## Description Book for Model Book No. 19

### Hints for PASSAP gifts (marked with T)

#### T 2124 and T 2125 Bathroom set consisting of pedestal mat and seat cover

Cut paper pattern in desired shape or according to existing mats. Use strong nylon yarn and knit in direction of arrow. Carpet pattern : on both beds put all nds into W.P. set lock at back on EX, at front on CX, St.S on front bed as small as possible. Knit 2 rows with both locks, 2 rows with front lock only, etc. With 6 sts knit a stocking st tubular strip long enough to fit round outer edge of seat cover. Sew to edge of cover and pull strong elastic through.



#### T 2140 Hat

\*Put 4 nds (2 front, 2 back) into W.P. miss 29 nds.\* Repeat from \* to \*, 7 times. Set lock to N/N. Knit a length to fit round head (measure tightly). Sew pattern stripes together to form loops. Make seam to form hat. Crochet or knit on oval to fit top of hat. At edge run 2 or 3 rows of shirring elastic through knitting for a comfortable fit.

#### T 2141 Hangers

Various covers for hangers, all knitted tubular with lock set on DX, about 41 cm long. Number of sts and stitch patterns according to diagram : hanger 1, 2 and 4 on page 26, hanger 3 and 5 on page 21, hanger 6 on page 27.

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Model marked with \* include instructions for the PASSAP COMBI.

Models marked with "U 70" can be worked only with the help of the U 70 transfer lock.

First of all, we should like to apologise for the late appearance of Model Book 19. The delay was due to the work involved in bringing out our very comprehensive Baby Book.

We hope we have made up for the delay by bringing you a very varied collection of summer and winter models, with something to suit every taste.

We are constantly being asked for some of the timeless, classic styles, which appeared in earlier issues of the Model Book, now out of print, and so we have decided to reprint a few of these, from time to time, for the benefit of newer knitters. In this issue we have included children's styles 1470 and 1509.

For relatively inexperienced knitters - or those who want to make something new very quickly - we should like to draw attention to the simple, endlessly useful pullovers (1992 and 2113) and the dress (2123). Or you can knit the brocade-effect jacket (2132) without the fairisle design, to make a classic and wearable style.

We hope that this new collection will give you a great deal of pleasure.

Before starting your work please study carefully the explanations given on pages 1 and 2

Patterns: The drawings refer to half width, the indications of stitch numbers refer to whole width of each part.

Figure I	= back	Figure IX	= pants
Figure II	= front	Figure X	= gusset
Figure III	= sleeve	Figure XI	= scarf
Figure IV	= collar	Figure XII	= cap, bonnet
Figure V	= border, cuff	Figure XIII	= mittens
Figure VI	= pocket	Figure XIV	= socks, stockings
Figure VII	= skirt, front	Figure XV	= straps
Figure VIII	= skirt, back	Figure XVI	= bra, halter, bodice, top

If the centre line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is worked simultaneously with reversed shapings, i. e. decreasing or increasing is made on the left as well as on the right side.

If the centre line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is worked separately with reversed shapings, i. e. first knit one part according to diagram (increasing or decreasing at right), then the second part the opposite way (decreasing or increasing at left).

Abbreviations:

Col.	= colour of wool	○	= tubular ( or ) = half tubular
st, sts	= stitch, stitches	●	= every (in every row)
St.S	= stitch size	×	= times
Nd, nds	= needle, needles	+	= increase
R	= row	-	= decrease, cast off
T	= 2 rows	▲	= graduations (short rows)
		■	= for open work row hang st to the next nd, leave empty nd in W. P.

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter "st"). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working Position on back and front bed.

Exception: For tubular or half tubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed. The same number of needles must therefore be put into Working Position on the other bed. In these cases the sign for tubular  $\bigcirc$  respectively ( or ) for half tubular is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increase or decrease always occurs in the first row of a section.

- $+ 3 \times 2 \cdot 8 \cdot R$  means: increase 2 stitches 3 times in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- $- 19 \times 3 \cdot 7 \cdot R$  means: decrease 3 stitches 19 times in every 7th row (back 2 stitches, front 1 stitch or vice versa).
- $- 17 \times 1 \cdot 2 / 3 \cdot R$  means: decrease 1 stitch 17 times, alternately once after 2 rows and once after 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle - 4 \times 8 \cdot 2 \cdot R$  means: work graduations, i. e. short rows (on DUO with pushers and lock BX). Step by step put 8 nds (and their respective pushers) into Rest Position 4 times after every 2nd row (for double bed 4 nds each back and front). Once all graduations are finished, continue knitting normally, i. e. all nds in Working Position (pushers in Neutral Position).

Graduations can be knitted two ways, either from outer edge towards centre (gradual decreasing with the minus-sign "-" after the black triangle) or from the centre towards outer edge (gradual increasing with the plus-sign "+" after the black triangle.)

Number of stitches and centimetres :

- $136 = 20 \text{ cm}$  means: a total of 136 sts (for K/K 68 stitches each on back and front) make a width of 20 cm.
- $\bigcirc 146 = 43 \text{ cm}$  means: cast on 146 sts each on back and front bed for tubular which makes a width of 43 cm.

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be tested by you, by making your own test square for your own wool.

Test square: We strongly recommend that you make always a test square with your own material before starting to work, in order to calculate for your material the necessary numbers of stitches and rows along the PASSAP - chart. The chapter "The test square and its calculation" in your instruction book informs you how to proceed for these calculations. This is very important, especially when adjusting a model to another size.

Pinafore dress (to wear with sweater model 1913)

Size: to fit a 92 cm bust

Material: 21 ozs medium wool

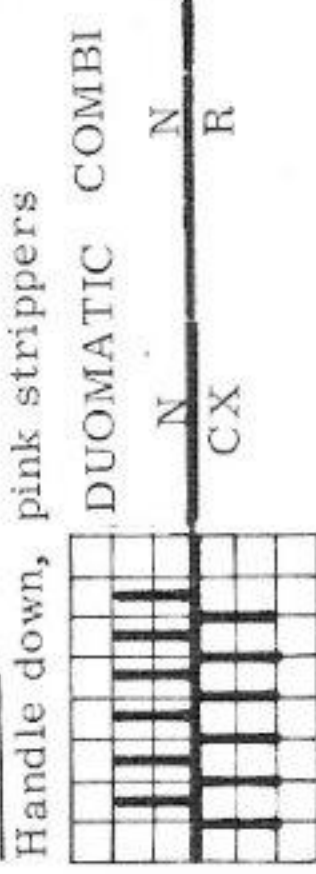
Stitch size: PASSAP DUOMATIC "long-stitch-pattern" back 3 1/4, front 5 1/2 bands 5 1/4 and 7

Stitch size: PASSAP COMBI "long-stitch-pattern" front 5 1/4, back 3 bands St.S 5 and 6 1/2, tension arm 4, yarn brake 4 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 20,5 cm (8"), 100 rows = 15,5 cm (6 1/8")

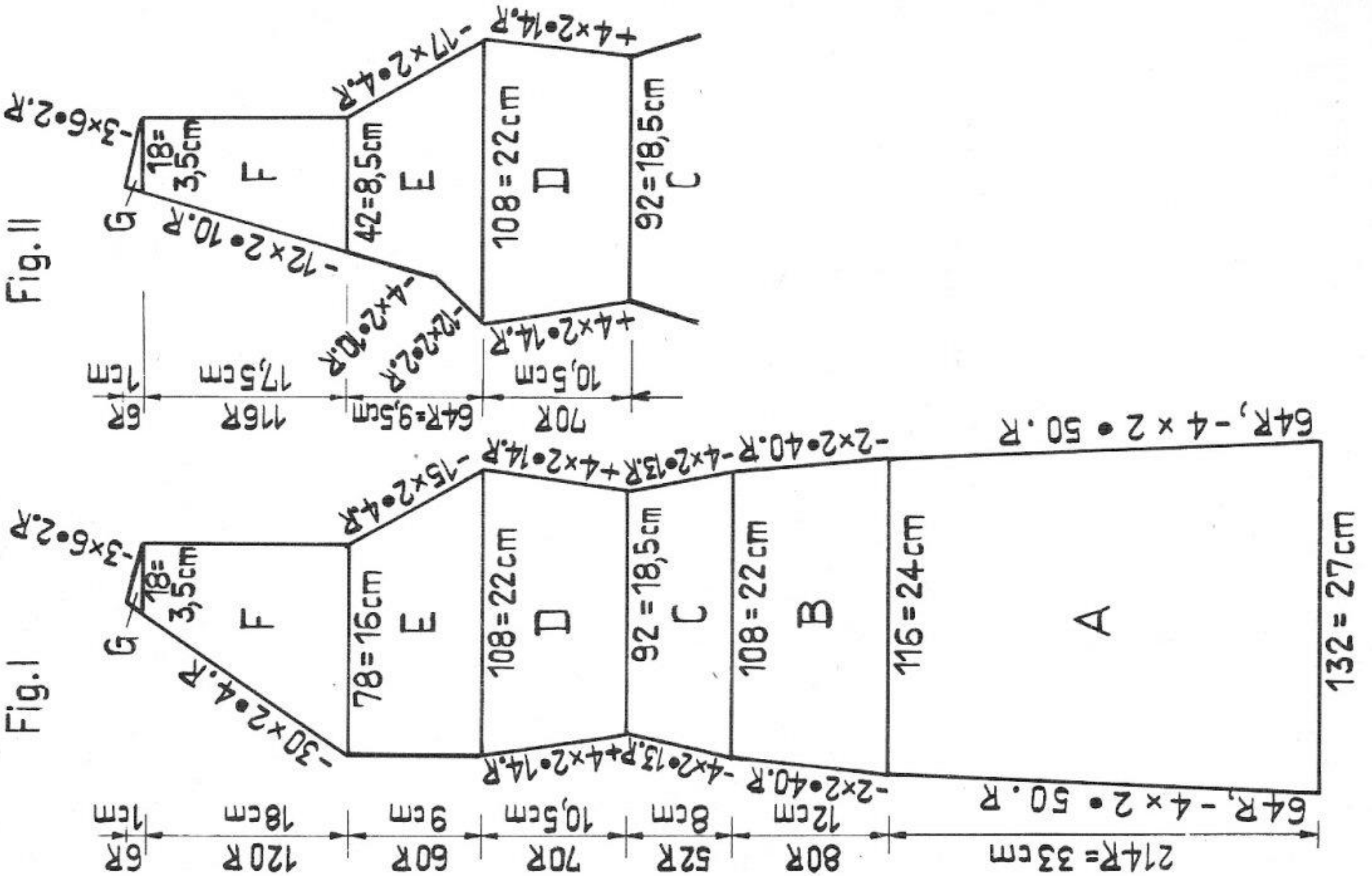
Pattern: entire pinafore in "long-stitch-pattern" bands for neck and armholes in stocking st

Handle down, pink strippers



Material: 360 metres length per 100 gr approx. 113 yds per 1 oz

**Fig. I:** Right back according to diagram, left back reversing shapings. A = with 132 sts make zig-zag, knit 4 rows CX/CX, then knit in pattern according to diagram. Decrease at both ends. B and C = decrease at both ends. D = increase at both ends. E = at right decrease, at left knit straight. F = at right knit straight, at left decrease. G = shape shoulders.

**Fig. II:** Right front according to diagram, left front reversing shapings. A to D = as for Fig. I. E = at both ends decrease according to diagram. F = at right knit straight, at left decrease according to diagram. G = as for Fig. I.

**Neck band:** Knit once. Begin and end with contrast yarn. With 128 sts on each bed make an open cast-on, tubular, and with St.S 5 1/4, knit 14 rows tubular. Every alternate row (RC 2) decrease 1 st at both ends, back and front, using double decker tool. For 15th row change to St.S 7, for 16th to 28th row change to St.S 5 1/4, hereby increase 1 st every alternate row, at both ends, back and front, i.e. with double decker tool transfer 2 sts by 1 st outwards and twist and place running thread onto empty nd.

**Armhole band:** Knit twice. Begin and end with contrast yarn.

With 80 sts on each bed make an open cast-on for tubular. Proceed as for neck band but increase and decrease only at one end.

**To make up:**

Pin out parts to size and press lightly. Join centre front and centre back seam. Join side seams with back st. Close shoulder seams. Attach neck and armhole bands, first to outside, backstitching into open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. Shapings of neck border should correspond with centre front and centre back, shaping of armhole bands with side seams. Then fold bands in half to inside and catch down, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Press seams and bands lightly.

# 2122 PASSAP - DUOMATIC \*

Jumper suit with pleated skirt - back cover

Size: to fit an 86 cm bust

Material: 27 ozs synthetic knitting yarn with silky finish; 23 ozs light-blue, 4 ozs white, an oddment very fine synthetic yarn for hem.  
A waist slip.

Stitch size: DUOMATIC: 4 1/4 COMBI: 4, tension arm 7, yarn brake 5 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 28 cm (11 1/2"), 100 rows = 20 cm (8")

Pattern: stocking st in light-blue, skirt with white horizontal stripes according to description, pleats with crochet edges.

Fig. I: Begin and end with contrast yarn.

A = stocking st. After 30 rows start decreasing as follows: at both sides place 42nd and 40th stitch onto 41st nd, move this triple stitch 1 nd inwards. Mark nds with 3 sts on them with a pusher. At both ends move sts 2 nds inwards, using

deckercombs. Return 2 nds to N.P. For all following decreaseings proceed thus: Place 1 st at right and left onto nds marked with pusher. E = shape shoulders, cast off.

Fig. II: A + B = as for Fig. I. C = increase thus: at both ends move 30 sts 1 nd outwards, using deckercombs. Pick up purl stitch loops of 31st stitch and place on empty nd. For all following increase move 1 more stitch outwards so that increases form a straight vertical line. Divide work for neck: at right put 75 sts on deckercombs or thread. D = at right decrease according to diagram, at left make two more increases. E = at right continue decreasing, at left make bust dart with BX and pushers (graduations starting from the outside). F = at right decrease, at left shape armbole, then straight. G = at right shape neck, at left shape shoulder. Now, place sts on deckercombs back on to nds of machine and knit sections E to G with reversed shapings.

**Size:** to fit a 92 cm bust

**Material:** 18 ozs medium wool

**Stitch size:** PASSAP DUOMATIC back 4 1/2, front 4 3/4

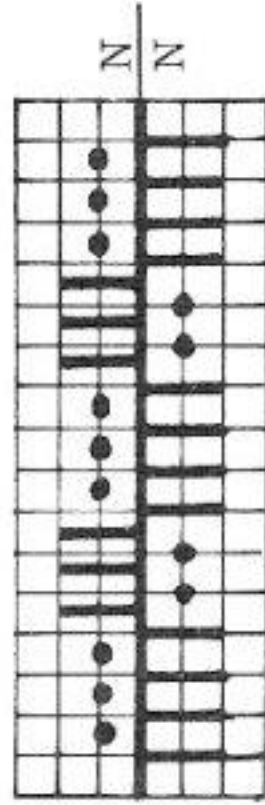

**Test square:** 100 sts (stretched) = 25 cm (9 7/8"), 100 rows = 22 cm (8 5/8")

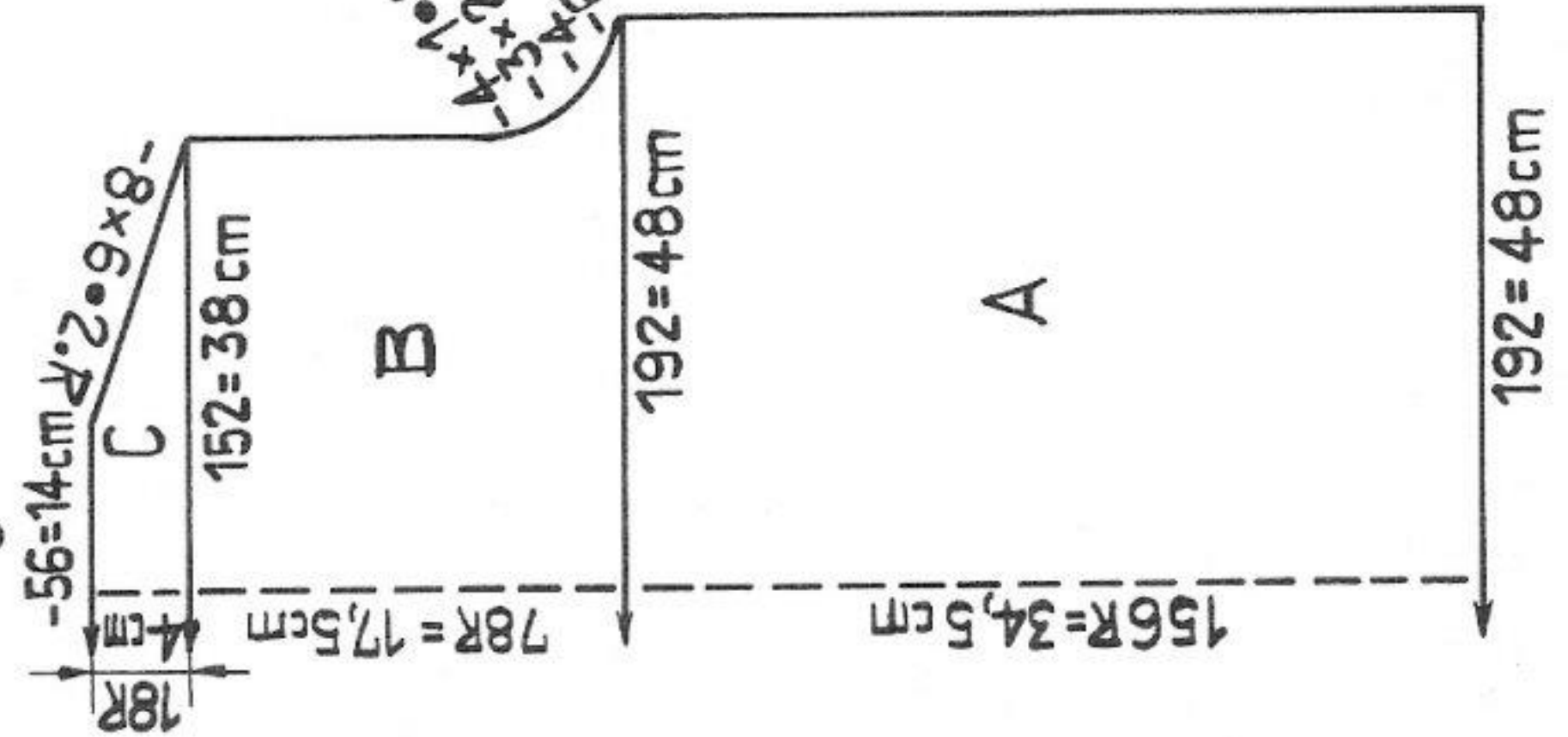

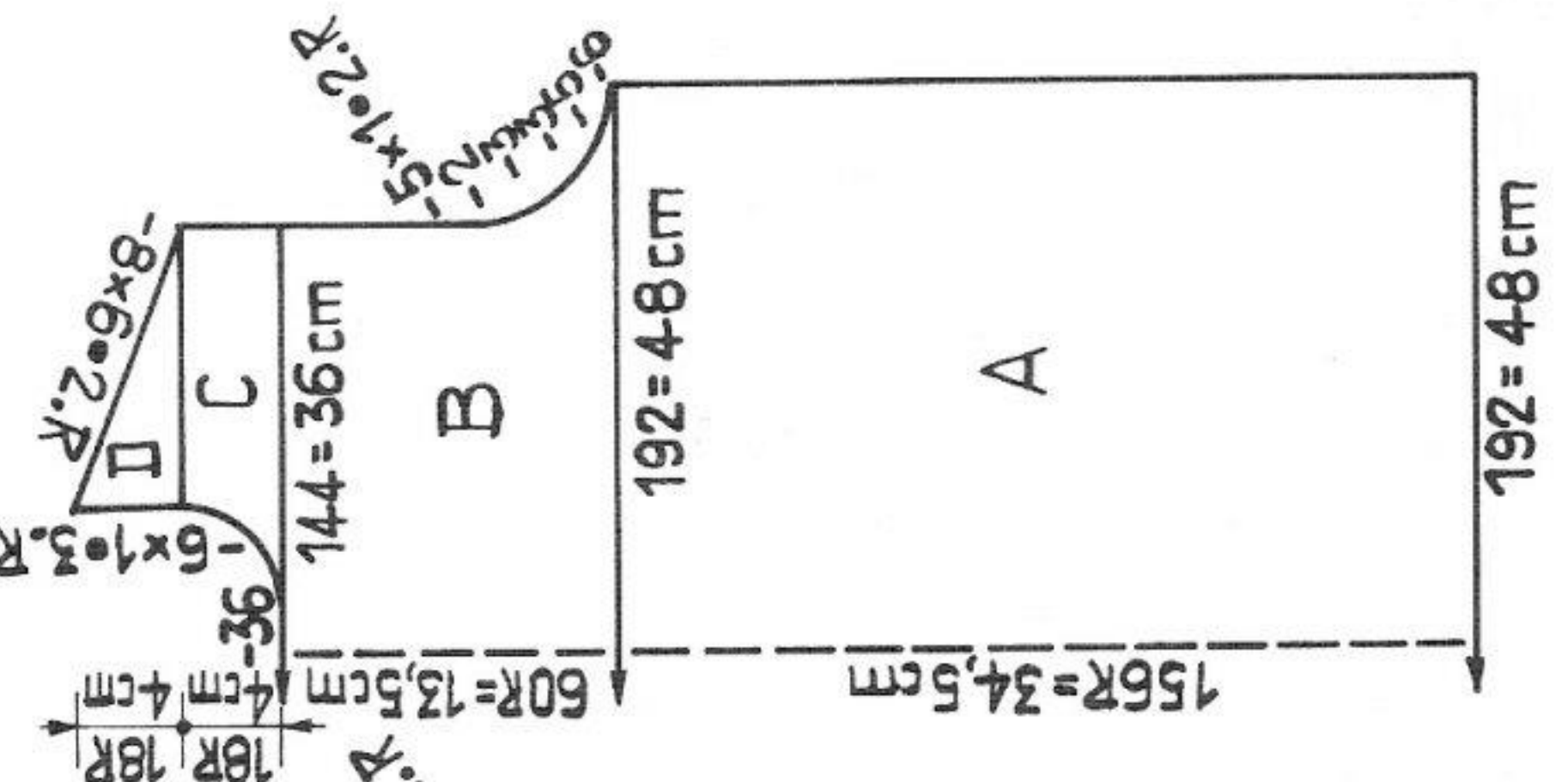
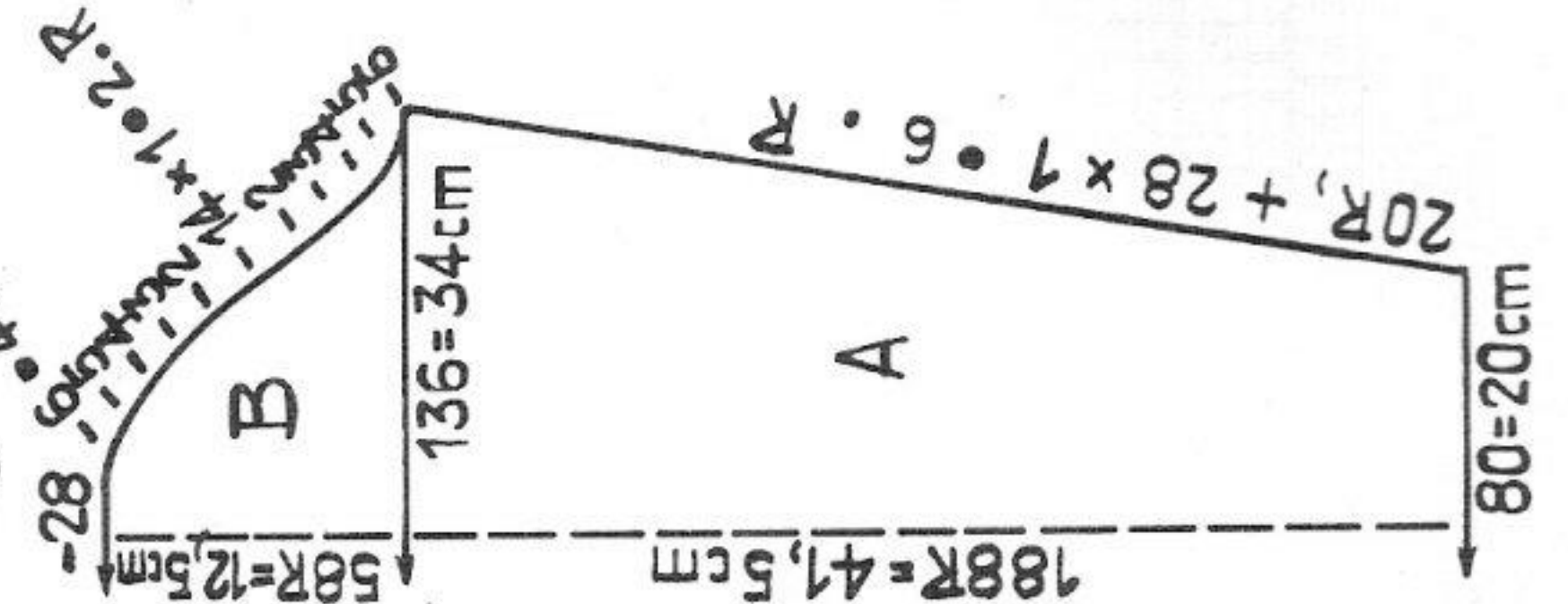

Join side, shoulder and sleeve seams and set in sleeves. Join both edges of collar with mattress stitch on the wrong side of the knitting and sew to neck edge, st by st with back st, unravelling contrast yarn. Fold in half to outside.

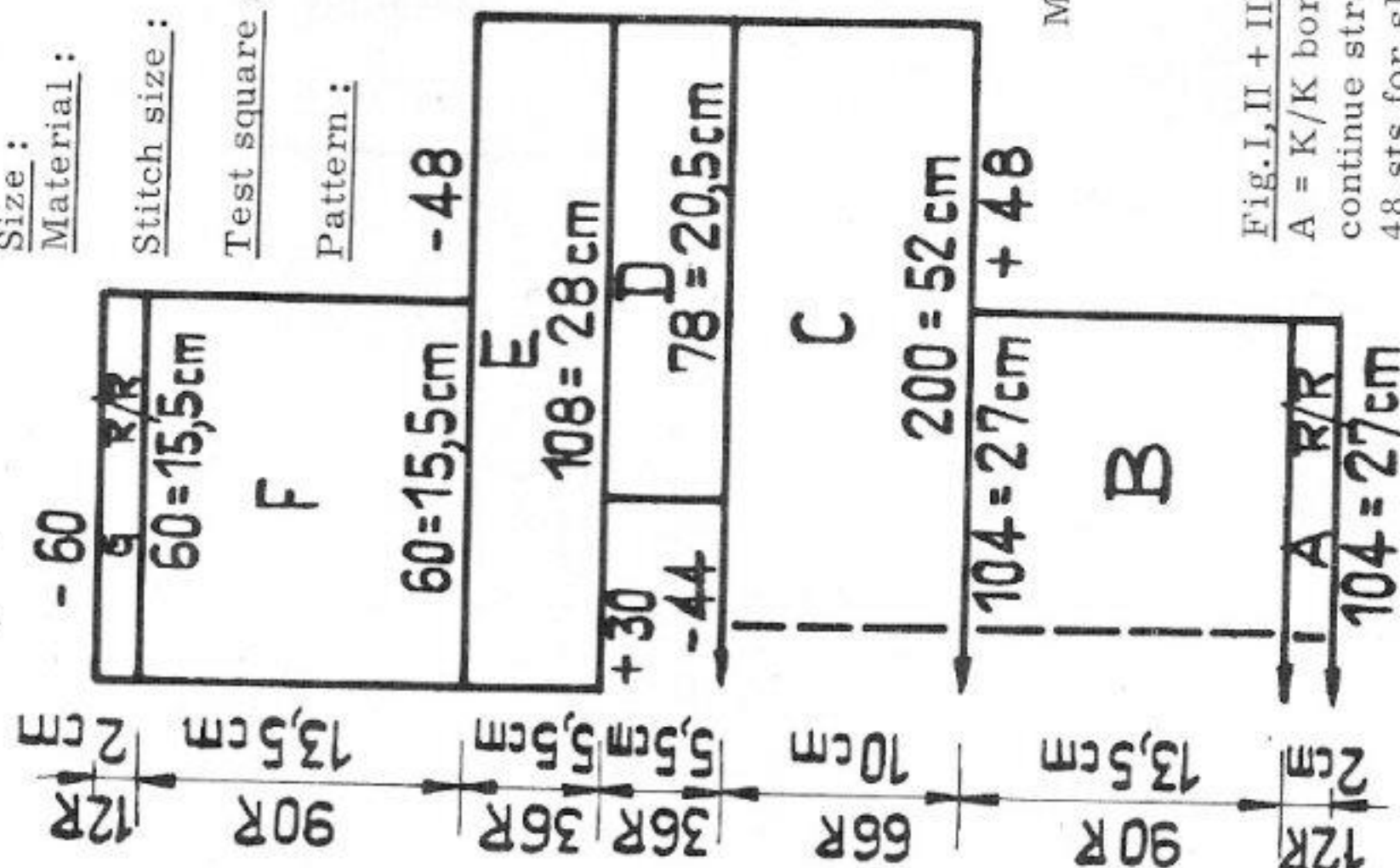

- Size:** 5 to 8 months
  - Material:** 3 1/2 ozs medium baby wool: 2 1/2 ozs white, 1 oz green, 3 buttons
  - Stitch size:** pattern = back 5, front 2 1/2, K/K and 1:1 rib border = 2 1/2
  - Test square:** 100 sts = 26 cm (10 1/4")
  - Pattern:** 100 rows = 15 cm (6")
- jacket in two-colour pattern according to diagram, borders in green in K/K and 1:1 rib

Material: 425 metres length per 100 gr  
134 yds per 1 oz

Fig. I, II + III: Begin at back

A = K/K border with green, cast on with racking. B = continue straight in pattern. C = at both ends cast on 48 sts for sleeve. Continue straight in pattern.

D = divide work for neck. Note pusher position and cast off 44 sts in the centre. At left put 78 sts (39 sts each on front and back bed) on dekercombs. With the 78 sts at right continue straight in pattern. E = at left cast on 30 sts for neck, continue straight. At right cast off 48 sts. F = continue straight (left front). G = green, K/K. Cast off.

For right front place the 78 sts on dekercombs back on to nds of machine. Knit sections D to G, reversing shapings.

Cast off as by hand: Transfer all sts to front bed (using transfer lock U 70). Knit 1 row with St.S 6, lock is at left. Place second st on to first nd and knit through. Place the st thus obtained onto second nd, third st on to second nd and knit through. Place this new st on to third nd, and so on.

Neck band, green: Pick up 90 sts along neck edge and place on to nds of machine. Knit 1 row stocking st with St.S 5, transfer sts for 1:1 rib and knit 9 rows. In the 5th row of neck band make buttonhole thus: place 5th st onto 4th st and 6th st onto 7th st, leaving empty nds in W.P. Cast off.

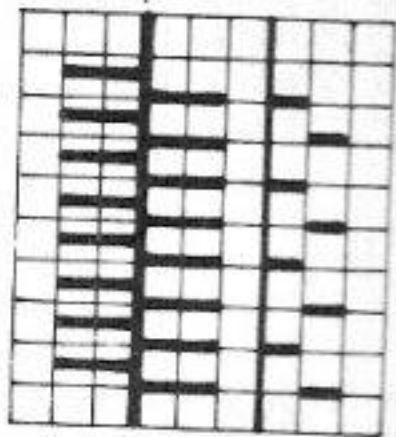
Cuffs: green. Pick up 50 sts along lower edge of sleeve and proceed as for neck band, omitting buttonhole.

To make up:

Join side and sleeve seams. At front sew on 3 buttons, take buttons through pattern and top buttonhole.

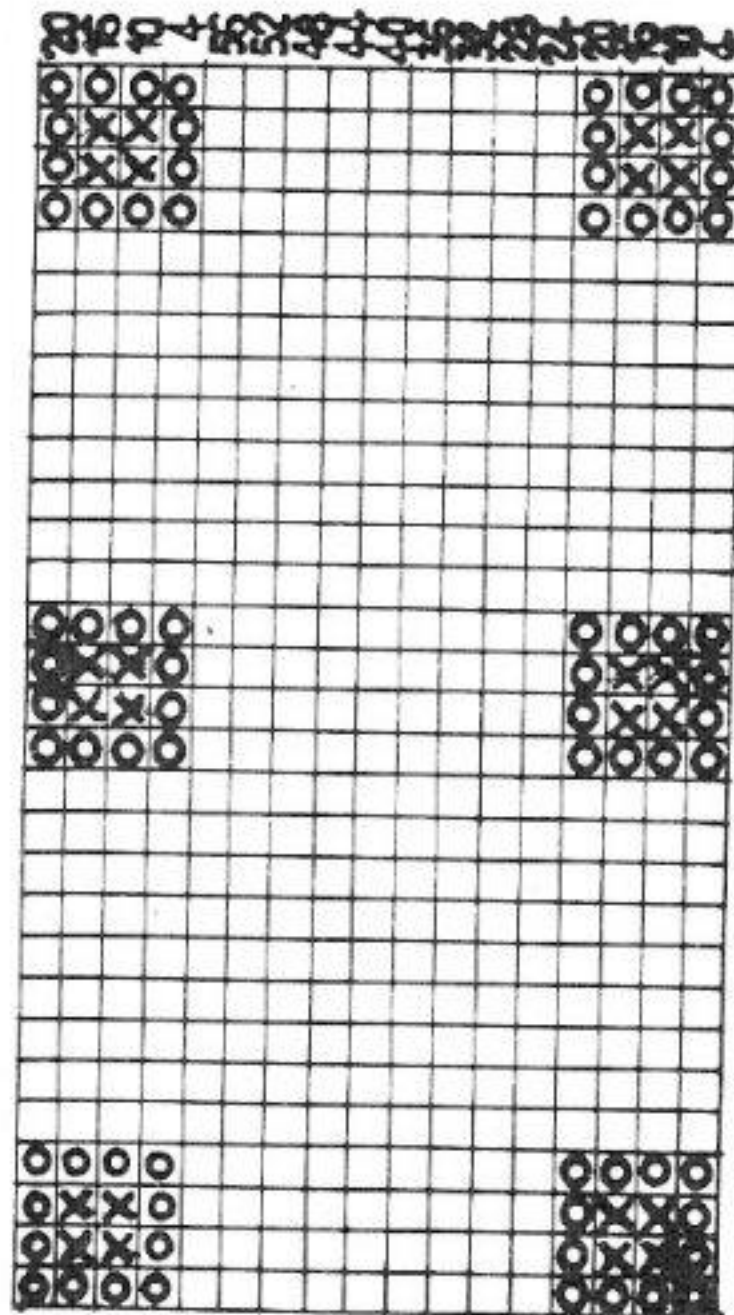

# 1990 A+B PASSAP - DUOMATIC

Man's and boy's sleeveless pullover

Size: A: to fit a 96 cm chest B: to fit a 60 cm chest

Material: fine wool. Model A: 5 1/2 ozs navy blue (col.1), 5 ozs red (col.2) an oddment white (col.3).

Model B: 3 ozs red (col.1) 2 1/2 ozs navy blue (col.2), an oddment white (col.3)

Stitch size: A and B = back 2 3/4, front 3. Borders 4

Test square: 100 sts = 14 cm (5 1/2"), RC 100 = 10 cm (4")

Pattern: fairisle, borders in stocking st. A and B are knitted the same way. Please note the different measurements on the diagram.

Material: 800 metres length per 100 gr approx. 251 yds per 1 oz

Fig. I, back: A = cast-on with tubular rows with col.1, knit RC 16 tubular. B = fairisle stitch according to diagram, alternating col.1 and 2, starting with col.2. C = shape armholes. D = shape shoulders, cast off loosely.

Fig. II, front: A = as for Fig. I. B = fairisle stitch as for Fig. I. When row counter reads 36 start three-colour-fairisle according to diagram. C = divide work: put left half of sts on dekercombs, at right complete first shoulder: at right shape armhole, at left shape V-neck. D = at right shape shoulder, at left knit straight. Put sts on dekercombs back on to nds of machine. Knit second shoulder (sections C and D) with reversed shapings.

Neck and armhole bands: Begin and end with contrast yarn.

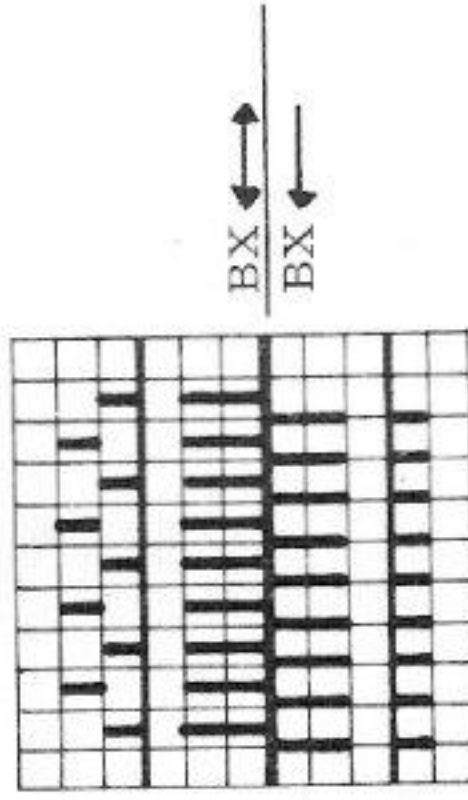
With the indicated number of sts and col.1 knit 58 rows stocking st tubular, at right front and back first decreasing 1 st every 4th row. When row counter reads 29 start increasing 1 st every 4th row.

Neck band: A = 120 sts on each bed, B = 82 sts on each bed. Armhole bands: A = 70 sts on each bed, B = 58 sts on each bed.

To make up:

Block and press all parts. Join side and shoulder seams. Sew bands to neck and armhole edges, starting at point. First sew to outside, backstitching into the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn, fold to inside and sew down, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn.

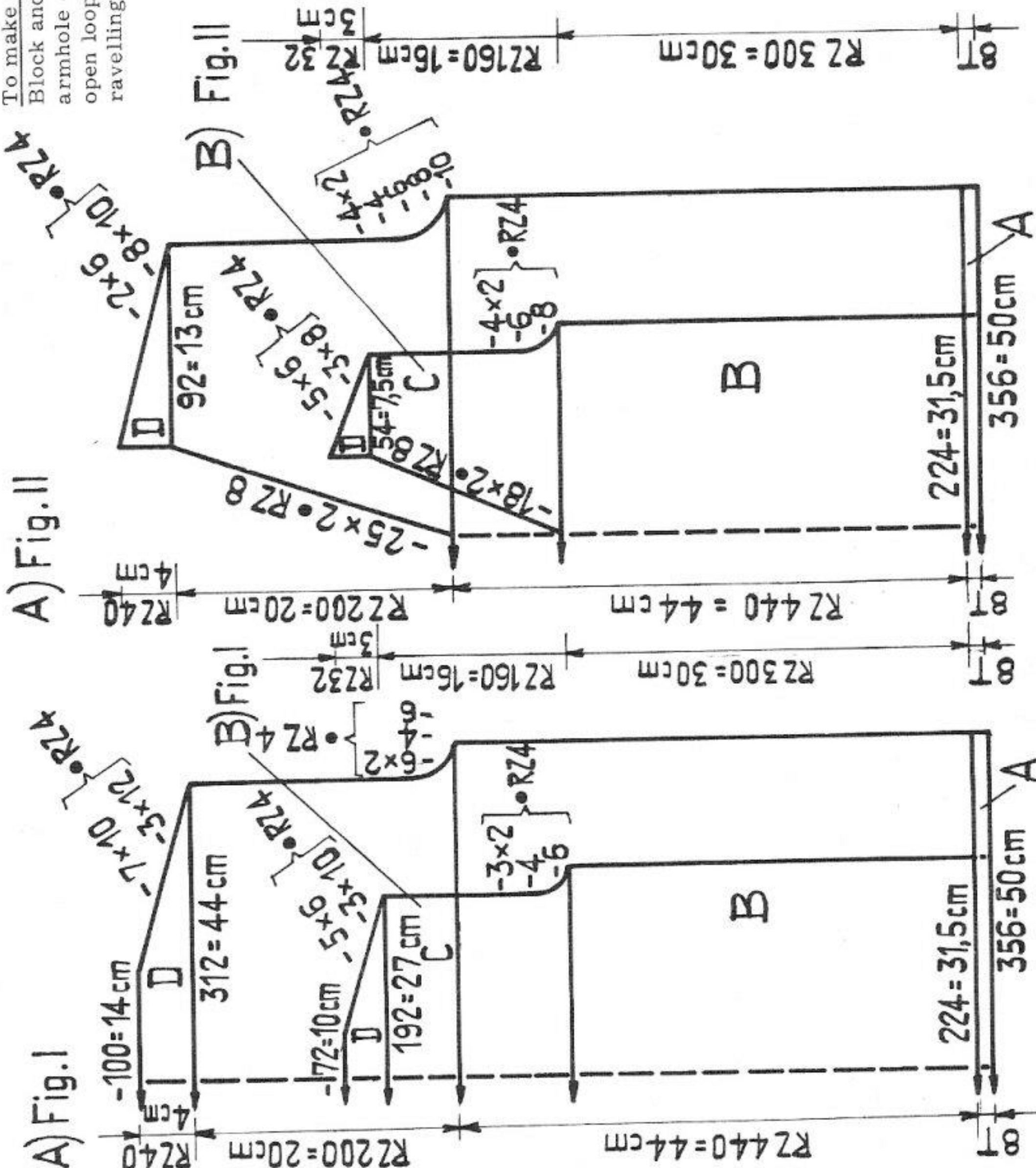

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# 1999 PASSAP - DUOMATIC \*

Evening blouse

**Size:** to fit an approx. 86 cm bust  
**Material:** 5 1/2 ozs fine dralon, 1/2 oz Lurex thread, 2 small buttons  
**Stitch size:** DUOMATIC 41A, COMBI 4, tension arm 2, yarn brake 2 1/2  
**Test square:** 100 sts = 32 cm (12 2/3"), 100 rows = 22 cm (8 3/4")  
**Pattern:** stocking st, taking Lurex thread and dralon together.

**Fig. I, back:** A and B = stocking st. After 10 rows start decreasing thus: at both ends place 32nd and 30th st onto 31st stitch, move this triple stitch 1 nd inwards. At both ends move sts with deckercombs 2 nds inwards. Mark nds with 3 sts on them with the corresponding pushers. At both ends return empty nds to N.P. For all following decreases proceed thus: place 1 st at right and left onto nd marked with pusher. Move this triple st 1 nd inwards and mark with pusher, at both ends move sts 2 nds inwards, return empty nds to N.P., and so on. C = after 10 rows start increasing thus: with deckercombs move 24 sts 1 nd outwards, both right and left. Place purl loop of 25th stitch on to empty nd. D and E = at both ends decrease, cast off.

**Fig. II, front:** A and B = stocking st. After 10 rows start decreasing as for back, but placing 42nd and 40th stitch onto 41st stitch, etc. C = after 10 rows start increasing thus: at both ends mark 34th stitch with the corresponding pusher. For each increase start from this marked nd, i.e. move outer sts 1 nd outwards. Place purl loop of marked stitch on empty nd. Leave pusher in this position. After 72 rows work, put sts of right half on deckercombs. At right of the remaining 67 sts place additional 14 sts of waste knitting onto empty nds of machine (for knitted-on facing). Knit left half of front as follows: at left knit straight, at right increase. E = at right continue increasing, at left decrease. F = divide work: at right put 21 sts on deckercombs. At right decrease, at left knit straight, then continue according to diagram: at right decrease, at left knit straight. G = at right knit straight, at left decrease. H = place 21 sts on deckercombs back on to nds of machine, at left decrease, at right increase. I = at right and left knit straight, cast off.

**For right half place 67 sts on deckercombs back on to nds of machine and knit sections D, E, F, G, H, and I with reversed shapings. To finish off front, place sts of facing (twice 14 sts) back on to nds of machine, unravelling contrast yarn. Knit 18 rows (downwards), cast off.**

**Fig. III, sleeve: begin with contrast yarn.**  
 A = stocking st, after 12 rows decrease with 24-deckercomb. B = decrease at both ends. Cast off remaining 18 sts.

To make up:

Block and press all parts lightly. Join shoulder, side and sleeve seams. Sew collar to neck and facing edge, right sides facing. Sew down collar inside. Catch down facing with invisible sts, if necessary iron on adhesive material to stiffen revers and collar edge. At lower edge of sleeves unravel contrast yarn and cast off by hand the 12 sts between arrows on diagram. Put remaining sts on a thread to ease them in when sewing on cuffs, first to outside, backstitching into the open loops, then to inside, sewing down st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Make 3 button loops on overlap and sew on 3 buttons to match loops. Set in sleeves. Make lower hem.

Man's and boy's sweater

Size:

Chest: A = 100 cm, B = 72 cm

Material:

A = 11 ozs fine wool, B = 6 ozs fine wool

Stitch size:

DUOMATIC 2 1/2 COMBI 2, tension arm 8, yarn brake 4 1/2

Test square:

100 sts = 20 cm (8"), 100 rows = 20 cm (8") (slightly stretched)

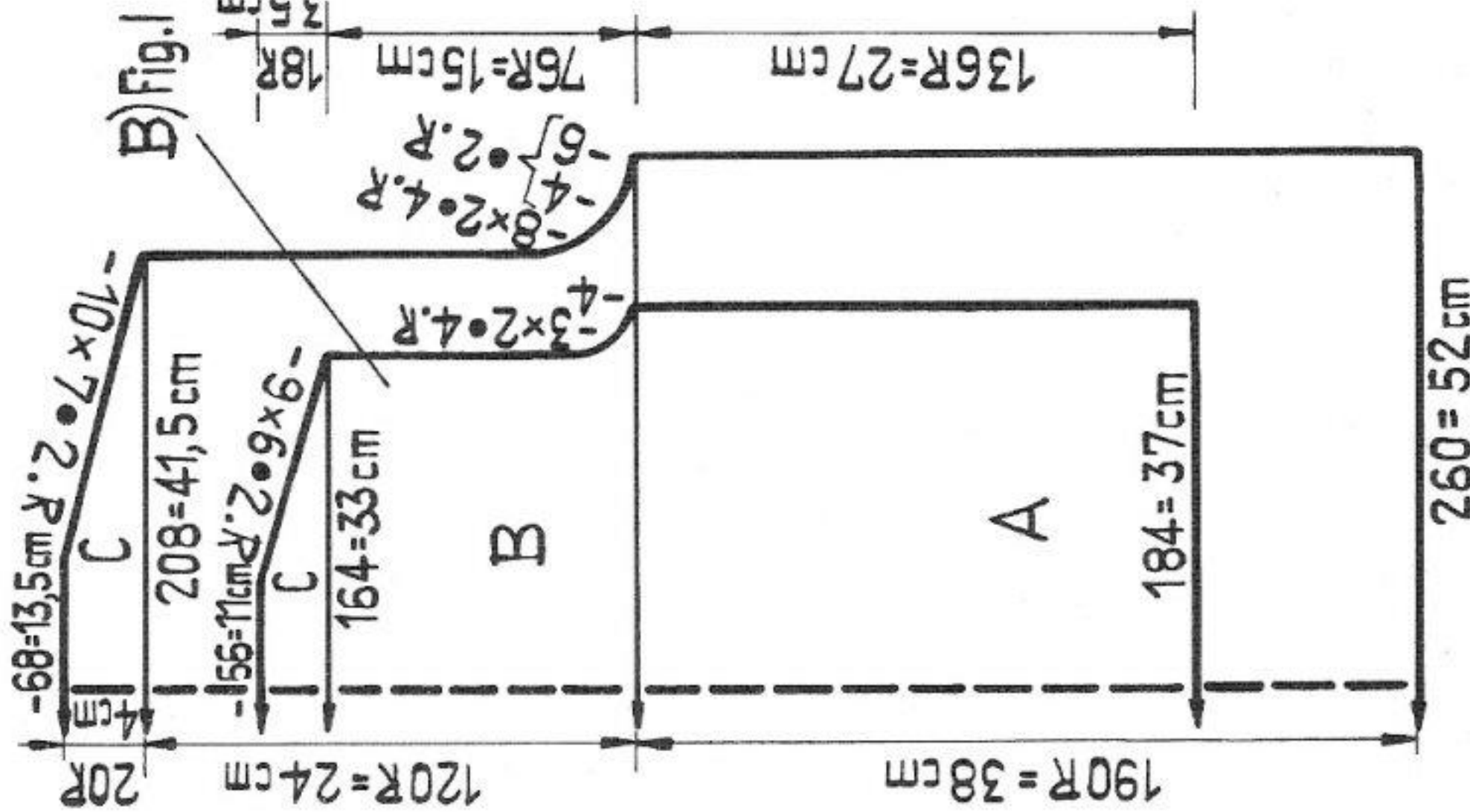

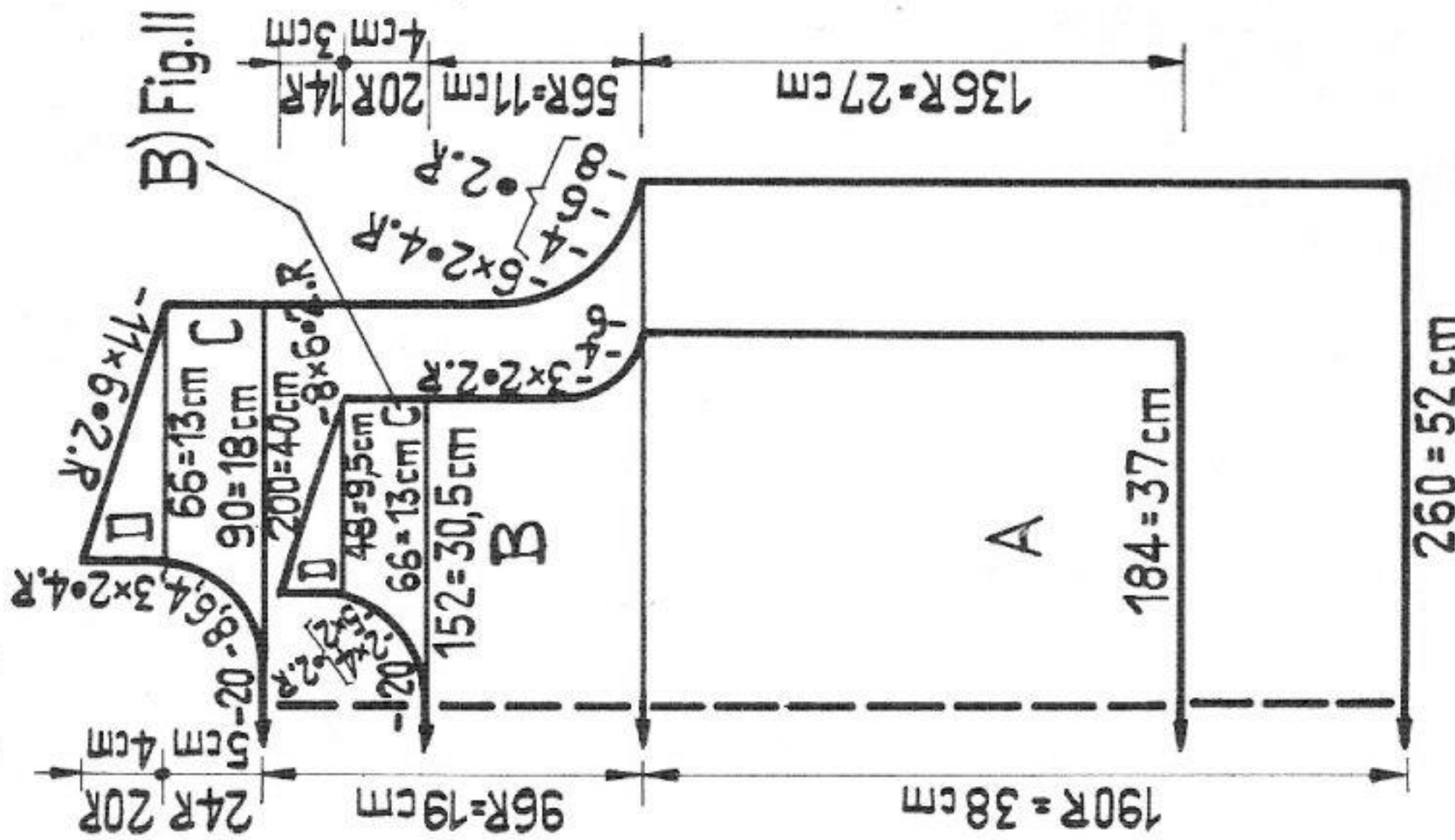

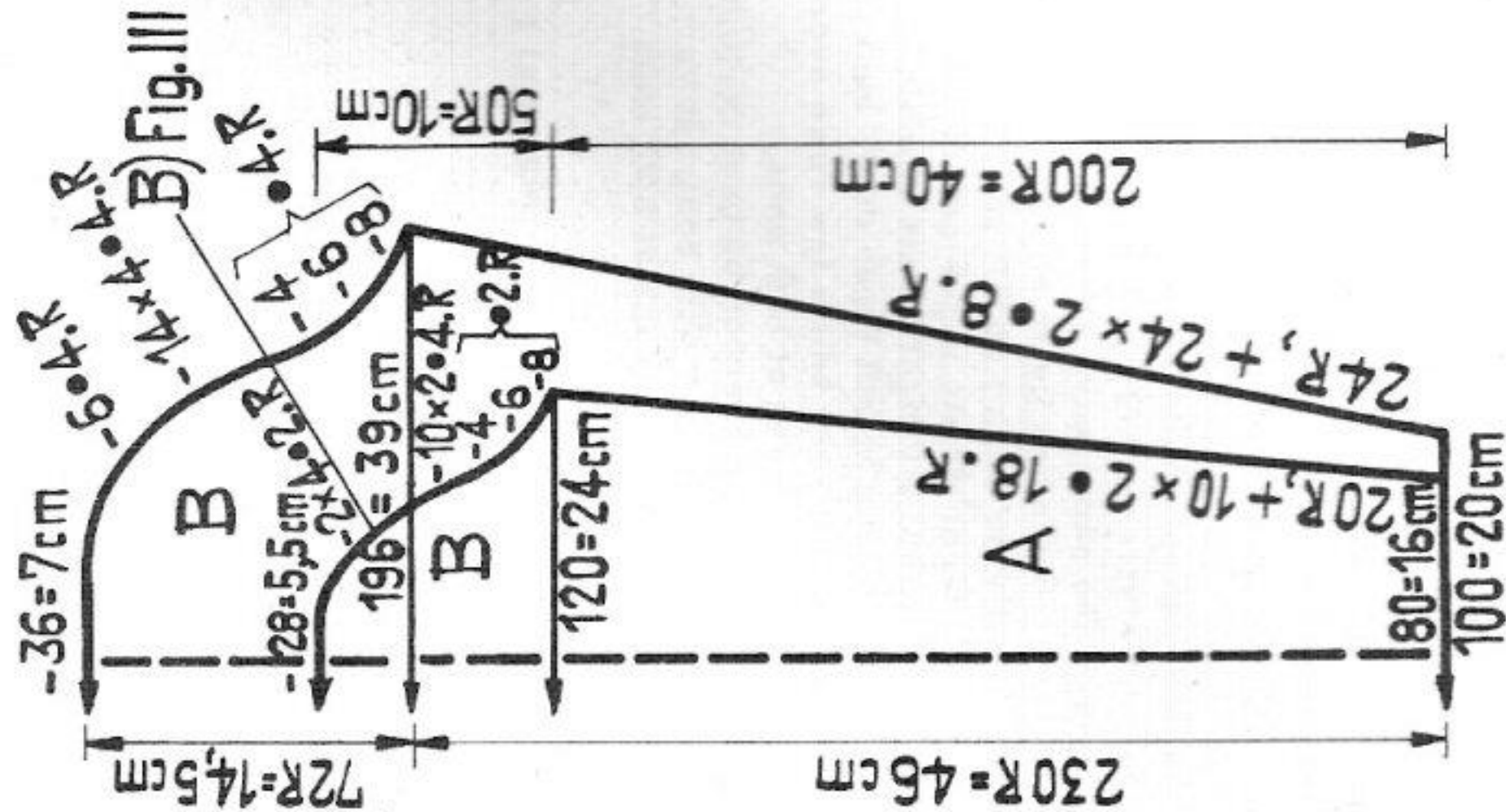

After 10 rows begin decreasing thus: at both ends place 29th and 31st st onto 30th st (there will be 3 sts on this nd) move this triple st 1 nd inwards. At both ends move sts 2 nds inwards, using dekercomb, return 2 empty nds to N.P. and mark nds with 3 sts on them with a pusher. For all following decreases proceed thus: place 1 st at right and left onto nds marked with pusher. D = start raglan shaping with quintuple deker according to diagram. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

**Fig.II, front :** A, B and C = as for Fig.I. D = divide work: at left put 55 sts on dekercombs or thread. Continue with right half: at right continue increasing, at

left (centre) cast off 3 sts every alternate row until 36 sts remain. E = at right continue increasing, at left knit straight. F = at right raglan shaping with quintuple deker, at left knit straight.

**Left half :** place sts on dekercombs back on to nds of machine and knit sections D to F, reversing shapings.

**Fig.III, right sleeve :** A = hem: stocking st-tubular. When row counter reads 22 transfer all sts to front bed. B = continue in stocking st, increasing at both ends. C = raglan shaping with quintuple deker according to diagram. D = at left continue shaping with quintuple deker, at right decrease with single deker.

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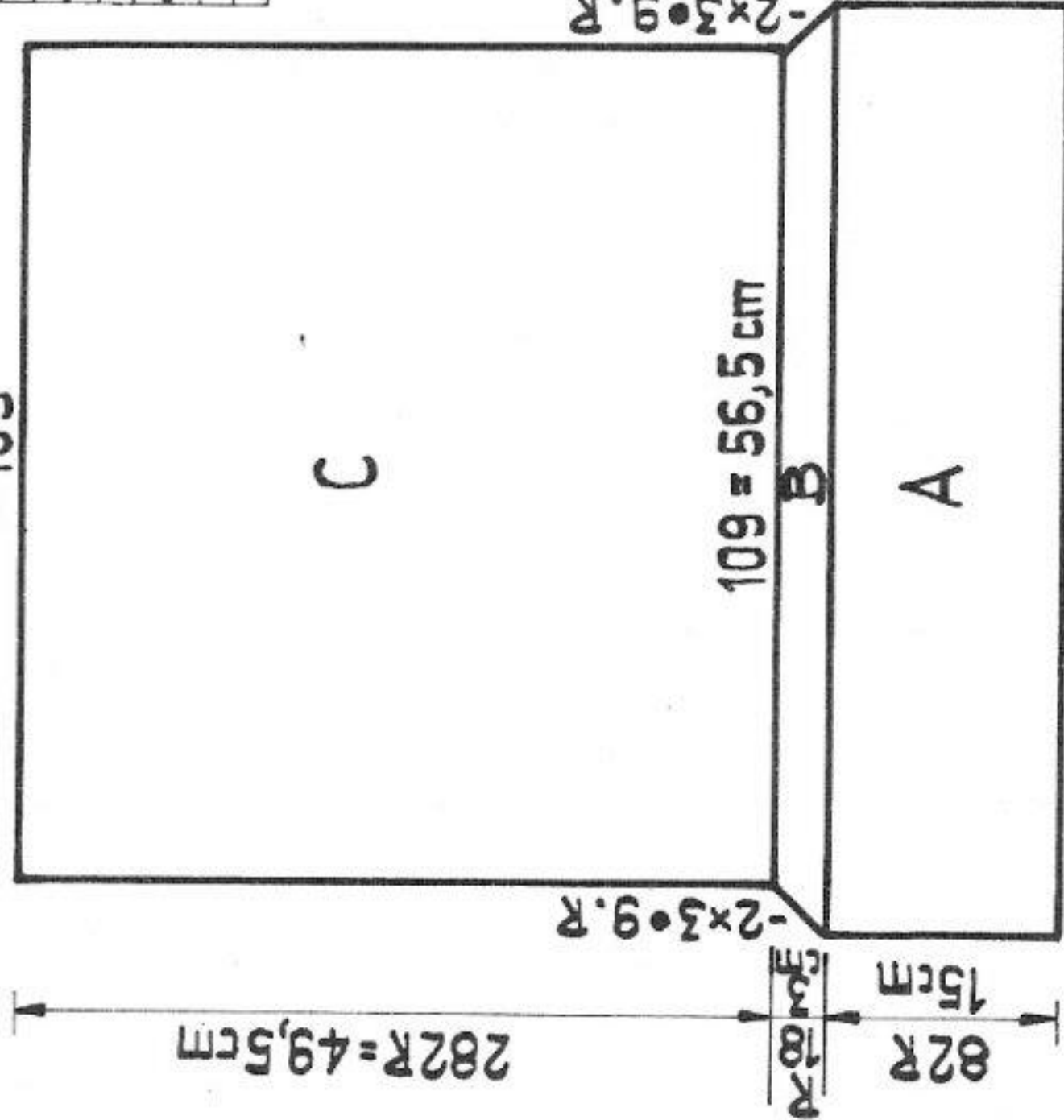


Diagram 3: hem border

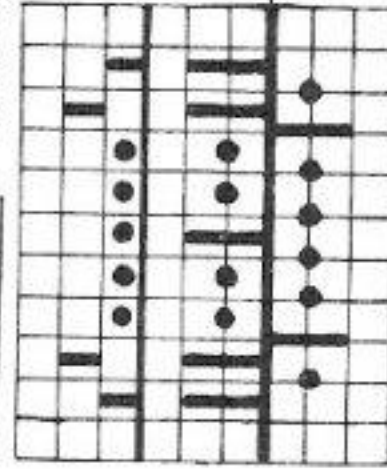
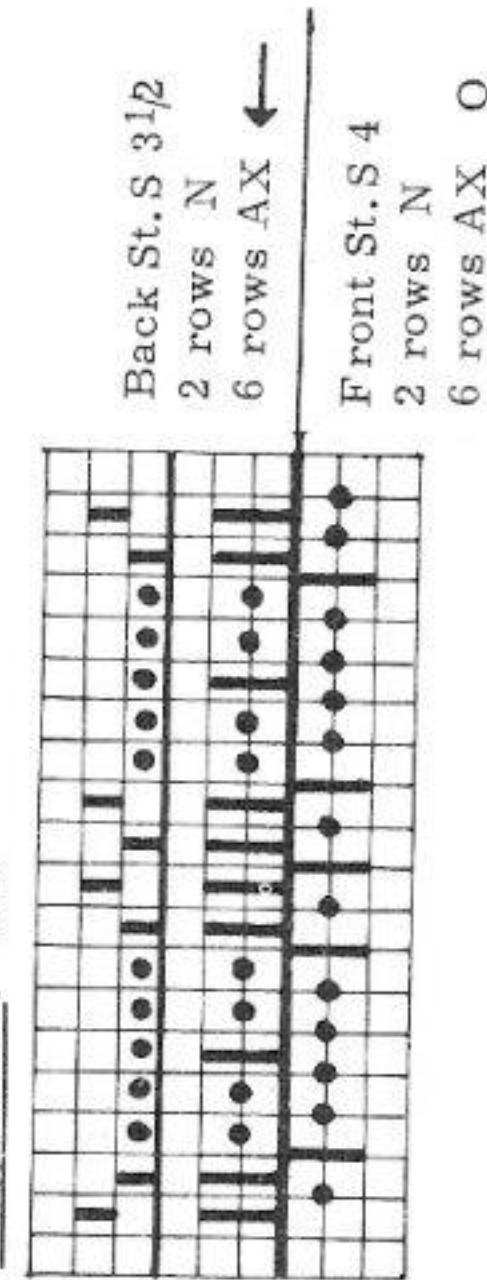

Place remaining st on 4th nd of front bed. Knit 1 row. Twist zig-zag thread and place on nds of back and front bed. Knit 62 rows between each buttonhole. This kind of buttonhole does not need finishing.

**Buttonband:** as buttonhole band, omitting buttonholes.  
**Sleeve bands (make two):** Begin and end with contrast yarn. With 23 sts knit according to diagram until row counter reads 250, release.  
**Collar:** knit sideways to body. Cast on 76 sts according to diagram, work until row counter reads 260, cast off.  
**To make up:** (coat)

Block and press all parts. Sew side panels to back and front, matching dots ● and circles ○. Join shoulder and sleeve seams. Graft sts of short edges of sleeve bands together, unravelling contrast yarn. With back stitch sew bands to lower edge of sleeves (see illustration). Set in sleeves. Sew hem to inside, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. With back stitch sew buttonhole band to right and button band to left front. Sew collar to neck edge, starting and ending at centre of front bands. Then fold collar in half to inside and sew down. Join short edges of collar with invisible sts. Sew on buttons. Press hem and seams lightly.

Waist band, beige: stocking st tubular. With 10 sts knit a band of desired measurement (waist measurement plus about 2 cm for overlap). Insert waist elastic and oversew short edges.

To make up:

Trousers: Fold both parts along crease (x-x-x-x-x on diagram), block and press carefully (first press test square for test purposes). Join both parts along seat seam, starting at centre front and ending at back opening. Pin back seam facing to inside and set in zip fastener. Sew on waist band with back stitch, secure overlap with large press stud. Fold section A in half to inside and sew down. Press again.

Jacket: Block and press all parts carefully, join side, shoulder and sleeve seams, set in sleeves. Sew facings to inside. Sew on cuffs, right sides facing, easing in fullness of sleeve. Turn cuffs and sew down inside. Remove contrast yarn from buttonholes, grafting sts of back and front together. Sew on buttons. Sew button and buttonhole band to centre front the same way as cuffs, neaten buttonholes, sew on buttons. At top oversew first half of front bands, unravelling contrast yarn. Sew on collar, first to remaining loose sts of front bands, then to neck edge, backstitching into the open loops, unravelling contrast yarn. Do the first on the outside, then on the inside. Graft sts of short edge of waist band together and insert petersham of correct size. Sew waist band to lower edge of jacket, easing in jacket. At overlap make 2 buttonholes: with buttonhole stitch sew buttonhole, then cut open. Sew on buttons to match buttonholes.

Set lock at back to GX, at front to N and knit 4 rows, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

**To make up:**

Press contrast yarn on neck band and on sleeves. Join shoulder and side seams. Join neck band and sew to neck edge, first to outside, backstitching into the open loops, then to inside, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Join sleeve seams, leaving 5 cm open at top. Sew these edges to horizontal edge of armhole, then fit vertical edge of armhole between the two layers of section B of sleeve. Sew on sleeve, first outside, backstitching into the open loops, then inside, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn.

**Fig. II, front:** A = begin with contrast yarn. After 18 rows start to decrease: at both sides place 38th and 40th stitch onto 39th nd, move this triple stitch 1 nd inwards, using deckercombs. Return 2 nds to N.P. For all following decreasing proceed thus: place 1 st at right and left onto nds marked with pusher. Move this triple stitch 1 nd inwards and mark with corresponding pusher, etc. etc. B = after 10 rows start increasing thus: at both sides mark 34th stitch with a pusher, starting from the marked nd move sts 1 nd outwards and place purl stitch loop of marked st on to empty nd. Leave marking in the same place throughout. After 64 rows make bust darts with graduations starting from the outside, using pushers and lock set on BX. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

**Straps (make two):** With 12 sts knit 48 cm in stocking st tubular.

**To make up:**

Block and press all parts. Join side seams. At top and at lower edge make an 8 cm hem, unravelling contrast yarn. Sew on straps according to desired measurement.

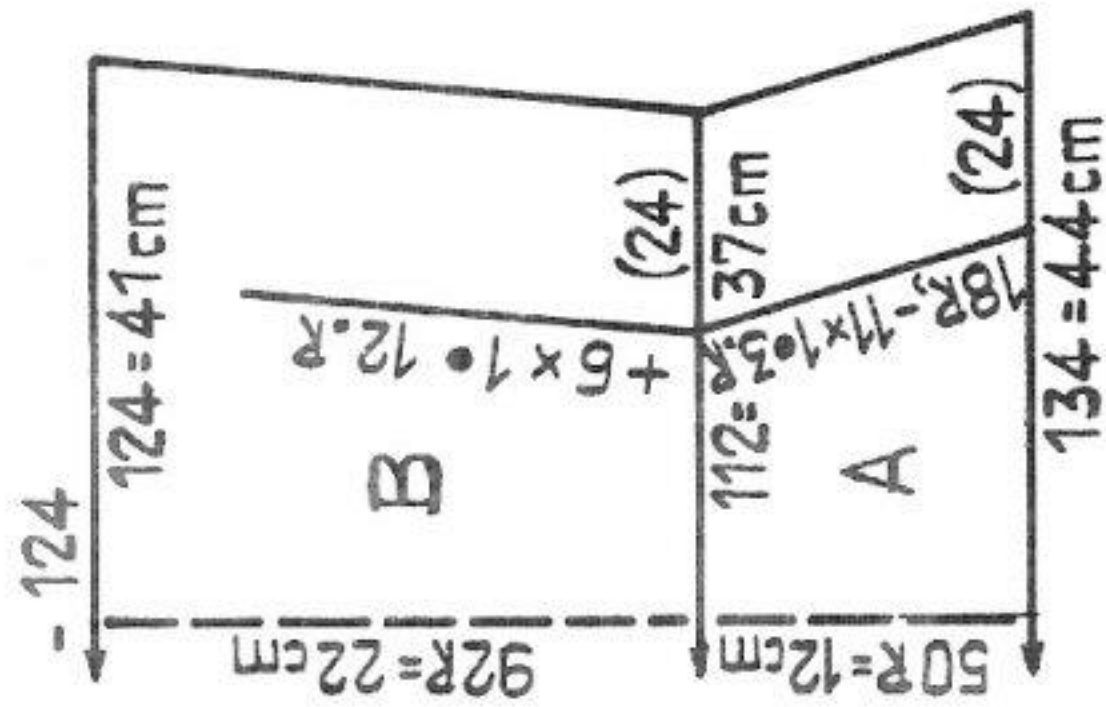
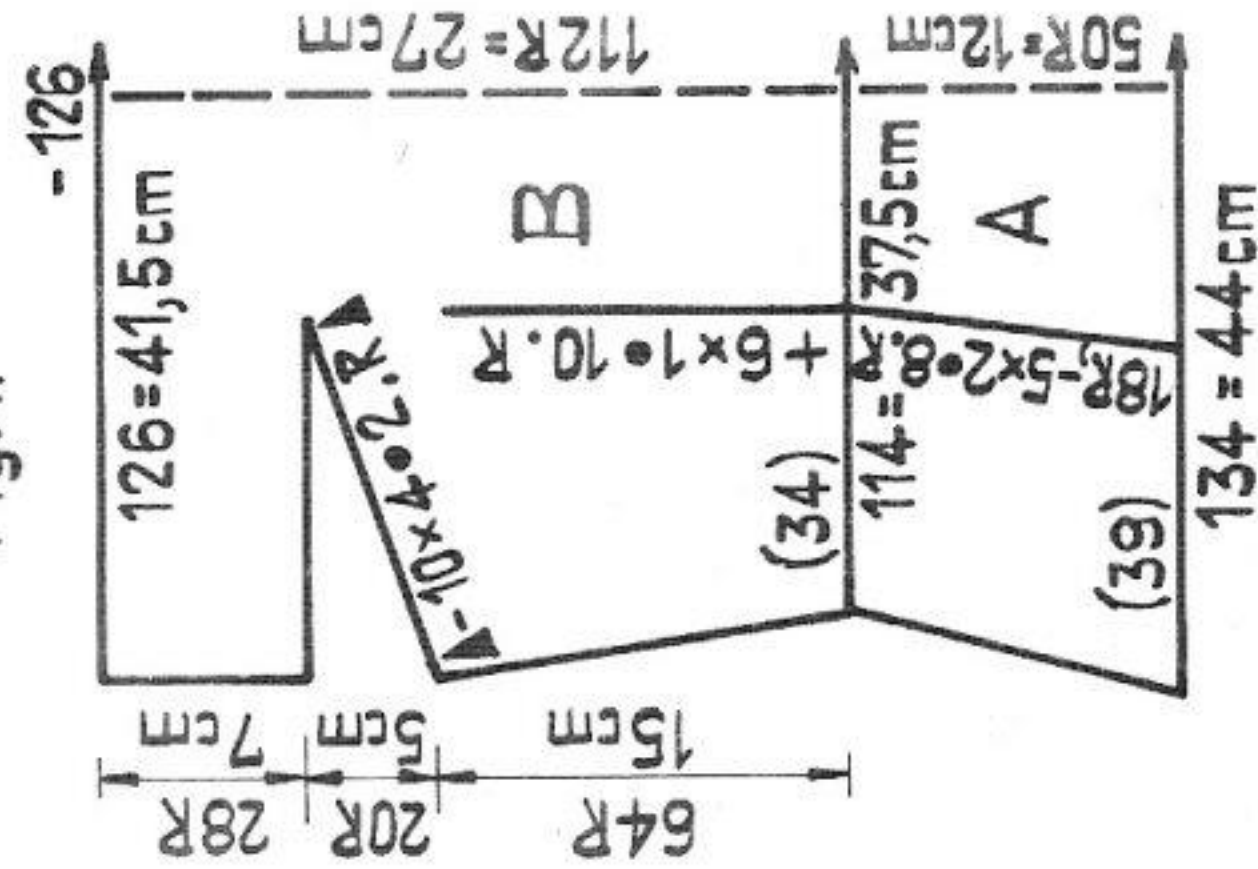

At right knit straight, at left increase. C = at right decrease, at left knit straight. D = at right continue decreasing, at left shape armhole. E = at right knit straight, at left decrease.

**Fig. III, sleeve (make two):** A = 2:3 rib border in dark green, begin with contrast yarn. B = bring all nds into W.P., hanging purl stitch loops onto empty nds. Continue in fairisle pattern according to diagram, increasing at both ends. C = decrease at both ends, cast off loosely.

**Fig. IV, collar in dark green:** A = begin with contrast colour, at left of machine. 2:3 rib, straight. B = at right cast on further 100 sts and with BX and pushers knit a few rows with contrast yarn, then 4 rows dark green over all 162 sts. With BX and pushers make graduations from the left side according to diagram. C = continue straight. D = with BX and pushers make graduations from the right side. Lastly knit 4 rows over all 162 sts, with BX and pushers knit a few rows with contrast yarn over the 100 sts at right, release. E = continue straight = centre of collar. Now, knit sections E to A, reversing shapings, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

**Fig. V, button and buttonhole band in dark green:**  
**Buttonhole band:** begin and end with contrast yarn. Knit in 2:3 division. After 6 rows make 3 buttonholes starting from the left side: with BX and pushers knit 8 rows over 45 sts, then over the next 45 sts and then over the third set of 45 sts. Lastly, knit 8 rows over the remaining 13 sts. Knit 28 rows over all nds, repeat buttonholes as before. Finally, knit 8 rows over all nds, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

**Button band:** Proceed as for Fig. V, omitting buttonholes.

**To make up:**

Block and press all parts, omitting lower border of jacket. Join side, shoulder and sleeve seams. Fold lower border according to broken line on diagram to inside and sew down, unravelling contrast yarn. Graft sts of sections A of collar (centre back seam). Join outside edge of collar. Sew collar to neck and reverse edge of jacket, first to outside, backstitching into the open loops, then to inside, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Sew button and buttonhole bands to front. Join collar and bands, leaving an opening for 4th buttonhole. Fold cuffs in half to inside and sew down, unravelling contrast yarn. Set in sleeves. Neaten double buttonholes and sew on buttons to match.

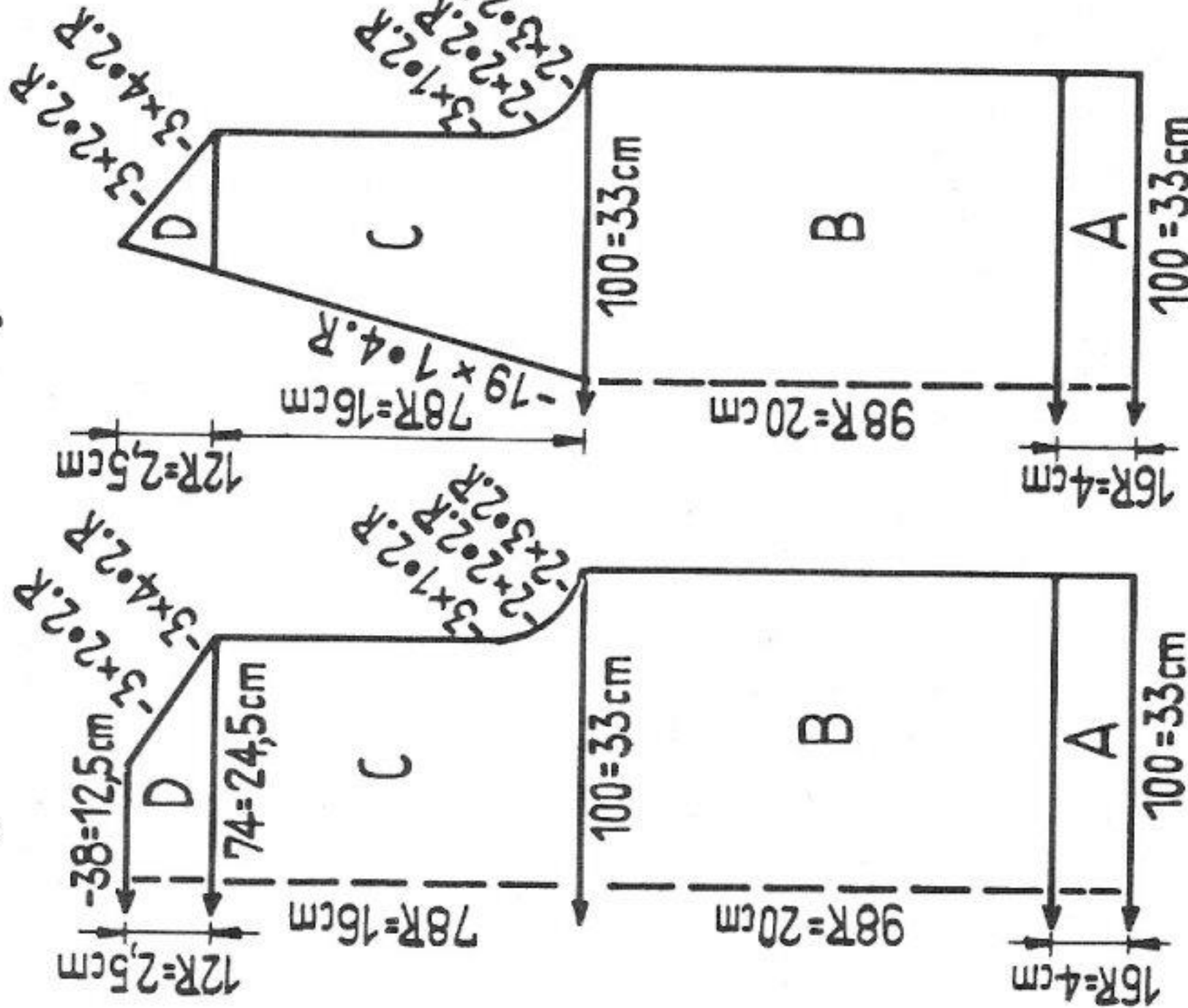

After 70 rows make bust darts with graduations starting from the outside, with pushers and lock set on BX. E = divide work: at right put 61 sts on dekercombs.
