Material: 16 ozs of medium "bouclé" yarn, 3 buttons

Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC stocking st 5, 2:2 rib 3 1/2

Test square: PASSAP COMBI stocking st 5, tension arm 8, yarn brake 4, 2:2 rib St. S 3 1/2

Pattern: 100 sts = 13 3/4", 100 rows = 8"

Sweater stocking st, wrong side outwards, welts, neck and front bands 2:2 rib.

Before starting your work please study carefully the explanations given on pages 1 and 2

Patterns: The drawings refer to half width, the indications of stitch numbers refer to whole width of each part.

Figure I	= back	Figure IX	= pants
Figure II	= front	Figure X	= gusset
Figure III	= sleeve	Figure XI	= scarf
Figure IV	= collar	Figure XII	= cap, bonnet
Figure V	= border, cuff	Figure XIII	= mittens
Figure VI	= pocket	Figure XIV	= socks, stockings
Figure VII	= skirt, front	Figure XV	= straps
Figure VIII	= skirt, back		

If the centre line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is worked simultaneously with reversed shapings, i. e. decreasing or increasing is made on the left as well as on the right side.

If the centre line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is worked separately with reversed shapings, i. e. first knit one part according to diagram (increasing or decreasing at right), then the second part the opposite way (decreasing or increasing at left).

Abbreviations:

Col.	= colour of wool	○	= tubular (or) = half tubular
st, sts	= stitch, stitches	●	= every (in every row)

		■	= for open work row hang st to the next nd, leave empty nd in W.P.

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter "st"). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working Position on back and front bed.

Exception: For tubular or half tubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed. The same number of needles must therefore be put into Working Position on the other bed. In these cases the sign for tubular \bigcirc respectively (or) for half tubular is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increase or decrease always occurs in the first row of a section.

- $+3 \times 2 \cdot 8 \cdot R$ means: increase 2 stitches 3 times in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- $-19 \times 3 \cdot 7 \cdot R$ means: decrease 3 stitches 19 times in every 7th row (back 2 stitches, front 1 stitch or vice versa).
- $-17 \times 1 \cdot 2./3 \cdot R$ means: decrease 1 stitch 17 times, alternately once after 2 rows and once after 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle -4 \times 8 \cdot 2 \cdot R$ means: work graduations, i. e. short rows (on DUO with pushers and lock BX). Step by step put 8 nds (and their respective pushers) into Rest Position 4 times after every 2nd row (for double bed 4 nds each back and front). Once all graduations are finished, continue knitting normally, i. e. all nds in Working Position (pushers in Neutral Position).

Graduations can be knitted two ways, either from outer edge towards centre (gradual decreasing with the minus-sign "-" after the black triangle) or from the centre towards outer edge (gradual increasing with the plus-sign "+" after the black triangle).

Number of stitches and inches:

- $136 = 8''$ means: a total of 136 sts (for K/K 68 stitches each on back and front) make a width of 8".
- $\bigcirc 146 = 17''$ means: cast on 146 sts each on back and front bed for tubular which makes a width of 17".

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be tested by you, by making your own test square for your own wool.

Test square: We strongly recommend that you make always a test square with your own material before starting to work, in order to calculate for your material the necessary numbers of stitches and rows along the PASSAP - chart. The chapter "The test square and its calculation" in your instruction book informs you how to proceed for these calculations. This is very important, especially when adjusting a model to another size.

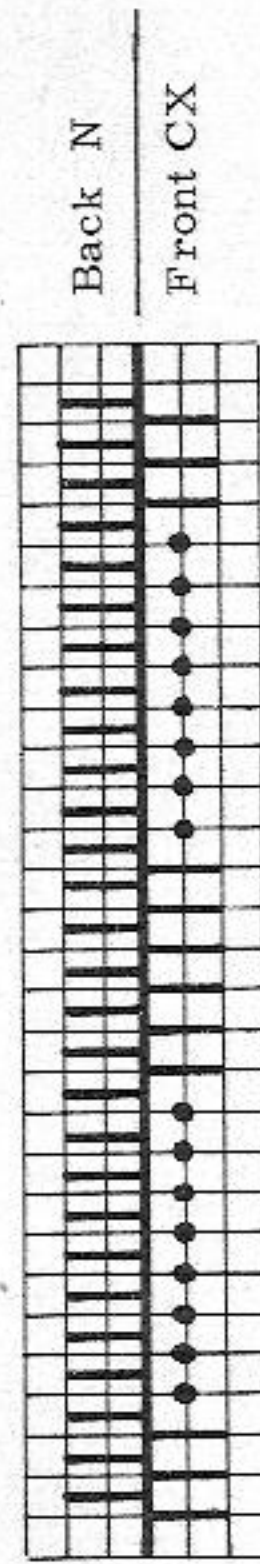

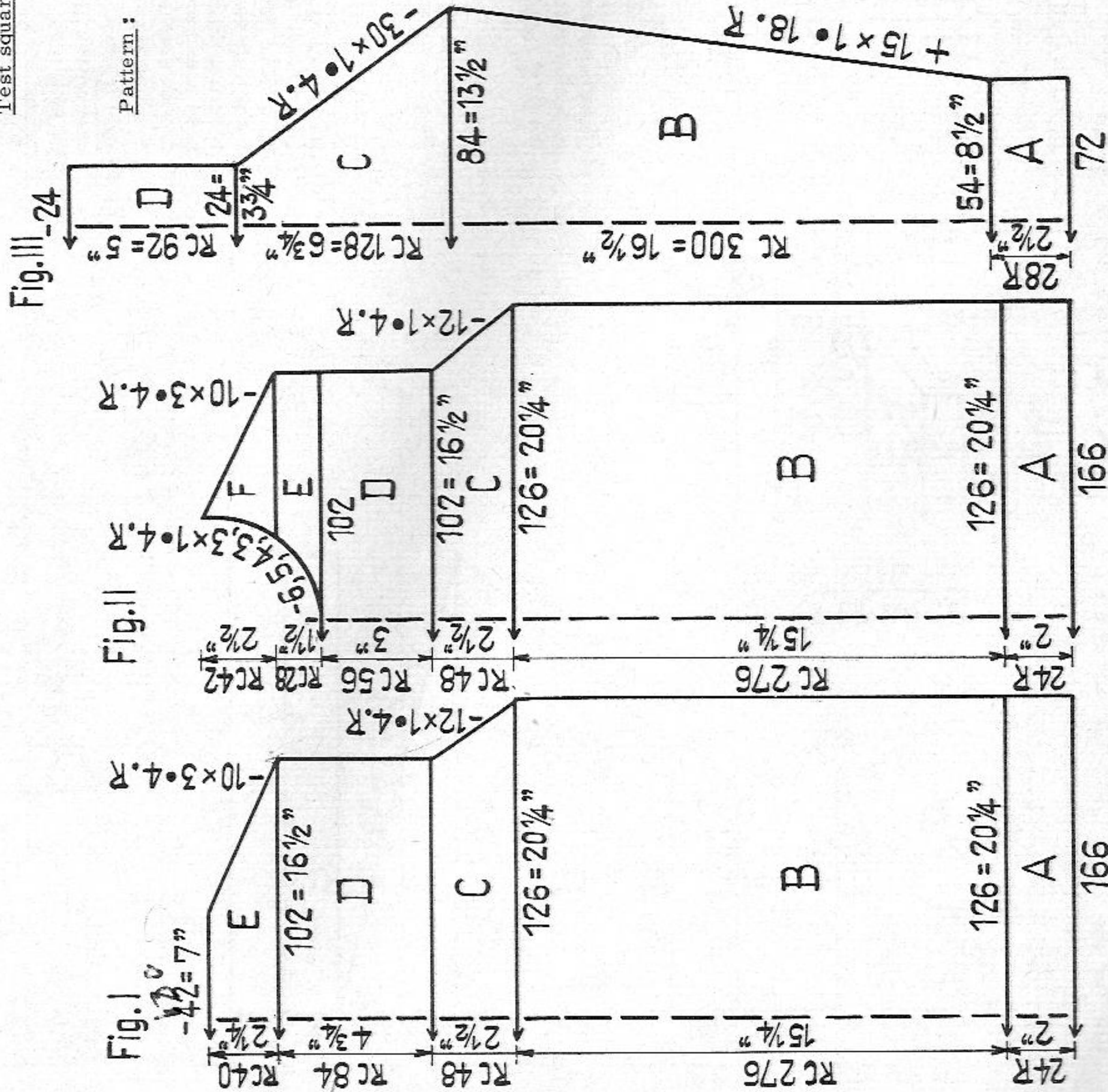

Fig. I, II and III: A = 2:2 rib. B = transfer all sts to back bed, arranging nds for pattern at front bed, pattern. C to F = pattern. Fig. II: at E divide work and continue knitting with reversed shapings.

Neck band: Cast on 196 sts for 2:2 rib and knit 12 rows. Put empty nds also in Working-Position and knit 10 rows tubular, then a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size, cover with wet cloth and allow to dry completely.

Close side and sleeve seams and set in sleeves. Join section D with shoulder.

Close neck band, then sew to neck first outside, then inside with back stitch, unravelling contrast yarn.

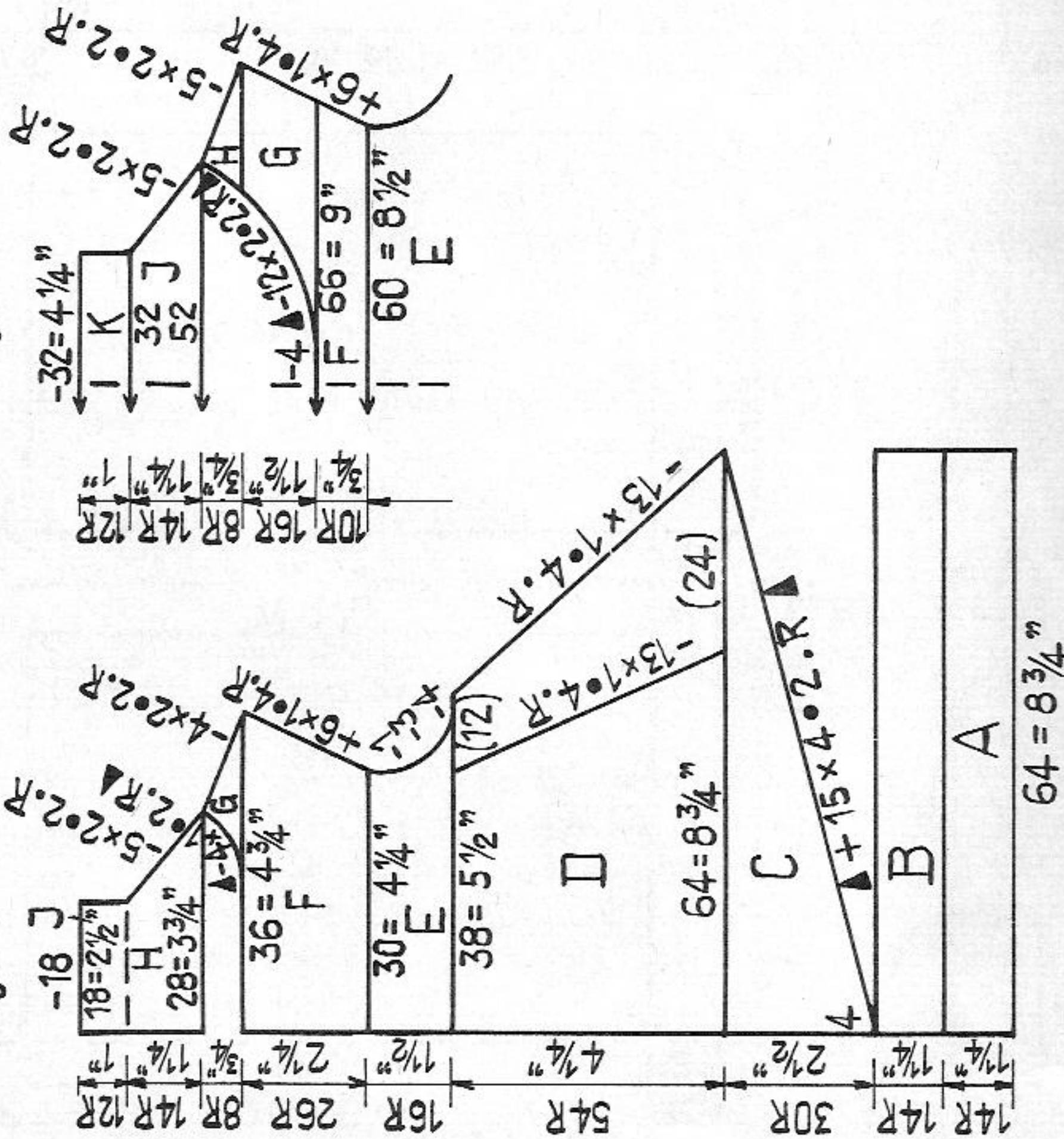
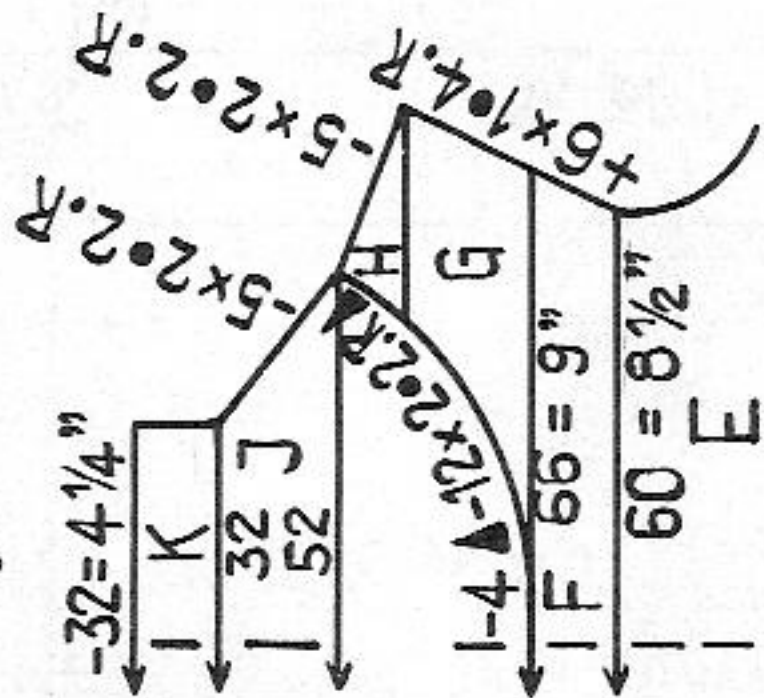

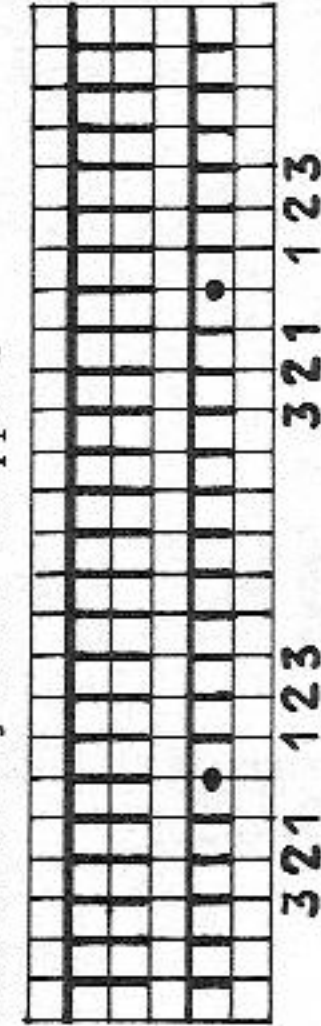

When butterflies are finished, put all nds in Working-Position, pushers back in pusher rail, set lock at N and continue knitting stocking st, hereby, after the first row twist and hang up the topmost cross thread onto the 3 empty nds.

Crochet-trimming: Row 1: single crochet. Row 2: 1 single crochet in the 1st st, chain 4, 1 double crochet in the 1st chain st, miss 3 sts, 1 single crochet in the 5th st etc.

Fig. I: Knit two parts with reversed shapings. A = white, stocking st. B = red, 4 rows stocking st, 6 rows butterfly pattern, 4 rows stocking st. C = white, stocking st with graduations from centre outwards (with pushers and lock BX). D = white, stocking st, decreasing as follows: for first decrease put edge st onto second nd, then with decker comb transfer 24 sts by 1 nd inwards (2 sts on first nd count as one) at edge return 2 empty nds in Neutral-Pos., knit 4 rows. For second decrease repeat this procedure, but transferring only 23 sts inwards. Go on working this way, always transferring 1 st less, until 26 sts have been decreased in all. E and F = white, stocking st. G = white, stocking st with graduations for neck. H = red as section B, butterfly pattern. J = white, stocking st.

Fig. II: A to F = as for Fig. I, but knitting both parts in one piece, i.e. cast on 128 sts and make graduations at section C and decreases at section D on both ends. After section F divide work. G and H = knit separately with reversed shapings, working with pushers and lock at BX. Start by putting 4 pushers in Rest-Position at centre. J and K = knit the two parts in one piece as for Fig. I, sections H and J.

To make up: (dress)

Lightly starch all parts, block and press. Close seams, fold in half sections A, J (back) and K (front) and slip-stitch to inside. Make crochet trimming around armhole and along back edges. Attach 4 buttons at right back and use chain sts of crochet trimming as buttonholes.

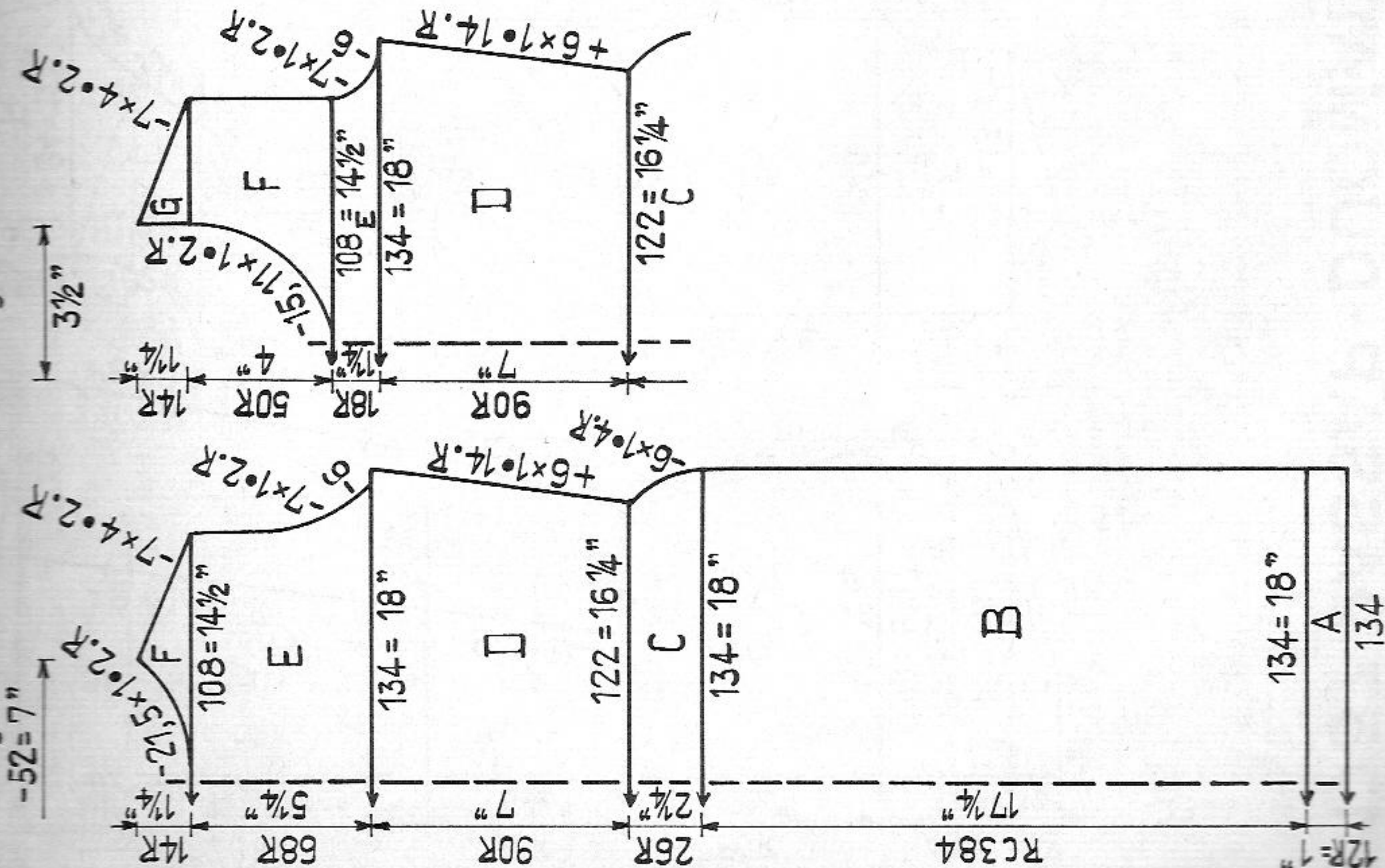
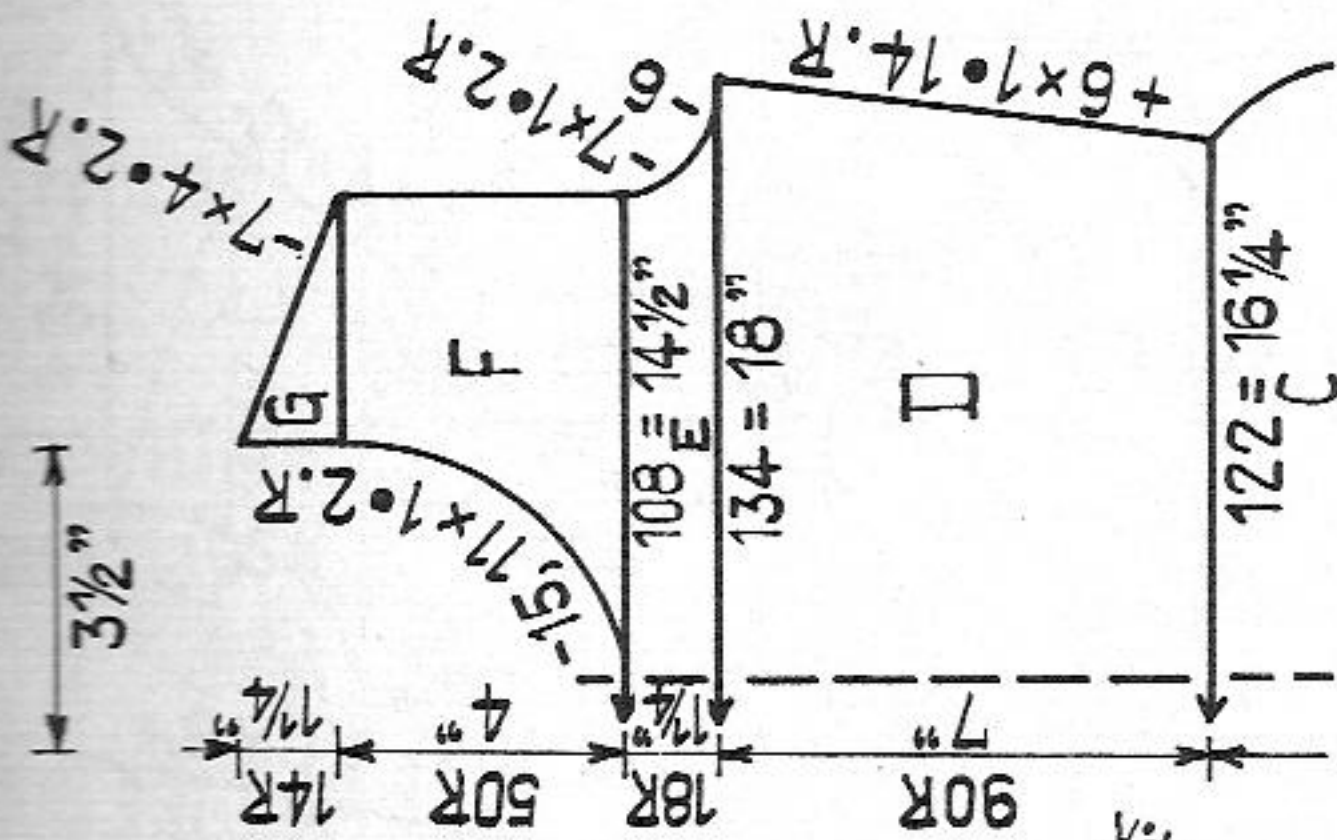

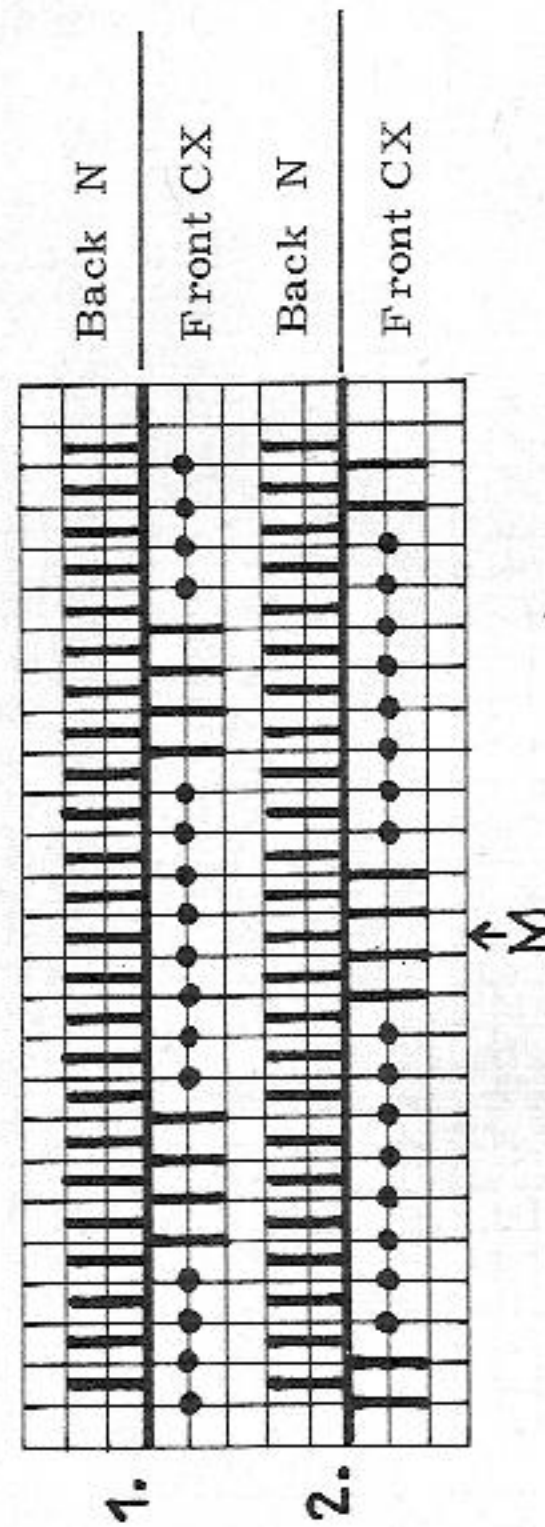

Fig. I: A = stocking st for hem. B = knit 8 series in "release-stitch" pattern (DUOMATIC RC 384). C to E = stocking st. F = divide work and continue knitting with reversed shapings.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly. Close seams. Slip-stitch hem to inside. Make crochet trimming around neck and armholes as follows: 1 row of single crochets, then 1 row of single crochets backwards (crab's walk).

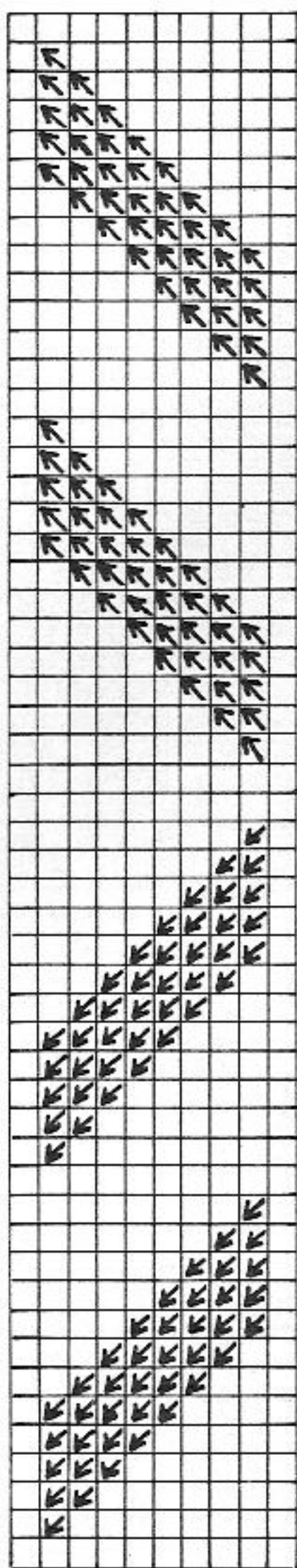

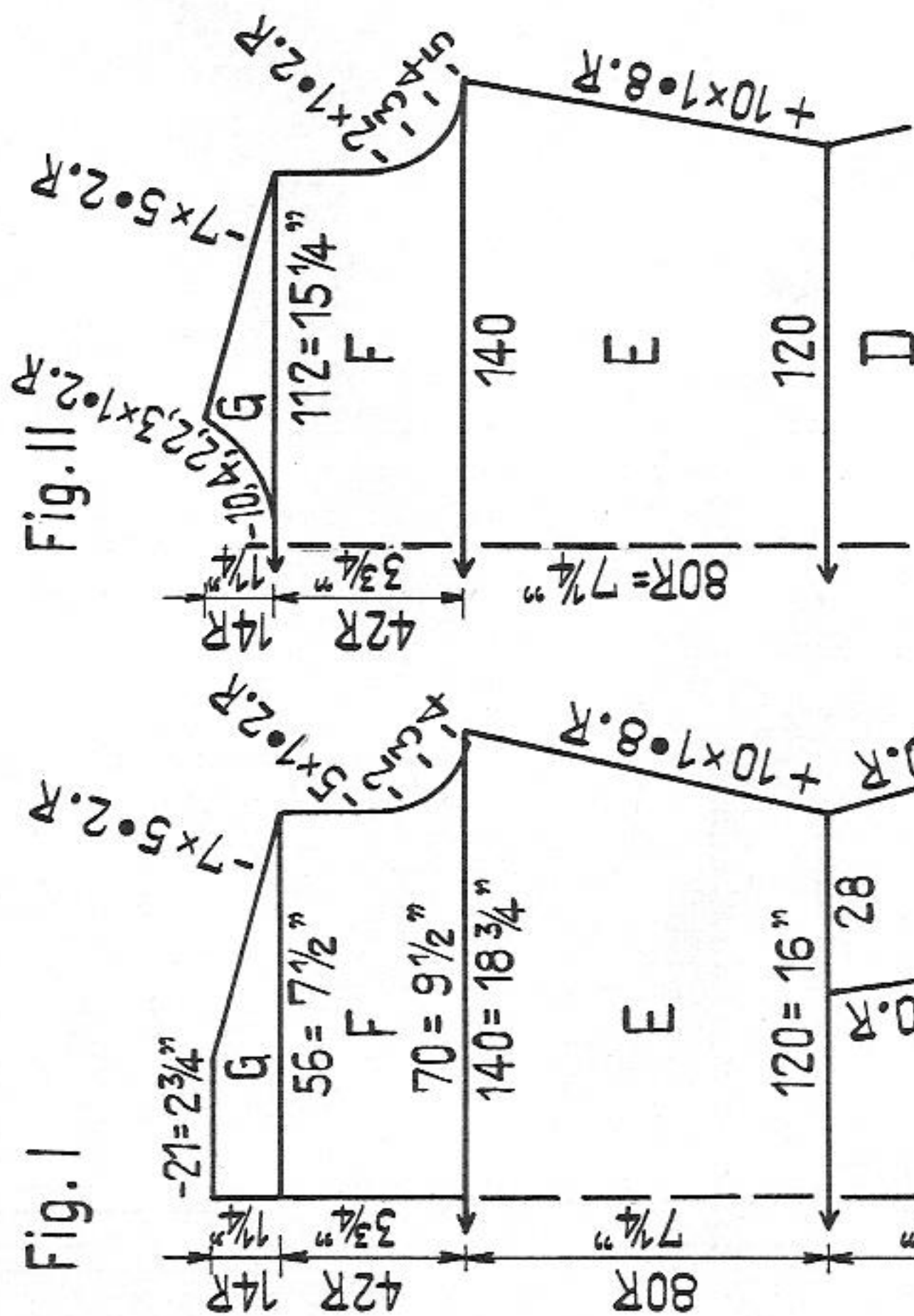

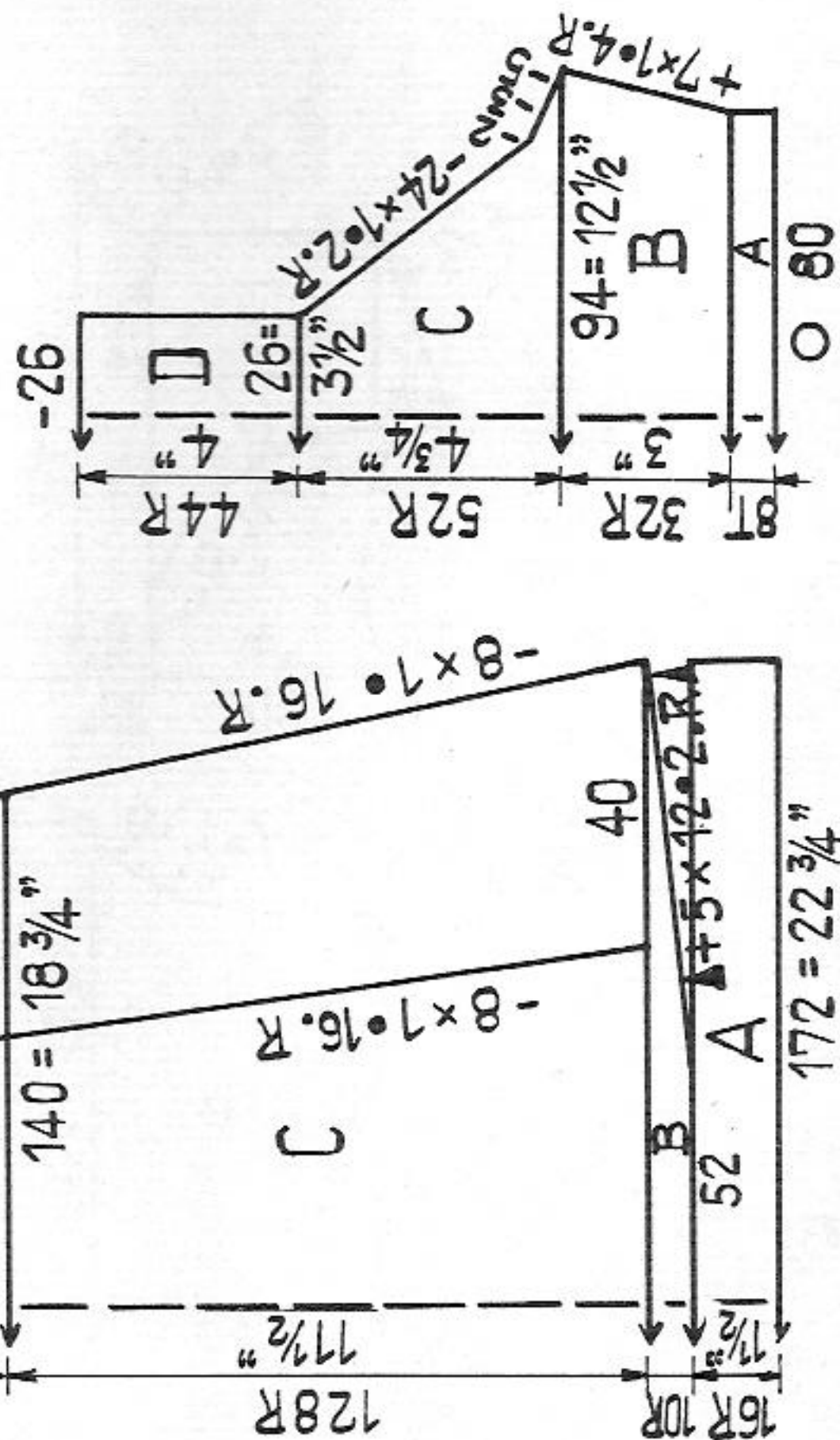


Fig. I: A = Hem, stocking st. B = stocking st with graduations at both ends from centre outwards. C = stocking st, at both ends decreasing as follows: first decrease with triple deker, decr. 1 st (third st is double and counts as one st). Now, with deker comb, transfer 40 sts by 1 nd inwards and put 2 empty nds in Neutral-Position at edge. Knit 16 rows. For second decrease repeat this procedure, however, transfer 39 sts only with deker comb. Continue working this way, always transferring one st less, until 16 sts have been decreased at both ends. D = stocking st with decreases at intervals of 10 rows. E = stocking st. F and G = divide work and continue knitting separately with reversed shapings.

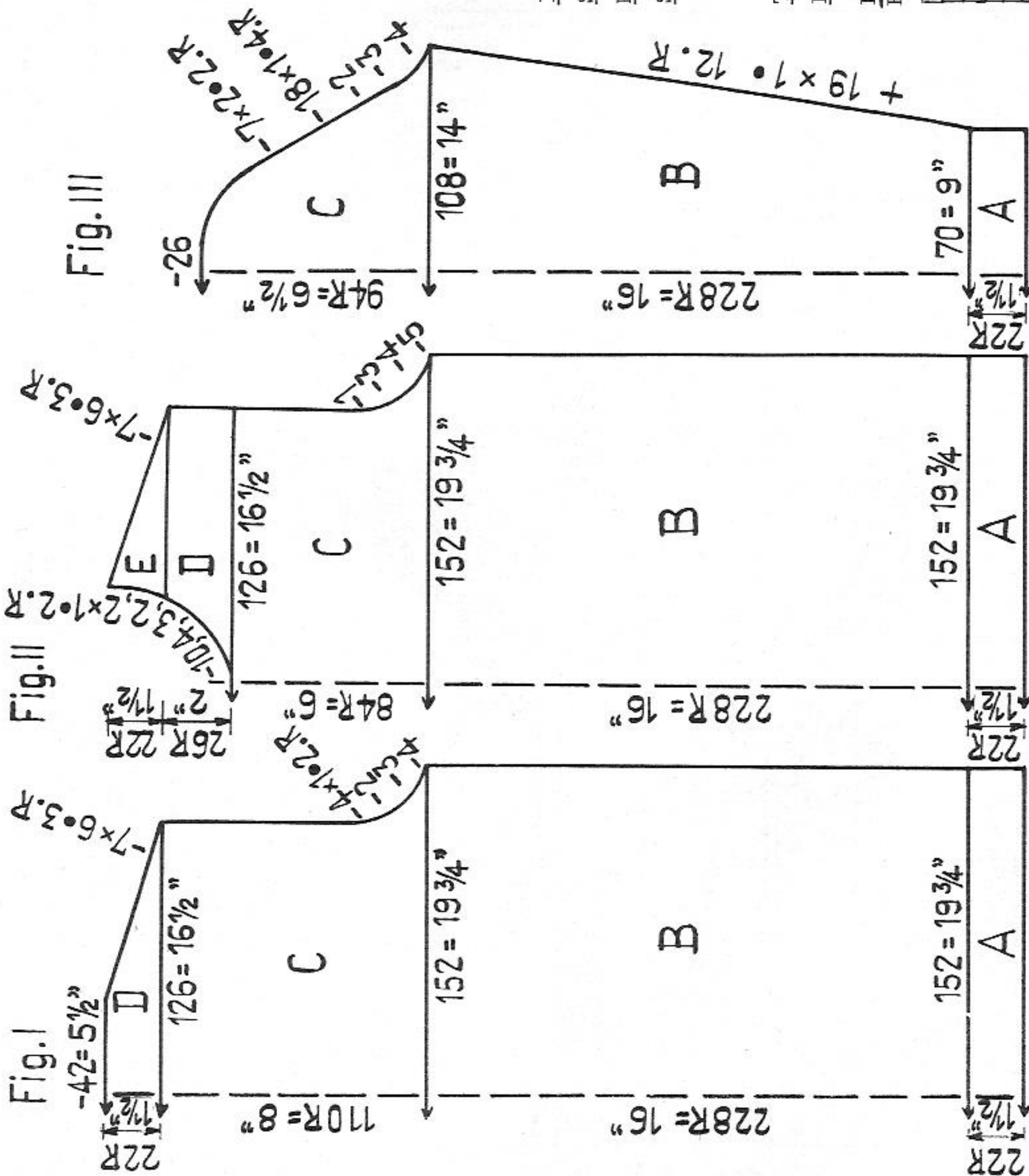
Fig. II: A to D = as for Fig. I. E and F = stocking st with transfer pattern in centre, G = divide work and continue working separately with reversed shapings, stocking st with neck and shoulder shaping.

Fig. III: A = tubular in 1 : 1 division. B to D = transfer sts for stocking st, stocking st.

Neck binding: Begin and end with contrast yarn. Cast on 104 sts for stocking st, knit 16 rows changing St. S as follows: 3 rows St. S, 5 1/2, 3 rows 5 1/4, 4 rows 5, 3 rows 5 1/4, 3 rows 5 1/2.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly. Close side and sleeve seams and set in sleeves, joining section D of sleeve to shoulder. Attach neck binding first outside, then inside, st by st with back st, unravelling contrast yarn. Around back opening work 1 row of single crochet, then 1 row of single crochet backwards (crab's walk). Crochet 1 loop at back right and attach button at left to correspond.

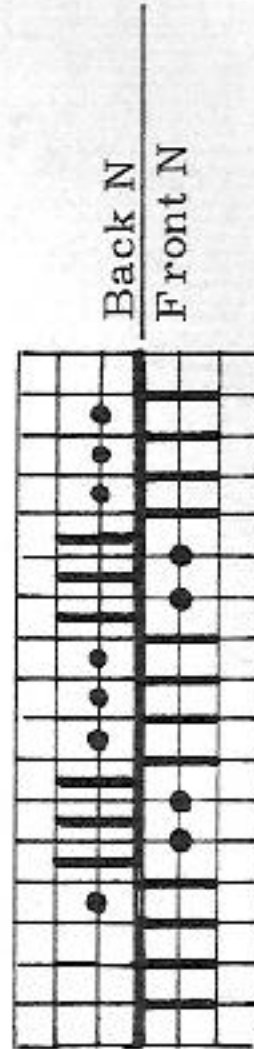


Fig. I and III : A = over a width of 132 nds, counted on front bed, cast on for 2:2 rib and knit 2 rows. Now transfer sts for pattern (4:3 rib, handle down) and with 152 sts and St.S 4 continue knitting in pattern. B to D = pattern with St.S 4 1/2

Fig. II : A to C = as for Fig. I. D and E = divide work and continue knitting separately with reversed shapings.

Collar : With 132 sts knit pattern over 60 rows with the following St.S : 15 rows with St.S 4 1/2, 30 rows 4, 15 rows 4 1/2.

Shoulder trimming : Knit twice. For tubular cast on 2 sts on each bed and knit 50 rows.

To make up :

Press parts lightly without stretching. Close sleeve seams, side seams and right shoulder. Turn under a 1/4" hem on front and back left shoulder.

Attach collar, first to outside then to inside. Stitch trimmings along left shoulder, flush with collar leaving spaces for 5 buttonholes, 1/2" apart, on front and fixing buttons on back. Overlap front and back trimming and set in sleeves.

Material: 330 metres length to 100 g (360 yards length to 3 1/2 ozs approx.)

Beach wear: midi - skirt (or wrapper) and matching bikini

Size: to fit a 36 to 37" bust, a 27" waist and a 36 to 37" hip approx.

Material: 25 ozs medium synthetic bouclé yarn; 21 ozs white, 4 ozs red approx.

Skirt: 15 1/2 ozs white, 3 1/2 ozs red, elastic to fit waist, two clasps or press studs

Bikini: 5 1/2 ozs white, an oddment of red, elastic for bra and briefs, 2 "falsies", 1 clasp, 16 metal eyelets.

Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC stocking st front 5 1/2, trimming front 5 1/2, back 3 1/2

PASSAP COMBI stocking st back 5 1/2, tension arm 8, yarn brake 4 1/2, trimming St. S back 5 1/2, front 3 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 15 1/4", 100 rows = 7 1/2"

Pattern: stocking st, reverse outside

midi - skirt white with red trimming

bikini white, cord for straps and side-fastening red

Bikini

Fig. I and II, bra, white: Knit twice with reversed shapings. A = hem, stocking st. B = at one end cast off 20 sts for fastening, then continue knitting stocking st with graduations from both ends inwards. C = stocking st.

Fig. IX and IXa, briefs, white: Knit each part twice with reversed shapings. A = hem, stocking st. B and C = stocking st with graduations from crutch outwards. D and E = stocking st.

Red cord for straps and fastening at briefs: For tubular cast on 2 sts on each bed and knit 100" approx. Cut off the desired length.

To make up: (briefs)

Close back and front centre as well as legs, leaving sides open. At waist and legs hem 1/2" to inside and pull narrow elastic through. Reinforce the 4 side edges with rep band at inside and attach 4 eyelets on each side to thread cord through (see illustration).

To make up: (bra)

Join parts at centre front leaving a small opening between section A and C to knot the halter through. Hem half of section A to inside and pull elastic through. Fix clasp for back fastening. Fix "falsies" with a few stitches inside top making 1/4" hem at upper edge at the same time.

Size: to fit a 32" bust approx.

Material: 23 ozs grained, burlé or "bouclé" yarn (linen/cotton)

22 ozs beige, 1 oz green, 7 small buttons, elastic to fit waist.

Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC stocking st 5, 1:1 division 4 1/2 to 4 3/4

PASSAP COMBI St. S 5, 1:1 division 4 1/2 to 4 3/4, tension arm 6, yarn brake 3

Test square: 100 sts = 15 1/4", 100 rows = 8 1/4"

Pattern:

Bodice stocking st with crochet trimming. Skirt stocking st with crochet trimming at lower edge and 1:1 division at waist i.e. over every alternate row on one bed.

Material: 280 metres length to 100 g (306 yards length to 3 1/2 ozs approx.)

Trousers, blue: weave stitch pattern, knit twice with reversed shapings. A = hem, B = increasing at both ends. C = decreasing for gusset. D = decreasing at both ends. E = work graduations with pushers, as per diagram. F = waist hem.

To make up: (trousers)

Block and press all parts. Close legs, then make seat seam. Slip-stitch waist hem to inside and pull elastic through. (If desired set in zip at front) Slip-stitch lower hems to inside. Press creases.

Sweater, red:

Fig. I b: A = cast on 124 sts for 1:1 rib and, with St.S 2 1/4, knit 24 rows. B = transfer sts, stocking st, St.S 4 1/2. C = shape armhole, decreasing with triple decker. D = knit straight. E = shoulder shaping, decreasing with quintuple decker.

Fig. II b: A to D = as for Fig. I b. E = divide work, casting off 20 sts at centre, then continue knitting right shoulder first, then left shoulder. Decreasing for neck as per diagram. F = increasing at outer end, cast off loosely.

Fig. III b: A = 1:1 rib with St.S 2 1/4. B = transfer sts, stocking st, St.S 4 1/2, increasing at both ends. C = decreasing for sleeve cap, with triple decker, cast off.

Neck band: cast on 130 sts for 1:1 rib, knit 60 rows with St.S 2 1/4. Put all ends in working and with St.S 4, knit 28 rows tubular, then a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up: (sweater)

Block and press all parts. Join shoulders with back stitch. Set in section C of sleeves: along sections C, D and E of Fig. I b and II b, with mattress stitch, along F with back stitch. Close side and sleeve seams. Close neck band, then attach to neck, first outside, then inside, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn.

Fig. I: A = Hem. B = stocking st. C = stocking st, decreasing with quintuple decker. D and E = stocking st. F = divide work and continue knitting with reversed shapings, decreasing for neck. G = shoulder shaping.

Fig. II: Knit twice with reversed shapings. A, B and C = as Fig. I. D = stocking st with bustline darts (graduations). E = stocking st, decreasing for armholes. F = decreasing for neck. G = shoulder shaping.

Fig. VII and VIII: Knit two equal parts. A = St.S 5, cast on 116 sts and knit 208 rows straight. B = transfer sts for 1:1 division, set St.S to 4 3/4, knit 26 rows. C = for waist set St.S to 4 1/2 and knit 26 rows in 1:1 division, a few rows with contrast yarn and release.

To make up:

Skirt: Block and press both parts. Close side seams and slip-stitch waist hem to inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Pull elastic through. At lower edge make one row of single crochets, then one row of single crochet backwards (crab's walk).

Bodice: Close side seams and shoulders gathering back shoulder a bit. Close sleeve seams and set in sleeves. Slip-stitch lower hem to inside. Along front edges and neck make 3 rows of single crochets, at the same time, in 3rd row make 7 button-holes, then work 1 row of single crochet backwards (crab's walk). Attach buttons to left front. Work crochet trimming around lower sleeve edge.

Stocking st tubular and half tubular, with coloured stripes in red, green, white, decreasing with double decker. Collar turned to outside, white. Fringes white according to pattern.

Fig. I: A = little skirt. With green cast on 196 sts in 1:1 rib, then all nds in Working-Position, 8 rows pearl stitch at front, then continue in transfer pattern accord. to diagram. After 60 rows, knit 2 rows stocking st. B = stocking st, first 8 rows white, then continue in green. C and D = stocking st. Do not cast off for shoulder, but work graduations and then again 4 rows with all nds. To finish knit 2 rows with contrast yarn and release.

Fig. II: A and B = as for Fig. I. C to F = divide work and continue knitting separately with reversed shapings, decreasing for neck and working graduations for shoulder as for Fig. I.

Fig. III: A = tubular in 1:1 division, green. Cast on 34 sts on each bed, then knit 14 rows tubular. B and C = transfer sts for stocking st, stocking st.

Neck band for dress: With white cast on 70 sts on each bed, then continue knitting 24 rows tubular. Knit a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up - dress:

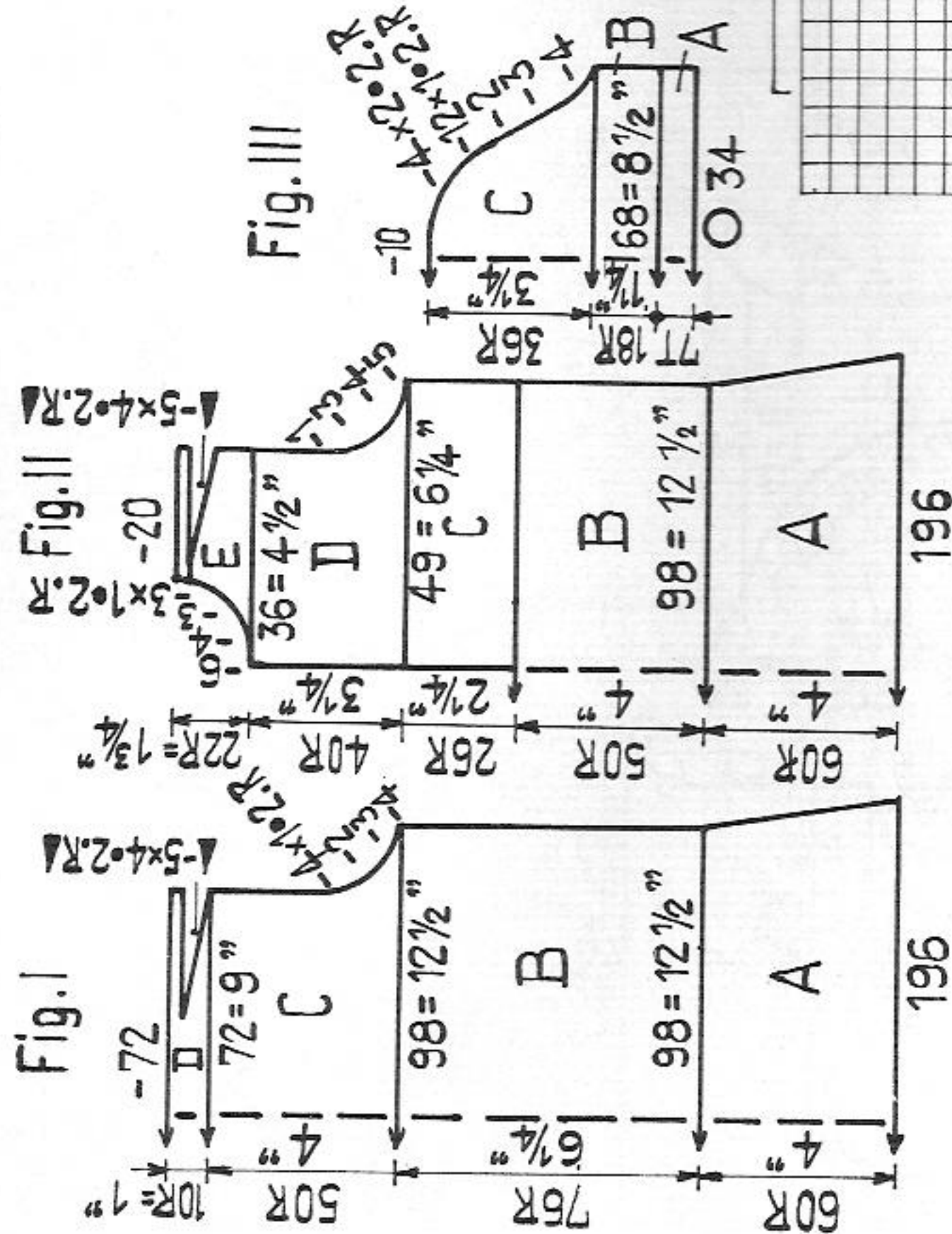
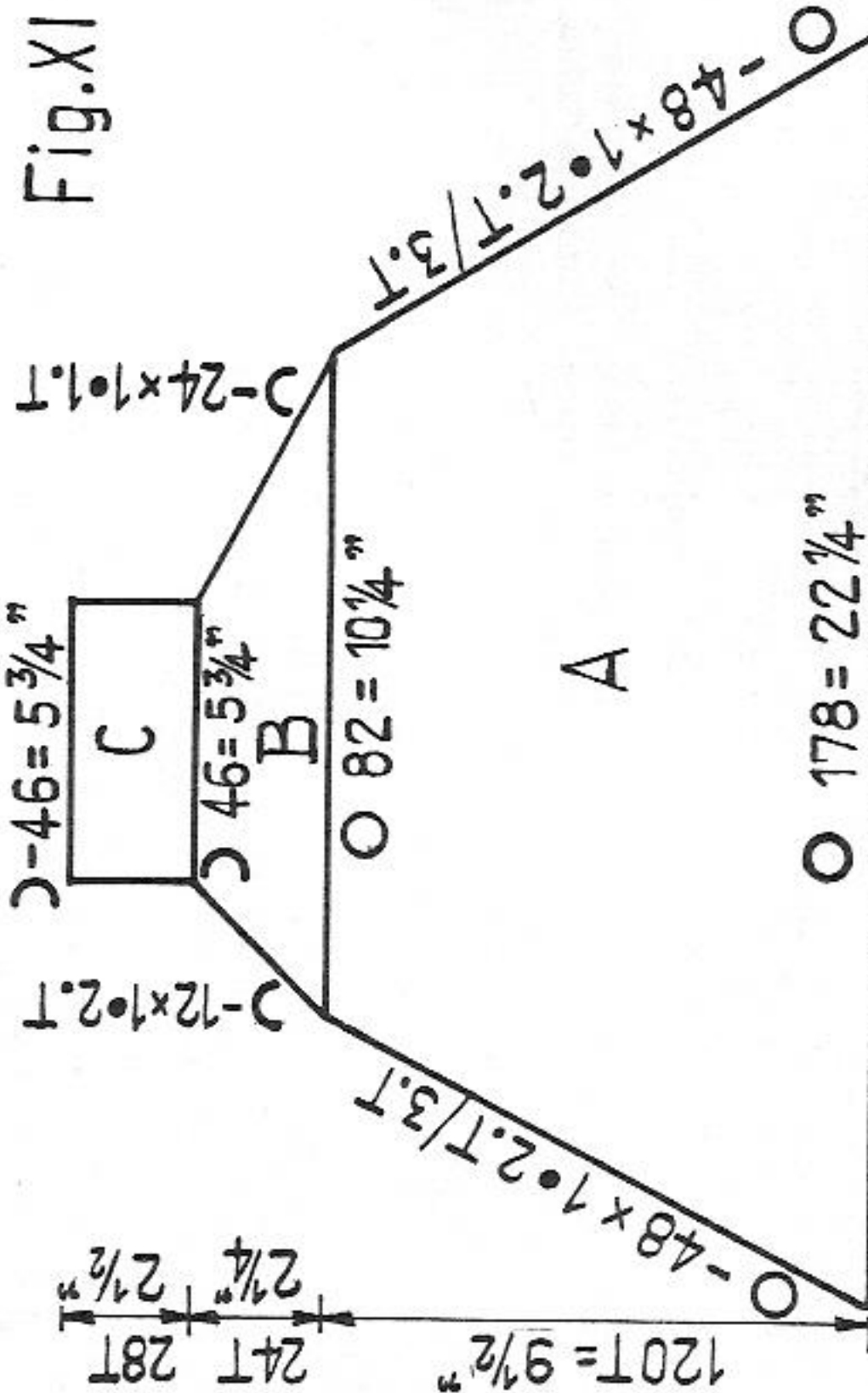
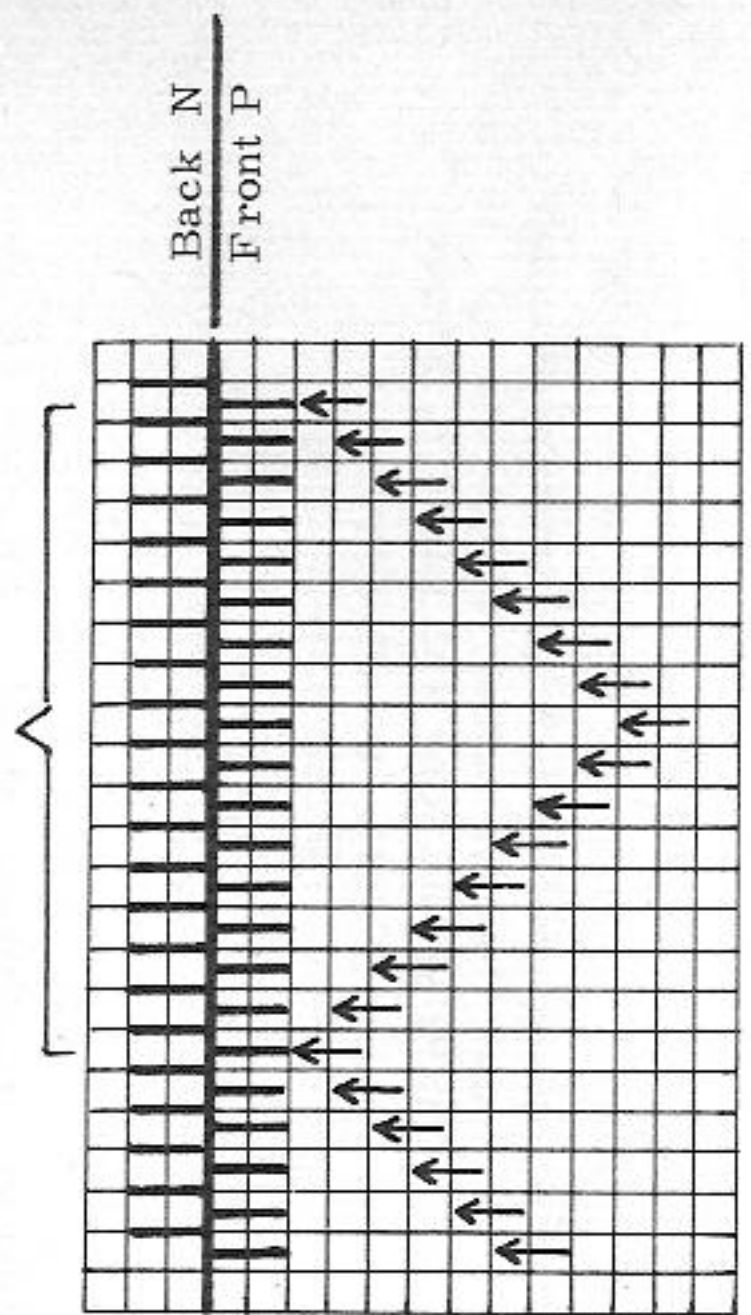
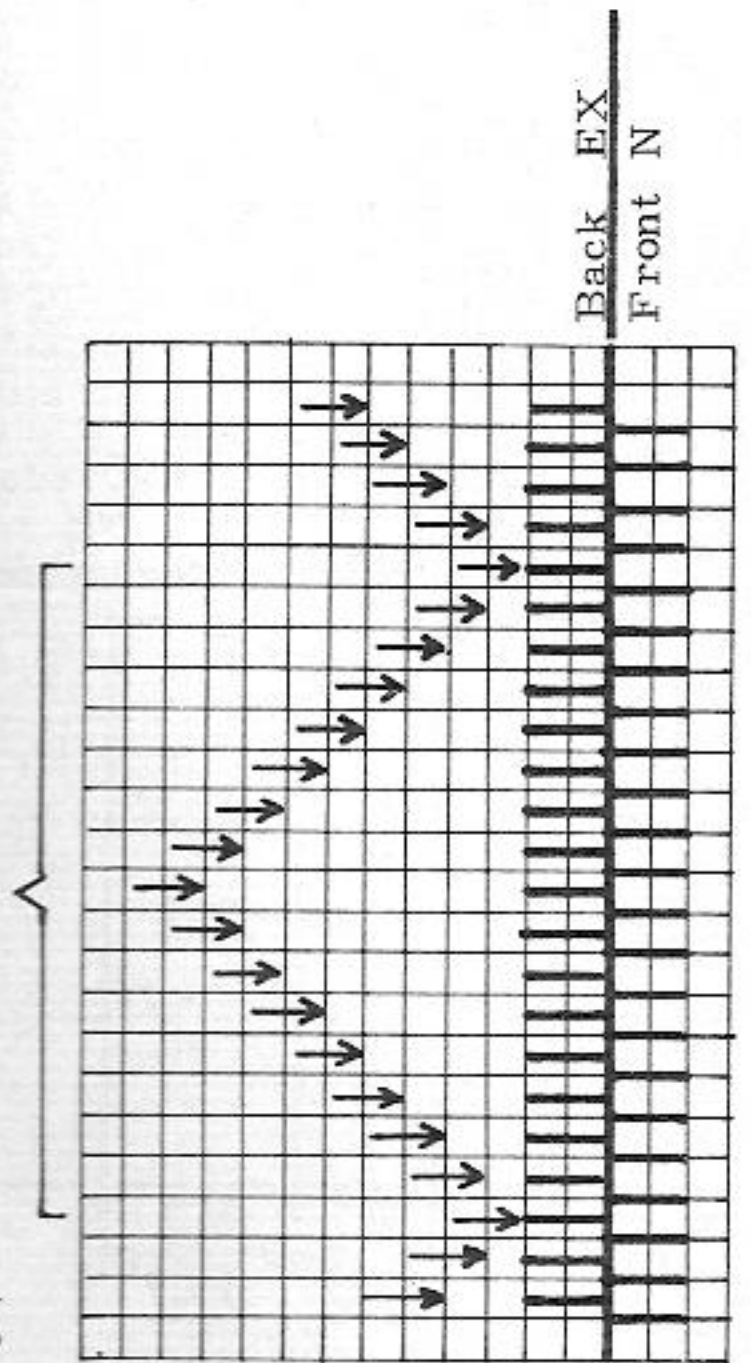
Pin out parts to size and press lightly all stocking st parts. Close side seams with back stitch and shoulders with graft stitch, unravelling contrast yarn. Close sleeve seams and set in sleeves. Attach neck band first to outside, then to inside, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Around front opening work 3 rows of single crochet, in the second row, work 6 buttonholes. Attach buttons.

Fig. III: A = for trimming pattern cast on 120 sts in red and knit 21 rows. B and C = loop pattern as for Fig. I, incr. and decr. accord. to diagram. Cast off. **Collar, red:** Cast on 210 sts for trimming pattern and knit 40 rows straight. Then, with St.S. 3, knit 30 rows, at the same time, with triple decker, at both ends, decr. 1 st each 3rd row, 10 times. Now, at front, knit 6 rows stocking st and a few rows with contrast yarn, then release. Repeat the same at back.

Button band, underlap, red: Cast on 160 sts for trimming pattern, St.S. 3, knit 30 rows, at the same time, at right with triple decker, decrease 1 st each 3rd row, 10 times. Now as for collar, at front knit 6 rows stocking st and a few rows with contrast yarn, release. Repeat the same at back.

Buttonhole band, overlap, red: Cast on 160 sts for trimming pattern and knit 30 rows, decreasing as for button band, but at left. At the same time, in the 18th row, work two buttonholes from the right as follows: miss 13 sts, with contrast yarn knit by hand over the following 4 sts, miss 25 sts, knit 4 sts by hand, miss the remaining 28 sts. Then continue knitting 12 more rows in trimming pattern and finish as for button band.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly. Close side seams, shoulders and sleeves. Set in sleeves. Join shaped edges of collar to underlap and overlap. Then, matching centre collar to centre back, sew collar as well as flaps around neck and at front along sections E, D and C, st by st with back stitch, first outside, then inside, unravelling contrast yarn. At front centre at B sew overlap over underlap. Finish buttonholes and attach buttons.

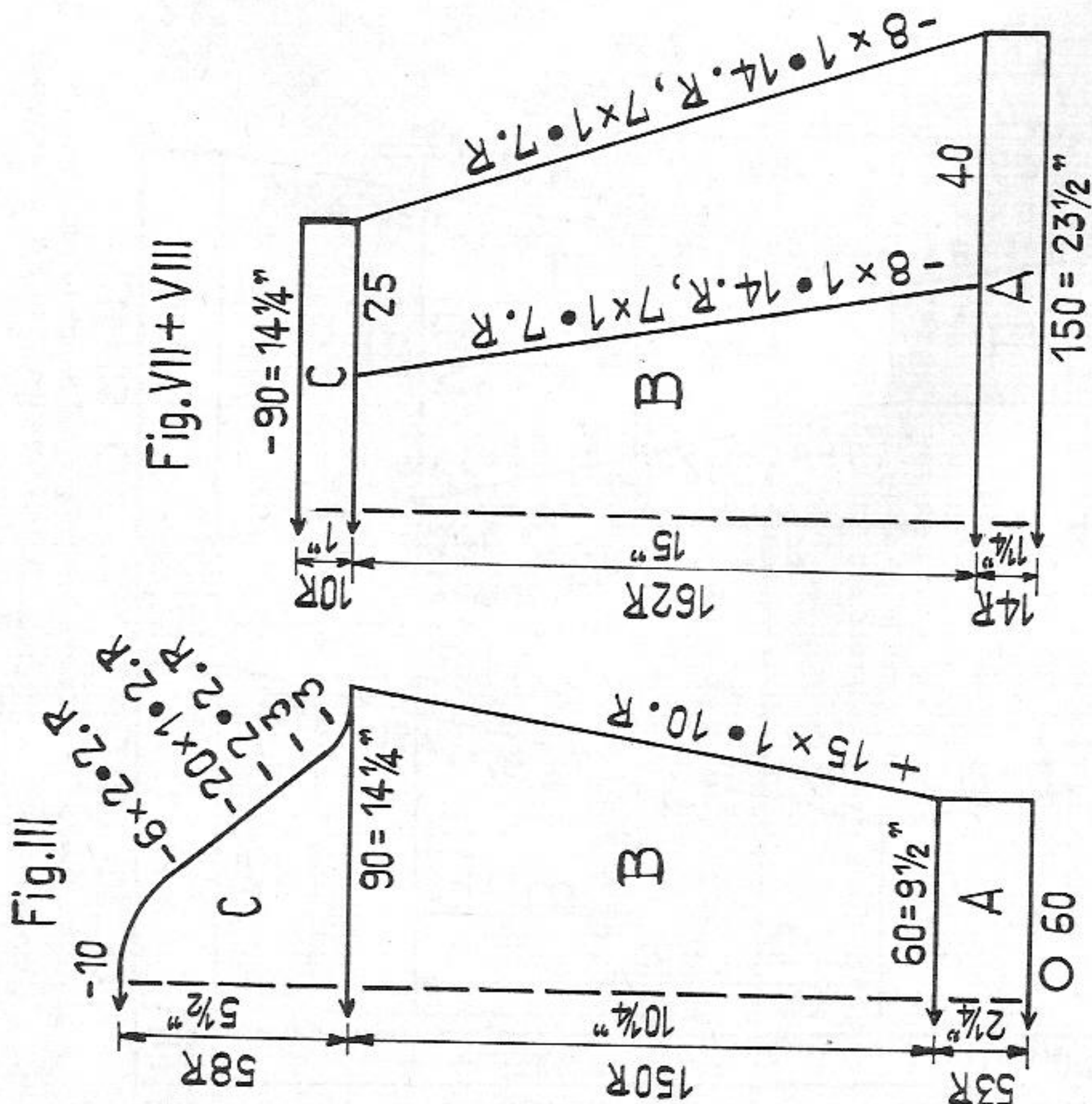

To make up, coat :

Block all parts, cover with damp cloth and let dry. Join all seams with back stitch. Set in sleeves. Fold inside lapels outwards along line x - x - x - x and join cast off edges from * to * with back stitch. Then turn lapels to inside and fix at shoulder seams. Removing contrast yarn stitch around double buttonholes. Attach collar from * to * first outside with back stitch, then slip-stitch to inside, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. To avoid distortion, reinforce button- and buttonhole bands with adhesive material. Just above hem trimming, fix to inside the additional 16 centre sts. 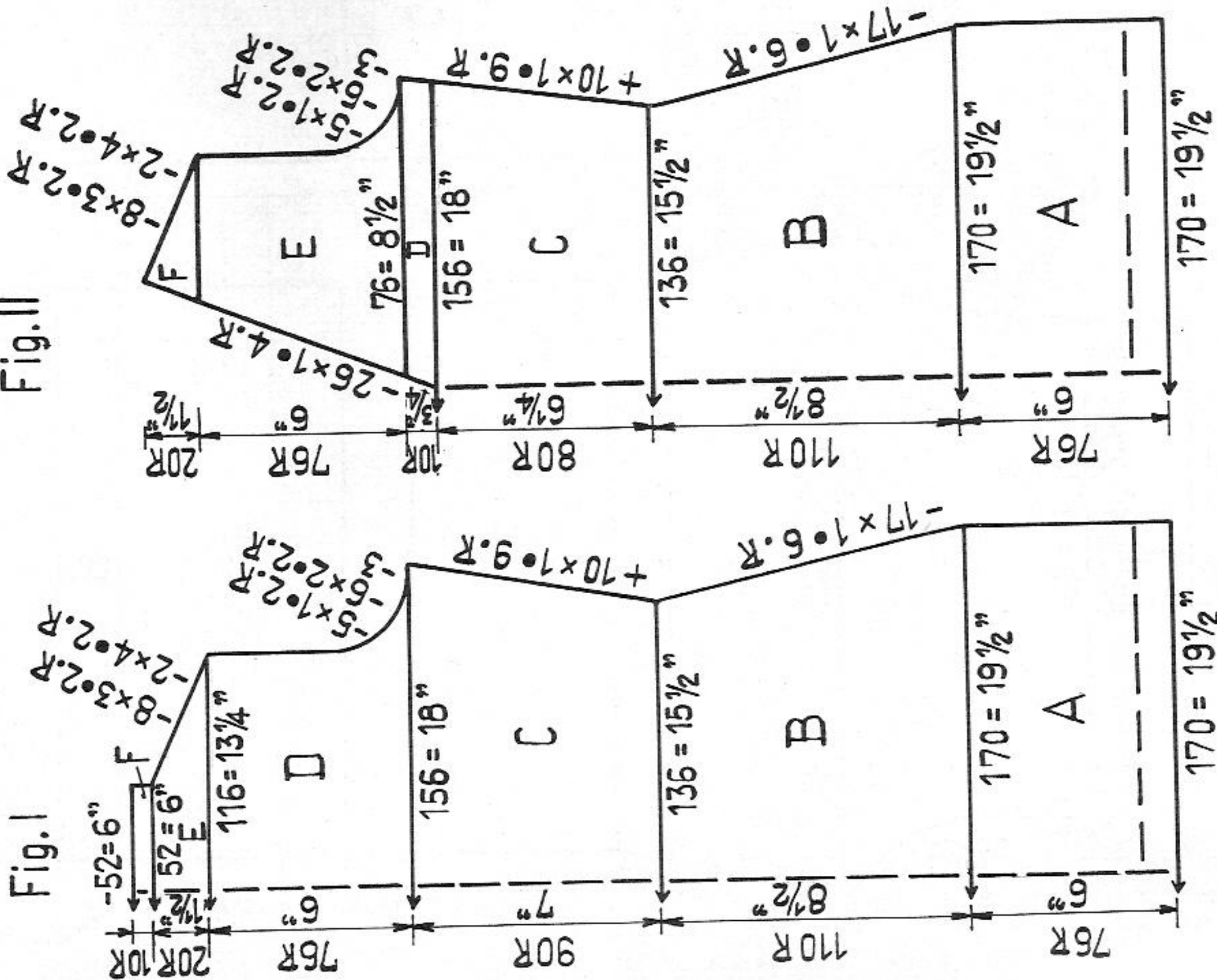

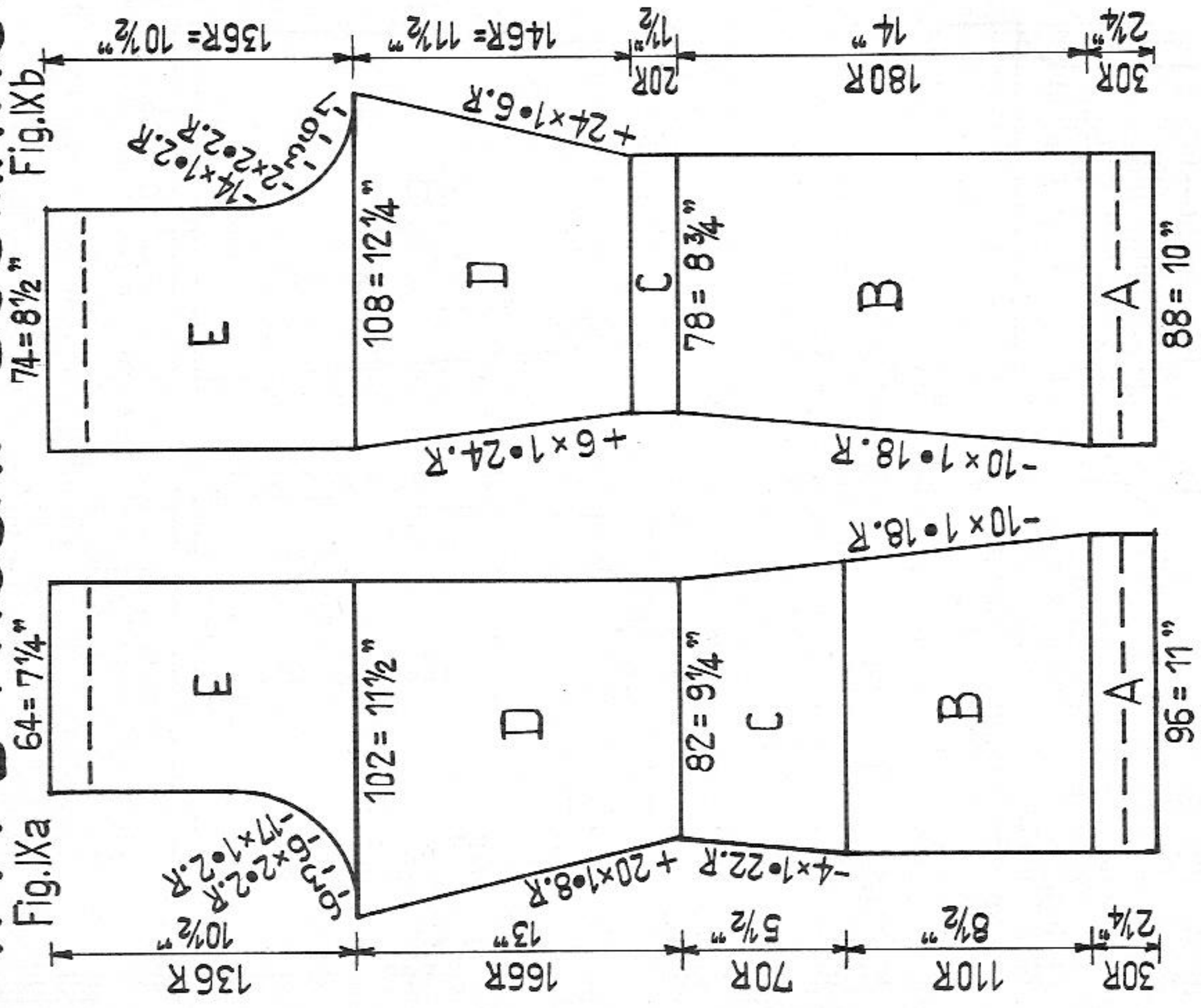

Fig. II: A to C = as for Fig. I. D = as for Fig. I, but with graduations for bust darts. E, F and G = as for Fig. I, number of sts and decreasing as per diagram.

To make up, tunic:

Block and press all parts, gathering pattern stripes lightly. Graft shoulders and neck facing, unravelling contrast yarn.
