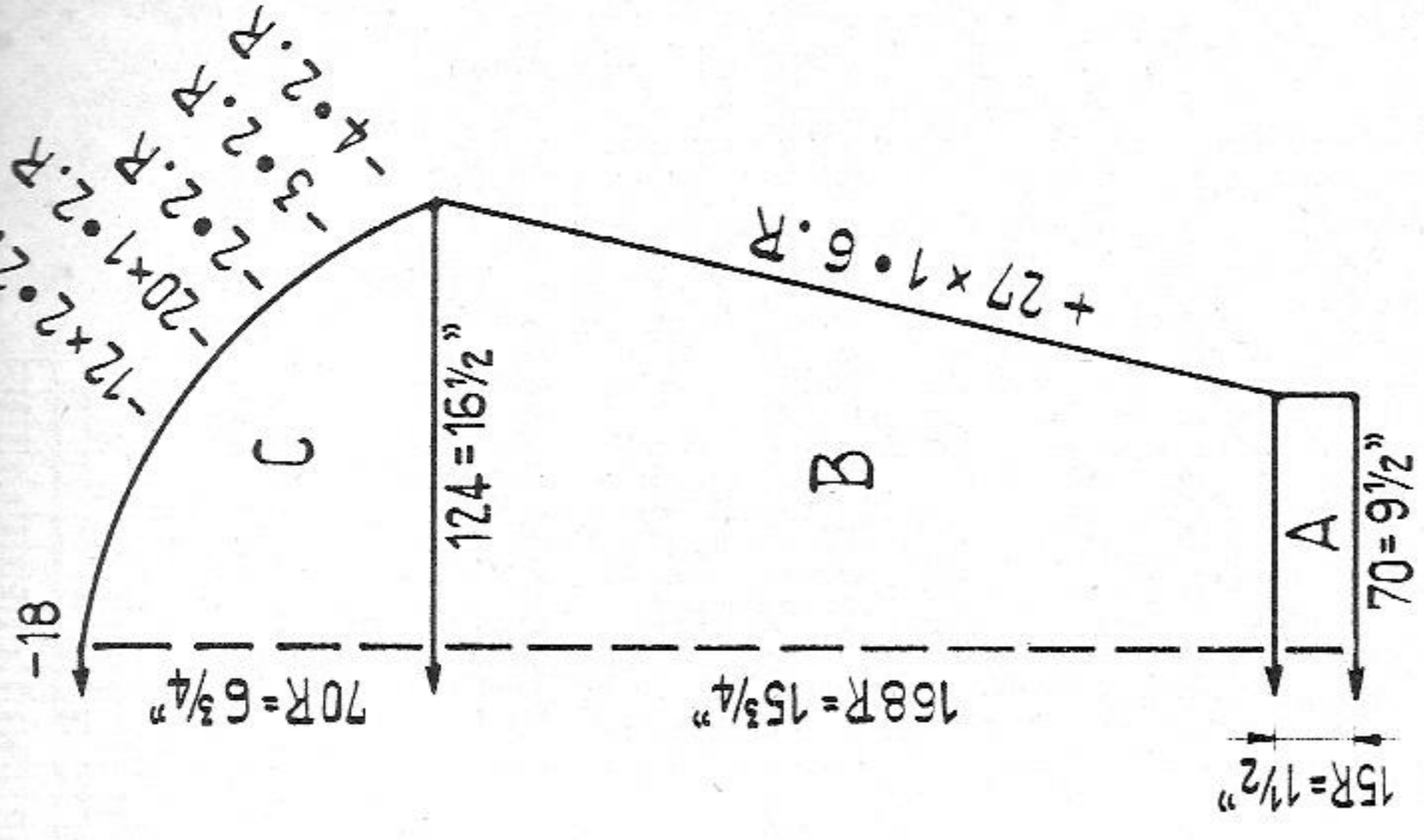

Bed jacket

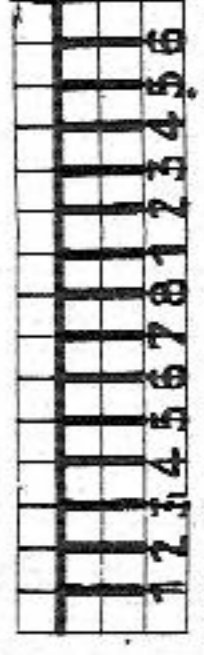
Size: to fit 36 to 38 inch bust

Materials: approx. 10 ozs Baby wool, 1 1/2 yard silk ribbon

Stitch size: 1:1 border 2, pattern 5 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 13 1/2", 100 rows = 9 1/2"

Pattern:



With tripledecker needle hang the 1st, 2nd, 3rd st for 1 nd to the right, and the 5th, 6th, 7th st for 1 nd to the left. Leave empty nds into W.P. and knit 2 rows. After 6 rows reverse pattern.

Figure I: A = 1:1. B, C and D = pattern.

Figure II: A = 1:1. B = pattern. C = pattern, for collar transfer 1 st from front bed to back bed every 3rd row. With the transferred sts on the back bed knit also the pattern. D and E = pattern.

Figure III: A = 1:1. B and C = pattern.

Front borders: knit twice. Cast on 178 sts in 1:1 and knit 5 rows. Bring all nds into W.P. and knit 2 rows tubular with St.S. 5 1/2, then on back bed 2 rows st. st. and on front bed 2 rows st. st. With contrast wool knit 2 rows tubular and 2 rows K/K then release.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Join collar at back centre and stitch around backneck. Join front borders and stitch them into position along front and collar with back stitch st by st, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Attach silk-ribbon.

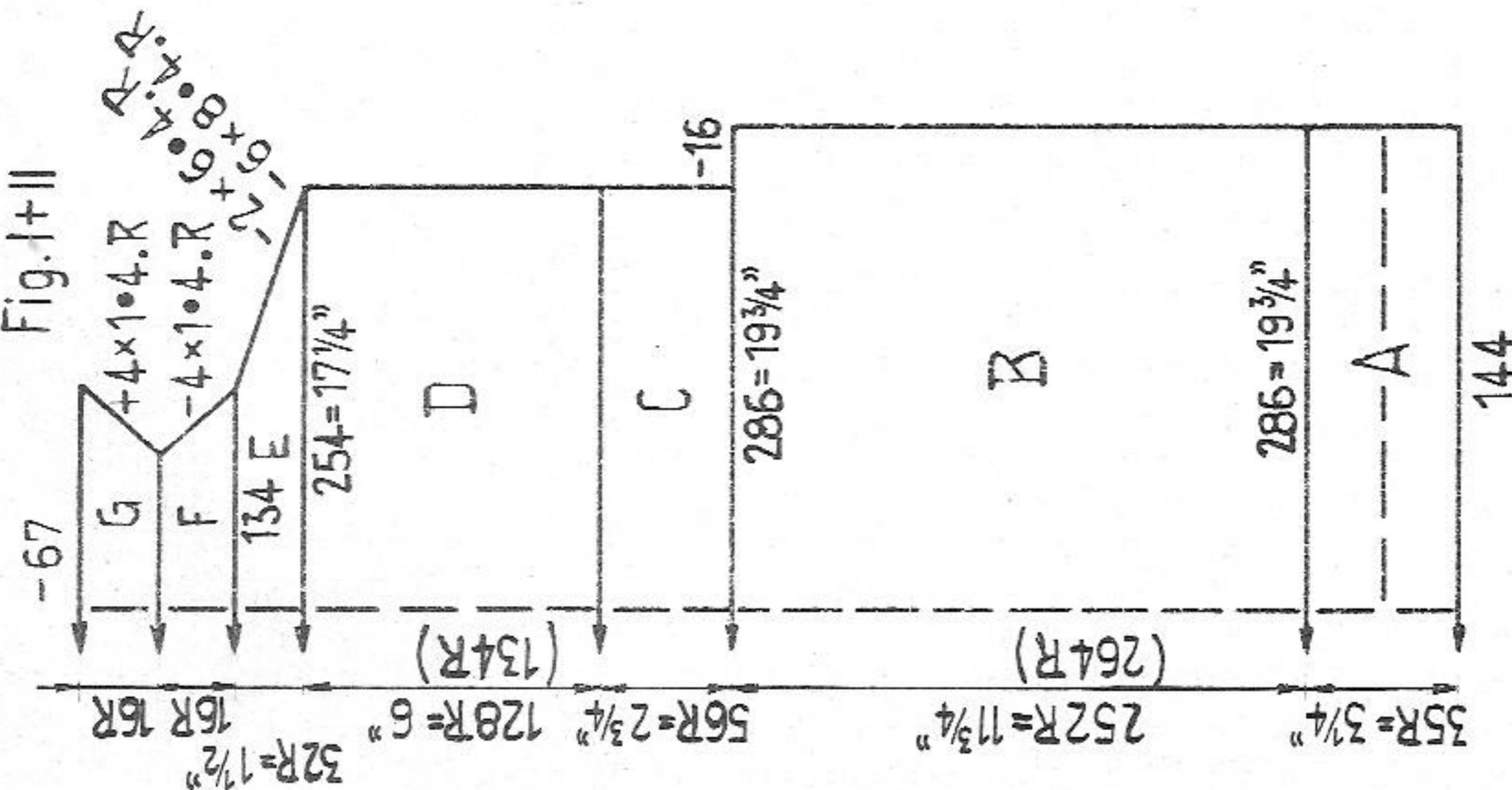
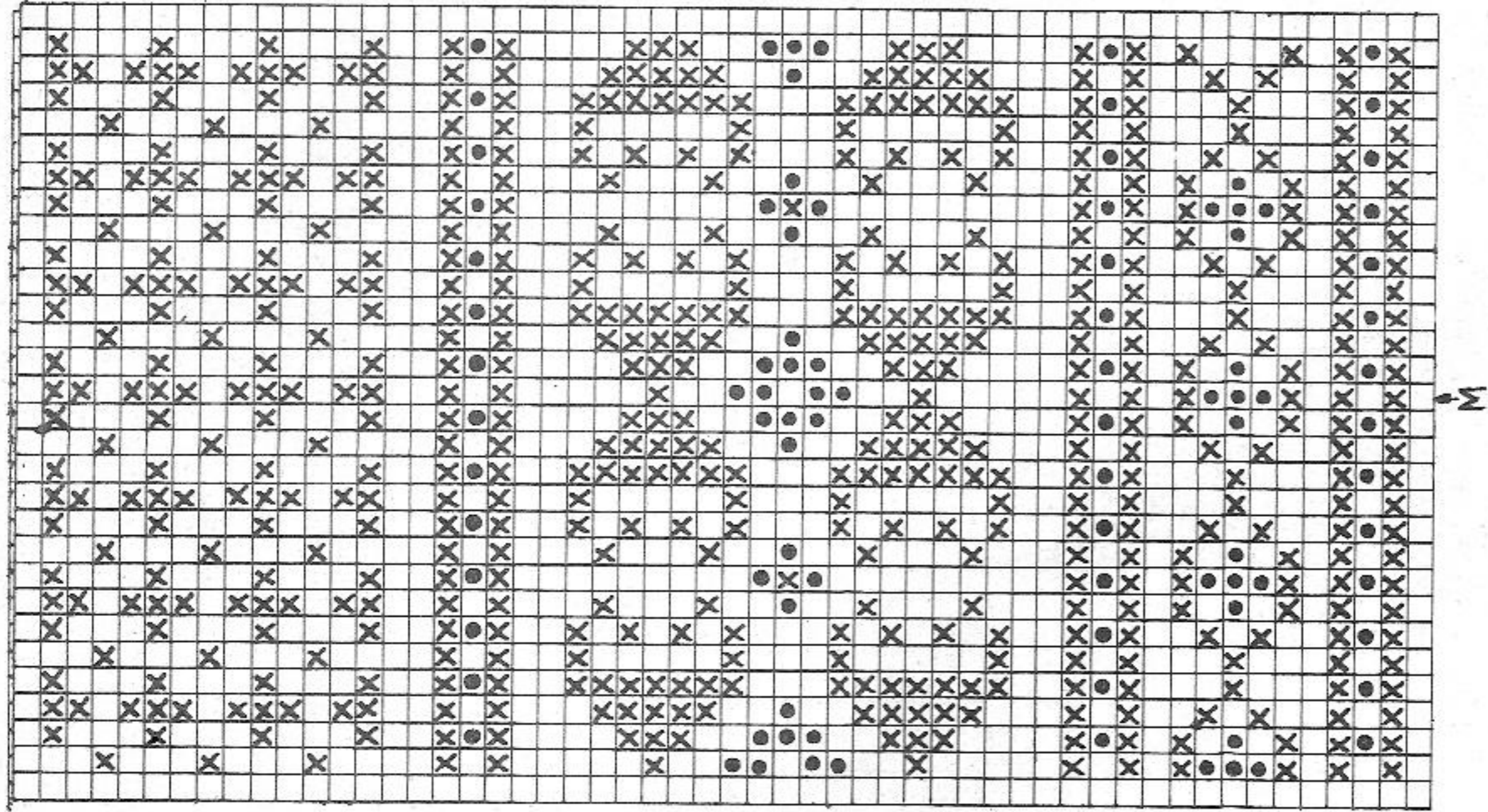
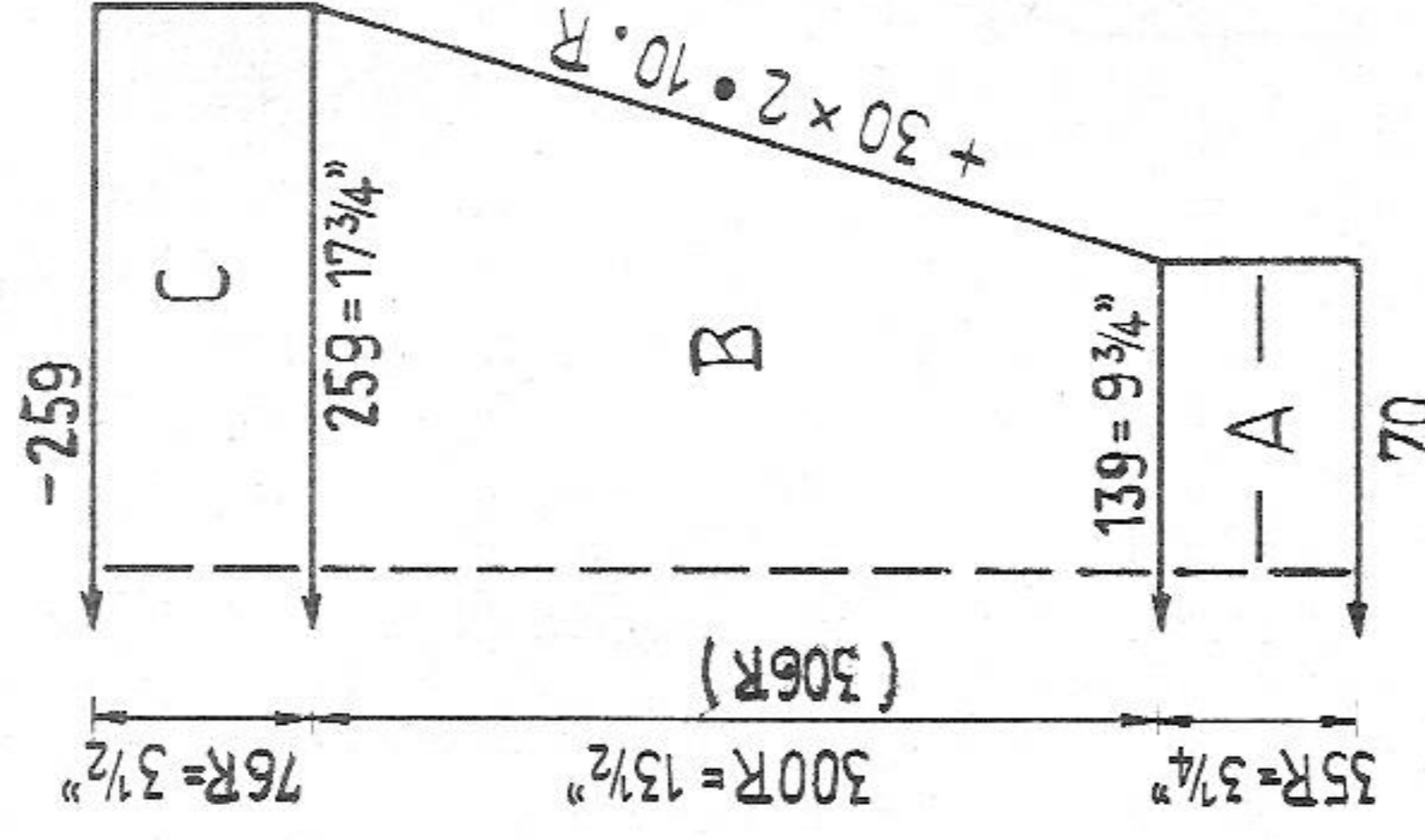

Lady's sport sweater

Size: to fit approx. 36 inch bust

Materials: medium sweater-wool, 17 ozs blue, 8 ozs red, 2 ozs white

Stitch size: 1:1 border 2 1/2, pattern 4 1/2

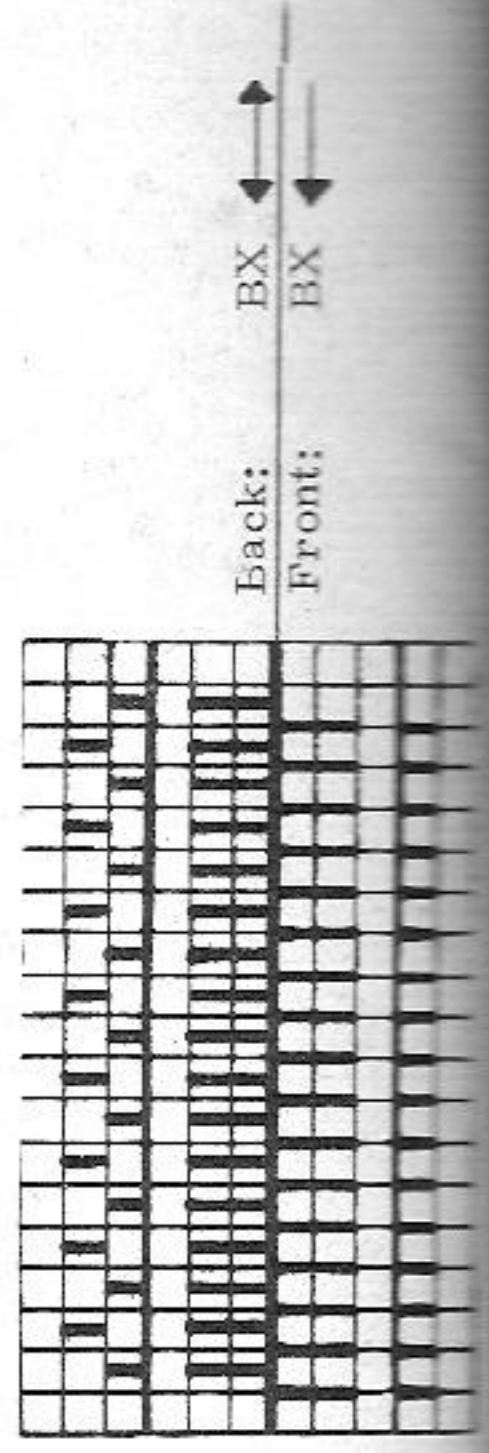
Test square: 100 sts = 6 3/4". 100 rows = 4 3/4"

Pattern: knit fairisle according to diagram. X = red, • = white, empty square = blue. 1 square = 1 st = 2 rows = RC 4. The rows in brackets indicate the rows on the Row Counter. M = centre.

Figure I and II: A = 1:1 in blue. B = pattern according to diagram. C = pattern III. D = pattern II. E = pattern III. F and G = 1:1 in blue.

Figure III: A = 1:1 in blue. B = first knit pattern I, then continue with pattern III. C = pattern III.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Sew all borders half to inside.

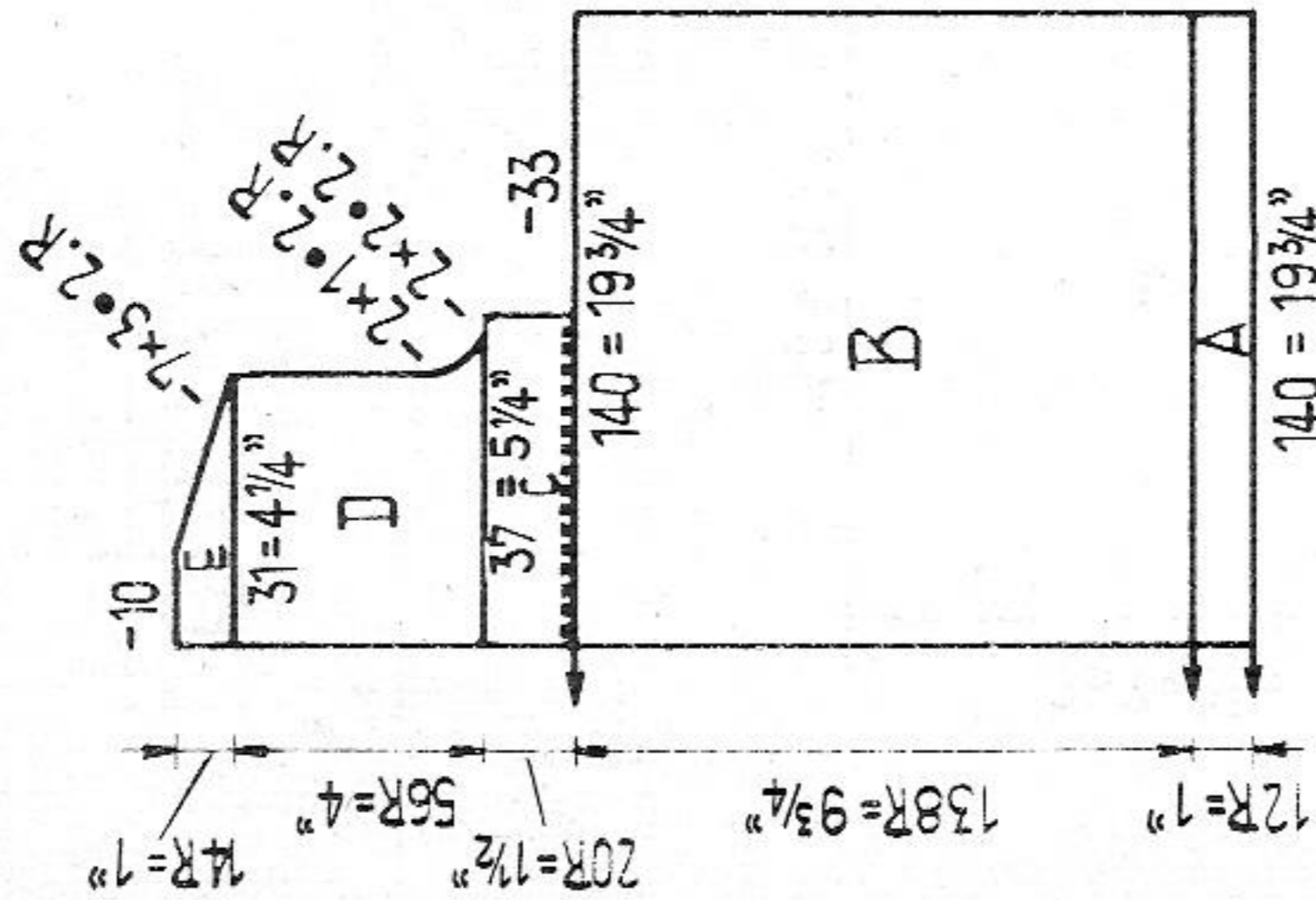

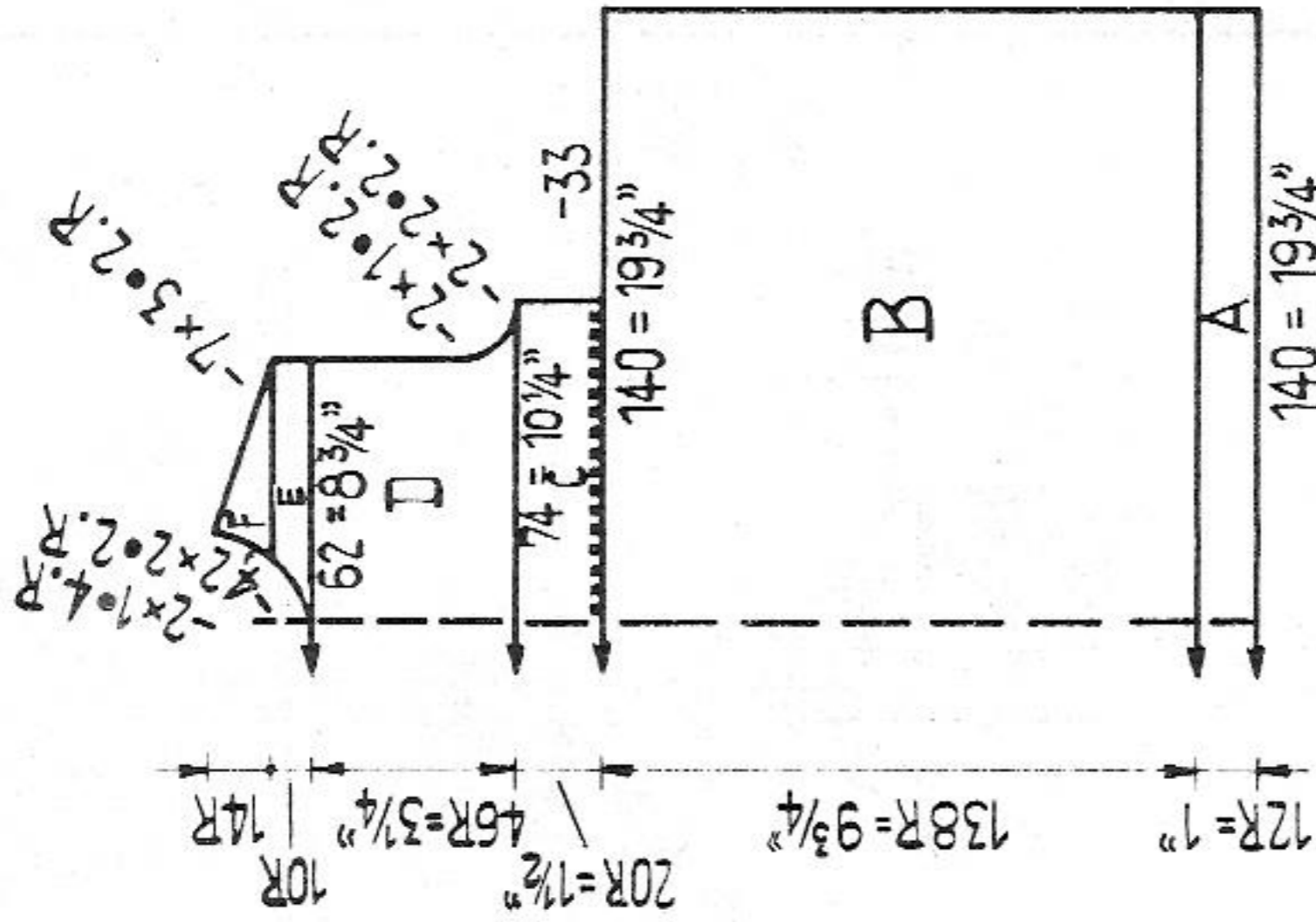
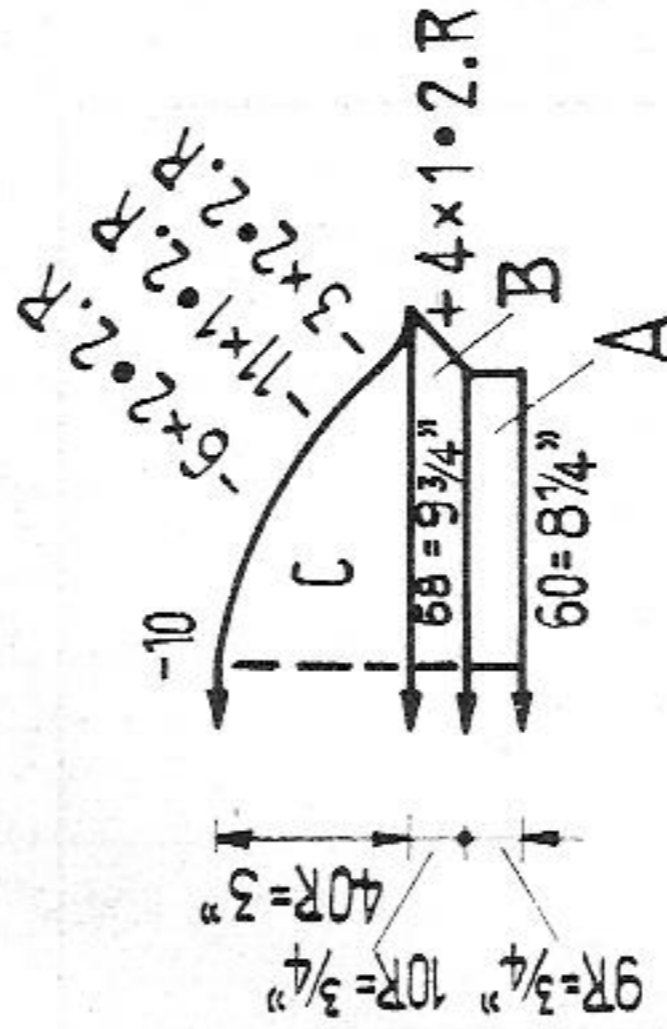

Little girl's dress

Size: approx. for 1 to 1 1/2 years

Materials: approx. 5 ozs medium Baby wool, 9 buttons, 1 1/2 yard silk ribbon

Stitch size: hem 4 1/2, stocking st and pattern 5, 1:1 border 1 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 14 1/4", 100 rows = 7"

Pattern:

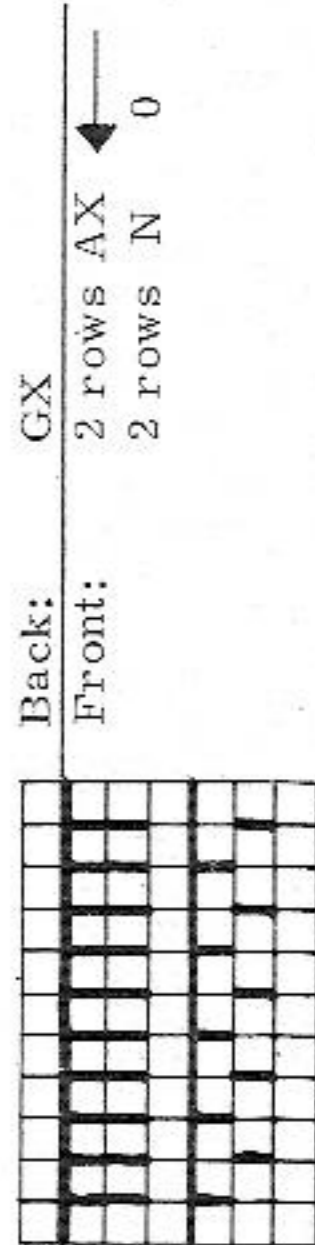


Figure I: A = hem, st. st. B = knit stripes of pattern as follows: 14 rows st. st., 14 rows pattern, 14 rows st. st., 14 rows pattern, 14 rows st. st., 14 rows pattern, 14 rows st. st., 10 rows pattern, 10 rows st. st., 10 rows pattern, 10 rows st. st. Take all sts onto a stitchholder. C = hang back half of knitted part over 37 nds, and knit 10 rows st. st., 10 rows pattern, at the same time make 1 row of open work at the first row of st. st. D and E = knit alternately 10 rows st. st. and 10 rows pattern.

Figure II: A and B = work as for Fig. I. C = hang back the sts over 74 nds and knit 10 rows st. st. and 10 rows pattern, make open work row in the first row of st. st. D = as Fig. I. E = divide work and continue with pattern. F = pattern.

Figure III: A = 1:1. B and C = knit alternately 10 rows pattern, 10 rows st. st. To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Crochet 2 rows of firm st around neck and back-opening, making 9 buttonhole loops at the left part. Attach buttons and pull silk ribbon through the open work row.

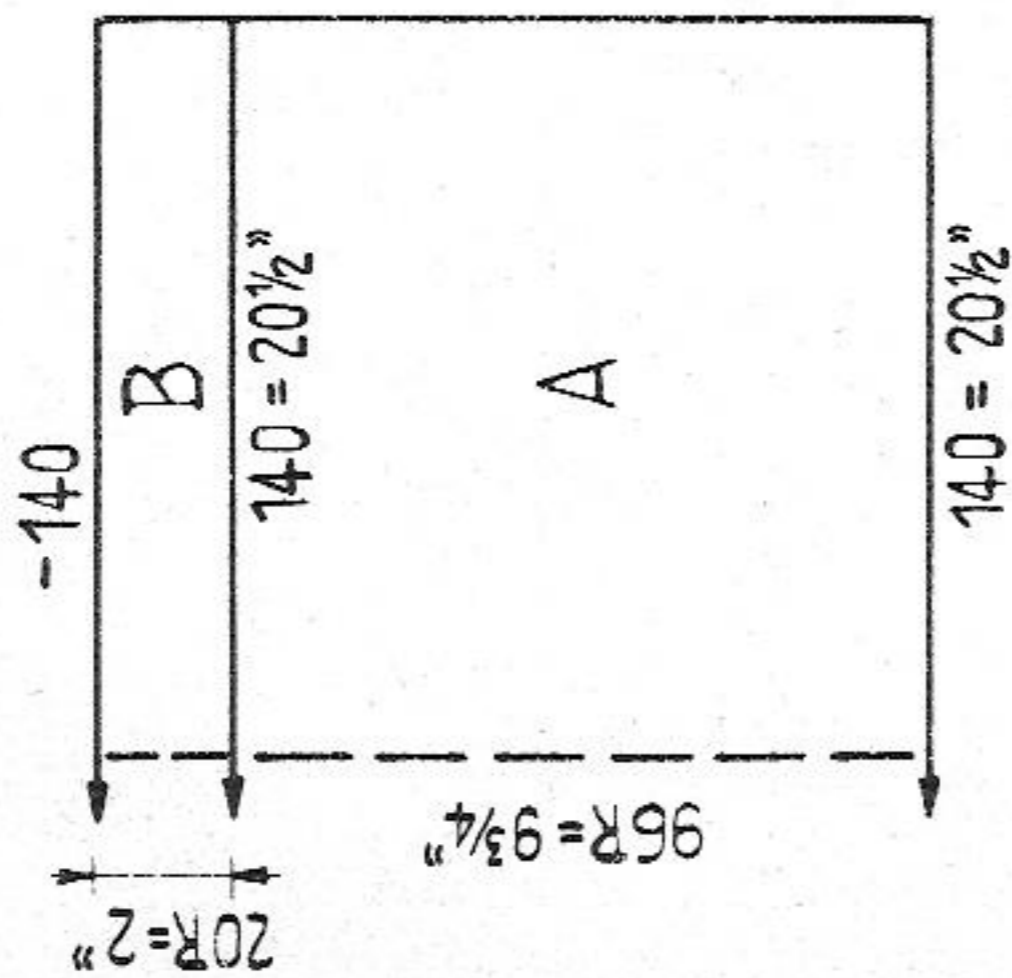
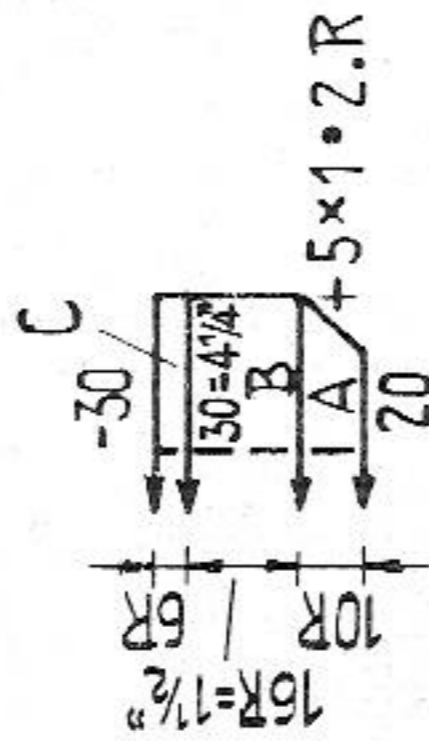

Little girl's dress

Size: approx. for 1 1/2 years
Materials: approx. 5 ozs Baby wool, cotton or silk of same colour for embroidery, elastic thread
Stitch size: stocking st, 6, pattern back 5 1/2 / front 4
Test square: 100 sts = 14 1/2". 100 rows = 10 1/4"
Pattern:

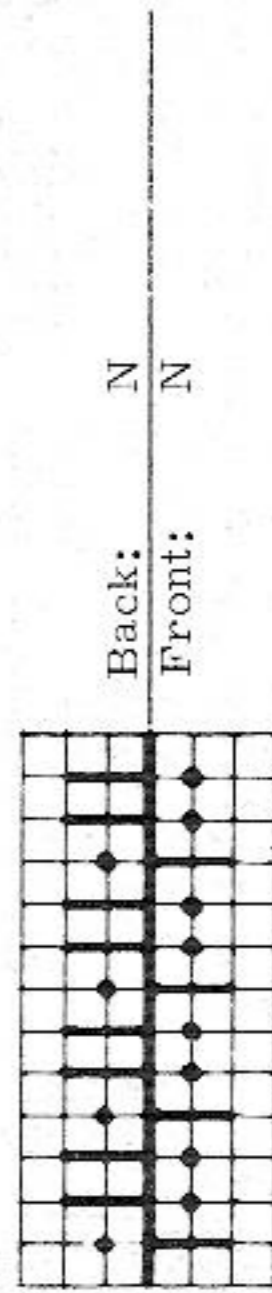


Figure I and II: A = stocking st. B = pattern.
Figure VI, pocket: A and B = stocking st. C = pattern.
Straps: knit twice. Cast on 18 sts for tubular (back and front each 9 sts), and knit 230 rows tubular.
To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. With smockstitch embroider yoke and pocketborder. With elastic thread, inside of yoke crochet 4 rows of firm stitch. Fix pocket and stripes.

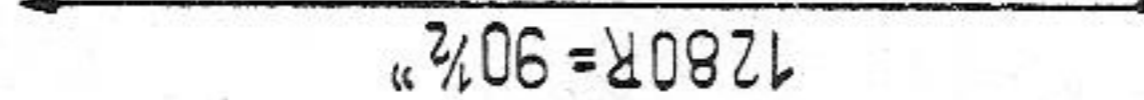
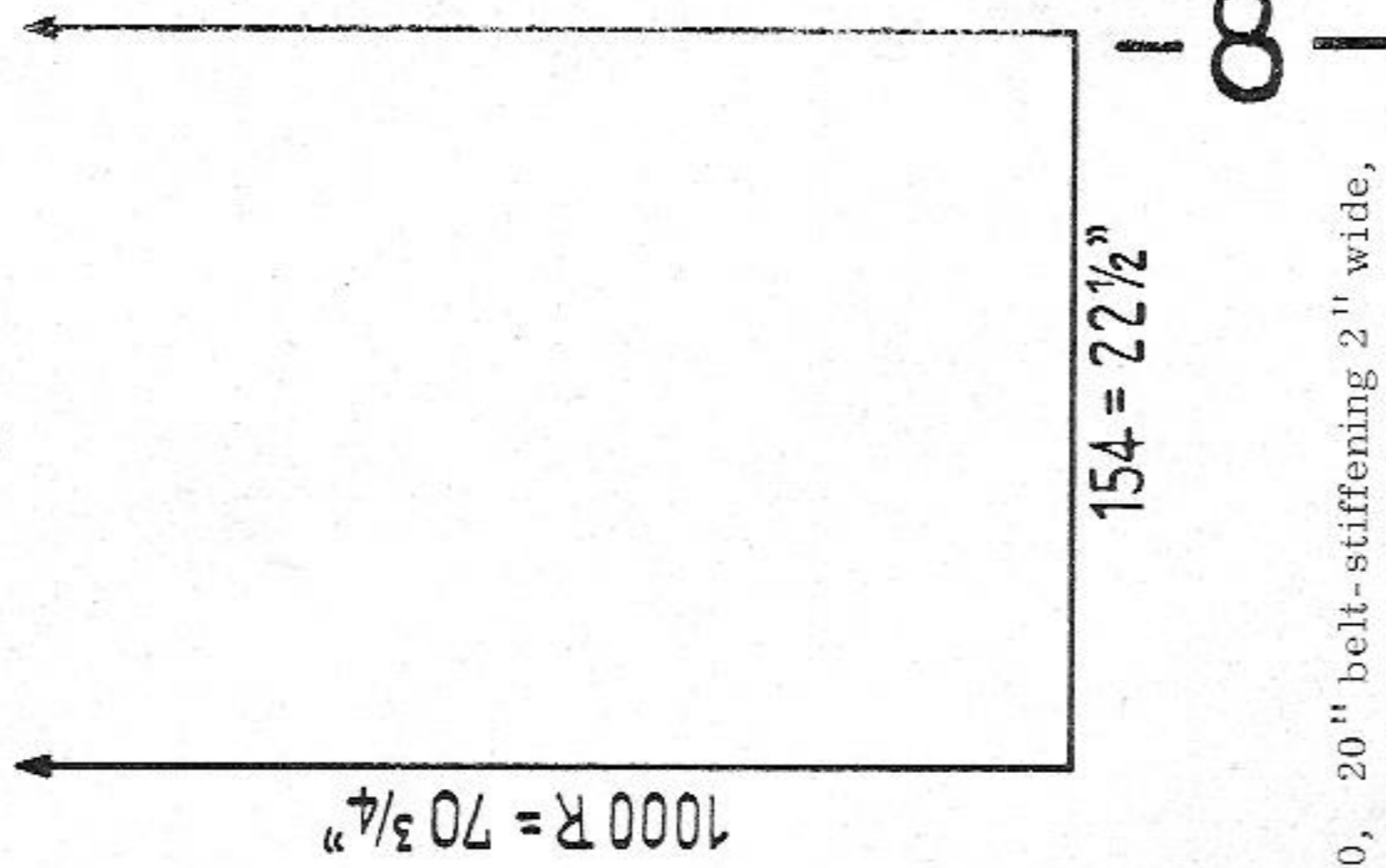

Dress for baptism

Size: approx. 2 to 6 months
Materials: 24 balls of cotton DMC No. 20, 20" belt-stiffening 2" wide, 3 yards silk ribbon, 4 yards taffeta
Stitch size: 4
Test square: 100 sts = 14 1/2". 100 rows = 7 1/4"
Pattern:

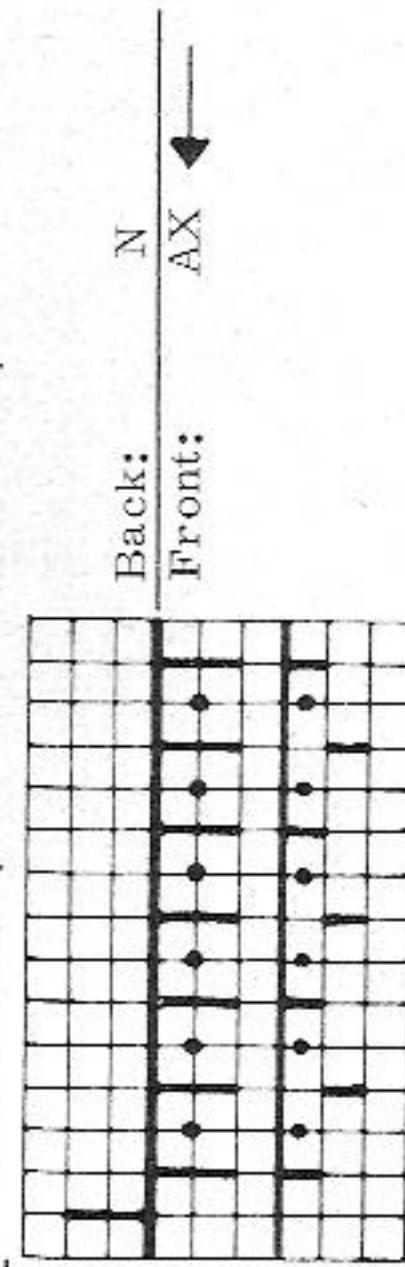


Figure a and b: A = pattern.
Belt: cast on 160 sts and knit 80 rows stocking st with St.S. 4. Cast off.
Straps: knit twice. Cast on 30 sts for tubular (back and front each 15 sts), and knit 300 rows. Cast off.
To make up: Starch and iron to size. Cut taffeta for Fig. a and b, and cover each piece with taffeta. On one side edge ruffle to length of belt. Cover belt stiffening, then stitch on first Fig. b, then underneath Fig. a. At the back at each belt edge attach silk ribbon, and take them to the front, making a bow at front centre. Attach straps.

Size: to fit approx. 34 inch bust
 Materials: approx. 12 ozs medium sweater wool
 Stitch size: 1:1 border 4, stocking st. 6
 Test square: 100 sts = 14 1/2". 100 rows = 10 1/4"
 Pattern: stocking stitch

Figure I: A = 1:1. B = stocking st., for raglan work with triple decker. D and E = stocking st. F = divide work, stocking st.
 Figure II: A - D = work as for Fig. I. E = divide work, st. st. F = stocking st.
 Figure III: A = 1:1. B = stocking st., for raglan hang the 3rd and 4th sts onto the 5th and 6th nds and follow up with the remaining sts.

Figure IV: A = 1:1. B = 1:1. for the dec. work as follows: on front bed hang the 6th st onto the 5th nd and knit 2 rows, then on back bed hang the 7th st onto the 6th nd and follow up with the remaining sts, knit 2 rows. Repeat this continuously. C and D = 1:1.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Join collar at back and sew them around neck, leaving a 1 inch opening at front centre.

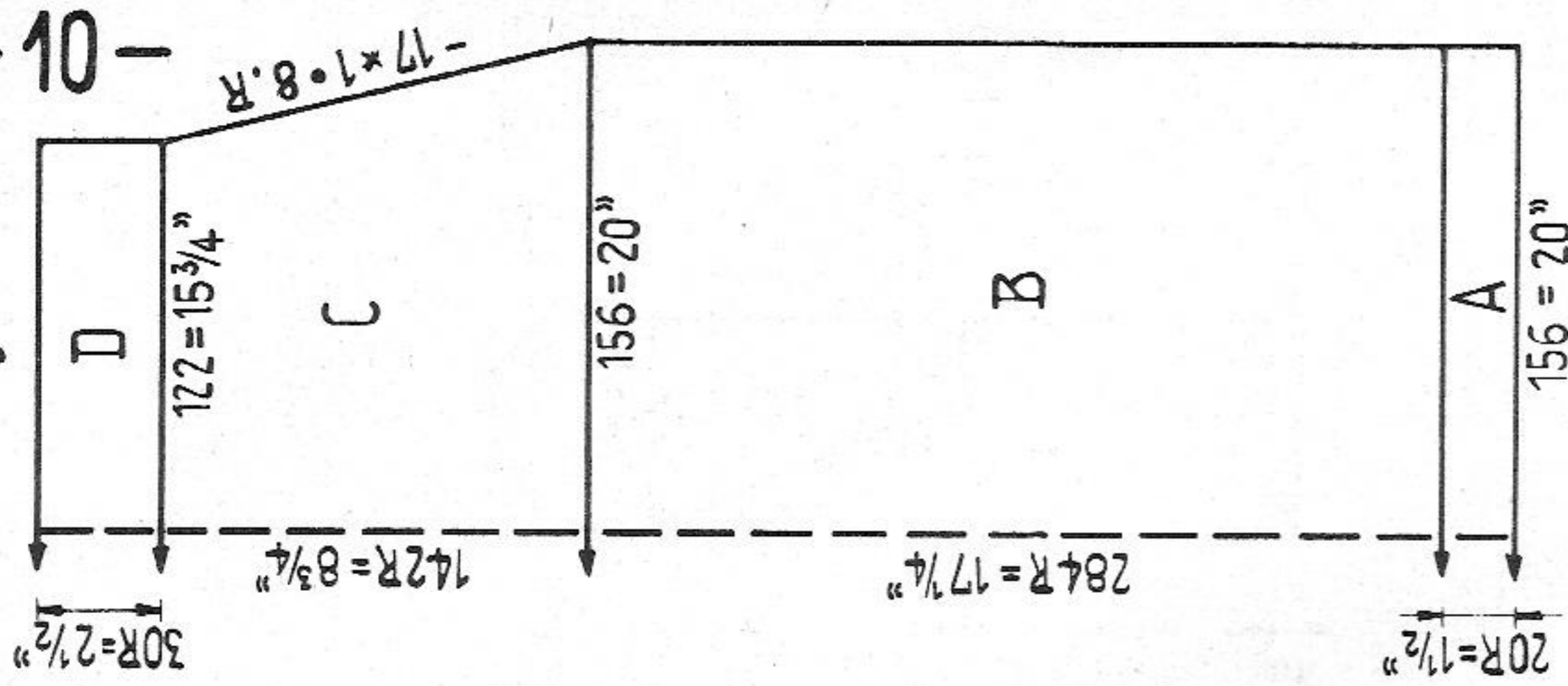


Figure I: A = stocking stitch. B, C and D = pattern. E = divide work, pattern.

Armhole border: knit twice. Cast on 17 sts and knit 170 rows in pattern, at the same time at left dec. 1 st, at right inc. 1 st in every 2nd row.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch neck- and armhole borders into position. Hem lower edge to inside. Skirt. Join seams, leaving open at left side for zip. Sew hem and waistborder to inside. Pull elastic through waistborder and fix. Set in zip.

Fashionable lady's sweater in two colours

Size: to fit 34 to 36 inch bust

Materials: approx. 10 ozs fine wool dark lilac, 8 ozs light lilac

Stitch size: tubular 3, stocking st, 4, pattern 3 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 5 1/2". 100 rows = 4 1/4"

Pattern: Knit fairisle according to diagram. X = light lilac, empty square = dark lilac. 1 square = 1 st = 2 rows = 4 RC.

Figures I and II: A = tubular with dark lilac. B = pattern. C = pattern. C = pattern, for the dec. work with double dekerneedle. D = pattern. E = stocking st. with dark lilac.

Figure III: A = tubular with dark lilac. B = pattern. C = pattern, for the dec. work with double dekerneedle.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Sew neckborder half to inside.

- Size:** for approx. 2 to 3 years
- Materials:** approx. 5 ozs babywool rose, green and white for embroidery, 3 buttons
- Stitch size:** 1:1 border 3, stocking st., stocking st. and pattern 5
- Test square:** 100 sts = 13". 100 rows = 8 3/4"
- Pattern:** stocking st. Frontpart with pattern. M = centre.



Knit 4 rows, then hang the 1st and 2nd sts onto the 3rd and 4th nds, and the 3rd and 4th sts onto the 1st and 2nd nds. Repeat

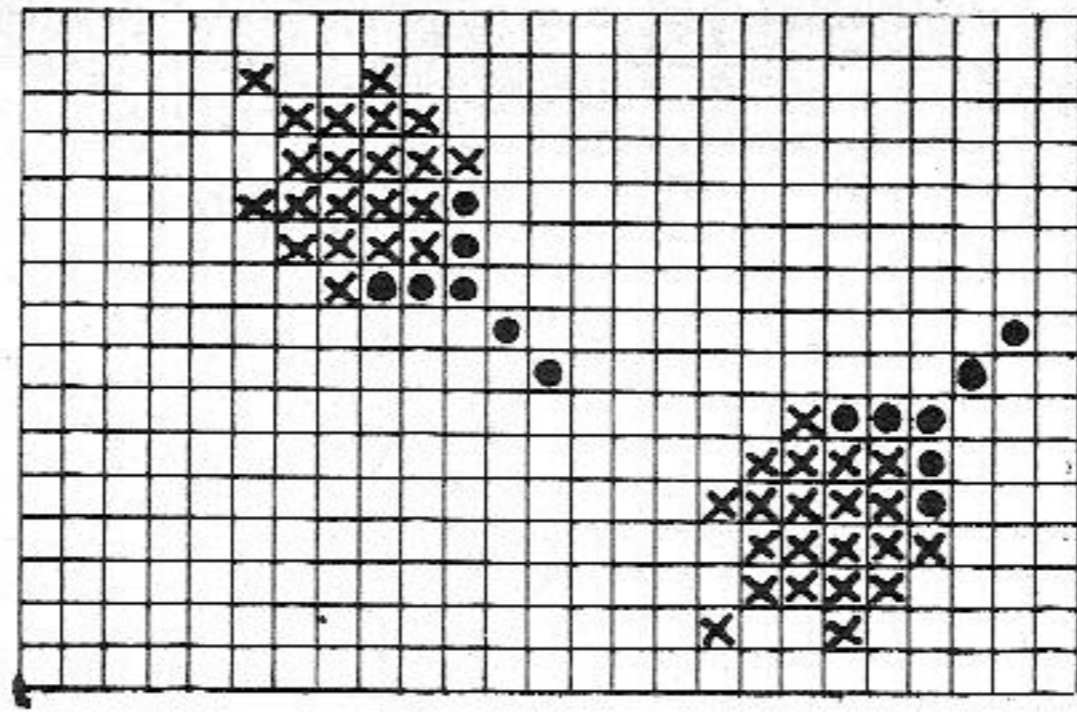

Neckborder: Cast on 76 sts and knit 12 rows stocking st. With contrast wool knit a few rows, then release.
To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch neckborder around neck with back stitch st by st, unraveling contrast wool, then slip st inside. Around back opening crochet 1 row of firm st, making 3 buttonhole loops. Attach buttons. Embroider the centre part of front acc. to diagram.

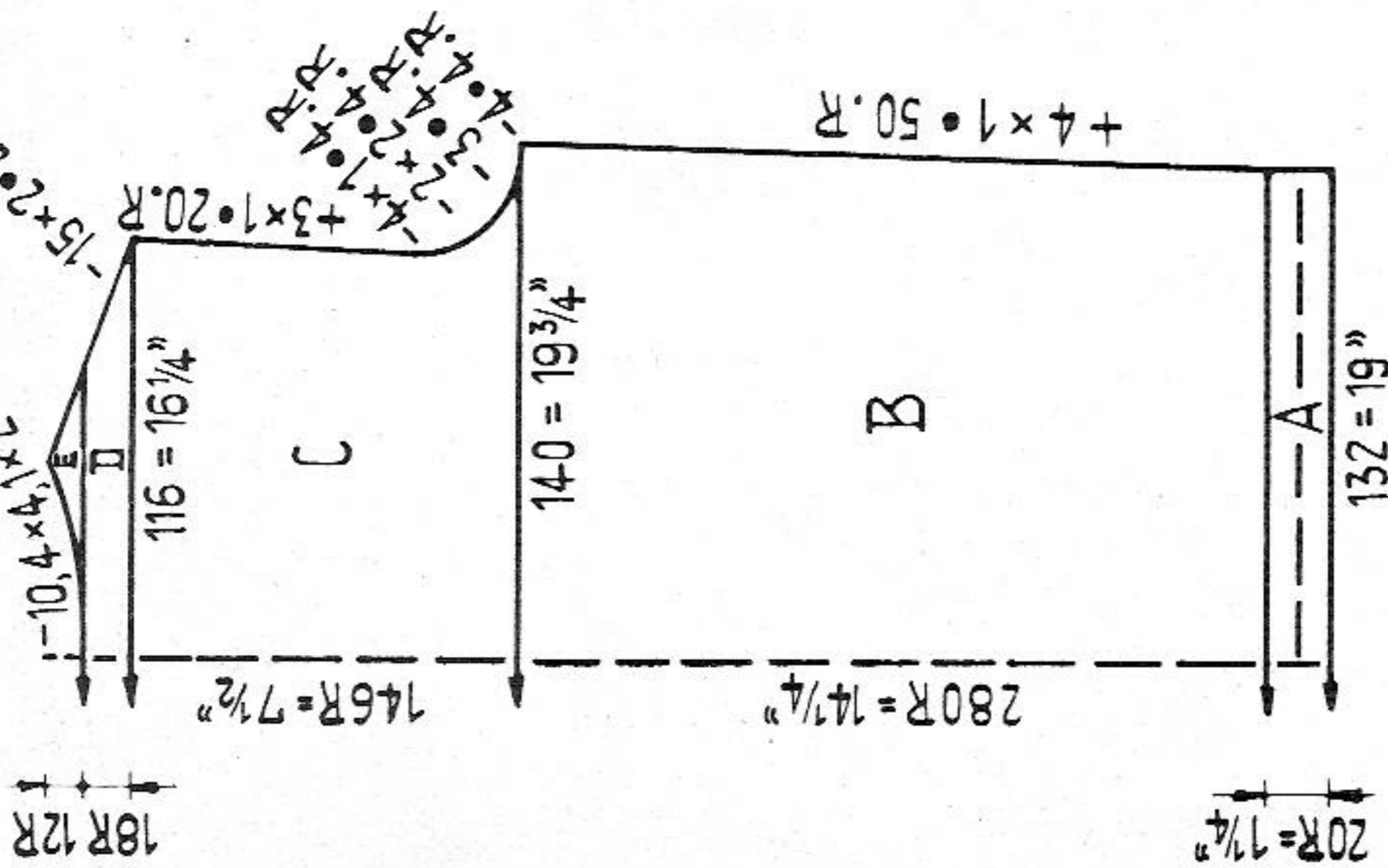
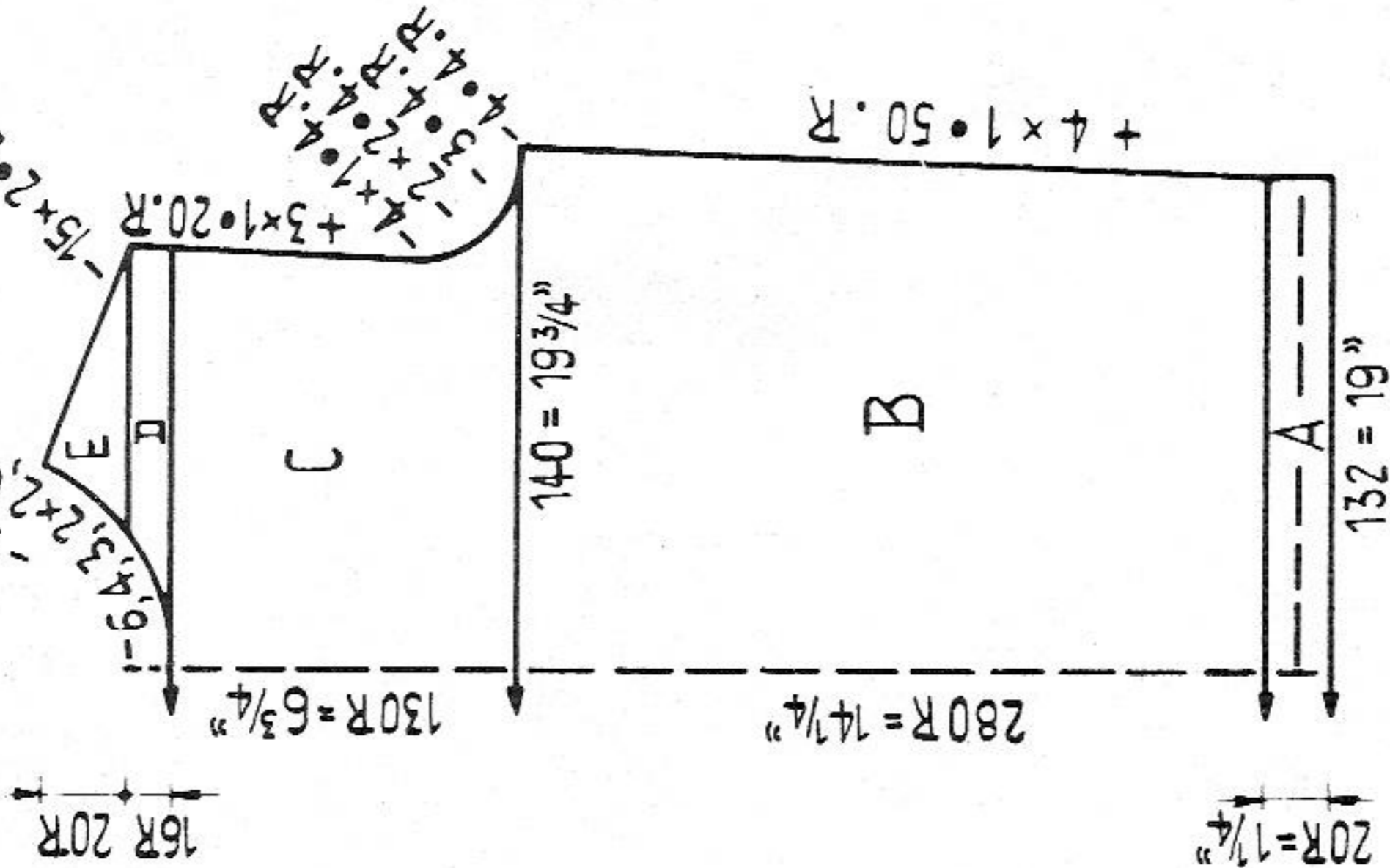


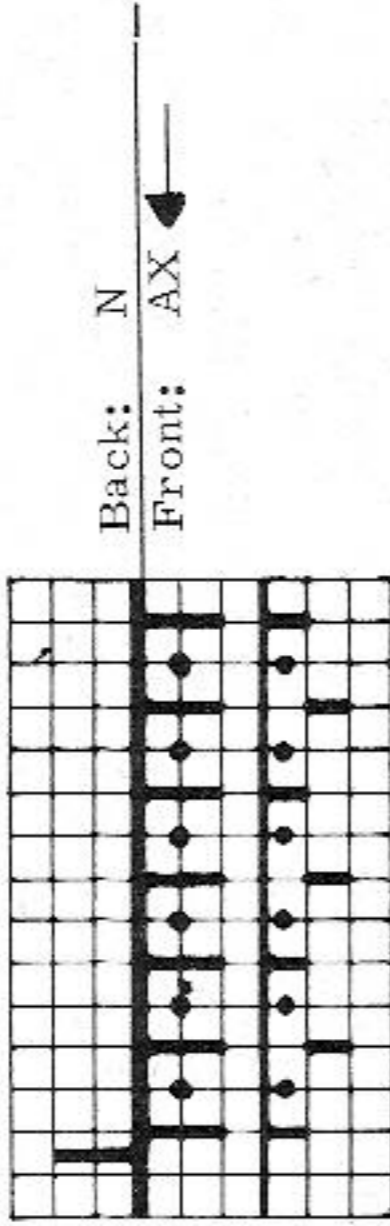

Lamp:
Materials: 2 ozs cotton yarn, lining, 1 lamp-shade for covering (approx. 6" high), 1 lamp-holder

Pattern:



Cast on 22 sts and knit 400 rows in pattern. Cast off.
To make up: Join seam and then pull over the lampshade. Fold lower and upper edge to inside and sew on. Line the lamp with lining and fix the lampshade on the holder.

Lady's cotton sweater

Size: to fit 36 inch bust

Materials: approx. 9 ozs medium cotton yarn red, 3 buttons

Stitch size: 4

Test square: 100 sts = 14 1/4". 100 rows = 5 1/4"

Pattern:

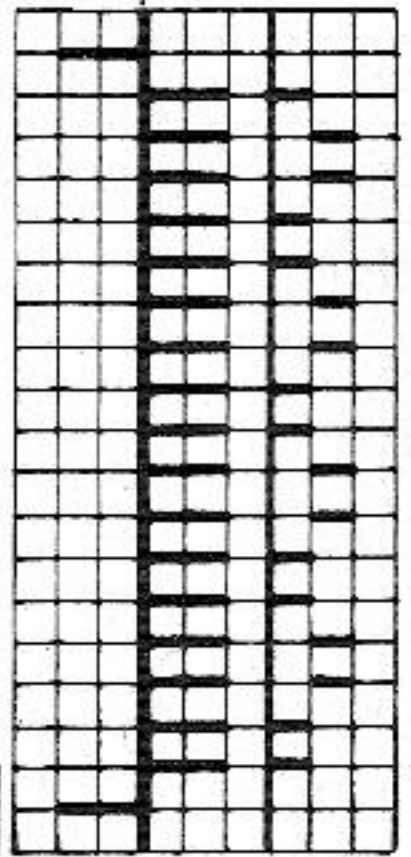


Figure I: A = stocking st. B, C and D = pattern. E = divide work, pattern.
Figure II: A = stocking st. B and C = pattern. D = divide work, pattern. E = pattern.
Armhole border: Knit twice. Cast on 120 sts for stocking st. and knit 14 rows. With contrast wool knit a few rows, then release.
Neckborder: Cast on 150 sts for stocking st and knit 14 rows. With contrast wool knit a few rows, then release.
Trimming border: With contrast wool cast on 160 sts and knit a few rows. Then with cotton yarn knit 12 rows stocking st, and with contrast wool again a few rows. Release.
To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Fold trimming border into half and stitch them into position with 5 sts distance from the front centre st by st with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool, and at lower edge make a little rounding. Stitch neck- and armhole-borders into position st by st with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Sew lower edge half to inside. Attach buttons.

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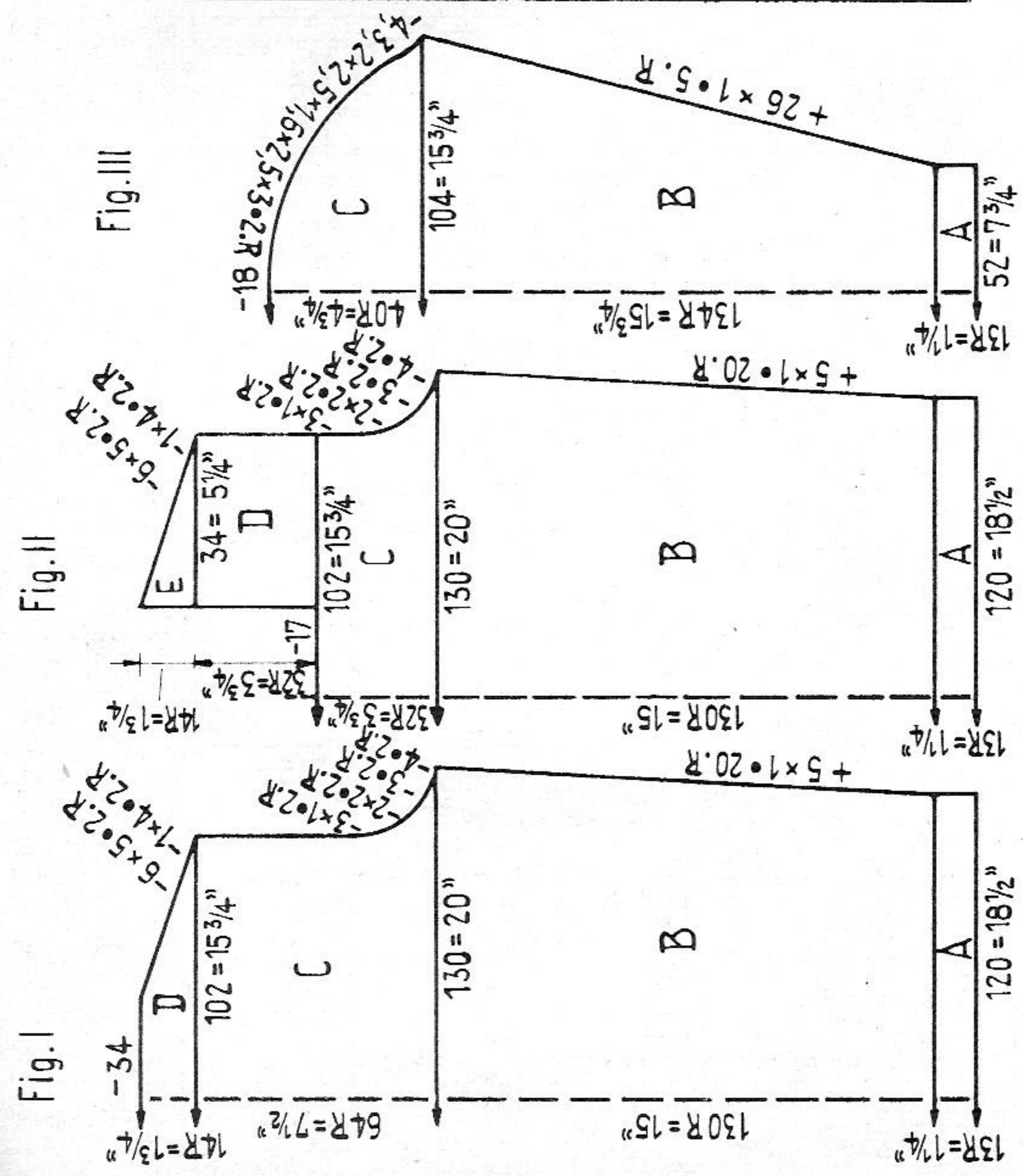
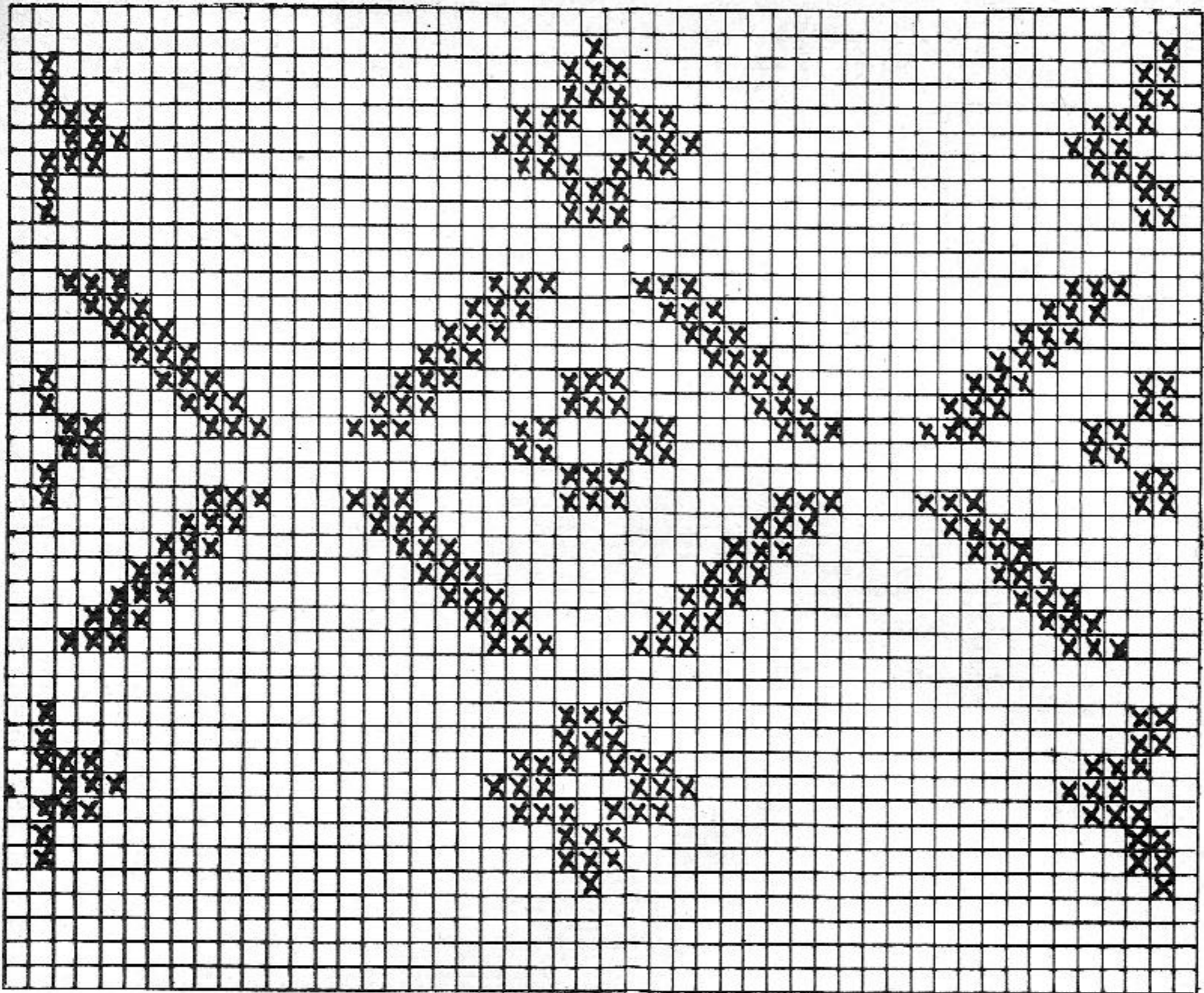
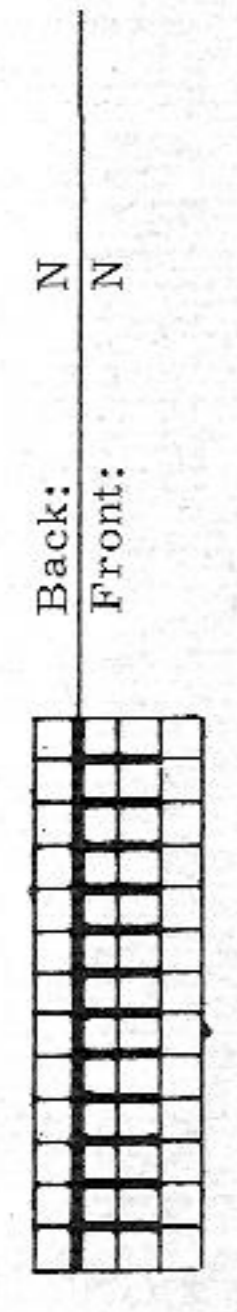


Figure I: A = 1:1. B, C and D = pattern.

Figure III: A = 1:1. B and C = pattern.
Neckborder: Hang the sts from the stitchholder back to the machine in 1:1 and knit 12 rows. Cast off.
Collar: Cast on 200 sts in K/K and knit 49 rows with St.S. 3 1/2, at the same time at each edge inc. 2 sts 7 times in every 6th row as follows: front and back hang the 4 outer sts for 1 st to the outside, then hang the cross threads onto the empty rnds. Cast off.
To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch collar around neck, then at each edge attach the 1:1 border loosely underneath the collar.

Size: to fit 36 inch bust
Materials: 18 ozs medium shetland wool
Stitch size: 1:1 border 4, pattern back 5, front 6 1/2
Test square: 100 sts = 15 1/2". 100 rows = 11 3/4"
Pattern: Work transfer pattern according to diagram. X = sts on the back bed. 1 square = 1 st = 1 row. Repeat pattern reversed.

Babycoat with bonnet

Size: for approx. 1 1/2 years

Materials: approx. 11 ozs thick babywool, 4 buttons

Stitch size: hem 5, stocking st. 6

Test square: 100 sts = 14 1/4", 100 rows = 10 1/4"

Pattern: stocking st.

Figures I, II, III: A = hem, stocking st. B - E = stocking st.

Figure IV: stocking st.

Figure VI: stocking st.

Figure XII: A and B = stocking st.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Along front edge crochet 6 rows of firm st, at the same time at the right part make 3 buttonholes with 1 3/4 inch distance after the 2nd row. Around collar crochet 2 rows of firm st. Stitch collar around neck, from centre front border to centre front border. Around pocket work 1 row of firm st, then stitch them into position 18 sts distant from the front edge and 20 rows from lower edge. Bonnet: Along front edge crochet 6 rows of firm st. For neck border crochet 4 rows of firm st, starting at the left corner, at the same time in the first row hold edge together strongly and at the right corner crochet 20 chain sts for the fastener. Attach button.

Stitch around buttonholes and attach buttons.

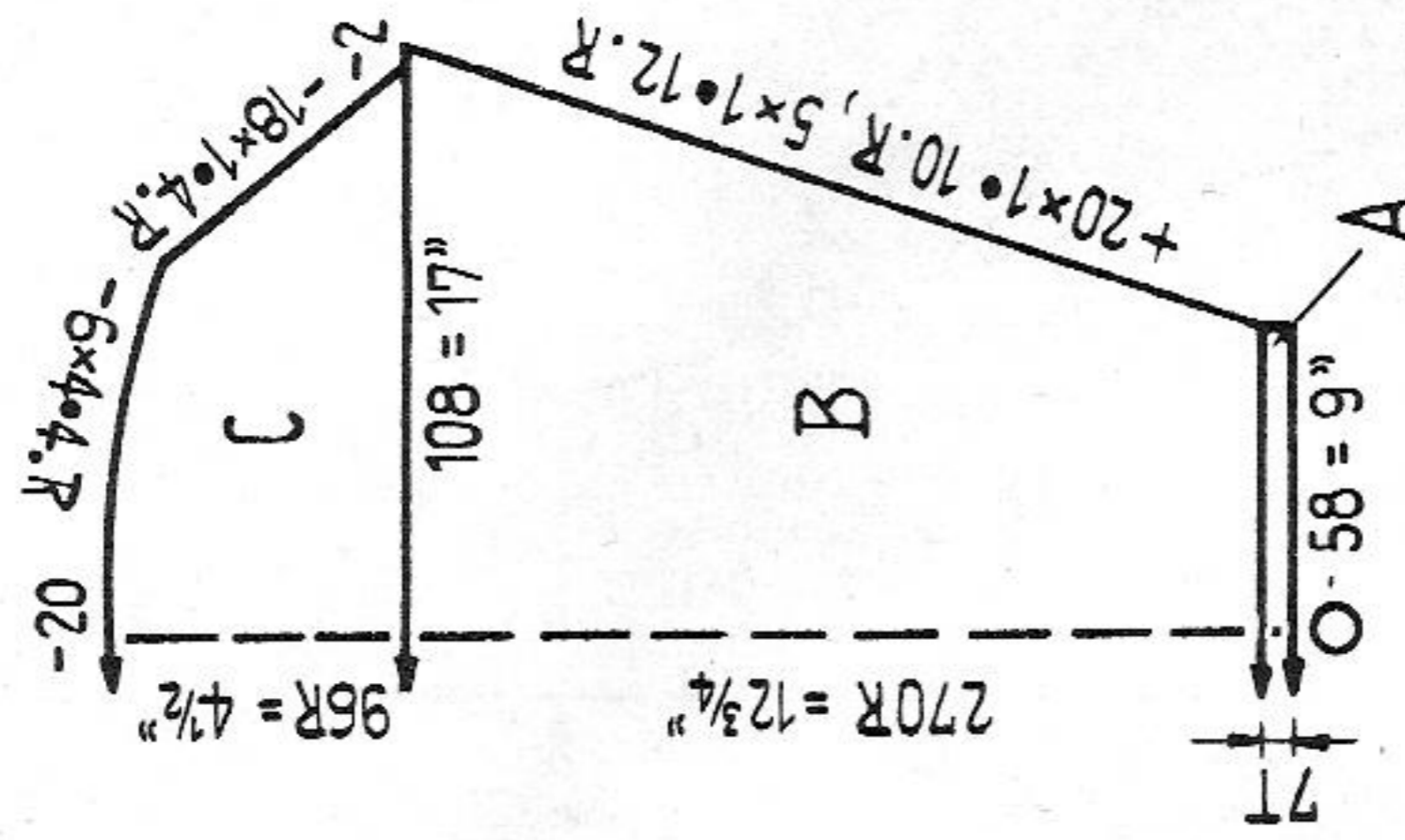

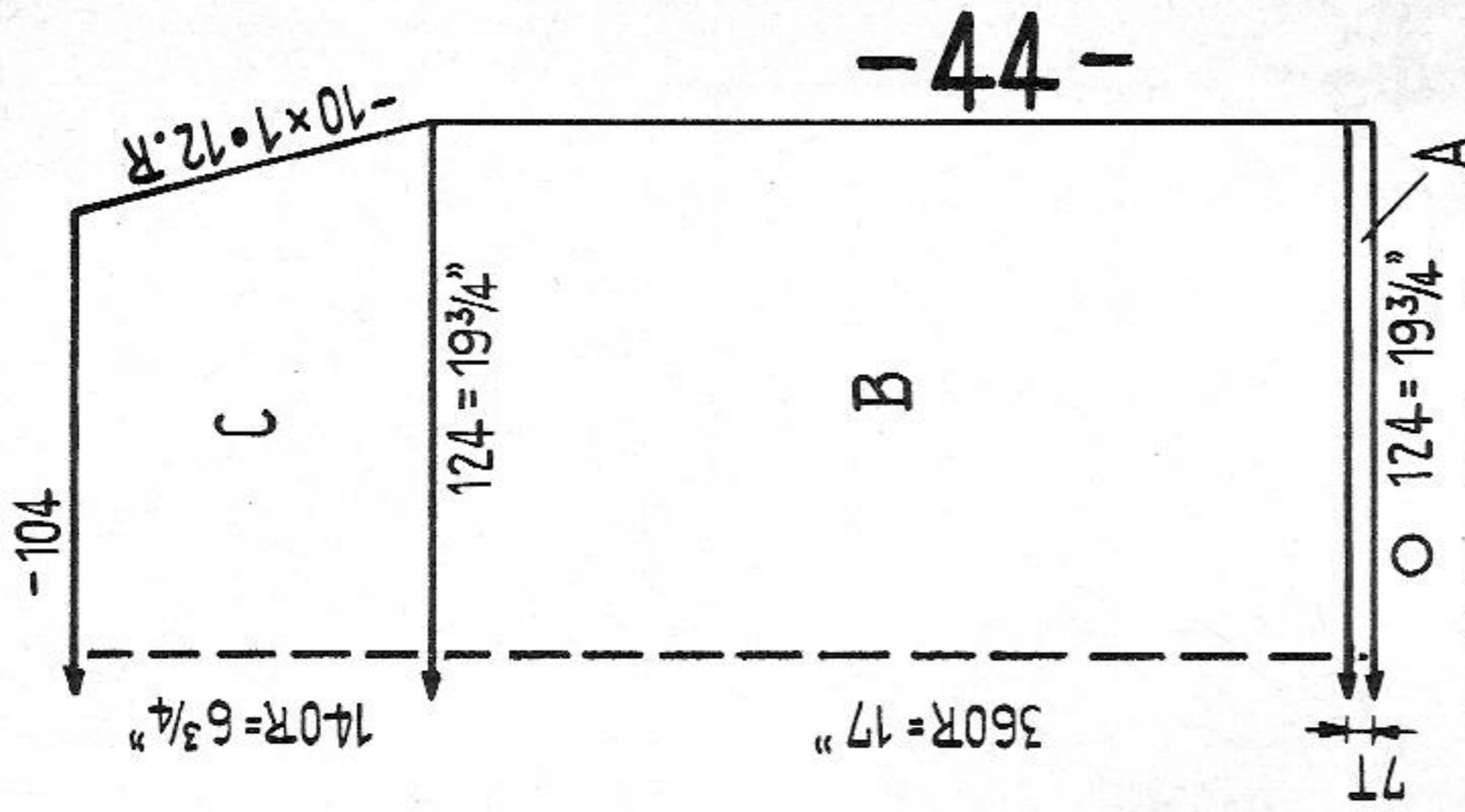

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch neckborder with red to the outside around neck, then fold and sew half to inside. Sew all hems half to inside. Embroider the rose according to diagram with cross stitch or graft stitch.

Now always opposite the lock bring 1 pusher into R.P. and knit 1 row, then wind the wool around the nd belonging to that pusher. Repeat continuously at both ends until all pushers are in R.P. Knit 2nd and all further blue lozenges as the first one.

b) Now bring all pushers into R.P. and the centre pusher of the 1st red lozenge into W.P. Now always opposite the lock bring 1 pusher into W.P. and hang the loop of the adjacent nd onto the nd belonging to that pusher, knit 1 row. Repeat continuously at both ends until all pushers are in W.P. Then repeat section a) with red. Knit 2nd and all further red lozenges as the first one.



Repeat section b) with white and blue.

Figure I: A = 1:1 in white. B = pattern, afterwards stocking st in white. C and D = stocking st in white.

Figure II: A = 1:1 in white. B = pattern, afterwards stocking st in white. C = divide work, stocking st in white. D = stocking st in white.

Figure III: A = 1:1 in white. B and C = stocking st in white.

Neckborder: Cast on 264 sts in K/K and knit 1 row with white, 2 rows in blue, 2 rows in red, and 2 rows in blue. Now with white knit 6 rows tubular. With contrast wool knit 2 rows tubular and 2 rows K/K, then release.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch neckborder around neck, first outside st by st with back-stitch, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Mitre front centre.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Join neckborders and stitch around neck, first outside st by st with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Join armhole borders as neckborder.

Special note: Exceptionally the indications from section B onwards refer to the sts of the front bed only. On back put nds into W.P. or N.P. as desired.

Neckborder: With red cast on 90 sts in 1:1 and knit 19 rows. Cast off.
Figure IX, pants: A = 1:1. B and C = stocking st. D = stocking st with short rows. E = stocking st. Knit 2nd part with reversed shapings.
Figure XII: A = 1:1 in red. B = pattern. C = pattern in white. For the dec. at both ends hang the 25th and 26th sts onto the 27th nd and follow up with the remaining 24 sts, knit 4 rows, then hang the 24th and 25th sts onto the 26th nd and follow up with the 23 sts, knit 4 rows, a.s.o. Take all sts onto a strong thread.

Mittens: Cast on 38 sts in 1:1 and knit 22 rows. Now transfer the sts for tubular. Knit 60 rows tubular. At the same time, after 20 rows, make thumb opening: with contrast wool knit over nds 4 to 9 from left just as for a buttonhole. For the point at both ends dec 2 sts 5 times in every 4th row. Take the remaining sts onto a stitchholder. **Thumb:** unravelling the contrast wool, hang sts back to the machine and knit 22 rows tubular. For the point at both ends dec. 2 sts. Pull together the remaining sts.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. **Sweater:** Join seams. Stitch neckborder around neck, then fold and sew half to inside. **Pants:** Join seams. Sew waistborder to inside and pull elastic through. At lower edge of leggings fix small elastic. Press folds. **Cap:** Join seam and pull together the upper sts. Fix pompon. Fold border half to outside. **Mittens:** Join border and graft the sts from the stitch holder.

Lady's two-piece suit (cover)

Size: to fit 32 to 34" bust

Materials: approx. 38 ozs tweed wool (welcome more, "Escapade"), 1 zip, 3 buttons, elastic and lining

Stitch size: 7 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 16 1/2". 100 rows = 12 1/4"

Pattern: stocking st, pur1 stitch side to the outside.

Figures I, III, VII, VIII: A - D = stocking stitch.

Figure II: A - E = stocking st, at the same time after 20 rows make 1st buttonhole over the 6th to 10th nds and two further buttonholes after 40 rows each.

Collar: Cast on 84 sts and knit 36 rows. Cast off. For collar take knit-stitch side to the outside.

Front border: Knit twice. Cast on 132 sts and knit 8 rows. With contrast wool knit a few rows, then release.

Collar border: Cast on 120 sts and work as for front border.

Sleeve border: Knit twice. Cast on 60 sts and work as for front border.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. **Jacket:** Join seams. Along lower edge crochet 2 rows of firm sts. Stitch front border with pur1 side to the outside first outside st by st with back stitch along front edge and for 2 1/2" along neck, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Join collar border as front border, then stitch collar along neck, leaving 1 1/2" free from the front edge. For sleeve border start sewing 20 sts away from the seam and 2 1/2" from the lower edge, then at the lower edge form a corner and sew 2nd end underneath. Finish buttonholes and attach buttons. **Skirt:** Join seams, leaving at left an 8" opening for zip. Set in zip and stitch on the elastic. Hem lower edge. Line the dress according to the pattern.
