The PASSAP DECO makes your DUOMATIC into a fully automatic punchcard pattern knitter. The PASSAP DECO programmes every type of pattern : tuck stitch, fairisle, slip stitch or raised patterns.

Our new model book contains a whole range of models that have been worked with the PASSAP DECO - you will find double-bed tuck stitch for a sensational raised effect (model 2515), generous fairisle patterns up to 40 stitches in width, and unlimited in height, as for model 2512. Or single motifs (model 2510) that can be placed quite easily anywhere you like with the PASSAP DECO.

Combined with the U 70, you can also programme lace patterns, as e.g. in model 2532.

And what's more, you now have the chance of knitting with three or four colours on one row! Special cards with programmed patterns for use with the PASSAP COLOR make this possible.

Last but not least, the PASSAP DECO can be fitted to most DUOMATICs, and naturally to the DUOMATIC 80, too. Why not ask your PASSAP dealer for full details or a demonstration?

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Models that have been knitted with the PASSAP DECO can of course also be worked without the PASSAP DECO on the DUOMATIC or DUOMATIC 80. You will find corresponding diagrams for most of the fairisle patterns, enabling you to either arrange the pushers by hand or punch a card for the PASSAP JAC. Where, due to lack of space, it has not been possible to fit in a diagram, similar cards from the wide range of JAC cards can be used.

Please remember :

If you knit on a DUOMATIC, always set the stitch size $1/2$ a number lower than the one indicated in the description.

Before starting your work please study carefully the explanations on pages 2 and 3

Patterns: The drawings refer to half width, the indications of stitch numbers refer to whole width of each part.

If the centre line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is worked simultaneously with reversed shapings, i. e. decreasing or increasing is made on the left as well as on the right side.

If the centre line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is worked separately with reversed shapings, i. e. first knit one part according to diagram (increasing or decreasing at right), then the second part the opposite way (decreasing or increasing at left).

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Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter "st"). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working Position on back and front bed.

Exception: For tubular or half tubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed. The same number of needles must therefore be put into Working Position on the other bed. In these cases the sign for tubular \bigcirc respectively (or) for half tubular is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increase or decrease always occurs in the first row of a section.

- $+3 \times 2 \cdot 8 \cdot R$ means: increase 2 stitches 3 times in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- $-19 \times 3 \cdot 7 \cdot R$ means: decrease 3 stitches 19 times in every 7th row (back 2 stitches, front 1 stitch or vice versa).
- $-17 \times 1 \cdot 2./3 \cdot R$ means: decrease 1 stitch 17 times, alternately once after 2 rows and once after 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle -4 \times 8 \cdot 2 \cdot R$ means: work graduations, i. e. short rows (on DUO with pushers and lock BX). Step by step put 8 nds (and their respective pushers) into Rest Position 4 times after every 2nd row (for double bed 4 nds each back and front). Once all graduations are finished, continue knitting normally, i. e. all nds in Working Position (pushers in Neutral Position).

Graduations can be knitted two ways, either from outer edge towards centre (gradual decreasing with the minus-sign "-" after the black triangle) or from the centre towards outer edge (gradual increasing with the plus-sign "+" after the black triangle.)

Number of stitches and centimetres :

- $136 = 20 \text{ cm}$ means: a total of 136 sts (for K/K 68 stitches each on back and front) make a width of 20 cm.
- $\bigcirc 146 = 43 \text{ cm}$ means: cast on 146 sts each on back and front bed for tubular which makes a width of 43 cm.

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be tested by you, by making your own test square for your own wool.

Test square: We strongly recommend that you make always a test square with your own material before starting to work, in order to calculate for your material the necessary numbers of stitches and rows along the PASSAP - chart. The chapter "The test square and its calculation" in your instruction book informs you how to proceed for these calculations. This is very important, especially when adjusting a model to another size.

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Sweater

- Size : 84 to 92 cm / 33 to 36 1/4 in. bust
 Material : 350 gr / 12 1/2 ozs mohair/polyacryl
 Stitching : Stocking stitch 6, pattern 5
 Stitch size : 50 sts = 26 cm / 10 1/4", 50 rows = 18 cm / 7"
 Test square : Stocking stitch knitted with every alternate needle, purlside used as right side. Sleeve turn ups, bands and collar AX-pattern acc. to diagrams 1 + 2.

Fig. I :

A = tubular cast-on over 89 nds acc. to diagram 1, 1st row St.S 2, 2nd row St.S 3, 3rd row St.S 3, 4th row St.S 4. Then knit straight in pattern. B = transfer sts to front for st.st., knit straight. C = shape armhole at both ends, continue straight. D = shape shoulder at both ends, cast off loosely.

Fig. II :

A + B until 94th row as for Fig. I. C = divide work, cast off loosely 15 sts at centre. Place 37 sts at left onto dekercombs, knit straight at right. D = shape armhole at right, knit straight at left. E = straight at right, shape neck at left. F = shape shoulder at right, knit straight at left.

Fig. III :

Second shoulder : return sts to nds of machine and knit sections C to F with reversed shapings. A = bring nds into W.P. acc. to diagram 2, make tubular cast-on, knit straight acc. to diagram 2. B = transfer sts to front for st.st., knit straight. C = shape sleeve head at both ends, cast off.

Fig. IV :

collar with neckband
 A = over 75 nds cast-on as for Fig. I. Knit straight in pattern. Then cast off loosely 57 sts at centre. B = place 9 sts onto dekercombs at left, make a note of the pusher position. At right knit neckband straight in pattern, cast off. Then, at left return sts. to nds of machine, knit straight, cast off.

To make up : Insert a fine knitting needle into the tubular cast-on rows, and pull into shape. Pin out parts to size and press under a wet cloth without exerting pressure. Join shoulders, sew on collar. Sew neckband invisibly onto edge of neck opening, sewing the ends into position from the inside of the neck opening. Join side and sleeve seams, use bands as turn-ups. Set in sleeves.

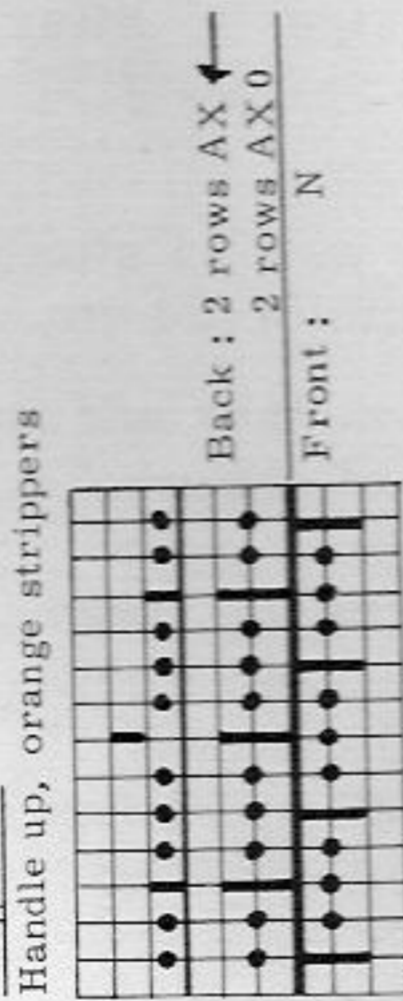

Handle up, orange strippers

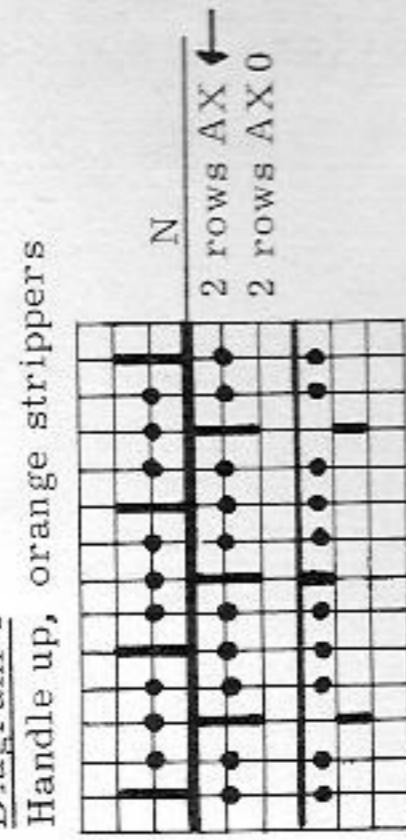

Stitch size : Fairisle = 2 1/2, stocking stitch white = 5
Test square : Fairisle : 100 sts = 13 cm / 5 1/8", RC 100 = 8, 5 cm / 3 3/8"
Pattern : Stocking stitch : 100 sts = 30 cm / 11 3/4", 100 rows = 23 cm / 9"

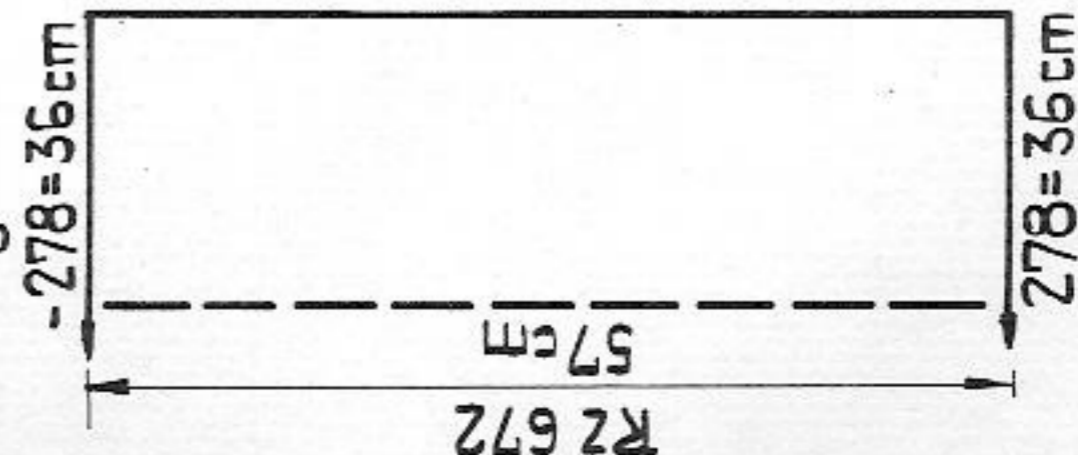

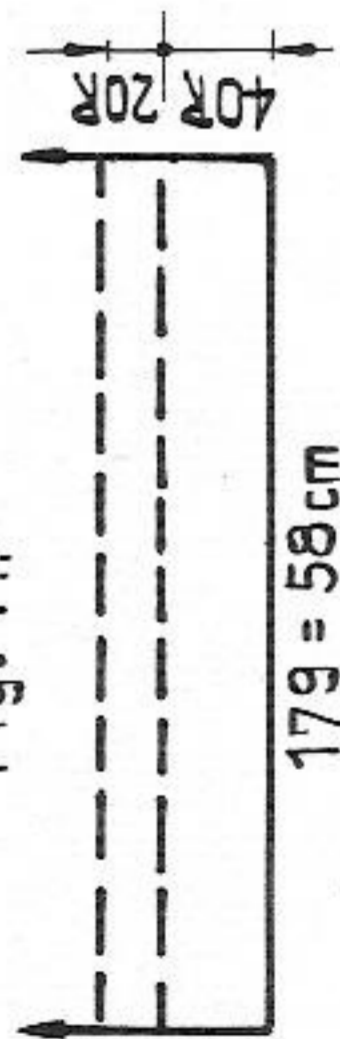

 Tubular cast-on in cognac. Then fairisle acc. to diagram. Knit straight.
Fig. VII : white, pleats

Begin with contrast yarn. Cast on 179 sts for stocking stitch. Then, knit * 39 rows St. S 5, 1 row St. S 6 1/2, 19 rows St. S 5, 1 row St. S 4 *. Repeat from * to * 14 times more.
 60 rows = 1 pleat = 4 cm / 1 1/2 in. To end with, knit 40 rows St. S 5. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Waist band : white, taken two-fold. Stocking stitch, tubular.

Begin with contrast yarn. On each bed cast on 7 sts. Knit a band to required measurements (i. e. to fit waist + 10 cm / 4 in.). End with contrast yarn, release. Press. Insert elastic, and join ends of waist band with graft stitch.

To make up : Press fairisle panel. First press the pleated part flat, then pin the pleats into position along the loose knitted rows, and press again. Tack the upper edge. Sew beginning and end of pleated part invisibly, st by st, to fairisle part (underneath), unravelling contrast yarn. Crochet waist band to waist, using green tool.

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Shawl with knotted fringe

Material : 235 gr / 8 1/2 ozs machine wool taken threefold : 210 gr / 7 1/2 ozs white, 25 gr / 1 oz cognac
Pattern : Stocking stitch, tubular
Stitch size : 5
No test square.

Lay a zig-zag thread over 100 nds on each bed. Set lock to CX/CX. Knit 25 times : RC 60 white, RC 4 cognac, RC 60 white. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.
To make up : Press. Neaten threads on wrong side of knitting. Join end with graft stitch, unravel contrast yarn. Make knotted fringe at both ends.

Material : 800 m length per 100 gr
 251 yds per 1 oz
 10 cm = approx. 4"

Material : medium wool white and blue
Carpet pattern : EX back and front all nds in W. P.
 CX knit 2 rows with both locks
 knit 2 rows with front lock only
 (to release loops)
Stitch size : back 4, front 1 1/4
Squares :

Knit 7 blue and 8 white squares.

1 square = 60 sts (back) RC 300

Cast on 60 sts on back bed, knit RC 300, cast off.

Edging :

In carpet pattern, with 30 sts knit 2 strips of approx. RC 2100 and 2 strips of approx. RC 900.

To make up : Press parts lightly. Join the squares in accordance with the photo. Sew on edging.

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To make up: Block and press parts. Matching dots and arrows, sew sleeves between front and back part with mattress stitch. Join side and sleeve seams. Join collar with mattress stitch and sew to neck opening (taking it slightly lower at the back), st by st backstitching into open loops, and unravelling contrast yarn.

Sweater with raglan sleeves

- Size: approx. 14 years old, height 164 cm/64 1/2
 - Material: 220 (240) gr / 8 (8 1/2) ozs Industrial wool, 4-fold
 - Stitch size: DUOMATIC 80 stocking stitch = 5 1/2, 1:1 rib = 2 1/4
 - Test square: COMBI stocking stitch = 4 3/4, 1:1 rib = 1 1/2, tension arm 4 1/2, yarn brake 5 1/2
 - Pattern: 100 sts = 24, 5 cm/9 3/4", 100 rows = 27 cm/10 1/2"
- Stocking stitch, raglan shaping with quintuple decker. Bands and polo neck in 1:1 rib.

Fig. I:

A = tubular cast-on for 1:1 rib, knit straight. B = transfer sts for stocking stitch, knit straight. C = stocking stitch. Shape raglan at both ends as follows: every second row move alternatively 5 sts by 1 nd, then by 2 nds in. Cast off.

Fig. II:

A + B as for Fig. I. C = at both ends decr. as for Fig. I. D = divide work. Cast off 14 (16) sts at centre. At left take sts onto deckercombs. For 1st part: shape raglan at right, at left shape neck. For 2nd part: return sts to nds of machine and knit with reversed shapings.

Fig. III:

first sleeve
A = tubular cast-on for 1:1 rib, knit straight. B = transfer sts for stocking stitch, incr. at both ends. C = shape raglan at both ends as given for Fig. I. D = at right shape neck, at left shape raglan. Second sleeve: as for first sleeve, but reversing shapings for section D.

Polo neck:

With 178 nds tubular cast-on for 1:1 rib, knit 100 rows. Transfer sts for stocking stitch. Knit 1 row with St. S 5 1/2, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Material for two curtains measuring 220 cm/87 inches in length = 1500 gr/53 ozs fine cotton yarn.

Handle down, blue strippers



Back and front: St. S 4
4 R AX, rack 1 nd to the left
2 R N, rack 1 nd to the right
repeat

Bring 120 nds and 60 pushers into W.P. on each bed, acc. to diagram. Cast on with racking with lock on N/N. Then knit straight in pattern acc. to diagram to required length. Knit 10 rows with St. S 5 1/2, lock at back GX, front N, then change lock at back to N, front GX, knit 10 rows. Transfer all sts from back to front bed and cast off together.

Man's zip-up jacket

- Size :** chest 100 (110) cm / 39 1/2 (43 1/4) inches
220 gr / 8 ozs nubby cotton/acrylic yarn, 170 gr / 6 ozs polyacryl,
1 open-ended zip fastener.
- Stitch size :** 6 1/2, 1:1 rib = 3 1/2, K/K = 4
- Test square :** 100 sts = 36 cm / 14 1/4", 100 rows = 30 cm / 11 3/4"
- Pattern :** Stocking stitch, welt and bands 1:1 rib, collar and pocket trimming K/K.

Fig. I :

Make tubular cast-on with polyacryl, knit straight. B = knit st. st. straight with nubby cotton yarn. C = shape armholes at both ends, continue straight. D = cast off 20 (30) in the centre, place left part onto dekercombs, for right part: shape shoulder at right, at left shape neck. Left part : return sts to nds of machine, and knit with reversed shapings.

Fig. II : knit two parts with reversed shapings.
A = as for Fig. I. B = knit stocking stitch straight with nubby cotton yarn. C = at right place 14 sts of section D onto dekercombs, then, alternately, decr. 1 or 2 sts, knit st. st. straight at left, place these left side sts on dekercombs. D = return right side sts to nds of machine, knit straight at right, incr. at left. E = return left side sts to nds of machine, knit st. st. straight. F = shape armhole at right, knit straight at left. G = knit straight at right, cast off 12 (18) sts at left, then shape neck. H = shape shoulder at right, knit straight at left.

Fig. III : knit two parts alike

A = with polyacryl tubular cast-on in 1:1 rib, knit straight. B = with nubby cottan yarn, increase at both ends, knit stocking stitch. C = shape sleeve head at both ends.

Fig. IV :

A = tubular cast-on, K/K, decr. at both ends with double decker. B = knit RC 8 tubular with lock at front and back on CX and St.S 6. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. VI :

A = begin with contrast yarn, then st. st. tubular, incr. at right, decr. at left. B = knit straight at right, decr. at left. C = decr. at right and left, cast off.

Pocket trimming: knit two parts alike

With 60 sts, K/K, tubular cast-on, with polyacryl, knit 6 rows. Transfer sts to front bed, knit 2 rows st. st. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up : Block and press parts. Sew pockets to the edge of the slit st by st, backstitching into the open loops, and unravelling contrast yarn. Sew trimming into position along the edge of the pocket, st by st, backstitching into the open loops, and unravelling contrast yarn. Slip stitch side edge of trimming to jacket. Join shoulder seams. Set in sleeves. Sew collar to neck opening, st by st, backstitching into the open loops, and unravelling contrast yarn. Catch down on inside. Join sleeve and side seams. Press seams.

Handle down, black strippers

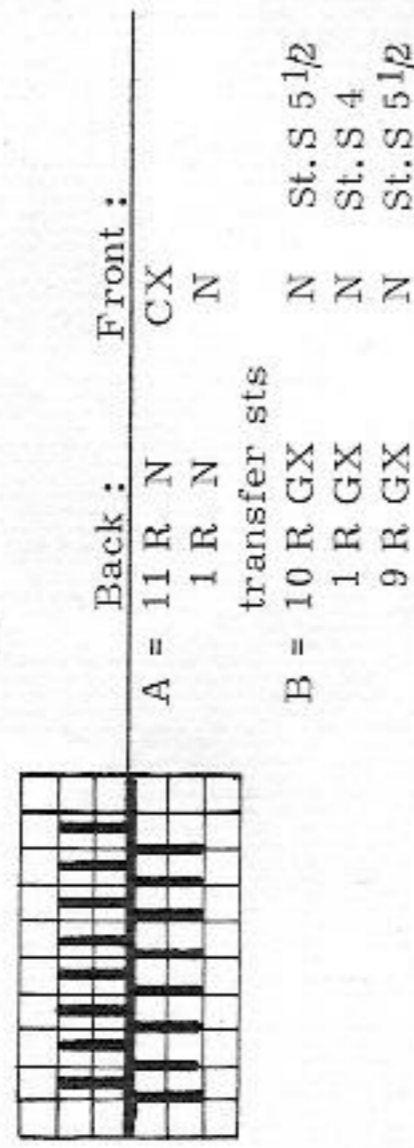


Fig. VII + VIII :

Begin with contrast yarn. Knit sections A + B 31 (32, 33) times, beginning and ending with 10 rows st. st. for section B. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.
Waistband : Stocking stitch, tubular.
 With 7 nds on each bed, lock CX/CX, knit a few rows with contrast yarn. Then knit a tubular piece to required length (waist measurements + approx. 10 cm / 4 inches). End with contrast yarn, release. Press. Insert elastic, and graft together.
To make up : Press pinned out part, then arrange pleats and press again hard. Graft together beginning and end, unravelling contrast yarn. Starting at the waist, sew down pleats with invisible sts along approx. 16 cm / 6 1/2 inches. Crochet waistband on with green tool.

Fig. VII + VIII

Material : 550 m length per 100 gr
 172 yds per 1 oz
 10 cm = approx. 4"

Fig. I : back. Stocking stitch, half tubular, open at right.

A = using contrast yarn, cast on 103 sts on each bed. Knit a few rows. Change to offwhite, using 24-deckercomb decr. at right back and front, i.e. always move 24 sts 1 nd in. At left knit straight. B = knit straight. C = to shape armhole, cast off at right back and front, then decr. acc. to diagram. D = tuck pattern; using brown, knit RC 16, then place all purlstitch loops of last row of C onto needles. E = offwhite. Knit straight. F = divide work for neck : at left back and front cast off 10 sts each, then knit first shoulder on front bed, second shoulder on back bed acc. to diagram.

Fig. II :

A = begin with contrast yarn. Knit 64 rows straight, then decr. at both ends with quintuple decker. B = knit 72 rows straight, then make bust darts with graduations starting from the outside. C = shape armhole at both ends, continue straight. D = divide work, place 49 sts onto deckercombs, knit straight in offwhite. E = tuck pattern : 8 rows brown, then place purlstitch loops of last row of D onto needles. F = offwhite, straight. G = incr. at right, shape neck at left. H = shape shoulder at right, knit straight at left. For second shoulder return sts at left to nds of machine, and knit sections D to H with reversed shapings.

Fig. IIIa : left sleeve

A = hem : begin with contrast yarn. Knit straight. B = 8 rows brown for tuck pattern, then place purlstitch loops of last row of A onto needles. C = offwhite, incr. at both ends. D = shape sleeve head with graduations starting from outside with BX and pushers. E = 4 rows brown with all nds, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. IIIb : right sleeve with fairisle motif acc. to diagram

A + B as for left sleeve. C = 14 rows offwhite, incr. once at the edge. D = fairisle motif at centre of sleeve : for each needle in W.P. place 1 pusher in W.P. Then acc. to diagram place pushers into R.P., knit 1 row brown, at left wind yarn round the first needle which no longer knits in brown, 1 row brown, then 2 rows offwhite. Cont. incr. at both ends, always moving 1 pusher for each new stitch from the blocking rail into W.P. E = sleeve head shaping as for left sleeve (but with pushers in blocking rail), at back finish fairisle motif. F = offwhite, cont. graduations for sleeve head. E = 4 rows brown, a few rows contr. yarn, release.
Neckband : brown. Begin with contrast yarn. Knit 8 rows over 170 nds. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Lateral trimmings : brown. Begin with contrast yarn. Knit 8 rows with 170 sts, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up : Block and press parts. Join shoulder seams. Join side seams with mattress stitch, always catching 1 stitch of the vertical tuck pattern. Sew neckband to outside of neck opening and front slit, st by st, backstitching into open loops, shaping corners at front, then catch down on inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Join sleeve seams and make hem, st by st; then, st by st, set in sleeves using brown, and unravelling contrast yarn. Unravel contrast yarn along hem, and cast off by hand. Make hem. Press.

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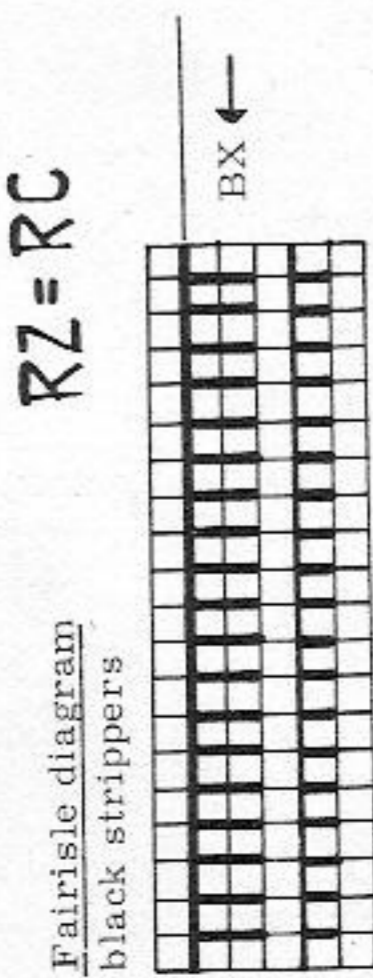
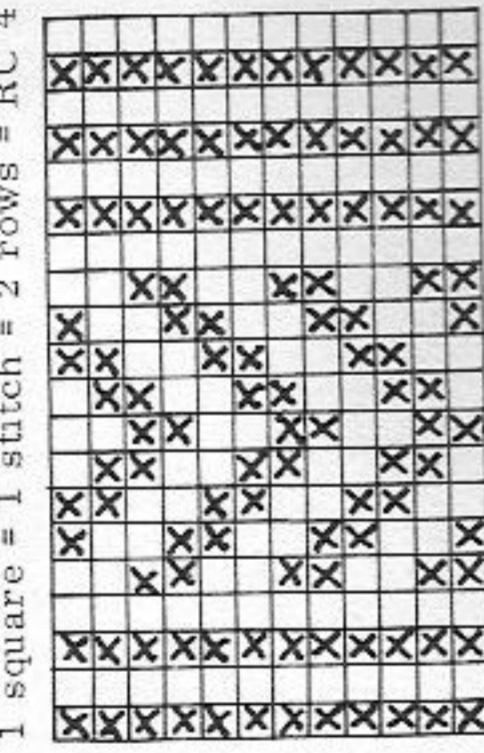

Material: 350 (380) gr / 12 1/2 (13 1/2) ozs fairly fine mohair/acrylic; 190 (210) gr / 7 (7 1/2) ozs white, 160 (170) gr / 5 1/2 (6) ozs yellow 5 1/4
Stitch size: 100 sts = 31 cm / 12 1/4", RC 100 = 13,5 cm / 5 1/4"
Test square: Single-bed fairisle acc. to diagram or punchcard 89 PASSAP DECO.
Pattern: Bands and hems in stocking stitch.

1 square = 1 stitch = 2 rows = RC 4

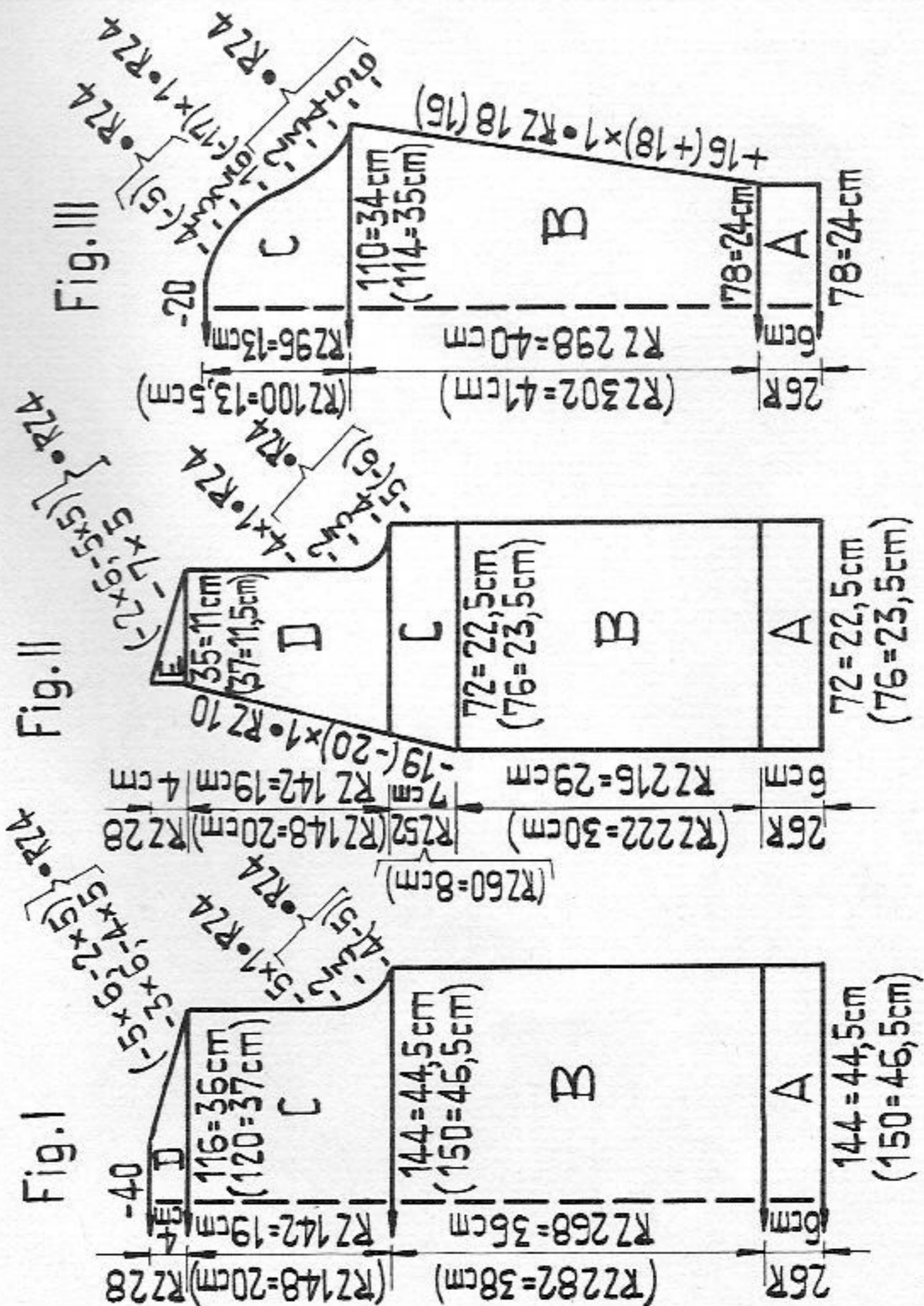

Fig. III: knit two sleeves alike
A = begin with contrast yarn. Stocking stitch, white. B = fairisle pattern, incr. at both ends. C = shape sleeve head at both ends, cast off.

Neckband: white

Cast on 122 (128) sts on each bed with contrast yarn. Half tubular, open at right (right arrow keyes). Knit RC 52. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press under damp cloth - very lightly. Join side and shoulder seams. Fold hem 3 cm / 1" to inside and catch down st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Sew on neckband on the outside, st by st, backstitching into open loops, then catch down on inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Join sleeves, make hem as for cardigan hem. Set in sleeves. Lightly press seams, bands and hems.

Tubular cast-on over 140 sts in 1:1 rib. Knit 74 rows. Transfer sts for st. st., knit 1 row. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up: Block and press parts. Join shoulder seams. Join polo neck with mattress st and sew to neck st by st, backstitching into the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. Join side and sleeve seams. Set in sleeves.

At left put 1 pusher into Rest Position until only 2 pushers remain in W.P. on the front bed = 26 rows. Return all pushers into W.P. Repeat 6 times more. End with contrast yarn. Graft together beginning and end, unravelling contrast yarn.

Bottle mat:

With 20 nds and pushers on front bed and 2 nds on back bed knit as for glass mats. Each sections consists of 36 rows.

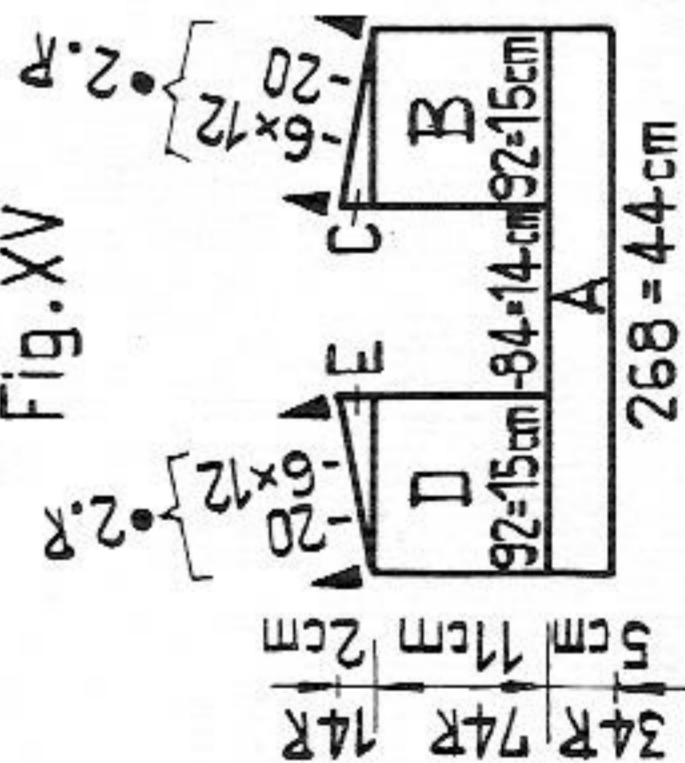
Begin with contrast yarn. Cast on 175 sts on each bed. Knit half tubular, open at right. Colour sequence: 6 times: RC 8 pale green, RC 8 dark green, RC 8 medium green (= RC 144). Then twice: RC 44 pale green, RC 4 dark green, RC 4 medium green, RC 4 pale green, RC 4 dark green and RC 4 medium green. Then 5 times: RC 8 medium green, RC 8 pale green, RC 8 dark green. For first armhole: with contrast yarn, BX and pushers, knit approx. 10 rows over 40 sts at right front. For front part: 6 times: RC 8 pale green, RC 8 dark green, RC 8 medium green = RC 144. Then RC 44 pale green, RC 4 dark green, RC 44 medium green, RC 4 pale green, RC 4 dark green. For neck: at front, over 58 sts, knit a few rows with contrast yarn with BX and pushers. Then RC 4 medium green, RC 44 pale green, RC 4 dark green, RC 44 medium green, RC 4 pale green, RC 44 dark green. Then 6 times: RC 8 medium green, RC 8 pale green, RC 8 dark green. End with contrast yarn, release.

Yoke:

Fig. XV: A = using contrast yarn cast on 134 sts on front bed, knit a few rows. Add 134nds at back, lock at front to N, back CX, St.S 4, knit 34 rows straight. Cast off 84 sts at centre, at left place 92 sts onto dekercombs or thread. B = knit straight, C = graduations with BX and pushers: front and back 46 nds each in W.P., lock front BX 0. back BX ←→ Knit 1 row, right back and front 10 pushers into blocking rail, knit 2 rows, at right 6 pushers each into blocking rail, etc. Cast off. D = return sts to nds of machine, and knit as for B. E = at left on each bed 10 pushers into blocking rail, knit 2 rows, etc. Cast off.

To make up: Block and press parts. Unravel contrast yarn on armhole and neck, and cast off loose sts by hand. Graft front part and back together, unravelling contrast yarn. Leave an opening of 40 sts for second armhole, and cast these off by hand. Thread shoulders and back onto a length of yarn. Sew on yoke from inside with back stitch. At front neck opening sew on button and loop to match. Press dress, and make hem. For belt: using one of each colour knit a belt 150 cm/59" long, tubular, with 3nds on each bed.

Test square : 100 sts = 52 cm / 20 1/2", 100 rows = 27,5 cm / 10 3/4"
Pattern : Bands 1:1 rib, sweater transfer pattern with U 70 acc. to diagram or with punchcard 70 PASSAP DECO.

Material : 640 m length per 100 gr
 200 yds per 1 oz
 10 cm = approx. 4"

Fig. I:

A = tubular cast-on in 1:1 rib, knit 70 rows. B = transfer sts for st. st., knit in pattern acc. to diagram, straight. C = decr. at both ends, cast off loosely.

Fig. II:

A + B as for Fig. I. C = decr. at both ends. D = divide work for neck: place sts onto decker-combs at left (with DECO make a note of RC on punchcard). For first part shape raglan at right, at left shape neck. For second part return sts to nds of machine and knit with reversed shapings.

Fig. III: first sleeve

A = tubular cast-on in 1:1 rib, knit 50 rows. B = transfer sts for st. st., knit in pattern, incr. at both ends, taking care that at least 3 sts at each end knit in st. st. C = decr. at both ends. D = shape neck at right, at left shape raglan. Second sleeve: A, B and C as for first sleeve, section D with reversed shapings.

Neckband : st. st., tubular, St. S 5 1/2

Begin with contrast yarn. Cast on 86 sts on each bed, lock CX/CX, knit RC 2, then at left 10 times decr. 1 st back and front every RC 2 using single decker = RC 24. Then every RC 2 incr. 1 st each back and front as follows: move 1 st 1 nd out, and place purlstitch loop of this st onto empty nd = RC 24. End with contrast yarn, release.

To make up: Block and press parts. Sew sleeves, matching dots and arrows, between back and front part. Join sleeve and side seams. Sew neckband first to outside, then to inside, st by st backstitching into open loops, and unravelling contrast yarn. Press.

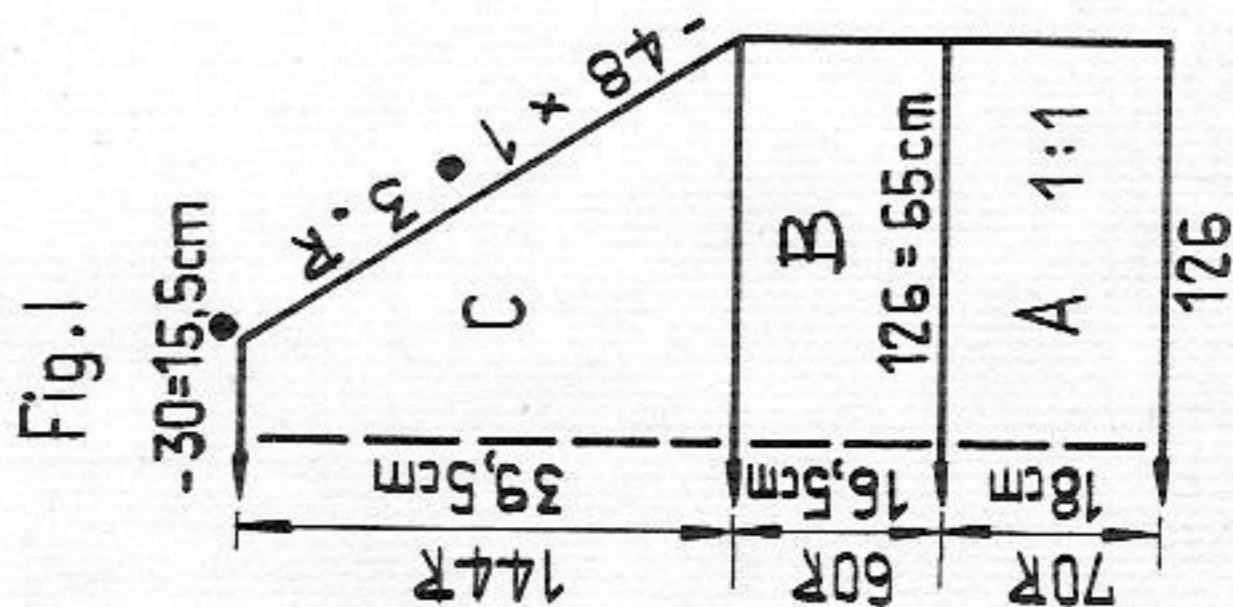

Stitch size: DUOMATIC 80 = 7, COMBI = 6 1/2, yarn brake 4, tension arm 7.
Test square: 100 sts = 43,5 cm/17 1/4", 100 rows (RC 200) = 34 cm/13 1/2"
Pattern: Stocking stitch, stocking stitch tubular and half tubular.

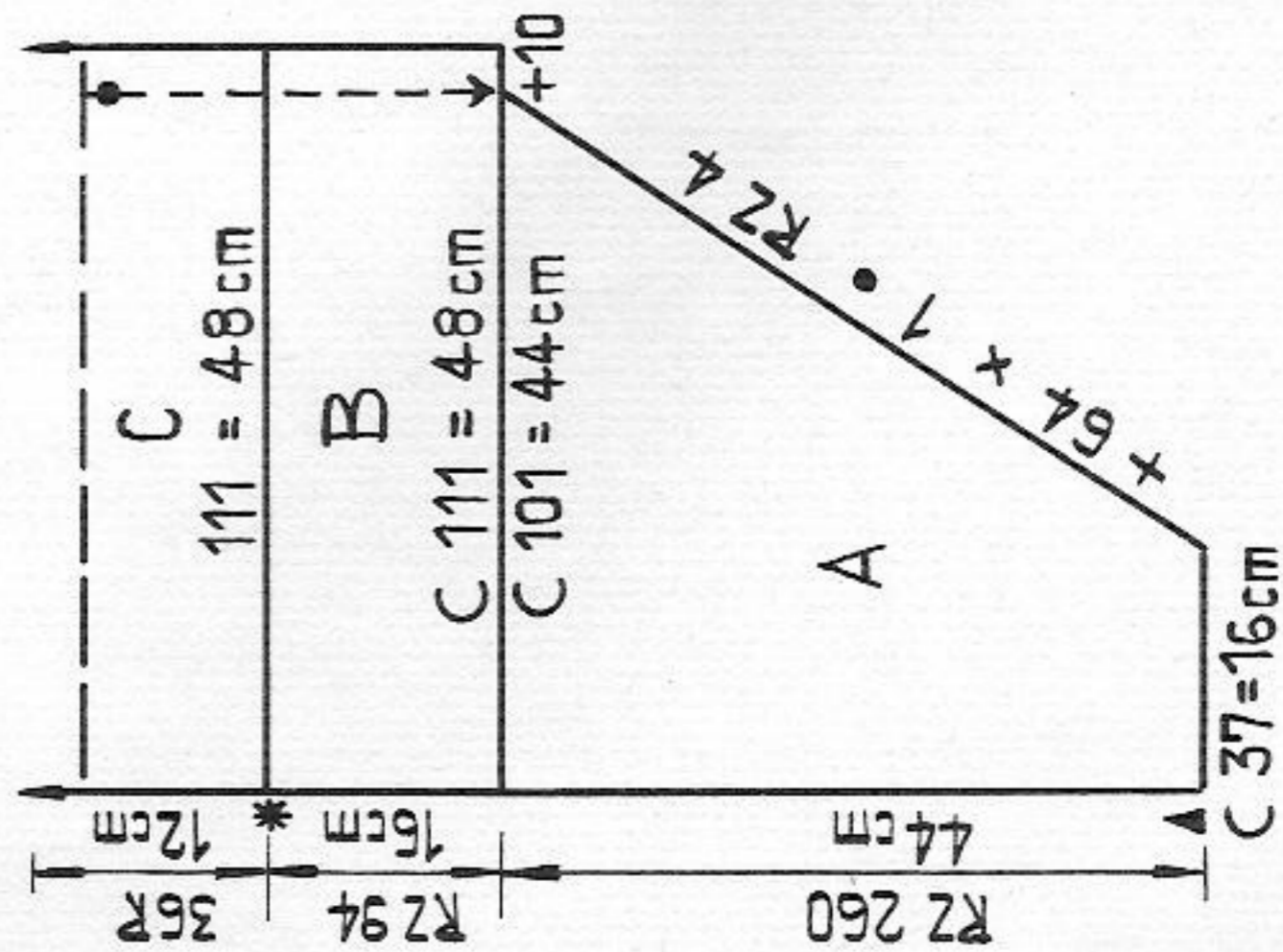

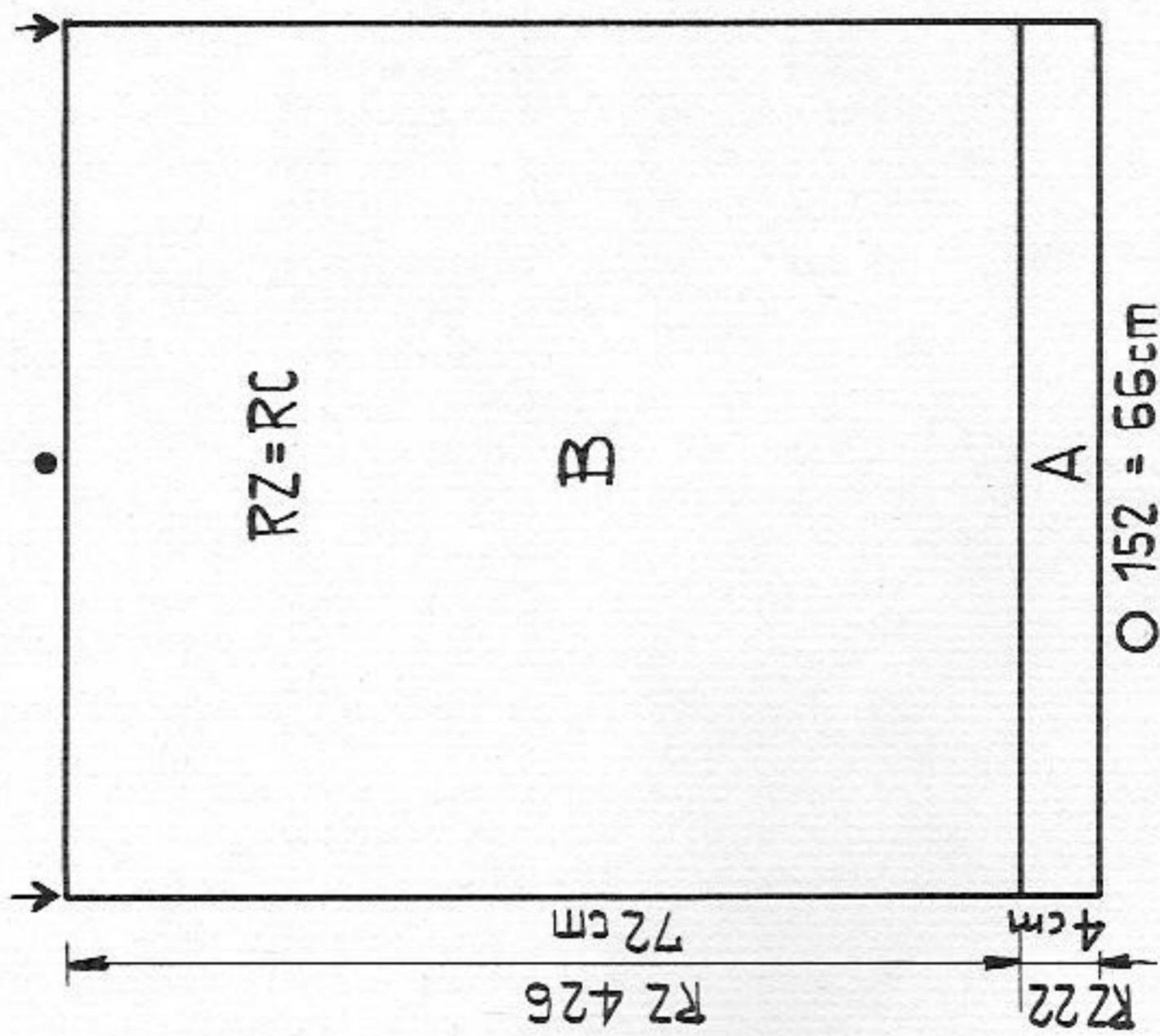


Fig. I + II + III:

A = begin with contrast yarn, half tubular, open at right, pink, incr. at right on front and back bed. B = half tubular, knit straight. C = lock at back GX, front N, knit straight, then lock at back N, front GX, knit straight. Repeat sections C + B + A (with reversed shapings, i.e. decreasing for A), a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. VII + VIII:

A = begin with contrast yarn, knit 22 rows tubular, st. st., straight, lilac. B = knit straight, in colour sequence acc. to chart. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Belt:

Knit belt approx. 160 cm/63" long with rayon, tubular, with 4 nds on front bed, 3 nds on back bed, St. S 5.

Sleeve bands: knit twice

With rayon, pink, tubular, at front 2 nds, at back 1 nd, St. S 3, approx. 180 cm/70" long. To make up: Block and press parts. Sew skirt, st by st, backstitching into open loops, onto bodice as per broken line on diagram. Slip stitch lower edge of bodice to skirt, insert belt.

Join sleeve seams, at wrist fold in 2 rows, sew into position, unravelling contrast yarn. For inserting sleeve bands, sew silk band to inside of sleeve from star to triangle with 3 rows of stitches. Insert sleeve band into silk band, between the rows of stitches, starting at wrist up to shoulder and back again to wrist. Make skirt hem to required length.

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Models marked with * include instructions for the PASSAP COMBI.
 Models marked with "U 70" can be worked only with the help of the U 70 transfer lock.
