Increasing several stitches in single bed knitting

Today, with kimono sleeves being in fashion again, it often happens in single bed knitting that 10 or more stitches have to be added at the same time. This also becomes necessary when knitting on some facing.

You may find that following the instruction book (page 30) can result in a rather bulky cast-on and thick seam. However, it is possible to achieve a much neater seam with less trouble by adopting the following method : -

Take an old test square and place as many stitches as required on the needles of the machine. Should the test square be too wide, simply cut off the surplus, as you will have to remove the test square anyway at the end. If you have no old swatch handy, then you could knit some small pieces of the required width before starting work and remove these on deckercombs from the machine. This will simplify putting the stitches back later on. When making up the finished garment, unravel the contrast yarn and join seams with knit stitch or, in the case of a facing, sew the same stitch by stitch to the inside. Always remember to first press the parts before unravelling the contrast yarn in order to avoid running stitches.

Before starting your work please study carefully the explanations given on pages 3 and 4

Patterns: The drawings refer to half width, the indications of stitch numbers refer to whole width of each part.

Figure I	= back	Figure IX	= pants
Figure II	= front	Figure X	= gusset
Figure III	= sleeve	Figure XI	= scarf
Figure IV	= collar	Figure XII	= cap, bonnet
Figure V	= border, cuff	Figure XIII	= mittens

If the centre line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is worked simultaneously with reversed shapings, i. e. decreasing or increasing is made on the left as well as on the right side.

If the centre line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is worked separately with reversed shapings, i. e. first knit one part according to diagram (increasing or decreasing at right), then the second part the opposite way (decreasing or increasing at left).

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter "st"). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working Position on back and front bed.

Exception: For tubular or half tubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed. The same number of needles must therefore be put into Working Position on the other bed. In these cases the sign for tubular \bigcirc respectively (or) for half tubular is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increase or decrease always occurs in the first row of a section.

- $+ 3 \times 2 \cdot 8 \cdot R$ means: increase 2 stitches 3 times in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- $- 19 \times 3 \cdot 7 \cdot R$ means: decrease 3 stitches 19 times in every 7th row (back 2 stitches, front 1 stitch or vice versa).
- $- 17 \times 1 \cdot 2 / 3 \cdot R$ means: decrease 1 stitch 17 times, alternately once after 2 rows and once after 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle - 4 \times 8 \cdot 2 \cdot R$ means: work graduations, i. e. short rows (on DUO with pushers and lock BX). Step by step put 8 nds (and their respective pushers) into Rest Position 4 times after every 2nd row (for double bed 4 nds each back and front). Once all graduations are finished, continue knitting normally, i. e. all nds in Working Position (pushers in Neutral Position).

Graduations can be knitted two ways, either from outer edge towards centre (gradual decreasing with the minus-sign "-" after the black triangle) or from the centre towards outer edge (gradual increasing with the plus-sign "+" after the black triangle.)

Number of stitches and centimetres :

- $136 = 20 \text{ cm}$ means: a total of 136 sts (for K/K 68 stitches each on back and front) make a width of 20 cm.
- $\bigcirc 146 = 43 \text{ cm}$ means: cast on 146 sts each on back and front bed for tubular which makes a width of 43 cm.

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be tested by you, by making your own test square for your own wool.

Test square: We strongly recommend that you make always a test square with your own material before starting to work, in order to calculate for your material the necessary numbers of stitches and rows along the PASSAP - chart. The chapter "The test square and its calculation" in your instruction book informs you how to proceed for these calculations. This is very important, especially when adjusting a model to another size.

Child's pinafore dress

Size: to fit an approx. 5 (3) year old, height 110 (98) cm/43 (38 1/2) ins

Material: 140 (125) gr/5 (4 1/2) ozs fine Dralon; 90 (80) gr/3 1/2 (3) ozs pink, 35 (30) gr/1 1/2 (1) ozs blue and 15 gr/1 1/2 oz white

St.S & test square: see model 2260

Pattern: Skirt in 3-coloured fairisle acc. to diagram or with PASSAP Jac card no. 1 (5). Bodice and straps in 2:2 rib.

Fig. I + II: knit two parts alike. For smaller size leave out RC 20 fairisle stitch at the beginning and end of A.

A = make cast-on with tubular rows in pink (main colour); RC 20 with fairisle stitch, pink, without pattern. Then knit the pattern once acc. to diagram; then RC 20 straight in fairisle stitch, pink, without pattern. B = pink, in 2:2 rib acc. to diagram, i. e. place every 3rd and 4th st onto adjacent nds at back and front. Knit straight, cast off.

Straps: pink, knit twice

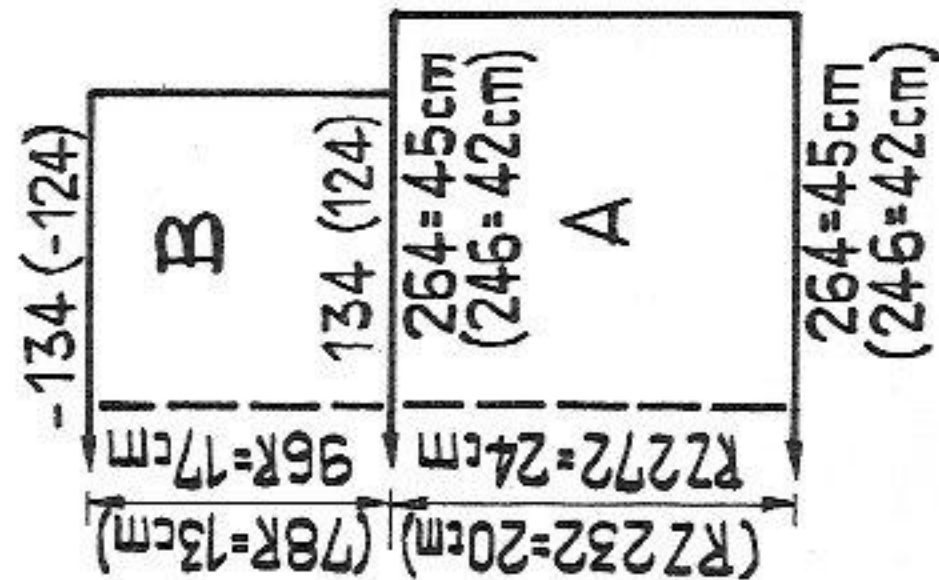
With 26 nds knit 180 rows in 2:2 rib. Cast off.

To make up:

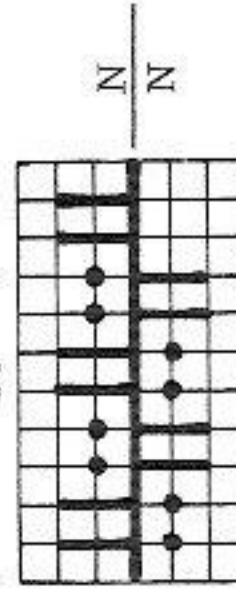

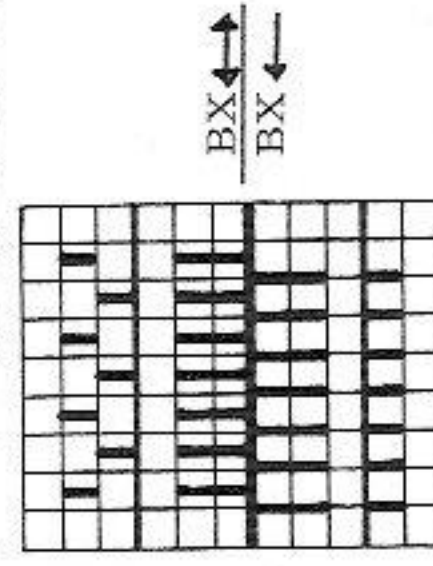

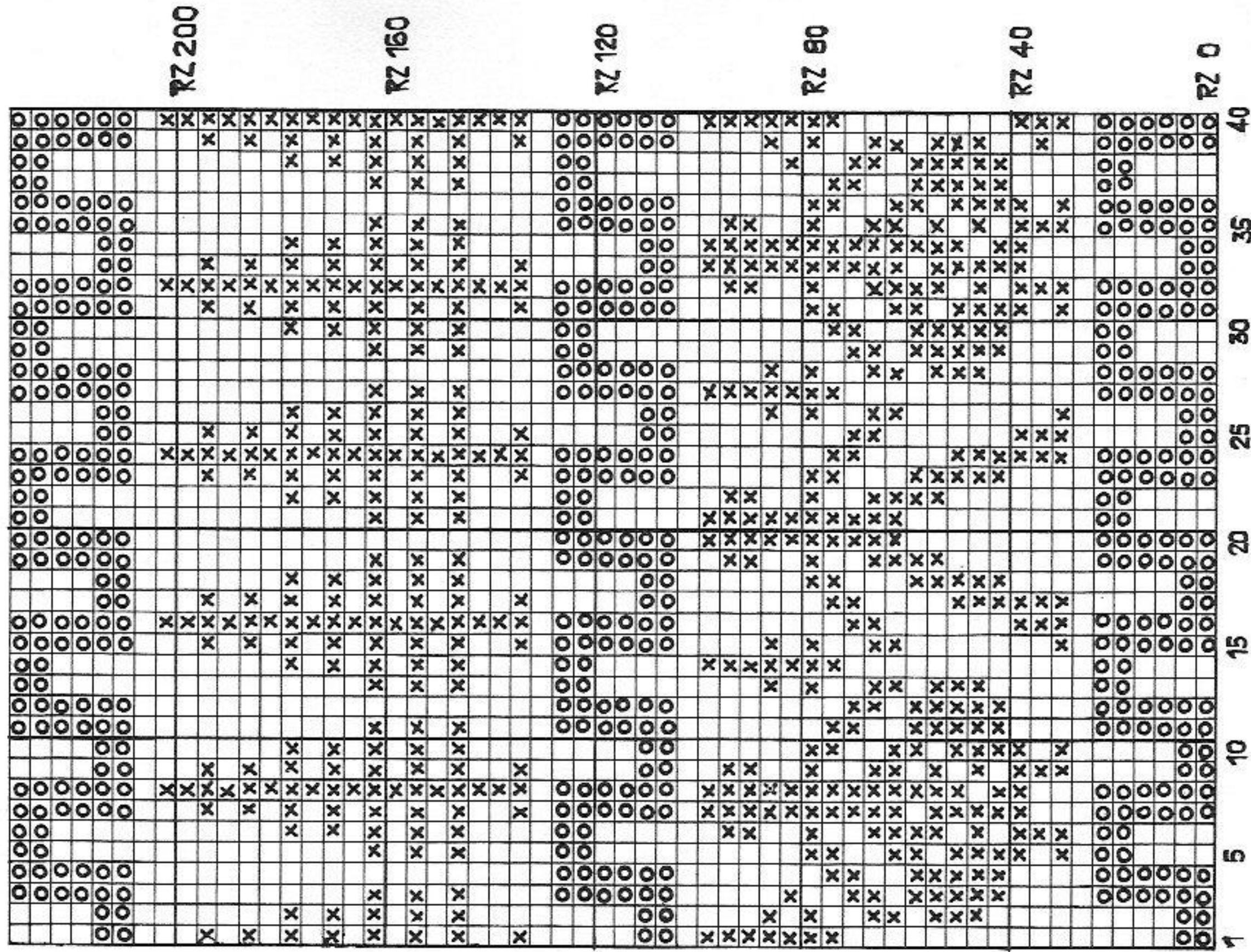

Size : to fit an 84 (92) cm/33 (36 1/4) ins bust

Where there is only one figure on the diagram, this is the same for both sizes.

Material : 575 (650) gr/20 1/2 (23) ozs fine acrylic ; 300 (340) gr/10 1/2 (11) ozs red and 275 (310) gr/10 (11) ozs white, elastic waistband

Stitch size : Fairisle 3, stocking stitch 3 3/4

Test square : 100 sts = 16,5 cm (6 1/2"), RC 200 = 19,5 cm (7 3/4")

Pattern : Two-piece in fairisle pattern acc. to diagram or with PASSAP Jac card 80 (381), bands in red, stocking stitch, tubular.

Fig. I, top back :

A = red. Hem band in stocking stitch, tubular. B = in pattern acc. to diagram, decrease at both ends. C = increase at both ends. D = shape armholes, then knit straight. E = shape shoulders, cast off.

Fig. II, front :

A, B and C as for Fig. I, however, only knit RC 188 (200). D = cast off 80 sts at both ends (bust darts), then divide work : at right take 48 (58) sts with deckercombs

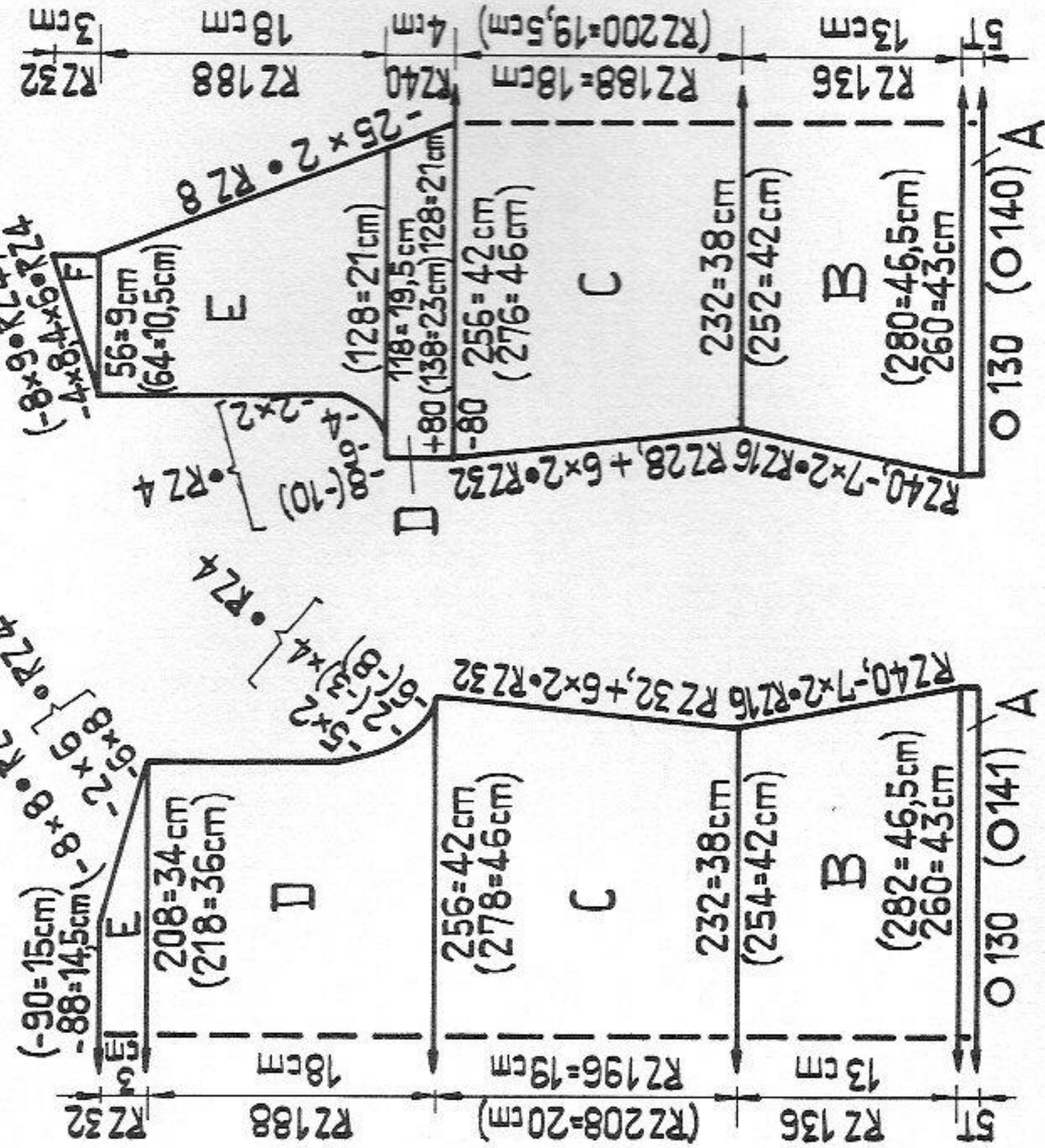
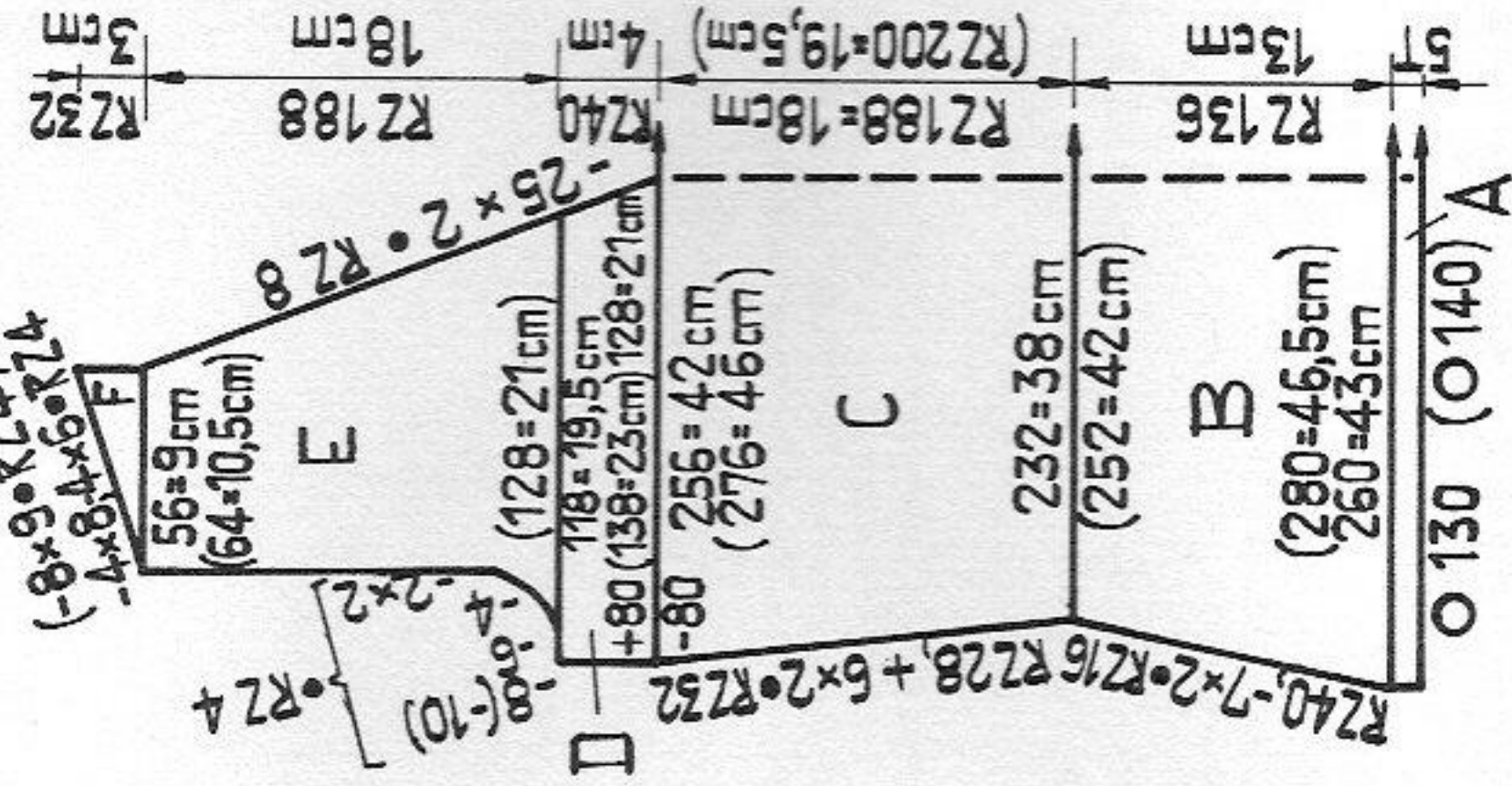

from nds of machine. Make a note of pusher position and pattern row. At left leave the empty 80 nds in W.P. and continue knitting in pattern. At right shape neck opening, at left knit straight. E = at right shape neck opening, at left shape armhole, then knit straight. F = at right knit straight, at left shape shoulder. For second shoulder put the 48 (58) sts back onto nds of machine, at right put 80 nds and pushers into W.P. acc. to pattern row of which you have made a note and continue knitting in pattern. Knit sections D, E and F with reversed shapings to diagram.

Fig. III, sleeves : knit two equal parts

A = red. Stocking stitch tubular. B = in pattern, increase at both ends. C = shape sleeve head, cast off.

Neckband : red. Begin and end with contrast yarn.

Tubular, at lower edge make open cast-on with 200 sts, at right knit straight, at left 10 times every alternate RC decrease 1 stitch back and front with single decker. Then 10 times every alternate RC increase 1 stitch each (total RC 42). Release.

Skirt

Fig. VII + VIII : three equal parts

A = red, stocking stitch tubular. B = in pattern. Increase at both ends. C = transfer all sts to front bed and knit stocking stitch in red, then a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up : Block and press all parts with damp cloth. Skirt : Join seams. Fold section C in half and catch down on inside st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Insert elastic waistband. Top : Join shoulder and side seams. Join sleeve seams and set in. First sew neckband to neck opening, st by st, backstitching into the open loops, then catch down on inside st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Press seams carefully without using pressure.

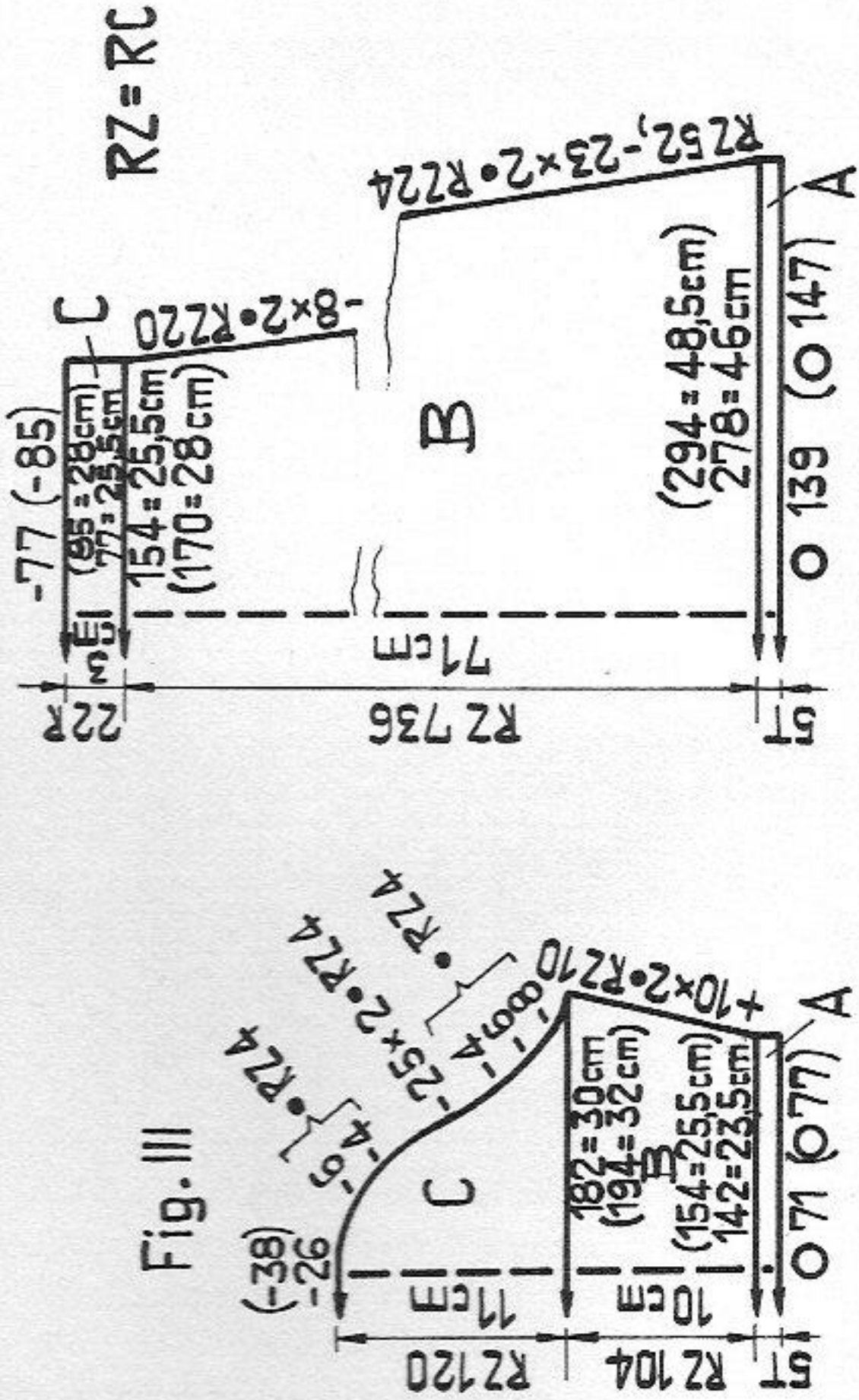
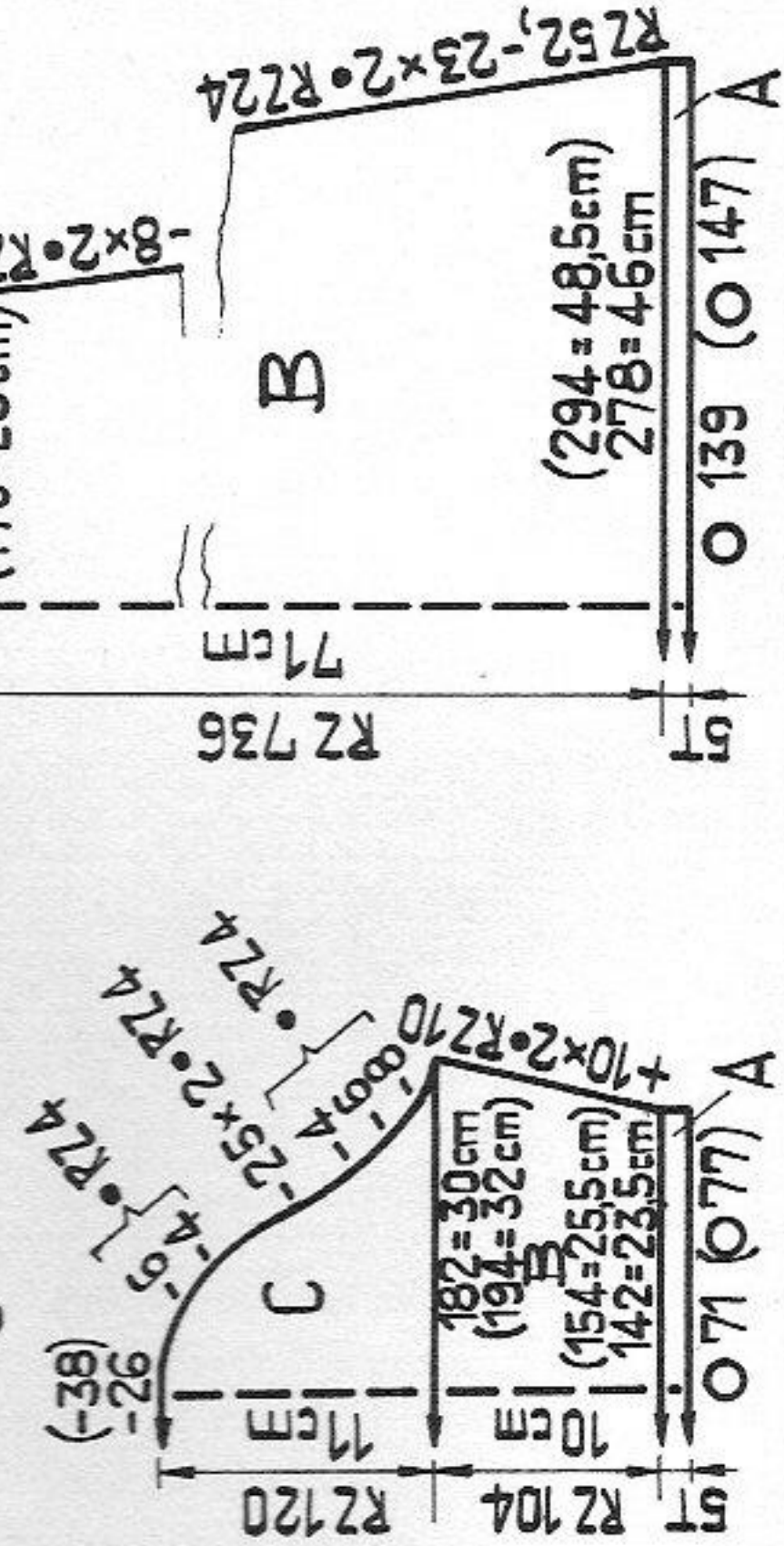

 Test square : 100 sts = 28 cm (11"), 100 rows = 17 cm (6 3/4")
 Pattern : Loop pattern acc. to diagram, sleeve bands in ribbing

Fig. I:

A = with nds in W.P. acc. to diagram, lock N/N, cast on with racking. Then knit straight in loop pattern following diagram. B = at each end shape armholes, continue straight. C = at each end shape shoulders, cast off loosely.

Fig. II : knit two parts with reversed shapings

A = cast on with racking, then knit straight in pattern. B = at right continue straight, at left shape armhole, then knit straight. C = at right shape neck, at left continue straight. D = at right knit straight, at left shape shoulder.

Fig. III : knit two parts alike

A = cast on with racking acc. to diagram as for Fig. I. Then, with lock on N/N knit 60 rows straight. B = knit straight in loop pattern acc. to diagram. C = at each end shape sleeve head, cast off.

To make up:

Close shoulder and side seams. Close sleeve seams in such a way that the wrist border can be half folded to the outside. Set in sleeves.

D = divide work, in the centre cast off 68 (56) sts, at left place 72 (84) sts onto deckercombs. 1st part: decrease at each end. 2nd part: replace sts onto nds of machine and knit with reversed shapings.

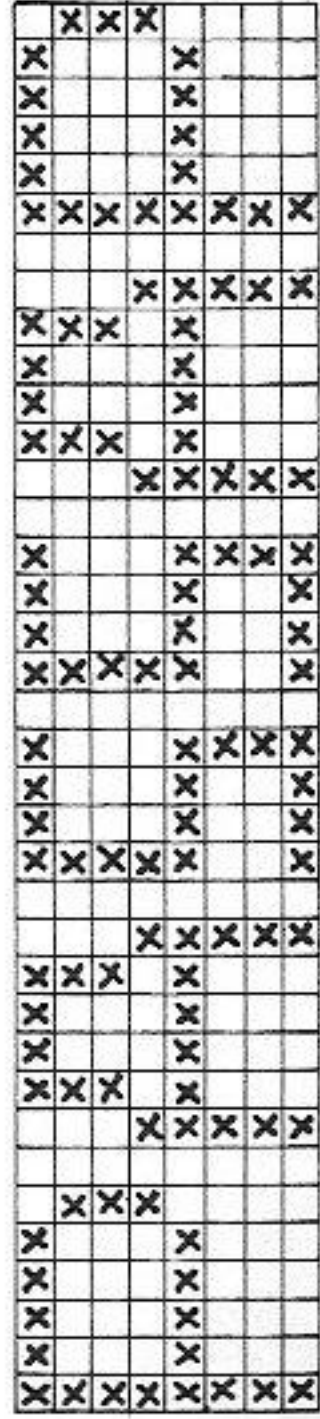

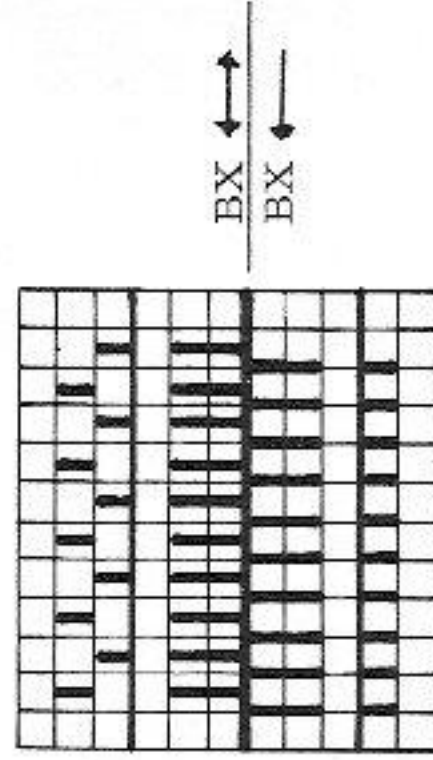

Zip-up linen dress

- Size:** to fit an 88 (96) cm / 34 1/2 (37 3/4) ins bust
Material: 650 (700) gr / 23 (25) ozs nubblly cotton/linen yarn, 1 zip measuring 36 cm (14")
Stitch size: Stocking stitch 4 3/4, borders back 3 3/4, front 4 3/4
 COMBI : stocking stitch 4 1/2, borders back 3 1/2, front 4 1/2 tension arm 4, yarn brake 5
Test square: 100 sts = 33 cm (13"), 100 rows = 21,5 cm (8 1/2")
Pattern: Stocking stitch, purlside outwards. Sleeve and neckbands in "long stitch". All decreases with quintuple decker.

Fig. I :

A = begin with contrast yarn. Decrease at both ends. B = knit straight. C = shape armhole, continue straight. D = shape shoulder : at both ends transfer 5 sts 1 nd inwards, leave empty nds in Working Position. Knit 1 row. Release end stitch at each side, put empty nds in Neutral Position, repeat. Knit a few rows in contrast yarn, release.

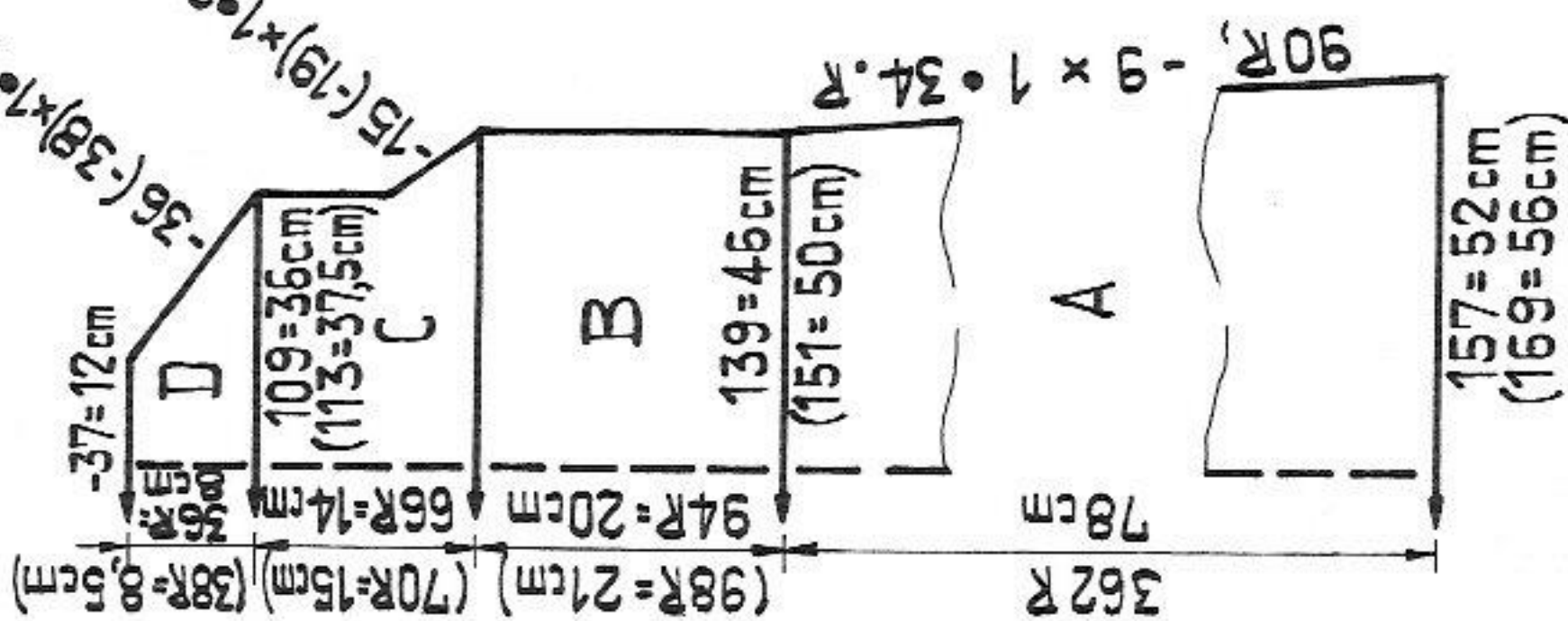

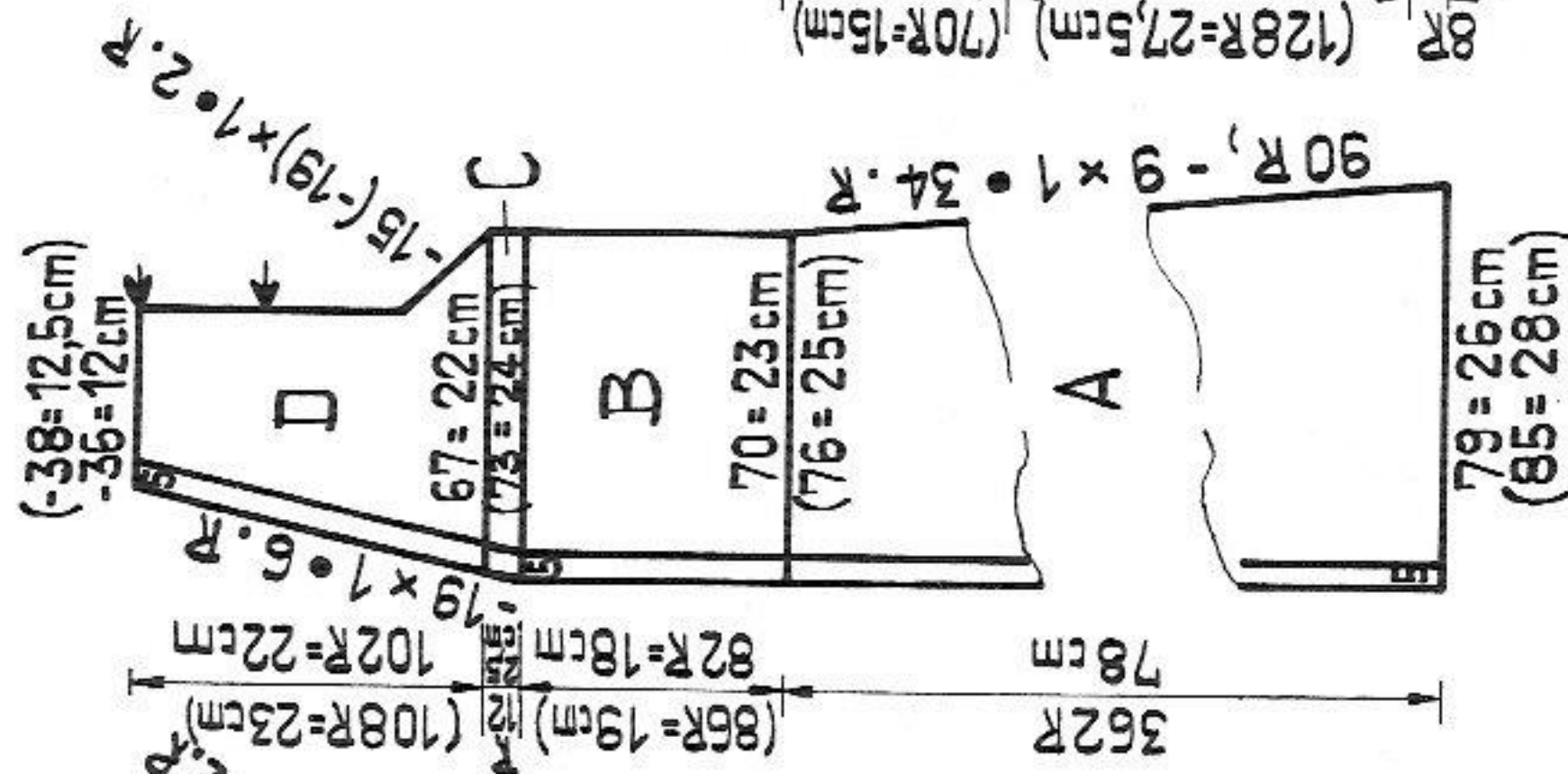
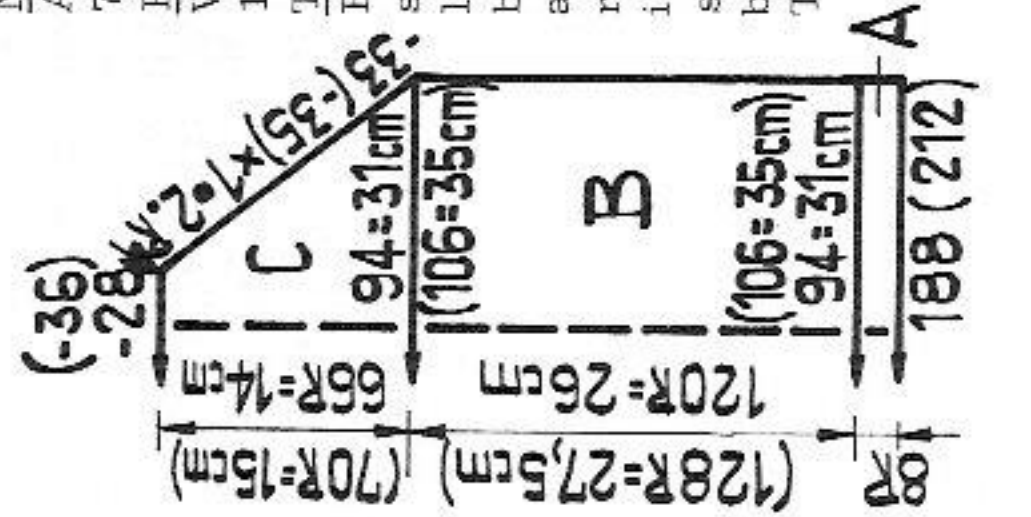

Neckband : V-neck for model 2232, white
 Tubular, open at bottom. With contrast yarn cast on 115 (118) sts on each bed, knit a few rows. Then RC 24 white, decreasing 12 times at left edge, back and front, 2sts every RC 2, using double decker. Then knit RC 24, increasing 12 times as follows : * first put an extra nd into W.P. at left front, knit RC 2, release the extra nd. Then, at left front and back, move 1 st outwards by 2 nds, place purlstitch loop of this st onto nd next to the last, leaving 3rd nd empty in W.P. *. Repeat 11 times from * to *. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.
Neckband : round neck for model 2233, white
 Cast on as for model 2232, knit RC 48, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.
Armhole bands for models 2232 and 2233
 Tubular. With 58 (60) sts each knit as for neckband for round neckline.
To make up : Block and press parts lightly. Join shoulder and side seams. Attach neck and armhole bands first to the outside, st by st, backstitching into the open loops, then st by st catch down on inside, unravelling contrast yarn.

Fig. II : right front

A = begin with contrast yarn. Knit 2 rows. On back bed at left put 5 nds into W.P. for band. Set lock at back to CX, St.S 3 3/4; front N, St.S 4 3/4. At right decrease, at left knit straight. B = straight. C = at right knit straight, at left decrease for neck opening : at front transfer 5 sts 1 nd inwards, at back move inwards the 5 sts for band. D = at right shape armhole. Then knit straight. At left make neck opening as above. Knit a few rows with contrast yarn, release.
Left front : knit with reversed shapings
Fig. III : sleeves, knit two parts alike
 A = band : 1 row N/N, St.S 2. Knit 8 rows with St.S 3 3/4 lock CX at back and St.S 4 3/4 lock N at front. With lock set on N/N knit 1 row with St.S 4 3/4. Transfer stitches to front bed for stocking stitch. B = knit straight. C = decrease both ends for raglan. Knit a few rows with contrast yarn, release.
Neckband, back : begin and end with contrast yarn
 At back set lock to CX, St.S 3 3/4; front N, St.S 4 3/4 : with 5 sts on each bed knit 76 rows on front and back bed, release.
Belt : begin and end with contrast yarn.
 With lock on CX/CX, St.S 4 3/4, with 7 sts on each bed, knit tubular for approx. 150 cm (59"), release. Turn belt inside out. Join open ends with graft stitch. Press.
To make up :
 Block and press all parts. On inside join shoulders of front panels, st by st, to slanted shoulder sections of back panel, backstitching into open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. Join side and sleeve seams. On inside sew sleeves st by st, backstitching into open loops, to straight edge of sleeves, i.e. from arrow to arrow acc. to diagram, unravelling contrast yarn. With mattress stitch join raglan sections to armholes. Join centre front with mattress stitch, leaving opening of 36 cm (14") for zip. Then sew in zip. With knit stitches and flush with shoulder seams join back neckband to front neckbands, then attach to back with backstitches. Unravel contrast yarn at back and sew loose sts inside to neckband. Turn up hem to desired length, st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Press.

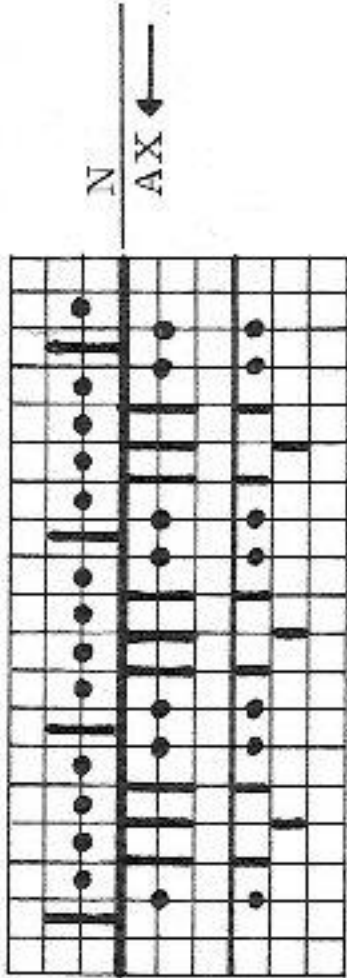
