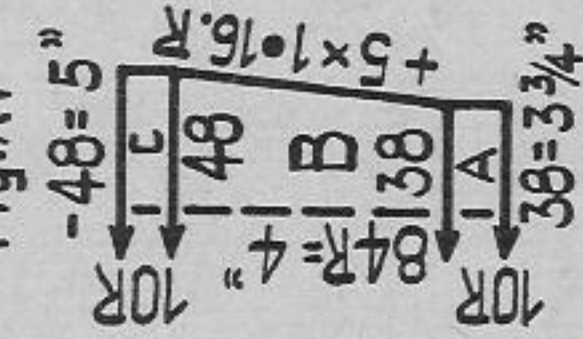


Fig. I + II - dress: A = stocking st, red, hem. B = for pattern pushers in W.P., \*\*\* 12 rows pattern white, 6 rows stocking st red, 12 rows pattern green, 6 rows stocking st red, repeat twice from \*\*\*. Then continue knitting pattern and stocking st in red. C = stocking st, red, hem.

Fig. XV - straps: Knit twice in pattern only. A = stocking st, hem. B = pattern, 12 rows each in red, white and green, repeat up to RC 84. C = stocking st, red, cast off.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Close side-seams, leaving a 3" opening at the top of the seam for armholes, and sew open parts separately 1/2" to inside. At top and at lower part sew stocking st rows to inside and make 4 small pleats at both ends of top of front and back (according to illustration), reducing parts to 11" in width. Sew stocking st rows of straps to inside and attach cast-on edge A to dress near armholes, seam to inside.

Size: to fit a 26 3/4" chest approx., age abt. 7 to 8 years

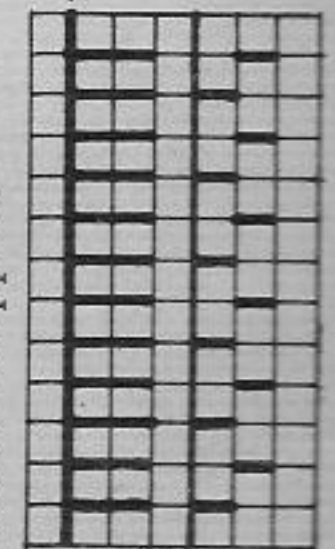
Material: 5 1/4 ozs of fine wool, red, 1 oz each of white and green wool

Stitch size: pattern and stocking st, 4

Test square: pattern: 100 sts = 10 1/4", 100 rows = 4 3/4"

Pattern: knit whole dress as follows: 12 rows in pattern, 6 rows stocking st; straps in pattern only

Handle down, black strippers

Patterns: The drawings refer to half width, the indications of stitch numbers refer to whole width of each part.

If the centre line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is worked simultaneously with reversed shapings, i. e. decreasing or increasing is made on the left as well as on the right side.

If the centre line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is worked separately with reversed shapings, i. e. first knit one part according to diagram (increasing or decreasing at right), then the second part the opposite way (decreasing or increasing at left).

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter "st"). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working Position on back and front bed.

Exception: For tubular or half tubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed. The same number of needles must therefore be put into Working Position on the other bed. In these cases the sign for tubular  $\bigcirc$  respectively ( or ) for half tubular is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increase or decrease always occurs in the first row of a section.

- $+3 \times 2 \cdot 8 \cdot R$  means: increase 2 stitches 3 times in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- $-19 \times 3 \cdot 7 \cdot R$  means: decrease 3 stitches 19 times in every 7th row (back 2 stitches, front 1 stitch or vice versa).
- $-17 \times 1 \cdot 2 / 3 \cdot R$  means: decrease 1 stitch 17 times, alternately once after 2 rows and once after 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle -4 \times 8 \cdot 2 \cdot R$  means: work graduations, i. e. short rows (on DUO with pushers and lock BX). Step by step put 8 nds (and their respective pushers) into Rest Position 4 times after every 2nd row (for double bed 4 nds each back and front). Once all graduations are finished, continue knitting normally, i. e. all nds in Working Position (pushers in Neutral Position).

Graduations can be knitted two ways, either from outer edge towards centre (gradual decreasing with the minus-sign "-" after the black triangle) or from the centre towards outer edge (gradual increasing with the plus-sign "+" after the black triangle.)

Number of stitches and inches:

- $136 = 8''$  means: a total of 136 sts (for K/K 68 stitches each on back and front) make a width of 8".
- $\bigcirc 146 = 17''$  means: cast on 146 sts each on back and front bed for tubular which makes a width of 17".

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be tested by you, by making your own test square for your own wool.

Test square: We strongly recommend that you make always a test square with your own material before starting to work, in order to calculate for your material the necessary numbers of stitches and rows along the PASSAP - chart. The chapter "The test square and its calculation" in your instruction book informs you how to proceed for these calculations. This is very important, especially when adjusting a model to another size.

Fig. I: A = stocking stitch, white for hem, B = pushers in W.P. for pattern, knit 132 rows pattern in white (B1). Then knit in pattern, 12 rows each in red, green and white and repeat, then once 12 rows red and 12 rows green, which gives a total of 96 rows (B2). Now continue knitting up to the end with white in pattern (B3). C - E = pattern, white.

Fig. II: Knit two parts as Fig. I, but with reversed shapings. Make two sets of buttonholes in right front (section C) according to diagram.

Fig. III: A = as Fig. I B = Put pushers for pattern in W.P., then knit 96 rows pattern with colours (B1) as Fig. I and continue knitting up to the end with white (B2). C and D = pattern white.

Collar: Cast on 160 sts with red for stocking stitch and knit 8 rows stocking stitch. Now put pushers for pattern in W.P., knit in pattern 20 rows red and 60 rows green, cast off.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Place ironed parts on lining material and cut lining leaving a surplus for seams. Sew knitted coat together and set in sleeves. Stitch hems to inside at lower edge and coat sleeves. Also turn in front edge facing and finish buttonholes. Attach collar to neckline, flush with front edge, first outside (red stripe outwards, seam inwards), then fold collar in half and sew to inside. Sew lining together and attach inside coat, making hem of lining separately. Fix buttons.

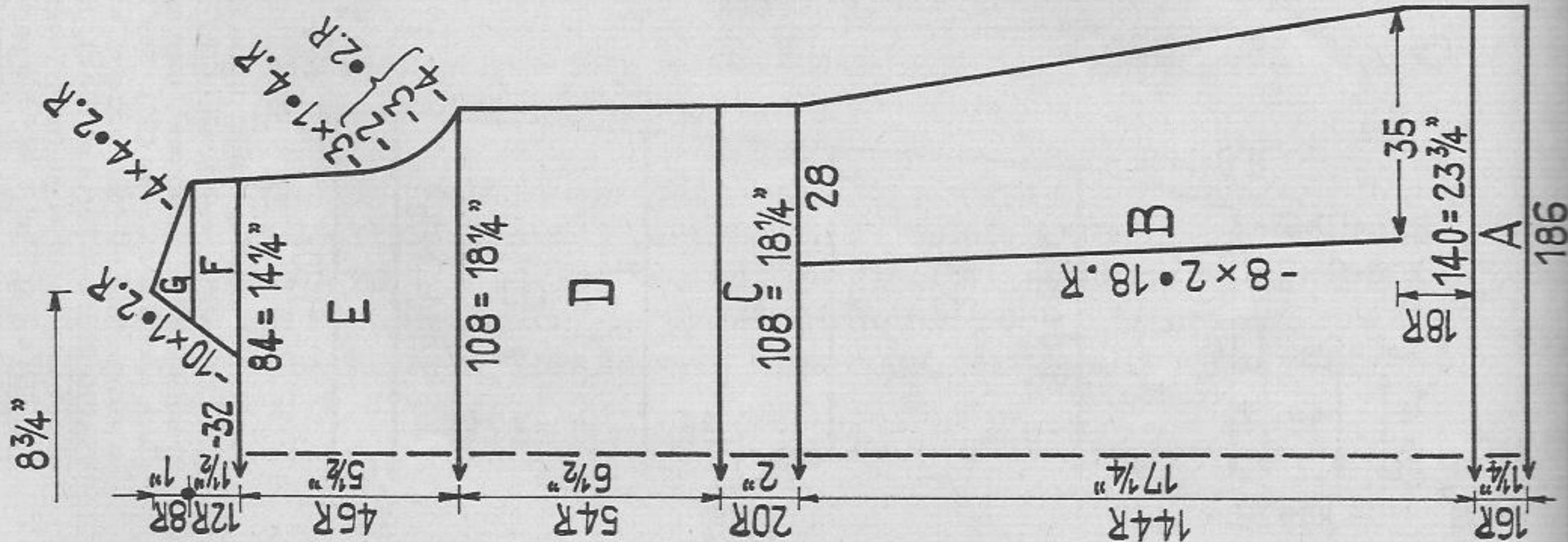
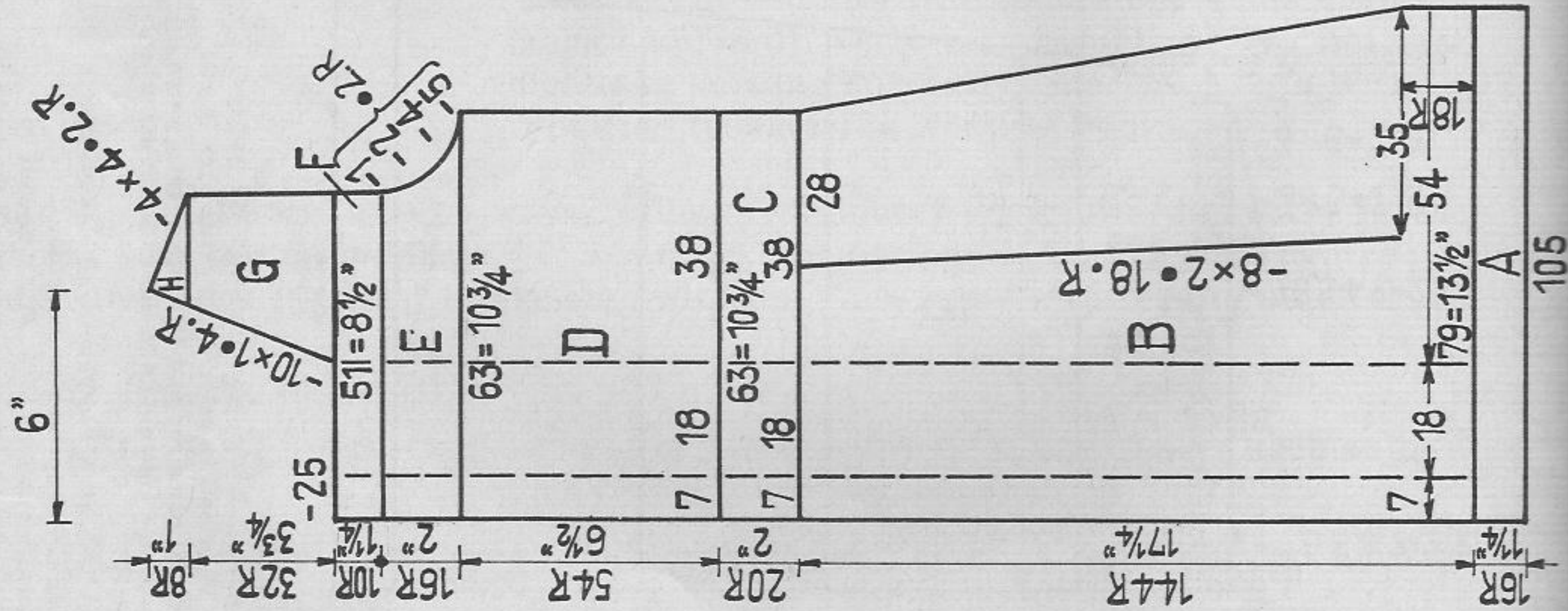

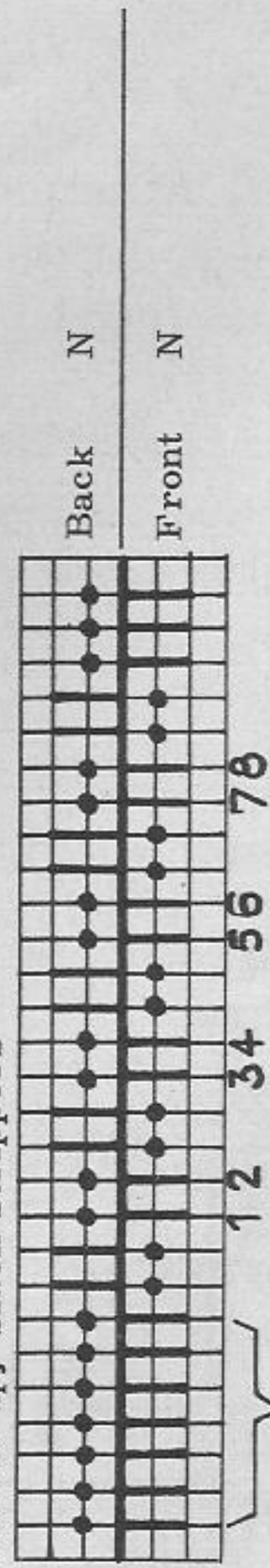

Knit 6 rows, then cross sts 5 and 6 over sts 3 and 4, knit 6 rows, then cross sts 3 and 4 over sts 1 and 2 and, at the same time, sts 5 and 6 over sts 7 and 8. Repeat throughout front part.

Fig. I: A = 2:2 with handle down. B = transfer sts for stocking st, stocking st. After 18 rows make 1st decrease as follows: at both ends transfer 35 sts by 2 nds from edge towards centre, at outer edge 2 nds each out of work, knit 18 rows; 2nd decrease: 34 sts by 2 nds towards centre; 3rd decrease: 33 sts by 2 nds towards centre, etc. C = transfer sts for 2:2 with handle upwards, knit 2:2. D and E = transfer sts for stocking st, stocking st. F and G = divide work and continue knitting separately with reversed shapings, stocking st.

Fig. II: Knit two parts with reversed shapings. A = as Fig. I. B = transfer sts for stocking st and cable pattern (counting from right, 54 sts for stocking st, followed by 18 sts for cable pattern and 7 sts stocking st), knit stocking st and cable pattern, decrease as for Fig. I. C = at right transfer the 38 stocking sts for 2:2, knit 2:2 and cable pattern. D = at right transfer sts again for stocking st, stocking st and cable at left 2:2 without cable pattern. G and H = stocking st.

Bias binding for neck and armholes:

Knit 59" in one piece and cut off the required sizes:

At the extreme right of the machine cast on 10 sts for stocking st, then, every 2nd row, decrease 1 st at right and increase 1 st at left.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size, cover with damp cloth and let dry well. Close side and shoulder seams. At the outside of neck and at armholes attach bias binding with right sides together, then sew to inside; at neck the whole band, at armholes half the band only. Set in zip.

Stretch parts slightly, pin out and press lightly with hot iron over damp cloth. Close side-seams and shoulders and set in sleeves. Attach neck band first outside st by st with backstitches, unravelling contrast yarn, then hem half to inside.

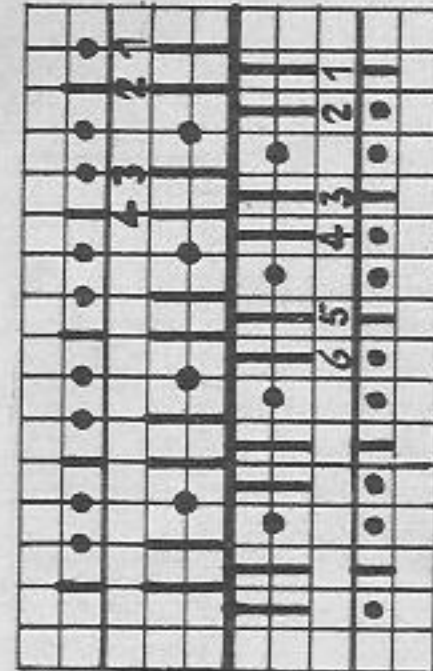

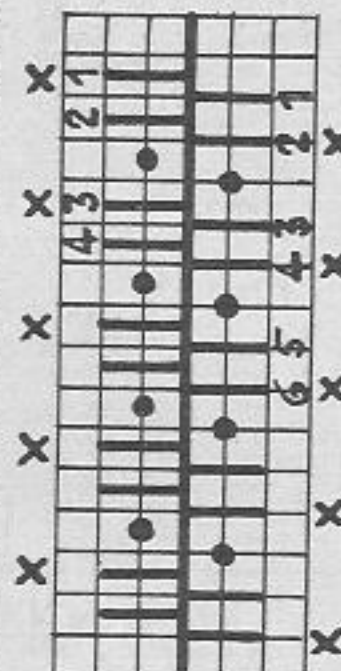

D 2 = pattern.

To make up:

Stretch parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Make edge-to-edge seams, leaving an opening of abt. 2" at front for neck opening. Sew straps onto back (be careful to match pattern). Double-crochet 2 rows around neck line and armholes, gathering slightly at armholes. Pull satin ribbon through pattern according to illustration. Fix lining to dress.

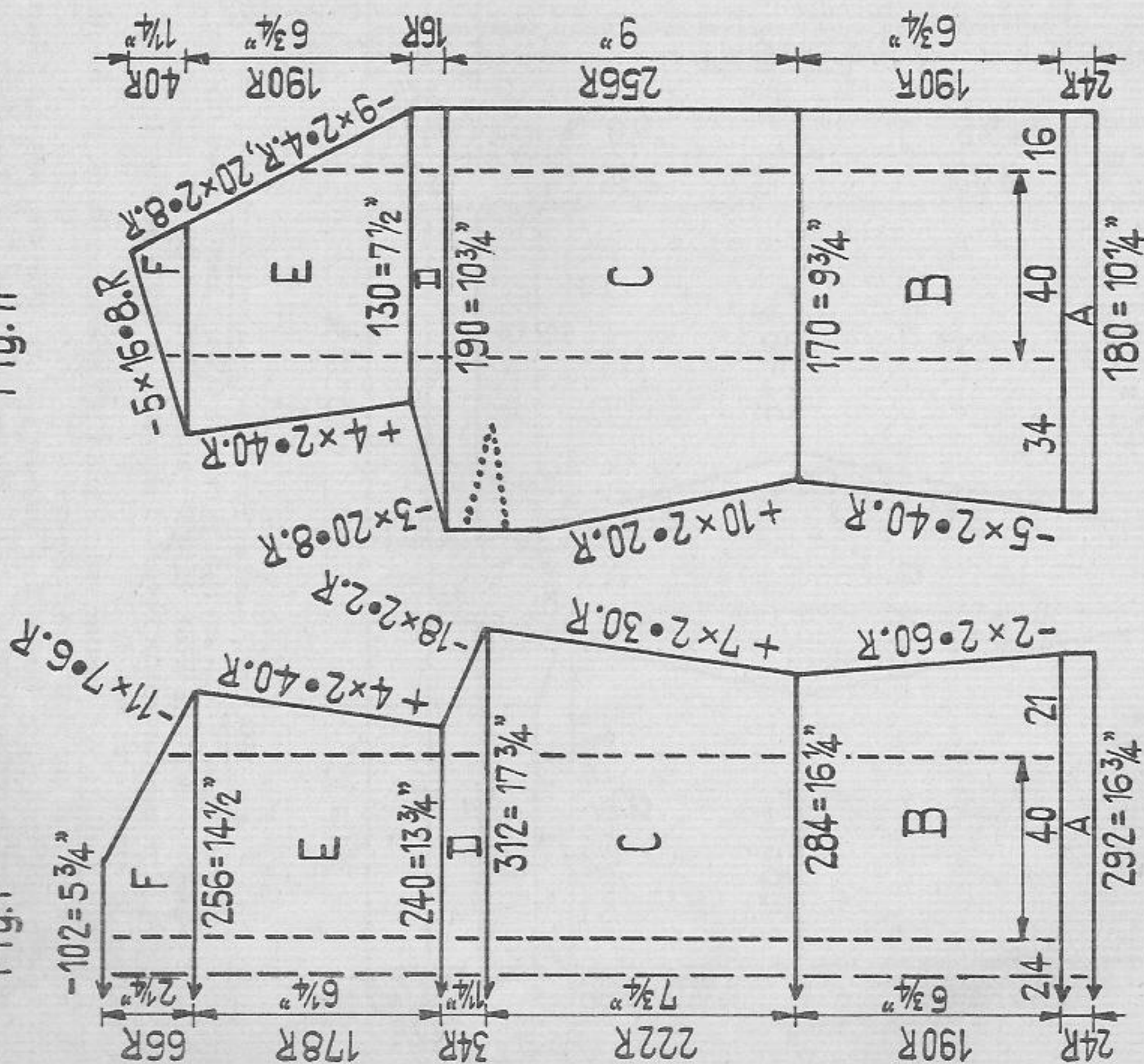

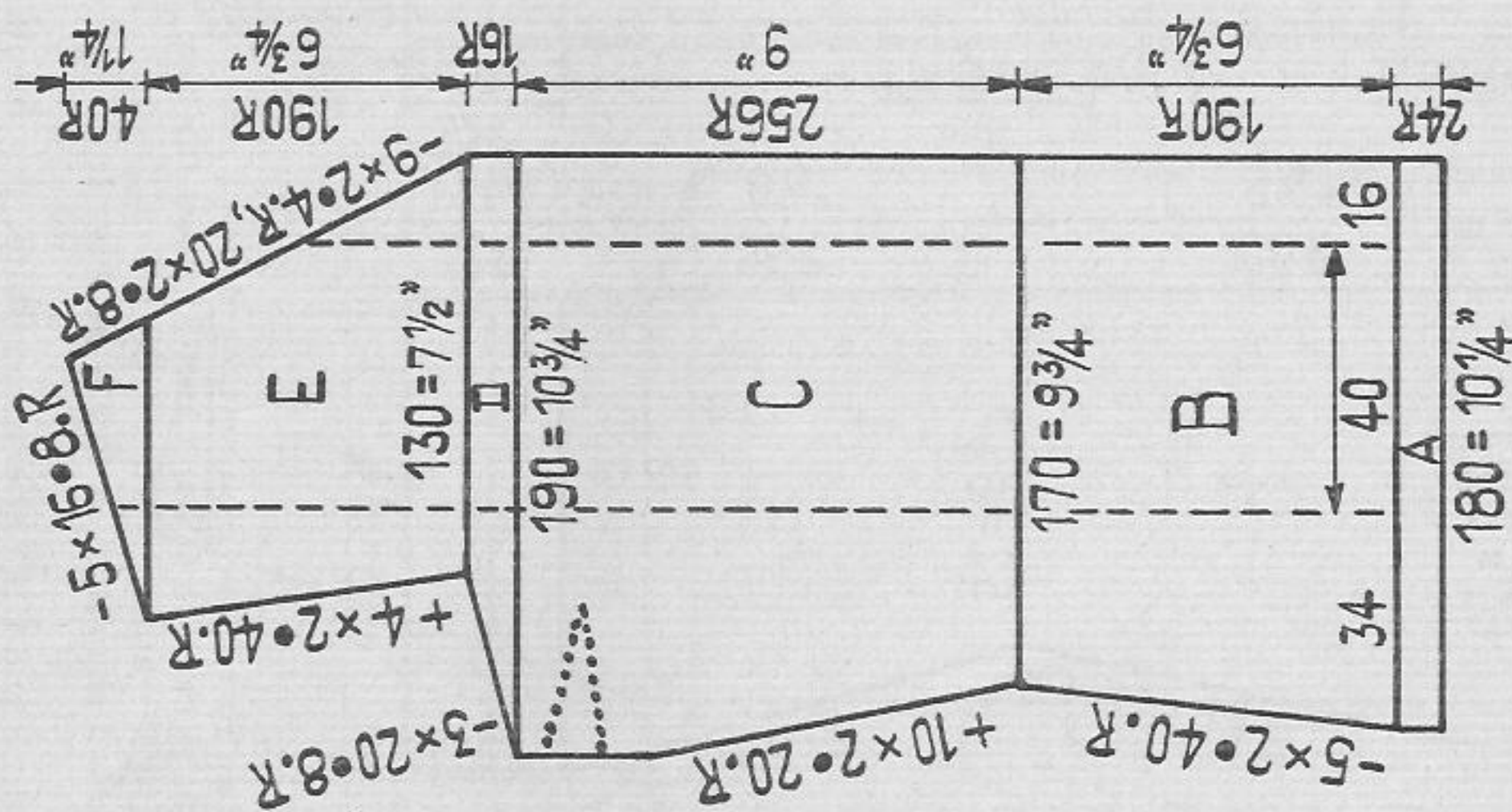


Fig. I: A = border, dark grey. B to F = twice Fairisle pattern according to diagram. Needle division on front bed according to figures on diagram.

 Neck band for front part: Cast on 18 sts with grey, knit 1300 rows alternately 1 row K/K, 2 rows tubular.  
 Sleeve bands: Knit twice. Cast on 18 sts with grey, knit 400 rows same way as neck band.  
 To make up:  
 Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Make darts in front part according to dotted line on diagram. Close side-seams and shoulders. Sew on borders, seam towards inside, leaving in right front part openings for 4 buttonholes. Sew on buttons.

Size: to fit a 39" to 40" bust approx.

Material: 12 1/2 ozs of fine industrial wool, taken twofold; 9 ozs dark grey, 3 1/2 ozs white, 4 buttons

Stitch size: Fairisle pattern 3, borders 1 row K/K, 2 rows tubular St. S 2 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 5 3/4", 100 rows = 3 1/2"

Pattern: on each front, one Fairisle stripe, on the back two Fairisle stripes, with needle division at front bed, according to drawing on diagram

Knit all borders alternately 1 row K/K, 2 rows tubular.

Fairisle diagram:

Jac 40, length stripes ornamental leaves, pattern No. 20

empty square = dark grey, X = white; 1 square = 1 st = 2 rows = RC 4

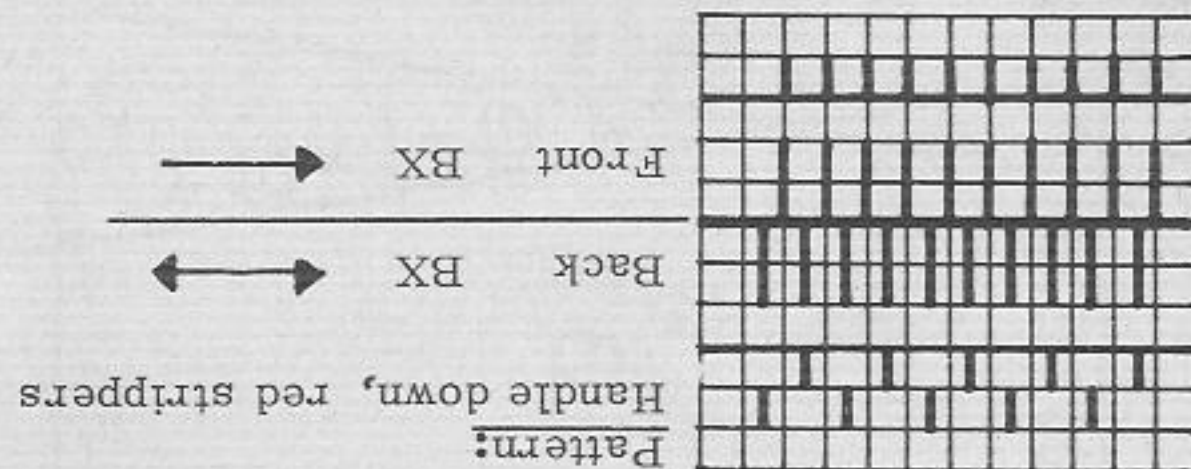
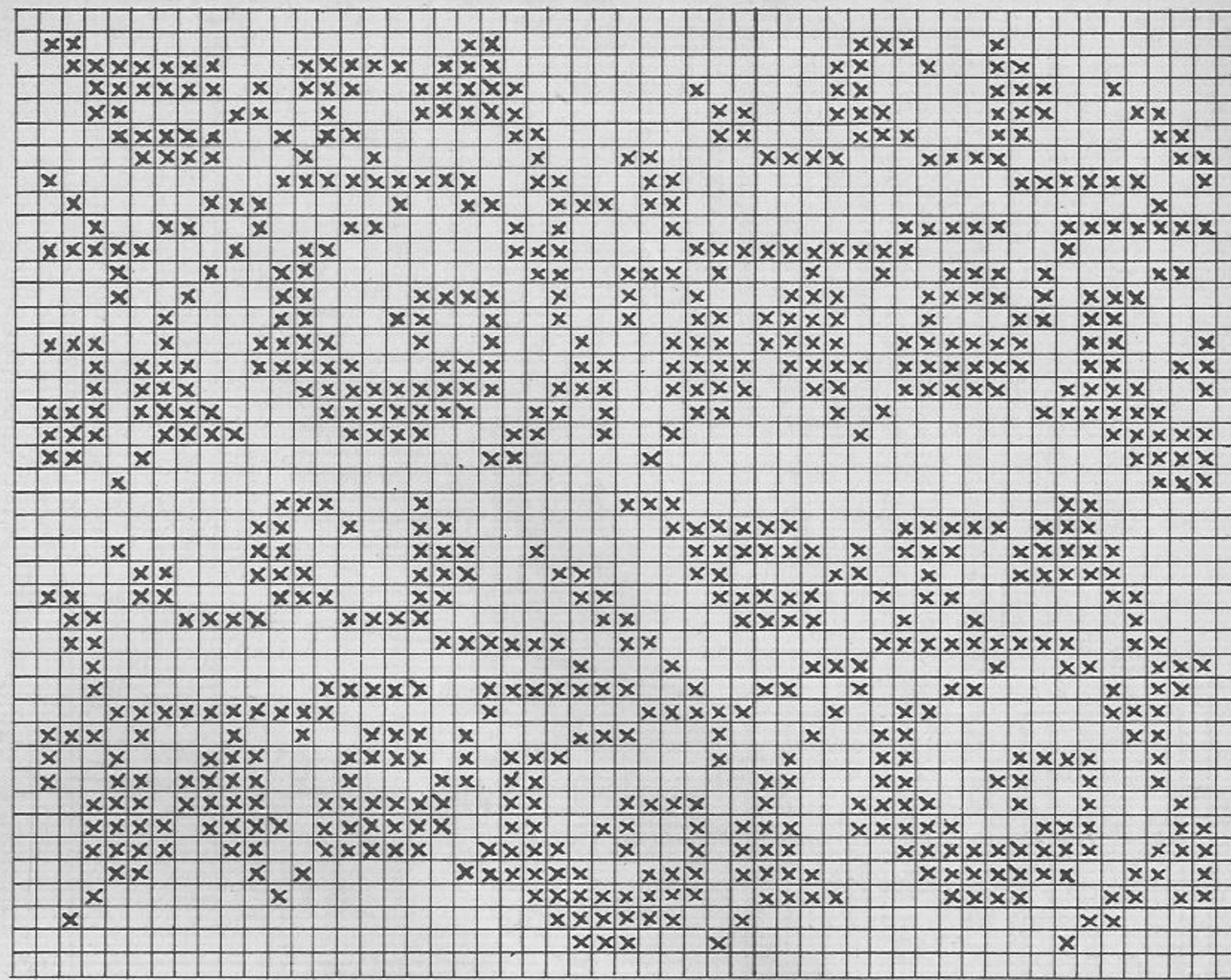

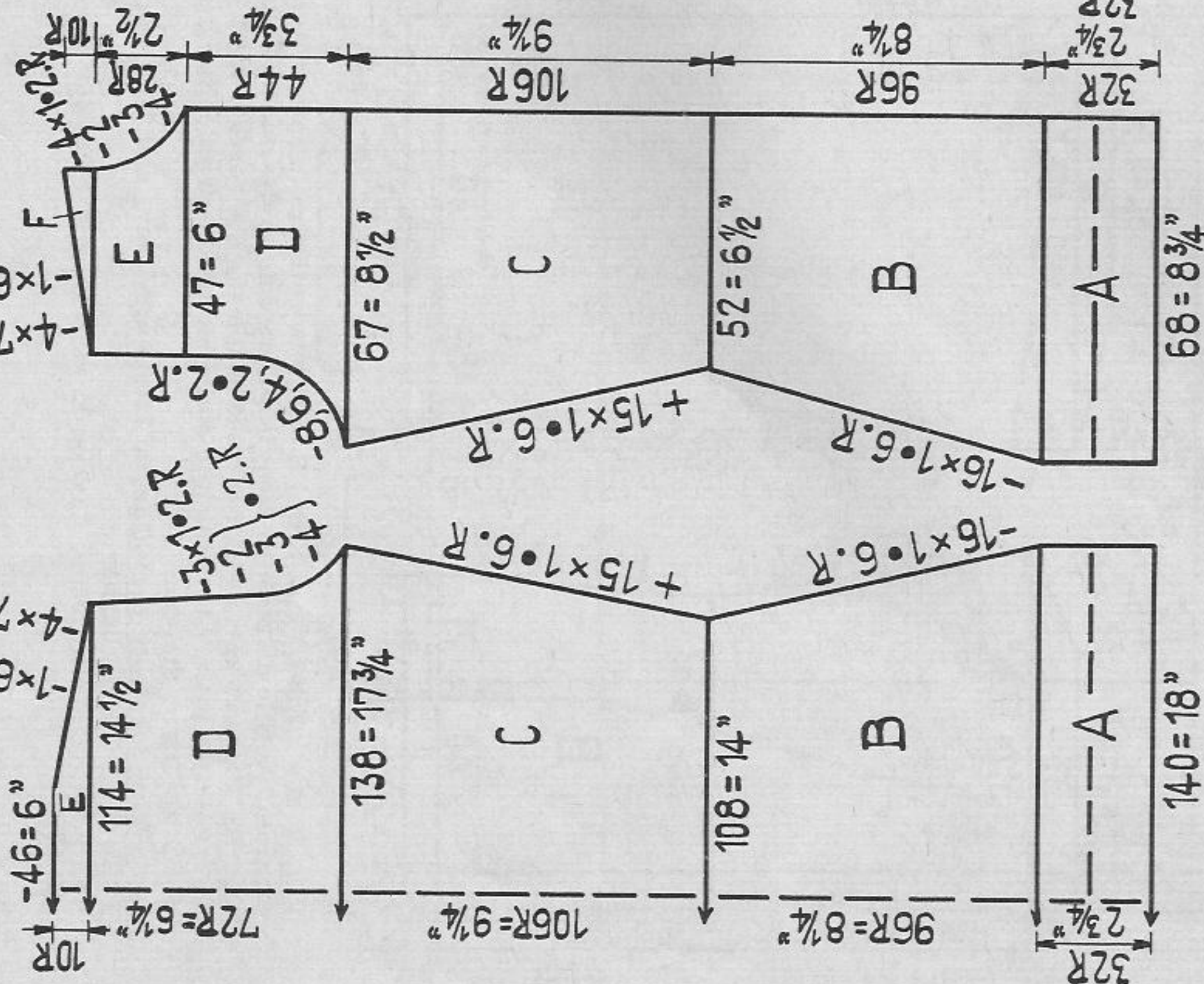

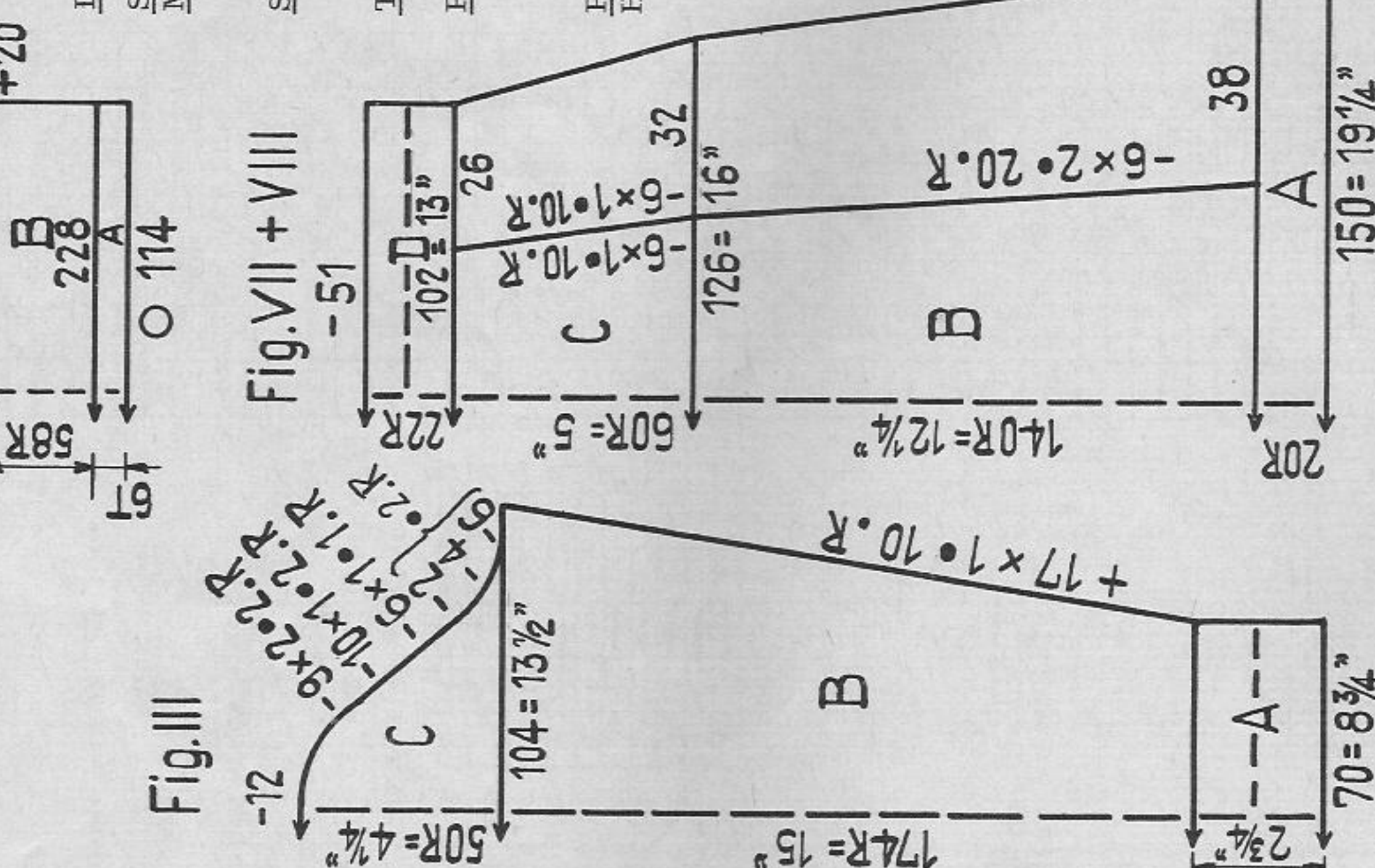


Fig. VII + VIII: Skirt: Knit twice. A = hem, stocking st. B and C = stocking st, knit 20 rows, then make first decrease as follows: transfer 38 sts by 2 nds towards centre, i.e. with double decker, at both ends, hang 38th and 37th sts onto 40th and 39th nds, then, with decker comb, transfer remaining sts onto adjacent nds in two operations. At edge put 2 empty nds out of work into N.P. For second decrease, transfer 37 sts by 2 nds towards centre, for third decrease 36 sts by 2 nds towards centre, etc. D = reduce number of sts to half, i.e. hang st 1 over st 2, st 3 over st 4, etc., knit stocking st in 1:1 division.  
 To make up:  
 Pin out parts to size, press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Sew jacket together and set in sleeves. With top and bottom edges flush with edges of jacket, sew borders on, first outside, then inside, st by st with backstitches, unravel-ling contrast yarn. Attach collar, same way as borders, flush with border. Sew skirt together, making a hem at upper and lower edge and pull elastic through upper hem.

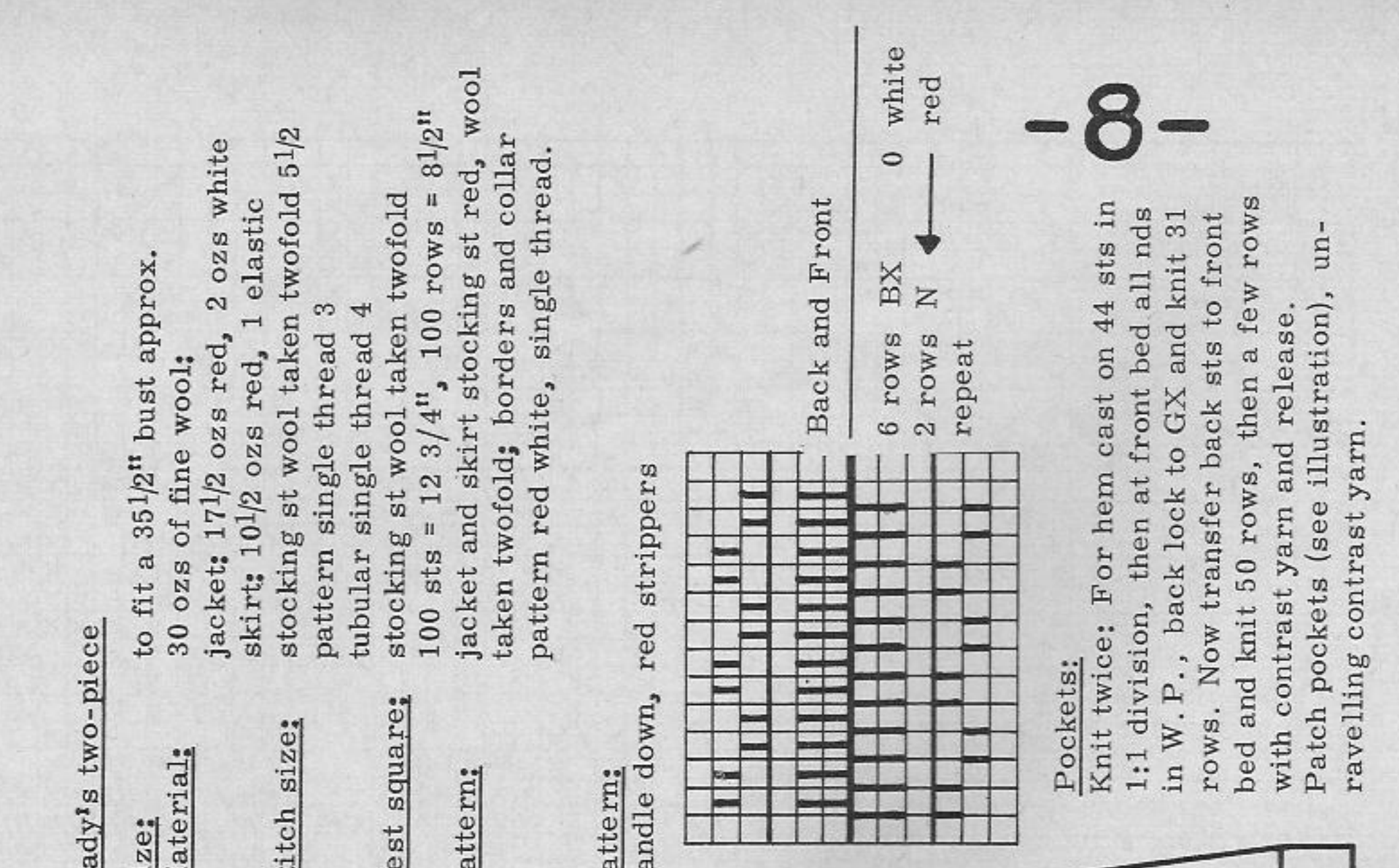


Fig. XI: Collar: A = tubular red. B and C = pattern red white. D = tubular red, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

At left always wind yarn around the next following nd after every 2nd row. Knit border with lock back N, front EX, and 336 rows in pattern straight throughout.

**Second corner:** From \*\* to \*\* lock at right, back BX, front EX, racking every 2nd row: \*\* put all pushers on back bed into W.P. Then, from the left towards the right, put one pusher each on back bed out of work every 2nd row making 1 long st on front bed with contrast yarn. After 68 rows remain 3 sts at right each on back and front bed. \*\* Now repeat first half corner and border.

**Third and fourth corner:** Knit as second corner.

**Final half corner:** Repeat first part of second corner once again from \*\* to \*\* and cast off loosely.

Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC stocking st and pattern 6 1/2

PASSAP COMBI stocking st and pattern St. S 6 1/2, tension arm 8, yarn brake 4 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 15 3/4", 100 rows = 11 1/2"

Pattern: skirt stocking st brown-green, at waist transfer pattern according to diagram, green-beige, beige, red, blue; upper part stocking st light beige.

Diagram for transfer pattern:

1 square = 1 st = 2 rows = RC 2

After every 2nd row



↗ = transfer st to right  
↖ = transfer st to left  
↑ = nd always knitting  
leave empty nds always in W. P.

Fig. I + II: A = stocking st, brown-green, after 22 rows decrease as follows: at both ends decrease 1 st each. The 2 sts on edge nds to be counted as 1 st each. Now at both ends, counting from edges towards centre, transfer sts 25 to 48 by 1 nd to inside using deker comb, then, following these, transfer sts 1 to 24 by 2 nds to inside. Thus, 3 sts have been decreased at both ends, i.e. 6 sts in all. Repeat after every 14th row. B = transfer pattern according to diagram, 6 rows green-beige, 4 rows beige, 4 rows red, 2 rows green-beige, 4 rows beige, 4 rows blue, 4 rows beige, 2 rows green-beige, 2 rows red, 2 rows green-beige, 2 rows beige, 2 rows blue, 2 rows beige, 4 rows green-beige; 44 rows in all. C = stocking st, light beige. Fig. I; D and E = divide work and continue knitting separately with reversed shapings, stocking st, light beige. Fig. II; D = stocking st, light beige. E and F = divide work, stocking st, light beige.

Fig. III: A and B = stocking st, light beige.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Close side-seams and shoulders. Set in sleeves. Round back opening crochet 1 row of firm sts backwards (crab's walk) with light beige and set in zip. Around neck and sleeves crochet 3 rows of firm sts with brown-green, then crochet a 4th row backwards (crab's walk). Turn up 1 1/2" hem and put in lining, if required.

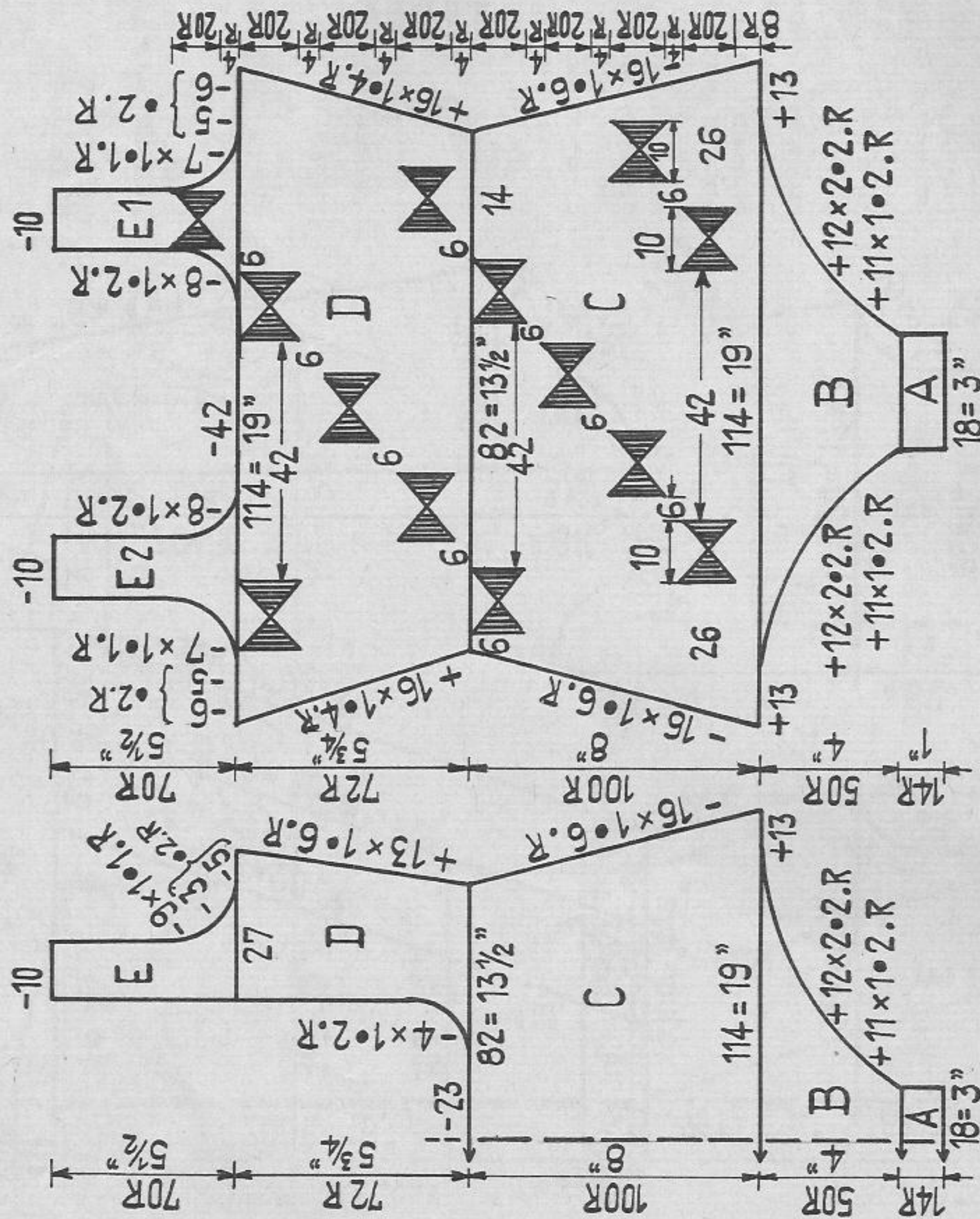
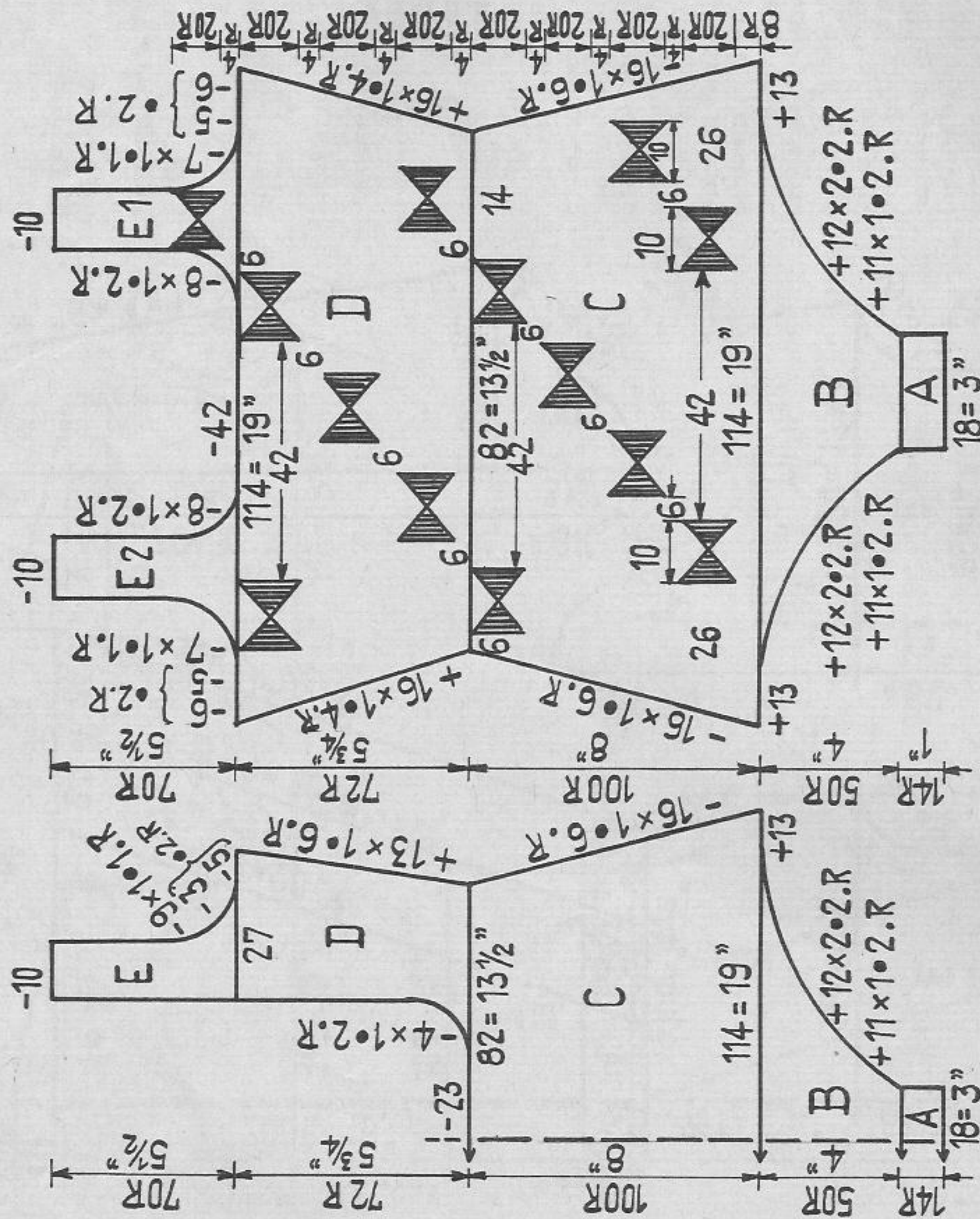

To make up:

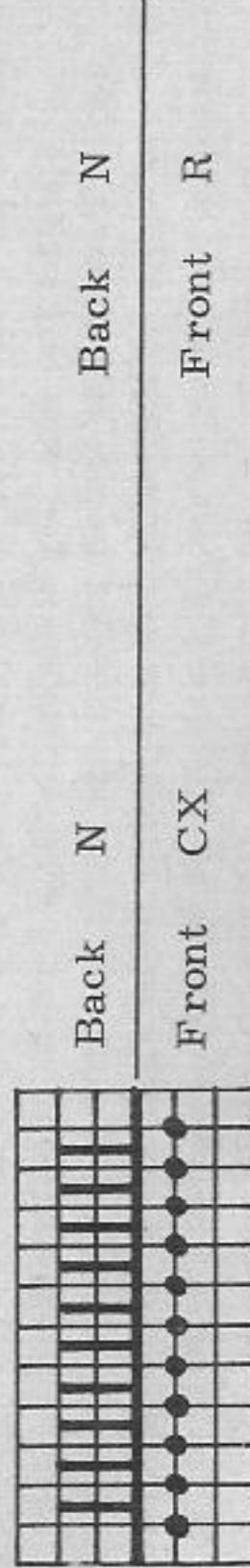

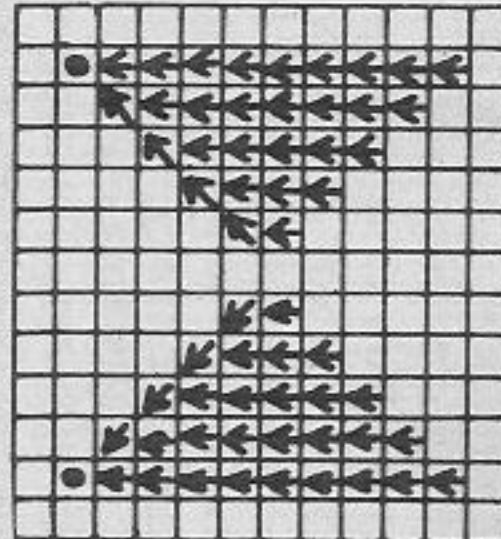

Fig. II - front: Cast on with contrast yarn. A and B = stocking st, on back bed. C and D = pattern, on front bed. Pattern designs according to diagram. E = divide work, knit at first E 1 with pattern, then E 2 without pattern, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

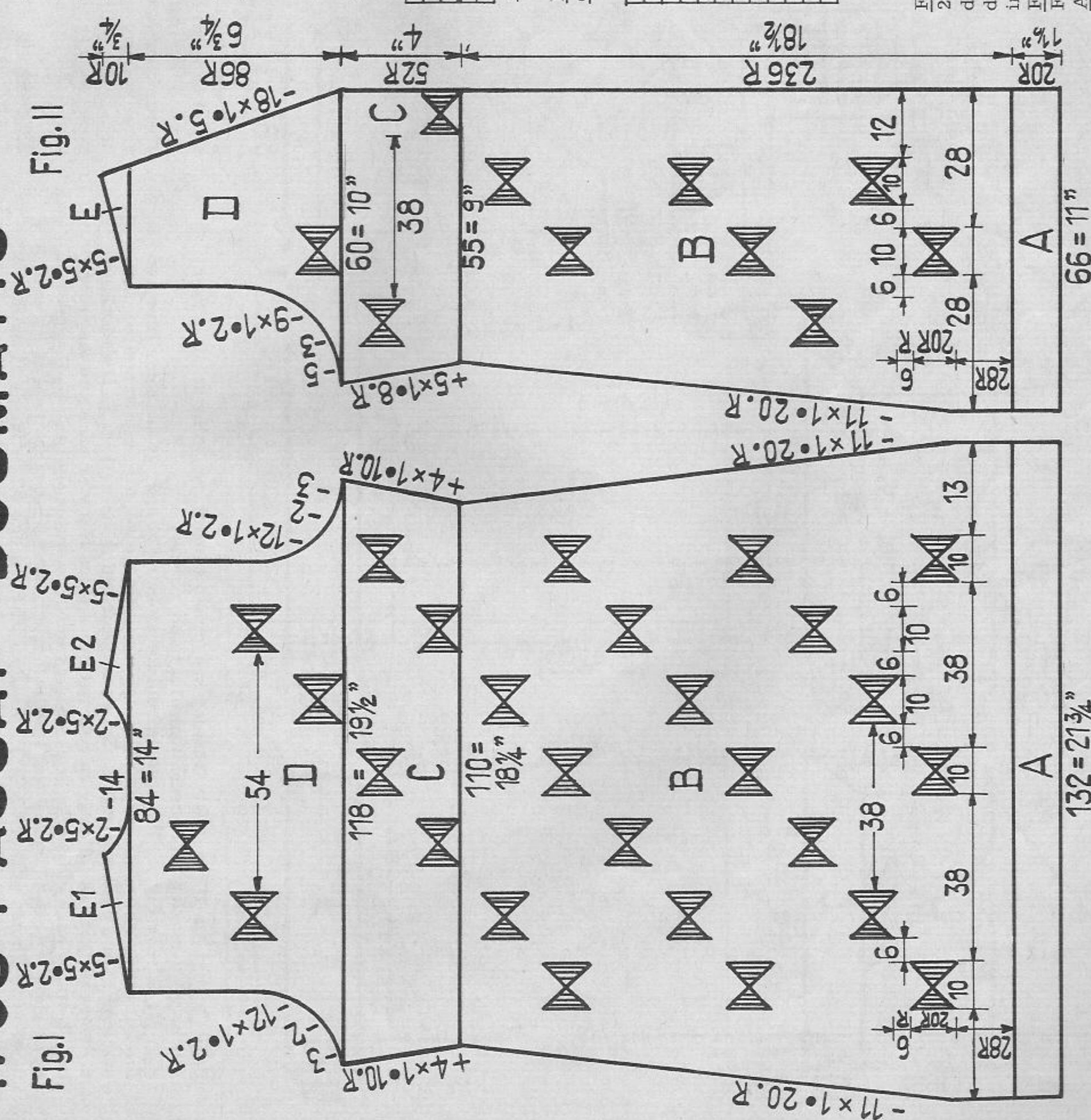

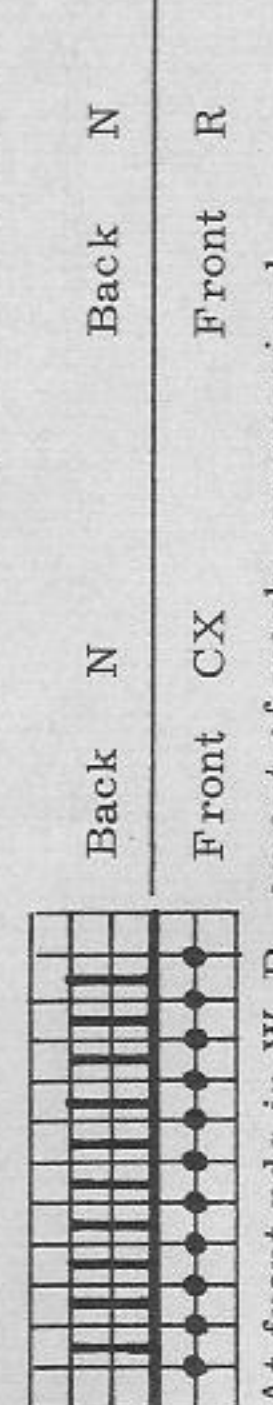

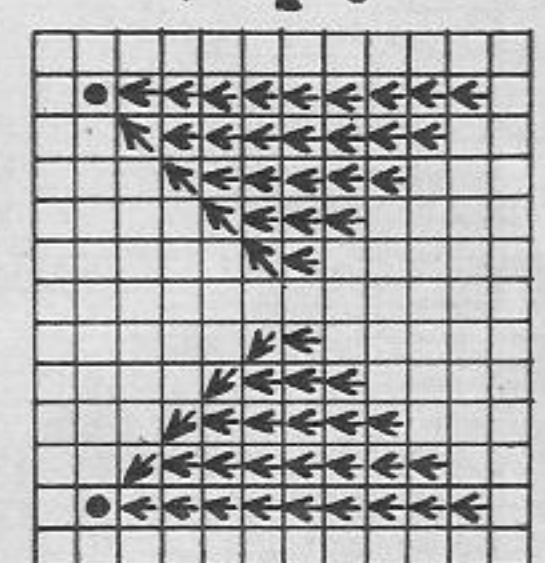

Test square: 100 sts = 16 1/2", 100 rows = 7 3/4"  
Pattern: jacket stocking st all on back bed, pattern designs on front bed according to diagram. Count sts on back bed only.

Armhole bands: Knit twice. Cast on 102 sts for 1:1 rib, knit 20 rows and a few rows with contrast yarn, release.  
Neck bands for front: Knit 3 times, as armhole bands, with 178 sts.

To make up:  
 Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Close side-seams and shoulders. Oversew armhole bands to inside, fold in half and attach to outside st by st with backstitches, unravelling contrast yarn. Join neck and front bands and sew to outside, along neck and front, st by st with backstitches, unravelling contrast yarn.

**Size:** to fit a 39 1/2" chest approx.  
**Material:** 12 1/4 ozs of medium Crylor yarn  
**Stitch size:** stocking st 5 1/4, pattern front 5 1/4, back 2 1/2, 1:1 rib 2 1/2  
**Test square:** 100 sts = 13 1/2", 100 rows = 9"  
**Pattern:** stocking st with two pattern stripes and pockets on the front

**Pattern stripes:**  
 Handle up, black strippers

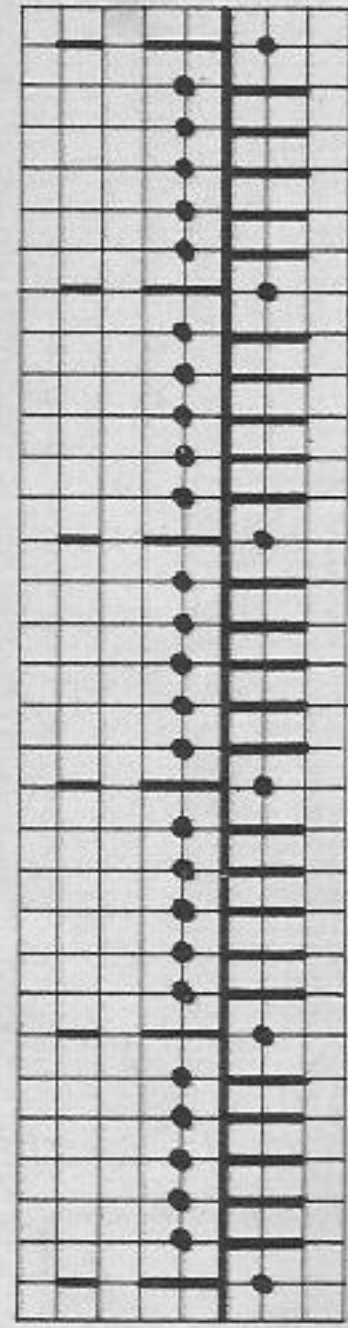

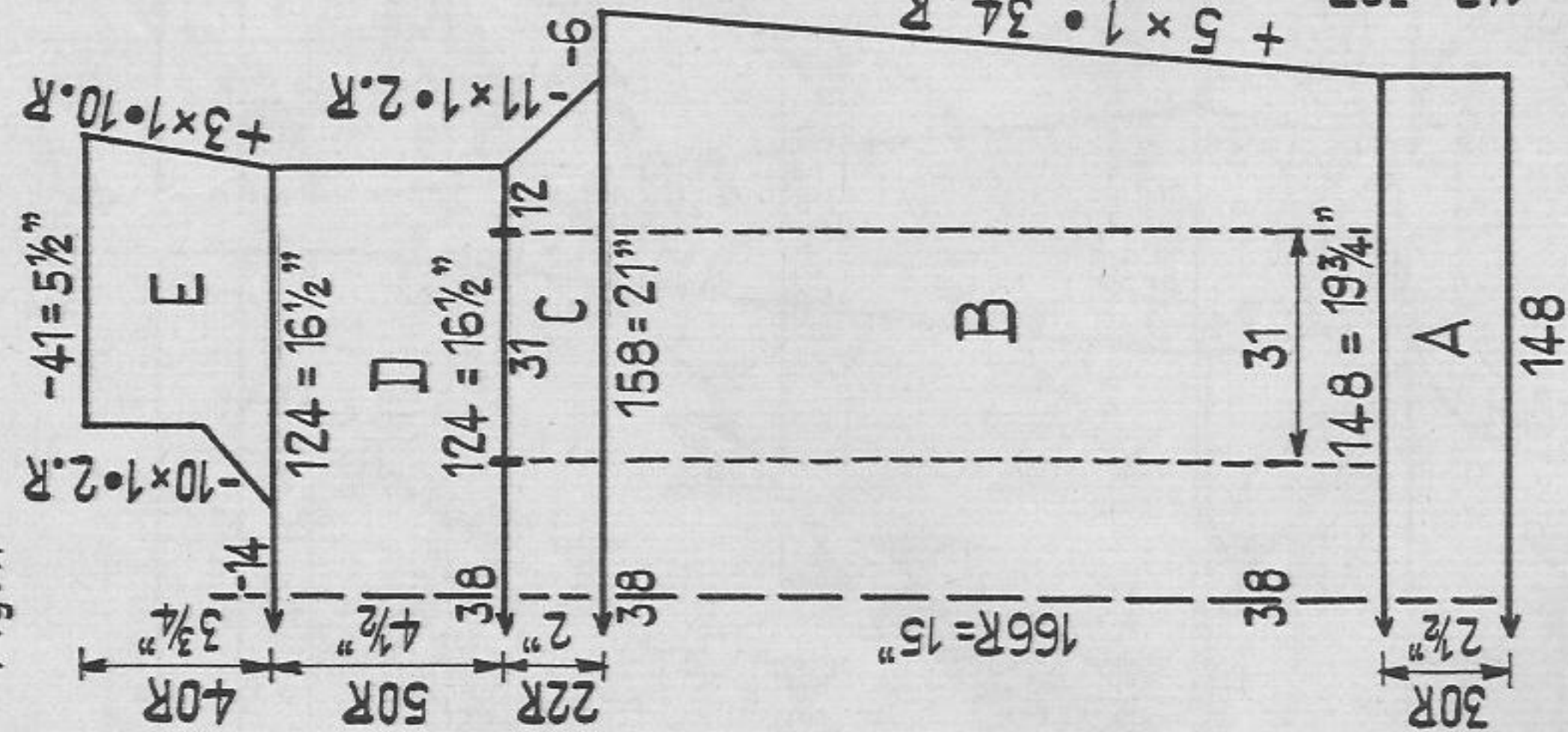

Put pushers in W.P. under 12 nds at left, 38 nds in centre and 12 nds at right. Knit 2 rows contrast at BX on these nds. Return pushers to N.P. Now put pushers into W.P. under 31 pattern-stripe nds at left, replace Crylor, bring 31 nds to W.P. at the back and knit 1 row N/BX with stitch size 2. Now lock at left, GX/BX stitch size 5 1/4, continue knitting

18 rows for pocket flaps on front bed. Transfer all sts from back to front and, again on front bed, knit 60 rows for pocket. Break off yarn and, on left side, knit second flap and pocket. When both pockets are completed, put lock to the extreme right, unravel contrast yarn and continue in stocking st. E = divide work and continue knitting separately with reversed shapings, knit stocking st, decreasing at neck with triple decker.

**Neckbinding:** Cast on 144 sts for 1:1 rib, knit 32 rows 1:1 rib, a few rows with contrast yarn and release.

**To make up:**

Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Assemble shirt and set in sleeves. Attach neck binding to outside st by st with backstitches, unravelling contrast yarn, and sew half to inside.

**Stitch size:** PASSAP DUOMATIC sweater front 5, back 2 1/2;

2:2 rib borders: St. S 3, tubular at neck 4 1/2

PASSAP COMBI sweater front 2 1/2, back 5, tension arm 8,  
yarn brake 5; 2:2 rib borders: as for Duomatic

**Test square:** 100 sts = 12 1/2", 100 rows = 7 3/4"

**Pattern:** knit entire sweater in Fisherman's rib with racking, arrange  
pattern starting at centre; all borders in 2:2 rib, handle down.

**Fig. I:** A = 2:2 rib, B to D = transfer sts for pattern, pattern.

**Fig. II:** A to C = as Fig. I. D and E = divide work and continue knitting separately  
with reversed shapings, pattern.

**Fig. III:** A to E = pattern; at E from left side, cast off gradually. Work second  
sleeve with reversed shaping.

**Neck band:** With St. S 3, cast on 188 sts and knit 8 rows in 2:2 rib. Then put all  
nds into W. P. and, with 300 sts and St. S 4 1/2, knit 24 rows tubular. Knit a few  
rows with contrast yarn and release.

**To make up:**

Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Assemble  
sweater and set in sleeves. Attach neck band by tubular rows at first to outside,  
then to inside, unravelling contrast yarn.

Pullover to wear with dress 1700A and pleated skirt 1701

Size: to fit a 36 1/4" bust approx.

Material: 7 ozs of fine synthetic yarn, white, an oddment of turquoise wool

Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC stocking st 4, 2:2 rib with handle up 2 1/2  
PASSAP COMBI stocking st St.S 4, tension arm 9, yarn  
brake 4 1/2, 2:2 rib with position lever down St.S 2 1/2, tension  
arm 3, yarn brake 2 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 11 3/4", 100 rows = 7"

Pattern: pullover stocking st white, 2:2 rib with handle up (COMBI  
position lever down), white with turquoise stripes.

Fig. I, II + III: A = 2:2 rib with handle up (COMBI position lever down), 10  
rows white, 4 rows turquoise, 2 rows white, 4 rows turquoise, 8 rows white.  
B = transfer sts for stocking st, stocking st. C = stocking st. D = divide  
work and continue knitting separately with reversed shapings, stocking st.  
E = stocking st.

Collar: For 2:2 rib with handle up (COMBI down), cast on 150 sts in white,  
knit 34 rows white, 4 rows turquoise, 2 rows white, 4 rows turquoise, 8 rows  
white, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up:  
Pin out parts to size, cover with damp cloth and let dry well. Close side-  
seams and shoulders, set in sleeves. Sew collar ends together and attach collar  
along cast-on edge to inside of neck with overhand sts, then fold collar to  
outside and attach it st by st with backstitches 3/4" below the neckline, un-  
ravelling contrast yarn.
