Poncho

Material: 22 ozs medium wool, 11 ozs white, 5 1/2 ozs red, 5 1/2 ozs green. 137", approx. of white Bobble fringing

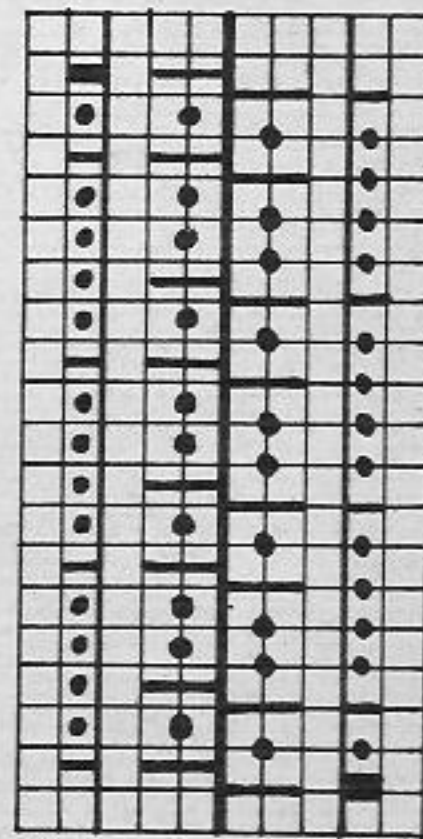
Stitch size: pattern 4 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 18", 100 rows = 6"

Pattern: Knit two equal parts. 42 rows of each colour in the following sequence: white, red, white, green and so on. For each part cast on 144 sts and knit 630 rows, then cast off.

Pattern:

Handle down, red strippers. Pay attention to edge pushers.



Back and Front

2 rows N

4 rows AX

Rack 1 nd to left

2 rows N

4 rows AX

Rack 1 nd to right

Repeat.

To make up. Sew cast off edge of one part to side edge of other part, repeat. See that lower edges are flush, leaving the necessary neck opening at upper edge of poncho. See diagram and illustration.

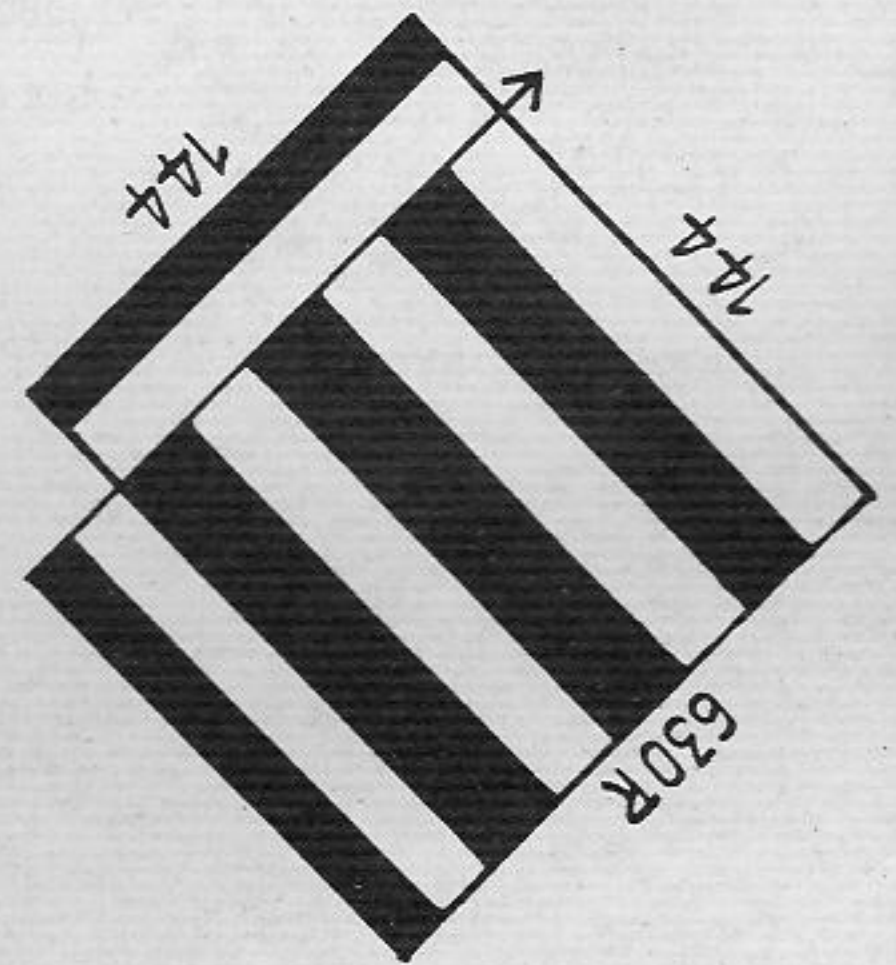

Before starting your work please study carefully the explanations given on pages 1 and 2

Patterns: The drawings refer to half width, the indications of stitch numbers refer to whole width of each part.

Figure I	= back	Figure IX	= pants
Figure II	= front	Figure X	= gusset
Figure III	= sleeve	Figure XI	= scarf
Figure IV	= collar	Figure XII	= cap, bonnet
Figure V	= border, cuff	Figure XIII	= mittens
Figure VI	= pocket	Figure XIV	= socks, stockings
Figure VII	= skirt, front	Figure XV	= straps
Figure VIII	= skirt, back		

If the centre line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is worked simultaneously with reversed shapings, i.e. decreasing or increasing is made on the left as well as on the right side.

If the centre line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is worked separately with reversed shapings, i.e. first knit one part according to diagram (increasing or decreasing at right), then the second part the opposite way (decreasing or increasing at left).

Abbreviations:

Col.	= colour of wool	○	= tubular (or) = half tubular
st, sts	= stitch, stitches	●	= every (in every row)
St.S	= stitch size	×	= times
Nd, nds	= needle, needles	+	= increase
R	= row	-	= decrease, cast off
T	= 2 rows	▲	= graduations (short rows)
		■	= for open work row hang st to the next nd, leave empty nd in W.P.

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter "st"). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working Position on back and front bed.

Exception: For tubular or half tubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed. The same number of needles must therefore be put into Working Position on the other bed. In these cases the sign for tubular \bigcirc respectively (or) for half tubular is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increase or decrease always occurs in the first row of a section.

- $+ 3 \times 2 \cdot 8 \cdot R$ means: increase 2 stitches 3 times in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- $- 19 \times 3 \cdot 7 \cdot R$ means: decrease 3 stitches 19 times in every 7th row (back 2 stitches, front 1 stitch or vice versa).
- $- 17 \times 1 \cdot 2 / 3 \cdot R$ means: decrease 1 stitch 17 times, alternately once after 2 rows and once after 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle - 4 \times 8 \cdot 2 \cdot R$ means: work graduations, i. e. short rows (on DUO with pushers and lock BX). Step by step put 8 nds (and their respective pushers) into Rest Position 4 times after every 2nd row (for double bed 4 nds each back and front). Once all graduations are finished, continue knitting normally, i. e. all nds in Working Position (pushers in Neutral Position).

Graduations can be knitted two ways, either from outer edge towards centre (gradual decreasing with the minus-sign "-" after the black triangle) or from the centre towards outer edge (gradual increasing with the plus-sign "+" after the black triangle.)

Number of stitches and inches:

- $136 = 8''$ means: a total of 136 sts (for K/K 68 stitches each on back and front) make a width of 8".
- $\bigcirc 146 = 17''$ means: cast on 146 sts each on back and front bed for tubular which makes a width of 17".

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be tested by you, by making your own test square for your own wool.

Test square: We strongly recommend that you make always a test square with your own material before starting to work, in order to calculate for your material the necessary numbers of stitches and rows along the PASSAP - chart. The chapter "The test square and its calculation" in your instruction book informs you how to proceed for these calculations. This is very important, especially when adjusting a model to another size.

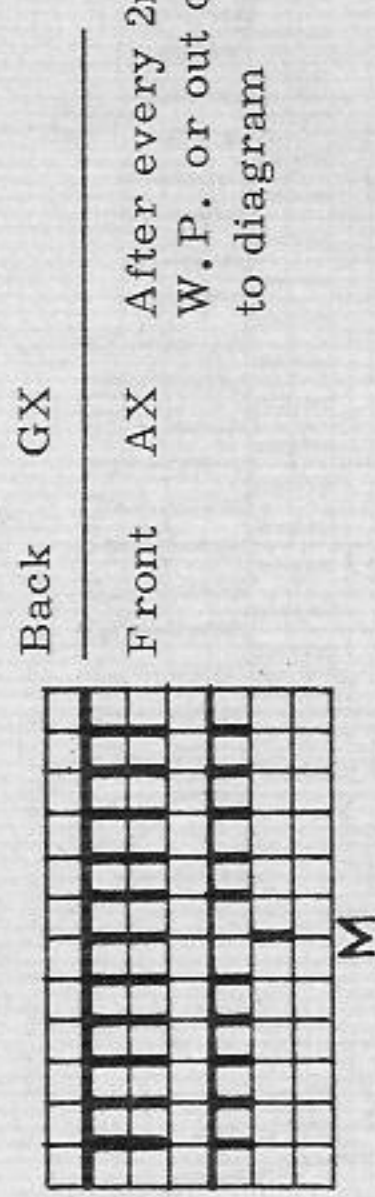


Girl's sweater

Size: to fit a 23 1/2" to 24 1/2" chest approx., age abt. 5 to 6 years
Material: 5 1/4 ozs of medium to thick wool with shiny yarn, white, 3 buttons
Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC stocking st and pattern 6, 1:1 rib 3 1/2
 PASSAP COMBI stocking st and pattern St. S 6, tension arm 8, yarn brake 3 1/2, 1:1 rib St. S 3 1/2, tension arm 2, yarn brake 2 1/2
Test square: 100 sts = 15", 100 rows = 9 3/4"
Pattern: sweater stocking st, wrong side outwards, at front pattern according to diagram and stocking st.

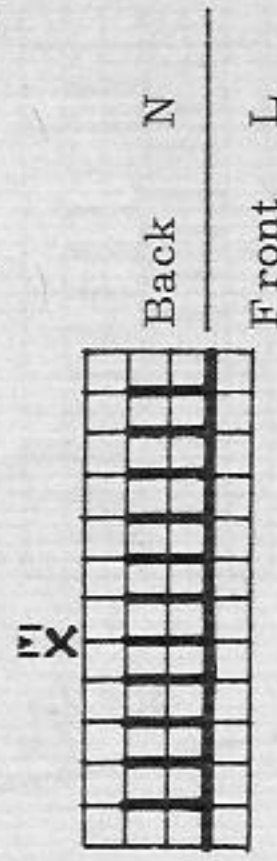

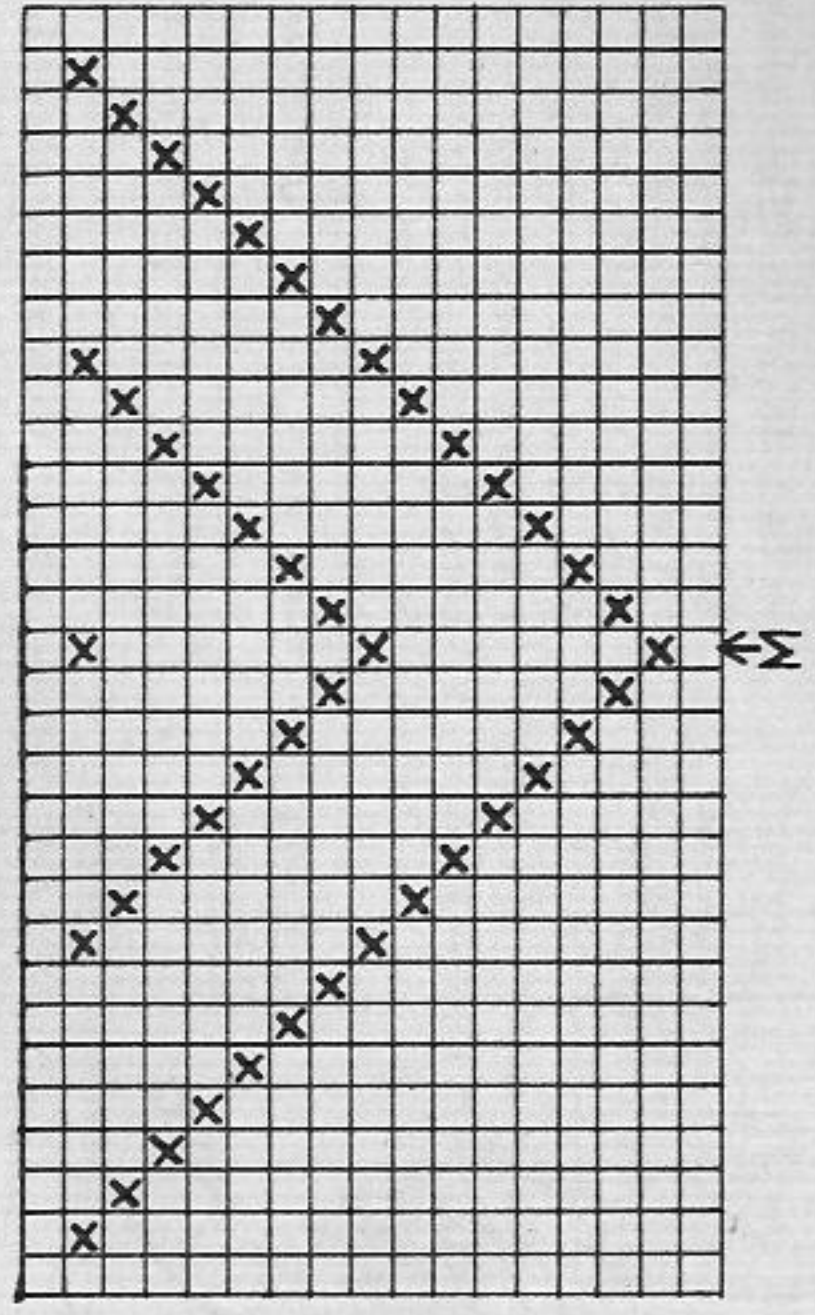


Fig. I + III: A = 1:1 rib. B to E = transfer sts for stocking st, stocking st.

Fig. II: A = 1:1 rib. B = transfer sts for stocking st. With PASSAP DUOMATIC; put pushers in W.P., then knit pattern in centre according to diagram and at both ends stocking st. C and D = pattern and stocking st. E = divide work and continue knitting separately with reversed shapings, let pattern taper off, stocking st. F = stocking st.

Collar: Cast on 40 sts for 1:1 rib. Knit 26 rows, a few rows with contrast yarn and release.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Sew sweater together, leaving an opening of 3" at left shoulder. Attach collar to outside st by st with backstitch, unravelling contrast yarn, then seam half to inside. Make 2 rows of single crochet around shoulder opening, making 3 loops on the front and sew on 3 buttons on back shoulder.

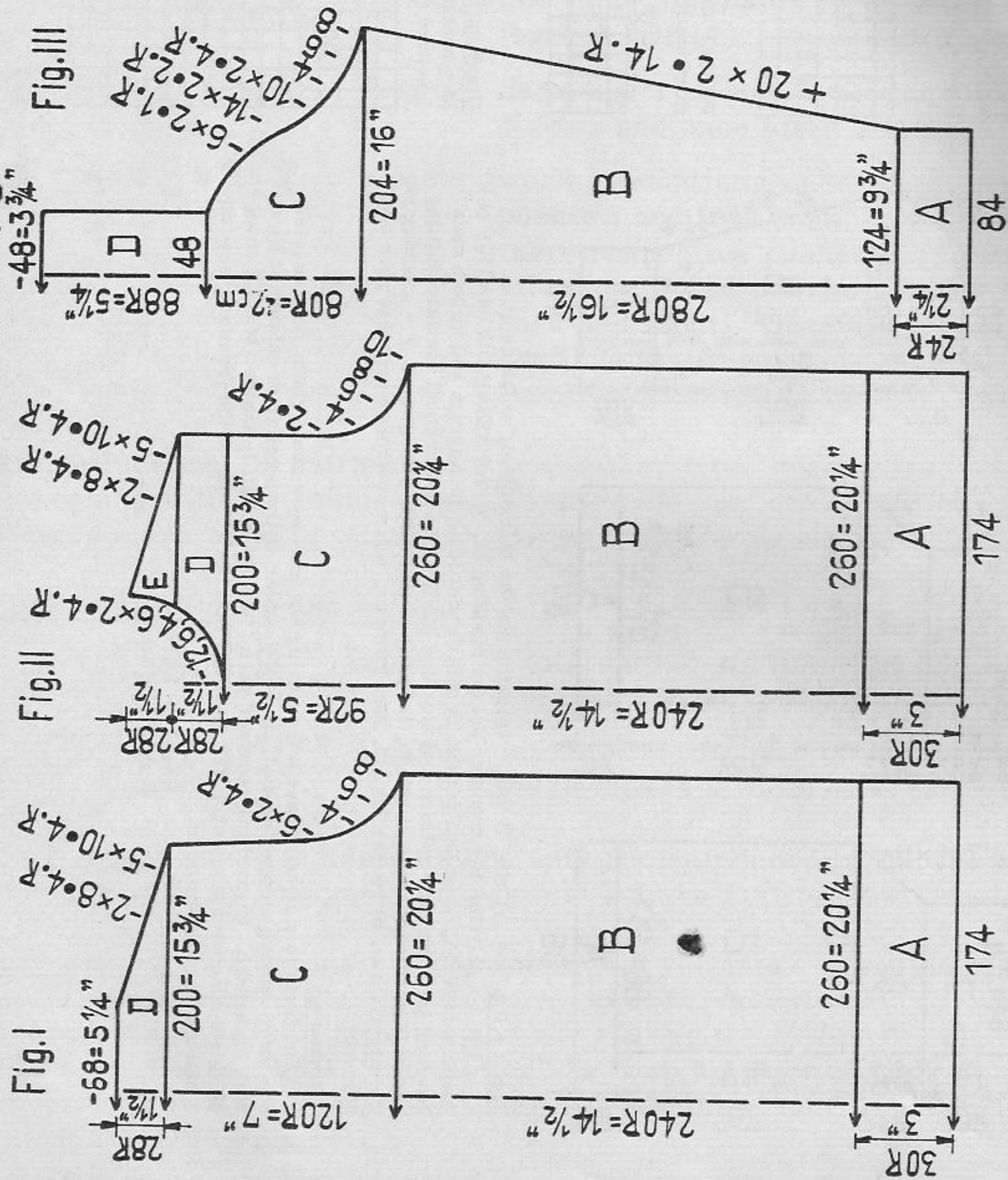


Fig. I: A = 2:2 rib, double thread. B = nds for pattern in W.P. Pattern. C and D = pattern.

Fig. III: A = as Fig. I, however, in centre transfer sts for cable pattern 2, knit pattern and cable pattern. C and D = pattern and cable pattern.

Collar: Single thread, cast on 204 sts for 2:2 rib, knit 46 rows, then a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Close side-seams and seams of sleeves, then attach section D of sleeve to shoulder between Fig. I and II and set in sleeves. Oversew collar to neck along cast on edge, fold to outside and sew to outside st by st with backstitch 1/2" below neck-seam, unravelling contrast yarn.

Man's sweater with cable pattern

Size: to fit a 38 1/2" to 39 1/4" chest approx.

Material: 21 ozs of fine Shetland wool

Stitch size:

PASSAP DUOMATIC pattern with single thread, back 3, front 3 1/2, 2:2 rib collar with single thread 2 1/2, welts in 2:2 rib with double thread 4 1/2
 PASSAP COMBI pattern with single thread St.S back 3, front 3 1/2, 2:2 rib collar with single thread St.S 2 1/2, welts in 2:2 rib with double thread 4 1/2, tension arm 2, yarn brake 2 1/2
 100 sts = 7 3/4", 100 rows = 6"

Sweater in pattern. Front and sleeves with cable pattern, borders and collar 2:2 rib.

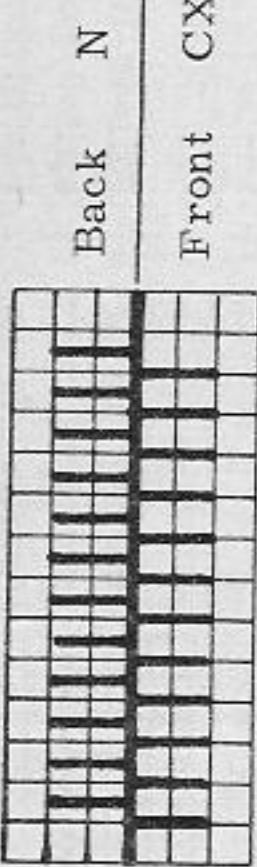
Attention!

Knit sweater and collar with single thread, welts in 2:2 rib at sweater with double thread. On front and on sleeves count also empty nds, as if they were working.

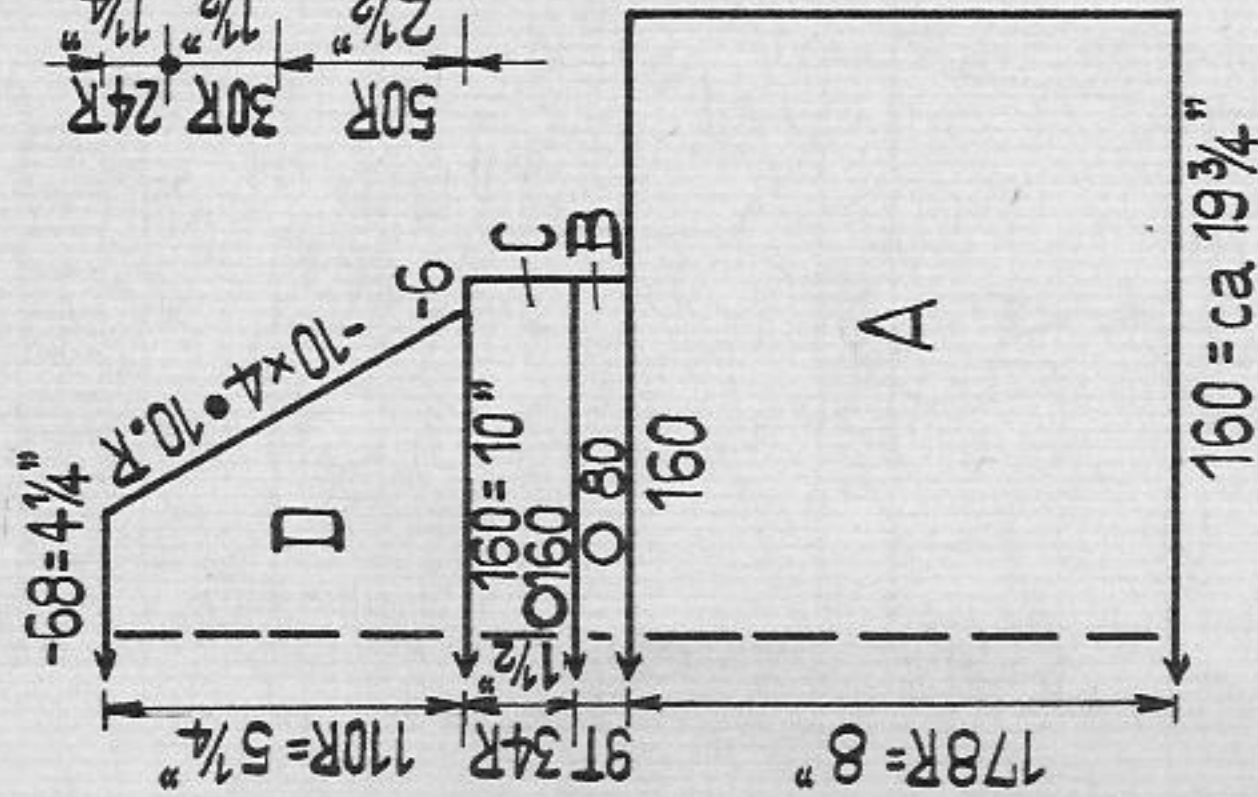

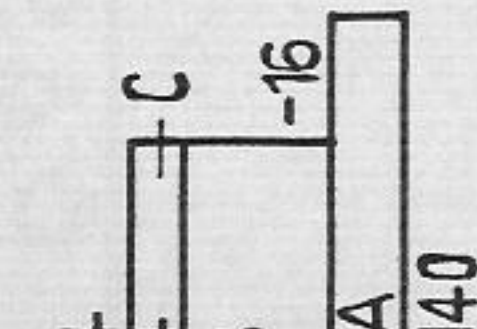

To make up:

Do not press! Close side and sleeve seams, sew sleeves in place. Attach cast-off edges of collar along collar ends. Front ends being flush with front opening, stitch collar at first to outside, then to inside, st by st with back stitches, unravelling contrast yarn. Along front opening, work 1 row of single crochets and close at neck with button and loop. Twist a 47" cord and pull through tubular rows at waist. Fasten two pompons to cord ends.

Child's dress

Size: age abt. 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 years

Material: 8 3/4 ozs of fine Orlon yarn or fine wool, taken twofold, 1 gold button

Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC pattern 1 for skirt 2 1/2, pattern 2 for upper part and sleeves 1 1/2, tubular 4 1/2
 PASSAP COMBI pattern 1 for skirt St.S 2 1/2, tension arm 2, yarn brake 2 1/2, pattern 2 for upper part and sleeves St.S 1 1/2, tension arm 2, yarn brake 2 1/2, tubular St.S 4 1/2, tension arm 10, yarn brake 4 1/2

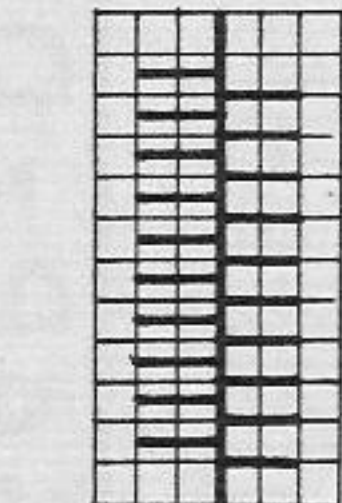

Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC pattern 4 1/2, 2:2 rib borders 3
 PASSAP COMBI pattern St. S 4 1/2, tension arm 9, yarn brake 4 1/2,
 2:2 rib borders St. S 3, tension arm 2, yarn brake 2 1/2
Test square: 100 sts = 12 1/2", 100 rows = 8"

Pattern: blouse in pattern, with crochet trimming around neck line and armholes, purl side to outside.

Crochet trimming: Make 4 rows of single crochet, inserting crochet hook into back of stitch only in 2nd, 3rd and 4th row. 5th row: make 1 double crochet into each of 1st and 2nd sts, miss 4 sts, make 6 double crochets into 7th st, miss 4 sts, make 1 double crochet into each of 12th and 13th sts, 6 double crochets into 18th st, etc.

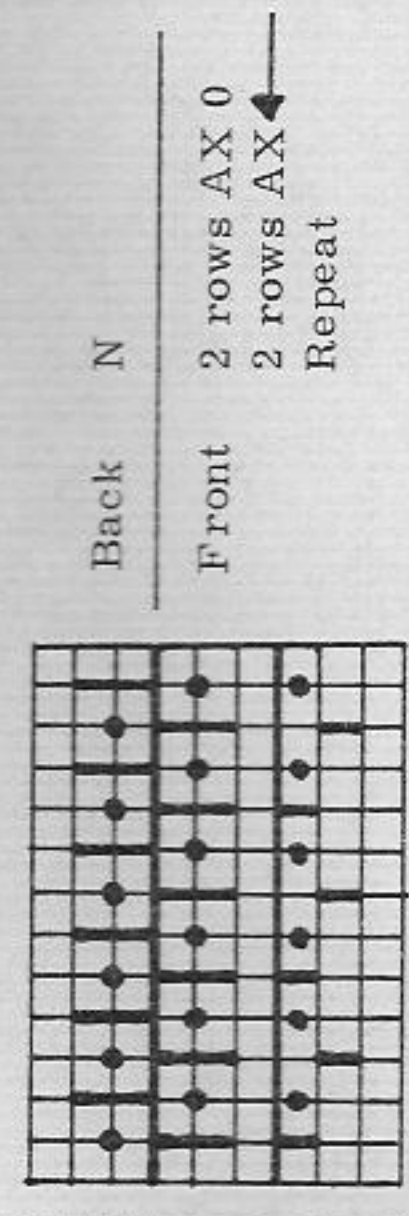
Fig. I + II: A = 2:2 rib borders. B = transfer sts for pattern, pattern, C and D = pattern, decreasing at armholes and neck line with treble decker. Fig. II at E and F = pattern.

To make up:
 Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Close side and sleeve seams. Work crochet trimming around neck line and armholes.

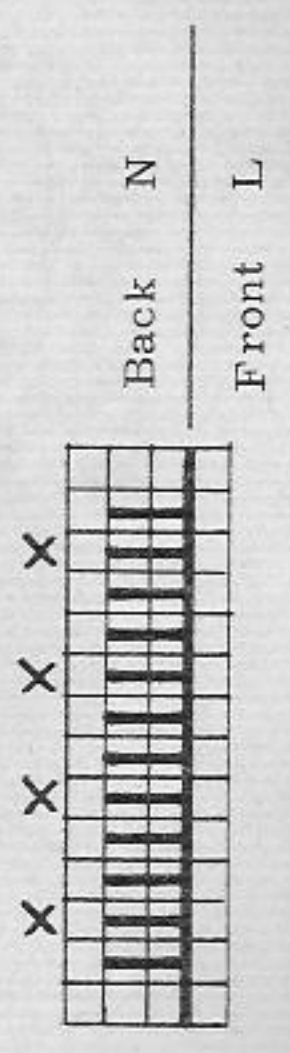

Size: to fit a 33" to 34" bust approx.
Material: 19 1/4 ozs of fine industrial wool, taken fourfold; 15 3/4 ozs yellow and 1 3/4 ozs of each of dark blue and white wool
Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC stocking st 4 1/2, tubular 4
 PASSAP COMBI stocking st St.S 4 1/2, tubular St.S 4, tension arm 8, yarn brake 4
Test square: 100 sts = 11 1/2", 100 rows = 7 1/4"
Pattern: Entire dress is worked with yarn taken fourfold; dress in stocking st, bodice and sleeve borders tubular.

Fig. I: A = border tubular, dark blue. B = transfer sts for stocking st, knit 4 rows white in stocking st, 2 rows yellow, 6 rows dark blue, 2 rows yellow, 4 rows white, then yellow throughout. D and E = stocking st, decreasing with treble decker. F = stocking st, shoulder with graduations. G = stocking st, ending with a few rows contrast yarn, release.

Fig. II: A to H = as for Fig. I, but divide work at E and continue knitting separately with reversed shapings, stocking st.

Fig. III: A to C = as for Fig. I, decreasing with treble decker.

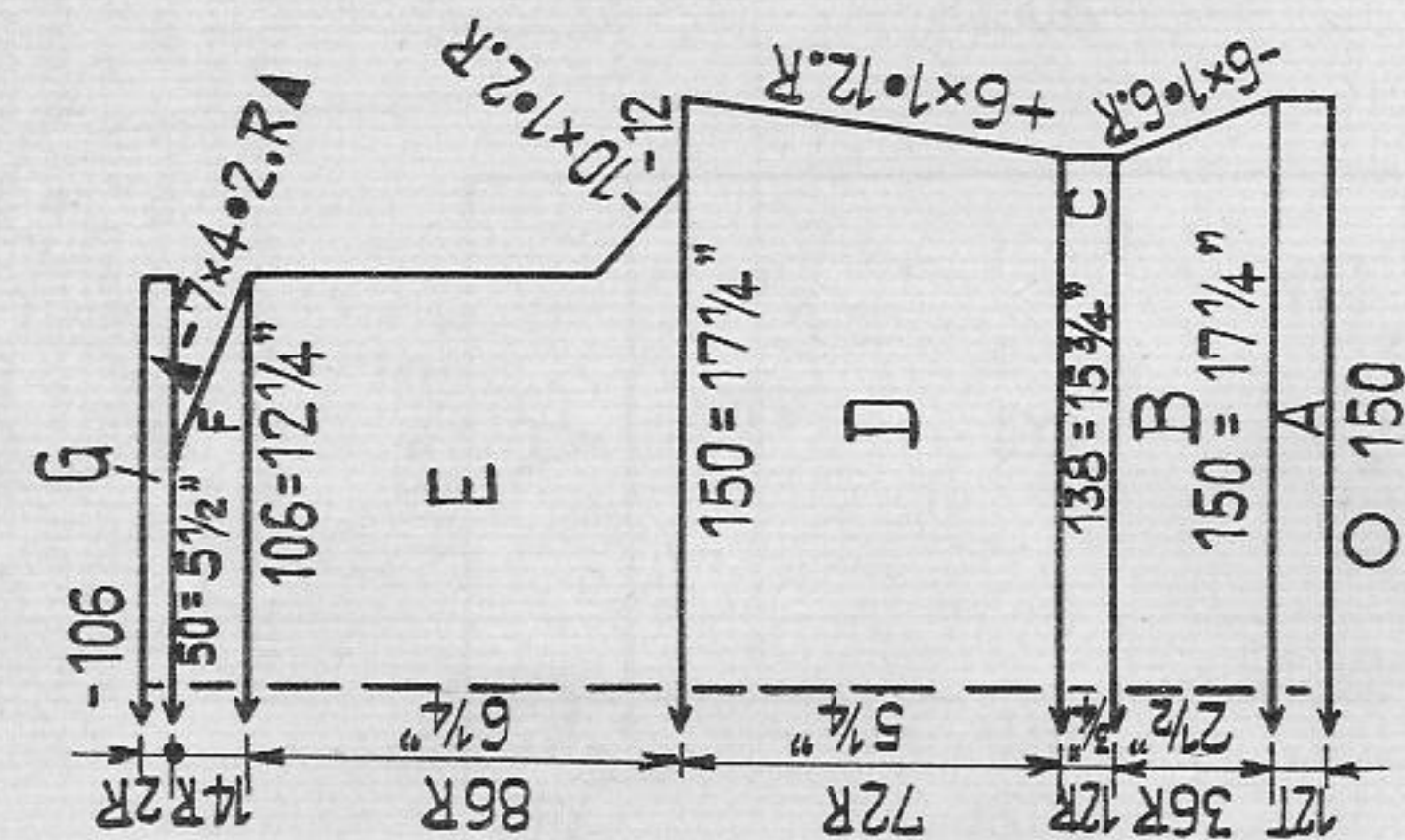

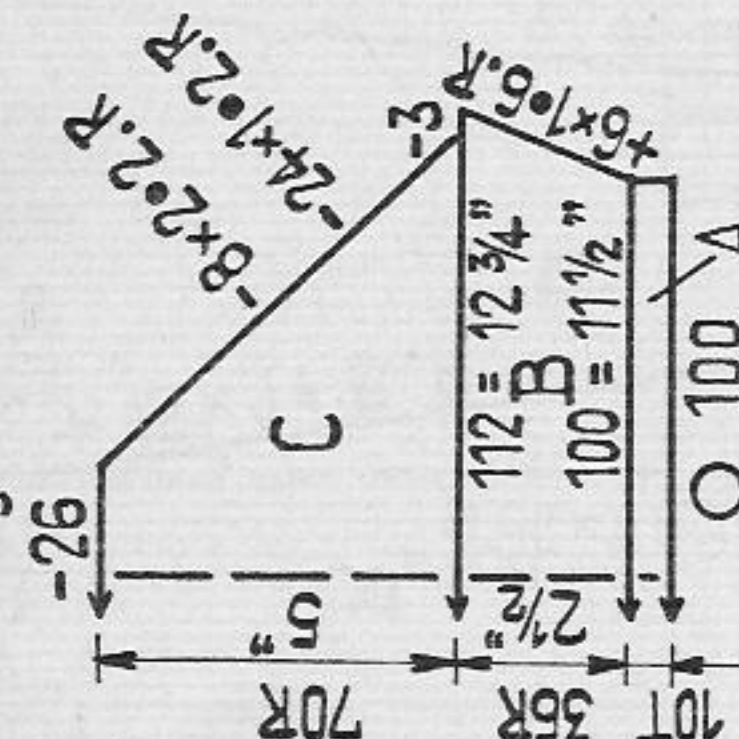


Fig. VII - skirt: Work crosswise to body, i.e. begin with lengthwise edge. Start knitting in stocking st with contrast yarn. A = 13 rows in stocking st. **B = stocking st with graduations, 10 rows. C = stocking st**. Repeat from ** to **, 15 times. Finally knit section B once again, then 13 rows in stocking st, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Neck binding: Start and end with contrast yarn. Knit two pieces with reversed shapings. On 94 sts, knit 2 rows yellow, 4 rows white, 2 rows yellow, 6 rows dark blue, 2 rows yellow, 4 rows white, decreasing 1 st at left ten times in alternate rows using treble decker. Then knit 10 rows in yellow, increasing 1 st at left 5 times in alternate rows, knit a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Close side seams of bodice and join shoulders with graft sts, unravelling contrast yarn. Set in sleeves. Sew skirt together with graft sts and attach to inside of bodice above border. At lower edge slip stitch 2" to inside. Sew neck binding together, then attach cast-on edge to outside of neck line, approx. 1" from edge with back sts, unravelling contrast yarn. Stitch yellow stripe of neck binding to inside.

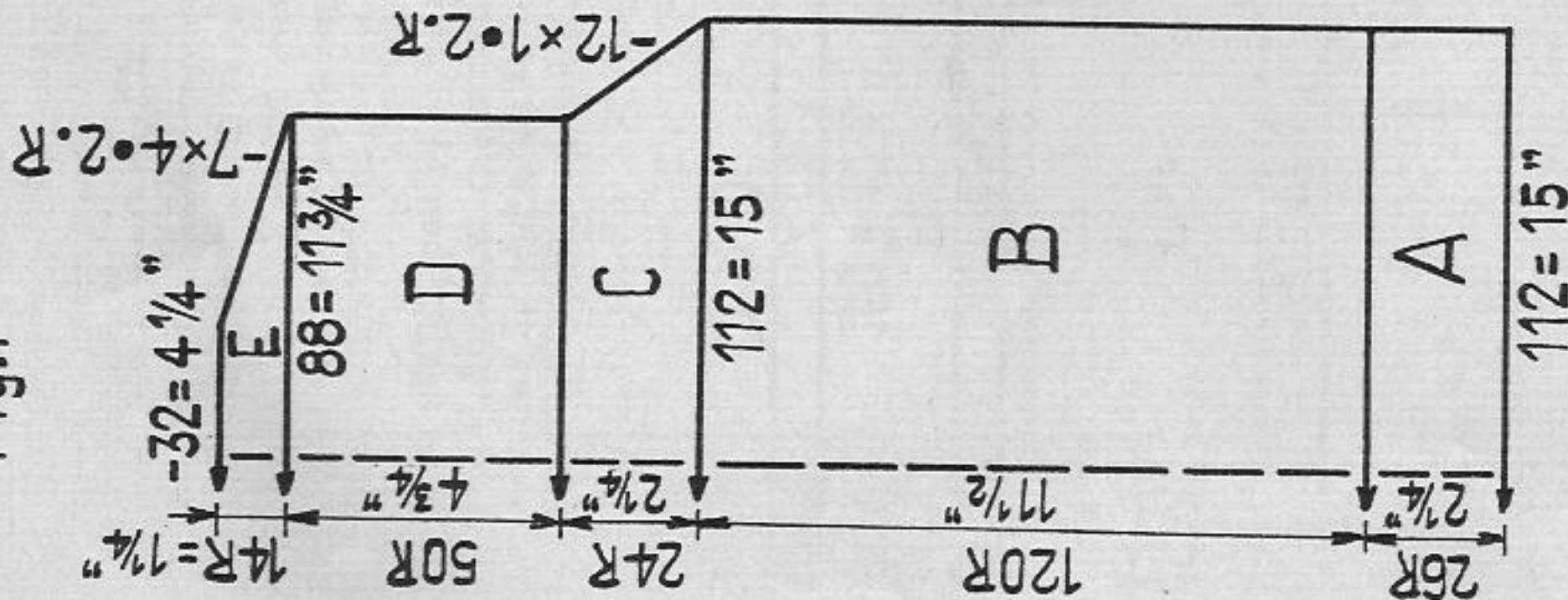

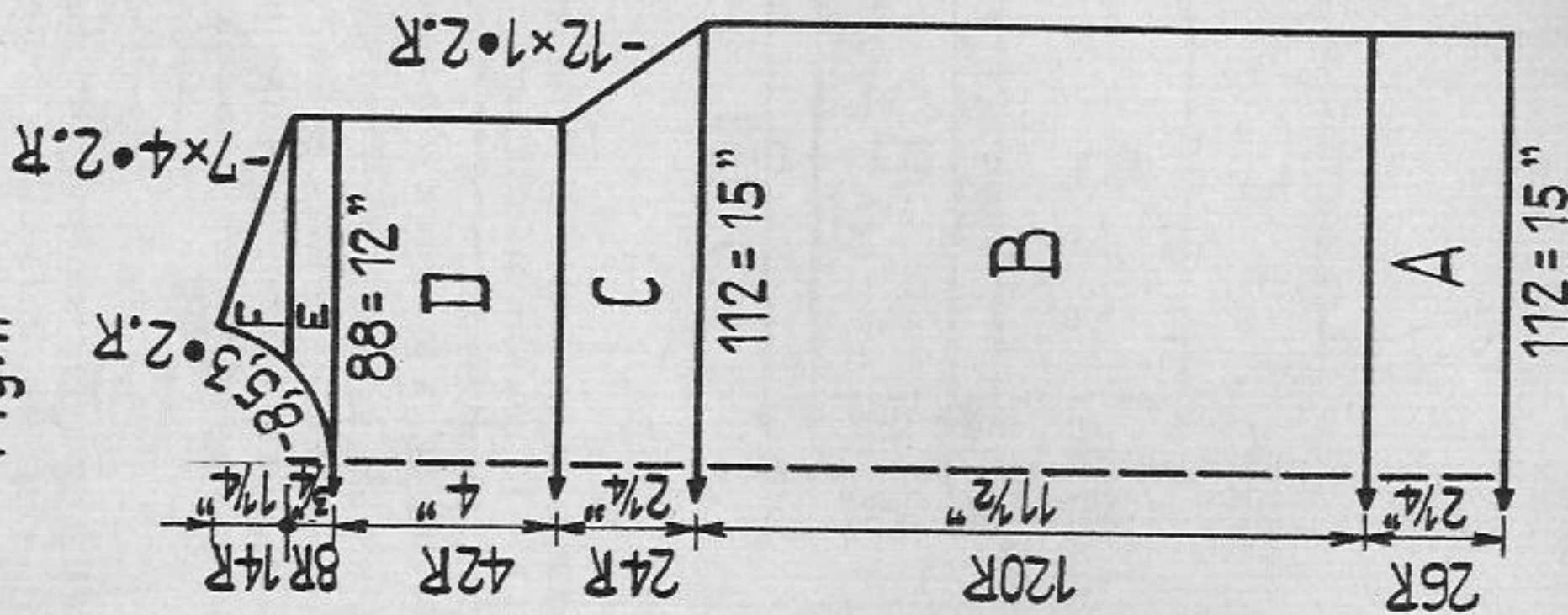
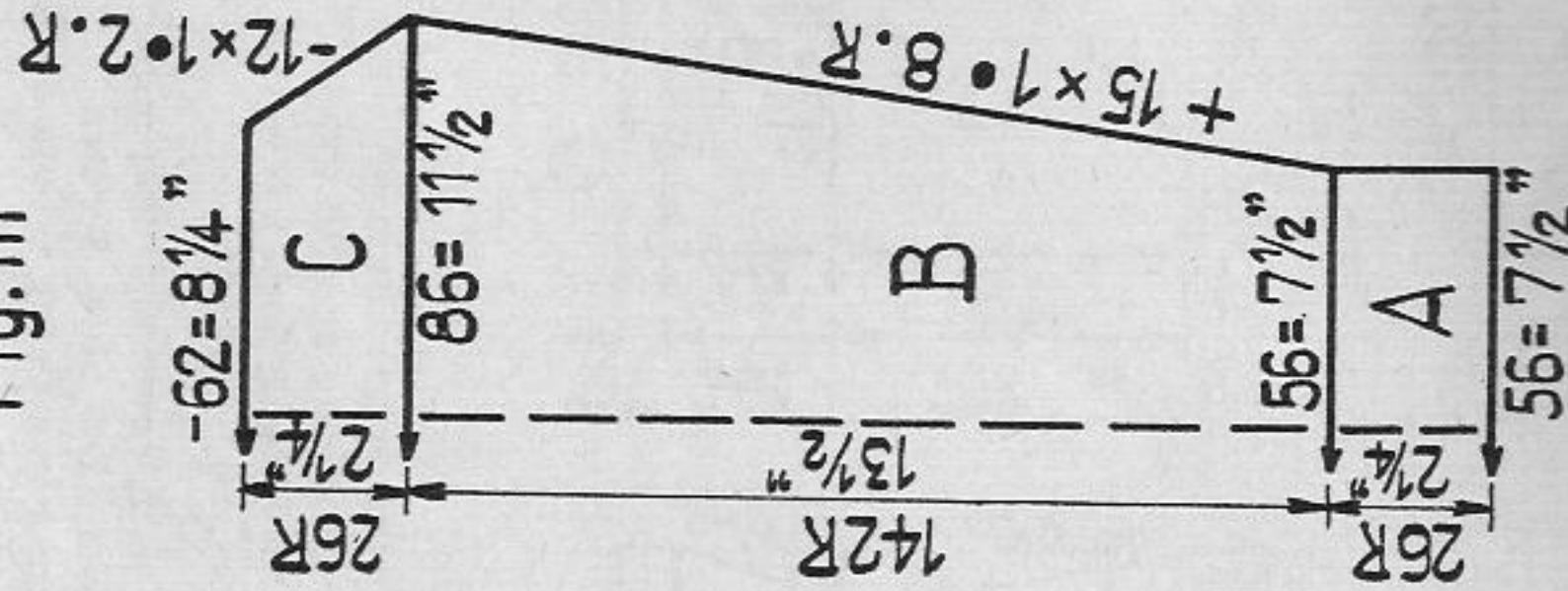

Cap: With beige, cast on 120 sts for 1:1 rib and knit 28 rows. Transfer sts for stocking st. Arrange pushers for pattern and knit 1 pattern series, continue knitting with beige throughout. Now hang at first st 4 onto nd 5, put empty nd out of work and knit 6 rows with St. S 4 1/2. Now reduce sts again, so that only every other nd is working, put empty nds out of work and knit 12 rows with St. S 3 1/2, finally pull yarn through remaining sts.

To make up:

Press stocking st part lightly. Close seam, gather sts at top tightly and fasten three-coloured pompon.

Size:

to fit a 28 1/4" chest approx., age abt. 4 to 5 years.

Material:

10 3/4 ozs of medium wool; 5 1/4 ozs beige, 2 3/4 ozs of each of green and yellow wool

Stitch size:

stocking st and pattern 5 1/2, tubular 4 3/4, 1:1 rib borders 2 3/4, 1:1 rib for turtle-neck collar 3 1/2

Test square:

100 sts = 13 1/2", 100 rows = 9 1/2"

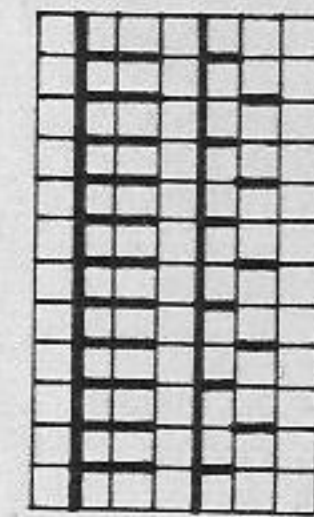

Fig. III: A = 1:1 rib border, beige. B = transfer sts for stocking st. With beige, begin with 12 rows in stocking st. Arrange pushers and work pattern series, twice. C = stocking st, with beige.

Turtle-neck collar: Entire collar is worked in beige. Cast on 116 sts for 1:1 rib, knit 34 rows. Put nds in W.P. for tubular, knit 12 rows tubular, then a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Assemble sweater and set in sleeves. Attach collar at first to outside, then to inside, unravelling contrast yarn.

Size: to fit a 36 1/4" bust approx.

Collar - jacket: On both beds, cast on 150 sts for tubular (150 sts on back bed, 150 sts on front bed), knit 14 rows tubular, then 40 rows in pattern 2, 14 rows tubular, a few rows with contrast yarn and release.

Belt - jacket: With 82 sts on each bed, knit as for collar.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Assemble jacket and set in sleeves. Starting 3" behind sleeve seam, attach open tubular rows of cuff along sleeve edge as follows: at first to outside, then to inside, st by st with back sts, unravelling contrast yarn. Make 1 buttonhole, in centre of collar, spacing it in line with other buttonholes. Finish remaining button-holes and sew on buttons. Stitch Patch Pockets on and fold pocket flaps to outside. Unravel contrast yarn of belt and join with graft sts. Fasten to back at waist with 2 buttons.

Fig. VII - VIII - skirt: A, B and C = as for Fig. I. D = transfer sts for 1:1 rib, knit 1:1 rib, cast off loosely.

To make up - skirt:

Press lightly same as other parts. Close side seams. At waist fold 1:1 rib rows to half and sew to inside. Pull waist elastic through.

Press upper part, sleeves and collar lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Set in Raglan sleeves. Attach collar at first to outside, then to inside, st by st with back sts, unravelling contrast yarn. Close collar in front with 2 cords and 2 pompons. At waist stitch 7 rows of upper edge of skirt to inside and pull elastic through, if desired.

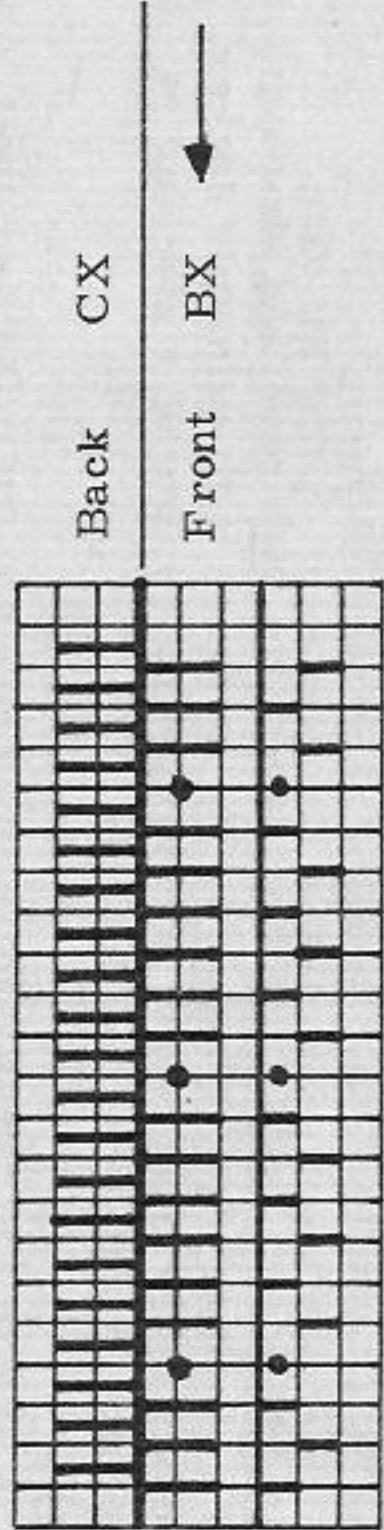
Two-piece dress

- Size:** to fit a 37" to 37 3/4" bust approx.
Material: 35 ozs of fine industrial wool, taken twofold. Skirt 12 1/4 ozs, jacket 22 3/4 ozs, 9 buttons, 1 waist elastic
Stitch size: pattern 1: front 2, back 2 1/2, tubular 3 3/4, 1:1 rib at waist of skirt 2
Test square: 100 sts = 5 3/4", 100 rows = 3" i.e. 200 rows = 6", see PASSAP Chart, column 6, and multiply by two the indicated number of rows.

Pattern: Jacket, skirt and pockets are worked in pattern 1; all cast-on edges tubular; collar, cuffs and pocket flaps in pattern 2.

Pattern 1:

Handle down, red strippers



Pattern 2:

Always work 2 rows tubular, 1 row K/K.

Fig. I - jacket: A = tubular. B = transfer sts for pattern 1, put pushers in W.P., and work in pattern 1, ending at E.
Fig. II - jacket: Knit two parts with reversed shapings. Pattern 1 appears on the back of the knitting, so work right front with buttonholes according to diagram, left front with reversed shapings, but without buttonholes. A to E = as for Fig. I. F = pattern 1.

Fig. III - jacket: A and B = pattern 1.

Fig. V - jacket, cuff: Knit twice. A = tubular. B = pattern 2. C = tubular, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Lady's sleeveless jacket

- Size: to fit a 35 1/2" to 37" bust approx.
Material: 12 1/4 ozs of fine wool; 5 1/4 ozs of Mohair wool, turquoise with silver, 7 ozs white
Stitch size: pattern 3, bindings in turquoise 4 1/2
Test square: 100 sts = 13 1/2", 100 rows = 5 1/2"
Pattern: jacket in pattern, bindings in stocking st with turquoise



Pattern:

Handle up, red strippers

Special note! Pay attention to rnd on back bed at left.

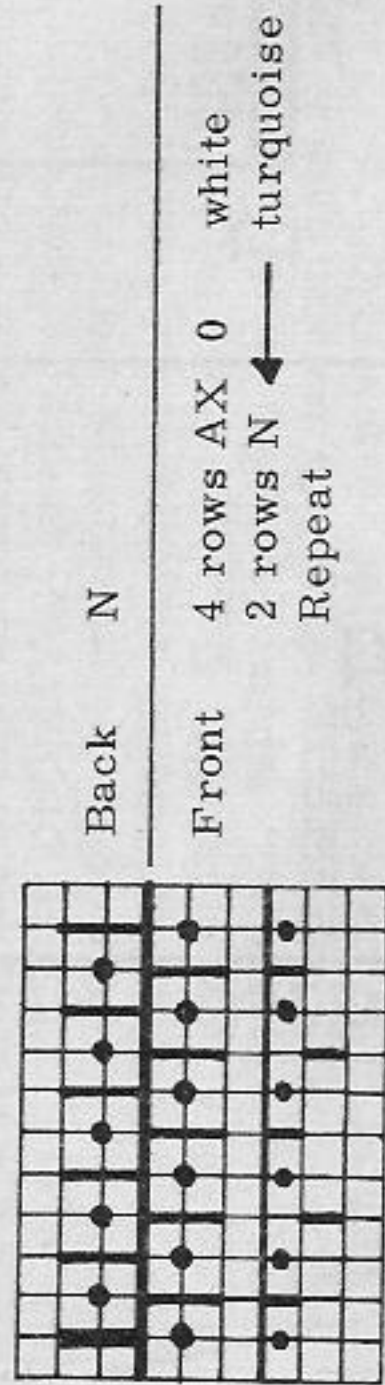


Fig. I: A to E = pattern.

Fig. II: Knit two parts with reversed shapings. A to E = pattern.

Bindings round jacket opening and armholes are worked with turquoise Mohair wool: Work on 15 sts in stocking st for 158" approx. and cut to desired length.

To make up:

Do not iron, but press bindings lightly. Assemble jacket. Round jacket opening and armholes, attach bindings to outside, with right side facing and seam inwards, then fold in half and stitch to inside or let roll to inside.

Test square: 100 sts = 14 1/4", 100 rows = 10 1/2"

Pattern: stocking st, 2:2 rib borders at sleeves and neck band

Fig. I + II: A = stocking st, hem, black. B and C = knit 24 rows black, 12 rows red, 12 rows black, 12 rows white, 12 rows black, 12 rows red and then with black throughout. Decrease with quintuple decker, stocking st. D to F = stocking st, black. Fig. I at F, Fig. II at E = divide work and continue knitting separately with reversed shapings, stocking st.

Fig. III: Knit with black throughout. A = 2:2 rib borders. B = transfer sts for stocking st, stocking st. C = stocking st.

Neck band: With white and St.S 3, cast on 209 sts for 2:2 rib, knit 20 rows in 2:2 division, with St.S 4 1/4. Now put all rnds in W.P. (155 sts on back bed, 155 sts on front bed) and, with black and St.S 5 1/4, knit 22 rows tubular, at each end increasing 2 sts (1 st on back, 1 st on front bed) every 4th row, 6 times, with double decker, and then with black and St.S 3 3/4, knit 2 rows K/K. With red and St.S 5 3/4, knit 24 rows tubular, increasing 6 times as for black, knit a few rows with contrast yarn and release.

To make up - sweater:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Close side and sleeve seams. Set in sleeves. Sew neck band together, and stitch at first to outside, then to inside, st by st with back sts, unravelling contrast yarn.

Fig. IX - half back and half front: Knit two parts with reversed shapings. A = stocking st, hem. B = stocking st. C = stocking st. Increase with quintuple decker. D = stocking st with graduations in right front, according to diagram. E = stocking st, decreases with quintuple decker. Finally cast off loosely.

To make up:

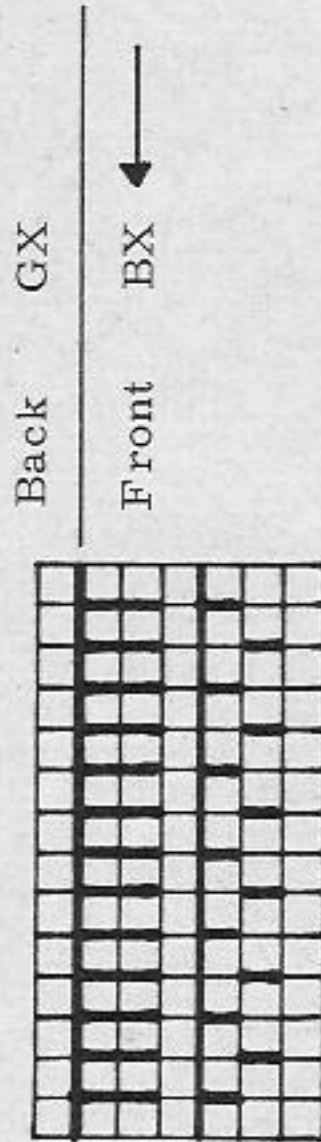
Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Close inside-leg seams, then sew both trouser parts together and press lightly. At waist sew 1" approx. to inside and pull elastic through. Hem legs.

Test square: 100 sts = 10 $\frac{3}{4}$ ", 100 rows = 4 $\frac{3}{4}$ "
Pattern: trousers are worked in pattern, borders in stocking st

These trousers are knitted from top to bottom.

Fig. IX - back of trousers: Knit two parts with reversed shapings.

A = waist welt, stocking st. B = put pushers in W.P. for pattern, work pattern with graduations from edge towards centre. C to G = pattern. H = stocking st, hem of leg.

Fig. IXa - front of trousers: Knit two parts with reversed shapings as for Fig. IX, but without graduations.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Close side and leg seams, then sew both trouser parts together. Sew stocking st rows at waist of trousers and at legs to inside and pull elastic through waist.

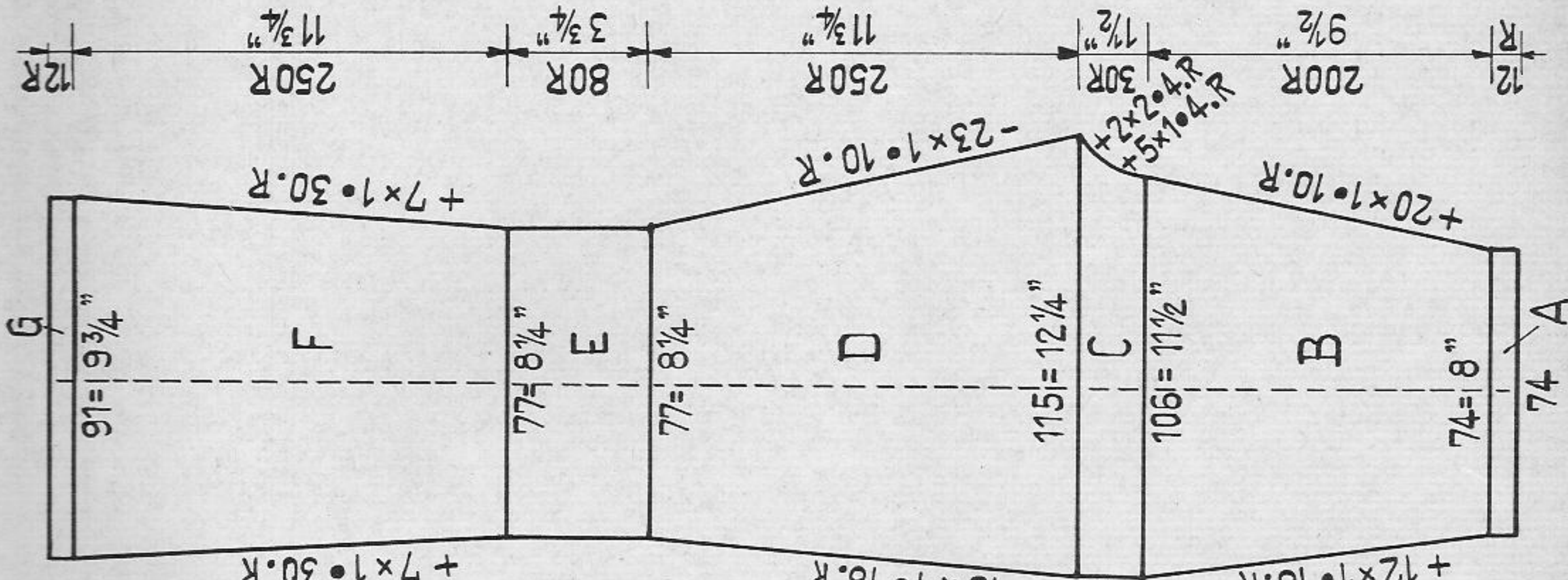

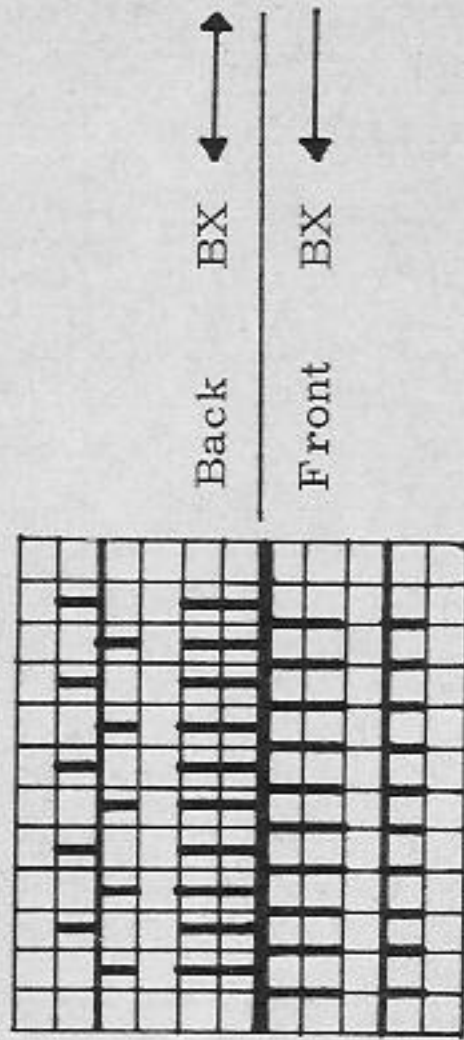
Test square: 100 sts = 6 1/4", 100 rows = 4"

Pattern: Fairisle according to diagram or Jac 40 "Armin", Pattern No. 82a

Special note! Take single yarn for Fairisle, double yarn for 1:1 rib borders and neck facing, in dark grey.

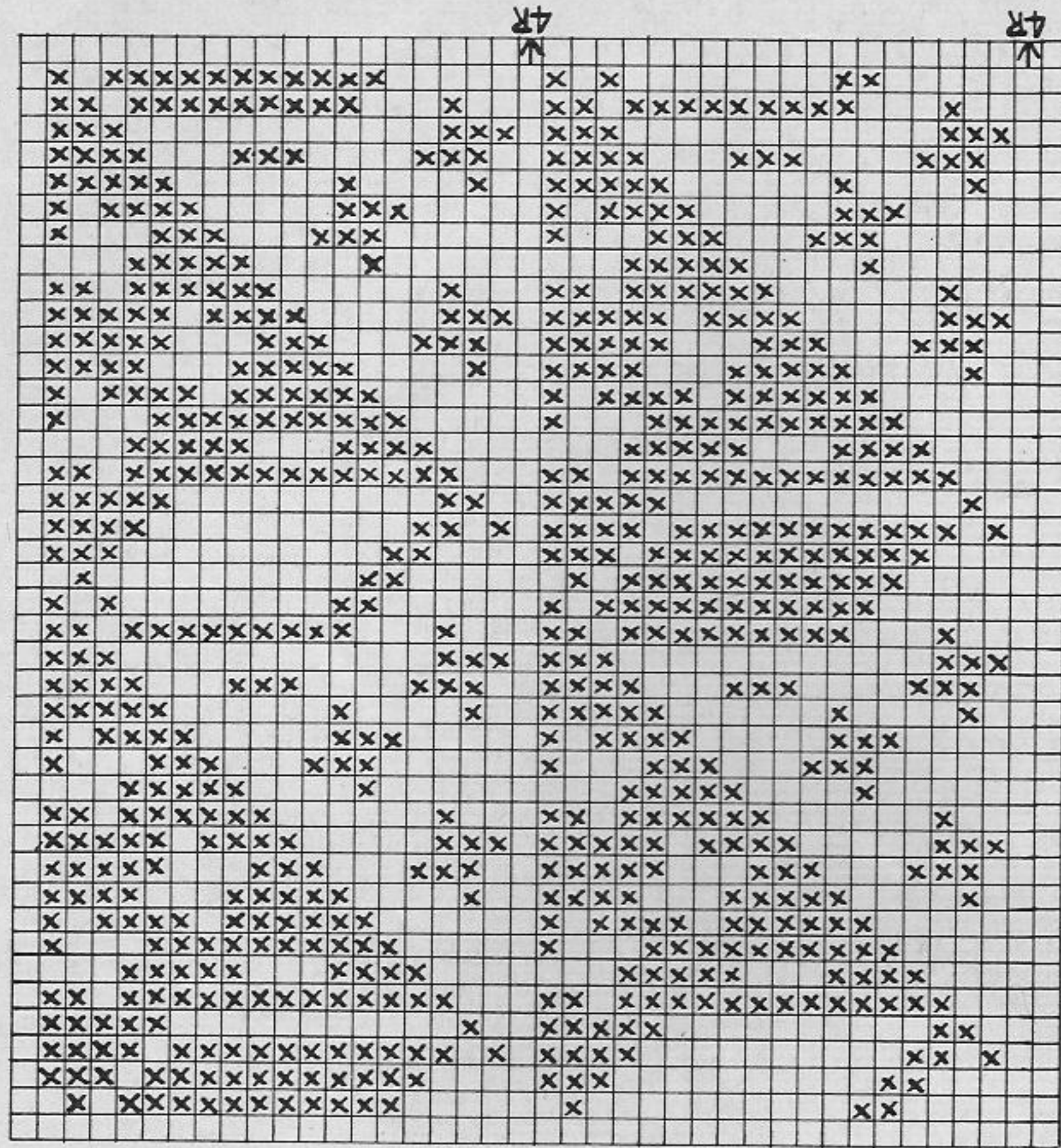

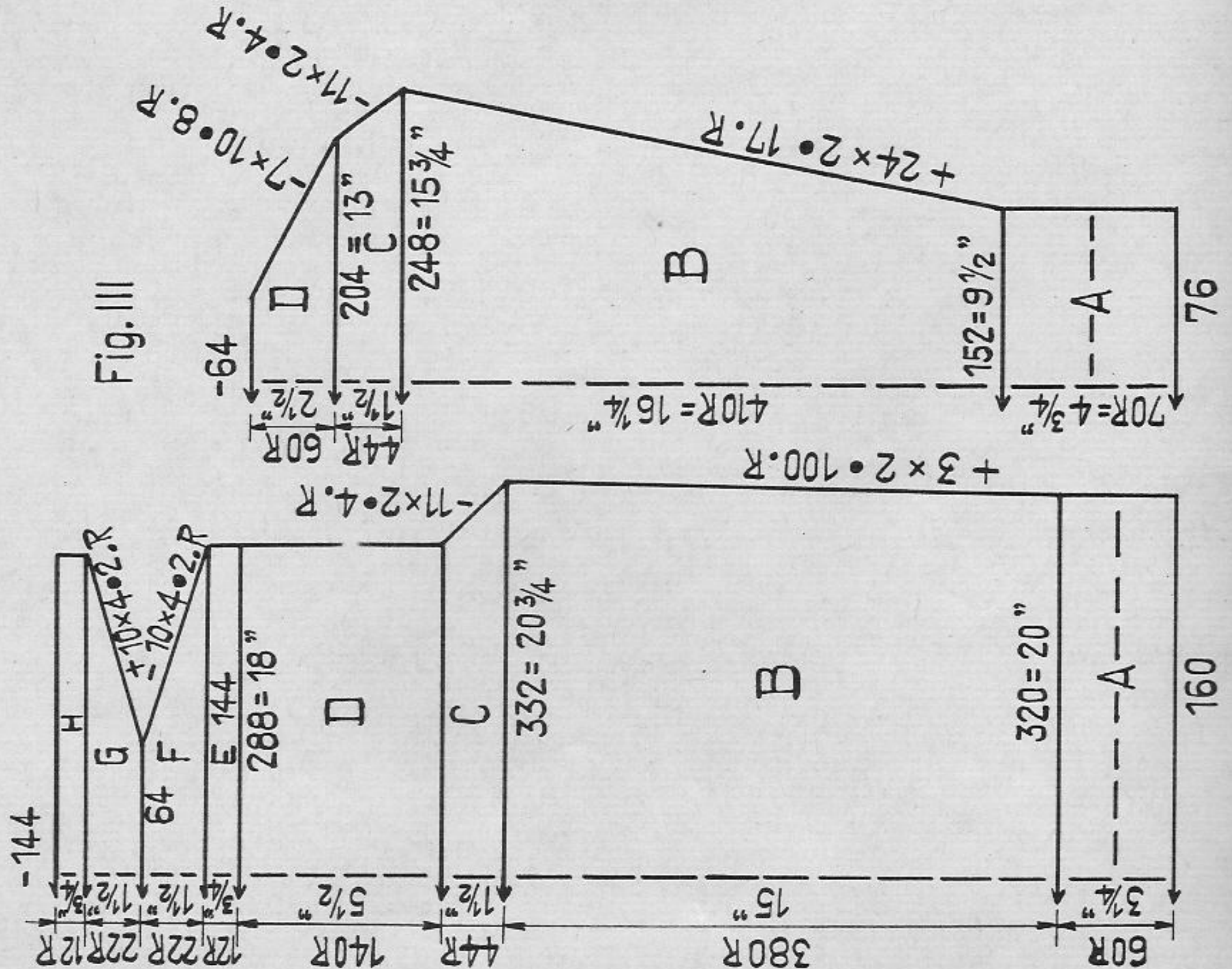
