When it turns out to be a success why not knit skirt 2256 as well and you will have a new outfit in a jiffy. At once you will discover how well worth while a knitting machine is.

To make things easier for you when using our description book, we have described as many models as possible in two sizes. See our detailed description on page 3.

We hope you will thoroughly enjoy knitting our latest designs.

More sizes !

On glancing through our description book you will notice that many of the models have been described in two sizes. We have put all the indications referring to the second size in brackets. However, in some cases certain indications are the same for both sizes and thus they only appear in brackets once.

This means that you have a better possibility of finding a model in the size you require. If this shouldn't be the case the two sizes indicated will make it easier for you to judge where and how you should make alterations.

We have been able to make this alteration and still retain a clear and simple description which will help you to see nearly all the necessary indications on the drawing instead of having to look for the figures in the small printed text. You only need to read the text as a guide before knitting.

Evergreens !

On pages 5 to 7 you will find models from former books for which we have received requests time and again, as they also appear in our brochures and still find much appeal.

Before starting your work please study carefully the explanations given on pages 3 and 4

**Patterns:** The drawings refer to half width, the indications of stitch numbers refer to whole width of each part.

Figure I	= back	Figure IX	= pants
Figure II	= front	Figure X	= gusset

If the centre line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is worked simultaneously with reversed shapings, i. e. decreasing or increasing is made on the left as well as on the right side.

If the centre line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is worked separately with reversed shapings, i. e. first knit one part according to diagram (increasing or decreasing at right), then the second part the opposite way (decreasing or increasing at left).

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Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter "st"). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working Position on back and front bed.

Exception: For tubular or half tubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed. The same number of needles must therefore be put into Working Position on the other bed. In these cases the sign for tubular  $\bigcirc$  respectively ( or ) for half tubular is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increase or decrease always occurs in the first row of a section.

- $+ 3 \times 2 \cdot 8 \cdot R$  means: increase 2 stitches 3 times in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- $- 19 \times 3 \cdot 7 \cdot R$  means: decrease 3 stitches 19 times in every 7th row (back 2 stitches, front 1 stitch or vice versa).
- $- 17 \times 1 \cdot 2 / 3 \cdot R$  means: decrease 1 stitch 17 times, alternately once after 2 rows and once after 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle - 4 \times 8 \cdot 2 \cdot R$  means: work graduations, i. e. short rows (on DUO with pushers and lock BX). Step by step put 8 nds (and their respective pushers) into Rest Position 4 times after every 2nd row (for double bed 4 nds each back and front). Once all graduations are finished, continue knitting normally, i. e. all nds in Working Position (pushers in Neutral Position).

Graduations can be knitted two ways, either from outer edge towards centre (gradual decreasing with the minus-sign "-" after the black triangle) or from the centre towards outer edge (gradual increasing with the plus-sign "+" after the black triangle.)

Number of stitches and centimetres :

- $136 = 20 \text{ cm}$  means: a total of 136 sts (for K/K 68 stitches each on back and front) make a width of 20 cm.
- $\bigcirc 146 = 43 \text{ cm}$  means: cast on 146 sts each on back and front bed for tubular which makes a width of 43 cm.

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be tested by you, by making your own test square for your own wool.

Test square: We strongly recommend that you make always a test square with your own material before starting to work, in order to calculate for your material the necessary numbers of stitches and rows along the PASSAP - chart. The chapter "The test square and its calculation" in your instruction book informs you how to proceed for these calculations. This is very important, especially when adjusting a model to another size.

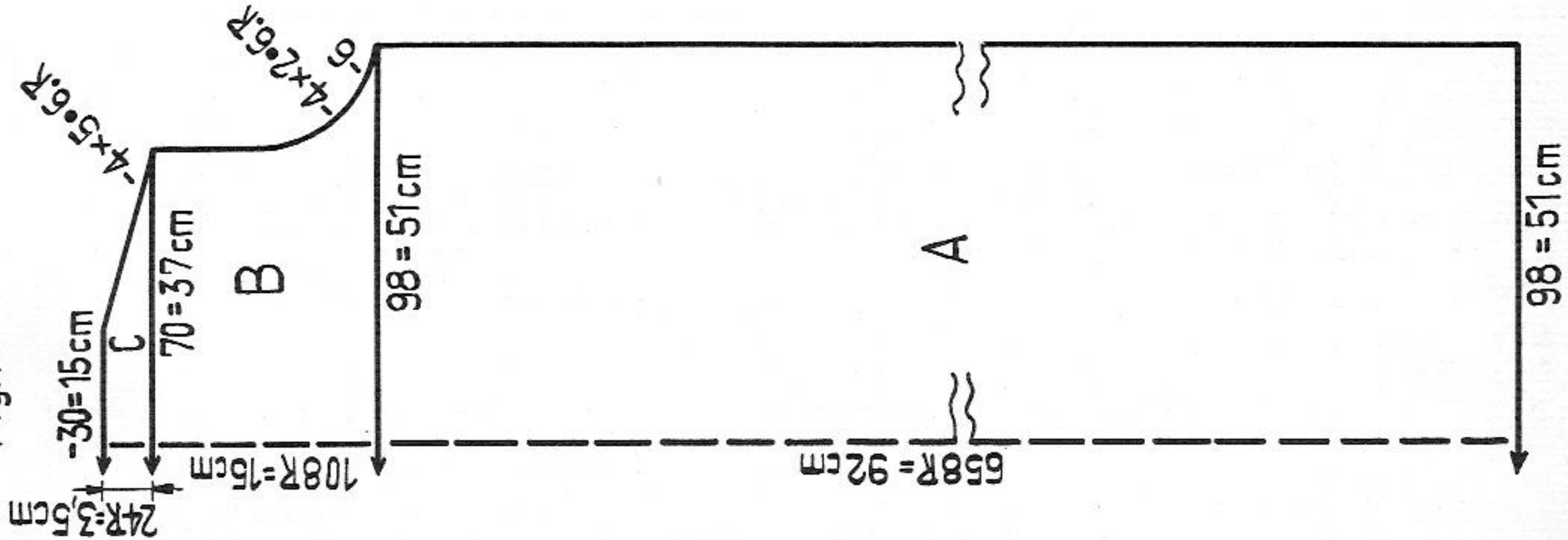
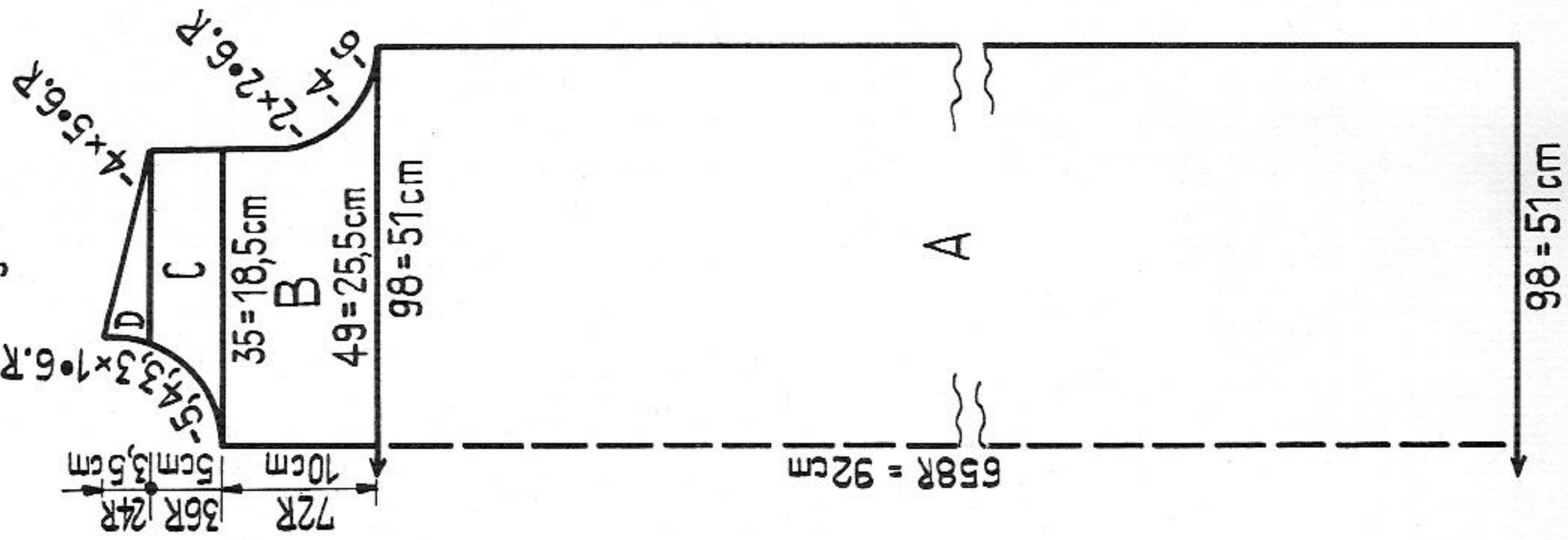
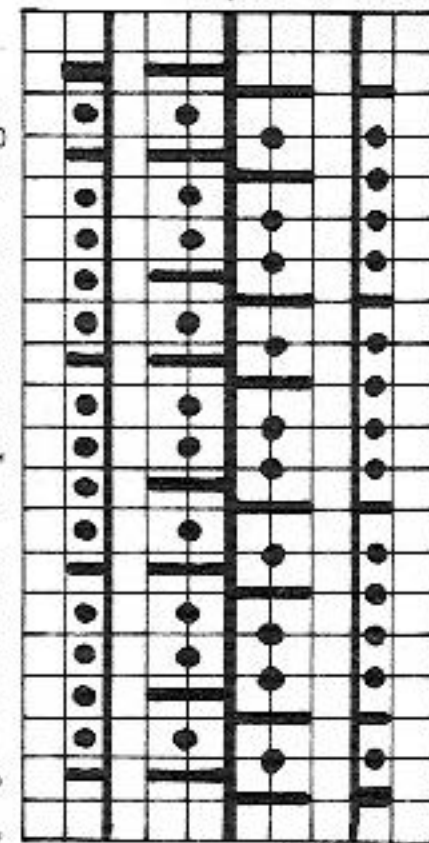

Then at front transfer sts 2-6 and sts 19-23 1 nd towards centre with quintuple deker. On back bed also transfer both needle groups 1 nd inwards. Knit 2 rows. Repeat 5 times every alternate row. Join the remaining sts.

**Trimming for armholes:** Knit twice. Cast on 6 sts on front bed and 1 stitch at centre of back bed for stocking stitch and knit 154 rows, cast off.

**Neck trimming:** As for armhole trimmings, but knit 210 rows.

### To make up:

- Stretch parts of dress slightly on all sides, block and press all parts lightly. Press trimmings and tab. Join side and shoulder seams. First sew trimmings to outside of neck opening and armholes, purlside facing outwards, then catch down on inside. Sew tab, purlside outwards, to centre front of dress. Crochet along edges of tab, neck opening and armholes with dark blue silk as follows:
- 1 firm stitch through first stitch, 2 4-chain sts, 1 firm stitch through 3rd stitch,
  - 2 4-chain sts, etc. Crochet around edges of fancy button and sew to top of tab.
- Close neck opening with press studs.

At both ends move all sts with dekercombs 2 nds inwards, leave 2 nds at both ends in N.P. Repeat 10 times every 14 rows. Finally knit 2 rows red, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

**Fig. III, first sleeve:**

A = begin with contrast yarn, then 4 rows navy blue, 4 rows white and 2 rows red, continue repeating 4 rows white and 4 rows navy blue up to the end. B = increase at both ends. C = centre back: divide work and knit straight with BX and pushers, a few rows with contrast yarn, release. D = front neck opening: decrease at right, increase at left, cast off.

**Fig. II, front:** A and B = begin with contrast yarn. Continue in stocking st, decreasing at both ends. C = increase at both ends. After 80 rows make graduations starting from the outside with BX and pushers. D = knit straight. E = divide work. Cast off loosely centre 32 sts. Put sts of right part on dekercomb, continue with sts at left, decreasing at right. F = at left shape shoulder. Knit right part, repeating sections E and F with reversed shapings.

**Fig. III, sleeve:** make two. A = begin with contrast yarn. B = loop pattern with ivory and brown: 6 rows brown, then in pattern acc. to diagram or PASSAP Jac pattern card 58 (41). Finish off pattern border with 6 rows brown. C = after 10 rows start decreasing: at both sides mark 33rd nd with a pusher, from right and left place 1 st onto marked nds. Move triple sts 1 nd inwards. At both sides move sts 2 nds inwards, using dekercomb. At both ends return 2 nds to N.P. Mark triple sts with corresponding pushers, i.e. after each decrease move these pushers 1 nd inwards. D = shape sleeve head. Cast off remaining 26 sts.

**Cuffs:**

Unravel contrast yarn at lower edge of sleeve and place sts back onto nds of machine, placing 2 sts on 1 nd = 66 nds in W.P. Knit 24 rows. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

**Collar:** Two pieces. **First part:** begin with contrast yarn, with 88 sts knit 2 rows with ivory and 6 rows with brown in stocking st, then 18 rows in two-colour-loop pattern acc. to diagram or PASSAP jac pattern card 58 (41), finally 6 rows brown and 30 rows ivory in stocking st. Collar shaping thus: every third row decrease 1 st at both ends 9 times, then increase 1 st every third row, 9 times. A few rows with contrast yarn, release. **Second part:** As first part, starting with 68 sts.

**To make up:**

Block and press all parts. Join shoulder and side seams. Sew collar to neck edge: First part (larger) to front, second part to back of neck, following broken line on diagram and backstitching into open loops, unravelling contrast yarn. Join both parts of collar. Sew collar to inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Join sleeve seams. Fold cuffs to inside and sew down, unravelling contrast yarn. Set in sleeves. Make hem to desired measurement, first pinning and then sewing.

**Second sleeve:** knit with reversed shapings to diagram

**Neck band:**

Cast on with tubular rows in navy blue over 150 nds for 1:1 rib, then knit 2 rows navy blue, 2 rows white. Transfer all sts to front bed, 2 rows stocking stitch in red, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

**To make up:** Block and press all parts

Graft sts of centre back together (section C of sleeves), unravelling contrast yarn. Sew neck band to neck opening, st by st, backstitching into the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. Sew first skirt part to sleeves with red, matching arrows, st by st, backstitching into the open loops, at front tack neck opening together at section D, matching dots and attach second skirt part, st by st, in same way, unravelling contrast yarn. Join side and sleeve seams. Hem 8 rows of each sleeve to inside, make skirt hem to desired length. Press hems and seams.

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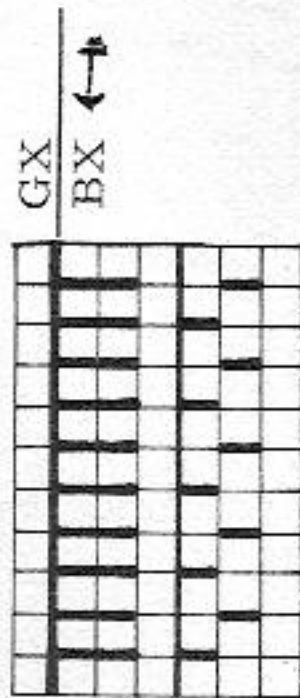

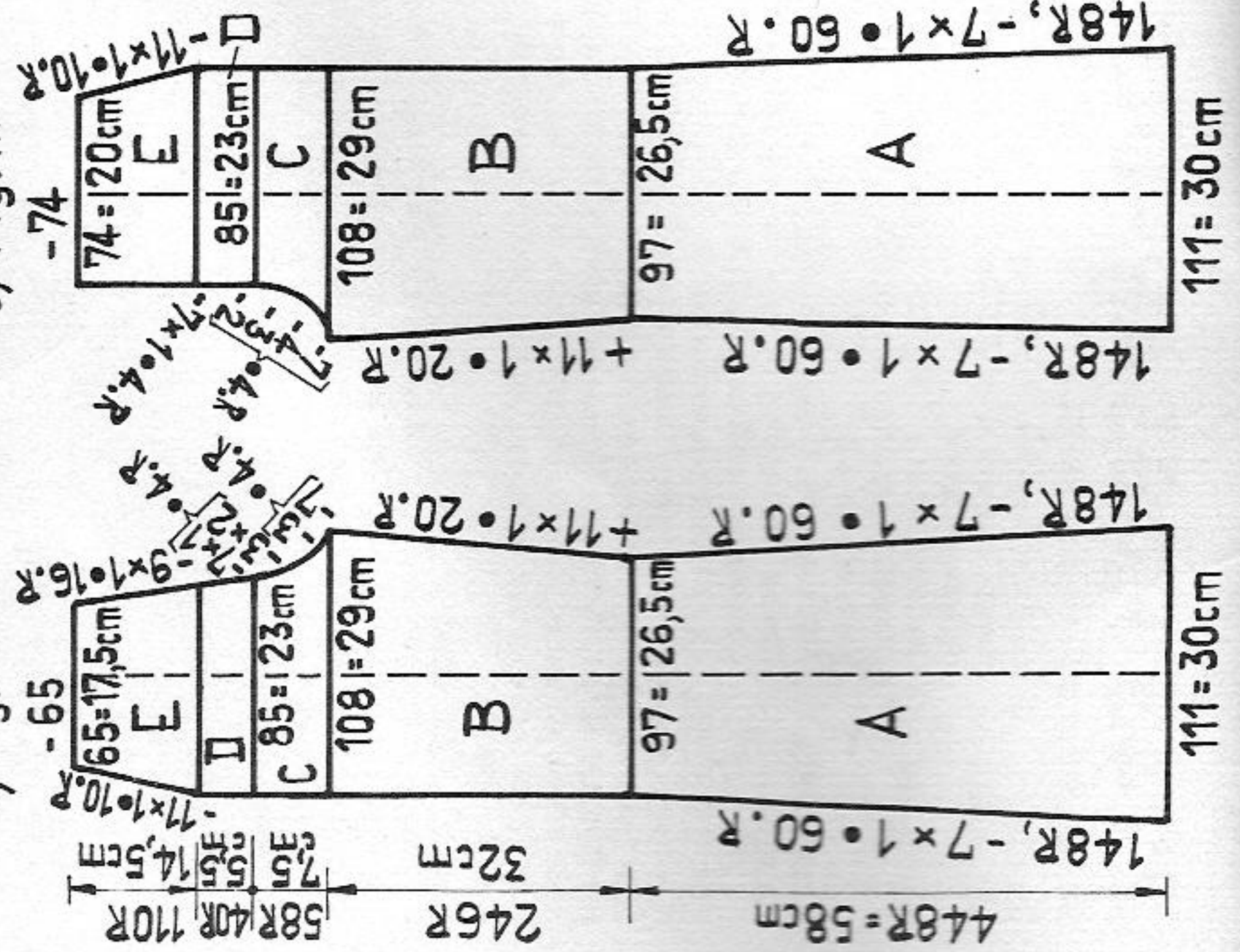

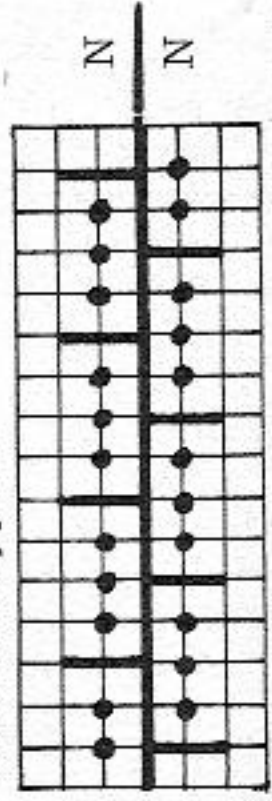

Slip these double sts one through the other, so that only 1 st remains on each nd. Counting from the right, knit second through third stitch. Place this stitch on to second nd. Knit first through second st and place this stitch on to 8th nd on front bed. Make 4 more buttonholes as before with 50 sts between each buttonhole. Knit 1 row, twist zig-zag thread on each nd. This kind of buttonhole does not need finishing.

**To make up:**  
Block and press all parts. Join side, shoulder and sleeve seams. Set in sleeves. Oversew edge of pocket inside. Sew buttonhole band to right front and neck, and button-band to left front and neck, backstitching into the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. At back of neck graft sts of both bands together. Sew on buttons.

Knit 1st stitch through 2nd stitch and place stitch obtained onto 4th stitch of remaining sts on front bed. Miss 28 sts (14 front, 14 back) and make 2nd buttonhole as first. Knit 6 buttonholes at intervals of 28 sts. Knit 1 row and twist zig-zag thread on empty nds at back and front. After 12 rows in K/K, lock CX/CX, St.S 4, knit 12 rows, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Button band: Knit as for buttonhole band but without buttonholes.

To make up:

Join shoulder, side and sleeve seams. Join bands with mattress stitch, press contrast yarn and with buttonholes at right, first attach to centre front and neck opening, backstitching into the open loops and sew to inside, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Sew on buttons, set in sleeves.

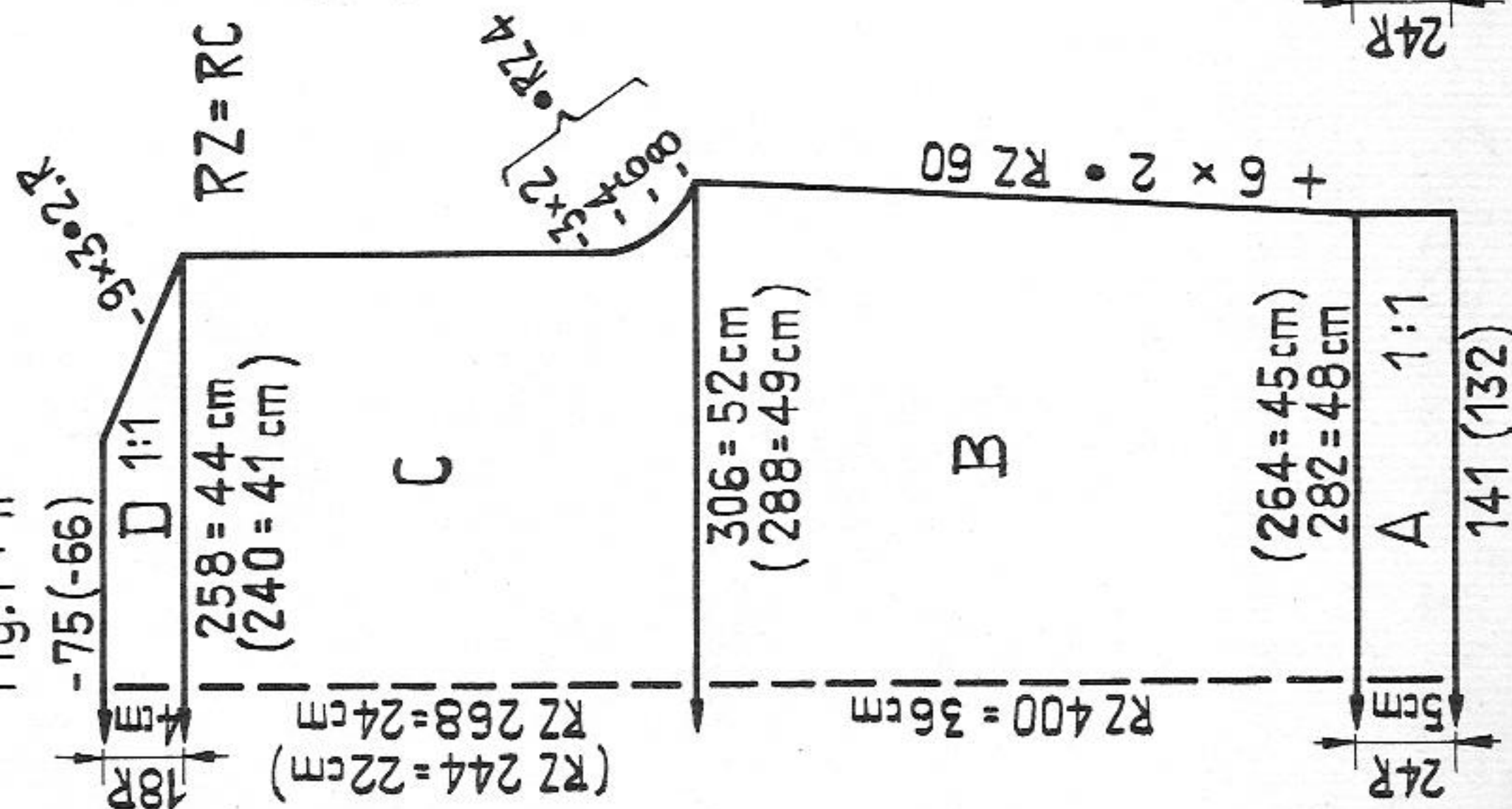

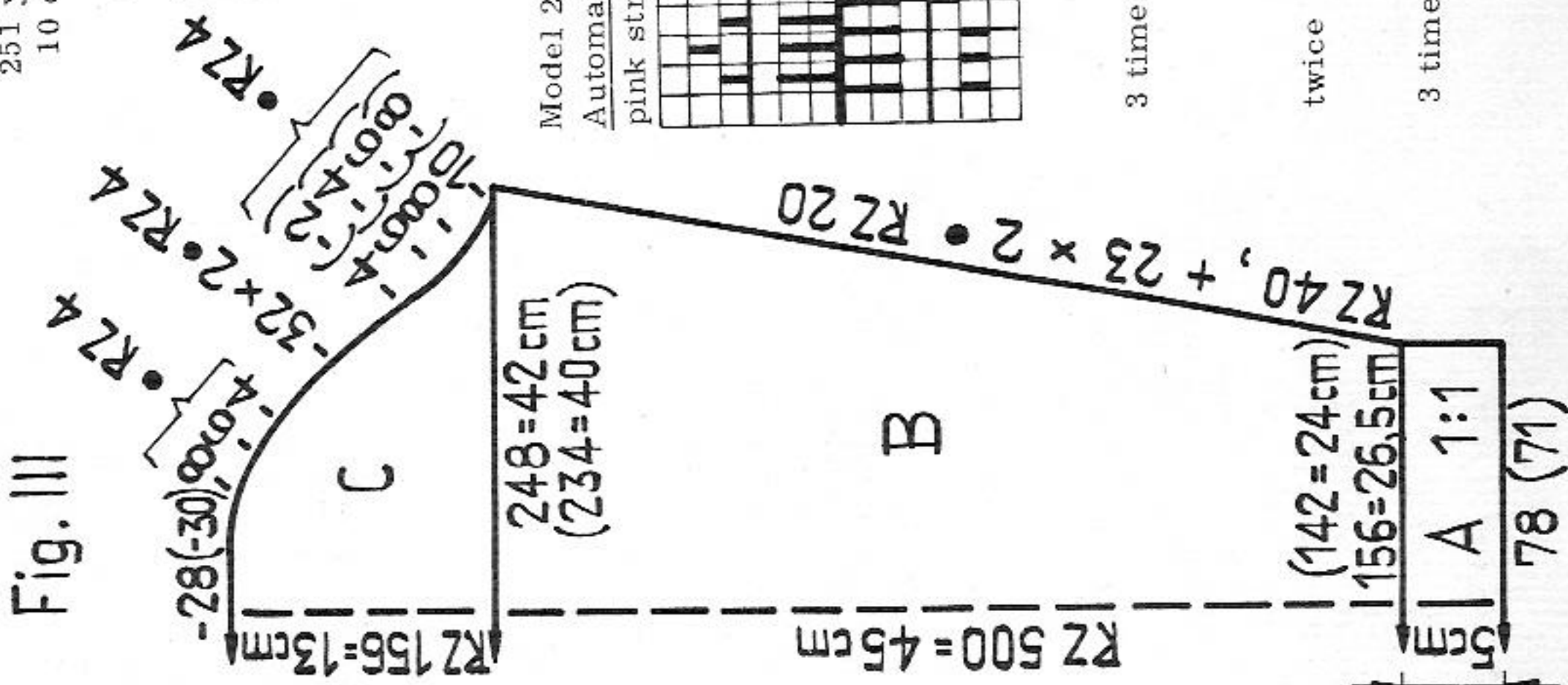

**Stitch size:** Fairisle 3, 1:1 rib in two-fold yarn 2 1/2  
**Test square:** 100 sts = 17 cm (6 3/4"), RC 200 = 18 cm (7")  
**Pattern:** Pullover in fairisle pattern acc. to diagram, plain borders in 1:1 rib with two-fold yarn

**Fig. I + II:** Knit two equal parts

A = 2210 green, 2211 navy blue. Cast on with tubular rows in 1:1 division, knit straight. B = put all nds into W.P. On front bed place the purlstitch loop of the following nd onto each empty nd. Knit in fairisle pattern acc. to diagram. Increase at both ends. C = in pattern. Shape armholes, then knit straight. D = transfer sts for 1:1 rib border (always 2 sts onto 1 nd), plain as for border. Shape shoulders. Cast off very loosely.

**Fig. III:**

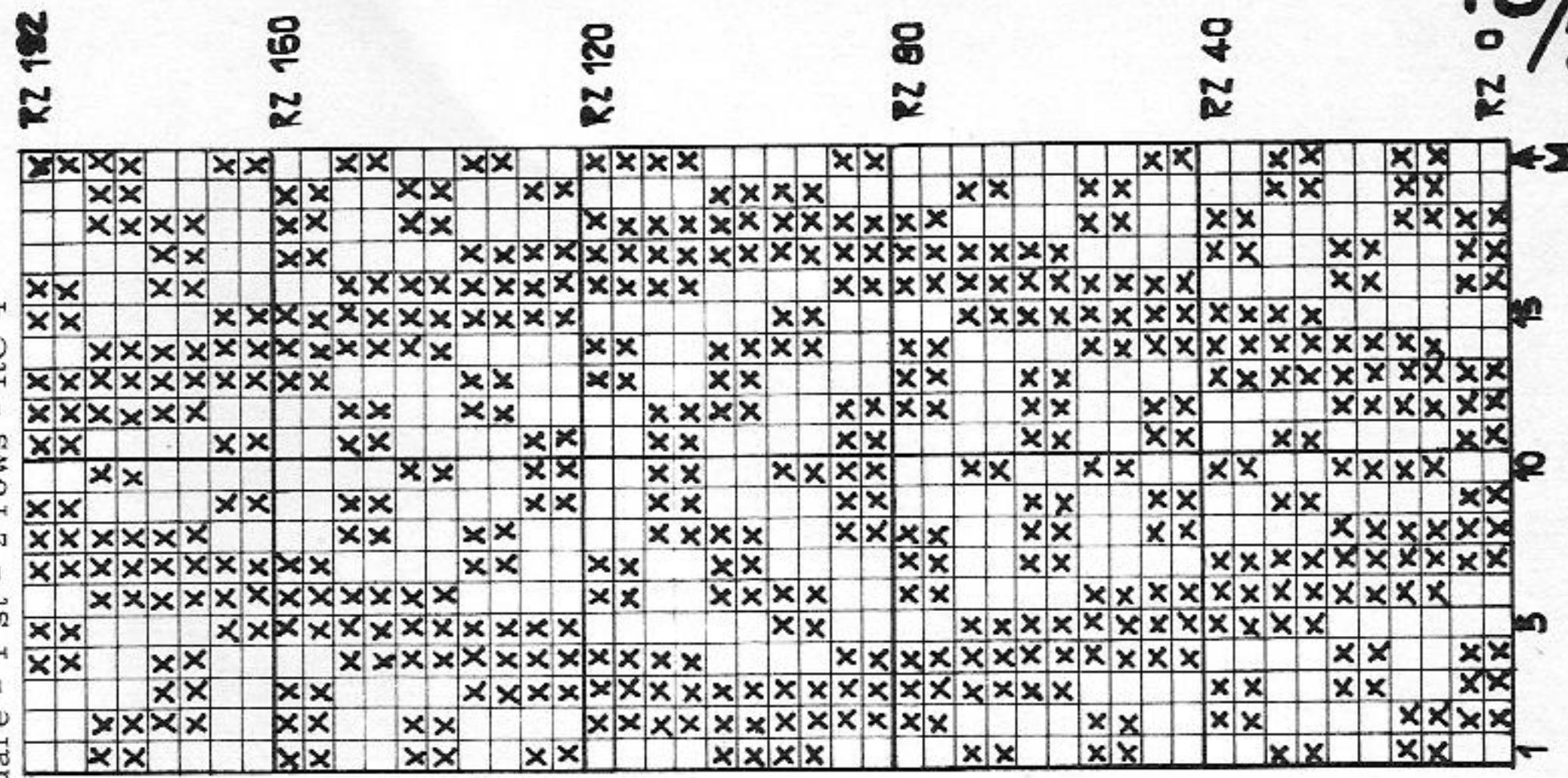
A = 1:1 rib border as for Fig. I + II. B = in pattern, increase at both ends. C = in pattern, shape sleeve head, cast off.

To make up:

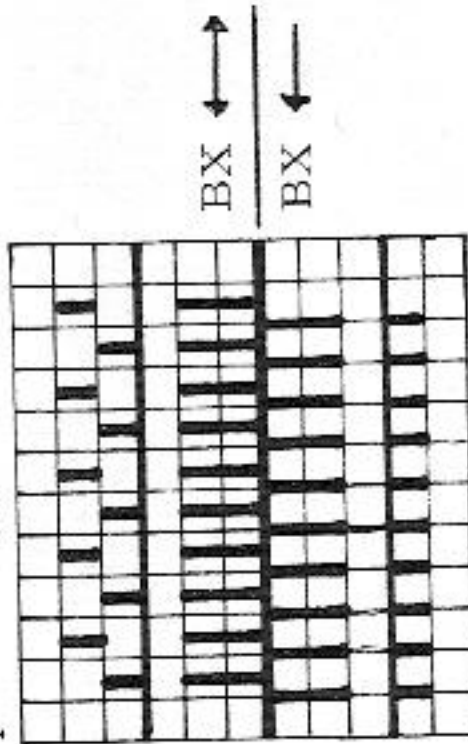
Join shoulder, side and sleeve seams, set in sleeves.

**Pattern:**

Dress in "long stitch" pattern, hem stocking stitch, tubular. COMBI "long stitch" instead of CX set lock to R, for graduations leave ends in R.P.

**Fig. I:**

A = stocking stitch, tubular. B = "long stitch" pattern = set lock at front to CX, at back to N. Decrease at both ends with triple decker. C = decrease at both ends with triple decker. D = knit straight. E = shape armholes. F = increase at both ends. G = shape shoulders, cast off.

**Fig. II:** right front

A = stocking stitch, tubular. B = "long stitch" pattern = set lock at front to CX, at back to N, at right knit straight, at left decrease with triple decker. C = at right cast off 4 sts, at left decrease with triple decker. D = knit straight. E = at extreme right shape neck opening, at left shape armhole, F = continue decreasing at right, increase at extreme left. G = at right knit straight, at left shape shoulder. Left front : knit acc. to diagram, but set lock at front to N, at back to CX.

**Fig. III:** right sleeve

A = cast on with tubular rows, then set lock at front to CX, back to N (cuff). B = set lock at front to N, back to CX, knit straight. Cast off 94 sts at both ends. C = saddle shoulder : knit straight. D = decrease at right, at left knit straight. Left sleeve : Knit acc. to diagram, but at A set lock at front to N, at back to CX, then lock front CX, back N.

**Collar:** Begin with contrast yarn. At front put 1 additional row into W.P. contrary to needle rule. A = stocking stitch, tubular. B = set lock at front to CX, at back to N. Decrease at both ends with double decker. C = first collar point with graduations : right front 57 pushers in R.P., back 57 pushers in W.P., set lock at back to BX 0, front to BX 1, knit 2 rows, then put 3 pushers each on front and back bed within blocking rail, knit 2 rows, etc. For the second collar point put 57 pushers on back bed into W.P., at front 57 pushers into R.P., lock is at right : knit 1 row, then put at right on front and back bed 3 pushers each within blocking rail, knit 2 rows, etc. Finally 1 row N/N. D = transfer all sts for stocking stitch to front bed, with St.S 4 1/2 knit 3 rows, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

**To make up:** Block and press all parts. Join sleeves with saddle shoulders to back and front parts, matching dots, circles and arrows, then join sleeve and side seams, leaving seam on outside for sleeve cuff. First sew collar at section A to outside of neck opening, st by st, backstitching into the open loops, then catch down on inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Make seam at edge of collar (D) st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Graft sts of centre front together, catching 4 sts at a time into the seam and insert zip from C to D.



# 2214+2215 PASSAP-DUOMATIC \*

2214 Raglan pullover with plain sleeves

Size: to fit an 88 cm bust

Material: 9 ozs medium wool

Stitch size: Stocking stitch =  $4\frac{3}{4}$ , 2:2 rib =  $2\frac{3}{4}$

COMBI stocking stitch =  $4\frac{1}{2}$ , 2:2 rib =  $2\frac{1}{2}$ , tension arm  $4\frac{1}{2}$ , yarn brake  $3\frac{1}{2}$

Test square: 100 sts = 31,5 cm ( $12\frac{1}{2}$ "), 100 rows = 22,5 cm ( $8\frac{3}{4}$ ")

Pattern: Stocking stitch, borders in 2:2 rib.

Fig. I:

A = borders in 2:2 rib: cast on with tubular rows, knit straight. B = transfer sts for stocking stitch to front bed. Increase at both ends. C = shape armholes, shape raglan with triple decker. Cast off.

Fig. II:

A + B = as for Fig. I, increase acc. to diagram. C = divide work with BX and pushers, at right shape neck opening, at left make bust darts from outside with graduations, then knit straight. D = at right neck opening, at left first decrease for armhole, then shape raglan with triple decker. Knit second side with reversed shapings.

Fig. III: right sleeve acc. to diagram.

A = cast-on and border in 2:2 rib with 114 nds as for Fig. I. B = stocking stitch, increase at both ends. C = shape armholes acc. to diagram, at right knit straight, at left decrease with triple decker. D = at right knit straight, at left continue decreasing with triple decker. Decrease at centre as follows: counting from right mark the 32nd and 33rd nd with 1 pusher each, then every alternate row from both

sides move all sts with deckercombs 1 nd inwards onto marked nds. E = at extreme right decrease 1 stitch every row (front neck opening), at left continue decreasing with triple decker, cast off.

Left sleeve: knit with reversed shapings to diagram.

Neck band: 2:2 rib

With 190 nds cast on with tubular rows, then knit 22 rows, increasing 1 stitch 20 times at both ends in every row. Transfer all sts for stocking stitch to front bed, 1 row stocking stitch, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up: block and press all parts.

Join sleeves to front and back with mattress stitch, then join side and sleeve seams. Sew neck band to neck opening, st by st, backstitching into the open loops, join at front with backstitch.

2215 Raglan pullover with puff sleeves

(Size and material as for back (Fig. I) front (Fig. II) Model No 2214)

Fig. III: right sleeve, stocking stitch

A = begin with contrast yarn, knit 8 rows, counting from outside mark every 31st and 32nd nd with corresponding pusher, place 1 stitch from both sides onto marked nds, then move all sts inwards with deckercombs. Mark all double sts again with pushers. Repeat this decrease 7 times. B = at right shape armhole, then decrease with triple decker. At left shape raglan with triple decker. C = decrease at both ends with triple decker acc. to diagram. D = decrease at extreme right for neck opening, continue decreasing at left with triple decker.

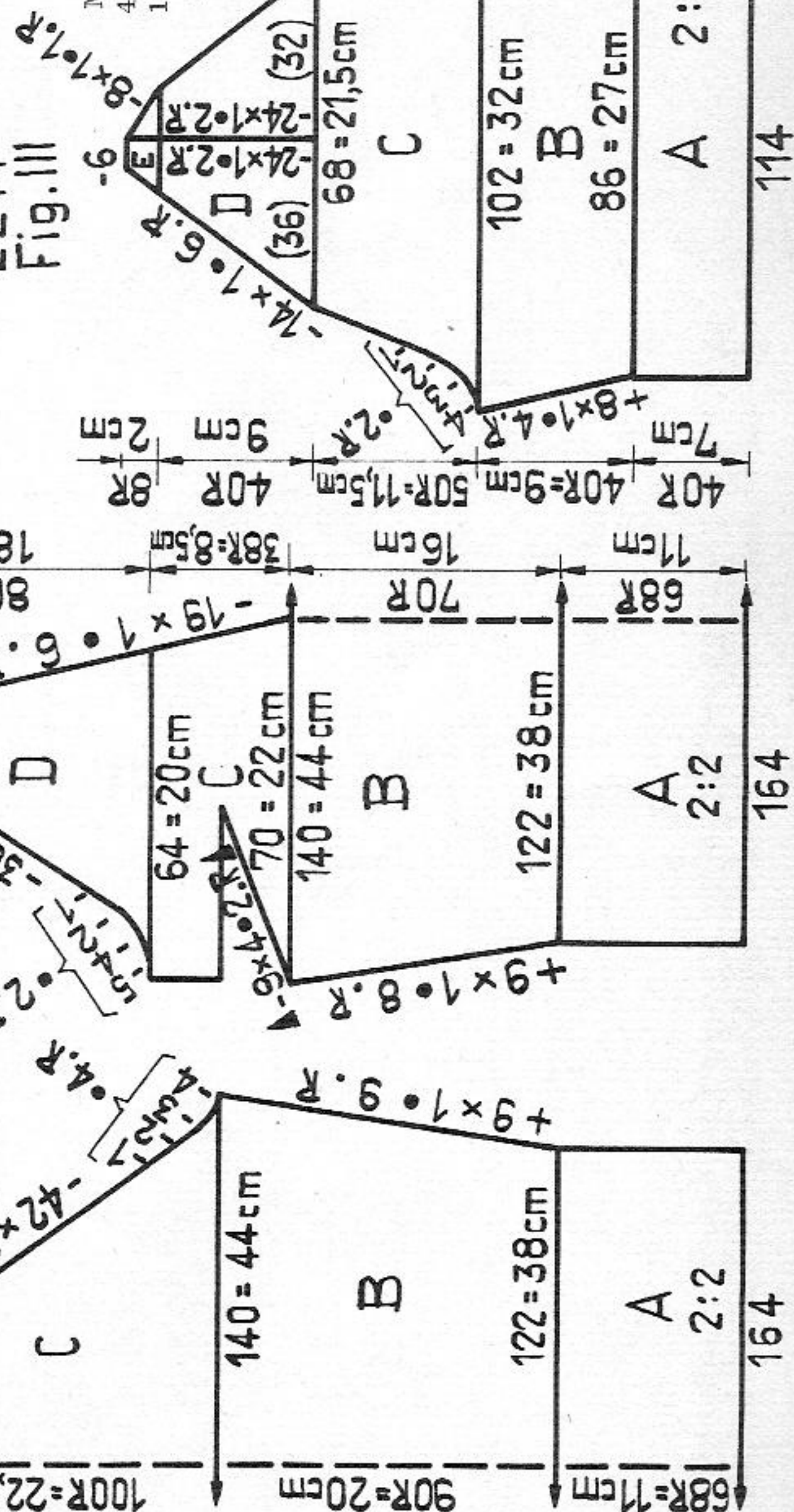
Left sleeve: knit with reversed shapings to diagram.

Sleeve bands: Stocking stitch

Unravel the contrast yarn on sleeves and place the loose sts onto nds of machine, reducing to 82 sts as follows: at both ends put 1 stitch onto 1 needle twice and 2 sts each onto the remaining 78 nds. Knit 16 rows, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

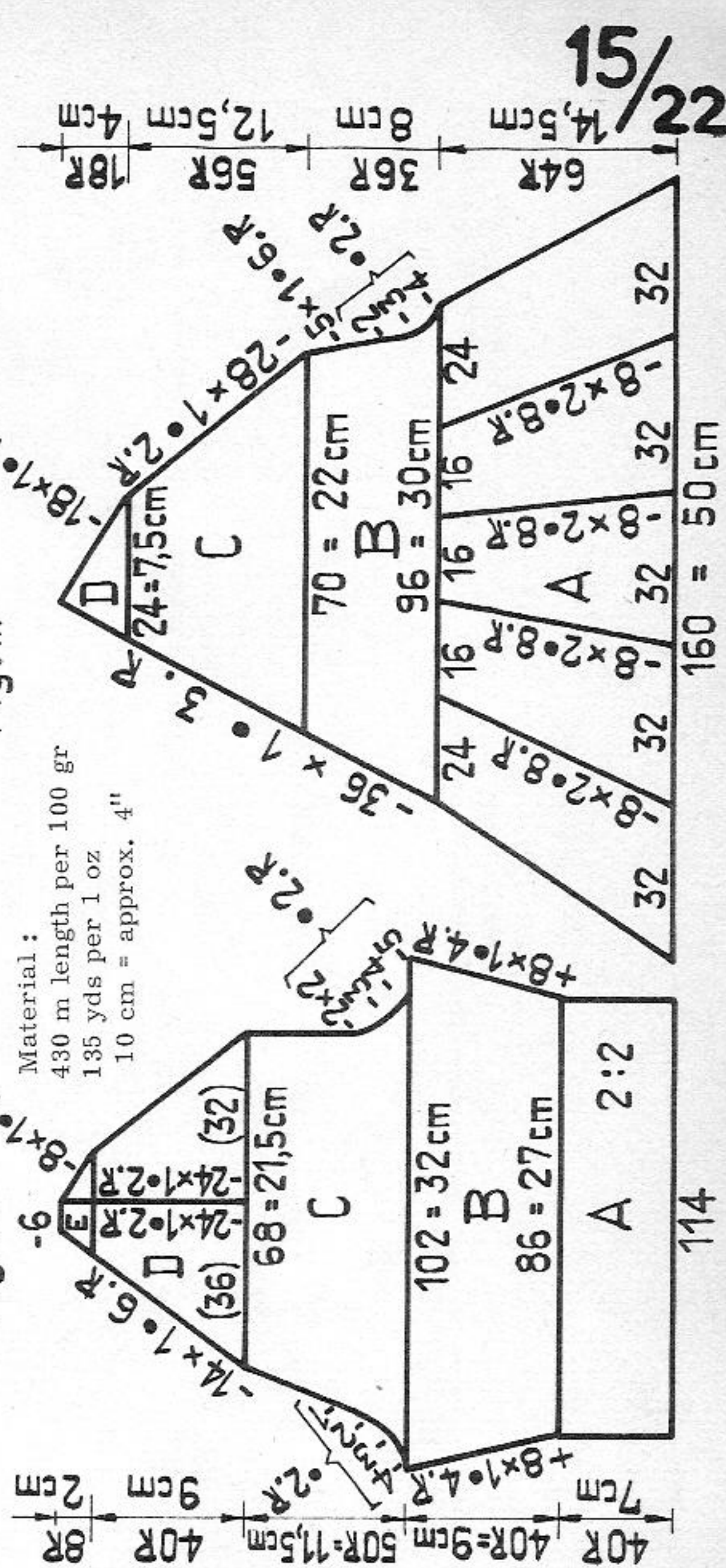

Test square : 100 sts (every alternate nd) = 50 cm (19 3/4"), 100 rows (RC 200) = 34 cm (13 1/2")

Pattern: Stocking stitch, knitted with every alternate nd, purlside outwards, borders in 1:1 rib.

Fig. I: Half tubular, open at right, knitted with every alternate nd. A = begin with contrast yarn, decrease at right back and front bed with quintuple decker. B = continue decreasing at right back and front. C = at right back and front shape shoulders, cast off loosely.

Fig. Ia + IIa, right side panel with saddle shoulder

A = begin with contrast yarn. Stocking stitch with every alternate nd. Decrease at both ends with quintuple decker. B = continue decreasing with quintuple decker. C = saddle shoulder, knit straight. D = at right cast off, at left knit straight.

Left side panel: as for right panel, but knit section D with reversed shapings.

Fig. II: left front

A = begin with contrast yarn. Stocking stitch with every alternate nd. At right knit straight, at left decrease with quintuple decker. B = at right knit straight, at left continue decreasing. C = at right cast off 7 sts loosely, then shape neck opening, at left continue decreasing with quintuple decker. D = at right knit straight, at left shape shoulder.

Right front: knit with reversed shapings to diagram.

Borders: Cast on 18 sts in 1:1 rib, knit 314 rows with St.S5. Knit the first corner with BX and pushers as follows : for each nd which is knitting put 1 pusher into W.P. on back and front bed, set lock to BX. At left, back and front bed, put 1 pusher into R.P., knit 2 rows, repeat 6 times, then 7 times from right put 1 pusher each into W.P., knit 2 rows until all nds are knitting again. After 120 rows straight make the second corner as previously, then knit 314 rows straight, cast off.

To make up: Block and press all parts on the right side. Join the side panels with the longer edge of saddle shoulder facing the back, to back and front parts. At front leave slits open for the hands between both arrows. Work 1 row of single crochet along edges of slits. Make a 4 cm hem and catch down on inside, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Join border to centre front and neck opening, using backstitches. If desired, sew one or two hook and eye fasteners to neck opening. Press seams and hem.

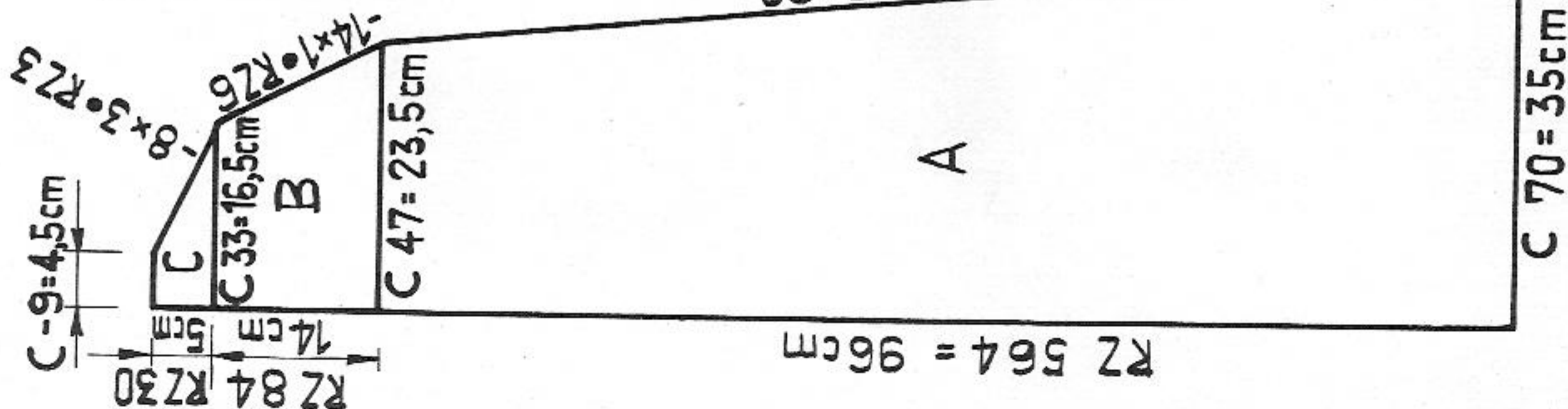

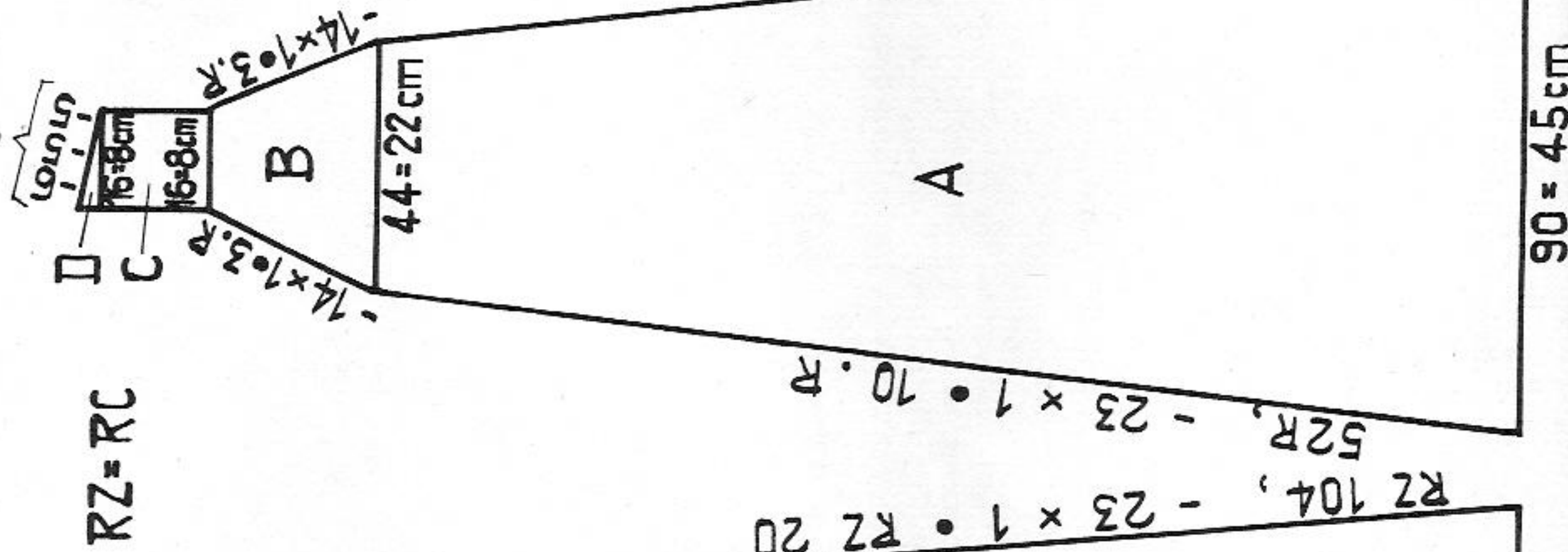
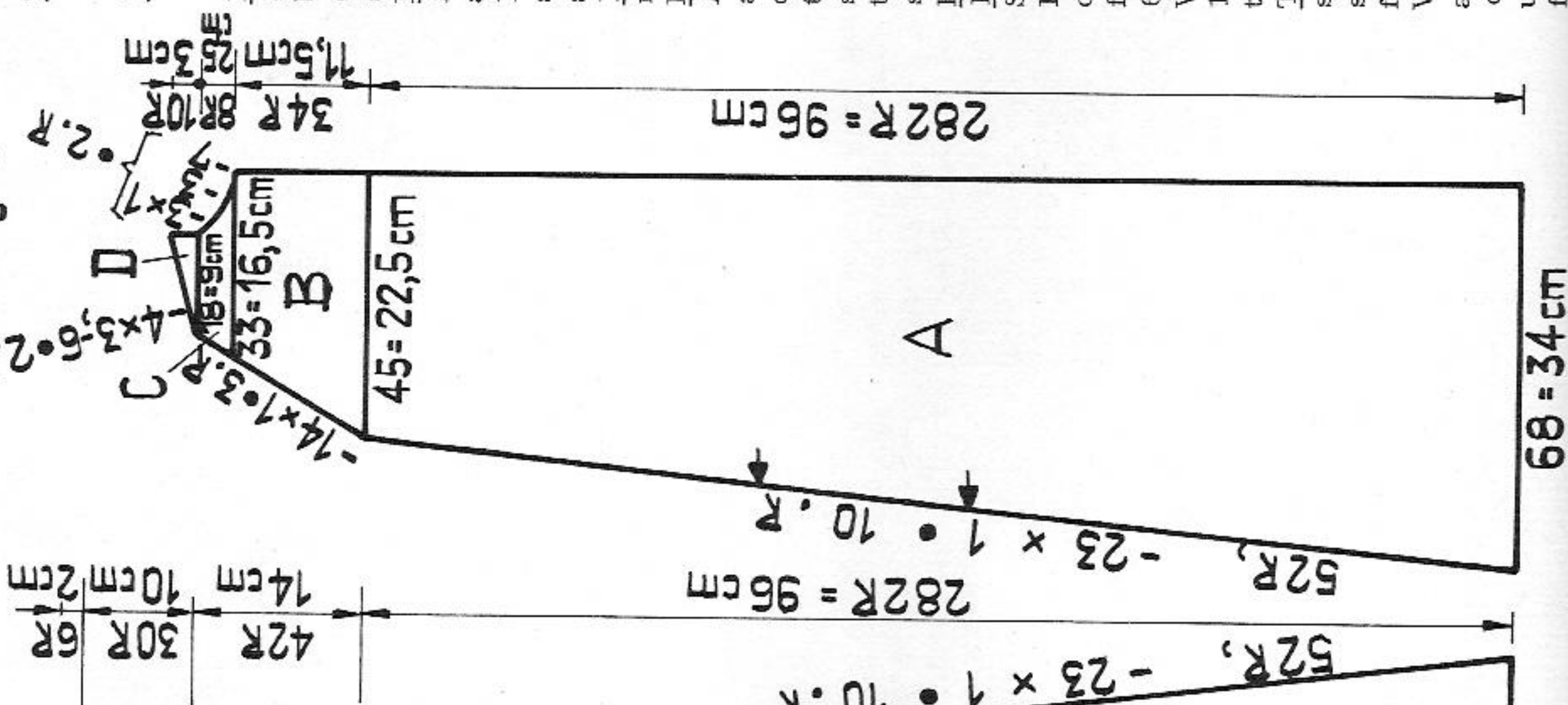

Size : to fit an 84 (88) cm bust. Where there is only one indication on diagram this is same for both sizes.

Material : 350 (380) gr sports wool

Stitch size : Stocking stitch = 7, 1:1 rib = 4

COMBI : Stocking stitch = 6 3/4,

1:1 rib = 3 3/4 tension arm 8, yarn

brake 3 1/2

Test square : 100 sts = 43 cm (17"), 100 rows (RC

200) = 30 cm (11 3/4")

Pattern : Stocking stitch, half tubular and tubu-

lar, all borders in 1:1 rib.

Fig. I + II : 1/2 front and 1/2 back knitted in one piece

1st part :

A = centre back. Begin with contrast yarn on back bed. With 98 (100) sts, knit 24 rows straight. Knit a few rows with contrast yarn to protect wool and leave on nds of machine. B = on front bed knit at least 20 rows with contrast yarn over 98 (100) sts, then work neck opening with original yarn acc. to diagram, immediately making graduations with BX and pushers from inside. C = half tubular, open at right : at section A unravel contrast yarn and knit back and front together. At right knit straight, at left, back and front, decrease with double decker. D = decrease at extreme right, back and front bed (shaping of kimono sleeves), at left continue decreasing with double decker. E = sleeves, tubular. At right knit straight, at left continue decreasing. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

2nd part : as for 1st part, but knit section A on front bed and section B on back bed.

Fig. IV : roll collar with insert.

A = cast on with tubular rows for 1:1 rib, knit straight. B = at right cast off 88 sts loosely, then decrease at both ends acc. to diagram.

Waist band : knit two equal parts.

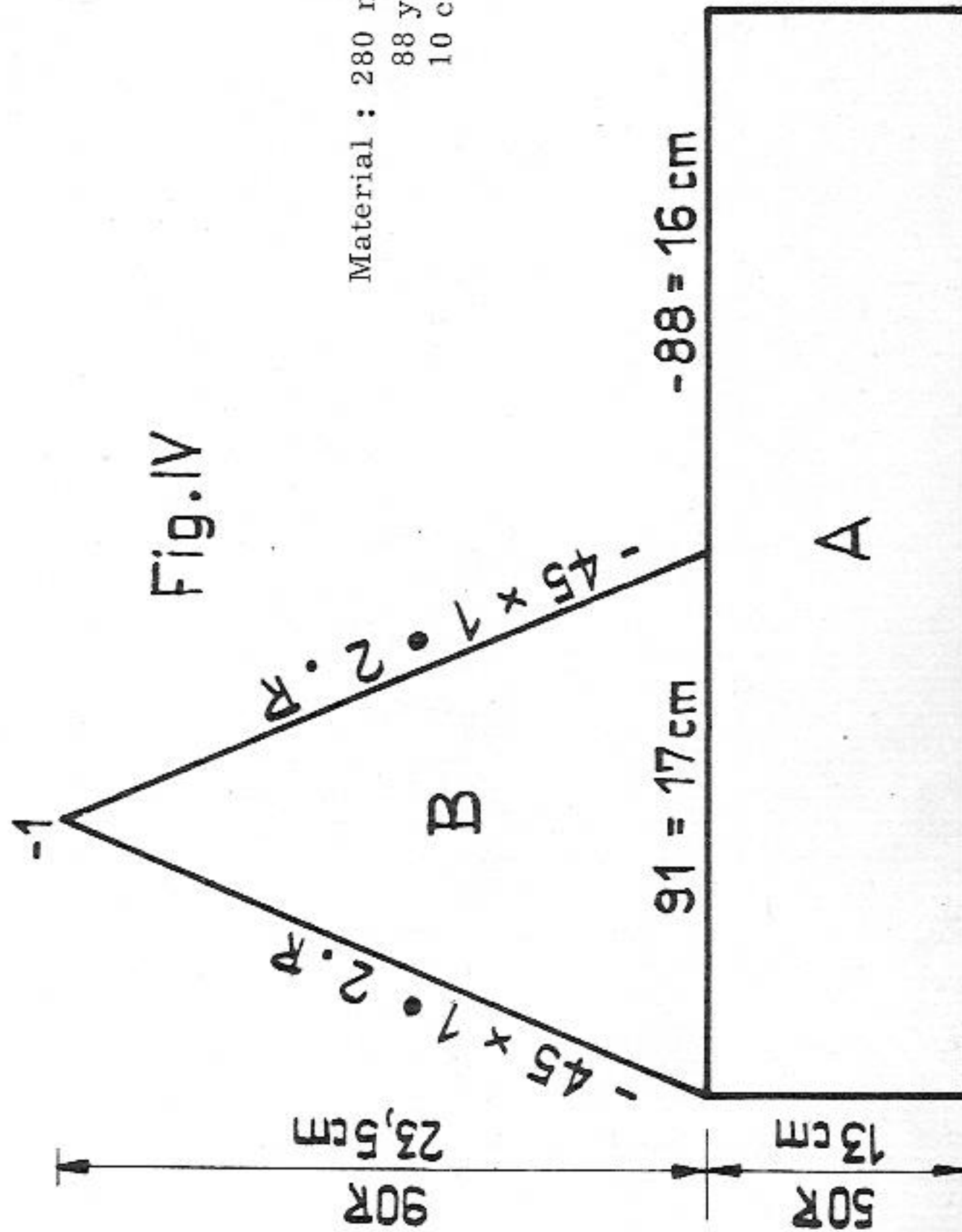
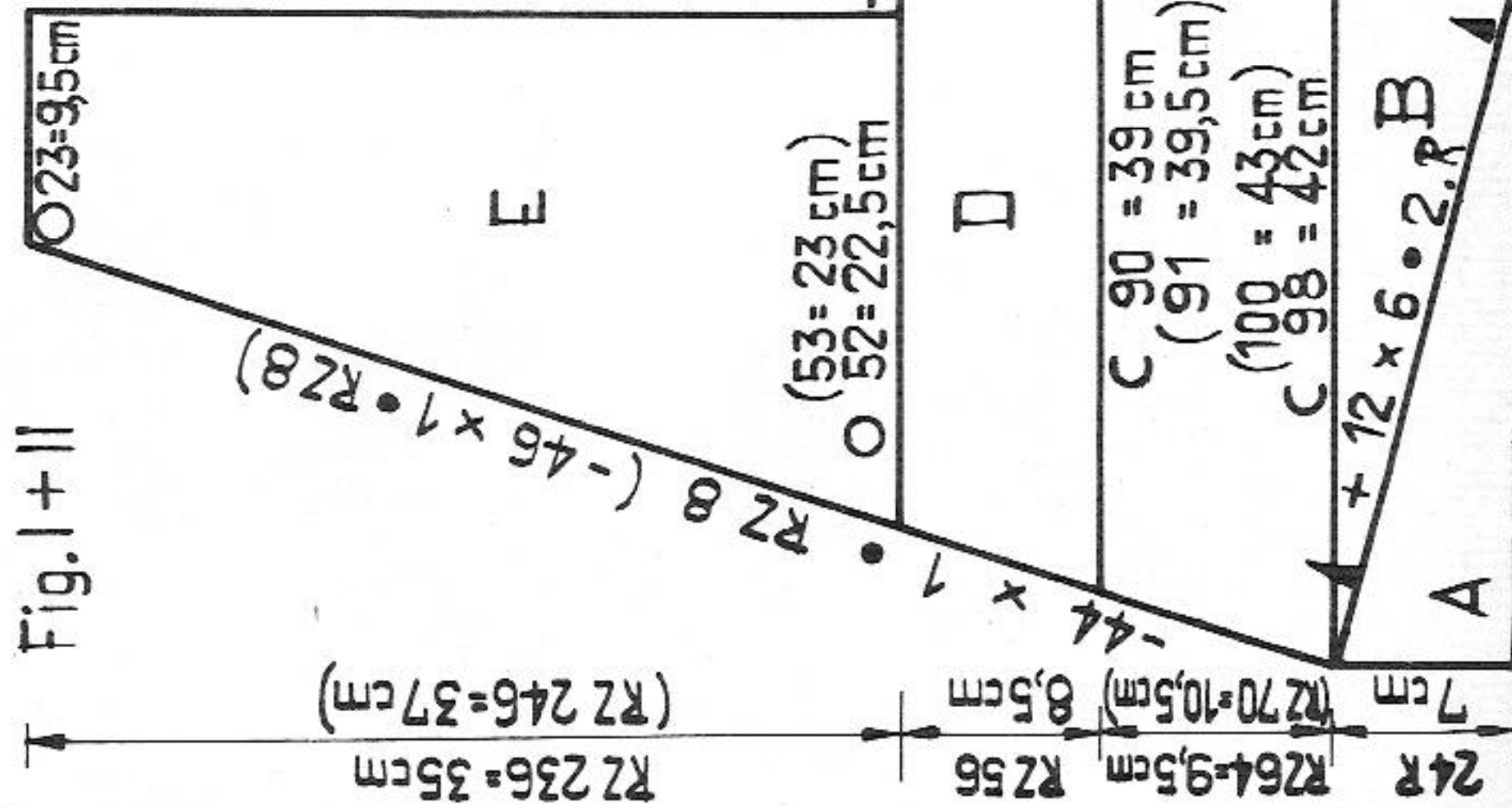
With 110 nds cast on with tubular rows for 1:1 rib, knit 40 rows, then transfer all sts for stocking stitch to front bed, knit 1 row stocking stitch, St.S 7, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Sleeve bands : knit twice

With 48 nds knit 30 rows as for waist band, release.

To make up : Press parts lightly

Graft sts of centre back and the 26 sts at centre front together, unravelling contrast yarn. Join edges of V-neck (B) with the edges of insert, st by st, backstitching into the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. Join collar with mattress stitch and attach to cast off 88 sts somewhat lower at the back. Graft sts of sleeve bands together with sleeves, unravelling contrast yarn, then join together with mattress stitch in such a way that they can be folded back.

**Test square:** 100 sts = 45 cm (17¾"), 100 rows = 31 cm (12¼")  
**Pattern:** Stocking stitch with graduations, purlside outwards  
**Fig. VII + VIII:** knitted in one piece. Begin and end with contrast yarn. A = stocking stitch. Only knit 10 rows for the first section A, for each of the following knit 20 rows acc. to diagram. B = make graduations from outside with BX and pushers as follows: put all pushers into W.P., knit 1 row, at right put 13 pushers into R.P., knit 1 row, at right put 1 pusher back into W.P., knit 1 row, at right put 13 pushers into R.P., knit 1 row, put 1 pusher back into W.P., knit 1 row, etc. Knit sections A + B another 13 times, then 10 rows stocking stitch, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

**To make up:** pin out skirt to size and press on right side. Graft sts of side seams together, unravelling contrast yarn. At waist turn 2 cm to inside and catch down. Insert waist band. Make approx. 4 cm hem. Press.

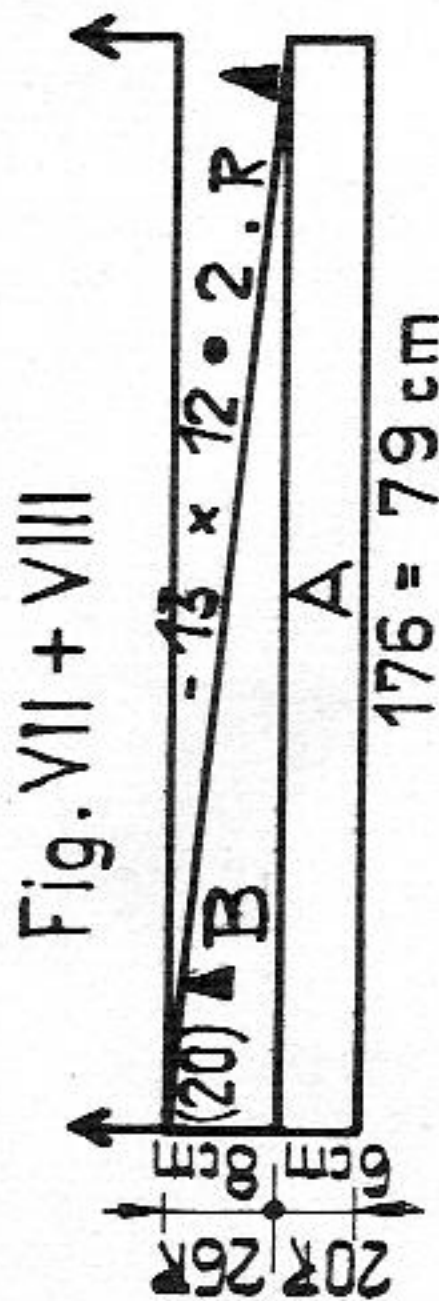

# T 2158 PASSAP-DUOMATIC

## T 2158 Hat in carpet pattern

With medium weight dralon cast on 130 sts for 1:1 rib. With St.S 2¾ knit 26 rows. Transfer all sts to back bed, on front bed put all nds into W.P. and knit RC 240 in carpet pattern: set lock at back to EX at front to CX, St.S at back to 3½, at front to 2. Transfer sts for 1:1 rib and knit 20 rows in 1:1 rib. Break off yarn and thread through sts. Make seam, then draw up sts and fasten off.

# 2219 Jacket

## Fig. I: begin with contrast yarn

A = hem, stocking stitch. Knit with plain blue wool. B = "long stitch" pattern: set lock at front to CX, at back to N. With blue/pink wool. After 16 rows decrease at both ends with 24 deckercomb. C = increase at both ends. D = shape armholes, then knit straight. E = shape shoulders, cast off.

## Fig. II: right front

A = hem as for Fig. I. B = "long stitch" pattern blue/pink. At right knit straight, at left decrease with 24 deckercomb. C = decrease at extreme right, increase at extreme left. After 88 rows make bust dart at left, beginning from outside as follows: Set lock at back to BX 0, put all pushers into W.P., front BX ←→, put all pushers into R. P. At extreme left put 4 pushers on front bed and 3 pushers on back bed within blocking rail, knit 2 rows. On front bed put 3, on back bed 4 pushers within blocking rail, knit 2 rows, etc., until 18 rows have been knitted for bust dart. At the same time continue decreasing at right. Put all pushers within blocking rail, set lock at front to CX, at back to N, continue decreasing at right, at left knit straight. D = at right continue decreasing, at left armhole, then knit straight. E = at right knit straight, at left shape shoulder.

## Left front: knit with reversed shapings to diagram.

## Fig. III:

A = hem as for Fig. I. B = "long stitch" pattern blue/pink. Increase at both ends. C = shape sleeve head, cast off.

## Fig. IV: cross over collar in two parts. Cast-on = outer edge.

A = cast on with tubular rows, "long stitch" pattern with BX and pushers: set lock at back to BX 0, put all pushers into W.P., set lock at front to BX ←→, put all pushers into R.P. Make graduations as follows: knit 1 row, at right, front bed, put 1 pusher, at back 2 pushers within blocking rail, knit 2 rows, at right front 2 pushers, at back 1 pusher within blocking rail, knit 2 rows, etc. After 30 rows decrease at left with 24 deckercomb, putting pushers within blocking rail. B = stocking stitch: 4 rows on front bed, set lock at front to N, back to GX, knit 4 rows on back bed, set lock at front to GX, back to N, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

## 2nd part as first part, but set lock at back to BX ←→, front to BX 0.

**To make up:** Block and press on the right side. Join side, shoulder and sleeve seams, set in sleeves. Join collar at centre back with mattress stitch, then begin at waist, first sew to outside of opening st by st, backstitching into the open loops, then catch down on inside st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Catch down jacket and sleeve hems st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Cross over right and left front parts of jacket at a width of approx. 10 cm and sew a large press stud to the beginning of collar. For tie belt knit a tube with 20 sts in desired length. Graft both ends together.  
 Pleated skirt

## Fig. VII + VIII a: begin and end with contrast yarn.

A = blue knitted double, 12 rows stocking stitch. B = on back bed put 150 nds into W.P., with blue/pink knit 23 rows, set lock at front to CX, at back to N, 1 row, N/N, transfer all sts to front bed. C = pink, knitted double, 12 rows stocking stitch. Repeat this sequence another 21 times, the last time knitting only 11 rows pink, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

## Fig. VII + VIII b: blue/pink knit two equal parts, begin with contrast yarn.

A = 6 rows stocking stitch on front bed, set lock at front to N, at back to GX, 6 rows stocking stitch on back bed. Lock front GX, back N. B = "Long stitch" pattern. Decrease at both ends with 24 deckercomb. C = waist hem: transfer all sts for stocking stitch to front bed, knit 24 rows, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

**To make up:** Before folding pleats press the skirt firmly on the right side, then fold pleats, tack and press again. Graft together with pink wool, unravelling contrast yarn. Join the upper part of skirt together with mattress stitch and then only attach to pleated skirt st by st, backstitching into the open loops and catch down on inside, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Catch down waist hem st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Insert elastic waist band.

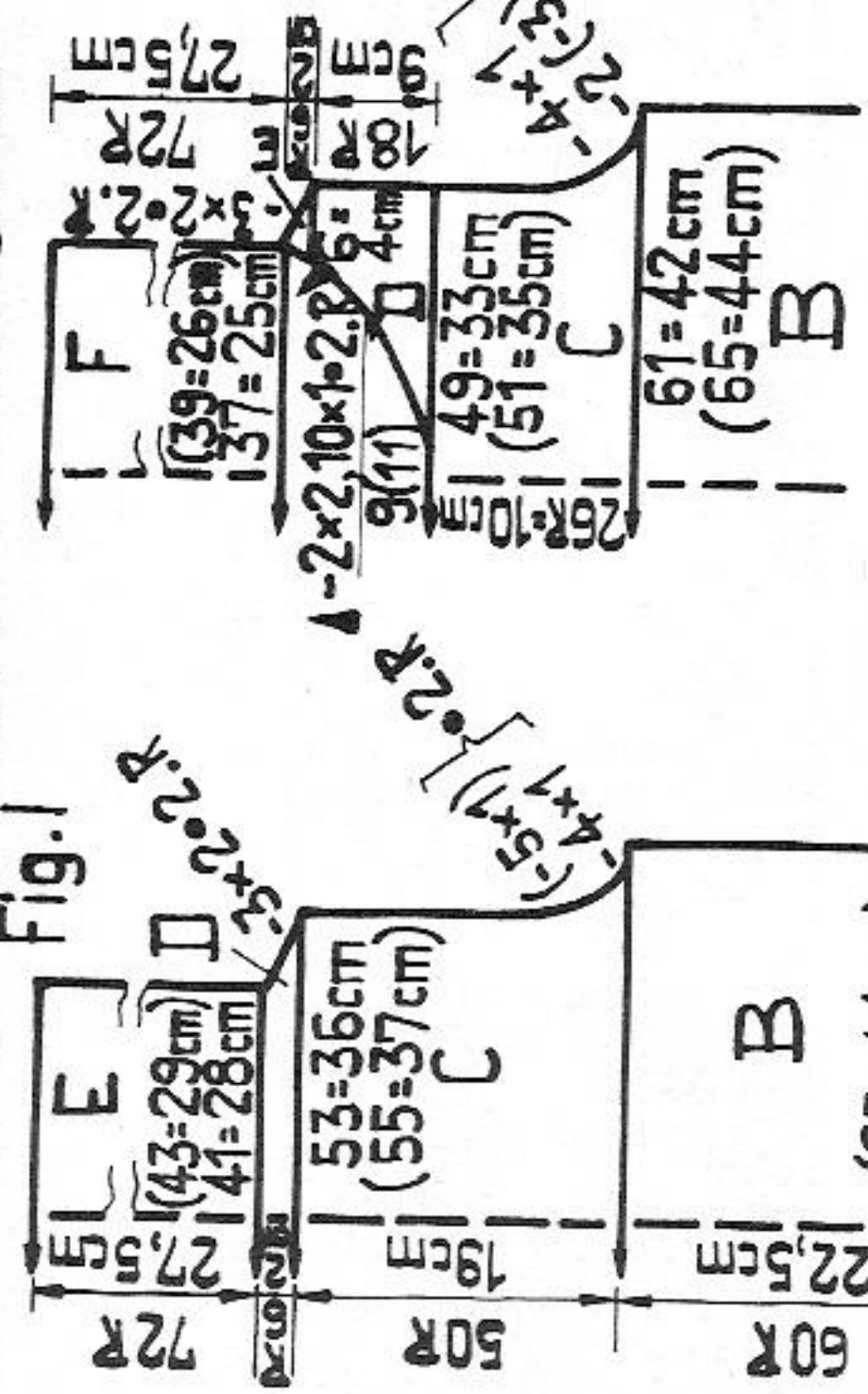

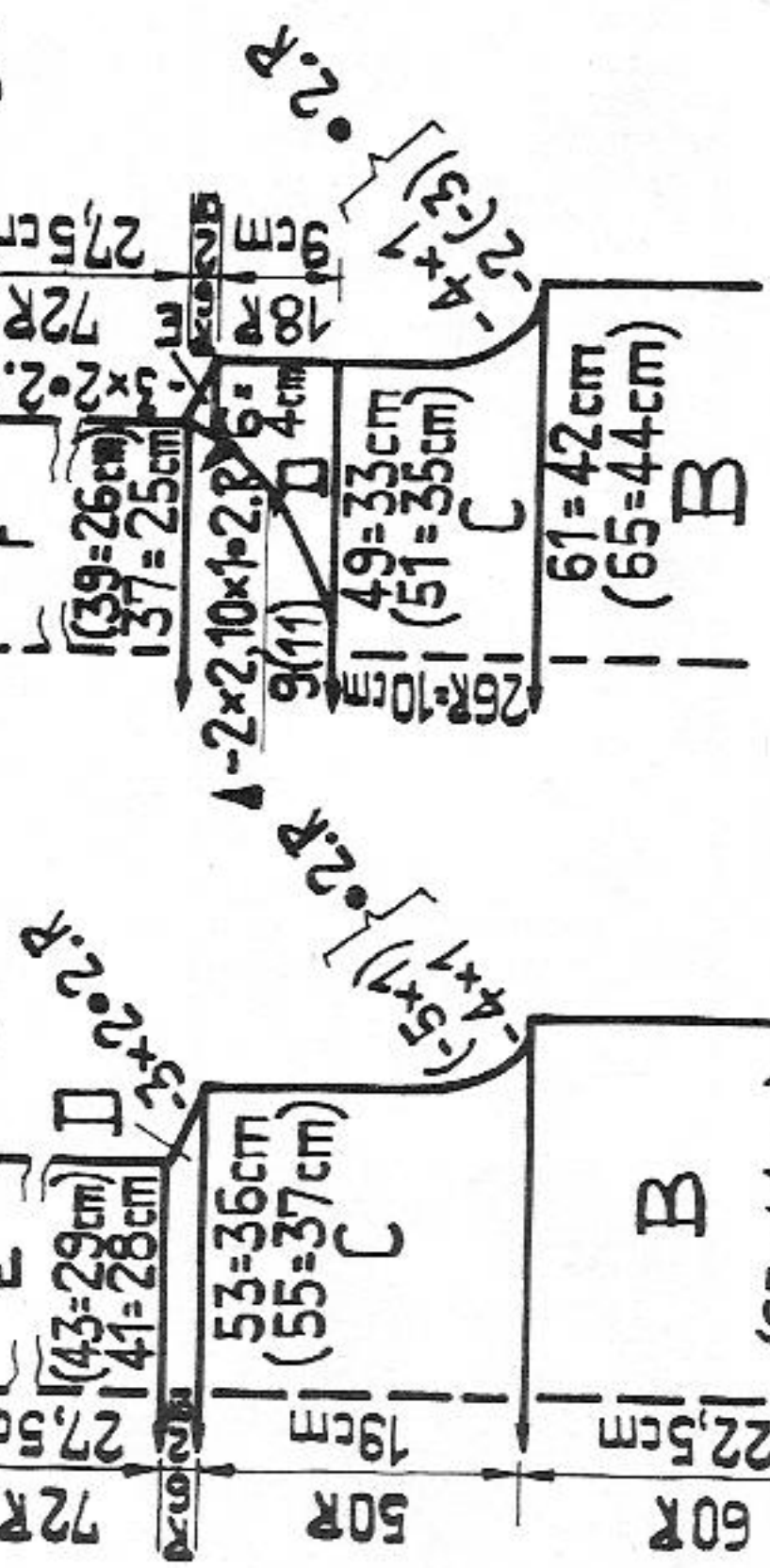
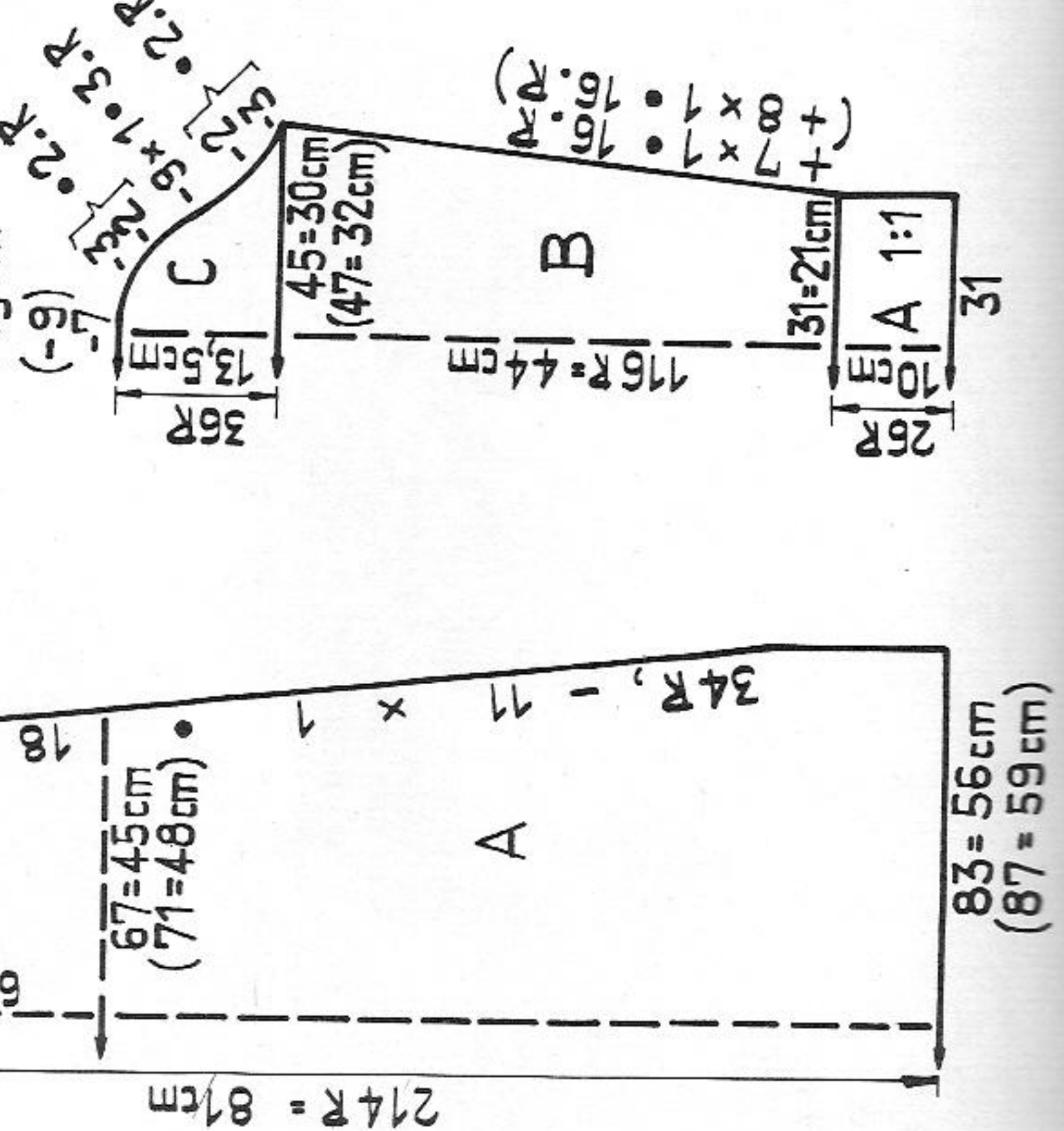

For pullover : Mod. 2221 : begin acc. to dotted line at A on diagram, cast on 67 (71) sts and knit only 64 rows for A. Decrease at both ends 3 x 1 stitch in every 18th row with deckercomb. Otherwise knit as for dress.

Fig. I, back : begin with contrast yarn.

A = cast on 83 (87) sts with every alternate nd. After 34 rows decrease at both ends with 24 decker-

comb. B = knit straight. C = shape armholes, then knit straight. D = shape shoulders. E = roll

collar : knit straight, cast off loosely.

Fig. II, front :

A and B as for Fig. I. C = shape armhole acc. to diagram, then knit straight. D = work neck

opening with graduations : miss 9 sts at centre, at right put corresponding pushers for 20 nds

into W.P., set lock to BX. At right knit straight, at left make graduations acc. to diagram. E =

at left continue making graduations, at right shape shoulder, put empty nds and pushers into N.P.

At left put 20 pushers into W.P. and repeat sections D and E with reversed shapings to diagram.

F = roll collar : set lock to N, knit straight with all nds, cast off very loosely.

Fig. III : Knit two equal parts.

For sleeve bands cast on 31 sts acc. to diagram, knit straight. B = transfer all sts for stocking

stitch to front bed. Increase at both ends. C = shape sleeve head, cast off.

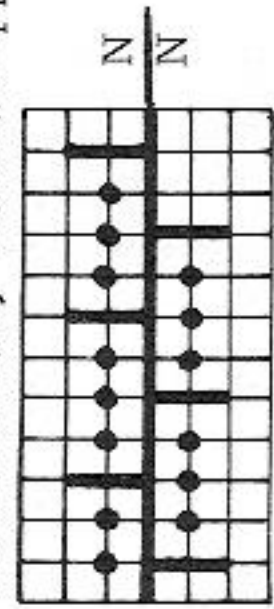
To make up : Block all parts and press with damp cloth. Join side, shoulder and roll collar

seams. Join sleeve seams and set in. Catch down bottom hem on inside, st by st, acc. to desired

### Fig. I:

A = white, 4 rows automatic cast-on with pushers, then 8 rows of scallops acc. to diagram. B = red. Loop pattern, knit straight. Knit a few rows stocking stitch with contrast yarn, release, press contrast yarn. C = put skirt back onto nds of machine, placing 2 sts onto each nd. Knit 8 rows of scallops in white acc. to diagram. D = red, loop pattern. Knit straight. E = red, loop pattern: divide work, at left put 36 sts on-shoulder, cast off. At right shape armhole, at left knit straight. F = at right shape and knit second shoulder with reversed shapings to diagram.

### Fig. II:

Leave empty nds in W.P., knit 1 row, and twist zig-zag thread onto nds. Repeat every 32 rows. Knit 10 rows over last buttonhole, cast off.

Collar with buttonhole band as above, but knit without buttonholes.

To make up: Block and press all parts.

Graft sts of collar together at centre back, unravelling contrast yarn. Join shoulder and side seams. Sew on collar and buttonholes at left with mattress stitch. Join sleeve seams and set in. Press all seams.

Skirt front cover

Size: to fit a 90, 94, 98 cm hip

Material: 12 ozs medium wool, 1 elastic waistband

Stitch size: Stocking stitch front 5, back 3, COMBI St. S 4 3/4, back 2 3/4, tension arm 3, yarn brake 4 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 36 cm (14 1/4"), 100 rows = 21 cm (8 1/4")

Pattern: Stocking stitch, hem K/K

Figs. VII + VIII, skirt: begin and end with contrast yarn

A = cast on 179 sts on front bed and at extreme left opposite the last 5 nds on back bed add 5 nds for K/K, knit 11 rows (black strippers). B = make graduations acc. to diagram with BX and pushers as follows: put all pushers into W.P., lock is at left. At right (waist) return 19 pushers to R.P., knit 1 row, at right return 20th pusher to R.P., knit 1 row. Repeat twice. Then at right return 16 pushers to R.P., knit 1 row, return 17th pusher to R.P., knit 1 row, etc. C = knit 18 rows straight. Repeat sections B and C another 18 times (to fit a 94 cm hip = 19 times, 98 cm hip = 20 times). After last graduation only knit 7 rows.

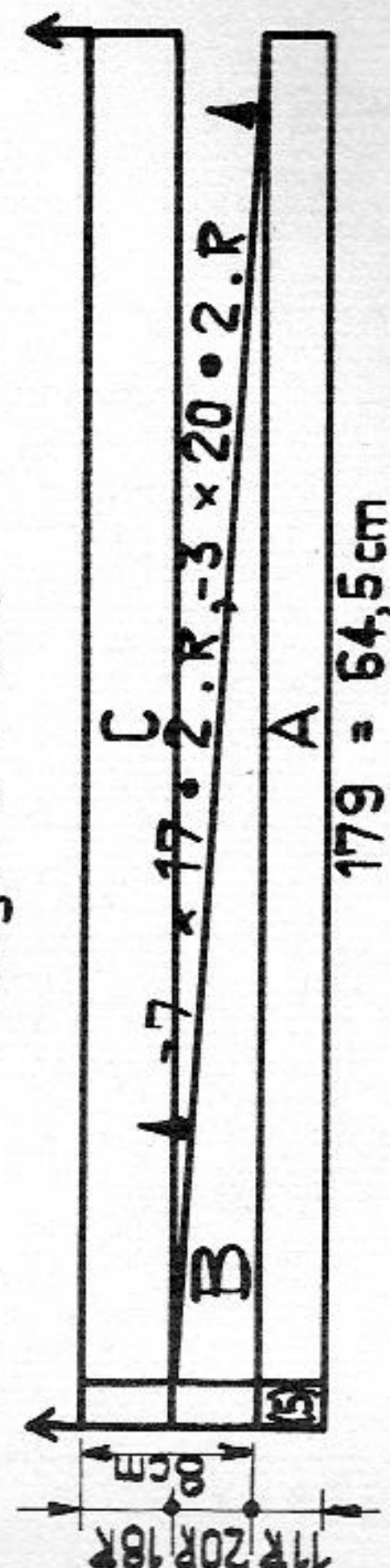
Waist band: Begin and end with contrast yarn.

Stocking stitch, tubular. With 8 nds on each bed knit a tubular strip acc. to size of waist.

To make up: Block skirt acc. to desired length and press.

Graft sts at beginning and end of skirt together, insert elastic through waist band and graft sts at both ends together, unravelling contrast yarn. Crochet waist band in chain stitch using green tool.

Material: 430 m length per 100 gr  
135 yds per 1 oz  
10 cm = approx. 4"

Cuffs: with 8 needle groups and 7 spaces in between knit 140 rows twice.

Collar: with 6 needle groups and 5 spaces in between knit 500 rows once.

Tie belt: stocking stitch tubular, knit a tube of approx. 150 cm length with 8 nds on front and on back bed.

To make up: Block and press all parts lightly.

Join shoulder and side seams, leaving passage for belt open. Join sleeve seams and set in. For cuffs sew the fringe edges together with feather stitch and join to form a ring. Sew finished cuffs to sleeves. For collar edge sew fringe edge to fringe edge along centre front and neck opening, beginning and ending directly above belt. At front B sew on press studs at points marked with •. Pull belt through. If desired attach hook and eye fastener at bust level (centre front edges meet at C and D).

Trousers

Knit two equal parts, but once on back bed CX, front N, once on back bed N, front CX. Unshaped edge of D and G = centre front.

A = hem: with 124 (131) nds knit straight. B = on back bed put 124 (131) nds into W.P., put the 42nd (46th) nd at left (on bed where nds are knitting) into R.P. (for permanent crease). Knit straight in pattern. C = at right increase, at left knit straight. D = shape crutch acc. to diagram. E = at left take 95 (100) sts with decker-combs from nds off machine. At right decrease for seat seam, at left decrease for hip darts. F = put all sts onto front bed for waist hem, knit 10 rows stocking stitch, a few rows with contrast yarn, release. G = put the 95 (100) sts back onto nds of machine, at right decrease for darts, at left knit straight. H = as for F.

To make up: Block and press all parts lightly. Press crease lightly on right side along line of dropped sts. Join leg seams from A to C and seat seam. Sew up hip darts. Turn waist hem to inside and catch down st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Insert waist band. Catch down section A on inside and press trousers again.

T 2248 Oven cloth

With 100 sts (50 front, 50 back) knit RC 100 in whatever fairisle pattern you choose. Cast off, leaving 2 sts at left, back and front bed, knit a tab with CX/CX. Naturally you can also make good use of your test squares in this way.

T 2250 Needle booklet

With 40 nds on each bed knit RC 200 in whatever fairisle pattern you choose, cast off. Knit inside leaf with same number of sts and rows but in one colour with smaller stitch size.

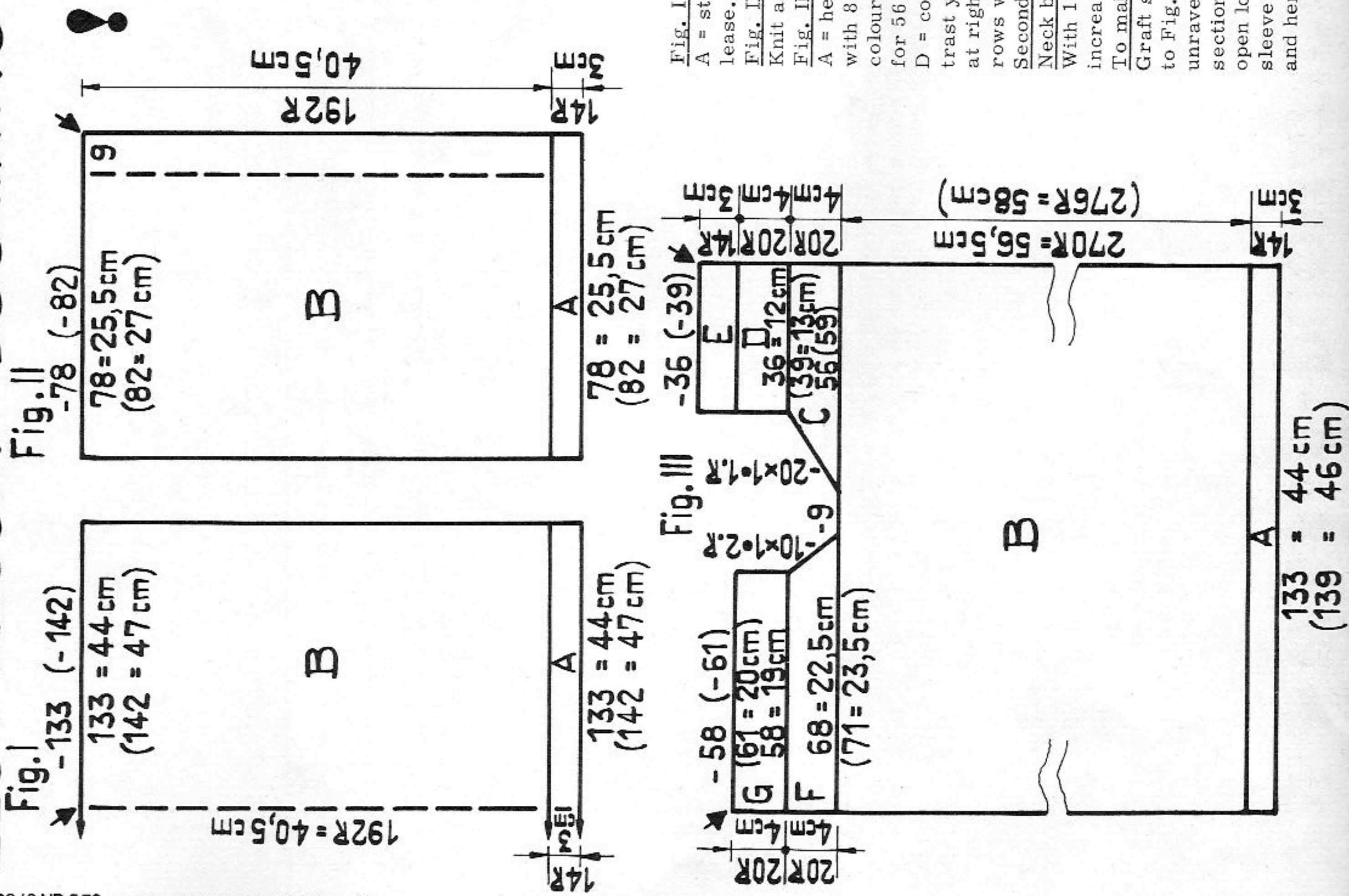

Material: 430 m length per 100 gr

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Loose jacket with Dolman sleeves front cover

Size: to fit an 84 (88) cm bust

Material: 15 ozs medium wool: 3 ozs dark pink, 3 1/2 ozs light pink, 4 ozs light green and 4 1/2 ozs dark green (17 ozs medium wool: 3 1/2 ozs dark pink, 4 ozs light pink, 4 1/2 ozs light green and 5 ozs dark green), 4 3/4, COMBI St. S 4 1/2, tension arm 3, yarn brake 4 1/2

Stitch size: 100 sts = 33 cm (13"), 100 rows = 21 cm (8 1/4")

Test square: Stocking stitch, stripes acc. to diagram, kimono sleeves and yoke knitted in one piece.

Pattern:

Diagram for colour sequence

- 4 times { 2 rows light pink
- { 2 rows dark green
- 10 rows light green
- 4 rows dark green
- 2 rows light green
- 4 rows dark green
- 4 rows light pink
- 8 rows dark pink = 48 rows repeat

Fig. I, back: Begin and end with contrast yarn  
A = stocking stitch, light pink, hem. B = colour sequence acc. to diagram, knit straight, release.

Fig. II, front: knit two equal parts  
Knit as for Fig. I with the number of sts indicated on diagram.

Fig. III: 1st sleeve. Begin with contrast yarn.  
A = hem, light pink, stocking stitch. B = continue with colour sequence, knit straight. Begin with 8 rows dark pink. C = front neck opening: divide work. Make a note of position of colour sequence. Starting from right cast off 9 sts after 56 (59) sts. At right put pushers for 56 (59) nds into W.P., set lock to BX. At right knit straight, at left shape neck opening. D = continue with colour sequence, knit straight. E = hem: light pink. A few rows with contrast yarn, release. F = back neck opening: set lock to N, pay attention to colour sequence, at right shape neck opening, at left knit straight. G = colour sequence, knit straight, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Second sleeve: knit with reversed shapings to diagram.  
Neck band: light green. Tubular.  
With 120 nds on each bed make closed cast-on for tubular, knit 32 rows gradually increasing St. S to 5 1/4. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up: block and press all parts.  
Graft sts of centre back together (Fig. III, Section G). Sew back (matching arrows) st by st to Fig. III, backstitching into the open loops on inside, sew on front parts in the same way, unravelling contrast yarn. Hem front border, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn at section E. First sew neck band to outside of neck opening, st by st, backstitching into the open loops, then catch down on inside st by st, and unravel contrast yarn. Join side and sleeve seams. Unravel contrast yarn on jacket and sleeves and hem st by st. Press seams and hems.
