Top of beach wear, knitted crosswise to body - front cover

Size: to fit a 85 cm bust

Material: 4 ozs synthetic bouclé yarn, 4 buttons

Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC 5 1/4

Test square: PASSAP COMBI 5 1/4, tension arm 7, yarn brake 3 1/2

Pattern: 100 sts = 38 cm, 100 rows = 16 cm

Pattern: stocking st, purlside outwards

Fig. I + II: A = start at centre front. Knit straight, B = at right knit 20 rows straight, then decrease with graduations, at left increase. C = at right increase with graduations, then continue straight. At left shape shoulders. D = at right knit straight, at left cast off 24 sts, then decrease. E = at right make darts (graduations), at left knit straight. F = at right knit straight, at left increase. G = at right knit straight, at left cast on 24 sts, then increase for shoulder shaping. H = knit straight. Dotted line = centre back. Now knit sections H to A, reversing shapings.

Cord for buttonholes: With 3 sts (2 front, 1 back) knit tubular a length of 15 cm approx.

To make up:

Join shoulders. At lower edge hem 1 cm to inside. Fold section A in half and slip-stitch to inside. Attach cord along right front edge, forming four loops as buttonholes. At left front edge sew on buttons to match buttonholes.

Sunny spring and torrid summer - time for vacation and beach pleasure - with these in mind we made the fashion collection for our new PASSAP MAGAZINE. And what does it suggest to you ?

The newest in fashionable yarns : not only pure wool and cotton, but also synthetic bouclé yarn to give the "turkish towel" effect, knop yarn of a cotton/linen mixture, splendid Rayon matched to Lurex with coloured burls and even Nylon sewing machine thread have been used - all carefree materials, easy to wash and quickly dry.

Very interesting are the new and fashionable lacy patterns that are knitted on two beds but which will give the effect of a single bed pattern (wrong side outwards, see model No. 1857), due to the use of the new transfer lock U 70.

Our exclusive golden evening dress (see back cover of Model Book 15) adds a special touch of brightness to the collection. It was done in genuine fairisle technique using very thin, clear Nylon machine thread and Rayon. The result is a lovely lacy stitch pattern.

Moreover, the two children's garments No. 1832 and 1836 won the first prizes in Spain in the PASSAP Fashion Competition for Instructors and Customers.

PASSAP friends from Germany, Greece, Spain and Switzerland have given their contributions to this model book and we wish to thank them all most sincerely.

Before starting your work please study carefully the explanations given on pages 1 and 2

Patterns: The drawings refer to half width, the indications of stitch numbers refer to whole width of each part.

Figure I	= back	Figure IX	= pants
Figure II	= front	Figure X	= gusset
Figure III	= sleeve	Figure XI	= scarf
Figure IV	= collar	Figure XII	= cap, bonnet
Figure V	= border, cuff	Figure XIII	= mittens
Figure VI	= pocket	Figure XIV	= socks, stockings
Figure VII	= skirt, front	Figure XV	= straps
Figure VIII	= skirt, back	Figure XVI	= bra, halter, bodice, top

If the centre line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is worked simultaneously with reversed shapings, i. e. decreasing or increasing is made on the left as well as on the right side.

If the centre line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is worked separately with reversed shapings, i. e. first knit one part according to diagram (increasing or decreasing at right), then the second part the opposite way (decreasing or increasing at left).

Abbreviations:

Col.	= colour of wool	○	= tubular (or) = half tubular
st, sts	= stitch, stitches	●	= every (in every row)
St.S	= stitch size	×	= times
Nd, nds	= needle, needles	+	= increase
R	= row	-	= decrease, cast off
T	= 2 rows	▲	= graduations (short rows)
		■	= for open work row hang st to the next nd, leave empty nd in W.P.

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter "st"). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working Position on back and front bed.

Exception: For tubular or half tubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed. The same number of needles must therefore be put into Working Position on the other bed. In these cases the sign for tubular \bigcirc respectively (or) for half tubular is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increase or decrease always occurs in the first row of a section.

- $+3 \times 2 \cdot 8 \cdot R$ means: increase 2 stitches 3 times in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- $-19 \times 3 \cdot 7 \cdot R$ means: decrease 3 stitches 19 times in every 7th row (back 2 stitches, front 1 stitch or vice versa).
- $-17 \times 1 \cdot 2./3 \cdot R$ means: decrease 1 stitch 17 times, alternately once after 2 rows and once after 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle -4 \times 8 \cdot 2 \cdot R$ means: work graduations, i. e. short rows (on DUO with pushers and lock BX). Step by step put 8 nds (and their respective pushers) into Rest Position 4 times after every 2nd row (for double bed 4 nds each back and front). Once all graduations are finished, continue knitting normally, i. e. all nds in Working Position (pushers in Neutral Position).

Graduations can be knitted two ways, either from outer edge towards centre (gradual decreasing with the minus-sign "-" after the black triangle) or from the centre towards outer edge (gradual increasing with the plus-sign "+" after the black triangle.)

Number of stitches and inches:

- $136 = 8''$ means: a total of 136 sts (for K/K 68 stitches each on back and front) make a width of 8".
- $\bigcirc 146 = 17''$ means: cast on 146 sts each on back and front bed for tubular which makes a width of 17".

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be tested by you, by making your own test square for your own wool.

Test square: We strongly recommend that you make always a test square with your own material before starting to work, in order to calculate for your material the necessary numbers of stitches and rows along the PASSAP - chart. The chapter "The test square and its calculation" in your instruction book informs you how to proceed for these calculations. This is very important, especially when adjusting a model to another size.

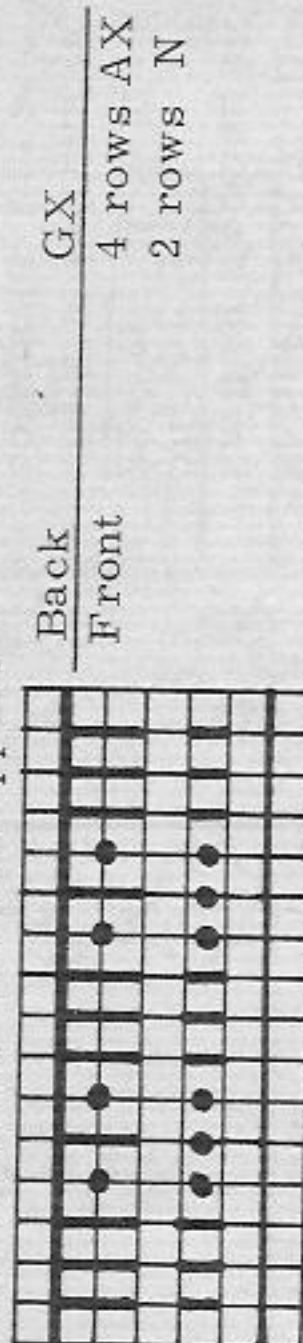

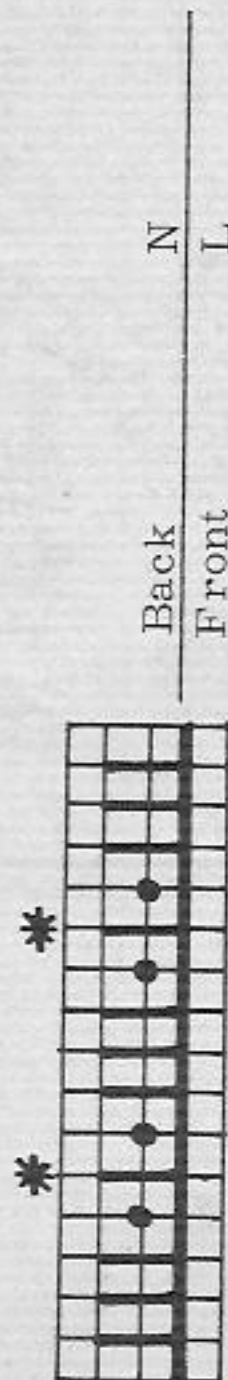

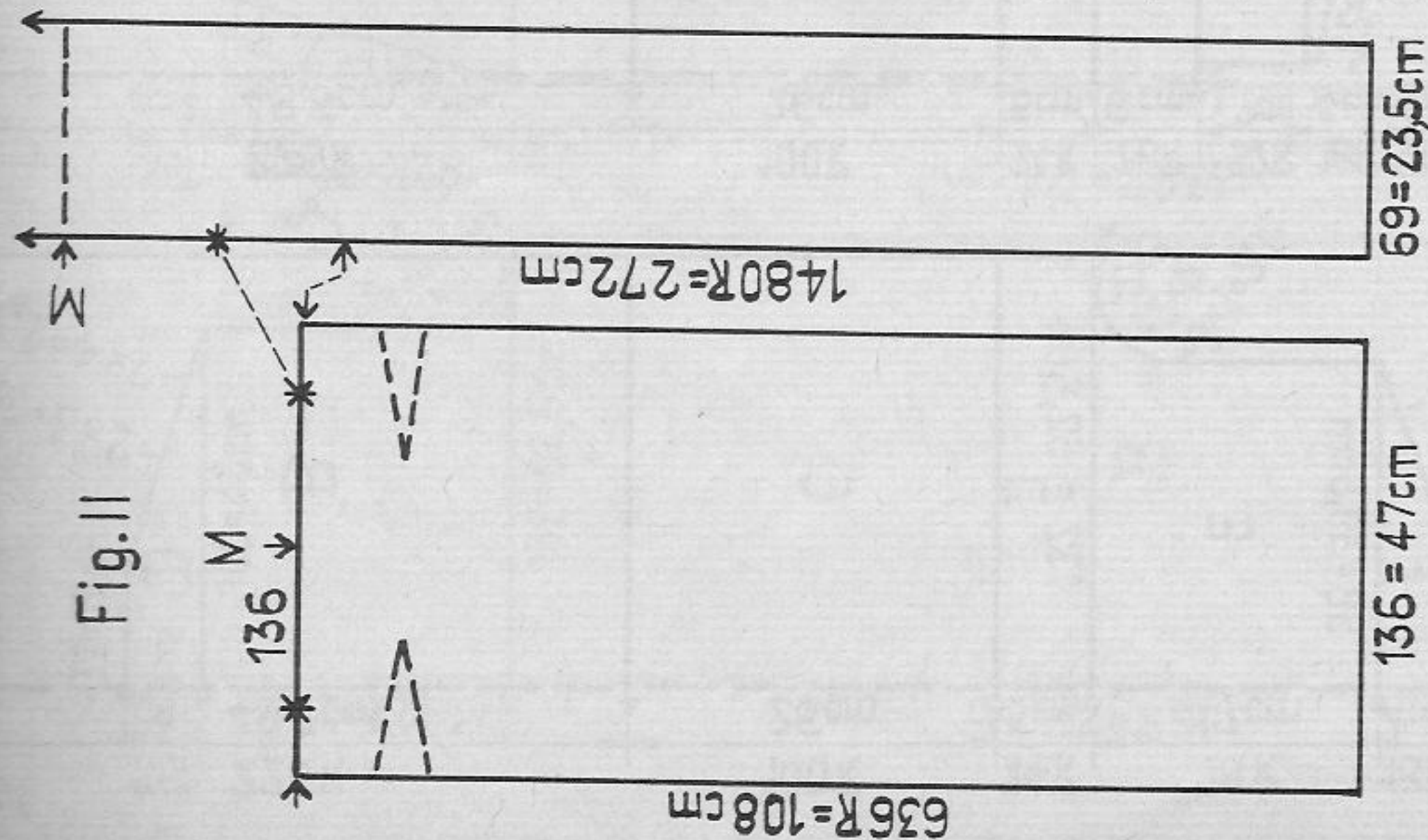
Nds with * in Rest-Position, knit 4 rows. Press left returning key, knit 2 rows. Repeat.

Fig. II: Cast on 136 sts and knit 636 rows in pattern, then a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. I: Cast on 69 sts, knit 1480 rows in pattern, cast off.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size, moisten and allow to dry. At upper edge of Fig. II make a 2,5 cm hem, sewing st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. At both sides sew bust darts about 8 cm below upper edge, each dart 6 cm deep and 13 cm long approx. Starting from the bottom, attach one side edge of Fig. I all round to Fig. II, matching points * and M of Fig. I with those of Fig. II, leaving armhole openings between * and *. Close other side edge of Fig. I to make seam at back from the bottom, up to desired neck opening. At lower edge of dress make a hem, adjusting length to wish.



Collar: Stocking st. With 44 sts knit 168 rows according to needle division for collar.
Belt: Stocking st. With 18 sts knit 180 rows according to needle division for belt.
Buttonhole band: Cast on 110 sts for 2:2 rib and knit 10 rows. Prepare for tub. by hanging connecting links onto empty nds, both back and front. With 74 sts on each bed knit tubular: 2 rows red, 6 rows white, 2 rows red. Now, with contrast yarn, make 6 buttonholes on each bed from left, over sts 4 to 6, 17 to 19, 30 to 32, 43 to 45, 56 to 58 and 69 to 71. Knit 4 rows tubular red, 6 rows tubular white, release.
To make up:
At back and front close seam along sections C and D. Close shoulders and side seams. Close crutch at sections A and B. Slip-stitch sections A to inside and pull elastic through. Attach under collar outside around neck along dotted line at back up to arrows on front (see diagram) and cut off surplus material. Fold facing to outside and slip-stitch upper edge (K 1) to shoulder seam. Close side edges of collar, turn collar and slip-stitch to inside. Attach buttonhole band to right front, from top along sections G and F down to middle of section E, first outside st by st with back st, then slip-stitch to inside unravelling contrast yarn. Finish off double buttonholes. Close centre front at section E up to buttonhole band. Work two rows of single crochet along left front to form underlap. Attach 6 buttons to match buttonholes. Close side edges of belt as well as cast-on and cast-off edges. Attach belt at waist level with two buttons at side seams. Work 1 row of single crochet around armholes.

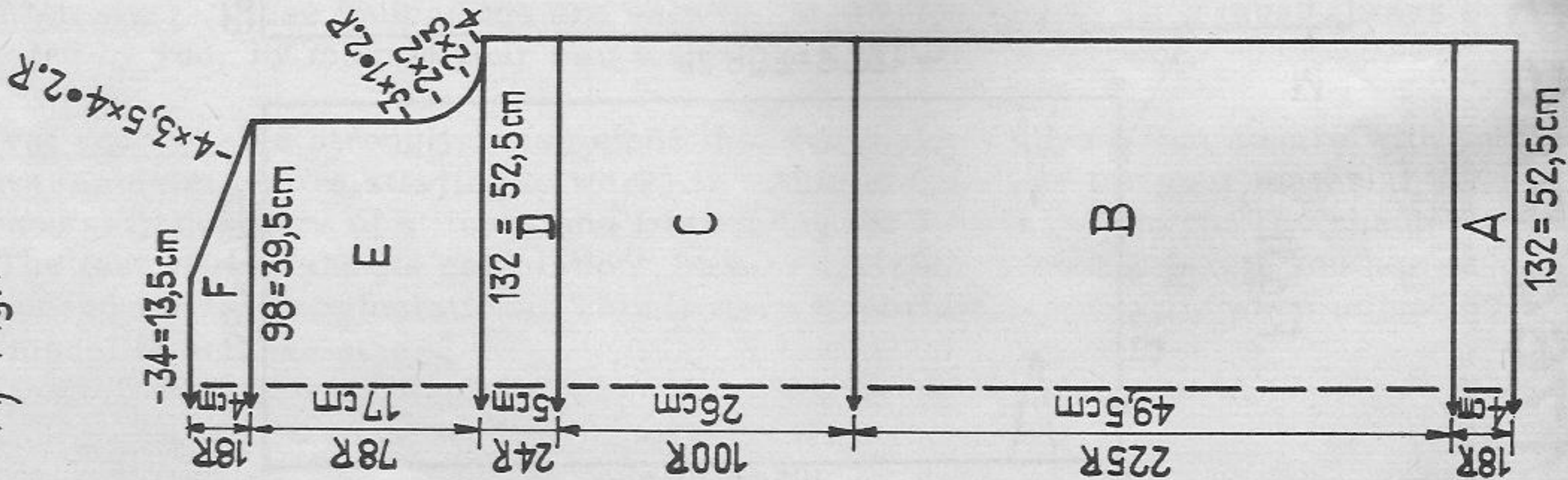

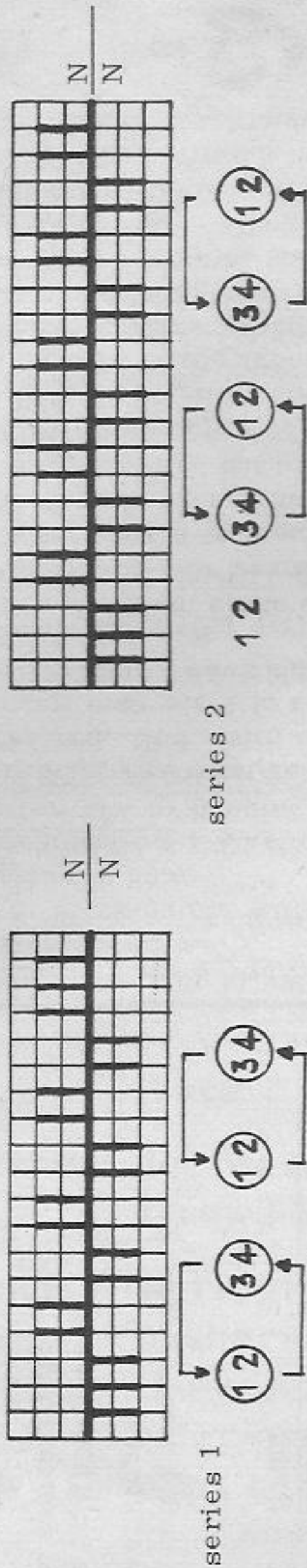
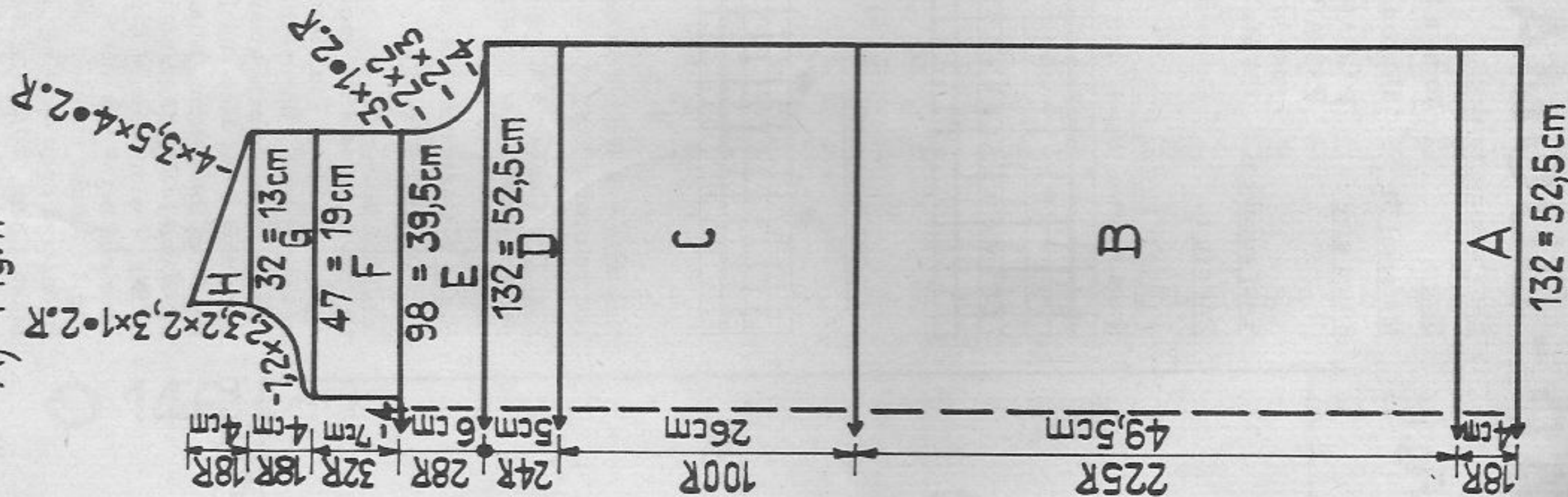
Pattern: Dress in stocking st with cable pattern at waist. Coat stocking st. Sleeve welt and pocket bands in 2:2 rib, neck and buttonhole band in K/K rib.

Fig. I: A = stocking st for hem. B = stocking st. C = cable pattern as follows: transfer sts according to diagram and, with St. S 6 3/4 on both beds, knit 100 rows crossing sts at front according to series 1 in the 10th, 30th, 50th, etc. row, and according to series 2 in rows 20, 40, 60 etc. i.e. every 10th row alternating series 1 and 2. D = transfer sts from back to front and, with St. S 5 3/4, continue knitting stocking st. E = shape armhole. F = decrease for shoulder shaping. Cast off.

Fig. II: A to E = as for Fig. I. F = cast off 4 sts at centre to divide work, then continue knitting each shoulder separately with reversed shapings. Knit straight at both ends. G = at one end knit straight, at the other shape neck. H = at one end shape shoulder, at the other knit straight.

Armhole bands: Knit twice in stocking st beginning and ending with contrast yarn. Cast on 80 sts. Knit 6 rows with St. S 5 3/4, 1 row with St. S 7 1/2, then another 6 rows with St. S 5 3/4. Release.

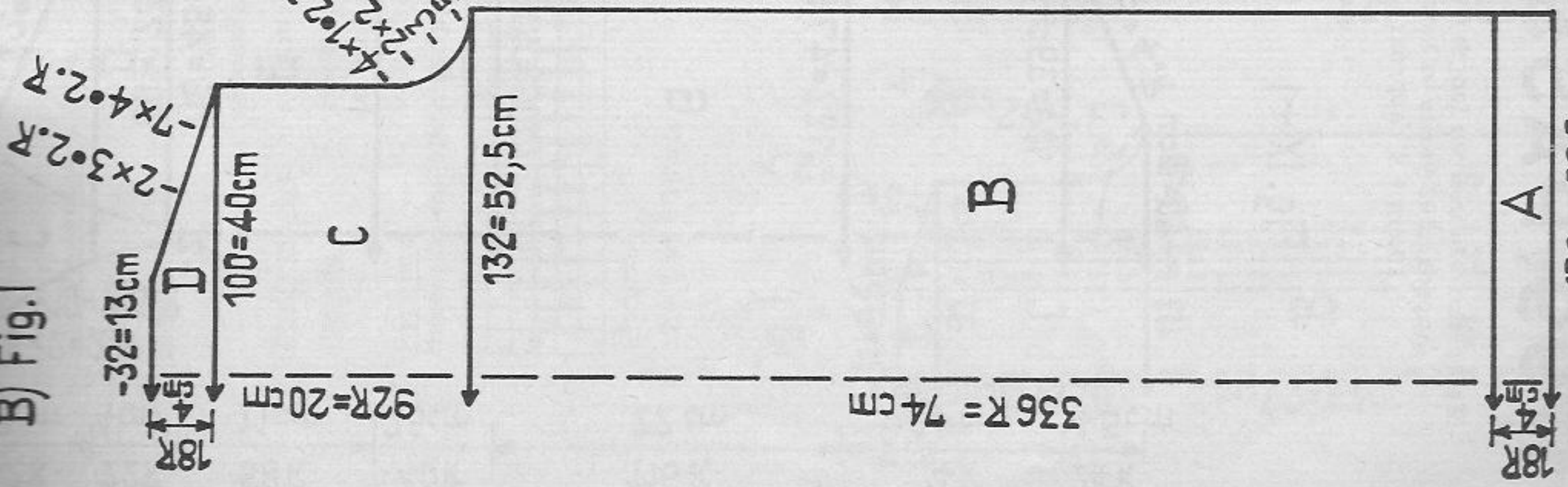
Neck band: Knit once with 130 sts as for armhole bands.

To make up:

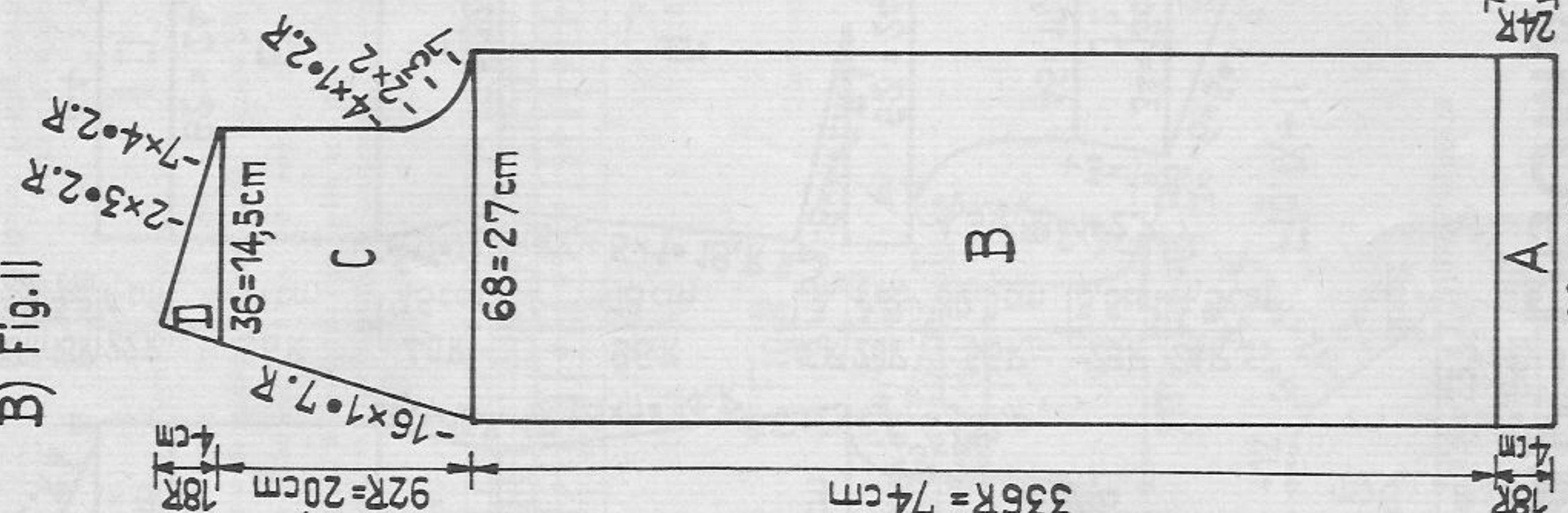
Block and press all parts lightly but do not press cable pattern. Close shoulders, then attach armhole bands to outside, st by st, with back st and flush with side edges, unravelling contrast yarn. Now close side seams and armhole bands at the same time. Fold armhole bands in half and sew to inside, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Attach neck band to neck in the same way, starting at left centre front. At lower edge make an approx. 4 cm hem, according to desired length. Press hem, seams and trimming bands lightly.

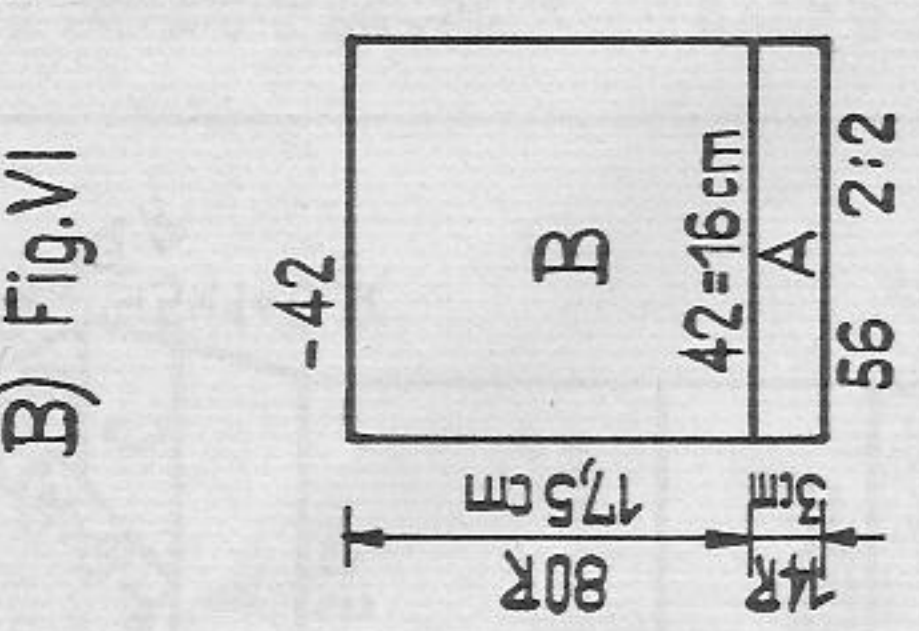

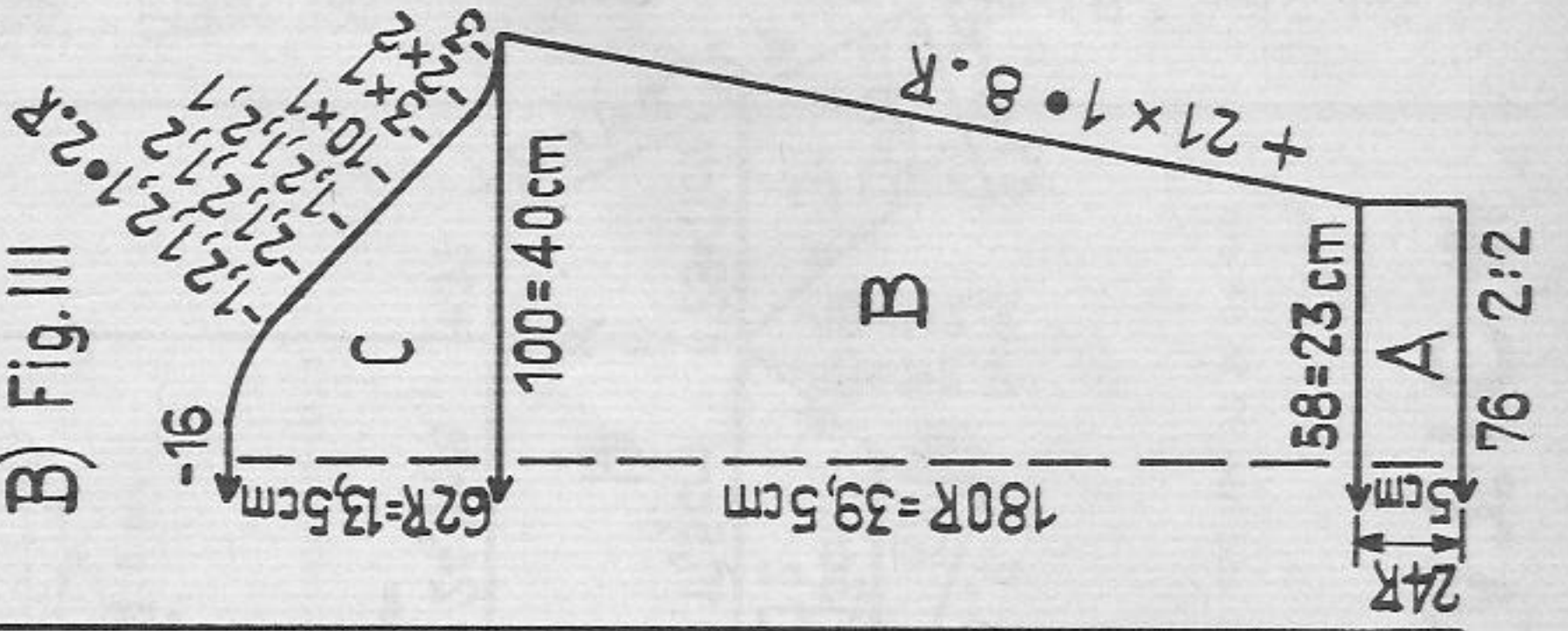

Fig. I: A = 18 rows stocking st for hem. B = knit straight. C = shape armholes at both ends. D = shape shoulders. Cast off.
Fig. II: Knit twice with reversed shapings. A and B = stocking st. C = at one end shape armhole, at other decrease for neck using quintuple decker. D = at one end shape shoulder, at the other continue decreasing for neck.

Fig. III: Knit twice. A = for welt cast on 76 sts for 2:2 rib and with St.S 3 3/4 knit 24 rows. Transfer sts for stocking st. B = with St.S 5 3/4 knit stocking st, increasing according to diagram. C = decrease for sleeve head. Cast off.

Pockets: Knit twice. A = cast on 56 sts for 2:2 rib with St.S 3 3/4 knit 14 rows. Transfer sts for stocking st. B = with 42 sts and St.S 5 3/4 knit 80 rows, then a few rows with contrast yarn. Release.

Buttonhole and neck band: Cast on 22 sts for K/K rib and with St.S 3 1/2 knit 14 rows. Work vertical buttonholes as follows: at right back and front put 6 pushers in W.P., set locks to BX and knit 9 rows. Lock is at left. Pull down sufficient yarn below the feeding eyelet for reinforcing the buttonhole later on, and hold it down by hanging the green tool on it below the needlebeds. At right, return all pushers in N.P., pass lock to the right. Now at left back and front put 5 pushers in W.P. and knit 9 rows. Lock is at left. Set both locks to N and knit 27 rows. Repeat this procedure 6 times. Knit 540 rows after the 7th buttonhole. Cast off.

To make up:

Tack pockets to front parts at desired level, then sew side edges with mattress st and lower edge with graft st, unravelling contrast yarn. Close side seams and shoulders. Make a 4 cm hem at lower coat edge. Tack buttonhole and neck band onto coat as follows: right sides together, starting with buttonhole band and tack on wrong side - along right front - neck - left front, flush with lower edges. Then sew with back st close to edge st. Unfold and press seam on wrong side. Set in sleeves and attach buttons.

Material: 5 1/2 ozs medium, synthetic yarn

Size: to fit a 90 cm hip approx.

Material: 5 1/2 ozs synthetic bouclé yarn, elastic for waist

Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC St.S 5 1/4

Test square: 100 sts = 38 cm, 100 rows = 16 cm

Pattern: stocking st, purlside outwards

Pattern: stocking st, purlside outwards

Fig. IX: Knit once according to diagram, once with reversed shapings. (One edge straight.) Sections A, B and C = back, sections E and F = front.

A = cast on 18 sts and knit 12 rows straight, then start increasing at right.

B = continue increasing at right. C = knit straight. D = at right work darts with graduations from outside. E = knit straight. F = at right cast off 42 sts, decreasing according to diagram. Knit 4 rows straight, cast off.

Belt: For tubular cast on 6 sts on each bed and knit a belt of 65 cm length approx.

To make up: Fold unshaped edges by 3 cm to outside and catch down, thus forming turn-ups in stocking st. Close leg and seat seams with back st. Pull elastic through belt and close belt edges. Attach belt with knit st to top of waist edge. Do not press.

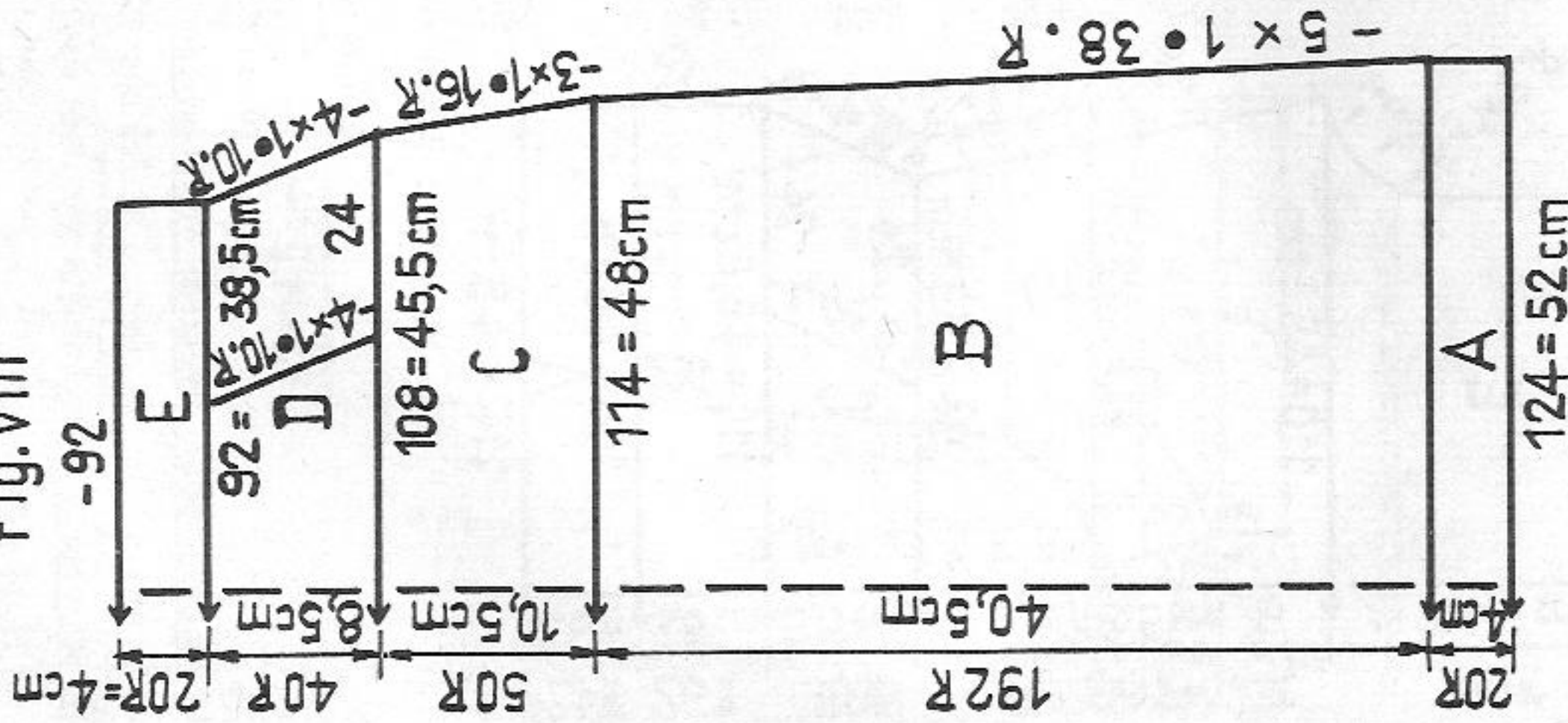
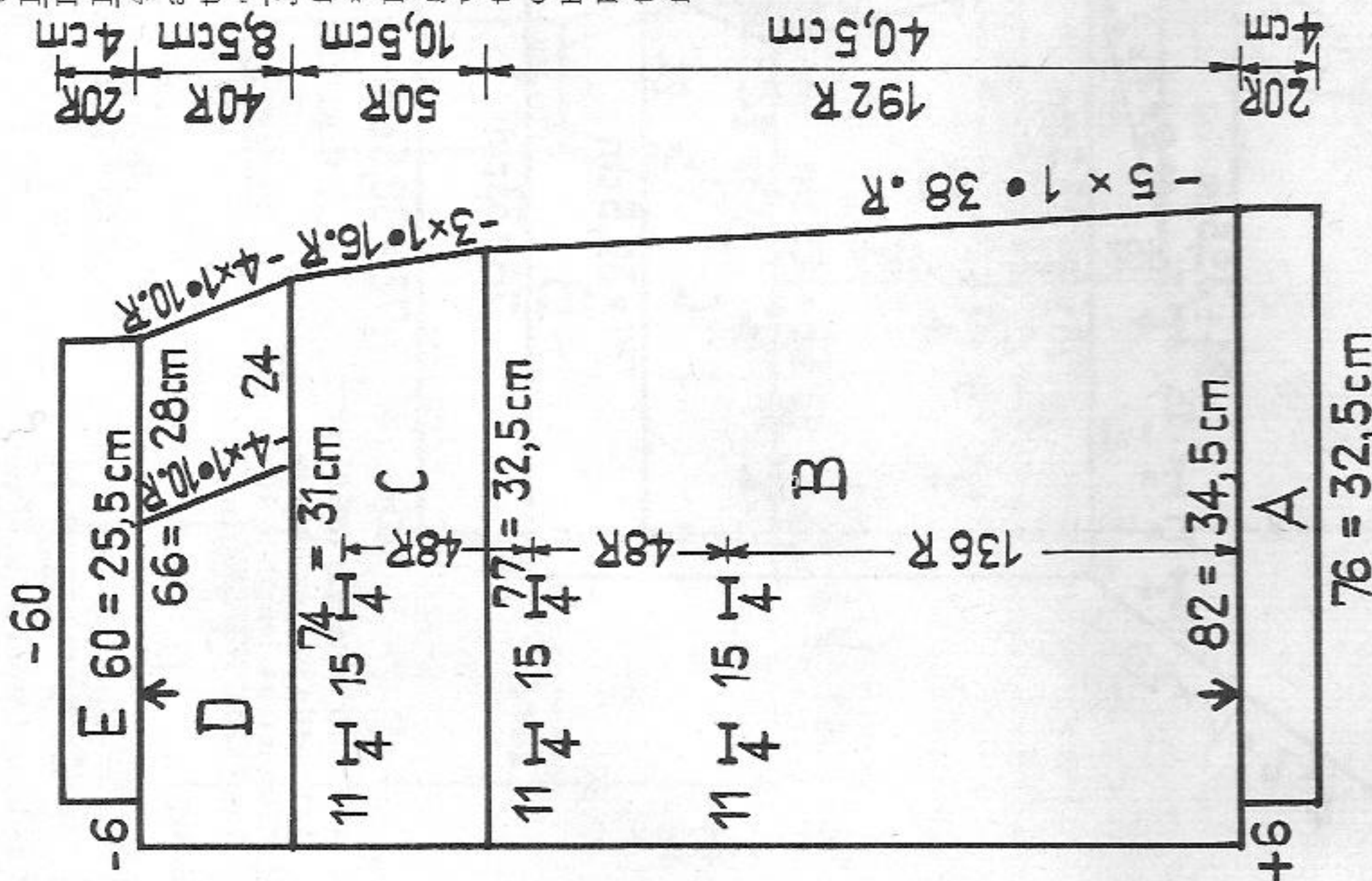

To make up jacket:

Join side, sleeve and shoulder seams. Fold facing along fold line (x-x-x-x-x) first to outside (purlside facing purlside) and sew together from fold line to * (4,5 cm) with back st. Then turn facing to inside and attach sections J and K to front sections G and H. Join cast-on edges of section A of collar with graft stitch, unravelling contrast yarn. Attach collar to inside, right side outwards, from * to * with back st. Close side edges of collar with back st, turn to outside and attach other edge from * to *. Slip-stitch front facing and six cast-on sts to inside or fix with special adhesive. At lower edge turn a 5 1/2 cm hem to inside and catch down or fix with adhesive. Unravel contrast yarn at buttonholes and crochet off loose sts. At lower edge of sleeve turn a 5 cm hem to inside and catch down. Set in Sleeves, attach buttons. Press collar and facing edges lightly.

Skirt B

Fig. VIII, skirt, back: A = hem, mauve. B = start colour series with 8 rows mauve and continue according to pattern description. Decrease at both edges. C = decrease at both ends. D = decrease as follows: at both ends transfer edge st to next nd, then with decker comb transfer 24 sts by 1 nd inwards (first st double). E = waist hem, 9 rows stocking st with St. S 5 1/2, 1 row with St. S 6 1/2, 10 rows with St. S 5 1/2, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. VII, skirt, front: Right front according to pattern, left front reversing shapings, omitting buttonholes. A = hem, mauve. B = start colour series as for Fig. VIII. At left cast on 6 sts and then knit straight. At right decrease. After 136 rows make buttonholes as for Fig. II, knit 48 rows (2 colour series) and repeat buttonholes. Knit 6 rows to finish section B. C = at right decrease at left - after 42 rows - make buttonholes as before. D = at right decrease as for Fig. VIII D, at left knit straight. E = at right knit straight, at left cast off 6 sts, then continue straight, 9 rows stocking st with St. S 5 1/2, 1 row with St. S 6 1/2, 10 rows with St. S 5 1/2, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up skirt:

Join side seams. Sew lower hem and the 6 cast-on sts to inside or fix with adhesive material. Turn waist hem to outside (E) (purlside inside) and, with back st, sew down st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Insert elastic. Neaten buttonholes. Place front parts one upon the other (arrows = centre front) and attach buttons to match buttonholes. Attach two large press studs to fix waist.

Fig. I: A = hem, mauve. B = start colour series, decreasing at both ends. C = at both ends transfer edge st to next nd, then with decker comb transfer 24 sts by 1 nd inwards (first st double). D = increase at both ends. E = shape armholes. F = shape shoulders. Cast off.

Fig. II: Knit right front according to diagram, left front reversing shapings, omitting buttonholes. A = hem, mauve. B = at left cast on 6 sts, start colour series, decreasing at right, at left knit straight. C = at right decrease as for Fig. I, at left knit straight. D = at right increase, at left make two buttonholes as follows: at left miss 11 sts, knit 4 sts with contrast yarn, miss 15 sts, knit 4 sts with contrast yarn. After having knitted 48 rows (2 colour series) repeat buttonholes as before. Fig. I, back bodice: Knit once according to diagram, once with reversed shapings. Pusher division for back. A = cast on 44 sts for K/K rib, knit 62 rows straight in pattern. B = decrease at right, knit straight at left, C = 2 rows N/N, transfer all sts from back to front and knit 14 rows stocking st for neck band, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. II, front: A = cast on 86 sts for K/K rib, knit 62 rows in pattern with pusher division for front, B = decrease at both ends, C = as for Fig. I.

Fig. III, sleeve: Knit twice. Pusher division for sleeves.

A = knit K/K for welt, B = knit straight in pattern. C = decrease at both ends, 2 rows N/N, transfer all sts to front. D = knit 14 rows stocking st, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. VII + VIII; (skirt) Pusher division for skirt.

Over 264 sts knit 102 rows straight in pattern, 2 rows N/N, transfer all sts to front, knit 2 rows stocking st. Release.

Cord: With 3 sts at front and back knit tubular a length of 90 cm approx.

To make up:

Close skirt, side and sleeve seams with mattress stitch. Join sleeves to front and back, at neck with mattress stitch, the rest with back stitch. Fold neck band in half and slip-stitch to outside, st by st, with back st, unravelling contrast yarn. At centre back pin shell pattern edges one on top of the other, then join back and bodice with back stitch placing right sides together and matching shell pattern edges at centre front and centre back as well as at sides. Attach a pompon at each cord end or make clusters with 6 buttons, see illustration. At nape of neck attach a loop and a button, then fix another 5 buttons evenly distributed at underlap, each button on a shell. The corresponding shells of the overlap will serve as buttonholes. Don't press.

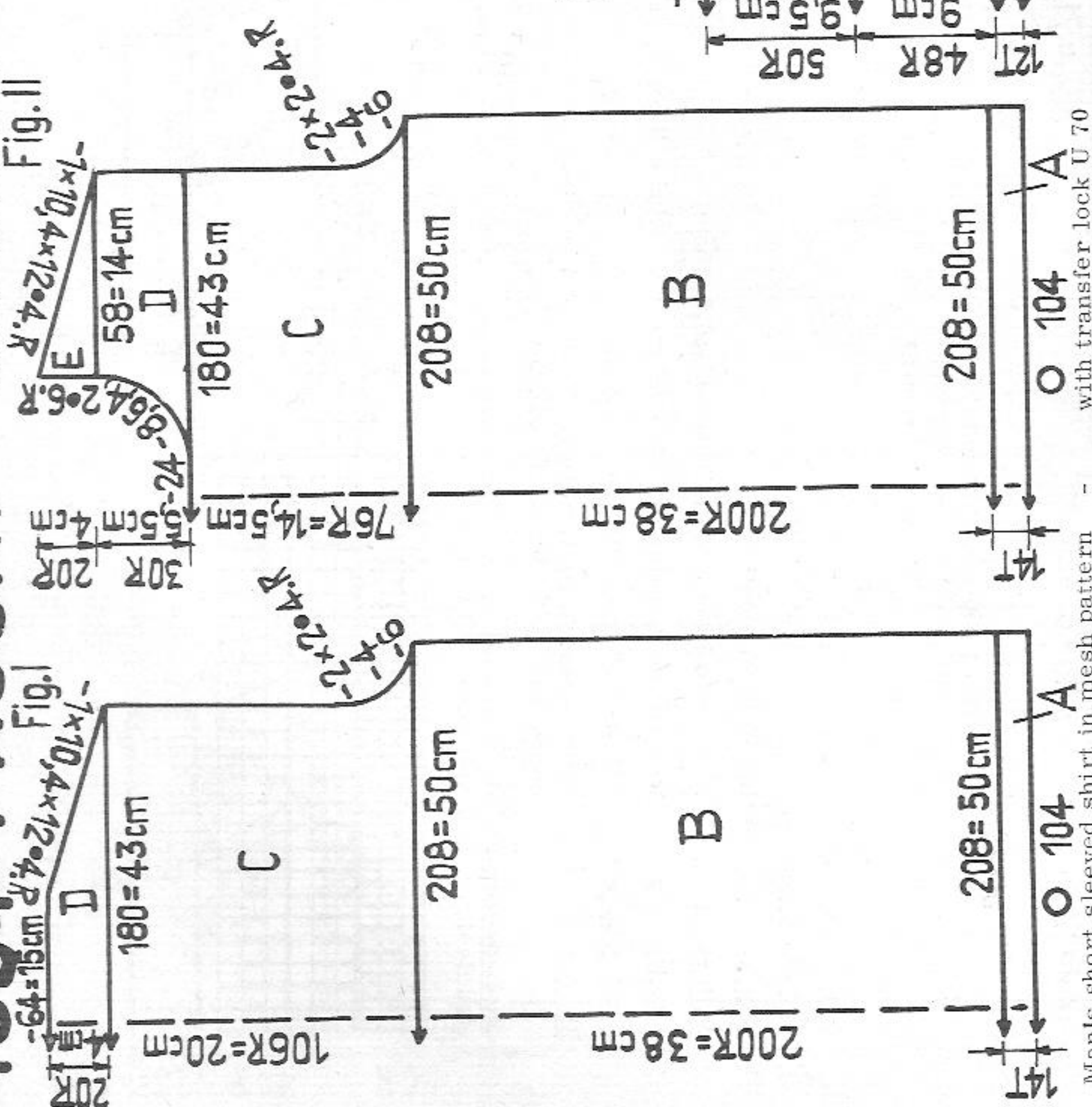
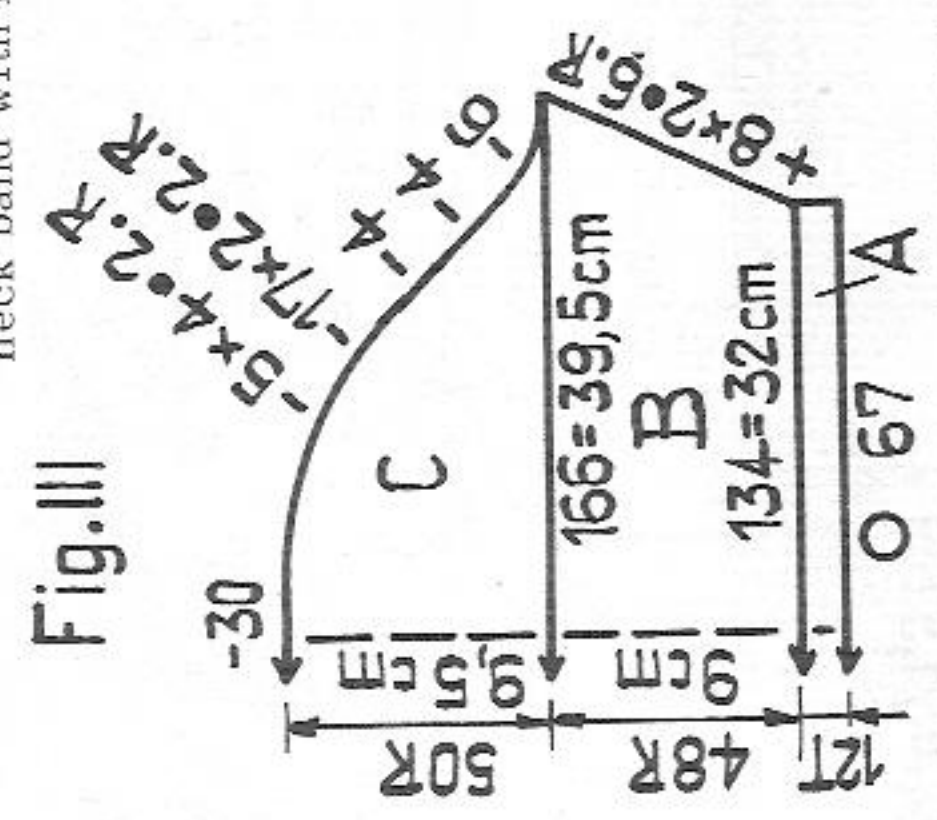


Fig. I: A = tubular. B = pattern according to diagram. C = decrease at both ends for armhole. D = shape shoulders, cast off.
Fig. II: A to C = as for Fig. I. Now cast off 24 sts in the centre. Put left shoulder on deker combs and let it hang inbetween the beds. Knit right shoulder according to diagram. D = at right knit straight, at left decrease for neck. E = at right shape shoulder, knitting straight at left. Then hang sts of left shoulder back onto machine and knit sections D and E, reversing shapings.
Fig. III: Knit twice. A = tubular. B = knit in pattern, increasing at both ends. C = shape sleeve head, cast off.
Neck band: Tubular. Cast on 112 sts on each bed and knit 28 rows tubular (RC 28). A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up:
 Pin out parts to size and press. Join sleeve, side and shoulder seams. Set in sleeves. Attach neck band - starting at shoulder seam - first outside, st by st, with back st, then inside, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Close neck band with mattress st at shoulder seam.



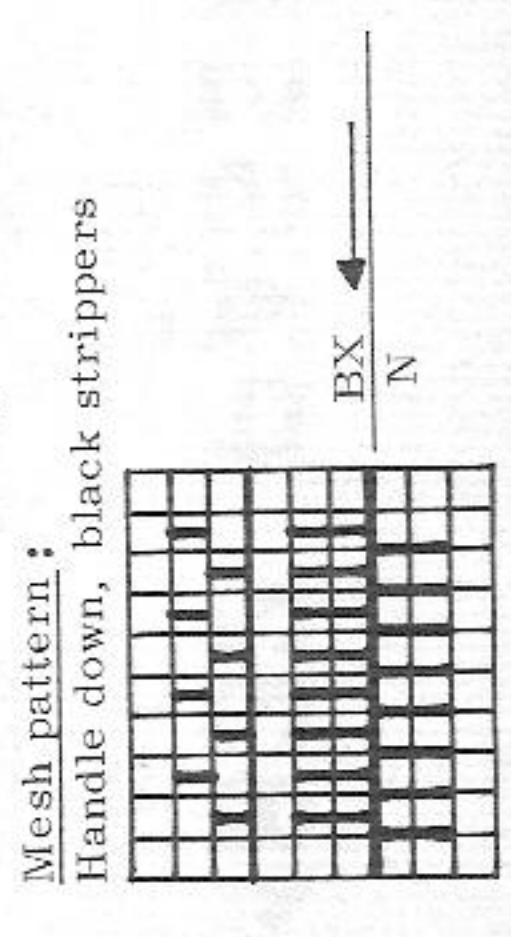

Fig. II: A to C = as for Fig. I. D = divide work, casting off 13 sts at centre, and continue knitting each shoulder separately with reversed shapings.
Fig. III: Knit two parts alike. A = welt, 2:2 rib. B = transfer sts for stocking st, increase at both ends. C = shape sleeve head.

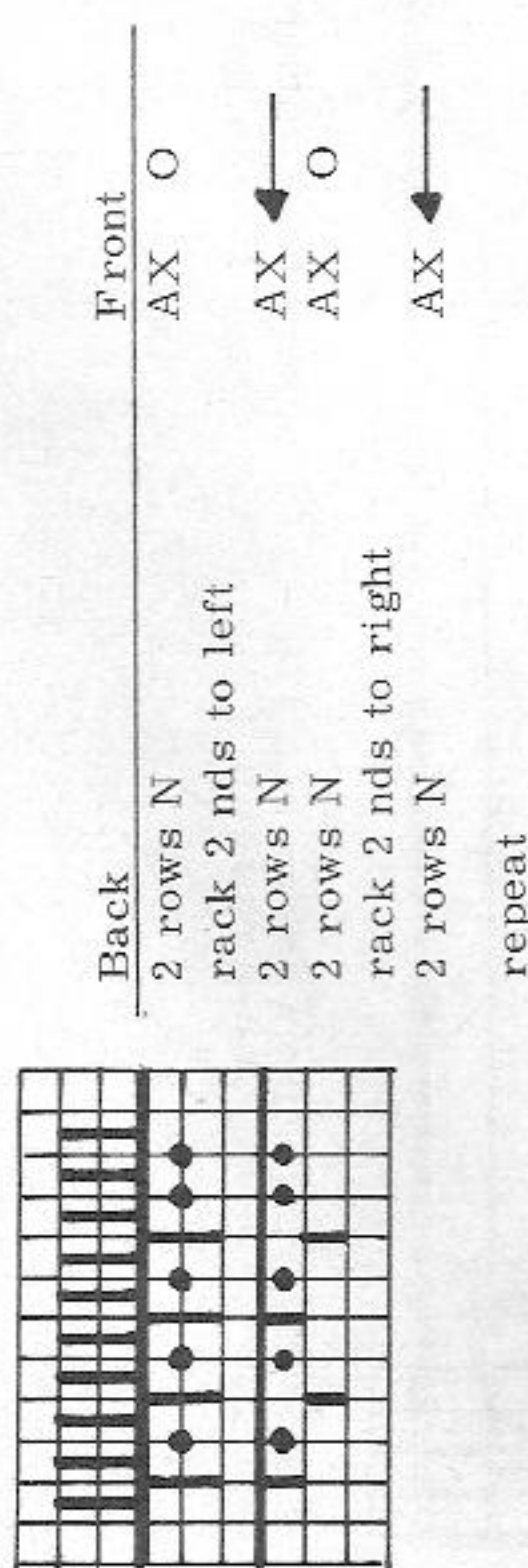

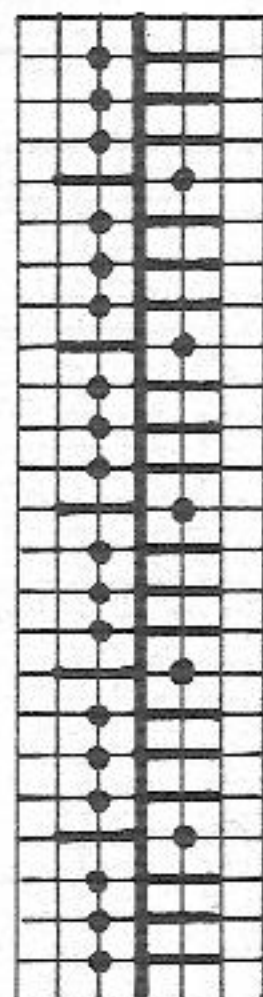
To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly. Close side, shoulder and sleeve seams. Set in sleeves. Attach trimming along front opening and around neck, shaping neat corners at beginning of neckline. At left front sew on 7 buttons and close cardigan, slipping buttons through pattern of trimming.

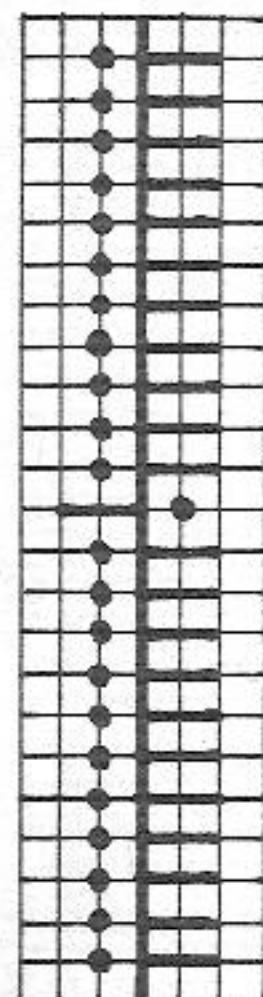

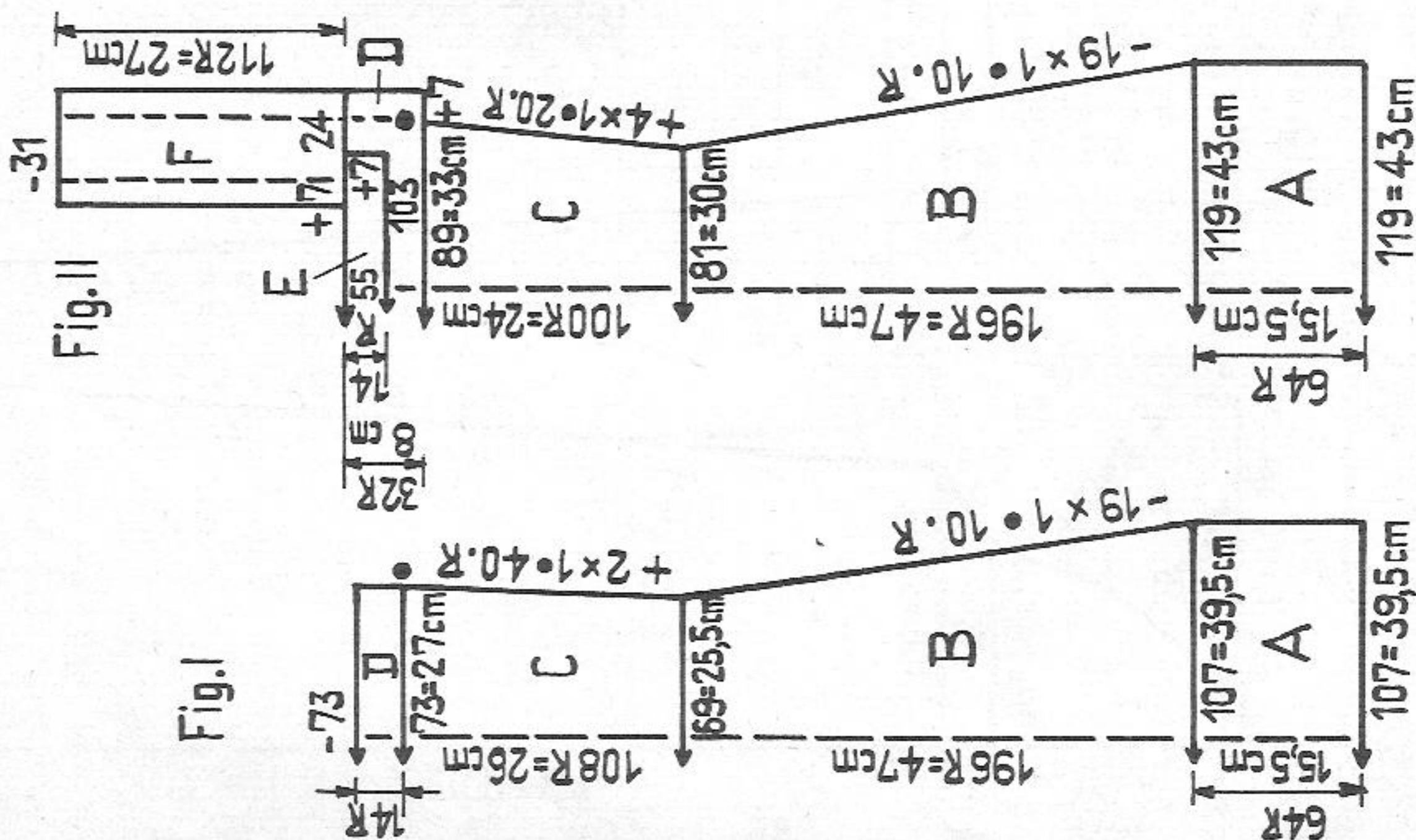

Fig. I, back: Knit twice. A = with racking cast on in 1:1 rib then transfer sts according to diagram 1. With St.S 5 1/2 (front) and 3 1/2 (back) knit pattern, straight. B = arrange nds according to diagram 2. With St.S 5 1/4 (front) and 3 1/2 (back) knit pattern, decreasing at both ends. C = increase at both ends. D = with all sts on front bed knit stocking st, straight. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. II, front: Knit once. A, B and C = as for Fig. I. Please note that, with pattern 2, there has to be one stripe in centre front. D = at both ends cast on 7 sts for strap facings (total 103 sts). Knit straight. Now, at both ends put 24 sts on decker comb and let them hang inbetween the beds. E = at both ends of the remaining 55 sts, cast on 7 sts (total 69 sts). With all sts on front bed knit 14 rows stocking st (for neckline facing). A few rows with contrast yarn, release. For right strap hang 24 sts back onto machine and - at left - cast on 7 more sts. Continue knitting straight with one pattern stripe in the centre. Cast off. Knit left strap the same way, reversing shapings.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press. Close back seam and slip-stitch section D to inside, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Join front and back parts (● on ●) At neckline join the 7 cast-on sts of sections E and F at slip-stitch strap and neckline facing to inside. Fix straps at back - to desired measurement. Finally press all seams and hems.



Lady's summer dress (lower border and stripes in lacy transfer pattern)

Size: to fit a 92 cm bust approx.

Material: 27 ozs linen/cotton yarn

Stitch size: Lower border, front 5 1/2, stripes front 5 1/4, back 3 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 37 cm, 100 rows = 24 cm

Pattern: lacy transfer pattern with transfer lock U 70, according to diagram 1 and 2

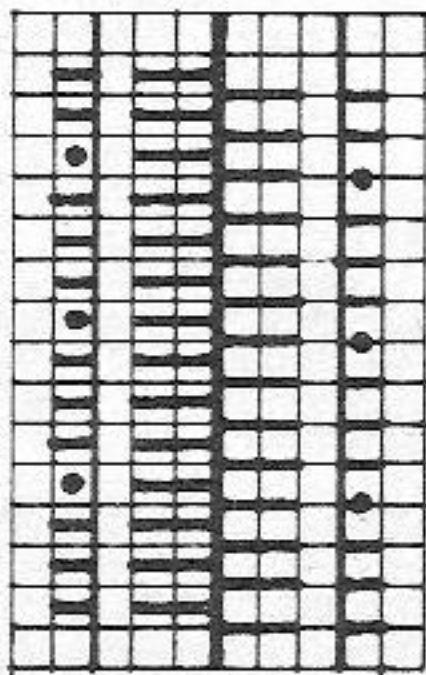

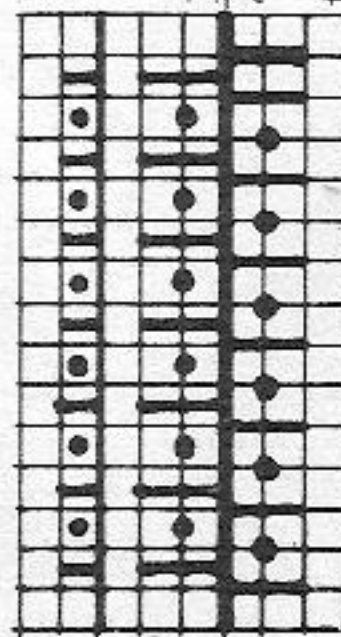

How to proceed:

Cast on 324 sts according to pattern 1 and knit scallop edging. Now transfer sts and continue in pattern 2. Every 8th row decrease 1 st at both ends as follows: At right hang the second st onto the third nd in W.P., then hang the first st onto empty nd (second nd). At left hang second st onto third nd in W.P. and first st onto second nd, then empty nds out of work and pushers within blocking rail. Repeat until 4 sts remain, cast off. Knit two identical parts and sew two slanted edges together, leaving scallop edges at lower border of shawl. Pin out shawl to size and allow to dry under wet cloth.

Knitted and braided belt

From one ball (50 gr) of wool or synthetic yarn make a cord as follows: with 6 sts (3 back, 3 front) knit tubular a length of approx. 8 times the desired waist measurement. Cut cord in 4 equal parts and make a plait of four. Join ends of plait with invisible sts thus forming a circle. Then form a double circle as per illustration and attach as trimming 5 large buttons covered with matching material. As fastener slip an oddment of cord through ends of belt and make a bow.
