Child's dress

Size: To fit a 23 to 24" bust approx., for 5 - 7 years
Materials: 5 1/2 ozs medium wool white, a rest each in dark-blue, green, red, 1 small button.
Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC stocking st 6
 PASSAP COMBI stocking st 6 1/4, tens. arm 10, yarn-br. 5
Test square: 100 sts = 14 1/2", 100 rows = 9"
Pattern: stocking st, with coloured stripes at skirt and collar
Fig. I + II:
 A = stocking st, 18 rows white, 4 rows red, 4 rows green, 6 rows white, 4 rows dark blue, 4 rows white, 10 rows red, 4 rows white, 4 rows dark blue, 6 rows green, 4 rows red, 4 rows green, 6 rows white. Now take all sts onto stitch holder and hang back to the machine as follows: first st alone, second and third sts together etc., totally 100 sts. B and C = stocking st white. D = divide work and continue - each part separately - knitting with reversed shapings. E and F = stocking st white.
Collar:
 First sew shoulders together. Then, around neckborder, pick up 78 sts and hang on to the machine. Knit 2 rows in white. Then continue knitting with 2 rows green, 2 rows dark blue, 4 rows red, 4 rows white. Now knit 1 row with stitch size 8 and 12 rows with normal stitch size in white, cast off.
Armhole borders:
 Knit twice. Around armhole pick up 60 sts and hang on to the machine. Knit 24 rows in white, cast off.
To make up:
 Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Close side seams. Slip stitch collar and arm borders half to inside as well as the white stripe at skirt bottom.

May we ask you to first study the explanations given on pages 1 and 2 before starting your work.

Pattern: drawing refers to half width, indication of stitch number to whole width of each part.

If the central line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is done simultaneously with reversed shapings.

If the central line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is done separately with reversed shapings.

Stitches are only given by a number (without "st."). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working-Position on front and back bed.

Exception: For tubular or halftubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed, the same number of needles has to be put into Working-Position on the other bed. In these cases, the sign for tubular \bigcirc resp. halftubular C or D is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increasing and decreasing always in the first row of a paragraph.

- $+3 \times 2 \cdot 8.R$ means: 3 times incr. 2 stitches in every 8th row
(1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- $-19 \times 3 \cdot 7.R$ means: 19 times decr. 3 stitches in every 7th row
(2 stitches at back, 1 stitch at front and vice versa)
- $-17 \times 1 \cdot 2./3.R$ means: 17 times decr. 1 stitch, alternately after 2 rows
and 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle -4 \times 8 \cdot 2.R$ means: work graduations, on DUO with lock at BX and pushers,
on COMBI with nds in Rest-Position. 4 times, after
every 2nd row, gradually put 8 pushers (DUO) resp. 8 nds
(COMBI) in Rest-Position (for double bed knitting 4 at
each bed). Once all graduations are finished, continue
knitting normally, i. e. for DUO put pushers in Neutral-
Position and lock at N, and for COMBI press returning key.

Number of stitches and inches:

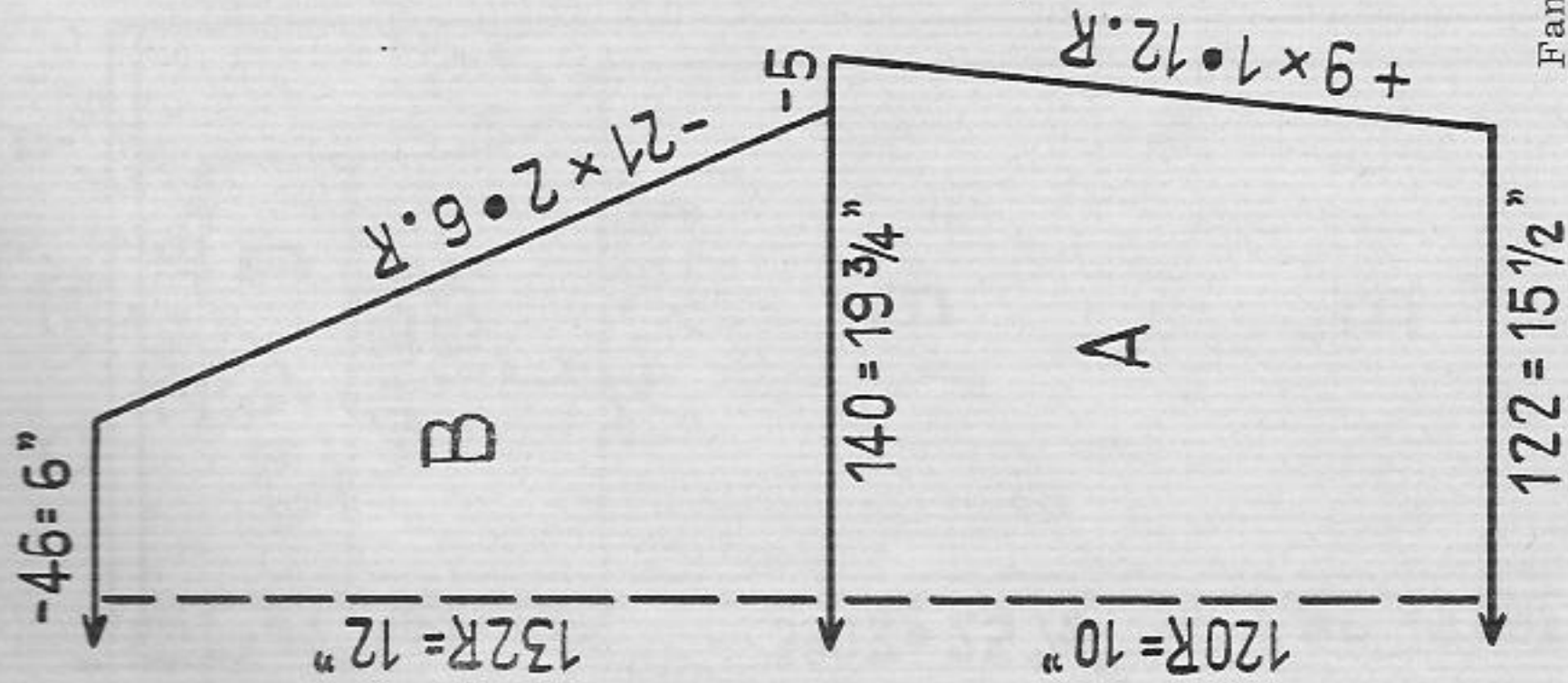
- $136 = 8''$ means: a total of 136 stitches (for K/K 68 stitches each on
front and back) make a width of 8".
- $\bigcirc 146 = 17''$ means: cast on 146 stitches each on front and back for tubular
which makes a width of 17".

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be
controlled by you in making your own test square for your own wool.

Test square: We suggest that you always make a test square for your own wool before
starting to calculate the necessary numbers of sts and rows along the PASSAP-chart.
How to proceed you may read in the chapter "The test square and its calculation" in
your instruction book. This is very important, especially when transferring a model
into another size.

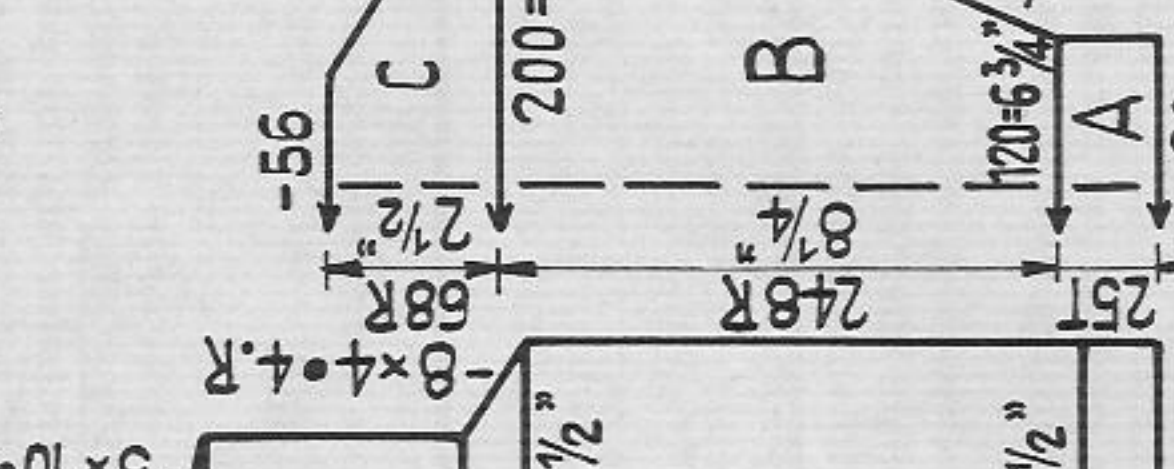


Fig. I+III: A and B = stocking stitch, 11 rows normal stitch size, 1 row stitch size 8 etc. Raglan with quintuple decker.
Fig. II: Knit two parts with reversed shapings. A - C = as Fig. I.
Fringes for sleeves: Knit 200 rows twice.
Fringes around jacket: Knit 1400 rows.
To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. When pressing fringes stretch texture. Sew parts together. Sew fringes around sleeves and jacket first outside then inside with running sts. At right of neck at upper front attach 2 loops and at left 2 buttons at the inside.

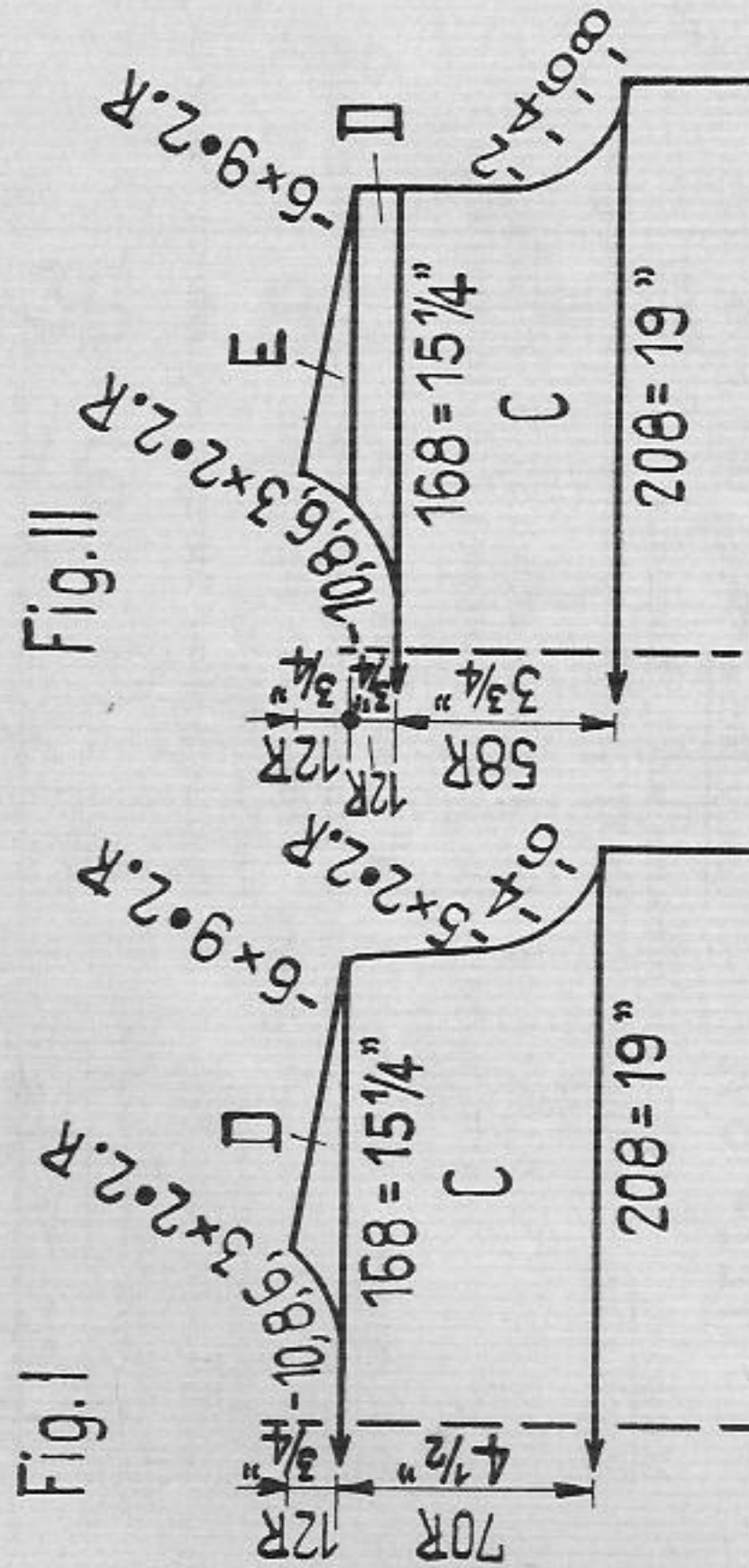
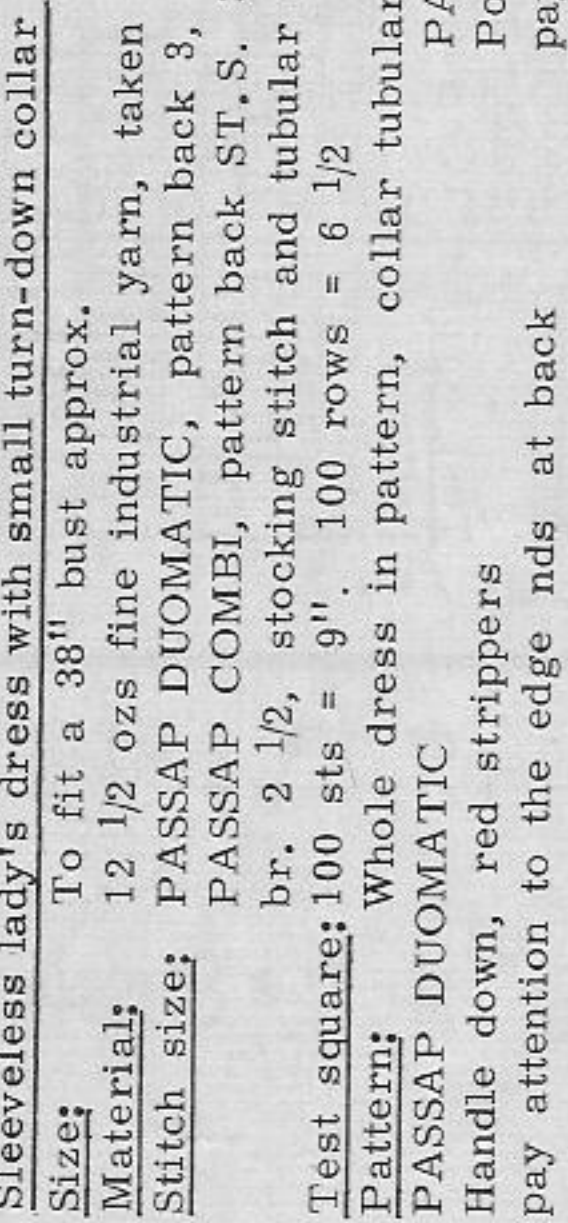

Size: To fit a 38" bust approx.
Material: 12 1/2 ozs fine industrial yarn, taken twofold
Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC, pattern back 3, front 3 3/4, stocking stitch and tubular 4
Test square: 100 sts = 9", 100 rows = 6 1/2"
Pattern: Whole dress in pattern, collar tubular, borders stocking stitch
PASSAP DUOMATIC
 Handle down, red strippers
 pay attention to the edge nds at back

PASSAP COMBI
 Position-lever for bed adjustment upwards
 pay attention to the edge nds at back

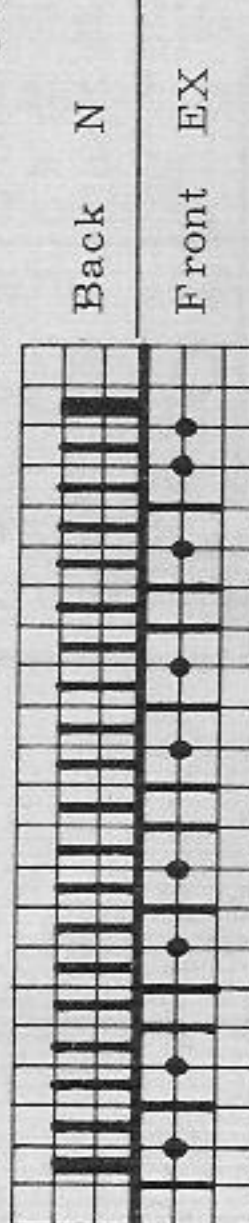


Fig. I + II: A = tubular. B - C = pattern. D = divide work and go on knitting with reversed shapings, pattern. E = pattern.

Collar: Cast on for tubular 120 sts (120 sts back, 120 sts front) with contrast yarn and knit 8 rows, then knit 28 rows with the original wool. Now, with 3 decker tool at back and front each right and left, transfer 3 sts 1 st to outside in every second row, 10 times leaving empty nds in working position. To finish transfer 140 sts to back and cast off.
Armholes: Knit twice. Sew shoulders together. Around armhole pick up 110 sts and hang to machine. Knit 14 rows stocking stitch, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.
Belt: For tubular cast on 5 sts (back 5 sts front 5 sts) and knit 600 rows tubular.
Bow: As belt, but knit 320 rows.
To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Close shoulders and attach arm-borders, then close side seams. Sew arm-borders half to inside. Fix collar first outside then inside st by st with back-sts, unravelling contrast yarn. Make bow and fix at front centre near collar.

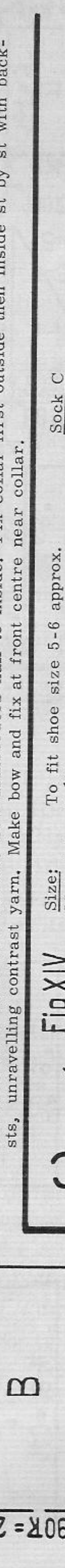
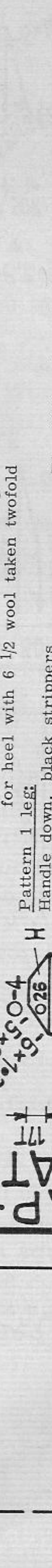


Fig. XIV: A = tubular over all nds. B, C and D = transfer sts for pattern, 1, knit pattern 1. At end of section D take sts on auxiliary thread, turn work to have leg decreasing in front and hang sts back for pattern 2. E and F = shape heel at front bed, taking wool twofold stocking stitch. G = foot, pattern 2. H = put all nds at back also in W.P. and shape toe in tubular stocking stitch.

Size: To fit shoe size 5-6 approx.
Material: 5 1/2 ozs medium wool per pair

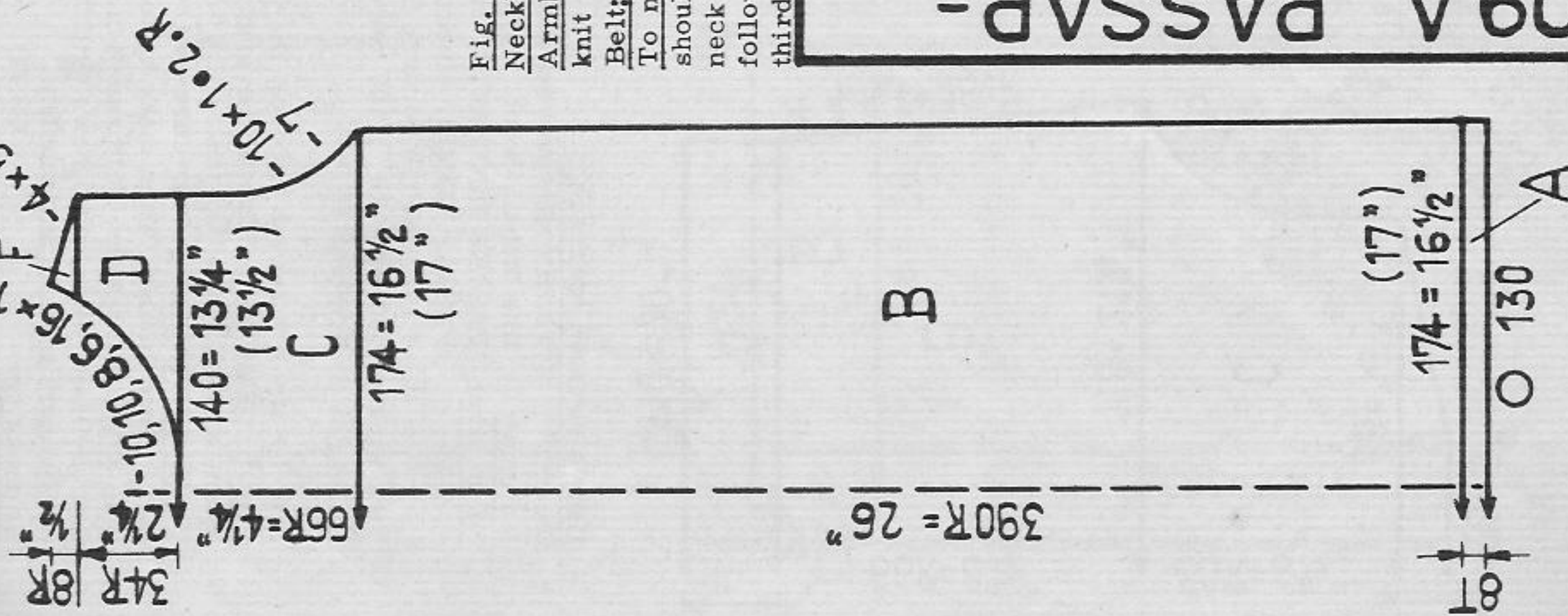

Pattern: PASSAP-DUOMATIC-Pattern at back 3, at front 3 3/4, stocking st and tubular 4

Pattern: PASSAP COMBI pattern at back ST. S 3, at front ST. S 3 3/4, tension arm 2, yarn br. 2 1/2, stocking st and tubular St. S. 4 tension arm 9, yarn br. 5 1/2.

Test square: PASSAP-DUOMATIC 100 sts = 9 1/2", 100 rows = 6 3/4"

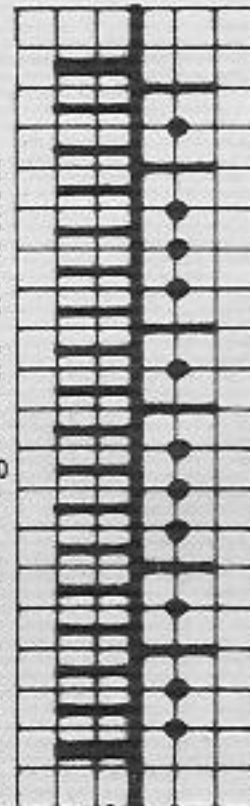

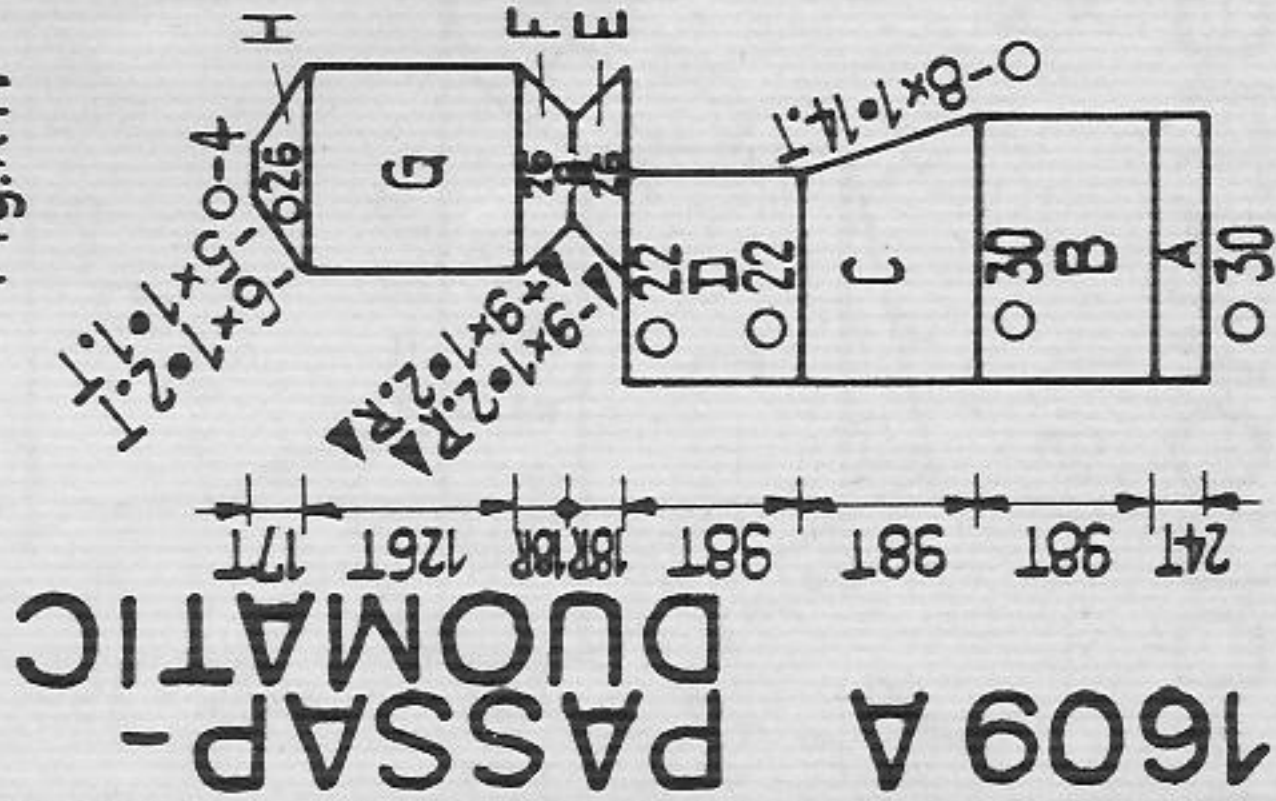
Fig. I + II: A = Tubular. B to C = pattern. D = Divide work and continue knitting with reversed shapings. Pattern. E = Pattern. Neck borders: Knit twice. Pick up 85 sts each at back and front part, transfer to the machine and knit 14 rows stocking st, cast off.

Arm borders: First close shoulders, then knit twice. Around armhole pick up and transfer 110 sts to the machine and knit 14 rows stocking stitch, cast off.

Belt: For tubular cast on 5 sts each (at back 5 sts, at front 5 sts) and knit 600 rows.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Knit neck borders, then close neck opening, armholes and hem along borders: * 1 firm st, 1 loop st, then make 3 double crochets into the loop st as follows; make 1 double crochet and leave it on the needle, make second double crochet and leave it on the needle, make third double crochet and now crochet off at once all three double crochets. Leave 3 sts and repeat from * onwards.

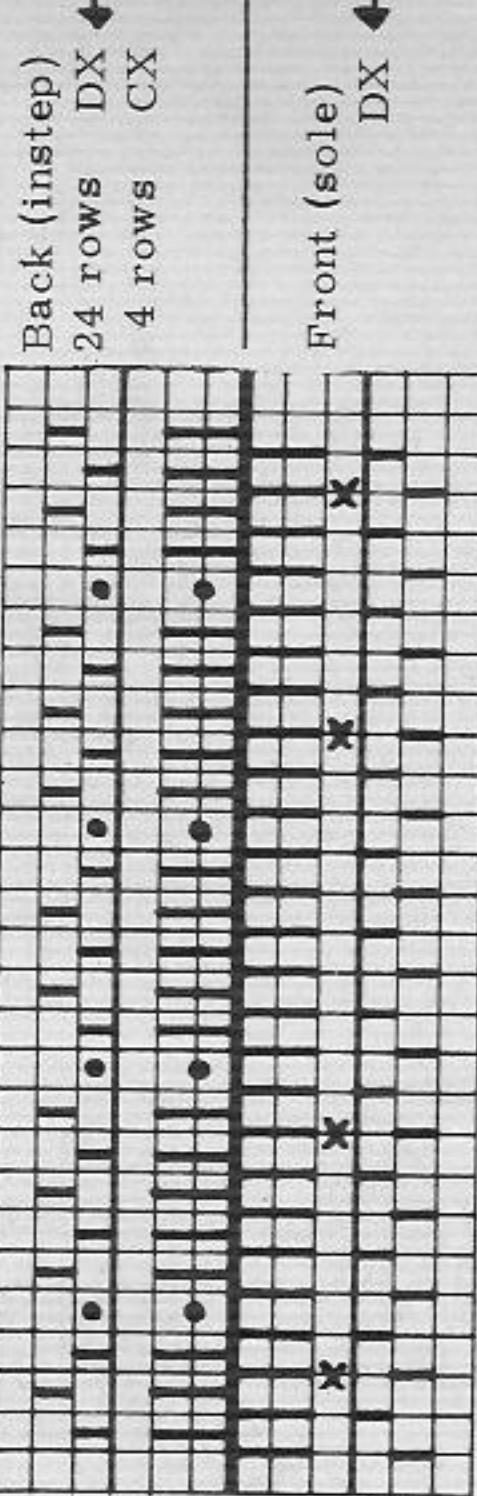

Borders for seam: Start and finish with contrast yarn. Cast on 60 sts for stocking stitch and knit 500 rows with original wool.
Straps: Knit twice. Cast on 18 sts for tubular (18 sts front, 18 sts back) and knit 300 rows tubular, cast off.
Fig. VII + VIII skirt:
Tubular-casting-on, then A = pattern. B = knit N/N with the same sts, cast off.
To make up:

Stretch knitting both ways, pin out to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Skirt: Close side seams, at top sew 1" hem to inside and pull through elastic band. Top: Sew darts at top according to dotted line at diagram and close side seams. Crochet 1 row of firm sts around armholes, gathering the knitting a bit. Attach straps to inside flush with armholes wrongside facing outwards. Sew borders together with graft stitch, unravelling contrast yarn. Then sew it at outside of top wrongside facing outwards, then sew half to inside.

Size: To fit a 34 1/2" bust approx.
Material: 9 ozs fine/medium Orlon or Acryl yarn, 3 buttons
Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC, stocking stitch 5 1/4, pattern 5
Test square: PASSAP COMBI, stocking stitch ST.S. 5 1/4, tension arm 10, yarn-br. 5
Pattern: 100 sts = 12 1/2", 100 rows = 8 3/4"
 PASSAP DUOMATIC, sweater stocking stitch, borders in pattern
 PASSAP COMBI, sweater stocking stitch, borders stocking stitch with open-work rows.

Fig. I: A = Double-bed casting-on, knit at front bed (COMBI back) 24 rows, make one open-work row and knit 26 rows. Now transfer sts from back to front (COMBI from front to back) and make another open-work row at the same time. Then knit B-E = stocking stitch.
Fig. II A-C: as Fig. I. D = divide work continue knitting separately with reversed shapings, stocking stitch. E = stocking stitch.
Fig. III: A and B = stocking stitch.

Borders: PASSAP DUOMATIC: Knit all borders in pattern, cast off.
Neckborder: Cast on 90 sts, knit 24 rows
Border for opening: Cast on 70 sts and knit 24 rows
Borders at sleeves: Knit twice, cast on 48 sts, knit 24 rows
Trimming-band: Cast on 8 sts for stocking stitch, knit 300 rows stocking stitch, cast off.

Borders: PASSAP COMBI: Knit all borders as follows:
 doublebed casting-on, then knit 6 rows stocking stitch at front bed, make one open-work row, knit 8 rows stocking stitch. Now transfer sts from front to back and make another open-work row at the same time. Knit 12 rows stocking stitch and cast off.

Neckborder: Cast on 178 sts (178 sts front, 178 sts back)
Border for opening: Cast on 130 sts (130 sts front, 130 sts back)
Borders at sleeves: Knit twice, cast on 88 sts (88 front, 88 back)
Trimming-band: Cast on 8 sts for stocking stitch, knit 300 rows stocking stitch, cast off.

To make up:
 Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Sew sweater together, set in sleeves, leaving open 2" seam at wrist. Gather borders with a thread to arrange for proper length according to sweater. Now attach border with a flat stitch and flush with opening to outside. The same applies to neckborder. Now sew trimming-band around neckline and opening. Sew hem of 1/2" at sleeves to inside. Then attach borders of sleeves to inside at hem. At top opening and wrist make a loop each and attach buttons correspondingly.

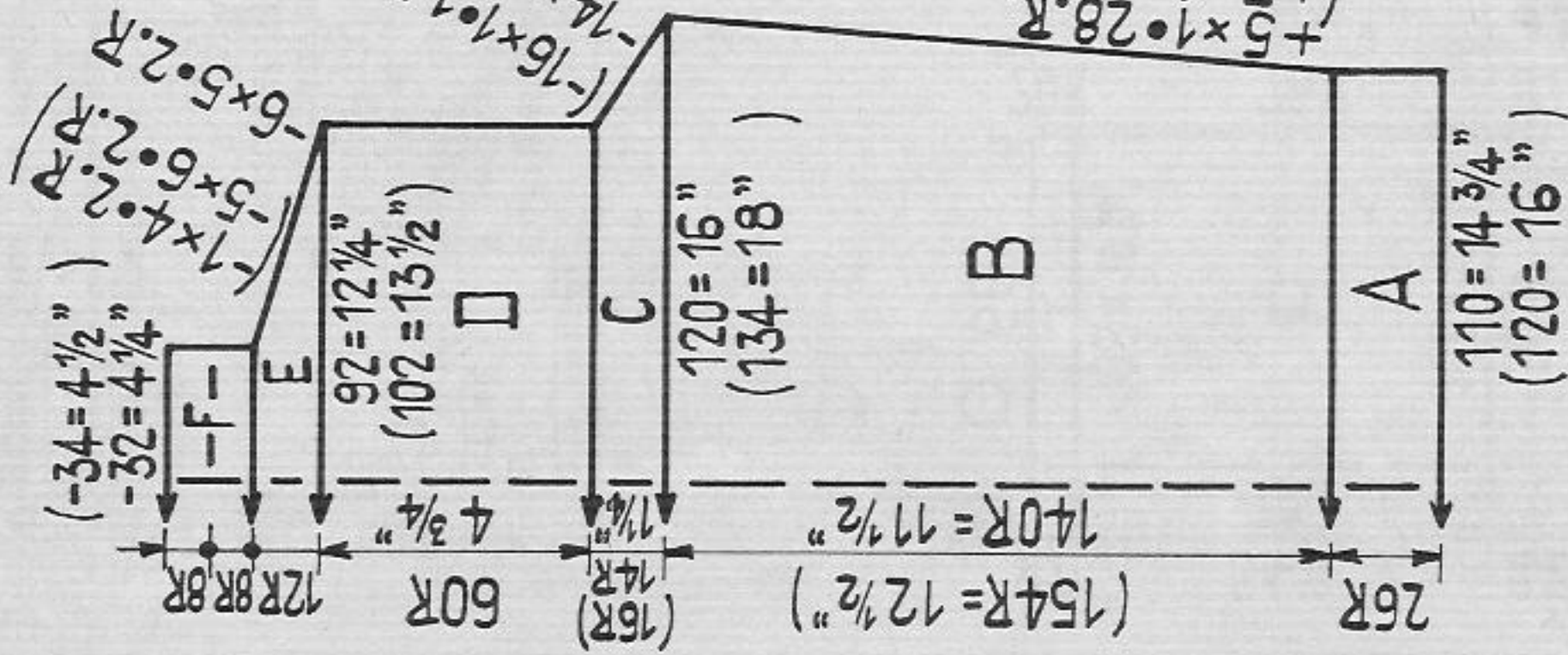

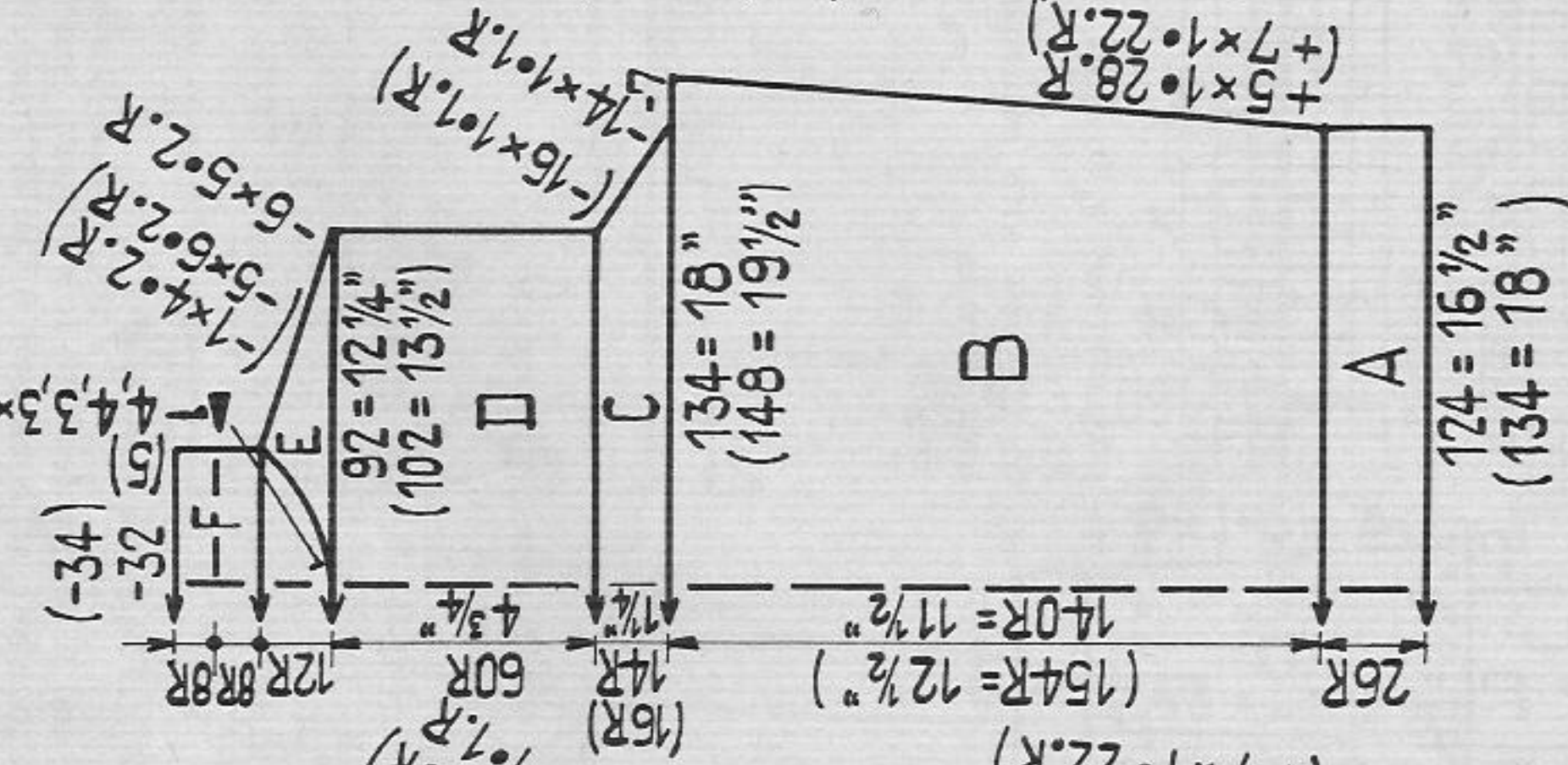
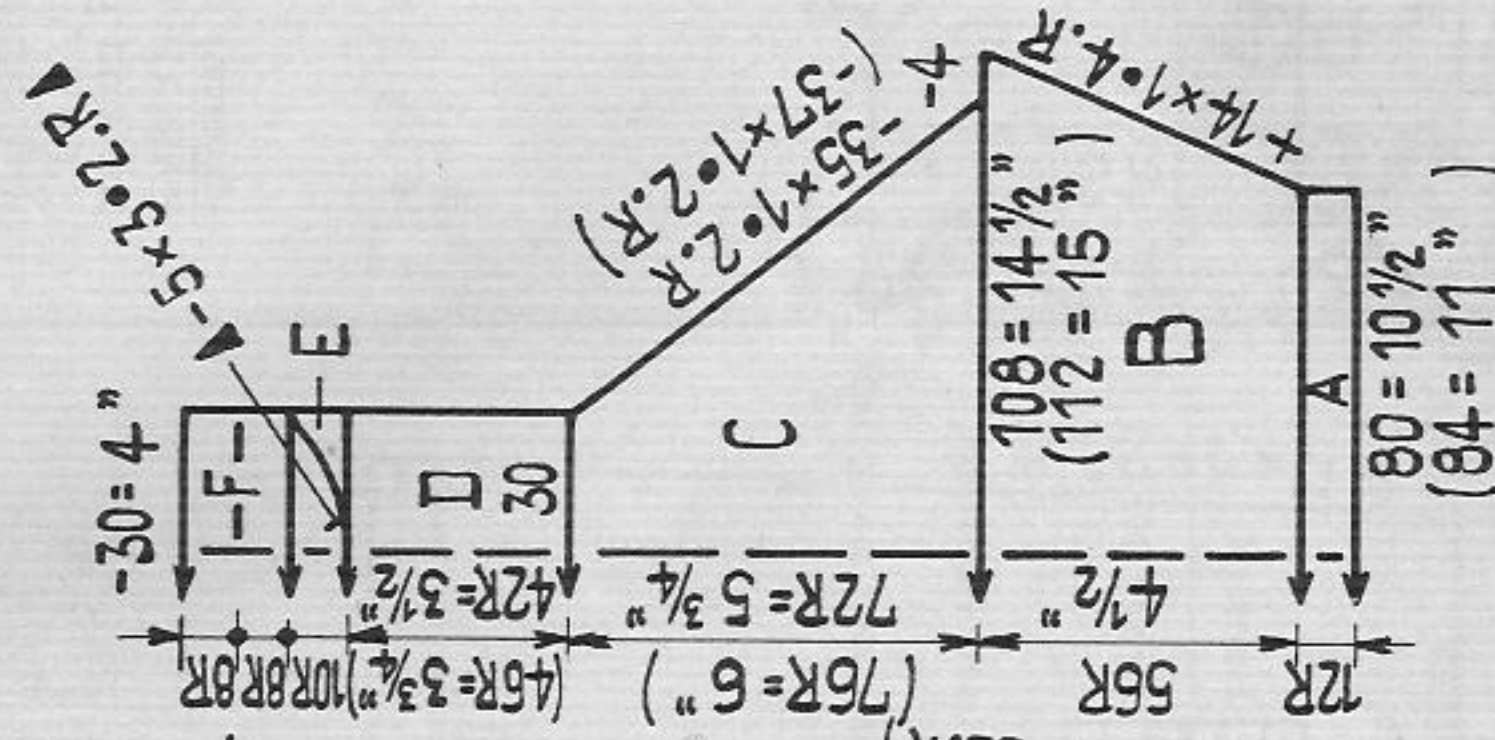

Lady's mohair sweater with silver-thread

Size: To fit a 35 1/2" and 39 1/2" bust approx.

Material: 9 ozs fine Mohair wool white with Lurex

Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC, stocking st 5 1/4, neckborder in stocking stitch 4 3/4, 1:1 rib border 2 1/2

PASSAP COMBI, stocking stitch ST.S. 5 1/4, neckborder stocking stitch ST.S. 4 3/4, tension arm 8, yarn-br. 5 1/2, 1:1 rib borders ST.S. 2 1/2, tension arm 2, yarn-br. 2 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 13 1/2", 100 rows = 8"

Pattern: Stocking stitch, neckborder stocking stitch with graduations

The figures in brackets on the diagram are valid for a 39 1/2" bust approx.

Stocking stitch knitwork of Mohair-wool has a tendency to stretch both ways, therefore no surplus.

Fig. I: A = 1:1 rib borders. B - E = stocking stitch. F = neckborder, knit 8 rows stocking stitch, ST.S. 4 3/4, 1 row stocking stitch ST.S. 7, 8 rows stocking stitch ST.S. 4 3/4, then a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. II + III: A - D = as Fig. I. E = neckline, first at right then at left with graduations, at the same time decrease at shoulder. F = neckborder as Fig. I.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Sew parts together. Set-in sleeves. Fold neckborder along the row of larger stitches and sew to inside, stitch by stitch, unravelling contrast yarn.

PASSAP COMBI, tubular ST.S. 5, tension arm 10, yarn br. 5 1/2, pattern ST.S. 4 1/2, 1:1 rib ST.S. 2 1/2, 3:1 rib at section D ST.S. 4 1/4, 2:1 rib at section E ST.S. 4, tension arm 2, yarn br. 2 1/2.

Test square
of pattern: 100 sts = 9 1/2", 100 rows = 8 3/4"

Fig. I + II: A = tubular. B and C = transfer sts for pattern, pattern. D = throughout hang two stitches together at back bed (COMBI front bed) and knit in 3:1 division. E = handle upwards (position lever COMBI downwards) and throughout transfer the front stitch to its facing nd of back bed (COMBI from back to front), put empty nds out of work and knit in 2:1 division. At the end, work an open-work row, knit 2 rows and cast off.

Fig. III: A = 1:1 rib. B - E = as Fig. I.
To make up: Sew sweater together. If neck-line too small leave seam a bit open at top. Twist a cord with wool and pull it through the open-work row.

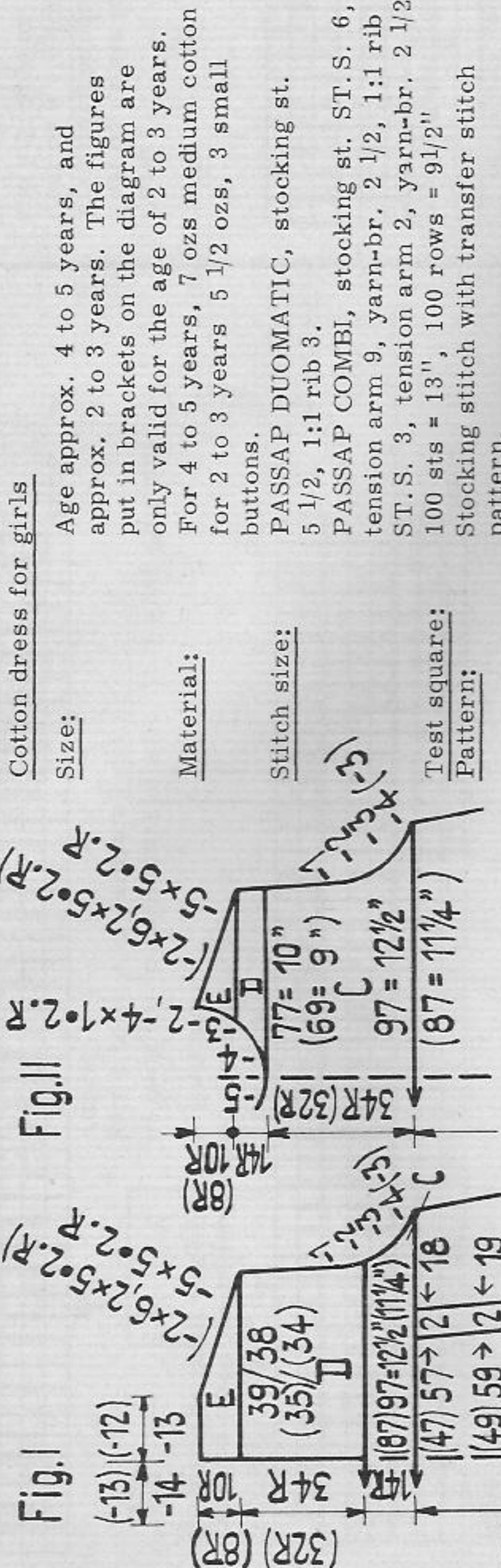

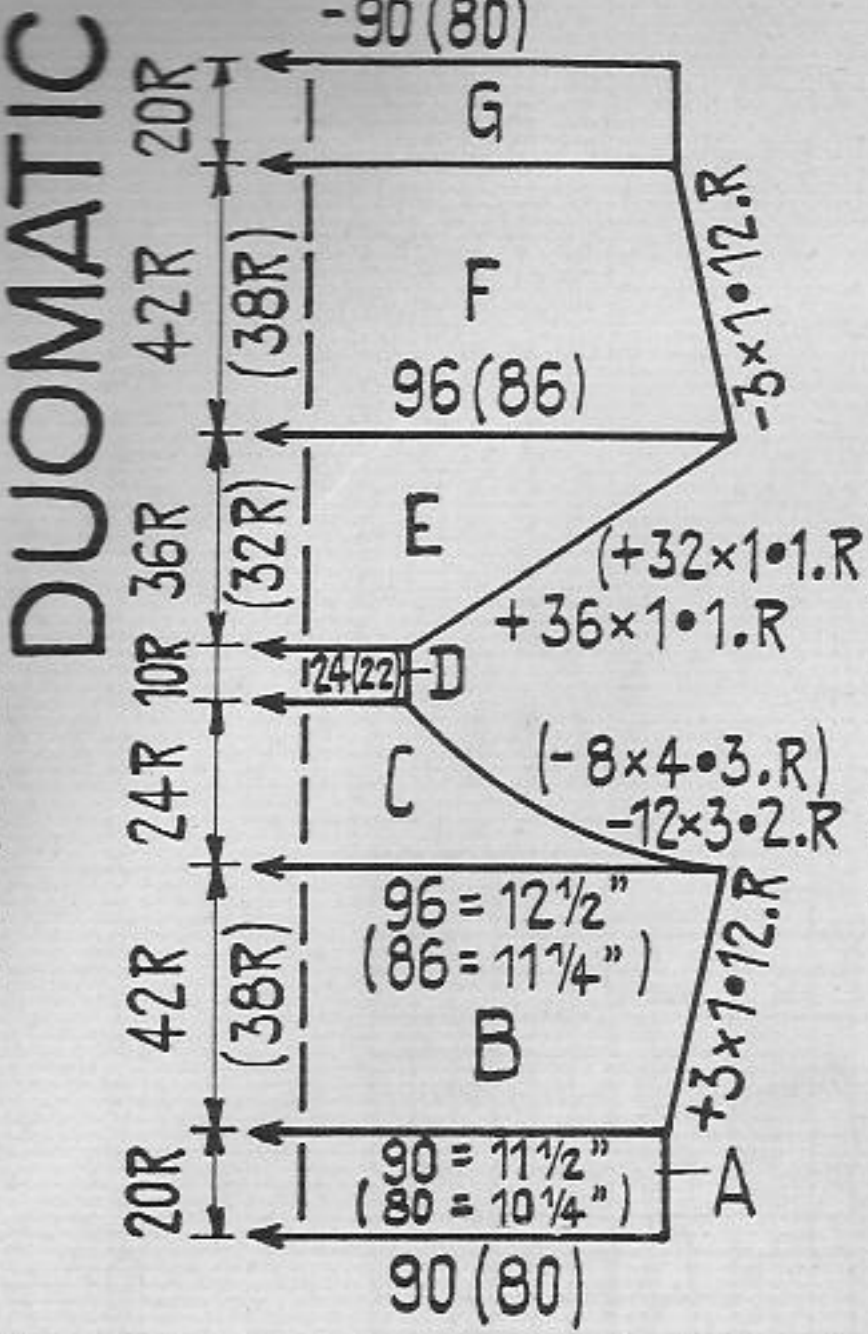

To make up:

Sew two parts each together, arrange pleats, pin them and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth.

Fig. I + II:

Hang two joined parts back to machine, always 7 sts per pleat, which means, for each pleat first hang 6 sts on to machine then, over these, 7 sts twice, so that there are always 3 sts on 6 nds and 2 sts on 1 nd per pleat. Right side of knitting facing the knitter. 14 times 7sts in all plus one additional st each at right and left for seam = a total of 100 sts.

PASSAP-COMBI. For each pleat hang back to machine first 7 sts twice then 6 sts once, reverse side of knitting facing knitter.

A = stocking stitch, 10 rows white, 10 rows blue, 6 rows white, 4 rows blue, then go on knitting white to the end. B = stocking stitch white. C and D = divide work and continue knitting separately with reversed shaping, stocking stitch white.

To make up:

Pin out upper parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Close side seams and shoulders. Attach neck- and arm borders (reverse side out) first outside then inside. Crochet 2 loops for buttons at back opening and fix buttons.

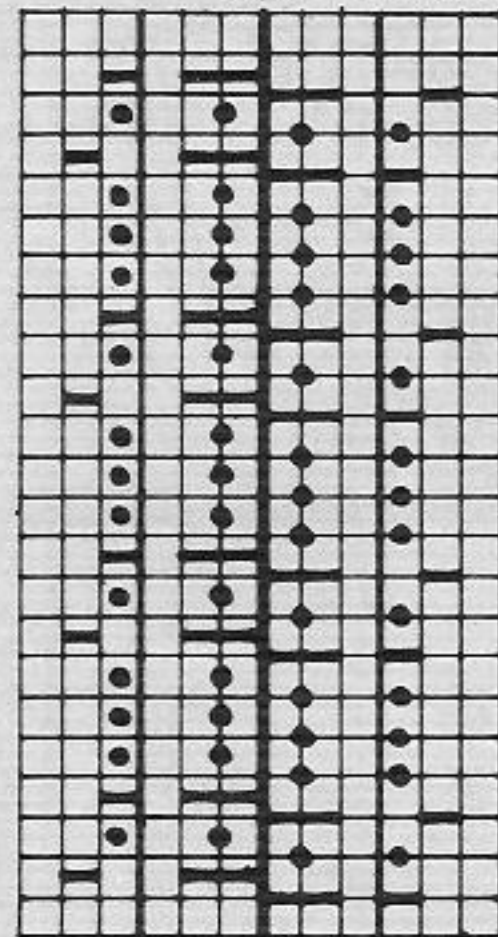

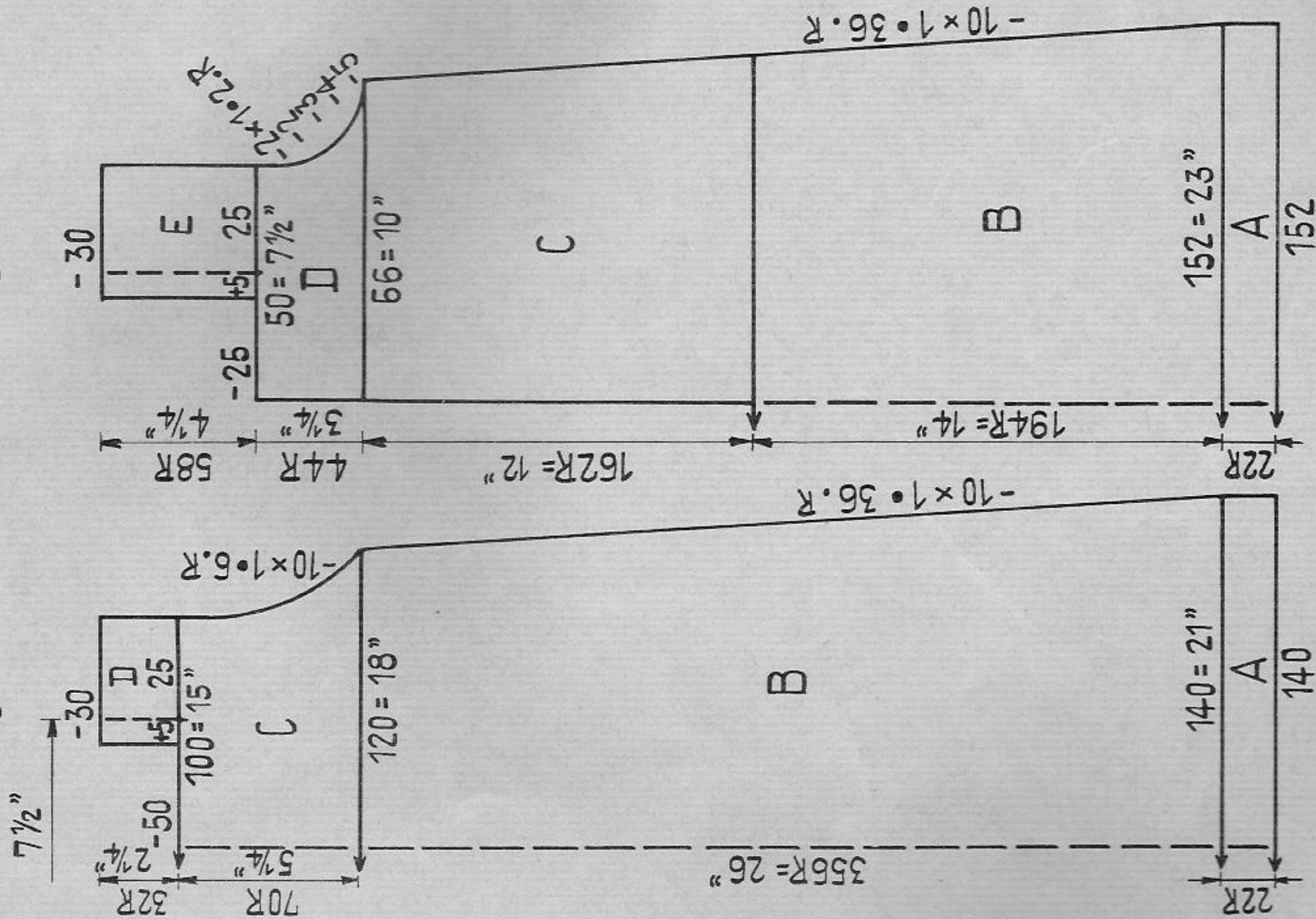
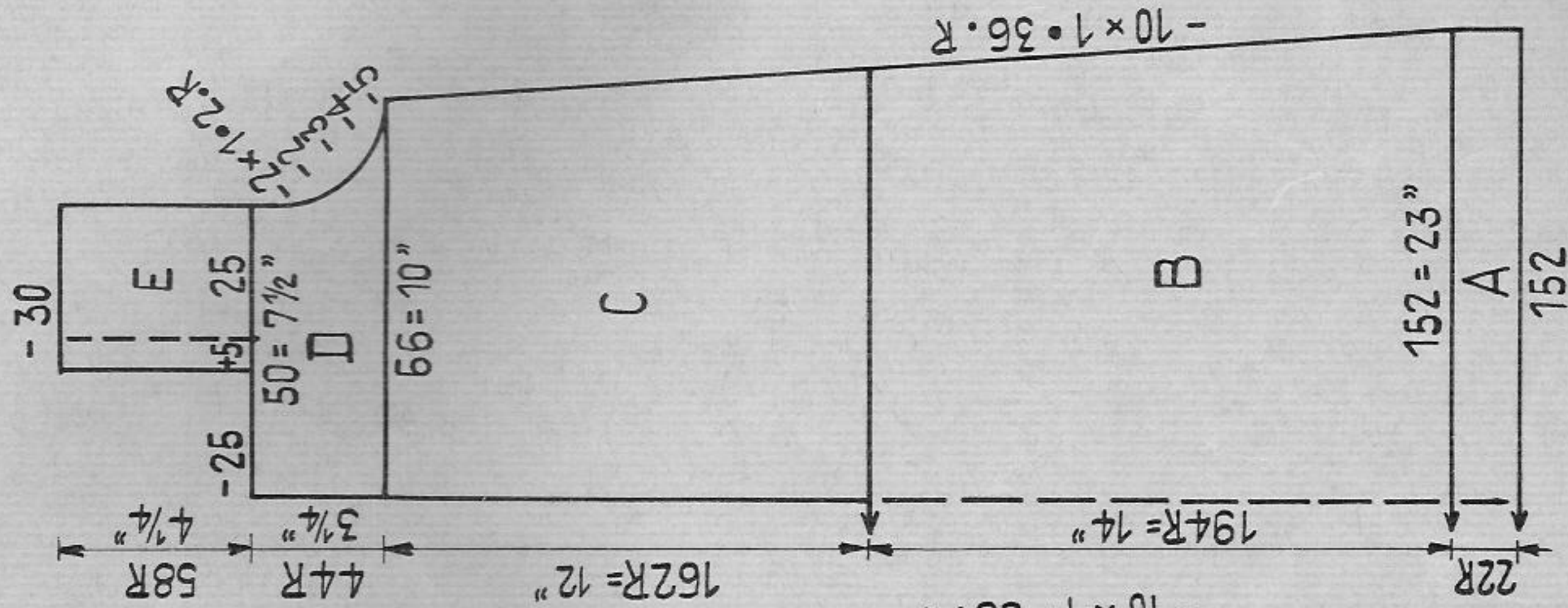

Size: To fit a 39" to 39 1/2" bust

Material: 17 1/2 ozs medium bouclé yarn, 1 zip

Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC stocking stitch 6

Test square: 100 sts = 15", 100 rows = 7 1/4"

Pattern: Stocking stitch, reverse side out

Fig. I: A = stocking stitch for hem. B and C = stocking stitch. D = shoulders with knitted-hem at neckline.

PASSAP DUOMATIC. At center of part for neckline put 50 pushers for 50 nds in W. P. Lock at BX and knit with those 50 sts 12 rows, cast off. Put pushers out of work. **Right shoulder:** At left following the 25 sts of the right shoulder put 5 additional nds with the corresponding 5 pushers in W. P., lock at BX and knit 12 rows with these 5 sts. Now put also the pushers for the 25 nds in W. P. (shoulder 30 sts) and knit right shoulder, cast off. **Left shoulder:** At right following the 25 sts of the left shoulder put 5 additional nds with the corresponding 5 pushers in W. P., lock at BX and knit 12 rows with those 5 sts. Now adjust lock to N and knit left shoulder with 30 sts altogether, cast off.

PASSAP COMBI. Leave 50 nds in the center of bed in W. P. and put the nds at right and left in Rest Position, knit 12 rows. Cast off the 50 center sts. **Right shoulder:** At left, following the 25 sts of the right shoulder, cast on 5 sts, knit 12 rows with these 5 sts. Break off yarn now, push lock to right, at right put the 25 sts of shoulder in Yarn-Receiving-Pos. and knit shoulder with 30 sts. **Left shoulder:** At right following the 25 sts of the left shoulder cast on 5 sts by hand and knit 12 rows with these 5 sts. Then pressing left returning-key knit 1 row with all 30 sts. Now knit left shoulder, cast off.

Fig. II: A and B = as Fig. I. C = divide work, continue knitting separately with reversed shapings, stocking stitch. D = stocking stitch. E = stocking stitch, knit hem at neckline as Fig. I.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Sew hem at bottom and at neck to inside. Crochet 1 row of firm sts around armholes. Set-in zip.

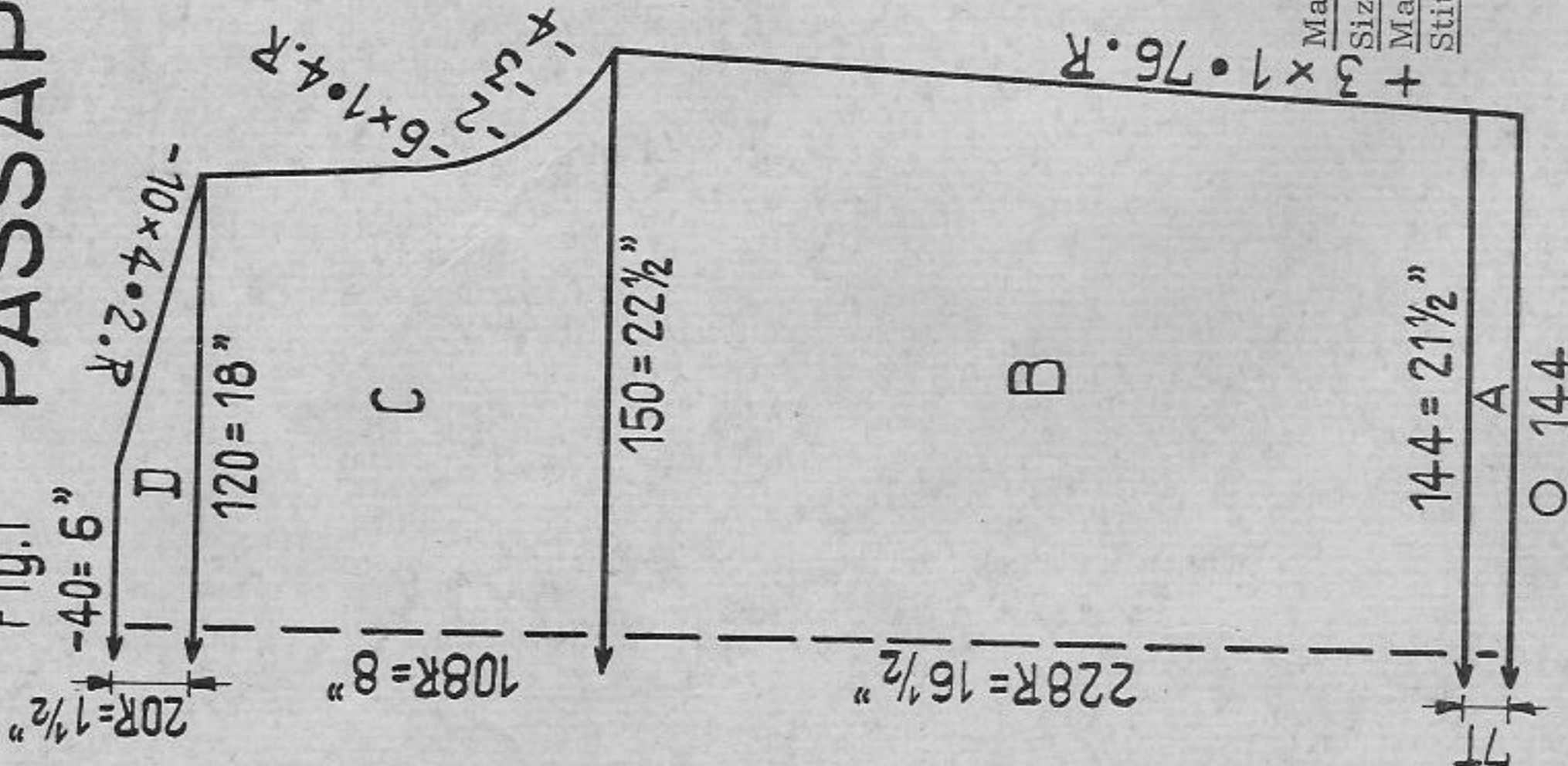
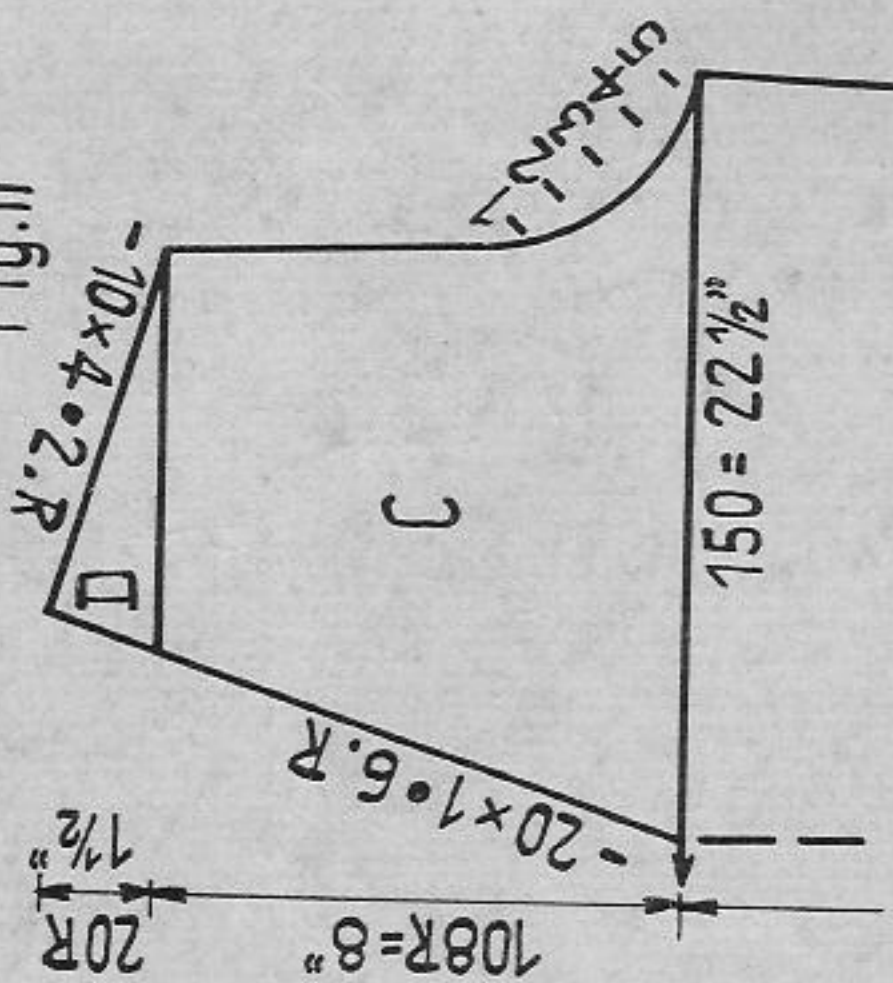

Test square: 100 sts = 15", 100 rows = 7 1/4"

Fig. II: A = tubular. B = stocking stitch. C = divide work and continue knitting separately with reversed shapings, stocking. D = stocking stitch.

Neckborder: For tubular cast on 166 sts (front 166 sts and back bed 166 sts) and knit 14 rows tubular, a few rows with contrast yarn, cast off.

Armborder: Knit twice. For tubular cast on 116 sts (116 sts front, 116 sts back) and knit 14 rows tubular, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Close side seams and shoulders. Attach neck- and armborder first outside then inside st by st with back stitches unravelling contrast yarn.

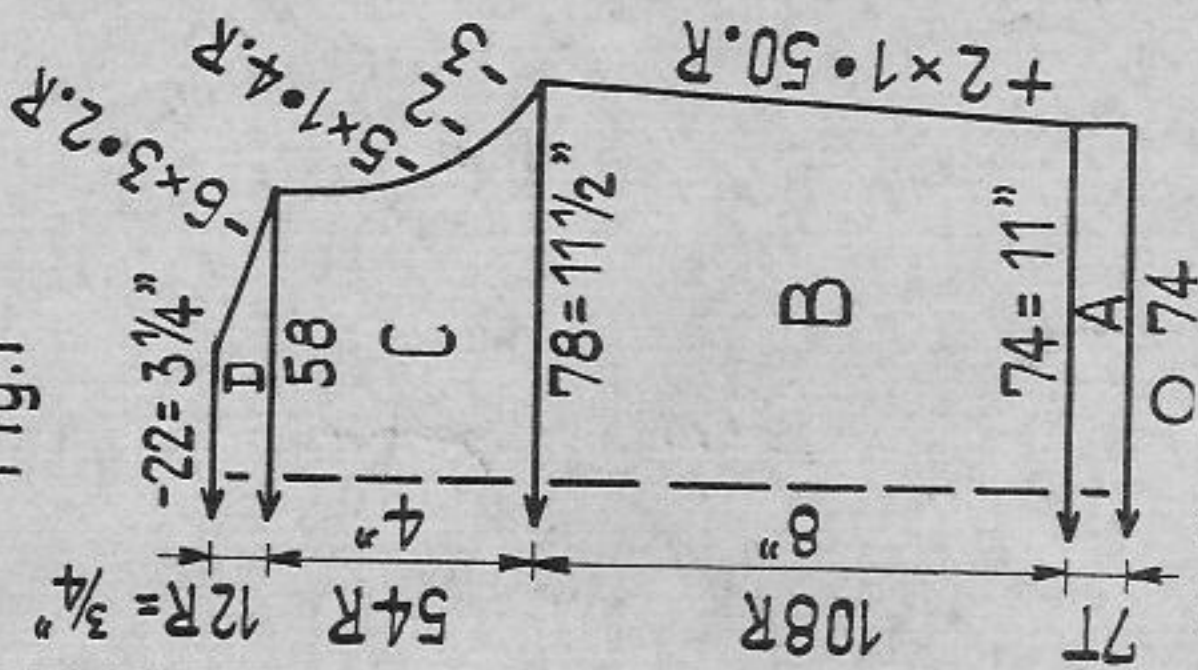
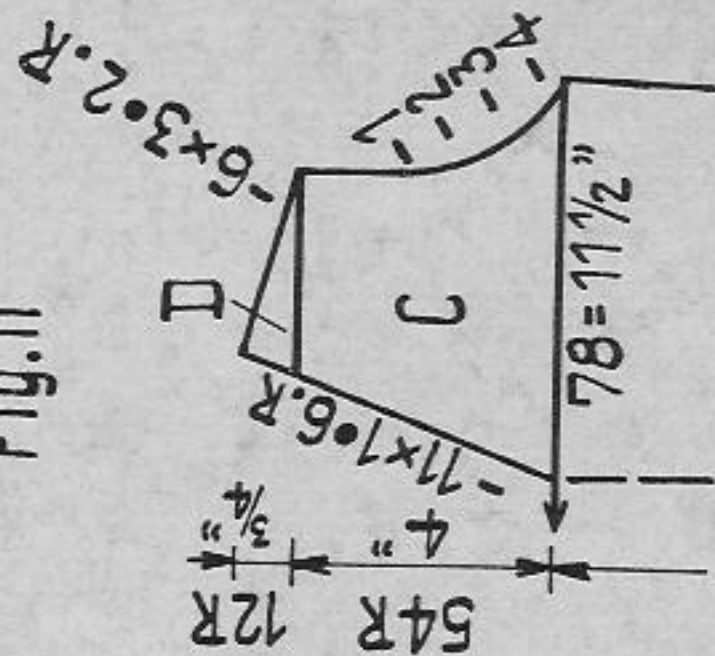

Fig. II: A and B = as Fig. I. D = divide work and continue knitting separately with reversed shapings, stocking stitch with bouclé yarn.

Neckborder: Cast on 84 sts for tubular (84 sts front, 84 sts back bed) with white wool and knit 2 rows, then knit 12 rows with bouclé yarn, a few rows with contrast yarn, cast off.

Armborder: Knit twice as neckborder with 60 sts each (front 60 sts and back bed 60 sts).

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Close side seams and shoulders. Attach neck- and armborder first outside then inside, st by st, with backstitches unravelling contrast yarn.
