On the first page of our model book we are happy to show you a most unusual poncho which has been knitted on a PASSAP DUOMATIC 80 by a young artist from New York who has discovered for herself what a knitting machine can do for you. She chose the knitting machine because she was looking for a technique she could specialize in and which had not yet been fully explored. Most "fiber artists" use 'weaving' to express themselves, but Susanna Lewis is convinced that the knitting machine is a tool that can take you just as far. Her great success is certainly proof of this : her works of art, ponchos and capes, are sold at steep prices at an artisan gallery on New York's Madison Avenue.

Of course, we can't give you the working instructions of this poncho - it's just to show you what can be done on our knitting machines apart from the usual garments featured in our books. We hope many of you will be inspired to follow Susanna Lewis's example and embark on your own exploratory path to adventure.

Please note the new abbreviations for the pattern descriptions

2 R	Knit 2 rows
4 R	Knit 4 rows
1 	Racking handle one full turn to the right
2 	Racking handle two full turns to the right

Before starting your work please study carefully the explanations on pages 2 and 3

Patterns: The drawings refer to half width, the indications of stitch numbers refer to whole width of each part.

Figure I	= back	Figure IX	= pants
Figure II	= front	Figure X	= gusset
Figure III	= sleeve	Figure XI	= scarf
Figure IV	= collar	Figure XII	= cap, bonnet
Figure V	= border, cuff	Figure XIII	= mittens
Figure VI	= pocket	Figure XIV	= socks, stockings
Figure VII	= skirt, front	Figure XV	= straps
Figure VIII	= skirt, back	Figure XVI	= bra, halter, bodice, top

If the centre line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is worked simultaneously with reversed shapings, i. e. decreasing or increasing is made on the left as well as on the right side.

If the centre line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is worked separately with reversed shapings, i. e. first knit one part according to diagram (increasing or decreasing at right), then the second part the opposite way (decreasing or increasing at left).

Abbreviations:

Col.	= colour of wool.	○	= tubular (or) = half tubular
st, sts	= stitch, stitches	●	= every (in every row)
St.S	= stitch size	×	= times
Nd, nds	= needle, needles	+	= increase
R	= row	-	= decrease, cast off
T	= 2 rows	▲	= graduations (short rows)
		■	= for open work row hang st to the next nd, leave empty nd in W. P.

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter "st"). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working Position on back and front bed.

Exception: For tubular or half tubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed. The same number of needles must therefore be put into Working Position on the other bed. In these cases the sign for tubular \bigcirc respectively (or) for half tubular is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increase or decrease always occurs in the first row of a section.

- $+ 3 \times 2 \cdot 8 \cdot R$ means: increase 2 stitches 3 times in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- $- 19 \times 3 \cdot 7 \cdot R$ means: decrease 3 stitches 19 times in every 7th row (back 2 stitches, front 1 stitch or vice versa).
- $- 17 \times 1 \cdot 2 / 3 \cdot R$ means: decrease 1 stitch 17 times, alternately once after 2 rows and once after 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle - 4 \times 8 \cdot 2 \cdot R$ means: work graduations, i. e. short rows (on DUO with pushers and lock BX). Step by step put 8 nds (and their respective pushers) into Rest Position 4 times after every 2nd row (for double bed 4 nds each back and front). Once all graduations are finished, continue knitting normally, i. e. all nds in Working Position (pushers in Neutral Position).

Graduations can be knitted two ways, either from outer edge towards centre (gradual decreasing with the minus-sign "-" after the black triangle) or from the centre towards outer edge (gradual increasing with the plus-sign "+" after the black triangle.)

Number of stitches and centimetres :

- $136 = 20 \text{ cm}$ means: a total of 136 sts (for K/K 68 stitches each on back and front) make a width of 20 cm.
- $\bigcirc 146 = 43 \text{ cm}$ means: cast on 146 sts each on back and front bed for tubular which makes a width of 43 cm.

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be tested by you, by making your own test square for your own wool.

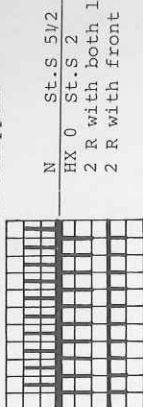
Test square: We strongly recommend that you make always a test square with your own material before starting to work, in order to calculate for your material the necessary numbers of stitches and rows along the PASSAP - chart. The chapter "The test square and its calculation" in your instruction book informs you how to proceed for these calculations. This is very important, especially when adjusting a model to another size.

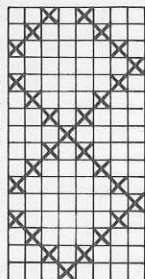

C = shape armhole at each end. D = cast off 30 sts at centre. Divide work. Place left half onto deckercombs (make a note of the row number on the deco). Right half : shape shoulder at right, shape neck at left. Left half : knit as for right half, but with reversed shapings. Note : return the sts to exactly the same needles (from which they were taken off), and keep pattern correct.
Fig. II : right front half
 A + B = as for Fig. I. C = shape neck at left. D = shape armhole at right, cont. to shape neck at left. E = knit straight at each end. F = shape shoulder at right. Left front half : knit with reversed shapings.

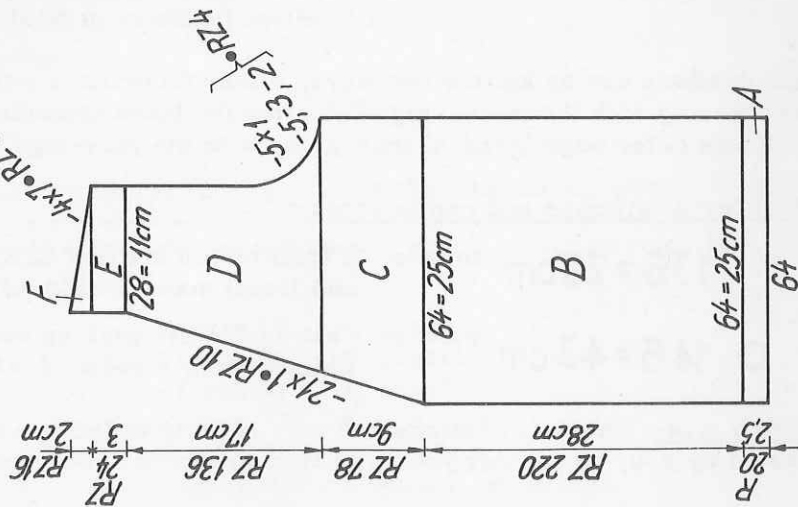
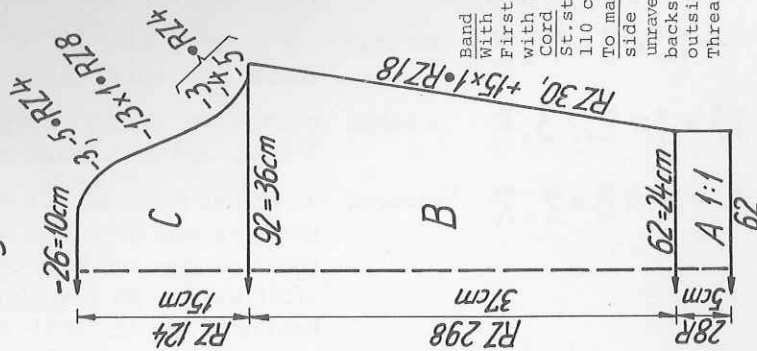

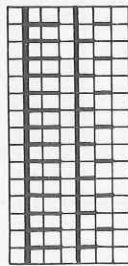
To make up : Block and press parts. Join shoulder, side and sleeve seams. Set in sleeves. Make the hem, unravel contrast yarn. Sew neckband to jacket opening, backstitching through the open loops, first on the outside, then the inside, unravelling contrast yarn. Thread cord through lace pattern at waist level.

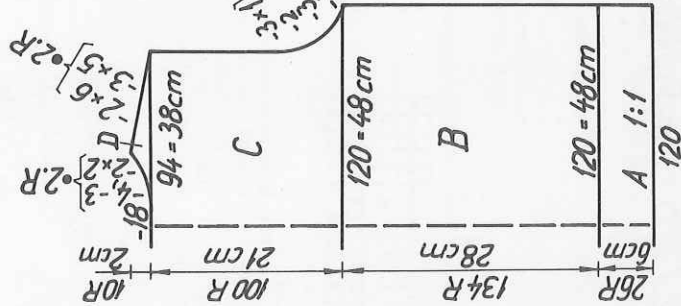

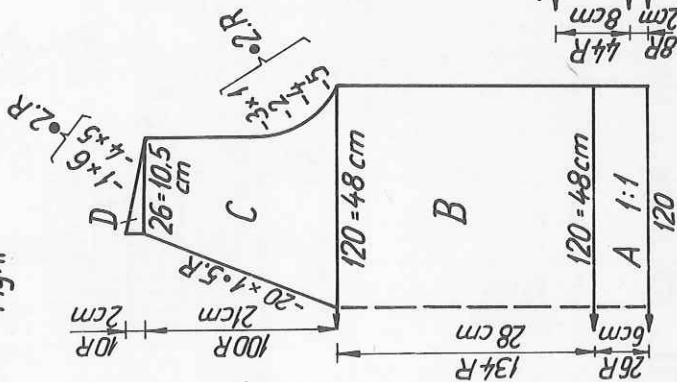

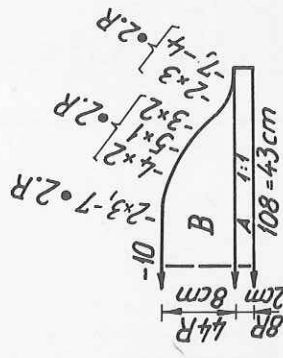

A = apricot, tubular cast-on for 1:1 rib with 120 sts. St.S 4 knit 26 rows. Transfer all sts to front bed. B = knit straight at each end, stripes and inbetween rows as given in separate chart. C = cont. to knit st.st., shape armhole at each end, cont. straight. D = cast off centre 18 sts, place left half onto dekercombs. For right half : shape shoulder at right, shape neck at left. Left half : return sts of left half to nds of machine and knit section D with reversed shapings.

A & B = as for Fig. I. C = divide work, place left half onto dekercombs. Right half : shape armhole at right, cont. to knit straight at right, shape neck at left. D = shape shoulder at right, knit straight at left. Left half : return sts to nds of machine and knit sections C & D with reversed shapings.

Fig. III :

A = apricot, tubular cast-on for 1:1 rib with 108 sts. St.S 4, knit 8 rows. Transfer all sts to front. B = apricot, 2 rows lock N; brown, 2 rows AX-pattern; apricot, 2 rows N, cont. to knit st.st., shape sleeve head at each end.

Neckband :

Apricot, tubular cast-on for 1:1 rib with 162 sts. St.S 4 knit 6 rows. Transfer all sts to front. St.S 5 3/4, brown, knit 2 rows AX, then, with apricot 2 rows N. End with a few rows contrast yarn, release.

To make up : Block and press all parts. Join shoulder, side and sleeve seams. Set in sleeves. Sew neckband to neck opening, st by st, backstitching through the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. Join centre front point with mattress stitch.

 Work the two other buttonholes in the same way, after 54 rows. C = inc. at
 right, knit straight at left, buttonholes as per diagram. D = shape armhole

 end. F = divide work. From the left, place 44 sts on deckercombs. Cast off
 the following 32 sts. Right half : at left, begin with neckshaping, at right

 half : Return sts to nds of machine. Shape neck at right, knit straight at
 left. Cast off.

Left front part : knit with reversed shapings and omitting buttonholes.
 Fig. III : knit two parts alike
 A = as for Fig. I, but with 58 nds. B = cont. in pattern, inc. at each end
 on every 16th row. C = inc. on every 8th row at each end. D = shape sleeve
 head at each end. Cast off.

Collar : Begin and end with contrast yarn.
 Single-bed cast-on with 100 sts, seablue, knit 52 rows in pattern.
 To make up : Block and press parts. Join shoulder seams. On front parts,
 fold facing to inside, press and catch down lightly. Sew collar to the inside
 of neck opening, backstitching through the open loops of last row knitted in
 main colour; do not stretch collar right round neck opening, but leave 5 cm
 free at each end. Close these end bits with mattress stitch. Fold collar in
 half, join side edges with mattress stitch, then catch down each loop of collar
 on the outside, unravel contrast yarn. Neaten all buttonholes, unravelling
 contrast yarn. Join side and sleeve seams. Set in sleeves. Turn up all hems,
 with the facing-parts lying over the hem. Sew on buttons.

Size : up to a 104 cm bust
Material : 490 g fine synthetic yarn : 250 g blue and 240 g white

Test square : 100 sts = 26 cm, RC 200 = 24 cm
Pattern : AX-Fairisle acc. to diagram with deco card 24

Fig. I & II : knit two parts alike

A = blue, tubular cast on with 216 sts. Begin with AX-Fairisle immediately after cast on, knit straight. B = blue, lock back and front N, knit 24 rows. End with a few rows contrast yarn, release.

Fig. III : knit twice

A = as for Fig. I & II, but with 168 sts. Knit RC 308. Cast off all 168 sts. To make up : Block and press parts lightly. Fold the part knitted with lock at N to inside on both front and back part, and st by st, unravelling contrast yarn, sew in position. Set in sleeves in such a way as to match the arrows and dots indicated in the diagram, the shoulders (section B) will then overlap and are held together with 3 buttons on either side (see photo). Join side and sleeve seams. Join side seams, leaving an opening at the bottom measuring approx. 10 cms, make row of single (double crochet) round these slits.

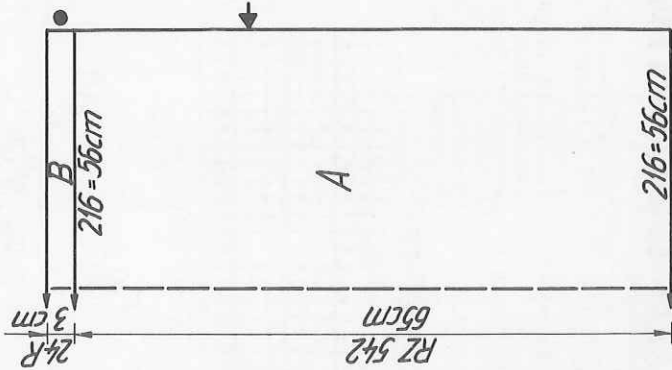
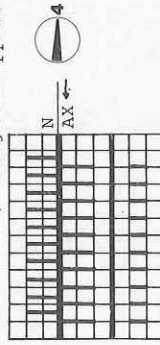
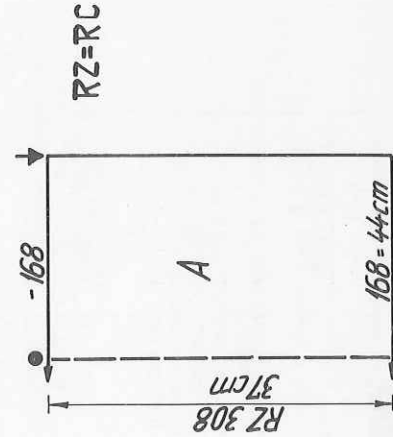

Fig. VIIa+VIIIa : A + B = first pleat

Using contrast yarn, single-bed cast-on with 160 nds. Knit a few rows st.st. A = seablue, knit 18 rows st.st. B = knit 54 rows in BX-pattern. Knit sections A and B 5 times in all, repeat section A once more, then knit 144 rows in pattern. Now, repeat the whole procedure, from the beginning, once more.

Fig. VIIb + VIIIb : knit twice
A = using contrast yarn, single-bed cast-on with 128 nds. Then, knit in pattern, seablue, decreasing every 6th row, i.e. transferring 12 sts in by 1 needle. B = knit 12 rows st.st., straight. A few rows contrast yarn, release.

To make up : Block and press parts lightly. Arrange pleats, press, and from the waist downwards close each pleat along approx. 10 cm with mattress stitch. Unravel contrast yarn from the side edges (cast-on edges), and graft together. Join side edges of panel (Fig. VIIb+VIIIb). At the waist, fold the stocking stitch part to inside, backstitch through the open loops, unravel contrast yarn. Insert waist elastic. Join panel to pleated skirt part, unravelling contrast yarn and backstitching through the open loops. Turn up hem to required length.

Pattern : Sweater with V-neck, in half fisherman's rib.
 Bands in 1:1 rib. Wrong side worn as right side.

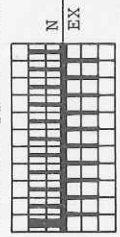

 A = tubular cast on for 1:1 rib with 65 sts on back bed and 64 sts on front bed. St.S 3/2, knit 20 rows. B = knit in pattern acc. to diagram, RC 150. C = dec. at each end for armhole as follows : using quintuple decker tool, dec. at each end back and front 1 st every RC 4 7 times in all. D = cont. to knit straight. E = shape shoulder at each end. Cast off remaining 37 sts.
Fig. II :
 A & B & C = as for Fig. I. D = dec. centre st on back bed, then divide work. Place left half onto deckercombs. For right half : knit straight at right, dec. at left for V-neck using triple decker tool. E = cont. to dec. at left, shape shoulder at right. For left half : return sts to nds of machine and cont. to knit, keeping pattern correct and knitting sections D & E with reversed shapings.
Fig. III : knit two sleeves alike
 A = tubular cast on for 1:1 rib with 31 sts on back bed and 30 sts on front bed. Knit 20 rows. B = cont. to knit in pattern acc. to diagram, inc. at each end. C = with quintuple decker tool, dec. at each end as given for Fig. I, section C, for sleeve head. Cast off the remaining 17 sts.

To make up : Block and press parts. Sew saddle part between front and back part, matching dots and arrows. Set in sleeve head. Sew collar, with pattern II outside, first to the outside, then to the inside of neck opening, backstitching through the open loops, unravel contrast yarn. Joins sleeve and side seams. Using mattress stitch, sew the two front bands to jacket front edges. Neaten buttonholes by unravelling contrast yarn and joining the open loops with backstitch. Sew on buttons.

Neckband :
 Tubular cast on for 1:1 rib with 100 sts. St.S 3/2, knit 8 rows, at the same time inc. at each end back and front 1 st every alternate row 4 times in all = 116 sts. Push all needles lying empty inbetween into W.P. Lock CX/CX, St.S 3/2, knit 2 rows. Change to St.S 6 and knit 4 rows. End with a few rows contrast yarn, release.
To make up : Block and press parts. Join shoulder seams. Sew neckband, first on the outside, then on the inside, to neck opening, st by st backstitching through the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. Join side and sleeve seams. Set in sleeves.

- Size : to fit a 88 cm bust
 Material : 550 g mercerised cotton yarn
 Pattern back = 5/2, front = 2/4.

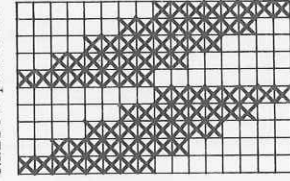
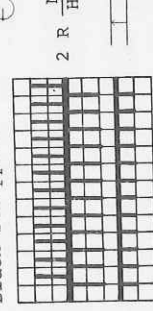


Diagram : Pattern with U80 and deco card 75

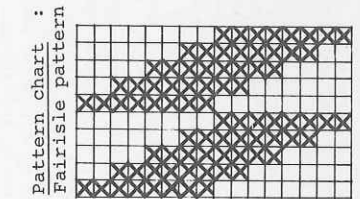


Diagram 2 : 'long stitch'
 handle down, orange strippers

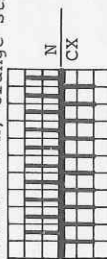
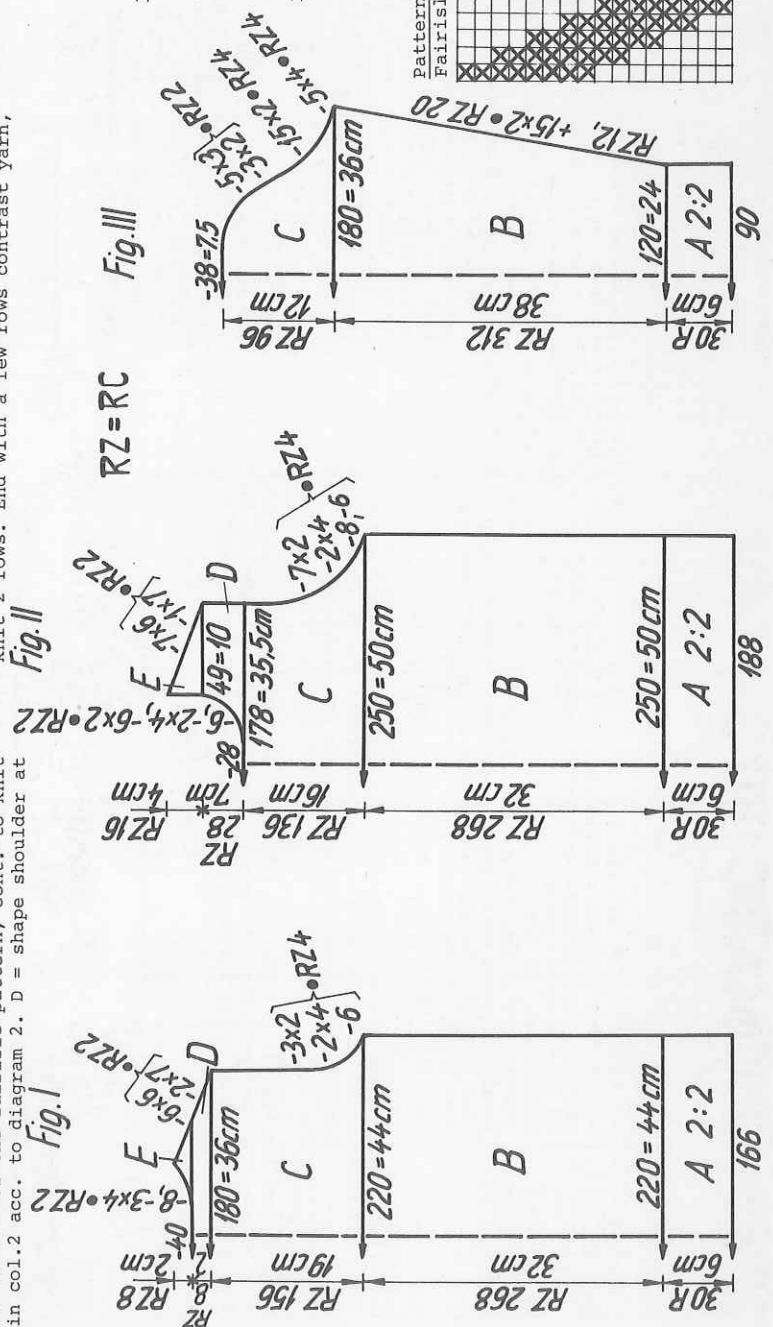
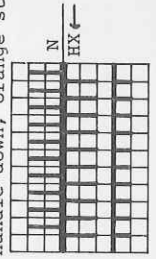


Diagram 1 : Fairisle 'long stitch'

To make up : As given for 2786.

Fig. VII & VIII : knit 4 parts alike

A = tubular, closed cast on with 108 sts on each bed. Lock CX/CX, St.S 5, knit RC 20. B = transfer all sts to front. Cont. to knit st.st., St.S 6, at the same time dec. 1 st each end 28 times every 10th row (using triple decker). C = knit 20 rows straight for waistband. End with a few rows contrast yarn, release.

To make up : Block and press parts. Join all vertical seams. Fold 10 rows of section C to inside, and sew in position, st by st, backstitching through the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. Leave small opening for inserting waist elastic.

B = transfer all sts to front, inc. 10 sts at each end (place 10 sts of an old test square onto nds of machine). Knit in pattern acc. to diagram 1 and 2 using the U 80, straight at each end. C = cont. to knit in pattern, at the same time shaping shoulder at each end. Cast off remaining 56 sts.

A = tubular, closed cast on with 68 sts on each bed. St.S 4 3/4, knit RC 20. B = transfer sts of back bed to front and knit straight, in pearl pattern acc. to diagram. C = cast off 21 sts at each end, cont. to knit straight with the remaining 26 centre sts. D = place both edges of sections A and B to the left and right of the 26 sts = 78 nds in all in W.P. Knit 1 row st.st. Transfer sts for 1:1 rib. St.S 3 1/2, knit 12 rows. End with a few rows contrast yarn, release.

To make up : Join two seams at section C. Fold section D in half to inside and attach st by st with hem stitch, unravelling contrast yarn. Insert silk ribbon to tie at the front.
