The new Pattern Leader from PASSAP.

It does away with tedious calculations of stitches and rows and ensures that every piece of knitting results in a perfect shape.

In the present model book you will find three garments knitted with PASSAP forma. The patterns are part of the nine basic patterns that come with every PASSAP forma. Of course, there are also blank pattern sheets on which you can draw models of your own. In addition, there will be available in the future further selections of printed patterns for other models.

PASSAP forma can be attached to all models of the DUOMATIC range. Please ask your stockist about it, for you will certainly find that knitting with PASSAP forma is easier and simpler and therefore still more fun.

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DUOMATIC S

All models which can be knitted on the DUOMATIC S are marked "DUOMATIC 80/S". The few that are not marked in this way, are mainly garments which have been knitted in double-bed fairisle using pushers on the back bed. However, all these patterns can of course also be knitted on the DUOMATIC S, if you follow the instructions given in the instruction book, that is, if you set the back lock at N.

Note : If you do this, you will of course obtain a completely different test square, as fairisle knitted on the DUOMATIC S results in a much longer piece of knitting, in other words, you get more centimetres for the same number of rows. It is therefore a must to make a new test square when a fairisle pattern originally knitted on a DUOMATIC 80 is to be worked on a DUOMATIC S.

And remember :

If you knit on a DUOMATIC, always set the stitch size $\frac{1}{2}$ a number lower than the one indicated in the description.

You will find the index on the back page.



Here you will find our particularly easy and quick to knit models.

Before starting your work please study carefully the explanations on pages 2 and 3

Patterns: The drawings refer to half width, the indications of stitch numbers refer to whole width of each part.

Figure I = back
Figure II = front
Figure III = sleeve
Figure IV = collar
Figure V = border, cuff
Figure VI = pocket
Figure VII = skirt, front
Figure VIII = skirt, back

Figure IX = pants
Figure X = gusset
Figure XI = scarf
Figure XII = cap, bonnet
Figure XIII = mittens
Figure XIV = socks, stockings
Figure XV = straps
Figure XVI = bra, halter, bodice, top

If the centre line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is worked simultaneously with reversed shapings, i. e. decreasing or increasing is made on the left as well as on the right side.

If the centre line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is worked separately with reversed shapings, i. e. first knit one part according to diagram (increasing or decreasing at right), then the second part the opposite way (decreasing or increasing at left).

Abbreviations:

Col. = colour of wool.
st, sts = stitch, stitches
St. S = stitch size
Nd, nds = needle, needles
R = row
T = 2 rows

○ = tubular (or) = half tubular
● = every (in every row)
X = times
+ = increase
- = decrease, cast off
▲ = graduations (short rows)
■ = for open work row hang st to the next nd, leave empty nd in W. P.

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter "st"). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working Position on back and front bed.

Exception: For tubular or half tubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed. The same number of needles must therefore be put into Working Position on the other bed. In these cases the sign for tubular \bigcirc respectively (or) for half tubular is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increase or decrease always occurs in the first row of a section.

- $+3 \times 2 \cdot 8 \cdot R$ means: increase 2 stitches 3 times in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- $-19 \times 3 \cdot 7 \cdot R$ means: decrease 3 stitches 19 times in every 7th row (back 2 stitches, front 1 stitch or vice versa).
- $-17 \times 1 \cdot 2 \cdot / 3 \cdot R$ means: decrease 1 stitch 17 times, alternately once after 2 rows and once after 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle - 4 \times 8 \cdot 2 \cdot R$ means: work graduations, i. e. short rows (on DUO with pushers and lock BX). Step by step put 8 nds (and their respective pushers) into Rest Position 4 times after every 2nd row (for double bed 4 nds each back and front). Once all graduations are finished, continue knitting normally, i. e. all nds in Working Position (pushers in Neutral Position).

Graduations can be knitted two ways, either from outer edge towards centre (gradual decreasing with the minus-sign "-" after the black triangle) or from the centre towards outer edge (gradual increasing with the plus-sign "+" after the black triangle.)

Number of stitches and centimetres :

- $136 = 20 \text{ cm}$ means: a total of 136 sts (for K/K 68 stitches each on back and front) make a width of 20 cm.
- $\bigcirc 146 = 43 \text{ cm}$ means: cast on 146 sts each on back and front bed for tubular which makes a width of 43 cm.




Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be tested by you, by making your own test square for your own wool.

Test square: We strongly recommend that you make always a test square with your own material before starting to work, in order to calculate for your material the necessary numbers of stitches and rows along the PASSAP - chart. The chapter "The test square and its calculation" in your instruction book informs you how to proceed for these calculations. This is very important, especially when adjusting a model to another size.

Dress with stand-up collar

Size : up to 102 cm bust
Material : 490 g fairly fine mohair/acrylic
 10 small buttons
Stitch size : 6
Test square : 100 sts = 35 cm, 100 R = 28 cm
Pattern : Stocking stitch, collar st.st. tubular

Fig. I :
 A = with 48 nds in 1:1 division tubular cast-on, then transfer sts to front for st.st., cont. in st.st. straight. B = shape armholes at each end. C = shape shoulders at each end. Cast off.

Fig. II :
 A = until row 322 as for Fig. I. B = divide work, place left side on dekercombs. Then, at left, cast on 8 additional sts, knit straight at right and left. C = knit straight at left, shape armhole at right. D = shape neck at left, knit straight at right. E = straight at left, shape shoulder at right. 2nd part : return sts to nds of machine, and knit sections B+C+D+E with reversed shapings.

Belt : Stocking stitch, tubular, with 2 sts at back and two sts at front, St.S 5, knit belt to desired length.

Fig. III : knit two parts alike
 Begin with contrast yarn, knit straight st.st. B = shape sleeve heads at each end. When you have finished, press the contrast yarn of the cast-on hard, then, return the cast-on edge to the needles of the machine, always putting 2 sts on 1 nd. Unravel contrast yarn. Using St.S 4 1/2, knit 60 rows, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Collar :
 Stocking stitch, tubular, with 130 nds on each bed, St.S 4 1/2, knit RC 28, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.


To make up : Block and press parts (folding facing of front part slit opening to inside). Join shoulder seams. St by st, backstitching into the open loops, sew collar first to outside of neck opening, then to inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Join sleeve and side seams, set in sleeves. Sew cuff bands to inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Sew buttons into position as shown in picture, then crochet loops to match on the other slit edge as follows : using the green tool, make 9 single (double) crochet sts, then 9 chain sts, etc. Hem dress to required length.




Fig. I : A = tubular cast-on with green, then knit fairisle, straight. B = shape armhole at each end. C = shape shoulder at each end. Cast off.

Fig. III : knit two parts alike
 A = tubular cast-on with green, then knit fairisle, straight. B = shape armhole at each end.

Turn-up on sleeves : knit two parts alike
 Stocking stitch, tubular, begin with contrast yarn with 54 nds in Working Position on each bed, then knit RC 140 with green. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Neckband :
 Stocking stitch, tubular, with 120 nds in Working Position on each bed, St.S 6, knit RC 8. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.



To make up : Block and press parts. Join shoulder, sleeve and side seams. St by st, backstitching into the open loops, sew the neckband first to the outside then to the inside of the neck, at the same time unravelling the contrast yarn. Backstitch cuffs to sleeve edge, unravelling contrast yarn, then catch down at the top. Set in sleeves.



A = tubular cast-on, then knit in fairisle pattern acc. to diagram straight.
 B = waist : knitted double to allow insertion of belt. Using offwhite knit 10 rows on front bed with lock at back GX, front N; using brown knit 10 rows on back bed with lock at back N, front GX. C = fairisle, straight. D = for armhole, first cast off 24 sts at each end, then dec. Cont. to knit straight. E = shape shoulders at each end, cast off.

Fig. II :

A = tubular cast-on, then knit straight in pattern. B = waist : knitted double to allow insertion of belt. Using brown, knit 10 rows at back; then, at front use offwhite and over 10 sts at right knit 10 rows, and over 40 sts at left also knit 10 rows. C = knit straight in pattern. D = knit straight at right, shape armhole at left. After RC 44, leave 32 sts at right on the nds of the machine, transfer the following 25 sts from the front to the sts on the back bed and cast them off together. Then, using a length of brown yarn, lay a not too tight twisted zig-zag across the 50 empty nds, knit RC 60 in pattern. E = shape neck at right, knit straight at left. F = straight at right, shape shoulder at left. Second front part : knit with reversed shapings.

Fig. III :

A = tubular cast-on, then knit straight in fairisle pattern. B = shape sleeve heads at each end, cast off.

Sleeve bands : knit two parts alike, offwhite

Acc. to 3:3-rib diagram, put 70 nds in W.P., knit 50 rows straight. Transfer sts to front for st.st., knit 2 rows st.st. with St.S 5 1/2. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. VIa :

A = over 22 nds on each bed, lay zig-zag at back and front (1 row N/N), then, knit tubular RC 17. Now, at back, knit a few rows with contrast yarn, at front, with offwhite knit 39 rows with St.S 5 1/2, 1 row with St.S 4, 40 rows with St.S 5 1/2, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. VIb :

A = with 26 nds on each bed knit 1 row with lock N/N, then tubular RC 40, at the same time increasing every RC 4, i.e. at back and front transferring 1 st 1 nd out and placing the purlstitch loop of this st on the empty nd. B = cont. to inc. at right, at left back and front dec. using single decker. C = straight at right, at left, cont. to dec., a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

 Material : 450 g sports wool : 375 g white, 50 g space-died (ombre) and 25 g green
 Stitch size : Stocking stitch 7/2, borders 5 3/4, neckband 6
 Test square : 50 sts = 27,5 cm, 50 R = 19 cm
 Pattern : Stocking stitch knitted with every alternate needle, borders 1:1 rib acc. to diagram 1 + 2, stripes acc. to instructions.





 A = with 90 nds tubular cast-on acc. to diagram 1, knit 14 rows with St.S 5 3/4.
 B = transfer all sts to front. Knit 16 rows white, then 1st stripe as follows:
 2 rows green, 4 rows space-died, 4 rows white, 4 rows space-died, 2 rows green. Then 52 rows white. For 2nd stripe : 2 rows green, 4 rows space-died, 2 rows white. C = stripe : 2 rows white, 4 rows space-died, 2 rows green, remainder white. At the same time dec. for raglan at each end, i.e. using orange tool, always move 3 sts 1 working needle in. Cast off loosely.






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Collar : 3:3-rib, offwhite.

Beginning with contrast yarn, cast on 163 sts at front, knit 1 row st.st. with offwhite and St.S 6, then transfer sts acc. to 3:3-rib diagram : at front always miss 3 sts, transfer 1 cross thread and 2 sts to the back. Knit 100 rows, then transfer all sts to the front again, knit 1 row st.st. with St.S 6, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Belt : brown

With 12 nds in K/K and St.S 3/2, knit a belt measuring approx. 130 cm, cast off.
 To make up : Block and press parts. On front parts, first set in breast pockets in the following way : sew the 22 sts of the band (A) st by st, backstitching into the open loops, to the outside of the lower edge of the slit, unravelling contrast yarn. Slip-stitch the narrow band edges into position at each end. Fold section B of the pocket along the broken line and sew st by st to the upper edge of the slit, unravelling contrast yarn. Join the open edges of pocket lining. Join back and front part, leaving an opening in the side seams for the pockets as in diagram. Matching arrows, dots and circles, sew pockets to the edges of side seam openings, st by st, backstitching into the open loops, and unravelling contrast yarn. St by st, backstitching into open loops, sew cuffs (sleeve bands) to lower sleeve edge, unravel contrast yarn. Join sleeve seams. Set in sleeves. Sew collar to outside of neck opening, st by st, backstitching into open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. Set in zip fastener. Fold collar in half to the inside and sew zip into position in-between the collar edges. St by st sew collar to the inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Insert belt.

Fig. II :

A + B as for Fig. I. C = raglan shaping acc. to diagram, stripes as for Fig. I. D = divide work : at left, place 18 sts onto dekercombs, cast off (loosely) 14 sts at centre. 1st part : shape raglan at right, shape neck at left. 2nd part : return sts to nds of machine and knit with reversed shapings.

Fig. III : first sleeve

A = bands acc. to diagram 1. Knit 14 rows. B = transfer all sts to front. Knit 98 rows with white, then the stripes as follows : 2 rows green, 4 rows space-died, 2 rows white. Inc. at each end. C = stripes : 2 rows white, 4 rows space-died, 2 rows green. Knit remainder with white. At the same time shape raglan at each end acc. to diagram. D = dec. at right, shape raglan at left. Second sleeve : A to C as for first sleeve. D = knit with reversed shapings.

Neckband : white

With 120 nds tubular cast-on acc. to diagram 2. Knit 8 rows with St.S 6, transfer all sts to front, knit 2 rows, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up : Block and press parts. Sew sleeves matching arrows and dots between back and front parts. Join side and sleeve seams. Join neckband and attach st by st backstitching into open loops, unravelling contrast yarn.

A = with 90 nds acc. to diagram 1 tubular cast-on, then transfer sts acc. to diagram 2. Knit 20 rows. B = transfer sts for st.st. knitted with every alternate needle, knit straight. C = shape armholes at each end, cont. straight. D = shape shoulders at each end, cast off.

Fig. II :

A = with 45 nds cast-on as for Fig. I., ribs, knit straight. B = transfer sts for st.st. knitted with every alternate needle, knit straight. C = straight at right, shape neck at left. D = shape armhole at right, shape neck at left. E = shape shoulder at right, knit straight at left. Second front part : knit with reversed shapings.

Fig. III :

A = with 40 nds cast-on as for Fig. I, ribs, knit straight. B = transfer sts for st.st., inc. at each end. C = shape sleeve heads at each end, cast off.

Fig. IV :


A = single-bed cast-on over 46 sts with every alternate needle, knit a few rows. Then transfer sts for ribs acc. to diagram 2, take out a pusher from the blocking rail for every nd in W.P. Beginning with 16 sts, start increasing from the right with graduations. B = knit straight. C = straight at right, dec. at left with single decker. D = buttonhole band : knit 6 rows, then, from the right, knit off the 3rd, 4th and 5th st by hand using contrast yarn, work 4 more buttonholes every 20 rows. Knit 6 rows, cast off. Second half of collar : knit with reversed shapings, but omit buttonholes.




Pockets : knit twice

With 28 nds acc. to diagram 1 tubular cast-on, then transfer sts for ribs acc. to diagram 2, knit 8 rows and transfer for st.st. knitted with every alternate nd, knit 28 rows st.st., a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up : Block and press parts. Join shoulder seams. Join collar along centre back using graft stitch, unravel contrast yarn. Then, with mattress stitch and a little deeper at the back, sew it to centre front and around neck opening. St by st, backstitching into open loops and unravelling contrast yarn, sew pockets into position 6 stitches from the side seams and flush with the top of the welt. Sew on side edges of pockets with invisible stitches. Join side seams and sleeves. Set in sleeves. Sew on buttons.

Fig. I :

A = light green. For 2:2 rib, tubular cast-on with racking. Knit 20 rows straight. B = transfer sts to front for st.st., inc. at each end. C = shape armholes at each end, cont. to knit straight. D = cast off 21 sts at centre, place left side on dekercombs. For right side, shape shoulder at right, shape neck at left. **Second shoulder :** return sts to nds of machine and knit with reversed shapings.

Fig. II :

A = light green. For 2:2 rib, tubular cast-on with racking. Knit 20 rows. B = transfer sts to front, then knit fairisle with lock BX and pushers, inc. at each end. C = divide work, place left side on dekercombs. Make note of row number on punchcard. For right side, inc. at right, shape neck at left. D = shape armhole at right, shape neck at left. E = straight at left, shape shoulder at right. **Second part :** return sts to nds of machine, knit sections C + D + E with reversed shapings.

Neckband :

Stocking stitch, tubular, 100 nds on each bed, beg. with contrast yarn. Then, at right, dec. 1 st at front and back 10 times every RC 2 knitting RC 20 altogether, then knit RC 2 with St.S 8, then, inc. 1 st at front and back 10 times every RC 2, knit RC 20, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Armhole band : knit two parts alike

Begin with contrast yarn, 68 nds on each bed in W.P., knit RC 20 straight stocking stitch tubular, then RC 2 with St.S 8, then RC 20 straight st.st. tubular, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up : Block and press parts. Join shoulder and side seams. St by st, backstitching into the open loops, sew neckband first to the outside then to the inside of neck opening, unravelling contrast yarn. In the same way sew on armhole band to armhole edge.

Dress with pleated bodice

- Size : 88 cm bust
- Material : 750 g synthetic yarn, 6 buttons, 1 narrow elastic
- Stitch size : Stocking stitch = 6, "long stitch" = 3
- Test square : 100 sts = 37 cm, 100 R = 26 cm
- Pattern : Stocking stitch, collar and buttonhole band acc.to diagram.

Handle down, orange strippers




Fig. Ia : centre back panel. Begin with contrast yarn. A = knit straight. B = divide work, cast off 14 sts at centre. 1st shoulder : shape shoulder at right, shape neck at left. 2nd shoulder : knit with reversed shapings.

Fig. Ib : first side panel of back. Begin with contrast yarn. A = straight. B = shape armhole at right, knit straight at left. C = shape shoulder at right, knit straight at left. Second side panel: knit with reversed shapings.

Fig. II : first front part. Begin with contrast yarn. A = knit straight. B = shape armhole at right, straight at left. C = straight at right, shape neck at left. D = shape shoulder at right, straight at left. Second front part : knit with reversed shapings.

Fig. IV : collar

A = tubular cast-on with 192 nds, then knit acc. to diagram, working a buttonhole on the 10th row as follows : 6 sts in from right edge, knit off by hand 3 sts at front and 2 sts at back using contrast yarn. B = st.st. tubular, RC 10 with St.S 6, a few RCs with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. V : buttonhole band : long stitch acc.to diagram with 25 nds tubular cast-on, then knit 26 rows. First buttonhole : 6 sts in from right edge knit off 3 sts at front and 2 sts at back using contrast yarn. Then knit 48 rows. In the same way, work 4 more buttonholes, cast off.

Fig. VII : back skirt part. Stocking stitch, half tubular, open at right. Begin with contrast yarn. Cast on 146 sts on each bed, knit straight, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. VIII : front skirt part. Begin with contrast yarn, knit single-bed straight. A few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. VI : pockets. Knit twice, begin with contrast yarn.

A = st.st. tubular, cast on 35 sts on each bed. Every RC 4, back and front, inc. 1 st at right, at left dec. 1 st. B = straight at right, dec. at left. C = at each end, dec. every RC 2, then transfer all sts to front and cast off together. Belt : 2 parts alike

Begin with contrast yarn. Cast on 30 sts on each bed and knit RC 600 tubular. Then, at right back and front, dec. 1 st every RC 2, pull yarn through the last 2 sts.






Diagram for fairisle stitch
