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PASSAP-DUOMATIC - PASSAP 12 - PASSAP-COMBI

Model Book No 6

First of all we like to thank our PASSAP -friends in Belgium, Denmark, France, Italy, Portugal and Switzerland for their excellent contributions to our new model book.

This time we had quite a special task to fulfil as we wanted to bring not only descriptions for PASSAP-DUOMATIC and PASSAP 12 but also givings for the new PASSAP-COMBI. Due to the fact that the PASSAP-COMBI is specially designed to be used with thicker wool, the test square usually differs from those of other PASSAP machines. After extended tests we solved this problem in as much as we, where ever necessary, are giving the special test square for PASSAP-COMBI as well, at the same time putting the corresponding figures for stitches, rows or inches in brackets on the diagram. Where there are no indications for a special test square and no brackets on the diagram, the givings are valid for all three PASSAP machines.

This method allows us to bring descriptions for 42 PASSAP 12 and 56 PASSAP-COMBI models besides the 62 DUO models of book no 6. The suggested patterns are, of course, adapted to the possibilities of each machine.

Concerning the diagrams the indications for " back " and " front " are deleted this time. You just keep to the main rule : letters above the line concern the back bed, letters below the line concern the front bed.

We hope, that all our PASSAP friends will get used to this method and easily find the givings valid for their proper machine.

And now - good luck and lots of fun with Your PASSAP machine !

Patterns : The drawings refer to half width, the indications of stitch numbers to whole width of each part.

Figure I	= back	Figure IX	= pants
Figure II	= front	Figure X	= gusset
Figure III	= sleeve	Figure XI	= scarf
Figure IV	= collar	Figure XII	= cap, bonnet
Figure V	= band, cuff	Figure XIII	= mittens

If the centre line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is worked simultaneously with reversed shapings.

If the centre line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is worked separately with reversed shapings.

Stitch size : These numbers are recommended by us, but must be controlled by means of a test square knitted on your machine with your wool.

Abbreviations :

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working Position on front and back bed.

Exception : For tubular, the necessary stitches are only given for one bed, on the other bed, the same number of needles has to be put into Working Position. In these cases, the sign for tubular ○ respectively half tubular (or) is set before the relevant number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

- + 3 × 2 • 8 . R** means : 3 times incr. 2 stitches in every 8 th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front)
- 19 × 3 • 7 . R** means : 19 times decr. 3 stitches in every 7 th row (2 stitches at back, 1 stitch at front and vice versa)
- 17 × 1 • 2 . / 3 . R** means : 17 times decr. 1 stitch, alternately after 2 rows and 3 rows
- ▲ - 4 × 8 • 2 . R** Means : knit graduations (PASSAP-DUOMATIC with pushers and lock at BX). Gradually , after every 2 nd row put 8 sts into Rest Position (for double bed work 4 on each bed). When all graduations are finished, knit normally again over all needles (PASSAP-DUOMATIC pushers in Neutral Position)

Number of stitches and inches :

- 136 = 8"** means : a total of 136 stitches (for K/K rib 68 stitches in each bed) make a width of 8 "
- 146 = 17"** means : cast on 146 stitches each on front and back for tubular which makes a width of 17 ins

Test square and PASSAP chart

Follong the fashion line, this booklet contains quite a few dresses and two-piece suits, descriptions of which require more space than any other type of garment. We therefore left out the PASSAP chart. nevertheless we recommend that you make a test square for every new model you knit up. You may calculate the necessary numbers of stitches and rows along the PASSAP chart and other explanations given in chapter " Shaping " (PASSAP-DUOMATIC and PASSAP 12) or " Sundry " (PASSAP-COMBI) of your instruction book.

How to divide work : Knit stitches, which should temporarily rest, like a buttonhole, with contrast yarn. Put ghe needles into Neutral Position. Thus you obtain long loops, which holf the stitches. Later on you just have to unravel the contrast yarn and the stitches will slip back to their needle heads.

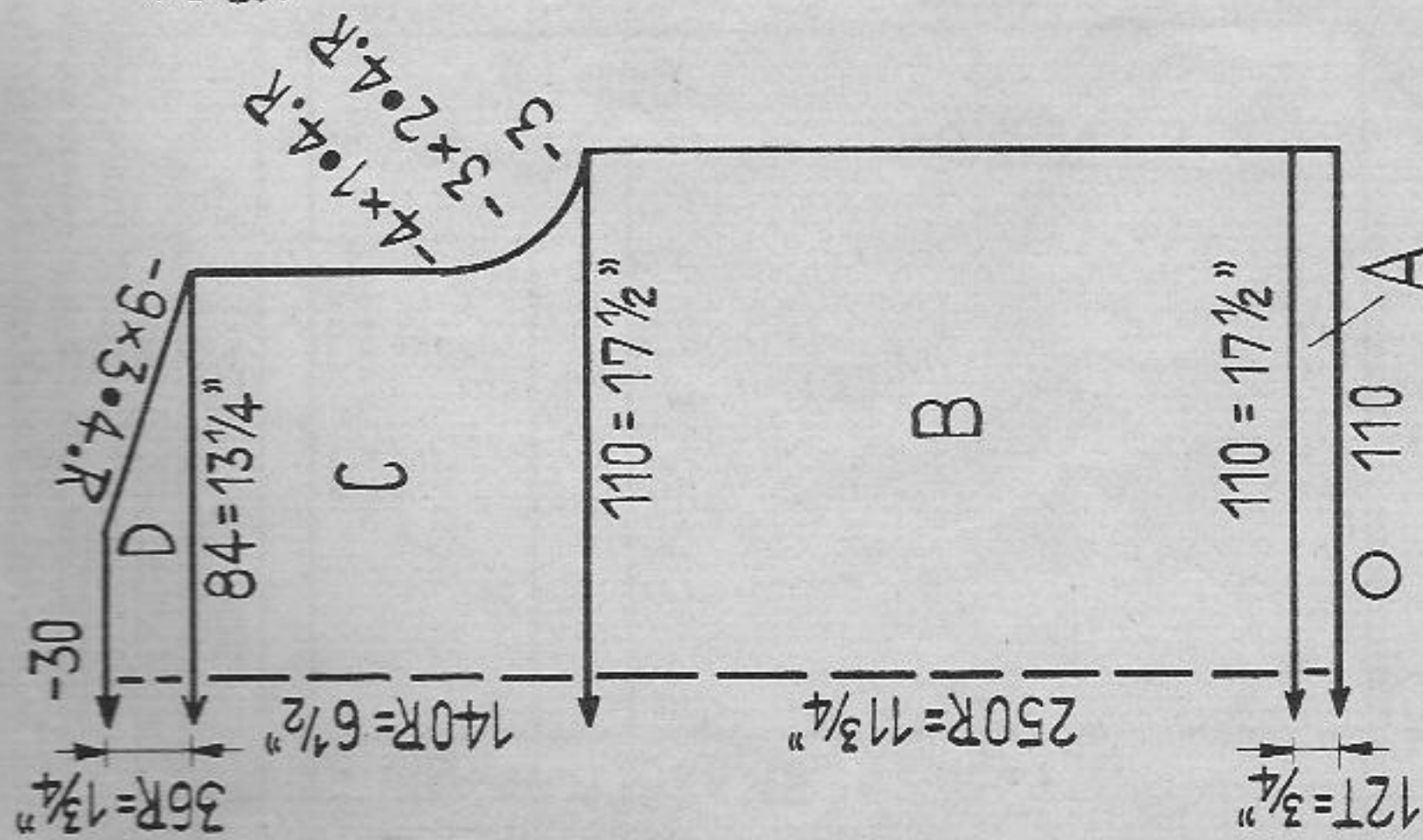

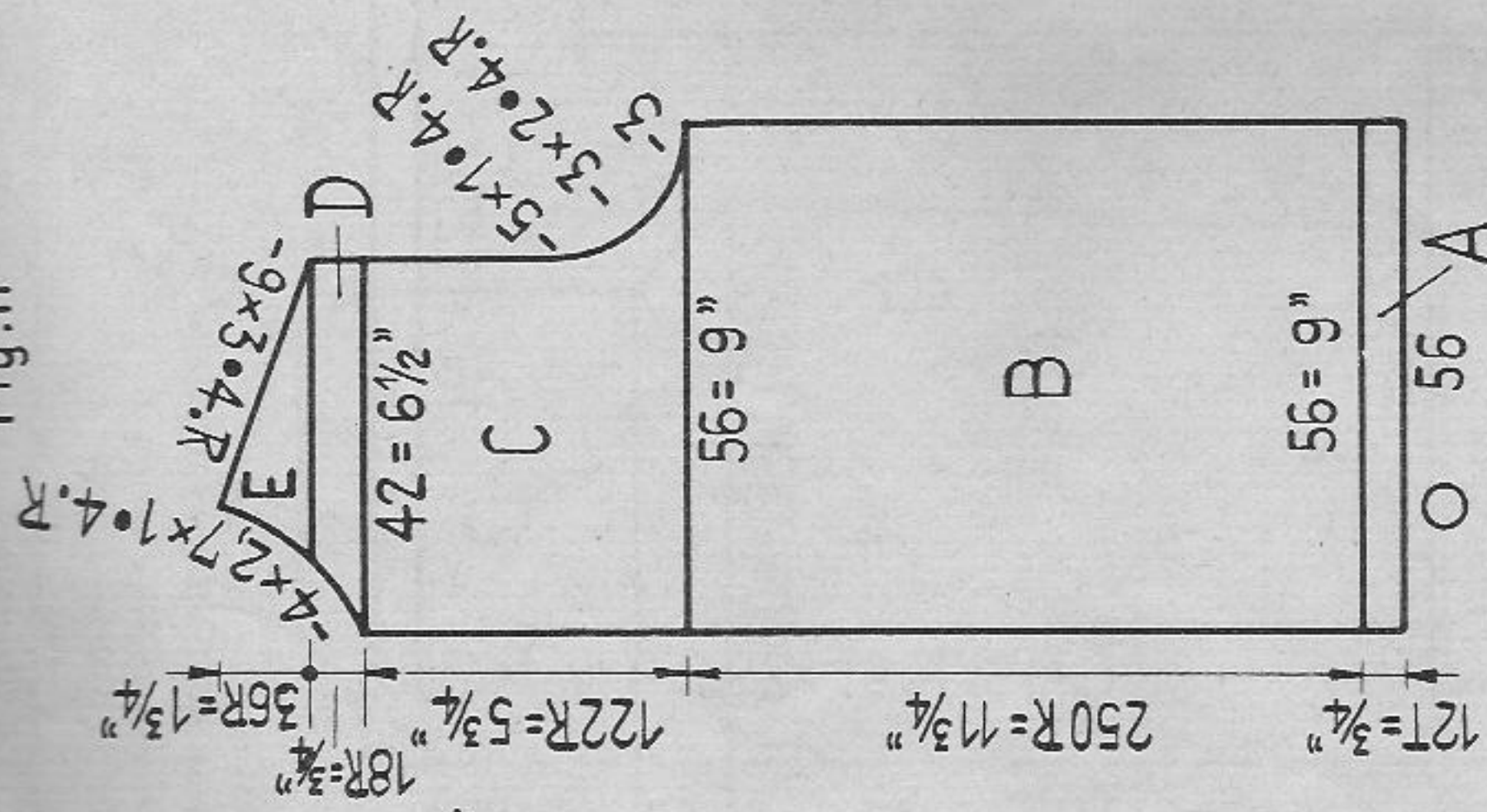
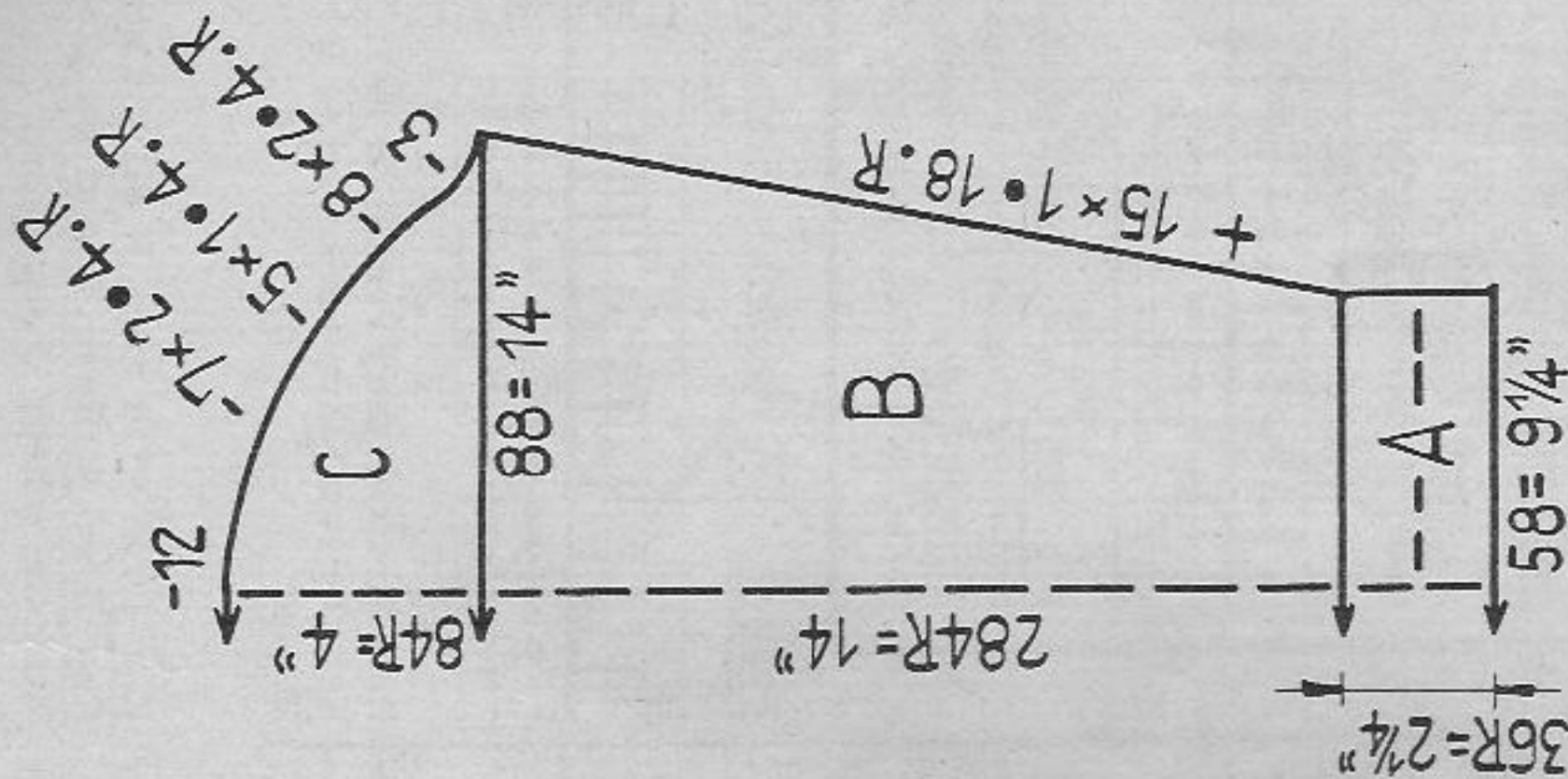

Girl's jacket

Size : to fit a 32 to 34 inch bust.

Materials : approx. 17 1/2 ozs medium sweater wool, 6 buttons

Stitch size : 1:1 rib 3, tubular and pattern 4

Test square : 100 sts = 16", 100 rows = 4 3/4"

Pattern:

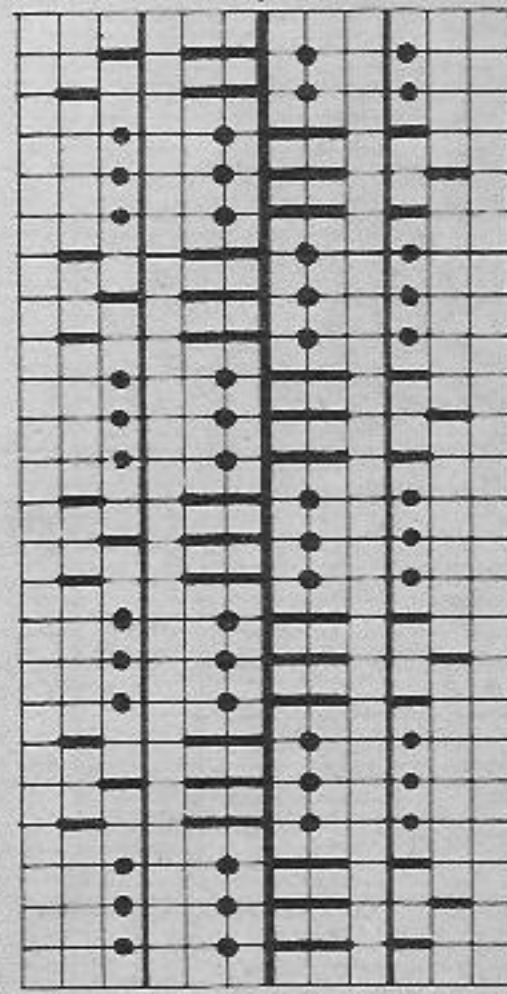


Fig. I and II : A = tubular. B - E = pattern.

Fig. III : A = 1:1 rib. B and C = pattern.

Front border with button holes: Knit twice. Cast on 12 sts for tubular (12 at each bed) and knit 400 rows tubular. At the same time make button holes at front and back each over the 5 th to 8 th nds, in the 22 nd, 96 th, 170 th, 244 th, 318 th and 392 nd rows. Knit second part without button holes.

Collar : Cast on 110 sts for tubular (110 at each bed) and knit 80 rows tubular.

1 row normal rib and 10 rows tubular. Now, with contrast wool knit 4 rows tubular 2 rows normal rib and release.

To make up. Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Sew front borders along front part. Stitch collar into position from centre front border to centre front border, first outside st by st with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Finish button holes and attach buttons.

 Test square : PASSAP-DUOMATIC/ PASSAP 12 100 sts = 11", 100 rows 7 1/2"
 PASSAP-COMBI
 100 sts = 11 1/2", 100 rows = 7 1/2"
 Figures in brackets on the diagram refer to inch-measurements for COMBI sts only.
 Pattern : pattern and transfer pattern according to diagrams.

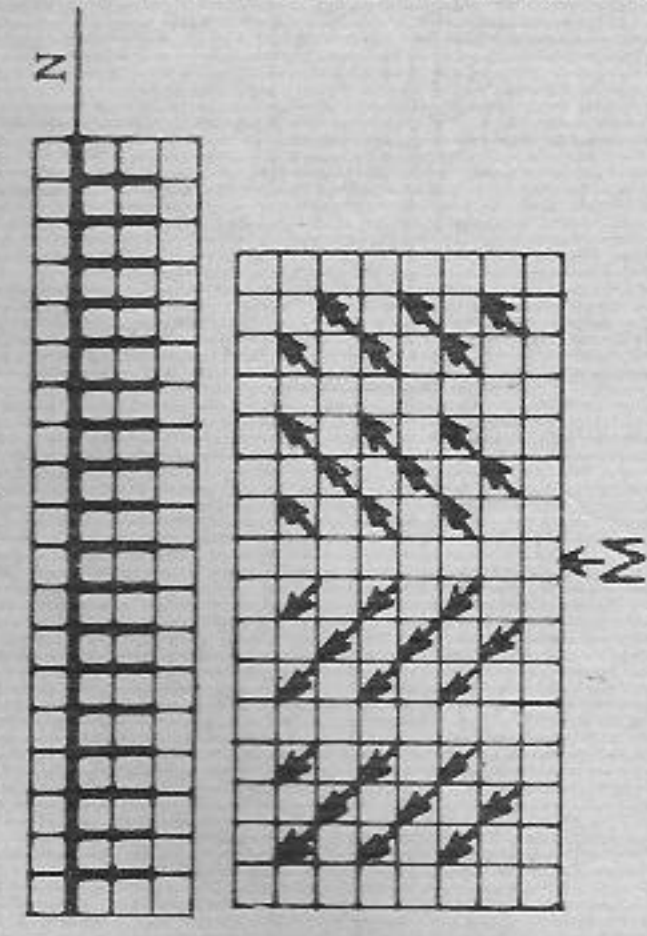
Fig. I : A = tubular. B = transfer pattern. C - F = pattern.

 To make up. Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth.
 Join seams. Stitch collar into position first outside st by st with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool. Then slip stitch inside.

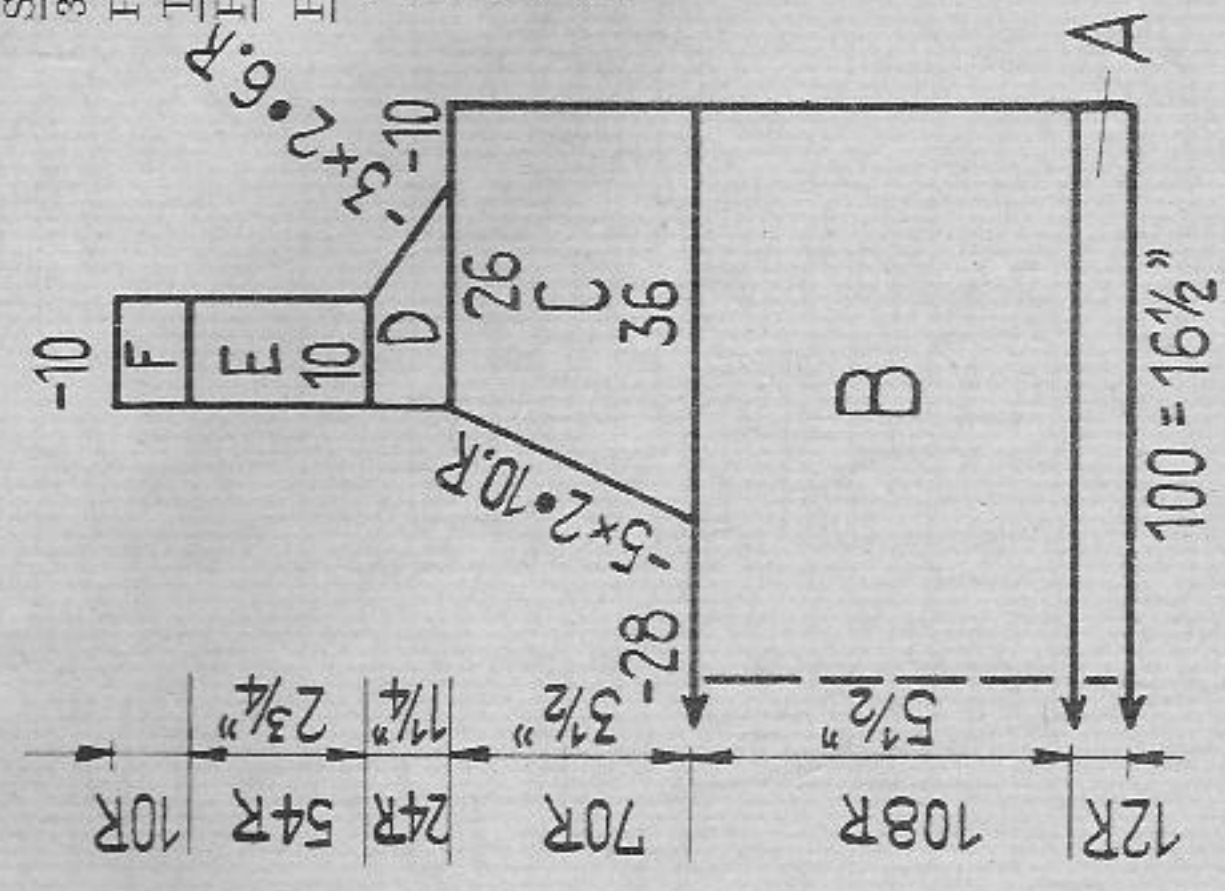

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Sew neckband half to inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Crochet 2 rows of firm sts. around armhole.

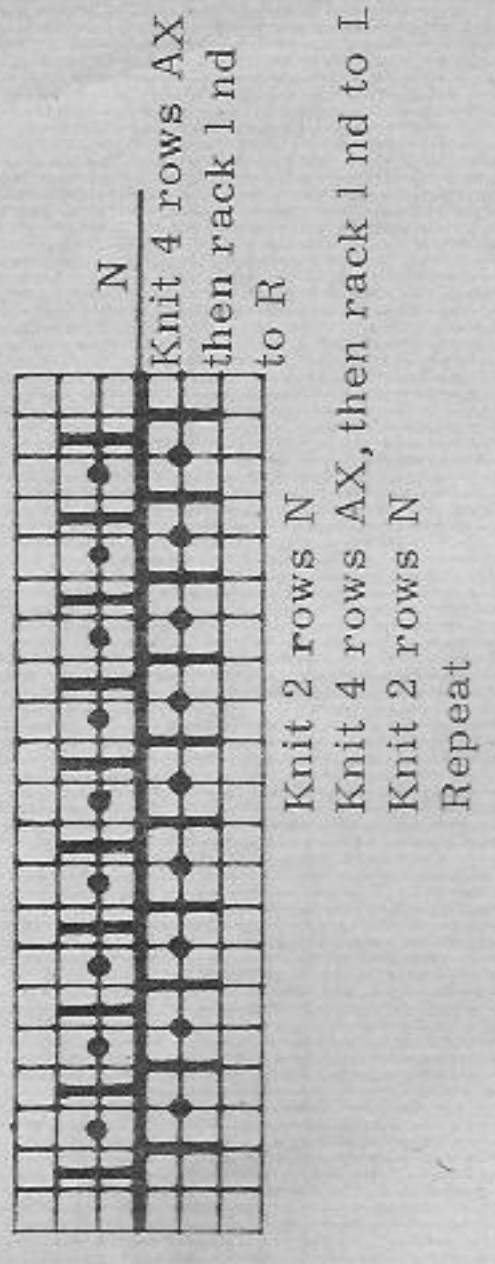

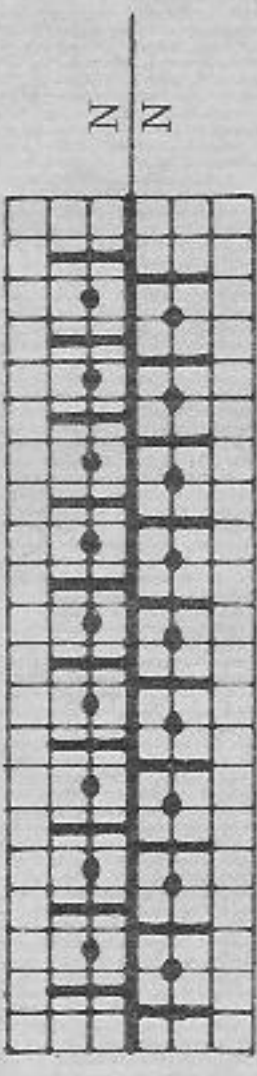

Fig. XII, cap: A = 1:1, B = pattern, C = take 64 sts. at left on to a stitchholder and knit the first part with 36 sts., pattern. D = take 10 sts. at right onto a stitchholder and knit with 26 sts. pattern. E = pattern. F = 1:1, cast off.

Now hang 28 sts. at centre of part from stitchholder back to the machine in 1:1, knit 10 rows and cast off.

Now hang the remaining 36 sts. from stitchholder back to the machine and knit 2nd part like first, reversing shaping Hang 20 sts. (10 sts. left, 10 sts. right) from stitchholder back to the machine in 1:1 and knit for neckline 10 rows, cast off.

To make up: Join seams at back, Pull together the upper 1:1 rows (A) and fix pompon. Sew 1:1 rib for neckline as well as frontborder half to inside. Fix 2 buttons.

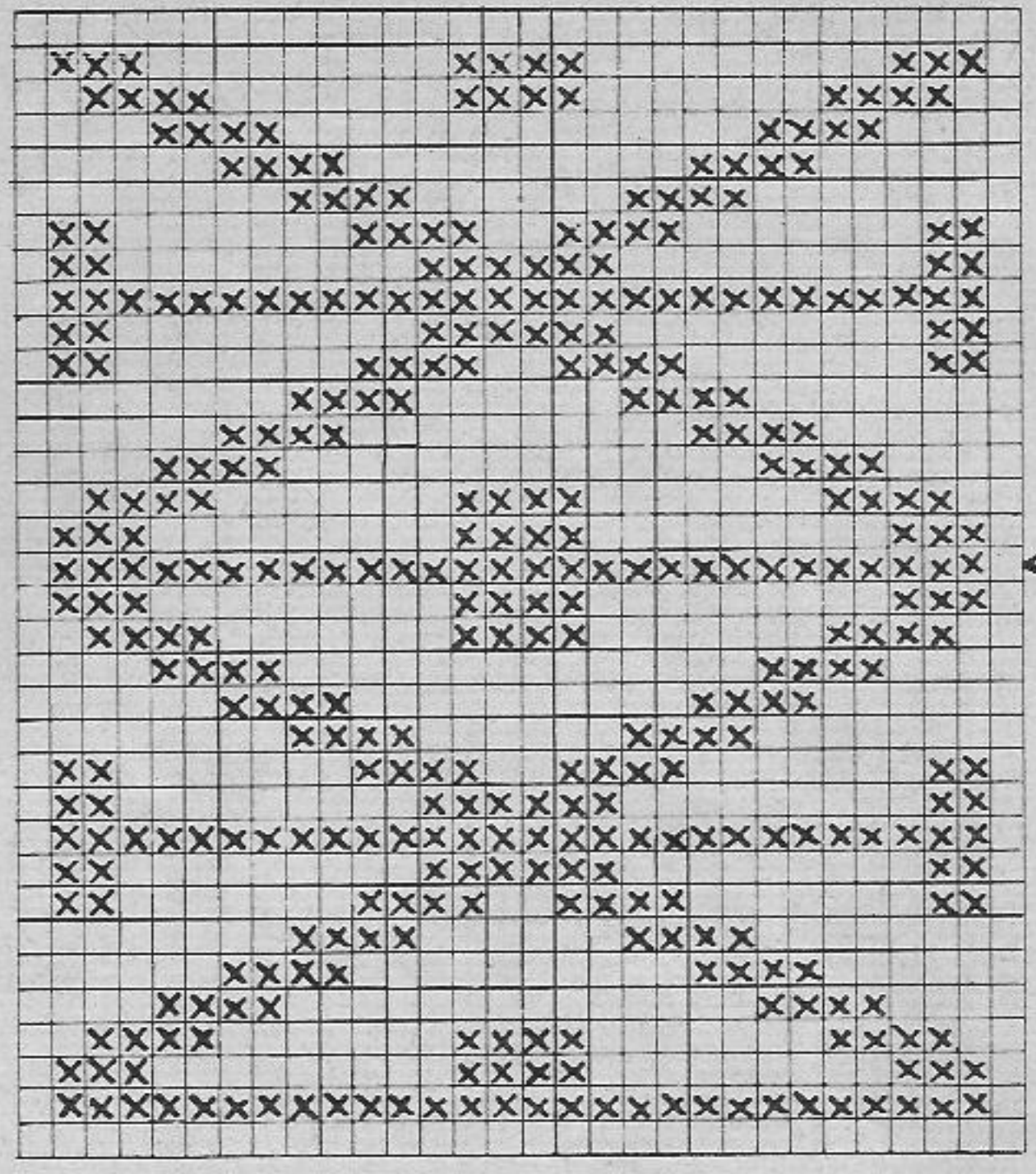
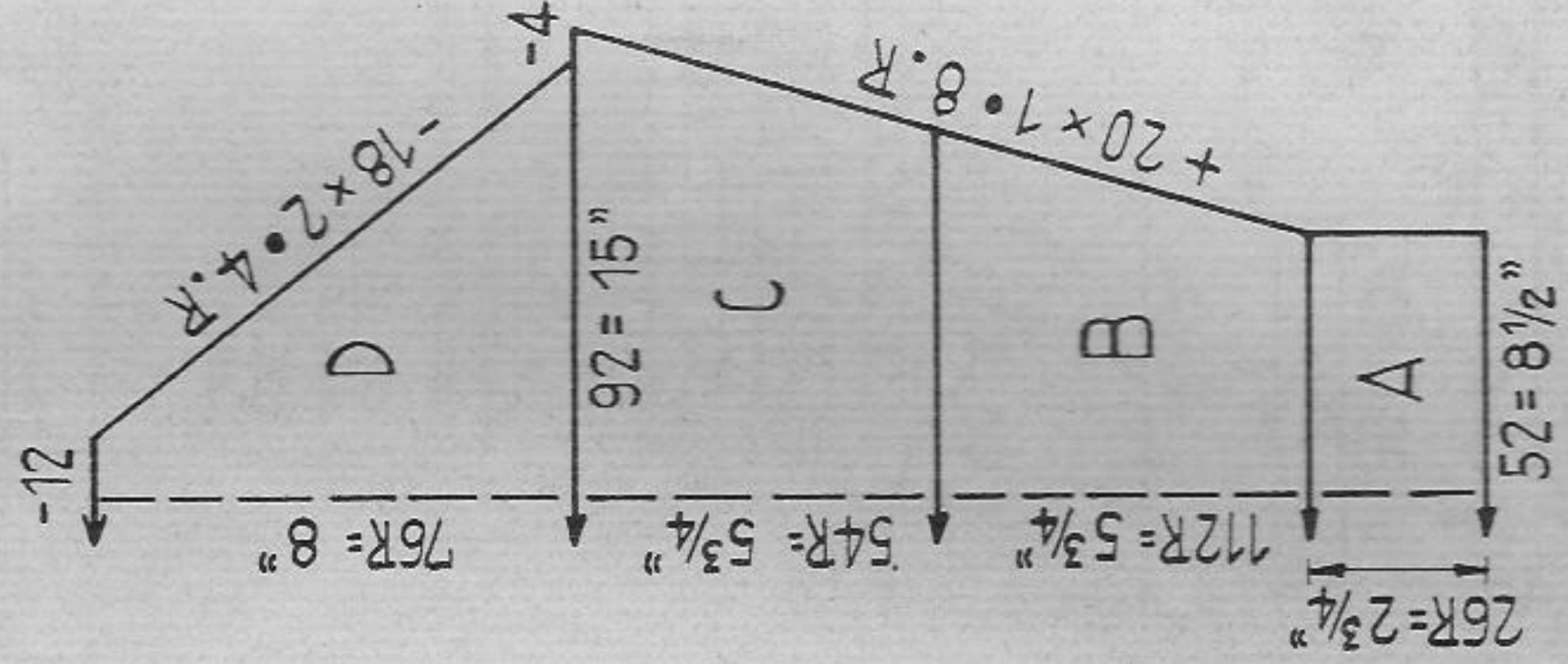
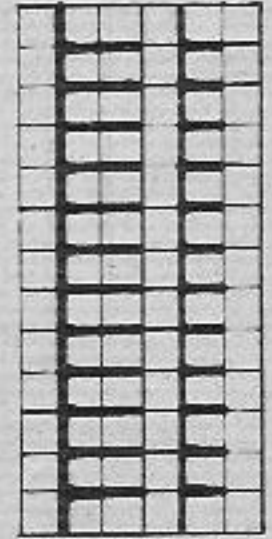


Fig. I and III: A = 1:1 green. B = fairisle trimming according to diagram. C and D = stocking st in green, for raglan use triple decker.

Materials: approx. 26 1/4 ozs fine wool white, 7 ozs light blue, 5 1/4 ozs dark blue (Sweater 35 ozs, Cap 3 1/2 ozs)

Stitch size: fairisle 4, 1:1 rib 3

Test square: 100 sts = 6 1/2" 100 rows = 4 3/4"

Pattern: knit fairisle according to diagram

• = light blue

x = dark blue

empty square = white

one square = 1 st = 2 rows = RC 4

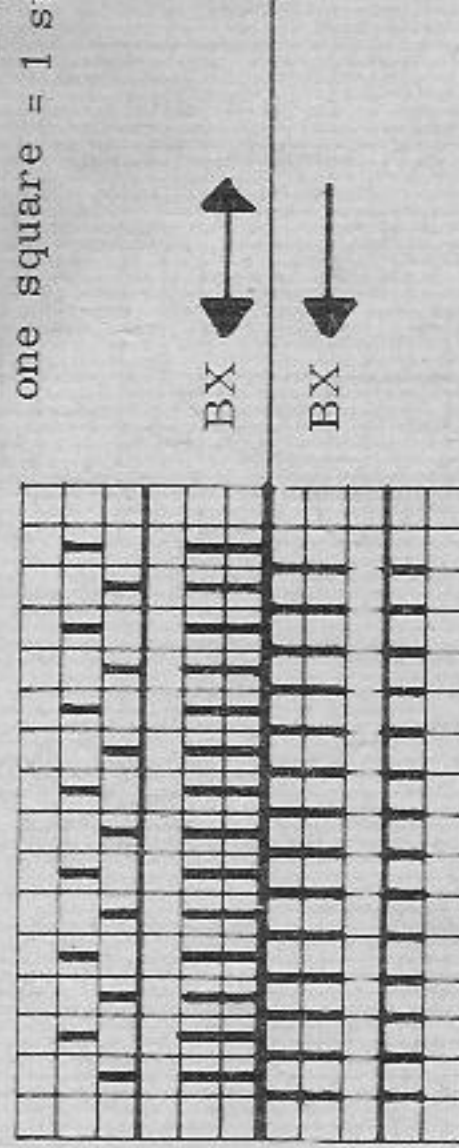

In 1:1 cast on 140 sts with contrast wool knit a few rows. Knit 90 rows in white, then a few rows with contrast wool, release.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Sew 1:1 rows half to inside. Sew normal rib rows at neckline to inside, at upper sleeve edges join with armhole. Fold collar in half and slip stitch inside st by st, approx. 1 inch deep - in doing so unravel contrast yarn.

Cap: Join seams. Pull upper 1:1 rows together and attach multicoloured

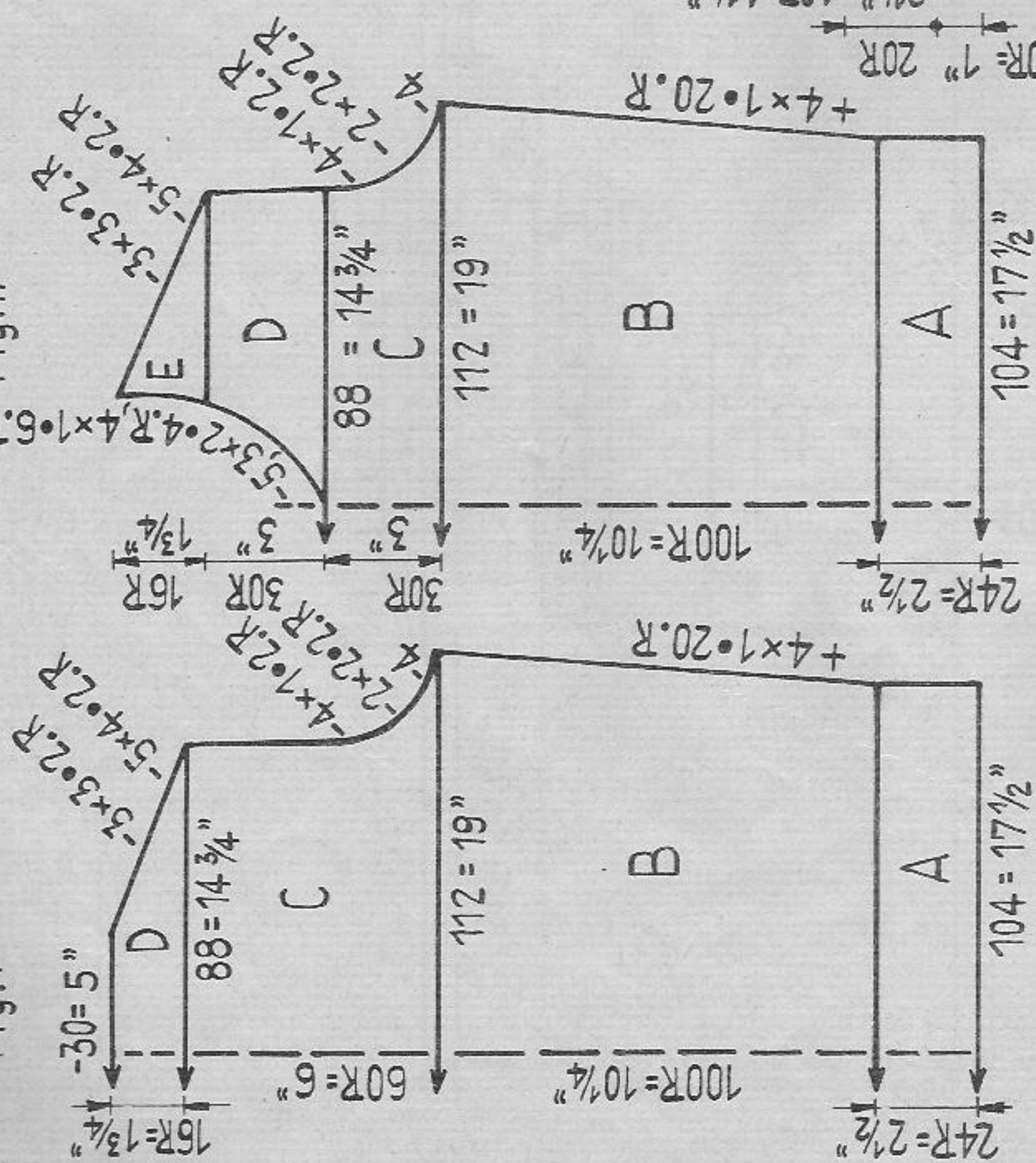

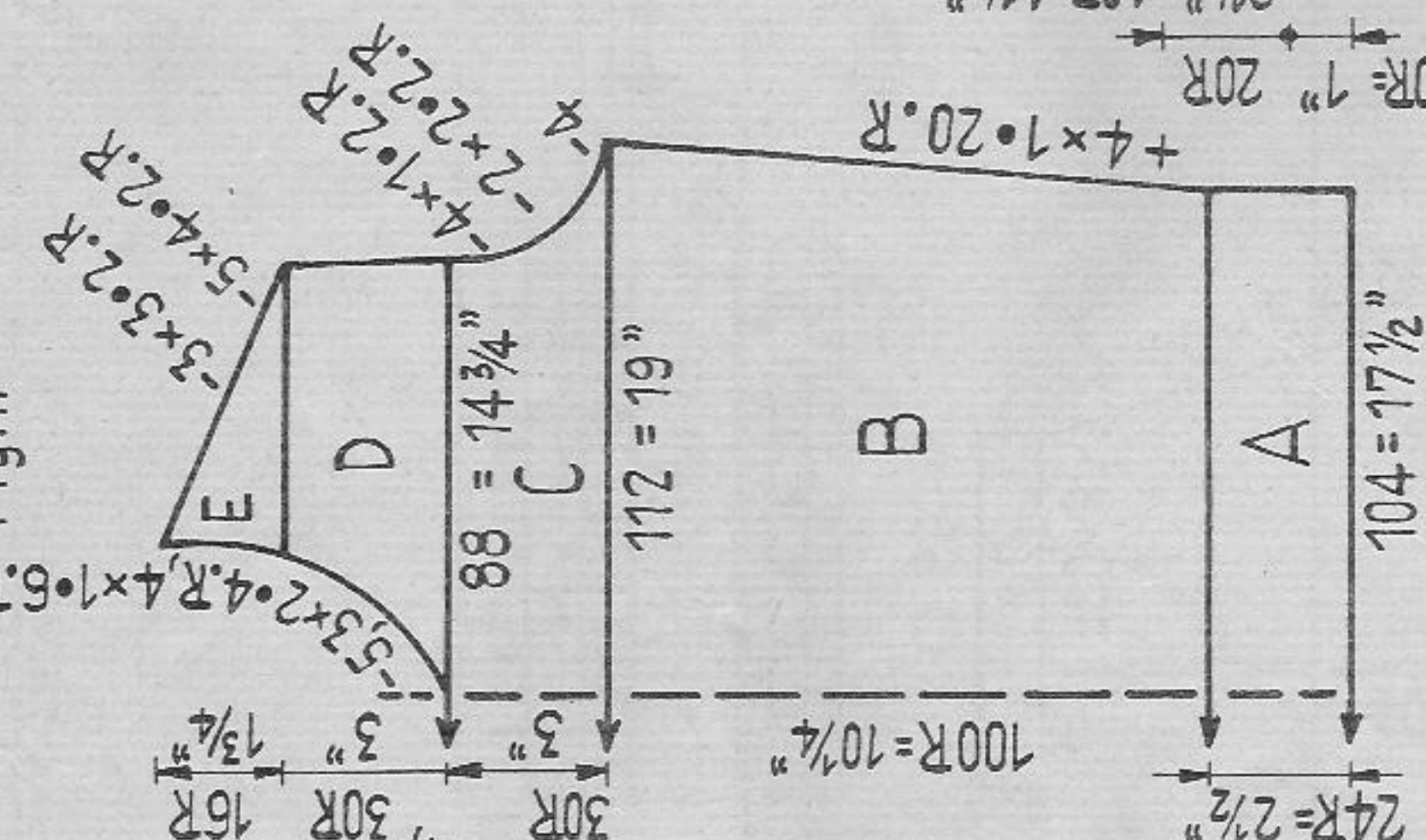
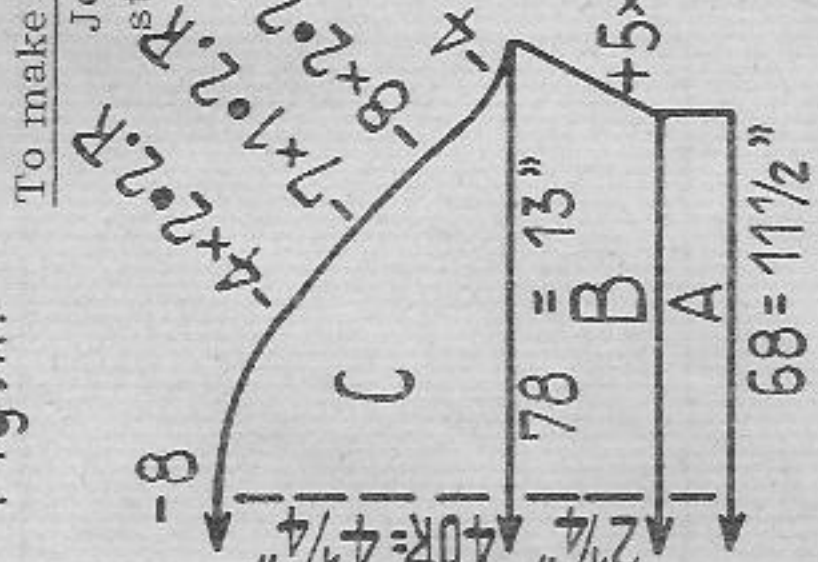

Material: approx. 10 1/2 ozs mohair wool

Stitch size: PASSAP-DUOMATIC stocking st and pattern 6 1/2, 1:1 rib 4
PASSAP-COMBI stocking st and pattern 4, 1:1 rib 2 3/4

Test square: 100 sts = 17" 100 rows = 10 1/4"
Pattern: Back and sleeves stocking st

Fig. II: A = 1:1. B = Start with transfer pattern and knit alternating pattern and transfer pattern throughout. C = patterns. D = divide work patterns. E = patterns.

Neckborder: Cast on 120 sts for stocking st and knit 8 rows. Knit a few rows with contrast wool, release.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch neckborder into position, first outside st by st with back sts., unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside.

Fig. V Neckborder: Knit twice. Cast on with contrast wool, then knit A and B in stocking st. Again a few rows with contrast wool, release.

Collar: Cast on 140 sts in 1:1 with contrast wool and knit a few rows, then with 140 sts knit 90 rows in green, again a few rows with contrast wool and release.

To make up: Pin out to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth.

Join seams. Stitch neckborder around neck, first outside at by st with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. (For turtle collar see Model No. 1451)

Fold collar in half and sew inside at by at approx. 1 inch deep, in doing so unravel contrast yarn.

Man's fairisle sweater

Size: To fit approx. 38 to 39 inch chest

Material approx. 19 1/4 ozs fine wool green, 7 ozs white.

Stitch size: pattern 3 3/4, tubular borders 4, collar 5

Test square: 100 sts = 6 1/4" 100 rows = 3 1/2"

Special note! As the PASSAP chart starts at 4" only check the numbers of rows based on your proper test square.

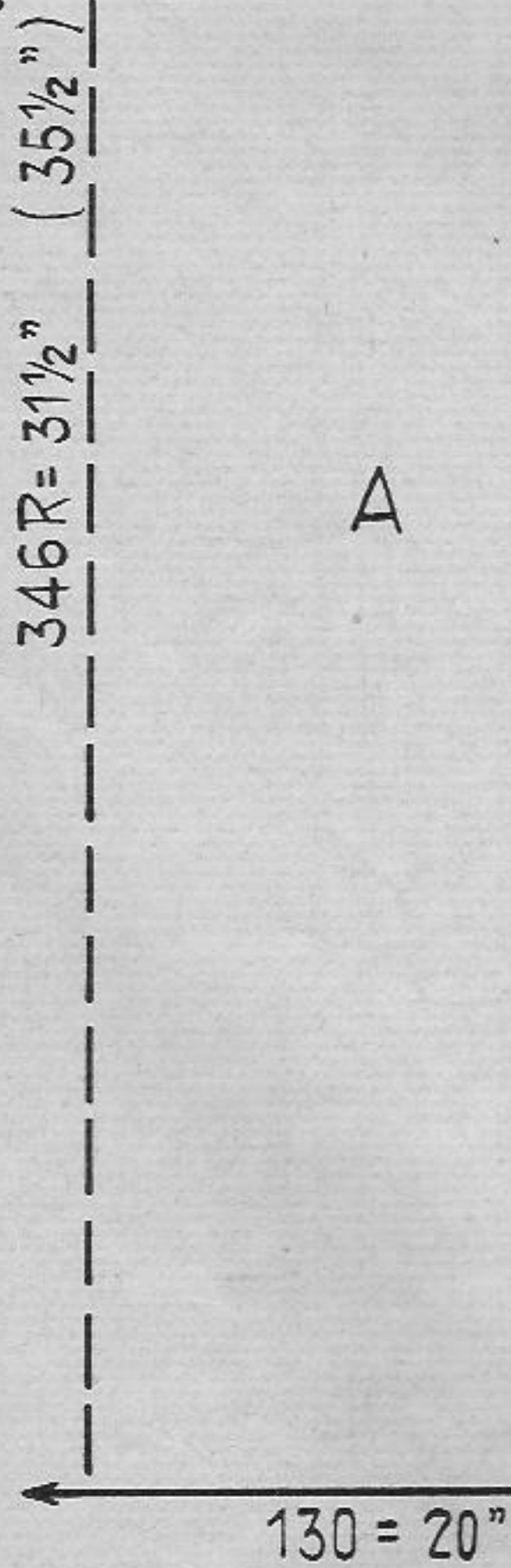

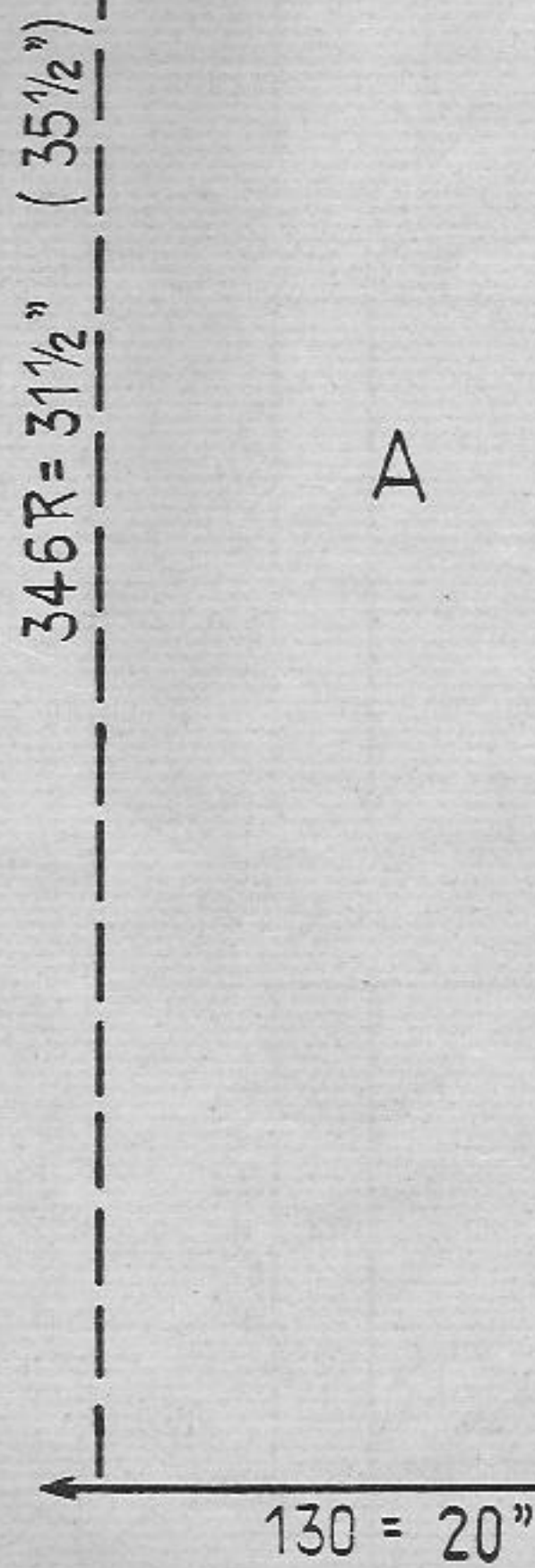

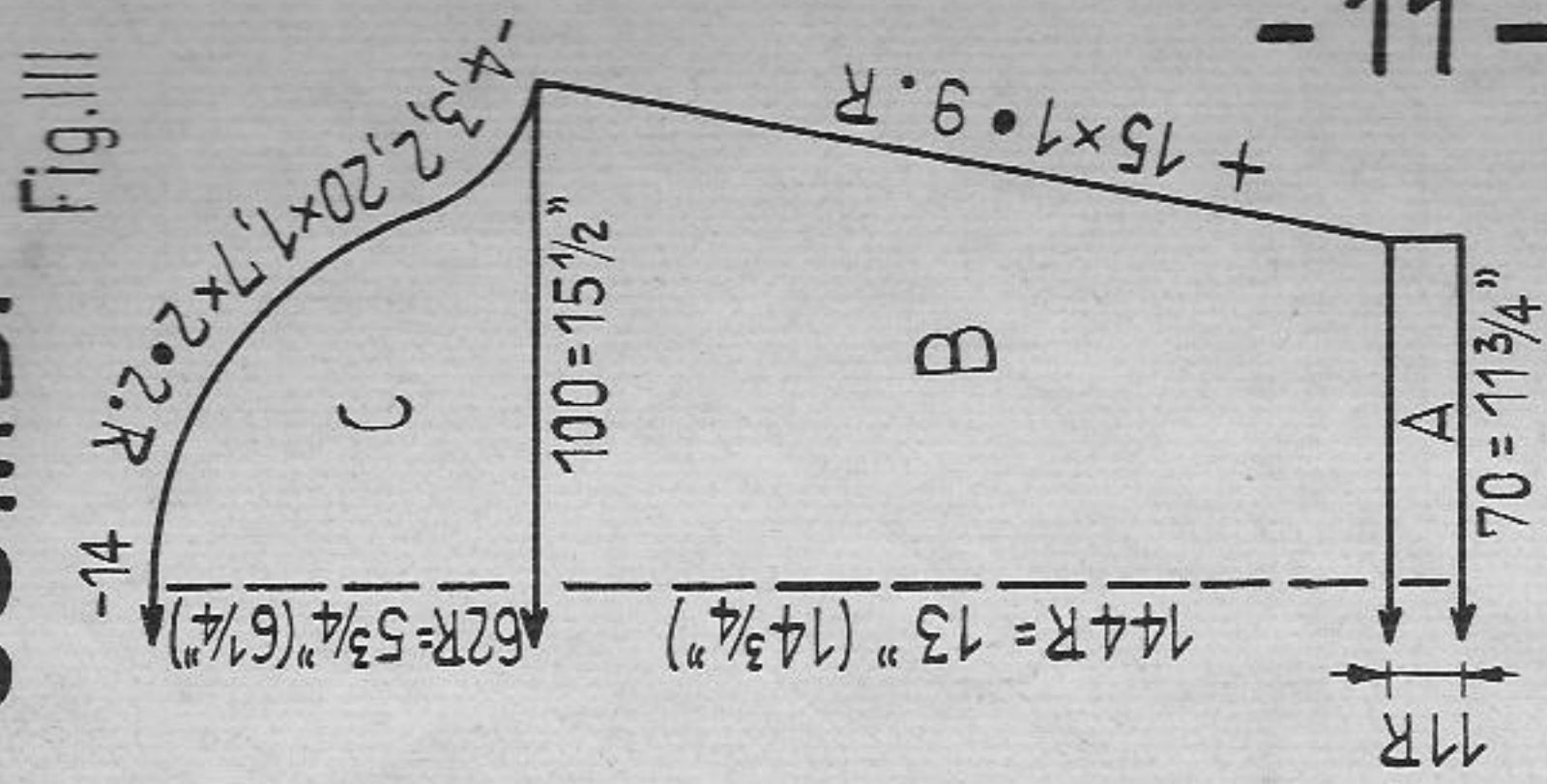

Lady's dress

Size: To fit approx. 37 to 38 inch chest

Materials: approx. 21 ozs medium/thick wool with synthetic yarn

Stitch size: PASSAP-DUOMATIC / PASSAP 12 stocking st 5 1/2, 1:1 rib 3 1/2, pattern for collar and pocket 5 1/2, cable belt 6
PASSAP-COMBI stocking st 3 1/2, 1:1 rib 2 1/2, pattern for collar and pocket 4 1/4, cable belt 3 1/2.

Fig. I: A and B = stocking st. C = divide work, stocking st, knit right half first, then left half with reversed shapings.

Fig. II: A and B = stocking st. C = divide work, stocking st as for Fig. I. D = stocking st.

Fig. III: A = 1:1. B and C = stocking st.

Pocket: Cast on 36 sts for tubular (36 sts each at back and front) and knit 10 rows tubular, then 40 rows in pattern and again 12 rows tubular, cast off.

Collar: Cast on 120 sts for tubular (120 sts each at back and front), knit 10 rows tubular, 40 rows in pattern and again 12 rows tubular, then a few rows with contrast wool, release.

Bands for cable belt: Knit 3 times. Cast on front and back each 4 sts and knit approx. 96 inches in tubular.

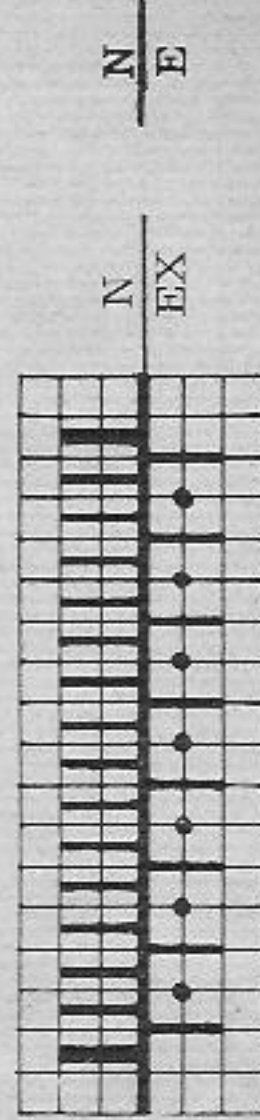
To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch collar around neck, first outside st by st unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Fix pocket. Cable bands for belt.

Test square: PASSAP-DUOMATIC / PASSAP 12 100 sts = 15 1/4" 100 rows = 9"
PASSAP-COMBI 100 sts = 15 1/4" 100 rows = 10 1/4"

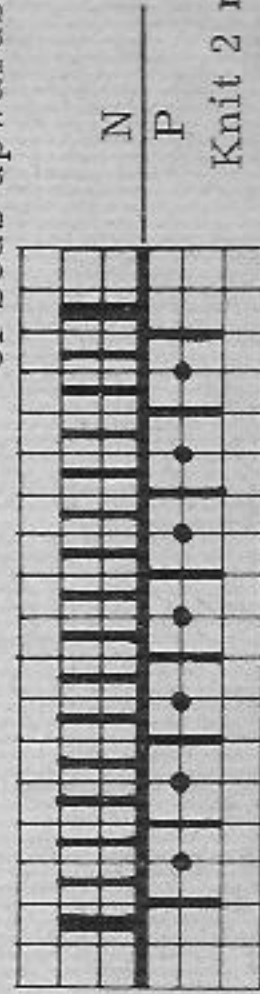

Size: To fit approx. 29 to 30 inch chest

Material: approx. 16 ozs 2 ply shetland wool to work up twofold.

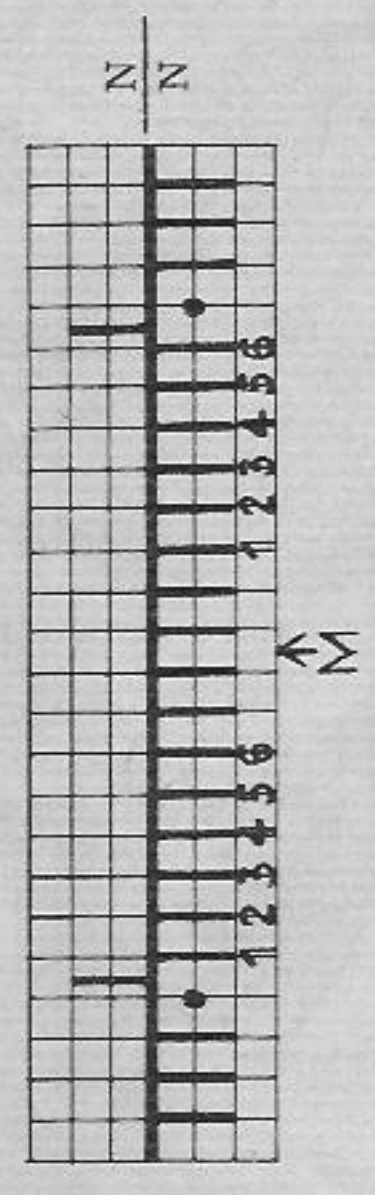
Stitch size: PASSAP-DUOMATIC / PASSAP 12 pattern and stocking st 6, 1:1 rib 3 1/2

Test square: PASSAP-COMBI pattern and stocking st 4 3/4, 1:1 rib 2 3/4 100 sts = 15 3/4" 100 rows = 10 3/4"

Pattern: back and sleeves stocking st, front part cable pattern with purl sts at both sides.

Cable pattern: PASSAP-DUOMATIC / PASSAP 12 PASSAP-COMBI

position lever for bed adjustment upwards



M = centre of cable pattern and front centre cable sts 1 - 2 - 3 - with sts 4 - 5 - 6 at the same time transfer 1 st each at both sides to back bed put empty nds in Neutral-Position
Knit 8 rows
Repeat

Fig. I + III: A = 1:1. B+C=stocking st. For raglan hang the 4th and 5th sts onto the 6th and 7th nds and follow up with remaining 3 sts, use black tool.

Fig. II: A = 1:1. B = cable pattern at centre of part. At left and right transfer 1 st each to back. After 8 rows work first cable, according to diagram, stocking st. C = Cable pattern and stocking st. Raglan with black tool.

When there remain only 5 sts each at front bed right and left of pattern transfer 1 st each from back bed to front bed and decrease at front bed.

D = divide work, then finish separately with reversed shapings. Cast on in 1:1, 124 sts knit 34 rows. Go on with 1:1 and knit 12 rows tubular, a few rows with contrast wool, release.

Fig. I: A to C = pattern. Take very fine wool twofold.

Fig. II: A and B = pattern. C = divide work, pattern. D = pattern

To make up:

Pin knitting onto lining, and sew along edges with zigzag stitch. Then cut off rest of lining. Join seams with sewing-machine. Crochet 2 rows of firm sts around neck, armholes and lower edge. Then work crochet trimming as follows: 1st row: 3 double crochets into each following st, 2 loop sts, 3 double crochets into 3rd, 4th, 5th st, 2 loop sts etc. 2nd row: 1 firm st into centre double crochet of first row, then 5 double crochet sts into loop sts of 1st row. 1 firm st into centre double crochet st of 1st row etc. At neck and armholes crochet one trimming, at lower edge two trimmings. For belt crochet a length of approx. 32 ins loop sts, then at both sides one crochet trimming each. Sew darts into lining at waist height, if desired.

Materials: For dress: 5 1/4 ozs medium white wool, 3 1/2 ozs dark blue, 6 buttons.

For jacket: 5 1/4 ozs dark blue, an oddment of white wool, 7 buttons

Stitch size: PASSAP-DUOMATIC / PASSAP 12

Stocking st and tubular 5 1/4, 1:1 rib 2 3/4

PASSAP-COMBI stocking st and tubular 2 1/2, 1:1 rib 1 3/4

Test square: 100 sts = 13" 100 rows = 8"

Pattern: stocking st

Fig. Ia dress: Right back: A = stocking st in white, after 12 rows work the first 2 buttonholes over the 4th to 6th sts and 13th to 15th sts, then 4 times 2 further buttonholes after 34 rows each. B = stocking st in white then raglan shapings with triple decker.

Left back: Knit with reversed shapings without buttonholes.

Fig. IIa dress: A and B = stocking st in white. C = divide work, stocking st in white, raglan as for Fig. Ia.

Fig. IIIa dress: A = 1:1 rib, 4 rows white, 6 rows dark blue, 4 rows white.

B and C = stocking st in white, raglan as for Fig. Ia.

Pleated skirt: Cast on 50 sts for stocking st at front bed, knit with dark blue 14 rows and 1 row with white. Transfer sts onto back bed. Knit 13 rows in white. Transfer sts to back bed, knit 14 rows dark blue and 1 row in white. Transfer sts to back bed, knit 13 rows in white etc., continue like this until there are 22 blue and 22 white stripes. Cast off.

Neckborder for dress: Cast on 78 sts (78 sts on each bed) for tubular and knit 12 rows in white, 16 rows in dark blue, 12 rows in white, then a few rows with contrast wool and release.

Dress trimming: Cast on 2 sts for tubular and knit 640 rows

Fig. Ib jacket: A = 1:1 rib, 4 rows dark blue, 6 rows white, 4 rows dark blue. B and C = stocking st in dark blue, raglan with triple decker.

Fig. IIb jacket: Right front: A = 1:1 rib as for Fig. Ib. After 6 rows work buttonhole over the 4th to 6th sts. B = stocking st in dark blue. After 20 rows work the first

2 buttonholes over the 4th to 6th sts and 13th to 15th sts, then 4 times 2 following buttonholes after 26 rows each. C and D = stocking st in dark blue, raglan as for Fig. Ib.

Left front: Knit with reversed shapings without buttonholes.

Fig. IIIb jacket: A = 1:1 rib, 6 rows dark blue, 6 rows white, 6 rows dark blue. B and C = stocking st, dark blue, raglan as for Fig. Ib.

Jacket neckborder: Cast on 100 sts for 1:1 rib knit 4 rows dark blue, and 3 rows in white. Then, at left, make 1 buttonhole over the 4th to 6th sts. Knit 3 rows in white. Now put all ends in Working - Position for tubular, knit in dark blue 16 rows, then a few rows with contrast wool, release.

To make up:

Pin out all parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch neckborder first outside then inside st by st with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool. Double down buttonholes and finish with buttonhole stitch. Fix buttons. Make seam at pleated skirt and a two inch lower hem. Then fold white stripes over blue stripes, see picture, and join skirt to upper part. Stitch dress trimming on top of seam and make bow with the remaining two ends.

Special note! Casting on for all parts in 1:1 rib with tubular, then transfer sts for pattern or stocking st.

Fig. I: Right back with flap at back centre: A = cast on, then pattern. B = cast off sts for flap, pattern. C and D = pattern. Knit left back with reversed shapings, without flap.

Fig. II and III: A - D = pattern. Make buttonholes in brown coat front at right as follows: first buttonhole after 185 rows over the 7th to 9th sts, 4 following buttonholes after 36 rows each.

Borders: Begin and finish all borders with contrast wool. Knit with camelhair wool in beige, stocking st.

Neckborder: 130 sts and 20 rows

Upper front part: knit twice. 118 sts and 20 rows

Lower front part: knit twice. 150 sts and 20 rows

Lower back (slit): knit twice. 140 sts and 20 rows

Sleeve borders: knit twice. 110 sts and 20 rows

Belt for outside in beige: For tubular 9 sts each and 1100 rows.

Belt loops: For tubular 7 sts each in beige and 60 rows, knit 4 times.

Belt for inside: For tubular 9 sts each and 220 rows in beige.

Pockets: Cast on 50 sts for pattern knit in beige 124 rows, then 20 rows stocking st and a few rows with contrast wool, release.

To make up: Pin out each coat separately to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. At front part of beige coat fix lining to inside according to dotted line, at the diagram Fig. II. Now put coats together and stitch around edges.

Borders: Taking purl st side to outside, stitch borders onto front part, neck, sleeves and back slit st by st first outside, then inside, unravelling contrast wool Flap: Stitch flap to back centre. Right and left of flap as well as at side seams fix one belt loop each.

Pockets: Stitch stocking st rows half to outside st by st, unravelling contrast wool, then fix pockets onto beige coat.

Buttonholes: At brown coat finish buttonholes and fix buttons correspondingly.

Belt for outside: Turn up belt, purl st side outside, then pull lining to inside and pull belt through belt loops.

Belt for inside: Fix onto back centre.

Hat: Cast on 180 sts for pattern, knit in beige 50 rows, then transfer sts for 1:1 rib knit 24 rows cast off.

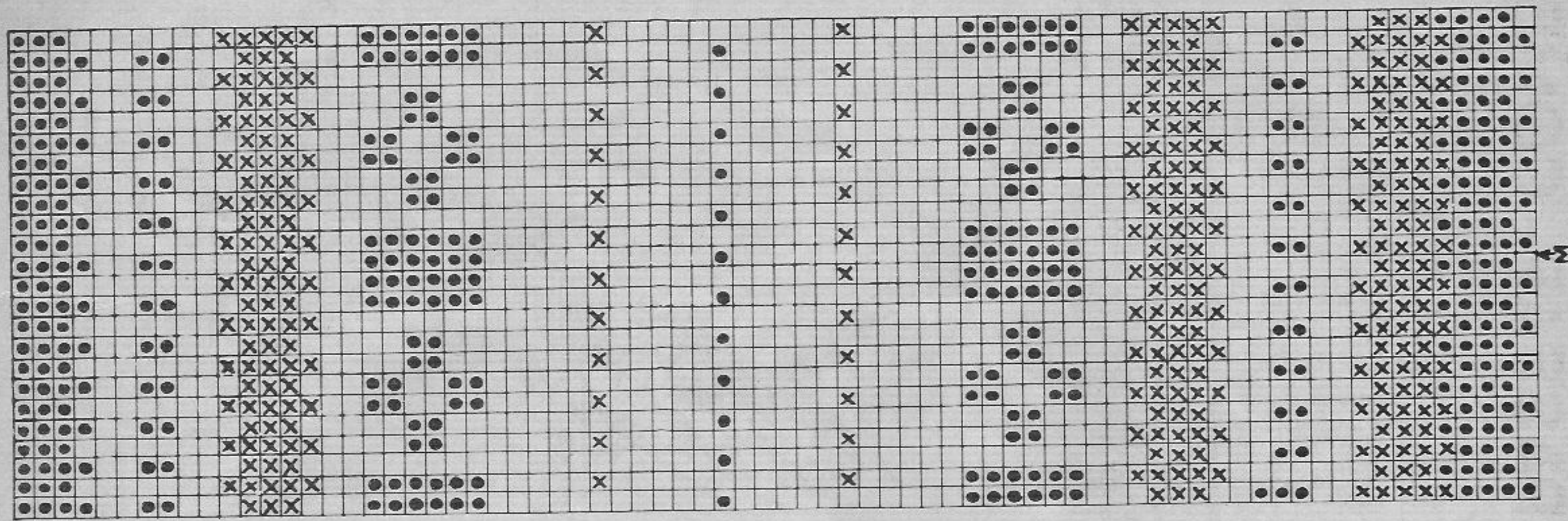
Hat brim: Knit twice. Cast on 126 sts for pattern in beige, knit 150 rows pattern, then cast off.

Hatband: Cast on 7 sts each for tubular in brown and knit 170 rows.

To make up:

Join back seams, then gather 1:1 rib rows. Join hat brims, fold around lining and stitch onto hat. Turn up hat band purl st side to outside, then fix band above seam between hat and hat brim. Put lining inside hat.
