Here a small request to our new PASSAP-Friends: please read the explanations on pages 1 and 2 before starting to knit. It is so much easier to follow our descriptions if you know the meaning of our abbreviations!

And now - happy knitting to you for the "crochet-look" on PASSAP.

Patterns: Drawing refers to half width, indication of stitch number to whole width of each part.





If the central line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is done simultaneously with reversed shapings.

If the central line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is done separately with reversed shapings.

Stitch size: These numbers are recommended by us, but must be controlled by means of a test square, knitted on your machine with your wool.

Abbreviations:

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i.e. to all needles which are in Working Position on front and back bed.

Exception: For tubular, the necessary stitches are only given for one bed, on the other bed, the same number of needles has to be put into Working position. In these cases, the sign for tubular \bigcirc respectively halftubular C or C is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

- + 3 × 2 • 8.R** means: 3 times incr. 2 stitches in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- 19 × 3 • 7.R** means: 19 times decr. 3 stitches in every 7th row (2 stitches at back, 1 stitch at front and vice versa).
- 17 × 1 • 2./3.R** means: 17 times decr. 1 stitch, alternately after 2 rows and 3 rows.
- ▲ - 4 × 8 • 2.R** means: work with pushers and knit graduations (Lock BX). Gradually after every 2nd row return 8 pushers into Rest Position (for double bed work 4 pushers each on back and front bed). When all graduations are finished, put pushers into Neutral Position and knit normally with all needles and without pushers.

Number of stitches and inches:

- 136 = 8"** means: a total of 136 stitches (for K/K 68 stitches each on front and back) make a width of 8".
- 146 = 17"** means: cast on 146 stitches each on front and back for tubular which makes a width of 17 ins.

Test square and PASSAP chart

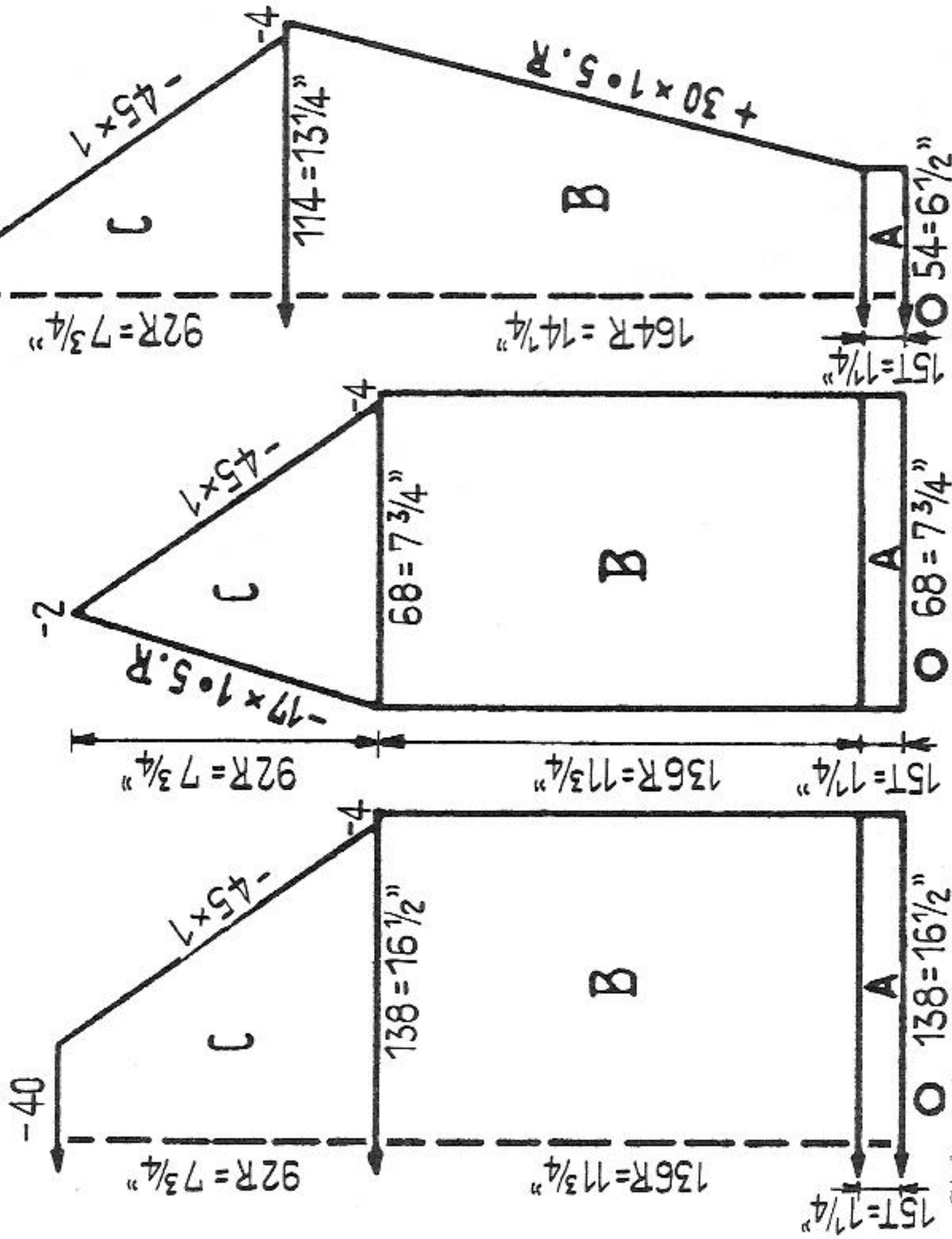
Following the new fashion line, this booklet contains quite a few dresses and two-piece suits, descriptions of which require more space than any other type of garment. We therefore left out the PASSAP-chart. Nevertheless we recommend that you make a test square for every new model you knit up. You may then calculate the necessary numbers of stitches and rows along the PASSAP chart and other explanations given in chapter 10 of your instruction book.

How to divide the work: Knit stitches, which should temporarily rest, like a buttonhole, with contrast yarn. Put the needles into Neutral Position. Thus you obtain long loops, which hold the stitches. Later on you just have to unravel the contrast yarn and the stitches will slip back to their needle heads.

PASSAP 12: Each model can also be done on PASSAP 12, if you choose a PASSAP 12 pattern. - Fairisle patterns can be done on PASSAP 12 with heel deckers, which are available at any PASSAP dealer.

Girl's twinset, jacket

Size: to fit approx. 30" bust
Materials: approx. 11 ozs medium sweater wool brown, 6 buttons
Stitch size: tubular and border $4\frac{1}{2}$, stocking stitch 5
Test square: 100 sts = $11\frac{3}{4}$ " 100 rows = $8\frac{3}{4}$ "
Pattern: stocking stitch

Raglan shaping:

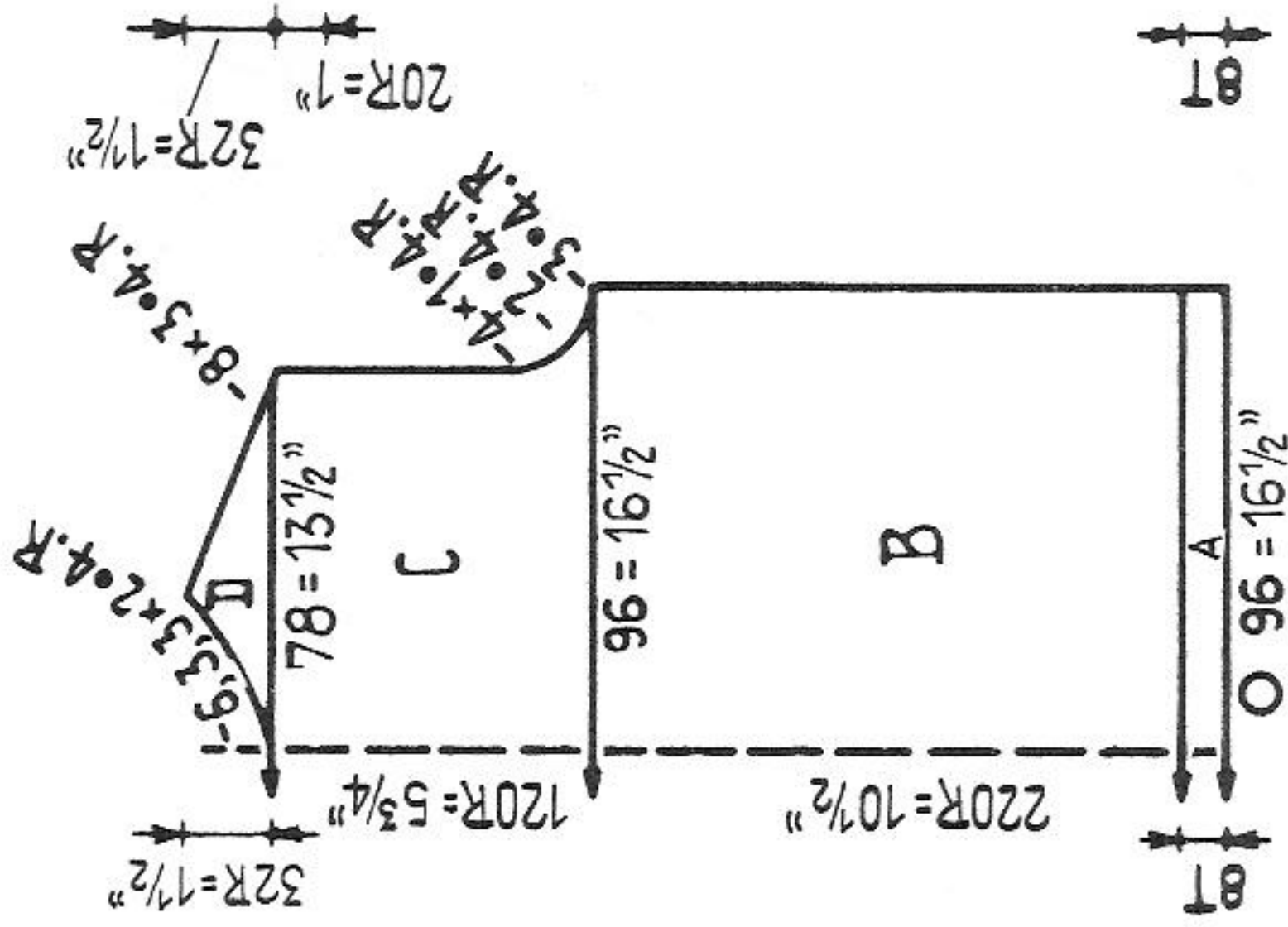
hang the 6th st onto 7th nd and follow up with remaining sts, 1 row
 hang the 5th st onto 6th nd and follow up with remaining sts, 1 row
 hang the 4th st onto 5th nd and follow up with remaining sts, 1 row
 hang the 3rd st onto 4th nd and follow up with remaining sts, 1 row
 knit 5 rows and repeat.

Figures I, II, III: A = hem, tubular. B = stocking stitch. C = stocking stitch with raglan shaping.

Border: cast on 150 sts and knit 30 rows stocking stitch, at the same time after 7 rows make buttonholes as follows: from left over the 6th to 9th nds make 1st buttonhole, then 5 more buttonholes, each 4nds wide, leaving 12 sts in between. After 23 rows repeat the buttonholes. With contrast wool knit a few rows, then release. Knit 2nd border without buttonholes.

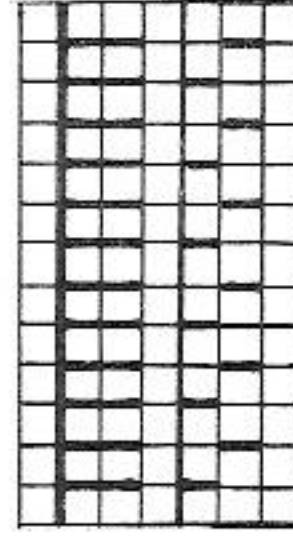
To make up: pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch on borders, first outside st by st with back-stitch, unravelling contrast wool, finish buttonholes, then slip stitch borders to inside. Attach buttons.

Sweater (for Duomatic only)

Size: to fit approx. 30" bust
Materials: medium sweater wool, 6 ozs blue, 4 ozs brown
Stitch size: tubular and stocking stitch $4\frac{1}{2}$, pattern 5
Test square: 100 sts = $17\frac{1}{2}$ " 100 rows = $4\frac{3}{4}$ "

Neck border: with blue cast on 120 sts and knit 16 rows stocking st. With contrast wool knit a few rows, then release.

Armhole border: knit twice. Cast on 80 sts and work as for neck border.

To make up: pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch on borders, first outside st by st with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside.

Size: to fit approx. 38" bust

Materials: fine sweater wool 17 ozs black, 4 ozs light red, 4ozs dark red

Stitch size: 2:2 border 2 1/2, pattern of one colour 4, fairisle pattern back 4 / front 5

Test square: 100 sts = 6 3/4"

pattern of one colour 100 rows = 4 3/4"

fairisle pattern 100 rows = 4"

back and sleeves in black. Front in fairisle pattern according to diagram.

X = dark red, • = light red, empty square = black. For the fairisle

pattern knit always 2 rows with dark red, 2 rows with light red, 2 rows

with black (if necessary, knit with the sts of back bed only).

Girl's jacket

- Size: to fit approx. 30 " bust
- Materials: 9 ozs medium sweater wool, 5 buttons
- Stitch size: hem 4 1/2, stocking st. 5
- Test square: 100 sts = 13 " 100 rows = 9 1/4 "
- Pattern:

stocking st. For pleat trimming work as follows: at back bring all nds into W.P. Stitch size back 1 / front 2 and knit 1 row. Then set back to GX and on front knit 3 rows st. st. with St. S. 5. Now transfer all sts from back to front. For back and front make the 1st pleat trimming after the hem, the 2nd pleat trimming after RC 34 and the 3rd one after RC 44. For sleeve work one pleat trimming after the hem only.

Figure I: A = st. st., hem. B = st. st. with pleat trimming. C and D = st. st.

Figure II: (first knit pocket lining) A = st. st., hem. B = st. st. with pleat trimming, after 48 rows for pocket opening take the 14th to 38th sts onto a stitchholder and hang the sts from the pocket lining into the empty nds. Make buttonholes after 14, 41, 66, 91 and 116 rows over the 3rd and 7th and 14th to 18th nds.

Figure III: A = st. st., hem. B and C = st. st.

Pocket lining: cast on 25 sts and knit 30 rows. Take all sts onto a stitchholder.
 Pocket border: hang the sts from the stitchholder back to the machine and knit 6 rows st. st. Cast off.

To make up: pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Join neckborder and stitch around neck. Finish buttonholes and slip stitch frontborder half to inside. Hem waistborder and sleeves. Attach pocket lining with loose sts and slip stitch pocket border half to inside.

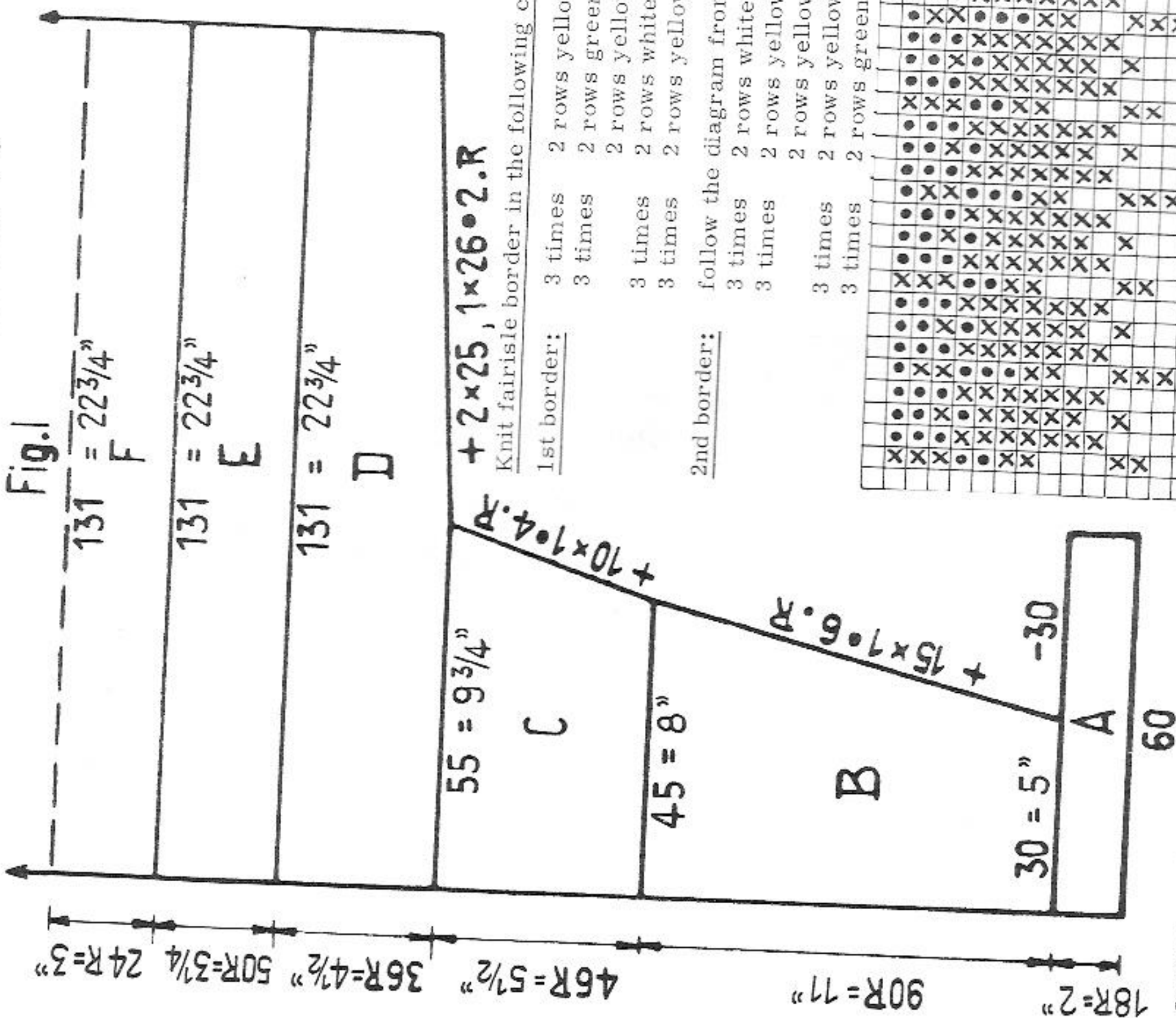

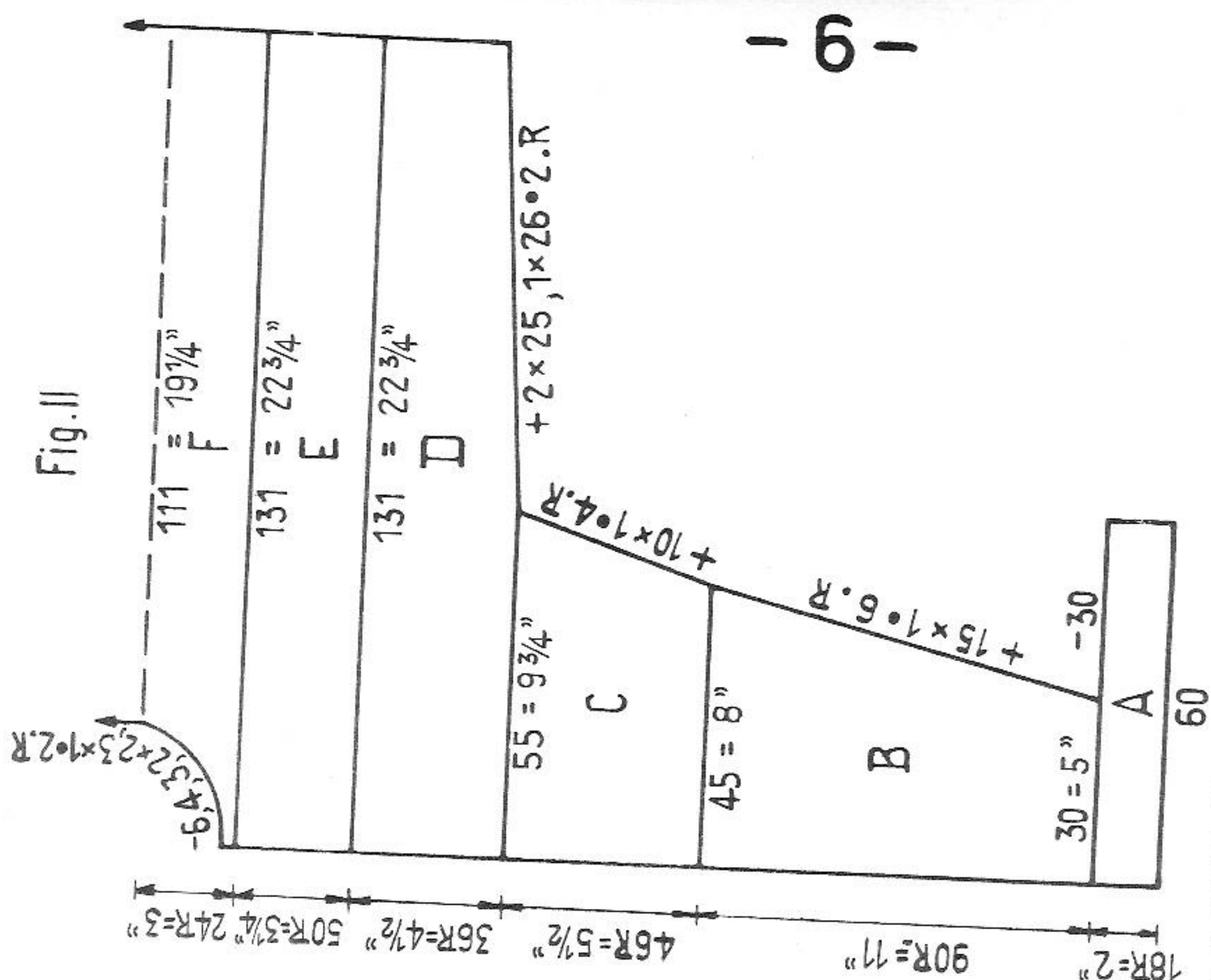
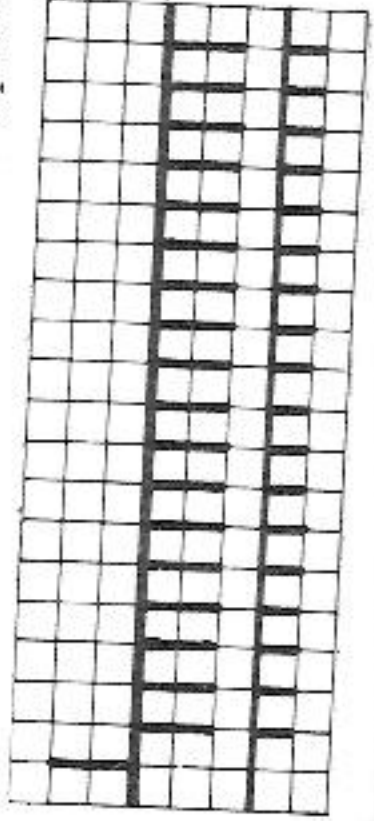

 Waistborder: knit twice. With green cast on 110 sts in 1:1 and knit 19 rows. Cast off.
 To make up: pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Join sleeve borders with graft st. Using white wool join collar and attach to neck first outside st by st with back-stitch, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch half to inside. Join waistborders and stitch into position.

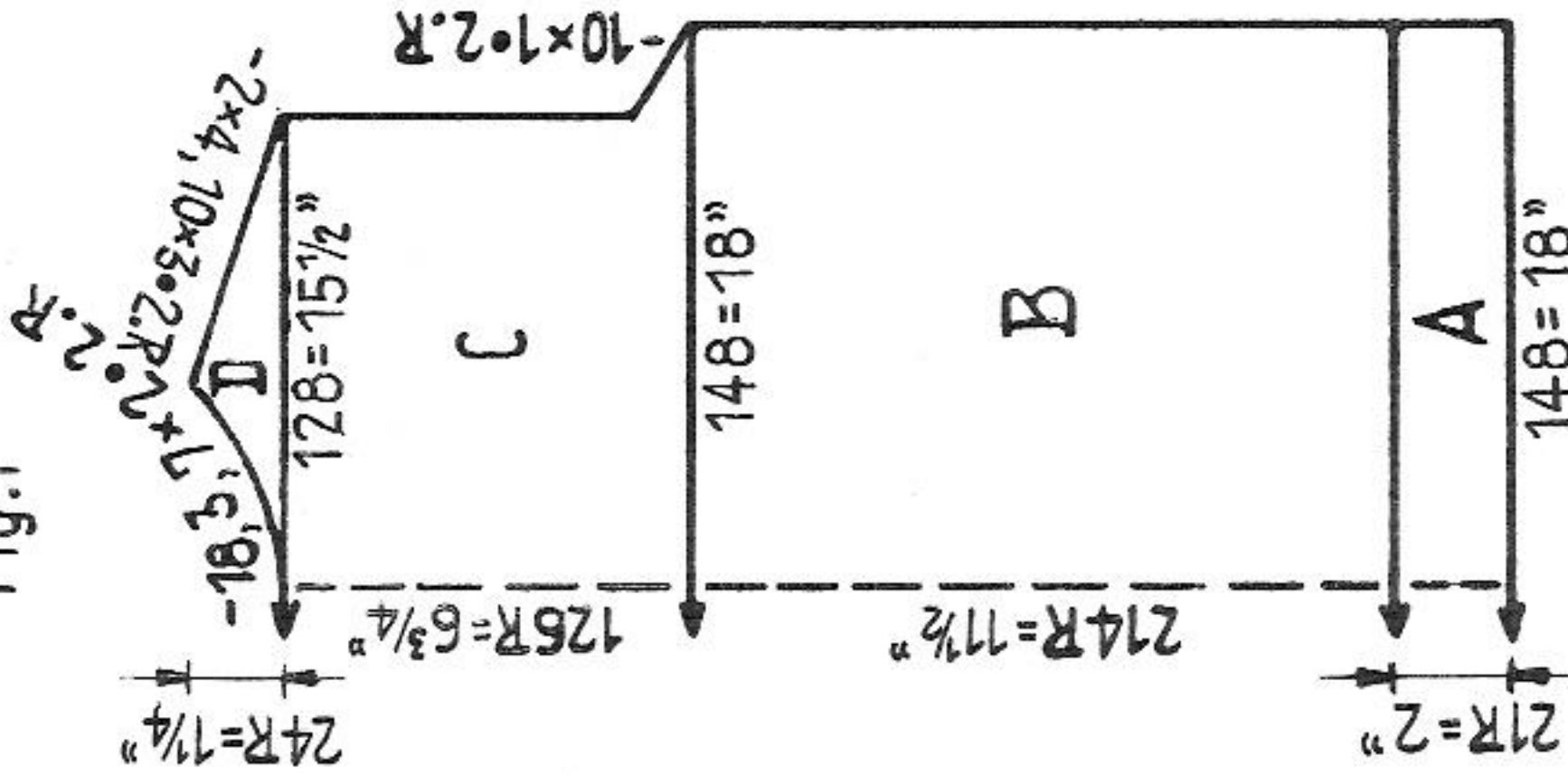

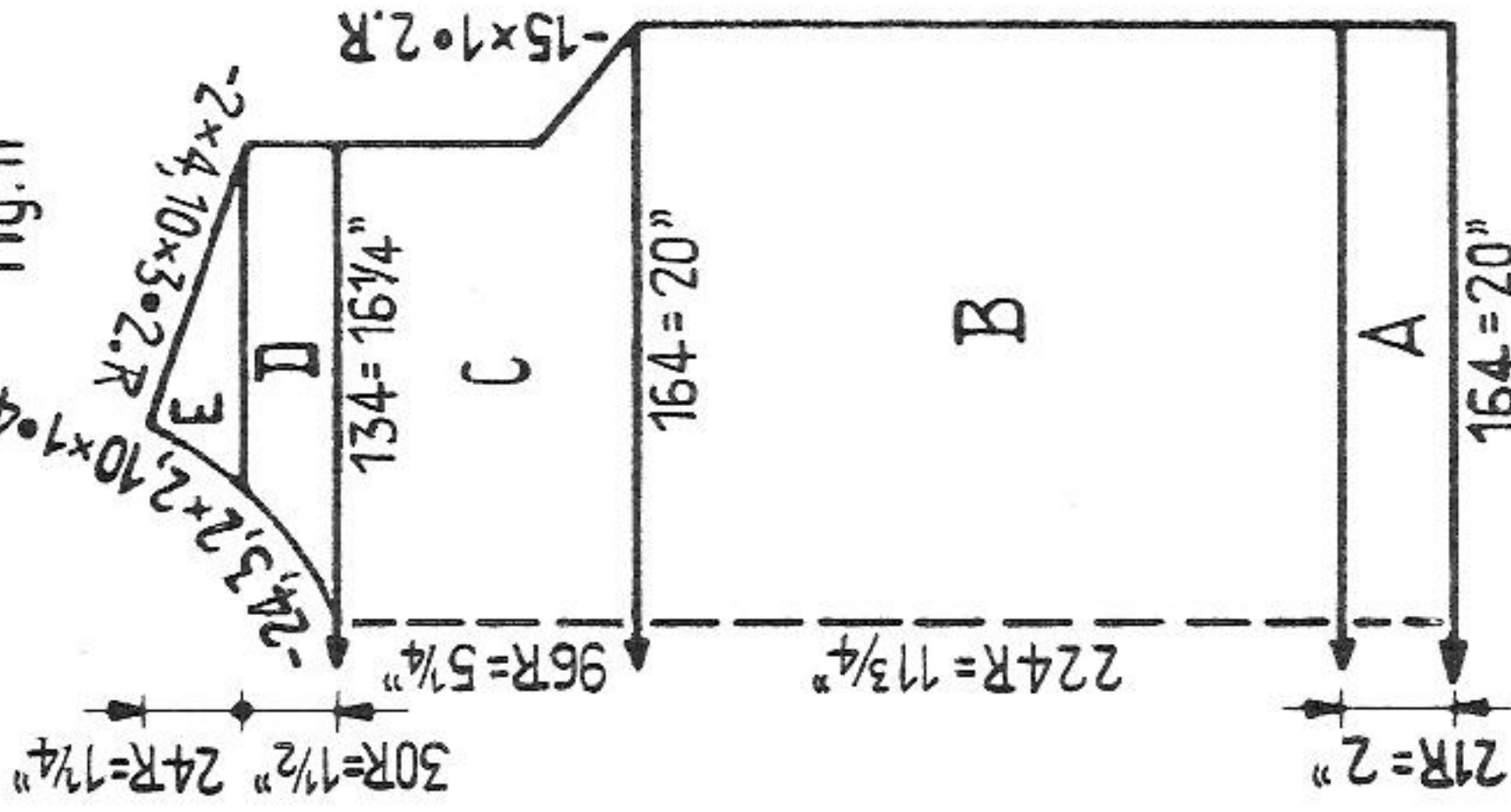

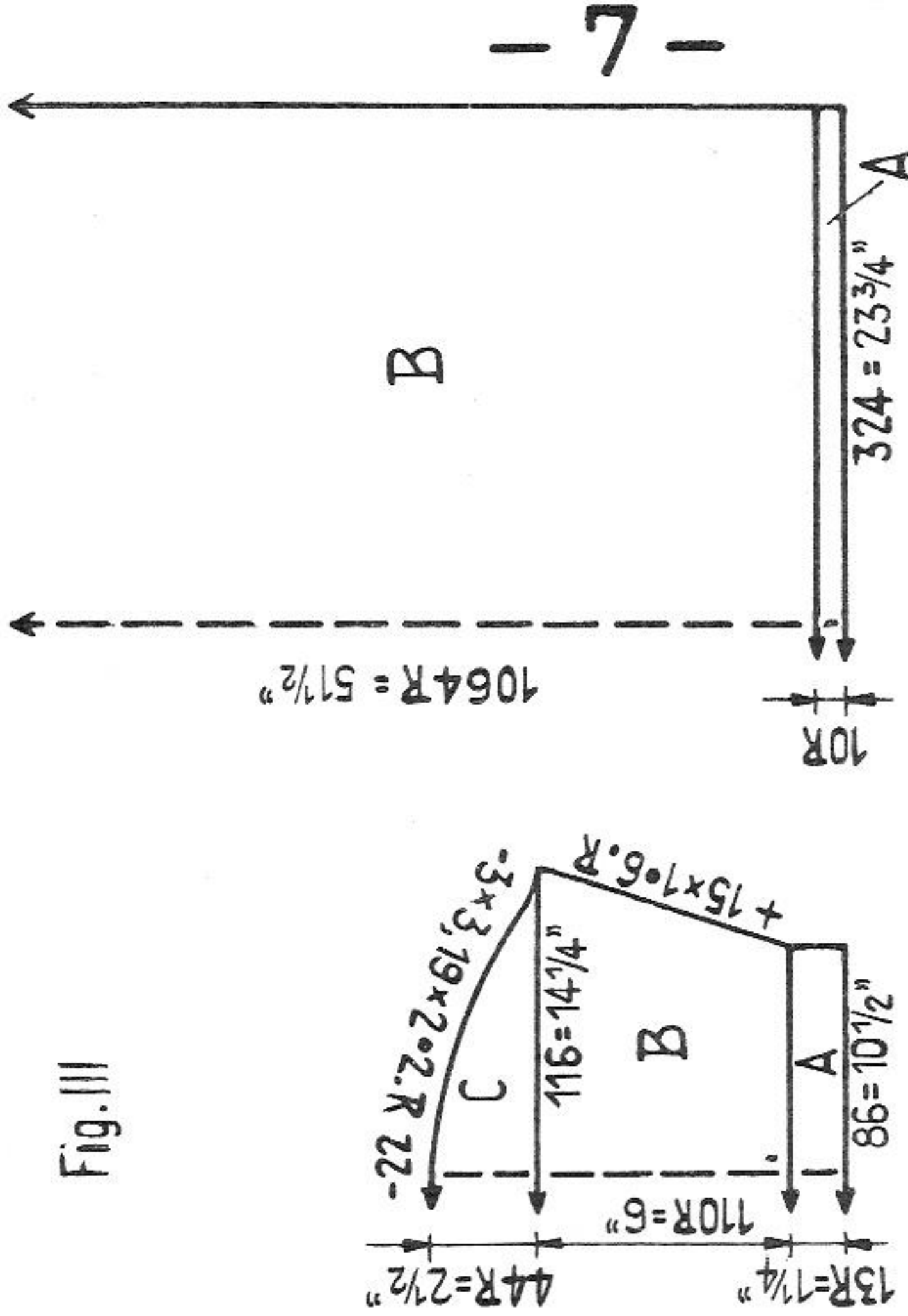

PASSAP-kilt with matching sweater

- Size: to fit approx. 34 to 36" bust
- Materials: 17 ozs green, 9 ozs red, 10 ozs black wool 4 ply, 3 large snap-fasteners, 1 decoration safety-pin
- Stitch size: 1:1 border 3, pattern for sweater 5. 1/2, pattern for skirt 5 1/4
- Test square: sweater: 100 sts = 12 1/4". 100 rows = 5 1/4". skirt: 100 sts = 7 1/4". 100 rows = 5"
- Pattern: sweater in green. Pattern II and pattern for skirt on page 14

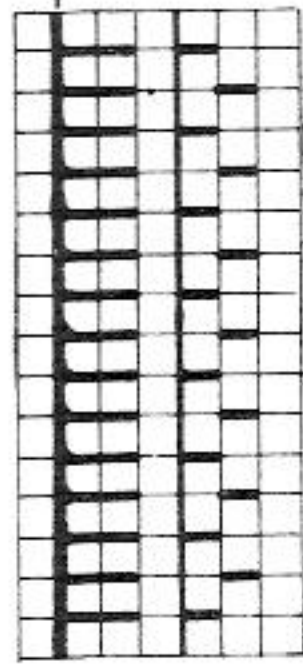


Figure I: A = 1:1. B and C = pattern I. D = divide work, pattern I.

Neckborder: cast on 140 sts in 1:1 and knit 11 rows. Then bring all ends into W.P. and knit 16 rows tubular. With contrast wool, knit 4 rows tubular and 2 rows N/N, then release.

Figures VII, VIII: A = 10 rows with black, pattern. B = pattern and finish with 10 rows black.

Belt: cast on 310 sts and knit with pusher division 2 as follows: 3 times 2 rows red / 2 rows black, 8 rows green, 3 times 2 rows red / 2 rows black and 20 rows black. Cast off.

Trimming bands: knit 6 times. With green cast on 3 sts and knit approx. 5 feet tubular. To make up: pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth.

Sweater: join seams. Join neckborder and stitch around neck, first outside with back-stitch st by st, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Skirt: on the right side over the place of the empty nds loosely stitch on trimming bands. At the 4th and 8th green stripes, cut an opening of 6" each making plaits 1 3/4" deep. At front and back each form two plaits 1 1/2" deep. Sew on belt, leaving open 6" for understap. Fold and slip stitch belt to inside. For skirt fastening, attach 3 snap-fasteners. At overlapping, attach fringes 2 1/2" long through black brim.

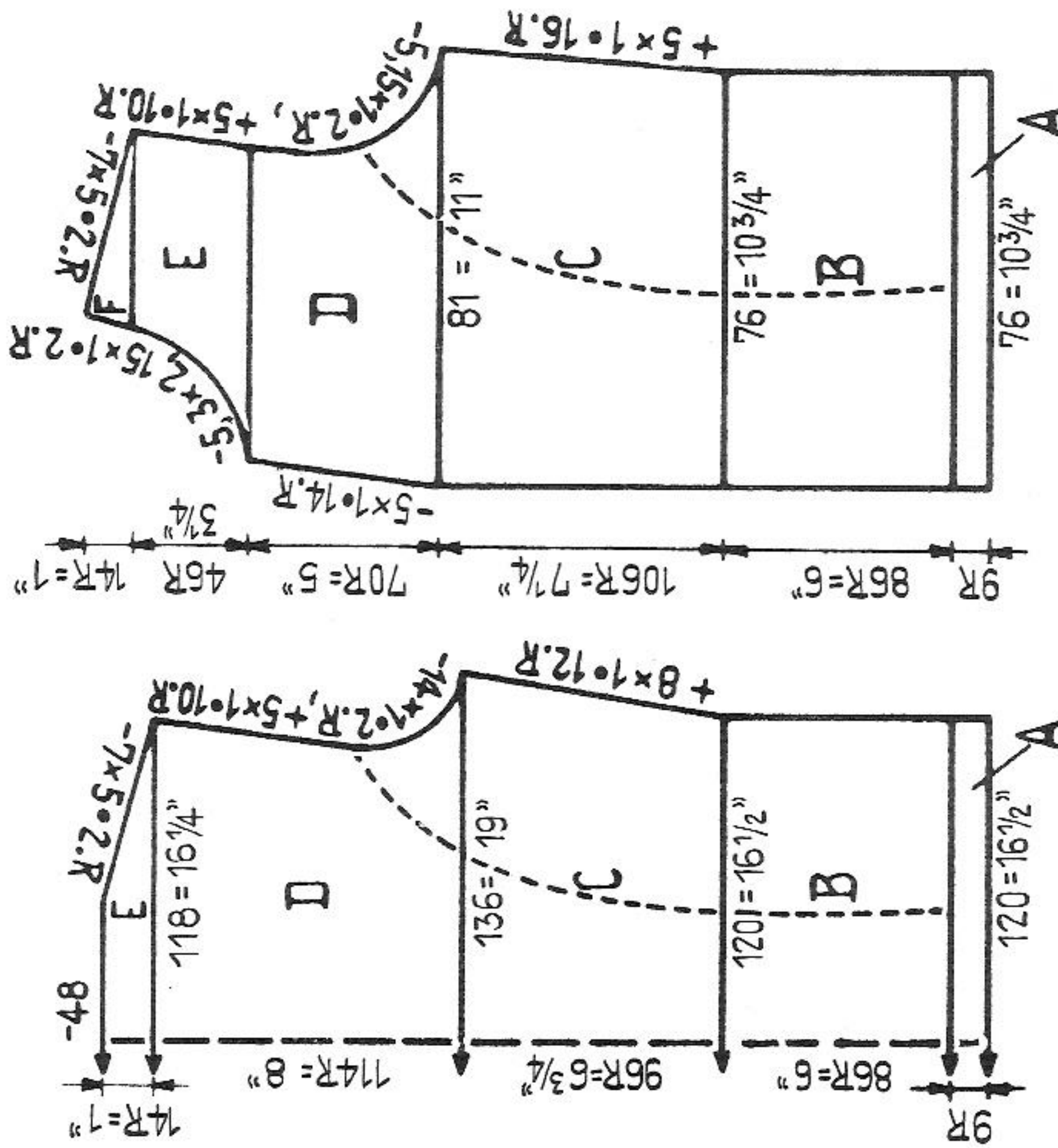
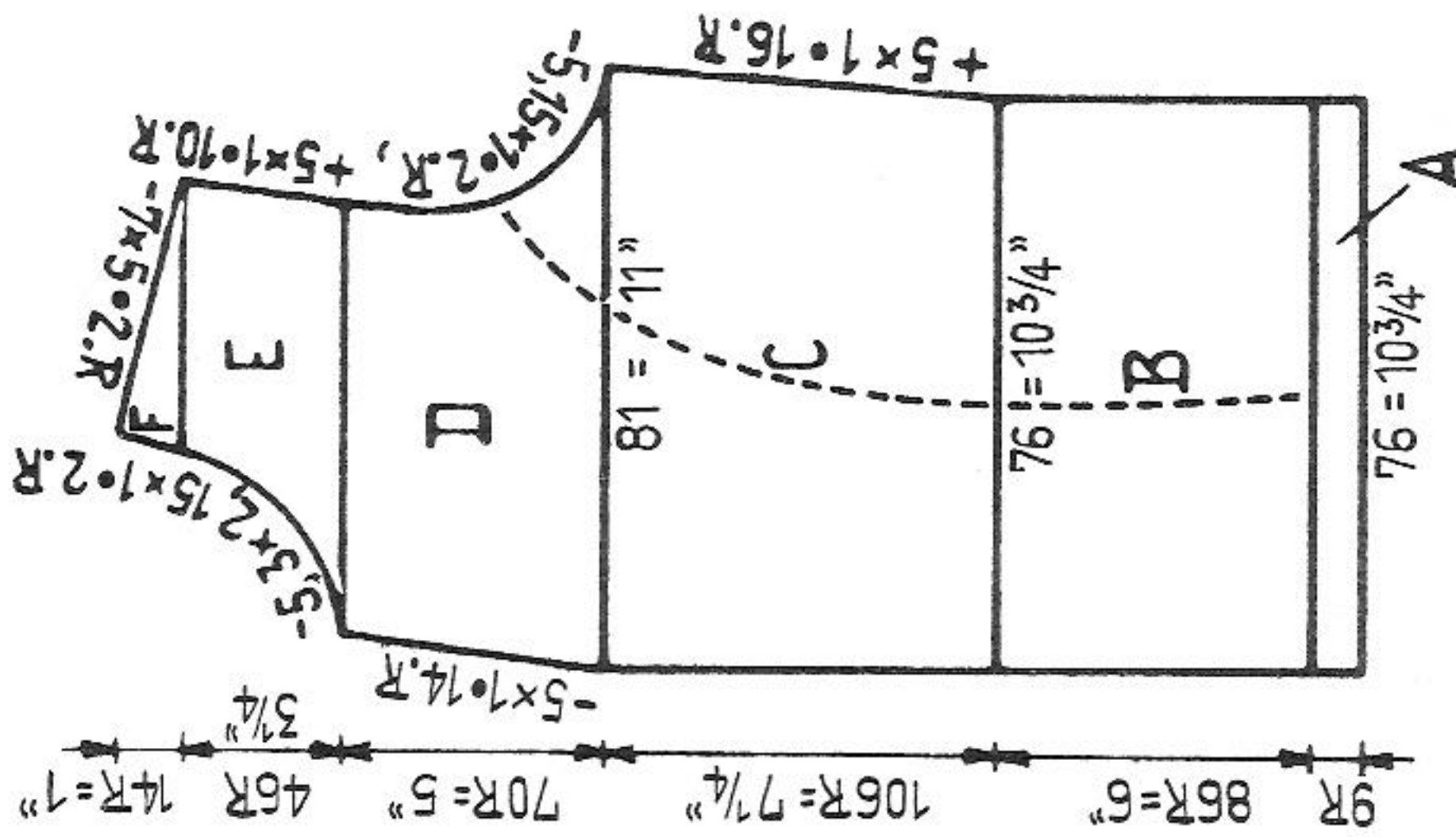

Test square: 100 sts = 13 3/4" x 7"

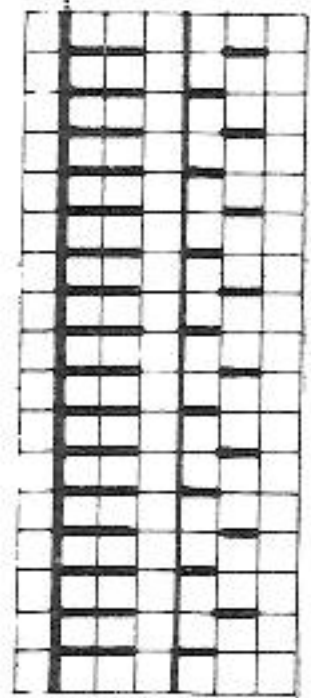

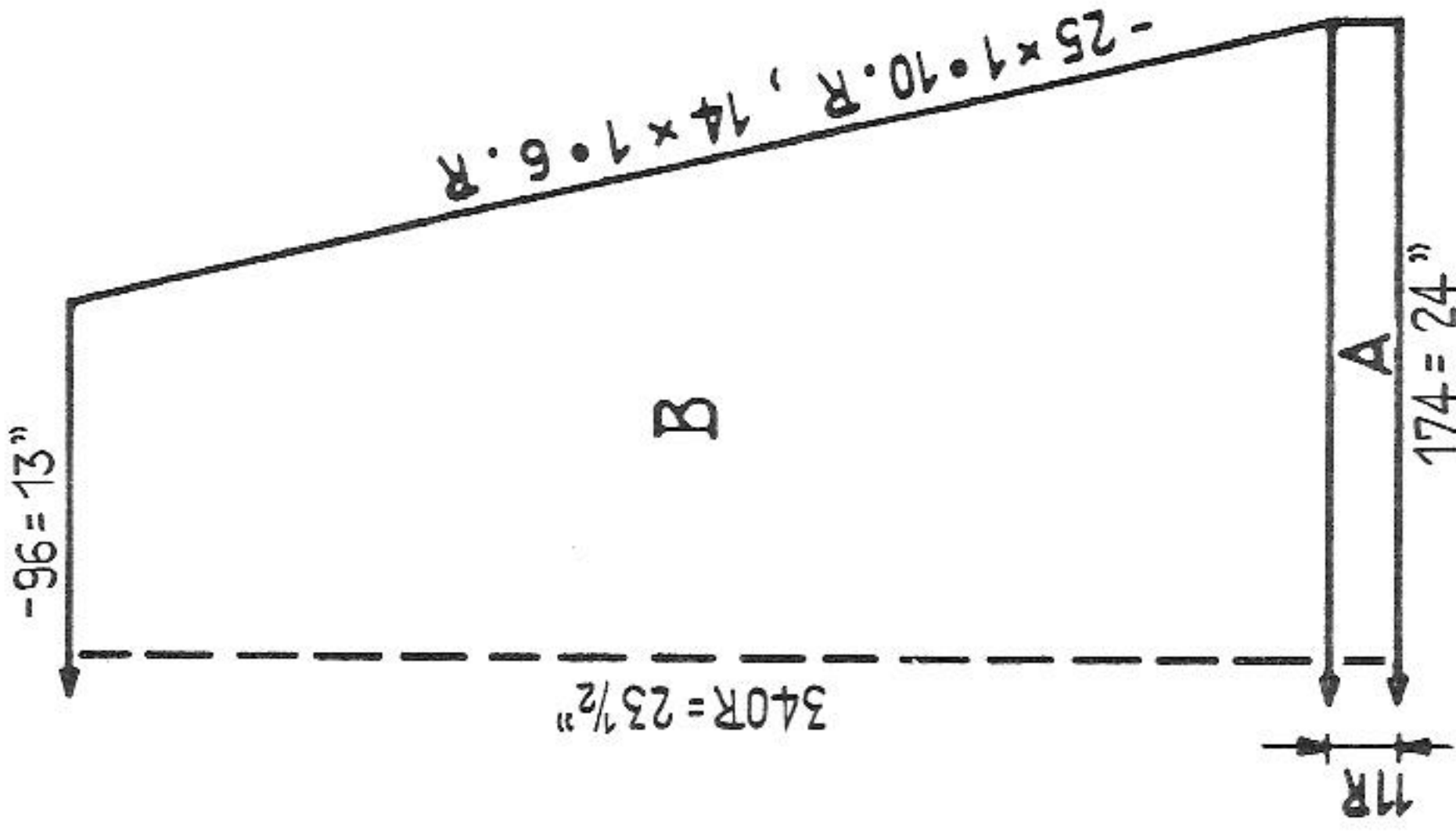
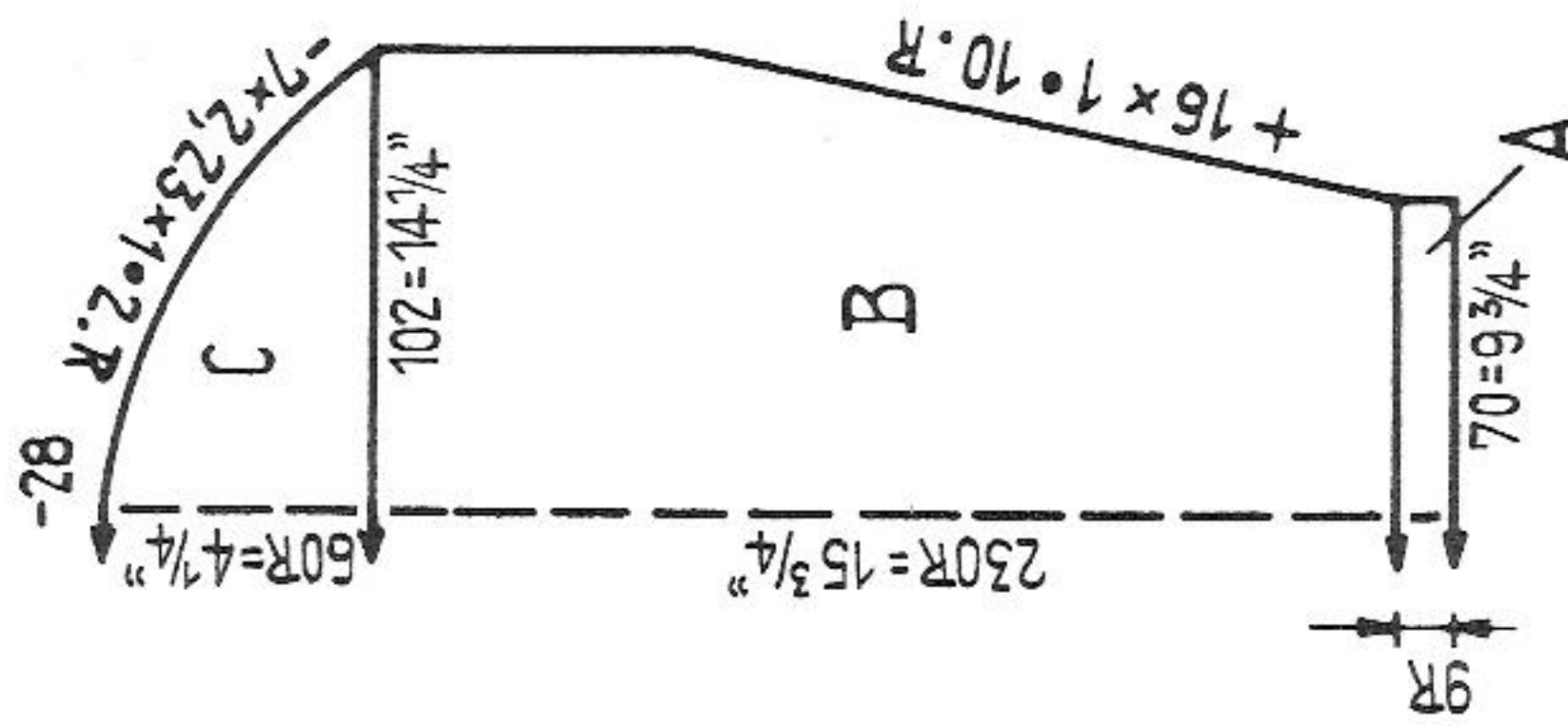

Front facing: knit twice. Cast on 20 sts in K/K and knit 154 rows. Cast off.

To make up: pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth.

Jacket: join seams. Along front edges sew 2 to 3 sts to inside, then attach facing there. Fold collar in half and stitch around neck. At front and back, make the

trimming seams inside with back-stitch. Sew hems to inside. Attach the snap-

fastener approx. 6 1/2" from lower edge, work single crochet around trimming

ring and attach ring over snap-fastener. Skirt: join seams, and stitch on elastic

at waist. Sew hem to inside.

- Materials:** fine sweater wool 12 ozs dark red, 7 ozs white
- Stitch size:** 1:1 border 1 3/4, pattern 3 1/2
- Test square:** 100 sts = 6 1/4". 100 rows = 4"
- Pattern:** knit fairisle according to diagram. x = white, empty square = dark red.
1 square = 1 st = 2 rows = 4 RC

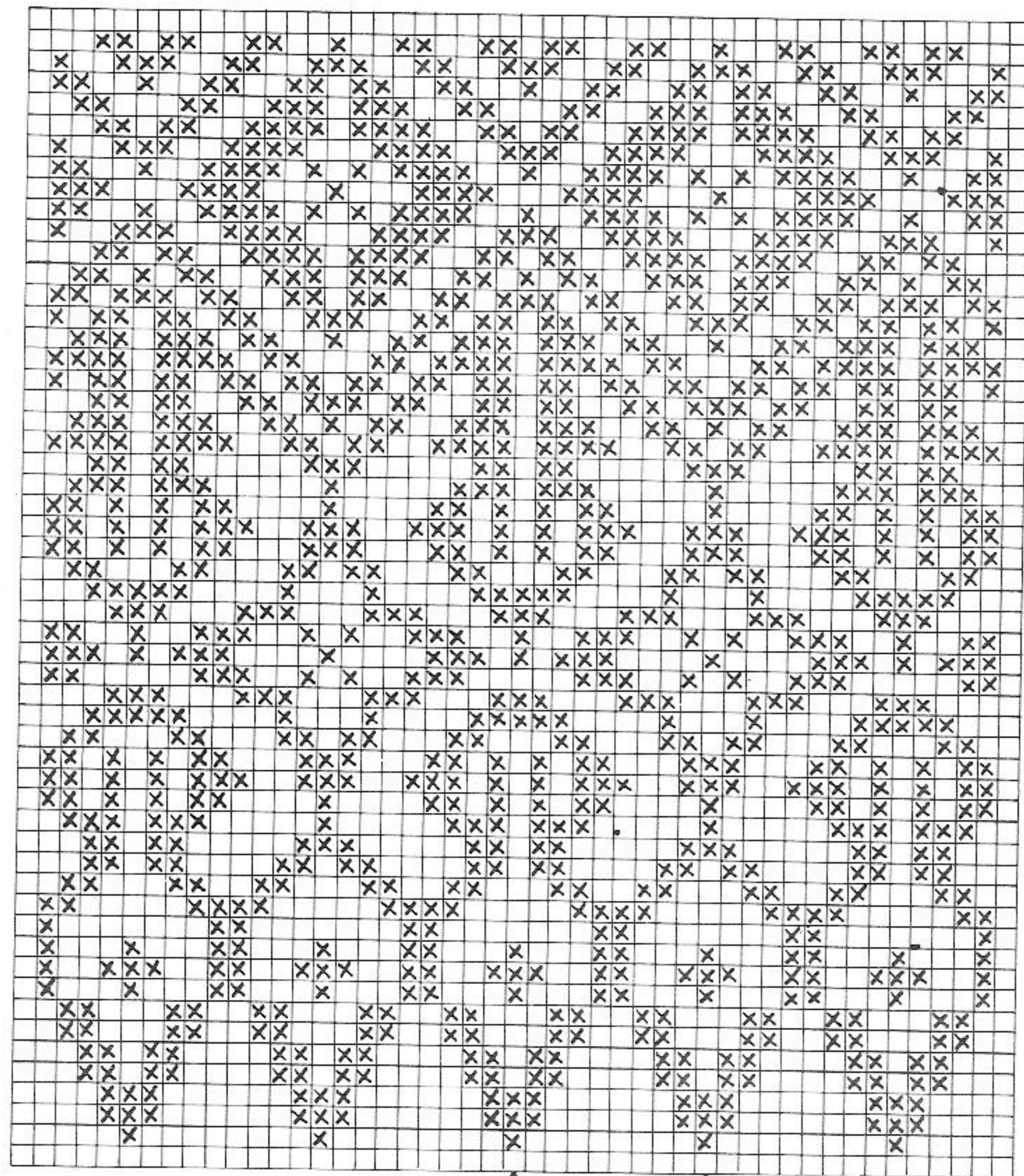
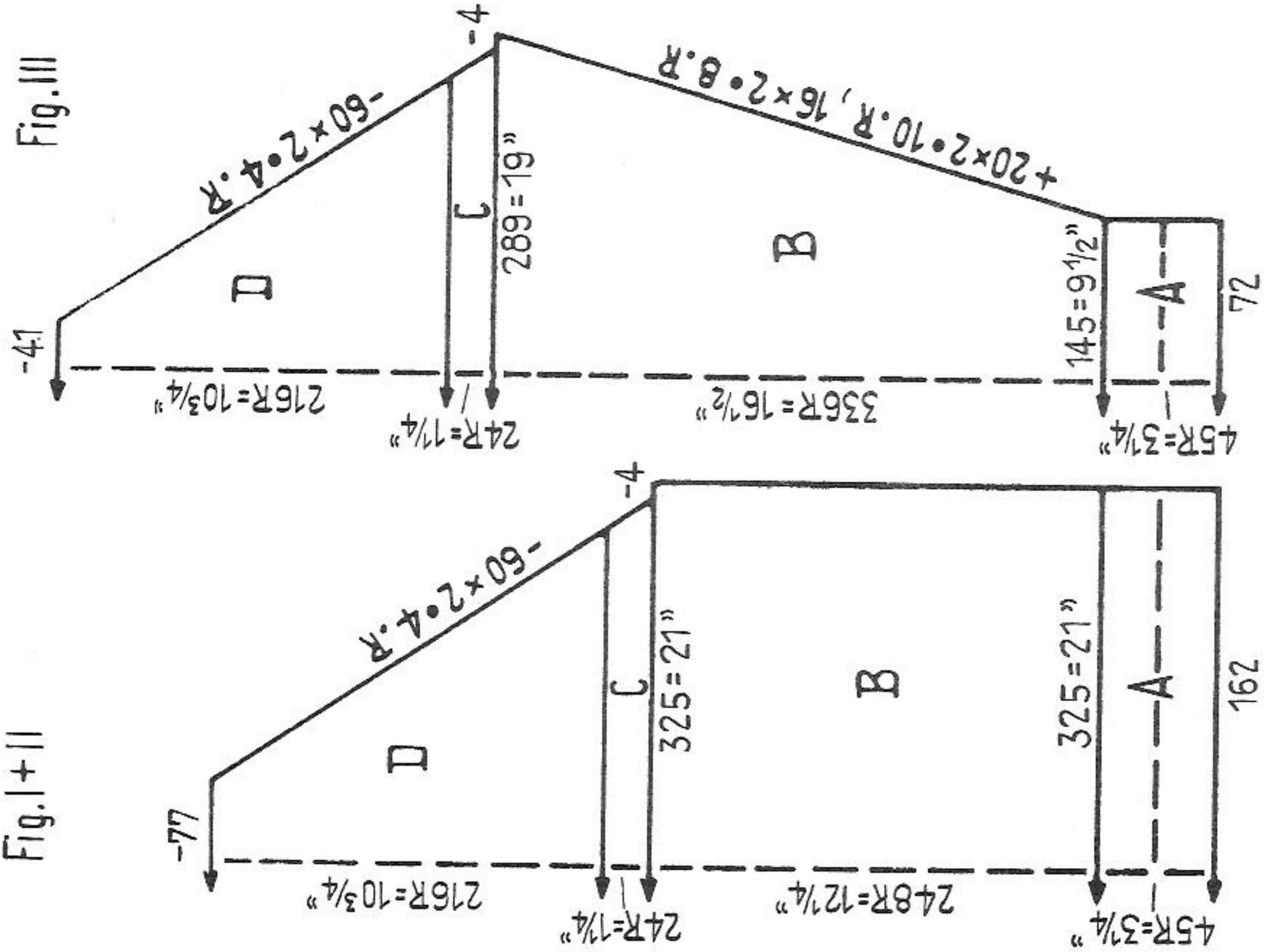

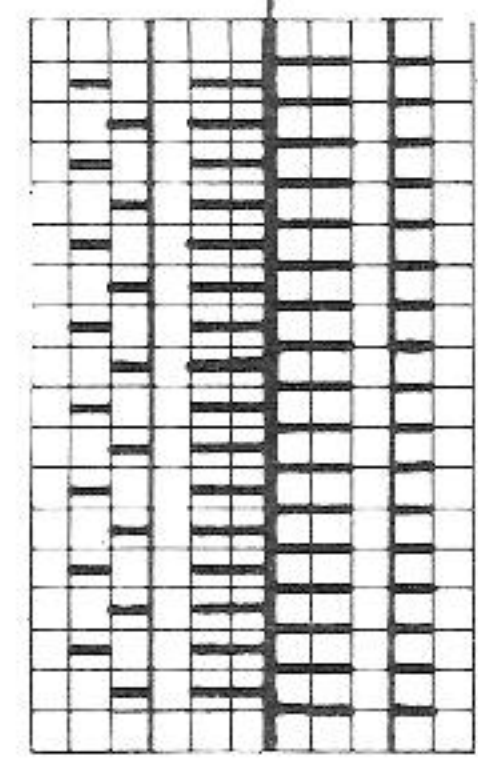

Figures I, II, III: A = 1:1 with blue, B and C = pattern with blue, D = fairisle pattern. Take all sts onto a stitchholder.

Neckborder: hang the 120 sts from the stitchholder in 1:1 back to the machine and knit 26 rows. Cast off.

To make up: pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Sew all borders half to inside.

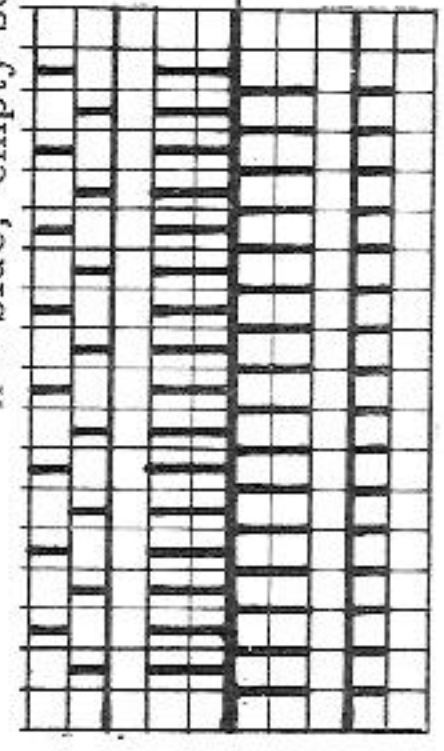
Fairisle pattern I

Lady's fairisle jacket

- Size:** to fit approx. 36" bust
- Materials:** medium sweater wool, 14 ozs white, 5 ozs blue, 8 buttons
- Stitch size:** 1:1 border 1 3/4, pattern 4 1/2
- Test square:** 100 sts = 6 1/2", 100 rows = 5"
- Pattern:** knit fairisle pattern according to diagram of model 1378.
x = blue, empty square = white. 1 square = 1 st = 2 rows = 4 RC.

Figure I: A = 1:1 with blue. B = fairisle pattern I. C and D = pattern with white. E and F = fairisle pattern II.

Front border: with blue cast on 23 sts in K/K and knit 270 rows with St.S. 1 3/4 making 1st buttonhole after 10 rows over the 8 centre sts. Make 7 further buttonholes after each 36 rows. Knit 2nd border without buttonholes.
Neckborder: with blue cast on 110 sts in 1:1 and knit 31 rows with St.S. 1 1/2. Cast off.
To make-up: pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Sew waist- and sleeve borders half to inside. Stitch front borders into position. Stitch neckborder around neck and slip stitch half to inside. Join front borders to neckborder. Finish buttonholes and attach buttons.

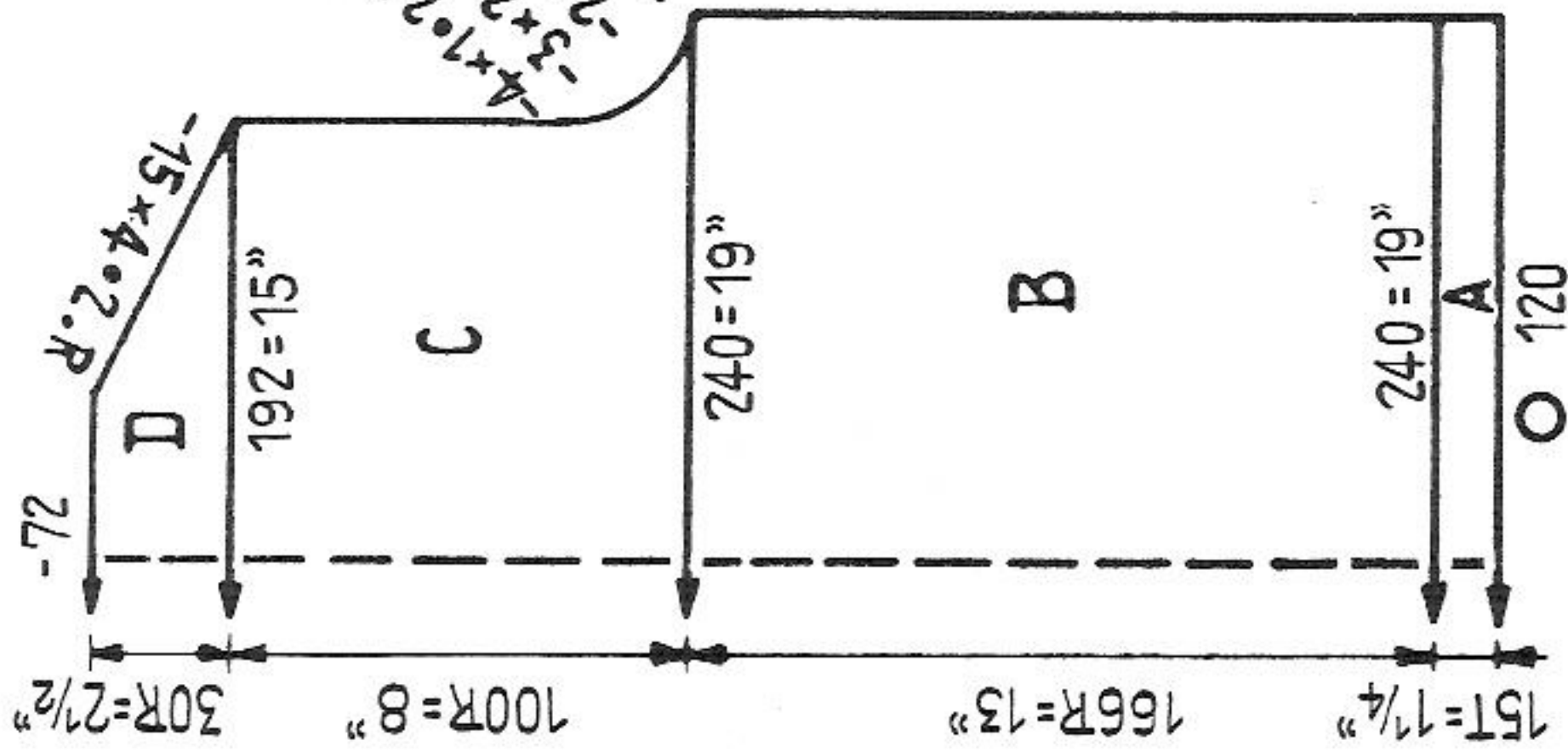

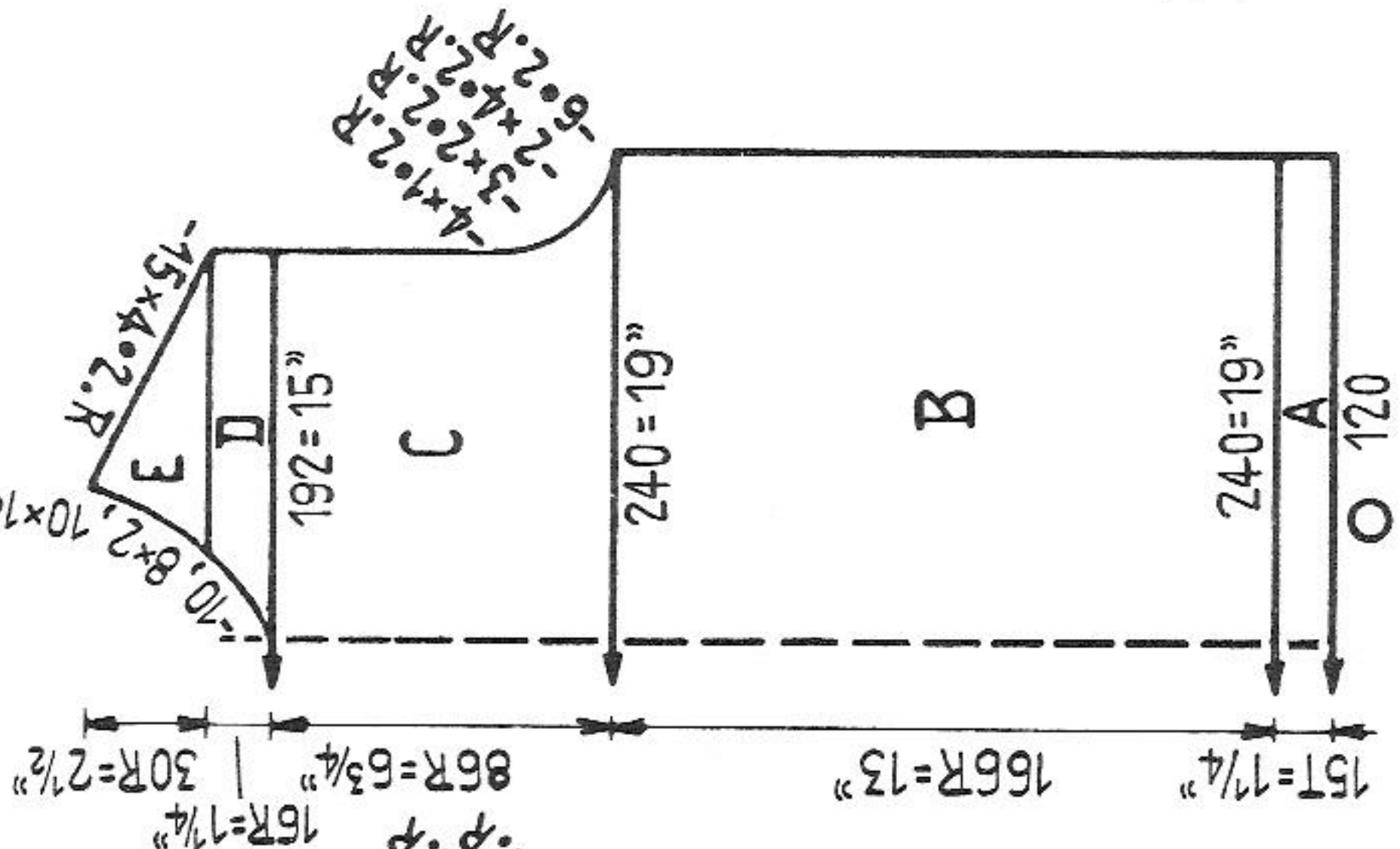
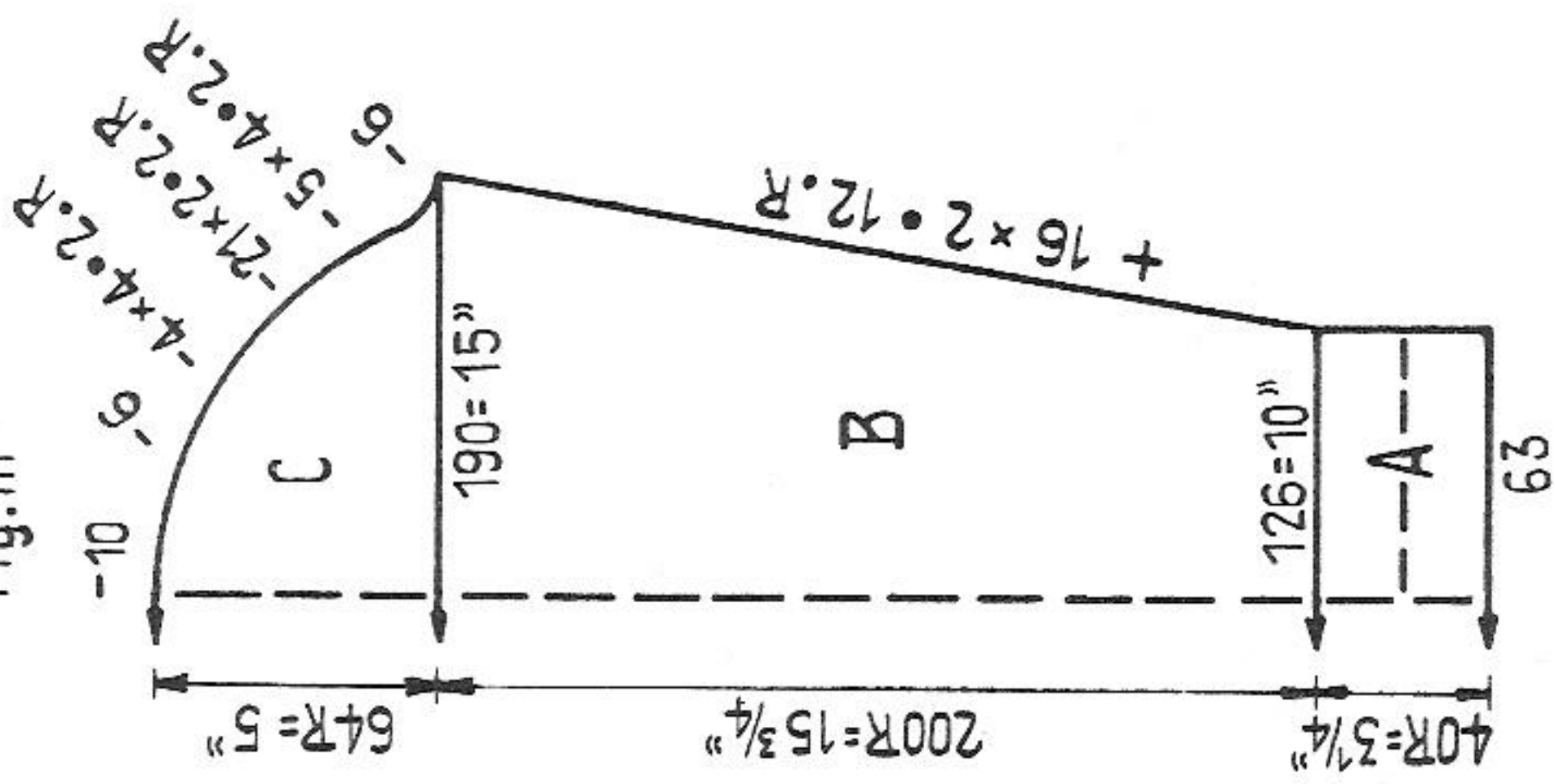

Lady's sweater

Size: to fit approx. 36" bust

Materials: approx. 21 ozs medium wool with dralon

Stitch size: 1:1 border 3 1/2, pattern back 4 1/2 / front 6, tubular 5

Test square: 100 sts = 8" 100 rows = 8"

Pattern: for front at front bed bring the 46th, 52nd, 58th, 64th, 70th and 76th nds out of work, (for neck shaping, count the N.P. nds as W.P. nds)

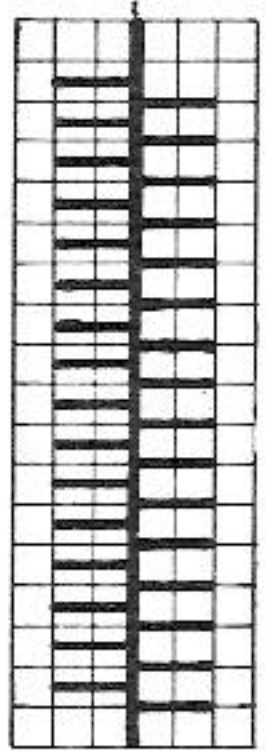


Figure I: A = tubular, B, C and D = pattern.

Figure III: A = 1:1, B and C = pattern.

Collar: cast on 132 sts in 1:1 and knit 60 rows. Then bring all nds into W.P. and knit 12 rows tubular. With contrast wool, knit 4 rows tubular and 2 rows N/N. Release.

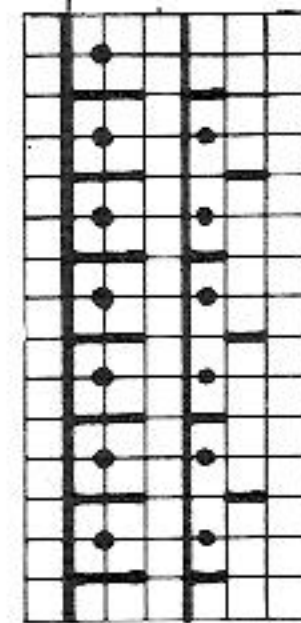

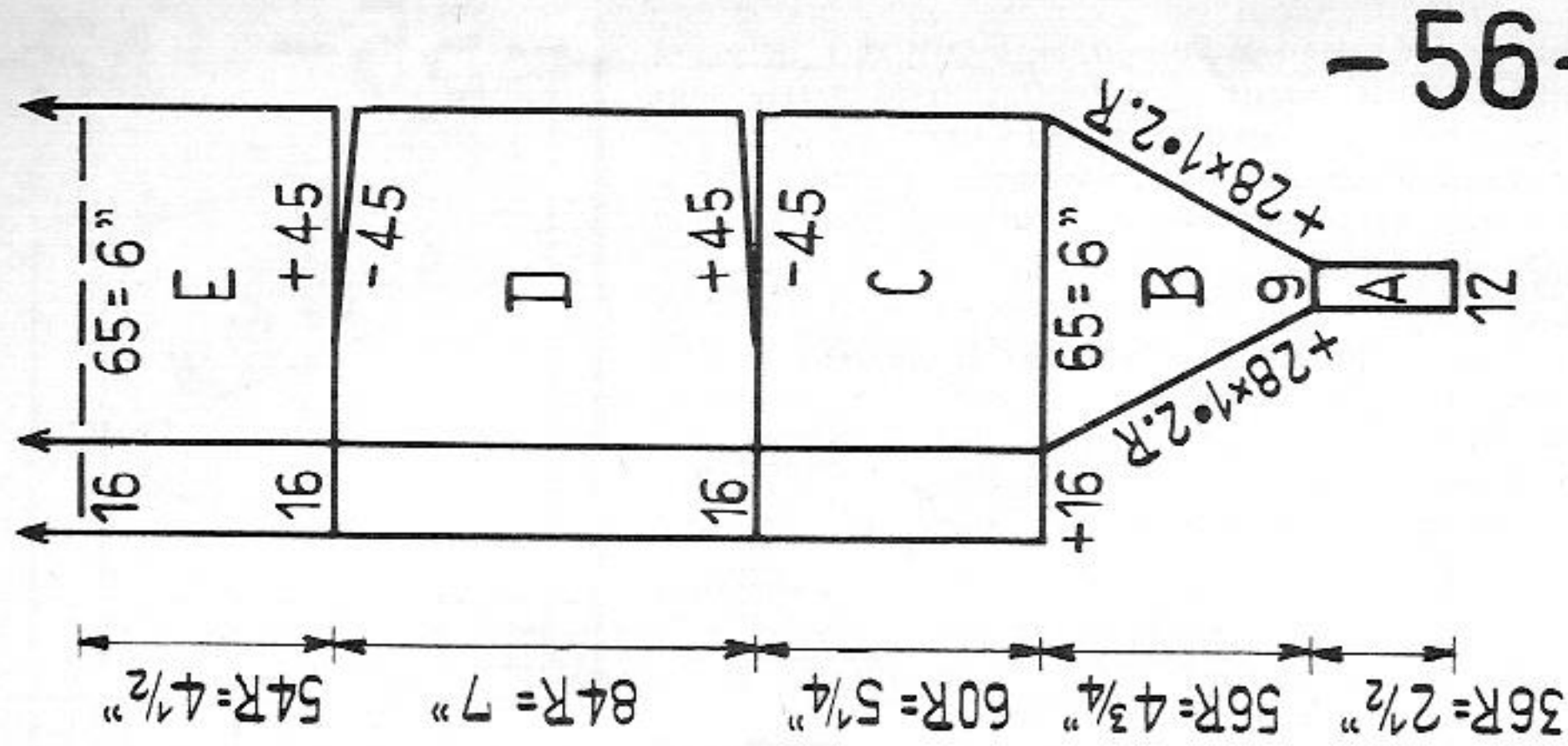


Figure I: A = 1:1. B, C and D = stocking st.

Frontborder: cast on 20 sts in K/K and knit 350 rows, at the same time after 6, 34, 62 and 90 rows make a buttonhole over the 8th to 13th nds. Cast off.

Armhole border: knit twice. Cast on 120 sts for tubular (back 120 sts / front 120 sts) and knit 16 rows tubular. With contrast wool knit 4 rows tubular and 2 rows N/N, then release.

To make up: pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Join the two cable borders and stitch around neck. Stitch on frontborder and finish buttonholes. Stitch on armhole borders, first outside with back-stitch st. by st, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Attach buttons.

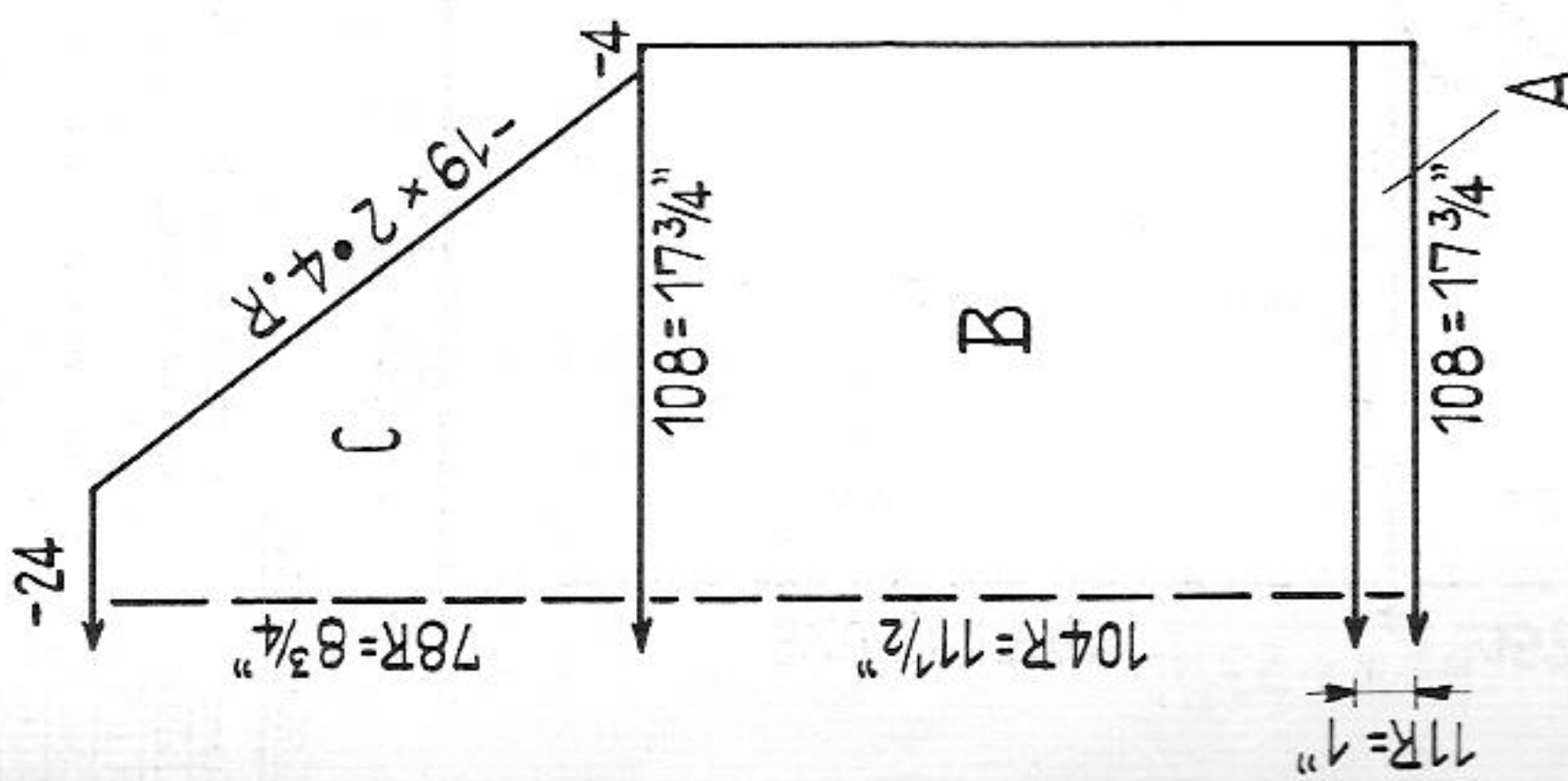

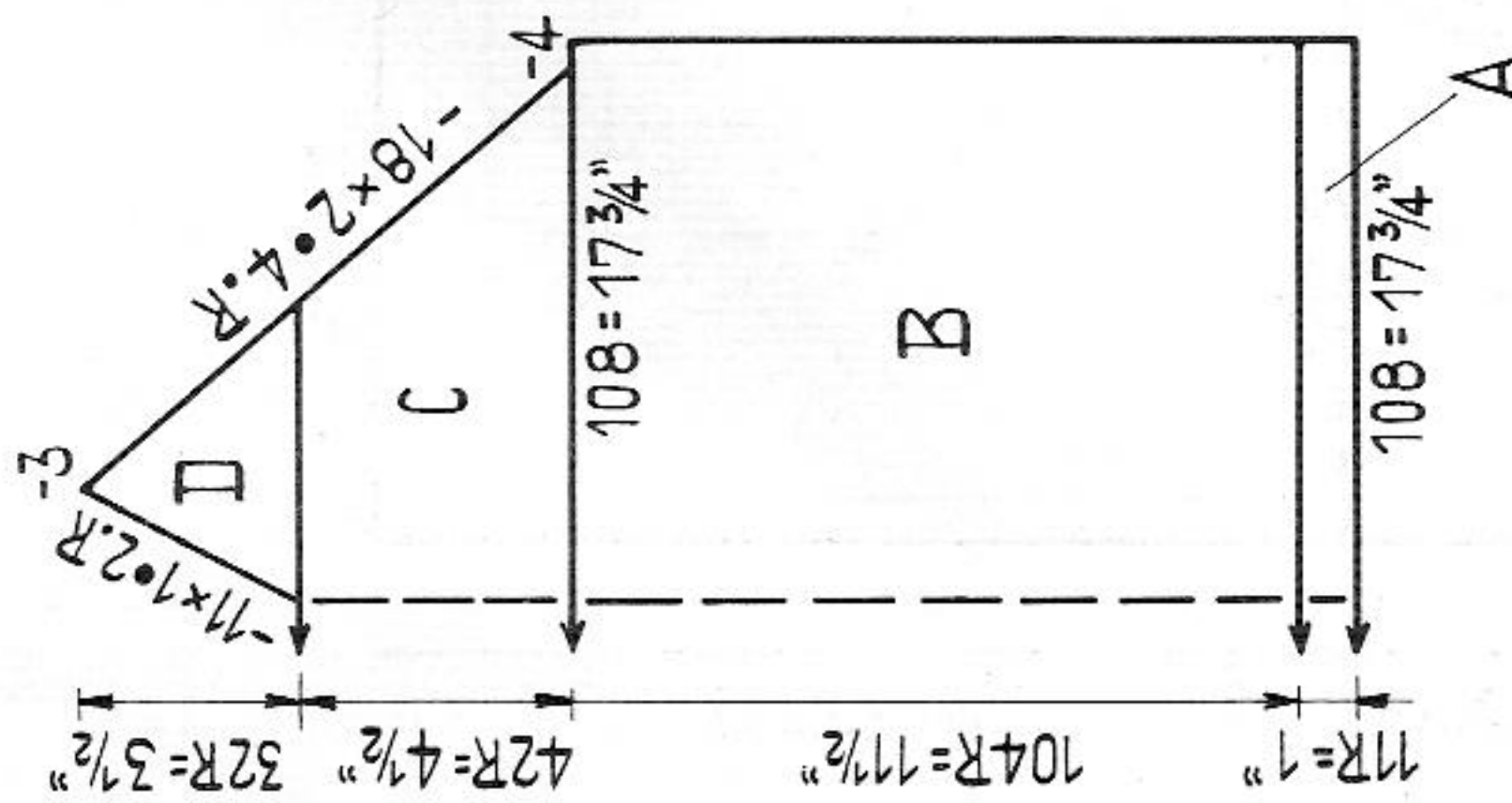
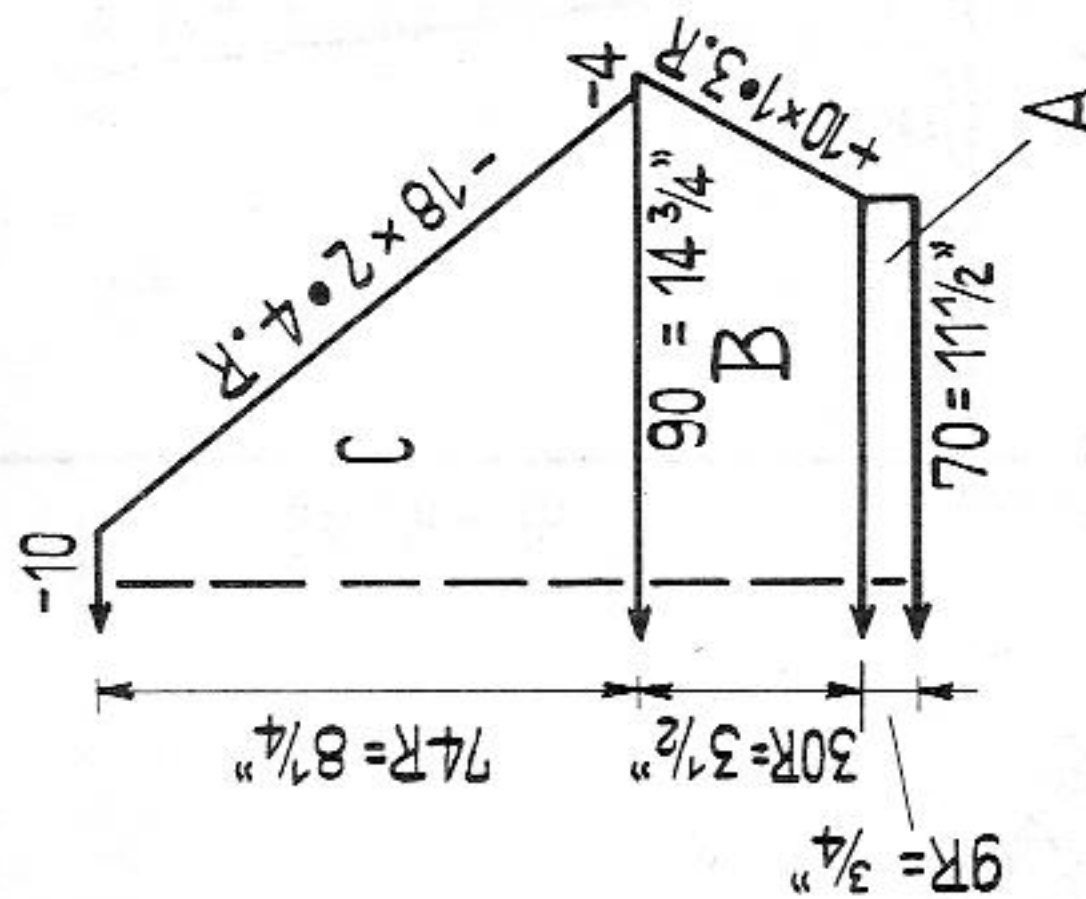

 Test square: 100 sts = 16 1/2". 100 rows = 11"
 Pattern: stocking stitch.

Figure I: A = 1:1. B = stocking st., C = stocking st., for raglan hang the 4th and 5th sts onto the 6th and 7th nds and follow up with the remaining sts.
 Figure II: A = 1:1, B = stocking st., C = stocking st., for raglan work as for fig. I.
 D = divide work, stocking st.
 Figure III: A = 1:1. B = stocking st., C = stocking st., for raglan work as for fig. I.
 Collar: cast on 90 sts in K/K and knit 11 rows with St. S. 4. Then 8 rows tubular with St. S. 5 1/2. With contrast wool knit 4 rows tubular and 2 rows N/N, then release.

Loop: cast on 3 sts in K/K and knit approx. 16". Cast off.
 To make up: pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth.
 Join seams. Stitch on collar, first outside st by st with back-stitch, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Make a bow and fix it in the centre of front neck.

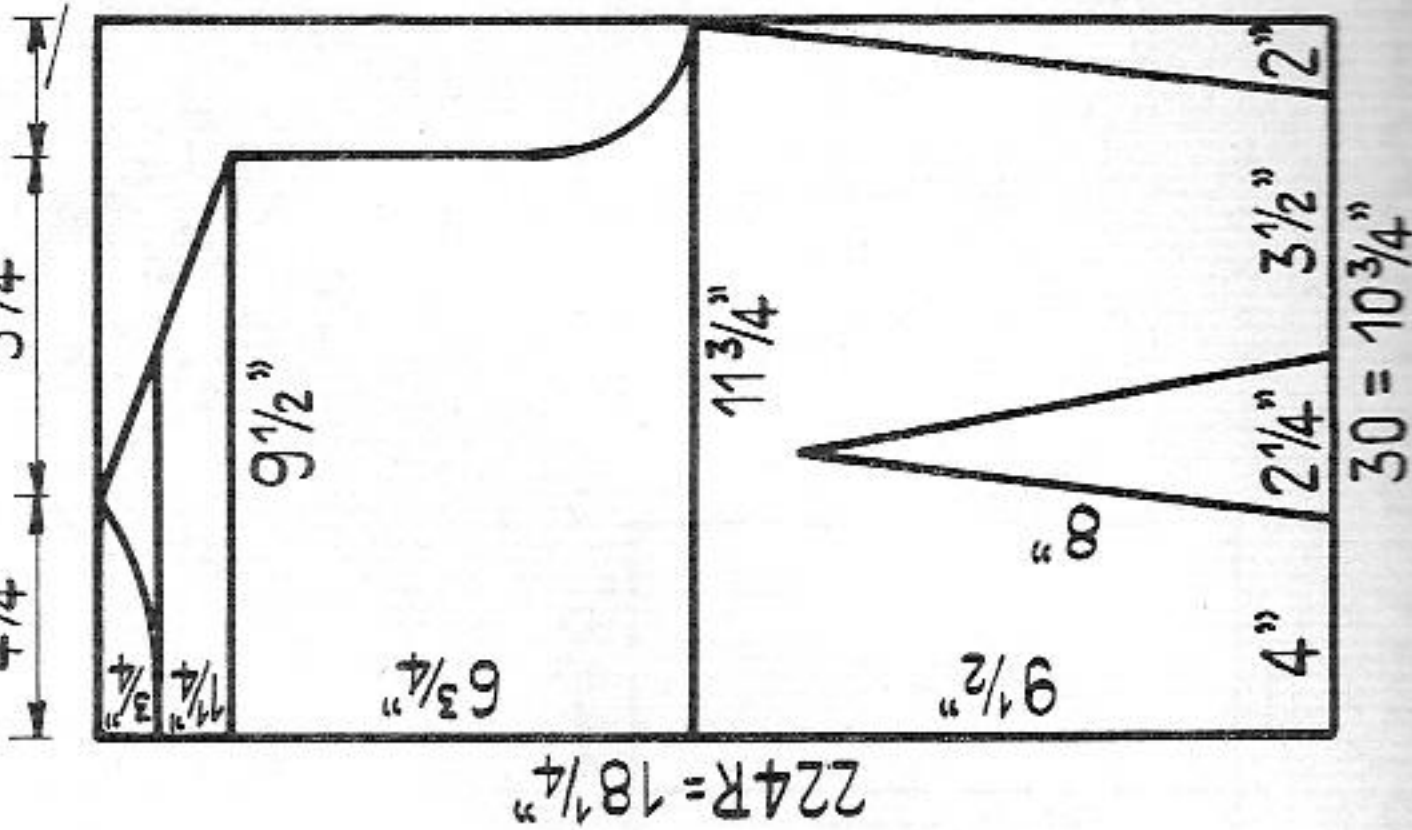


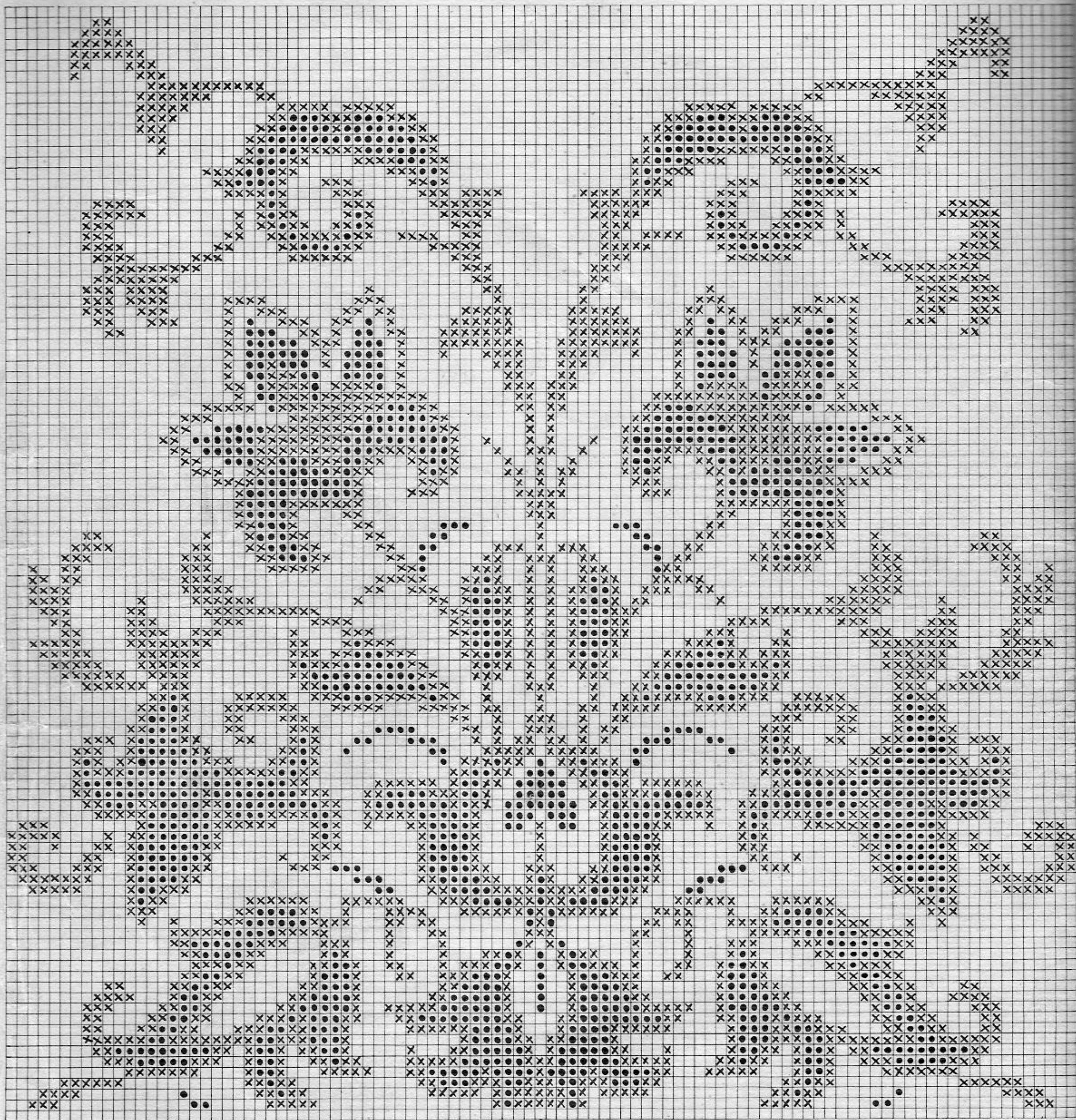
Figures I, II, III: pattern.

Figure VIII: knit twice, pattern.

To make up: pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Cover all parts with tulle and fix with invisible sts. Cut according to pattern or a bought pattern, then sew along the edges with zig-zag. Make the darts. At front part (waist height) cut sideways up to the darts. Join upper parts, leaving back seam open. Set in sleeves. Join the two skirt parts (fig. VIII) at the casting on edges A, leaving 6" open for zip. Then join the casting off edges B to the side edges of front (fig. IIb). When skirt is finished so far, make a fold along the dotted line C and put it on C of front part (fig. II). From there gather skirt and fix to upper part. Around neck sew 1/2" to inside. Along back opening fold 1 3/4" to inside and set in zip. Sew sleeve- and lower hems to inside.
