New ! Tips for Sewing

Stitch by stitch, backstitching into the open loops



Again and again, in the making up instructions for garments, you will come across the words "stitch by stitch, backstitching into the open loops".

This is how to do it :

If you want to sew on your neck band neatly, finish with a few rows of contrast yarn and strip off. It is very important to press your knitting before sewing. For a band with stretch (e.g. K/K or 1:1) press only the contrast yarn. The pressing prevents dropped stitches and makes the knitting less likely to roll up.

Unravel the contrast yarn until only one row of stitches remains. When you have threaded your needle and are ready to begin sewing, unravel the first two stitches of this last contrast row. From behind push the needle through the main part of the garment and through the second stitch of the last row knitted in main yarn. From the front, take the needle through the first stitch of the same row (catching it to the garment beneath) and pull the needle out through the third stitch of the same row.

Go back one stitch - i.e. push the needle through the second stitch, pull it out through the fourth. As you work your way along the row, unravel the contrast yarn, two or three stitches at a time. You will be pleased to see how neatly your band has been sewn on.

Before starting your work please study carefully the explanations given on pages 1 and 2

Patterns: The drawings refer to half width, the indications of stitch numbers refer to whole width of each part.

If the centre line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is worked simultaneously with reversed shapings, i.e. decreasing or increasing is made on the left as well as on the right side.

If the centre line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is worked separately with reversed shapings, i.e. first knit one part according to diagram (increasing or decreasing at right), then the second part the opposite way (decreasing or increasing at left).

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter "st"). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working Position on back and front bed.

Exception: For tubular or half tubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed. The same number of needles must therefore be put into Working Position on the other bed. In these cases the sign for tubular \bigcirc respectively (or) for half tubular is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increase or decrease always occurs in the first row of a section.

- $+3 \times 2 \cdot 8 \cdot R$ means: increase 2 stitches 3 times in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- $-19 \times 3 \cdot 7 \cdot R$ means: decrease 3 stitches 19 times in every 7th row (back 2 stitches, front 1 stitch or vice versa).
- $-17 \times 1 \cdot 2 / 3 \cdot R$ means: decrease 1 stitch 17 times, alternately once after 2 rows and once after 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle -4 \times 8 \cdot 2 \cdot R$ means: work graduations, i. e. short rows (on DUO with pushers and lock BX). Step by step put 8 nds (and their respective pushers) into Rest Position 4 times after every 2nd row (for double bed 4 nds each back and front). Once all graduations are finished, continue knitting normally, i. e. all nds in Working Position (pushers in Neutral Position).

Graduations can be knitted two ways, either from outer edge towards centre (gradual decreasing with the minus-sign "-" after the black triangle) or from the centre towards outer edge (gradual increasing with the plus-sign "+" after the black triangle).

Number of stitches and centimetres :

- $136 = 20 \text{ cm}$ means: a total of 136 sts (for K/K 68 stitches each on back and front) make a width of 20 cm.
- $\bigcirc 146 = 43 \text{ cm}$ means: cast on 146 sts each on back and front bed for tubular which makes a width of 43 cm.

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be tested by you, by making your own test square for your own wool.

Test square: We strongly recommend that you make always a test square with your own material before starting to work, in order to calculate for your material the necessary numbers of stitches and rows along the PASSAP - chart. The chapter "The test square and its calculation" in your instruction book informs you how to proceed for these calculations. This is very important, especially when adjusting a model to another size.

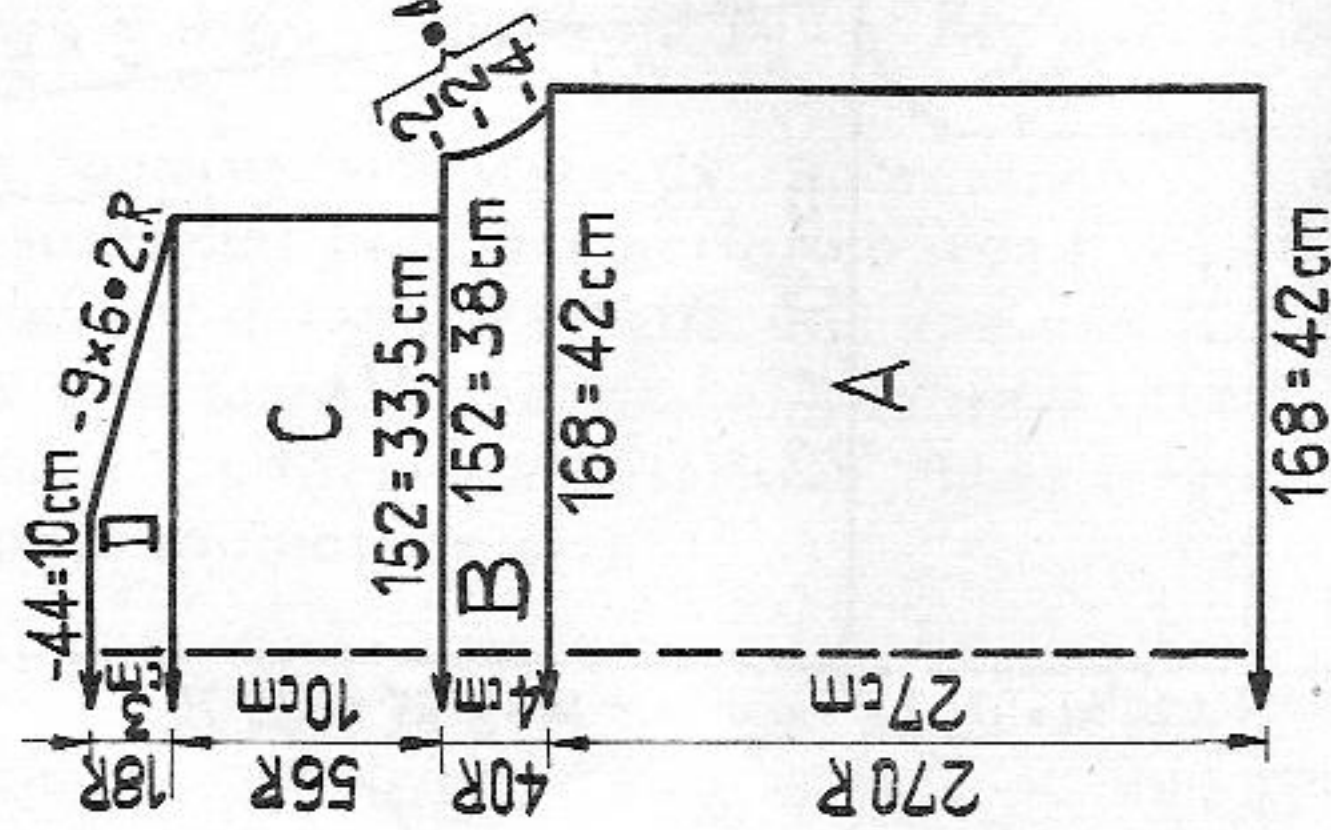
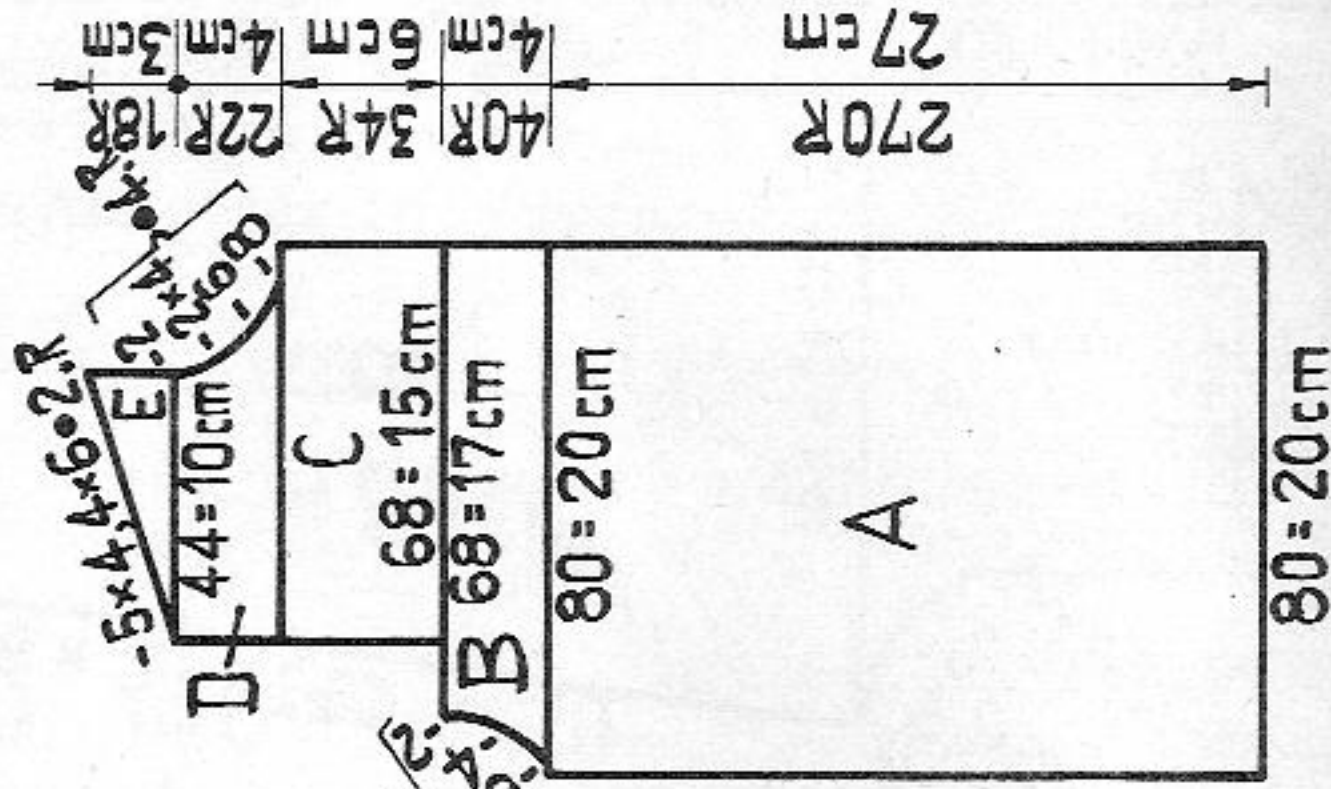

Girl's two-piece

Size: to fit an approx. 11 year-old, height 146 cm
Material: 13 ozs industrial wool: 12 ozs blue, 1/2 oz red and 1/2 oz green, 3 buttons, 1 elastic waist band.
Stitch size: Racking pattern = 2 1/2, K/K = 2 1/4, stocking stitch and stocking stitch tubular = 3 3/4
Test square pattern: 100 sts = 25 cm (9 3/4"), 100 rows = 10 cm (4")
Test square K/K: 100 sts stretched = 22 cm (8 3/4"), 100 rows = 18 cm (7")
Pattern: Skirt: racking pattern in colour sequence, K/K and stocking stitch.
 Jacket: racking pattern in colour sequence and K/K.

Fig. I: Jacket

A = cast on tubular rows with blue. 60 rows racking pattern acc. to diagram, then 5 times * 4 rows red, 4 rows green, 4 rows blue *. Continue to knit with blue to end. B = racking pattern, shape armholes, then knit straight. C = K/K, knit straight. D = K/K shape shoulders, cast off.
 Fig. II: Knit right front acc. to diagram.

Arrange pushers beginning with arrow at left of diagram. A = racking pattern in blue, 60 rows acc. to diagram, then 5 times * 4 rows red, 4 rows green, 4 rows blue *. Knit with blue to end. B = racking pattern at right, knit straight, at left shape armhole. C = K/K, knit straight. D = K/K, at right shape neck, at left knit straight. E = K/K, at right knit straight, at left shape shoulder.

Left front: knit with reversed shapings to diagram. Arrange pushers beginning with arrow at right of diagram.

Fig. III: blue, sleeve in K/K, knit twice.

A = cast on with tubular rows, increase at both ends. B = shape sleeve head, cast off.

Collar:

With 142 nds cast on blue with tubular rows, then racking pattern acc. to diagram: 16 rows blue, 4 rows red, 4 rows green, 4 rows blue, 4 rows red, 4 rows green. Then knit 16 rows with blue in K/K, 10 rows CX/CX with St.S 3 3/4, a few rows with contrast yarn, release, press contrast yarn.

To make up: do not press

Join shoulder, side and sleeve seams. Insert sleeves. Sew collar to outside of neck opening, backstitching into the open loops, then catch down on inside, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Attach 3 loops to right yoke and sew buttons onto opposite yoke.

Material: 800 m length per 100 gr

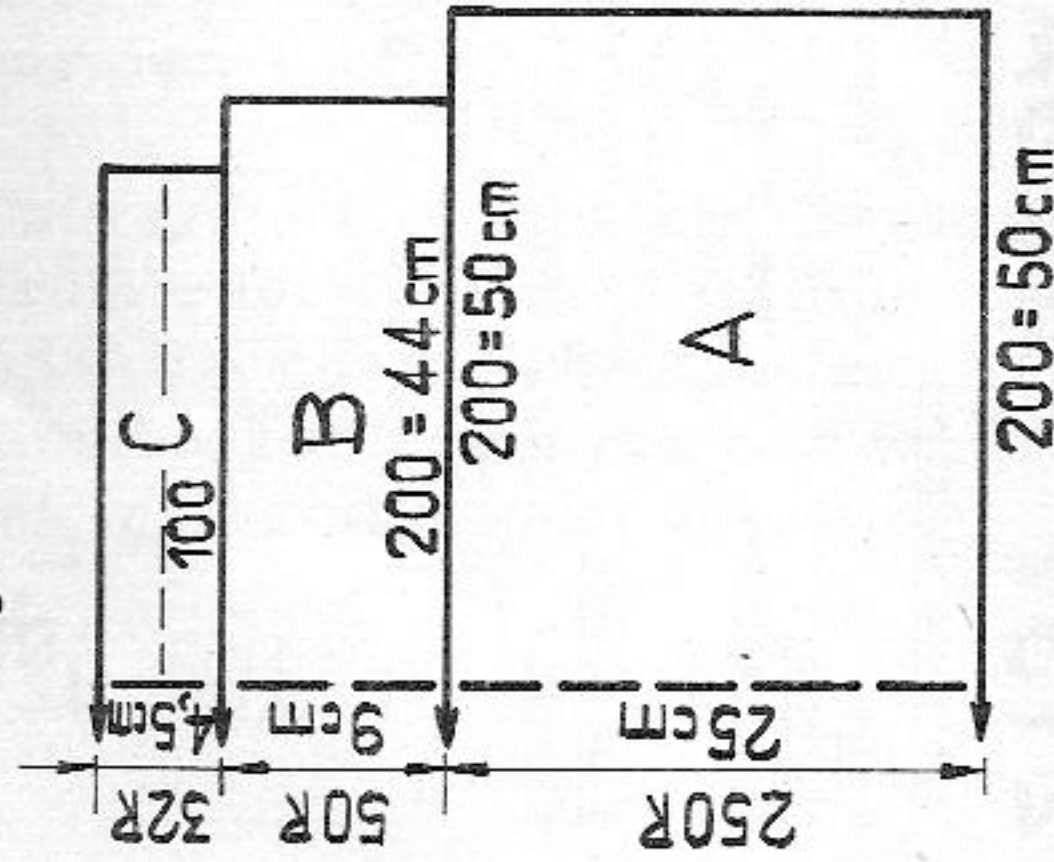

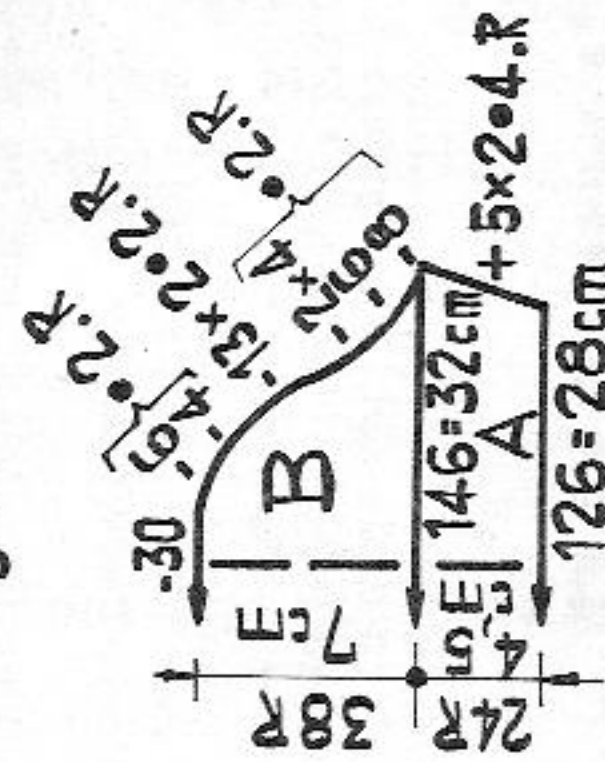

A = cast on with tubular rows, then racking pattern acc. to diagram. Knit 60 rows blue, then 5 times * 4 rows red, 4 rows green, 4 rows blue *. In between 16 rows blue, then again 5 times from * to *. Knit with blue to end. B = 50 rows in K/K. C = waist hem: do not transfer sts. Set lock at back to GX, at front to N with St.S 3 3/4, knit 32 rows, 1 row with lock N/N, lower front bed a little and cast off sts with green tool.

To make up: do not press

Join side seams with mattress stitch. Insert waist band.

Raglan blouse with square neckline

Size: to fit an approx. 86 cm bust

Material: 6 1/2 ozs mohair, mauve, an oddment white

Stitch size: stocking st 6, 3:1 rib = 3 1/2 (back bed) and 5 1/2 (front bed)

Test square: 100 sts = 48 cm (19"), 100 rows = 40 cm (15 3/4")

Pattern: stocking st knitted with every second nd. Waist and neck band in 3:1 rib, sleeve bands in scallop edge acc. to diagram.

Fig. I: begin with contrast yarn. A = 3:1 rib acc. to diagram. B = transfer sts to front bed for stocking st in 1:1 division. Increase at both ends. C = raglan shaping with quintuple decker. D = transfer sts for 3:1 rib, at both ends continue decreasing with quintuple decker. Cast off with white.

Fig. II: A + B = as for Fig. I. Make bust darts with BX and pushers, starting from the outside. C + D = as for Fig. I.

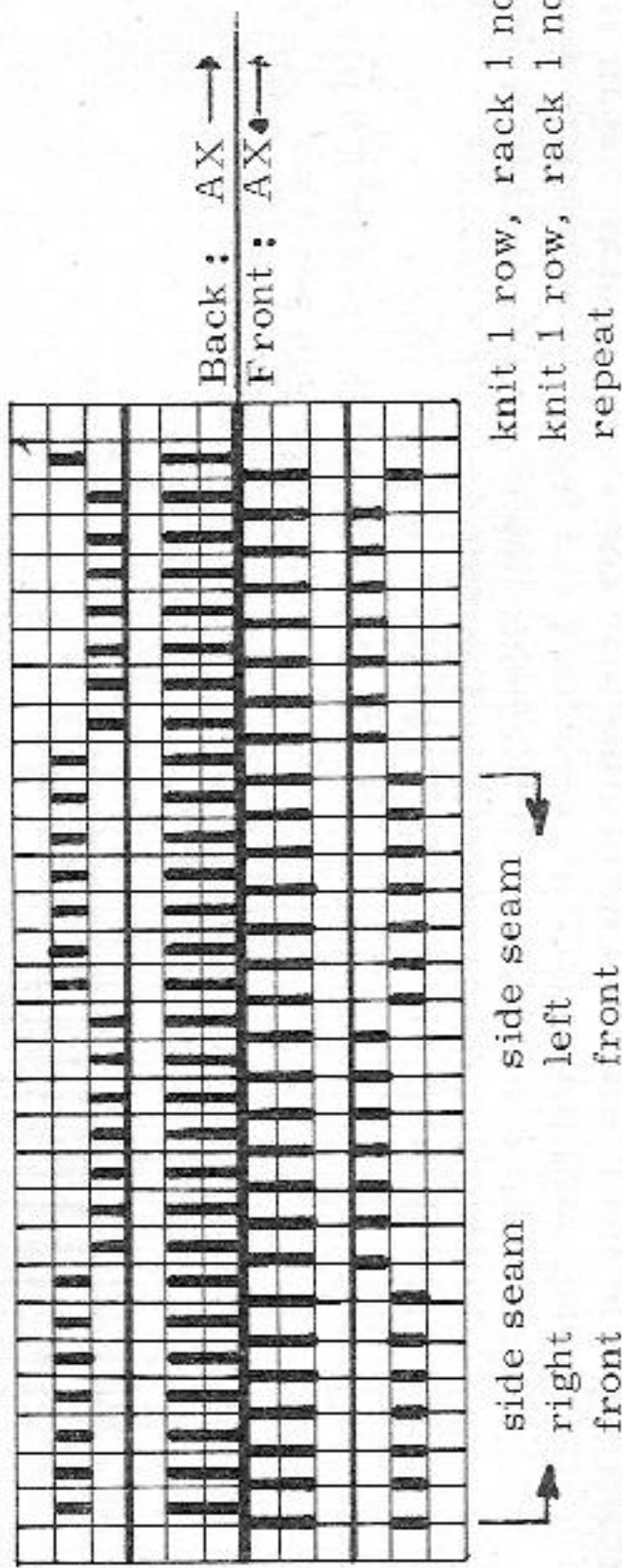
Fig. III: A = cast-on and scallop edge acc. to diagram. B = stocking st in 1:1 division, decreasing with 24 deckercomb. C + D = as for Fig. I.

To make up:

Block and press all parts. Unravel contrast yarn of sections A of back and front and put sts on needle. With white cast off loosely by hand. With mattress stitch join sleeves to back and front. Join side and sleeve seams. If desired pull cord through open work row of sleeve.

Shirt dress, buttoned at front

Size: to fit an approx. 84 cm bust

Material: 18 ozs medium synthetic yarn, 4 buttons

Stitch size: DUOMATIC; weave stitch = 4 3/4, 1:1 rib and K/K = 2 3/4

COMBI; weave stitch = 4 1/2, 1:1 rib and K/K = 2 1/2, tension arm 5, yarn brake 4

weave stitch: 100 sts = 30 cm (12"), 100 rows = 15 cm (6")

1:1 rib: 100 sts (slightly stretched) 30 cm (12")

100 rows = 21 cm (8 1/4")

K/K: 100 sts = 18 cm (7"), 100 rows = 20 cm (8")

skirt in weave stitch, top in 1:1 rib, collar in K/K

Pattern:

Fig. I, back: A = regular cast-on with tubular rows, i.e. 12 rows tubular CX/CX, then weave stitch acc. to diagram. Finish off with a few rows contrast yarn, release. B = place sts back onto nds of machine, placing 2 sts onto every third nd, all the way along, unravelling contrast yarn. Continue in 1:1 rib, C = shape armholes. D = shape shoulders, cast off loosely.

Fig. II, front: A = as for Fig. I. B = place sts of right half (96) back onto 72 nds of machine (2 sts on every third nd) for 1:1 rib. Between the 10 nds at left bring the 10 empty nds into W.P. for K/K border. Continue straight in 1:1 rib and K/K at left. After 32 rows make buttonhole at left over sts 11 to 16. Make 3 more buttonholes, knitting 32 rows between each buttonhole. C = at right shape armhole, at left bring empty nds for K/K into W.P. as directed on diagram. D = at right shape shoulder, at left cast off loosely 20 sts, then shape neck, bringing further empty nds into W.P.

Place sts of left half onto 62 nds of machine (2 sts on every third nd). At right cast on further 20 sts for button band in K/K. Knit sections B to D with reversed shapings, omitting buttonholes.

Fig. III, sleeve (make two): A = 1:1 rib, increasing at both ends. B = decrease at both ends. C = continue straight. D = decrease at right.

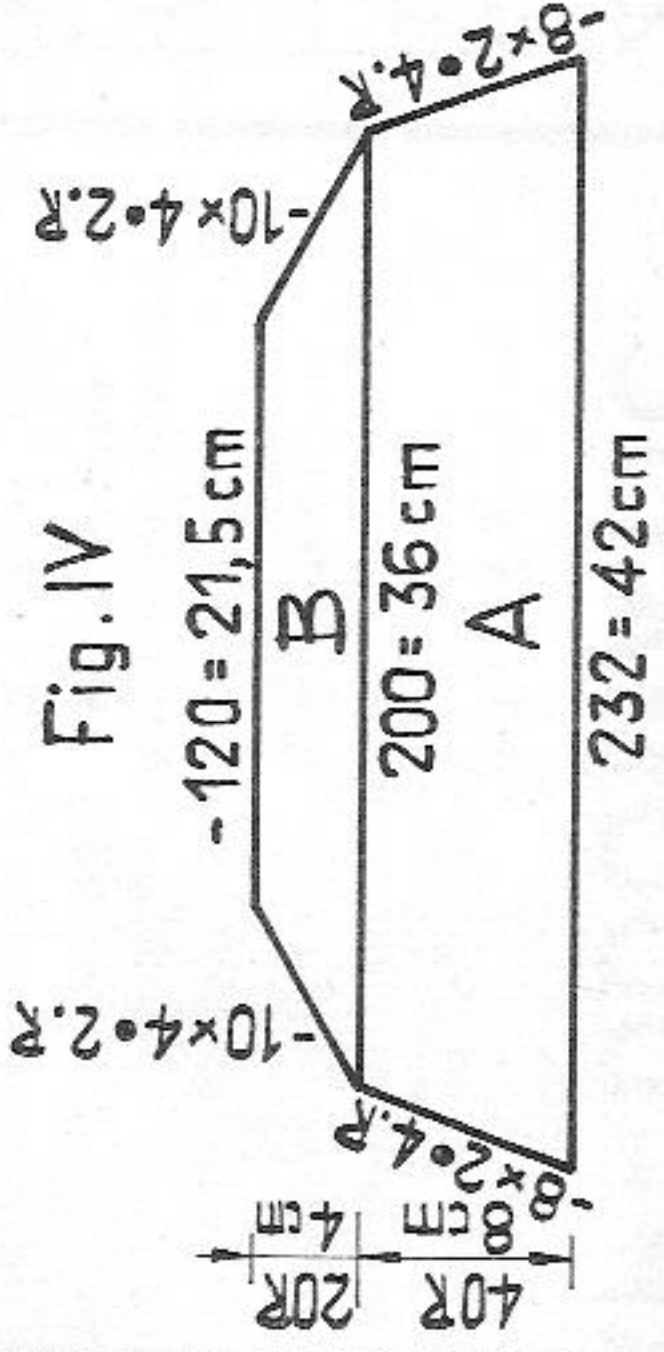
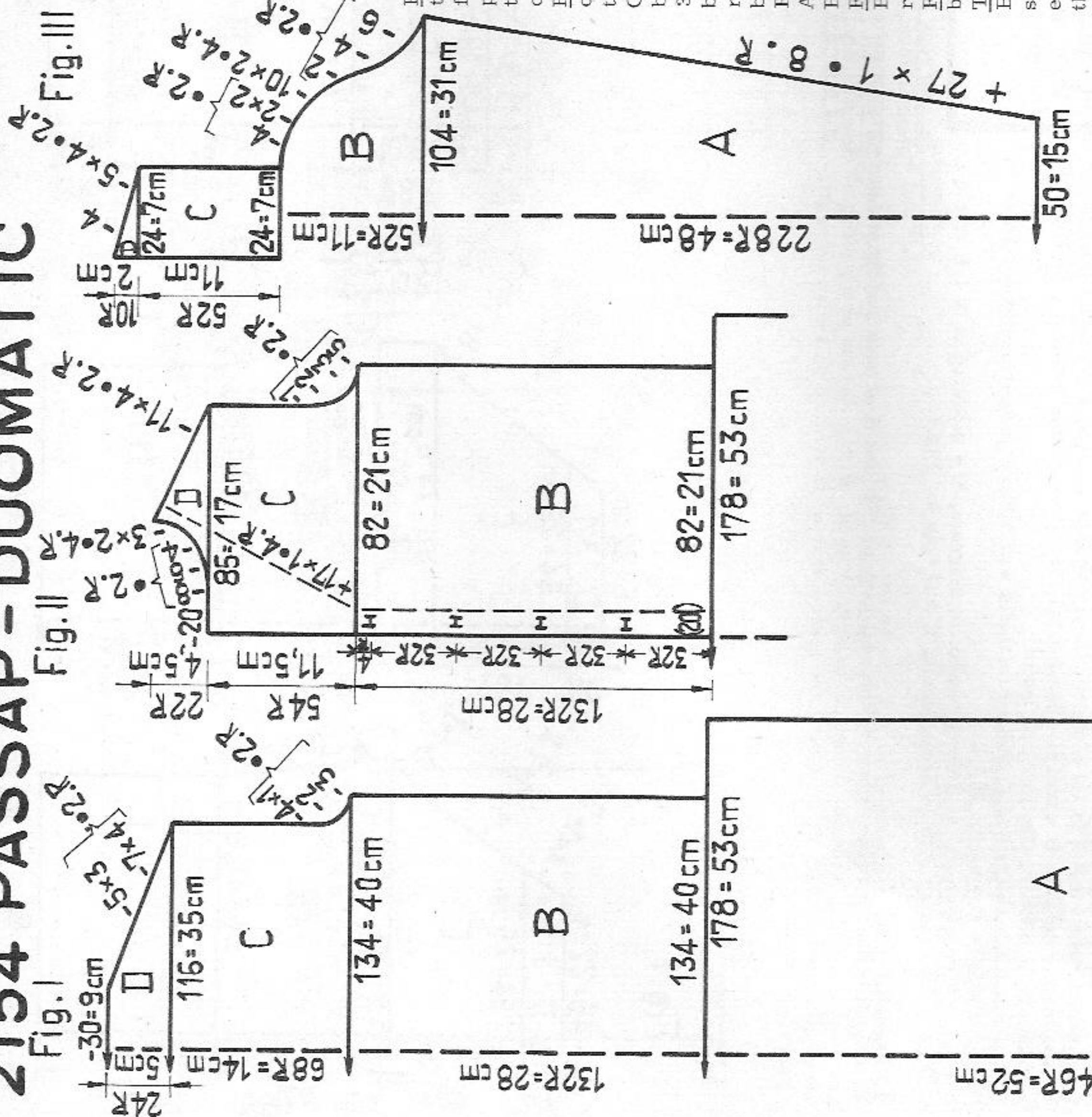
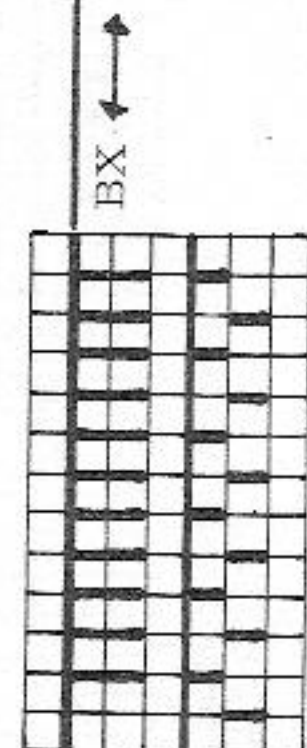
Fig. IV, collar: A = K/K, decreasing at both ends. B = decrease at both ends, cast off loosely.

To make up:

Block and press skirt only. Join side and sleeve seams. Set in sleeves, sewing saddle shoulder between back and front. Sew collar to neck edge, right sides facing. At the beginning of section B, sew down the 20 sts of the button band. Sew on buttons.

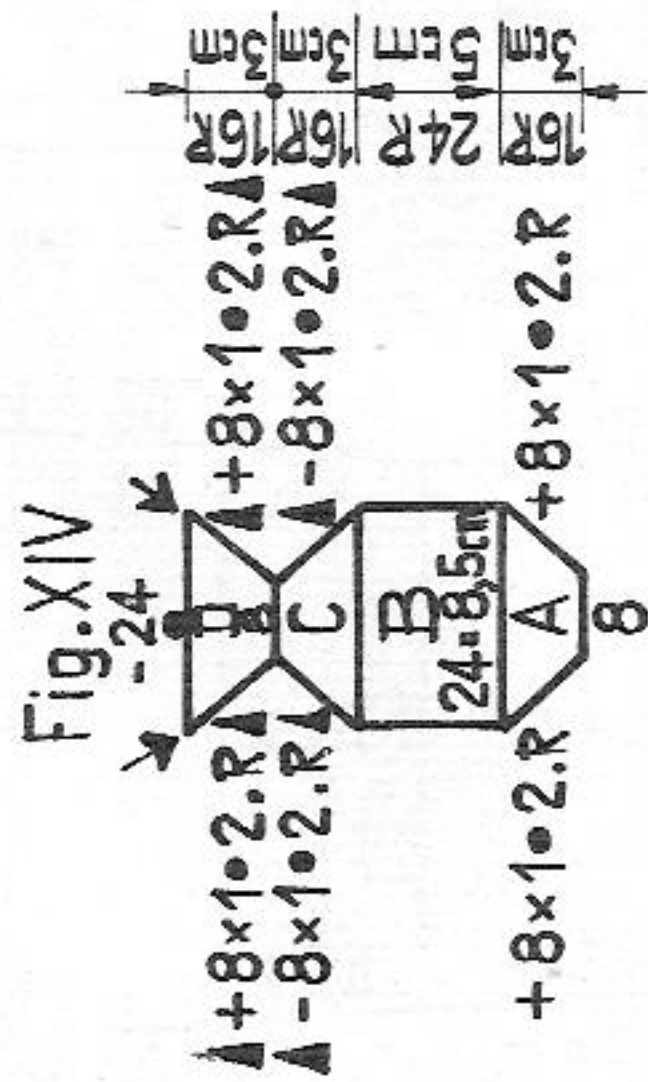
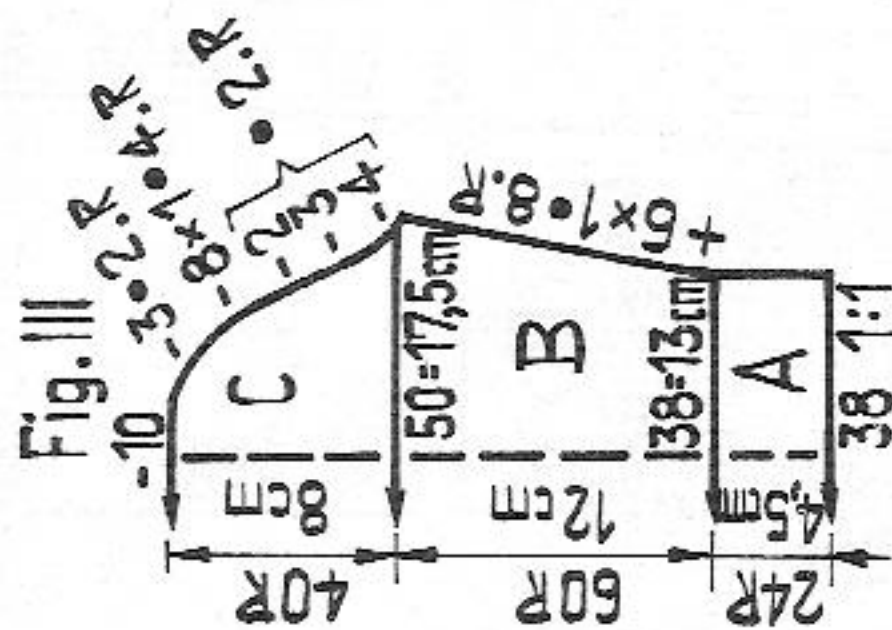

stocking st (purlside outwards), main part knitted in one piece, blue. Cuffs in 1:1 rib, red. Neck band stocking st tubular, red.

Fig. I, II + IX :

A = cast on 106 sts, knit straight in stocking st. B = at right cast on further 51 sts, continue straight. C = at left shape shoulder, then cast off 36 sts for armhole. D = continue straight. E = at left cast on 36 sts, at left increase for shoulder shaping. At right cast off 11 sts in the 6th row, and cast on again (slit for foot). F = at left cast off 4 sts, then decrease for neck shaping. G = at right put 51 pushers into W.P., set lock to BX, knit 10 rows, cast off. On the same 51 nds cast on 51 sts and knit 10 rows, and leave sts on nds. Return pushers within blocking rail. At left put 92 pushers into W.P. and knit 20 rows, return all pushers within blocking rail. Set lock to N. H = continue with all 143 nds : at right knit straight, at left increase for neck shaping. J = at left cast on 4 sts, at left decrease. At right cast off 11 sts in the 22nd row, and cast on again. K = at left cast off 36 sts for second armhole, then continue straight. L = at left cast on 36 sts, increase for shoulder shaping. M = straight. N = at right cast off 51 sts, knit straight, cast off.

Fig. III :

A = 1:1 rib border, red. B = transfer sts for stocking st, continue with blue, increasing at both ends. C = shape sleeve head, cast off.

Fig. XIV : with red. A + B = sole, C + D = toe

A = stocking st, begin with 8 sts, increasing at both ends. B = straight. C + D = make graduations with BX and pushers : at both ends decrease and increase acc. to diagram. Cast off.

Neck band : with red, stocking st tubular.

With 56 sts on each bed make zig-zag (N/N), knit 20 rows tubular (RC 20), a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Underlap, to fix press studs between legs

With blue and 7 sts on each bed knit 44 cm in stocking st tubular.

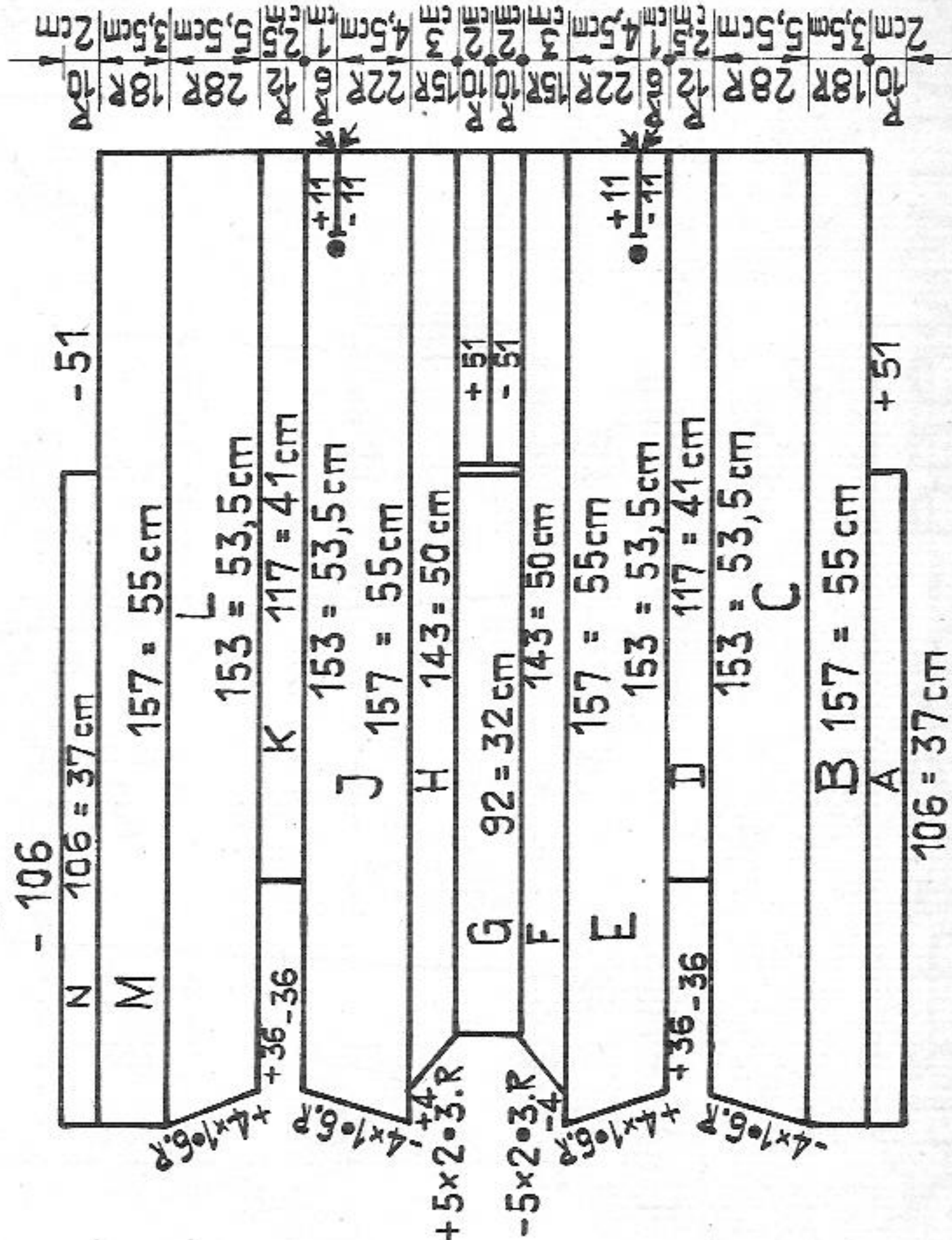
Overlap, to fix press studs :

Place inside edge of section G at crotch (double line on diagram) onto 20 nds of machine. Knit 10 rows, cast off.

To make up :

Moisten all parts, pin out to correct measurement and allow to dry. Join shoulder and sleeve seams. Set in sleeves. Sew on neck band, first to outside, backstitching into the open loops, then to inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Join centre back seam about 4 cm from bottom, set in zip fastener. At inside edge of leg sew the 10 (knitted-on) rows to inside, at the other edge sew on overlap to match. At foot sew overlap and underlap for 2 cm together. Then sew on 5 press studs equally spaced along opening. Sew on foot (Fig. XIV) matching arrows and dots, using back stitch.

Size: to fit an approx. 86 cm bust and 90 cm hip

Material: Long dress: approx. 21 1/2 ozs orlon; 15 ozs green, 5 1/2 ozs apricot and 1 oz brown. Short dress: approx. 16 ozs orlon; 10 1/2 ozs green, 4 1/2 ozs apricot and 1 oz brown. 1 zip - 38 cm length, 75 cm elastic - 5 mm width.

Stitch size: 4 1/4 COMBI; 4, tension arm 7, yarn brake 5 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 29 cm (11 1/3"), 100 rows = 21 cm (8 1/4")

Pattern: Stocking stitch, colour sequence acc. to diagram.

Short dress: begin Fig. VIIa + VIIIa and Fig. VII + VIII at section E. With the indicated number of sts first knit hem = section A, then E.

Fig. VIIa + VIIIa:

Skirt side panels. Knit 4 panels, two for the right side and two for the left. Decrease at both ends with double decker acc. to diagram. A = green. Hem. B = green.

Knit straight. C = 4 rows brown, 72 rows apricot, 4 rows brown. D = green. E = 4 rows brown, 52 rows apricot, 4 rows brown. F = green. G = 4 rows brown, 32 rows apricot, 4 rows brown. H = green. On two of the side panels, cast off 2 sts at the left, and on the other two side panels cast off 2 sts at the right (as shown on diagram) for skirt seam. Put all 46 sts on deckercombs or thread and remove from machine.

 COMBI stocking stitch St. S 4 1/2, 1:1 St. S 2 1/2, tension arm 3, yarn brake 7
Test square: 100 sts = 33 cm (13"), 100 rows (RC 200) = 20,5 cm (8")
Pattern: Stocking stitch, half tubular, knitted from top to bottom.
 Colour sequence acc. to chart. Waist band in 1:1 rib, white.

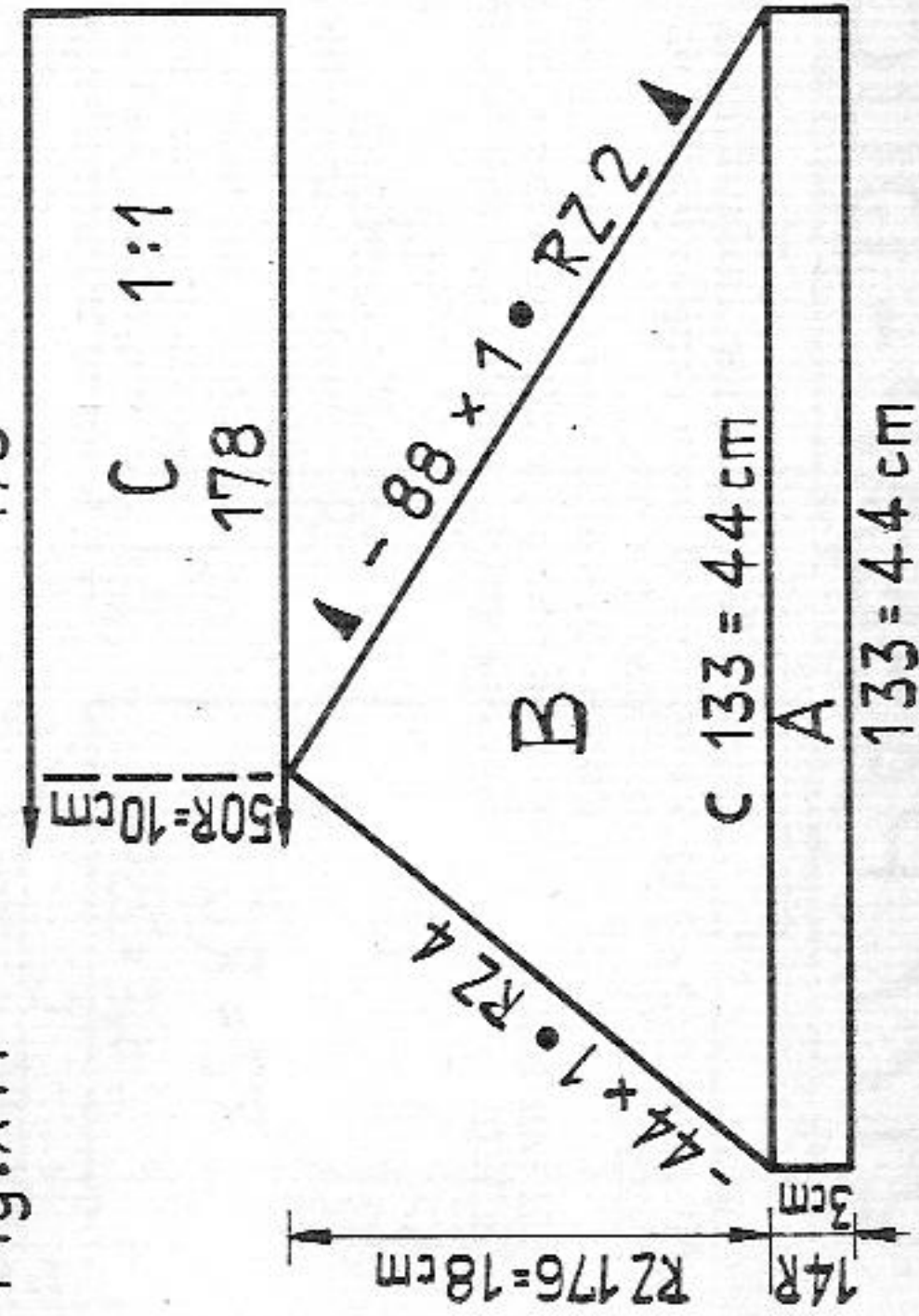
Fig. XVI: begin with contrast yarn
 A = hem of upper edge in white. On the right side of the machine first knit on front and then on back bed 14 rows with 133 sts. B = half tubular, open at right. Knit colour sequence acc. to chart, making graduations at right every alternate row on front and back. At left cast off every fourth row at back and front using double decker tool (pushers always within blocking rail). C = at right knit 1 row white over remaining sts (89 sts each on front and back bed). Transfer sts with deckercombs from back to front bed to the left of those sts which are already on front bed.
