PASSAP fashion - always and again right up to date

Stripes, stripes, stripes - everywhere - in contrasting colours or tone on tone : this is the message for the coming fashion season. Moreover, when knitting inlaid stripes, you will find the PASSAP DUOMATIC of particular help, see for example our model 2385 on the back page of the illustrated book.

Along with the stripes the "ethnic" look is still very much with us - multi-coloured in fairisle or lacy patterns - and used for exciting trimming effects, also creating the impression of wide stripes.

You will find the models in lace pattern summery light and pleasant to wear, and that they can be knitted easily and successfully thanks to our transfer lock U 70, as shown by the man's model 2402 and the child's dress 2404.

Once again we include a suggestion for using up wool remnants : - "Nessie" our giant snake will surely be a special attraction and add fun and colour to any nursery.



And remember, when you are looking for simple and quick to knit models, look out for the exclamation mark.

We are confident that this new collection of PASSAP DUOMATIC knitted models will again meet with your approval and will give you much pleasure.

Increasing several stitches in single bed knitting

Today, with kimono sleeves being in fashion again, it often happens in single bed knitting that 10 or more stitches have to be added at the same time. This also becomes necessary when knitting on some facing.

You may find that following the instruction book (page 30) can result in a rather bulky cast-on and thick seam. However, it is possible to achieve a much neater seam with less trouble by adopting the following method : -

Take an old test square and place as many stitches as required on the needles of the machine. Should the test square be too wide, simply cut off the surplus, as you will have to remove the test square anyway at the end. If you have no old swatch handy, then you could knit some small pieces of the required width before starting work and remove these on deckercombs from the machine. This will simplify putting the stitches back later on. When making up the finished garment, unravel the contrast yarn and join seams with knit stitch or, in the case of a facing, sew the same stitch by stitch to the inside. Always remember to first press the parts before unravelling the contrast yarn in order to avoid running stitches.

Before starting your work please study carefully the explanations given on pages 3 and 4

Patterns: The drawings refer to half width, the indications of stitch numbers refer to whole width of each part.

 Figure II = front
 Figure III = sleeve

If the centre line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is worked simultaneously with reversed shapings, i. e. decreasing or increasing is made on the left as well as on the right side.

If the centre line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is worked separately with reversed shapings, i. e. first knit one part according to diagram (increasing or decreasing at right), then the second part the opposite way (decreasing or increasing at left).

Abbreviations:

Col. = colour of wool
 st, sts = stitch, stitches
 St. S = stitch size
 Nd, nds = needle, needles
 R = row
 T = 2 rows

○ = tubular (or) = half tubular
 ● = every (in every row)
 X = times
 + = increase
 - = decrease, cast off
 ▲ = graduations (short rows)
 ■ = for open work row hang st to the next nd, leave empty nd in W. P.

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Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter "st"). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working Position on back and front bed.

Exception: For tubular or half tubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed. The same number of needles must therefore be put into Working Position on the other bed. In these cases the sign for tubular \bigcirc respectively (or) for half tubular is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increase or decrease always occurs in the first row of a section.

- $+ 3 \times 2 \cdot 8 \cdot R$ means: increase 2 stitches 3 times in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- $- 19 \times 3 \cdot 7 \cdot R$ means: decrease 3 stitches 19 times in every 7th row (back 2 stitches, front 1 stitch or vice versa).
- $- 17 \times 1 \cdot 2 \cdot / 3 \cdot R$ means: decrease 1 stitch 17 times, alternately once after 2 rows and once after 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle - 4 \times 8 \cdot 2 \cdot R$ means: work graduations, i. e. short rows (on DUO with pushers and lock BX). Step by step put 8 nds (and their respective pushers) into Rest Position 4 times after every 2nd row (for double bed 4 nds each back and front). Once all graduations are finished, continue knitting normally, i. e. all nds in Working Position (pushers in Neutral Position).

Graduations can be knitted two ways, either from outer edge towards centre (gradual decreasing with the minus-sign "-" after the black triangle) or from the centre towards outer edge (gradual increasing with the plus-sign "+" after the black triangle.)

Number of stitches and centimetres :

- $136 = 20 \text{ cm}$ means: a total of 136 sts (for K/K 68 stitches each on back and front) make a width of 20 cm.
- $\bigcirc 146 = 43 \text{ cm}$ means: cast on 146 sts each on back and front bed for tubular which makes a width of 43 cm.

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be tested by you, by making your own test square for your own wool.

Test square: We strongly recommend that you make always a test square with your own material before starting to work, in order to calculate for your material the necessary numbers of stitches and rows along the PASSAP - chart. The chapter "The test square and its calculation" in your instruction book informs you how to proceed for these calculations. This is very important, especially when adjusting a model to another size.

Polo neck sweater with stripes

Size: to fit an 84 (92) cm / 33 (36 1/4) in. bust

Material: 330 (360) gr / 12 (13 1/2) ozs fairly fine wool: 300 (330) gr / 10 1/2 (12) ozs white, 20 gr / 1 oz blue and 10 gr / 1/2 oz green

Stitch size: DUO stocking stitch 4 3/4, 1:1 rib = 2 1/2
COMBI stocking stitch 4 1/2, 1:1 rib = 2 1/4, tension arm 7, yarn brake 4 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 29 cm / 11 1/2", 100 rows = 21,5 cm / 8 1/2"

Pattern: Stocking stitch, welt, sleeve bands and polo neck 1:1 rib.

Front part stocking stitch, half tubular, colour sequence acc.

Fig. I: to instructions.

A = cast on with tubular rows for 1:1 rib, knit straight. B = transfer sts for stocking stitch, knit straight. C = at each end shape armhole, continue straight. D = at each end shape shoulder, cast off.

Fig. II: front part, begin at first shoulder

A = with contrast yarn cast on 29 (33) sts on front bed, knit a few rows. Using white make graduations towards left according to diagram for shoulder shaping, increasing at right. B = at right increase, at left knit straight. C = at right cast on 14 (18) additional sts, then increase at each end. Finally to protect material

knit 2 rows across with contrast yarn, leave sts on nds of machine. Second shoulder: on back bed repeat sections A, B and C. D = unravel contrast yarn at front. Knit half tubular, open at right. Increase at right back and front, on left closed side dec. with double decker on back and front bed. Knit RC 52 in white, then work colour sequence as follows: RC 20 blue, RC 8 green, RC 16 blue, RC 4 white, RC 12 blue, RC 8 green, RC 4 white, RC 4 blue, RC 8 green. Continue in white until end of section. E = at right back and front decrease, at left continue to dec. with double decker.

Fig. III: knit two parts alike

A = cast on with tubular rows, knit straight. B = transfer sts for stocking stitch, increasing at each end. C = at each end shape sleeve head, cast off.

Welt for front part:

With 146 (162) nds cast on with tubular rows for 1:1 rib, knit 50 rows straight, transfer sts to front for stocking stitch, knit 1 row stocking stitch, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Polo neck:

With 150 nds cast on with tubular rows for 1:1 rib, knit 74 rows, transfer sts for stocking stitch, 1 row stocking stitch, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up: Block and press parts lightly. Sew welt to front part, st by st, backstitching into the open loops. Join shoulder, side and sleeve seams, set in sleeves. Close collar with mattress stitch, then st by st, backstitching into the open loops sew it to neck opening, unravelling contrast yarn.

Loose jacket with lace effect

Size: to fit an 84 (92) cm / 33 (36 1/4) in bust
Material: 320 (360) gr / 11 1/2 (13) ozs cotton yarn
Stitch size: Stocking stitch 4 3/4, pattern back 4, front 4 1/2
Test square: Measured across a width of 100 nds = 52 sts = 32,5 cm / 12 3/4"
Pattern: Loop pattern acc. to diagram, hems stocking stitch, neckband stocking stitch half tubular

 handle down, black strippers

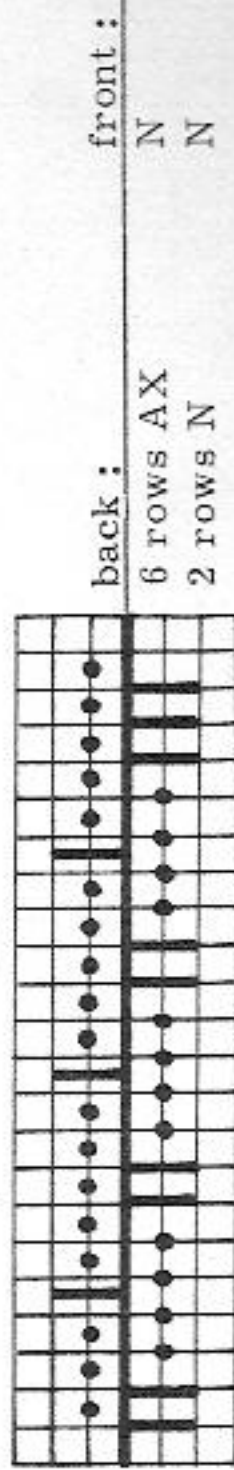


Fig. I: begin with contrast yarn

A = hem, stocking stitch. B = transfer sts acc. to diagram, leaving 3 stitches at each end at the front. Continue straight in pattern. C = at each end cast off for armhole, then knit straight, cast off loosely.

Fig. II: first front part

Using 70 (76) sts work A + B as for Fig. I. C = at right cast off for armhole, continue straight. D = at left cast off for neck, knit straight for shoulder, cast off. Second front part: knit with reversed shapings.

Fig. III: knit two sleeves alike

A + B = as for Fig. I. Cast off loosely.

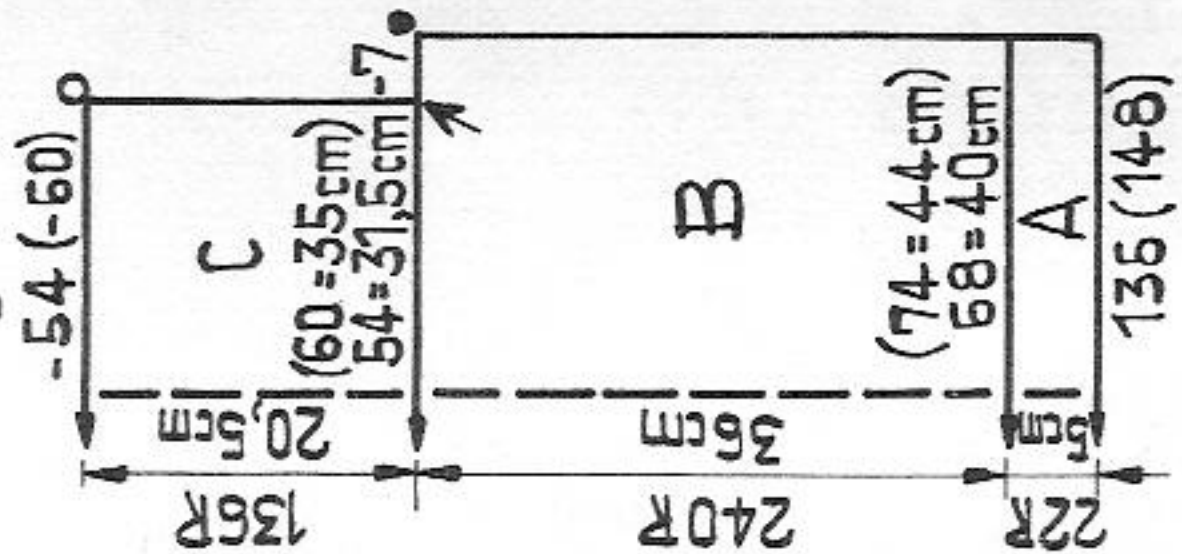

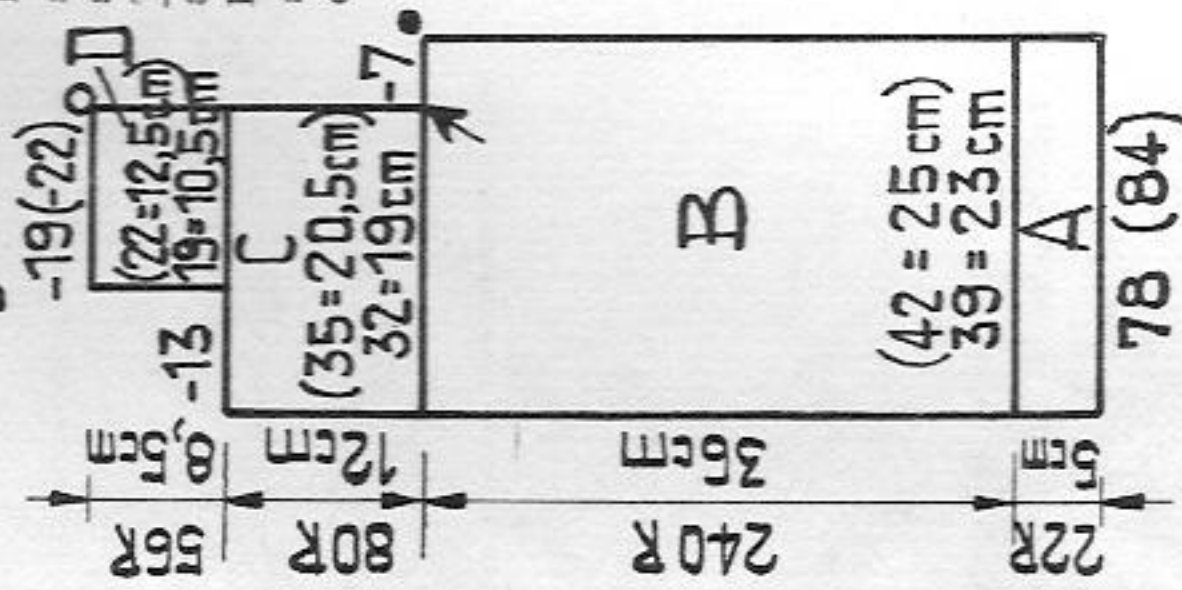
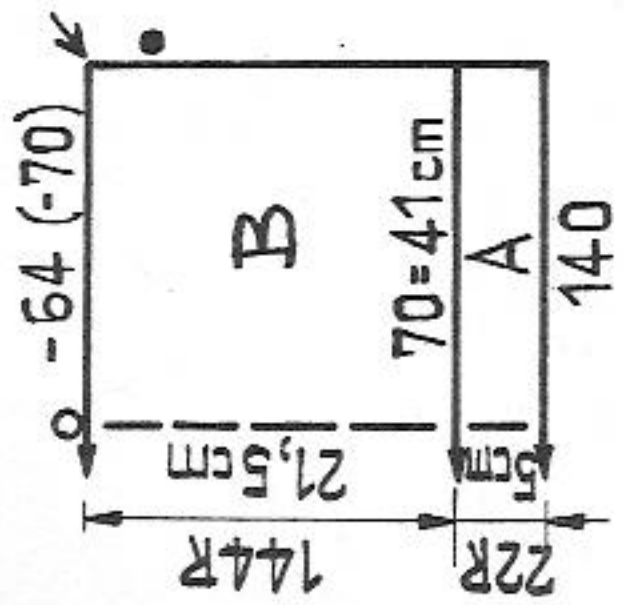

Beach dress

Material: 320 m length per 100 gr
 100 yds per 1 oz
 10 cm = approx. 4"
Size: to fit an 84 (88) cm / 33 (34 1/2) in. bust
Material: 500 (550) gr / 17 1/2 (19 1/2) ozs cotton yarn
Stitch size: DUO = 4 3/4, COMBI = 4 1/2, tension arm 7, yarn brake 3 1/2
Test square: 100 sts = 29 cm / 11 1/2", 100 rows = 23 cm / 9"
Pattern: Stocking stitch. (To ensure a good fit on a pinafore type dress, it is advisable to make the bodice close fitting).

Fig. I:

A + B = cast-on, then decr. at each side with quintuple decker. C = knit straight. D = neck finish, straight, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. II:

A + B as for Fig. I. C = after 66 rows make bust darts on each side, starting from the outside and using BX and pushers. Continue straight. D = as for Fig. I.

Straps: Stocking stitch, tubular. With 9 needles at back and front, lock on CX/CX, knit two tubes measuring approx. 46 cm / 18" each. End with contrast yarn, release.

To make up: Block and press parts. Join side seams. Hem neck finish D st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Make hem to desired length. Sew on straps, unravel contrast yarn and join ends with knit stitch. Press hems and seams.

Neckband: first half

With contrast yarn, half tubular, open at right, cast on 39 sts at front, 25 sts at back. Knit RC 20, at left closed edge, back and front, decreasing 4 times 1 st every RC 4 (using single decker). Now knit RC 20, at left back and front increasing 5 times as follows: move 1 st 1 nd out, placing purl-stitch loop of this stitch on to empty nd. End with contrast yarn, release. Second half: reverse shapings, i.e. at front cast on 25 sts, at back 39 sts.

To make up: Block and press parts. Join back and front parts at shoulders. Sew sleeves to armhole edges, matching circles and arrows, then to cast-off sts as far as dot. Fold hems in half and slip stitch to inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Join neckbands at back with mattress stitch, then attach st by st, backstitching into open loops, first to outside, then to inside of neck opening, unravelling contrast yarn.

First cast on 22 sts for section D with contrast yarn. Knit 34 rows in stripes, beginning with 4 rows red, 2 rows black, 8 rows yellow. Place sts on to dekercomb. A = using contrast yarn, cast on 124 sts at extreme right of machine. Knit a few rows. Then knit the whole model in stripe sequence acc. to pattern, beginning with 2 rows red, 2 rows black, 8 rows yellow. 20 rows straight. B = at right decr., at left incr. After 36 rows make bust dart from the left with BX and pushers, while continuing to decr. at right. C = after 24 rows make graduations from the right, then knit 18 rows straight. Now cast on 19 additional sts at left and place the knitted part D next to it on to the nds of the machine. E = at right incr., at left decr. Then cast on 16 additional sts at right for the crotch. F = at right knit straight, at left decr. Now 208 rows have been knitted = centre front. G = at right straight, at left incr. 3 sts every 2nd row as follows : with 1st and 3rd nds in W.P. knit 1 row, then put 2nd needle in W.P., knit 1 row, etc. H = at right cast off 16 sts, then decr. At left incr. J = at left knit 34 rows with 22 pushers and BX, continuing with stripes. Cast off and put pushers back in N.P., lock on N. Cast off the following 19 sts. K = knit 18 rows straight, then start graduations from the left, then knit 24 rows straight. L = at right incr., at left decr. After 28 rows start graduations from the right, at the same time increasing at right. M = straight, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. V : neckband : half tubular, open at right, beginning with contrast yarn. Knit RC 4 black, remainder red. At right, open edge, knit straight. At left back and front decr. with single deker. Then incr. again as follows : back and front move 1 st 1 nd out, placing pur l stitch loop of this stitch on to empty needle. End with contrast yarn, release.

Leg bands : tubular, open at lower edge, lock CX/CX. With 65 nds each back and front knit a few rows with contrast yarn. Then knit RC 4 in black, RC 36 in red, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Straps : tubular, red. With 3 nds back and front knit a strap approx. 120 cm / 50" long.

To make up : Press contrast yarn only. Join centre back with knit stitch, unravelling contrast yarn and 1 row knitted in red. For bra part join sections D + J, carefully matching dots and circles. Join crotch seam, gathering back part. Using black yarn sew leg band st by st, backstitching into open loops, first to outside of leg opening, then graft to inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Attach neckband in the same way from arrow to arrow. Possibly insert elastic. Using chain stitch and green tool, crochet straps to back top edge and knot at nape of neck.

Briefs

Fig. IX : knitted in one piece. Begin at centre back.
A = knit a few rows with contrast yarn, then work the whole part in stripes acc. to pattern of model 2379, beginning with 2 rows red, 2 rows black, 8 rows yellow. Knit straight. B = at right decr., at left knit straight. C = straight. D = at right incr., then cast on 16 additional sts for crotch. E = knit straight.
Broken line = centre front. Now knit sections E to A with reversed shapings to diagram, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Leg bands : yellow, knit two

Tubular, open at lower edge. Using contrast yarn cast on 65 sts back and front. Then knit RC 40 in yellow. End with contrast yarn, release.

To make up : Press contrast yarn only. Join centre back with back stitch, unravelling contrast yarn and 1 row knitted in red. Join crotch seam, gathering back edge slightly. St by st, backstitching into open loops, attach leg band first to outside of leg opening, then stitch to inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Make hem, insert waist elastic.

Bra

Fig. XVI : 1st half

A = begin with contrast yarn. Then work in stripes acc. to pattern, beginning with 8 rows yellow. At right knit straight, at left decr. B = at right cast on 19 (24) additional sts, continue straight. At left decr. C = at right knit straight, at left decr. Cast off.

Second half : reverse shapings.

Straps and tying bands :

Yellow. K/K. With 4 nds each and St.S 3 knit one strip approx. 85 cm / 33 1/2" and two strips approx. 65 cm / 25 1/2" long.

To make up : Unravel contrast yarn and cast off loose sts. Join sections A and B, matching arrows. Sew shorter bands, from circle to dot, to front neck line and tie loose ends as straps at nape of neck. Make a narrow hem of approx. 1/2 cm / 1/4" from dot to end of section C. Sew longer band to lower edge of bra and close loose ends with a hook at back.

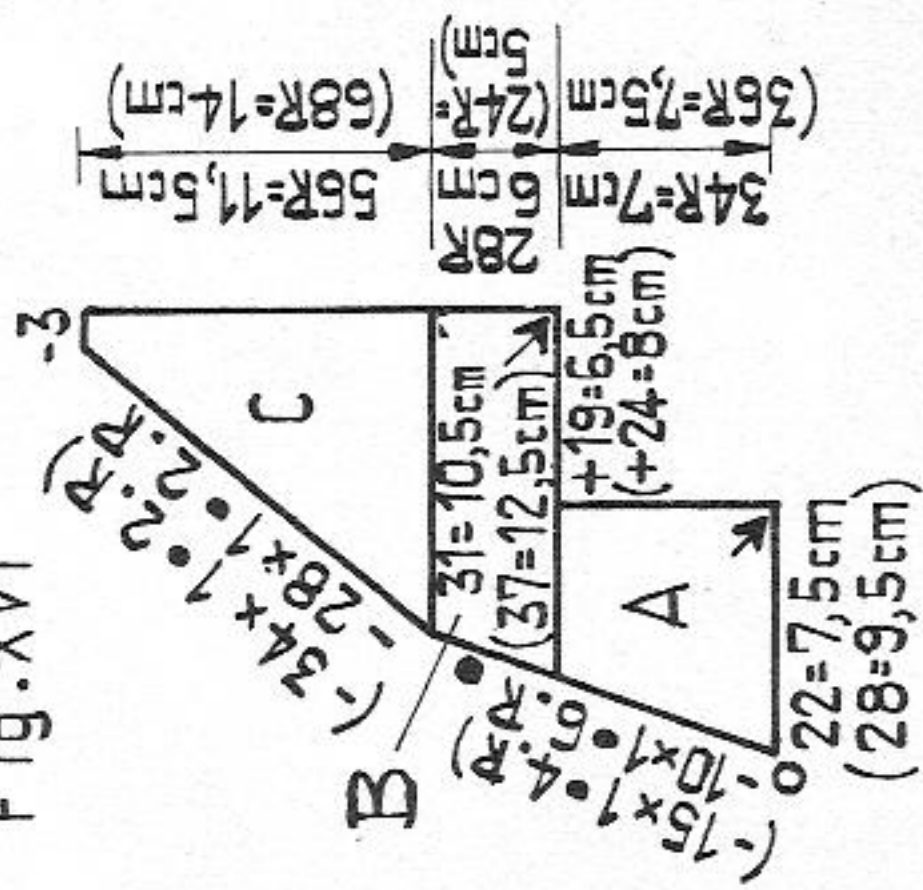
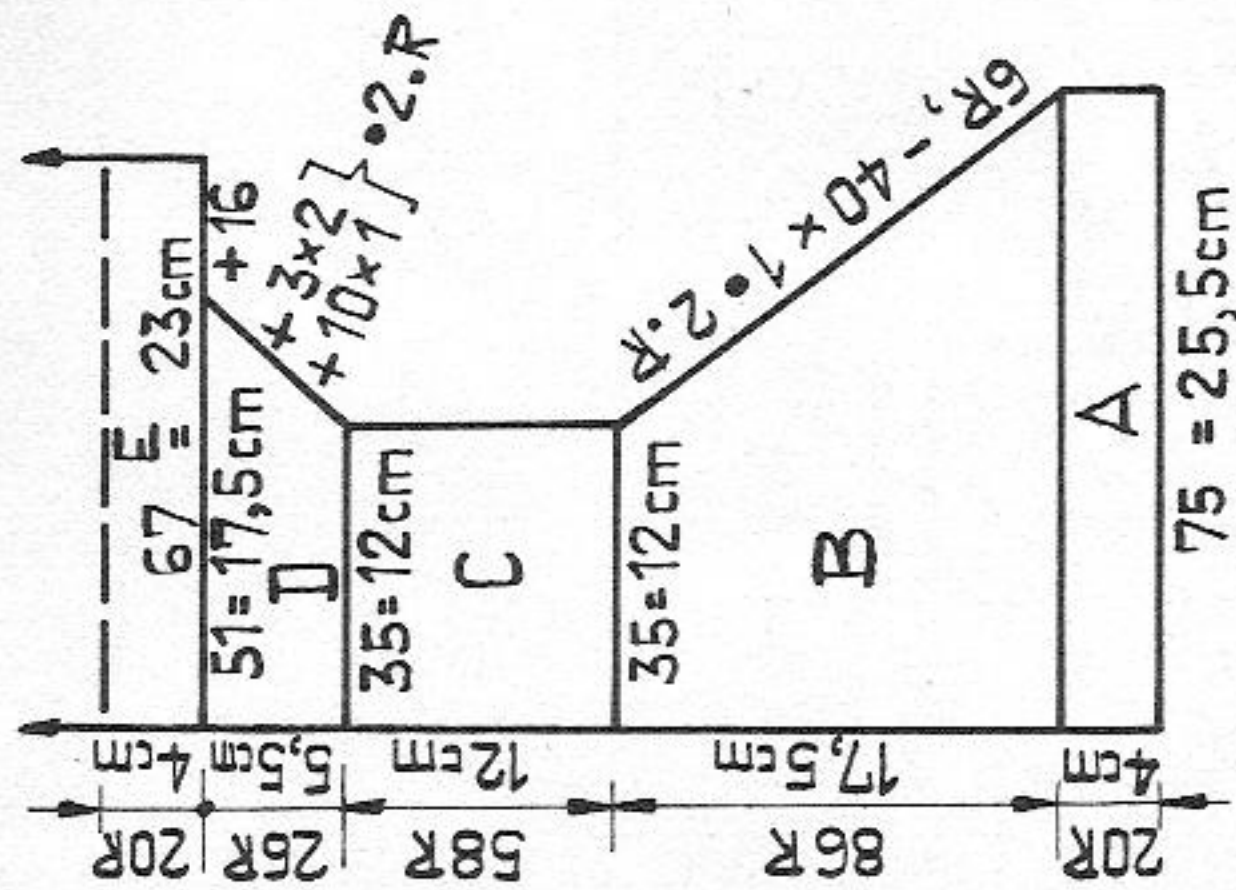

Backless top (to go with model 2383)

Size : to fit an 88 (96) cm / 34 1/2 (37 3/4) in. bust

Material : 250 gr / 9 ozs cotton/linen yarn, i.e. : 130 gr / 4 1/2 ozs offwhite, 80 gr / 3 ozs black and 40 gr / 1 1/2 ozs cognac. 1 length elastic

Stitch size : DUO = 5, COMBI = 4 3/4, tension arm 4, yarn brake 5

Test square : 100 sts = 36 cm / 14 1/4", 100 rows = 21 cm / 8 1/4"

Pattern : Stocking stitch, entirely in stripe-pattern : 4 rows offwhite, 2 rows black, 2 rows cognac, 2 rows black, repeat.

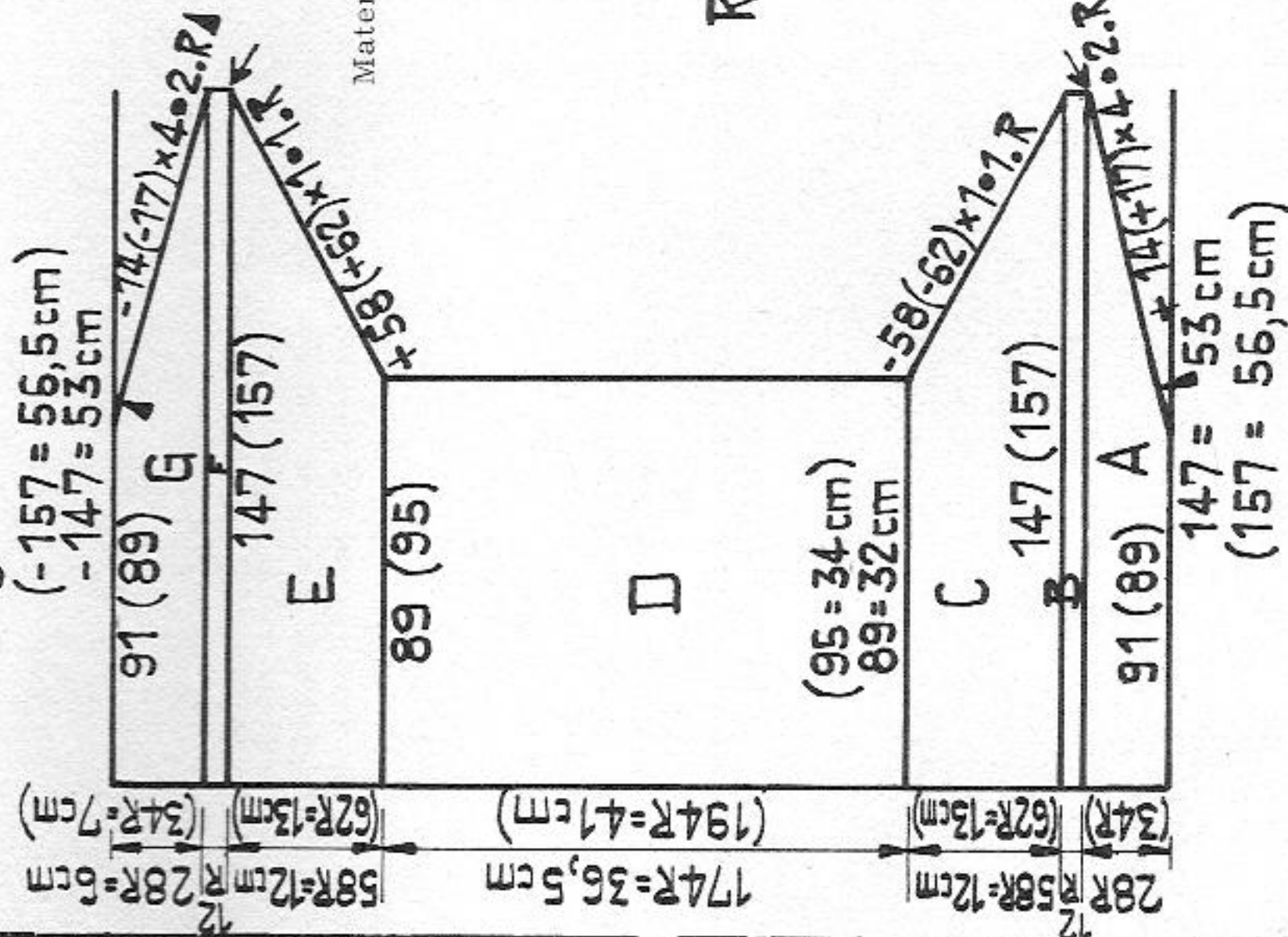
Fig. I + II : begin at centre front

A = using contrast yarn cast on 147 (157) sts and knit a few rows. Then, starting from inside shape neck using BX and pushers, at the same time begin stripe-pattern with 2 rows offwhite. B = 8 rows straight. C = decr. at right, knit straight at left. D = back, straight. E = increase at right. F = straight. G = at right, starting from outside, make graduations for neck using BX and pushers, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. IV : Collar. Tubular, offwhite. Begin at collar edge.

A = back and front put 116 nds into W.P., knit 1 row with lock at N/N, St.S 1 1/2, then with lock at CX/CX knit 2 rows with St.S 3 1/2, then St.S 5. At each end back and front decr. with double decker. Then at centre, back and front, knit a few rows with contrast yarn

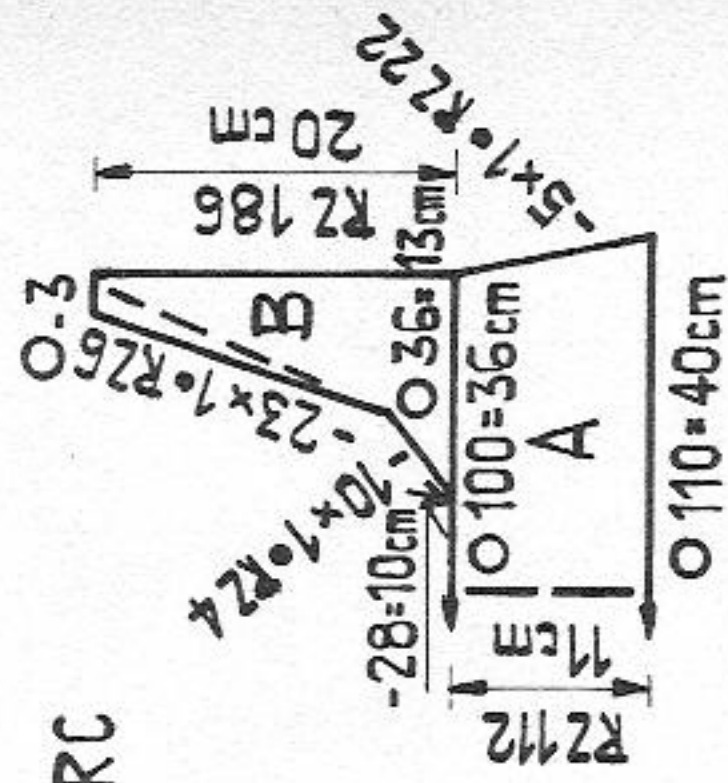

Dress in the "Folklore-Look"

Size: to fit an 88 - 92 cm / 34 1/2 - 36 1/4 in. bust

Material: 400 gr / 14 ozs fairly fine mohair/acrylic : 325 gr / 11 1/2 ozs offwhite, 30 gr / 1 oz red, 15 gr / 1/2 oz black, 15 gr / 1/2 oz green, 15 gr / 1/2 oz blue. 6 press studs.

Stitch size: 5 1/2

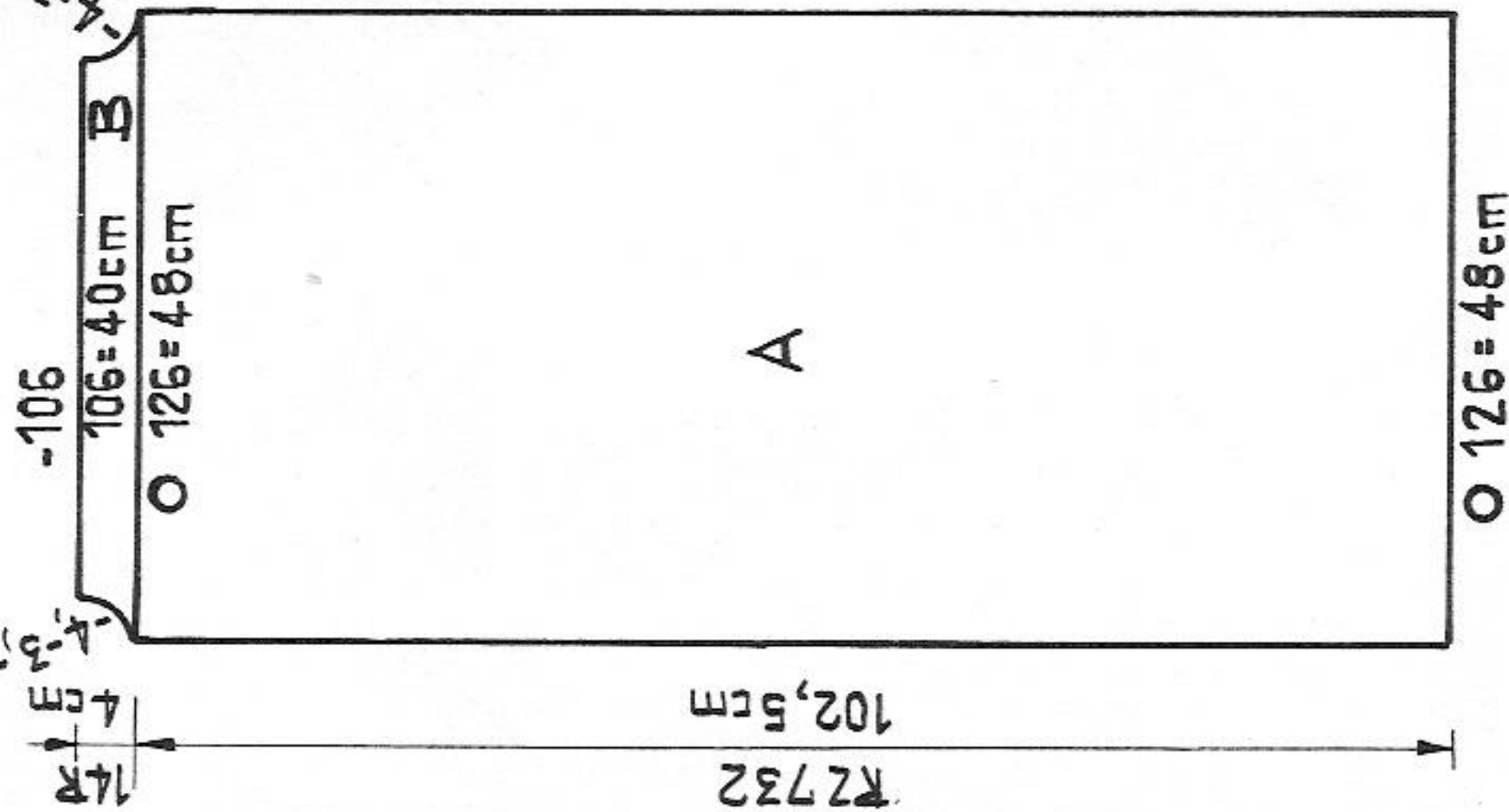
Test square: 100 sts = 38 cm / 15", 100 rows (RC 200) = 28 cm / 11"

Pattern: Stocking stitch, shoulder part and cuffs in fairisle, PASSAP Jac card 26 (45a)

Fig. I + II: front and back parts

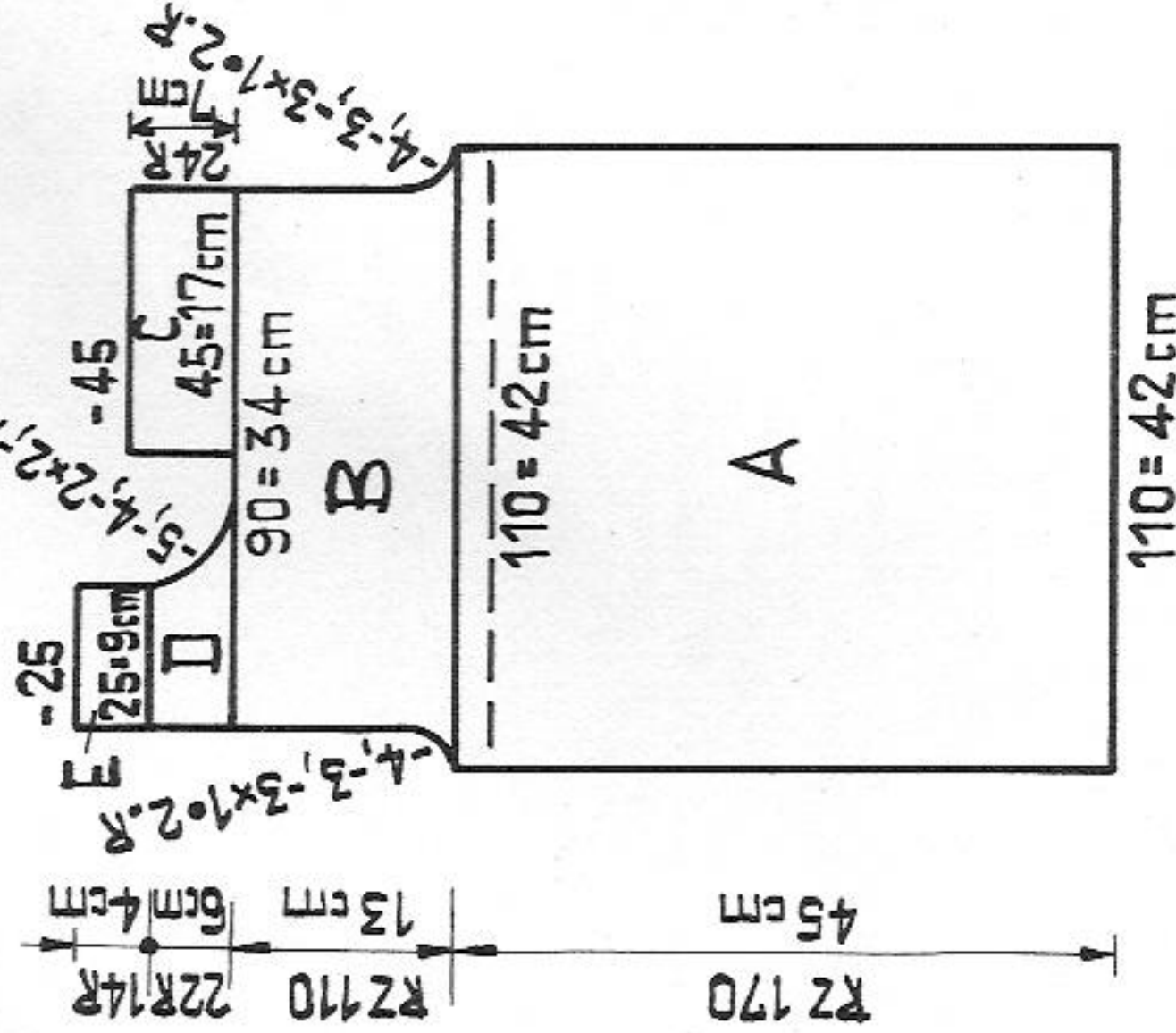
A = begin with contrast yarn, then knit tubular straight. B = with lock at back GX, front N, at each end shape armhole on front bed, end with contrast yarn, release. With lock at back N, front GX, repeat section B on back bed.

Fig. III: first sleeve with yoke

A = cast on with tubular rows, then transfer sts and knit stocking stitch. After 160 rows start single bed fairisle acc. to diagram. B = yoke, fairisle, at each end shape armhole. C = at right over 45 nds knit straight, stocking stitch, offwhite, using BX and pushers. A few rows with contrast yarn, release. D = stocking stitch, offwhite, at right shape neck, at left knit straight. E = hem for front opening: knit straight, end with contrast yarn, release. Second sleeve: knit with reversed shapings.

Cuffs:

Beginning with contrast yarn cast on 56 sts, knit 4 rows offwhite, then fairisle acc. to diagram C for cuffs, 46 rows offwhite in stocking stitch, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Collar: Beginning with contrast yarn cast on 96 sts, knit 46 rows offwhite, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up: Block and press parts. Join centre back seam of yoke with knit stitch. For centre front opening slip-stitch sections E to inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Join sleeve seams. Close cuff edges at each end. Gather sleeves and attach cuffs from outside, st by st, backstitching into open loops, unravel contrast yarn and slip-stitch to inside. St by st with backstitch attach collar to neck opening, unravel contrast yarn and slip-stitch to inside. Gather upper edge of dress and attach, st by st, from outside to yoke, unravelling contrast yarn. Make hem of dress acc. to desired length, unravelling contrast yarn. Press hem. Twist a cord and attach to front neck acc. to picture.

Belt:

Cast on 179 sts and knit 10 rows offwhite in stocking stitch. Knit sections A and B acc. to diagram (RC 72), then 10 rows offwhite in stocking stitch, cast off.

To make up: Press. Cut out a piece of stiff linen and shape the corners as in the picture. Pin the knitting on top of it, folding under any surplus material and attaching it at the back with feather stitch. To finish off use a matching piece of lining material. Ask your shoemaker to fix a hook at each side, and fasten the belt with a twisted wool cord.

Backless top

Size : to fit an 84 (92) cm / 33 (36 1/4) in. bust

Material : 230 (260) gr / 8 (9) ozs cotton yarn

Stitch size : AX-pattern = 4 3/4, K/K + 1:1 rib = 2 1/2, stocking stitch tubular 5

Test square : 100 sts = 36 cm / 14 1/4", 100 rows = 16, 5 cm / 6 1/2"

Pattern : AX-pattern acc. to diagram with PASSAP JAC card No. 4 (44), waistband 1:1 rib, neckband stocking stitch, tubular, collar K/K

Fig. I : back

A = cast on with tubular rows, knit straight. B = transfer sts to front, pushers in W.P., lock AX, and knit straight using the PASSAP JAC. Cast off.

Fig. II : front part

A + B as for Fig. I. C = divide work, placing left half on to dekercomb and noting position of JAC card. First half : decr. at each end acc. to diagram, then cast off. Second half : replace sts on to nds of machine and work with reversed shapings.

Fig. IV : collar (may be omitted)

With 220 nds make tubular cast-on for K/K. Decr. at each end back and front using double deker. Then transfer all sts to front, knit 1 row. Cast off.

Fig. V : Neck and strap band

A = cast on with contrast yarn, tubular, open at lower edge. Knit a few rows. Then, with basic colour knit straight at right, at left back and front decr. with single deker. B = at left incr. every RC 2 as follows : back and front move 1 st 1 nd out, placing the purl stitch loops of these sts on to empty nds. End with contrast yarn and release.

To make up : Block and press parts. Join side seams. Along armholes slip stitch approx. 1/2 cm / 1/4" to inside. Attach band first to outside of front neck opening, st by st with back stitch, then graft to inside. Then, using knit stitch, join the remainder into a tube for the straps, unravelling contrast yarn. 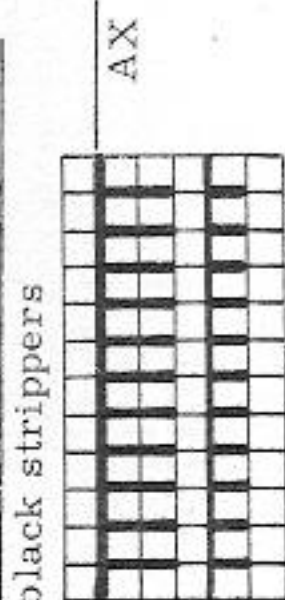


Chart for two-coloured loop pattern

Cords : navy. Tubular. With 1 nd at back, 2 nds at front, lock CX/CX, St.S 3 1/2, knit a cord measuring approx. 350 cm/138 in, cut into four equal parts, neaten ends.

To make up : Pin out bodice to size and press. First pin out skirt flat and press, then tack block pleats along large stitch row. Sew back and front parts, matching arrows, st by st with backstitch, to top edge of skirt, unravelling contrast yarn, taking care to stitch through all three layers of pleats. On both sides leave a 2 cm/3/4" gap between back and front parts. Join shoulder and sleeve seams, slip stitch sleeve bands to inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Gather sleeve head with a piece of thread, set in sleeves. Work 1 row of chain stitch all round back slit. Attach neckband first to outside of neck opening, st by st, backstitching into open loops, then slip stitch to inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Fasten with button and corresponding loop (worked in chain stitch). Make skirt hem acc. to desired length, press hem and pleats. Insert cords into pleats - see photograph (using green tool will facilitate this).

Pattern : Jumper knitted as one piece, stocking stitch, purlside inwards; sleeves, polo neck and waist bands 1:1 rib. Stripes : 2 rows black, 2 rows cognac, 2 rows black, 4 rows offwhite.

Fig. I + II : Begin at side seam

A = begin with contrast yarn. Cast on 91 sts, then knit in color sequence acc. to pattern, beginning with black. B = at left cast on 53 (57) extra sts (or place the sts of an old test square on to the nds of the machine). At left incr. for shoulder. C = back, knit straight. D = at left shape shoulder, then cast off 53 (57) sts for armhole. E = straight. F = at left cast on as for B, then incr. for shoulder. G = at left cast off 7 sts first, then shape neck. H = knit straight. I = at left incr. K = cast on 7 extra sts, then decr. for shoulder. Cast off for armhole. L = knit straight, ending with 4 rows offwhite. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. III : sleeve in 1:1 rib. Knit twice. Striped acc. to pattern.

A = using black cast on with tubular rows, continue with 2 rows cognac, 2 rows black, 4 rows offwhite etc. Increase at each end. B = knit 17 rows in 1:1 rib, then transfer sts to front for stocking stitch, knit 1 row with St.S 5, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Waist bands : 1:1 rib, stripes and cast-on as for Fig. III. Knit twice.

With 140 (146) nds knit 39 rows in 1:1 rib, transfer sts to front for stocking stitch, 1 row with St.S 5, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Polo neck : 1:1 rib. Stripes and cast-on as for Fig. I.

With 160 nds knit 67 rows in 1:1 rib, transfer sts to front for stocking stitch, knit 1 row with St.S 5, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up : Block and press parts. Using offwhite join jumper at side seam, unravelling contrast yarn and 1 row of offwhite (section L). Join shoulder seams. Sew on sleeves, matching arrows, st by st backstitching into open loops and unravelling contrast yarn, then join sleeve and armhole edges, matching dots. Join sleeve seams. Using mattress stitch close 1/3 of polo neck on outside, then 2/3 on inside, then, st by st with backstitch join it to neck opening, unravelling contrast yarn. Graft together waist bands and sew to edge of waist. Fold 1/3 of polo neck to outside.

With a total of 5 nds (back 2, front 3) knit tubular approx. 10 m/11 yds. Cut into 4 equal parts. Finish off ends neatly.

To make up : Block and press parts. Join flounce to skirt with mattress stitch, gathering flounce slightly. Sew bodice in the same way to skirt. Join dress all along one side, unravelling contrast yarn. Using all nds back and front and St.S 4 cast on with racking. Then, with lock on EX/EX knit approx. 1200 rows, taking special care to knot the different yarns securely together and using up the knots in knitting. Cast off loosely on both beds.
