Please read these introductory remarks!

Following our PASSAP-friends' often expressed desire we will be issuing our fashion journal twice a year from now on. The book for spring- and summertime fashions is to appear in January/February and the book for autumn- and winter fashions in August/September. As you will know the instruction books are obtainable in several languages: German, English, French, Spanish, Italian and sometimes also in another language. Naturally, the translations for these books take a lot of time and it is therefore possible that some minor delay may result. In the whole we hope, however, to be able to keep to our planned issuing dates.

Once again our PASSAP-friends from various countries have contributed to the success of a PASSAP-Model-Book. It contains models from Athens, Bogota, Capetown, Lisbon, Milan, Paris and Zurich - and we express our thanks to all people who took share in our model book hoping to satisfy the individual taste of everybody.

"Crochet-Look" is still top fashion and also tissue-like knitting with woven effects - all things every DUOMATIC-owner is able to do elegantly and easily. For PASSAP 12-owners we have also described some enticing models.

Especially for those possessing the new PASSAP-COMBI we have carefully worked out pattern descriptions:

Where a special test square for PASSAP-COMBI was necessary we have put into brackets the corresponding numbers for rows or sts on the patterns.

St. S. = stitch size is generally used for newer COMBI-machines. In case the knitting does not come out well with this stitch size please try the number in brackets ( or ... ).

Tens. arm = tension arm The latest experience has shown that when knitting stocking stitch the tension arm must have a strong back pull, and when knitting on double bed it must have a weak back pull. Please stick to our indications, they have been tested!

yarn br. = yarn brake Also when setting the yarn brake you should follow our indications. Here too it is important: for single bed knitting strong - for double bed knitting weak setting.

When waxing the wool correctly before knitting you will get an easy lock movement and a beautiful, even texture.

May we ask you to first study the explanations given on pages 1 and 2 before starting your work.

Pattern: drawing refers to half width, indication of stitch number to whole width of each part.

If the central line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is done simultaneously with reversed shapings.

If the central line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is done separately with reversed shapings.

Stitches are only given by a number (without "st."). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working-Position on front and back bed.

Exception: For tubular or halftubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed, the same number of needles has to be put into Working-Position on the other bed. In these cases, the sign for tubular  $\bigcirc$  resp. halftubular  $\text{C}$  or  $\text{D}$  is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increasing and decreasing always in the first row of a paragraph.

- $+3 \times 2 \bullet 8.R$  means: 3 times incr. 2 stitches in every 8th row  
(1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front),
- $-19 \times 3 \bullet 7.R$  means: 19 times decr. 3 stitches in every 7th row  
(2 stitches at back, 1 stitch at front and vice versa)
- $-17 \times 1 \bullet 2./3.R$  means: 17 times decr. 1 stitch, alternately after 2 rows  
and 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle -4 \times 8 \bullet 2.R$  means: work graduations, on DUO with lock at BX and pushers,  
on COMBI with nds in Rest-Position. 4 times, after  
every 2nd row, gradually put 8 pushers (DUO) resp. 8 nds  
(COMBI) in Rest-Position (for double bed knitting 4 at  
each bed). Once all graduations are finished, continue  
knitting normally, i. e. for DUO put pushers in Neutral-  
Position and lock at N, and for COMBI press returning key.

Number of stitches and inches:

- $136 = 8''$  means: a total of 136 stitches (for K/K 68 stitches each on  
front and back) make a width of 8".
- $\bigcirc 146 = 17''$  means: cast on 146 stitches each on front and back for tubular  
which makes a width of 17".

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be controlled by you in making your own test square for your own wool.

Test square: We suggest you to make a test square for your own wool before starting to calculate the necessary numbers of sts and rows along the PASSAP-chart. You will find two charts each on the front and back inside cover pages. How to use the test square you may read in the chapter "The test square and its calculation" in your instruction book. This is very important, especially when transferring a model into another size.

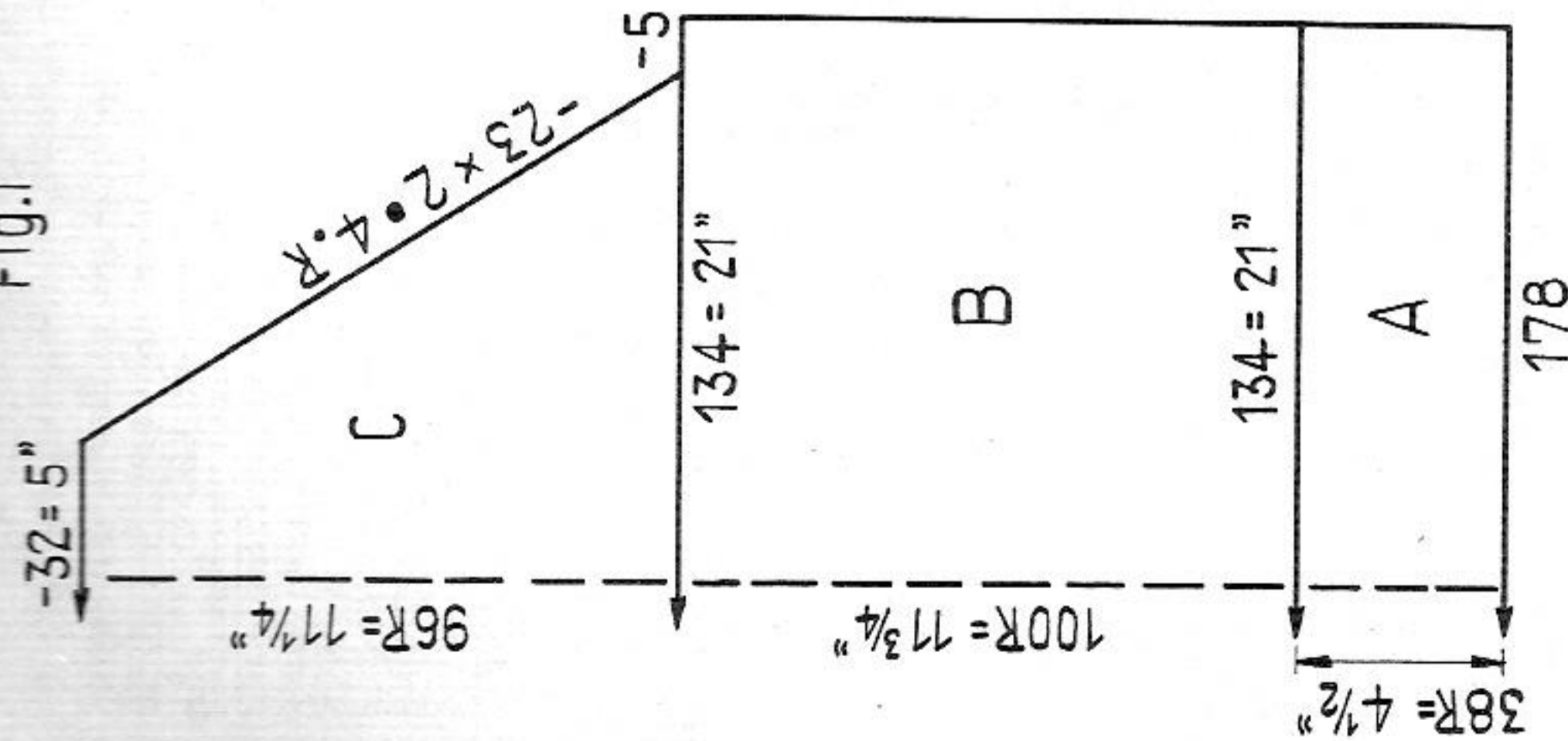

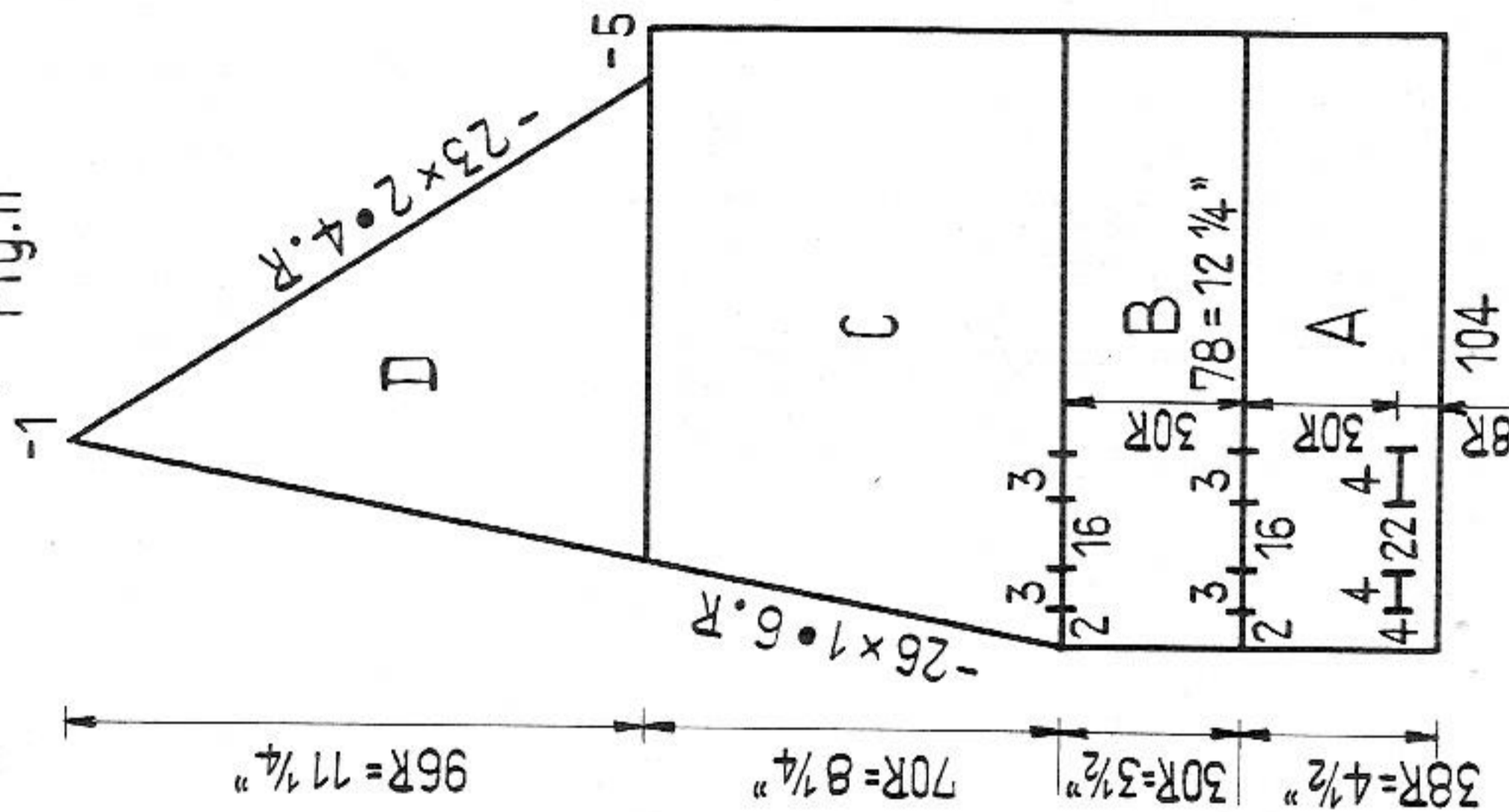
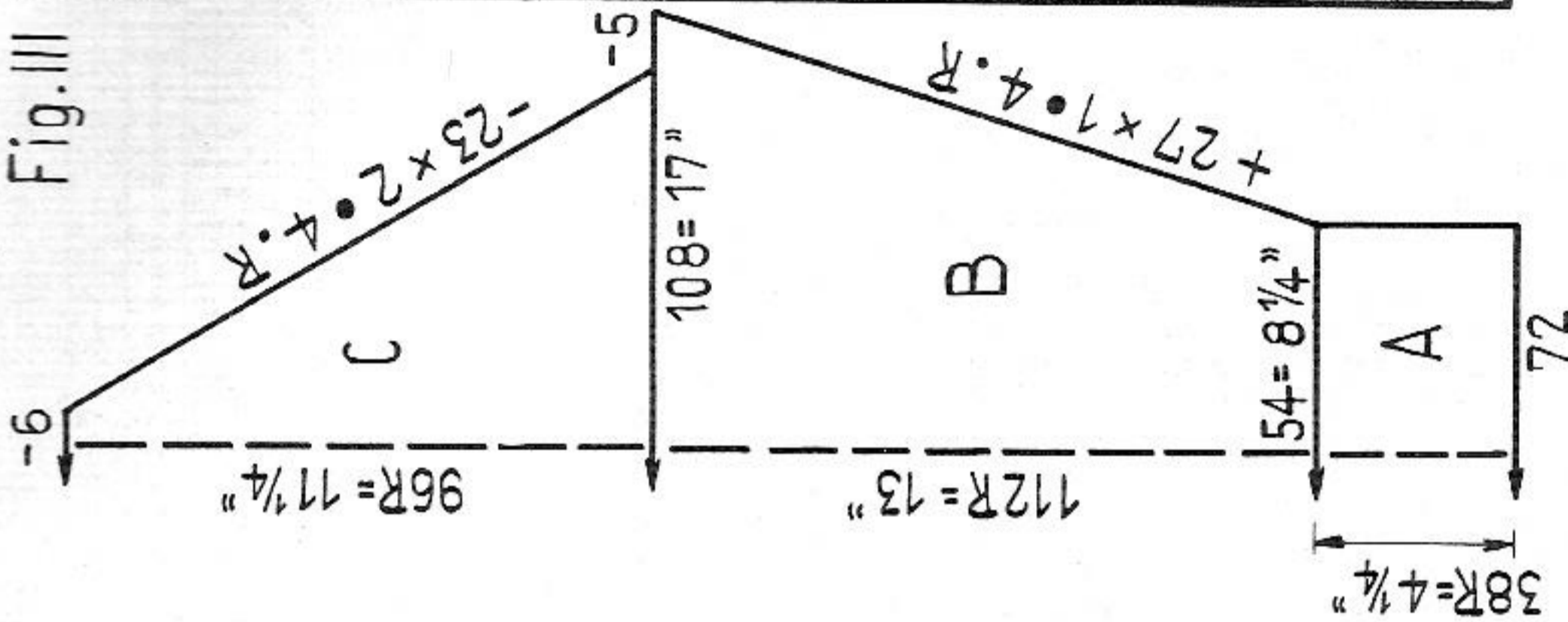

Size: To fit a 39 to 40 inch chest, approx.

Materials: approx. 25 ozs thick spotted sweater wool  
6 buttons, a rest of fine wool in black, white, red,  
for borders.

Stitch size: PASSAP-DUOMATIC / PASSAP 12

Stocking st 7, 2:2 rib 5 1/4, tubular for borders 4 1/2  
PASSAP-COMBI stocking st. 7 1/4 (or 6 1/4), tens. arm 5, yarn br. 3, 2:2 rib 4 3/4,  
tens. arm 3, yarn br. 3 1/2. Tubular bands 4 1/2 (or 3 1/2), tens. arm 5, yarn br. 3.

Test square: 100 sts = 15 1/2", 100 rows = 11 3/4"

Pattern: Stocking st

Fig. I + III: A = 2:2 rib. B - D = stocking st. For raglan use quintuple decker (brown tool).  
Fig. II: Left front part: A = 2:2 rib, work first two buttonholes after 8 rows, paying  
attention to the figures on diagram! B = stocking st, work buttonholes in the first stocking  
st row! (see diagram). C and D = stocking st, raglan as for Fig. I. - Knit right front part  
with reversed shapings, but without buttonholes.

Bands for front parts and neck: Knit twice. Cast on 180 sts in white for tubular. Knit 8 rows  
tubular, then 8 rows tubular black, 8 rows tubular red, 12 rows tubular white, a few rows  
tubular with contrast wool, release.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join  
parts and bands. Taking seam into middle of back, stitch neckborder and front borders first  
outside then inside st by st with backstitches, unravelling contrast wool. Stitch around  
buttonholes and fix buttons.

Man's sweater  
Size: to fit a 40 1/2 inch chest approx.  
Materials: approx. 17 1/2 ozs synthetic yarn (Orlon, Dakron or such like)  
Stitch size: PASSAP-DUOMATIC / PASSAP 12  
Pattern: back 6, front 6 1/2, 1:1 rib 3 1/2  
PASSAP-COMBI pattern back 6, front 4 1/2, 1:1 rib 3 1/2.  
Tens. arm 2, yarn br. 1 1/2.  
Test square: 100 sts = 16 1/2", 100 rows = 9 1/2"

Important: Exceptionally indications for sts refer to back bed only. At front put nds in or out of work as necessary.

M = Middle of pattern, back, front and sleeve.

1, 2, 3, 4 = Cross sts 1 and 2 with sts 3 and 4, placing sts 1 and 2 now over and next time under sts 3 and 4.

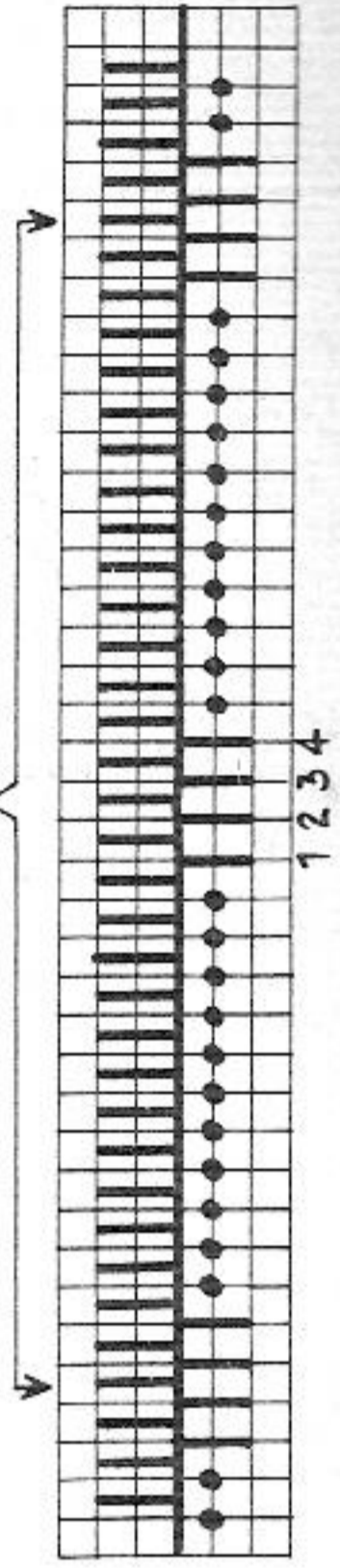

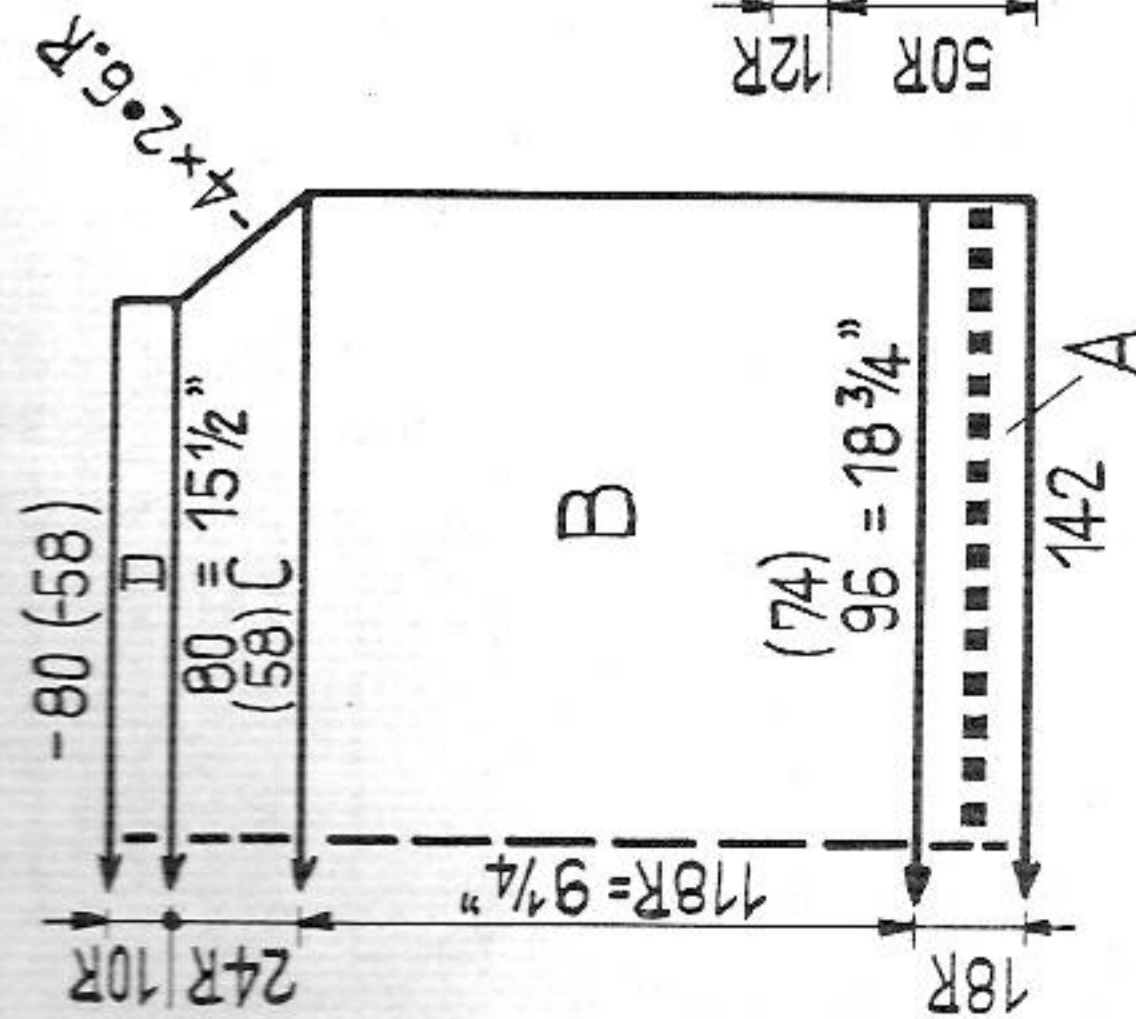

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Join parts. Stitch neck band first outside st by st with back stitch, then slip stitch half to inside.

Cast on tubular, then 7 rows stocking st. (DUO at front bed, COMBI at back bed), 1 open work row, 8 rows stocking st. Transfer cast on sts from back bed to front bed (PASSAP-COMBI from front bed to back bed), knit 1 row stocking st. B = transfer sts for pattern, pattern. C = pattern. D = transfer sts for 1:1 rib, knit 1:1 rib, cast off.

Fig. I a + II a: A and B = stocking st.

Neckborder: With contrast yarn cast on 110 sts for stocking st, knit a few rows. Then, with original wool knit 8 rows, 1 open work row, and again 8 rows, then a few rows with contrast wool and release.

Armhole-borders: Knit twice. Cast on 40 sts for stocking st and knit as neckborder.

Bow: Cast on 2 sts each for tubular and knit 120 rows, then cast off and stitch bow.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Sew Fig. I a and II a to skirt parts, close side seams and shoulders and put in sleeves. Sew neckborder first outside then inside st by st with back sts unravelling contrast yarn.

At wrist pull in sleeves a little bit. Fix sleeve- and neckborders. Fix press button and attach bow on top.

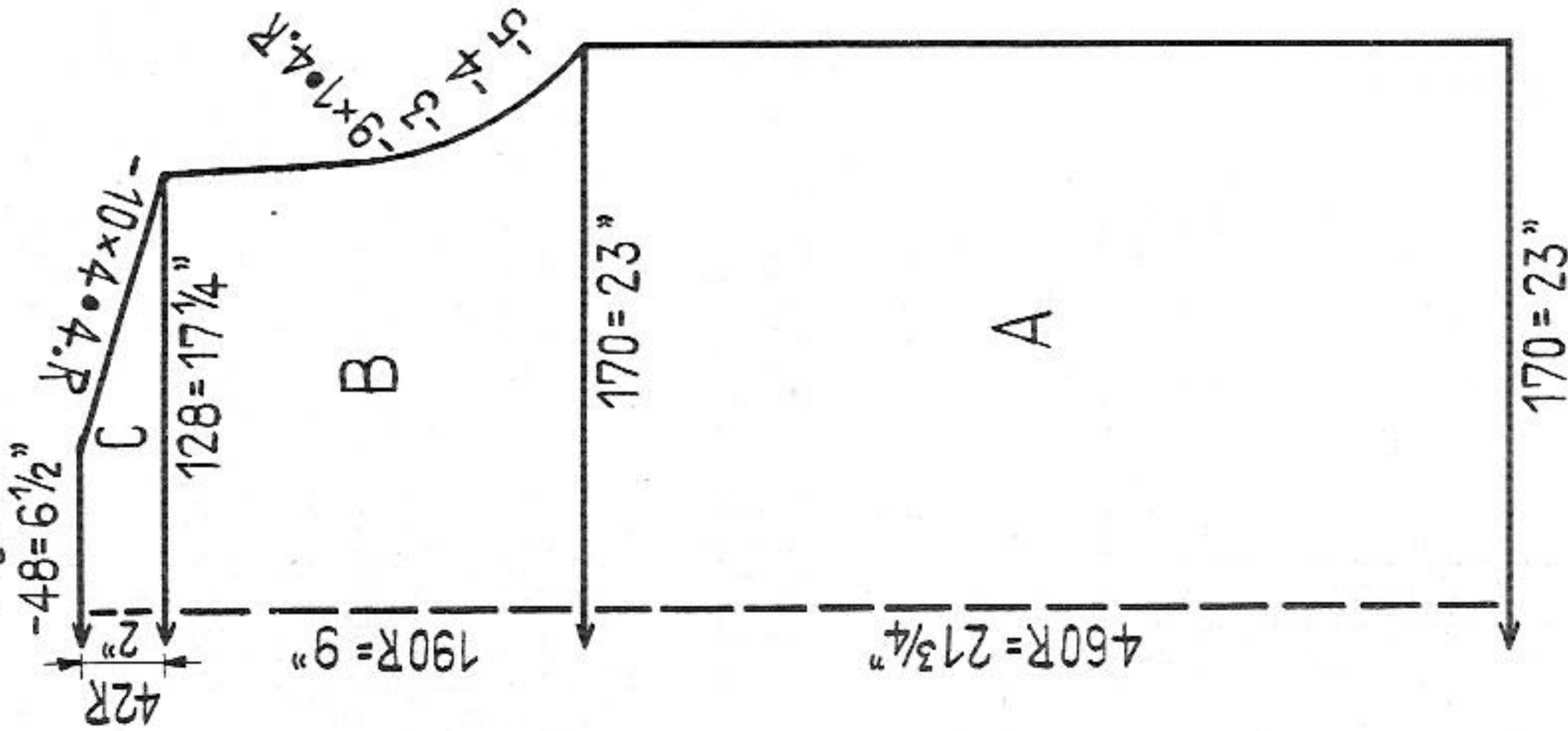
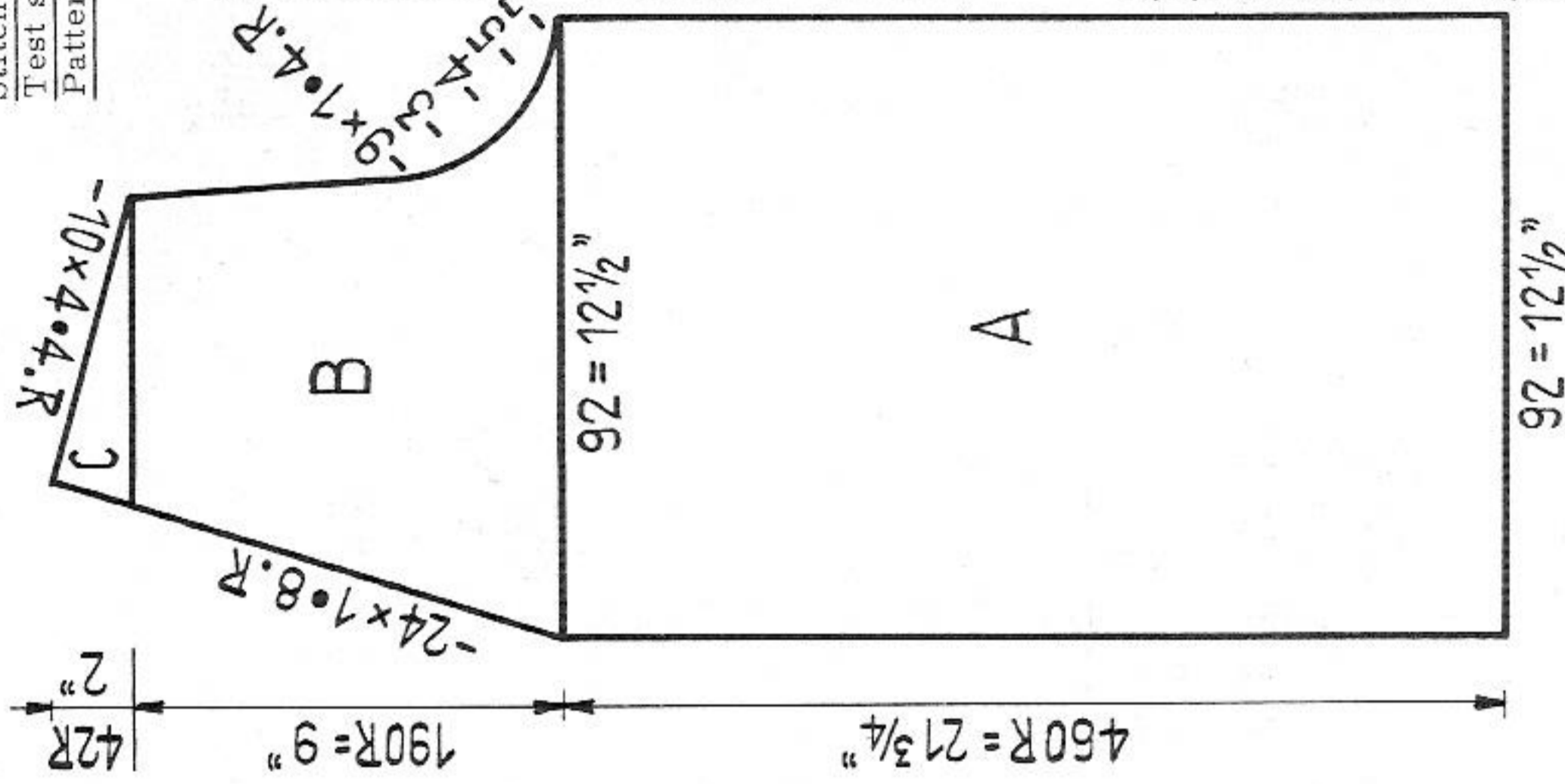

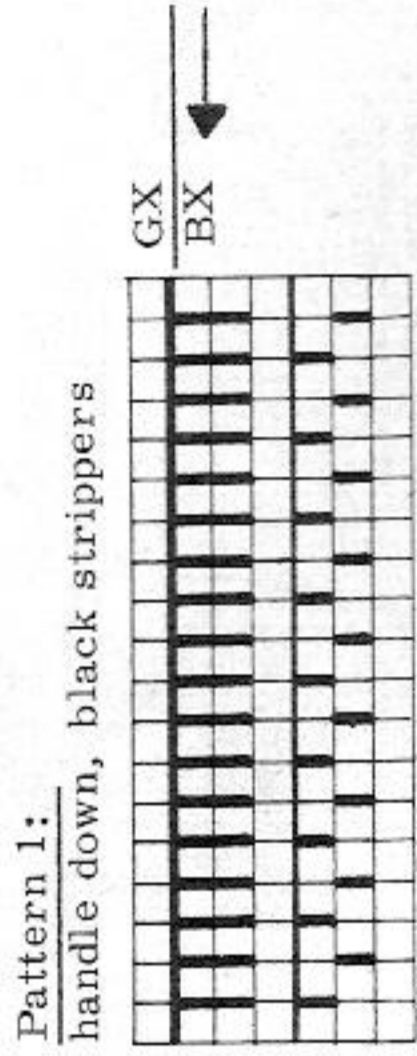
Lady's beach jacket with nymph-pattern to fit a 45" bust approx.

Materials: approx. 10 1/2 ozs fine industrial curled speckled wool, knitted together with fine plain wool, 8 1/2 ozs fine white wool

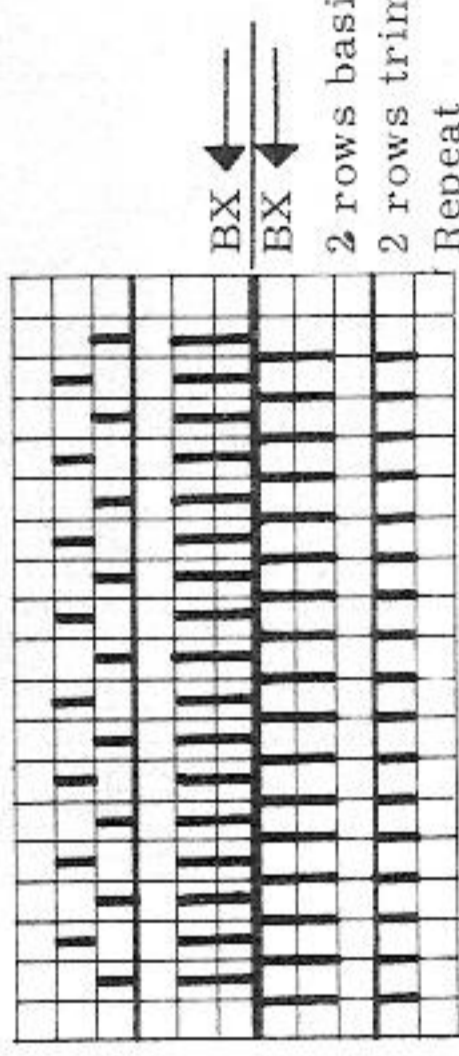
Stitch size: Pattern 1: 5. Pattern 2 back 5, front 4. Stocking st. 4. K/K 2 1/2.

Test square: 13 1/2", 100 rows = 4 3/4"

Pattern: Back Pattern 1. Right front part: below pattern 2 (nymph as diagram), above pattern 1. Left front part: below pattern 1, above pattern 2 (nymph reversed to diagram).



Pattern 2: (according to diagram) handle down, black strippers



2 rows basic colour blue  
2 rows trimming colour white

Fig. I: A to C = Pattern, blue.

Fig. II: Right front part: A = 10 rows Pattern 1, blue, knit at back bed. Then count 36 sts from right and, towards left, arrange for pattern 2, knit pattern 2, then continue with pattern 1. (When nds have to be put to work transfer connecting links from back bed to front bed; when nds are out of work, transfer sts to back bed.) B and C = Pattern 1, blue.

Left front part: (nymph reversed to diagram)

A = 300 rows pattern 1, blue, knit on back bed.

Then count 42 sts from right and, towards left, arrange for pattern 2, knit pattern 2. B = Finish knitting with pattern 2. Then continue with pattern 1 in blue. C = Pattern 1, blue.

Armborders: Knit twice in white. With contrast wool cast on 120 sts for stocking st, knit a few rows, then 14 rows in white and again a few rows with contrast wool, release.

Neckborder - front part: Cast on 26 sts for K/K in white and knit 950 rows, cast off.

Side-Borders for front part: Knit twice in white. Cast on 24 sts for K/K, knit 194 rows, then decr. on both sides 2 sts 5 times every 2nd row, sew up the remaining 4 sts.

Side-Borders for back: Knit twice in white. Cast on 22 sts for K/K. Knit 110 rows, cast off.

Belt: Cast on 22 sts in white for K/K and knit 600 rows, cast off.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Sew pieces together leaving an opening of approx. 12" at side seams. At lower edge slip stitch 10 rows to inside for hem. Sew front part of neck border around neck and front parts. Sew side borders over the openings, small border at back, broad border at front, with point showing upward; leave opening for belt in waist height, see photo. Sew armborders first outside then inside st by st with back sts unravelling contrast wool.

Description for nymph pattern here. Diagram at back cover page

1 square = 1 st = 2 rows = RC 4

X = Nds and pushers at front bed in Working-Position. For each new nd put to work hang the connecting link of the corresponding back st onto the new front nd so that there will be no hole. At front only the white pattern nds are knitting. empty square = at front nd is out of work (if necessary transfer corresponding sts to back bed). At back all nds are knitting.

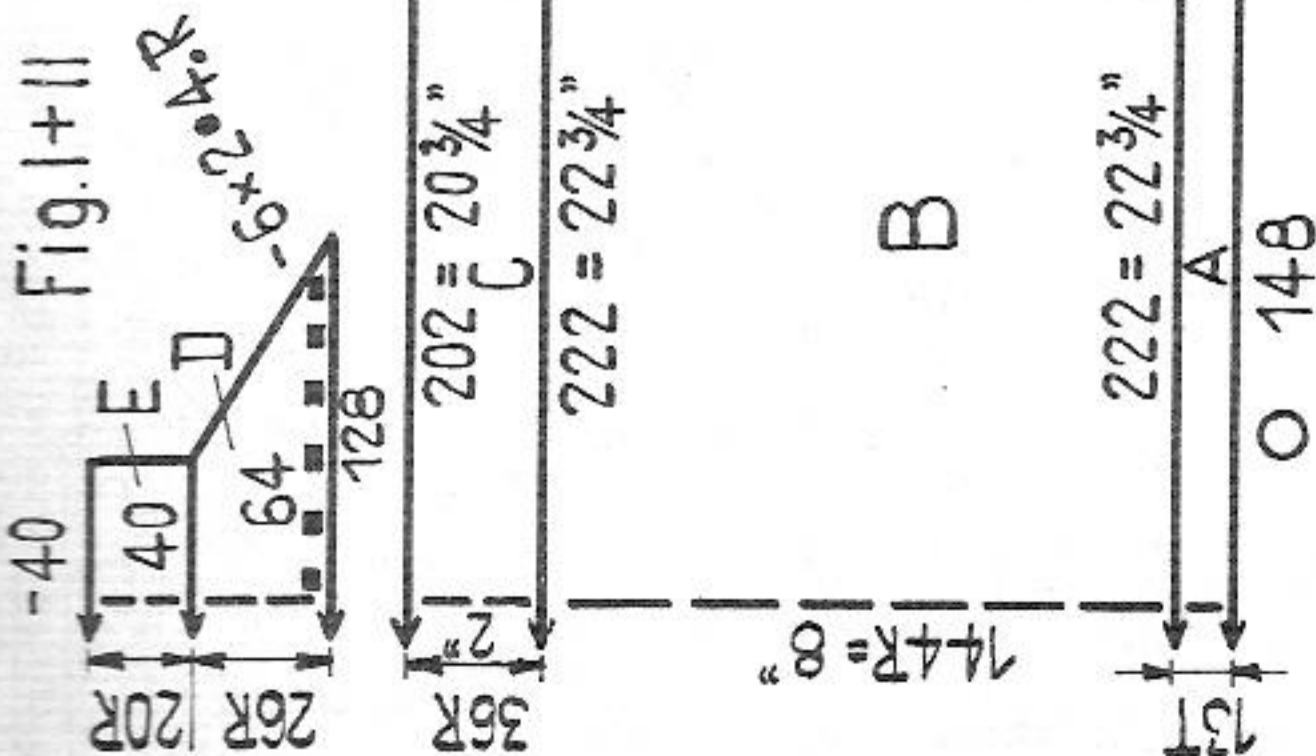
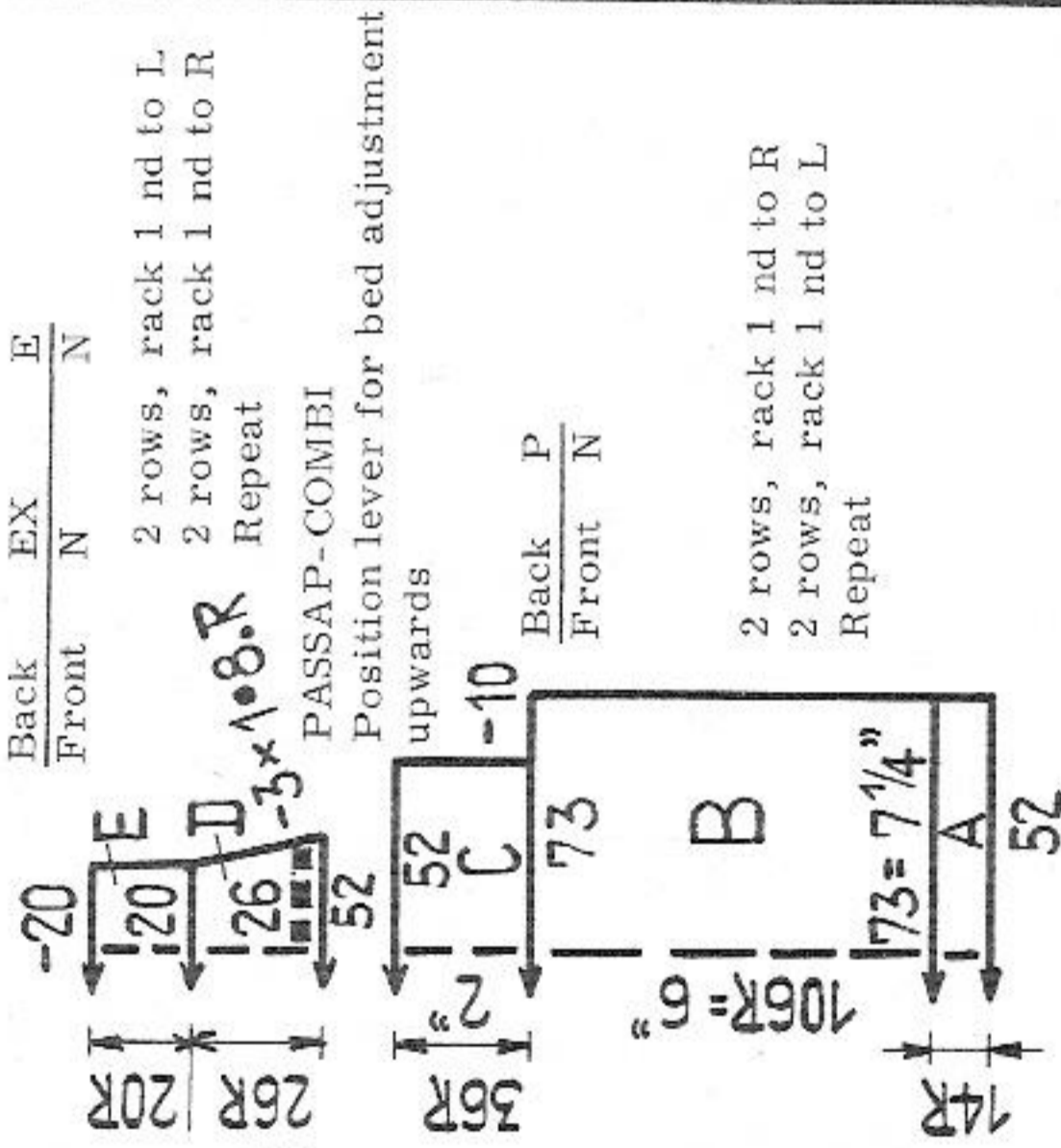

Stitch size: PASSAP-DUOMATIC / PASSAP 12

Stocking st and tubular 4 1/2, pattern back 4 3/4, front 3 3/4, 1:1 rib 2 1/4

PASSAP-COMBI stocking st and tubular 4 1/4 (or 3 1/4), tens. arm 6, yarn br. 5. Pattern back 2 3/4, front 2 1/4, tens. arm 1, yarn br. 3 1/2, 1:1 rib 2, tens. arm 1, yarn br. 3 1/2  
Test square: 100 sts = 10 1/4", 100 rows = 5 1/2"

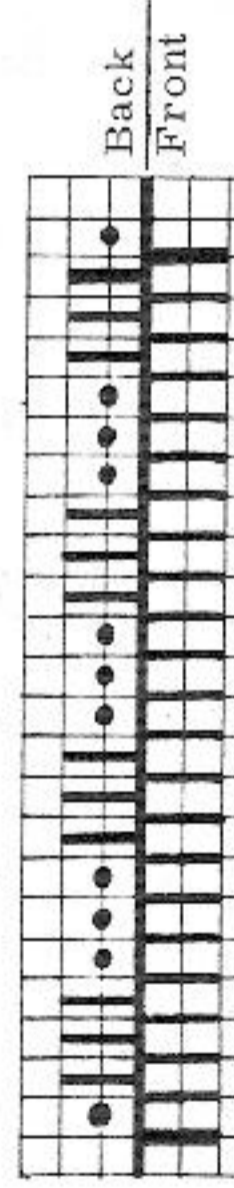


Fig. I + II: A = Tubular. B = Transfer sts for pattern, pattern. C = Pattern. D = Transfer sts for stocking st (128 sts), 1 row stocking st, then take all sts onto a stitch holder or a thread and hang them back always two by two (64 sts), 1 row. Now 1 open work row transferring every 4th st to next nd, continue with stocking st. E = 1:1 rib. Cast off.

Fig. III: A = 1:1 rib. B to E = as Fig. I.

To make up: Block and press lightly all stocking st parts. Join parts, leaving open 4 inch at back. Crochet one row of firm sts around back opening, then, at one side, crochet 4 loops and at the other attach 4 buttons. Pull silk ribbon through open work row.

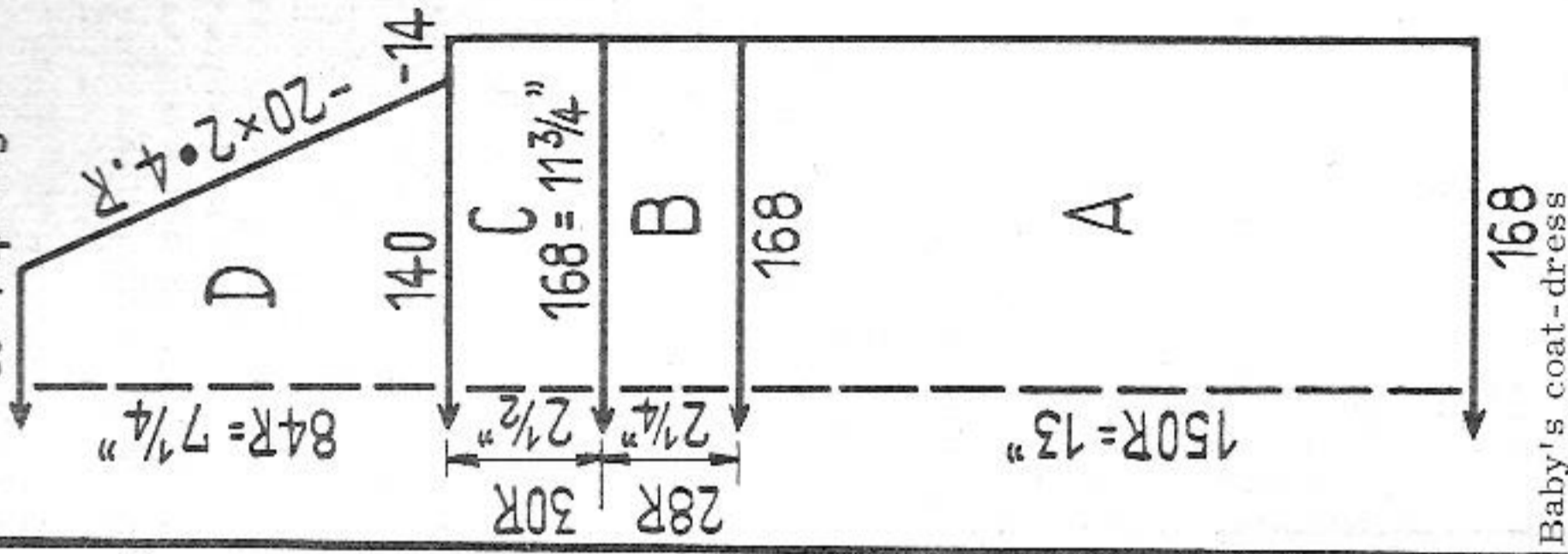
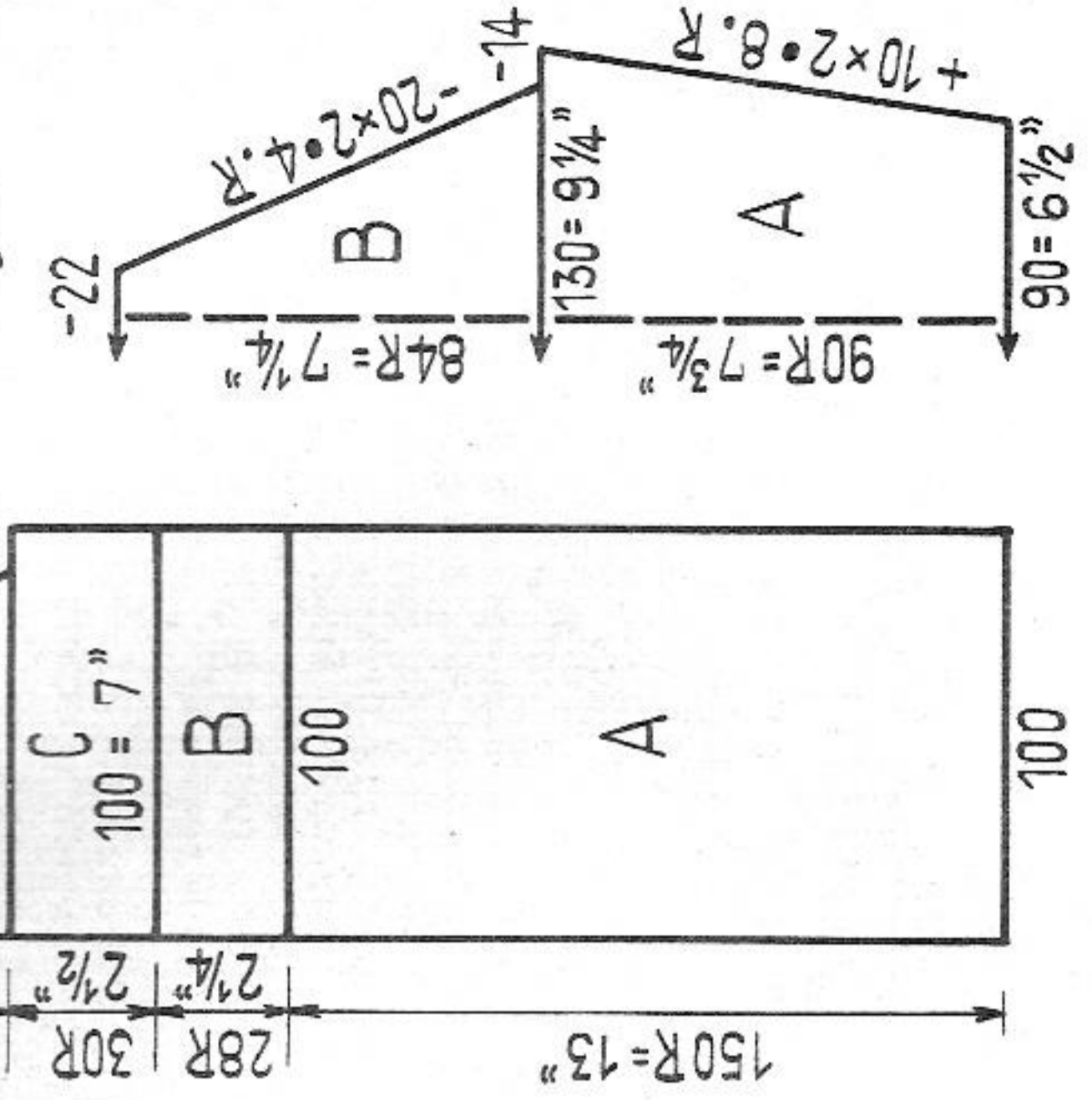

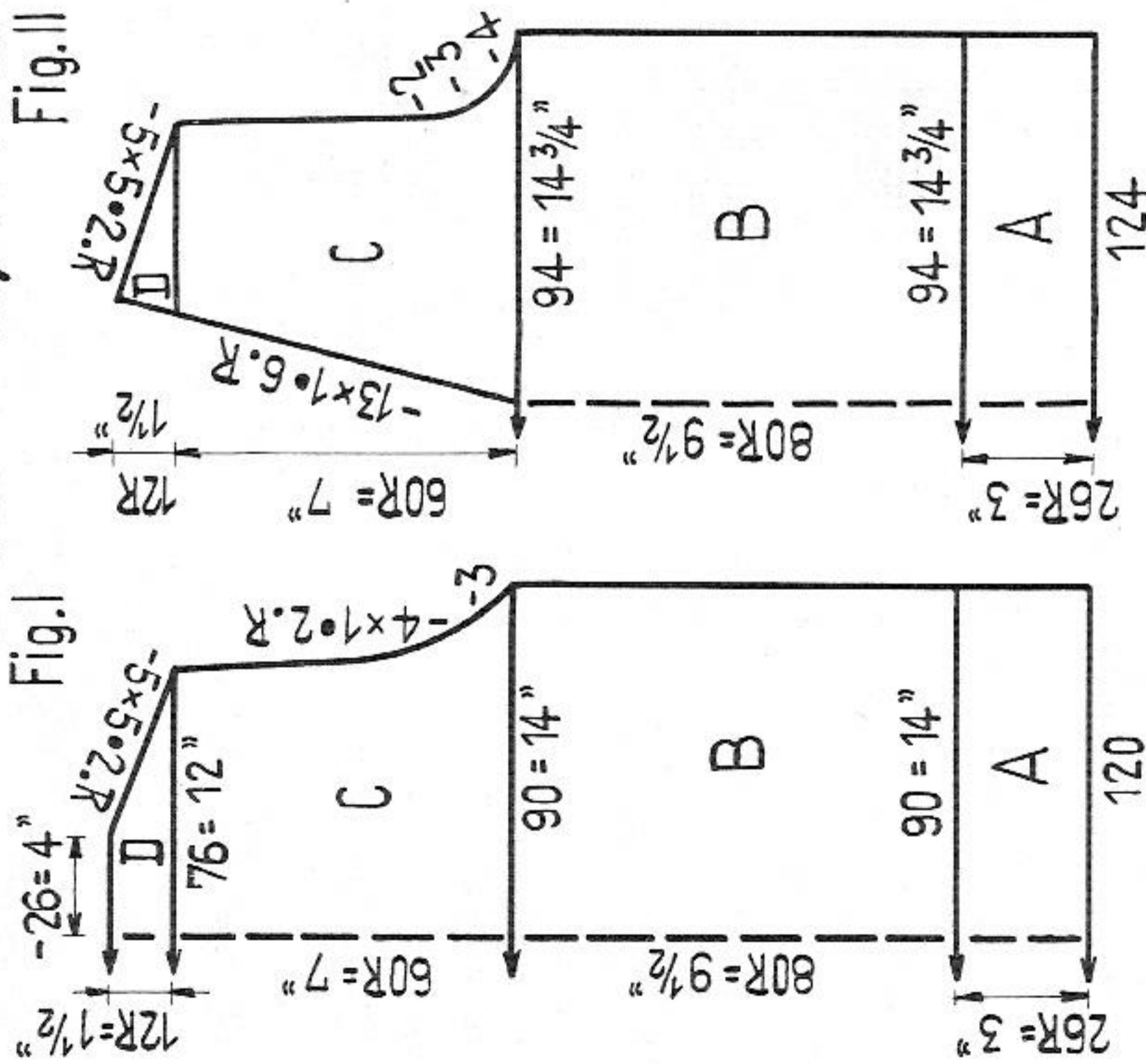

Collar: Cast on 120 sts for K/K and knit 26 rows, then 16 rows tubular, a few rows with contrast wool, release.

Materials: 7 ozs heavy sweater wool, spotted, a rest each of fine wool in black, white and red for bands.

Stitch size: PASSAP-DUOMATIC/PASSAP 12 Stocking st 7, 2:2 rib 5 1/4, Tubular for bands 4 1/2

Pattern: PASSAP-COMBI Stocking st. 7 1/4 (or 6 1/4), tens. arm 5, yarn br. 3, 2:2 rib 4 3/4, tens. Pattern: stocking st.

Test square: 100 sts = 15 1/2", 100 rows = 11 3/4"

Fig. I: A = 2:2 rib. B to D = Stocking st.

Fig. II: A and B = as Fig. I. C = Divide work, stocking st. D = stocking st.

Neck-band: For tubular cast on in white 160 sts on each bed, knit 8 rows, then 8 rows black, 8 rows red, 12 rows white, a few rows with contrast yarn and release.

Armhole bands: Knit twice as neck-band, but cast on 104 sts on each bed.

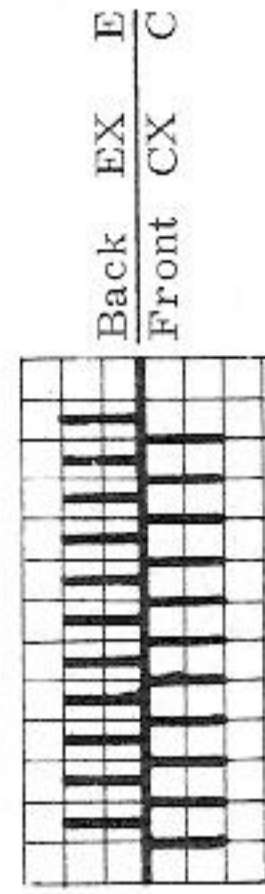
To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Close shoulders and side seams. Stitch on neck and armhole bands first outside, st by st, then inside, unravelling contrast yarn. At front mitre ends neatly.

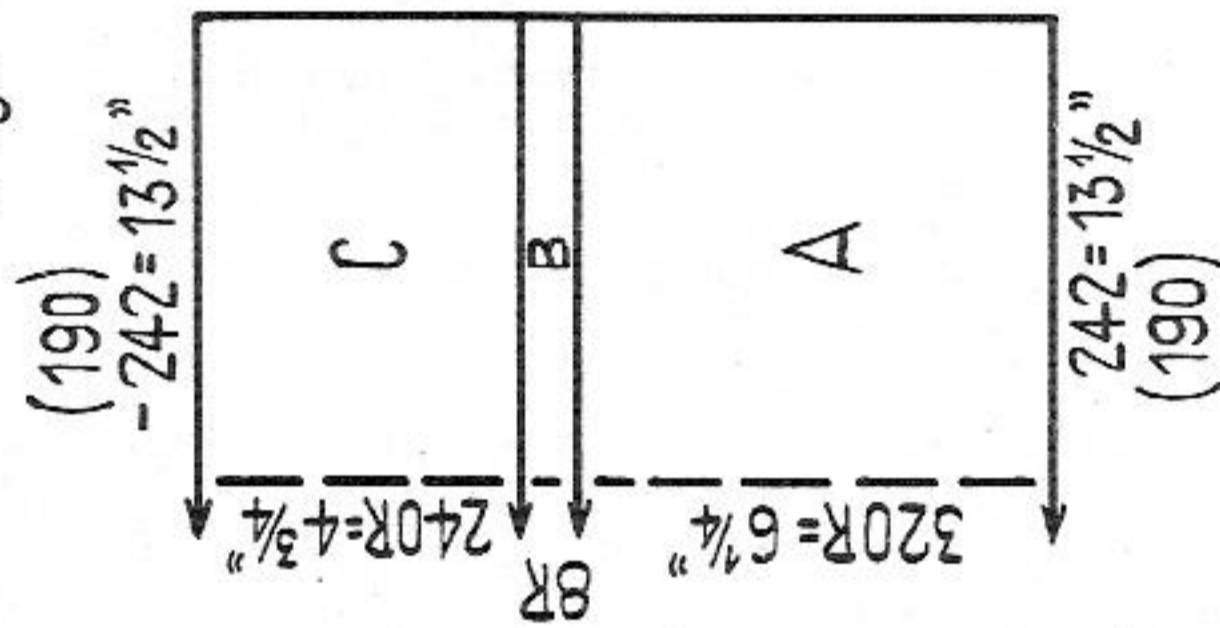
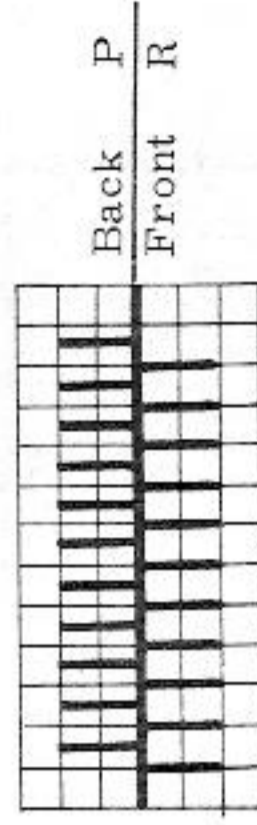

Stitch size: PASSAP-DUOMATIC/PASSAP 12 carpet-pattern back 3 1/2, front 1 1/2, K/K 3 1/2

Test square: PASSAP-COMBI carpet pattern stitch size back 2 1/4 (or 2) front 1 - K/K 3 (or 2), tens. arm 2, yarn br. 3

carpet: 100 sts = 5 1/2", 100 rows = 2"

pattern: PASSAP-COMBI 100 sts = 7", 100 rows = 2"

Figures in brackets on the diagram refer to COMBI sts only.

Fig. I: A = Carpet pattern. B = 4 rows K/K, 1 open work row, 5 rows K/K. C = Carpet pattern.

Ears: Knit twice. For carpet pattern cast on 48 sts and knit 100 rows. Cast off.

To make up: Close back seam. Stitch together upper head part C making 2 or 3 pleats. Gather ears and attach to head. Then fill head with stuffing. Pull a cord made out of white wool through open work row and gather tightly. Make 4 pompons and attach as paws according to illustration. Attach glass eyes and embroider a small nose. Fill body with stuffing or put it on a bottle.

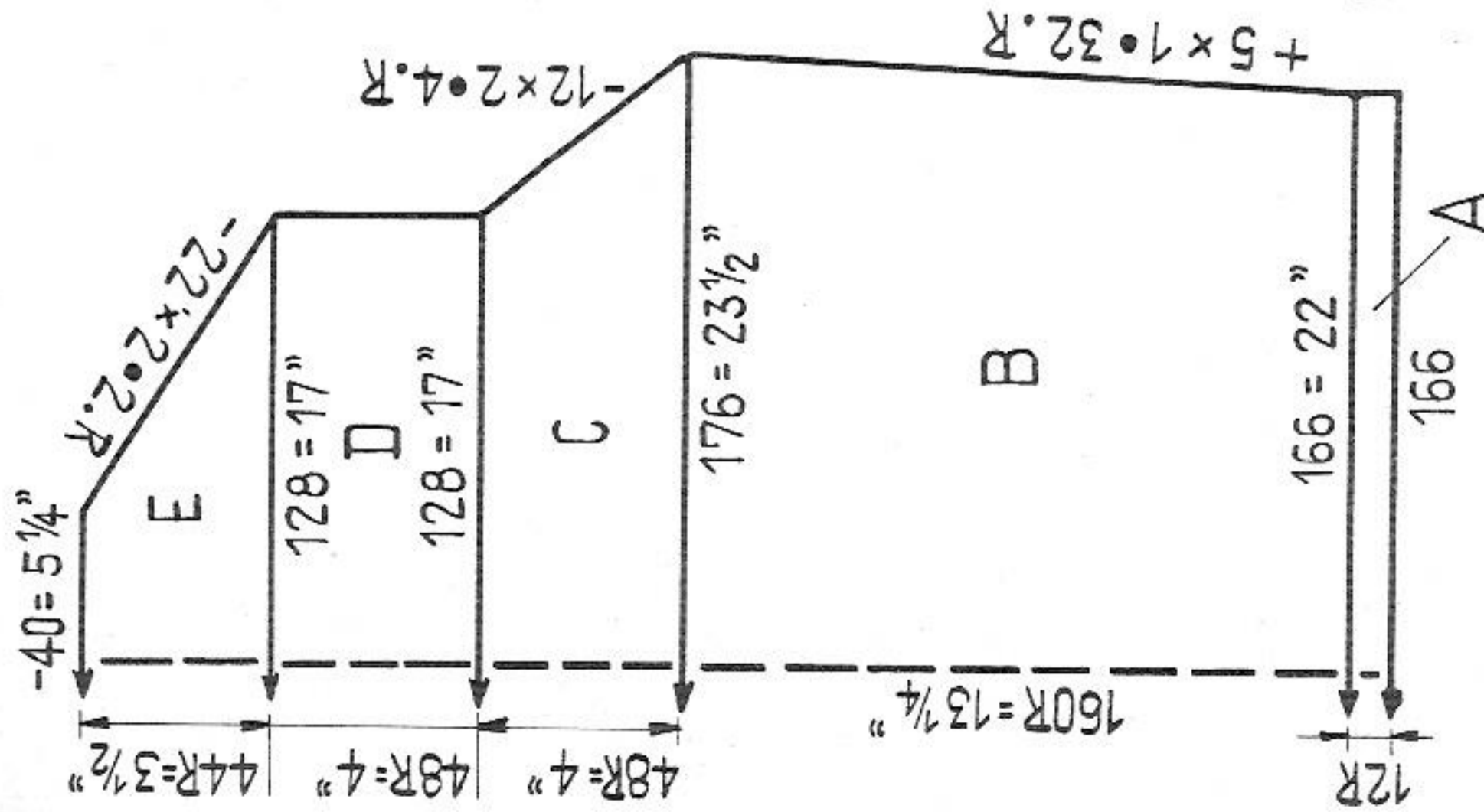

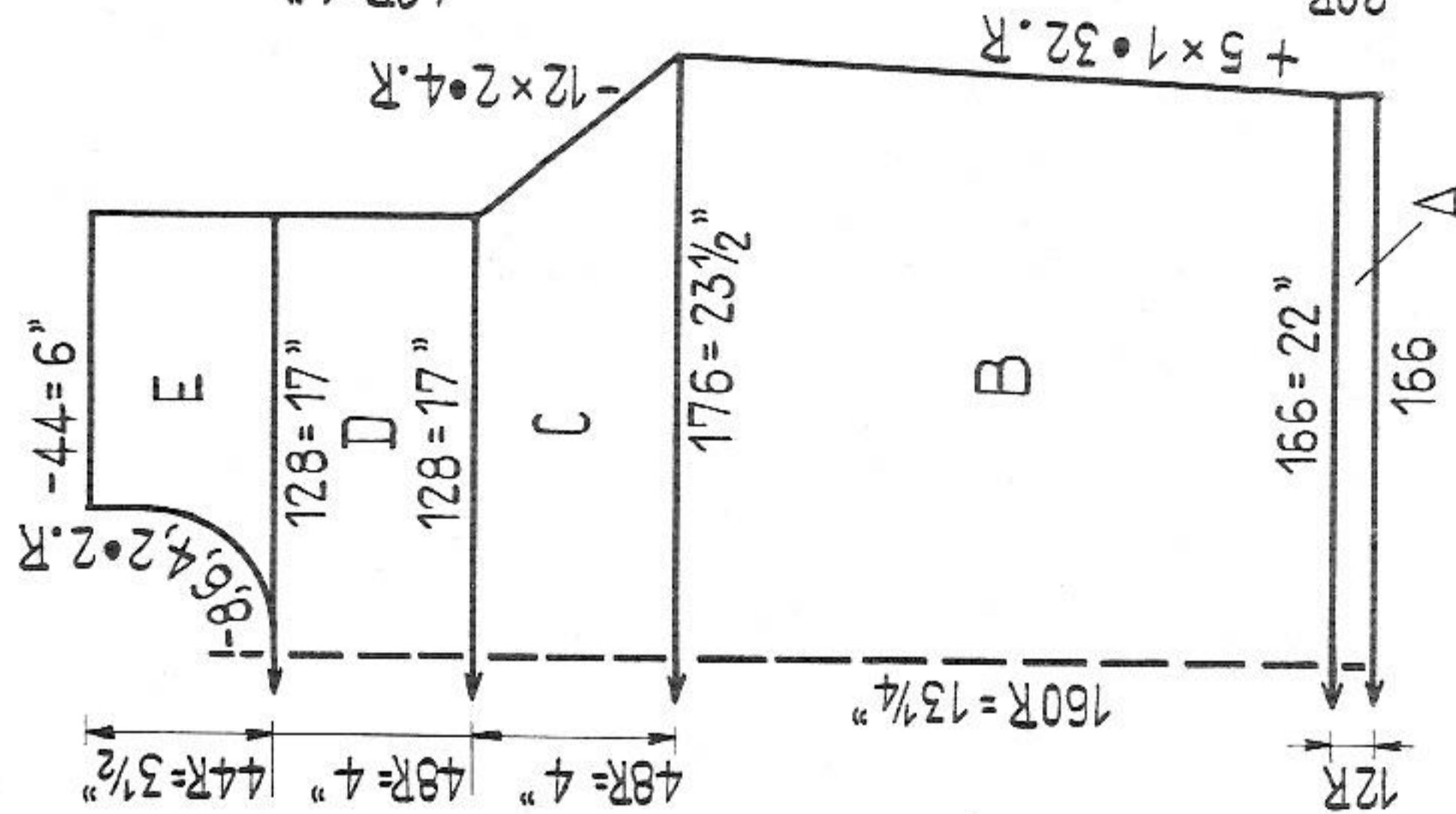
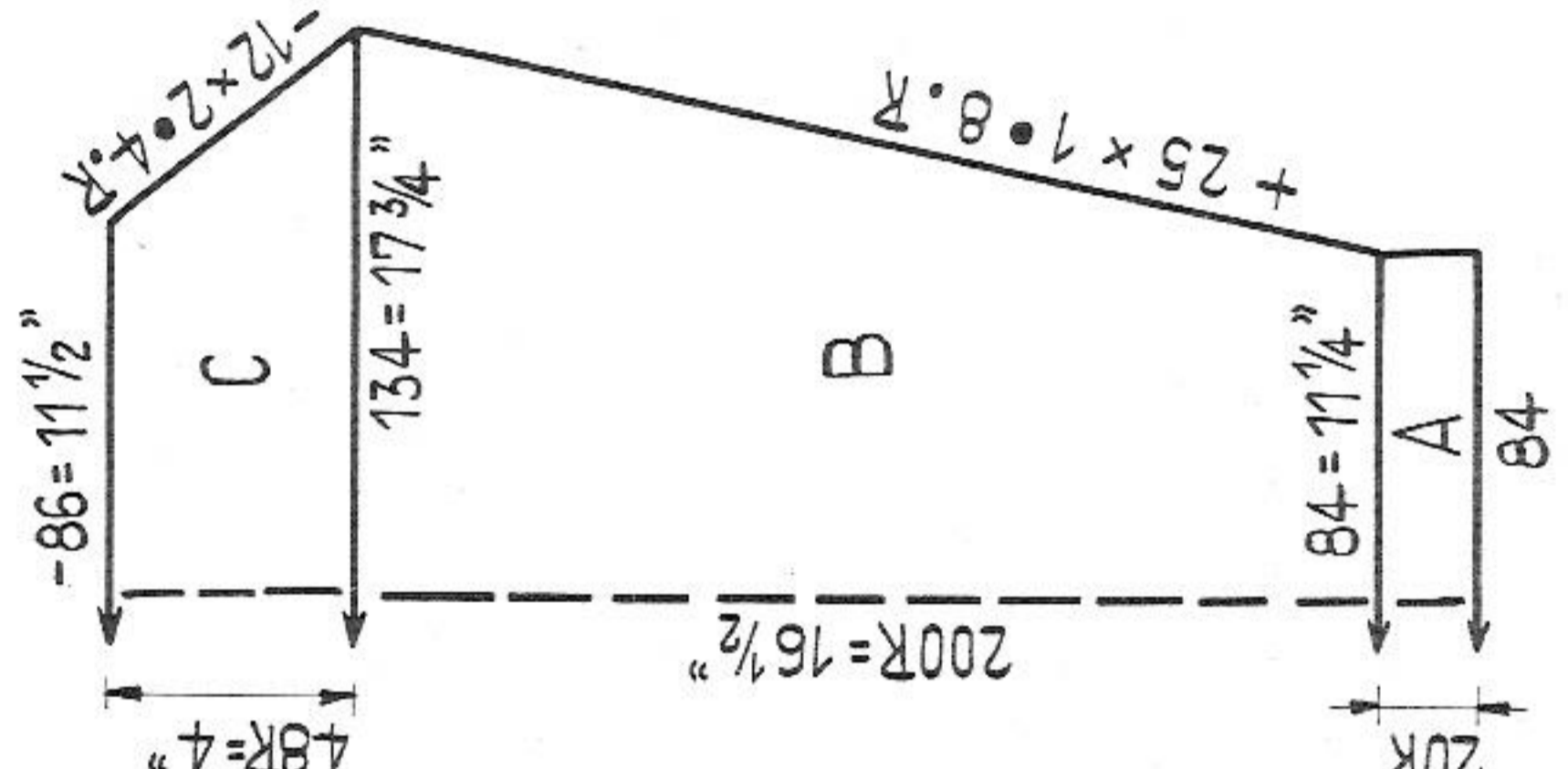

**Jacket**  
**Fig. I a:** A = 16 rows white, then 12 rows fairisle red, 20 rows fairisle according to diagram, 12 rows fairisle red, 20 rows fairisle according to diagram, 12 rows fairisle red, B = Tubular in white, C to E = Fairisle red.  
**Fig. II a:** Right front: A = as Fig. I, B = Tubular in white, making 2 buttonholes each back and front after 8 rows, as shown on pattern, C = Fairisle red, again 2 buttonholes after 130 rows, D = Fairisle red, again 2 buttonholes after 76 rows. E and F = Fairisle in red.  
**Left front:** As right front, but with reversed shapings and without buttonholes.  
**Fig. III:** A = 16 rows tubular in white, then fairisle in red, B = Fairisle in red. Now at both sides, front and back take 17 sts each on a thread. With the remaining sts knit 20 rows fairisle in red, 20 rows fairisle according to diagram and 40 rows fairisle in red. To finish knit 20 rows tubular in red, a few rows with contrast yarn and release.  
**To make up:** Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Join parts and set in sleeves. Join free ends to collar first outside st by st, then inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Leaving a space of 1 1/2" stitch collar to neck, first outside st by st, then inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Crochet 1 row of firm sts along front edges, stitch around buttonholes and attach buttons.

**Size:** To fit a 44 3/4 inch chest, approx.  
**Materials:** 25 ozs fine wool approx.  
**Stitch size:** PASSAP-DUOMATIC / PASSAP 12  
 Stocking st 5 1/4, 1:1 rib 2 3/4  
 PASSAP-COMBI Stocking st. 4 3/4 (or 2 3/4), tens. arm 7,  
 yarn br. 5 1/2. 1:1 rib 1 3/4, tens. arm 2, yarn br. 3 1/2.

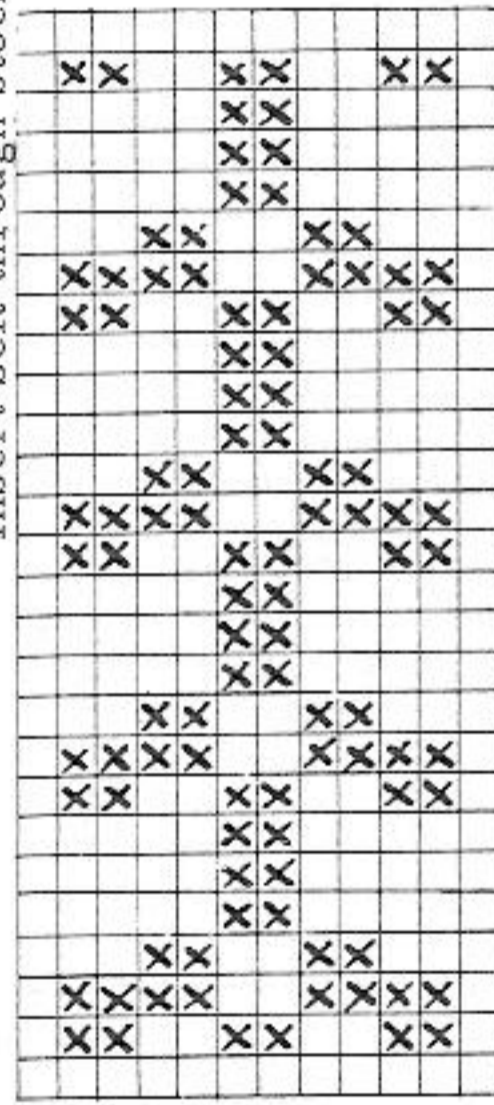

 after 6 rows as follows: At right put pushers in Working-Position,  
 i. e. 5 at front and 7 at back. Lock BX/BX and knit 8 rows. Break yarn  
 and put pushers back in Neutral-Position. Now at left front and back put  
 6 pushers each in Working-Position, knit 8 rows. Break yarn, put pushers  
 in Neutral-Position and lock at the extreme right. Set lock to N/N and  
 continue knitting. Make 4 further buttonholes after rows 38, 76, 114 and  
 152. Knit 700 rows in all, cast off.  
 To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over  
 damp cloth. Join parts and set in sleeves. Stitch neck band around front

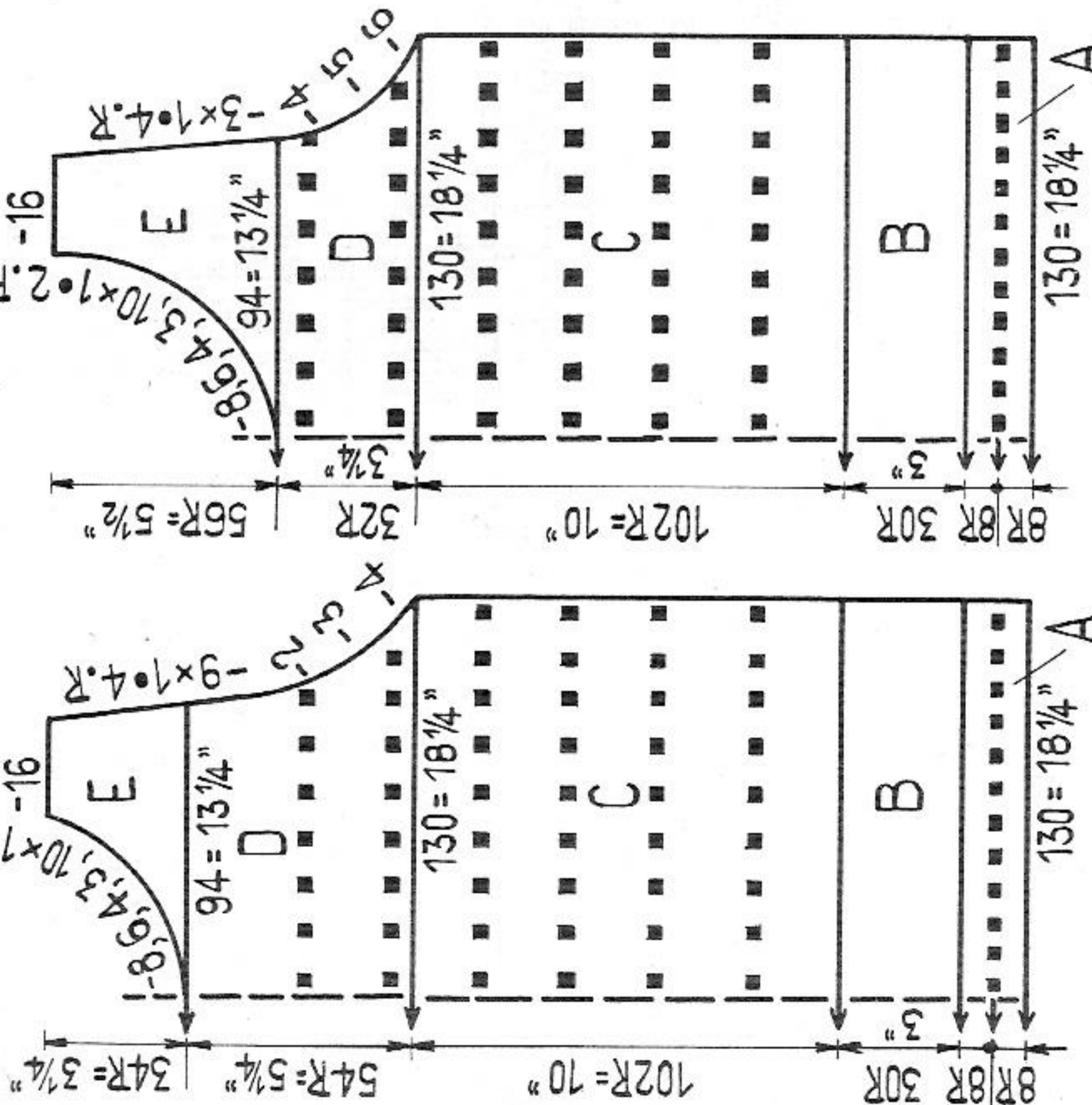
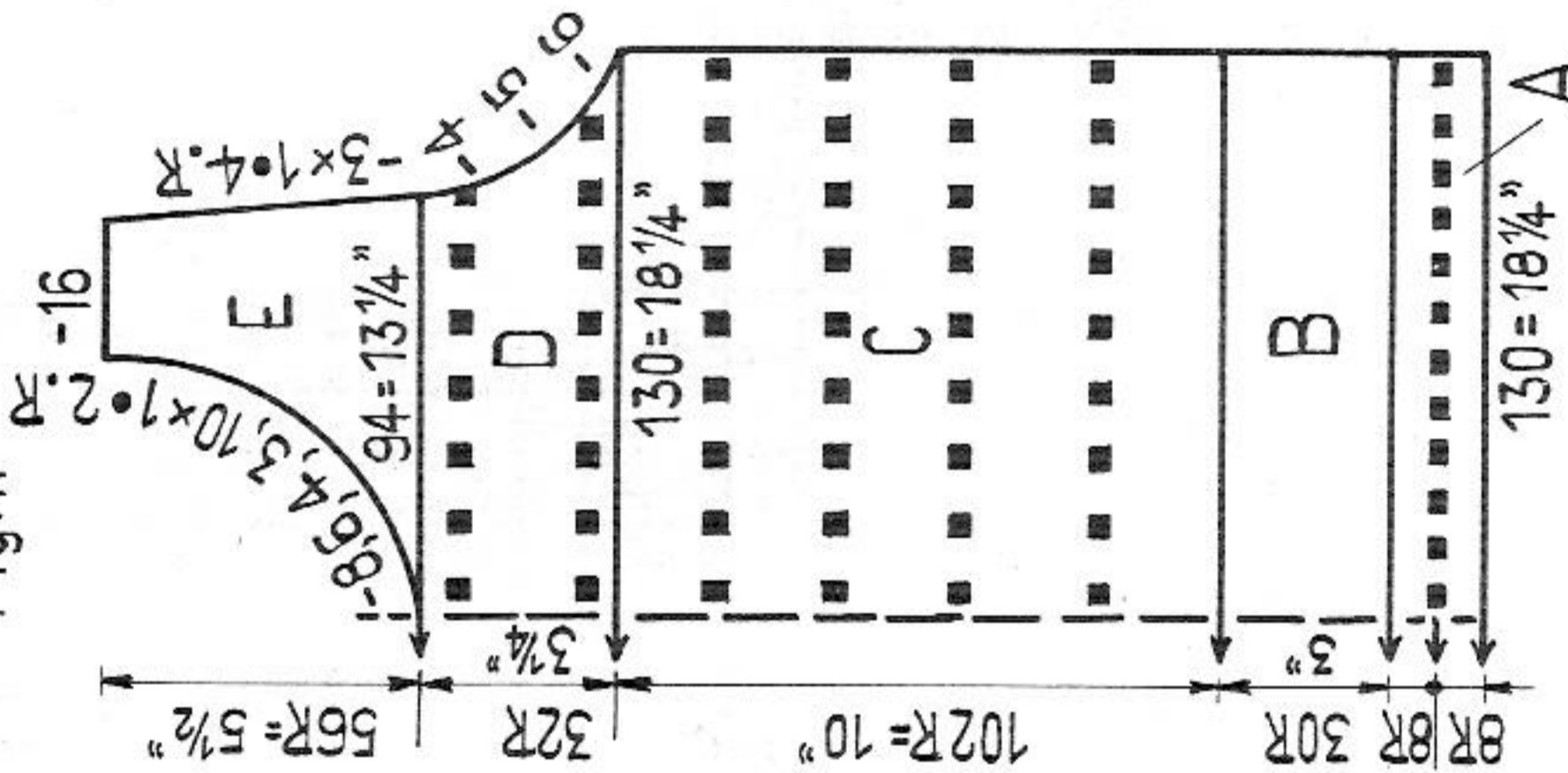

- Materials:** 10 1/2 ozs medium cotton yarn
- Stitch size:** PASSAP-DUOMATIC / PASSAP 12
- Stocking st and transfer pattern 5 1/2, welts 5 PASSAP-COMBI
- Stocking st and transfer pattern 6 (or 3 3/4), tens. arm 7, yarn br. 5
- Test square:** 100 sts = 14", 100 rows = 9 3/4"
- Pattern:** Stocking st with transfer pattern and open work rows.

**Transfer-Pattern:**

- \* This nd knits always
  - ↗ Transfer st to the right
  - ↘ Transfer st to the left
- leave empty nds in Working-Position  
1 square = 1 st = 2 rows = RC 2



**Fig. I + II:** A = Cast on at double bed, then knit 7 rows at front, 1 open work row, 8 rows at front (PASSAP-COMBI at back). Now transfer sts to front (DUO) or to back (COMBI) and knit 2 rows stocking st. B = 30 rows transfer pattern (working 15 square rows) using tool with 5 deckers. C and D = Stocking st with open work rows in every 20th row, transferring every 5th st. E = Divide work, stocking st. At last a few rows with contrast yarn, then release.

**Neck band:** Begin and end with contrast yarn. Cast on 180 sts and knit 10 rows stocking st.

**Armhole bands:** Knit twice as neck band. Cast on 104 sts and knit 10 rows.

**To make up:** Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Join side seams normally and shoulders with knit stitch, unravelling contrast yarn. Stitch on armhole- and neck bands, first outside, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn, then slip stitch inside.

**Fig. I a:** As Fig. IIa, but without any pockets.

**Fig. II a:** A = 1:1 rib in red. B = Stocking st, 4 rows red, 4 rows white, then follow up with red, 26 rows in all. Now work lower pocket: From left put pushers in Working-Position for nds 16 to 36, lock at BX, knit 70 rows red, 4 rows white, 6 rows red. Set lock at N again, put pushers in Neutral-Position and follow up with red. C = Stocking st in red, until row 14. Now work upper pocket: From right put pushers in Working-Position for nds 12 to 32, lock at BX, knit 6 rows red, 4 rows white, 54 rows red. Set lock at N again, put pushers in Neutral-Position and follow up with red. D = Stocking st in red. E = 4 rows white, 6 rows red. F = 10 rows red.

**To make up:** Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Fold upper neck hem at white stripe and slip stitch inside. At armholes slip stitch 1 inch to inside. At pockets sew flaps according to picture (6 rows red, 4 rows white, 6 rows red), lower flap upwards, upper flap downwards, and slip stitch rest to inside.

**Pattern:** 100 sts = 12 1/2", 100 rows = 4 3/4"  
**Attention!:** Blouse in pattern, Collar, trimming and borders in K/K and tubular For collar, trimming and borders cast on over all nds in K/K and knit alternately 1 row K/K, 2 rows tubular. The indications on the diagram and in the description refer to the total number of RC-rows.

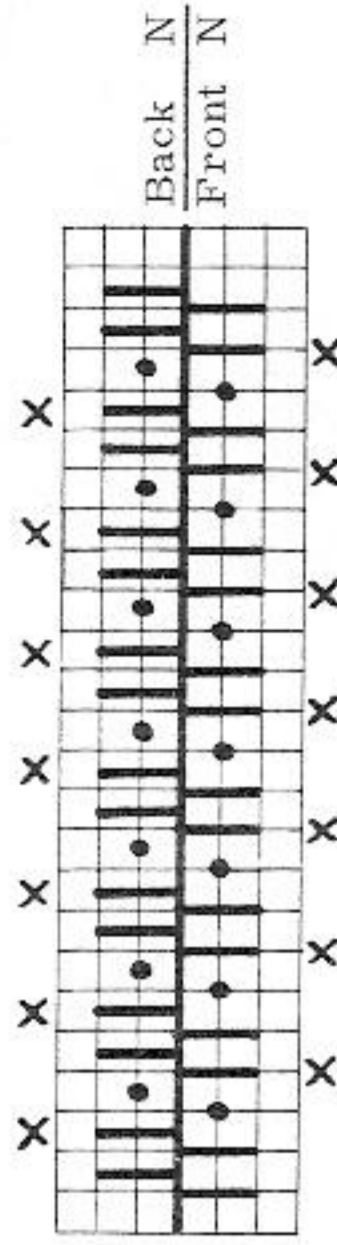

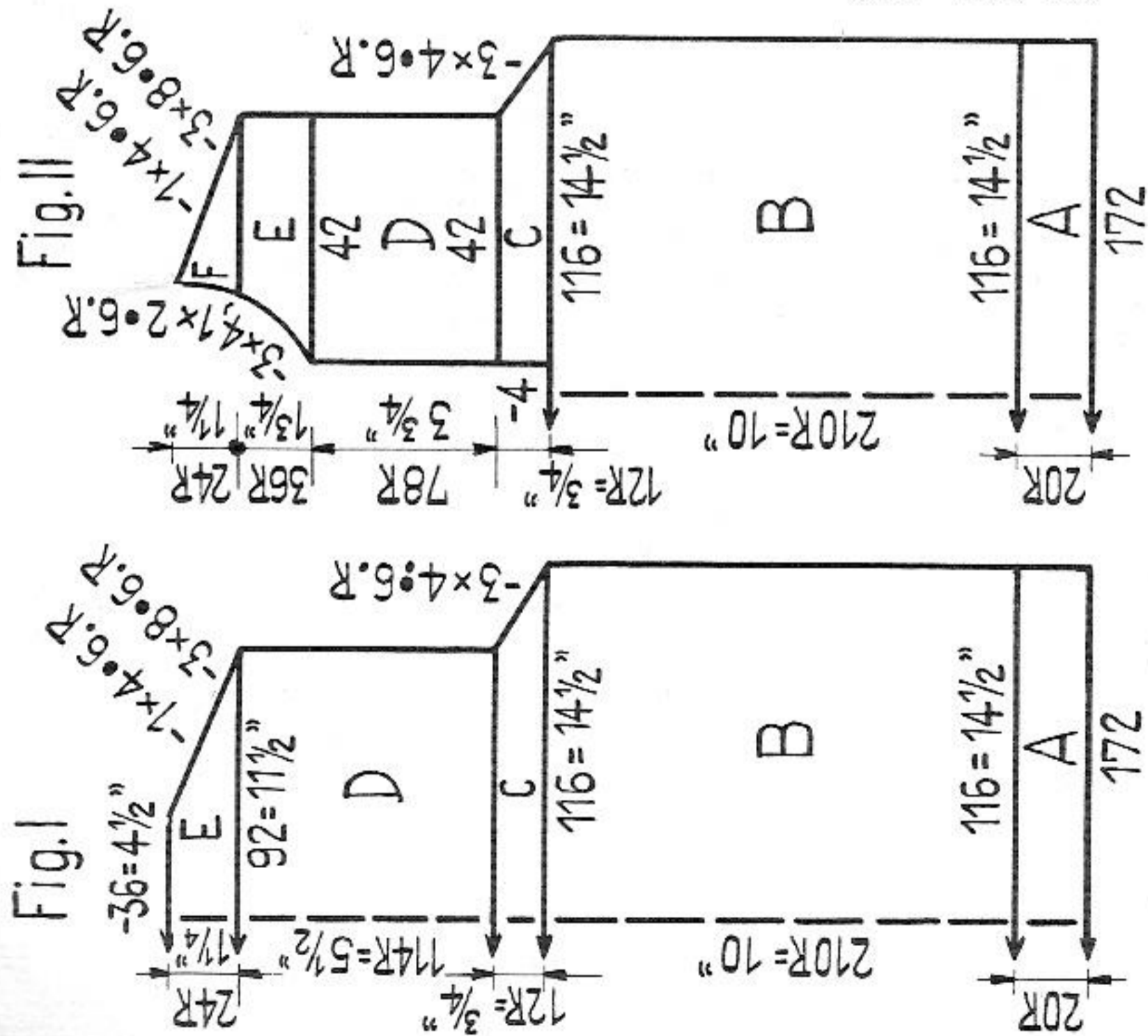
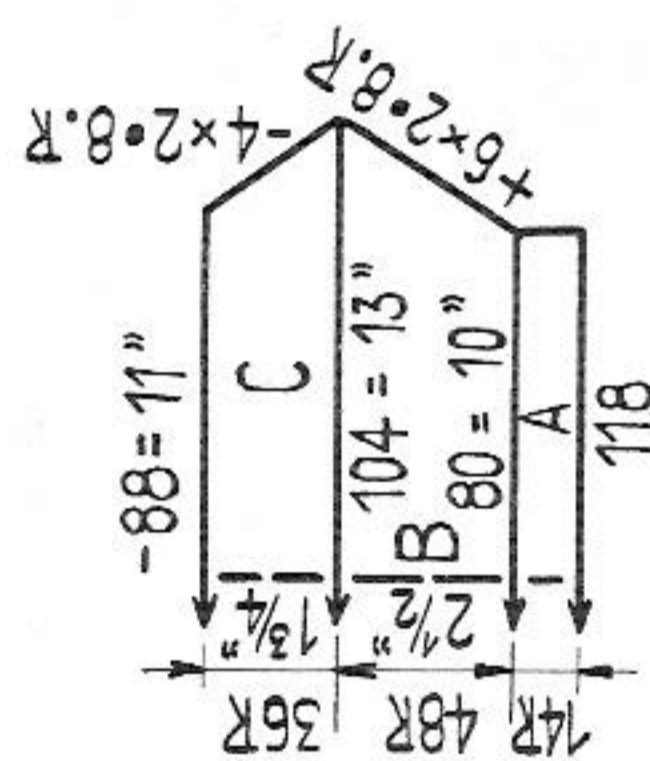

Knit second trimming without buttonholes.  
**To make up:**  
 Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Attach trimming in front centre with back stitches, st by st, first outside then inside, unravelling contrast wool. Finish buttonholes and fix buttons.

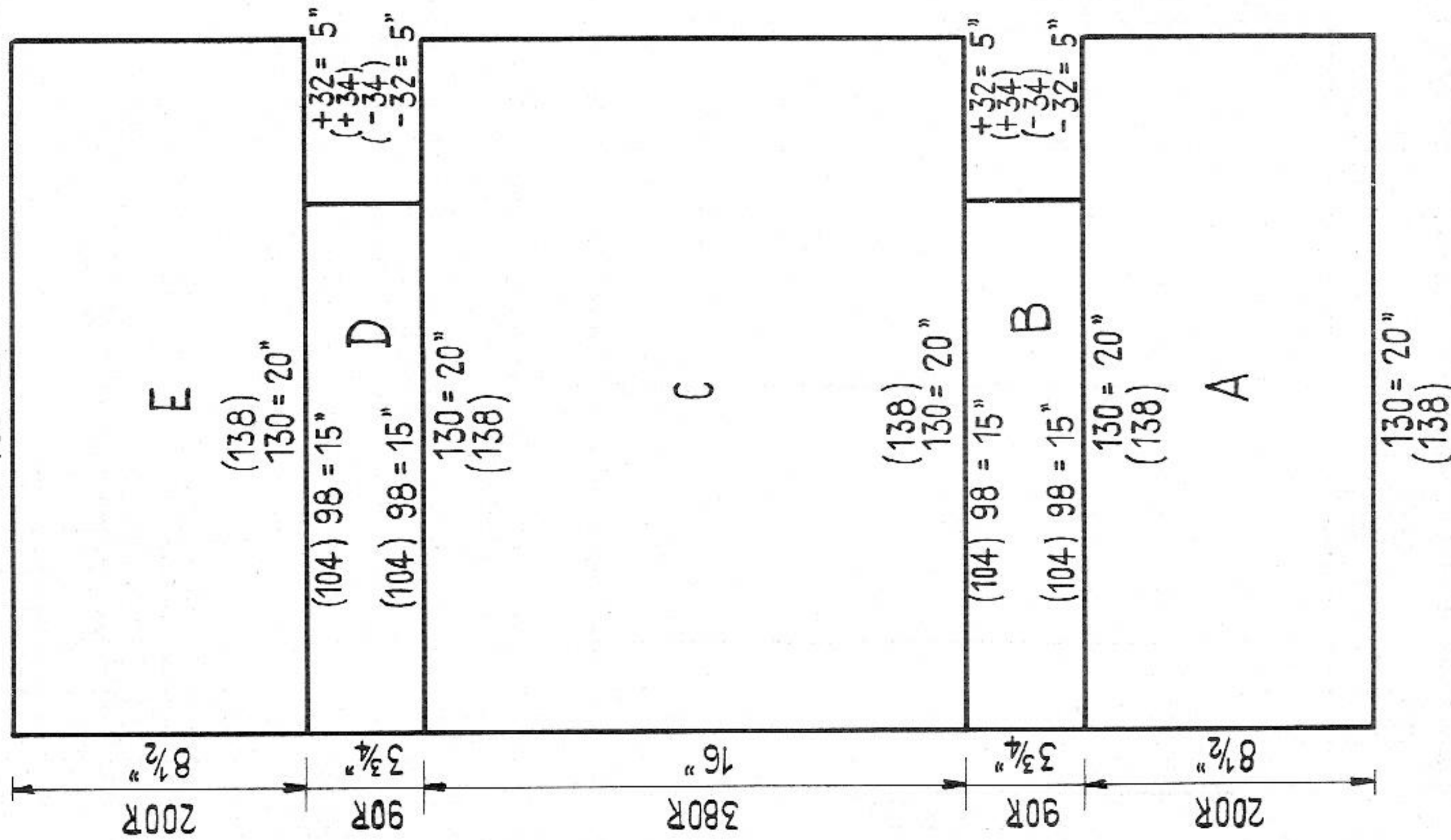
**Collar:** Cast on 300 sts for pattern in navy-blue and knit 72 rows in pattern blue. Then knit 168 rows fairisle according to diagram. At last knit 20 rows tubular in navy-blue, a few rows with contrast wool, release.

**To make up:** Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Sew both parts together for front and back seam at sectors A, B and C as well as G, H and I. Stitch collar st by st with back stitches in the neck-opening, first outside then inside, unravelling contrast wool. At lower edge of fairisle pattern fix fringes of white cotton yarn.

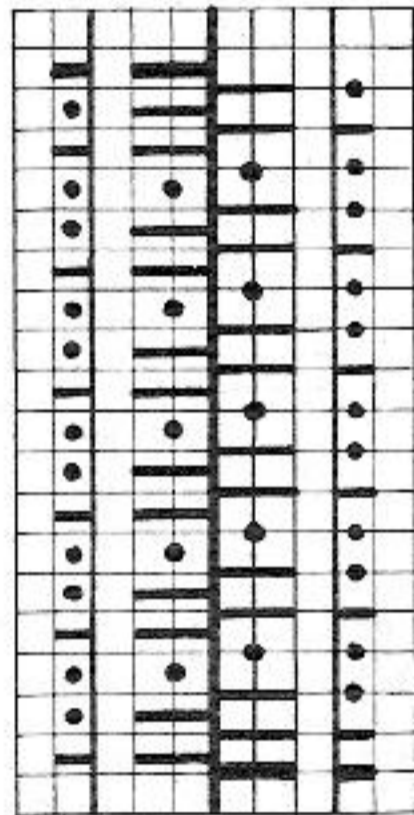

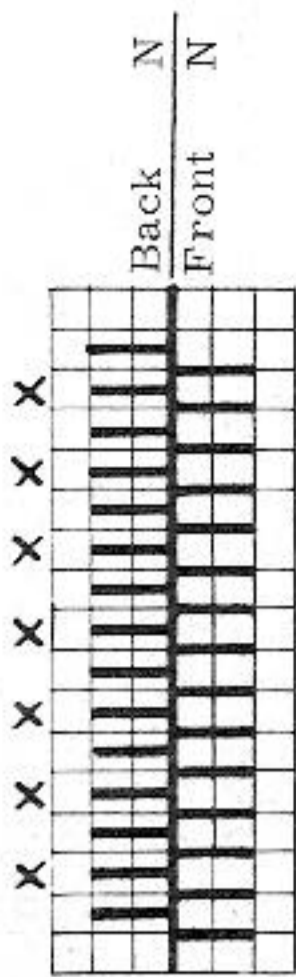

Fig. I + II: The blouse is to be started and finished in the front middle, i. e. it will be knitted crossways to the body in one single piece. A - E = Pattern.

Straps: Knit twice. Cast on 28 sts for pattern and knit 60 rows (COMBI 64 rows) in pattern, cast off firmly.

To make up: Stretch and pin out parts horizontally to shape and iron, see note "attention".

Crochet 1 row of firm sts around the blouse gathering armholes slightly.

Attach straps: by casting off firmly the straps become narrower on one side, and this side should be fixed to the front part. Sew buttons approx. 1/4" from left front edge, evenly distributed, using openings of blouse pattern as buttonholes.

**Size:** To fit a 38 inch bust, approx.  
**Materials:** approx. 14 1/2 ozs medium to fine white wool, an oddment of silk for crocheting, 1 button for covering, 2 press buttons  
**Stitch size:** Pattern 5, stocking st at front 4 1/2", at back 3  
**Test square:** 50 sts = 10 1/4", 100 rows = 5 1/2"  
**Pattern:** dress in pattern, borders and trimming stocking st, purl st side outwards

**Needle division for trimming:**  
 Handle down, black stripper  
 M = middle of trimming

**Fig. I + II:**  
**A - D = Pattern.** Fig. II at B = divide work and continue knitting with reversed shapings, pattern.  
**Trimming:** Cast on for pattern, see nd division for trimming. Knit 140 rows, then decrease for top as follows: at front transfer 1st stitch on 2nd nd, 7th st on 8th nd, 18th st on 17th nd and the 24th st on 23rd nd. Then, at front, transfer sts 2 to 6 and sts 19 to 23 with 5 eyelet-decker by 1 nd toward the middle. At back, transfer both groups of stitches also by 1 nd toward the middle. Knit 2 rows. Repeat this 5 times every 2nd row. Sew up the remaining 4 sts.  
**Armhole borders:** Knit twice. At front, cast on for stocking st 6 sts and at back in the middle 1 st, knit 154 rows, cast off.  
**Neckborder:** Same as armhole borders, but knit 210 rows.  
**To make up:** Stretch parts slightly in all directions, then pin out to size and press lightly. Press borders and trimmings. Close side seams and shoulders. Taking purl st to outside, sew neckborders and armhole borders st by st first outside then inside. Join seams of trimming - taking purl st to outside again - and fix it in front middle of dress. Now, with dark blue silk, crochet around trimming, neckborder and armhole borders into the right outstanding st as follows: 1 firm st into first st, 2 loop sts, 1 firm st into 3rd st, 2 loop sts etc. Make crochet covering for button and fix at trimming. Close neck by means of press buttons.

Two-piece suit made of cotton

Size: To fit a 35 inch bust approx.

Materials: approx. 22 1/2 ozs medium cotton yarn, 6 buttons for covering, 1 elastic

Stitch size: PASSAP-DUOMATIC / PASSAP 12 stocking st 5

PASSAP-COMBI stocking st 5 (or 2 1/2), tension arm 7, yarn br. 5  
100 sts = 13 1/4", 100 rows = 8 1/4"

Pattern: Back, sleeves and skirt stocking st. Front with open work pattern: Transfer every 7th st to the 8th nd and knit 2 rows. Repeat, always shifting the pattern 1 nd to the right (or left respectively), to obtain a diagonal effect.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth.

Jacket: Join parts and make crochet trimming at jacket and sleeves. Make crochet covering over 6 buttons and fix to jacket evenly distributed. Use openings of pattern as buttonholes.

Skirt: Cut lining to size of knitted parts, leaving enough width for seams, join skirt (= petticoat). At petticoat sew to inside 3/4" for upper and 2 1/2" for lower hem. Pull elastic through upper hem. Join knitted skirt, then make crochet trimming i.e. underneath elastic. Finally sew knitted skirt on petticoat, just underneath upper hem, around lower edge.

Fig. I + III + VII: A and B = stocking st, for raglan use decker with 5 eyelets.

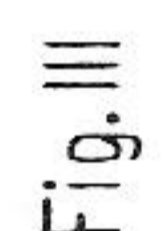
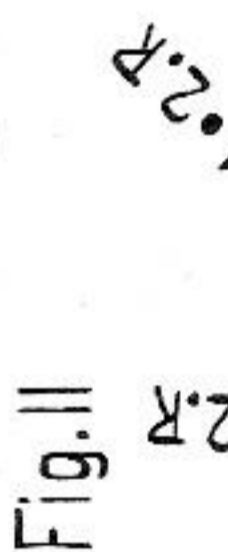
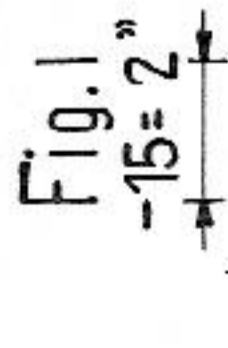

**For skirt:** knit twice, cast on 84 sts and knit 14 rows

**To make up:** Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Stretch trimmings well to shape and iron as well. Sew parts of dress together and put in sleeves. Stitch skirt seam approx. 1 3/4" to inside, and around neck and sleeves approx. 1/2" inside. Sew white trimmings around neck, sleeves and lower part of skirt, according to photo. Crochet around back opening, closing it with a button and a loop.

 Stitch size: Pattern and stocking st 5 1/2, tubular 5  
 Test square: 100 sts = 6 3/4", 100 rows = 5 1/2"  
 Pattern: The whole sweater is knitted in automatic fairisle pattern according to diagram. Pusher division only once for 1st row. Colour change always 2 rows beige, 2 rows brown.

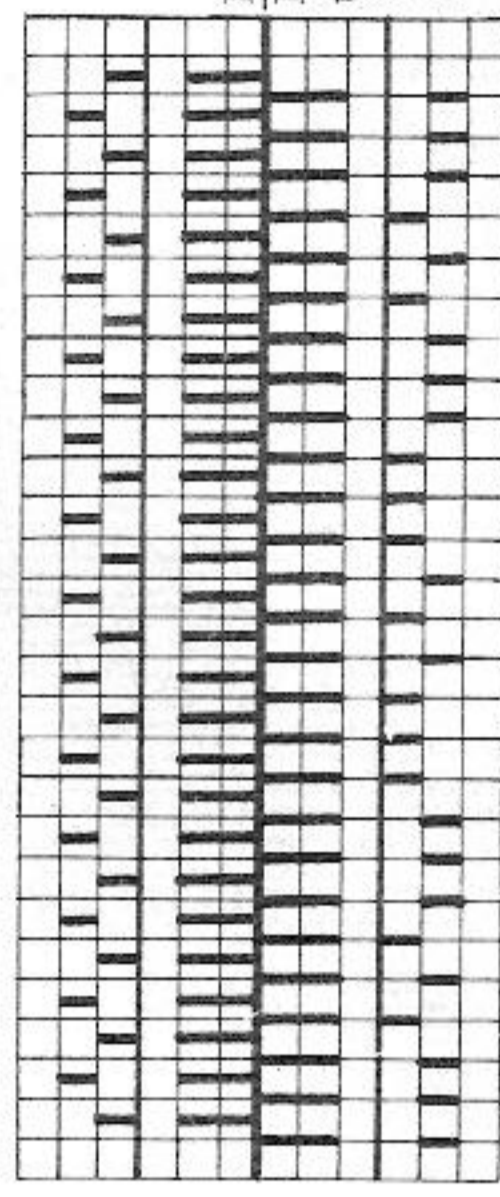

A = tubular, brown, B - D = Pattern  
 Fig. II: Knit two parts with reversed shapings. A = tubular, brown, B to E = Pattern.  
 Neckborder, stocking st: Start and finish with contrast wool.  
 Cast on 90 sts and knit 10 rows with brown, stocking st.  
 Front part borders, stocking st: Knit twice. Knit like neckborder with 179 sts.  
 To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams and put in sleeves.  
 Join neckborder with front borders, then slip st to cardigan first outside then inside st by st with backstitches, unravelling contrast wool. Sew in zip.

- 8 rows RC 60
- 2 rows O, 2 rows RC 64
- 8 rows RC 72

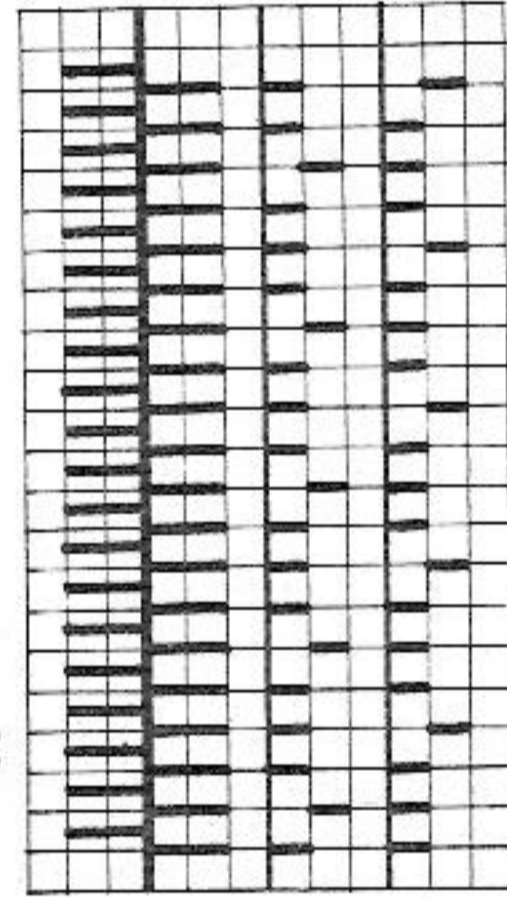
PASSAP-COMBI Pattern front 1 1/2, back 5 1/4 (or front 1 1/2, back 3 1/2), tens. arm 5, yarn br. 4

**Test square:** 100 sts = 17", 100 rows = 9"

**Pattern:** Whole dress in pattern, must be lined

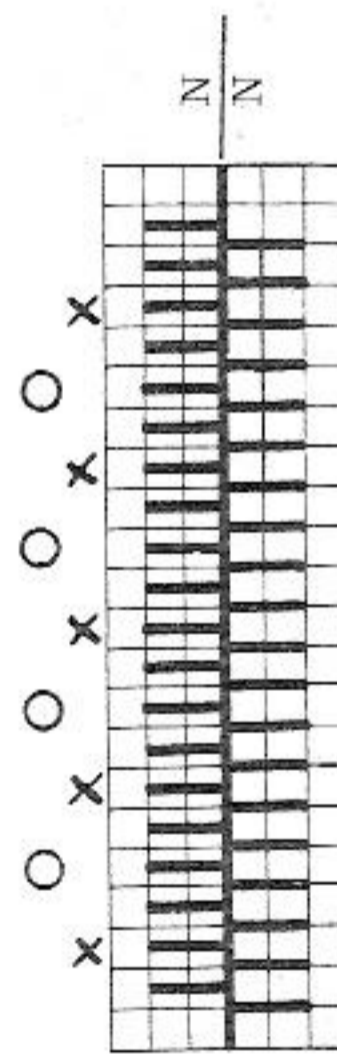

### Special note!

Knitting as well as test square must be carefully pinned out before pressing lightly, so that the long sts will be stretched. Only the knitted rows are indicated on the diagram. Therefore, with PASSAP-DUOMATIC, the row counter has to be set back by 2 numbers before each pusher division. With PASSAP-COMBI, however, the row counter has not to be set back, as these rows are not marked on the R.C.

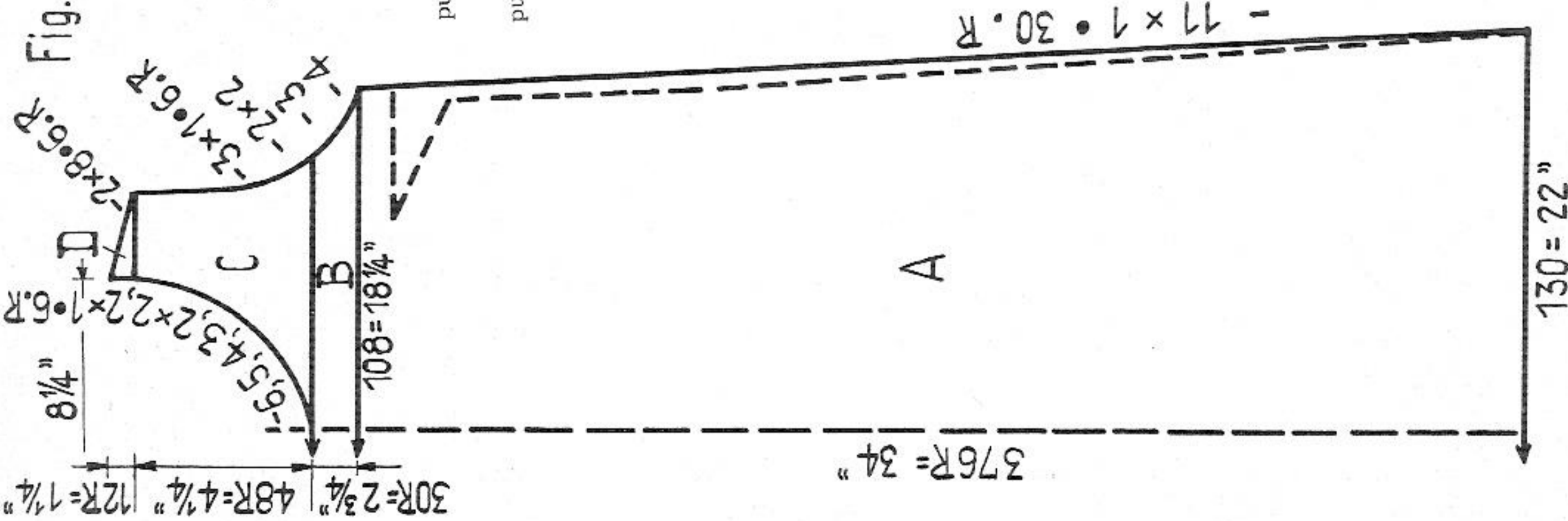
### Fig. I + II:

Start with stocking st (PASSAP-DUOMATIC at front bed, PASSAP-COMBI at back bed). A and B = Pattern. C = divide work and continue knitting with reversed shapings. Pattern. D = Pattern.

### To make up:

Stretch and pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Cut lining according to knitting including additional width for seams (if darts are desired make lining for front part approx. 2" longer, and sew darts only in the lining, according to dotted line on diagram). Sew knitting and lining separately together. At knitted dress crochet 1 row of firm sts around neckborder and armholeborders, then sew in lining. Stitch hems for lining and knitting at lower edge separately.

Now set back lock at N, front lock at GX. Put feeding eyelet with wool in eyelet support and pass lock twice without yarn, to left and right, releasing sts at back. Now put eyelet with yarn back in its socket, set back row counter by 2 numbers.

**Back:** N N  
1 row N N  
4 rows GX AX pusher division a  
1 row GX N

**Front:** N N  
1 row N N  
4 rows GX AX pusher division b  
1 row GX N

Release sts at back as above, set back RC. Repeat from beginning.
