Description Book for Model Book No. 8

Smart lady's dress - Cover page
 Size: To fit a 39" bust approx.
 Material: 26 1/2 ozs fine Mohair wool, 6 gold buttons
 Stitch size: pattern and stocking st 5 1/2
 Test square: 50 sts = 15", 100 rows = 7 3/4"
 Pattern: Whole dress in pattern



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Fig. I, II + III:

A = stocking st. B to E = Pattern. Fig. II at E = divide work and continue knitting separately with reversed shapings. Pattern.

Crochet trimming: First row firm sts, 2nd row: 1 firm st into first st, 4 loop sts, 1 firm st into 2nd and 3rd sts, 4 loop sts, etc.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Close all seams and put in sleeves. Make crochet trimming around neck- and wrist edge. For button trimming above wrist, at inner sleeve, crochet approx. 4" high along 13th st. from seam as follows: first, one row of firm sts, then 1 row of firm sts with 3 loop sts as buttonholes. Now fold towards outside and fix buttons according to size of loops. Stitch stocking st rows half to inside at bottom of dress.

Model Book No. 8 - Index at opposite page

Here is once again a new PASSAP model book - this time mainly made for autumn and winter garments. We wish to express our gratitude to our PASSAP friends from Belgium, England, Finland, France, Greece, Portugal and Switzerland, who have helped a great deal to bring out this book with such a rich collection and so quickly. For that reason we are sure to offer something special for every individual taste.

As with model book No. 7, you will find a wool sample card enclosed with this book. This card is for comparison purposes only, when buying wool in your country. Due to the fact that the wool names and qualities vary in every country, we consider this the only possible way to show you the sorts of wool from which the garments are made.

The adjustments for PASSAP DUOMATIC and PASSAP COMBI are indicated separately. All information about stitch size, tension arm and yarn brake are only suggested and have to be tried on your own machine.

The PASSAP 12 customers can knit all patterns indicated for DUOMATIC with N, CX, EX or GX, correspondingly with N, C, E or G on the PASSAP 12. We therefore renounced from giving any specified notes on the PASSAP 12.

Where back and front parts are equal up to the neck, we have this time only drawn the different section of the front in order to save space. This enabled us to publish well over 40 models. We hope you like them!

May we ask you to study the explanations given on pages 1 and 2 before starting your work.

Pattern: Drawing refers to half width, indication of stitch number to whole width of each part.

Figure I	= back part	Figure IX	= pants
Figure II	= front part	Figure X	= gusset
Figure III	= sleeve	Figure XI	= scarf
Figure IV	= collar	Figure XII	= cap, bonnet
Figure V	= band, cuff	Figure XIII	= mittens
Figure VI	= pocket	Figure XIV	= socks
Figure VII	= skirt, front	Figure XV	= straps
Figure VIII	= skirt, back		

If the central line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is done simultaneously with reversed shapings.

If the central line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is done separately with reversed shapings.

Stitches are only given by a number (without "st. "). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working-Position on front and back bed.

Exception: For tubular or halftubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed, the same number of needles has to be put into Working-Position on the other bed. In these cases, the sign for tubular \bigcirc resp. halftubular (or) is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increasing and decreasing always in the first row of a paragraph.

- + 3 × 2 • 8 . R means: 3 times incr. 2 stitches in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- 19 × 3 • 7 . R means: 19 times decr. 3 stitches in every 7th row (2 stitches at back, 1 stitch at front and vice versa)
- 17 × 1 • 2 . / 3 . R means: 17 times decr. 1 stitch, alternately after 2 rows and 3 rows.
- ▲ - 4 × 8 • 2 . R means: work graduations, on DUO with lock at BX and pushers, on COMBI with nds in Rest-Position. 4 times, after every 2nd row, gradually put 8 pushers (DUO) resp. 8 nds (COMBI) in Rest-Position (for double bed knitting 4 at each bed). Once all graduations are finished, continue knitting normally, i. e. for DUO put pushers in Neutral-Position and lock at N, and for COMBI press returning key.

Number of stitches and inches:

- 136 = 8" means: a total of 136 stitches (for K/K 68 stitches each on front and back) make a width of 8".
- 146 = 17" means: cast on 146 stitches each on front and back for tubular which makes a width of 17".

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be controlled by you in making your own test square for your own wool.

Test square: We suggest you to make a test square for your own wool before starting to calculate the necessary numbers of sts and rows along the PASSAP-chart. How to use the test square you may read in the chapter "The test square and its calculation" in your instruction book. This is very important, especially when transferring a model into another size.

Fig. XII, cap: A = Pattern with AX at back, then 2 rows N/N. B = Pattern. C = 1:1 rib, cast off.

Cap-bands: Knit twice. For tubular cast on 23 sts each at front and back, knit 12 rows, then decrease 3 times 1 st every 4th row at back and front on both sides. Now decrease on both sides 7 times 1 st every 4th row at back and front. With remaining 6 sts in all knit 160 rows tubular, cast off.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Join parts and set in sleeves. Stitch on collar first outside st by st, leaving 1 1/2" from edge each at right and left, then slip stitch inside. At neck crochet a loop at step-over and a button at step under. Stitch around buttonholes and attach buttons.

Cap: Close seam, gather 1:1 rib rows at top and attach a bow or a Pompon there. Attach cap-bands at sides. Pull 3 ply blue yarn through pattern: at collar 1 1/2" from edge and at top part 3/4" each above and below upper buttonhole

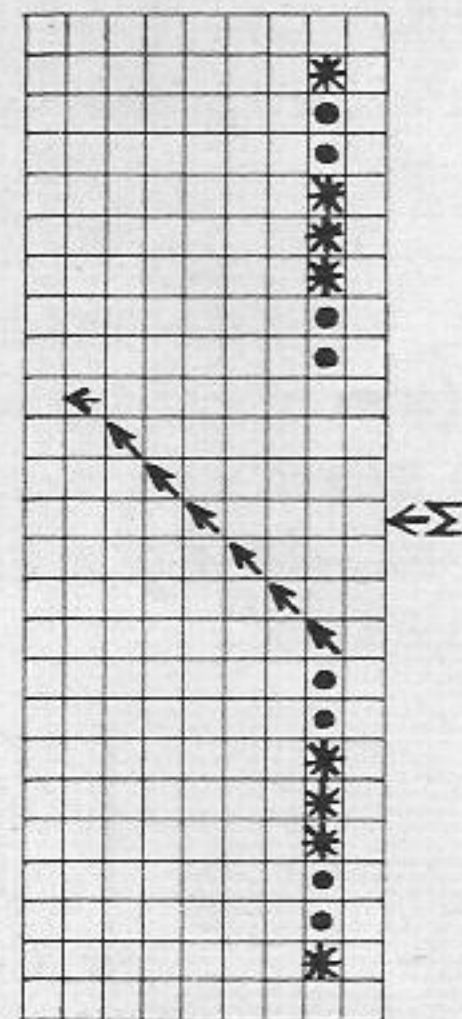

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Join parts and set in sleeves. Sew bands to front and neck, first outside st by st, then slip stitch inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Stitch around buttonholes and attach buttons.

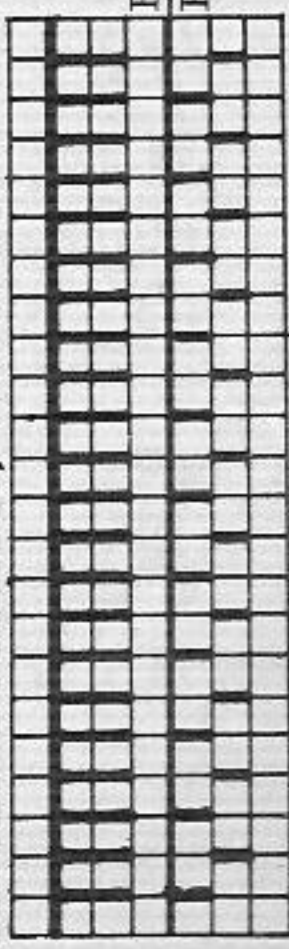

Neckborder: Cast on 104 sts for stocking st. and knit 16 rows, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Cut lining material according to knitted parts, add surplus for seams. Join parts. Stitch 1:1 rib to inside. Stitch neckborder and front borders outside with backstitches st by st unravelling contrast yarn, then sew half to inside. Hem front borders to inside, leaving approx. 1/2" width at edge. Work out buttonholes, cutting borders. Crochet round pieces to cover buttons and fasten to jacket. Sew lining. Put in elastic waist band at skirt.

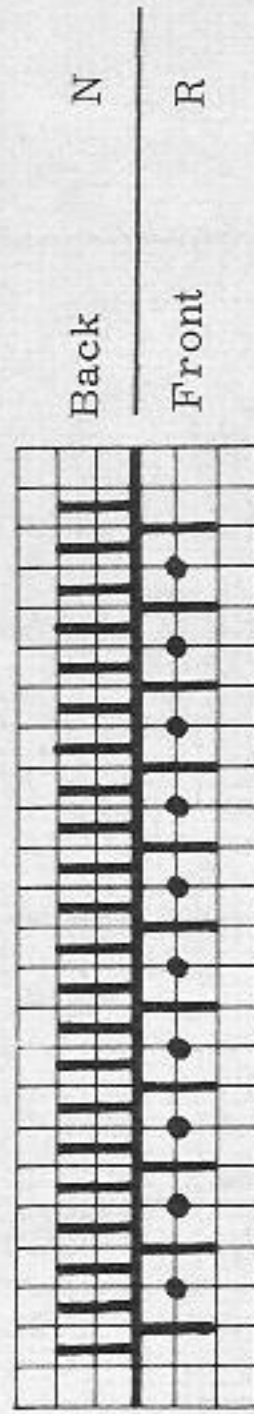

Neck trimming: Cast on 130 sts for 1:1 rib, knit 20 rows, knit a few rows with contrast wool, release.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Sew parts together and set in sleeves. Stitch 1:1 hem to inside. Sew neckborder on the outside st by st with back stitches unravelling contrast yarn, then sew half to inside. At front opening crochet 1 row of firm sts, then a second row with 6 loops at the right as buttonholes. Correspondingly sew 6 buttons at the left. Sew 3 press-buttons along the inner neckline (two near front opening, one in the centre back), also put three half press-buttons at upper part of 1:1 rib border at wrist.



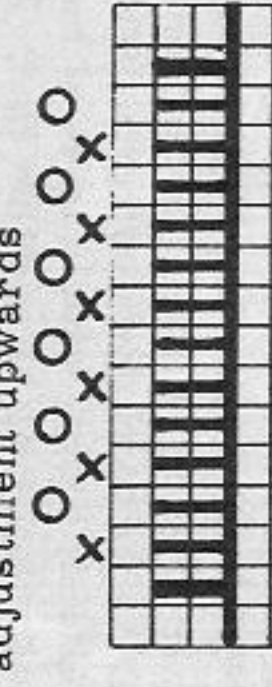

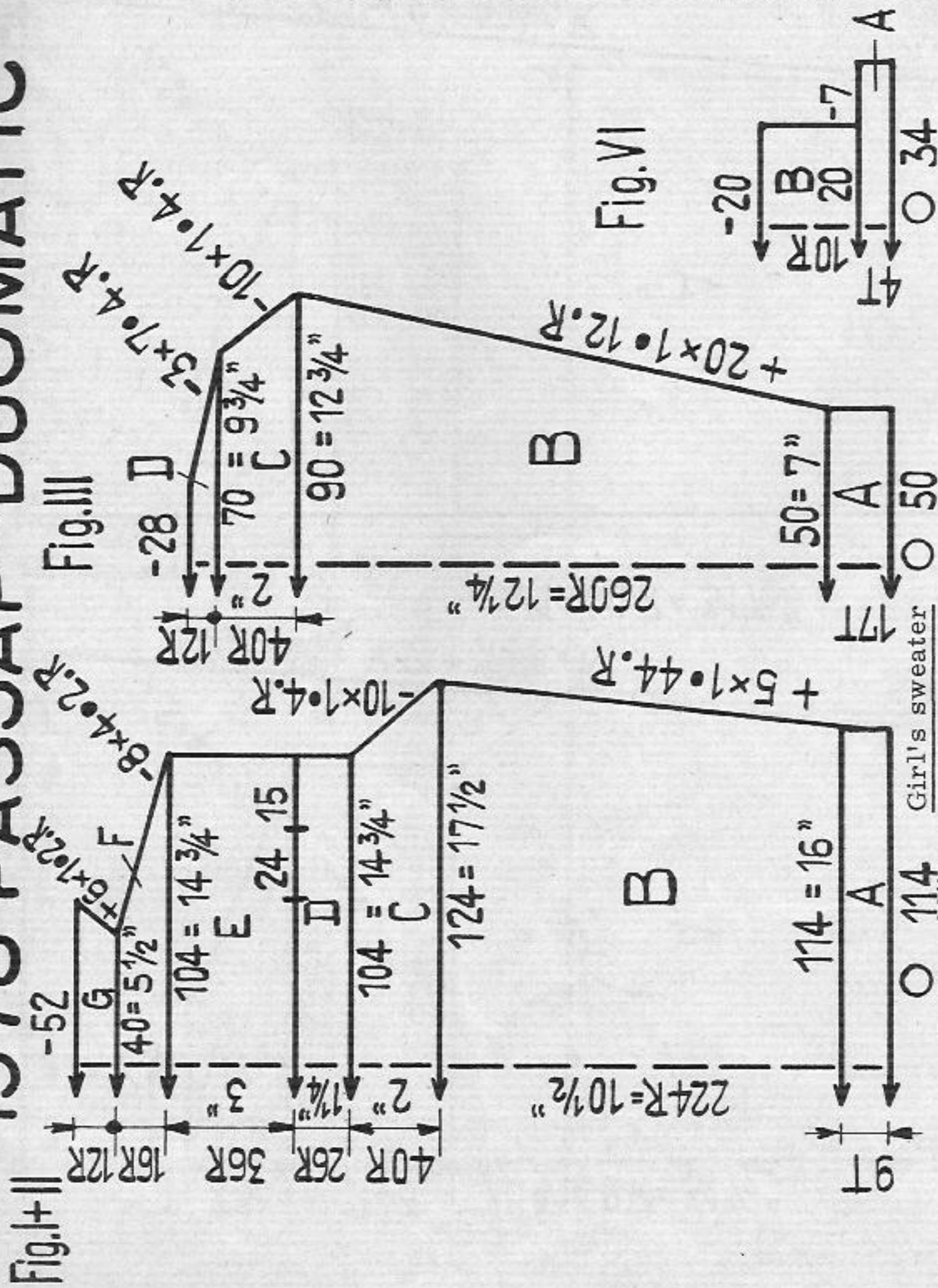
Collar: Cast on 140 sts for 1:1 rib, knit 14 rows with ST.S. 2 1/2, then transfer sts for pattern 2 and knit 70 rows pattern 2 with ST.S. 3 1/2. Transfer sts for stocking stitch and knit 8 rows with ST.S. 4 1/2, 8 rows with ST.S. 4 1/4, 8 rows with ST.S. 4, 8 rows with ST.S. 3 3/4, 8 rows with ST.S. 3 1/2 all in stocking stitch, cast off.

Cuffs: Knit twice, cast on 80 sts for stocking stitch, knit 20 rows, with ST.S. 3 3/4. Now knit 30 rows in pattern 2 with ST.S. 3 1/2, then knit in one buttonhole each over the 9th to the 11th sts at both ends and knit 30 rows in pattern 2. Then knit a further 20 rows in stocking stitch, with ST.S. 4, cast off.

Front trimming: Cast on 60 sts for stocking stitch, knit 20 rows with ST.S. 4, now knit 30 rows in pattern 2 with ST.S. 3 1/2, then knit in a large button hole at one end over 30 sts off the 3rd edge-needle and knit once more 30 rows pattern 2. Now knit 20 rows in stocking stitch with ST.S. 4, cast off.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Stocking stitch parts are to be sewn to the inside (pattern being on the reverse side). Sew 1:1 rib rows half to inside at collar. Finish buttonholes of cuffs. At front trimmings sew bridges at the big button hole according to the buttons on dress. Sew half press-buttons on collar and cuffs according to those at dress.

Test square: 50 sts = 11 3/4", 100 rows = 4 3/4"
Pattern: Whole dress in pattern pink, collar and borders stocking st grey (or silver)
Pattern: handle down, blue strippers

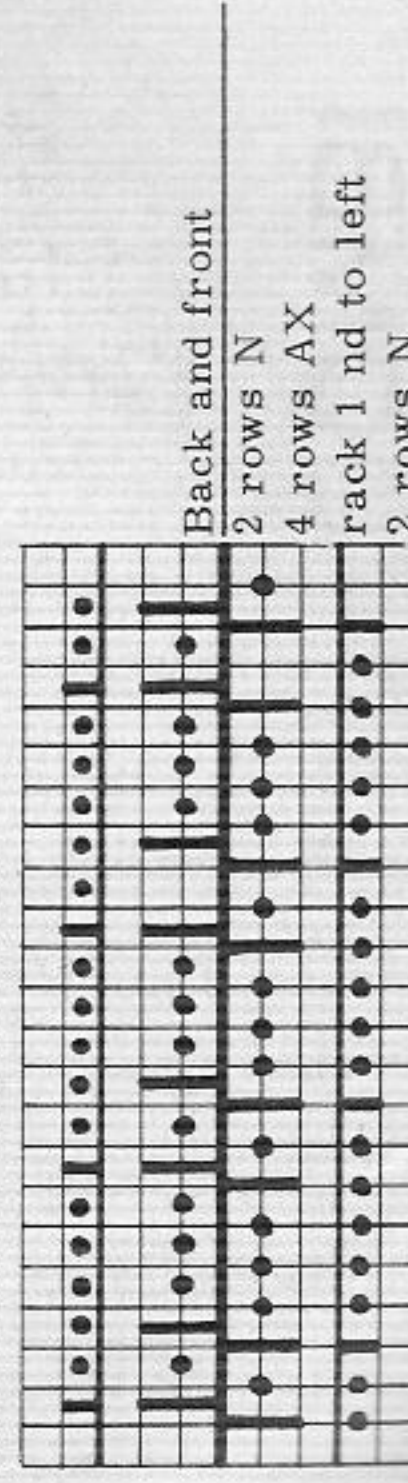


Fig. I: Cast on for tubular, then A to C = pattern, cast off.

Collar: For stocking st cast on 120 sts in grey. Knit 48 rows stocking st, cast off.
Arm borders: Knit twice. Cast on 104 sts in grey, knit 48 rows stocking st, cast off.
Borders for side opening: Knit twice. Cast on for tubular 28 sts with grey (14 sts at front, 14 sts at back), knit 400 rows, then, at back and front, decrease by 1 st 14 times in every 4th row.
Fancy button: Knit fringes approx. 6" long or crochet a small round piece and fix it on cardboard.
To make up: Stretch parts in all directions, then pin out to measurement and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Cover lining with knitted parts and cut to size leaving surplus for seams. Join side seams at knitting and lining separately leaving an opening at right lower edge. Fix right shoulder at armhole and at neck with a few sts. Join left shoulder only at armhole, leaving rest of seam open and crocheting 1 row of firm sts around opening. Slip st collar and arm borders first to outside then slip st half to inside. Close collar at left shoulder with 2 press buttons and fix fancy button. Now fix lining around neck, shoulders and armholes. At lower edge of lining make hem separately fixing only at opening of knitting. Attach borders to opening, point showing upwards.

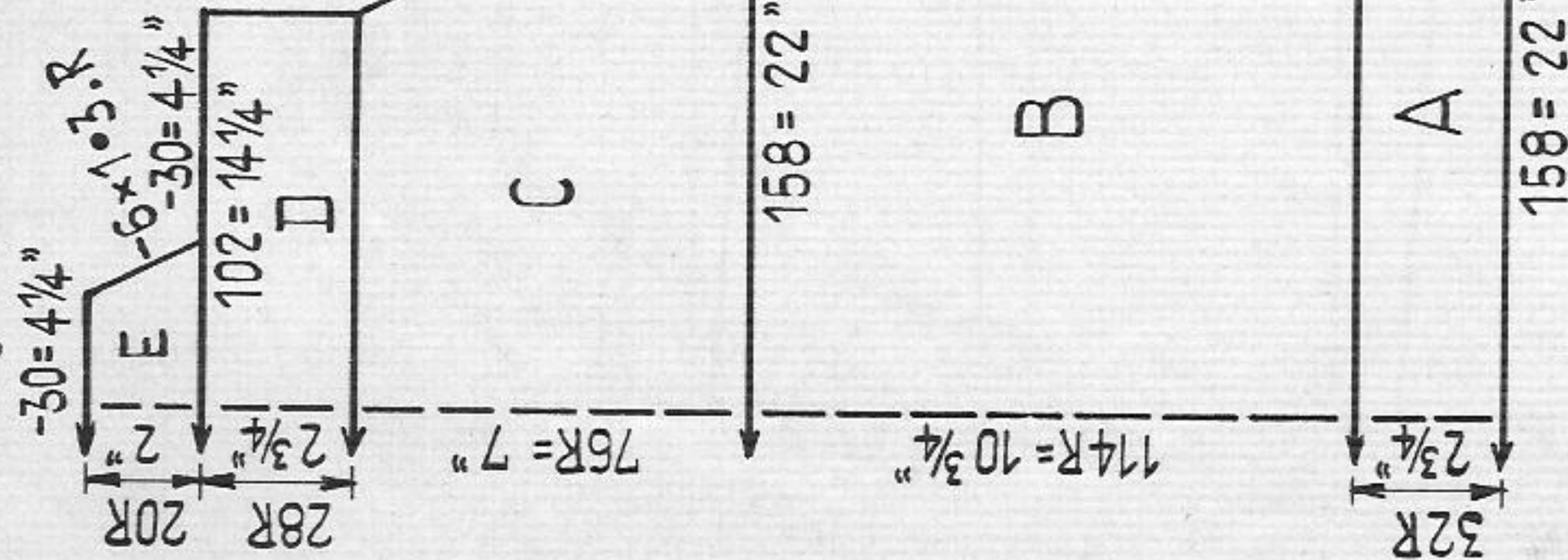

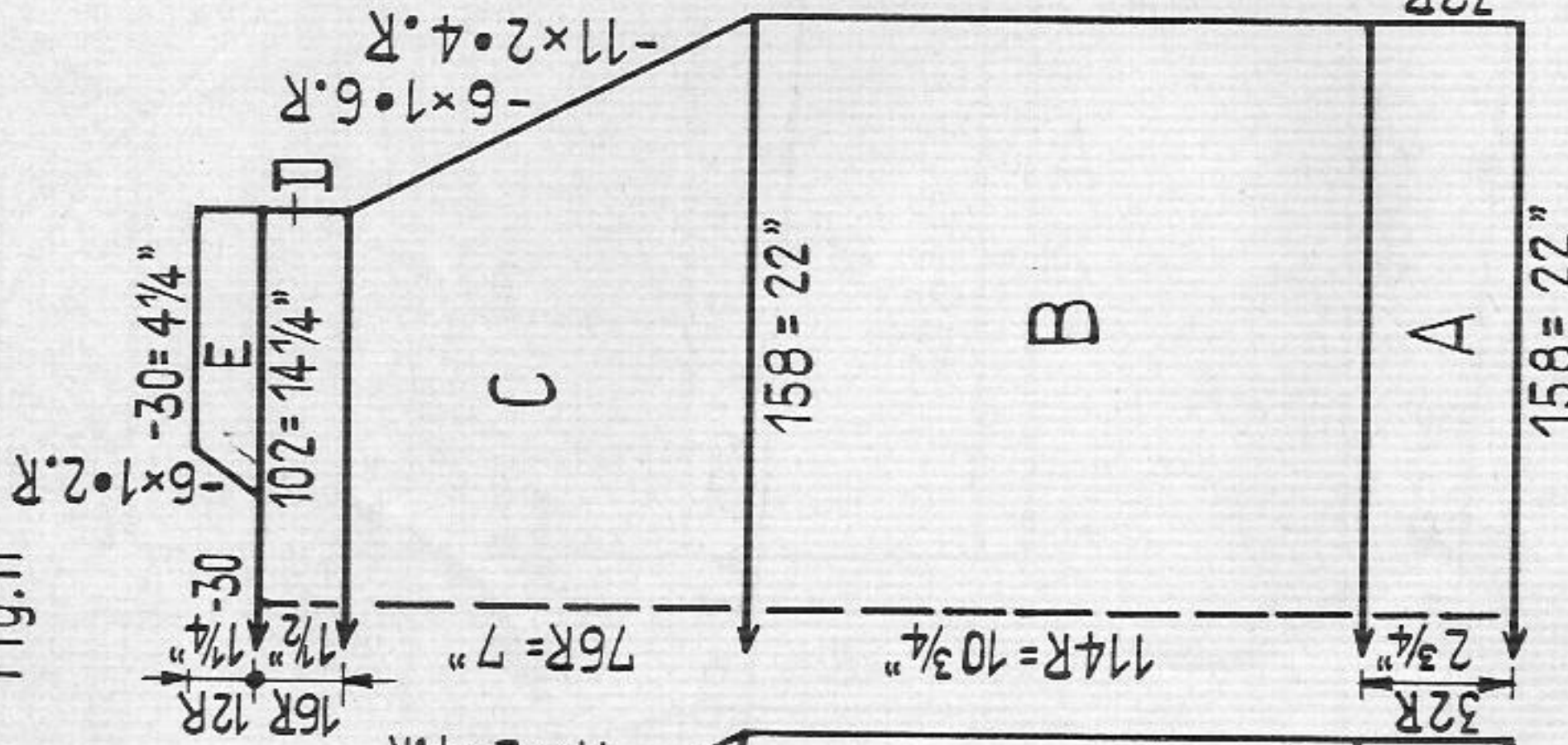
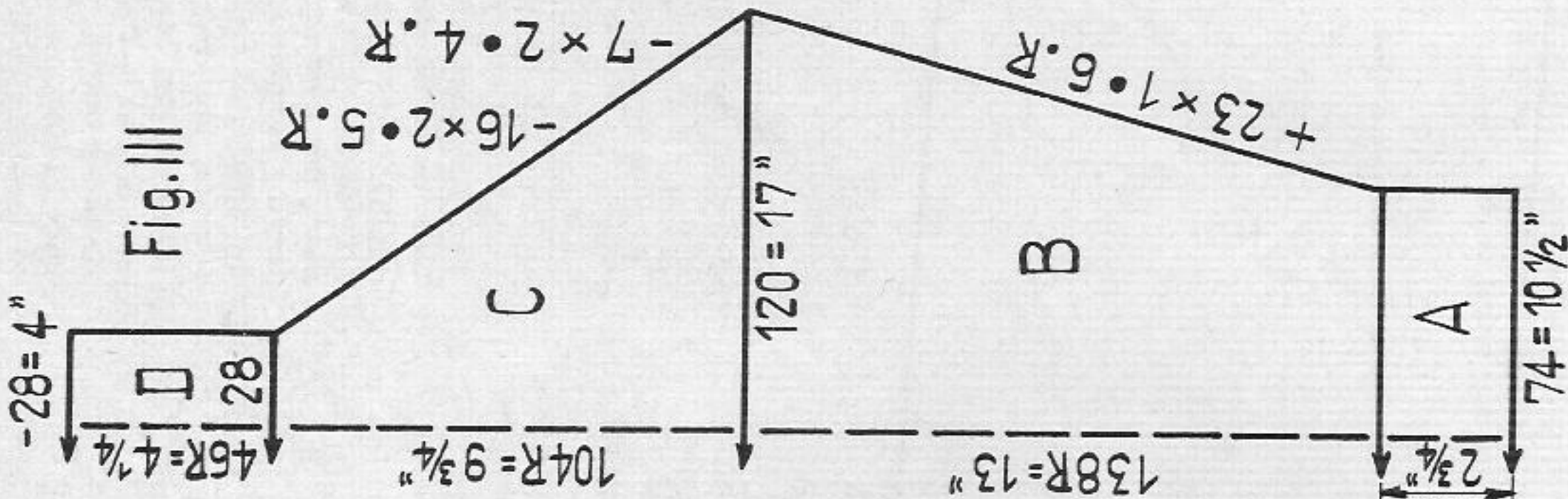

Material: Medium/heavy wool, red, 21 ozs
Stitch size: PASSAP-DUOMATIC
 stocking st. 6, 1:1 rib 3 1/4
 PASSAP-COMBI
 stocking st. st. size 6, tension arm 9, yarn br. 5,
 1:1 rib st. size 3 1/4, tension arm 2, yarn br. 2 1/2
 100 sts = 14", 100 rows = 9 1/2"

Test square:

Pattern:
 Fig. I, II, III: All decreases are being done with 5-decker tool

Necktrimming: Cast on 166 sts for 1:1 rib, knit

Feet: Cast on 86 sts for pattern 1 and knit 12 rows in pattern 1. Now decrease 6 x 2 sts at left and right (at back 1 st, at
 front 1 st) in every 4th row. Then make an open work row and continue knitting again 4 rows pattern 1, cast off.
To make up: Join legs separately at section A, then sew romper parts together. Fold feet half to inside and make seam at
 cast-on edge and decreasing edge. Then sew feet to legs - puckering legs slightly. Make crochet trimming around upper
 edge of rompers. Pull silk ribbons through open work row at waist and feet.

Fig. I a: Cape with hood: A and B = Cape. C = Hood. A = 14 pattern series, cast on 168 sts for pattern 2 and knit pattern 2. Make
 three identical parts. Take sts on double thread at end of parts. Now, for B hang back all 3 parts to the machine, stocking st
 side facing front, 116 sts of each part (58 sts at front, 58 sts at back), totally 348 sts (at front 174 sts, at back 174 sts).
 B = with 348 sts, 10 rows K/K, 10 rows pearl rib at back, 10 rows K/K, 10 rows pearl rib at back, 10 rows K/K, 10 rows pearl
 rib at back, knit 10 rows K/K. Take all sts on double thread.
Hood: C = Cast on 60 sts for pattern 2 (5 pattern series) and knit pattern 2, cast off.
To make up: Fold hood half to inside and make back seam. Join above with B puckering part B to the width of hood. Make crochet
 trimming around hood and cape. Fix 6 loops at left of B, and at right sew 6 buttons to the inside. Pull silk ribbon through pattern

Material: 17 1/2 ozs heavy wool dark blue, 2 ozs each red and beige wool
Stitch size: PASSAP-DUOMATIC, pattern and stocking stitch 6, tubular 5, 2:2 rib 3 1/2

PASSAP-COMBI, pattern and stocking stitch ST.S. 6, tubular ST.S. 5, tension arm 9, yarn-br. 5, 2:2 rib ST.S. 3 1/2, tension arm 2, yarn-br. 2 1/2.
 100 sts = 14 1/2", 100 rows = 9 3/4"
Test square: Sweater dark blue in stocking st. At front single bed fairisle according to diagram (Jac 40, pattern 94, "Iceland Stripe")

Pattern: PASSAP-DUOMATIC

handle down, black strippers, attention to edge needles at back

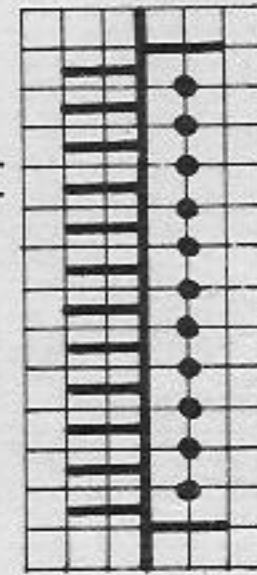


Fig. I+III: A = 2:2 rib, B to E = stocking stitch, decr. with 5 decker tool.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. First stitch both front parts right and left to fairisle trimming, then join all parts. Set in sleeves, sew half of D (upper sleeve end) to section E of back. The other half will form part of the neckline (continuation of section E). Attach front collar first outside then inside st by st with backstitches, unravelling contrast yarn.

Fairisle diagram, 1 series in height, half a series in width
 For welt cast on 54 sts in 2:2 rib and knit 32 rows, then transfer stitches for fairisle (stocking stitch). (41 sts)

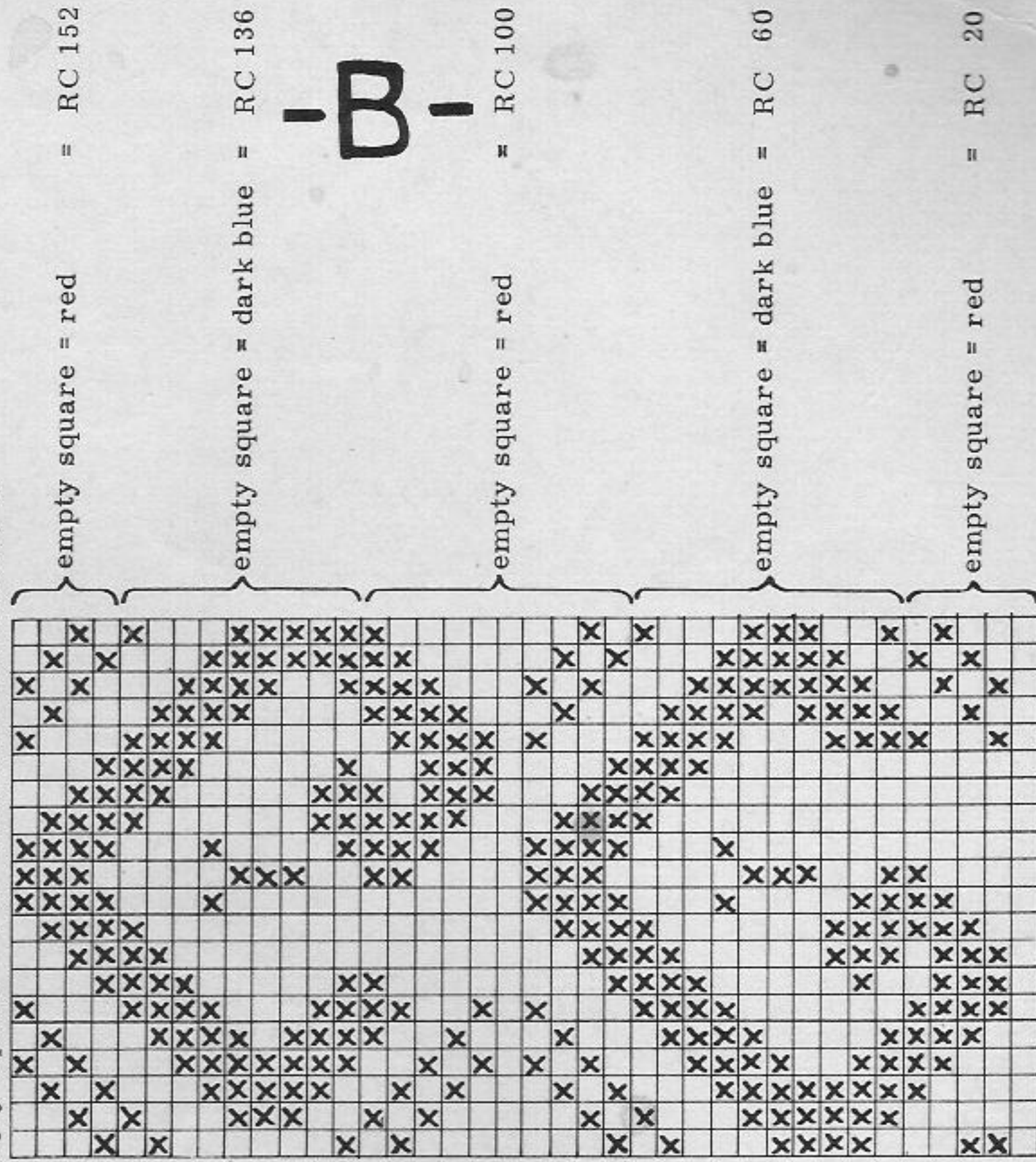

Facing with loose ends for hood: Cast on 178 sts for carpet pattern in white. Knit 4 rows stocking st, then 200 rows carpet pattern and cast off.
Loop for loose ends: Cast on 8 sts for tubular, knit 80 rows tubular, release sts and fix with knit stitches facing.

To make up: Pin out red parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Pin out white parts to size reverse side upwards, cover with rubber milk and let dry thoroughly. Sew together both suits separately as follows: side seams, shoulders and leggings up to end B. Close back seam D 1 and C 1 with D 2, and C 2 and at front close rounding from C to X leaving an opening for zip. Put in sleeves. **Hood:** Sew to neck right side outwards and placing centre of hood against centre of coat puckering width of hood at shoulder seams and making two folds in the back. Close upper seam of hood (D). Now slide both parts into one another.

At wrists and lower leggings fix white part above 2:2 rib, then slip stitch ribbing half to inside and fix on white stock. st rows. Pull elastic band through stocking st rows (D) at red part and fix both sides at front centre. Join white and red parts at waist above and below stocking st rows. Sew in zip first outside at red part then cover and fix inside over white part. Along neckborder tack red and white together, then join both hoods along B, C and D. Sew facing first inside along hood rim C and D, then turn to outside and fix with loose stitches. Finish loose ends separately and pull both through loop.

Man's lounging dress - "leotards" with sweater

"Leotards"

Size:

42, numbers put in brackets on the pattern are valid for size 40.

Material: medium sock wool, 17 1/2 ozs green and 2 ozs each red and black, 1 elastic band

Stitch size: PASSAP-DUOMATIC stocking st and tubular 5

PASSAP-COMBI stocking st and tubular ST.S. 5, tens. arm 9, yarn br. 5,

Test square: 100 sts = 12 1/2", 100 rows = 8 1/4"

Pattern: Pants stocking st green, part of socks green with red/black stripes

The sock part can be knitted tubular or half tubular. When knitting tubular, for each colour changing you have to break the yarn and start a new with the next colour. When knitting half tubular pay attention that the seam will be in the back centre, and transfer sts in such a way that the colour change can be made from right, i. e. leave the right side open. At the foot the seam is on the inside.

Fig. IX and XIV: Knit two parts with reversed shapings. A to E = Green.

A = Cast on in green on double bed, then knit 16 rows stocking st at front.

Now transfer back sts to front. B = Stocking st with graduations. C = Cast

on an additional 4 sts for facing of zip at opening, stockings st. D = Cast

off the additional 4 sts, then stocking st with increasings for seat. E =

transfer sts for tubular according to pattern, tubular. F = Start sock

part, tubular or half tubular (see pattern explanation): 4 rows black, 4

rows red, 4 rows black, 4 rows green, 4 rows black, 4 rows red, 4 rows

black, then *** 12 rows green, 4 rows black, 4 rows red. From *** on-

wards repeat continuously up to toe. G = Transfer sts for heel, stocking

st green with graduations. H = Stocking St green with graduations. J = Foot

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join

both parts from A to D and continue joining increasings for seat along D till

end of C. At front, at both sides of opening sew 4 sts each to inside according

to dotted line, then set in zip. Pull elastic band through section A and close

seam in front middle.

For making pants without socks you follow the pattern as well, knit, however,

section E half tubular, i. e. open at one side, transfer sts after E first to single,

bed then for 1:1 rib, in order to finish in 1:1 rib.
